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Patong land under probe

65 rai in question on sale at Bt 4 billion

THE Public Sector Anti-Corruption Commission (PACC) conducted a survey of land on Phuket's west coast to investigate two chanote title deeds covering a total of 65 rai that were placed on the market at 4 billion baht.

The investigation team visited the land plots overlooking Freedom Bay in Patong on June 24.

Secretary-General Amphol Wongsiri, who led the team, said consultation with officials from the Royal Forest Department revealed that the title deeds were issued illegally as the land lies in a national forest reserve.

"The first step is to investigate all officials who had any authority in approving these documents," Mr Amphol added.

Evidence showed that involvement goes as high up as former high-ranking government officials, Mr Amphol explained.

"Surveyors and officials from the

Phuket Provincial Land Office and the Forest Resource Management Office 12, based in Krabi, also took part in the approval of these illegal land documents," Mr Amphol said in a statement issued through the


The statement says that Somchai Piensathaporn, director-general at the Royal Forest Department, sent a document issued on September 22, 2010 to a then-senior government official explaining that the two plots were located in a national reserve and that therefore title deeds could not be lawfully issued.

The official approved the chanotes later that month, "but in his rush he forgot to place an official stamp on the documents," Mr Amphol said.

The PACC investigation has revealed that 200 million baht was paid to officials for approval of the illegal deeds, he said.

Additional evidence is being collected to send to the Bangkokbased National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC).

Secretary-General Amphol and his team also investigated two other illegal title deed cases while they were in the region.

One involved the unlawful eviction of villagers from a 25 rai plot behind Suan Luang Park in Phuket Town, he said.

The other was related to a 76-rai plot of public forest land and an Islamic graveyard in Koh Yao Yai in Phang Nga province.

Mr Amphol's investigation into the land plots was televised nationwide on Channel 7's nightly news program Pradended.

Body of missing Aussie tourist found offshore at Karon

THE body recovered a kilometer offshore from Karon Beach on Thursday morning has been confirmed as that of missing Australian tourist Jennifer Laidley.

Ms Laidley, 44, disappeared while swimming further south on Karon Beach just after sunset on Monday.

"Ms Laidley and her friend arrived at the beach at about 7:15pm, after the lifeguards closed the beach and went home," said Uten Singsom, head of the Phuket Lifeguard Club contingent assigned to patrol Karon Beach.

Mr Uten explained that Ms Laidley went lifeguards joining the effort by using their for a swim while her friend went for a walk along the beach for about 15 minutes.

"When her friend came back to where Ms Laidley's clothes were lying on the beach at about 7:30pm, she couldn't see Ms Laidley anywhere. So she asked taxi drivers nearby for help and the drivers suggested she report it to officers at the Karon Police Box," he said.

On reciving the report that Ms Laidley was missing, rescue agencies launched an immediate search that continued late into Monday night.

The search resumed the next day, with

jet-skis to comb the waters of Karon Bay, said Mr Uten.

Karon lifeguard Phachoke Jamjareonjan finally found Ms Laidley's body floating about a kilometer offshore from the Nong Harn Lagoon at the northern end of Karon Beach at about 8:15am on Thursday.

Ms Laidley's companion Lisa Cosland confirmed the identity before her flight home to Australia Thursday afternoon.

Ms Cosland thanked the Karon Municipality Tourist Rescue service and all the other organizations who took part in the search for her friend.

Car thief finds 'God', surrenders to police

OVERWHELMED by a guilty conscience, a woman with 14 outstanding arrest warrants for car theft surrendered herself on Monday to Phuket Police.

Cherry Piwsa-ard ("Cherry Clean-skin") told officers at Patong Police Station last night that "God" had appeared to her in a dream and ordered her to surrender herself to authorities.

Police Duty Officer Rattaket Manmuang say Miss Cherry told officers she was a native of Ayutthaya province who formerly enjoyed a life of luxury as the wife of a well-to-do foreigner.

"I had invested in a business with friends and spent millions of my husband's money, but I was cheated by my friends. So he broke up with me. That was my fault," he quoted Miss Cherry, 32, as saying.

Mired in personal debt, Miss Cherry became involved with an acquaintance who ran a racket stealing cars and selling them in the southern border provinces.

Her first theft was of a Honda Jazz that she rented out for a few days at 1,000 baht per day, then sold for 60,000 baht, she said.

Her string of thefts continued

until she had stolen 13 more cars.

She was paid 60,000 baht for a typical compact car, and up to 100,000 baht for a Toyota Fortuner, she said.

Part of the money was used to pay off debt because she was afraid of her creditors, she explained.

"I have been unable to sleep well lately because I have done

wrong to so many people. Then God visited me in my dreams last night," police quoted her as say-

"If I could somehow pay back the owners of the cars I stole, I would do it," she said.

Korean charged over drunk driving death

A KOREAN man is facing a manslaughter charge after a head-on collision resulted in the death of Rik Johannes de Jong, 51, from the Netherlands.

Mr De Jong was well known among foreign expats as the restauranteur of The Secret Cove restaurant at Ao Yon.

He had operated the restaurant with his Thai wife since 2009.

Mr De Jong was riding his motorcycle along Pattana Thongthin Road in Wichit at he was struck by a pickup driven by a Korean man, said Phuket

City Police Duty Officer Ekkasit Pinkaew.

Mr De Jong was dead at the scene, he said.

"At first the Korean man did not allow me to breathalyze him. He was slurring and could only speak Korean, we had to wait until we brought him back to the police station to test him," said Lt Col Ekkasit.

He declined to name the Korean man charged.

Mr De Jong's body was taken about 4:30am on June 25 when to Chalong Temple, where it was cremated last Saturday.

Jealous cop murders wife, self

A POLICEMAN shot his wife point-blank then turned the gun on himself in the latest murdersuicide in Phuket.

Patong Police identified the victim as 25-year-old Suchapha Saman-iam, wife of Snr Sgt Maj Boonsuk Saman-iam, 39.

According to eyewitness accounts, the shooting took place at about 8pm at the couple's home on Nanai Road, where they operated the Yaris Design woman's fashion tailor shop.

Witnesses, including Miss Suchapha's mother, said officer Boonsuk was convinced his wife was having an affair with another man, as he had heard rumors and his wife never picked up his phone

Officer Boonsuk was on duty all day July 3 providing security for the general election, during

which time he tried to call her many times, to no avail.

He returned home after delivering ballot boxes to Phuket Rajabhat University, where the votes were counted.

When Mrs Suchapha returned home, she told him she had been with friends at the Phuket Variety weekend market on the outskirts of Phuket Town.

He did not believe this and a violent argument ensued. It ended with officer Boonsuk, still in uniform, drawing his 9mm service revolver and shooting his wife in the head from point blank range at the back of the boutique.

After that he turned the gun to his own skull and fired.

The two bodies, lying face-up and foot-to-foot, were taken to the hospital for examination and storage until they are claimed by relatives.

The couple had been married four years and leave behind one child, a girl.

Marine chief launches coral smuggling crackdown

THE Director of the Marine and Coastal Resources Conservation Office (MCRC) in Phuket has warned coral smugglers against the practice, after investigations showed continuing illegal activity.

"Despite ongoing publicity on this matter, smuggling and illegal sale of coral continues. The latest case was on July 3, when volunteers in Cherng Talay informed MCRC staff that there was a market vendor selling bracelets made from coral," office director Pitul Panchaiyaphum said.

Further investigation led authorities to the Surat Thani home of Komon Patchan, who was arrested for dealing in bracelets made from pieces of dead coral. Collected at the scene were 120 bracelets and 20 pieces of coral.

Thailand's Wildlife Preservation and Protection Act 1992 prohibits the trade of protected wildlife, the remains of protected wildlife or products made from their remains.

Coral of all types are categorized as protected species

Land holdings under fire

90% of prime Phuket land controlled by foreigners, claims Land Dept

PHUKET leads all of Thailand in the amount of land held by foreigners, with up to 90 per cent of prime beachfront land being illegally held through Thai nominees, claims one of the country's top land officials.

Speaking at a recent seminar on legal issues relating to land ownership, Land Inspector Sriracha Charoenpanit said Thailand's positive characteristics, that include friendly people and hospitality, made it an attractive place for foreigners to seek a home, work and acquire land.

The cumulative effect of this had been a growing problem of land ownership though Thai "nominees", he was quoted as saying in a Thai-language report on the state-run MCOT website.

Thailand was one of many countries experiencing this problem, he said.

"Thailand must rectify these problems by tightening up existing laws and adding stricter conditions regarding land ownership by foreigners. This must include penalizing violators, in-

cluding the nominees," he said.

In response to the problem, new legislation is currently being drafted and expected to be made law in August. The new legislation will make it easier to prosecute violators, the head of the Land Department said.

Mr Sriracha explained that the law being drafted will be similar in principle to the anti-money laundering laws.

The law would also expand legal measures, better define what constitutes a violation and specify penalties, he said.

Penalties for Thai nominees could rise to as much as double the existing punishments, while foreigners found guilty will have their land seized before being deported, he said.

