Murky waters

Wastewater discharge at Karon Beach under scrutiny

CLAIMS that untreated wastewater was being pumped into the sea by hotels at Karon and Kata Beaches have been dismissed by provincial authorities as a 'misunderstanding'.

The wastewater originated from a municipal facility instead, they said.

Allegations brought forth last month after the filming of a popular German TV show sparked an investigation headed by Vice Governor Weerawat Janpen.

Five resorts were implicated.

"The footage did not implicate any hotels directly. However, it claimed that wastewater dumping had come from hotels. Our team investigated the places shown in the footage," he said.

"The wastewater treatment facilities involved are located near hotels, but they are actually the responsibility of Karon Municipality," he said.

Karon Mayor Tawee Thongcham explained to the Gazette that the two locations shown in the footage were Karon Municipality's sewage collection facility near

Kata Beach and the pumphouse that discharges treated wastewater further north, near the far northern end of Karon Beach.

"Wastewater is sent from many hotels in those areas to our wastewater collection station, where it continues to the main water treatment plant," he said.

"However, on the day the footage was filmed [March 18], there three to four hours for the Provincial Electricity Authority to fix

"So, the water kept flowing from the hotels as usual while our [sewage] collection tanks were over capacity. The pumps were offline, causing the excess [sewage] to overflow to the beach," Mayor Tawee said.

Such blackouts happen once or was a blackout at 5pm. It took twice a year, he added.

To prevent such incidents from recurring, Mayor Thawee petitioned Governor Tri Augkaradacha to install a generator at the site.

As for the pumphouse further north in Karon, where treated wastewater is released into a canal that ultimately empties into the ocean, he said, "Our April 23 tests of the water here show that the BOD [biochemical oxygen demand] was around 6, which means the water is safe.

"If the BOD is higher than 20, it is dangerous. I can guarantee that the sea water in both places is safe," he said.

The footage in question is expected to air in Germany this month, and possibly in Russia by next month.

German Honorary Consul Dirk Naumann told the Gazette that the footage – produced for *Wir Retten* Ihren Urlaub ("We Save Your Holiday") - had included live dumping of wastewater, as well as on-location tests revealing millions of harmful bacteria.

"They [the show's producers] had intentionally left the air date open because they are waiting for a reaction from the Thai government," he added.

Census 2010: Phuket population 'only' 525,000

PRELIMINARY figures from the nationwide census conducted last year report 525,018 people living on Phuket: 409,137 Thai and 115,881 foreigners.
However, the figures have yet

to be confirmed by the National Statistics Office in Bangkok, said Prapai Pukngarm, of the Statistical Techniques and Planning Branch at Phuket Provincial Statistical Office.

"When that is done, much more information will become

available," she said.

Asked whether the Phuket Statistical Office thought the figures accurately indicated the actual number of people living on Phuket, she replied, "No. Of course, these numbers do not include every single person living in Phuket. The system is not perfect.

Some people do not want to tell us about everyone staying in their house, and Burmese living in labor camps only give us details of the number legally registered Burmese workers living there," she said.

MoU touted to resolve Deep Sea Port blockades

A MEMORANDUM of Understanding (MoU) between taxi drivers and tour operators who use the Phuket Deep Sea Port will be drawn up in an attempt to resolve the dispute over access to tourists disembarking there.

The MoU, to be drafted by the Phuket Marine Office within one month, is expected to put in writing terms of a verbal agreement negotiated a month ago.

The verbal agreement was made during an emergency meeting at the port that followed the April 6 blockade when the cruise liner Silver Spirit was in port.

Phuket Marine Office chief Phuripat Theerakulpisut told the meeting the MoU would generally allow taxi drivers access to half of the passengers disembarkeing at the port.

However, when passengers booked portof-call tours before their arrival in Phuket, the split might be 70% to 30% in favor of the tour operators, he said.

He also assured there would be no more blockades at the port.

Many of the tour company representa-

tives at the meeting questioned the proposed MoU's validity from a consumer protection standpoint.

Kanin Vivataga, managing director of tour company South Services, said taxi drivers often failed to take passengers to their desired destinations, instead taking them to establishments where they can earn commissions, he said.

"Some passengers book specific types of vehicles they would like to travel in. They should have the right to make such choices. We have to find a compromise on all these issues if this is going to work," he said.

Orachorn Saiseethong of Sea Tour said the 50:50 split would work only for large groups of passengers without prior itineraries. "For groups of 200 to 500 passengers who have already booked tours from abroad, the deal will not work," she said.

Wichit Municipality deputy mayor Chairat Kumban said there are currently 92 taxis and 84 vans operating in the area. They are all local people just trying to keep their families clothed and fed, he said.

We should try and understand them and not brand them as 'mafia' as some have done," he said.

Cable TV wars run riot

FOLLOWING a spate of cablecutting incidents over the past few months, local cable providers around the island are fed up.

Suspecting sabotage, Atsadakorn Sidokbuap of KPP Cable TV and Kampanat Thantiwat, managing director of PA Business Phuket, filed a formal request for action to Phuket Electricity Authority (PEA) chief Somchai Krueapat on Tuesday.

Mr Kampanat said he was acting on behalf of a consortium representing all cable TV providers on Phuket.

The request asked PEA to perform a thorough investigation of their transmission line towers to determine whether any unauthorized cabling was evident, and if so, to put an end to it.

The cable companies claimed their services have been constantly interrupted due to the cutting and unplugging of their cables.

Having found suspicious, unrecognized fiber-optic and coaxial wires at the towers where their own wires were tampered or removed, Mr Kampanat said he

believes private-sector competitors were responsible.

At least three incidents in April were reported among consortium members, Mr Kampanat said.

Cables were deliberately cut, unplugged and damaged at towers near Tesco Lotus and later around Makro – including 3BB cables – during early April, he added.

After inspecting the latest incident, which occurred in late April

in Koh Kaew, his associates gathered evidence including one of their own severed cables, a pair of wire cutters, and even claimed to have identified a suspect at the scene.

The alleged culprit, employed by a major national telecommunications provider, denied the allegations, said Mr Kampanat,

Just ask us: We're happy

A CLEAR majority of *Phuket Gazette* readers feel they are happy living in or visiting *Phuket*, results of a recent readers' poll reveal.

The *Gazette* asked online readers: "On a scale of 1-5 (1 = completely miserable; 5 = bliss), how would you rate your average emotional state living in, or when visiting, Phuket?"

Overall, 56.2% answered that they were happy (37.5%) or even blissful (18.7%).

By contrast, only 20.4% replied that they were unhappy (13.5%) or miserable (6.9%).

Almost one quarter of those taking part (23.3%) rated their emotional state with a "3", indicating they were neutral: Neither happy nor unhappy.

The poll was initiated by a nationwide ABAC survey that found Phuket residents rated their own happiness lower than residents of any other province in Thailand.

In a breakdown by demographic, tourists taking part in the *Gazette* poll were more likely to be happy (71%) than unhappy (14%). Almost a third (29%) said they felt "blissful" while in Phuket.

Thais were far less likely to report they were happy. Just under half (49%) reported feeling happy compared to 23% who said they were not. The rest were neutral.

Resident expats were in the middle, with 63% saying they were happy compared to 24% who said they were not. The remainder were neutral.

Call for better work rates, conditions for Burmese

LABOR Day in Phuket was an active one for a group of local laborers demanding special attention from the government.

Vice Governor Weerawat Janphen last Sunday presided over a job fair themed "Phuket Laborers Unite for the Environment, against Drugs" at the Phuket HomeWorks Supercenter.

Many employers took part in the event, accepting applications for a reported 1,500 job vacancies.

Led by Phuket Federation of Hotel and Service Labor President Vichit Dasanta, laborers presented eight demands to the V/Gov Weerawat on stage.

Printed on a large poster was their prime request: An increase in the daily minimum wage rate to match the rising cost of living.

The current minimum wage in Phuket is 221 baht per day, the highest in Thailand.

The workers also called for pricing controls on household es-

sentials, as well as strict enforcement of labor law and immediate expulsion of illegal immigrant workers from the country.

Furthermore, they asked the closing time of entertainment venues to be extended to 2am and, if possible, to consider establishing Phuket province as a special administrative area.

Such a move would be practical given Phuket's special status as a prime regional tourist destination, they said.

Lifeguards issue warning over rip tides

DESPITE no drownings being recorded at Phuket beaches over the past month, the president of the Phuket lifeguard organization this week warned tourists to beware of strong rip tides.

"Over the past few days, there have been big waves with strong underwater currents," said Prathaiyuth Chuayuan, president of the Phuket Lifeguard Service (PLS).

"Red flags have been posted in danger zones and the monsoon season is coming," he warned.

"Earlier this month, there have been days without large waves on the surface, but there have been underwater currents.

"So do not rush into the water. Ask a lifeguard where it is safe to swim," Mr Prathaiyuth advised.

The warning comes after the PLS completes its first month under its new annual contract to patrol Phuket beaches.

PHUKET is enjoying record numbers of foreign tourists in 2011, according to official statistics.

The number of international passengers arriving at Phuket Airport January through March totaled 654,009, up 25.1% over the same period in 2010, according to the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT).

This included a growth of 31.3% (228,768) in January, 24.3% (231,326) in February and 21.6% (193,915) in March.

From April 1 through 23 April, international passengers arriving at the airport totaled 123,934, up almost 31% over the same period last year.

Meanwhile, Airports of Thailand (AoT) has announced that the first phase of its expansion project at the airport is expected to be finished in September, just in time for the next tourism high season.

AoT Board of Directors chairman Tirapol Noparumpaat led a meeting of the AoT board at the Sea Pearl Villas Resort in Kathu following an inspection tour of the airport last week.

Airport enjoy record arrivals Police face meth tests

EVERY police officer in Phuket is to be tested for ya bah (methamphetamine), the provincial police commander has announced.

"Every police station must urine test every officer under their command by May 1," said Maj Gen Pekad Tantipong last Thursday.

