Flood aid on its way

PHUKET has rallied to dispatch more than 100,000 baht in donated funds and other aid to help the hundreds of thousands of people directly affected by flooding in Thailand's central and northeastern regions.

Thus far, at least 59 people have been killed from the ongoing deluge in central and northeast Thailand. More than three million people are estimated to be affected by the country's worst floods in decades.

Tens of thousands have evacuated their homes and are in need of life-saving essentials.

The initial dispatch of Phuket aid was destined for Lopburi, one of the worst-hit provinces.

The donation center, located at Provincial Hall, was coordinated by the Phuket Provincial Office and Red Cross Phuket, where donations have been pouring in over the past week.

Public cash contributions totaled 104,298 baht. Real estate development firm The Phanason Group contributed 100,000 baht.

Many other items were brought to the donation center. These included bags of rice, bottles of water, instant noodles, toilet paper, canned food, blankets, pillows, clothes, and even pairs of slippers.

Donations have been made by both the private and government sectors, including the Kusoldharm Foundation, the Phuket Red Cross, Cherng Talay Tambon Administration Organization, Tourist Police, Thalang District, Muang District and the Phuket civil defense volunteer organization.

The event also marked the closure of the relief center. The Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM) has assumed responsibility for accepting donations at its offices on Damrong Road in Phuket Town.

The DDPM is now asking for cash donations only, if possible.

On Wednesday, the Public Health Minister urged 19 state hospitals in Bangkok, Nonthaburi, Pathum Thani and Samut Prakan to prepare for possible flooding.

Health Minister Jurin Laksanawisit instructed medical workers in those provinces to protect hos-

pitals and medical equipment from floodwaters.

Floods had damaged 42 healthcare units, including hospitals, during past weeks. Three main hospitals, Maharat Nakhon Ratchasima, Chaiyaphum and Phimai, have resumed normal operations.

Preliminary estimates of the total cost of reparations to flooddamaged to hospitals so far stands at more than 370 million baht.

Gov issues flood, landslide warning

THE governor has urged officials and local agencies to be vigilant in preventing flooding and landslides in areas of construction sites and recently completed housing projects.

The call follows the Thai Meteorological Department issuing a weather warning for heavy rains caused by a monsoon trough over the Andaman Sea.

Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha told officials gathered at the Land Office to be wary of drains blocked by silt and muddy runoff from nearby construction areas denuded of foliage.

Land Office chief Paitoon Lertkrai said, "We are taking extra care to ensure construction follows the EIA [environmental impact assessment] that was approved for the project, with special attention given to the size of the drains and wastewater systems.'

Mr Paitoon said that about 50 residential housing projects were currently underway in Phuket, 12 of which were approved last year. "Some of them have just been completed," he said.

Only two housing projects have been approved this year, he added.

"It's normal to receive some complaints about flooding while any project is under construction. The complaints usually stem from drains being blocked," he added.

However, the Land chief pointed out that potential Phuket home buyers were getting smarter.

"The number of complaints about housing projects is decreasing as people are now more astute. If any projects have flooding problems, they simply will not buy the houses in these projects," he

Highway robbery

THREE teenagers held up a pair three youths, all on the same moof young women at gunpoint in Thalang and stole their motorbike early last Sunday morning.

News of the hold-up was reported to Thalang Police by Wirach Rawdboot, the older brother of one of the victims.

The woman, with a female friend riding pillion, was driving her Yamaha Fino home from work along a quiet stretch of Srisoonthorn Road when the

torbike, began trailing them, Mr Wirach said.

The trio then suddenly cut off the women, forcing them at gunpoint to get off the motorbike. One of the attackers jumped on the Fino and both motorbikes sped off into the darkness.

Thalang Police are investigating the incident, but no arrests have been reported.

Patient sexual assault claim a 'misunderstanding': hospital

VACHIRA Phuket Hospital has concluded that a sexual assault charge against one of its staff members was the result of a "misunderstanding".

The hospital investigation began after a woman filed a complaint with Phuket City Police last Tuesday that she had been sexually assaulted by hospital staff while undergoing an x-ray examination.

Lt Col Sian Kaewthong told the Gazette that the woman had gone to the hospital at about 2am that day "because she had taken too much paracetamol".

"After she was treated, she was taken into the x-ray room for further examination. She said that she was touched around her body [in the x-ray room]," Lt Col Sian said.

"But, I think that it might be a misunderstanding because in the x-ray room there were many hospital staff; the woman and the [accused] staff member were not

in the room alone," he added.

The woman did not want to press charges against Vachira Hospital. Her intentions were to ensure that other hospital staff did not follow the same behavior, he said.

Lt Col Sian said that police will keep the report as evidence but have left it as an "internal problem for the hospital to take care

Vachira Phuket Hospital Deputy Director Dr Somnuk Jirayut told the Gazette, "We have concluded that this case is a misunderstanding. The patient may not have been fully conscious [at the time of the alleged incident] after being treated for the overdose.

"This is not the first time she

has come to the hospital for this treatment," he added.

"She needed an x-ray of her entire torso, not only her stomach, because the overdose could have affected other organs. So, her bra had to be removed. Because she came alone, the staff could not consult any relatives.

