Vegetarian **Festival** returns

'Baby dumping' rise sparks stateless alarm

THE rising number of babies being abandoned on Phuket is causing alarm among the authorities, with the director of the Phuket Shelter for Children and Families voicing concern that babies who cannot be identified possibly becoming "stateless".

The shelter has been notified of more than 20 babies being abandoned since October 1 last year. The actual number is probably far higher, said Jiranan Jiamjaroen, the shelter's director.

The most common reasons behind the baby dumping were parents being unable or unwilling to care for them on their own.

"Such cases typically involve single young mothers who unintentionally became pregnant. In these cases it is very difficult to track down the parents and the babies need long-term care," Ms Jiranan said.

Such were the causes for the most recent case, that of a boy

not even one year old being aban- track down the parents and redoned in the back of a pickup truck on Kwang Road. Shelter workers were able to

unite them with their child, but the family remains under close watch by shelter workers, she said.

Another form of abandonment comes when parents leave their children with friends, babysitters or in nurseries and never return to collect them. In some cases the care-givers do not know the names or contact details of the parents and are unable to contact them.

To minimize the number of such incidents, Ms Jiranan urged people providing childcare services to record the names and ID numbers of the parents.

Ms Jiranan believes that many of the abandoned babies are the children of migrant workers from other provinces, though it is impossible to know with certainty in most cases.

"Most of the abandoned babies are left without birth certificates or other forms of identification, making their already bleak prospects for the future even worse as 'stateless people'," she said.

She urged anyone experiencing family problems, or aware of possible child abuse, to call the shelter's hotline: 1300.

MoF heavies step up for convention center

MINISTRY of Finance General Inspector Prasit Suebchana met Phuket Vice Governor Somkiet Sangkhaosutthirak this week to reaffirm that his ministry will fight for Phuket's convention center to go ahead.

The international convention and exhibition center (ICEC) project stalled early this month when the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MNRE) announced that the project's plan had failed its initial environmental evaluation (IEE) assessment.

However, Mr Prasit, who is also the vice president of the Treasury Department's standing committee for the ICEC, said he a had met many local residents who told him none of the "failures" held any credence.

"Treasury Department officials discussed the issues with Phuket provincial government, business agencies, local organizations and local residents to see what the facts are," he said.

"As for the site being a location where sea turtles lay their eggs, I had the chance to inspect the area, and people there said they had not seen sea turtles at that part of the beach for a long time... They said sea turtles lay eggs at another part of the beach - not the ICEC site," he said.

Regarding complaints by the MNRE that the project site was home to what they called "Phuket's last forest", Mr Prasit replied, "I have now seen the area. It is not a forest. Most of the area is already bare.

"The trees that are there now will remain untouched and kept as a protected area in accordance with the project plan." The project

plans also came under scrutiny following reports that the center, under its current

planned design, Prasit Suebchana would not be "tsunami-proof".

"The local people I spoke to said the tsunami [in 2004] only caused some flooding in that area. Nothing was destroyed. The

tsunami hit Mai Khao Beach about 500-600 meters away, so the area [for the planned ICEC] is not in a tsunami-risk zone," he said.

As for criticism that the center would not be "worthwhile" in terms of investment, Mr Prasit said the Treasury Department will again report its position on this to the MNRE.

"The Ministry of Finance and Phuket thorities believe the ICEC is worthwhile The ICEC is needed by Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi. It will help the economies of these provinces," he said.

'The Treasury Department will push for the ICEC to go ahead, even though it might be delayed, because we have to represent the fact that the ICEC is not going to cause any issues," he said.

Battle for Surin Beach stalls after failed raid

THE saga over the stalled clearing of a restaurant encroaching on Surin Beach continues, with the restaurant owners refusing to remove structures and local authorities planning to file yet another report.

Pla Restaurant was spared from a raid last Wednesday morning when a multi-agency task force of no less than 30 officers acting under an order from the Governor was expected to arrive and take action.

Organized to coincide with the passing of a 30-day notice to vacate, the raid was called off after a last-minute missive from Thalang District Chief Narunart Suwanpratheep requesting that no action be taken against the restaurant at this stage.

Oddly, it was Mr Narunart who back in July this year instigated the investigation into the restaurant's encroachment on the beach, when he asked Cherng Talay Tambon Administration Organization (OrBorTor) president Manote Panchalad to inspect the site.

Yet Mr Manote has told the *Gazette* that he had not given up. "Now I have to file a report within 15 days," he said.

The fight over the right to extend the restaurant up to the water's edge has resulted in ac-

cusations over double standards and influence by "mysterious" people.

"They said we are encroaching on public land, but you can see all along Surin Beach right up to Bang Tao Beach that the beach is being encroached upon," said Charoen Singkaew, who helps run the familv-owned restaurant.

"We are just trying to make the beach look better. We dug this sand from the water right in front of the restaurant. When we remove our tables and decorations [each night when the restaurant closes], everything is fine. We didn't destroy anything," he added.

Somsak Boontapatipa, the head of the family-run restaurant, was just as angry. "Why do we have to be the only restaurant to be pulled down? Everyone builds on the beach," he said.

Mr Somsak alluded to unspecified "local complexities" that were influencing the issue.

Yet Mr Manote stands resolute in taking action.

"There is no reason to hold off on this. You can see it with your own eyes and they know what they are doing," he said.

"I know they want to talk to me privately, but this is not up for negotiation. They cannot build anything on the beach. If you see anyone else do it, please report it to me," he said.

"And if they are accusing someone of receiving some benefit from this, please feel free to speak up and name who that person is," he added.

Rubber barriers saving lives

OLD car tyres being used to create median strips along Chao Fa West Road in Chalong have reduced fatal accidents by almost 100 per cent, say Phuket police.

The rubber barriers comprise tyres stacked three high, tied together and painted red and white.

"We have installed these stacks on the median of dangerous sections of road," explained Chalong Police Station Superintendent Col Krittapad Dej-intorrasorn, who formerly went by the name of Wichit Intorrasorn.

"The tyres work very well at night. They help reflect light and encourage drivers to slow down," he added.

The rubber barriers have been set up at traffic accident "black spots", such as the entrance to Soi Koktanode on Chao Fa West Road and the first curve heading up Kata Hill from Chalong to Kata.

Some locations will be upgraded to have permanent median strips installed, such as from Baan Chalong School to Chaitaram Temple (Wat Chalong).

Col Krittapad said the number of reported accidents and the number of fatalities at all sites where the rubber tyres have been set up had fallen since the medians were installed.

"The number of road accident deaths has fallen by almost 100 per cent compared with the same period last year," said Col Krittapad.

Last year, four people died in accidents at the black spots in July alone. There were no traffic-accident deaths at any of the locations in July this year, he said.

Experts warn of water woes

MEETING Phuket's growing demand for water will depend largely on local communities developing new resources and integrating the provincial supply network, experts said this week.

The news came at a public hearing on Wednesday, when Dr Pakorn Ditthakit of Bangkokbased Scan Consulting Ltd explained the findings of a study.

His 10-member team was commissioned by Phuket Provincial Office to conduct research on Phuket's water needs in the face of growing demand due to rising population.

At the hearing, Dr Pakorn explained that the focus of the study is to develop plans addressing water supply over the next 20 years.

The study will include flood prevention and water quality issues, he added ..

The report will cover the entire island, from urban users supplied by the Provincial Waterworks Authority (PWA) to consumers on smaller municipal systems and rural residents relying on groundwater resources.

Despite abundant rainfall aver-

island has experienced worsening shortages in recent years due to the continuing growth of the tourism industry, Dr Pakorn said.

In the short-term, avoiding water shortages will depend on the ability of each community to introduce small-scale projects on their own, he said.

"Such projects would include construction of dikes and new aging some 2,500mm annually, the storage basins, increasing capac-

ity of existing reservoirs and dredging new canals," he added.

He said long-term measures for Phuket would include linking up the island's two main reservoirs, Bang Wad in Kathu and Bang Neaw Dum in Thalang, with the island's planned third reservoir: the Klong Krata now under construction in Chalong.

Reservoir plans move ahead

AS PART of the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization's (OrBorJor) plans to spend 590 million baht on developing the areas surrounding Phuket's two main water reservoirs as recreational areas, OrBorJor President Paiboon Upatising has mandated that the areas must include jogging tracks and bike lanes.

"I would like work to start by 2013 so we can have green parks on the island for Phuket residents, as I promised," he said at a public hearing this week.

The budget for redeveloping the Bang Wad Reservoir area would be about 223 million baht. Four zones would be established: 1)

would boost supply to popular tourist areas, he said.

Asked if projects such as the desalination plant in Karon were part of the long-term strategy, he said, "No, no, no... We have to rely on surface water resources first."

The high cost of pumping and treating water from the sea resulted in a prohibitive unit charge of over 40 baht per cubic meter.

Service zone; 2) Seminar zone; 3) Botanical garden and recreational zone; and 4) adventure zone.