"The order was issued by Provincial Police Region 8 at the end of last month," he added.

The same testing was to be conducted in Surat Thani, Krabi, Phang Nga, Ranong, Nakhon Sri Thammarat and Chumphon.

"Any officer testing positive will be severely punished," said Maj Gen Pekad, adding that even commanding officers will be tested.

"I will receive all of the results and know how many officers in Phuket test positive. However, I have yet to receive any reports of officers testing positive," he said.

Under the scheme, police will be tested by workers from the Phuket Provincial Health Office using a "Meth Cassette" kit manufactured by the Government Pharmaceutical Organization.

Those whose urine turns purple after being mixed with the reagent

will have blood samples taken. These will be sent to a police testing facility in Trang for final confirmation in a procedure that takes about one week.

'We cannot test them all simultaneously as they work different ficers. So far none have tested

shifts and some need to travel out of the province as part of their duties. For this reason they will be tested in groups," he said.

"This is the third year Phuket City Police has drug tested its ofpositive," said Phuket City Police Deputy Superintendent Chaiwat Auykham.

As police are sometimes ordered to conduct random drug tests on the general public, it is important that they prove they are not involved with drugs themselves, he said.

Phuket City Police arranged testing of 289 officers over a twoday period: 193 officers on April 28 and most of the remainder the next day.

About 30 officers currently outside the province will be tested later, Lt Col Chaiwat said.

"All Phuket City Police officers, almost 300 people, must undergo drug testing. The results will be submitted to our commander at the beginning of next month [May]," he added.

There are a total of 1,196 police officers stationed in Phuket.

A reliable source in at least one police station told the Gazette that officers were well aware that methamphetamine testing was imminent and that officers were "instructed to prepare" for it.

The detection period for methamphetamine in urine can range from anywhere from one to five

Police arrest three for killing of Thalang teen

POLICE arrested three young men who have confessed to the stabbing murder of Phuket teen Thawatchai "Ton" Maelanon, whose body was discovered in a rubber plantation in Thalang on March 26.

At a press conference at Phuket City Police Station last Friday, Provincial Police Commander Pekad Tantipong identified one of the three suspects as 23-year-old Apirak "Khao" Sae-eiw.

The other two youths, both 16, were presented to the media with their faces covered.

According to police, the three on March 19 lured the 15-yearold fellow gang member to a remote location off Thepkrasattri Road with the intention of shoot-

In their confession, the three said they had given the boy 5,000 baht for the purchase of ya bah (methamphetamine). They became furious when they learned he took some of the drugs by himself, sold with conspiracy to commit murthe rest – and ignored repeated der and weapons charges. demands for repayment.

W h e n they reached the site, a rubber plantation along the access road Namuang Village, Apirak tried to shoot the boy, police quoted the

boys as saying in their statement.

When the gun failed to discharge, one of two youths stabbed him once with a sharpened chisel. He then turned the weapon over to Apirak, who continued the assault, police said.

The three left the scene only after they were sure Thawatchai was dead.

Among the items of evidence presented were a homemade handgun and a mobile phone.

Tsunami fears spark ICEC redesign

CONCERNS over whether the Phuket International Convention and Exhibition Center (ICEC) would be able to withstand a tsunami have sparked a full review of the project design plans.

Wongsakorn Nunchukhan, from the Department of Public Works And Town & Country Planning office in Phuket last week told a progess-update meeting at Provincial Hall that the 141-rai coastal site in Mai Khao, at the north end of the island, is considered a tsunami-risk zone.

"The design and construction of the center and adjoining facilities should be 'tsunami safe' because tsunamis can strike at any time," he said.

Vice Governor Somkiet Sangkaosutthirak, who presided over the meeting, highlighted the delay the suggestion would trigger.

"This suggestion will [need to] be discussed further among relevant organizations, such as the Phuket Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation [DDPM], after which we will discuss it again before

proceeding," he explained.

The project is already under time pressure. Its originally-scheduled completion was May 2014, but funding under the government's Thai Khem Kaeng ("Strong Thailand") economic stimulus package require the project to be completed by November 2013.

Cabinet approved a budget of 2.6 billion baht for construction of the center, but funding for other projects to support the ICEC, such as highway upgrades and light rail projects, will have to be sourced from relevant departments including the Highways Office, Provincial Electricity Authority and the Provincial Waterworks Authority, the meeting was told.

'The architects [KAED 103] will draft a master plan for the whole project so the other offices will have have a clearer picture of what the project will look like," said V/Gov Somkiet.

Police link Tesco meth 'delivery man' to Vitamilk ya bah mule

PHUKET City Police last week arrested a drug mule with 2,000 ya bah (methamphetamine) pills and 197.14 grams of ya ice (crystal meth), with a street value of about 1.1 million baht.

The bust followed the arrest of Jamnong Chumplub, from Nakhon Sri Thammarat, who was found in possession of 10 ya bah pills in an earlier raid.

During questioning, Jamnong told police he "ordered" the drugs through a man he identified only as "Phab", who is apparently serving a prison sentence in Nakhon Sri Thammarat, according to po-

Jamnong was waiting for a drug delivery when police arrested him.

Officers arranged for Jamnong to have another shipment delivered to a rendezvous point at Tesco Lotus at noon last Friday.

Police pounced on Aram "Paek" Or-Yam, 48, from Ranong, when he showed up with the drugs.

He now faces charges of pos-

At the media conference, Aram confessed that he had been hired many times to deliver drugs for Phap. He was paid 20,000 baht for each delivery.

Phuket Provincial Police Com-

mander Pekad Tantipong said police believe Aram was part of the same drug network that saw a man caught trying to smuggle 2,000 ya bah pills hidden in Vitamilk cartons onto the island two days earlier.

An informant tipped off Phuket

patrol police that Tianchai Chiewchan, 27, was carrying the pills from Surat Thani to Phuket

Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM) Phuket officers took up position at Siam Commercial Bank on Thepkrasattri Road as the van carrying the suspect approached.

The officers identified Tianchai as he got out of the van based on a description provided by an informant and noted that he "was acting suspiciously".

As they approached the Surat Thani native, the DDPM officers identified themselves and searched his belongings.

On discovering his stash, the officers arrested him.

Tianchai confessed that the he had been paid 5,000 baht by someone in Surat Thani to deliver the pills to "Ian", an unidentified Thai man in Rawai, police said.

Tianchai was charged with possession of illegal drugs.

US dad gets 10 years for passport fraud

AN American father arrested in Phuket in June last year has been sentenced by a US federal court to 10 years in prison for forging documents needed to illegally bring his daughter to Thailand, according to a US media report.

Samuel Lee Horton, 38, was arrested by FBI agents in Phuket in June 2010 for violation of an outstanding child custody order.

During his stay in Phuket, he told his three-year-old daughter Zoei that her mother had died, reported MSNBC news affiliate WYFF4 at the time of his arrest.

Horton was given the maximum possible sentence of 10 years for passport fraud, followed by three years of probation, the WYFF4 report said.

Horton earlier pleaded guilty to charges of forging his ex-wife's signature on his daughter's passport application, a serious offense under US law.

Horton's ex-wife Cindy now has full custody of their daughter and son, and Horton has been stripped of his parental rights.

Steven Stander, 27, was grabbed by lifeguards after a beach operator spotted him stealing a digital camera from a bag belonging to Australian tourists frolicking in the water.

"I saw him take a camera from the one of the ladies' bags and hide it under his shirt as he walked off, so I called out to the lifeguards to stop him.

"We all surrounded him to stop him walking away. As soon as he saw this, he raised his hands and gave himself up. He also handed the camera back to us," Mr Thairath said.

"My friend and I were swimming for about 20 minutes. While

A SOUTH African man was sen- I was facing out to sea, I heard someone blowing a whistle. I turned around and saw a couple of people waving to me and calling me back to the beach," said one of the Australian tourists, who asked to be named only as "Lisa",

"When I saw him, he confessed that he stole it and apologized to me," she said.

With her camera back, Lisa said she did not want to press charges.

"I just want to tell the beach vendor and lifeguards who helped me that I am very grateful for what they did.

"Otherwise, if the camera was stolen, I would never get those photos back again," she said.

After completing his week-long sentence, Mr Stander is to be handed over to Phuket Immigration, who are likely to deport him.

Roads to get huge makeover

NEW road projects planned for Phuket and Phang Nga are budgeted at more than 140 million baht, the Highways Department has revealed.

The road to the airport, the road on the north side of the Sarasin Bridge and the bypass road are all scheduled for major upgrades.

Sathaporn Sornchana, deputy general manager of the regional Highways Department office, said work is already underway to repair a 5.5-kilometer stretch of Thepkrasattri Road southbound in Thalang, from the airport road turnoff to Wat Phra Thong.

The road has been damaged by trucks carrying heavy loads into Phuket. The northbound lane is fine because it is used by empty trucks heading off-island," said Mr Sathaporn.

Hat Yai PSM Construction Co has been contracted to complete the project within 120 days, from February 10 to June 9, with a budget of 19,248,900 baht.

Six heavily damaged sections of the road are to be structurally repaired before the entire length is resurfaced.

Work stopped from April 8 to 17 for Songkran, but has since resumed, Mr Sathaporn said.

He is hopeful the work will be finished ahead of schedule.

"I would like to see construction finished before May 10," he

The project became a top priority after community action group Khon Rak Phuket (People who Love Phuket) filed complaints to offices in Bangkok, which led to Bangkok officials travelling to Phuket to inspect the condition of the road firsthand, said Mr Sathaporn.

"We are trying to solve the problem. We have installed a weigh station in Khok Kloy, on the north side of the Thepkrasattri Bridge . The weigh station was installed before New Year [Janu-

ary 1] and was in use for three months before its official opening ceremony on April 1," he explained.

Now any trucks carrying over 25 tons are asked to reduce weight to that figure before crossing over to Phuket, he added.