"The staff confirmed that they did inform her they were going to remove her bra. After the examination, she did not make any complaints at the hospital," Dr Somnuk said.

"We questioned two staff members and have learned from their supervisor that they both have clean records.

"However, I have warned staff to be more careful in dealing with patients. This case is a good example," he added.

Dr Somnuk said the results of the internal investigation have been sent to hospital director Dr Jessada Chungpaibulpatana.

The findings will later be forwarded to police.

Arson suspected in car blaze

POLICE are investigating a presumed arson attack that turned a parked car into a ball of flames in Phuket Town last week.

First on the scene, a soi off Phuket Road near Bang Neaw Shrine, were emergency rescue workers from the Kusoldharm

Although equipped with three chemical sprayers, they could do little but watch as the flames completely engulfed the car. Arriving soon afterwards were

Phuket Municipality firefighters, who took 30 minutes to douse the flames. Witnesses told police the fire

appeared to start beneath one of the wheels before quickly spreading to the gasoline tank.

Owner Jirasak Naknan, 53, told police the vehicle had been parked

in the same location since the Friday night before.

The car was recently repainted, but there was no reason to suspect an electrical fault was responsible for igniting the blaze, he told police.

Police suspect a personal or business dispute may have caused an arsonist to set the car alight.

Mr Jirasak operates the highly successful Ran Khu Lek beauty salon in the area.

Damage to the eight-year-old Opel passenger car is estimated at around 100,000 baht.

Police will review images from CCTV cameras in the area to try and find out who, if anyone, was responsible for the fire.

from Kamala to Kathu valley

KAMALA'S top official has proposed construction of a new road linking the West Coast town with Kathu, bypassing Patong.

The five-kilometer road would head directly over the hills behind Phuket FantaSea and join an existing road at Kathu Waterfall.

The new road, if approved, would cost more than 17.4 million baht just for the 2.6-kilometer stretch in Kamala. The section in Kathu would cost even more.

Anxious to get the project moving, Jutha Dumluck, president of the Kamala Tambon Administration Organization, has already filed a budget request to the Phuket Provincial Office asking for funding to be provided under the Thai Khem Kaeng (Strong Thailand) scheme.

"This shortcut will help save fuel costs, traveling time and help ease traffic congestion over Patong Hill," Mr Jutha said.

Unlike the long-awaited road joining Patong to Chalong, which

stalled where the intended road crossed onto state forest land, the Kamala-Kathu road would not need to pass an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), explained Mr Jutha.

The road would cross agricultural land, not state forest, he said.

Kathu Mayor Chaianan Suthikul confirmed he was aware of the project and that his office is now surveying the proposed route.

However, Kathu Municipality had yet to apply for budget approval for their part of the road, Mayor Chaianan said.

New road touted Tsunami survivors head for Phuket

THE crew of surf charter boat Freedom 3 are on their way to Phuket after narrowly escaping with their lives from Monday's tsunami off the Mentawai Islands, Indonesia.

"I'm just so happy all the crew and passengers are safe," said 10year Phuket resident and Freedom Surf Adventures owner John Wilkinson.

British chef and first mate Chris Love said *Freedom 3* was anchored in Macaronis Bay, northern Pagai, about 100 meters from surf charter boat Midas when the tsunami struck about 11pm.

Passengers on both boats were relaxing after dinner. Some were already in bed.

"The bay drained out and within minutes a three-meter wall of whitewater hit our boat, lifted us up and pushed across the bay," said Mr Love.

The seven crew on Freedom 3 could only brace for impact as they were pushed towards the Midas by the surging waves.

Freedom 3 then plowed into the

Midas, which immediately burst into flames.

Mr Love said Australian captain Lee Clarke snapped into action, powered Freedom 3 into oncoming tsunami waves and out into deeper waters to safety.

Meanwhile, the crew and passengers of the Midas had to abandon ship as their boat was engulfed in flames. Most of them were pushed several hundred meters inland and climbed trees to

Two of the *Midas* passengers were salvaged by Freedom 3.

"All the passengers are now

are heading back to Phuket, where the boat will be taken out of the water for the minor repairs," John Wilkinson told the Gazette.

Amazingly, his captain reports Freedom 3 having only "minor cosmetic damage".

Mr Wilkinson said Mr Love called him to tell him the news early Tuesday morning, once they had a phone signal.

"I'm just proud of their courage. The captain and crew fought against all odds to get the passengers to safety," he said.

City hotel staff to face drug testing

MANDATORY drug testing is part of an initiative by Phuket City Police aimed at ridding hotels and guesthouses of illegal drugs.

Representatives of 75 accommodation establishments last week met for a briefing on the initiative, dubbed the "White Hotel" project.

The scheme is the brainchild of Phuket City Police Deputy Superintendent Chaiwat Auykham, who wants to create a "sustainable" approach to drug suppression in the police district, which covers Koh Kaew, Wichit and Rassada as well as Phuket Town.

"We will provide information to hotel staff about illegal drug use and help them find ways to stay away from narcotics," he said.

Staff will also be trained in identifving behavior that could be indicative of drug dealing or drug use, and how to report suspicious individuals to the authorities.

