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Bang Tao beach huts hold out

AFTER receiving yet another notice of eviction from the local authority, the restaurants and stalls along the beach at Bang Tao are set to stay.

Manote Panchalad, president of the Cherng Talay Tambon Administration Organization (TAO), told the *Gazette* that his officers posted notices of eviction on October 13.

The notices were posted on permanent structures at the site that were deemed illegal.

The move followed the TAO receiving an official order from the Thalang District Office to inspect the area for illegalities, Mr Manote explained.

The notices gave the beachfront operators until November 14 to vacate their premises.

However, a week before the eviction deadline, his office began seeking assistance to resolve the impasse without having to enforce the eviction orders.

"If the buildings are not vacated by November 14, we do have the legal authority to remove them, but we are trying to meet with the Thalang District Office or a higher authority to find a solution," Mr Manote said.

"This problem started many years ago, not only in front of the Laguna Beach Resort, but also in front of the Sheraton Grand Laguna Phuket and at Surin Beach," he added.

Mr Manote explained that his officers tried the same maneuver two years ago.

"But we didn't have the manpower to follow up, and so the

restaurant owners expanded their businesses... again," he said.

Today he finds himself in the same situation.

"We have the authority to remove the buildings, but we do not have enough officers to actually enforce it.

"On the other hand, if we do remove the buildings, villagers who have businesses there will get together and put pressure on us,"

"Negotiation among the TAO, the Thalang District Office and the owners of those businesses is necessary in order to find the best solution for managing Bang Tao Beach." he said on Tuesday.

The business owners seem unperturbed by the latest eviction orders.

"They warn us to remove the buildings every year, sometimes it's the TAO, sometimes the District Office, sometimes it's the Marine Department Phuket Office, but they never enforce what they tell us to do," said tour vendor "Ko Waen".

"We don't think they will remove our businesses, because if they do, they will have to do the same all the way from the Sheraton to Surin Beach.

"Most of the owners here are local people. We just earn living and we have have been here a long time. I have sold tours packages here for 10 years," he added.

Locals ramp up flood relief efforts for South

THE people of Phuket have collected more than 14 million baht in donations for people in flood affected areas of the country. Meanwhile, Patong Municipality is continuing its

The figures were announced at a press conference Tuesday, presided by Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha.

The province organized six donation drives, beginning on October 18. The latest, last Saturday, saw various organizations and citizens donate about 11 million baht in goods and more than three million baht in cash, which was sent to Haad Yai, Phatthalung, Nakhon Sri Thammarat and Surat Thani.

In addition to goods and cash, members

of the Phuket Village Headman's and Tambon Chief's club also traveled to Haad Yai, where they helped cook meals for victims of the flood.

Joining them were Phuket Provincial Health Office doctors and officers who assisted in medical treatment.

Separate from the provincial donation drives, Patong Municipality conducted its

A van carrying 15 Patong Municipality officers and a six-wheeled truck hauling donations including 20,000 bottles of water, rice, canned fish, milk and clothing, left last Saturday morning for Chian Yai District in Nakhon Sri Thammarat province.

The collection was organized by Patong

Municipality in cooperation with the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM) in Patong.

Goods were donated over two days by hotels, private businesses and individual people at four collection points throughout the resort town.

Patong Deputy Mayor Chairat Sukhabaan, who was born in Nakhon Sri Thammarat, traveled with the donations.

"The area [Chian Yai] is like a bowl, with water running in from everywhere, especially from the mountains," he said.

"If there is flooding, sometimes the village will stay under water for months. Most of them are quite poor and the area does not receive media attention as it is rural."

"The expenses to transfer the donations are quite high, but we are happy to do this," Mr Chairat said. - Atchaa Khamlo

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Thai worker drowns

RELATIVES and friends watched in horror as Thai construction worker Kittisak Thongtirat was swamped by a big wave then disappeared in rough surf at Karon Beach on Monday.

Duty officer Nitikorn Rawang of Chalong Police said Mr Kittisak, 25, went swimming near the Centara Grand Beach Resort Phuket, where he was working.

"His friends and relatives warned him and tried to stop him entering the rough surf while wearing jeans, but he wouldn't listen," said Lt Nitikorn.

"People nearby and friends rushed to help him, but nobody could do anything," he added. One man trying to help was caught in a rip current and dragged out to sea. Lifeguards were forced to launch a jet-ski to safely recover him, Lt Nitikorn said.

Lifeguards, local business folk and even the Navy joined the search, but it was not until Tuesday afternoon that Mr Kittisak's body was found about 100 meters offshore, two kilometers from where he was last seen.

Mr Kittisak had worked at the hotel for three months and enjoyed swimming in the sea, Lt Nitikorn said.

The brand-new, 1.9-billion-baht, five-star Centara resort opened just last month.

Netherlands consulate opens for business

THE Kingdom of the Netherlands has expanded its consular services in Thailand by opening new consulates in Phuket and Chiang Mai.

Seven Smulders has been royally appointed by the Netherlands to serve as the Kingdom's honorary consul for Phuket.

The Netherlands Consulate in Phuket officially opened on October 22. It provides almost all services of a consulate except issuance of visas and passports.

The consulate also serves as the emergency contact point for both residents and Dutch travelers in the region.

Phuket, along with Phang Nga, Krabi and Surat Thani provinces, is covered by the consulate, located in the Dara Hotel on Chao Fa West Road, diagonally across from Central Festival Phuket shopping mall.

An estimated 180,000 Dutch tourists visit Thailand every year. About half of these are estimated to visit the South, including

Phuket, Mr Smulders said.

"Thailand is so huge, and especially after the [2004] tsunami, the Netherlands government realized that Phuket is so far away from Bangkok, we had no representation in Chiang Mai or Phuket," Mr Smulders said.

"The government decided the time was right to open a consulate here," he added.

Mr Smulders has a master's

degree in civil law from Leiden University in The Netherlands. His career highlights include twenty years as an active director of the Netherlands Council for Trade Promotion.

He has also been serving as an honorary adviser to the Thai Convention and Exhibition Bureau's exhibition department for two years.

In addition, he is still very active in the global trade fairs and exhibition industry.