Next is resurfacing the bypass road from the Bang Khu Intersection to the Premium Outlet Factory and from the Samkong (Tesco Lotus) Intersection to Darasamuth School (Central) Intersection.

Work is expected to start around March next year.

"People don't understand why we always have do road construction. Roads have limited lifespans, up to seven years at most. After that they need major improvements," explained Mr Sathaporn.

Navies discuss disaster relief, nuclear meltdown

THE third and final installment of the Western Pacific Naval Symposium's (WPNS) Humanitarian Aid and Disaster Relief workshop drew to a close last Friday.

The event was attended by major humanitarian aid agencies and 16 navies, covering half of the globe.

The focus last Friday was naval involvement in providing relief to disaster-stricken areas, including nuclear accident sites.

The workshop, themed "Seapower – A Unifying Force for Good", aimed to improve participating nations' understanding of what was required in providing disaster relief and to better coordinate delivery of relief to disaster areas.

"We're now looking at how to better disseminate the information required to alleviate the grave concerns and questions coming up so there is a better understanding of how to deal with those types of disasters," said William J Wesley, WPNS Executive Director for Plans and Policy.

Coral gets its groove back

RECENT shallow-water surveys conducted off Phuket have documented significant regrowth of coral, marine biologists say.


Researchers headed by divers from the Marine and Coastal Biology and Ecology Unit of Phuket Marine Biology Center (PMBC) reveal the island's coral reefs are starting to show signs of recovery from last year's devastating coral bleaching episode.

Initial post-bleaching damage assessments showed that coral loss ranged from 25% in some areas to 97% in more vulnerable sites, such as Siam Bay of Racha Yai island.

Diverse coral larvae growth was observed at sites all around the island's territorial waters.

Coral reefs in Phuket waters are estimated to cover an area of nearly 17 square kilometers, according to the PMBC researchers.

One PMBC report released last month assessed the health of an 80-meter-long reef located off the

small bay north of Karon Beach, near Le Meridian Phuket Beach Resort. In addition to the regrowth of no less than 30 coral species, a moderate number of fish and even blue sea stars (*Linckia*

small bay north of Karon Beach, laevigata) were spotted by divers.

The PMBC estimates the reef could recover to its original prebleached state in three to four years, under the right conditions.

The report cites human activi-

ties in the area as the primary obstacle. Sedimentation from runoff as well as algal blooms thriving on nutrient-rich wastewater were listed as the main hindrances to coral rehabilitation.

The survey also attributed subsurface debris such as fishing tackle and plastic as another threat.

The researchers also called for resorts to better inform guests who dive and snorkel at nearby reefs about correct coral reef exploration techniques.

Reflecting on his first, uneventful dive in Thailand off the coast of Kalim bay last week, Pierre Yves Cousteau, son of legendary Jacques Yves, commented: "You don't want to shoot yourself in the foot, or saw off the branch you are sitting on by destroying the reason why people are coming."

Mr Cousteau visited Phuket last week in order to meet recreational dive industry representatives, prospecting potential partnerships for his non-profit marine conservation venture Cousteau Divers.

Tremors prompt house evacs

A 4.4-magnitude earthquake in the Andaman Sea last Saturday night did very little damage to anyone in Phuket, but it sparked fear in some neighborhoods.

Damaged tiles in a house south of Phuket Town prompted residents of the area to leave their homes.

"My wife received an SMS on her mobile phone about an earthquake.

"Then, about an hour later while I was in the living room with our son, I heard a sound like a rat running and hitting the door and table," said one resident in a street off Wirat Hongyok Road.

"I grabbed a wooden stick and started looking for the rat, but I couldn't find it.

"Then the tiles on the floor started cracking and popping up from the floor. This went on for about 20 minutes.

"I called for everyone – there were six people in my house – to

leave the house immediately," he said.

Other residents left their homes to join his family on street. One household did so after a family member started to panic.

Worried about whether his house might collapse, another man called the Ruamjai Rescue Foundation.

Rescue workers arrived and after inspecting the home said the damage was likely from poor construction.

"After all the disaster movies I've seen, I thought something was going happen suddenly.

"It was better for us to be prepared, even though it turned out to be nothing," he said.

Asked for his name, the man declined, saying that people might "tease" him for being overly worried by the event.

"It will attract people to visit Phuket during the low season and help keep Phuket 'alive' all year," he said.


"There are two major beauty contests held annually in Thailand, but none are for half-Thais only," Mr Kritphanat said.

His Majesty recovering from surgery

HM KING Bhumibol Adulyadej is recovering well from an operation to remove cerebrospinal fluid from his brain, the Royal Household Bureau has said.

Excess fluid was preventing the revered monarch from being able to walk steadily. The condition is common in the elderly and the operation is a standard treatment, according to the bureau.

The 83-year-old – the world's longest-reigning monarch - was admitted to Siriraj Hospital in Bangkok in September 2009 with fever, fatigue and lung inflammation.

HM The King has stayed in the hospital ever since for physical therapy and nourishment to regain his strength, MCOT reported.

In an interview last month with TV host Wuttitorn Milintachinda, HRH Princess Chulabhorn Valayalaksana said her father still worked every day from the hospital.

"His Majesty has never taken a day off work," she said.

Report slams Govt, reds

NEW York-based Human Rights Watch (HRW) has released a damning report on human rights abuses committed during last year's anti-government red shirt protests, noting that no government officials have faced charges over the violence.

The 139-page report, based on 94 interviews with victims, witnesses, protesters, academics, journalists and others, also detailed abuses by so-called "black shirts", armed elements associated with the protesters who "staged deadly attacks on police officers and soldiers".

"In plain view government forces shot protesters and armed militants shot soldiers, but no one has been held responsible," said Brad Adams, HRW Asia director.

"Those who were killed and wounded deserve better than this. The government should ensure

that all those who committed violence and abuses, on both sides, are investigated and prosecuted.'

The United Front for Democracy Against Dictatorship (UDD). better known as the "red shirts", staged weeks of protests in April and May last year.

Tens of thousands of protest-

ers barricaded themselves into Bangkok's central shopping district of Ratchaprasong, demanding the government immediately dissolve parliament to stage elections.

The protests were dispersed during an aggressive push by the military on May 19. A total of 90 people were killed during the pro-

tests, with around 2,000 injured.

The high death toll and injuries resulted in part from excessive and unnecessary lethal force on the part of security forces, HRW said.

To disperse the main protest at Ratchaprasong, the army deployed snipers to shoot those who breached "no-go" zones between the UDD protesters and army barricades or who threw rocks and other objects toward soldiers. At times, soldiers also shot into crowds of protesters, said HRW.

"UDD leaders have been charged with crimes, but despite promises by the government to also hold security forces accountable, no one in the army or police has been charged," Adams said. "This has fed the understandable belief among many Thais that the scales of justice are imbalanced."

UDD leaders also contributed to the violence with inflammatory speeches to demonstrators, urging supporters to carry out riots, arson attacks, and looting, the report said.

For months, UDD leaders had urged followers to turn Bangkok into "a sea of fire" if the army tried to disperse the protest camps.

Rights groups speak out on journo arrests

FREE speech advocacy groups from "partly free" to "not free". have condemned the arrest last week of a prominent red shirt supporter and journalist on charges of insulting the monarchy.

Somyot Pruksakasemsuk, editor of the Voice of Taksin and Red Power magazines, was arrested by the Department of Special Investigation on April 30 while attempting to cross the border into Cambodia. A request for bail was rejected.

Mr Somyot said he was unaware he was wanted for Lese Majeste, a charge punishable by up to 15 years in jail, until Immigration officials checked his passport at Sa Kaew checkpoint.

Mr Somyot claimed he was leading a group of 30 tourists on a trip to Angkor Wat in Cambodia, a sideline he ran in addition to his political activities.

The arrest followed the release of a press freedom report by USbased Freedom House that ranked Thailand 138th in the world for press freedom. The rights body country's media environment polls," he said.

"This arrest confirms that a crackdown on the opposition media is under way," a Reporters Without Borders spokesperson said.

"Once again it is a Lese Majeste charge that has been used to detain an opposition journalist and activist. This is not an isolated case, but one that targets all media that are close to or support the opposition. In less than a month, about 20 opposition figures have been accused of 1 se-majest ."

The Committee to Protect Journalists (CPJ) also condemned Somyot's detention.

"We call on the relevant authorities to release Somyot Prueksakasemsuk and to stop using anti-royal charges to stifle partisan media," said Shawn Crispin, CPJ's senior Southeast Asia representative.

ICEC plans face waves of challenge

THE latest turn in the decades-old saga of Phuket's unrealized effort to build a world-class convention and exhibition center is not one for the positive. It recently came to the attention of the Department of Public Works and Town and Country Planning that the 140 rai of coastal land slated for the project lies in a "tsunami risk" zone, necessitating the need for a major redesign. [See page 3].

For years it remained debatable whether Phuket really needed such a facility at all. Most successful convention centers are located in major metropolitan areas, ensuring that tens of millions of potential visitors are within easy driving distance.

However, the relentless growth of Phuket over the past decade now makes the lack of such a facility a major drawback, especially as the Commerce Ministry has begun touting Phuket as the future "Tourism Hub of ASEAN" after measures of a regional free-trade agreement go into effect in 2015.

That Phuket can attract large-scale international gatherings is no longer a matter of dispute. The island hopes to host the postponed ASEAN summit meetings as soon as next month, following on the successful staging of the ASEAN Ministerial Meeting in July, 2009. Meanwhile the Laguna Phuket resort complex in Cherng Talay is already grappling with the logistics of hosting the Amway China incentives meet that will see some 8,000 sales reps from that company visit the island a year from now.

AirAsia's successful establishment of Phuket as

a regional air hub and reports that Australian carrier Strategic Air has similar plans, together with a record number of tourist arrivals in 2010, further highlight the island's emergence as a major international destination.