At the heart of the agreement will be a memorandum of understanding (MoU).

To be signed by both police and hotel operators, the document will be a written commitment by hotels confirming that they will adopt a "Triple No!" strategy in dealing with illegal narcotics use on their premises: No drug makers, no drug traders, and no drug takers.

The MoU will also be signed by operators of serviced apartments and other types of temporary lodging facilities.

Establishments that sign up for the project will be subject to follow-up evaluations to ensure they are living up to their commitments, Lt Col Chaiwat said.

Theerasak Sa-Nga Saeng, Personnel Manager at The Metropole hotel in Phuket Town, described the idea as "great".

The initiative would serve as a natural extension of the Department of Labor Protection and Welfare's "White Organization" project – but with more teeth.

For human rights reasons there is no mandatory drug testing under the White Organization project, but hotels in the White Hotel project will be able to work together with police to organize mandatory random drug testing of employees, he explained.

The Westin Siray Bay Resort and the Sinthawee and iPavillion hotels will be the first to take part in the project, it was announced.

Sea gypsies in Rawai protest water shortage

POLICE and local officials went into negotiations with leaders of the Rawai Sea Gypsy community last week after a street protest that blocked traffic for about an hour.

About 250 members of the community took part in the rushhour protest, which began at about 8:30am on Wiset Road near Rawai Pier, the main road through the


At the heart of the dispute was water rights.

A well that had been the villag-

ers' primary water source ran dry due to development of private land nearby.

Arriving to negotiate with the sea gypsies was Phuket MP Rewat Areerob, Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pekad Tantipong and Rawai Mayor Aroon Solos.

The protesters agreed to reopen the road and move the protest to nearby Wat Suwanarom after Mayor Aroon promised to provide them with water from the temple supply within 30 days.

Floating tradition

RASSADA sea gypsies set bad luck adrift in a handmade boat this week while the Rawai community washed away misfortune with water blessed by a witch doctor.

The traditions, upheld twice a year, mark the sea gypsies' most important festival: In Rassada, it is called loy reua, or the "boat floating" festival and in Rawai it is the suad klang baan and arb nammon, or "village chanting" and "bathing in holy water".

Although the rituals differ, both share a common origin and have served the same purpose for sea gypsy communities for hundreds, if not thousands, of years.

However, modernization is taking its toll, placing such traditions in jeopardy.

The sea gypsies have no written language of their own, so it is up to Sorot Pramongkit, of the Laem Tukkae village in Rassada, to keep track of his community's ancestry and maintain tradition.

"We hold the festival twice a year just as our ancestors did, but I cannot say for certain why we hold it twice," he said.

more certain. "This festival is to release bad luck out of the village; if we do it just once a year, bad luck could return," she said.

The festival is held around the middle of the sixth and 11th lunar months (usually in May and October) and coincides with the beginning and the end of the mon-

soon season. "They both are held on the days of the full moon. I think it is quite similar to the Buddhist belief that on those days our ancestors' spirits can come into our world," Mr Sorot said.

Mrs Kanda points out that sea gypsy culture is handed down through recounting legends and holding festivals such as this.

"I remember our elders telling us stories when we gathered around, instead of watching TV like children do now," she said.

To counter the threat of losing their culture, her husband has been writing down as much as he can about sea gypsy traditions.

"In Rawai, we don't set boats adrift. We bathe ourselves with water blessed by our toh mor [witch doctor], Majim Lakkoh, 82. This washes away bad luck. He learned this rite from his fathers before him," Mr Alin said.

In the evening of the first day of the Rawai festival, each family in the village fills a large urn with

water. Led by tor mor Majim, they chant prayers all night to guard the water from being contaminated by evil spirits. At daybreak, they purify themselves with the water to ward off misfortune.

Although it seems ironic, the recent boom in tourism may help preserve both sea gypsy festivals. "It's good for tourists to see

Bombings mark Tak Bai massacre

INSURGENTS launched attacks in all three provinces of the restive Deep South on October 25, the sixth anniversary of the Tak Bai massacre in which 85 people died.

At least 13 bombs went off in Yala, Pattani and Narathiwat, injuring 16 people, it has been reported.

In Narathiwat, 10 home-made landmines in rubber plantations exploded within a seven-hour period after being stepped on by villagers.

In one incident in Si Sakhon District, four plantation workers were hit by the same explosion. The blast blew a 53-year-old man's leg off. Three others were hit in the face and body by shrapnel.

Around the same time, bombs went off in rubber plantations in Yala and Pattani. A device in Yala seriously injured a 70-year-old man. Bombs in Pattani blew both legs off a 50-year-old woman and seriously hurt a man of the same age.

The attacks took place six years to the day after the Tak Bai incident in Narathiwat, which lingers as a source of resentment.

After six Muslims suspected of being insurgents were arrested by police in 2004, hundreds of people demonstrated at the Tak Bai district police station.

The protesters threw rocks and attempted to storm the building. Hundreds were arrested. The prisoners were stacked five or six deep into army trucks and driven to neighboring Pattani Province.

By the time they arrived, 78 had died. Another seven people were shot dead.