Mr Sriracha said foreigners had already acquired about one-third of all land within the country, about one billion rai.

The land grab was most prominent in resort destinations such as Phuket, Koh Samui and Koh Chang, where foreigners currently hold land to run resorts or have second homes, he said in his speech.

Failure to stop the problem would put Thais at a competitive disadvantage, restricting their access to land and putting the national food supply in jeopardy, he said.

The bill should be ready in August. If passed into law, inspections would follow, he said.

After the speech Mr Sriracha confirmed in an interview that initial surveys by land inspectors found Phuket had more land controlled by foreigners than any other province, with the figure reaching to 90 per cent in beachfront areas.

Similar situations existed in Pattaya, Cha-am, Hua Hin and parts of Chiang Mai and Chiang Rai, he said.

CCTV puts rape allegation in doubt

IMAGES captured on CCTV and other evidence have cast doubt over a British woman's claim that she was raped at knifepoint by a Patong tuk-tuk driver, police say.

The 21-year-old woman reported the alleged assault to Cherng Talay Police last Tuesday.

The woman said she hired a tuk-tuk in Patong to take her back to her room at a resort in Cherng Talay, but was instead taken by the driver and his companion to Tri Trang Beach at the south of Patong Bay, where she was robbed and raped, she said

The case has been transferred to Patong Police, where Superintendent Arayapan Pukbuakao said CCTV images recorded that evening showed the woman leaving central Patong on a motorbike with a Caucasian man.

If a rape did take place it was probably not perpetrated by a tuktuk driver, he said.

The tuk-tuk driver who returned the woman to the resort, initially questioned by Cherng Talay Police, has denied any involvement.

A Cherng Talay Police investigator who asked his name to be withheld told the *Gazette*, "Our investigation started with the hotel security guard who records vehicles entering and leaving the resort. We found out that a tuktuk driver sent her back to the hotel at around 5am."

The woman had abrasions and other wounds to her thighs and legs, he confirmed.

"We suspected the tuk-tuk

driver until we checked CCTV footage and found that he lived in Phuket Town," he said.

"He said he didn't do anything to her. He found her in the Tri Trang Beach area, then brought her to the Patong Police box on the beach road, across from Soi Bangla. Patong Police tried to question her at that time, but she was unintelligible so police advised her to get some rest then come back for questioning later," he said.

"Our investigation revealed that she and a [female] friend went to Seduction [nightclub] and then separated, each going with a different foreign [Caucasian] man," he said.

Patong Police have not yet identified the foreigner, he said.

"At that time she was drunk, so it is not sure whether she remembered the event or not. Her body had some scratches, probably sustained when running away from something," said the officer.

Paiboon presses Pheu Thai for progress

PHUKET Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) President Paiboon Upatising has wasted no time in appealing to Yingluck Shinawatra's new Government, now taking shape, to tackle the problems from the rising cost of living as soon as possible.

"I would like to ask the new Cabinet to continue supporting infrastructure improvements on the island, including construction of the International Convention and Exhibition Center [ICEC] and improved security across Phuket," he told the media on Tuesday.

The ICEC, set to be built on 140 rai of Treasury Department land on the island's northern tip

in Mai Khao, received the Abhisit government's approval of 2.6 billion baht in funding under the *Thai Khem Khaeng* ("Strong Thailand") fiscal stimulus package.

It seemed as close as ever to becoming a reality, even after the

revelation last May that the site was located in a tsunami hazard zone would need to be redesigned.

Both of Phuket's recentlyelected Democrat Party MPs have assured that the project will continue to move forward under Pheu Thai, but political changes at the national level have a long history of derailing Phuket's decades-old dream of having a world-class convention center.

Mr Paiboon was more curious about the future of the project, saying it would now be up to the new government to push the project through. He encouraged them to do so, citing Phuket's need for such a facility and promising coordination and support from the *OrBorJor*.



No election violence: Police

THE police crackdown in Phuket in the run-up to the July 3 election landed a bumper haul of guns, drugs and arrests - but resulted in no arrests for violence related to the election.

A total of 45 factory-made and homemade guns were seized and 350 people were arrested for drugs since May 12, according to statistics issued last Monday by Phuket Provincial Police.

More than 5,000 ya bah (methamphetamine) pills and 350 grams of ya Ice (crystal methamphetamine) were seized in raids and at road checkpoints across the island, along with more than 35 grams of marijuana and more than 20 kilograms of kratom, an indigenous plant ingested as a stimulant.

The crackdown was played out in four separate periods.

From May 12 to 26, officers seized 12 guns and arrested 12 people for possession of unlicensed firearms, while 142 people were arrested for drugs.

Two people were arrested for assault in incidents not related to the election.

From May 30 to June 12, police seized 16 guns and arrested 18 people on firearms charges,

and arrested 97 people for drugs. Three cases of assault were reported resulting in two arrests.

From June 16-30, the crackdown netted 15 more illegal guns with 17 related arrests being made, and a further 102 people being arrested for drugs. Five cases of assault during the period resulted in four arrests.

Lending a hand, Muang District officers on June 22 arrested two men in possession of two unlicensed BB guns - one rifle and one pistol. The men were caught passing through a checkpoint in front of the Phuket Shooting Range near Chalong Circle.

Muang District officers also arrested two men with 30 ya bah pills on June 25 with drug-sniffing dog Bebe the beagle's first bust at Suan Luang Park in Phuket

The only election-related incidents during this period were two business operators – one in Muang District and the other in Tung Tong, Kathu - being charged with selling alcohol during prohibited hours for the absentee voting on June 26, and Tah Chat Chai Police arresting one person for destroying election campaign post-

The last period of the campaign began last Friday and continued through Thursday this week.

At the time of going to press, police had made seven arrests for drugs and charged one shop owner in Muang District for selling alcohol during election hours during the period.

Tah Chat Chai police had also made another arrest: one person was caught burning election campaign boards.





Phuket leads nation in 'no vote' balloting

PHUKET had the highest percentage of "No Vote" ballots cast in the country, according to the latest unofficial results that accounted for 98 per cent of votes

In total, 15,996 of Phuket voters (8.66%) on Sunday put an X in the appropriate boxes, denoting they did not wish to cast a ballot for any of the candidates or parties listed.

In the same category, Ranong province was the runner up with 7.78%, followed by Chumphon (6.82%), Nakhon Pathom (6.82%) and Phetchaburi (6.62%).

According to statistics, 2.74 % of voters nationwide cast "no votes" for the party list ballot, while 4.04% did the same for the constituency candidate ballot.

Out of about 47 million eligible voters in Thailand, 34.8 million (about 74 %) cast votes at 94,216 polling stations across the country's 77 provinces and the special administrative zone of Bangkok.

The top five provinces in terms of voter turnout were: Lamphun

(86.64%), Trang (81.97%), Chiang Mai (81.27%), Satun (80.74%) and Ratchaburi (80.73%).

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Culture carrier returns

SIX years since their last visit aboard MV *Doulos*, the crew aboard MV *Logos Hope* will be returning to Phuket, bringing with them more than 5,000 books as part of their "global mission to serve humanity".

The *Logos Hope* is twice as large as any previous vessel operated by German-based charity GBA Ships, including the *Doulos*, which visited Phuket in 2006.

The *Doulos*, at the time the world's oldest passenger liner, was built two years after the *Titanic*. She was sold to a Singaporean interest in 2009.

The 132-meter *Logos Hope* will drop anchor at Phuket Deep Sea Port at Ao Makham on August 17.

"The ship will be open to visitors from 10am to 9pm from Tuesday to Saturday. On Sunday and Monday, the ship will be open from 2pm to 9pm," said Brazilian Heverton Muniz, project manager of *Logos Hope*.

On board the goodwill ship are 400 volunteers from 45 different countries

"We stop over in each country for two weeks. All aboard are volunteers. We do not receive any money to work, but we receive training and are provided facilities to learn about different cultures," Mr Muniz said.

While in port the volunteers perform a variety of community projects to help locals in the host country.

"We have doctors on board, so during our visit in Liberia, Africa, for example, we provided dental care to local people," he said.

In addition to maintaining the huge library of books, the volunteers stage cultural events to educate and entertain visitors on

board.

At the opening of the ship's book fair in Galle, Sri Lanka on July 1, the crew held a Parade of Nations to showcase national costumes from a variety of cultures around the world.

"We have yet to set the entrance fee, but six years ago the fee was only 10 baht. So, we

would like to invite everyone to visit our ship," she said. Volunteer Nissie Attalaavnan-

Volunteer Nissie Attalaavnangoon was on board the *Doulos* when it visited Phuket six years ago.

"The reception last time was fantastic. Thousands of school students visited our ship, giving our crew the chance to learn more about Phuket.

"Our goal is not to sell books. We want to learn about the cultures of each country we visit," she said.

However, a nominal fee will be charged to come aboard.

Officials 'slash and burn' pirate goods

COUNTERFEIT goods worth more than 58 million baht were destroyed at the incinerator in Phuket Town last week as part of the nationwide crackdown on copyright infringement.

