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Beach guards 'will be back'

PHUKET lifeguards will soon be back on the beaches in greater numbers and with more new lifesaving equipment, Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) president Paiboon Upatising has confirmed to the *Gazette*.

The news follows the February 26 expiration of the contract for the Phuket Lifeguard Club (PLC) to guard the beaches, leaving no organization officially responsible for saving swimmers.

"According to government regulations, we had to give all other interested parties the opportunity to bid for the new contract, but PLC was the only tender. We will contact them to renew the contract with us soon," Mr Paiboon said on Wednesday.

The contract will be for one year, starting mid-March, and with more lifeguards and more money for buying more lifesaving equipment, he said.

Meanwhile, volunteer lifeguards are patrolling the beaches when they can, said PLC president Prathaiyuth Chuayuan.

"About 30 members and volunteers are helping to guard some beaches, such as Nai Yang, Nai Thon, Nai Harn and Surin, during the weekends, when those beaches are busy with tourists.

"Some of our volunteers still stand guard on weekdays too, but that depends on their availability. If they have free time, they will go and help," he said.

Although surf at this time of year is usually safe to swim, Mr Prathaiyuth urged beachgoers to be vigilant

"The volunteers may not be on duty all day, so swimmers themselves should check whether it is safe to swim. They can also ask beach vendors and hotel operators for advice," he said.

Last year, PLC's 83 lifeguards patrolled 13 beaches, where they conducted or assisted in about 1,000 rescues, said Mr Paiboon.

Yet, Mr Prathaiyuth is looking to improve on that. He called for ropes and floating devices be deployed to identify safe swimming areas. "These can prevent swimmers and jet-skis from being in the same areas, making it easier for us to protect tourists," he said.

He also called for more effort by the government and local hoteliers in warning Russian tourists of the surf, as they were the one segment lifeguards had particular trouble communicating with.

'Raging bull' jumbo retired to camp

THE male elephant that went berserk and killed a Phuket tourist at Khao Sok National Park last week has been released into a wild-life sanctuary and will no longer be used in the tourism industry, the *Gazette* has learned.

One of the survivors, Helen Gothe of Australia, said she was told by the general manager of Siam Safari that the animal had been sent to a sanctuary after it attacked the elephant she was riding.

The pachyderm later stomped to death a Swiss woman in her 60s who had the misfortune of being put on its back.

The most badly injured of the survivors was 45-year-old Christine Colomb, who described the deceased woman as "her closest friend".

Mrs Gothe and her husband Sean, who sustained only minor injuries, returned home

to Australia on Tuesday.

Mrs Gothe, who suffered a broken rib and other injuries, told the *Gazette* on Wednesday that she visited Mrs Colomb at the hospital on Sunday.

The Swiss woman had been released



from the ICU at Bangkok Hospital Phuket, where she was treated for injuries including 12 broken ribs and a punctured lung.

The injuries were sustained when numerous branches struck her torso as the elephant tore through the jungle at full speed.

Mrs Colomb was due to be released on

Monday or Tuesday, but is expected to spend a few weeks at her resort before she will be able to fly home, she said.

"We'd like to thank Siam Safari for all their help in smoothing things out," Mrs Gothe said.

"The general manager in particular was really great. All of the staff at the hospital were fantastic and all the people at our resort, the Baan Lamai in Patong, were great as well," she said.

"The people at Siam Safari told us the elephant was moved to a sanctuary, and all the other elephants were checked by vets and all healthy, apart from our elephant that sustained some cuts, but she was doing really well...

"She's eating and functioning normally, so that was fantastic to hear."

Aldhouse extradition 'may take years'

THE City of Westminster Magistrates' Court in London has told the *Gazette* that the extradition hearing of Brit Lee Aldhouse "can take months or years".

Aldhouse remains wanted in Thailand for the stabbing murder of American Dashawn Longfellow in Rawai in August last year.

However, court official Russell Sykes said the former kickboxer remains remanded in custody to Wandsworth Prison until March 28, when he is to once again appear in the City of Westminster Magistrates' Court. The hearing at 10am is marked "for review", Mr Sykes said.

Aldhouse previously appeared in the same court on February 1 and March 1.

"Extraditions can take months or years, [it] depends on the legal argument," Mr Sykes said.

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Splashdown: Artificial reef sunk at Bang Tao

A TOTAL of 1,630 concrete cubic frames were sunk in Bang Tao and Kamala Bays this week as the ongoing artificial reef project continued.

The current installment, costing 7.9 million baht, was funded by the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) and the frames deployed by the Phuket Marine and Coastal Resources Conservation Office (MCRC).

"There are 20 sites in Bang Tao and Kamala Bays, all about three kilometers offshore," said MCRC Director Pitul Panchaiyaphum.

"The sites are not more than 20 meters underwater to ensure divers have good visibility," he explained.

The artificial reefs are expected to attract fish and other sea creatures within about one month. Coral formation should begin to form after about three years, he

In addition to becoming attractions for divers, the reefs will be a boon for local fishermen.

Artificial reefs established years ago are now havens for growing

numbers of fish, providing local fisherman in some areas with record catches, Mr Pitul said.

The concrete frames are also expected to deter illegal fishermen from entering the areas.

Measuring 1.5 meters along each side and weighing about one ton apiece, it is hoped the cubes snag large nets used by illegal trawlers.

The frames are being placed in clusters of 80 to 100 cubes, with each cluster 500 meters to a kilometer apart. "If they were placed separately, they would not be very effective in stopping vessels from illegally fishing in the area," said Director Pitul.

"We chose Bang Tao and Kamala bays because these areas are critical. There has been much illegal fishing in these waters," he

The next bays to benefit from the ongoing project will be Kata, Karon and Nai Harn, said Direc-

Phuket is 'safe': Poll

PHUKET is a safe place to visit or themselves as "tourists" or "visilive, say a majority of respondents in a recent Gazette poll.

The poll asked: "All things considered, do you think Phuket is a safe place to visit and live?"

Overall, just under 63% answered that Phuket is "very safe" or "fairly safe", compared to about 37% who responded that it was "not very safe" or "very un-

The most common reply was "fairly safe", which was chosen by 46.3% overall.

Only 10.7% of the respondents overall thought Phuket was "very

In a breakdown by demographic, those who identified tors" were the most likely to view Phuket as a safe place to live or

Seventy per cent of tourists answered that Phuket was "very safe" or "fairly safe" compared to just 30% who thought is was "not very safe" or "very unsafe".

A clear majority of local foreign residents (60%) and Thais (58%) also answered that Phuket is "fairly safe" or "very safe".

Thais were most likely to think Phuket was "very unsafe" (14%), followed by local foreign residents (12%) and tourists (7%).

A total of 835 readers voted in the two-week poll, which ran from February 10 to February 24.

Tourist dies in jet-ski accident RESCUE workers last weekend recovered the body of a young man who died in an apparent jet-ski

accident off Phuket. Lt Col Jessada Saengsuree identified the victim as 20-yearold Pakpien Nunnoi, a native of Si

Sa Ket Province. Mr Pakpien was on an extended family holiday, staying with his elder sister on Koh Rang, off the

east coast of Phuket. Sien Pakpien, the victim's father, said his son borrowed his sister's jet-ski and quickly developed a great enthusiasm for riding it offshore and around the small

His family became worried when he failed to return after several hours last Sunday.

Setting out to look for him around 4pm, they found the dam-

aged jet-ski about 100 meters offshore – but there was no sign of Mr Pakpien.

A two-day search that included divers failed to find the body. It

was finally spotted by a local fisherman on Tuesday near a rocky bluff locally known as Hode Hin.

Kusoldharm Foundation workers recovered the body and returned it to the main island at Laem Hin Pier, from where it was transferred to Vachira Phuket Hos-

An examination of the body revealed Mr Pakpien suffered a severe head injury.

Police assume that he suffered an accident that caused his head to hit the jet-ski, which knocked him unconscious.

He then fell into the water and likely drowned, said police.

The family have accepted his death as an accident and will not pursue any criminal charges in relation to his death, police said.

Woman, 58, found lying unconscious, half-naked by roadside

A 58-year-old woman was found lying unconscious by a Phuket roadside last week. She was naked from the waist down with blood pouring from her head.

The woman, whose name was withheld, may have been raped, Thalang Police Lt Col Weerayut Sittirattanakul said.

At about 5am last Thursday, Thalang Police received a report of a woman lying unconscious near a parked motorbike on the side of Srisoonthorn Road, about 3km west of the Heroines' Monument.