The incident caused outrage among Thai Muslims and led to an upsurge in violence in the Deep South. It is often cited as emblematic of former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra's mishandling of the southern unrest.

Mr Thaksin defended the army

by claiming the people who died were already weak from fasting for Ramadan.

After Mr Thaksin was ousted by a coup in 2006, new Prime Minister Surayud Chulanont traveled to Pattani and apologized for the incident. No-one has ever been prosecuted for the massacre.

The latest bombings came just days after the government extended the state of emergency in Yala, Pattani and Narathiwat for three months. The emergency decree, which bans gatherings of more than five people, has applied in the three Deep South provinces since 2005.

Thai FM: refugees to go home 'only when safe'

THE Thai foreign minister has vowed that some 200,000 Burmese refugees living on the Thai-Burma border will not be repatriated immediately following the country's controversial elections next month.

Kasit Piromya said they would be sent home only if it was safe and the political situation was stable, according to exiled Burmese media organization The Irrawaddy.

Mr Kasit was speaking at Mae La refugee camp in Tak Province, which alone houses around 40,000 refugees.

The comments stand in contrast to those made in New York in September, when he said Thailand was preparing to send camp residents home.

The country would "launch a more comprehensive program for the Burmese people in the camps, the displaced, the intellectuals who run around the streets of Bangkok and Chiang Mai Province, to return to Burma after the elections," he told reporters.

The comments caused deep concern among refugees on the Thai-Burma border, most of whom fled their homes to escape violence or political persecution.

Many observers believe the country is unlikely to stabilize following its first elections in two decades, set for November 7.

The junta is attempting to force armed rebel groups in the ethnic states on Burma's borders to join the country's army as a border guard force. Some, such as the United Wa State Army, are refusing to comply, leading to fears of renewed conflict following the elections.

This year's polls have widely been described as a sham designed to ensure continued political domination by the military, which has governed the country in some form since 1962.


The Burmese election commission has announced that foreign journalists and election observers will be barred from entering the country during the polls.

In the last election in 1990, Aung San Suu Kyi's National League for Democracy party won a landslide victory which the junta refused to accept.

Ms Suu Kyi has spent 14 of the years since then under house arrest in Rangoon, where she remains today.

Making sense of the numbers game

THE Gazette story "Increase in violent crime reports in Phuket" published recently online set off a multi-sided discussion in the online readers forum, with several readers pondering the relationship between police statistics and the actual situation on the ground.

Dismissing the report as irrelevant, some pointed out the low number of reported cases of prostitution: 1,692 cases in the province for all of fiscal 2010.

It goes without saying that the actual number of people providing sex services in Phuket is several orders of magnitude higher. Indeed, 1,692 acts of prostitution would probably constitute a pretty slow night on Soi Bangla alone.

The ability to misrepresent or otherwise "spin" statistical data for various purposes is well known.

It is a particularly big problem in the Thai media, not only because of its sensationalist tendencies but also because many people in the industry lack basic numerical literacy. This is a reflection of our society at large. It is even common for our leaders to make nonsensical statements like "I am 1,000% sure".

At the Gazette we feel it is important to report government statistics data as much as possible in the same way they are presented by the government agencies that produce them, letting readers decide for themselves what they mean, if anything.

Statistical analysis can be a very powerful tool, but only when properly applied. To be meaningful, the figures need to be taken at

face value, the context they were collected in well understood.

Some readers have been inclined to assume that a "25.2% rise in the number of prostitution cases reported" indicates a surge in popularity for mankind's oldest profession. Not necessarily; it is probably a better indicator of the number of brothels that failed to pay tea money.

It is also important to remember that government statistics in Thailand are, in large part, collected for internal purposes – not as grist for the media mill. This is why arrest rates figure so prominently in crime statistics, for example.

As for the increases in reports of violent crime, here too background factors need to be taken into account. For example, the increase in cases of premeditated murder, from 38 to 45 over the past two fiscal years, represents a percentage increase of about 18.4%. This has to be considered in light of the island's swelling population.

Finally, some readers have charged the Gazette as irresponsible for publishing crime statistics that could be damage the tourism industry. To this we reply that our mandate is to keep our readers informed of issues that affect them, not to join in creating false illusions for an industry that already has more than its fair share of cheerleaders.

wanting to adopt are not related at all, it is against the Hague Convention on the Protection of Children and Cooperation in Respect of Intercountry Adoption, which states: "Each State should take, as a matter of priority, appropriate measures to enable the child to remain in the care of his or her family of origin."

Subsequently, it is also against the Thai laws promulgated under the Child Adoption Act B.E. 2522 (1979) and the Child Protection Act B.E. 2546 (2003).

Hence, I don't recommend it as it is against the law and it will look like a child-trafficking case.

It is okay to adopt this boy if he is an orphan or related to the foreigner by blood.

However, a foreigner who marries a Thai already with child can adopt that child as well as children of his spouse's relatives.

If the mother cannot look after her child, she can contact the Department of Social Development and Welfare in Phuket for help.

We can support her in taking care her child within her family.

We can also provide money to

support them.