Before the serious destruction began, high-ranking officials and guests used box cutters to slash fake Louis Vuitton bags and Ralph Lauren shirts, while others smashed pirated DVDs with oversized sledgehammers.

"This is the first destruction of confiscated pirated products of the year. There are 95,038 items, of which 27,677 were seized by Phuket Provincial Police in copyright raids," said Pajchima Thanasanti, Director-General of the Department of Intellectual Property.

Among the 25 tons of illegal goods to be destroyed were 63,236 items seized by Customs officers in Phuket and their counterparts stationed at border crossings at Kantang, Sadao and Pedang Besar in Southern Thailand.

Topping off the pile were 4,125 items seized by officers from the Department of Special Investigations.

Of the 7.9 million baht in counterfeit goods seized in Phuket, garments were the most common, contributing 23,408 items to the pile.

A SWEDISH mother has appealed for help in finding her son, who has not been in contact since arriving in Thailand two months ago.

Writing from Sweden, Lise-Lott Carlberg informed the Gazette she had not heard from her 24-year-old son Michael since he landed in Bangkok on May 5.

"We know that he has been located in Bangkok, so I pray to you that you will help me to find my son. We have been in contact with the police, who advised us to get in contact with the media in Bangkok," she said.

Ms Carlberg described her son as 183cm tall, with blue eyes and of average weight.

"He has a scar right under his chin from a fall when he was a little boy," she added.

"All I can do is hope and pray that you will take this most seriously," said Ms Carlberg.

YINGLUCK Shinawatra is set to become Thailand's first female prime minister after the Pheu Thai Party romped home to victory in last week's general election.

Abhisit Vejjajiva resigned as leader of the Democrat Party to take responsibility for the result, which saw his party win just 159 seats against Pheu Thai's 265.

In her first speech after results showed her party on course for a sweeping victory, Mrs Yingluck thanked voters for their support.

"It is not the victory of the party, but a chance to serve the people," said the 44-year-old businesswoman who was a political novice just two months ago.

"We will implement every policy we promised during our election campaigns. We will not disappoint our people," she said.

The question most analysts

would try to bring Mrs Yingluck's elder brother Thaksin back to Thailand.

Mr Thaksin, who lives in selfimposed exile in Dubai to escape a jail sentence for abuse of power, had previously said he wanted to return to the country in December for his daughter's wedding.

But a proposed amnesty that would whitewash Mr Thaksin's conviction and allow him to return would be highly controversial and likely to meet fierce resistance.

Cambodia welcomes new government

CAMBODIA has welcomed the Pheu Thai Party's election victory, while the party has said mending relations with neighboring countries is a "top priority".

"We are delighted with the victory of the Pheu Thai Party. We hope the new government formed by the Pheu Thai Party will resolve border issues with Cambodia more positively than the previous government," Cambodian Foreign Minister Hor Namhong was quoted by Xinhua as saying.

"Cambodia wants a fair and peaceful solution on border conflict, based on international laws, good neighborhood and friendship between Cambodian and Thai peoples, and the judgment of the International Court of Justice in

Speaking after a meeting with coalition partners, prime-ministerin-waiting Yingluck Shinawatra said it was now an urgent task for her government to restore bilateral relations with neighboring countries.

Focus needed on the big picture

THE landslide election win by the Pheu Thai Party last weekend may strike fear in the hearts of some Phuket residents, but the new coalition government that forms should be given a chance to establish itself and make good on its promises to bring about national reconciliation and prosperity.

Things to look out for in the short term are the number of red-shirt leaders who are rewarded with prominent positions and how long it will take before amnesty proceedings begin to bring back Thaksin Shinawatra.

Even more interesting will be the extent to which the attractive-but-inexperienced Mrs Yingluck is allowed to guide policy on her own. Shortly after her win was announced, her brother-in-exile was giving interviews on state-run television from Dubai.

Although unintentional, the Orwellian images of Big Brother's talking head towering above the TV anchorman was sure to give some viewers a feeling of d j vu, conjuring up memories of chilling periods in recent history, like the daily assassinations that marked the early stages of the War on Drugs in 2003.

There are reasons for optimism, however. News of the Pheu Thai election win was met with an immediate surge in the SET index that is thought to reflect confidence by foreign investors.

Here in Phuket, with its all-important tourism industry, it is better to have a stable political situation in Bangkok than a government catering to our needs in the midst of street protests and turmoil in the capital.

A look at the two-and-a-half years of achievements of the Democrat-led coalition government highlights this fact.

In some ways this was a period when Phuket had unprecedented representation at the highest levels of power, with three sitting MPs including party list representative Chalermlak Kebsup, Anchalee Vanich Thepabutr serving as secretary to Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva and Thanyarat Achariyachai heading the senate committee on tourism.

We also enjoyed the services of two dynamic governors committed to provincial development.

But despite what would appear to have been a golden opportunity, apart from the airport expansion project, little has been done to improve the local tourism industry's infrastructure or sustainability. Important regulations affecting the industry that should have been dealt with by legislators, like the harmful alcohol control laws and pub closing times put in place under Thaksin, remain in place.

We would like to remind our newly-elected MPs as they enter the opposition that their job description is to help form legislation and national government policy, not only fight the drug problem in Pa Khlok or solve local traffic congestion issues.

Westerner's patience earns Thai citizenship

First PERSON

MANY people have asked me why I want to become a Thai citizen. I've lived in Thailand for more than half of my life and like many foreigners, have always been treated differently than the local Thai citizens. I have not been able to have a household registration or to own a business, much less be able to vote.

Foreigners have to continually deal with visa regulations and work permit guidelines in order to make a living. As a non-resident of Thailand and as a non-resident of England, where I was born, I felt like I lived in some sort of limbo, that I do not truly belong anywhere.

I like the idea that I am a fully participating citizen in the place that I choose to live, and becoming a citizen of Thailand has made me feel like this is my country where I can live my life without prejudice or discrimination because I am now Thai. Now I can be the director or shareholder of a company and can own more than 49 per cent of any business if I want.

It's a rather intimidating process becoming a Thai citizen. It took me over nine years dealing with the paperwork and the bureaucracy. My application stayed in the police department for eight years primarily because I could not

system. Eventually I was advised how to get my application approved. I also had to navigate through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for the final signature.

When it came time for my interview for citizenship, I faced a panel of seven high-ranking officials including a Vice Governor figure out how to get through the of Phuket, the head of the Tax Department and senior police officers. There were early morning visits to my home to verify that I was really married to a Thai man and when I was required to have my fingerprints taken, I was put in line with criminals at the Chalong Police Station.

There was a check with Interpol to confirm there were no outstanding international arrest warrants and I had to sing the Thai National Anthem in Thai. I surprised the panel when I showed my ability to do that in both the Central and Southern dialects

And now I am Thai. I have a Thai ID card which gives me access to signing legal documents and my name can now be put on my household registration. Moreover, I will qualify to get a pension some day.

I wanted to vote in last week's election, but there is a five-year waiting period for new citizens before they can vote. I feel privileged to be a more integrated member of the community. I am proud to be a Thai citizen.



Pheu Thai and Preah Vihear: Critical issue or pandering to voter heartland?

I am a foreigner living in Thailand with my Thai wife and our children. I have a non-immigrant "O" visa.

I hear horrible stories about work permits, the different interpretations of "work" and the consequences of not having a permit. These stories include being blacklisted regardless of your family ties and investments in Thailand.

I don't want to work here illegally. I love Thailand, its culture and the locals. I want to abide by the country's laws. I am a private online investor in stocks, commodities and currencies in foreign markets. I work from my home here in Thailand.

Setting up a Thai company is not an option. I want to avoid any misinterpretation by labor departments and/or immigration authorities and also any danger to my family by not abiding by local laws.

All my investment accounts, stock exchanges and brokers are located outside of Thailand. Is my work legal? Do I need to apply for any type of work permit?

Phuket Provincial Employment Office chief Noppadol Ployudee replies:

Stock investment is not lawfully defined as work. As long as you are not working, you do not need to apply for a work permit.

For example. If you are a share-

holder or an executive of a company, but you do not sign documents related to the daily functions of that company, you do not need a work permit.

However, you must pay income tax if you receive stock dividends.

The only documentation that we are authorized to issue to foreigners working here is a work

If you do not work, there is no official documentation that can be issued to you.

Registering a trailer

How do I register a boat trailer? My boat trailer was made in the USA and came with the boat.

I have a utility trailer, made locally in Pattaya. I can't get blueprint drawings for either trailer.

The registrar at the Department of Land Transport, Phuket branch, replies:

If the boat trailer is already in Thailand, you have to bring to the Department of Land Transport the trailer and all the documents that you got from the Customs checkpoint where you entered Thailand.

If you don't have blueprints for the trailers, it won't be a problem because we have our own engineering department. You can bring your trailers to the department and get the engineering drawings later. The first step is to bring all the Customs documents to the department for us to review.

Green balls to fix dirty water

IMPLEMENTING effective micro-organism (EM) balls to dilute wastewater before discharging it is practical, cost effective and could save Phuket hotels and resorts millions of baht.

