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Tsunami towers 'unsound': Locals

OFFICIALS in Bangkok say all 19 tsunami warning towers in Phuket are operational and functioning correctly, yet some local residents say they haven't heard the sirens sound for months.

The towers are supposed to be tested by a playing of the national anthem at regularly-scheduled times twice a month.

But Siriprapa Auychai, a 29year-old masseuse who works at the south end of Patong Beach, told the Gazette that no one she knows has heard the tower near the bridge at the south end of the beach sound since about December last year.

"Actually, the towers need to be taken care of and need to be cleaned. They are located near the beach, where they are prone to rust – but they are just being left," she said.

The other two towers along Patong Beach appear to be operating normally, however.

A lounge chair operator working near the police box at the end of Bangla Road said he heard the anthem played on schedule on May

1, while two motorbike taxi drivers in front of Kalim School confirmed they heard the tower at the nearby Sunset Beach resort sound at the same time.

Down in Karon, people report hearing a variety of sounds emitted from the tsunami warning tower in front of the Hilton Phuket Arcadia Resort & Spa Hotel, including the sound of crackling

Taxi drivers in front of the tower, one of two in Karon, said it had been months since they heard a recognizable noise from the tower.

"The last time we heard the national anthem played from the tower was about two months ago," said Udomporn Jaipiang, 39.

"Sometimes I hear noises coming from the speakers that sound like an electrical short circuit inside," he added.

"So we just keep an eye on sea instead to see if a tsunami is actually coming," he added.

The other warning tower in Karon, located near Karon Park near the Nong Harn Lake, also appears worse for wear.

'The speaker is rusty. I've heard that officials will fix it, but I haven't seen any of them yet," said one beach guard.

Despite these accounts, officials deny the warning towers are in need of repair.

San Jantharawong, chief of the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM-Phuket) that is responsible for maintaining the towers, told the Gazette, "The

B30mn of cocaine seized in airport arrests

SIX kilograms of cocaine were seized by officers in two separate arrests at Phuket International Airport this week.

Swiss national Peter Balmer, 47, was arrested on Monday after being found in possession four kilos of cocaine in the form of "black cocaine" mats.

In the second bust, about 11pm Tuesday night, Thai national Pimpisa "Ja" Piangyotha, 39, was nabbed by officers with two kilos of pure cocaine in her luggage. She was reportedly bound for Bangkok.

Lt Col Prawit Engchuan of Phuket City

Police said officers were tipped off by an unnamed informant that a large drug shipment from South America was expected to arrive in Thailand via Phuket Airport this week.

City police then coordinated with airport immigration and customs officers, along with officers from Tah Chat Chai. All were on high alert, he said.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pekad Tantipong said police believe the two suspects were part of the same network.

However, Balmer and Pimpisa claimed not to know each other before their arrest.

Balmer told the Gazette that he didn't know the "black stuff" was cocaine until the police told him.

He arrived at Phuket airport about 4pm. Customs officers became suspicious after scanning his luggage. A thorough inspection revealed the two black sheets of cocaine, each weighing two kilos, concealed in the sides of his suitcase.

Pimpisa also claimed ignorance. She told

the Gazette that a friend she identified only as "Mike", a black man she barely knew and met only six months earlier, sponsored her a two-week holiday to Brazil, covering all expenses. He gave her US\$2,000 spending money, she said.

On the day of her return, a Brazilian friend of Mike placed a bag into her luggage to be delivered to Mike when she returned to Bangkok, she said.

Officers said the drugs from both busts had a combined street wholesale value of 20 million baht.

At going rates, the combined haul had a maximum street retail value of 33mn baht, they added.

warning towers are tested by playing the national anthem on the 1st and 16th of every month.

"The towers still work. We have not received any reports otherwise, not from our own officers or from local authorities or from local residents."

Chief San added that the National Disaster Warning Center (NDWC), which is responsible for issuing tsunami warnings, has confirmed that all 19 warning towers in the six Andaman provinces were operational.

NDWC Director Somsak

Khaosuwan told the Gazette, "We have not received any complaints about the warning towers, which we regularly inspect."

However, he added that the alarm currently used by the towers sounds the same as an ambulance siren or other emergency vehicle.

"This might confuse people, so we will change the alarm so people will instantly recognize what it is," he said.

Investigation continues into tourist diver's death

POLICE have yet to make any arrests in the investigation into the death of Japanese tourist Hitomi Shibata, Chalong Police Duty Officer Attawat Suwannarat confirmed this week

'We have not arrested or pressed charges against anyone as we still have to question the boat driver and the crew about what happened first," said Lt Attawat, who is leading the investigation.

Lt Attawat said Miss Shibata, and the friend she was diving with, booked a diving course with a company in Japan that sold tours affiliated through global tourism operator Kon Tiki.

However, after arriving in Phuket, the couple's dive tour booking was transferred to a local operator as the dive tour

originally offered was full, he explained.

Miss Shibata, her friend and their dive instructor were placed on board the boat Aqua Art 3, belonging to local company Marine Project, along with about 20 other divers, he added.

The three were diving at a depth of about 12 meters at Ao Kluay ("Banana Bay") off Koh Racha Noi when the accident happened, Lt Attawat said.

"The dive instructor said Hitomi suddenly started floating toward the surface because she accidentally pressed a switch on her suit. which let air into the suit," he said.

"She died instantly when her head was hit by the propeller of the boat, which was moving slowly to pick up groups of divers," he added.

"Her body was transferred to a speedboat and rushed back to Chalong Pier, arriving at 2:30pm. It was then taken Vachira Phuket Hospital for further examination,"

Karon beachfront cabling keeps tourists tumbling

THE project to install power and telecommunications cables underground along the Karon beachfront is causing accidents on an almost daily basis, local residents have told the Phuket Gazette.

"Most of the victims are foreigners on motorbikes who are not used to the road," said one female local taxi driver.

The dangerous strip, about two meters wide, stretches more than three kilometers along the beachfront.

"We receive complaints every day from both local residents and hotels as they don't know what is going on," Karon Mayor Tawee Tongcham told the Gazette.

"The project is to install all telecommunication and power cables underground, but it involves many different organizations, such as TT&T, TOT, CAT and cable TV

"These companies do not have the budgets for their parts of the project available at the same time,' he said.



Tuk-tuk drivers blame foreign tourists' lack of local road knowledge as the reason so many end up in hospital.

Each time one of the companies finally has the budget available, municipal workers have to dig the road up again to install that company's cables, he said.

"Most recently, CAT and TOT asked us to dig up the road to put their wires underground," Mayor Thawee said.


"Right now, power cables and water supply pipes are already underground, but we're waiting for the telecommunication wires to be installed," he added.

The bad news for motorists is that the road will not be paved until all the cables have been installed, the mayor said.

That is not likely to happen before June, when the project is scheduled for competion, he - Atchaa Khamlo

Pirate raids net 11 vendors, B6mn in goods

Light rail investors eye regional links

THE latest delegation to approach Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha with ideas for Phuket's light-rail project on Monday highlighted the need for developing transport links with other provinces.

"If the routes in Phuket are linked with routes in other provinces, rather than only focusing on light rail within Phuket, it can be a profitable investment," said independent investor liaison Pranom Phuangkanok.

Mrs Pranom, representing Bangkok-based developer Roongwadee Construction 1991 Co Ltd, headed the delegation that met Governor Tri to discuss developing a light-rail system in Phuket.

Mrs Pranom explained to the *Gazette* that she is acting as facilitator between Roongwadee Construction and Chinese investors ready to fund the project.

She is also involved in a project to develop light-rail links between Surat Thani and Phang Nga provinces, Mrs Pranom said.

Governor Tri said the Chinese investors had already transferred

US\$100 million into a Thai bank to show they are prepared to invest in Phuket's light rail project.

However, Roongwadee has requested 15 days to perform a thorough assessment of the Phuket light-rail project as they said the information currently available was not detailed enough to propose to the investors ready to fund the project, he noted.

If the Chinese investors agree to go ahead and fund the project, investors and engineers will be invited to Phuket for further discussions.

"If everything goes well, I will move to have a draft contract drwan up." Gov Tri added.

Old Town 'wireless' by November MUNICIPAL workers will start

MUNICIPAL workers will start pulling down power poles lining the streets of Thalang, Dibuk and Theprasattri Roads in the heart of Old Phuket Town by November, if all goes according to plan, Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwansupapana recently announced.

Speaking at a meeting at Phuket City Municipality offices last Friday, Mayor Somjai said that stage two of the project to install underground all power and telecommunication cables in Old Phuket Town was ready to begin.

Phuket City Municipality has held two public hearings seeking feedback from local residents, she

So far the feedback has been positive, with most people living in the area satisfied with the project, Mayor Somjai said.

Stage II is budgeted to cost 39,740,900 baht, comprising 26,476,600 baht from the Provincial Electricity Authority (PEA)

and 13,264,300 baht from Phuket City Municipality.

The project also requires involvement from TOT, CAT and TT&T as telecom cables belonging to those companies will also be installed underground, said Mayor Somjai.

Work will start with the PEA

burying cables along Dibuk Road in June, with Krabi Road, Phuket Road and part of Thepkrasattri Road next in line.