Mr Smulders, whose career has taken him to all corners of the globe, speaks five languages and has an understanding of Thai.

The Netherlands Consulate is the 18th foreign consulate to open in Phuket.

In response to the growing need for Gazette readers to contact their consular representatives on Phuket, the Gazette Guide now includes contact details for all 17 active honorary consulates on the island that co-ordinate through official meetings every three months.

11,437 pills seized in mega-bust

PHUKET Police busted a two-million-baht drug deal orchestrated by a drug kingpin working behind bars in Prachinburi.

A sting operation led to the arrests Monday of Saichon "Moe" Nison, 34, of Prachinburi and Chaowalit "Nong" Chedchupat, 25, of Bangkok.

The pair were arrested at the 999 Hotel in Phuket Town with 11,437 *ya bah* (methamphetamine) pills in their possession, police said.

On October 13, a police informant gave Phuket Police information that a "big" *ya bah* dealer had contacted him from inside prison via mobile phone to set up a drug deal.

The informant said Prachinburi Provincial Prison inmate Umpon Ratniyom, an acquaintance, asked him if he would like to buy the *ya bah*, worth about 1.5 million baht, and 200 grams of *ya ice* valued at 560,000 baht.

Mr Umpon, 47, originally

planned to send the two drug mules to Phuket in October, but postponed the deal.

On Monday, Ms Saichon, one of the mules, called the informant and set up a meeting in Khok Kloi, Phang Nga.

After meeting, Ms Saichon brought the informant to buy the

drugs from Mr Chaowalit, who was waiting in Phuket Town.

While Ms Saichon was leading the informant to Mr Chaowalit, police were following closely behind.

When they were sure that Mr Chaowalit, who arrived by bus from Surat Thani and was waiting in Phuket Town, police nabbed Ms Saichon.

Police made Ms Saichon take them to Mr Chaowalit's hotel, where they spotted him standing in front of his room.

When he saw the police, he bolted into the room and jumped out a window, but to no avail. He was arrested at the scene.

The pair were presented at a press conference on Tuesday chaired by Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha and Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pekad Tantipong.

Police said that both suspects confessed to possession of the drugs with intent to distribute.

Temple thief shooting 'self-defense' - Police

A MAN gunned down by police last week was shot in self-defense, police say.

"Police were chasing him, and the robber started shooting at the officers, so they returned fire," Phuket City Police Superintendent Wanchai Ekpornpit said.

The man was shot four times in the chest.

"He died instantly at the scene," said Col Wanchai.

No identification was found on the body. Police believe he was Burmese and working illegally as a laborer.

Officers were pursuing the man after responding to a call reporting that Koh Sireh Temple had been broken into.

The temple had recently suffered a spate of burglaries, Col Wanchai explained.

Police arrived at the scene to find the man trying to rob the donation box, he said.

When the man saw the officers, he ran into the surrounding forest, Col Wanchai said.

Police also suspect the man was involved in other criminal activities and may have been part of a gang, Col Wanchai added.

Fanelli case on hold

LEGAL proceedings against confessed killer Ronald Fanelli are on hold until the American returns to Phuket, the Gazette has learned.

He is currently undergoing psychiatric examination at a facility in Surat Thani

Mr Fanelli, a former US Navy officer, was sent to Suan Saranrom Hospital for examination on September 13, reportedly at his own request.

The case against him has been deferred until an evaluation report is issued and he is returned to Phuket Provincial Prison, a source at the jail told the Gazette.

Mr Fanelli has been charged with the murder of bar hostess Wanphen Pienjai, a 37-year-old mother of two who disappeared from the Sweethearts Bar in Kata on June 18.

The subject of police manhunt almost a month long, Mr Fanelli was arrested in a rented home in Karon on July 17.

During his confession at a press conference at Phuket City Police Station on July 18, Mr Fanelli described the killing as a "terrible, terrible mistake".

The Gazette left a long list of questions with Mr Fanelli during a 10-minute meeting with him at Phuket Provincial Prison in early September.

However, he later returned the list with the questions unanswered and a brief note saying he needed to consult his lawyer first.

Meanwhile, a group of online poker players based outside of Thailand has raised about 30,000 baht for the surviving family of Ms Wanphen.

The group hopes to increase that amount to 100,000 through a charity fundraiser scheduled for January in Bangkok.

Bill Rini, who visited the family in September with the first installment of the money raised, wrote on his personal blogsite:

"Sa-ard [Wanphen's mother] brought down a letter sent to her by the Phuket Rotary Club granting Wanphen's children, Farm and Iang, scholarships amounting to 6,000 baht (about US\$193) a year each while they stayed in school.

"If either of the children wanted to attend university they indicated that they would review that with her when the time came.

"Amusingly, everyone there translated 'Rotary' to 'Lotary' and thought it had to do with the lottery. I had to explain what a rotary club was and everyone seemed to do that embarrassed chuckle when they realized how far off they had been."

City arson: six cars in a week

A WAVE of arson attacks has left six vehicles damaged or destroyed over the seven days.

The latest attack took place at 1am in a small soi off Phang Nga Road, in the heart of Phuket Town.

Phuket City Police duty officer Somchai Nuubun told the Gazette that police and Kusoldharm Foundation rescue workers were the first responders.

Equipped only with a chemical fire extinguisher, they were unable to stop the blaze as it spread and engulfed the front half of the car.

The flames were finally doused about 30 minutes later, but only





The latest vehicular victim burns. after the car was damaged beyond repair. Important documents contained in the passenger seating area were also destroyed.

Car owner Patcharin Kongpetch said she had no idea as to the motive for the attack, as she had been parking in the same spot for two years and hadn't had any disputes.

The attack was the sixth similar incident in since November 3. All six fires were started by a gasoline-doused tire being placed next to the front-left tire of the vehicle, Capt Somchai said.

Money problems and revenge were possible motives for the attacks, said police.

US consular clinics to return to Phuket

THE Consular Section of the US embassy in Bangkok has announced its staff will be in Phuket on December 17 to provide consular outreach services.

"Dates are subject to change, but we intend to stay as close to this schedule as possible," the embassy wrote in a recent release.