If the mother is genuinely incapable of looking after her child,

capable of looking after her child, we can do so for her temporarily. Any foreigners interested in adopting orphans can contact us and

Illegal tour guides Drunk driving hurting Thailand

IN THE tourism industry today there are companies run by foreigners - especially Russians who use Thais as their "nominee tour guides", or what we call "sitting guides".

These companies hire Thai guides to cover for their Russian guides who are actually giving travel information, taking tourists around and selling tour packages.

The Thai guides in these companies can't even speak Russian. All they do is sit in the office. That's why we call them "sitting guides".

According to Thai law, foreigners cannot be tour guides in Thailand.

The occupation is restricted to Thai nationals only.

To become a guide, one must graduate from an educational institution – good or bad – and earn a tourist guide license.

The term "sitting guide" means someone who has their license but who is hired not to take tourists around, but only to legitimize tour companies because they have a tour guide license.

Basically, the sitting guides are being used by illegal tour operators as an excuse.

If this continues, the industry will be damaged.

The sitting guides themselves

cannot improve and their talents and skills will be wasted. We feel sorry for them.

We want to plead with them to try to develop their language skills.

We want to ask them to work by themselves and not be used as a tool for foreigners.

This illegal practice started with Korean tour operators and now it seems to have been imitated – to great extent – by their Russian counterparts.

The overseas holidaymakers under the care of these illegal tour operators are taken to restaurants, spas, even hotels that are run by foreigners. The revenue is not circulated within Phuket at all.

It's like we let them take advantage of our location and natural resources for the benefit of their businesses. Finally, they will simply take the money back to their own country.

Another concern is that tourists will look at Thailand in a different way because they are taken by these companies to see illegal snake shows, taken to buy

fake snake gallbladders - sometimes even to buy illegal drugs.

What these tourists see is not how Phuket and Thailand really are.

They have few chances of meeting Thai people or feeling a "Thai atmosphere", as they mostly do a lot of shopping within a short period of time.

I am not saying that Korean and Russian tourists are bad: The bad guys are the illegal tour operators.

My biggest worry is not that Thai guides will lose their jobs, but that the country is losing income.

The Thai government always says that there is enormous income from both countries [Korea and Russia].

However, the money actually flows out of the country.

The natural resources of Phuket are also wasted when we have to build new roads and supply more water for more people, which increases the cost of living for Phuket residents.

Only government officials can fix this issue since the power is in

you might have been talking with the wrong person.


Trash problems in Rawai are a top priority for Mayor Aroon Solos, so everyone is welcome to file complaints about trash here.

On the bouncing baht's trail

THE strength of the baht has not gone unnoticed among Phuket's expat population. Particularly those who derive some, if not all, of their income from overseas pensions or assets in their home currencies. But the reason behind the ever-rising value of the baht is not always clear.

Exchange rates, which have been leaning ever more in favor of the baht in recent years, have had a detrimental effect on the spending power of expats here in Phuket. Recently the baht has appreciated even quicker, causing concern among many retirees on the island.

Before uncovering the reasons behind the baht's escalating value, we must delve back into recent history to see that this situation is not unusual.

Before the Asian Financial Crisis in 1997, which was triggered by the baht's devaluation earlier that year, the baht had traded consistently at around 40 baht to the UK pound and 25 baht to the US dollar. This had been the case for at least 15 years. It is therefore worth remembering that recent exchange rate levels are not a new phenomenon.

The Asian Crisis and the baht's devaluation suddenly made people with overseas income extremely happy. By January 1998 the baht had fallen further, to 56 against the US dollar.

Traveling abroad with the baht was less enjoyable. I remember one somber day in Leicester Square when my poor baht was slapped with a rate of 92 to the UK pound. The tube back to my hotel was just about affordable.

Currently, with the baht appreciating back to 47 against the UK pound and below 30 against the US dollar, many Phuket expat residents with overseas income are suffering considerably.

The primary difference between now and the pre-Asian Crisis is that the cost of living in Thailand has gone up since the mid 1990s, whilst income levels have not kept pace.

Local exporters, business leaders and trade associations are becoming concerned about the strong baht and its negative impact on their orders, revenues and bottom lines.

However, the baht's relative strength is only noticeable against major western currencies.

In comparison with most other Asian currencies, the baht has marginally appreciated but its relative strength has been modest.

This strength has mainly occurred in the past few months since the protests in Bangkok ended.

The strength of the baht against most western currencies (with the exception of the Australian dollar) is down to a number of factors. Principally, it involves the relative soundness of the Thai economy, its lack of excessive debt from a government, corporate and personal perspective and the expectations of continued strong GDP growth.

These sound fundamentals have also attracted overseas capital into Thailand, which has given an extra boost to the currency.

Thailand's stock market has been one of the best performers globally this year.

Some of this is due to foreign investors buying Thai shares that offer greater growth prospects and higher dividend payouts. Add all these factors together and the question should really be: Why isn't the baht even stronger?

A short term bounce in western currencies is certainly a possibility. However, it seems clear that over the mid to long term the strength of the baht (and other Asian currencies) is set to continue. One of the potential solutions to successfully navigate the shifting sands of the currency market is to hedge overseas investments into Asian currencies.