That the Abhisit government has approved 2.6 million baht in funding for the project under the *Thai Khem Khaeng* (Strong Thailand) fiscal stimulus package has brought the project as close to reality as it has ever been, yet observers who have tracked the heartbreaking history of the project know all-too-well that economic and political factors can set it back to square one at any time.

It also comes as a sad irony indeed that the latest design by project architects reached the computer graphics stage, with a "Sino-Portuguese/sea turtle" theme, before obvious concerns like tsunami preparedness ever entered the equation.

Whether or not the current plans for the center are ever realized will likely rest with the fortunes of the Democrat Party in the next elections, scheduled to take place by July. If Mr Abhisit cannot form a coalition after the poll, the future of the convention center will face far more uncertainty than anything the threat of another tsunami might engender.

By doing this, Phuket could improve its reputation for civic responsibility.


During this 11-day event, we will have a good chance to give back and help make some dreams come true.

...asking the questions that affect you...

Tanongsak Booncleub, acting chief of the Phuket Provincial Excise Office, replies:

To sell beer or other alcoholic beverages using a cart is considered hawking.

Under Thai law, we cannot issue a license or allow anyone to sell alcoholic beverages in this manner [by hawking] since it is unfair to other alcoholic beverage vendors who have to pay extra expenses, such as rent and setting up their business.

Meena Panan, an officer at the Public Health and Environment Division of Patong Municipality, replies:

Anyone wanting to sell products or provide services in a public area must first obtain a permit from the local authority.

To apply for such a permit in Patong, or for more information, contact Patong Municipality's Public Health and Environment Division.

The products or services to be provided must not conflict with any laws. Under the Alcohol Beverage Control Act B.E. 2551

(2008), the sale of alcoholic beverages is prohibited in public areas.

We do not allow any beach vendors to set up stalls selling alcoholic beverages. We only allow them to provide beach beds, umbrella services, and food and

drinks that are not alcoholic.

If you see anyone selling products or providing services in public areas without permission from the local authority, report it to the Patong Municipal police at 076-340843.

Razor clam trade rising

EVER since the devastating tsunami that hit Phuket on December 26, 2004, the residents of Saen Suk Beach have reaped an unexpected boon from their natural environment: razor clams.

Before the disaster, nobody had ever found this long, thin species of shellfish in the sands of Saen Suk, located on the island's east coast in Rassada sub-district.

But since then, their numbers have grown so quickly that some villagers are now making a living by digging the clams out of the sand and selling them to restaurants.

Now, the residents want to use their razor clam industry to promote their community as a tourist attraction showing how people can make money while living in harmony with nature.

Somsak Phakdiwanit, chairman of Saen Suk Beach Community, said the economy of the community had always revolved around fishing, but razor clams had never been a part of it.

But after the tsunami, villagers, who mostly live in houses just off the beach, started to find the shellfish in small numbers in the sand.

Initially, they ate them themselves, but about two years ago some villagers started to sell the clams.

Rather than pouring lime onto the sand, a method of catching the shellfish that kills the razor clams and other sea creatures the villagers wait until low tide and dig them out of the wet sand. It's a more environmentally friendly way of doing things.

In fact, the villagers have issued a regulation forbidding the use of lime to catch shellfish, which villagers fear could lead to the depletion of stocks of the precious shellfish.

As a result of the villagers' cautious approach, there are more and more razor clams on Saen Suk Beach, bringing more and more income into the community.

Today, residents are gathering 40-60 kilograms of the shellfish from the beach every day, selling them to Phuket's restaurants for 100 baht per kilo. In fact, demand from the island's eateries is now so strong that villagers can't meet the demand.

The community is proud it has been able to cultivate the trade without

driving the razor clams to extinction.

They consider the razor clam to be not just part of the economy, but a symbol of how communities can work together and look after the environment an example to other communities in Thailand.

Mr Somsak said the community wanted the authorities to designate and promote Saen Suk Beach and its razor clam trade as a tourism attraction for Phuket.

As a result, the community will hold its first ever razor clam digging competition in the near future. Mr Somsak said there had already been a lot of interest in the event.

He said the villagers were confident that with the right know-how, they can make Saen Suk Beach thrive through fishing, tourism, and the careful management of the burgeoning trade in razor clams.

NTC say 3G could take two more years

THE long-awaited 3G rollout is benefit most from 3G mobile likely to be delayed by two years, a member of the National Telecommunications Commission (NTC) has admitted.

A panel from the NTC was in Phuket expressly to answer questions from the press at a conference at the Centara Grand Resort in Karon on April 27.

"3G technology is already available in Thailand. The only problem is that the Thai court has currently disallowed private companies from providing the services,"explained Assoc Prof Sudharma Yoonaidharma, one of the NTC's six commissioners.

"However, when the legal issues are resolved, large and densely populated cities in Thailand will technology. In this sense, Phuket will be at the forefront because there is a lot of user demand here, especially for temporary mobile services.

"A lot of telecom users in Phuket are tourists who demand temporarily mobile services from local mobile providers.

In Phuket, there are a lot of users that make up this group, making it a very lucrative market for mobile network operators," he added.

The commissioner openly criticized centralization of IT services, and their concentration in Bangkok, and urged local businesses to step up in regional markets.

"If the telecom industry is to advance to a more competitive

state, there needs to be more local participation. In the past, the industry has been too centralized and large firms were finding it difficult to provide custom services to meet the specific needs of this region," he said.

Laws affecting this aspect of the industry will be changed to accommodate more foreign investment and allow smaller, localized firms to thrive, added the commissioner.

"Phuket has the potential to become a regional telecommunications hub, provided there is adequate investment in technology and infrastructure," Prof Sudharma said.

He pointed out that Phuket's local telecom businesses, located close to more developed regional hubs like Singapore and Malaysia, will need to prepare for tough competition when Thailand finally joins the ASEAN Economic Community in 2015.

"Phuket's potentials arise from the fact that it is a self sustained economy, with a good telecommunications infrastructure already in place and a large group of international users who demand next-generation telecom

services," Prof Sudharma said.

Advanced networking and telecom services can reduce operation costs for businesses, and the availability of next generation telecom services increases the value added to real estate products, further benefiting the real estate industry in Phuket, he said.

Prof Sudharma explained that certain changes to Thai laws had already revolutionized the Thai telecom and media industries.

"In future, the law will only allow the government to own a few television and radio channels in the country. The rest will have to be auctioned off and privatized.

"Following such liberalization in television and media, Phuket will become a very lucrative market where there will be extensive demand for quality international programming because of its large international audience," Prof Sudharma said.

Wealthy Arab tourists high on Phuket's agenda

THE Phuket governor is confident inbound tourism from the Middle Eastern market will continue to perform well after attending a tourism trade show there earlier this month.

Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha was part of the delegation representing Phuket at the 2011 Arabian Travel Market (ATM 2011) exhibition, held in Dubai from May 1 through 6.

Arrivals to Phuket from the Middle East reached 400,000 last year, about 20 per cent of the number of arrivals from Europe.

Increased tourist numbers reflect confidence in Phuket as a destination, he added.

Middle Easterners on holiday in Phuket have a relatively expenditures per capita, with many taking advantage of medical tourism services such as checkups, surgery, post-surgical rest and recovery as well as spa treatments.

They are also interested in Phuket's unique history and local culture, he said.

Among the many resorts and attractions represented at ATM 2011 were Dusit Thani Laguna, Phuket FantaSea, Andara Resorts and Villas, Avista Phuket Resort & Spa, M evenpick Resort & Spa Karon, Impiana Hotels and La Flora Resort Patong.

Speaking of recent civil-unrest in the country, the Governor reiterated that there has been no negative affects carried over to the Phuket tourism industry.

UTCC raises its growth forecast to 4.4 per cent

THE University of the Thai Chamber of Commerce (UTCC) has revised its forecast for Thailand's economic growth for the better this year, thanks mainly to the extra spending during the general election.

Thailand's economic growth could reach 4.4 per cent this year, up from the previous projection of 4.2 per cent.

The growth will likely be supported by the more stable political situation, upcoming general election, global economic recovery and lessened impact from the Japan disaster.

Thanavath Phonvichai, director at the UTCC's Economic and Business Forecasting Centre, said that the national election would be a major factor to drive the Thai economic growth.

The center estimated that extra spending during the period would be about 40-50 billion baht this

Phuket touted as ASEAN tourism capital by 2015

THAILAND joining the Association of South-East Asian Nations (ASEAN) Economic Community in 2015 will open a window of opportunity for Phuket to become a key tourism hub for Southeast Asia, Deputy Commerce Minister Alongkorn Ponlaboot in Phuket announced last week.

Presiding over a seminar titled "How Phuketians will prepare [for] Asean Free Trade Area (AFTA) and [joining the] Asean Economic Community (AEC)" at The Metropole hotel in Phuket Town on April 28, Mr Alongkorn told Phuket to prepare to reap the economic benefits of AFTA, to come into effect in less than four years.

Thailand has much to benefit from its ASEAN partners, he said.

Trade among the ASEAN nations is projected to reach US\$ 1.7 trillion, with Thailand's estimated trade with the bloc valued at US\$ 200 billion. With such projections putting Thailand at the top of ASEAN's list, the government has made promoting trade among its ASEAN partners a priority, he said.

In light of this, Phuket should become the "Tourism Capital of ASEAN" by continuing to expand its tourism base and increase investments towards ASEAN tourism as a whole, Mr Alongkorn said.

However, the Commerce Deputy Minister said that Phuket must first develop a comprehensive, provincial level business development plan which clearly designates roles and time-lines.

The Deputy Minister explained that the ultimate aim should be to

connect Phuket markets with those of the rest of the world via AEC.

By implementing more intensive marketing campaigns targeting neighboring Bay of Bengal nations – home to a quarter of the world's population – Phuket can become a gateway for ASEAN tourism, he explained.