Local residents said they had earlier heard an "accident" and came out to see what had happened, Lt Col Weerayut said.

"They saw one man lying unconscious on the side of the road. Another man, who [witnesses said] seemed to be drunk, was fighting with the woman. The witnesses then went back into their houses," he said.

"Later they found her lying unconscious and called the police." Both men were more than 30

years old, witnesses said.

The woman had a deep wound

The woman had a deep wound to her right eyebrow and bruising between her chest and stomach.

"It's not clear whether she sustained these wounds in an accident or if someone hit her with a blunt object," Lt Col Weerayut said.

Police will await a doctor's report to see if the victim had also been raped, he added.

The woman may have had an accident with another motorbike and then got into a fight or was robbed, Lt Col Weerayut said.

The woman lived in nearby Bang Jo and went to the Tha Reua Market via Srisoonthorn Road every day, Lt Col Weerayut said.

Woman, 58, found lying Fanelli on the inside

MURDER suspect Ronald Fanelli has yet to enter a plea with Phuket Provincial Court and the American says his detention at Phuket Provincial Prison is making him physically ill.

Speaking through a telephone in the visitors' center on Tuesday, Mr Fanelli said a court appearance scheduled for last Thursday had to be postponed after "a timing mix-up" resulted in his lawyer being unable to appear.

Mr Fanelli has been charged with the murder of bar hostess Wanphen Pienjai, a 37-year-old mother of two who disappeared from the Sweethearts Bar in Kata on June 18 last year.

Her decaying body was found six days later stuffed into a suitcase dumped in a remote area off Chaofa Thani Road in Wichit.

Following a one-month manhunt, Mr Fanelli was arrested and confessed to killing Ms Wanphen, but said "it was a terrible, terrible accident. I never intended to harm that person".

His lawyer was to enter his initial plea in the case on Thursday, he said.

Gaunt and appearing somewhat apprehensive, Mr Fanelli was disinclined to discuss the charges or how he would plea.

His lawyer would speak for him at his next court appearance, which is scheduled for later this month, he said.

He confirmed having spent three months in treatment at Suan Saranrom Hospital in Surat Thani, which specializes in the treatment of psychiatric conditions.

However, he denied that the treatment came at his own request, as was previously reported.

The court system and prison officials now have complete con-

trol over him and his own desires count for nothing, he said.

He described the facilities at Suan Saranrom as "spartan" but said the staff there were "outstanding".

Mr Fanelli also spent some time at Surat Thani Provincial Prison, which he said was less crowded than Phuket Prison.

Doctors have prescribed him Depakene, which is used to control mood swings and in the treatment of psychiatric conditions including bipolar disorder and depression, as well as epilepsy.

He was also prescribed Valium to help him sleep and ibuprofen

for migraine headaches, he said.

However, all of his medication has run out and he continues to suffer from "the stress of having to watch out for my own physical safety as well as that of my friends who are weaker than me".

Inmates at the prison are supposed to have access to doctors once a month, he said.

Asked about *ya bah* (methamphetamine) inside the prison, as recently reported, he said he hadn't seen any evidence of it. "But I don't seek it out either."

As a US Naval officer for 13 years, it would have been impossible for him to do his job on drugs and he had no history of recreational drug use, he said.

The overcrowding at the prison has led to a lack of cleanliness that has given him scabies and other infections he said, holding up his arms to show his sores.

"We sleep asses to elbows here," he said, adding that some inmates appeared to be suffering from active tuberculosis.

His Thai wife continues to visit him regularly despite the traveling involved. He also saw his son, now 18 months old, when he was in Surat Thani, he added.

Hospital chief calls for donations for new ward

THE director of Vachira Phuket Hospital has appealed to the public for donations in order to complete a new ward at the hospital, the largest government medical facility on the island.

Health Minister Jurin Laksanawisit will chair the foundation stone laying ceremony on March 11, yet funds are still needed to complete the new building.

"Since 2006, the hospital has received 80 million baht in donations and Bt20mn from the government – but we still need Bt42mn baht to complete the construction," Hospital Director Dr

Jessada Chungpaibulpatana told the *Gazette*.

The five-storey building will have 68 patient rooms and two basement parking levels with space for 126 cars.

All the rooms will be general inpatient recovery rooms. The ward has not been dedicated to any specialist field of medicine.


Construction is scheduled to take 1,000 days to complete.

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UK envoy puts safety on the agenda

UK AMBASSADOR to Thailand Asif Ahmad met Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha on Tuesday to discuss a slew of issues affecting British residents and tourists, with the aim of working together with local authorities to boost safety on the island.

"We have 850,000 British tourists who visit Thailand every year. I'll say up to half come to Phuket... The majority of British residents and tourists here have nothing other than a good time only a few have problems," said the ambassador.

"The biggest challenge for us is to educate and advise our own citizens: Do not do in Thailand what you would not do at home. Nobody in the UK would go on a motorcycle without a helmet... They'd be arrested in five minutes.

"It's a serious issue – we lose many people here from motorcycle injuries – and there are an alarming number of injuries. That's something we want to work on," he added.

"We want to come back to Phuket before June to run a campaign to explain to tourists about

basic safety, including to not go swimming in the monsoon season," Amb Ahmad said.

The ambassador also raised the issue of how reports of sex attacks, regardless of victims' gender or nationality, were handled by police.

"I have been discussing this today, especially crimes and sex offenses against women. If they are attacked, no matter whether they are Thai, Russian or British - the issue is the same.

"Police should be trained to deal with the situation sympathetically - and women officers, not male officers, should be handling the investigation," he said.

"I want to bring some British expertise in these area, and counseling on prosecution. That's one good example of something we can co-operate with Thailand on," he added.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pekad Tantipong, who met Amb Ahmad earlier in the day, told the Gazette, "Ambassador Asif said he will help by talking to the Commissioner-General in Bangkok about the need for female police officers in Phuket.

"Right now there are no female investigation officers in Phuket. All

of them work at [Royal Thai Police] headquarters in Bangkok.

"If they transfer a few female officers to us, that would be great," he said.

Maj Gen Pekad said his office had formally requested female officers to be posted to Phuket, but had yet to receive a reply.

"Phuket police only have male officers to investigate these cases, and female foreign victims are not comfortable talking about this in front of male officers," he said.

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Regarding threatening jet-ski operators and bogus insurance claims, Amb Ahmad said that he believed the issue was mixed.

"There are appropriate places for jet-skis. I am not sure a crowded beach is one of them. I believe some claims of damage being done to jet-skis are genuine, and that not all jet-ski operators are 'bad', but the bad ones do need to be dealt with," he said.

Gov Tri said, "We admit that problems exist and we are trying hard to solve them."

He pointed out the recent breakthrough in having most tuk-tuks in Patong agreeing to set maximum fares, with public feedback to be collected after three months.

However, Amb Ahmad suggested that all tuk-tuks in Phuket be fitted with meters, like taxis in Bangkok.

"I think [the tuk-tuk situation] is not perfect, but it's getting better... [If meters were installed]. What the meter tells you is what you pay. That's the best way to deal with this situation," he said.

Amb Ahmad also had good news for British residents on the island: He confirmed that the British embassy in Bangkok was looking to return to Phuket in June or July with "surgeries" offering outreach consular services similar to those conducted by the US embassy.

He also praised the efforts of British Honorary Consul to Phuket Martin Carpenter, who "does a lot of invaluable 'front line' work for us very well," he said.

Mr Carpenter confirmed to the press there were "between 5,000 and 6,000" British nationals living



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Guide dies during sea kayak tour

A TOUR guide with well-known tially suspected a box jellyfish may kayak tour operator John Gray's Sea Canoe drowned after apparently suffering a diabetic seizure during a tour of Koh Hong in Krabi.

Suriyan "Mee Mee" Rachapai, 25, a resident of Ao Por, apparently suffered the seizure after diving into the sea.

John Gray said Mr Suriyan was previously offered an office job after receiving treatment for dia-

However, he insisted on taking tourists on kayak tours because he loved his job so much.

Fellow crew members said he dived into the sea during a "swim break" and came up smiling.

He then dove under again and never resurfaced.

John Gray, who rushed to the scene by speedboat, said he inihave been responsible.

There was no clear explanation for the disappearance of the experienced guide, who had been working for him for about three years and was very highly regarded by both guests and colleagues, he

Conditions at the time were perfect, with little or no current.