Spearheading the eco-friendly initiative, is Kata-Karon Municipality by stepping up its campaign for hotels not hooked up to its wastewater mains to use EM balls. The move follows the publicity fallout of the German TV documentary crew which filmed untreated wastewater at Karon and Kata beaches in May.

"A hospital in Chainat province reportedly saved over 300,000 baht a year in wastewater treatment. On the other hand, the overall cost of producing EM balls was roughly a few thousand baht

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Itthiporn Sangkaew.

"Phuket businesses can benefit a great deal from this technique. The first time I observed it in action was in Saraburi province, where the technique was developed. Since then, many hospitals and schools in that region have been using EM balls to treat wastewater," he added.

According to information provided by the municipality, EM balls can be made at home using only bio-waste from fruits and vegetables and a certain mixture of "good" bacteria that has the ability to neutralize or kill bacteria harmful to the environment.

The micro-organisms are added to the mixture of bio-waste and left to ferment. During this time the good bacteria multiplies inside the bio-waste mixture. Given time,

a year," said Karon Deputy Mayor the resulting mixture contains enough good bacteria to effectively treat dirty water.

Initially, a few hotels in Karon showed interest in the project, but now more hotels are seeing the cost-saving benefits and are following suit, said Mr Ittipong.

"Karon hotels alone produce more than 10 tons of bio-waste each day. The waste, which would otherwise end up as garbage, can be used to make EM balls in order to fight other environmental problems," said the deputy mayor.

"There are many ways in which hotel and business operators can use EM balls. For example, simply placing them in urinals, toilets and along wastewater canals can greatly help reduce harmful bacteria." he said.

"As a result, the wastewater hotels discharge will be safer and safer for the environment. After treat-

ment, the wastewater is often good enough for watering plants and gardens and hence can be recycled for this purpose. In this respect, hotels can reduce water usage and save on costs," he added.

Karon Municipality is leading the initiative by collecting biowaste and turning it into EM balls, which will be widely distributed.

Simply throwing these biowaste balls into ponds, canals and waterways can make a huge difference in improving the quality of water that flows into the sea, the deputy mayor said.

Third Big C now under construction off Thepkrasattri

CONSTRUCTION of a third retail outlet by Big C is now underway on Thepkrasattri Road in Phuket, the *Gazette* has learned.

Staff at the Sinsuk Thani project office in Thalang told the Gazette last week the company rented out a large plot of land in Rassada to the retailer and that construction was already underway.

The new Big C will be Phuket's third, following the firm's takeover over of the Carrefour store in the Jungceylon shopping complex in Patong.

The store, to be in a smaller for-

mat than the Big C hypermarket on the Bypass Road, will be located just north of the Rajabhat University Junction, on Thepkrasattri Road southbound in Rassada.

Sinsuk Thani will retain part of the land located behind the project for future development after the new store in complete, the staff member said.

With its takeover of Carrefour's stores in Thailand, Big C has over 110 locations nationwide and is now the country's second largest chain of retail outlets.

PHEU THAI ELECTION WIN

Business as usual?

PHEU Thai's landslide victory in the general election last Sunday gives the party the right to form the new government. Leading up to the election, the party's campaign platform was rich in policies which promised to bring prosperity to the Thai economy. The following list includes some of the promises.

ROADS

DESPITE Pheu Thai's relatively low popularity in the southern region – having failed to win a single seat in any of the 14 provinces – the party has pushed forth its Southern Economic Bridge promise to develop a "land bridge" or "gateway", which would be a super-highway linking deep-sea ports on the Gulf of Thailand and the Andaman Sea.

If carried out, the project would incorporate Nakhon Sri Thammarat, Surat Thani, Phan Nga, Krabi and Phuket provinces – opening a strategic shipping channel between the Indian and Pacific Oceans that would allow ship cargo to bypass the traditional sea passage via the Strait of Malacca. This proposal has received less resistance than the previous one, which involved digging a canal through the Isthmus of Kra. Like many infrastructure mega-projects being considered for more than a decade, the highway proposal has yet to materialize due to the lack of funding.

Another promise echoed in Pheu Thai's southern election campaign was to expand Highway four (Phet Kasem Road) from two to four lanes. The sections poised for an upgrade run through Chumphon, Ranong, Phang Nga and Krabi provinces.

TAXES & WAGES

Pheu Thai also said it will raise the nationwide minimum daily wage rate to 300 baht. Since its election victory, the party announced that the change will take effect from January 2012. Currently, the minimum daily wage rate varies in each province. The lowest daily rate is 151 baht in Pichit, Payao and Mae Hong Son provinces, while the highest rate of 226 baht per day is in Phuket.

The party promised it will also raise the minimum salary for Bachelor's Degree holders up to 15,000 baht. The salary boost will first be applied to civil servant positions, followed by positions in the private sector. Currently, the extend the Airport Link from

minimum monthly salary for government entry level jobs is just under 9,000 baht-a-month for Bachelor's Degree holders 12,000 baht for Masters' Degree holders.

FUEL

There has also been a promise to issue an "energy credit card" to taxi, tuk-tuk, van and motorcycle drivers, to allow them a petrol or gas credit limit equal to 80 per cent of their estimated monthly energy expenses. For example, a taxi driver who normally spends 10,000 baht a month on petrol, could rack up a debt of 8,000 baht each month on his energy credit card.

RAIL

The party promised a high-speed rail link between Chiang Mai and Rayong via Korat. This may be good news for northerners, but it will not necessarily guarantee that a strategic link to China would ensue, as was popularly touted in the Democrat's proposal of a rail link to Nong Kai, rather than Chiang Mai.

Pheu Thai has also promised to

Suvarnabhumi Airport in Bangkok to Chachoengsao, Chonburi and Pattaya. This is in addition to adding 10 more Bangkok Transit System routes in the Bangkok metro area and setting a flat fare rate of 20 baht per trip.

LAND

The party promises to make Bangkok and its vicinity floodproof by building off-shore flood gates and reclaiming more than 300 square kilometers of damaged shorelines, as well as developing the central and eastern seaboard regions into financial, IT, fishery and tourism hubs of Asia.

THE SKY'S THE LIMIT

To demonstrate just how high the Pheu Thai is aiming, one of the promises highlighted on the policy

page of the party's website is to invite foreign investors to construct the world's tallest building as a landmark for Thailand. As of yet, there have been no plans, studies or budgets announced regarding the proposed project. The one assurance the party did give is that it would not borrow capital to build it or any of its other mega-projects.

Currently, the world's tallest building is the Burj Khalifa tower in Dubai. Standing at 828 meters high, it cost US\$1.5 billion and took nearly six years to complete. In Kuwait, the Burj Mubarak al Kabir project has already received approval from the Kuwaiti government and could be completed by 2016. It is expected to reach over 1km in height and cost more than US\$7 billion to build. So the stakes are high – financially and literally.

Harbor expansion on hold

PLANS by Seatran Travel to build a shipyard adjacent to the Rassada Harbor are on hold, awaiting government approval.

Tanan Tanbhaibul, managing director of Seatran, said layout plans for the shipyard on four rai of land north of Rassada Harbor have been completed and the company has already applied with the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) to use the site.

Seatran Travel operates the Rassada Harbor under a 30-year contract with the OrBorJor that began five years ago. The port, on the south bank of Khlong Tah Cheen in Rassada, is the main departure point for tourists heading to Koh Phi Phi in Krabi by ferry.

If approved, the project will include a shipyard and slipway, as well as adding about 60 meters of additional berthing facilities to the existing harbor.

"This project can handle the growing numbers of boats consistent with the number of domestic and foreign tourists travelling to Phuket and nearby provinces. The facility will be focused on integrating rapid, high-quality services. These will range from dry-docking bottom cleaning, high water pressure bottom washing, painting, hull repair, custom fabrication and power system overhaul," said Mr Tanan, who is also president of the Phuket Real Estate Association.



The project would also include boat construction and floating repair facilities, he said.

In addition to the land use request, Seatran is also awaiting approval from the Marine Department, Mr Tanan added.

Get your browsers right

IF YOU have a pirate copy of Windows the source - the vector - for more infec-XP and you've never updated your web browser, chances are very good you're still running Internet Explorer 6 (IE 6), and – forgive me for saying – chances are also very good that your system's been infected.

If you have a pirate version of Windows,

and you're running IE 6, even if you're using a good antivirus program I'd guess there's at least a 50-50 chance that

you're infected with a rootkit right now. A more realistic figure is 80 per cent or more. Which means everything you're typing into your PC, and much of what's stored on your PC, has already been sent to somebody, somewhere, without your knowledge or approval.

Of course it's important that you get a legal copy of Windows. I've written about that before; if you need details, drop by one of our Sunday morning Computer Clinics and I'll step you through the process. Once you have a legal copy of Windows, it's also vitally important that you install and update a good antivirus program. My personal preference is Microsoft Security Essentials, which is free, unobtrusive, very capable, and easy to use.