With a current combined population of more than 600 million among 10 member states, Alongkorn emphasized the importance of local marketing campaigns to realize the significance of ASEAN trade and economy as a whole, and not just

focus on Phuket and Thailand as independent entities.

In accordance with the AEC blueprint, the Deputy Minister declared that by 2015 "Asean will be a unified body of nations—whether speaking of its markets, base for production of goods and services, investing, and many other aspects."

Commenting on recent border clashes between Thai and Cambodian troops, the Deputy Minister assured everyone that the conflict would likely not have a negative impact on other important trade areas, citing that trade in the conflict zone amounted to about 5 per cent of all trade between the two countries.

The seminar, organized in conjunction with Phuket Rajabhat Institute, Department of Trade Negotiations, Ministry of Commerce and Phuket Provincial Commercial Office, attracted about 300 attendees.

The aim of the event was to establish a base of knowledge and readiness among the public, civil servants and public and private organizations.

The tech world is changing fast and so is the face of news, with much of it breaking on Twitter

NEWS of Osama bin Laden's death came to international attention when, around 11:40pm Washington time on Sunday night, US President Barack Obama announced that American forces had entered bin Laden's compound and killed him.

But if you'd been following Twitter starting more than two hours earlier – from about 10:30am in Phuket – you would've already known the whole story.

Obama verified the news story at 11:35pm, but Keith Urbahn – the chief of staff for

Donald Rumsfeld, who was Defense Secretary under Bush – broke the news at 10:25pm. His message: "So I'm told by a reputable person they have killed Osama Bin Laden. Hot damn."

While speculation was rife with all of the major news agencies that Obama would announce something much bigger than another shootout in Libya, and rumors were flying among reporters and writers and producers – aided and abetted by leaks from inside the White House itself – nobody in the major networks would get on the air and report a story that was about to unfold with the President at the center.

Instead, the Twitter universe lit up with the story, and had it nailed before the President stepped up to the microphone.


Don't get me wrong, 98 per cent of the stuff on Twitter is pure junk: teenage angst, rants and raves, useless garbage. But that other 2 per cent can be pure gold. And it's easier than you think to separate the wheat from the chaff.

The idea behind Twitter is pretty simple. You "follow" other people. Other people can "follow" you. Anybody can post a short

message, up to 140 characters, on Twitter. If you "follow" someone who posts a message, you'll see it when you log on to Twitter. (If you keep Twitter running on your PC, or on your phone, as I do, the message appears in your Twitter window.) If you post a message, the people who "follow" you can see it.

That's all there is to it. Twitter is a very simple one-to-many form of communication, kind of like SMSing all of the people who have agreed, in advance, that they want to receive your SMSs.

If you "follow" someone and you get tired of what they're "tweeting", you can

Twitter followers knew about the Bin Laden story an hour before the rest of the world.

"unfollow" them, no sweat, and you'll never see their tweets again. You're never forced to follow anybody. You can follow and unfollow at will.

I follow several news sources and a bunch of people in the computer industry. Twitter's turned into my major source of breaking news, in Thailand, in the computer industry, and in the world.

There's no magical tracking mechanism, no Big Tweet *Phu Yai Baan* in the Sky who keeps track of you – nothing like the iPhone tracking stuff. It's all anonymous, and very easy. Many people use Twitter on their phones, but you can also use it with a web browser, or on an iPad or Android tablet.

The right timeframe of investments

ONE of the biggest mistakes people often make in their finances is mismatching their investment horizons with the timeframe within which they will actually be using the money.

Many people presume that once they have retired, their entire nest egg should be treated equally.

The reality is that some of it will be spent within the first five years, some of it in five to 10 years, and the rest of after 10 years or more.

The first step is look at all the expenses expected to occur within the first five years of retirement, such as travel, ordinary living expenses, and any major purchases, such as a new car.

To this, add in an "emergency cushion". Exactly how much this should be is a matter of personal opinion, but it is generally better to err on the side of caution.

As five years is not long enough for investments with even a small amount of volatility to recover from a "hit", all of this reserve should be kept as cash in a fixed deposit at a bank, or an equivalent.

The main thing with this money is liquidity and avoiding any negative return whatsoever.

DOING FIVE TO TEN

Next, determine how much money is needed during the five to 10-

year period, given the current level of spending and any anticipated purchases during the period.

Here, a little movement in the wrong direction can be tolerated, but obviously nothing like a direct stock market investment, which may drop 50 per cent in one year and take a decade to recover.

This period is a bit short to consider real estate, although real estate can often be sold at a pretty gain within only a few years. The worst case scenario must be considered

when planning, and so I place real estate into a 10-year time frame just to be on the safe side.

THE LONG HAUL

The rest of the nest egg can be placed into just about anything that fits one's risk profile, as a decade or more is usually long enough for most asset classes to recover from any significant losses.

How much is reserved for this period is largely affected by how much of one's "liquid net worth" is eaten up by annual living expenses.

Liquid net worth basically means cash or investments that can be very quickly converted into cash. For most people liquid net worth is their total worth minus their real estate holdings.

If savings are very large in relation to living expenses, then people can obviously afford to take on much more risk, as poor investment performance will likely reduce only the amount left behind to loved ones.

If annual living expenses are large relative to savings, be very

careful to not lose any savings, as this will literally take food out of your mouth and cramp your lifestyle in your final years.

Since investments with a longer time horizon usually end up yielding larger returns, properly matching your actual needs should allow the highest overall return on your money without getting you into a pinch where you have to sell investments at a bad time to put food on the table.

Overall, it is better to have more money in the bank than less, since life tends to find an endless number of ways to force unforeseen expenses on us.

But keeping too much money in the bank can mean not gaining returns that could provide an extra holiday, a nicer car, a bigger inheritance for your loved ones, or whatever else it is that you could do with the extra cash.

Diabetes forum unites sufferers

Living with diabetes abroad can be challenging at times, but now one woman has made it easier for diabetics in Phuket to share information and support

DIABETICS and those living with diabetes on Phuket now have a support forum to help with all aspects of managing this chronic metabolic disease.

Fiona Smith is a Type 1 diabetic and established the group some time ago, but expansion only occurred after a meeting with Woody Leonhard, a Phuket Gazette contributor and Type 2 diabetic himself. Once the diabetes connection had been made, particular beneficial knowledge came to light.

"I'd been informed by my local pharmacist that I couldn't get my insulin here in Phuket, but

within five minutes of meeting Woody, I discovered that all I needed to do was go to Super Cheap," Fiona recalls.

Up to this point, the group had focused solely on those with Type 1 diabetes, but Fiona then broadened the group's scope to include not only people who had been diagnosed with the disease, but also those whose lives are directly affected, such as family members, friends and health professionals.

Rationale for the forum is simply to share information and offer support among its members for all aspects relating to living with diabetes on Phuket.

"Our members can tell each

other who to contact for certain things, where to get specific supplies and how to cope with different situations," Fiona said.

Currently the forum deals with expat experiences, but Fiona hopes that they will eventually attract Thai members, or that they might be inspired to set up their own Thai language group.

"To the best of my knowledge, Type 2 diabetes is a huge issue in Thailand. I would imagine that there is a real need for some support out there," Fiona suggests.

She's right. Diabetes is Thailand's fastest growing disease. According to Thailand's Ministry of Public Health, more than three

million people in Thailand are diagnosed with diabetes. In 1995, global figures indicated 135 million had diabetes with a projected rise to 300 million by 2025, and economically developing countries such as Thailand will account for two thirds of this estimated number.

"Knowing where to get your medication and other paraphernalia is an issue here and they can be quite expensive. Back in our home countries, as it's a chronic disease, the government subsidizes everything you require in recognition of the fact that if you don't get it, you die, simple as that," Fiona said.

With these figures and facts in mind, it would seem the diabetes forum will be a necessary support network for many on Phuket.

Understanding the difference between Type 1 and 2 is an important aspect of living with the disease.

In simple terms, insulin is a hormone, or

messenger between cells in the body, produced by the pancreas.

This hormone is vital to the process of removing excess glucose, a simple sugar, from our blood which if allowed to build up, becomes toxic and The Facebook group logo potentially fatal.

Build up of glucose is more commonly known as a high blood sugar level (HBSL).

Diabetes is the name given to the condition whereby the body loses the ability to produce insulin (Type 1) or becomes resistant to its own hormone (Type 2).

The cause of Type 1 is still unknown, but is believed to be a genetic immune system malfunction, while Type 2 is believed to be caused primarily by lifestyle.

"HBSLs increase the development of long-term complications, but you can bring down your HBSL with good lifestyle management. Low blood sugar levels however, can be very dangerous and lead to comas and even death. This has been my experience. I can only assume that the medical community don't like to overwhelm you when you are first diagnosed. I had no idea about seizures and didn't find out until I woke up with the paramedics beside me and surrounded by my family one Christmas morning,' Fiona remembers.

Woody Leonhard recounts his own painful experience when he understood his daily life would

"I slipped on ice and broke my leg. It was a compound fracture and the bone became infected. Bone infections can be dangerous and persistent. Mine was both. The doc-

tors watched my blood sugar, and it peaked just before I started showing signs of infection. The only solution was to bring down the sugar levels with insulin. I've been taking insulin daily

since," he said. Fiona and

Woody are working hard to develop their online self-help group on Facebook.

They hope to increase awareness of diabetes and open lines of communication for all those living with the condition. Who knows, with your help, maybe solutions can be found.

USS Ronald Reagan arrives in Phuket

Japan to Phuket, disaster to detox

THE moment a massive earthquake and tsunami struck Japan on March 11, a nuclear-powered floating city was en route to Pusan, Korea on a "routine western Pacific deployment" with more than 4,500 men and women on board.

On March 12, the floating city - the USS Ronald Reagan aircraft carrier – and its strike group made up of the USS Chancellorsville and USS Preble were re-directed to the eastern coast of Japan near Sendai, one of the areas hardest hit by the tsunami.