During the outreach session, US consular staff will provide:

- Passport renewal applications.
- Notarial services and certified copies, including income affidavits for retirees in Thailand.
- Applications for extra visa pages will be accepted, but the passports must be taken back to the US Embassy for final processing the next business day.

Exact hours, venues and costs have yet to be announced.





Lucky ladyboy doubles the fun

A LUCKY 42-year-old ladyboy is set to marry not one, but two young men in a lavish wedding ceremony in the central Thai province of Nakhon Sawan.

Somjit Songjaeng has lived with her first husband-to-be, 22-yearold Anurut "Jack" Kraisa, for six years. Not content with one lover, she met her second fiancé, 27year-old Sathit "Bank" Rawdyoo, at the end of last year.

It can't hurt that Ms Somjit is a millionaire. Born in Takhlee District in Nakhon Sawan, she moved to Switzerland 25 years ago. There she fell in love with a young Swiss man named Christian who worked in a watch factory.

The couple moved back to Thailand, but after two years they began to have problems and split. Ms Somjit moved back to Switzerland and opened a restaurant – which became very successful. She returned to Takhlee and bought property, including land where she built three houses now worth 20 million baht.

UK envoy to arrive 2012

THE UK will not have an official ambassador to Thailand and Laos until 2012, British embassy Deputy Head of Mission Daniel Pruce told the *Gazette* this week.

Mr Pruce was on a one-day visit to Phuket, his first official visit to the island, on Tuesday.

He met the Phuket governor, the provincial police chief, then visited the head of Phuket Immigration. He wrapped his visit up by speaking at a meeting of the British Business Association – Phuket

Mr Pruce explained that former British Ambassador to Thailand and Laos, Quinton Quayle, has joined drinks giant ThaiBev's UKbased operations, but is expected to return to Thailand regularly.

"Quinton's replacement has been identified and that person has been nominated to the Thai government," he explained.

The candidate cannot be named until the Thai government has accepted the nomination, he added.

However, regardless of how soon the candidate is approved, the person will not take up the post of ambassador until about March 2012, he said.

The candidate is to undergo an

intensive 18-month Thai-language course, as well as ethics and cultural training to prepare "him" for the posting.

"Our experience through Quinton and David Fall at the embassy is that it makes an enormous difference if the ambassador speaks good Thai.

"It adds a great dimension to the effectiveness of our work," he added.

Mr Fall and Mr Quayle were known for their proficiency in Thai. Days before flying out, Mr Quayle was a guest on several Thai TV talk shows.

Much of his popularity with the Thai people stemmed from his

ability to speak fluent Thai, and from his love of football. He is a West Bromwich Albion fan.

In the interim, London-born Asif Ahmad, former Deputy Director of the Foreign Office Asia Pacific Region unit, has arrived in Thailand to carry on as chargé d'affairs as "acting ambassador".

Mr Ahmad, an economics graduate from Durham University, is a former director of the UK Trade and Investment Asia Pacific unit, which is run jointly by the Department of Trade and Industry and the Foreign & Commonwealth Office (FCO).

On local matters, Mr Pruce said his meeting with Governor Tri Augkaradacha was positive.

"It was very interesting, in particular his vision of the future of Phuket, especially regarding transportation. We spoke about taxis, fares, standards of services and rail links, all of which are very important for Phuket," he said.

Accidents on Phuket rated highly in his talks with Phuket Provincial Police Commander Maj Gen Pekad Tantipong.

"There were some good ideas I can take back to the embassy," said Mr Pruce. The Know Before You Go campaign, posted on the FCO website, will likely boost its attention to road safety for travelers, he added. – *Phuket Gazette*

Keeping Loy Krathong afloat

LOY Krathong is renowned as perhaps the most beautiful of all traditional Thai festivals but it seems to be losing its luster among Phuket youths...

On the night of November 21, millions of floats adorned with flowers and alight with candles will be set adrift at sea, on canals, lakes and rivers to send off any traces of bad luck from the past

Unlike Songkran, which marks the beginning of the Thai New Year with over-enthusiastic patrons "blessing" passers-by by pummeling with them water, Loy Krathong invokes a sense of inner peace among those who take part.

Yet, teenagers in Phuket told the Gazette the festival held little attraction for them. Some did not even know when the event would be held.

For Wattigorn Wonglhaw, aged 15, the event is simply not excit-

"Loy Krathong in Phuket is so quiet. It doesn't seem to have many activities to do or shows to go see," he said.

Manit Onsuntipaup, 18, said the lack of promotional buzz may be the cause.

"It's not like the Vegetarian Festival last month, which was more lively. I was told about it every day through TV and radio, but news about Loy Krathong is dead quiet.

"I still haven't heard or seen any advertisements on TV about where or how the event will be organized," he added.

Jantima Permpoonsaptavee, 15, agrees. "It's different from the Vegetarian Festival. I know when that festival is coming. I see the yellow flags with Chinese writing. But for Loy Krathong, it's not clear when it will be on.

At age 14, Suttikit Pikulpol likes the event, but he has to rely on someone to tell him when it will be on. "I enjoy the event, but to be honest I don't know when Loy Krathong is each year. I usually find out two or three days before the event when someone tells me,"

Likewise, 17-year-old Mawika Lodjeang said, "If you asked me when it is, I couldn't tell you, because the day of the event changes every year."

While many youngsters seem to be losing touch with the festival, others are happily keeping the tradition alive by enjoying the time with their families.

"I go to the festival with my parents every year at Suan Luang. It's just another cultural event, but I can spend time with my beloved family," said 14-year-old Jarupong Theeraprayoon.

Wanon Vunlime, 18, also enjoys his family time. "Mom and dad took me to Patong Beach last year. I think it is the best place to enjoy the event. It was fun," he added.

For many Westerners, one of

the marvels of Loy Krathong is that in true Thai spirit it not only centers on the family, but also extends to the community as a whole.

"People in my neighborhood usually get together a few days before the event. We help each other to make the krathong. It's like our community activity," said Naphat Satapoomin, 14.

"Once we have made the krathong, we float them into the sea at Cape Panwa. We also sit down and eat together near the pier.

Even young Naphat worries the festival might disappear, with more and more people thinking the event is not worth taking part in.