"It was as if God simply said, 'Now is your time'," he said, breaking into tears.

Mr Suriyan's body was recovered by Kusolharm Foundation divers and returned to Ao Por Pier.

John Gray said he was satisfied with the emergency response procedures of his crew, but was very disappointed that national park staff did not assist in the rescue effort.



Land grab sparks full investigation

A HANDFUL of shelters and houses quickly built on an undeveloped plot north of Phuket Town has sparked a full investigation by the Phuket Land Office into who owns the land.

The issue came to a flashpoint on February 22, when Pasinpon Sabtamrongkan arrived at the site to find about 40 local residents and a hastily built fence - stopping him from accessing land registered as owned by his wife, Methinee Janpong.

"They told me the land belongs to them... It's my land, I can enter whenever I want, but the people said I was not allowed in and threatened to hurt me," he said.

Contention over the land, accessed by a dirt road about a kilometer south of the Bang Khu Intersection in Sapam, began two months ago.

"I came here and found people [literally] building houses and shelters on the land. I told them to leave, but they just kept on building," Mr Pasinpon explained.

"I hired a man called 'Nuad' to stay in a house on our land and cut the grass and weeds. But people started encroaching onto our land after he left about six months ago," he added.

After discovering three houses, some shelters and a brick wall had been built on his land – along with newly planted banana and coconut trees and wire fences marking off different areas – Mr Pasinpon formally requested the Land Office to investigate.

"Tanit Janpong, my father-in-

original owner in 1979," Mr Pasinpon explained.

"The whole plot used to be empty and later [Suchart] subdivided it to sell smaller plots cheaply - from 20,000 to 40,000 baht each. Most of the buyers were government officers," he added.

"My wife bought the remaining land from her father eight years ago," he said, adding that each plot was about 80 to 90 wah, covering "four to five rai" in total.

Also outraged by the land grab was Lt Col Jaran Boonsoparb of Phuket City Police.

"Dr Prasong Sangkhachai, my father-in-law, owns our plot of 87 wah. He bought it from Tanit Janpong. The Chanote was issued in 1989," he said.

"We may have to talk and negotiate with them first because they may not know, but this is a warning to let them know: If the buildings stay, I will pull them down myself," he said.

Arriving at the site that morning was Nikom Ukati and a team of fellow surveyors from the Phuket Land Office.

"When we arrived, some people 'opposed' us measuring the land. But we explained the problem to them and they let us continue our work," he said.

"I am here to measure the four plots of land [that Mr Pasinpon claims his wife owns] and to confirm the plot areas by identifying the boundary markers. In total, 25 plots are to be investigated," he explained.

"At this time, I have yet see any Chanote titles presented by people who have built houses and shel-

Tuesday, Mr Nikom told the Gazette that none of the people who occupy the recently-built houses and shelters claimed to have Chanote titles for the land they were now living on.

Observing the commotion at the site was Worrawit Uisakul.

"This is public land. Anyone can build here," he told the *Gazette*.

Asked if he lived in the area or owned any of the houses in question, Mr Worrawit said he was "just a friend of someone here" and that he was "just here to

Yet Mr Nikom denied any of the land was state land.

"None of the land here is public land. From the evidence I have so far, the land is privately owned," he said.

Despite documentary evidence already confirming the ownership of the 25 plots, his team would continue measuring each and every plot – as requested, he added.

Most likely his team will complete the investigation by the end of March, Mr Nikom said on

Adding to the mix of complaints, Jamroen Pin-amorn told the Gazette, "I own 13 rai here. I did not buy it from [former gar-

dening caretaker] Nuad, but I believe he sold land to other people."

Mr Jamroen then showed the Gazette two very basic documents that he said proved he had full ownership rights to his land.

"This document was issued by Royal Forest Department in 1979," Mr Jamroen said.

Mr Pasinpon expressed his good faith in Mr Nuad, but he also had some doubt.

"I do not believe he sold my land, but we need to find him and ask him whether he did or not.

"But I think it would be quite difficult to find him now," he





HIV up among ladyboys Man dies in police

INCREASING sexual activity among the youngest members of Phuket's transgender community is leading to a worrying rise in HIV infection rates, public health offi-

Dr Sak Tanchaikul, chief of Phuket Provincial Public Health Office (PPHO), said he was deeply concerned about HIV infection rates among "men who have sex with men", which his agency members refer to collectively as "MSM".

Already over nine per cent of people who fall into the MSM category in Phuket have contracted HIV, he said.

A provincial subcommittee tasked with stopping the spread of the disease will coordinate efforts with all related agencies and groups to ensure that infection rates do not go any higher, he said.

"MSM is one of the risk groups because they have many sex partners. The more partners they have, the greater the risk of them contracting HIV," he added.

Mrs Eam-orn Kittitornkul, chief of the PPHO's service develop-

ment division, said research con- ['ladyboys'] are having more ducted by her agency found an increase in sexual activity among transgender people.

"The MSM group is having major problems. From our studies last year, we found that kathoey sexual partners than ever before. In the past they typically reported having had one or two partners. But in 2010 we found many aged from 15 to 19 have already had four or more partners," she said.

Schools had an important role to play in providing knowledge about HIV and teaching those in high-risk groups how to protect themselves, she said.

Phuket Rajabhat University has invited famous sex education instructor Dr Pansak Sukraroek to lecture students, Dr Sak said.

"I think it is useful. The youth will have more understanding and know how to protect themselves [from HIV]," he said.

Apart from educational institutions, local authorities such as tambon administration organizations (OrBorTor) also receive budgets to fund HIV/AIDS awareness programs, said Mrs Eam-orn.

"Having a field trip or educational tour at the year end may help solve the problem somewhat.

"I think it would be better for the local authorities to help us [PPHO] install condom vending machines or disseminate knowledge about the value of condom usage to local residents," she said.

A campaign to increase public awareness about the need for condom use is being planned for Phuket, Dr Sak said.

Chalee Jampa-ngam, 53, was driving along Phra Barami Road around noon on Wednesday when he collided with a pedestrian and fell off his motorbike.


Mr Chalee received three stitches for a head wound at Patong Hospital, where staff asked him to stay overnight.

However, Mr Chalee instead reported himself to Patong Police Station, where he was charged with drunk driving resulting in injury to another person.

He was put in a holding cell, where he was discovered dead at about 8am the following morning.

Patong Police Superintendent Arayapan Pukbuakao said Mr Chalee's family have told police they do not want to pursue an investigation into his death, which they presume to be related to a pre-existing medical condition.

DSI changes story on Reuters man's death

INVESTIGATORS have reversed a finding that a Japanese cameraman who died during last year's red-shirt protests was killed by soldiers. There are claims the reversal came under pressure from the Army.

In an earlier report, the Department of Special Investigations (DSI) found that Reuters journalist Hiro Muramoto, 43, was shot by government troops during clashes with protesters on April 10.

A witness had claimed the high-velocity bullet that killed Mr Muramoto came from the direction of a group of soldiers.

But the DSI now claims Mr Muramoto was killed by an AK-47, a weapon not used by Thai troops.

"The forensic reports from a respected doctor found that an AK-47 caused the death of the Japanese cameraman.

"The Thai army does not use this kind of weapon," DSI chief Tharit Pengdit told

Former police forensic science chief Amporn Jarujinda, who is advising the DSI, claims photographs of Mr Muramoto's body showed he had sustained bullet wounds at least seven millimeters in diameter, consistent with an AK-47.

On Sunday, a local English-language newspaper reported claims that the army chief had visited Mr Tharit following the initial investigation to complain about the findings.

The BBC reported that a military officer was assigned to the DSI to "help" the investigation.

But Mr Tharit denied there had been any government interference. "There's no pressure," he told reporters. "I can confirm that we are doing our jobs as normal."

Since learning of the new findings, Reuters called the DSI for clarification.

"The apparent contradiction between the preliminary investigation and these reports makes full transparency about the process and the findings imperative," Stephen Adler, editor-in-chief of Reuters News, said in a statement.

PM admits he's a Brit

AROUND THE nation

PRIME Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva has admitted he holds dual Thai-British nationality, though he insists he still considers himself a Thai.

Mr Abhisit, who was born in Newcastle-upon-Tyne to Thai parents in 1964, made the admission during a debate in parliament last Thursday.

"I admit I have not given up British nationality because it is understood legally that ... if the nationality laws are conflicting, Thai law must be used," he said, Associated Press (AP) reported.