"The work to be done will be much like that already conducted along Thalang Road," Mayor Somjai said.

UFO sighting Burglar caught with signals disaster keys to police HQ

POLICE last Friday presented a man who has allegedly confessed to committing no less than seven break-ins in Phuket Town recently.

One of the homes robbed was that of Capt Thapakorn Hanu-mard, who is the assistant to Phuket Police Commander Pekad Tantipong.

Capt Thapakorn's house is located directly opposite Phuket City Police Station in a police apartment block.

Police said they arrested Uthai Suandokmai, 33, at his rented room in Phuket Town, on May 5.

In his room they found many items identified as stolen, including the keys to Phuket Provincial Police headquarters and to Capt Thapakorn's car.

In tracking down Uthai, officers identified a laptop computer for sale at KPP mobile that was listed as stolen, for which the receipt was issued to the suspect, said police.

Police said Uthai confessed to seven counts of burglary.

He targeted houses with no one

home and stole only valuables that could be easily carried away and easily converted to cash, police said.

Uthai needed money to buy drugs, police said.

He reportedly took about five to 10 ya bah (methamphetamine) pills a day (300 baht each) and one "dose" of ya ice (crystal meth) a

day (4,000 baht per gram), police quoted him as saying.

Police added that Uthai previously served 18 months in jail for buying a stolen motorcycle.

He was charged for the seven break-and-enter crimes he confessed to, said police.

THE National Environment Board, chaired by Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva, has approved the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) report for the Koh Klong Pee road to traverse mangroves on the edge of Phuket Town.

The decision was made at a meeting at Parliament House on May 4, announced Phuket City Municipality Mayor Somjai Suwansupapana.

At the meeting, PM Abhisit was informed that the estimated budget for the project was 185 million baht, Mayor Somjai said.

The project aims to build a 600meter road connecting Saphan Hin to Sakdidet Road, with an elevated section spanning over mangroves.

The next step for the project is to present the EIA report to the Cabinet so it can decide whether or not to allow the project to go ahead despite its national ban on mangrove encroachment instituted on July 23, 1991.

The blanket ban on mangrove encroachment allows one exception: projects deemed to be "for public benefit".

'Mangrove' A long quest for identity

Phuket's stateless sea gypsies inch forward in their decades-long struggle to become Thai citizens

THIRTY Phuket sea gypsies recently took the first step in the daunting process of applying for Thai citizenship.

Their plight as stateless people was was one of many issues raised during a May 4 meeting at Phuket Provincial Hall.

Chaired by Vice Governor Weerawat Janpen, the gathering was intended to discuss ways to preserve sea gypsies' traditional lifestyles in a rapidly changing

Providing some background, Rawai sea gypsy representative Niran Yangpan_said a list of 80 sea gypsies seeking citizenship was submitted to Phuket Provincial Office in a naturalization process that began in 1994.

When the process ceased in 2009, there were still 16 Rawai sea gypsies on the list, he said.

Urging all relevant government offices to work together to resume the process, Mr Niran asked those present to consider the difficulties stateless people experience on a daily basis.

"Without an ID card, they don't have the right to medical treatment ter every month.

in government hospitals, nor can they apply for jobs.

"Some poor sea gypsies died penniless waiting for their ID cards, and after they died it was impossible [for their relatives] to request a coffin for them from any public foundation," he said.

A representative of the Phuket Provincial Cultural Office said there was a total 30 Phuket sea gypsies without ID cards, the 16 from Rawai and 14 more from Sapam.

Sumran Yukunthorn, deputy chief of the Phuket Provincial Office Administration Group, is responsible for overseeing the effort to get the sea gypsies ID cards.

He told the Phuket Gazette a week after the meeting that he had already submitted the list of 30 names to Muang District Office along with a request to proceed with the approval process.

"The Muang District Registrar will question each applicant, relevant witnesses and consider all the submitted documents before submission to the Ministry of Interior.

"It might take some time since this is a national security issue," said Mr Sumran, adding that he would update progress on the mat-

New incinerator 'half-finished'

WORK on Phuket's second solid waste incinerator is nearly halfcomplete. When finished, the facility will house the highest capacity trash-to-electricity plant in the country, Phuket City officials say.

The news follows a progress meeting on Tuesday attended by Tawarat Sutabutr, deputy director of the Department of Alternative Energy Development and Efficiency (DEDE); Phuket Mayor Somjai Suwansupapana; and Prachoom Suriya, head of the municipality's environmental

Mr Tawarat said the Ministry of Energy would buy the power

produced by the gasification facility, which is costing about 100 million baht to build.

Work on the plant is about 45 per cent complete. When finished, its two burners will be capable of

incinerating 700 tons of solid waste per day, he said.

However, the completed project will not mark the end of Phuket's solid waste management

'The amount of solid waste produced in Phuket has increased to 570 tons per day, a seven per cent increase over the last year. The capacity of the existing incinerator is only 250 tons per day," Mayor Somjai said.

The remainder continues to pile up in the landfill behind the project.

Work on the project is scheduled for completion next year.

Man found dead in water well

PHUKET Police are treating as an apparent suicide the drowning death of an elderly man whose body was found at the bottom of a water well last Friday.

Thalang Police were notified of the tragedy by residents of Ban Nai Khlam in Cherng Talay, many of whom were gathered around the well by the time police and Kusoldharm Foundation rescue workers arrived.

Thalang Police duty officer

Yosaphat Suwannasit identified the deceased as local resident Sutham Douangrat, age 65.

Relatives told police that before he went missing a day earlier, Mr Yosaphat had told them he was under stress from a variety of physical ailments.

Resuming their search for him Friday morning, they found his sandals near the well before discovering his body at the bottom under about nine meters of water.





Army leads post-flood rebuilding

A SPECIAL committee to assist flood victims is coordinating efforts to rebuild and repair homes damaged or destroyed by the March 31 floods and landslides.

The floods and ensuing landslides, mostly in the Khao Phanom Bencha area, claimed at least three lives and displaced thousands.

The rebuilding is being rolled out in two phases, explained Nuntawan Prathumsuwan, an officer at the Krabi office of the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation, told the Gazette.

"We are receiving support from the Royal Thai Army 5th Infantry Division and 4th Development Division. They are rebuilding homes using plans from the government," said Ms Nuntawan.

"Our target for the first phase is to finish 45 houses each month, completing all 136 houses desig-

nated for rebuilding within three months," Col Nopawong Suravichai, commander of the 5th Infantry Division, told the Gazette.

"We have 45 teams, each comprising 10 soldiers. Three houses have already been completed," he

The second phase of the homebuilding project focuses on having families affected by the disaster to move from risk areas to safe ground, said Ms Nuntawan.

"We have already received approval from Bangkok to build 59 houses as the families already have

land in safe areas on which to build the new homes," she said.

Families in 55 homes to be rebuilt are still trying to secure land in safe areas, said Ms Nunthawan.

We are trying to help them with this," she added.

Both phases of the disaster-relief project are being coordinated by the Committee for Assistance to Flood victims (CAF) set up by the Krabi Governor's Office.

"The Krabi Governor will receive disaster-relief funds from Bangkok and he will then allocate that money for buying construction materials. We will not be handing out cash," she said.

Providing extra funds to help build the homes are the Thai Red

Cross and Thai TV Channel 3, Ms Nuntawan said

Families receiving assistance under the program are being allocated 190,000 baht for houses for small families of not more than three people, 240,000 baht for houses for families of four people or more, she added.

The group of 22 traveled to the city of Nanjing, in Jiangsu Province, and later to Shanghai.

The team comprised tourism, agriculture, livestock and education officials and representatives from the Krabi Governor's Office. The team met their Chinese counterparts to exchange ideas for joint ventures and exchange programs.

An MoU was signed between representatives of Jiangsu and Krabi provinces and discussions were conducted on education exchanges and direct flights from Nanjing and Shanghai to Krabi.

In June, the first charter flight will bring the 300-strong entourage from China for their first visit to Krabi. A video about Krabi will be produced for CCTV and covered by mass media in China.

Second Krabi Airport expansion underway

CONSTRUCTION is underway on a new international terminal at Krabi International Airport to boost capacity for international arrivals.

The new terminal, covering 7,955 square meters, is expected to increase international passenger throughput by 50%, up to 500 passengers per hour.

Currently, both domestic and international services, including immigration, customs and ticketing, are all handled in the one building.

Other improvements being made include extra aircraft parking, namely two more parking bays for Boeing 747-400 aircraft and four more parking bays for Boeing 737-400s.

The capacity for helicopters will remain unchanged at two.

The expansion, which will allow additional international direct

flights to Krabi, and scheduled for completion in 2012.

Krabi Airport was subject to a huge overhaul completed in 2006 at a cost of 743 million baht.

Campaigning Pheu Thai MP shot in politically-motivated attack

IN A shocking start to the election campaign that left observers wondering whether worse was to come, opposition MP Pracha Prasopdee was shot and wounded by gunmen on a motorcycle in Samut Prakan on

Mr Pracha sustained three gunshot wounds to the back and shoulder in the attack, which happened as he was driving his car in Phra Samut Chedi district.