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FHM Model committed suicide: Police

POLICE have announced an FHM model found shot dead in her luxury condominium in Bangkok last month committed suicide.

Deputy national police chief Panupong Singhara Na Ayutthaya reportedly said Sasithorn "Pik" Onmiwol, 28, shot herself after taking an overdose of sleeping pills.

The verdict represents a turnaround for the police, who previously said they believed Ms Sasithorn was murdered.

The model was found lying on her bed with a bullet wound to her head on October 11. Her boyfriend was prime suspect in the killing.

Gen Panupong said on November 8 police had thoroughly examined the crime scene and found no evidence that anyone else had been in the room.

Lt Gen Jaramporn Suramanee said investigations had shown the door to the condo was locked from the inside.

DNA found on the murder weapon, a .32 caliber Smith & Wesson revolver, belonged to Ms Sasithorn. Her fingerprints were also found on the gun.

Police used 3D imaging to simulate the moments leading up to Ms Sasithorn's death, said Lt Gen Jaramporn.

Before shooting herself Ms Sasithorn had swallowed more than 10 sleeping pills, which was enough to kill her, he said.

The Nation reported that police believe the motive for the suicide was stress from romantic and financial problems, and the fact that Ms Sasithorn was an "introvert".

Police have informed Ms Sasithorn's friends and family of their findings and they had not con-

Refugees flee war zone

THOUSANDS of refugees poured into Thailand to escape fighting in Burma which erupted following the country's first elections in two decades on November 7.

On the day the country went to the polls, which critics dismissed as a sham designed to prolong military rule, ethnic Karen rebels took over key government buildings in Myawaddy on the Thai-Burma border.

Thai authorities began sending refugees back to Myawaddy November 9 after a state of quiet returned to the town, The Nation reported.

The audacious move by a rogue brigade of the Democratic Karen Buddhist Army (DKBA) provoked the Burmese army to attack with heavy artillery on Monday. At least three people were killed and 20 injured in the fighting.

A rocket-propelled grenade landed in the Thai district of Mae Sot across the Moei River, which runs along the border, reportedly injuring several people.

The Burmese army had sought to absorb ethnic armies as a Border Guard Force. While most of the DKBA agreed to the plan, Bri-

gade 5 led by commander Na Kham Mwe refused, leading to rising tensions in Karen State.

Na Kham Mwe said he seized positions in Myawaddy to protest the elections. "I am doing this for democracy," he told reporters on the border.

The fighting caused as many as 15,000 refugees to flee into Mae Sot.

Fighting also spread further south to Payathonzu, over the border from the Three Pagodas Pass in Kanchanaburi province. DKBA troops reportedly razed government buildings, including the Ministry of Information and the Ministry of Construction.

"They have documents on all the data and conspiracies planned against us in those buildings," one DKBA commander told Burmese exile news agency the Democratic Voice of Burma (DVB).

At the time of writing the re-

sults of the Burmese elections had yet to be announced. The military junta's proxy party, the Union Solidarity and Development Party (USDP), was widely expected to win by a landslide.

The polls were dismissed by many Western leaders. US President Barack Obama said the polls

were neither free nor fair and demanded the release of Suu Kyi and other political prisoners.

Japan said it was "deeply disappointed" with the elections, while British Foreign Secretary William Hague described the result as a "foregone conclusion".

Flood toll reaches 165 as evacuations continue



THE death toll from Thailand's flooding has reached 165 as officials prepare to evacuate people from parts of the South at risk from flash floods and landslides.

The Chi River in Northeastern Thailand is also at risk of bursting its banks, threatening the provinces of Maha Sarakham, Buri Ram and Roi Et.

Heavy downpours were expected in Surat Thani, Phattalung and Nakhon Sri Thammarat over the coming days, prompting preparations to evacuate several districts. Eighteen provinces are still

flooded, the Thai News Agency reported on November 7. In Haad Yai in Songkhla, which

was hit by its worst ever floods last week, authorities are struggling to remove some 10,000 tons of garbage and debris from the streets.




in restoration costs, the town's mayor has said.


The nationwide disaster has prompted deep concern from His Majesty the King Bhumibol Adulyadej.

Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva said HM The King worried about people affected by the flooding and suggested authorities consider more flood-prevention projects along the Chao Phraya River and other waterways in the future.

Survival kits given by HM The King have been distributed to Muslim clerics and imams in Narathiwat in addition to a large amount of relief supplies already delivered to flood victims across the country.

International support means sporting success

THE Sports Authority of Phuket [under the SAT] is responsible for the organization and development of youth participation in 43 different sports.

Because it is included in the Thailand National Games and the Thailand National Youth Games, beach volleyball is one sport that we are encouraging and providing young players training for.

We now have 25 kids practicing beach volleyball with a local coach and we have both three-and five-year development plans.

The first thing is that we expect to win some medals in the Thailand National Youth Games, which Phuket will host in 2012. The kids should do well in the tournament because they will have trained on real beaches and will be familiar with the settings.

But if they are to be successful in national or international competitions, I admit that a foreign coach or someone more qualified is needed to pass along knowledge and techniques to our local coach.

After hosting the Thailand National Youth Games, Phuket will host the 4th Asian Beach Games in year 2014. We also expect success in these Games, because by that time we should have more youths playing beach volleyball.

The Swatch FIVB Beach Volleyball World Tour that just finished last Sunday was really advantageous for us. Our kids had the

chance to practice in the PTT volleyball camps and the main competition helped draw attention to the sport. I sent letters to many schools asking for students to come and cheer at the competition each day. About six schools responded.

Another sport we are developing is sailing. We asked 19 local organizations to send 30 youths each to attend sailing camps at a sailing school near Sarasin Bridge. We will support them to compete in as many sailing competitions as we can, especially the King's Cup Regatta next year – we'll train them to do their best.

Phuket has an advantage due to its location. We have beaches to

practice beach sports and perfect winds and sea for sailing, but we need more support from the local community. Although Phuket hosts many international sportiong events, locals pay little attention. Children, parents and teachers still focus on studies, not sports. So, I think schools should give the children a chance

One sport that Phuket youngsters are becoming very interested in is soccer. This is because FC Phuket is getting close to Division 1 and we can see match results and the team's movement in the press. There is also a Facebook following and many fans cheer the team on at Surakul Stadium and attend away games.