This is not possible with fixed pension payments but is certainly an option with overseas investments. Portfolios can be hedged into the Thai baht or Singapore dollar as well as the major western currencies.

As with most things hedging your bets is a sensible strategy to adopt, and for the time being the safest bets may well be in Asia.

"Medical tourism is an important product that hospitals in Phuket have come to rely upon," she said.


"We have world-class medical facilities that rival the best in the region, complemented by highly skilled doctors and medical personnel," she added.

Real estate run-down

THE soaring baht has affected the country in many ways, but it is unlikely to hurt the country's real estate markets in the short run, according to real estate firm Jones Lang LaSalle.

A large portion of Phuket's property market relies on foreign buyers, who have been deterred as prices quoted in foreign currencies have risen significantly with the appreciated baht (see page 10).

However, Managing Director of Jones Lang LaSalle Thailand Suphin Mechuchep pointed out that even before the baht's rapid appreciation, foreign demand for real estate was declining due to political uncertainties and the economic climate in the West.

The rising baht only adds to an array of problems that have already done their part in speeding the exodus of western buyers from Phuket's property market.

Focus has now shifted towards regional buyers who may not be affected by the rising baht as much, since most regional currencies have also been appreciating.

Facebook: the movie

It was bound to happen. A film about the rise of the youngest and 'most popular' billionaire in the world.

A MOVIE about Facebook will no doubt appeal to the same audience who obsessively "log in, like and poke" each other all day.

But The Social Network isn't about the end user, it's about the people who created Facebook.

The movie follows a group of bright, young students who supposedly understand their generation: an era when socalizing took to the Internet, and having an online persona was a must.

The Social Network is perhaps one of the most poignant of commentaries to hit the big screen in years due to its reach into today's social conscious.

The hype surrounding the

film's US and European premiers, credits it with accomplishing what Rebel Without a Cause did in the 50s, Easy Rider in the 60s, and The Breakfast Club in the 80s.

If each generation has a prevailing frame of mind, The Social Network labels today's youth as both the innovators and captives of the Internet's addictive social stage.

There is a brilliant scene in the movie when two Harvard students who claim Facebook was their idea manage to get a private meeting

with the university's president.

They do a perfect job explaining what Facebook is and how it was "stolen". They clearly understand its potential and how the president holds the power to change the website's future.

The ever-arrogant president who thinks his time is the most valuable on the campus, does not listen to the students' gripe.

He objects that they used their father's status to arrange a private meeting, and lectures them about

the importance of respecting his authority.

If he only knew that within a few years, the website that the students were talking about would be worth about US\$30 billion.

The student accused of stealing the idea is Mark Zuckerberg (Jesse Eisenberg), the CEO of Facebook and once youngest billionaire in history.

As membership of the site nears the one million mark in the movie, Zuckerberg gets business cards that read, "I'm CEO, b**ch"!

Zuckerberg is the kind of college student who becomes a bit of a recluse because he's almost too smart for his own good.

His social skills are shortsighted because of his sharp logic and blunt honesty that come with his intelligence.

He's so confused by emotion that he has to ask, "Is this real?" when his girlfriend dumps him in the opening scene.

As a fallout to being dumped, he does what most college students would: he gets drunk, real drunk.

Only he does it from his Harvard dorm and, with the help of his roommate, spends the night creating a website that is the prelude to Facebook. It's a hit throughout Harvard's campus. The trial run grabs the attention of other students – all of who knew a

website like Facebook was just waiting to explode on the scene and the rest is history.

The movie is set in a deposition room where a line of Zuckerberg's former friends and classmates are suing him for screwing them over. It tells the story in flashbacks.

There's backstabbing, manipulation, sex, drugs, and everything else you would associate with a group of twenty-somethings becoming millionaires overnight.

The real-life Zuckerberg has tried to keep a low profile prior to the release of The Social Network.

Post-release, he no longer has that luxury. He has lashed out at the film's lack of authenticity and that his beloved Facebook was created to get back at a girl who dumped him.

The film doesn't necessarily paint him in a positive light, but consider the following: The day of the film's US premier, Zuckerberg pledged (on Oprah, of all places) a US\$100 million donation to a New Jersey school system in need of improvement.

Who could bash a guy who just donated that kind of money to a needy school system?

That sort of tactic might be why he's still the "CEO...b**ch!", or why he has millions of friends - online of course.

John Willemse

JOHN Willemse is the Chief Production Engineer at Phuket FantaSea. He arrived in Phuket in 1996 as the owner's representative for the multimedia theater, and stayed on to become the engineer responsible for the technical aspects of the production.

"My job is to keep the show running to the highest standards. We opened in 1999 and since then many of the companies who supplied mechanical and technical support have gone out of business. I have to find important components and create systems to maintain the production."

It's not easy to maintain a stateof-the-art theater that is one of the largest of its kind in Asia. The main stage lift was manufactured in Orlando, Florida and was the heaviest lift in the world when FantaSea opened.

"The lift was designed to hoist 22 elephants up to the stage level during the show. But no one asked the elephants how they felt about that. It was only after the lift was installed that we learned they didn't wish to use it."