"My intention is clear. I was born in England but I consider myself a Thai.

"I studied in England but I intended to return to work and live in Thailand, to work for the country's interest, and didn't think of anything else."

Mr Abhisit, who is known by the nickname "Mark", gained British citizenship automatically because he was born in England.

The admission came 24 days after international lawyer Robert Amsterdam first claimed Mr Abhisit was British.

Mr Amsterdam, who is retained by exiled former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra, has petitioned the International Criminal Court (ICC) to investigate Mr Abhisit on charges of crimes against humanity related to killings during the red shirt protests in Bangkok last year.

Baby farm mothers going home

AT LEAST 14 Vietnamese women involved in an illegal surrogacy ring are to be sent home, according to the authorities.

The police will also take legal action against the Taiwanese company, Baby 101, accused of operating the service and holding some of the women against their will. The women were discovered in a raid on two houses in Bangkok last month.

Police have arrested several Taiwanese, Chinese and Burmese nationals for their part in the scheme.

Public Health Minister Jurin Laksanawisit said some of the women may have been raped.

Nine of the women said they voluntarily worked for the company, while others said they were tricked and held against their will after having their passports confiscated.

The company allegedly provided a surrogacy service for foreign couples. According to Thai law, it is illegal to act as a surrogate unless for a blood relative.

Despite the arrests, the company's website, www.baby-1001.com, continued to advertise services at the time of writing.

And we've decided to change nothing.

We're not altruistic, nor are we averse to corporate self-promotion - in moderation, and in the right places. But we do not believe that the in-boxes of our readers, advertisers or other contacts qualify as a 'right place'.

What is spam?

One definition, in Wikipedia, holds spam as "unsolicited bulk email, frequently with commercial content."

Another, at spam.abuse.net, defines a spammer as one who "floods the internet with many copies of the same message in an attempt to force the message on people who would not otherwise choose to receive it."

A third source, webopedia.com, defines spam as electronic junk mail, unsolicited, generally of an advertising nature, and sent often to a (stolen or purchased) mailing list.

Webopedia, goes on to digress into the etymology of electronic 'spam', referring to the dominant characteristics that it shares with the infamous canned lunch meat of the same name: "Nobody wants it or ever asks for it".

At the *Gazette*, we have our own, reader-preferred definition of spam: If the recipient sees it as such, it is. (We don't give much weight to the sender's view of it.)

In the case of the massive spam shot at Phuket residents last week, the 'targets', among others, included all of the roughly 200 members of a well known local charity organization whose mailing list was, by club rules, strictly private and confidential.

How the list found its way into the database of the sender, or the spamming service used by that sender, is unknown. Nor is it known at this point how many other local private membership lists were violated in the operation.

But the message to us was clear: DON'T spam thy neighbor. Whether masked as a 'Press Release', a 'Newsletter' or a daily 'News Alert', spam is ugly, crude and decidedly unfriendly.

It's also like bad breath and body odor. Your friends, customers and other 'targets' won't tell you. They'll simply tag you - in silence - as a **Blocked Sender.**

They eventually became quite aggressive towards us, even though my son was in a great deal of pain.

They would not call an ambulance or the police for us.

My local guide did so when I contacted him.

There appears to be no system

FIRST PERSON

THE first thing I will focus on is drugs. In Kapoe, the only drug problem is kratom leaves (a natural stimulant), but in Phuket there are various kinds of drugs, such as ya bah (methamphetamine), ya ice (crystal meth), and ya E (ecstasy), among others.

More types of drugs means more drug addicts and more drug addicts means more crime.

The government is quite concerned about this and has set a nationwide policy to clean up drug problems. I agree with this policy, and have set it as my top priority.

I will keep reminding my officers to keep an eye on drug trafficking, to raid entertainment venues and ask customers and staff to do urine tests (for drugs). I will also order officers to increase their inspections of areas known for drug sales.

Drugs are everywhere now, so anyone who has any news about them, please inform us as soon as possible. The situation with drugs can get better, if we get co-operation from local people.

Another important thing I need to clean up is bad police officers.

I served in Phuket for 18 years before and now I have come back. I lived here for a long time and I have come to think of Phuket as my second home.

I admit that there are some officers that threaten and extort, and I am willing to solve this problem.

DRIVERS on the roads of Phuket witness extraordinary maneuvers by selfish and careless individuals every day.

Add those 'driving attitudes' to the threat posed by deluges of rain which transform Phuket's driving surfaces into a life-sized Scalectrix track coated with Teflon, and you have the required elements to suggest emergency services and insurance companies remain on high alert.

It seems that for some, the course of action to take when behind the wheel of a car and faced with the onset of a downpour, is to accelerate.

The idea is unorthodox to say the least and at best may result in drivers arriving earlier to their destinations having not used their windscreen wipers.

The idea may also cause a 15 car rear ender, a two-hour traffic delay and increased insurance premiums.

With a reported figure of over 1,500 people having been treated in Phuket for road accident injuries in January and it being the wettest January on record, the warnings are clearly not being heeded. One suggestion is to educate drivers in wet-driving techniques.

Traffic accidents in the rain are usually due to driver error. When driving a car on a wet road the first thing a conscientious driver will do is slow down.

This simple action will also create a greater distance from the vehicle in front.

During inclement weather, extended gaps are crucial and provide a comfort zone in terms of vision and time. Increasing the gap or following distance will reduce the

effect of rear wheel spray and allow for better visibility.

Good following distance also affords time to slow down by gently braking or, preferably, by easing pressure off the accelerator. On wet roads these techniques can prevent loss of control as a result of hydroplaning.

Impatience and aborted attempts to overtake multiple vehicles may have drivers stamping on brake pedals to allow the offending driver room to recover and prevent collisions.

In the wet, this type of driving can be lethal.

Reading through most driving instruction manuals will usually lead to a section on following and braking distances.

Using a marker such as a telephone poll or a bridge, drivers can check if they are a safe distance from another vehicle. Counting seconds from when the vehicle in front passes the selected marker until the following car passes the same marker will provide the required information.

A three second rule is advised for all driving: Four to five seconds should be applied for wet roads while routes affected by oil should have drivers employ a 10 second rule.

Reduce speed, remain alert and increase your following-distance when driving in the rain and get to your destination safely.

Any business that exposes the public to health or safety risks must have a permit issued by a health authority before it can legally open for business.

The Phuket Provincial Health Office is not responsible for issuing these permits.

They are issued and renewed annually by the local municipality or authority for their area. In this case, Kathu Municipality.

Rattana Latthmapong, director of Kathu Municipality Health Division, replies:

No go-kart businesses have ever applied to us for this permit. Thank you for letting us know about this incident.

we usually just keep in touch with businesses and raise issues with them as we learn about them.

We will now inspect the two go-kart tracks to make sure they comply with public health and safety regulations.

'Phuket a diamond' for rich jet owners

MJETS is in talks with Airports of Thailand (AOT) to build a private jet terminal at Phuket International Airport (PIA).

The move comes on the back of the success of its first private jet terminal at Don Muang Airport.

MJets Executive Chairman Jaiyavat Navaraj believes the company's venture at PIA could put Phuket on the map for private aviators in the region.

Since MJets opened its first terminal at Don Muang Airport, the number of private jets landing there had increased from 25 to 40 flights per month, Mr Jaiyavat said.

The MJets private terminal at PIA is likely to include an executive lounge equipped with luxurious facilities, immigration counters and hangars for parking private jets. MJets will also provide a range of ground services for private jets.

"Currently there are around 30 to 35 private jets landing at PIA

every month. This is only an average figure. In a high season month there could be as many as 60 flights," Mr Jaiyavat said.

"Phuket is a diamond among tourist destinations in the region. It is also conveniently located near regional business centers like Singapore, Bangkok and Kuala Lumpur. It also has a complete network of 'billionaire's toys', which includes luxurious villas, hotels and yachting facilities. If we develop the right facilities here the island can become a regional hub for private aviation," Mr Jaiyavat added.

"A private jet terminal at PIA should increase the number of private jets landing at PIA by around 15 per cent in the first few years of operation alone," Mr Jaiyavat said.

Mr Jaiyavat said that MJets customers are a good mix of businessmen, executives and holidaymakers.

"People who hire private jets demand a lot of convenience and speed. They could use commercial flights, but they do not like to spend three hours at an airport, checking-in, passing immigration and baggage collection points, every time they travel," Mr Jaiyavat said.

We are talking about superrich clients who value every minute of their time," he added.