This has encouraged more boys to come to Phuket for the Vision Asia Program, organized by the Asian Football Confederation to develop grassroots and youth soccer across the continent.

There are four youth football clubs in the program: Kata, Kathu, Bor Rae and Cherng Talay. We aim to support these kids to pursue football as a career.

The highest density of animals are crammed into the cheapest environments, fed the cheapest food, and their health, mentally or physically, is not tended to. Don't

try and kid yourself that the vast majority of the meat in restaurants and shops has not been kept like that. There is a reason it is cheap.

Even on a purely selfish level, do you really want to ingest food that has been standing in its own feces all its life, been cannibalized or covered in abscesses?

Containing such a high volume of bodies, blood, disease and excretion in such a contained space – day in, day out – has caused bacteria and viruses to mutate and spread. Bird flu, Pfiesteria, H1N1 and foot and mouth have all been linked to these putrid production pits.

The previous CCTV cameras at the security boxes could only show an overall image without any zoom capability.

Dusit to unveil three new sites

DUSIT International is planning to open three more hotels in the south of Thailand to handle an expected surge in tourism.

One of the hotels will join the Dusit Thani Laguna in Phuket. It will likely be a trendy hotel, possibly a D2, which is one of Dusit's newer brands.

This will make it the second Dusit-owned hotel on the island. The other two properties are planned to become luxury hotels, one speculated to be built in Samui as the Dusit Thani Samui and another as the Dusit Devarana, to be built in Phang Nga.

Dusit International representatives reaffirmed their confidence in the growth of the Thai tourism industry and anticipated an increase in the number of inbound tourists for the coming year. This should benefit hotel industries across the country.

Mr Chanin Donavanik, CEO of Dusit International, expressed exceptional confidence in Phuket tourism. He revealed a positive outlook for hotel businesses on the island in terms of occupancy rates, saying that Phuket remains highly popular with foreign and domestic tourists.

He also pointed out that the improving political climate encourages optimism.

One of Dusit International's distinguished properties, Dusit Thani Laguna Phuket has seen a rise in bookings for the fourth quarter of this year, through to next year.

Tourism growth will also be supplemented by foreign airlines' decisions to add more direct and chartered flights to the

hold and Leasehold Property Fund (DTCPF) by year's end, which will make it the largest hotel property fund in the Thai Stock Exchange.

DTCPF will be backed by three of the company's resorts, namely the Dusit Thani Laguna Phuket, Dusit D2 Chiang Mai and the Dusit Thani Hua-Hin.

Dusit Management Co, a subsidiary of Dusit Thani Plc, will hold 99.99% of the fund and will lease the three hotels from the fund at fixed and variable rental rates to gain confidence and provide security in terms of returns to investors.

The fund's incorporation is pending approval of the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Earlier this year Dusit International announced the successful acquisition of the Dusit Thani Laguna Phuket. Previously owned by Laguna Resorts & Hotels Plc, a local subsidiary of the Singaporean Banyan Tree Group. The resort has been under Dusit's management for 23 years.

Know the buzz words affecting your investments

shapes and sizes. Over the years many Phuket expats have probably been offered investment products that are touted as "100% capital protected".

These offerings can be loosely grouped as "structured products" and are often far less secure than the name implies.

Structured products are offered to investors under many names by banks, building societies and financial advisers. They normally run for fixed terms of three months or longer and are described using words like "guaranteed", "protected" or "dynamic".

In some cases they're given complex titles such as "capital accumulator auto-call option". These reassuring titles imply a higher level of investment security. The reality is that the opposite is often the case; structured prod-

INVESTMENTS come in all ucts often carry additional higher risks, such as "counter-party risk" which can render the investment worthless.

> The counter-party is usually a bank, insurance company or financial institution which provides the "guarantee" or "protection" in return for the majority of the investors' capital being deposited within the counter-party's own fixed interest instruments.

> In extreme cases counterparty's may require over 99% of an investment deposited in such instruments, leaving less than 1% to invest. This means that, effectively, 99% of your investment is invested in, and reliant upon, the solvency of the counter-party, and only 1% is invested in the underlying asset.

> The returns on any structured product are dependent, to different extents, on the leveraged performance of both the underly-

ing asset (often an index, such as the Dow Jones Industrial Average stock index) and, far more significantly, the guarantor's deposit vehicle.

When Lehman Brothers filed for insolvency in September 2008, investments "guaranteed" by the failed bank, most notably those promoted in the UK and Singaporean markets, were rendered worthless overnight.

Only a few years earlier structured products known as "precipice bonds" had spectacularly failed due to another risk that of leverage - when the markets fell way beyond expectations. Investors were virtually wiped

Other dangers include "guaran-

tees" that aren't what they seem to be. Recent examples of this include: Guarantees issued by small subsidiaries, not carrying the full faith of the major institutions and guarantees that only cover a small part of the investment value.

Also, the use of low-cost subordinated instruments, like sub-prime or toxic notes, rather than an institution's primary debt structures, as well as the use of a remote jurisdiction whose legal structure makes enforcement of the contracts practically impossible.

The nature of many structured products means the beginning and end values are supposedly defined, but there is no investment valuation available for the period in between.

In short, not only do investors often not understand the risks or contractual nuances of what they're investing in but also, in many cases, they have no idea what it's worth at any given point between the start and the maturity of the investment.

As a result structured products have become the natural hiding place for every kind of illiquid or untraded asset whose value is impossible to establish, with any degree of certainty, in advance of its expected maturity date such as forestry products, traded or second-hand life insurance or endowment policies or litigation funding.

Does this mean that all of these products are a scam? No, not necessarily, but the risks become much higher when dealing in assets that are difficult to tie into any referenced valuation. In general the longer the term of these kinds of investment, the greater the risks.

The right structured notes on the right terms in relation to the right assets may have some validity but too many of the structured products currently available suit the product designers and distributors more than the investors.

Forewarned is forearmed most structured products should be seen as predatory financial instruments, something that marks a very clear and very present danger on your investment radar.

Phuket joins Qatar Air global network

A NEW daily direct flight connecting Doha and Phuket is set to benefit the island in a number of ways.