"The Service zone will be at the present parking area, while the Seminar zone will be at the Irrigation Department office, where we will build a seminar building with a capacity of 200 people," said Somluk Bunnarong of hired consultants Phisut Technology.

The botanical garden and recreational area would include an educational path under the theme "Local Seedlings".

"The adventure zone, at the south end of the reservoir, will include a jogging track and a 'dam island'," Mr Somluck added.

"It was only a short-term solution," he said.

Pumping water from the Ratchapracha Reservoir in Surat Thani would be a viable option from an engineering standpoint once the PWA supply network is fully integrated, but opposition from NGOs and local residents in Surat Thani and Phang Nga would probably render such a project impossible, he added.

Sailors rescued from Andaman storm

Guard confesses to maid slash-murder

to the murder of a maid at a workers' guesthouse in Phuket last night.

Patong Police duty officer Weerapong Rakkito identified the deceased as 39-year-old Nuanchawee Sarating, until the time of her death the maid at the guesthouse in Kalim.

At about 9:45pm, her body was found face-up outside her room under the four-storey guesthouse, opposite The Lodge resort on Phra Barami Soi 5.

The apparent cause of death was a single stab wound near her left collarbone.

The murder weapon, a 35-centimeter blade, was found nearby along with a necktie matching that worn by the guesthouse security guard Narong Sripetch, age 23.

Mr Narong went on duty at 6pm, but was nowhere to be found after the discovery of the body.

Police investigators proceeded to Mr Narong's rented flat on Soi Kok Moo (Soi Pig Sty), off Siriraj Road at the south end of Patong.

There they found Mr Narong, along with his bloodied uniform.

Under questioning. Mr Narong said he killed Ms Nuanchawee out of revenge after she admonished him for opening guests' rooms.

He told police she had no right to do that, and until the murder

A SECURITY guard has confessed he had never had any problems with anyone. However, a check of his crimi-

nal record told a very different story. According to his record, he was released from Surat Thani

Prison last month after serving a four-year sentence on a murder conviction in that province.

In addition, there was an outstanding warrant for his arrest issued by Surat Thani Provincial Court on August 16. The charges included breaking and entering, assault and rape.

Despite his criminal background and current fugitive status, he was somehow hired by a local security firm and assigned to work at the guesthouse.

Man marries ladyboy, Tensions **Muslim family furious**

A MUSLIM man's marriage to a 16-year-old ladyboy has collapsed after drawing a storm of criticism from the local community, who claimed the wedding was against the principles of Islam.

Leaflets were circulated in the family's village in Paera subdstrict in Satun claiming the "sacrilegious" binding of lovers had caused recent flooding in the province.

Ismael Langji, 18, is now claiming he was tricked into marrying 16-year-old Anurak Janyu or "Nong Dada" and thought "he" was a "she".

Mr Ismael's family even took the step of traveling to the office of Satun Provincial Islamic Council to hold a press conference to denounce the marriage.

The family claimed they only allowed Mr Ismael to marry Nong Dada because they didn't know she was transgender.

If they had known Nong Dada had been born a man, there was no way they would have allowed their son to wed her because it is forbidden in Islam for a man to



marry a man, they said.

They had only met Nong Dada a few times and she looked exactly like a woman in every respect, so there was no reason to suspect she wasn't quite as she seemed.

Explaining Mr Ismael's attraction to Nong Dada, the family said Mr Ismael was "brain damaged" and "easily influenced by others".

They claimed they had already held a wedding party, but had yet to hold the more important Islamic marriage ceremony. As such, he had not actually violated the principles of the religion. They added that they did not support gay marriage, as many in the area had incorrectly assumed to be the case.

Things got worse when Nong Dada's father and mother arrived at the Langji family press confer-

ence. A loud quarrel broke out, with the Janyu family denying there

had been any deception involved. Mr Ismael had already been sleeping with Nong Dada at their home for at least a month and knew very well that she was a ladyboy. They had welcomed him warmly into their family and treated him as their son-in-law, they said.

However if they had known the union of the two men was against Islamic law, they wouldn't have allowed the pair to have anything to do with each other, they said.

Mr Ismael, for his part, said he had no idea Nong Dada had been born a man since they had only known each other a little over a month.

As for the bride price, the Langji family had given the Janyus 30,000 baht and a one-bahtweight gold necklace for Nong Dada's hand in marriage.

The Langji family said they would ask for it back once tensions eased and appropriate negotiations had taken place. - Manager online

Karon Beach vendors accused of encroachment have alleged police abuse in the destruction of their restaurants and arrest of an owner. The Phuket Gazette's Janpen Upatising reports on the dispute and efforts to find a solution.

TENSIONS flared between police and beach vendors last Sunday when officers razed restaurants in a dawn raid on Karon Beach, sparking claims that excessive force was used in the arrest of one of the shop owners.

The three restaurants, located in front of the Centara Grand Beach Resort, were run by brothers Nawin "Dam", Daeng and Lek Pongkathin, who said they had been operating restaurants on the beach for the last 26 years.

Lek, the youngest of the brothers, told the Phuket Gazette that

he arrived at the beach at 5am to find "about 100 officers" already at work.

"The tents and kitchen of my restaurant were the first to go," he said. " N o b o d y

spoke to us. The first thing that happened was that [Phuket Provincial Police] Commander Pekad Tanti-nong ordered officers

to remove our stuff. They took only about one hour to pull it down," Mr Lek said.

"All we asked was for them to wait for 30 minutes to an hour for reporters to come. But they didn't want to. They wanted to get us out of the area," he added.

Mr Lek explained that local residents and family members formed a circle around the three brothers to stop police from removing them.

"The officers surrounded us, then they pulled the others out of the way until they could get us," said Mr Daeng.

"We did not use force. We said we would go to the police station by ourselves. But we needed them to wait for reporters," he said.

Mr Lek said that wasn't the case for the police, who he claims punched him in the neck.

"Later, we followed Nawin, who was taken to Chalong Police Station and charged with destroying the environment," said Mr Lek.

Mr Lek and Mr Daeng admitted they worked on public land. "But we didn't try to take the pub-

> lic land as our own. We just wanted to make a living there," said Mr Lek.

> "It is unfair. If they say we are working on public land, then why can other people do it? How about the others who can do the same on the same beach? This is a double standard

"I think it is

because our restaurants are in front of the Centara Grand Resort," said Mr Daeng.

Mr Lek also said the brothers were given no eviction notice.

Yet, Chalong Police Deputy Superintendent Narong Laksanawimon told the Gazette that the brothers long knew the forced removal was coming.

The Centara Grand Beach Resort filed complaints to Karon Municipality and the Phuket Provincial Office about the encroachment and a toilet built on

Karon Beach about three years ago, he said.

"The Phuket Governor at that time, Wichai Phraisa-ngop assigned relevant authorities to investigate. The authorities formed a committee and they found that Dam [Nawin] and his brothers had encroached onto the beach," he said.

"When we last spoke to them eight months ago – I was one of the committee members - we asked them to improve their restaurants so they looked better. Having toilets built on the beach like that was not beautiful.

"But they did not

agree with our request and so the committee decided to proceed with legal action," Lt Col Narong said.

Before we removed them [last Sunday], we had been through so many talks, but it didn't work. The situation was long past negotiations because they refused their chance eight months ago," he added.

Lt Col Narong aid any force used in removing the brothers was necessary.

"Officers from Karon Municipality and Muang District Office were instructed to proceed with the removal while police officers were present to take care of security," he said.

The trouble started when other beach restaurant operators tried to stop officials from pulling down the restaurants and then blocked officers from removing the brothers from the beach.

"If we had let them stay, they might have obstructed officials from doing their duty in removing the restaurants. We surrounded them to stop them from entering the removal area and in the end we needed to physically remove them because we wanted to take them to police station," Lt Col Narong said.

"Dam has been charged with encroaching on public land and physically obstructing Karon Municipality and Muang District officials from doing their duty," he added.

Mr Nawin posted bail immediately after his arrest.

are allowed on the beach.

"The problem is that Dam and his brothers have to be members of this group if they want to work on the beach. If they are not in the group, Karon Municipality cannot help them," he said.

An officer at Karon Municipality's Social Welfare Division, who asked not to be named, said that the "group" was established five years ago. The group exists to allow local residents to use public land on the beach to work, she explained.

Within the group, operators are

classified according to the type of work they engage in, such as massage services; umbrella and sunbed rentals; jet-ski rentals; longtail boats for hire; speedboats; and food and beverage providers, she added.

"To become a member of a group, the operator needs to be registered as living within the Karon municipal area," the officer said.

"The person wantng to operate a

also needs to seek permission from the members already operating in that business.

"This is because having new operators set up on the beach will reduce the revenue of the current vendors. If the members agree to let that person operate, they will let Karon Municipality know," she said.

"Karon Municipality is not the one who gives final permission [to operate on the beach], the current members [of the group] are," she said.

Return of the Gods

THE annual Phuket Vegetarian Festival this year will begin just before sunset on September 26, when participating Chinese shrines across the island raise their go teng poles and recite incantations to invite the Jade Emperor and Nine Emperor Gods to descend from the heavens.