Aside from chartering private jets, MJets also takes care of ground handling services for clients with their own private jets, including acquisition of landing permits for clients' jets at PIA.

Since MJets is an authorized service agent for Cessna aircraft in Thailand, clients who own a Cessna will also be able to service their private planes right here in Phuket.

Kraisi Phewkliang, Director of Ground Services at MJets said the AOT still needs to finalize the location for the construction of the private terminal within PIA.

Construction costs will depend on the size of land the AOT leases to the company.



Paying the price for lucky license plates

THE sixth annual "Lucky License tively modest 250,000 baht. Plate Auction" held in Phuket Town last weekend raised 23,504,500 baht, Kanok Siripanichkorn, chief of the Phuket Land Transport Office (PLTO), told the Phuket Gazette.

"I am very happy with the revenue raised – it's five million baht more than last year," Mr Kanok said.

All 301 plates up for auction were sold, averaging 78,088 baht apiece – the highest average ever at the annual Phuket event, Mr Kanok added.

The event last year raised 18,745,500 baht, averaging 62,277 baht per plate.

Securing the top bid of 1.4 million baht at the auction this year was license plate Kor Nor 9999 bought by motorcycle repair shop owner Jaruk Kaewpunnaray, 30, for his boss. Phuket's "numberone" man, Governor Tri Augkaradacha, also participated in the auction, winning the bid for license number Kor Nor 1111 for a rela-

Most of the money raised from the auction will go to the Department of Land Transport's national Road Safety Foundation to help pay for road-safety campaigns, Chief Kanok explained.

"Some of the revenue will be handed over to Phuket educational institutions and to local police to help fund local road-safety campaigns, and some will go toward helping disabled people in Phuket," he added.

"Every single baht will be returned to society," chief Kanok assured.

One of the key attractions of the annual event is that it gives people the chance to make merit, he added.

As next year's event will feature license plates with the Thai characters Gor Bor, "I believe anyone with the nickname 'Gob' [pronounced 'Gop', meaning 'frog'] will be interested," Chief Kanok said.

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Moto taxis go on the meter

METERS for motorcycle taxis will hit the streets of Bangkok this month in an effort to regulate fares and reduce accidents - a scheme which will be tested in Phuket soon as well.

Visitors to the Central World shopping complex in the Pathum Wan district of Bangkok will be the first to witness the meters in operation.

Approximately 24 motorcycle taxis stationed at the taxi rank outside the mall will take part in a road test over the next few days.

Per Lind, Chief Operating Officer of World Moto says "the test is in preparation for mass production. We will also conduct a test in Phuket within the next few weeks".

Paul Giles, President of World Moto, began developing the concept with Chris Ziomkowski, now World Moto's Chief Technical Officer, in 2008.

Statistics suggest there are some 180,000 motorcycle taxis operating in Bangkok alone. Of these, only 60 per cent are registered. Fare rates, which must be negotiated, are variable. These aspects prompted Mr Giles to create

a durable device that generates a standard tariff while also monitoring driving behavior.

"The Moto Meter is sealed against environmental hazards such as road dust, rain and splashing water," Mr Giles said.

Similar to "black box" technol-

ogy in airplanes and cars, the meter will record data of interest to law enforcement and insurers.

We hope the meter will help reduce accidents. Monitoring driving does tend to influence the way people drive," Mr Ziomkowski said.

Passengers will also be com-

forted to know that the new gadget is tamper-proof. Any attempt to interfere with it will cause an immediate shut-down. This feature helps further guarantee a fair price for journeys.

skills, but compensation could come in the form of extra revenue created by advertising.

An LED screen will allow passengers to view advertising and promotions en route to their destination. This will produce revenue for both the taxi driver and World Moto.

"Once we own that space above the handlebars, there are so many things we can do with that," Mr Giles said.

An initial investment of US\$1 million by World Moto is expected to return over US\$3 billion, according to Mr Giles. These figures are based on the number of motorcycle taxis worldwide, which is in excess of 20 million, and the US\$180 price tag for the meter.

"The price is cheaper than a standard taxi meter," Mr Giles said. "Reducing acrimony and averting lost potential fares, it should pay for itself soon," he added.

It is hoped that taxi co-operatives around the country will adopt the new device, affording this hazardous, but convenient form of transport the prospect of becoming a standardized industry.

We reuse only the outer casing, which is the most eco-harmful part. All internal working parts are replaced with new components which match those of any original equipment manufacturer (OEM)," Mr Bailey stated.

"In addition to using the best inks and toners, we clean, test and guarantee every cartridge will perform as well as the original. To

this end we also offer our customers a 100 per cent money back guarantee," he said.

Based in Cherng Talay, InkXpress has an office and manufacturing facility which supplies to a range of businesses throughout Phuket and Thailand. Most companies have printing needs and a meeting with Gordon may help reduce costs and play a part in conservation.

Nations unite for marine management

GETTING eight culturally diverse countries with varying systems of government and historically contentious relationships to co-operate on environmental management is a mammoth task.

That is precisely what the Bay of Bengal Large Marine Ecosystem project (BOBLME) hopes to facilitate over the next four years with nations in the Bay of Bengal region.

BOBLME, covering about 6.2 million square kilometers of ocean, began in April of 2009 and operates under the leadership of the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), bringing together Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Maldives, Myanmar (Burma), Sri Lanka and Thailand in its efforts to improve regional

environmental management.

BOBLME is one of 64 areas worldwide designated by the United States National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) as Large Marine Ecosystems (LME).

BOBLME, armed with a US\$31 million budget, is based in Phuket and aims to "assist the eight countries that share the bay [of Bengal] in developing a collaborative

framework to work together towards a common goal: The overall health and sustainability of this vast marine resource," according to a BOBLME statement.

There are an estimated 450 million people living in the Bay of Bengal coastal region who are dependent on its resources. Key to the project is its "borderless" scope as it seeks to work with scientists and regional governments in developing coastal management practices that benefit all nations in the LME.

In addition to guidance and coordination, BOBLME also provides financial support to countries and facilitates training, research and information gathering.

A major step forward for the

project began late last year when BOBLME facilitated an agreement between Thai and Burmese officials to address management of the Mergui [Myeik in Burmese] Archipelago, which extends from the Surin Islands in Thailand, north to

the coastal town of Mergui in Burma.

The archipelago is made up of more than 800 islands including Thahtay Kyun Island in Burma, home to the Andaman Club, a popular "visa run" destination near Ranong, Thailand.

The region is coming under increasing pressure from urban development, tourism, fishing and "it is not exempt from the impacts of climate change and rising water temperatures that are contributing to coral bleaching in some areas," a BOBLME statement read.

"BOBLME is supporting the Thailand and Myanmar [Burma] governments to implement a collaborative management approach in this special area that is shared by both countries," BOBLME Regional coordinator Chris O'Brien told the *Phuket Gazette*.

"We know there is a strong sense of community in this area and it will be interesting to see how communities in the Mergui Archipelago, including the Moken or Salong [sea gypsy] people, get involved in this initiative," Mr O'Brien said.

Teams will soon begin data collection, review and analysis for the Mergui Archipelago project, involving a wide range of government bodies, universities and non-government organizations.

"The goal of the activities is to inform management and improve governance that aims at the balancing of sustainable resource use and social wellbeing," according to the statement.

Speaking of the BOBLME headquarters location in Ao Makham, Mr O'Brien told the *Gazette*, "Being located in Phuket and away from a large capital city such as Bangkok means we have

the opportunity to get a better feeling for how the project is affecting people at the community level.


"Another advantage is that the project can benefit from closer ties to the many excellent technical organizations that are

located in Phuket, such as the Andaman Sea Fisheries Research and Development Center of the Department of Fisheries, the Phuket Marine Biological Center of the Department of Marine and Coastal Resources and the Prince of Songkla University."

The most recent meeting of BOBLME National Coordinators and National Technical Advisors took place in Phuket on February 9 and 10 to draft the 2011 "work plan".

The project is currently analyzing and adding to the Trans-boundary Diagnostic Analysis (TDA), which is the culmination of seven years of work. The TDA has identified three "main areas of concern": Overexploitation of the marine living resources, degradation of coral reefs, mangroves and seagrass, and pollution.

The next phase of the project will be the Strategic Action Plan, which will see implementation of various projects based on the TDA

Lessons in the palm of your hand

APPLE has an application for almost everything these days.

Commonly viewed as a distraction in class and a way to avoid studies, many of these "i-applications" now actually help rather than impede learning.