Wednesday, Thai Police Commisioner-General Wichean Potephosree said the attack was politically motivated, The Nation reported.

Police have collected forensic evidence at the scene and are hunting for unidentified attackers.

Police have been ordered to provide tighter security in the run up to the elections, the report said.

Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva visited Mr Pracha at Rama IX hospital in Bangkok on Wednesday and said he is in better condition, but "needed rest".

Mr Pracha, 51, was elected for the first time as Samut Prakan MP in 2001 under

the banner of former prime minister Thakin Shinawatra's Thai Rak Thai Party. He has close links to the exiled billionaire.

"I believe the gun attack on my brother was politically motivated because of fierce campaigning in the constituency of Phra Pradaeng and Phra Samut Jedi," Mr Pracha's sister and fellow MP Naruemol Thandamrong said on Wednesday.

She said Pracha had been re-elected several times, speculating that his rival candidates might have found it impossible to defeat him.

Elections set for July 3

PRIME Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva has announced the dissolution of Parliament, paving the way for high-stakes elections on July 3 that many analysts expect to be the most hotly contested Thailand has ever seen.

Mr Abhisit described the polls as a new beginning for the Thai

"I believe this house dissolution is the beginning for Thailand to move forward in order to effectively solve problems through democracy.

"That's why I did it willingly,"

The elections are expected to be a close race between Mr Abhisit's Democrat Party and the opposition Pheu Thai Party, controlled by former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra.

Mr Abhisit's government, which steered Thailand's economy to 7.8 per cent growth last year despite some heavy poturbulence, nevertheless been dogged by claims it lacks legitimacy.

The current coalition, led by the Democrat Party, was stitched together in December 2008, allegedly under pressure from the military, following controversial judicial decisions that dissolved two parties associated with Mr

A sense of injustice resulting from those decisions – and likely financial support from Mr Thaksin – led to the growth of the anti-government red shirt movement, which staged weeks of protests last year to demand Mr Abhisit dissolve Parliament.

The army forcefully dissolved the protests on May 19 in a bloody crackdown. At least 92 people died during the demonstrations amid among the protesters, the so- the past five years.

called black shirts, have also been blamed for provoking the troops.

Critics claim the red shirt movement and Pheu Thai are merely vehicles aimed at bringing Mr Thaksin back to power.

Bug spray suspect in hotel deaths

AN INVESTIGATION by a New Zealand television show may have uncovered the cause of several unexplained tourist deaths at Chiang Mai's Downtown Inn earlier this year: bug spray.

Five tourists died within weeks of each other of symptoms resembling food poisoning while staying at the three-star hotel.

Several other deaths were also linked to the hotel.


An investigation by the 60 Minutes show found traces of the chemical chlorpyrifos, used to kill bed bugs, in the room where Sarah Carter stayed.

United Nations scientist Ron McDowall said that the symptoms suggested those who died were over-exposed to the chemical.

"The fact traces of chlorpyrifos were found three months after Ms Carter's death and after the room was cleaned suggested there was a high concentration when she was staying there," he told the program.

"I think she has been killed by an overzealous sprayer who's been acting on the instructions of the hotel owner to deal with bed bugs," Dr McDowall said.

The revelations will embarrass the Chiang Mai authorities, who claimed the deaths were just a "coincidence" amid accusations of a cover up.

THE recent expansion of the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor) poh thong public transport service to the people of Koh Sireh is not only great news for some of the poorest residents of Phuket Town, but also gives long-suffering tourists an overdue, low-cost travel option.

The latest route's eastern terminus at Laem Tukkae will be a blessing for many, from the poor sea gypsy community there to guests at the upscale Westin Siray Bay Resort who want to explore the city's many interesting sites in an authentic, comfortable way.

Until the new service was launched earlier this month, guests at the resort seeking a way into town were forced to pay a "standard fare" of 300 baht for the five-minute trip, with popular destinations such as Bangkok Hospital Phuket, Big C and Tesco Lotus even higher at 400 baht, or 600 baht by van.

Now those wanting to reach these destinations - or just about anywhere else in Phuket Town will be able do so for 20 baht.

Can I get paid?

If someone has their own company but is hired by another to work for them on a freelance basis, is said worker entitled to severance pay from the employer?

> Severed Phuket

An officer at the Phuket Provincial Labor Protection and Welfare Office replies:

This depends on the agreement between you and your employer.

For example, if you work from home and send your work to someone who pays you, we don't call them an employer.

Payment depends on the agreement you had from the beginning of your work with them.

If you work part-time or even casually in an office and follow the company's regulations and schedule, that company can be called an employer.

You should get benefits exactly as if you were full-time staff.

It depends on the worker's actions.

If the worker follows the company's regulations like working times or public holidays, then the employer must give the same benefits as they do full-time staff.

If the worker sends work to a company or organization, they are not considered an employee, but a freelancer.

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Dolphin park plans | Police inaction should be canned

FIRST PERSON

THE 90-million-baht dolphin park is a bad investment for Phuket and will bring nothing but negative publicity.

The Earth Island Institute has a long-standing relationship with the multi-billion-dollar dolphin-safe Thai tuna industry.

I have informed the Thai Food Processors Association (which represents the Thai tuna industry), Thai Union Group (the largest single tuna company in the world) and several other large tuna companies in the country that Earth Island will not stand by and allow for yet more dolphins to be captured from the wild and imported into Thailand.

The Fisheries Ministry is on notice of this problem as well. This ministry will have to clear any imports with CITES (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species) in addition to dealing with negative publicity if permits are issued.

Earth Island has a firm policy against the live dolphin trade and will actively campaign to state that Thailand's multi-billion-dollar tuna industry is at risk if this dolphin park is allowed to proceed.

Earth Island is the third-party certifier for dolphin-safe tuna [www.dolphinsafetuna.com] and will launch a consumer campaign in the US and Europe - major consumers of Thai canned tuna - if necessary, in conjunction with

I will bring Ric O'Barry [of The Cove fame] to Thailand to join in this opposition as he is world-renowned.

Major networks such as CNN, Fox, and talk-show hosts such as Oprah will cover this story, as they are continually interested in our work to stop dolphin dealers that source dolphins from Taiji, Japan, the Solomon Islands and elsewhere.

Ric O'Barry and I also challenge the developers of this bad investment to a public forum debate on the issue.

We challenge the mayor and other officials to learn the truth behind keeping dolphins in captivity, which is a form of slavery, not education or research.

Phuket needs to know the truth, not some promise of big money under a bogus excuse for research and education. If tourists want to see dolphins, then get on a boat and watch them in a respectful way that allows them to be free.

Earth Island is prepared to do what it takes to make sure no additional captive dolphinariums are built in Thailand or elsewhere.

In 2008, the Thai Fisheries Ministry was notified of a potential import of wild-caught Solomon Island dolphins to Safari World Bangkok. We convinced the ministry at that time to not issue any import permits for dolphins.

The ministry will hopefully do the right thing in this case.

MY FAMILY and I moved from the US to Phuket last June and our second rented house in Nai Yang was burglarized the first week of November, a month and a half after we took residence there.

My husband was on one of his business trips then and I was home with my seven-year-old son. Fortunately, we were unharmed.

We live in a two-storey house. All of my stolen items (an iPod, my watches, camera and wedding rings) were on the kitchen counter on the first level.

I had a very busy morning with the police. As I don't speak much Thai, I enlisted my Thai neighbor to help with the translation.

Two days later, my friend and I went over to the Thachatchai Police Station to obtain the police report that they never gave me, as I wanted to put in a claim for my stolen items with our US insurance company.

I was told by the officer in charge then that it would take about a month before I would hear back from them.

My neighbor called them after a month and was told that they had sent all evidence collected to Bangkok for analysis and to be patient, that they were still working on the case.

After the second month, we called again. We were told that the Bangkok police were in Phuket and investigating and that they would contact me soon with details.

It has been five months now and I have not once received a phone call from any Thachatchai Police officer. As Phuket is a touristy place

for many foreigners from all over the world, it would be a shame if they were to encounter a horrendous crime like I did. It will give the impression that Phuket is a dangerous place to visit, and moreso when the police are seen to be inefficient or even disinterested.

Unless the security forces of Phuket put in a concerted effort to solve these crimes and bring justice with haste and efficiency. the image of idyllic, peaceful and safe Phuket will be tarnished.

I hope that no one will suffer the trauma and pain like I did of losing their prized possessions while being kept in the dark on the outcome of the investigations.

On the other hand, I hope the police force here would prove me wrong in my judgment of their inefficiency and recover my stolen possessions. That would be a dream come true.

...asking the questions that affect you...

According to a regulation of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment's Territory and Environment Protection Measures for Phuket Province BE 2553 [2010], it is prohibited to have any gas station within 50 meters of the sea.

According to the current issue of the "principle city plan" of Phuket [2005], in Patong, gas stations are only allowed in "orange zones", classified as medium population density zones. Orange zones cover areas on Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Road, Phang Muang Sai Khor Road and some parts of Nanai Road.