At midnight, nine lanterns are hung from each pole, marking the start of the nine-day festival.

The festivities begin in earnest the next day, with two days of prayers and ceremonies to make offerings to the gods, ahead of a full schedule of traditional activities to invoke purification of the mind, body and soul.

First to get ablutions underway on September 30 will be devotees, called mah song ("spirit mediums"), at Tae Gun Tae Shrine in Baan Pasak, Thalang, where participants will bathe in hot oil from 8pm. At the same time, devotees at Choor Su Goong Naka Shrine, south of Phuket Town, will bathe in hot water.

With purification by liquid complete, the true testaments of faith follow on the program.

On October 2, devotees will climb bladed ladders at Bangkoo Shrine from 7:45pm. Other devotees will walk through fire at Tha Reua, Yokkekeng and Jang Ong

Malaysia warns on travel to South as bombs kill four

MALAYSIA has warned against non-essential travel to southern Thailand after four of its nationals were killed in a multiple bomb attack that ripped through a popular tourist area last Friday.

The deaths mark the first time tourists have been killed for several years in Thailand's southern insurgency, which has claimed around 4,800 lives since 2004.

The attack happened on Friday night, when three bombs exploded simultaneously in Sungai Kolok in Narathiwat province.

Motorcycle bombs exploded outside a

karaoke bar and Chinese charity association, while a car bomb blew up outside the Merlin Hotel.

Besides the three Malaysian tourists – including a three-year-old boy – who died at the scene, rescue worker Seksan Rojpasiri, 38, later succumbed to his injuries. A further 74 people were injured, with 40 hospitalized and seven seriously hurt with broken limbs or burns to more than 50 per cent of their bodies.

Malaysia's foreign ministry issued a statement Sunday advising travelers to avoid southern Thailand until the security situation improves, AFP reported.

Thai authorities claimed the bombing was in retaliation for a major drug bust in Sungai Golok three days earlier.

Defence Minister General Yuthasak Sasiprapha said the bombing was the work of insurgent sympathizers who had joined with illicit drug syndicates to make money, challenge state power, discredit the government and intimidate people.

Region 4 Army commander Lt General Udomchai Thammasarorat said security would be tightened in Sungai Kolok to prevent more attacks and that officers would continue to crack down on the trade in illicit items that is reportedly funding the unrest.

Prachathai editor awarded for courage as net giants fret

CHIRANUCH Premchaiporn, the editor of the Prachatai news website who faces up to 20 years in jail for breaching Thailand's Lese Majeste law, has received the Hellman/Hammett award from Human Rights Watch for her commitment to free expression and courage in the face of persecution.

The honor comes as some of the world's best known internet companies - including Google, Yahoo and eBay – warn that the law could result in serious damage to Thailand's economy if it is not reformed.

Mrs Chiranuch was one of 48 people from 24 countries who received Hellman/Hammett grants from the New York-based human rights watchdog.

"The award-winners have faced persecution for their work, generally by government authorities seeking to prevent them from publishing informa-tion and opinions," Human Rights Watch said.

Mrs Chiranuch is currently being tried under both Article 112 the section of Thailand's Criminal Code enshrining Lese Majeste - AROUND THE nation

and the Computer Crimes Act, which is often used in tandem to prosecute those who insult the monarchy online.

But Mrs Chiranuch is not accused of insulting the monarchy herself. She is being prosecuted for failing to remove Lese Majeste comments posted anonymously on the Prachatai web forum quickly enough.

The contents of the comments cannot be reported.

Mrs Chiranuch is the first Thai to win the Hellman/Hammett, which Human Rights Watch has administered since 1989.

In a statement posted on Prachatai, Mrs Chiranuch thanked Human Rights Watch but added: "Even though this award gives me support, and encourages me to face the threats on the rights and freedoms of expression which makes me grateful at

the same time it also makes me feel sad.'

"We cannot deny that the significance of me being the first Thai who receives this award means that this is an indicator that the freedom of expression in this country has drastically declined since the 19 September 2006 coup," she explained.

Last week the Asia Internet Coalition, a Hong Kong-based lobby group including companies such as Google, Yahoo, Skype, eBay and Nokia, warned that the increasingly frequent application of the Lese Majeste law could have a serious impact on internet commerce.

Of particular concern was Mrs Chiranuch's case, it said. "By holding an intermediary liable for the actions of its users, this case could set a dangerous precedent and have a significant long-term impact on Thailand's economy."

"Changing the way the internet works in Thailand by denying intermediaries the protections they are granted in most countries around the world could have a significant detrimental impact," it claimed.

Flood toll reaches 112

THIS year's flood death toll Studies at Chulalongkorn Unireached 112 on Monday as monsoon weather continues to batter Thailand's North and Northeast.

In the latest fatalities, a father nd his two daughters drowned when their boat capsized in the Tha Chin River in Chai Nat province, 150 kilometres north of Bangkok, DPA reported.

The national flood operations center said 26 provinces remained under water with almost half a million households affected.

Department of Water Resources statistics show that more rain has fallen in recent months than in the same period for the past 30 years.

Professor Thanawat Jarupongsakul, a lecturer at the Unit for Disaster and Land Information

versity's Faculty of Science, said the La Nina effect was partly responsible for the flooding.

La Nina conditions were expected to ease in March Instead they got stronger again this month when the monsoon trough remained over the country for longer than it normally does, he said.

Kasikorn Research Center estimated that economic damage to the country's agricultural sector caused by flooding would likely reach 20 billion baht this year.

Flood water has already swamped millions of rai of farmland. A large part of the country's rice basket, which covers Suphan Buri, Ayutthaya, Chai Nat, Pathum Thani and Nakhon Sawan, is inundated.

Hotels need reason to come clean

THE *Phuket Gazette* wishes Governor Tri Augkaradacha the best of luck in his efforts to make legal the unknown hundreds of unregistered hotels on the island – he is certainly going to need it.

According to figures from Gov Tri's office [see facing page], there are just 279 hotels with a total of 31,014 rooms legally registered with the province. In contrast, there were over 43,000 rooms in more than 700 "accommodation establishments" registered with another government agency: the Tourism Authority of Thailand. The actual number of hotel rooms in Phuket is undoubtedly much higher because all establishments with more than four rooms available for rent on a daily basis are classified as hotels under the Hotel Act.

Phuket Tourist Association president Somboon Jirayus estimates that the number of rooms-for-rent by the day in guesthouses, serviced apartments and similar establishments on the island at over 50,000.

Typically-priced at about 500 baht a night, a room in one of these establishments is clean and comfortable, air-conditioned, equipped with wi-fi internet and a cable television service with 80 channels or more.

While the ubiquitousness of so many cheap accommodations continues to lure in ever more visitors, many in the upper end of the hotel industry spectrum understandably cry foul that so many of these establishments are able to operate outside the law, avoiding taxes and ignoring safety regulations.

Gov Tri is realistic in admitting that lax enforcement by the government in the past has allowed the current situation to develop and that some "negotiation" may therefore be needed to correct it. The Gazette doubts, however, that simply trying to persuade illegal operators to register "for their own benefit" is going to lead to significant change. After all, how many among us would actually pay our income taxes honestly and on time if we didn't have the threat of an audit hanging over our heads? Disincentives to register are especially high among guesthouse and serviced apartment owners, whose guests are predominantly free, independent tourists not on package tours. In their view, registration as a hotel simply opens a Pandora's Box of new rules and regulations that would need to be adhered to at considerable cost.

It is worth noting that some registered hotels refuse to pay the one per cent room revenue tax to the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization, despite periodic threats of legal action.

The fact that ministerial regulations released in 2008 to clarify the terms of the Hotel Act have had little effect on the situation on the ground in Phuket comes as no surprise. This is mainly because so many operators have no real incentive to comply with the Hotel Act in the first place.

Gov to bring illegal hotels into the fold

LETTER FROM THE GOVERNOR

STATISTICS as of September 12 show that there are 279 hotels with a total of 31,014 rooms legally registered with the province.

As for hotels operating without permission, there are 117 that we are aware of.

The owners of these hotels are running businesses without initial environmental evaluations (IEEs) or environmental impact assessments (EIAs), or were built without the necessary construction permits from local authorities.

There are also apartments, guesthouses and condominiums that offer daily accommodations and other services that fall under the Hotel Act, so they should be registered as such.

I would like to bring both of these groups into the system and have them legally registered. I have been working on a policy to help achieve this and I held a meeting with the [illegal] operators to inform them of my efforts – I will help them make it right.

I admit that in the past, the government sector was lax in terms of enforcement, so now I need to compromise with them – both for their benefit and ours.

For a start, the government would benefit from increased tax revenue from these businesses. Second, it would be good for them in terms of marketing and in obtaining investment funding. Currently, hotel operators go abroad on [promotional] road not be safe to have a road under

shows many times a year. Customers and travel agencies always make deals with legally-registered hotels. Also, hotels that don't have legal registration documents are ineligible to apply for investment through proper channels. Some must seek loans from informal funds that charge high interest rates.