A simple search on iTunes will return dozens of listings related to learning. From listening and speaking, to reading and writing, Apple's programmers have developed an application to suit all students learning English as a second language (ESL).

Although many applications are aimed towards learners, others can help teachers create lessons or provide multimedia activities that keep students tuned in to lessons rather than Justin Bieber's latest single.

Application prices range from free to just over 500 baht and it pays to do your homework before committing to your purchase.

Here's a review of just some of what's on offer out there.

QuickDict English-Thai Dictionary: This is a straightforward, direct translation dictionary. The user can enter a word in English and its definition comes up in Thai.

Simple translations are useful but some aren't entirely accurate. Definitions for concrete nouns are satisfactory but the finer points of English get a bit lost in translation.

"terrific", the definition was fine but one synonym used was "frightened" (*dtok jai*). Perhaps the writers got this word confused with "terrified".

Its best feature is the price tag, just 60 baht. That's cheaper than a paper dictionary and it could turn out handy for one-on-one lessons where a quick translation will do the trick. It's very basic but you get what you pay for.

Pocket English ESL Beginner I: Split into mini-lessons such as, "Self-Introduction" and "Nationalities", this application is geared towards learning basic conversation.

Priced at 150 baht, the application lets the user listen to conversations as well as dissect each word's meaning and pronunciation.

The layout and content are good but the instructions are written and presented for learners who possess advanced English skills. Considering its lessons are about the most basic introductions, including instructions that are more complex than the subject matter is a very odd approach.

This application could only be used in conjunction with a teacher

so self-study is nearly impossible with this particular application. Since the lessons are all ready to go, this application is probably best for a teacher short on materials and experience.

Phonetic Focus: From the moment you start this application you can see it's a quality product put out by Cambridge University.

Geared for those getting used to phonemic symbols and the International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA), this application benefits both teacher and learner in a myriad of ways.

It's very interactive and packed full of great activities. Users can use electronic flashcards to warm up to the IPA and then test their knowledge through fun and meaningful challenges.


The art design and crystal clear audio also leave the user wondering how Cambridge can offer such a great product for less than most pay for lunch. Priced at only 60 baht, it's an absolute steal.



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Portman swans into a winner

Director: Darren Aronofsky Starring: Natalie Portman, Mila Kunis, Vincent Cassel **Genre:** Psychological Thriller **Gazette Rating:** 4.5/5 – Must see

NATALIE Portman lost more than 10 kilograms and trained tirelessly for a year leading up to her Best Actress Oscar-winning role as a troubled ballerina in Black Swan.

The words "psychological thriller" and "ballet" don't usually go together, but this critically acclaimed movie proves that ballet is not all tutus and ribbons.

Bleeding toes, eating disorders, and intense competition are aspects of the often misconceived world of ballet that set the stage perfectly for a psychological thriller.

With expert direction from Darren Aronofsky (think Requiem for a Dream) and with the actors'

memorable performances, it's a shame the movie missed out on the Best Picture Oscar to The King's Speech.

The characterization in this film is outstanding. Nina (Portman) is an insecure, mentally fragile control-freak whose wish is to become the prima ballerina at her New York ballet institute.

She gets her wish. Her sleazy, manipulative and dominating instructor Thomas (Vincent Cassel) takes a shine to her and choses her as the lead in Swan Lake, to the envy of all her peers. The ex-prima ballerina (Winona Ryder) even becomes suicidal with jealousy.

But Nina's dream becomes her nightmare, as the role of Swan Queen proves demanding – she must play both the pure White Swan and the evil Black Swan.

She struggles to find her dark side in the hours of training, which includes intermittent molestation. mind games and abuse from Thomas, who brands her "a frigid coward".

Nina wants nothing but to perform perfectly and pushes the boundaries of her body and mind to get to know her evil side.

Self harm, delusions, aggression, drugs, and a much-hyped scene where she explores her sexuality with fellow ballerina Lily (Mila Kunis) are all aspects of this trip to the dark side.

Aronofsky's erratic and unconventional cinematography adds to the film's edgy discomfort. He also uses Nina's hallucinations to add a morbid and psychotic element.

I won't give the game away, but in one delusion her legs buckle painfully and another hints at schizophrenia when her mirror image moves independently.

Portman and Cassel execute twisted perfection in their difficult roles, a testament to their real, and all-to-rare acting prowess.

The film is full of messages relating to insecurity and fame which are relevant to a modern audience, but does not deliver them in the painfully obvious way most blockbusters do.


The soundtrack of eerie classical ballet music, which draws from Tchaikovsky's original ballet score Swan Lake, and the stifled, fragmented script add to the sense of Nina's physiological torment. The experience of watching it,

as well as the content itself, takes you uncomfortably close to the line of reality and delusion. Strange as it may seem, this

Cathy is the eldest of three sisters. She learned the importance of service in her mother's shop as a young girl. After taking a certificate in front-office management, she headed to Paris where she worked at the Hotel Cognac and then Hotel Elysses Ponthieu. She then joined and was promoted to General Manager at the Hotel Elysses Bassano in the 16th arrondisement where she stayed for five years.

In 1995, she came to visit Celine on Phuket, an event which changed her life. She decided to leave her professional career in Paris and explore a life in Thailand. She was appointed Assistant Rooms Division Manager at the Cape Panwa Hotel. Later, she moved to sell art at Patong Beach.

In 1999, she opened a French bistro, The Wall, in the jungles of Rawai with her partner. It instantly became one of Phuket's most interesting dining hideaways.

"We had a partner who had built a climbing wall in what was then a jungle. It provided a backdrop to

our restaurant. We offered French cuisine in a relaxed setting where our guests could bring their friends and young families and sit on the floor around low tables."

The Wall was an immediate success offering a unique and elegant dining option for mainly expat residents. By 2002, Cathy relocated the restaurant to the Nakathani and renamed it Naka Flavors, serving the same French cuisine but in an elegant clliffside setting. From 2004 through 2009, she was the charming proprietor of Flavors at Patong's Baan Thai Resort.

Celine is the youngest of the sisters. She enrolled in the Lycee Hotelier de Dinard where she graduated from the four year program with specific training in food and beverage. She also headed to Paris to find work and adventure.

"I really enjoyed bartending, which was not common then for a woman. I became the first woman bartender at the Rive Gauche Lutecia Palace in Paris. I also served as bartender at the Hotel Vernet. which attracted a lot of celebrities.

I recall LaToya Jackson, who had just posed in Playboy magazine wearing nothing but a snake."

Celine continued in the hospitality industry in France, then England where she was determined to learn English at Oxford. She got a job for a year at Banbury in a hotel manor school.

She spent the next few years traveling and working in Spain and finally Switzerland where she met her future husband, Claude Sauter.


"Claude accepted a job in Thailand in 1994 and I decided to join him. I was fortunate to be recruited by Khun Wallee Pachantabutr at the Phuket Cabana as Public Relations Manager."

Celine stayed at what became the Impiana Phuket Cabana until August 2004, assuming different management positions.

"I began to look around Phuket Town for an historic Sino-Portuguese building where I could open my own boutique hotel.

"After a year, working with Movida Interior Designers from Bangkok, we were able to acquire a long lease on a big, beautiful historic building on Phang Nga Rd. We transformed it into what is now the Siam Indigo restaurant."

Cathy Masson now manages the stylish Siam Indigo, while Celine is enjoying more time at home with her two small children.

I LOVE the smell of fish balls in the evening.

The whiff of Look Chin Pla was just one of many oily perfumes hanging heavy in the air while I stood outside Surakul Stadium on Saturday evening, savoring the pre-match atmosphere of FC Phuket's first home game of the new season against Rajpracha FC.

At the entrance to the stadium the vibe was one of anticipation. Fans nervously jostled for a position in line at the ticket office, the street food vendors squawked for custom, while young children decked in green clung tightly to their parent's hand for fear of getting overwhelmed by the flow of people.

The crowd swarming around the stadium before kickoff seemed to have bulged from last season.

Motorcycles filled every void available, while traffic police worked feverishly to keep cars moving along Wichit Songkram Road.

Entering Surakul – an old fashioned multi-purpose stadium built in 1959 – I'm reminded of those Eastern European-style openbowl arenas, where a running track separates fans from players, meaning the intensity in atmosphere can often be lost.

But not here. In fact, the more I visit Surakul the more I fall under its spell.