The "Reagan" was the first United States military craft on-station in what was named Operation Tomodachi (friend in Japanese), a US\$ 80 million US Armed Forces took all 4,500 sailors on board to disaster relief effort for Japan, the ship's commanding officer Captain Thom Burke said after arriving in Ao Makham on Sunday.

The 1,092 foot-long super-carrier and accompanying vessels carrying about 7,000 men and women - arrived in Phuket on Sunday morning for R&R and local community service after finishing the humanitarian mission in Japan.

"It was heartbreaking," Capt Burke told the *Gazette* of his experience in Japan.

"It was absolutely devastating. I mean, one picture does not do it – you had to see the whole panorama of destruction. It was just tragic, absolutely tragic. But the Japanese people were very stoic and very brave in dealing with this serious tragedy," he said.

"Our job was to give immediate assistance, to go find people who were stranded," he said.

Chief Petty Officer (CPO) Steven Harbour of the ship's Public Affairs Office told the Gazette, "The helicopters were dropping thousands of pounds a day of medical supplies, food, water and

even pet food - there were a lot of stray pets," he said.

"It was a full-scale operation that come together, and we came together as one big team. We really made a difference and it's something we're all proud of," he said.

According to the US Navy, the Reagan cost US\$ 4.5bn to build and US\$ 1mn "daily to fully operate".

Regarding the ship's involvement in Operation Tomodachi, CPO Harbour said, "When dealing with human life, I don't like putting a price tag on it -I mean there's no price tag on a human life."

The supercarrier's deployment in Japan was not without incident.

"During Operation Tomodachi, we did get within about 100 miles from the reactor plant that was having all those problems [Fukushima Dai-ichi] and one day got a little bit of what I call a 'dusting' of activity from that plant," Captain Burke said.

"We spent the next three weeks washing and cleaning, scrubbing the entire flight deck, the entire outside of the ship and cleaning the aircraft to get rid of it all.

"The dusting we got was very, very small and not a concern for the health of the crew, but something we needed to clean off and get rid of, which we have done,"

The Carrier Strike Group Seven left the area on April 5 and after a brief stopover in Sasebo Japan, set sail for Phuket.

"It's a great pleasure to be here in Thailand," Capt Burke said.

"My crew is very excited to be here. They've been working very hard and this is a chance for them to relax and see the tremendous culture here in Thailand.



Soi Dog Phuket facing closure, B5mn needed

After eight years of rescuing and treating stray dogs, the Soi Dog foundation Phuket is under threat

THE Soi Dog Foundation's future (SDF) on Phuket is uncertain.

Currently situated on 11.5 rai in Mai Khao, the foundation, which has been tackling Phuket's severe stray dog problem since 2003, purchased half of the site in 2009.

They are now facing pressure from the landowner to buy the other half, which SDF currently utilizes, by October for 10 million baht – something they simply do not have the funds to do.

"Many crucial facilities are on

the unpurchased land. The land SDF owns outright is not big enough to accommodate all our facilities," SDF Director John Dalley explains.

SDF houses some 250 dogs at any given time, in shelters and dog runs, and there is also a hospital and staff accommodation on-site.

All this demands plenty of space. SDF has managed to raise 5mn baht worth of funds for the land, and needs to raise the rest in six months, or the land will be bought by one of two commercial organizations that have expressed interest in it.

The recent outbreak of canine distemper among Phuket's stray dogs increased SDF's operating costs enormously and unexpectedly. The vaccination program has cost them over a quarter of a million baht on top of the 1mn baht

Pencilling humor into peoples lives

Dutch artist Iskander Walen visits Phuket on his Asia tour promoting cartoons as a form of expression

THE provocative and amusing work of Dutch artist Iskander Walen is everywhere, even on Phuket.

His art has been exhibited in Paris and Singapore, featuring regularly in Today newspaper, FHM and I-S magazines to name a few, as well as being published in two best-selling books.

His popularity lies in the simplicity of his art. Whether it's a sculpture of a bomb with a woman's breast protruding from it, or a cartoon mocking society, Iskander's work appeals to the masses in its universality and humor.

Last weekend two workshops held at Phuket International Acad-

For the past year Iskander has been teaching cartoon workshops around Asia in a bid to spread this message.

"All people, no matter how inexpressive, have world views and imagination to some degree.



"Cartooning helps them to present and communicate these ideas, which are key to human development," he says.

"My experience here [in Phuket] has confirmed what I already know. Cartoon drawing is not only for a certain group of people. The students here are all very qualified and it is not over their heads at all," he says.

At the PIA cartoon workshops, Iskander introduced his students to a number of techniques: developing a character, how to draw facial and bodily expressions, and where to place a speech bubble.

But Iskander says being a good cartoonist is not all about skill.

"The best cartoons are not the most beautifully drawn, they are the most interesting. Charlie Brown is really just a variation of a stick man," he says.

The work produced during the workshops showcased the students' individuality, with

the cartoons expressing everything from slap-stick humor to social commentary.

"Cartooning is for everyone, it's less daunting than other art forms. It's second only to photography





Get ready for take off, it's Fun Fly 2011

PHUKET Fun Fly, the paragliding competition that captivated tourists and local residents alike in May last year, will return to the skies above Nai Harn Beach and Phromthep Cape from June 23 to 26.

Among the activities, to be held from 8am to 6pm each day, will be spot landing and fun fly competitions as well as activities on Nai Harn Beach.

The paragliding photo contest, which resulted in some of the most stunning photos of Phuket to date being published, will also return, this year branded the Canon Photo Contest 2011.

"The event is being held to promote paragliding and as preparation for the Asian Beach Games in November 2014, as paragliding is one of the competitive sports

in those games," said Narong Promjitta, managing director of event organizer BMS. Last year 52 paragliders took part in the competition.

"Currently, 40 paragliders have confirmed they will take part this year. I expect about 60 paragliders in total will join the event in June," said Dr Prasert Theplaong, president of the Phuket Paragliding Club.

Sky-high joyriders wanting to be taken for a "tandem ride" can register at a booth set up on Nai Harn Beach. The cost is 800 baht per flight.

The tandem rides take off near the wind turbines on Khao Daeng, just north of Phromthep Cape.

Each tandem flight will last five to 15 minutes and land on Nai Harn Beach, said Dr Prasert.





Railroading Thailand

A look back to when railways came to Thailand in the 20th century, making travel all the more easy

HM KING Rama V's government ushered in an era of modernization that changed Siam for the better. By the end of his reign in the early 20th railway system that revolutionized travel in a country covered with thick tropical forest. HM King Rama V was also the first monarch to extensively tour his own Thai king to ever visit Phuket

By the end of HM King Rama V's reign, railway tracks had reached the south of the kingdom. In 1929, two years after he was crowned, HM King

Thailand on a royal tour of the region. On that occasion he decided to visit Phuket as well.

During that period, Phuket Town grown into an important trading center in the region. It was also the

Monthon Phuket, a large administrative territory which included the provinces of Phuket, Ranong, Phang Nga, Krabi and Satun.

HM The King left Bangkok on January 24, 1929. The royal visit was planned to coincide with Chinese New Year, since the south had a sizeable Thai-Chinese population. According to government records, the 12 carriage royal train left Chitrladda Station in Bangkok with HM The King and Queen, and an entourage of 91 dignitaries and servants. The train arrived in Patthalung the

century, Siam had a functioning following day. The royal entourage stayed and toured the region for a few days, visiting Trang, Ranong and Phang Nga, before sailing to Phuket aboard a royal steam ship, the first Maha Chakri.

HM The King arrived in Phuket kingdom, making him the first on the morning of January 31. The High Commissioner of Monthon Phuket, HSH Prince Sakdidet Chayakul, was on hand to greet their majesties.

HM The King and Queen Rampaipanne were later given a night tour of Phuket Town from Rama VII visited the south of their car. Their first night in Phuket


> ended with a local performance that was prepared to welcome the royal couple.

It comes as no surprise that HM The King's royal tour of Thailand's south would include a visit to

center of government for Phuket Town since it was an important seat of government. However in his address at Phuket's government hall, HM The King told the audience why he was eager to visit Phuket.

> "I feel it is important for me to personally see the geography of the town and observe the activities here first hand," HM The King said during his address.

> "Secondly, it is important for me to be personally acquainted with the people of Monthon Phuket, including government officials, religious figures, teachers, merchants and citizens. From ancient times it has been traditional for Siamese rulers and his

subjects to unite and work together in good and bad times. Therefore, if I can learn more from visiting this area, it will help me to rule and bring greater prosperity to my citizens," HM The King said on February 1, 1929. Later that day HM The King

and Queen visited Kosit Viharn Temple and also took a trip to Chalong Bay to observe an ore dredging vessel at work.

The Phuket that HM The King saw on his 1929 visit had changed significantly since his father HM King Rama V visited, decades earlier. Phuket Town was one of the most multicultural places in all of Siam, with people from many ethnic groups living and working together. Modern machinery had been imported and used extensively in tin mining, which meant that more tin was being mined and more income generated than ever before.

The Phuket City Hall, built in 1910 when Kor Sim Bee was High Commissioner, was the first building in Thailand to use

reinforced concrete. The island also got its first electricity plant during this period.

Due to flourishing international trade on the island, Standard Chartered, the first foreign bank in Thailand, also opened a branch in Phuket Town during this period, upon Kor Sim Bee's request. In addition, the town was well facilitated with parks, roads and even tennis lawns for the rich and upper class. It was a thriving and prosperous town that was the pride of southern Thailand.

On February 2, their majesties visited some of the schools in Phuket Town, including Songtek School and Hua-Bhun School. The Hua-Bhun School building that their majesties visited in 1929 now serves as the Phuket Thai-Hua Museum. Later that day HM The King also visited Vachira Hospital and that evening, the royal couple visited Chalong Temple before returning to their royal pavilion in Rawai to spend the night.