For the proposed road project under the high-voltage power pylons from Phuket International Airport to the bypass road, this project was initiated by former governor Wichai Phraisa-ngop as an alternative to Thepkrasattri Road.

Though there has not been much progress on this project, we still maintain it as part of our yearly development plan. We are now in the process of [trying to] expropriate 207 plots of land from 175 different owners. Some have agreed to provide the required land, but some have not. Once we acquire all the necessary plots we will continue by doing the EIA and

seeking a 450-million-baht budget. There are concerns that it will

high-voltage power lines. People ask what will happen if a car crashes into one of the pylons - will the whole island be blacked out? Or would exposure to electromagnetic radiation from high-voltage lines be dangerous to drivers?

The Phuket Highways Office and Phuket Provincial Office are responsible for this project, so it will fall to them to study these issues and find the best solutions.

You asked about the fact that I earned my master's degree from Kentucky State in Frankfort, Kentucky, also the alma mater of current prime minister Yingluck Shinawatra. I did study in the same field [public administration] and university as PM Yingluck, who also got her bachelor's degree at Chiang Mai University.

However, I studied at these places about 15 years before her and we don't know each other personally.

At any rate, she is my boss now and I see she is performing well to the best of her abilities. I will take action to put her policies into practice in Phuket.

Soi Dog in it for the long haul

THE recent Gazette online story about Soi Dog Foundation's (SDF) new cat hospital prompted a forum comment that justifies a response.

The writer queried how SDF could justify spending money on such a facility at the same time as appealing for funds to purchase the remaining land where its shelter and headquarters are based.

In 2009, SDF purchased about 4.6 rai of land in Mai Khao and at the same time entered a rental agreement on the remaining 6.5 rai, with an option to buy it by October 2011 at a fixed price of 10 million baht.

In June 2010, we received an unsolicited offer from a large international trust to build a cat hospital on the site. At the same time, the American School of the Hague (ASH) also asked if they could raise funds specifically to help cats. Neither of these offers could be used other than for the purpose intended and the children of ASH raised funds for the new facility.

At the end of 2010, SDF learned that the rented land was the subject of offers by developers and therefore we considered it to be an urgent requirement to buy it before the option expired.

An appeal was started at the end of 2010. The nature of the reporting of this led to some misunderstanding. At no point was SDF in danger of folding. In fact, the opposite was true and it continued to employ more veterinary teams aimed at doubling the number of sterilizations performed. However, we made a decision that if the funds could not be raised then we would take an option to move off Phuket and sell the land

already purchased to the same developer. As was reported at the time, this would have had a big impact on the stray population here which is currently under control and falling.

The trust committee was well aware of the situation and made an even larger donation to the land purchase. When construction started, it was clear from feedback from our international fundraisers that they were confident the target would be reached. An offer to double donations from a major donor in Germany contributed significantly to this view and, as announced this week, the purchase of the land was completed ahead of schedule with the actual price paid reduced to about 9mn baht.

SDF are therefore delighted to be staying in Phuket. SDF continues to be managed by volunteers both here and overseas, where it is a registered charity in six countries. It now has an advisory board of experienced business professionals who are currently drawing up a 10year business plan. It was recently described as one of the fastest growing charities in the world and its aims are to expand throughout Thailand in the coming years. However, following the successful appeal, its headquarters will remain in Phuket and we are grateful to local residents who helped make this possible.

Do Phuket cops arrest drunk drivers?

Can you get arrested for driving a car or motorcycle under the influence of alcohol in Thailand? If so, what are the penalties? Sam

Maj Sarawut Chuprasit, chief of Kathu Traffic Police, replies:

Yes, you can and will be arsted. We test drivers with a breath analyzer at checkpoints set up almost every night.

In accordance with Thai law. you are not supposed to have more than 0.05 per cent blood alcohol content when operating a motor vehicle.

If a driver tests a little higher than that, we will take into consideration whether they appear able to drive safely, because Phuket is a tourist destination.

Those deemed unable to drive will be arrested.

bail bond. Those who are not released on bail are jailed and sent to court on the next working day.

If you confess to the charges, the court will fine you about 5,000 baht, after which time your bail will be refunded.

Orachorn Attaveelarp of the Phuket Public Health Office replies:

According to the law and the information I have, if you are charged with driving under the influence of alcohol, you will certainly have to go to court. The fine will be from 2,000 baht to 10,000 baht, or three months imprisonment, or both. It depends on the court.

Besides a fine and imprisonment, you may be sentenced to do public service.

I don't think you can deny the charges because when you blow into the breath analyzer, a printed report is produced. You cannot deny the results and that report is legal evidence in court.

I used to be present at checkpoints with police officers and, usually, if the results of the breath test show that you're not too much over the .05 per cent blood alcohol content limit – around .06 or .07 - they'll ask you to stop at the checkpoint, take a rest and freshen yourself up.

After an hour, you have to blow into the machine again. If the results show you are below the legal limit, you will be let go.

The end of the road?

About four months ago, workers finished laying new pipe along the beach road in Karon, but the road was never repaired.

Sarayut Wasinanont, an officer at the Karon Municipality Civil **Engineering Division, replies:**

The construction project was the Phuket Provincial Electricity Authority's first trial of burying electricity cables on the island they buried power lines as well as CAT telecommunication cables underground.

That project is finished and now it is up to Karon Municipality to fix the road surface.

We have the budget and have had a construction company working on it for about a month now. It's about 40 per cent complete.

We are trying to have it completely finished by the end of October – before the high season begins – but it's been raining a lot lately, so we're not sure it can be done on time.



Local, export rice prices set to rise

MENUS in Phuket and across Thailand will soon be revised with the price of rice set to jump as a result of the Yingluk administration's changes to the rice mortgaging scheme.

Pitched as a mechanism to increase rice farmer's incomes and spending power, the controversial program - first implemented by the Thaksin administration six years ago - will offer increased rates on rice for loans to farmers who agree to pledge their yields as collateral.

The new rates, effective on October 7, will increase to 15,000 baht per ton for unmilled paddy rice and up to 25,000 baht per ton of milled Jasmine rice - up from pre-election rates of approximately 8,000 and 13,000 baht per-ton, respectively.

Since the collateral (the rice) essentially takes the form of the payment for the loan, farmers benefit from an increased guaranteed income while the government stockpiles the surplus of the country's and region's most consumed commodity.

However, the downsides of the program, including implications for both domesticconsumer and international-export markets, are beginning to take form in the economic horizon.

"We've been informed that our [shelf rice] prices will increase between 6 and 10 per cent next month," said Kwanruen Talungjit, Purchasing Manager of SuperCheap, one of Phuket's largest wholesale and retail rice distributors.

Kwanruen explained that much of the rice sold at SuperCheap is grown in the norththrough a Bangkok-based distributor.

She said that the reason why some varieties of rice, such as Malboonkrong and Chat brand, have recently had a lower price index in Phuket compared to Bangkok is because of excess stock supplies in addition to local competition factors.

"We've kept our prices low to keep our customers happy. Our stock supplies have allowed us to keep the price steady, but as the price goes up and our stock runs low, profit margins get smaller," she said.

Acknowledging the effect of this policy on consumer prices, a source in Phuket's Department of Internal Trade

asking not to be named, told the *Phuket* Gazette that consumers on the island shouldn't be too concerned.

Increased rice prices won't have the same level of impact on food prices as say pork, eggs and chicken, he said, explaining that the scheme will mostly affect the prices of packed rice and premium grade rice bound for the export market.

"Sacked rice, which is cheaper than packed rice, will still be sold in Phuket at a competitive price," he said.

Some economic analysts have projected that the scheme will cause the price of exported rice to jump 30 per cent, which will give the world's number two rice exporter, Vietnam, an opportunity to surpass Thailand. As of September 21, 2011, the Agri-

cultural Futures Exchange of Thailand (AFET) settlement rate for a ton (minimum 15 ton purchase contract) of 100 per cent Thai Hom Mali Rice Grade B was set at 31,500 baht for October 2011 contracts and 32,300 for December 2011 through May 2012.

Ammar Siamwalla, a prominent economist at the Thailand Development Research Institute was quoted in a *Nation* report last week, "Thai consumers may have to queue to purchase cheaper rice...But rice export rivals, such as Vietnam will gain substantially," he warned.





Mazda 2 success boosts targets

MAZDA Phuket is boosting sales targets this year due to the popularity of the new Mazda 2 model with the island's motorists.

The trend reflects the growing popularity of small cars as Phuket's roads become increasingly congested.

Thanaphum Hongyok, deputy managing director of Mazda distributor Anuphas Trading, said the company now expected to sell 800 cars this year, up from the old target of 700.

"Now, eight months [into the year], the company has already sold more than 500 vehicles. Because of that, we expect to hit our target quicker than we thought," he said. Mr Thanaphum said that Mazda Phuket, including all distributors would call 1 100

including all distributors, would sell 1,100

vehicles this year without difficulty. Last year the company sold 700.