Maybe it's the time of evening Phuket games are played. On Saturday it was approaching 6pm when I took my seat on the far side of the stadium (opposite the Main Stand).

It was that glorious time, the moment before dusk when the sky is a swirling mess of pastel pinks and blues, just as the sun begins its decent beyond the hills in Kathu. And I witnessed it all from where I was sitting as the game kicked off.

Soccer isn't soccer without passion, and boy do the Phuket fans have it in abundance. As soccer tribes go, the club is still a child

(two-years-old in fact), yet the energy radiating from the stands, the animation of supporters, is compelling.

The drums beat hard, screams bellow with every refereeing decision against their team, a man runs the length of the sideline with the tallest flag in the province, as folk try in vain to get the Mexican wave going. Smiles and grimaces, claps and howls, all encapsulate 90 minutes of football here.

Taking in the surrounding between gaps in play, I was again reminded how football often transcends cultural boundaries.

Expats make up a healthy portion of the Phuket fan base, and again on Saturday they mingled with the Thai natives next to them, both supporting the one team, displaying warmth and humor towards each other. This is a club for every cross-section of Phuket society.

There were a handful moments from the evening that will stay with me. At half-time I watched a Thai women, sitting next to her son, who was about seven-yearsold, buying a delightful delicacy of dried squid on a long stick from

It was just the two of them sitting there, mother and son, the young boy head-to-toe in Phuket green and the mother smiling away enjoying her snack.

Another was the performance of the four paramedics on duty (who had a busy night!).

On several occasions the men were asked to sprint halfway around the pitch to treat a Rajpracha player who had tumbled to the ground, apparently injured.

When the medical team eventually reached the stricken

player they were usually back on their feet with nothing wrong them.

However, the medical men took it all in their stride, trudging off the field out of breath, laughing among themselves, and waving to the fans in the stand, who rightly acclaimed their efforts.

The game ended in a 1-1 draw. The Phuket players walked a full lap of the pitch to pay homage to their loyal fans following the final whistle.

Supporters stayed long after the whistle, some still singing and dancing, while many just discussing the match and where to go for post-match drinks. Most looked like they never wanted to leave. I was one of them.

For many on the island, from every race and background, FC Phuket has become a part of their week.

It is a lifestyle and a passion, and it's brilliant to see.

The world needs peace, Phuket needs football!

NEW environmental regulations may significantly affect property developments and land values, law experts told those gathered at the American Chamber of Commerce (AMCHAM) Greater Phuket Chapter's inaugural 2011 event last Friday.

The keynote speakers at the event, entitled "Changes In Greater Phuket Planning and Environmental Regulations", were Sorachon Boonsong and Kammalard Urapeepatanapong, partners at Baker & McKenzie, and Anurag Ramanat, a partner at South Asia Law.

At the core of the presentation were the "areas and measures" defined by new Environment Act regulations, effective from July

The provisions govern the use of land in four "major tourist areas": Phuket, Hua Hin, Pattaya and

Mr Anurag also discussed new zoning regulations in Phang Nga, similar to those in Phuket, which went into effect on July 2, 2010.

The regulations designate nine "zones" on Phuket, each with dif-

ferent building restrictions.

"From our analysis, development and land value in Phuket may be significantly affected by the introduction of the Phuket Environmental Regulations, especially 'mega-size' hillside villas," a Baker & McKenzie statement read.

"This impact is demonstrated by the stricter requirements in many aspects," it continued.

Restrictions governing building height, free space requirements, and "slope area" are applied differently in each of the nine zones.

Building height requirements are straightforward, according to a table produced by Baker & McKenzie. The law firm's interpretation of the regulations explains that building height is based on the following two criteria:

- In the case where there is no leveling of the ground, or the ground level is lower than the public road in the area of the construction site, the measurement shall be made from the ground level of the construction site.
- In the case the level of the ground is equal to or higher than the public road, the measurement shall be made from the level

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Developing the land with impact in mind



FOR those interested in living in paradise, the decision of whether to live "on" or "off the grid" ultimately comes at a price.

Be it convenience, aesthetics, cost or trying to stretch the generosity of Mother Earth's resources, the debate is like that in any marriage or relationship: There will be compromise, and more and more to follow.

Giving back to nature when building your island dream house can often create a personal conundrum akin to that of Jekyll and Hyde – while those electric cards certainly do wonders for the planet, isn't a bright red Ferrari much more in tune with the impending midlife crisis?

Taking the high road - and drawing on one of those oxygen tanks for the moment – I've compiled some ideas from both local island homes and those abroad that make sense, sustainability-wise.

Reducing the "footprint" of building sites through the use of smaller, independent buildings allows green areas to coexist.

Earthworks for mega-structures that often require large-scale cut and fill can be minimized or eliminated by creating lightweight mini-buildings.

In light of changes to the island's environmental regulations last year that restrict free-space ratios, this approach works wonderfully.

Site drainage – whether it's into the ocean, down slopes or onto roadways – continues to blight Phuket.

While addressing issues of runoff and soil erosion inevitably require sub-drainage systems, the planting of native species for landscaping that have deep-root systems and can absorb rainwater runoff can help. Design features which use soil berms rather than concrete sidings also lessen impact.

Exaggerated roof overhangs not only produce shade, reducing the need for air conditioning, but can be used to capture large amounts of rainwater that can be

stored for domestic and landscaping use. Intelligent use of roof peaks creates opportunities for natural ventilation, as can windpowered extractor fans or external vents. Natural breezes can be circulated and hot air, which rises, can be eliminated without turning on the electricity.

Louvered feature walls can be another great addition. They can be open and closed, depending on the weather and with smaller footprints for buildings, existing spaces can serve dual purposes as indoor or outdoor living spaces.

Thick walls, often constructed from earth removed from the building site, reduce heat exchange and keep interiors night-time cool, even during the hottest part of sizzling tropical days.

Using individual solar lighting fixtures in outdoor areas saves electricity and reduces the need to dig up gardens and walkways. It also saves on the extensive use of plastic conduits and makes moving lights an incredibly easy task.

With a home that takes up less land area, you create space for not only ornamental landscaping, but usable trees, plants and gardens. Try planting a banana tree or two instead of visiting the supermarket.

The same approach can be taken with interiors. Recycling an eclectic mix of broken tiles can create original mosaics and the use of bamboo laminates instead of wood creates stylistic overtones.


We've managed to cover a lot of territory in the column today and now my mind is swimming laps in an Olympic-size pool of possibilities.

For those who don't have the luxury of building their dreams from scratch, remember that baby steps and small doses of investment can pay off - whether investing in energy-saving lights in your apartment or condo, or going out to buy and grow a plant for the very first time

The best thing is that this is like the day before summer vacation from school; tomorrow you have the freedom to try new things explore – and give just a little back to our island.

Landless let down by Cabinet

SIX communities in Phuket, of 34 across Thailand hoping to receive "community" title deeds to the land they live on, reacted with disappointment last week following a Cabinet decision not to address their concerns.

A Prime Minister's Office regulation, announced last year, called for the government to legalize and protect communities who make

their living on idle plots of government land.

After a lengthy selection process, 35 communities across Thailand were chosen to qualify for the "community Chanote" title deeds.

The chosen communities in Phuket

were: Baan Tha Sak in Pa Khlok; Baan Khlong Koh Phi in Wichit; Baan Khlong Pakbang in Patong; Baan Tha Reua Mai in Rassada; Baan Ao Yon in Wichit; and Baan Sapam in Koh Kaew.

So far just one area nationwide has received a "community Chanote" and residents of the remaining 34 are becoming skeptical they will ever receive the deeds.

They want the government to

speed up issuance of the deeds and to strong-arm uncooperative bodies such as the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MNRE).

The MNRE controls land on which 17 of the communities are

title deeds to communities living on protected forest land could encourage more encroachment on forests.

Members of the Phuket communities joined hundreds of poor people protesting in Bangkok in mid-February.

They urged the government to make good on promises to help Thailand's poorest residents.

The communities had therefore pinned their hopes on last week's Cabinet meeting to yield some progress, after Sathit Wongnongtoey, the minister responsible for the scheme, promised to present their concerns to PM Abhisit Vejjajiva and his Cabinet.

However, the Cabinet "ac-

knowledged" the issue, but decided to take no action, Phuket Gazette-affiliate Krungthep Thurakij reported.

Phongthip Samranchit, an adviser to the National Land Reform (NLR) in Thailand, an umbrella group representing communities affected by land rights issues, told Krungthep Thurakii that the MNRE had failed to hand over title deeds because it claimed it had no legal mechanism to do so.