HM The King spent his next few days touring the island's tin mines observing the different methods used in mining. He also visited the Thalang waterfall on February 4. On the afternoon of February 5, a group of foreign miners invited their majesties to attend a tennis tournament. HM The King and Queen honored their request and watched the tournament at the United Club in Phuket Town.

After seven days of touring and relaxing in Phuket, their majesties, along with their entourage departed Phuket for Trang railway station, where they boarded the royal train and returned to Bangkok.







Surviving World War II

Hillenbrand pens the story of a true hero...

LAURA Hillenbrand wrote a book about her equine hero *Seabiscuit*. Her book, *Seabiscuit*: *An American Legend* came out in 2003 and was made into a fabulously successful movie. She then spent the next seven years writing about a human hero.

Louis Zamperini was an Olympic runner, a World War II bombardier, survived a 47-day life raft ordeal in the Pacific and endured over two years of brutal Japanese captivity. In her acknowledgments at the

end of her book, the author recalls that Louis told her, "I'll be an easier subject than Seabiscuit because I can talk".

And talk he did, over the course of 75 interviews. The result is *Unbroken* (Fourth Estate, London, 2011, 473pp), subtitled "An Extraordinary True Story of Courage and Endurance".

Louie Zamperini did not seem destined for greatness. Born in 1917 in a small Californian town of Torrance, Louie mostly distinguished himself by petty thievery. Pushed by his elder brother, Louie turned to track and field and made it to the 1936 Olympics in Berlin.

Just short of graduation from the University of California, he joined the Army Air Force, trained as a bombardier aboard a B-24 Liberator and was sent to Hawaii.

Stationed to a tiny speck of an island

named Funafuti, the crew was badly shot up in a raid over the phosphorous-rich island of Nauru.

Afterward, they counted 594 holes in the planes fuselage. In vengeance, the Japanese bombed Funafuti.

Hillenbrand describes the action vividly as the bombs stomp closer like giant steps to the native hut where Louie and his pilot Allen Philips (Phil), are huddling in terror.

"An instant later, everything was scald-


ing whiteness and splintering noise. The ground heaved, and the air whooshed around, carrying an acrid smell.

Trees blew apart. "A bomb struck the tent in which Louie and Phil had been sleeping a minute before. Another burst beside a pile of men in a ditch, and something speared into the back of the man on top.

He said, "This feels like it, boys," and passed out. A bomb hit the ordnance truck, sending it into the air in thousands of pieces."

Sent on an air rescue mission in a faulty plane, Louie and Phil are forced to crash land in the South Pacific. They are the only survivors, except for the tailgunner who later dies. They drift westward for 3,000 miles, tormented by hunger and thirst and exposure to the relentless sun.

They fight off sharks, and miraculously

escape strafing by a Japanese bomber. They survive on rainwater and the occasional fish and seabird.

They are then picked up by a Japanese warship. After initial kind treatment in a hospital, they are launched into the horrors of a Japanese prison camp. He describes his first prison experience on the atoll of Kwajalein.

"When the guards weren't venting their fury at the captives, they entertained themselves by humiliating them. Every day, at gunpoint, Louie was forced to stand up and dance, staggering through the Charleston while his guards roared with laughter.

"The guards made Louis whistle and sing, pelted him with fistfuls of gravel, taunted him as he crawled around his cell to pick up bits of rice, and slid long sticks through the door window so they could stab and swat him, finding his helpless condition hilarious".

Louie was sent to three prison camps in Japan. Besides the privation and heavy labor, he was the victim of sadistic guards, especially one known as "the Bird", whom had a particular hatred for the famous Louis Zamperini.

He beat him constantly with fists, clubs and belt buckles. On a list of war criminals at the end of the war, "the Bird" was ranked number seven.

When he returned to the US, Louie was tormented by post traumatic stress and nightmares about "the Bird". Hatred consumed him and turned him to drink.

"During the war, 'the Bird' had been unwilling to let go of Louie; after the war, Louie was unable to let go of the Bird," Hillenbrand observes.

The story of Louie's ultimate redemption can only be called inspiring. He's now still alive and skateboarding, at the ripe old age of 94.

THE non-fiction *Wife, Interrupted* is one of those books you can't help but burn through, but would probably rather not be seen out and about with.


At just 200-odd pages, and with the spacing and font a 10-year-old could manage, it has all the tell-tale signs of a trashy, guilty-pleasure book.



Experts bullish on property

WHAT is the "sweet spot" in today's real-estate marketplace?

That was the question posed at the American Chamber of Commerce Thailand's Greater Phuket Chapter and *Property Report South East Asia*'s resort markets seminar on April 29.

David Simister, Chairman of CBRE Thailand, Antony Picon of Colliers International Thailand, Duangjai Kraus, Managing Director of Engel & V lkers Thailand and Andrew Langdon, Senior Vice President of Jones Lang LaSalle Hotels were on-hand to share their expertise at the Holiday Inn, Patong.

The answer to the question posed at the seminar is, rest assured, still "Phuket". However, there is competition out there.

The Phuket market continues

to do well, especially on the West Coast, with more property transactions taking place in the first quarter of 2011 than the same period last year, Mr Simister of CBRE Thailand said.

The profile of typical buyers is changing. However, with more Russian and Indian investors entering the market, he said.

"Quality still sells," Mr Simister said. Finding a good location with an impressive view is key, he added. "Phuket's maturing and I think that's good."

Investment in the Bali property market, often touted as a competitor to Phuket, is only about half of current investment in Phuket, he said. Cambodia, which has the best foreign ownership structure in the region, may be the next sweet spot, he said.

"If you're new [to property in-

vestment], buy in Cambodia in the next 10 years," Mr Simister said.

Antony Picon of Colliers International Thailand spoke about the upcoming Pattaya market.

"Pattaya is not what you thought it was. It's becoming an international city," he said.

The arrival of Central Festival shopping mall has attracted a new type of tourist, including many domestic tourists. He expects Pattaya to further develop as a shopping destination, he said.

Duangiai Kraus of Engel & V lkers spoke of market invest-

ment in Hua Hin, which she said was restricted due to high costs. The limited amount of beachfront area and entertainment were factors in the higher price tags for premium properties, she said.

Andrew Langdon of Jones Lang LaSalle spoke about the hotel market in Thailand.

His company has been behind the sale of several major hotels in Phuket including the Dusit Thani Laguna Phuket and the Laguna Beach Resort Phuket.

Phuket and Bangkok are driving the Thai hotel market and Chiang

Mai is no longer a player, he said.

Thailand bottomed out in terms of hotel transaction volume in 2009, but is bouncing back strongly with 2011 volumes already greater than all of 2010.

Asian investors were responsible for virtually all new hotel investments in Asia in 2010 and were also emerging as major players in the international market.

"Well located resorts in Thailand in established resort destinations such as Phuket and Koh Samui continue to attract serious investor interest." he said.

AS FAR back as I can recall in the dark and blurred place of my childhood memory I remember time spent in our family's front yard.

Growing up in suburban Los Angeles with long summer days and the Santa Ana winds howling beneath palm trees there was little shelter from the blistering heat.

My mother taught me to throw a baseball in the front yard (dad was working). We camped out in a small tent some nights and played pickup games of football, soccer and volleyball with kids from the block on the crab grass turf.

Our neighborhood was our kingdom and we roamed the collective yards of our friends from the time school let out up to the time darkness cast a blanket over the city and the call for dinner came through the wind.

Going back to California from time to time and driving along those familiar streets with ghosts and goblins of days past, I have rarely seen people in the front yards of their homes. Even Jehovah's Witnesses seemed to be missing.



Knowing the lay of the land on leases

DUE TO legal restrictions applying to foreign property buyers in Thailand, leases have become a popular and widely used option to legally acquire interest in land or property.

Typically, developers offer their buyers residential lease arrangements comprising an initial lease period of 30 years and, in addition, two lease extensions, each 30 years. This provides for a total term of 90 years.

Having a look at the Thai Civil and Commercial Code (CCC) may help you to understand why this structure, consisting of a relatively short initial lease term plus renewal options of the same duration, is common. Section 540 of the CCC stipulates that the maximum lease period for an immovable property is 30 years. Section 540 of the CCC further states that this period may be renewed, but it must not exceed 30 years from the time of renewal.

Although the CCC allows residential leases of immovable property for a term of 30 years and renewal of such lease, a buyer should be aware that a number of potential issues exist in connection with the renewal of a lease.

First of all any renewal clause being part of a lease agreement should include as a minimum requirement its term and a consideration. The consideration should be a reasonable rental fee payable for the extension of the lease.


A buyer should further understand that there is no lease in perpetuity which puts a buyer in a legal position which is equivalent to ownership. However, it shall be mentioned that some developers have implemented sophisticated corporate structures where the power to renew the lease shall be vested with the lessee.

Also a lease of immovable property which is longer than three years is only enforceable if it is made in writing and registered with the competent land office. This applies not only to the initial lease but also to any renewal thereof, thus requiring both landlord and tenant or their proxies to co-operate and attend at the com-

petent land office to affect the registration of the initial lease agreement, and upon its expiry, the registration of a new lease agreement. This means that there is no such thing providing for an automatic renewal of a lease; upon expiry of each 30-year lease term, execution of a new lease agreement and registration by the parties or their proxies at the competent land office is required.

Another important point to understand is that there might be issues when it comes to enforcement of a lease renewal against third parties. For instance in a case where a lease assignment or transfer of a lease from the original to a new lessee has taken place, a landlord may argue that he is not bound to renew the lease in favor of the new lessee upon expiry of the initial lease term. Also where the owner of a leased land or property sells or transfers such to a third party, the buyer of the land or property, may raise the objection that he is not obligated to renew the lease upon its expiry.

In the light of the above and in order to strengthen the competitiveness of Thailand's property market, it would certainly help if

the relevant laws would change and provide for reasonably longer lease terms making lease renewals redundant.