So, technically, even the single petrol station, Esso, on Phra Barami Road is illegal because it is in a "red zone", classified as a commercial and high population density zone.

The gas station, however, has been there for a long time - before those regulations were made – so it is still permitted to operate.

Another issue is the high land value in orange zones near the beach or easily in accessed areas. This makes investment in a gas station infeasible.

For example, one square wa [4 square meters] sells for about 300,000 baht. That's 75,000 baht

One rai [1600sqm] is not large enough to build a gas station. The Esso station in Patong takes up about four rai.

Land alone can cost as much as 480 million baht. Is it worth it just to build a gas station?

Fireworks light up my ire

Are there any laws restricting the sale and setting off of fireworks to recognized festivals, such as New Year's Eve and HM The King's Birthday?

Residents of Surin are being constantly disturbed by late-night fireworks, often after midnight. Is there any action that can be taken to stop this, or at least limit the lighting up of fireworks to say 10:30pm?

A "public relations" Officer at Cherng Talay Police Station, who declined to give his name, replies:

We often get calls from residents complaining about fireworks. Sometimes when we go to the location specified in the complaint we catch the people setting off fireworks. Other times the people have already left the area.

If we catch people illegally setting off fireworks we only warn them to not to do it. We do not fine or arrest people for setting off fireworks.

You have to remember that these people who set off fireworks in isolated incidents in the middle of the night are not the same re-

sponsible people who first obtain a permit from the District Office.

Aporn Meephol, an officer at Thalang District Office, replies:

Any person wanting to set off fireworks as part of an organized celebration, such as HM The King's Birthday or New Year, must first obtain a permit from the District Office at least two weeks before the event.

Regulations covering the setting off of fireworks do not restrict it to specified areas or times, so we approve each permit on its own merits according to what the occasion is, where the event is being held and what time the organizers want to set off the fireworks.

Usually, we allow fireworks to be set off between 7pm and

However, some special occasions, such as New Year and HM The King's and HM The Queen's birthday celebrations, people may be allowed to set off fireworks later in the night, depending on the District Chief's approval.

Loans, savings rise in unison

STATISTICS published last month by the Bank of Thailand (BOT) suggest that people in Phuket are saving more compared to previous years.

The data showed that overall savings (including current accounts, savings accounts and time deposits) in Phuket banks totaled 83.5 million baht in February, an increase of 7.7 per cent from February last year.

Bank savings rose by 2.65 per cent year-on-year (YOY) in February, whereas in January the savings rate grew by 4.79 per cent YOY.

The number of bank branches in Phuket also rose from 122 to 125 branches between February last year and this year.

Banks in Phuket also achieved a healthy YOY loan growth of 2.66 per cent in February. January's loan growth was even higher at 2.87 per cent, suggesting that local investors are taking a more confident stance toward Phuket investment.

Comparing these figures to the same period last year, banks in Phuket were only able to achieve a loan growth of 0.78 per cent in February and 1.93 per cent in January. Total bank loans in Phuket in February this year reached 100,594 million baht, passing the 100,000 million mark for the first time, according to the BOT.

The BOT data also breaks down the business sectors that received the most bank loans. Although the data published is only available until the fourth quarter (Q4) of last year, it provides a good indicator of the level of confidence in some of Phuket's most important industries.

The business sector that received the most bank loans in Phuket, not surprisingly, was the hotels and restaurants sector.

Total bank loans for this sector increased by more than five per cent since the third quarter (Q3) of last year, reaching 28,568 million baht, which demonstrates a healthy investment growth in the industry

Another sector that received substantial bank loans was the real estate sector, receiving a total loan of 11,705 million baht by the end of the Q4, comprising about 10 per cent of total bank loans in Phuket.

However, BOT data showed bank loans have been falling by roughly 1.5 per cent for the real estate sector since the Q3 of 2010, indicating a slowdown of investment in Phuket's real estate sector.

Bank loans to Phuket's real estate sector declined significantly during the second half of 2009, falling by more than eight per cent during this period, according to the BOT.

Loans for personal consumption comprised the highest percentage of total bank loans in Phuket – about 45 per cent. Bank loans for personal consumption rose by almost four per cent in Q4 of last year according to BOT data.

Such significant growth rates for personal consumption loans are an indicator of rising consumer confidence in Phuket.

Kajonkiet International School opens this month

THE Kajonkiet group of schools is preparing for a major shift in island demographics and greater demand for English-language education by opening its first international school this month, the school has announced.

Permkiat Ketkul, manager of Kajonkietsuksa School and Chairman of the Phuket Private School Association, said the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) plan to lift cross-border travel restrictions and become a unified economic unit by 2015 was a major factor in the school's decision to open its Kajonkiet International School Phuket (KISP) on a 45-rai hillside site in Kathu.

The school is expected to cater to an increasingly international island when the grouping of Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia,

Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore and Vietnam takes effect.

According to the ASEAN Economic Community (AEC) plan, in 2015 there will be a free flow of goods, services, investments, capital and skilled labor amongst the 10 countries.

Once companies within ASEAN are able to move freely within the region, Phuket will become home for new workers and their families, said Mr Permkiat.

This leaves Phuket's education market with two important responsibilities.

First, schools will have to plan for the influx of new students. Second, they will have to prepare their current students for a future where the English language and a global awareness are of utmost importance, he said.

Housing Bank overwhelmed by first home buyers

ISLAND residents hoping to get their first home loan queued up at the Phuket branch of the Government Housing Bank as early as 6am on Monday last week.

Monday was the first day of receiving applications under the government loan campaign targeting first time homeowners.

Welcomed by lower and middleincome earners, the scheme promises zero interest during the first two years of loan repayments.

The policy is expected to be a success in Phuket, where there is a large market for new properties priced under three million baht.

Within the first half hour of opening its doors, the bank reportedly issued more than 100 queue tickets.

Home loan applicants queuing up were mainly civil servants, eligible to borrow up to 2.5 million baht, and non-government workers who qualify for loans between 750,000 and 2mn baht.

TAT try to revive Thai – Japan tourism market

JALPAC Tour and Travel Co, a leading operator serving the Japanese market, has halted its inbound unit due to a lack of demand from Japan following the earthquake, tsunami and radiation crisis.

Surapol Sritrakul, managing director of the company, which is the partner of a Japan-based firm, said the group recently suspended its subsidiary, Jal Pac International Co, which focuses on inbound travel from Japan to Thailand.

"This sister company was established years ago to cope with the growth of inbound business from Japan. It is being frozen now but may resume service once Japan tourism has recovered," he said.

To help restore the Japanese market, the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) offices in Osaka and Fukuoka plan to organize a familiarization trip to Thailand for 10 to 15 travel operators May 11 to 15.

The operators are scheduled to visit key tourist destinations including Phuket, Krabi, Samui and Chiang Mai to meet local agents.

The TAT office in Tokyo will also work with major travel companies like JTB, HIS, Hankyu and NTA to host a tourism recovery project called "Smile Japan" to encourage Japanese into Thailand. Small-item spending for packages will be deducted to encourage people.

The TAT reported that 323,435 Japanese visited the country from January to March this year, up 5.8 per cent year on year.

The Japan market was expected to rebound by 70 per cent during Japan's annual holiday, Golden Week, April 29 and May 8.

Busy time for pawnshops as price of gold rockets

AS SCHOOLS prepare for the start of a new academic year, Phuket parents are hawking their gold to cope with the rising cost of commodities and school fees.

During this time of economic uncertainty, the pawn shop business is flourishing in Phuket.

With what is anticipated to be a record breaking "Back to School" season upon us, Phuket City Municipality Mayor Somjai Suwansupapana has announced that the Phuket municipality pawnshop has prepared 140 million baht in funds, a surplus of 40 per cent of the expected budget projections for May.

Comparing to May last year, when about 5,700 loans valued at 91.5 million baht, this May's loans are expected to exceed 100 million baht, she said

140 million baht should be more than sufficient to cover all loans, she added

Over the summer break, about

5,700 pawn loans equaled 99.3 million baht in March, while in April, roughly the same amount valued 97.7 million baht.

The rising value of gold is believed to be one of the main factors in the increased budget demands.

About 98 per cent of pawn

loans were exchanged for gold jewelry and ornaments, while the other two per cent for electronic equipment such as laptop computers she noted.

The municipality pawnshop currently loans 16,800 baht per one baht weight of gold, (one baht is equal to approximately 15 grams). This time last year, the rate was 14,000 baht, which equates to an increase of about 17 per cent.

"Rates paid [by the municipality pawn shop] are almost equal those paid by privately-run pawnshops; however, the [government] interest rate is lower," she said.

For loans under 5,000 baht, the interest rate is 0.5 per cent, while loans between 5,000 to 30,000 baht are charged an interest of one per cent, and for loans between 30,000 to 100,000 baht, 1.25 per cent.

According to the Gold Traders Association of Thailand as of May 7, the price of gold is 21,350 baht per baht weight of gold.

Blue Flag fair a hit as commodity prices soar

WITH commodity prices sky-rocketing, an Internal Trade Department fair with more than 90 booths selling cheap "Blue Flag" goods was a hit in Phuket last week.