In the first seven months of 2011, there were an estimated 6,000 new vehicles sold in Phuket. In the whole of the previous year only 8,000 were sold, suggesting that sales are likely to be far higher this year.

Phuket motorists are becoming increasingly interested in small cars, in particular B-Class cars such as the Mazda 2.

Mazda Phuket's marketing plans will see it holding road shows on the island in a bid to stimulate the market for small cars.

Today, 30 per cent of new car buyers are foreigners, with the rest being local Thais. Mazda Phuket aims to tap these customers by ensuring they get the chance to test its vehicles. It believes that once a potential buyer has driven one of its vehicles, they are much more likely to make a purchase.

Mazda Phuket's success this year has been more broadly repeated throughout Thailand.

Shoichi Yugi, managing director of Mazda Sales (Thailand), said the company expected to sell 42,000 vehicles this year, up 20 per cent on the previous year.

The success of the new Mazda 2 model, which the company says has a higher spec than other models of its class on the Thai market, has resulted in a 34 per cent rise in sales of the car to 3,900 so far this year.

Famous developers sweeping Phuket

FAMOUS Bangkok developers are queuing up to invest in Phuket's rapidly expanding real estate sector, with projects by Land & Houses, Supalai and Sansiri all being greeted by buyers with excitement.

But local firms are not being left behind as big names like Phuket Villa, Chao Fa Garden and Phanason stand ready to launch new projects.

Phuket Real Estate Association president Thanan Tanpaiboon said the real estate market was growing and changing rapidly, both in terms of the types of investments and the parties investing.

"Phuket's real estate market is 100 per cent dependent on tourism and when tourist numbers are good, the real estate market thrives," Mr Thanan said.

The foreign buyer market has recovered fairly well from the recent slump, with Russian buyers in particular helping to boost the market. Many Russians who have been regular visitors to the island are purchasing condominiums here as second homes.

North Phuket is favored by foreign buyers, with an area stretching from Cherng Talay to Mai Khao being particularly popular.

A group of Russian investors

are building Mai Khao Dream, a development comprising a hotel, villas and homes worth billions of baht.

Also popular is Saiyuan Road in Rawai, where many foreignfunded projects have sprung up in recent months.

"Right now the zones that are most active are the areas of Mai Khao and Nai Yang," said Mr Thanan.

"The old families of Phuket are starting to sell off the land because the price is good. There are investors from Central Thailand coming in and sweeping up the land to invest in hotels, accommodation and condominiums in order to be ready for the Phuket International Convention Center project," he explained.

The Thai market is continually expanding, with many new projects being opened famous developers from Central Thailand such as Land and Houses, Supalai, Pruksa and Sansiri. These developments have had a good response from customers on the island, since the brands are trusted and able to deliver their projects on schedule.

Piya Prayong, deputy managing director of Pruksa Real Estate, said that many more Bangkok developers were likely to invest in Phuket in the future.





Choosing the right internet landline

It isn't just a question

of one company offering

a whiz-bang new prod-

IN MY last Live Wire column I talked about the three general types of internet connections available in Phuket: landlines, wireless and satellite. This week I'll explain how to find the right landline. Next week I'll tackle wireless.

The most important point to understand about landlines is that they're changing all the time. Two years ago, 3BB had the best landlines, almost without exception. Since then, 3BB has fallen way down the list.

One year ago, TOT announced its Fiber Optic service – with an extravagant party seemingly emphasizing the breathtaking prices

TOT sought. At the outset, the TOT Fiber Optic service was terrible, with constant blackouts and a snail's pace throughput even on

good days. Since then, though, the prices have gone way down and the service has vastly improved.

Two points to keep in mind. First, as I've mentioned several times in the past month, the amount you pay for an internet line has almost no correlation with how fast the line runs internationally.

Second, the very best service today may be moribund next month, and absolute rubbish a year from now.

It isn't just a question of one company offering a whiz-bang new product, or another installing lightning fast servers. It's also a question of deteriorating service. Internet Service Providers that don't pay the money for bandwidth to keep up with demand get worse and worse. Both innovation and stagnation come into play.

So, realizing that any advice I give today may be suspect in two months, and demonstrably wrong next year, what can you do?

The answer – as you've probably guessed – is to look at what other people are getting, and how much they're complaining, on PhuketInternetSpeed.com. It's crowd-sourcing at its finest. Go to the Search page and look for your location, or look for the Internet packages that interest

you. If you're good at Excel, download the file and check for yourself.

Looking at the reported speeds for the past four months, it's apparent that the TOT Fiber 2U service is out ahead of almost every alternative, with international download speeds in the seven to 13 Mbps range. 3BB, CAT and the

Cable companies are quite slow, averaging 2 Mbps or less, although the 3BB 10 Mbps and 12 Mbps lines are delivering 3 to 4 Mbps. True's and TOT's ADSL lines are around 3 to 6 Mbps, with True's DOCSIS 20 Mbps Cable around 6 Mbps and TOT's AirMax WiNet at 3 to 4 Mbps.

spreadsheet with all of the details.

Right now, if I were shopping for a landline, I'd head over to TOT and see if they have Fiber Optic 2U 10 Mbps (1,400 baht per month) in my area.

If not, or if I wanted to save some baht, I'd see if they have the AirMax WiNet 5 Mbps package, or the standard ADSL 6 Mbps package (both of which cost 600 baht per month).

If I couldn't get any of those, I'd go to True and see if they have DOCSIS in my area (1,300 baht for nominal 20 Mbps, 700 baht for 10 Mbps).

As a last resort, I'd spend the extra money for 3BB 10 Mbps service (1,490 baht per month).

That's what I would do this week. Next week may be an entirely different story.

When you go, make sure you know the exact location of your house (a Google Map will help). If you have a work permit, or a Thai ID card, take it.

If you aren't Thai, and don't have a work permit, it's best to take a Thai national with you to act as guarantor for the line: if you skip town, your guarantor is on the hook to pay for the phone line.

Not everyone in Phuket has a landline and many people need internet on the move so next week, I'll look at the different wireless connections and show you how to pick the best one for your situation.

Then, the following week, I'll give you a few tips about signing up for service.

If you aren't yet reporting your speeds on PhuketInternetSpeed.com, please drop by and sign up! It's free, only takes a few seconds, and the results help everybody figure out what's working and what's not worth the effort.

Remember that all of the data – more than 22,000 reported sightings at this point - is immediately available to anybody who wants to download, look at or fiddle with the results.

Also remember that the Internet Service Providers are watching the reports.

Playing it safe with offshore QR

MANY retirees who have chosen to retire abroad are now considering transferring their UK pension offshore.

Transferring a UK pension isn't right for everyone. Generally the transfer value needs to be six figures for it to be worthwhile. However, if one does have significant pension rights, the benefits from tax avoidance usually make transferring a brainless black and

white decision, something which does not come up often in the financial world.

If you choose this option, safety ought to be your number one concern when you consider all the different plans and jurisdictions. The cost of getting it wrong can more than offset any tax gains made by removing the pension from the UK tax net.

For those who will retire abroad,



the benefits of transferring to an offshore QROPS are many, and they grow with the size of the pension. No income tax is paid while drawing the pension down, and for those in

a 50 per cent tax bracket, this doubles

your loved ones, you will also avoid the HMRC inheritance tax

The increased investment options available also mean there might be a much bigger pot to draw from. Most company and private pensions can be transferred offshore, but the state pension, unfortunately, cannot be transferred.

If you transfer to the wrong jurisdiction, however, you may leave yourself open to a risk that would more than offset the benefits, even if this risk is generally low in probability.

Singapore, for example, found all of its QROPS removed from the list of approved schemes as a whole, because of the

> actions of a few trustees. This meant unauthorized payment penalties of up to 55 per cent of the transfer values for clients of schemes who were following the rules.

Many other jurisdictions do not closely regulate the QROPS market, as it is a fairly new market created by UK legislation in 2006. If a few of the trustees try to

push the limits, transferring to one of these jurisdictions may open up the risk of a repeat occurrence of

what happened in Singapore. However, you shouldn't be afraid of transferring to a QROPS as one jurisdiction has come up with a code of conduct for trustees to follow.

Guernsey has been at the forefront of the market and has probably seen more transfers than anywhere else.

As they are a UK territory, they stay in close contact with the HMRC and make sure all of the rules are followed closely.

As the island's economy is almost entirely based on offshore financial services, there is a conservative approach to things in order to protect their status as the preferred OROPS destination. While the Isle of Man is very similar and arguably as safe, I still recommend Guernsey.

Using a well-established trustee in Guernsey will allow you to reap the benefits and sleep well at night knowing your life's savings are safely out of the clutches of the tax authorities.

THREE young boys from a government school in Phuket Town will fly to Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates to compete in the World Robot Olympiad (WRO) 2011 in November.

Pakin "Paper" Boonlom, Tipok "Nueng" Kinkobsin and Boonyarit "Tel" Pulsen - all 11 years old – won their age category in a national competition in Bangkok last month.

The ingenious youngsters built a robot that actually picks up and disposes of trash. Their autobot, as per competition rules, was made from Lego bricks and other components.