But it's also important that you get your browsers updated. Internet Explorer 6, which ships with Windows XP, has been tions than any other piece of software, ever. To see what version of Internet Explorer (IE) you're using, start IE, hold down the Ctrl key and press H, to bring up the Help menu, then click on About Internet Explorer.

If you have Windows XP, the latest version is Internet Explorer 8. For Vista or

Windows 7, the latest version is IE 9. You should upgrade to the latest version. IE 8 and 9 can both be downloaded

on Microsoft's web site, specifically at is.gd/Y4WXq5 and is.gd/dBMdM0.

If you've never tried Firefox (version 5, getfirefox.com) or Google's Chrome (version 12, google.com/chrome), give one or the other a try. They're both excellent browsers that you can install with a couple of clicks and run side-by-side with Internet Explorer, with no problematic interactions at all. Personally, I use Chrome most of the time, but you should give them all a try (even IE!) and pick the one you like the most.

Even if you use Firefox or Chrome, keep Internet Explorer updated so you don't get broadsided by a security hole.

The people who answer questions on the forum have access to the development and support teams, so they can frequently get very accurate answers to complicated questions.

problem would go away. With hindsight, it would have probably have been less painful to have taken a smaller pain in Bear Sterns than wait to do that when the bigger Lehman brothers mess happened. It appears nothing has been learned, as now Greece is being handled the same way as Bear

Research house Capital Economics recently said that we continue to think the markets are complacent about the potential implications of the crisis in Greece both for the rest of the eurozone and the global economy as a whole. But Greece still has the scope to be the next Lehmans, or at least the next Bear Stearns.

There is a widely held view that the fall-out from a Greek default would be limited and easily contained. After all, Greece is a small country and the bulk of Greek government debt is now owned either by Greek banks or by other eurozone governments, the ECB and the IMF. Nor would a Greek default be a major surprise.

While global markets may possibly ride out a Greek default without much difficulty, there are four reasons why markets may be too sanguine.

First, there's a lot of uncertainty about ripple effects throughout the global financial system.



Greece's debt crisis needs to be dealt with to minimize ripple effects.

Second, a Greek default would crystallize and deepen the worries about the dire state of the public finances in many countries.

Third, a Greek default would inevitably increase the pressure on other weaker members of the monetary union, notably Portugal, Ireland and perhaps Spain and Italy.

Finally, and perhaps most important of all, a Greek default would be another step on the road to an eventual break-up of the eurozone. At the very least, a Greek default would be a fatal blow to the credibility of those European policymakers who have resisted it at every stage.

The result is that Greece certainly has the potential to become the sovereign equivalent to the Lehman Brothers. Policymakers might therefore conclude from the Lehmans episode that Greece cannot be abandoned. But the German public in particular is taking some convincing and the Greek people themselves may decide that the price of interna-

What's more, even if Greece is rescued, the appetite and resources for another bail-out would surely be limited. Greece might therefore end up as the next Bear

tional support is simply too high.

before patience runs out. Overall, the argument that Greece is too small to matter and a default is somehow fully priced in does not seem to be widely accepted.


The euro still looks vulnerable to growing uncertainty about the future of the single currency, while there are more upsides for safe havens like US Treasuries and gold.

These are tough times to be a global asset allocator indeed. But in the meantime, multi-asset, multimanager funds are the way to go whilst, above all, remaining liquid.

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With fear it's fight or flight

A hands-on approach to therapy giving hope to people battling fear, trauma and phobias in Phuket

IT WAS the late Friedrich Nietzsche who once said, "I assess the power of a will by how much resistance, pain, torture it endures and knows how to turn to its advantage."

Although Nietzsche's words were uttered more than a century ago, the German philosopher's remark casts a long shadow on mankind's quest to conquer our

Fight or flight with our past is the conundrum mankind is entrenched in. Do we face our inner demons or flee to avert them? How do we live a life free of trauma?

Today across the globe, soldiers return from battlefields bearing horrific physical and mental scars, and victims of rape or child abuse live tight-lipped in fear of confronting their pasts. There are those who carry the death of a loved one on their shoulders, or those who harbor phobias that overrun their lives, but don't seek help.

We are the victims of our selfprotective tendencies. We are locked in our reasoning, controlled by our logic. We know that to confront fear and trauma is to relive it - so we don't.

All those suffering in silence will be glad to know that Emotional Freedom Technique (EFT), a form of psychotherapy capturing the imagination of health professionals around the world, is now here in Phuket.

FINDING SALVATION

Phuket's Tim Robins is used to hearing people's most intimate secrets, their hopes, fears and their traumas.

He is used to people crying. He is their shoulder, and in many cases their salvation.

But the 34-year-old from Warwick, England, doesn't claim to be a healer.

Despite helping more than 500 people through 1,600 sessions of EFT and also NLP (Neuro Linguistic Programming), Tim is adamant

that breaking free from trauma is achieved through people's acceptance of their own emotions.

The only EFT therapist on Phuket, Tim suspects he may be the only one in the whole country.

He explains that EFT is based on the idea that energy flows around the body on meridian lines, which can become blocked by negative emotions.

Or as American Gary Craig, who founded EFT in the early 1990s, says: "The cause of all negative emotions is a disruption in the body's energy system."

EFT tapping follows the same principles as acupuncture to release energy, but without needles.

Craig's EFT derives from the earlier meridian-tapping technique of Thought Field Therapy (TFT) of the 1980s, morphed from Kinesiology.

Both fields are evolutions of ancient Eastern "meridian energy" techniques, dating back to 1000BC.

'Our unresolved negative emotions are major contributors to most physical pains and diseases," Craig said.

Even Albert Einstein proclaimed in the 1920s that everything, including our bodies, is composed of energy – this would include our emotions.

This is what Tim and other EFT therapists around the globe deal with: disturbing emotional blockages which can cause physical pain, anxiety, depression or even phobias.

During an EFT session, Tim will tap on meridian points all over a person's body with his fingertips while discussing a trauma with the person in an effort to unblock the trapped emotions.

Tim has worked with people on Phuket who have all manner of emotional blockages that affect their physical behavior.

A woman with a fear of cockroaches, a war veteran plagued by guilt, a woman addicted to chocolate, a man trying to deal with the death of his brother: Tim has helped them all with EFT.

But these examples only scratch the surface of what EFT is being used for on a global scale.

FREUD WAS WRONG

Many practitioners of EFT, including Tim, view the Sigmund Freud model of "talk therapy" as lackluster in helping with trauma.

And Tim, who studied psychology at Bournemouth University, believes that his intensive study in the field taught him little about how to actually help people overcome their problems.

"I wanted to know the answers to questions like 'who we are as people?', but what I found was the diagnostic approach to the human condition.

"Physiological analysis is all about 'why?' Why did your father treat you that way? Why are you crying? Why do you feel bad? The only thing you can get from a why is a story," said Tim.

'Even if you get the reason, the right story, it doesn't stop the feeling, it just let's you know it's there."

Talking therapies fail to help trauma as it involves a part of the brain inaccessible through language.

EFT practitioners believe traumatic memories are stored in a part of the brain that controls emotions. Traumatic memories are not stored in our brains the way normal memories are, they persist and can feel as if they just happened. This is why trauma stays with us.

The tapping releases the traumatic experience from the emotional part of the brain.

"I'm interested in smashing the hell out of destructive memories that don't take us to a good place," said Tim.

But Tim says stigma still prevents many people from showing more interest in energy therapies.

"People think that they have a problem and that they cannot change who they are. The, 'I am who I am', type attitude.

"Many people with blockages are in general pretty balanced people. But I don't tend to meet many people like that. I meet many people who have hit a wall – the



end of the line type people."

"But this is for everyone. It is for any problem, no matter how small."

Although better known in America, health boards in the United Kingdom now use EFT to help trauma patients. The EFT movement is slowly ebbing into the minds of people around the world.

EFT'S INDELIBLE WORLD MARK

A quick search on the Internet will uncover thousands of testimonials for EFT.

On YouTube alone there are 4,700 videos dedicated to EFT from self-teaching methods and step-by-step courses, to amazing stories of people conquering ailments and adversities.

In one such video, American Pat Mason claims she was cured of her 80 allergies through EFT.

Then there's fellow American Hank Hadley's story.

Hank fell 25 feet down a hay chute when he was 10 years old.

He landed in a sitting position on concrete, compressing his spine. He had his first back operation in 1971. Others followed in 1972, 1979, 1984, 1992 and 2002.

"With each surgery the pain got worse...I lived in pain my entire life. I took Tylenol and Codine like candy.

Eventually diagnosed with multiple sclerosis, Hank was confined to a wheelchair for five years.

After discovering EFT, he embarked in regular sessions.

"EFT brought me out of the wheelchair and into arm crutches, then I gave up disability benefits and returned to work," he said.

"The multiple sclerosis is now non-existent in my body. I am 54 and I'm doing jumping jacks," he added.

There are hundreds of similar testimonials online from people all over the world, who claim the remarkable power of EFT.

These people are realizing that they are only the sum of their pasts. That the weight of their emotions make up their physical well-being.

These people chose fight instead of flight, and they seem happier for it.