Everyday goods such as rice, oil, eggs, fruit and clothes were all on sale at prices 20-30 per cent lower than normal.

The "Blue Flag Price Savers" fair, which took place from May 4 to 6 near the central stage of Saphan Hin Park in Phuket Town, was organized in co-operation with the private sector.

The event was aimed at ensuring ordinary people could afford everyday goods. The prices of many commodities are rising rapidly due to a number of factors

including high crude oil prices and this year's severe flooding, which damaged agricultural land in the south.

Last month, prices in the food and beverage sector grew 8.59 per cent year on year, due to eggs and milk rising 6.76 per cent, fruits and vegetables 20.61 per cent, and seasoning products 13.03 per cent, *The Nation* reported.

The price of non-food-and-beverage items rose by 1.35 per cent, from higher transport costs.

Supatcha Bunphalit, acting head of Phuket's Internal Trade Office, said the event had been arranged by her department together with relevant agencies and distributors to help contain the soaring cost of living. The fair received a very good reaction from Phuket people, she said.

Last week, *The Nation* reported that Thailand's year-on-year inflation rose to 4.04 per cent in April, the highest rate in 15 months.

The Commerce Ministry said the prices of 198 of the 417 items in the basket of goods used to calculate the Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose in April, mainly fresh fruits and vegetables, rice, oil, eggs and pork. The prices of 155 items were unchanged, while those of 64 products dropped.

"Higher headline inflation is [according to] the ministry's projection after the impact of flooding, which destroyed farm

goods," said Yanyong Phuangrach, permanent secretary of the ministry. "However, inflation is under control by the government, which will ensure that annual inflation will be under the target of 3.2 to 3.7 per cent this year."

Commerce Minister Porntiva Nakasai last week asked Cabinet to approve a budget of 200 million baht to hold more Blue Flag fairs nationwide.

iPad2 a steal

THE Tourism Authority of Thailand should take out a full-page ad in the New York Times: "Fly to Thailand," it could say, "and get a 20 per cent discount on a new iPad 2.3

Hard to believe, but the iPad 2 is significantly cheaper in Thailand than in the US – and the savings are even greater if your point of reference is in Europe.

I wrote about the iPad 2 a couple of months ago in the Phuket Gazette. People who lined up for the iPad 2s initial release in the US at that time still, with rare exception, sing its praises: faster, lighter, two cameras (not particularly good ones, but good enough), and that glorious display. Apple's iMovie only works on iPad 2, and Real Racing 2 HD crawls on the original iPad, so there are reasons besides Angry Birds Rio – for upgrading.

In Beijing, a fistfight broke out in the Apple store during the iPad 2 launch last Saturday: four people injured and a demolished glass door. Apparently a scalper tried to cut in line, and an Apple employee took umbrage. Hey, in China, even fake iPad 2s sell out.

Here in Thailand, all of the ma-



jor Apple shops in Bangkok sold out of iPad 2s on the first day, some within hours of opening. Surprisingly, several Phuket locations still had full stock available on Saturday. I checked the PowerBuy located on the second floor of Jungceylon, and they had all of the models available (WiFi and "3G" HSPA), with all of the memory options (16 GB, 32 GB and 64 GB), and both colors (white and black). At the Computer Clinic last Sunday, I heard that several other Phuket Apple shops had stock as well. If you want one, grab it quick.

Here's how the pricing turned out. In the US, Amazon.com lists many retailers with the entry-level 16 GB iPad 2, WiFi only, at US\$599, plus shipping. That's 18,100 baht at current exchange rates. Plus shipping and/or local sales tax. In Thailand, the 16 GB WiFi iPad 2 lists at 15,900 baht and they're widely available at that price. Do the math, and you'll see that buying an iPad 2 in Thailand is 12 per cent cheaper than in the US. Moreover, the list price here includes VAT, so if you're a tourist and you claim the VAT refund at the airport, you get a discount of just under 20 per cent compared to the US.

If you commonly buy your electronics in UK, hold onto your Bowler. Amazon.co.uk lists the iPad 2 16 GB WiFi at GB 489, plus shipping. That's a whopping 24,200 baht. Buy the same iPad exactly the same, no differences at all - from your local Phuket dealer, and you save more than 34 per cent. Add in the VAT difference, and local Limeys save more than 40 per cent by buying an iPad 2 in Thailand.

TAT should take out two full pages in The Times or The Guardian. It'll probably get more attention than page three of The Sun.

People commonly ask me why the iPad is cheaper here in Thailand than in the US or UK or Europe. As best I can tell. Apple set the price of the original iPad back when exchange rates weren't as friendly as they are now (er, "friendly" depending on

Investing in Africa: foolish or full of foresight?

WILL AFRICA become the next per cent of your portfolio in them BRIC country (Brazil, Russia, India, China)? Or will it sink like a stone unless all the political turmoil on the continent is resolved? Not long ago people were saying the same things about BRIC countries and they have not exactly done badly over the past decade or so.

African markets have been volatile during the past 10 years, and if you invested more than 15

then you were brave indeed - but your courage should have been rewarded by now.

Some fund managers and investment companies are now saying the same thing about Africa, despite the ongoing turmoil in the African Mediterranean countries.

People who think investing in Africa is nothing short of pure madness should remember that

there are companies registered in places such as the US, UK and Europe that invest in Africa but are headquartered elsewhere. This should help with any transparency issues of where your investment is going, if nothing else.

Some of the fund management companies that are currently looking at investing in Africa are also taking into account factors such as sustainable investments that ensure that a company is actively exercising environmental control, social welfare and good governance, altogether ensuring that it is not just the company's owners who benefit from outside

Look for a fund that has experience of Africa and, preferably, has offices there. The fund managers should know the countries they are investing in and will be looking for good companies with excellent prospects.

Obviously, there are geopolitical aspects to consider. To put it bluntly: Africa is huge. There are 54 countries on a single land mass that can easily accommodate the US, China, the European Union and India with room to

However, there is no point in investing in some place like Zimbabwe right now unless you know something that the rest of the world does not. However, other countries may be worth a look.

According to the US Geological Survey, Africa has: 89% of the world's platinum 74% of the world's chrome 60% of the world's diamonds 51% of the world's phosphates 23% of the world's gold 12% of the world's oil 9% of the world's natural gas

It is also highly likely that the last two sets of figures are a massive understatement as new finds are being made all the time.

Also, this list will only get longer as more investment is piled into the continent. A lot of this is being led by China, which is buying up large swathes of land in many African countries so they can take advantage of the potential mineral wealth on offer.

The Chinese are not daft, but remember that this type of investment will be very volatile and, unless you like risk, should only be a small part of your portfolio.

As mentioned in previous colmns, emerging markets can be very lucrative, but they are fraught with danger. Over the past decade the MSCI developed markets grew by 32 per cent, compared with emerging markets, which grew by 350 per cent.

But it must be pointed out that this phenomenal growth was accompanied by the latter phenomenal stress for investors.



AIRPORTS, including Phuket International Airport (PIA), are as much retail businesses today as they are facilities for aircraft to land and take off from. And as many people using Bangkok's Suvarnabhumi Airport know, they are also sites for long, frustrating arrival and departure lines.

With regard to shopping, most airports, including PIA, handle more people daily than the average shopping mall – and

that's saying something on Phuket, where shopping is a major incentive for tourists to visit.

So in recent times PIA's shopping, restaurant and concession business has grown considerably in line with global aviation industry trends.

Last year a record 3.5 million passengers passed through PIA, so the retail has expanded to meet the increased

So what better way for retailers at PIA and elsewhere to substantially increase

their turnovers, and for passengers to be able to spot the smallest line before joining it than by being able to use WiFi technology to track in real

time where airport travelers go and what they do while waiting for takeoff or transiting?

This is now a reality. Copenhagen Airport in Denmark is experimenting with a system run by aviation communications and technology company SITA. Dots on the screen of a laptop show different colors for arriving and departing passengers.



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

rowing and nail-biting period for family and friends alike.

As the Gazette listens to Nit recount her story about the surgery, husband Kru Nai clutches Tuptim closer to his chest, pressing his cheek to her head. He reaches tenderly for his wife, placing his free hand on her knee and gives a comforting squeeze.

Nit carries on with her story.

"When I woke after the operation, I immediately asked about my daughter. I had made it clear that my life was not important. As long as Tuptim had a chance of

living I wanted the surgeons to keep going, to take all my organs if necessary," she told the *Gazette*.

To her relief, doctors told her unconditional love both operations had been successful, but Tuptim's condition would have to be monitored closely to see if her body would

accept the new liver. Over the next three months,

Tuptim's recovery suffered many setbacks. The most serious was a lung infection, which doctors said most likely set in as a result of medication used to suppress her immune system and reduce the risk of organ rejection. Unfortunately the drug also opens the door to infections normally fended off by a healthy body.

'Apart from the 23 types of medication she must take for the rest of her life, she was also prescribed medicine to fight the lung infection. This cost 10,000 baht per day and had to be taken for a month," Nit said.

The added expense put more strain on the family.

Kru Nai sold almost all of his worldly possessions, as did family members to help with the mounting medical costs.