The first Qatar Airways flight from Doha landed in Phuket on October 12, and is part of the airline's aggressive expansion strategy.

Phuket is one of nine new destinations added by the airline in the past year, with plans for adding another 120 destinations in the next three years.

"Our growth strategy is to become a global network operator," said Qatar Airways CEO Akbar Al Baker.

"In a radius of only five hours flight time from Doha, there is a population of over three billion people, and this is what we will tap.

"Doha will serve as an excellent gateway for you, connecting Phuket to key cities around the world."

According to Mr Al Baker, the increased accessibility of Phuket to the rest of the world will help boost tourism, particularly since Doha's geographical location makes it ideal for carrying

passengers from East to West.

Popular connections for the Doha – Phuket route include Western European cities like London, Stockholm, Berlin, Moscow as well as cities in Northern and Southern America.

Mr Al Baker said that they decided to add a direct Phuket route due to the success of their Bangkok – Phuket flights. Last year, they carried 200,000 passengers into Phuket, and this year they plan to increase that to 300,000.

"Phuket is a favorite destination from the Middle East and from passengers that fly with us from Europe," Mr Al Baker said.

Thailand's Ambassador to Qatar, Mr Suvat Chirapant, went on to explain that Middle Eastern tourists have increasingly been looking to Asia as a holiday destination during their harsh summer climate.

"Previously Florida was the top choice, but after 9/11 it has been harder for them to get visas there and they don't feel as comfortable going," he said.

Medical tourism is also another sector of the industry that is set to benefit from the route, Mr Al Baker said.

He added that Thailand is the number-one destination in the world for this niche clientèle, with a 30% market share of the medical tourism industry, and he has been working with Mr Suvat to promote it.

The first ever medical tourism roadshow in the Middle East was held in Doha last month and the direct route will give Phuket a competitive edge over other medical tourism destinations in Asia, like Singapore and Korea.

"Medical services in Qatar are expensive, and there is a certain lack of expertise, so medical tourism is a selling point for Middle Eastern tourists," Mr Suvat said.

When asked whether the route will be popular with Thais wanting to holiday in Qatar, the ambassador was skeptical, citing the harsh climate and lack of natural attractions in Qatar as an obstacle.

"It is more of a business or MICE [meetings, incentives, conventions and exhibitions] destination, rather than for leisure and recreational tourism," he said.

Demand for the route has already proven high, with frequent bookings, Mr Al Baker said.

In response to comments about layover times of up to eight hours for passengers transferring from European flights Mr Al Baker said:

"We do realize this is an issue for many of the connections. But as with everything, we cannot satisfy every passenger, so for this very reason we have increased the frequency of our flights to Bangkok, so it gives you another convenient option."

He also added that the Kuala Lumpur pit stop that is currently part of the Doha – Phuket route will be eliminated as soon as more aircraft are available.

"When this happens I am sure there will be massive improvements in the connections between European capitals and Phuket," he added.

We choose to dine outside in the garden of this converted house and, even before the seating arrangements are sorted, the kids devour the complimentary bruschetta, offering me a sodden morsel of garlic bread in a heavily



prompted act of politesse. No matter – it's great to see children with an appetite for something other than processed food, although at that stage in

the evening they would have gladly chewed on table mats – visiting UK social workers please take note.

Lan Yai Ma's broad-ranging menu is predominantly focused on Thai food and naturally so, seeing that Chef Nathee, hailing from near Bangkok, has gained experience in both Marriott Courtyard and Hilton kitchens. He's a hardworking and talented man.

Chicken fried rice and basil leaf chicken or locally known as khrapouw gai (each 60 baht) go down a treat with the kids and it's not long before they've wandered off to examine other male diners' tattoos and their female companions' gold adornments. Meanwhile tom yam goong and tom yam seafood (both 95 baht) are decidedly spicy while a Lan Yai Ma mixed salad (120 baht) is washed down by the house red - a vino da tavola (95 baht); I have three glasses, of different sizes, the last big enough to contain three goldfish and an underwater coral castle. No wonder I was banished from the driver's seat when we headed back home. For mains it's superbly grilled sea bass, mashed potatoes and grilled veggies (225 baht) and this is where Chef Nathee shows his true mettle as

the fish is almost perfect and the vegetables spot on al dente.


The atmosphere at Lan Yai Ma is best described as "polite" with couples whispering sweet nothings, groups of European diners quietly discussing, no raised voices, soft background music that deserves to stay in the background and attentive service. And, as with most upper-level privately-run restaurants, it effortlessly knocks corporate attempts to create an intimate dining ambiance into a cocked hat.

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Helping the handicapped

A Dane's desire to make the island a better place for wheelchair users, for both tourists and local residents.

KIRSTEN Sonder's dream of helping disabled people in Thailand began in 2002 when she met a wheelchair-bound man at a party in Denmark.

Kirsten, a healthcare worker, listened as John Busk talked about his business traveling the world, rating holiday destinations on facilities and treatment for disabled tourists.

Confined to a wheelchair since birth, John knew all to well the challenges facing disabled travelers.

"He was so passionate about

his work and his mission to help others beyond their disability and see the world," Kirsten said.

Back then, Kirsten had been holidaying in Thailand for many years, taking time off from her busy work as a carer for the disabled in Denmark.

Taking her advice, John ventured to Thailand, but his trip was blighted by the services he encountered for disabled tourists.

His experience sparked Kirsten's idea to one day operate a much-needed service for the disabled in Phuket.

Last week, that dream became a reality when she opened her new business: Phuket Handicap Tours & Solutions Co Ltd in Chalong.

MEET AUNT KIRT

Known as "Aunt Kirt" to her Thai friends, Kirsten has moved to the island permanently to set up her business.

She strives to not only help tourists, but Phuket residents too.

Her shop sells and rents high quality disability items. She also strives to employ as many local disabled people as possible, to set an example for other businesses.

Meeting Kirsten, you are immediately struck by her deep sense of social responsibility, which stems from her upbringing. She comes from a long line of civil servants.

'My family always taught me to think about what you can give the society you live in," she said.