In the meantime, there is nothing else for it but to diligently investigate what safeguards for the protection of a lease, particularly its renewals, are potentially

available and to verify whether a developer is able and prepared to provide such for the peace of mind of his buyers.

Nurturing plant nursery growth

Healthy potassium, phosphorus and nitrogen levels in the soil are as important to plants as vitamins are to babies

A FEW weeks ago we took a look at the pH levels in local soil - with the aid of an excellent American testing kit.

This kit also enables you to test for three key ingredients present in any fertile soil - potassium (sometimes referred to as potash), phosphorus, and nitrogen.

Put crudely, their relationship with plants is a bit like that between vitamins/minerals, and people. As long as we get our necessary daily intake, we should feel ok, be better able to function, maintain our immune systems, and resist disease. That's the theory anyway.

It's a good idea to check plants in containers where the mix may have been weakened by constant watering.

Since it is the only essential plant nutrient not naturally present in plants, potassium is the key nutrient in helping to combat stress caused by, for instance, extremes of hot or cold, drought conditions, or the depredations of pests.

Without trying to get too technical, it ensures that regular supplies of water are absorbed by the root system, and thence into the tubes or xylem which transport water to the plant's visible parts by a process known as osmosis or osmo-regulation.

The tell-tale sign of potash starvation is a yellowing (chlorosis) of the older foliage, curling of leaf blades and burning at the edges.

Left unattended, the plant will die back and may succumb.

You probably won't have to worry about that happening here, it is much more likely to affect coolerclimate veggies such as tomatoes, potatoes, gooseberries

and red or black currants.

Phosphorus is another of those key elements necessary for sound plant growth. It needs to be mixed with water before your garden can absorb it properly.

As with potassium, it occurs

If you do have a pH level above 7.3, you will probably need to add something such as sulphur, compost, peat moss, or even sawdust

Crucially, phosphorus helps in converting the sun's energy into usable food. Without adequate supplies, plants will produce poor root systems and stunted flowers and fruit.

In the rainy season, this practice will lead to run-off of the excess chemicals, and they may find their way into the water table, and finally into streams and

FC Phuket climb to fourth

PHUKET FC demolished Thai Honda 6-1 at Surakul Stadium last Sunday in a commanding performance that propelled the team to fourth place in Thai Division 1 with two games in hand.

But the victory was bittersweet for the Southern Sea Kirin with the news that forward Thawin Butsombat's season is probably over after he sustained a broken ankle.

Phuket opened the flood-gates early with Nene Bi Tra Sylvestre netting a header from close range in the third minute.

Thai Honda responded with some sustained pressure, and Chaiphon Wangnukun's attempted strike from 22 yards glided just over the crossbar.

The Kirin had a chance to make it 2-0 in the 11th minute when Thawin Butsombat made a run down the left wing, supplying an unmarked Kone Adama in the penalty area, whose strike deflected off defender Henri Walter, into the side netting.

From there, Phuket managed to constrain the visitors in midfield, with the superb Thawin continuing to pile on the pressure.

The forward's efforts were to be rewarded just before half-time. when he struck the ball home from inside the penalty area after Niran

Phanthong's effort was deflected into his path.

Unfortunately, a desperate lunge from Henri Walter attempting to prevent Thawin's strike, connected with the FC Phuket player's foot and left him writhing in agony.

Thawin was stretchered off and taken to Bangkok Hospital, where it was revealed that his ankle was broken in two places. A doctor said the recovery could

take six months, with Thawin unlikely to make another appearance for the Kirin this season.

The second half saw a ferocious onslaught from the Kirin, even with a Thai Honda consolation goal doing little to halt the momentum.

Seven minutes in, Ivory Coast midfielder Abdol Coulibaly put FC Phuket up 3-0 after breaking from the Thai Honda defense to nod in a corner from Sarat Yuyen.

In the 62nd minute, a run by

Adama down the left wing ended with a pass into the box which found Korean midfielder Choi Jaewon, who sneaked past a sleeping Thai Honda defense to slot the ball home from the penalty spot, bringing the scoreline to 4-0.

It wasn't to go entirely Phuket's way. Six minutes later, a Thai Honda free kick from just off the right corner spot found the head of Isidon Lomtuakok, glancing onto the crossbar.

Thai Honda's Nana Yaw Asamoah was first to react to the rebound and his header beat FC Phuket keeper Thirawat Pinpradap, to put the score at 4-1.

That was the last of it for Thai Honda, however, as Man of the Match Adama ended the game with a brace in the closing stages.

The first came at the 79th minute, after midfielder Nithirot Sokuma's shot from well outside the box was parried by Thai Honda keeper Jirasak. Adama hit the loose ball home to hoist FC Phuket's tally to five.

With one more goal, the match ended shortly after with a deserved scoreline of 6-1 for FC Phuket.

FC Phuket now sit in fourth place in Division 1 with 17 points and two games in hand. The result of previous week's abandoned match against Bangkok FC is still awaiting a decision by the Thai Premier League.

The Kirin are two points behind Rai Pracha, who are eight points behind leaders Buriram FC and BBCU, both on 27 points.

On Sunday FC Phuket play 14thplaced Customs United away, with a chance to move into third place if Raj Pracha lose away to eighth-placed Songkhla on Saturday.

Thailand football legends gear up for mighty clash

THE clash of legends on Phuket is but six weeks away. In mid-June, a team of former Thailand internationals hope to turn back the clock and take the game to a potent force of illustrious former Liverpool FC players.

One of the most celebrated strikers ever to wear a 'war elephants' shirt is Piyapong Pue On. A national hero, he has represented Thailand on 129 occasions between 1981 and 1999. With an astonishing 103 goals, he still holds the record as this country's most prolific scorer.

Piyapong has been given the task of managing the Thailand team which will challenge Liverpool FC for the Prime Minister's Cup on June 13 in Bangkok and on June 18 in Phuket.

Proceeds from the charity matches will go to support the Youth Football Home foundation in Thalang.

"I was asked to be player/manager about three months ago and it is a great honor to have this responsibility," said Piyapong.

"The games are for a great cause, but I relish the opportunity to play against this great team and the players, I know, are very much looking forward to the challenge,"

Piyapong, an active officer in the Royal Thai Air Force, played for their football team from 1977 to 1984, then served as their manager from 1997 to 2008.

Scouted by South Korean K-League team Lucky-Goldstar Hwangso [now FC Seoul] in 1984, Piyapong was such an inspiration the club was crowned champions

him the accolade of the league's top scorer – the first time a foreign player had ever done so and a feat unrepeated un-

til 1999. "I come from a generation of amateur players. We played with much more spirit than those in the modern game. Nowadays the players are

professional athletes. They can analyze and compare games and playing techniques, which greatly improves performance. It's a different motivation when you play for big salaries, as opposed to playing just for the love of the game," Piyapong said.

The day after Piyapong's Thailand team face Liverpool, the full national squad were due to play Bahrain with hopes of qualifying

goals in 21 games, which also won for the 2012 London Olympics, but have now been eliminated due to fielding an allegedly illegal player.

"This is unfortunate. They had

a good chance to go forward in the competition. But we are moving in the right direction and if the team's results and fortunes improve, we should see a big impact in about four years," he said.

"Right now I want to focus on the Liverpool games. We are helping a worthy cause so I won't put too much pressure on my players, but I expect a great game and look forward to socializing with players and supporters," Piyapong said.

Kiatisak Senamuang, named as player-coach for the two-game rubber, is as much a household name in Thailand as Piyapong.

Nicknamed "Zico", he has been

capped 130 times for Thailand, but his goal tally ranges from 63 to 100 due to a conflict with FIFA over international appearances.

He currently manages Big Bang Chulalongkorn University FC, currently second place in Division 1 of the Thai League, two places above FC Phuket.

Kiatisak's playing career began with Krung Thai Bank. From there he had spells in Singapore and Vietnam and one season in England with Huddersfield Town FC under Steve Bruce.

"This not my first time facing Liverpool. We drew 1-1 in 2009 and I exchanged my shirt with Sami Hyypia after the game," he recalls.

"I hope many Thai people come to the game. It would be a great help to our team to have lots of support when we play these world-class players," Kiatisak

"Obviously we don't have the same abilities as when we were younger, but given the chance I'll

> Asked for his response to the Olympic qualifying debacle, Kiatisak reflected the Thai players disappointment.

> "This is a big mistake, but we're not sure where the problem stems from. The Asian Football Confederation have placed the blame on Thailand, but they must look at their responsibility in the matter. The team is very upset, but are willing to get involved to clear the issue," Kiatisak said.

> "In the end, the Legends game is for charity and we hope to provide entertainment for football fans and raise awareness for this cause," Kiatisak added.

> The Legends game kicks off on June 18 at 6.30pm in aid of Phuket's Youth Football Home.

War Elephants out of Olympics

THE Football Association of Thailand (FAT) are appealing Monday's disqualification of their national team from the Asian Football Confederation's Pre-Olympic Tournament.

The AFCs Disciplinary Committee cited the inclusion and fielding of defender Sucharit Chanthakul in Thailand's game against Palestine on February 23 at Suphachalasai Stadium in Bangkok as the reason for elimination.

According to the AFC, Sucharit has not served a ban from a red card received against Uzbekistan during the 2008 Under-19 AFC Championship in Saudi Arabia.

FAT believe their appeal carries weight based on two arguments.

Sucharit was in Thailand's national squad in last year's Asian Games but was not capped. Not

playing in the tournament will be submitted as application of Sucharit's suspension.

Liability for the mistake may rest with the AFC, according to FAT. Match Commissioners should be aware of eligible and ineligible players. Verification of all players and management names is the responsibility of the commissioner. Secretary-general of FAT, Ong-art Korsinkha said Sucharit's name was not offered as ineligible in the meeting prior to the game.

Thailand were due to play against Bahrain in Bangkok on June 19, following the Liverpool Legends match against Thailand Legends in Phuket on June 18.

Bahrain have already replaced Thailand on official fixture lists for the AFC tournament.