But if there is any doubt in the skewed relationship between our thought and feelings, we should turn once more to the words of Nietzsche...

"Thoughts are the shadows of our feelings – always darker, emptier and simpler".

THE recovery of an Air France black box have fewer maintenance issues, also delast month deep in the Atlantic Ocean draws into focus the role of this guaranteed air crash "sole-survivor".

Two years had passed since an Airbus 330 mysteriously dropped off the radar, an incident that left many questioning whether new Internet technology could be employed to send information before an accident and prevent it happening.

Before considering alternatives, the 51year-old-technology of the black box must

first be examined and understood.

Painted in heat-resistant orange paint for high visibility, its official name is "flight data recorder". Mounted in the tail section, where it is more likely to survive a severe crash, it is made of a thin layer of aluminum.

This encases a stack of memory cards, a dry-silica material 2.54cm thick for high temperature insulation. The shell around this, made of stainless steel or titanium, is 0.64cm thick.

Inside the black box are recording devices, either solid state or the more reliable magnetic tape recorder.

The magnetic recorders stack a number of memory chips. This means they don't have moving parts and consequently creasing the chance of something breaking during a crash.

The black box was invented in 1957 by Dr David Warren, an Australian scientist, following a number of Comet jet crashes in the 1950s for which the causes were never

try to make it mandatory for all aircraft to carry a flight recorder. The rest of the world soon followed.

The fact that investigators found the black box of Air France Flight 447 – which went into a 10,000 feet per minute dive into the Atlantic Ocean off Brazil - intact and working after two years underlines the black box's technological excellence and importance in helping to solve the reasons for air crashes.

But why such reliance on a concept developed in the 1950s in today's highly technological world?

Why not implement technology that supplies information before a crash to prevent it from happening?

Such technology exists, though is not yet widely used. The automated flight information reporting system (AFIRS), or a "blue box", uses sensors to detect abnormal situa-

tions. It then transmits the information through telemetry technology to the airline operator, maintenance, the aircraft or engine manufacturer and others within 15 seconds.

AFIRS is a satellite communication system which operates through Iridium, a global satellite telephone system.

No human intervention is required to initiate a report, routine or otherwise.

Routine reports are typically sent every five minutes to include updated position reports, fuel on board and status summaries of the aircraft.

Iridium provides full global coverage for the Internet address.

The reason this system has not taken off is the start-up cost, which is about US\$

There is also an ongoing cost of a few dollars per flight hour, but this is insignificant compared to the consequences and cost of an accident.

Improvements in black box technology are also being developed.

The next stage will enable it to include video images and audio recordings of the last few seconds, or most probably the last 30 minutes, of flight.

General Motors in the United States has also been using black box technology in its cars for a decade, thus helping police with accident investigations.

In the meantime, though, the 51-yearold black box will remain the mainstream means of recording flight data.

THAI launches a direct connection with Scandinavia

THAI's flight TG953 is a 10hour, 35-minute flight, departing

Copenhagen 8:45pm on Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays and arriving in Phuket at 1:20pm the following day.

On the return, passengers can take any of THAI's daily flights from Phuket to Bangkok and connect with flights to Copenhagen.

THAI will operate three additional flights per week on the Bangkok to Copenhagen route, with new service for flight TG952 departing Bangkok 1pm on Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays, arriving in Copenhagen on the same day at 6.45pm. THAI already operates daily flights on the Bangkok-Copenhagen route aboard the Boeing 747-400 and also offers several flights per day on the Bangkok-Phuket route.



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Phuket has bags full of personality



Robots fight, and the movie ends. It would be unjust to say the film isn't an impressive achievement in special effects, but they are so fast and so big that director Michael Bay jumps to slow-motion in just about every scene. Rest assured, if a decepticon (an evil robot) lunges towards an autobot (a good robot), it's going to be in slow-mo.

And for reasons unknown, when a human is shown on screen, Bay seems to have insisted that the sun be over his or her shoulder,

sparkling into the camera. Once was pretty, twice was getting old, thrice was, "what's going on?"

Michael Bay has had a career full of memorable movies. He doesn't shoot for critical acclaim, but aims to thrill the masses of the general moviegoing public. His films, which include The Rock, Bad Boys, and Armageddon, are typically enjoyed by audiences because they're loud and fun. I enjoyed those films. Dark of the Moon is not like them. It's terrible.

Has the 3D fad run its course?

WITH Transformers: Dark of the Moon now in theaters, the most recent addition to the 3D revolution comes in the form of robot body fluids. That's right, director Michael Bay made robots so angry they spit when they talk, then rendered that spit into 3D so that it can literally fly in the faces of his audiences worldwide.

Somewhere in the midst of being virtually showered with robot spit, this writer stopped and asked himself, "Is this really what audiences want?"

A lot of moviegoers are wondering the same thing, recent data shows. According to the showbiz website Movie City News, Pirates of the Carribean 4: On Stranger *Tides* – the highest-grossing international film debut in history – had 66 per cent of its opening screens in 3D. Those screens, however, only accounted for 48 per cent of the film's revenue.

What does this mean? Audi ences crammed into 2D theaters which offered fewer showtimes - to avoid the "3D experience".

When the report was issued, Twitter went viral with comments on the issue. Parents vented on hearing their kids complain about having to wear the bulky glasses for two hours. Moviegoers ranted on how images on 3D screens can be up to 50 per cent darker than their 2D counterparts.

Kathu wild thing, I think I love you

CROCODILE, frog, snake and warthog aren't the first things that spring to mind when a Westerner thinks "bar snack".

But in Thailand, these delicacies belong to the food group known as Gup Gam (snack food to be devoured with alcohol).

And where better to sample these outlandish delights than in the jungle on the outskirts of Kathu waterfall, where there's an openair Thai-style restaurant called Kruew Phai Lin.

You can't get much closer to nature than this. Large trees with roots the size of human legs twist around the path in the restaurant.

All seating is alfresco and there are three options: right, left and center stage. There's a smattering of heavy-set stone tables and chairs on three tiers of dusty earth, forming a semicircular arena around the beating heart of this culinary-jungle amphitheater – the kitchen.

More than 30 people are already sat and eating, impressive, considering it's just gone midday on a Thursday.

We opt for a middle table as an extended family of chickens cluck

around our ankles approvingly.

As we eye the menu, the waitress tells us that all frogs used in the restaurant's dishes are sourced locally – very locally – from the jungle around you.

Wisps of eye-singeing chili smoke tease the nostrils and make us splutter as sizzling and clanging goes on in the corrugated-tin-roof kitchen nearby.

Our food order arrives: spicy stir-fried crocodile (180 baht), fried frog with garlic and pepper (120 baht), fried deer with ginger (180 baht) and spicy stir-fried wild boar (190 baht).

We order another stiff drink as we mull over whether we're going to eat what is front of us.

We take the plunge and each dip into a dish, and as we snack and sip our way through them, our initial apprehension fades.

Even though there are springy little legs that look poised to leap from the plate of fried frog, and crocodile meat that has an al-

most serrated outer-skin, it all tastes deliciously familiar.

The wild boar was, surprisingly, a bit chewier and fattier than regular pork and had thicker skin.

The venison dish was the spiciest, and tasted a lot like beef. The crocodile had the most distinctive and unusual taste and texture of the meal, but was our group's most popular dish.

The frog was crunchy and had a few bones, but at the risk of sounding predictable, tasted a lot like fried chicken.

Despite their popularity as a bar snack in the Kingdom, frogs are seen by some virtuous Thais as passive animals and eating them is believed to bring about bad karma.

So if you're superstitiously inclined perhaps opt for the

crocodile instead – it's aggressive and tasty.

But Kruew Phai Lin serves regular Thai dishes as well, also exceptionally flavorful.

All ingredients are bought market fresh each day by restaurant owner Suwanna "Bheung" Saeteon, 36, originally from Phang Nga.

It's the quality ingredients and menu variety that has kept the 60-or-so daily stream of customers coming for the past 17 years,

She also says the natural surroundings and atmosphere of the restaurant is a draw for customers.

But we suspect the restaurant's popularity may also have something to do with Bheung's skill and passion.

She's cooking away furiously as she speaks, adding meat and vegetables a into the steaming, sizzling wok, spinning it around and reaching for pinches of the huge variety of spices and herbs on the rack in front of her. Her movements in the kitchen are effortless, natural, at one with her surroundings – just like her restaurant.

And the reason she serves such bizarre dishes?

She just likes to give her customers something different to enjoy.

"I think a large part of people's happiness and wellbeing comes from eating, and I enjoy giving people the opportunity to feel good about themselves through serving them great tasting food," she adds.

Life & style Claire Cookson

CLAIRE Cookson is the smiling, welcoming face at Pepper's Bar and Restaurant at Tinlay Place near the entrance to Laguna Phuket. She bought the popular pub in 2004, and when she's not traveling around the world she runs the weekly quizzes which fill the place.

"We've had our weekly guizzes for years and our clients never seem to tire of them. We have seven categories, with one always a musical round where we play a song for 10 seconds and the contestants try to guess the name of it, or the artist."