Kirsten's 20-year stint working with disabled and elderly people in her homeland has given her the means she needs to make her Phuket venture a reality.

People with impaired movement are her priority, and providing a service that can make daily tasks more manageable is her mission.

She can also place large, customized orders for equipment from overseas.

Not only are many of

the products unavailable elswhere in Thailand, they are also cutting edge in terms of design.

Her service involves consultancy work with resorts and businesses in Phuket to help them improve their services for the disabled.

She also wants to help local government libraries, schools and hospitals on best practices for disabled access. The latter she will not charge for.

Two modified, disabled-friendly tour buses are on order and expected to arrive in Phuket within weeks. The buses will be used to take tourists and locals on trips to surrounding provinces.

LONG ROAD

Kirsten said opening the business has been fraught with challenges.

"There has been little support from disabled organizations in Thailand," she said.

'To some degree, superstition still stands in the way of Thailand's progress for handicapped services," she said, referring to the "wheelchair ghost" attitude that still exists in Thailand today.

"This is the idea that if you touch somebody in a wheelchair, you will become disabled yourself. If you so much as sit in a wheelchair, the myth says that it can create bad karma that could handicap a relative," she

"I hope my business will go some way to reducing the stigma attached to being disabled here in Phuket," she said.

Superstition is not the only reason disabled people are marginalized in Thailand, according to

"You don't see disabled people out and about in Thailand because the infrastructure is not disabledfriendly, and the facilities aren't readily available," she says.

"Many places do sell wheelchairs, but they are made from materials that would not hold up when trying to maneuver sidewalks in Phuket."

Kirsten hopes her new business will provide an alternative option for disabled travelers, and locals on the island.

DORINDA Roseberry developed many of the therapies used in Phuket's spa industry after she was recruited by the Banyan Tree Spas in 1994 to develop their signature treatments. Before her arrival on the island, there was only beach massage and a couple of simple saunas. She introduced healing therapies such as yoga, Reiki, crystal therapy and meditation to be used to complement massages, body wraps and herbal scrubs.

"I was fortunate that the Laguna Phuket owner gave me a free hand to develop a spa program that started with massage but offered many choices for improvement."

Under the influence of a nun who became Dorinda's mentor, she became aware of the spirit world and began communicating with Catholic saints.

"I was always drawn to spiritual energy. I joined an ashram led by a Hindu woman sometimes referred to as the Holy Spirit. I began to study the energy centers, the seven chakras located at the back of the body. In England on holiday in 1984, she became involved in London's health and therapy culture. She studied crystal healing, rebirthing and how to contact spirit mediums.



Work resumes on Istana villas

DEVELOPERS at Istana Phuket have taken on the services of their new building contractors, HatYai Nanthakorn, with work resuming on November 15 after several months of downtime to implement changes on the project.

Building on the 60-rai property in Nai Thon will resume initially on Istana Phuket's showpiece, Villa 16, which developers hope to have ready by next year's second quarter. Six villas and the concierge building are expected to follow soon after.

Full completion of the project is expected in 2013.

Hong Kong based developers Prism Estates created a buzz in the real estate market when nine of the 19 "super villas" were sold off plan before a peg had even been driven into the ground.

The Istana Phuket villas were named as one of Thailand's top 10 luxury properties in the July 2009 issue of *Asia Property Report*.

With floor plans ranging from 1000 to 3200 square meters, prices, for what could arguably be called the island's most spectacular villas, start from US\$ 4.25 million for four-bedroom villas and rise accordingly to US\$ 6.45 million for five and six bedroomed villas up to US\$ 8.45 million for the extravagantly sized seven-bedroomed Villa 19.

Once complete, the villas will boast a number of features fusing home-buyers' lifestyle choices with eco-friendly living.

According to property guru Bill Barnett, "Luxury travelers are also seeking more socially responsible

As we head into what appears to be a very good high season, danger lurks around every corner, be it political factions threatening street action or unimagined global events.



Bluepoint back on investment track

BLUEPOINT Condominium developers say following renewed investor optimism in off-plan units, construction work at the southern Patong site will begin in March next year.

"All the designs are complete, the environmental and construction permits have been awarded and the project can now be relaunched," said Roland Bleszynski, Managing Director of Abode Developments Co Ltd. Originally launched in 2008, the owners decided to put the project on hold when the global financial crisis hit.

"We sold 13 out of 20 units off plan and all investors were refunded their investment," said Mr Bleszynski.

As part of a relaunch promotion, developers are offering up to 30% discount on condos bought before March next year and an additional 10% discount for the first three buyers before January 2011. Off-plan prices range from 14 to 32 million baht.

Before construction work had even begun, the project won the Royal Architectural Institute of Canada's Excellence Innovations In Architecture, which was awarded to Bluepoint Architect Paul Raff.

Mr Raff's homage to the front facade of the Louvre was a deciding factor in winning the award.

The Bluepoint "louvre" will use a composite product made primarily of waste sawdust from the timber industry.

Mr Raff said the project uses local, non-toxic materials and is energy efficient

"This significantly reduces energy consumption and the carbon footprint," he added.

"Our design aim was not only to maximize the feeling of living in this gorgeous part of the world, but to do so in an environmentally responsible way," he said.

The unique architectural approach maximizes views over the Andaman while maintaining privacy for residents.

Condominiums will be housed within three buildings, each with three levels.

Units range from one to three bedrooms, from 107 to 240 square meters with several floor plans to choose from.

Mr Bleszynski told the *Gazette* that recent environmental zoning regulations, restricting building work between 40-80 meters above sea level will not affect the Bluepoint project.

Both freehold and leasehold units are available and in addition to three sea view homes, Bluepoint has nine landscaped rooftop garden penthouses and eight plunge pool garden homes all with sea views.

"Great thought has been given to creating a small project that is respectful to the environment," said key investor Kjetil Horgen Øiseth

"Landscaping has been designed for the rooftops of the three buildings to reduce cooling costs and to help the development fit into the surrounding environment," he added.





Crown of thorns an island favorite

This is one plant you will see everywhere on Phuket, and for good reason. The *Euphorbia milii* can add vibrance to any garden.