And another good Samaritan, Antonio of Hollywood Nightclub in Patong, came forward to help.

For three long months after her surgery, Tuptim was kept in the ICU in Bangkok. For this entire period, visiting was kept to a minimum by doctors concerned of Tuptim's vulnerability to infection. While Nit stayed with Tuptim in

hospital her father's visits were restricted.

The period of separation was obviously tough on Kru Nai, who lovingly cradles Tuptim in his arms throughout the Gazette's time with the family.

Looking to the future, the prognosis is good for

Tuptim. Despite the prospect of having to take medication for the rest of her life – more for infections than anything else – Tuptim will likely be able to live a relatively normal life.

And reassuringly, at such a young age, she will bear no mental scars from her tumultuous first year, only scars on

Bypass Bali, go for the Gilis

The *Phuket Gazette* finds out what makes a holiday to the Gili Islands so special

BALI is a bit overrated these days, having been bombarded by *Eat*, *Pray*, *Love*-inspired hippie wannabes and Australians on their version of spring break. From Ubud to Kuta, Bali's understated charm is morphing into commercialized hell.

But there's a way to escape this: Bail on Bali and head to the Gili islands. The "Gilis" comprise three small islands about an hour boat-ride from Bali, located right next to the volcanic marvel of Lombok Island.

The Gilis embody the natural beauty of Indonesia while providing you with a variety of comforts to meet all your holiday needs, from snorkeling with turtles in the day to enjoying extravagant barbecue buffet dinners at night.

The Gilis are not particularly cheap, but you can save a rupiah or two if you travel sensibly – starting with getting there.

Hawkers in Bali will try and take you for a ride when buying a boat ticket. Many "starting prices" will be at the one-million




OLD SCHOOL: The main form of transport on the Gili islands. Photo: Tess Eaton

rupiah (about 3,500 baht) mark one way. This is outrageous.

Ask to go with the "GiliGili" boat tour company and tell them you have used their service previously for 250,000 rupiah (about 900 baht). You will quickly find that such a ticket, has magically become available.

It's advisable to first visit Gili Trawangan, the largest of the islands, and

then move on to the quieter and more romantic Gili Air and Gili Meno.

Once at Gili Trawangan you will find a variety of accommodation available – from upmarket family resorts with swimming pools to budget traveler dorms and guesthouses.

If you want to hold on to your cash as much as possible, then visit the Buddha Dive guesthouse. For 100,000 rupiah (350 baht)

per person you can get a fan room that sleeps three to four people a night.

All three Gili islands are small enough to stroll or cycle around – activities made easier by the fact there are no motorized vehicles.

However, you will find carriages drawn by pygmy horses intermittently bombing down the dusty ringroad. These are another fun and cheap way to get around.

Rent a bike from one of the many rental shops and pedal your way around the island as a fun day activity.

The road gets a bit sandy in places, and the trip will take about an hour or more depending on how many beer breaks you take at

the island's countless beachside cafes.

Stop at the Sunset Bar at the northernmost tip of the island and watch the sun go down behind Lombok's volcanos across the water for a truly memorable experience. If you're really lucky, the skies will be clear and the milky way like you have never seen it before – will reveal itself.

There is something for everyone: plenty of restaurants serving quality western and Indonesian fare, white sandy beaches, raggae bars, diving trips, surfing, yoga and more to enjoy at the Gilis.

Let's just "pray" Hollywood doesn't make a movie about them anytime soon.



Guenter Bellach

GUENTER Bellach is an avid cyclist. He has logged over 8,000 kilometers on his bike, cycling through Asia and Central America, much of it in the past five years. His record is especially impressive when you consider that he will be 80 years of age this year.

He has lived on Phuket with his Thai wife for most of the past 15 years, on a property near Thalang where he cleared the land, built his house and dug a pond where he swims almost every day. He is the picture of health and vitality.

Guenter is a land surveyor and still works on contracts in Laos on big hydroelectric projects.

He was born in 1931 in Eastern Germany. After the war, Guenter and his father crossed into West Germany several times in darkness.

"We wanted to move to the West for work and a better life. We had to sneak across a river into the West and return without getting caught. We were jailed once by the East German police but they let us go.

"By 1948, by using false papers, my mother was able to join my father and the family was reunited in West Germany."

The young Guenter was eager to emigrate abroad. In the early 1950s, he applied to live in Venezuela, Australia and the USA but was rejected as he had little

formal education or training.

Finally in 1953 he was accepted to work in Canada as a farm laborer.

"I eventually got a job in construction in Toronto and was chosen to work with the land surveyor. I found it interesting work and took a correspondence course to gain a qualification. I had very little formal education and taught myself English by reading books."

Guenter then went to work for civil engineering and surveyor companies. His goal was to become the most qualified surveyor in Canada, and he eventually received certification in seven provinces.

He worked on topographical surveys and measured subdivisions, but what he really wanted was to work out in nature.

"I asked to be sent to survey the border between the Northwest Territories and the Province of Saskatchewan. We had to work in the freezing winters when the ground was frozen solid, and we only had two to three hours of daylight to do our work.

"It was so cold that the camp

cook had to sleep with the eggs to keep them from freezing. I had to wear four sets of gloves and could barely see as my breath would turn to ice on my glasses."


Guenter has had a lifelong urge for what he describes as his freedom. He negotiated with his companies for long winter holidays so he could travel to remote tropical places. He took a two year posting to the Bahamas because he wanted to learn to sail. He bought a 23 foot sloop and became a competent sailor.

By 1991 he was ready to cross the Pacific Ocean alone in a sailboat. He left from San Francisco and arrived in Thailand several challenging months later.

Guenter has worked surveying oil wells in Guyana, Saudi Arabia and Oman. While on a break from the Middle East, he invited his son to join him on a bike tour around Southern India. Together they covered over 1,000 kilometers, from Chennai to Cochin.

He also joined his daughter and her family on a 500 kilometer bike trip around Eastern Germany and Western Poland, the region where he spent his childhood.

"I love living on Phuket. I am surrounded by nature and I think the Thai people have the most enjoyable attitude toward living in the entire world."

Life & style Thor thunders at box office

LONG gone are the days of superheroes like Spiderman and the X-Men being solely debated by skinny guys with large glasses and wardrobes supplied by their mothers. The birth of the comic book blockbuster has officially marked the death of one of the most sacred refuges of comic nerds.

Thanks to the likes of the Spiderman trilogy, Iron Man, and *Thor* – the latest comic hero to hit the silver screen – these once beacons of nerdity have become as mainstream as McDonalds.

For anyone who manages to avoid the hype of Hollywood hoopla, *Thor* is the latest chapter from Marvel Studios to introduce a character from the classic comic *The Avengers*. This is part of one of the largest projects in film history: to introduce each of the superheroes from *The Avengers* in their very own film, then have them join forces in a culminating blockbuster.

The Avengers is due to be released in 2012 and will bring together the characters from the Hulk (the Edward Norton version from 2008), Iron Man, Captain America (due for release later this summer), and *Thor*, which just raked in US \$66 million in its opening weekend. The effort has already generated more than US \$1 billion in revenue.

The interesting thing about Thor is that he is by far the most peculiar member of The Avengers crew. All the other characters are moreor-less products of science fiction: The Hulk found a serum that makes him green and ripped. Iron Man is just a fancy suit created by a super-genius engineer. Captain America is the result of a topsecret military project.

Thor, on the other hand, is a straight-up god. The god of thunder, to be exact. He lives in another world, travels to earth via wormholes and flaunts an omnipotent set of powers. Thor can fly, seemingly sustain almost any physical injury, and has a hammer that could challenge the bolts of Zeus. For these reasons, he might be a bit out of place amongst the rest of the Avengers, but he will certainly ensure that special effects are never in short supply.

For anyone confused by the trailer's images of armies in a golden-esque land full of horses and shimmering galaxies, the film does take place in two different worlds. The first is ours; the second is Thor's home planet of Asgard. Think of Asgard as a place where Lord of the Rings meets Norse mythology. It has beaming golden towers, shiny crystals and no atmosphere, which allows it to float in a surreal galaxy.

A cocky heir to the throne of Asgard, Thor possesses a renowned recklessness that earns him several warnings from his father, King Odin (Hopkins).

After Thor reignites a war with Asgard's ancient enemy, the king is forced to come up with a creative punishment, and earth becomes destination banishment. That doesn't say much about

what Asgard's people think of earth, but oh well - earth is always in need of a hero.

Director Kenneth Branagh is a lifelong fan of the Thor series. Best known for his roles in *Harry* Potter and the Chamber of Secrets and the 1996 Hamlet, he's right at home with *Thor*, and he ensures that the film remains true to its comic book origins.

That kind of dedication is typically the key to a successful comic book adaptation, but Thor's godly status makes him a different icon to moviegoers. He is unlikely to connect with a wide audience the way Spiderman or Iron Man can. As a matter of fact, his hard-edged Viking talk is so limited that Thor actually has very few lines in the

film, despite being on screen for the majority of it.

Still, no ensemble of superheroes would be complete without a completely dorked-out member, even if he looks like he needs to be screened for steroids. So nerds rejoice – you have your devout addition to The Avengers crew. The rest of moviegoers have a superhero movie that's big on special effects but short on substance.