The ongoing success of Pepper's has a lot to do with Claire's inviting personality. She makes her guests feel like they are coming to her home when they walk through the open fa ade.

She has not always been a publican. She was born near Newcastle and grew up outside Liverpool. After finishing school, she enrolled in a three year program to obtain a degree in Human Resources from a management school in Wigan.

She then joined her father's business, Flotec, which was a supplier of pneumatic and hydraulic products to industry.

Claire started when the company was small, with just five staff, including her mother who was the accountant. By the time she left in 2004, there were 160 employees.

"I was doing the HR in the business, but then it grew so large that I

eventually became Operations Manager in charge of the warehouse and distribution operations. My dad, who made the company such a success, suddenly passed away in 2004 and the family decided to sell. That's when I came to Phuket for the first time."

With enough capital to retire, Claire saw a future of adventure travel. But the opportunity to take over Pepper's from her brother who had an interest in the pub was also attractive. She decided to buy out the partners and operate on her own.

"I spent the first couple years managing the bar myself. It took awhile to learn to work within a very different culture, but by 2006 I was able to get away and started luxury traveling around Southeast Asia, staving in such places as Raffles hotels.

"But I regularly return and take over management duties at Pepper's as required."

Claire is in a position to live where she wants. She bought a house in Portugal a few years ago and has made trips to Argentina and Peru. She's been able to travel more now as she's taken a business partner, Pete Glover, who helps with operations at Pepper's.

While Claire plans another adventure abroad, she also thinks about expanding her business on Phuket. When the Kargo restaurant closed last year, she negotiated a lease and began renovations, and by March of this year opened Tapastree, a somewhat more upscale restaurant.


"My intention was to open a place for women to bring their partners for dancing. There really is not much for Western women to do on the island so I decided to open a type of club where a woman can dress up and have a civilized evening of entertainment."

As the name implies, Tapastree offers a full menu of tasty tapas as well as steaks from Australia and a DJ on the weekends.

Claire can be found most days moving between her two restaurants. She opens Pepper's at 8:30 every morning with the offer of a full English breakfast. And she closes her bars at around 1am. It all makes for a very full day for this dynamic woman.

"I'm lucky to get such a good response from tourists who return each vear. In the high season, I have a 50/ 50 balance of tourists and residents."

Claire bought a home at Laguna Phuket in 2005 and has learned to play golf with Martin Platt, of the Golf Guru. When she has free time. she enjoys reading and discovering new adventures on the internet.





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

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For cricket's sake: A field of dreams

Cricketers get a vision of their new pitch

MEMBERS of the Phuket Cricket Group (PCG) sub-committee met on June 27 for a groundbreaking ceremony as development of the Alan Cooke Ground (ACG) got underway.

Situated in the lakes area of Baan Liphon, the 10-rai site will be Phuket's first dedicated cricket facility and house a 250-squaremeter, two-storey club house.

The land is owned by Alan Cooke MBE who donated the plot to develop a facility to lift the profile of cricket on the island. The ground will also be used to host other sports and major events.

Tropical Landsaping International (TLI) has been selected for construction of the pitch. This process will involve laying a concrete wicket and then a synthetic

playing surface. Turfing the outfield of the ground is also part of TLI's remit.

"I am excited to be part of this project. TLI is carrying out the work as a service to the community and as our Managing Director, Alec Pettigrew, and I are keen cricketers," said Ben Davis, head consultant for TLI Asia Pacific.

Modern Z en Architecture, managed by Anthony Van Blerk, is responsible for the pavilion-style club house design which on the lower level includes: men's and women's changing rooms, showers and toilets.

On the upper level, there is a bar and dining area as well as a balcony for spectators.

Last week, the facility received a one million baht boost from an anonymous donor.

A press release from the PCG

indicated that 500,000 baht would be directly invested to ensure a quality finish for the clubhouse.

The remaining 500,000 baht will be put towards other facility improvements including a separate umpires' and scorers' room, nets training area and boundary fencing.

"I think most cricketers have a mental image of their ideal ground. The PCG sub-committee are all working to fulfill this vision, now shared by our donor," said Mr Cooke.

The contract for construction of the clubhouse has yet to be awarded, but an announcement is expected later this month and construction should start at the beginning of August.

It's all about the journey



THE intriguing twists and turns that led Mark Edleson from a career in the international financial services sector to that of green knight heading luxury hotel brand Alila is one well worth retelling.

Reinvention is something that somehow suits the tropical climate in Asia, or in some ironic sense mimics an old US Army recruitment slogan: "Be all that you can be".

Somerset Maugham hit the nail on the head in his epic *The Razor's* Edge with the words, "It's a tossup when you decide to leave the beaten track. Many are called, but few are chosen."

Mark's journey without maps went from corporate boardrooms at Citibank to becoming a founding partner of the respected GHM Indonesia and champion of a Chedi brand vision.

He later moved on with a wellness start-up, Mandara Spa Asia, which in time would be a leading global player and innovation pioneer.

With a taste of the hospitality business still fresh in his mind, he brought his combined experiences together with the purpose of developing a leading upscale boutique hotel and resort group that is now known as Alila.

Walking in someone's shoes is never easy; little thought is given to fit or terrain. A long trip can be as harsh as any moment in one's life. Such is the life of a hotel management start-up.

Having been involved in a startup in Hong Kong in the early 1990s that did succeed, I am intimately aware how soul destroying it is being the new kid on the block and having to compete with legacy chains and multinational behemoths. That vague look in people's eyes and piercing looks that scream out, "Who are you, again?"

But at the other end of the spectrum, all that rejection makes you hard, and somehow you get past the pain. People who have lived in Phuket for more than a few years might remember the pre-tsunami project on a Kamala hillside called Acqua, which was to be an Alila. Most people know it today as Allan Z eman's Andara.

In the hotel management game, sometimes you win, sometimes you lose. It happens to every brand, big or small.

Making a few trips down to Bali

in recent months, I have had the opportunity to visit Mark's properties in Ubud, Soori, Manngis and the latest in Uluwatu.

Alila Villas, set above a cliff overlooking a world-class vista, is perhaps one of Asia's best designed and conceived resorts.

Awards have been flowing in, from Forbes inclusion in its "Coolest Pools of the World" list to Conde Naste's "Best Hotels", and many others.

Perhaps more important is the focus on sustainability and social consciousness. The resort has garnered "Silver" certification from EarthCheck, plus a GreenGlobe design and building accolade.

An ongoing partnership with a nearby orphanage has linked into training programs, recycling and community-based activism, which is touching the lives of locals.

Despite some recent setbacks

in the Maldives, Thailand and Laos, Alila's pipeline is robust with a recent opening in the UNESCO destination of Siem Reap. More developments on the horizon in Vietnam and India are poised to take the brand further afield.

I always love attending hotel conferences in Asia when Mark is present, as we are often the only two not wearing ties. His sense of casual style and becoming comfortable in his own shoes make him a strong champion of Alila's lifestyle and commitment to quality.

Hopefully, one of these days Phuket will be lucky enough to host one of the brand's resorts.

If the Bali properties are any benchmark, the bar has been pushed high into the sky.

Brand Sheraton and Brand Laguna both prospered from the long-term business relationship.

With a reported US\$15 million renovation underway, and a new operator set to re-open the doors later this year under the Banyan Tree-affiliated Angsana moniker, all eyes are looking to the future.

Hillside home a lofty landmark





Teak and Makha wood finishes add style to the home.

VILLA 7 of the Ayara Kamala development, and its 160-million-baht price tag, recently hit Phuket's luxury home market. The house sits on the cliffs between Nakalay viewpoint and Kamala Beach – a 2.7 kilometer drive down the Layi-Nakalay Road.

The house has five bedrooms and six bathrooms spread throughout two storeys. Wood was used extensively in its construction which began in 2001 and was gradually completed over eight years. Teak is

used to beautiful effect as part of the structure and Makha wood was used for the furniture.

The upper floor features a large living room with a high ceiling and an attached kitchen. It is flanked on either side by two detached bedrooms and all three rooms have access to the expansive terrace, which includes a sala and an infinity pool that ends in a spectacular view of the Andaman Sea.

Moving downstairs reveals three additional bedrooms and a well furnished TV room, all connected by an open-air walkway.

LUXURY living

Each bedroom boasts its own balcony, swimming pool, interior sitting areas, televisions and spacious bathrooms – allowing for a unique level of privacy that the current owners are quick to highlight.

Rough stone has been used as tiling on much of the vertical outdoor surfaces, a style that extends to the interior of the TV room.



Most of the villa was built as designed, but the owners did request alterations to the sloped garden that is found at the property's northern tip. Stone steps and a footpath lead to a small sala with chairs set among large boulders. It is their favorite place to take in sunsets.

Veerasak Sirivangsanti, Managing Director of Ayara Kamala Resort & Spa, explained that the residential villas – 12 in total – and the resort's 10 three-bedroom bungalows were built simultaneously to limit dust and noise pollution for residents and guests.