Mrs Phongthip said she had asked Mr Sathit to explain the problem to the Cabinet last week. Prayong Doklamyai, an adviser to the NLR, said he thought the Cabinet did not dare make a decision.

The Cabinet had acknowledged the problem, but this would have no effect in bringing about action, he told reporters.

'When it goes like this, we just have to protest indefinitely," he said. The group may have to continue their protest until the government agrees to their demands, he added.

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Hardy Hydrangeas that beat the heat



THERE is a villa garden close to the lake in Nai Harn with one of the most glorious collections of Hydrangea in Phuket.

Although the name Hydrangea rarely conjures up visions of a Phuket paradise (more likely gardens in the cooler climes) they are flourishing in this garden. All thanks to the care lavished on them by a retired English lawyer and his charming wife.

This shrub's natural habitat is in moist woodland, so you would hardly expect to find Hydrangeas in Nai Harn, but you do, and they

They are doing well for two reasons. Firstly, because they are growing in large pots wellsupplied with plenty of rich humus, organic compost and liberal amounts of water.

Secondly, because they are located in a shady patio area at the side of the house where the sun can't scorch their foliage.

Hydrangeas are the most demanding of shrubs when it comes to acidic soil and murky light, so it's good that here they get plenty

Right now, the Hydrangea Macrophylla is coming into flower, with its densely packed clusters of blooms igniting the villa's cobbled patio.

Blueish-pink, these "mopheads" display their wares atop attractive green foliage. Here, they vie for attention with specimens of Red Ginger, already displaying their exotic spikes of scarlet bracts.

Make no mistake, this is not just a cool climate garden. Meticulously kept, and seven years since the present owners acquired it, the garden also contains plenty of

well-established tropical delights.

In the center of the lawn is a venerable avocado plant which produces the largest and most succulent pears imaginable.

Next to it is a prickly pear plant of similar vintage. The avocado provides shade for other shrubs in the adjacent borders, such as Clerodendrum Tricotomum, which is currently showing off its red flowers with white bottle shaped chutes that turn purple as they

Related to the pagoda plant, this woody shrub is not common in Phuket, yet deserves to be more popular.

The hedges enclosing this triangular garden are planted with pink and apricot colored Hibiscus on one side, and a mix of Thunbergia, Indian Rubber Vine and Bougainvillea inside the wall fronting the road.

The owners have fought and won a battle against fungus, mealy bugs and white fly - pests which infested the Hibiscus and threatened its survival. Now vigorous and healthy, the result is a dense border of flowers seven feet high.

The Thunbergia has survived a different kind of struggle - against the thorny embrace of the nearby Bougainvilleas, which became invasive and had to be cut back.

Close by in a separate circular bed is a fine Yellow Bells (Tecoma stans), also in full flower.

Against the house wall is a beautifully manicured hedge of orange Ixora, flanked by a low border of mauve Cuphea.

Relax on the veranda and the eye is captivated by floral vistas in all directions.

Nowhere is the Thai influence more evident than in the profusion Crown of Thorn plants, all neatly potted and arranged in ranks to attract the visitor's eye as it ascends the gentle paved slope to the front veranda.



PHEW, IT'S HOT: Hydrangeas are usually grown in cooler climates.

Salmon pink, cerise and yellow, there are also Euphorbia millii, the variety with tiny brilliant red flowers.

The delightful theme is repeated near a pool flanked by colorful pots of Euphorbias, and Variegated

On the roadside beyond the wall is a narrow strip of earth. Most owners would ignore this feature, but not these gardeners. Instead, they have assiduously enriched and watered the soil.

The results are colorful, with masses of pink Portulaca Daisies at ground level, and towering above them, clumps of brilliant red Zinnias and equally dazzling Canna Lilies. The symphony of color is completed by a row of giant sunflowers. A most harmonious combination.

Tip of the week

Spray and pray

INFESTATIONS in tropical gardens must be treated drastically and immediately.


Look for telltale signs such as falling or discolored leaves, try to identify the culprit, and treat with a modern insecticide or fungicide. And remember that it is at the larval stage that a lot of insects are most lethal.

I recently received a picture of a white grub with massive brown mouth parts where a critter had destroyed a reader's 300-year-old cashew tree in a matter of weeks by burrowing into its trunk and branches.

My prize fiddlewood tree went the same way – killed by a particularly virulent fungus which was detected too late.

The grub turned out to be the larva of Plocaderus Ferrigineus, which has ravaged whole cashew plantations in Africa. The fungus was probably black spot, and Mancozeb might have saved it.







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

FC Phuket protest nets precious points

FC PHUKET was handed a slice of good fortune this week when the club was awarded all three league points after protesting Rajpracha's use of too many foreign players.

The match at Surakul Stadium ended in frustration for Phuket as they were held to a 1-1 draw against a team intent on avoiding

A second successive draw meant Phuket languished in the lower reaches of Division 1 on Saturday night, but in a bizarre turn of events following the game, Phuket officials lodged an official complaint to the Thai League, complaining that Rajpracha exceeded the quota of foreign players used during the

The Thai football rulebook states that teams are not allowed field more than five foreign players at any one time. Rajpracha brought on two foreign substitutes late in the game, meaning they had six on pitch.

Following a meeting of Thai League officials on Monday, it was decided that Rajpracha had broken the rules and the league awarded the game to Phuket on a scoreline of 2-0.

The unexpected three points sees Phuket propel up Division 1

into third place, level on points and goal difference with Rajpracha FC, and just two points behind early league leaders Big Bang Chulalongkorn University (BBCU).

Phuket will view the default victory as well-deserved following the controversial events in the game last Saturday.

Kone Adama opened the scoring in 36 minutes when he nodded home after Sarat Yooyen had crashed a brilliant free-kick against the crossbar.

Although Phuket did go in at the break a goal ahead, the lead didn't last long into the second half, when Rajpracha's Rewat Meeleum equalized. Both teams spurned chances during the second period, but the visitors seemed satisfied with a draw, doing everything in their power – plenty of it outside the rules of the game – to return home with

The niggly nature of the game wasn't helped by a referee who failed to stamp out obvious Rajpracha time wasting. One of their defenders saw red during the second-half, while their goalkeeper should really have joined him after raising his hand against Adama late in the game.

Phuket's next game is against BBCU at Surakul Stadium on March 13. Kickoff is at 6pm.

PHUKET'S Liverpool Football Liverpool in Phuket are Club fanbase is set for a massive treat this June when a Legends of Liverpool team swing into town to take on a Legends of Thailand side at Surakul Stadium.

A squad that includes 15 Anfield greats will don the famous red shirt in Phuket on June 18 as part of their tour of Thailand, which will also take in a game at the Yamaha stadium in Bangkok on June 15.

Three different eras of the Merseyside club will be represented during the challenge game.

The legends team will include, wing-wizards John Barnes, Jason McAteer and Steve McManaman, colorful goalkeeper "Brucie" Grobbelaar, midfield-maestro Jan Molby and former captain Phil Neal.

Neal is the most decorated player in Liverpool history. In fact, no Englishman can boast more

The full-back helped bring 22 pieces of silverware to the Anfield trophy room and was the only player to feature in the Reds' first

four European Cup triumphs.

Also set to line out for Alan Kennedy and Robbie Fowler – both men were on the island recently to help promote the game.

Kennedy is one of Liverpool's greatest ever servants, a free-scoring full-back who netted the winning goal in Paris against Real Madrid in the 1981 European Cup final.

Kennedy is also a patron of the Youth Football Home (Phuket) Foundation and speaking about the Legends tours he said: "This group of players from Liverpool Football Club have won more Championships and trophies than any other team before or since for Liverpool, and were part of the successes of Liverpool FC during the '80s and '90s."

Off the pitch, the Liverpool Legends team will also participate in football clinics and meet fans at shopping malls in Phuket.

from April 1. Meanwhile, Liverpool's current first team squad have confirmed they will tour Asia next summer as part of preparations for the 2011/2012 season. The club has yet to confirm the countries it will visit during the tour, so it remains to be seen if Kenny Dalglish's Reds will return to Thailand.

Liverpool enjoyed a hugely successful pre-season trip to the country in 2009.

"The last tour there [to Thailand] in 2009 worked very well and we have a huge fan base there who will relish the chance to see the team in action," said a Liverpool FC spokesperson on their official site.







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