TWO TOP DJs are coming to the island later this month on a whirlwind tour.

The Spy snoops in the bookstore

IT'S INDEED a most pleasant surprise to find an English bookstore tucked in the midst of hamburger and pizza places at the Tesco Cherng Talay arcade.

The Bookazine is small but carries a good collection of books. Past the many titles proclaiming

sex and the steamier side of life, you can still come across some classics in the

Thailand section. They may not be always available, but four of them are particularly worth mentioning.

Though the *Kingdom of Make* Believe by Dean Barrett also has its share of sex, it's a story told with commendable sensitivity. A New York publisher returns to Thailand after 20 years to help his brother's widow. After many a turns and twists he discovers that "nothing in Thailand is what it seems" and in the end enters monkhood to seek the truth. (A different reaction from that of a character in Lawrence Durrell's *The Alexandria Quartet* who says that "If things were always what they seemed, how impoverished would be the imagination of man.")

In Mai Pen Rai Means Never Mind, Carol Hollinger gives an entertaining account of her experiences in Thailand almost four decades ago as a housewife, mother and teacher.

Her main message remains equally relevant today - to live happily in Thailand you must absorb the spirit of mai pen rai used by the Thai as a "secret weapon".

If you absorb this spirit, you will happily accept such things as

"creative driving" and clocks that chime mai pen rai instead of the hour.

The subtitle of Successful Living In Thailand by Roger Welty is self explanatory: Feel at Home in Thailand, at Ease with the Thais, and at Peace with Yourself in Unfamiliar Surroundings. The advice ranges from how to cope with stress to living with house lizards or geckos. Called chingchok in Thai they are thought lucky to have around the house. It is considered bad form

to kill them. The fourth book Falcon At the Court of Siam contains an unforgettable account by John Hoskin of a Greek -Constantine Phaulkon - who rose to great heights as King Narai's favorite courtier at the end of the 17th century, higher than any other foreigner before

He was, however, seen as a conniving man by his enemies who were consumed by jealousy and anger at his ambition. Constantine was eventually beheaded.

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Third route gets going

For all those in Phuket who support public transport, a new route for the 'poh thong' buses may leave you feeling tickled pink

THE PHUKET Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) launched the third service route for its expanding fleet of pink poh thong public transport vehicles early this month, expanding the coverage area onto Koh Sireh in Rassada.

Poh thong comes from the Hokkien name for the kind of "wood-framed" transport vehicle known in Thai as sawngtaew, literally "two rows" [of benches]. The use of the term *poh thong* to describe the vehicles harks back to earlier times, when Phuket's unique island dialect and extensive use of Hokkien vocabulary made it very difficult for off-islanders to understand.

On a linguistic note, the poh thong bus should not be confused with the similarly spelled, and more commonly used Thai words po thong, which mean "golden fig."

As for the distinctive color of the vehicles, pink was the color of

the surprising victory of current OrBorJor President Paiboon Upatising and is now the trademark of all things associated with the current administration, from water trucks to the new OrBorJor Hospital in the east of Phuket Town.

Since their inception in September 2009, the city's two inaugural poh thong lines have for the first time allowed passengers to cheaply and safely travel to many parts of Phuket Town proper, as well as parts of the surrounding subdistricts of Rassada and Wichit.

The two routes are basically the same as the routes plied by the fleet of old, mechanically-troubled and notoriously-unreliable green minibuses, introduced by the previous OrBorJor, that passengers sometimes had to wait up to one hour for. In sharp contrast, the new poh thong leave at regular intervals and even have GPS monitoring systems.

Route 1 runs between Saphan Hin and Big C, while Route 2 connects Laem Chan Health Station with Supercheap. Both routes cross paths at the Phuket Provincial Bus Terminal and again along Chumphon Road, where Phuket City Police Station is located.

For just a 10 baht flat fare (free for young children and uniformed students), even for foreigners, the poh thong buses run daily at 30 minute intervals between 6am and 7pm, not 8pm as reported elsewhere.

The latest addition, Route 3, provides service between Saphan Hin at the south end of town, then works its way through the city center and onto Koh Sireh in Rassada, with its terminus at Laem Tukkae, at the southern point of the island.

The new route is welcomed by thousands living on Koh Sireh and other parts of southeastern Phuket Town and neighboring Rassada, which are home to the Kan Keha (National Housing Authority) public housing project, the Saphan Pla fish pier, the new OrBorJor hospital as well as Rassada Harbor,

another *OrBorJor*-administered facility where ferries depart to the

Phi Phi Islands.

The terminus at Laem Tukkae is home to a large community of low-income sea gypsies, who will certainly welcome the service.

The poh thong service won a Prime Minister's Innovation Award last year. That success still firmly in mind, the OrBorJor is seeking to continually expand the network. The next route under consideration is one that would connect Phuket Bus Terminal 1 on Phang Nga Road with the "new"


Phuket Bus Terminal 2 on Thepkrasattri Road southbound in Rassada, presumably along Rassadanusorn Road.

Unfortunately the new bus station, which will be the terminus for all off-island buses after it opens, has sat dormant for almost a year-and-a-half as neither the OrBorJor or Rassada Municipality are prepared to operate it.

Dawn of the water dragons



Getting away from the sometimes feverish pace of life in Phuket is easily done these days by taking the road over the Sarasin Bridge and escaping into a world with fewer of life's pressures.



The Shangri-La Bang Tao update

PART of the former Shangri-La mixed use resort project in Bang Tao, which stalled during the global financial crises a few years ago, has been put up for sale by CBRE.

On offer is 70 rai of the 139 rai original site with 160-meter beach frontage.

The owners, Indonesian firm PT Jakarta Setiabudi International Tbk, reportedly have no immediate plans to develop the property.

The parcel of land remains one of the most strategic hotel development sites on the island and remains attractive given its proximity to destination resort Laguna Phuket.

Further up the road in Layan, Japanese firm Kajima are working on multi-million dollar ocean view villas that could enter the market by the end of this year.

Luxury residential village rising near Laguna Phuket

NEW UPSCALE integrated residential project The Odyssey will rise on the doorstep of Laguna Phuket in Cherng Talay.

Located on 57 rai, and bought in March of this year, the site is where the former Explorer development was located.

The project will be launched in the third quarter of this year, includes 260 luxury apartments with two, three and four bedroom configurations. Buildings will be seven stories, with swimming pools atop each structure.

Unit areas range from 140 square meters up to 325sqm for the 44 penthouses with private plunge pools. Recreational facilities include three tennis courts, squash courts and a large sports center.

Tawan diversifies

LOCAL property firm Tawan Property continues to spread their business model into growth sectors.

A recently announced partnership between Tawan Cruises and Sunseeker for the management of the latter's 18 boats is an example of shifting business paradigms.

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Bangkok Airways 'grand old dame' needs some love

BANGKOK Airways may lose the rights to use a classic building in Phuket Town as its office over fears of dilapidation.

The two-storey building, located on six rai in the green enclave of the provincial offices on Damrong Road, has stood empty for seven years.

Officers, led by Phuket Vice Governor Somkiet Sangkaosutthirak, inspected the building on May 4 along with Thamrong Thongtan, chief of the Phuket Treasury Office, who owns the building.

Mr Thamrong explained that Bangkok Airways signed 30-year lease on the building in 2004. Under the conditions of the lease, the airline was to restore the building to its former glory.

Although the airline has fulfilled its rental payments of nearly one million baht a year, Bangkok Airways has failed to renovate the building and has not occupied the

premises or used them as an office, as was originally intended, said Mr Thamrong.

Now his office is considering reclaiming the property in order to preserve the building, he said.

"As I see it, Bangkok Airways did not uphold the contract. We have to fairly consider whether or not to continue or cancel the contract," said Vice Gov Somkiet.

"If they [Bangkok Airways] want to continue to lease the building, we will consider whether or not to levy a fine. If they want to cancel the contract, we will turn this property over for other use," he added.

Bangkok Airways Business Development Manager Watchara Umnuayraksakul told the *Gazette* that continual economic upheaval since 2004 was the main reason the airline had been unable to move into the property as planned.


"Since 2004 we have faced one economic crisis after another, from the aftermath of the tsunami, to the [yellow shirts] forcing the airport to close in Bangkok, to the red-shirt protests last year. All this means we have been unable to follow through with the contract as planned," Mr Watchara said.

"But now our financial situation is getting better and we are looking into continuing the project, although we will have to first discuss with provincial officials about revising the contract before moving ahead," he added.

Mr Watchara said that if Bangkok Airways does go ahead with renovating and occupying the building, the project will include construction of a two-storey building at the site as accommodation for employees.



Little lily love in the tropics



BOOKS on tropical gardening contain little information about types of lily. In fact, few ornamental varieties are mentioned. There is plenty about the *allium* branch of the family – onions, chives, garlic and the like – but little on flowering lilies.

The problem is that though they have been around for 4,000 years, the majority of lilies grow only in temperate or sub-tropical regions.

Indeed, most Asiatic hybrids or Oriental lilies, despite their names, exist here only as imports. These are especially prized as cut flowers destined for hotels and drawing rooms.