"A contemporary design was used for the interior and we approached the exterior with some Thai influence to make the houses comfortable from a Western perspective...We were confident in our product and its appeal, so to help make the construction process smooth, we didn't open for sales until after each unit was finished," Mr Veerasak said.

"This helped limit outside influence until the houses were done, but it was also expensive. In the end we were able to do it," he added.







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Goodness gracious great buds of fire

Blooming 'flame trees' have Phuket ablaze with scarlet flowers all over the island, particularly at this time of year



TREES, like flowers, often remain unnoticed until they burst into bloom. The seasonal rains have stimulated a number of trees into showing off their wares. The flame trees, for example, are aflame with their brilliant scarlet flowers everywhere right now.

Less dramatic, but sporting flowers of a similar hue, is the geiger tree (cordia sebestena). In Thailand it is known as *khaw diaa*.

It is a great tree to have in your garden for many reasons. For a start, although it blooms mainly during Phuket's rainy season, the geiger tree will bud its orange flowers for most of the year.

It is also remarkably unfussy about conditions. It will not only

grow in poor soil with little care and attention, but it will also endure the salt-laden winds that harry Phuket's coastline.

As if to illustrate this, there are a couple in bloom within spitting dis-

tance of Rawai Beach, and further a small whitish-green lemon, are up the Wichit Road one is happily displaying its wares on a piece of waste ground.

The geiger tree does, how-

ever, like plenty of sun.

Although the geiger is a native of the Americas, it has been introduced to South East Asia, and has quickly acclimatized and naturalized in this

habitat. You can buy it in a few nurseries here, but it will take very easily from hardwood cuttings or, since the fruit is a drupe, from its stone.

The fruits, which resemble

edible, though there is little flesh on them and the taste is sour.

The geiger is distinctive in a number of ways. The dark, evergreen

leaves are rough to the touch and have sometimes been used as a substitute for sandpaper.

Moreover, the wood is extremely durable and can be used as timber.

The tree is normally grown as an ornamental for its brilliant orange flowers. These are tubular-shaped and appear in clusters of six to 10 paper-thin flowers that are attractive to bees and butterflies.

It is a sensible choice as a patio or yard tree, since it has a neat habit and should require little or no pruning. The trunk is also relatively slim and the tree is unlikely to outgrow its surroundings.

Because it is wider than it is tall upon reaching maturity, the space beneath its branches makes it a

The cultivar (boissiere) with its larger creamy-white flowers is another option.

If you are uncertain which small tree or large shrub to choose, then consider cordia sebestena if you want a neat, long-flowering, low-maintenance tree. If you prefer something more showy, then go for yellow bells (tecoma stans), the yellow oleander (thevetia peruviana) or the peacock flower (dwarf poinciana).

All are similar in dimensions, all flower more-or-less continuously and will tolerate a range of soil conditions.

But the geiger tree is the most forgiving of them all, and because of its bushy form, is the most

Moreover, since this blissful climate allows us to spend so much time in the open air, these furnishings assume an added importance.

A few provisos. If you decide to use wood, say for a table and chairs, ensure that the wood is properly treated.

Cheap surface varnish will soon peel off, so go for furniture that has been properly stained and looks robust.

Of course, the best wood of all is teak. It will last longer, look better and will never suffer from the depredations of termites.

This is especially true if you are thinking of a sala, summer house or pavilion.

But teak is expensive and, if you believe in environmental issues, you should hesitate about using it, since most comes from illegal sources.

Bamboo is an inexpensive, cheap and decorative alternative, but it will need to be replaced after a few years.

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
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
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FC Phuket in last BACKROOM BREAKDOWN 1 6 of Toyota Cup

FORTUNES at FC Phuket this season just aren't going to plan.

Before celebrations of their Toyota League Cup victory had subsided, news of defection, dismissal and injury sent shock waves through the club.

Phuket were drawn at home to Big Bang Culalongkorn University (BBCU) in the Toyota League Cup second round on June 29.

A win against their league rivals would have been a true test of Phuket's progress under new coach Sompong Wattana. BBCU still harbor hopes of reaching the play-offs when the league resumes later this month.

More than 6,000 fans descended on Surakul Stadium for the match, but it was the home fans who were on their feet first when Phuket hit the back of the net just after 15 minutes.

Excellent build-up play from the back between Niran Phanthong and Nitirote Sukuma eventually found Kone Adama who had a tap-in for the opening goal.

The score remained 1-0 for the next 55 minutes of the match, but BBCU started to dominate possession.

On 70 minutes BBCU equalized, to the delight of about 200 BBCU supporters in the stands.

With the teams at deadlock at full time, BBCU went into extra time with 10 men.

Late in the second period of extra time, the BBCU goalkeeper handled the ball from a defender's back pass. An indirect free kick was awarded inside the penalty area only yards from the goal line.

BBCU players jammed the goal mouth, but the ensuing shot came off a defender's arm according to the referee who signaled for a penalty, to the furious remonstrations of BBCU players and officials.

Nene Bi Tre Sylvestre converted the penalty which put Phuket into the last 16 of the Toyota League Cup.

At the end of the match, security had to escort the referee and his assistants off the pitch.

Nene Bi Tre Sylvestre was once again named "man-of-the-match" for his performance, while the match also marked the arrival of French goalkeeper Jonathan Mathijas, who gave a solid performance in his first outing for Phuket.

Brazilian sacked for being 'bad', Korean AWOL and injuries rife

UNFORTUNATELY for Phuket, Suphat Anthong suffered a broken ankle during the cup win which will require surgery.

The player is expected to miss at least three months before considering a return to training.

In his place Phuket has inked a six-month loan deal with Piyawat "Kapi" Thongman of Thai Premiere League team, Sisaket FC.

A few days after the cup game, Phuket coach Nareubate Ayuphong announced that Brazilian player Paulo Renato will leave the club, citing the player's behavior as reason for the departure.

"Our club has a clearly specified set of rules. Renato is a player who has had the most issues and the club has given him warnings on many occasions. He has not adjusted his behavior accordingly and as he is unable to follow the standards and rules of our club... We have decided to terminate his contract," said

A RECORD year is in store for the Best Asian Regatta 2011 with over 40 yachts expected for the eighth Six Senses Phuket Raceweek on July 21.

The Sambo team recently took part in the second ranking tournament held in Russia from June 10 to 13 and the third stage is scheduled for Kazakhstan in August.

Saphan Hin and Surakul refurbs

THE outdoor public swimming pool at Sapan Hin is a popular facility for both Thai and foreign patrons due to its size and reasonable entry fee.

Each year, the Phuket Provincial Administration Office (*OrBorJor*) closes the pool for essential maintenance from February until mid-April. This year, however, the pool has still not re-opened, raising questions and concern from the pool's return users.

Mr Ruesit Suttantaporn, who works for the Ministry of Tourism and Sports explained the delay.

"May I first apologize for any inconvenience experienced by people who use the pool. A number of systems are severely damaged and we are in the process of having these problems identified by expert technicians,"

Mr Ruesit told the *Phuket Gazette*.

"We closed the pool at the end of January and have conducted a number of engineering surveys. Our engineering division will propose a renovation and maintenance plan before July 15, and then we will carry out all the necessary repairs," he added.

Mr Ruesit advised that overhauling the damaged pool systems would take approximately three months and the facility would reopen in October. However, smaller renovations will continue until January 2012.

The swimming pool was established in 2003 and operated under the Sports Authority of Thailand before administration responsibilities were transferred to the *OrBorJor* in 2005.

"We are investing 2.8 million baht in this renovation. Nearly 80 per cent of the facility will be affected. Water pumps, filters, drains, hygiene and heating systems, and a system control room will be completely new. In addition to the systems we will also refurbish the shower rooms, the roof and re-paint the entire structure," Mr Ruesit said.

Mr Reusit also said that prices would not be affected by the upgrades.

"We still have the same price structure. Adults can enjoy a

swim session for 20 baht per person and children under 18 years old will pay just 10 baht per person," Mr Reusit said.

OrBorJor President Paiboon Upatising said the running track at Surakul Stadium is also undergoing renovation work and is closed for use.

"The running track at Surakul Stadium is being prepared for the

28th National Youth Games to be held here in Phuket next March. The construction contract runs from March 21 to August 15," Mr Paiboon said.

"The Sports Authority of Thailand have set aside a budget of 18,897,000 baht for the renovation and the surface will be synthetic, as it was prior to reconstruction," he added.

National rugby finals beckoning for Lomas

WHILE Phuket Lomas Under 13 rugby team was proving itself on the international stage in England, a depleted Under 17 squad travelled to Krabi for the National 7's regional play-offs on June 25.

Played at Krabi's home pitch in Ao Luk, the Lomas faced their regional rivals Krabi RFC and Surat Thani RFC to decide who would progress to the National Championship, which will be held in Bangkok this September.

The ball was released to Lek in the center who found a gap in the Krabi line and sprinted the entire length of the pitch for the winning try.

A score of 14-12 gave the Lomas the Regional rugby 7's title and an opportunity to challenge for the U-17 National Championship later this year.