John has had an almost unbelievable career working with technical and mechanical systems. As a youth, he was fascinated with chemistry and created a number of large explosions in his parents' backyard in Brisbane, Australia.

At age 15, he joined the Royal Australian Navy where he worked in weapons and communications. He spent the next few years learning electronics and engineering systems. In his spare time he bought broken TV sets in Melbourne, fixed them, and sold them at "much profit" on the Gold Coast.

After his release from the Navy, he got a job with Core Laboratories as a "mud logger", identifying soil and rock samples from the company's drilling sites. He soon recognized the power supplies used in the drilling apparatus were expensive and inadequate, so he created a cheaper, more efficient alternative. He was sent to train in the US and brought back to Australia the first computer system that could identify potential oil deposits. It was put into service around the Northwest Shelf off the north coast.

John then spent 10 years working as a rig electrician for Atwood Oceanics around Southeast Asia and Venezuela. In his spare time, he studied financial markets and got a broker's license in Singapore.

"I was interested in the mechanics of financial markets. I studied with a financial guru who charged 5,000 Singapore dollars an hour for a consultation. I was soon working in some very interesting markets."


He also developed an interest in lasers and brought the technology to Singapore where he produced the island's first laser light show. He was also chosen to serve on the country's economic development board

John moved to Thailand in 1984 and began producing laser shows for product launches. He worked with Grammy Entertainment and AV Systems designing rock concerts and night club interiors.

He was the Southeast Asia consultant for Laser Media from the US and served as technical expert for the Korea Liberation Day anniversary celebrations on the Han River and the Hong Kong Handover/ Welcome China celebrations.

In 1995, John was contracted to design and put the creative technical team together for Dino Park, the multimedia theme park at Kata Beach. He has worked on Phuket ever since.

"I'm working in my spare time manufacturing LED lighting in factories in China as I'm excited about all the applications for this low power, green energy product."



WORK on Phuket Airpark's environmentally conscious residential duplex development, Baan Rim Naam, has begun.

Earthmoving machinery doing the initial heavy lifting on the 100 rai property is underway. Plans for the island's only private airstrip include a series of hangar houses that will run alongside the runway allowing pilots to taxi straight into their homes

Other facilities that form part of the lifestyle development are horse stables along with a riding school as well as an archery club.


Future expansion will include a second and third project with condominiums and canal houses.



Baan Sukhothai falls for night entertainment

AFTER 27 years in Patong, the Baan Sukhothai Resort & Spa on Soi Bangla has been leveled to make way for a new night entertainment plaza.

Resident Manager Sornattha "Song" Padungpant told the Gazette that the resort fell victim to a lethal combination of the global economic crisis and Patong's oversupply of holiday accommodation.

"The management made the decision to close Baan Sukhothai because they had suffered losses for many years. Less customers, more hotel rooms in Patong, more competition – those factors beat them into giving up," said Ms Sornattha.

"Repeat guests only were not enough for Baan Sukhothai to survive," she added.

The resort closed on August 16. The location is now no different to any other construction site in the resort town as workers continue clearing away the historical debris.

The night entertainment complex will be run by the same owner as the resort: Phuket's Aikwanich family – a dynasty that

runs many tourism businesses on avoided a mass layoff. Phuket, including the Diamond Cliff Resort & Spa in Patong.

Ms Sornattha said that although the new entertainment complex is expected to open in November next year, the final construction plans had yet to be decided.

Ms Sornattha said the management did not want to leave the staff feeling discarded and has

Trumpeting bright yellow bells

NEXT up in our Top 20 Phuket plants is one of the first shrubs you're sure to encounter in tropical Asia: "yellow bells" or *tecoma stans*.

Known in Thailand as *thong urai*, the yellow trumpet tree is popular with Thais as a front yard specimen, where, given plenty of sun and well-drained soil, it will bloom almost all year.

It has the ability to set your garden ablaze with masses of golden trumpets.

Another member of the *big-nonia* (not to be confused with Begonia) family a pinkish-purple variety, also grows well in sunny climates. So well in fact, that it has been known to become so massive that it takes down structures.

This form is readily available in Phuket garden centers. While it can flower freely, it is less spectacular than the yellow version.

More of a climber, it also requires full sun and well-drained soil. Put it in a shady spot and it will sulk.

Yet another member of the genus is the orange trumpet or flame vine. In the right conditions, this shrub will produce masses and masses of orange tubular flowers.

Somewhat reminiscent of the *hamelia* or firebush, it is a much more prolific bloomer.

Pyrostegia venusta, to give it its tongue-twisting, botanical name, is a genuine vine – that is to say it has tendrils which attach themselves to supports, and help the plant climb.

But it is relatively uncommon in southern Thailand and prefers the cooler climate and higher altitudes in the north.

It would be interesting to hear from readers who have successfully cultivated it here.

So let's get back to the yellow trumpet vine – the real standout in the *bignonia* family and a Top 20 choice. Part of its charm lies in its ease of cultivation, since it will tolerate dry conditions and relatively poor soil. It is also lime tolerant, not an unimportant consideration in most new plots.

Propagation is straightforward: it can be struck from semi-hard cuttings and even grown from the plentiful seeds.