However, the trio were not the only students from Muang Phuket Municipal School on Phun Pol Road to pick up a prize in the national contest, held at IMPACT Muang Thong Thani.

Three 15-year-old fellow students in Mathayom 3-Rachi Hansamut, Siriwat Khua-run and Tapi Sritirat - won third place in their age category by building a robot that mixed all the ingredients necessary to make tord mun pla (Thai fish cakes). The machine even cooked them in a deep-fat fryer.

The accolades won in the contest are the proud results of a program run by Sophon Prateep Na Talang, who heads the "Lego course" at the school.

"We started sending teams to robot-building competitions about eight years ago. Our school has done well. This is the third year we have had the opportunity to compete in robot competitions abroad," he said.

"Last year, we went to the Philippines, but we didn't win any awards. Two years ago, we sent a team to South Korea and won the honorable mention award," he added.

Lego classes are compulsory for students in Prathom 3 to 5 (ages 9 to 11) but optional for older students at the school.

"It seems to be working very well as the students quite like the classes. All students learn the basics of building Lego robots, such as how to build the robots themselves and how to write the computer program to make the robots perform.

"The basic Lego building element helps to develop their creative thinking and the students must combine this with technology. Any students who show talent or deep interest in the program are given our full support in learning more," Mr Sophon explained.

"This does not affect their normal classes as we set the Lego class as part of the curriculum, and I have a few teachers to help me with some parts of the course, such as developing the artistic elements of the projects and teaching the students how to present their projects to competition judges," he said.

The teaching formula seems to be working, especially for young Pakin, Tipok and Tel, who took two months to build their cleaning robot.

"My father was the first to buy me Lego bricks and I have been building Lego toys for two years now. I like it. I can spend about four hours a day playing with Lego when I have the time," said Pakin.

Teammate Boonyarit was the same. "I have been playing with Lego for two years now and I spend two hours a day making things with Lego. We also spend time practicing with our Lego robots for going to Abu Dhabi," he said, excited.

Young Tipok was also looking forward to going overseas. "This is the first time I have come first in a robot competition. I'm very happy to go to the competition in Abu Dhabi. Even though there will be many teams in the competition, I think we have a 50-50 chance of winning," he said.

The trio's obvious enthusiasm has shone

through, said their teacher, Mr Sopon.

"I only gave them some hints on how to improve their robot, but the rest they figured out for themselves," he said.

Yet, a great challenge lies before them. Mr Sophon said that about 50 teams will be competing in the WRO from November 18 to 20.

"All of them will also be winners of national competitions in their home countries", he said.

The honor of winning in that competition will be glory only. The WRO offers no cash prizes - only trophies, medals and certificates will be bestowed on the winners.

As such, the budget to send Pakin, Boonyarit and Tipok to the UAE to compete has yet to be confirmed.

"The budget will probably come from Phuket City Municipality and the children's families," said Mr Sophon.

'Going ape' in the trees of Chalong

Phuket's new Xtremadventures park offers a full-on arboreal experience

ZIPPING, climbing, crawling, balancing and swinging through the trees of Phuket is no longer left to the domain of the monkey.

The island is now home to an adventure park unrivalled by others in size and an innovative first in all of Asia. Xtremadventures Phuket – owned by Frenchman Gilles Bassi and a partner - was opened in Chalong this June.

"When I came to Phuket, I realized there was nothing like this. so I thought it would be great to have one," Mr Bassi said.

The park is made up of 69 stations ranging from "very easy" to "challenging" and Asia's very first "Accro Spider" which makes use of nets to catch people when they fall and is ideal for young children – all the way down to four years old, Bassi said.

Adventurers testing the rest of the park must use a harness, and a combination of caribiners, ropes and a pulley.

Under the constant eye of professionally trained staff, guests must clip on to safety lines before having a go at the challenges: You can walk a tightrope, swing from platform to platform, soar on a flying fox, attempt "Asia's

highest tree climb" (25 meters) and zipline back to Earth.

How far you want to go depends on you, but this lanky, 192-cemtimeter primate can say that "challenging" does mean "challenging".

Experienced climbers will note that the safety equipment and quality of the park are top-notch, with all gear imported from France.

Bassi enlisted the help of his friend-cum-business partner Raphael Jamgotchian who was a partner in what is now France's largest tree adventure park.

Raphael and a French team built Extremadventures Phuket over 2.5 months. It was then certified by a team from Ceres Control France, which is required for all such parks in EU countries.

"I absolutely did not want to play with safety – if people want to have good fun, it must be done in 100 per cent safety," Bassi said.

All ten staff members at the park have been trained by Raphael in special safety and rescue procedures, Bassi added.



Pinky's Place: Why it's hip to be seen there

THIS PLACE is so laid back the staff come here to hang out when they're not working. The Gallery Café By Pinky is straightforwardly cool. Simple but delicious menu items, music to suit the hipster tone of the dé cor and staff who know how to mix business with pleasure.

It's like 'Cheers', but with better looking, petite staff, and without the awful soundtrack.

Thirty something co-owner Tuangporn "Pinky" Jatikavankh, knows a thing or two about how to design a menu to cater to European tastes – a large majority of her customers.

She spent six years in England where among other things she refined her culinary skills at Le Cordon Bleu London. She also picked up an English accent and a love for English football (she's a Manchester United fan).

"I still love British food, especially full English breakfasts, and this is one of our most popular dishes we serve today," Pinky said.

Coffees, cakes, homemade sodas and burgers, toasties and tasty sweet treats, all are deliciously moreish and reasonably priced.

While expats nursing hangovers are a mainstay at The Gallery in the "am" on weekends, they are not

A lifetime PRAH Mongkol Visut is one of

Phuket's most revered monks. Locals fondly refer to him as 'Luang Pu Supha'.

On September 17 Luang Pu Supha celebrated his 115th birthday, unofficially making him the oldest living man in the world.

Luang Pu Supha was born in 1896, since then the revered monk has seen drastic and unimaginable change in his century long lifetime. He has seen five Chakri monarchs ascend the throne and he was 37 years old when a council of democratic reformers seized power from King Rama VII, ending the absolute monarchy that had ruled the country for centuries. For the first time in history, the reformers replaced the absolute rule of the king with a democratic system.

Luang Pu Supha was also there when this fragile democracy was taken away and replaced by a military dictatorship under Field Marshall Phibun Songkram. He was there when the country's name was changed from Siam to Thailand in 1936. Whereas there may be some people remaining today who were born during the turbulent period of the Second World War, Luang Pu Supha was already well into his forties when Thailand was forced to ally with the Japanese and give them free passage into the country.

As a monk, Luang Pu Supha is known throughout the country for his dedication to fostering Buddhism throughout his long life. As a person who has had the rare opportunity to see three different centuries, people are intrigued, just to imagine what those old eyes have seen.

Luang Pu Supha was born in the province of Sakon Nakhon, about 115 years ago. When he was seven years old, his father took him to a nearby temple to study with the



monks. When he was nine years old, he was ordained as a novice monk in a temple in Ubon Ratchathani province.

It is said that one day a visiting monk who was on pilgrimage came to Luang Pu Supha's village when he was young. On meeting him, the monk predicted that Supha would devote his life to Buddhism and become a prominent figure in religion. He asked Supha not to forget him and to come back and visit him one day when he was ready.

Supha lived and studied at the temple until he was sixteen years old, learning Buddhism from a monk called Prah Ma Ha La. At the age of sixteen, Prah Maha La gave him a choice and asked him whether he wanted to study Pali and become a Buddhist theologian or whether he wanted to study meditation. Supha chose the latter.

When the time came, Supha decided to leave the temple to find the monk that had predicted his future. As fate would have it. Supha found the monk meditating under a tree. The monk, who was called Prah See Tat, tested and trained the young Supha's patience and tolerance, observed his table manners and worked him hard to see if he could endure. Prah See Tat also taught him about meditation.

Shortly after, the young novice undertook his first pilgrimage to 13 different temples. He crossed the Mekong River from Nakhon Phanom into Laos. The journey was arduous and tested his mettle. He had to trek through thick unpopulated forest where he could not ask for alms and had to live

off leaves and the bare sustenance the jungle provided. Prah See Tat, realizing his endurance and commitment, decided it was time to ordain the novice into monkhood in 1917.

Supha journeyed with Prah See Tat, crossed the Mekong River back from Laos and traveled until they reached Pu Kwai Mountain. The ordination ceremony took place in a nearby cave. Other monks that had been meditating in the area also participated in the ceremony. After he was ordained, Supha was given the name "Kantha Seelo".

Throughout his life, Luang Pu Supha undertook several pilgrimage trips through harsh terrains. He traveled north and crossed the border to Burma and encountered many dangerous adventures. Luang Pu Supha recalled it as his most exciting pilgrimage. He also traveled to India by boat, risking storms and violent seas for almost two months. Being in a non-Buddhist country, it was hard to ask for alms which meant that some days he had to go hungry.