But there are varieties that can grace your Phuket garden. Take the spider lily (*Hymenocallis littoralis*) as an example.

It is used everywhere on the island as a bedding plant, usually planted in massed ranks to create a dramatic effect. The spider lily is ideal as ground cover, since it has

attractive strapshaped leaves, and distinctive star-shaped flowers with long spidery petals emerging from a white hub – hence the name spider lily.

It is a neat plant, unlikely to exceed two feet in height. Because of its popularity, it

has spawned a number of cultivars, including a form with attractive variegated foliage, and

another with much narrower leaves. The flowers tend to appear at the same time, and last quite a

while.

But perhaps the lily's main selling point is its good nature. For it will tolerate a range of soils, and though it flowers most easily in sunny conditions, will also put up with deep shade.

Moreover it will, if left alone, multiply and provide an ever larger patch of

It is an excellent starter flower for the new garden.

One lily-lookalike that flourishes outdoors in Thailand's dry season is a variety of hippeastrum. No longer classified as a true lily, the hippeastrum belongs to the larger genus of amaryllidaceae that includes the lilies.

Right now, it is in flower around Phuket, a distinctive, singlestemmed plant crowned by four lily-like, trumpet-shaped flowers in an unusual shade of deep salmon pink. The blooms face to the four points of the compass – hence the colloquial Thai name translating as "facing four ways" or "compass plant".

It grows about 18 inches tall, and looks particularly decorative when grouped as a border plant. Give it time and the bulbs will multiply unseen. A roadside bed near Nai Harn Lake is evidence of that.

Most other species of hippeastrum will struggle in Thailand's heat. So it is usually sold here – as in Europe – as a massive bulb, which you then plant in a container with the top third projecting above the soil.

Give the bulb a rich potting mix, with a pH no higher than 6.5. A

slow developer, it will, like its outdoor Thai cousin, take up to 10 months to flower, and will only do so once it has produced a least four, characteristic, strap-like leaves.


However, the results are truly spectacular - voluptuous, trumpet-shaped blooms at the top of thick, fleshy stems, and a range of colors from deep red through salmon pink to cream and white.

There are many striped and bicolored forms, as befits a plant that has been extensively hybridized. And one stem may produce anything from two to a dozen blooms. But if you want your hippeastrum to flower again, you will need to put the bulb in cooler conditions for a few weeks before re-potting.

I am currently growing one in a container outdoors. Placed in a shaded area next to the house, it already has several leaves, so it should flower in due course - fingers crossed. But the real test will come if, and when, it is transferred permanently to a flower bed.

Known as *takrai* in Thailand. it grows in dense clumps and contains the same essential oil as lemon peel, a characteristic that gives it a citrussy tang.

Its slightly bulbous lower used in dishes throughout months.

Southeast Asia, forming a key ingredient in many coconutbased curries and soups.

Freely available in fresh markets year-round, cut roots can be transplanted into moist soil, where they should take.

Lemongrass is very hardy. It grows wild on the island and lives for three or more years. It is said to repel mosquitoes.

Propagation and harvesting are normally done by dividing stem and root top is the part the root stock every few

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
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
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
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FC Phuket slide to seventh after draw

FC PHUKET pulled back from 2-0 down to salvage a draw on the road at Samut Prakan in the Thai League's Division 1 last Sunday.

Goals by Nitirote Sukuma and Nene Bi secured the Southern Sea Kirin a point, but wins for Bangkok United and Songkhla pushed Phuket down to 7th place in the league.

The Kirin went into the match on the back of a 6-1 trouncing of Thai Honda. Samut Prakarn Customs United who were beaten 1-0 away at Suphan Buri and, at 14th in the table, had yet to win a game.

Both sides were frustrated for much of the first half, and were struggling to break free from the danger areas. Two headers from Kone Adama were the best chances FC Phuket had, but both went astray.

Customs had the best of the latter minutes, with the division's only English player Lee Tuck creating chances, but the half finished 0-0.

The Southern Sea Kirin appeared to be on yet another hard-luck road trip when Tuck scored early in the second half. Minutes later he set up Weerasak Kiatsoong-nern, who put Customs up 2-0 at 59 minutes.

But FC Phuket fought back with a beautiful free kick into the topright corner by Nitirote Sukuma at 67 minutes. The equalizer came at 72 minutes, when Customs United defender Surapon Phromriboon pulled down FC Phuket's Kone Adama in the penalty area and a sure-footed Nene Bi converted the spot-tackle.

FC Phuket coach Surachai Jirasirichote said: "We knew that our opponents had lost four games in a row. Because of that, they had to fight hard, and they showed it isn't easy to beat them at this stadium."

FC Phuket now sits in 7th place, with 18 points after 10 games.

Following a recent ruling by the Thai FA, the final seven minutes of Phuket's away fixture at Bangkok United, abandoned due to a freak storm, will be replayed. The score of 5-2 in the Bangkok side's favor will be retained. The date and location of play is undecided.

FC Phuket fans will have the chance to see Saraburi in action this weekend, when the Southern Sea Kirin play them again at home on Sunday at 6pm.

It was the second time the store had been robbed, he added. Last time, the warehouse next to the store was targeted.



In the ever-developing tech world we live in, the question remains: Why doesn't football make proper use of it?

I USED to love football. A game for thugs played by gentleman as the saying partly goes. My father played for Glentoran in Northern Ireland and in later years he became a respected referee. My younger brother followed this officious capacity in sports and became an international hockey umpire.

As one can imagine, our household was never short on sports arguments and especially debate regarding contentious decisions in football such as off-sides, red cards and goals, made by the men in black, as once they wore.

Irrespective of the different teams we supported, or our personal interpretation of incidents on any given Saturday or Sunday, to this day we agree on one aspect of sport. We continually ask the same question: Why the hell hasn't football introduced goal-line video technology?

The argument against the use of technology usually involves the nonsensical and archaic fear that the "human aspect" would be removed. Supporters of the obtuse Sepp Blatter, president of FIFA, use this argument in association with the costs of introducing the technology, which for anyone genuinely interested in the development of the game, can only lead to questions of a sinister or conspiratorial nature.

In the first instance, using video replay as a tool to help reduce unnecessary controversy in sport has no down side.

can be used to answer questions such as: did the ball cross the line?, was it a hand ball?, was it a penalty? These decisions can directly affect a goal being awarded.

Off-sides, fouls outside the penalty area and carding players would remain under the direct responsibility of the referee and his assistants.

Many a referee has made incorrect de-

cisions which adversely affect the outcome of an important game, costing a team valuable points or continuation in a competition.

The litany of errors is too great to offer in any great detail, but recent incidents of note include Thierry Henry's handball against the Republic of Ire-

land which secured France's inclusion to last year's World Cup and prevented a worthy Irish team from competing in South Africa.

During that very World Cup Frank Lampard scored for England against Germany in the last 16 stage at a crucial point in the match, but the goal was not acknowledged by the Uruguyan referee Jorge Larrionda.

Mr Lampard's fortunes were recently reversed when he was awarded a goal playing for his club Chelsea in a Premiership game against Tottenham.

Spurs goalkeeper, Huerleho Gomes stopped the ball from completely crossing the line, but his remonstrations to the officials were denied, where television replays showed him to be correct.

Copious amounts of money infest football and yet the powers that be have the audacity to suggest this technology is too costly to implement.

This seems a ludicrous statement when we consider the employment of a fourth official at matches whose ineffectual purpose

> is to prevent managers from stepping outside their designated zones and to hold aloft a digital board indicating substitutions and added time.

> His redundant presence would be better served sitting with a television crew, prepared for when referees require verification on a pending

goal issue, replaying and offering advice once checked.

Other sports not as affluent as football have employed a range of technologies to help with officiating. Tennis first introduced line technology in 1974.

Cricket has used a sensitive microphone system called the "snick-o-meter" to pick up the sound of ball on bat since 1999 and shortly after that in 2001, brought "Hawkeye" to the game, which shows the path of a ball. In 2006 the sport introduced another development called "Hot Spot" which uses infra-red cameras to determine the strike point of a ball.

Rugby too has introduced try-line technology, allowing the referee to consult with a fourth official to determine the legitimacy of a try and only tries.

Importantly all these sports have not only introduced technology, but also kept decision making powers with the aforementioned "human aspect", referees and umpires.

In tennis, players are allowed a certain number of challenges to line calls. In cricket, players are similarly allowed to query an umpire's decision, again with a

And rugby also gives captains the opportunity to review incidents and allows the use of replays after matches to cite players who have infringed laws that were not identified during games.

There should be the introduction of goalline video replays in football matches and post-match citations for any incident during a game. This would mean referees would not have to put up on-pitch delinquents harassing them at close quarters.

In today's game, professional football players have it all too easy across the board. With their over-inflated paychecks, matched only by their egos, these players bask in the spotlight of premature publication of their autobiographies and messy paternity suits. They bring the game into disrepute.

If football does not catch up with the momentum of technology in sport, gentlemanly conduct and fair play will be lost.

After all, we don't want to have "a game for thugs, played and organized by thugs."






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