A rapid grower, *tecoma stans* will reach a height of three meters in a couple of years.

If you have a small garden and do not want it dwarfing other shrubs, you can prune the top to restrict its height.

But it will not overwhelm its neighbors, since it has a very open structure. Clipping its wings may well thicken the foliage.

That it is cultivated widely as an ornamental pays tribute to its spectacular, trumpet shaped blooms which cluster at branch ends and forks.

They may be several centimeters across, and can appear so prolifically that the slender branches will arch under their weight. Look closely and you will find that the interior of each golden flower is scored with fine red lines.

After blooming, the shrub produces clusters of runner bean-like pods which turn from green to dark brown as they ripen.

The foliage is not typical of most tropical plants, for the sharp-toothed, lance-shaped leaves are not shiny or leathery, but delicate in texture and a pleasant shade of light green.

One of the shrub's many other names is yellow elder, in recognition of the fact that the leaves bear some resemblance to the elderberry of temperate climates.

Since yellow elder is deciduous, it is best planted among other shrubs and ornamental trees, where its periods of relative leaflessness will go unremarked.

Nowadays, and as a tribute to its wide appeal, cultivars are appearing on the market, some of which flower early.

Gold star esperanza is one such

hybrid and as is chrysanthemum, with even larger flower clusters.

The verdict on yellow bells is good, but there is some stiff competition from other tall yellow-flowering shrubs such as *cassia* surattensis or cassia alata.

But *tecoma stans* scores even higher than its rivals for visual appeal, for ease of cultivation and freedom from disease.

It has the additional merit of not being poisonous. The sole reservation is that it can sprawl, will sometimes lose some of its leaves, and will need clipping from time to time.

A small price to pay for such a gloriously floriferous plant.

Tip of the week

Choosing trees

YOU can use trees and shrubs in the garden in a number of ways.

One way is to plant ornamental specimens within the lawn area, where they can develop fully, and display their good looks.

In this case, you will want to select trees based on their attractiveness.

The pleasing form of most palms, or the pyramidal shape of conifers such as the Norfolk island pine decorate the garden quite nicely.

The varied foliage of the coral tree or *erythrina variegata* and the floral displays of the

flame tree, *delonix regia*, or the *jacaranda* are reason alone for them to feature in your garden.

In the monsoon season, yellow and orange *caesalpinias* can be seen blooming everywhere.

If you only have a small area of grass, select compact ornamentals.

Ideally go for shrubs with more than one season of interest, like a period of blossom, followed by changing leaf color, or attractive berries.

Suitable candidates for this include the Chinese rice flower aglaia odorata, magnolia coco, or a specimin of the solanum

PHUKET tennis player Helen De Cesare looks set for stardom after winning a place on the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) tour – and she is only 15 years old.

De Cesare is confident she can advance to the highest echelons of the sport and has her sights set on breaking into the world's top 10.

"One day, I want to win all the grand slam tournaments," she said.

Despite losing her professional debut to German world number 53, Julia Schruff, in Foggia, Italy earlier this year, she is determined to bounce back.

The experienced 28-year-old Schruff took a convincing 6-0, 6-2 win against the youngster, but De Cesare believes she is a better player as a result.

"I'm getting closer and closer to my dreams every day. Maybe I will never reach them, but I won't stop working towards them," she said.

Phuket-born De Cesare left Thailand aged 12 bound for the US where she trained before spells in France and Spain.

Currently based in her father's native Italy, De Cesare has a

rigorous training regime each day.

Last year, the talented youngster was coached by the former ATP player and Davis Cup champion Mose Navarra. Now she is under the guidance of the national coach of Federation of Italian Tennis, Luigi Fiordelisi. She is also followed by a pro team of physiotherapists, sport biomechanics and a dedicated fitness coaches.

Before embarking on her travels, the young De Cesare attended Kajonkietsuksa and the British International School Phuket.

Today, she studies through a US-based school's online program, where she is enrolled in grade 11.

Although De Cesare has to balance her education around her training schedule, her travels have allowed her to become fluent in four languages: English, Thai, Italian and Spanish.

De Cesare is confident she will return to Phuket soon.

"Next year I will be in Thailand to visit my family between tournaments in Asia and perhaps I will play when I'm there," she said.

There will be regular updates on De Cesera's progress in upcoming issues of the *Gazette*.

FC Phuket's promotion dream alive

FC PHUKET will look to capitalize on two away draws going into tonight's crunch home match in the league playoffs, and their bid for promotion to Division One.

Standing in their way of a much needed win is the current undefeated playoff table leaders Chainat.

Bangkok are the only other side to have lost a game. Chainat, who finished second to Chang Mai in Division Two (Northern Section) appear set to take one of the top two places, while Loei City look destined to spend another season in Division Two (Northeast Section).

It will probably come down to a battle between Rayong, Saumut Prakarn, Bangkok and FC Phuket for the second promotional spot.

Every meeting between these four teams so far has ended in a draw, making it very difficult to establish who will provide the biggest threat to FC Phuket.

King's Cup lures Asian fleet

THE fleet of Asian sailors taking part in the King's Cup Regatta this year is on track to set a new record.