He eventually reached the foothills of the Himalayas where the icy chill of the mountains proved hard to bear for a monk who wore only thin orange robes suited for warmer climates. He had to brave the harsh climates, walking more than eight kilometers, three to seven days a week in the harsh cold, in order to ask for alms.

Luang Pu Supha traveled extensively during his lifetime in order to visit different sites of pilgrimage, during a time when traveling was dangerous and hard. His only motive was his faith and his love for Buddhism. He returned to Phuket in his 60's and dedicated his time to helping the sea gypsies. The world's oldest man now resides at the temple named after him.

A forgotten tale of a plane crash in tribal New Guinea

Books By James Eckardt

Mitchell Zuckoff is a hack journalist and a very good one. His specialty is dredging up old forgotten stories and making them new again. His latest effort is Lost in Shangri-La (Harper Press, New York, 2011, 384pp). "Escape from a Hidden World – A True Story" is the subtitle of this tale of a plane wreck and rescue in New Guinea during the latter days of World War II. At the time, the story made headline news and the three survivors were feted from one end of the United States to another. They are long since forgotten but Zuckoff brings them back to life again.

Lieutenant John McCollord, Sergeant Kenneth Decker and Corporal Margaret Hastings, a petite, beautiful, spunky corporal in the Women's Army Corps, were the only survivors of a sightseeing C-47 transport plane that went down in New Guinea's Balien Valley amid Stone Age tribes with no knowledge of the outside world. The outside world wasn't

aware of them until 1938 when playboy American explorer Richard Archbold

flew over a valley inhabited by over 60,000 tribespeople who grew sweet potatoes and raised pigs and killed each other.

"They did not fight for land, wealth or power. Neither side sought to repel or conquer a foreign people, to

> caused it to crash into a mountain. After two days of recuperation, the three survivors fought their way through jungle and streams into a clearing Here they set out yellow tarpaulin covers from life rafts to signal rescue planes

and, sure enough, were spotted by a B-17 bomber. They had been lost for three days.

Gradually, the survivors came to the realization that the clearing was not an accident. They were in a garden of sweet potatoes and rhubarb. Then they heard voices.

"The jungle rustled and shook. As survivors stared helplessly in that direction, their fears took human form: dozens of nearly naked black men, their eyes shining, their bodies glistening with soot and pig grease, their hands filled with adzes made from wood and sharpened stone, emerged from behind the curtain of leaves."

Would they be killed? There were some votes in that direction but the final decision was to help them. Essentially, a quarter of the way into the book, the story is over. The rest is the mechanics of rescue.

Nine elite troopers are parachuted into another part of the valley, a clearing that turns out to be a designated battlefield or no man's land that separated the territories of the warring Logo-Mhael and Kurelu clans. The troopers are quickly surrounded by 200 armed warriors.

"Although some natives thought the visitors were spirits, others believed they were warriors like themselves who had escaped a massacre...They felt certain of one thing: the strangers were not their Kurelu enemies, so they had no immediate need to kill them."

The three survivors were eventually rescued in a daring glider mission and returned to a heroes' welcome in the United States.

Then they faded back into obscurity. Margaret married, divorced and raised two children while working at a clerical job in Rome, New York.

During a reunion of three survivors and glider pilots in 1974, she remarked: "Fear is something I don't think you experience unless you have a choice. If you have a choice, then you're liable to be afraid. But without a choice, what is there to be afraid of? You just go along doing what has to be done."

Asked if she'd like to return to New Guinea, she replied: "You bet!" She died of cancer four years later.



THEY say that all good things must come to an end. For me it is time to say farewell to those readers who have enjoyed reading the 134 profiles I've written about some of Phuket's most visible expats over the past two and a half years.







The American Chamber of Commerce (AMCHAM) Greater Phuket chapter held an event last week where record crowds turned out to hear Hong Kong billionaire Dr Allan Zeman give his thoughts on what it takes to make any business venture successful.

HUNDREDS of Phuket developers, resort industry professionals and business people packed into the chic Silk restaurant at Andara Resort and Villas in Kamala to hear what the "Father of Lan Kwai Fong" had to say.

Mr Zeman came to fame in Hong Kong when he purchased an entire block in the city's Central district in 1984 transforming it into the world-renowned restaurant and nightlife area known today.

Twenty years on he was invited to become the chairman of Hong Kong's Ocean Park and managed to increase profits there despite the opening of Disneyland Hong Kong.

"When you do business in a foreign country, the most important thing to learn is to first understand the culture of your customer. Where does your customer come from? What are they used to doing?" Mr Zeman said.

"Culture takes many, many centuries to change, so if you want to be successful, the most important thing you can do is adapt the way you do business to fit into the culture.

"Those of us that are living out here in Asia are very lucky. There is a tremendous shift from west to east, a paradigm shift. Europe as we know it, in many ways is a basket case, the same with North America. China is slowly starting to lead the world and has US\$3.25 trillion in reserves, America is bankrupt and Europe is not much better off. So, the wealth is really coming out here." he added.

After building his dream holiday home, Chandara, in Phuket, Allan Zeman realized the potential of the high-end resort market here and built Andara Resort & Villas and the Plaza Surin boutique shopping center. He believes Phuket has a great future.


"I've always been enchanted with this island. There's a magic here: there's the Thai culture, the food, the beaches, the weather, the natural environment. I'd say this place is blessed. I've always said that it's one of the best places in the world." said Mr Zeman

Given the success of Andara, which is now nearly sold out, the *Phuket Gazette* asked if there will ever be an Andara 2.

"You want to keep some exclusivity for current owners, so Andara will not expand. But we will be doing a sister project, Suandara, which is down the road and we're getting the land registered and all the necessary requirements.

"We are also building a new, bigger plaza across the road from Surin plaza with 54 shops, a restaurant on top, glass lift, elevators - a special landmark.

"Another lesson I have learned is that there is only 'first class'. Whatever business it is that you're in, always aim to be the best. If you aim for first class, you may end up in business class. If you aim for business class you may end up in economy. If you aim for economy, you'll go broke," Mr Zeman warned.

Phuket Airport tipped to reach breaking point

With tourism numbers surging, Phuket International Airport is expecting a record four million passenger arrivals for the year 2011.

AS ARRIVALS to Asia's leading resort destination in the first half of the year increased 20% over the same period in 2010 and an unprecedented number of new hotel rooms opened, sagging infrastructure is creating a widespread danger to the island's tourism industry.

In the changing dynamic of guest demographics the Patong area which accounts for 35% of the 43,571 accommodation rooms on the island has edged into the mainstream. Patong-wide occupancy hit 82% in the first half of the year, with China and Russia now taking a quarter share of the market.

Numbers are straining the handling capacity of the airport with Airports of Thailand (AoT) expecting 7.95 million passengers this year, which will exceed the stated capacity (6.5 million) by 22%. A US\$ 164 million expansion plan that will increase handling to 12.5 million by 2014 will only start construction next year and tourism operators are increasingly concerned over mounting delays by travelers.

First half hotel trading by volume markets saw a surge in Phuket's average occupancy across all hotel tiers to 73%. Key market metric Revenue per Avail-

able Room (RevPAR) moved up to its highest level since the global financial crises in 2008.

The island's top 5 tourism source markets to date are China, Russia, Australia, South Korea and Sweden.

Somehow Phuket has gone into a retro stage where tour groups, wholesalers and the mass movement of visitors are once again the norm rather than the exception.

A leading indicator in the cyclical development was shown in 2010 when charter flights hit their highest ever level equating to a 153% increase in year on year growth.

Commenting on a steady rise in airlift, Laguna Resorts and Hotels Plc Managing Director Michael Ayling said "The increase in the number of direct flights into Phuket is resulting in better air accessibility into Phuket and affordability of travel to the destination.

As long as the infrastructure keeps pace with the increased numbers of tourists, expansion of hotels and faculties that are well planned and implemented, the ho-

tels will be able to properly manage their room rates in line with the supply and demand dynamics."

Investment into Phuket's hospitality sector has strong positive business sentiment with a supply pipeline for the island of 6,968 rooms. This will see an increase of 16% by the end of 2014.

As the northern part of the island is preparing for work to start on the new International Convention and Exhibition Center, Minor International's Bill Heinecke said "We have reviewed opportunities to expand our very successful Anantara Vacation Club and Mai Khao is the destination of choice for a new 100 key resort that is set to open in late 2012."

Looking towards the future,

increasingly the number of existing hotels will face the necessity to upgrade, rebrand, or downgrade market position while transaction activity is expected to remain active.

In this business, either you move forward or go backwards, there is no standing still.

Unfortunately progress now faces increasing waiting time and delays at the island's international gateway and progress by the tourism industry could be derailed without a greater sense of urgency by AoT and immigration officials.

Foreign currency exchange risks

Property Legal By International Law Office

MANY foreigners who have decided to buy a residential property in Thailand are required to use funds held in foreign currency in their country of origin.