THE Euphorbia milii is the most popular flowering shrub in Thailand and well worth a mention in our Top 20 Phuket plants. It is however, sometimes snobbishly marginalized by horticulturists, and given little space in most reference books on flowering plants.

Nevertheless the crown of thorns, or the *poi-sian* in Thai, remains the container plant you are most likely to see on the island, wherever there is human habitation.

In Phuket, that means most places. Arranged in front yards, perched on front walls, or looking down from balconies, there they will be, showing off their red, cerise, or yellow clusters of blooms.

It is accurate to identify the crown of thorns as fundamentally a pot plant, and not strictly a candidate for the garden border at all.

But much of its appeal does derive from the fact that it tolerates life in a pot better than any other tropical flowering plant, that it will bloom more-or-less all year long, and that it will put up with relatively poor soil and dry conditions. Just give it plenty of sun and water occasionally.

On the other hand, the crown of thorns will thrive in a flower bed, and will almost certainly grow larger and faster in your garden than it would if constrained by a pot.

There aren't many people who try to grow it this way. After all, they don't need to. It also does well in a rockery, and it will provide a very effective barrier if grown as a hedge on account of its armor.

The crown of thorns is well named. A succulent, it produces distinctive, long, thick stems covered with two centimeter long spines.

At the top of each stem is its crowning glory: a cluster of pink,

cerise or yellow blooms, encircled by a truss of attractive pale green leaves.

The leaves are a striking backdrop to the brilliantly hued flowers. A mature plant will yield a number of these floral stems, each at a different height.

The crown of thorns, which is native to Madagascar, belongs to the vast *euphorbia* family which has more than two thousand named species, including the popular variety known as the *poinsettia*.

Euphorbia millii also has Christian associations, since it has been speculated that Christ's crown of thorns came from this plant.

Gardening

Hybridized in recent years, it is still typically cerise, or salmon pink. But yellow, cream, and now a white form, are becoming more widespread.

Moreover, there is a variety which has tiny, luminous, scarlet flowers peeping from a dense bush of small, brilliant leaves.

While the common deciduous variety does suffer from leaf drop, this one is less prone to shed its leaves

Slow growing, it takes readily to a pot, and is much prized by Thai gardeners. It has been known to grow to a half a meter bush, or more and will bloom all year long.

In terms of propagation, *Euphorbias* do produce seeds reluctantly. But the preferred method of renewal is by cuttings or air layering.

Air layering needs patience and skill: striking cuttings does not. But it is important to realize that these cuttings will not take if put straight into a potting medium. They will just go rotten.

Instead, place them in warm water for a few minutes, then let them dry out naturally for a day or two. The cut end will form a callous. Now is the time to immerse them in soil. They will almost certainly take.

The crown of thorn is particularly strong on visual appeal, and unbeatable on ease of cultivation and adaptability. It is the most good-natured of tropical plants. Apart from the odd monarch caterpillar, it is resistant to pests and disease. The only downside is however, that it needs careful handling because of its vicious spines and toxic latex.

In our Top 20 list, it is a must for inclusion.

Tip of the week

Understanding biodiversity

THERE are about 260,000 plant species worldwide. Because the earth's climate has never been constant, they have needed to change, adapt and evolve in order to survive.

Their extraordinary diversity is closely linked to soil conditions, terrain and climate.

Thus almost no tropical plants will survive frost: in Andalucia a few years ago, one night of unseasonable freezing temperatures destroyed entire plantations of avocados.

Desert plants such as cacti will rot if given too much water; cool climate shrubs and trees may need an extended period of chilling in order to produce flowers or fruit later on.

Though plants from the rain forest require filtered shade, most of our garden plants have to cope with intense sunlight: they may reduce the amount of exposed foliage by tilting their leaves upwards, or produce reddish new growth that contains pigments to screen ultra-violet light.

Coastal plants often have waxy leaves which resist salt











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




The Ironman 70.3 Asia-Pacific

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US take FIVB gold

AMERICAN volleyball star Kerri Walsh won her 39th career FIVB world tour gold medal, part of a historic day in the Phuket Thailand Open, played on Karon beach last weekend.

Along with partner Nicole Branagh, the US side defeated surprise opponents Marta Menegatti and Valeria Rosso of Italy, 21-23, 21-14, 15-11.

Carolina and Maria Clara Salgado of Brazil won the bronze medal by defeating Sanne Keizer and Marlene Van Iersel of Holland, 21-17, 21-14.

The title gives Walsh sole possession of the lead in overall tour wins.

She had been tied at 38 with former partner Misty May-Treanor, since the end of 2008.

Walsh partnered with Branagh for the third time last week. Two of their events have produced wins, having also won in Dubai in 2008.

She missed the entire 2009 season and all but two events this year while giving birth to two boys in but today we weren't serving very the past two years.

The fourth-seeded Americans became just the fourth women's team to win a Swatch FIVB World Tour gold medal after winning five elimination matches. They had lost in the second round to Elsa Baquerizo and Liliana Fernandez Steiner of Spain, but then swept six straight opponents before the title match.

In the gold medal tiebreaker set to 15 points, the USA led just 5-4 when they went on a 6-2 run to gain control at 11-6.

Surprise finalists Menegatti and Rosso, the first Italian team to ever compete in a gold medal match, seemed to have the crowd on their side.

The 16th-seeded duo became partners during the week preceding last week's tournament in Sanva. China, due to an injury to Menegatti's regular partner, Greta Cicolari.

"We really came here to win gold; it was not enough to just be here," Rosso said. "We made it this far due to our service game,

well. I feel like we both grew up a lot here.'


The Brazilian Salgado sisters defeated the top-seeded team in Phuket and suffered just one loss in the tournament, but the semifinal defeat at the hands of the Italians prevented them from playing for the gold medal.

Instead, the eighth-seeded team finished the season with a bronze


In the five-year history of events in Phuket, the Americans have won the last four, with Walsh also winning in 2007 with May-Treanor and Jen Kessy and April Ross claiming the titles in 2008 and 2009.

In the Federbrau Beach Volleyball Hotel Challenge, Le Meridien took the gold, while the Hilton Arcadia Resort and Spa took silver and the JW Marriott took bronze.

In the school tournament British International finished in first, SOS Children's village came second and another BIS team came 3rd.