Property transactions in Thai-

land utilize myriad ways in which a buyer pays the purchase price to the seller. For instance, a buyer may be required to make payments

make payments to the seller upon signing of the sale and purchase agreement, followed by installment payments in accordance with the construction's progress and then a final payment on completion. In some cases, full or part payment is made against registration of title transfer.

No matter what terms of payment may have been agreed between the parties, an important issue that applies to most property purchases by foreigners in Thailand is that of currency exchange. Whenever a buyer has the currency for his property purchase in a bank account outside of Thailand and the parties agreed

to a sale and purchase price in Thai baht (which is the usual case), the buyer is required to remit his foreign currency into Thailand in an amount equivalent to the agreed Thai baht purchase price.

A crucial issue to consider is that currency exchange rates experience volatile fluctuations; therefore, the amount of foreign

A crucial issue to consider is that currency exchange rates experience volatile fluctuations. C urrency equivalent to the agreed Thai baht purchase price may vary cons i d e r a b l y from the date the contract

was signed until the time payments are due. This may result in a buyer being required to paying far more (in foreign currency) that he originally anticipated.

For a buyer who may not have sufficient monetary reserves, this increase may cause his inability to pay on time, leading to his default of the sale and purchase contract. Such a scenario should be considered by a risk aware buyer, particularly in these days of economic uncertainty, as a default in payment may have severe consequences such as the termination of the sale and purchase agreement by the seller and/or forfeiture of all monies paid to the seller depending on the agreed terms.

Another relevant factor to consider when buying a property with foreign currency is the place and time of the currency exchange into Thai baht. Exchange rates may significantly differ depending on where the actual money exchange occurs. Usually, there is a material difference between an off-shore exchange rate set by a bank outside of Thailand and the on-shore exchange rates quoted by Thai banks. Therefore, a buyer may find it problematic to determine in advance the exact amount of foreign currency required to be transferred into the Thai baht bank account of a seller in order to make payment of a certain Thai baht amount due.

Furthermore, buyers should investigate if their property purchase is subject to certain laws or regulations requiring remittance of foreign currency into Thailand and its subsequent conversion to Thai baht. For instance in case of a condominium unit purchase foreigners are usually required to instruct their bank outside of Thailand to transfer foreign currency into Thailand (where the purchased property is located) in amount equivalent to the Thai baht sale and purchase price of the unit. The receiving Thai bank would then make the applicable conversion at the time of

credit of the currency into a Thai baht account in Thailand.

In addition, the purpose of the remittance and name of buyer is required to be disclosed under the payment instructions provided to the remitting bank. Otherwise it may result in a buyer being unable to collect the documentation from the money receiving bank in Thailand showing all details usually required by the competent land department office at the time of registration of title transfer. The same documentation may be required to be presented to your bank when applying for the repatriation of funds received upon a subsequent resale of a property. To summarize, before entering

into a legal agreement for the purchase of property in Thailand, all potential buyers should conduct a careful investigation into all the legalities and risks involved.

To avoid pitfalls and traps for the unwary, a buyer would be well advised to consult with a reputable law firm and professional advisors prior to signing any contracts or making payments for the purchase of a property in Thailand.

They've got it made in the shade



PLANTING some ground cover plants is a practical move that will add exceptional interest to your garden. For now, I'm going to pass on the most common ground cover plants in Thailand such as the spider lily and the spiral ginger, both of which attain heights of over 50 centimeters, and are practically employed in undercover environments all over Phuket. Instead, I will describe those unobtrusive plants that hug the ground, and rarely trouble their loftier neighbors.

Ground cover plants are valued for several reasons. They look decorative, they provide a sort of natural mulch by aiding the retention of moisture and most importantly, they perform a valuable function in carpeting those bare and unsightly areas in shrubberies and borders. They can also be used in containers where their foliage provides an attractive contrast to grander incumbents of pots such as Euphorbias or desert roses, shrubs which reach skywards, unimpeded.

Common throughout the tropics is *Tradescantia spathacea*, a member of the spiderwort family, and more familiarly known as 'Moses in a boat'. It has characteristically dense rosettes of lance-shaped leaves that are dark green and often glossy above, and purple underneath.

Though it hails from Mexico, this vigorous grower is available in garden centers everywhere in Phuket, usually potted in small plastic containers. The fleshy root system is shallow, and the plant can easily be propagated from cuttings, especially if you remove a small piece of root with the stem.

Because it's an understory plant from the tropical woodlands, it likes moisture and some

shade, though the leaves may lose their purplish underside in very low light. This is hardly a problem in Phuket, but it's an issue sometimes when the spiderwort is grown as a house plant in temperate areas, as it often is.

Here in Phuket, it can be grown outdoors, singly or in clumps, and its neat habit makes it suitable as a border plant, or for edging pathways. By the way, it got its name because the small, white, three-petaled flowers, appear between boat-shaped bracts in the axils of the leaves.

As with so many plants, hybrids are beginning to appear in garden centers in Phuket. Look out for a pretty, variegated cultivar with striped foliage in shades of yellow, pink or deep purple.

The purple heart or *Tradescantia pallida*, is another much cultivated member of the family. Again, it may be a familiar houseplant to European and American readers. Its leaves are a similar lance shape, but are a striking shade of smoky purple. It has small pink flowers, but it's also grown for its foliage.

It is less durable than its relative, has brittle stems, and a trailing habit. The other small drawback is its attractiveness to slugs and snails – you may need to protect your new plants with slug bait.

As with 'Moses in a boat', it needs some sun to produce its most attractive hues. However, it's even easier to propagate from cuttings, so beg a few snapped off stems from a friend if you want to introduce it to your garden. Given the right conditions, it will spread quickly. Yours truly has many flourishing in pots alongside their bigger brethren. A less widely known plant is *Hemigraphis alternata* which comes from Indonesia. Like the purple heart, it has a trailing habit, and is often seen in hanging baskets. The oval leaves are metallic green on top and purple below.

Already cultivars are appear-

ing, one with turned down leaf edges (*exotica*), and another with long, notched foliage (*repanda*).

long, notched foliage (*repanda*). To discover them though, may require some undercover detective work in local nurseries.

Tip of the week

Caring for orchids

EVERY Thai garden should have its share of orchids. They are the biggest and perhaps oldest single group of perennial herbs, and have arguably the widest range of forms and colors of any flowering plant.

Contrary to popular belief, orchids are relatively easy to cultivate. They have aerial roots and they are mainly epiphytic – their natural tendency is to anchor themselves to forks and crevices of tree limbs. Only a few terrestrial orchids grow in conventional soil, so not surprisingly, they need relatively little water, and most thrive in filtered sunlight.

Of course there are variations. Orchids with thick, leathery leaves need more sunlight than those with long thin foliage. The former retain moisture by means of a waxy cuticle which limits evaporation. In the garden, they are best grown in hanging baskets which offer some similarities to their natural conditions.





Sport Challenge trophy a sizzling success

tournament for treatment.

The Lomas under 13's and under 15's then combined for a match which provided the senior players respite in the covered grandstand from the inferno outside, and also entertainment from the youngsters, who exhibited some wonderful running and handling skills.

With three games remaining for each team to play it became glaringly obvious that the heat was already taking its toll and a decision was reached not to play the cup and plate finals, and simply conclude the tournament on a league basis.

In game three, DEA Tigers notched up their second victory with a 17-0 win over the Bedok Kings. The tournaments' fourth game highlighted the Vagabonds struggle for players, going down 31-5 to the Singapore Bucks. Game five between the Vagabonds

The Ironman World Championship in Kailua-Kona, originally a combination of the Waikiki Rough Water swim, the Around Oahu Bike Race and the Honolulu Marathon, is a full Ironman consisting of a 3.8 km swim, a 180.2 km bike ride and a 42.2 km run.

Lengthen your contact, don't follow through



THIS week's tennis tip is on length of contact. Length of contact is the length of the swing forwards at the moment of impact with the ball.

Forget the term "follow through" and promise to never say it again! Follow through is most commonly taught as wrapping your arm around your body. What this does is shorten the swing.

For a right-handed player's backhand, following through shortens the swing too far to the right, winding up in mistakes into the bottom of the net or mistakes too far to the right.

Instead, lengthen your contact forward, towards your desired target which is the opponents court in *front* of you.

Looking at two different backhands, Rafael Nadal's doublehanded backhand and Richard Gasquet's single-handed backhand, you can see that their strings are facing the court in front of them although the ball has already left their strings.

This is what length of contact looks like. A great drill is to practice hitting into the opponents alley from your service line then moving to three-quarter court, and then to the baseline hitting fifteen strokes into the alley at each depth.


This will teach you to lengthen your contact forwards as you move back. You can do this with a friend or on your own with a ball machine or drop hitting.

Luckily for Phuket, Songkhla would have to play this match without two key strikers, Panai Kongkaphan and league scoring leader, Chayene Santos, both suspended as a result of previous bookings. And to make matters worse, Japanese midfielder Ryohei Maeda was carried off the pitch after sustaining an injury just 15 minutes into play.

Phuket took control early on. Questionable officiating denied the Southern Sea Kirin two goals in the first half, however, driving up emotions among Phuket fans. The
