HM celebrates 84th birthday

PHUKET joins the nation in wishing His Majesty The King Bhumibol Adulyadej a happy, healthy 84th birthday on Monday, December 5.

His Majesty's health is gradually improving, Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra said after her visit to Siriraj Hospital in Bangkok last week.

Late last month His Majesty had a fever occurring at irregular intervals and pain in his lower abdomen, the Royal Household Bureau reported.

While PM Yingluck invites all Thais to join in the Seventh Cycle birthday celebrations, HM the King has humbly asked celebrations be kept simple due to the ongoing flood crisis.

On his birthday, His Majesty is expected to grant a public audience at the Chakri Throne Hall in the Grand Palace at 10:30am.

The Royal Guards from the Royal Thai Armed Forces will pledge an oath of loyalty on the same day, PM Yingluck said.

of the birthday celebrations, King of Bhutan Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck had allowed Thailand to borrow a Buddha relic from Bhutan so that Thai people could pay homage.

The longest reigning monarch in the world, HM the King so far has lived to see 27 Thai PMs take power in his 65 years on the throne.

He is deeply loved by Thais and is known for his commitment to projects that directly help common people - farmers, fishermen, laborers - through his many charities.

He is the only Thai monarch to hold a patent, one of which he achieved in 1993 for an ingenious wastewater system, "Chai Pattana".

HM the King was born on December 5, 1927, in Cambridge, Massachusetts, USA. He acceded to the Throne at age 18 on June 9, 1946.

He is also known as King Rama IX, the literal translation of his The premier said that as part name means "Strength of the Land

with Incomparable Power".

An accomplished jazz musician and sportsman, HM the King had his first ski lesson in 1935 and excelled, as he also did at water sports and badminton.

And in homage to HM the King's love of sailing, the 25th annual King's Cup Regatta will take place from December 3-10.

More than 2,000 sailors and 100 yachts are expected to take part this year.

The banks are joining in the celebrations, with the Bank of Thailand unveiling a commemorative 100-baht banknote.

A total of 9.9 million special 100-baht bills have been printed for distribution to the public.

The back of the banknotes feature depictions of some of His Majesty's well-known activities in such fields as water-resource development and management, science and technology, and his remarkable musical talent.

A special feature – a first for a Thai banknote – is a horizontal

up and down the denomination numerals when the note is tilted.

The special bills can be bought with a hard-paper cover for 200 baht each, or with a hard-paper cover and a bag at 500 baht.

A portion of revenue will go to the Chaipattana Foundation, a sustainable development charity established by His Majesty.

Reservations for the banknotes can be made at branches of combright gold bar that appears to move mercial banks, the Government

Savings Bank, the Government Housing Bank, the Bank for Agriculture and Agricultural Cooperatives and the Islamic Bank of Thailand.

All of the notes will be distributed on December 2.

B50,000 reward for currency booth robber

POLICE are offering a 50,000-baht reward for information leading to the arrest of the man who robbed a Siam Commercial Bank money exchange booth near Karon Circle on Saturday night, November 19.

Chalong Police Superintendent Krittapad Dej-intorrasorn also released a composite sketch of the wanted man, drawn from descriptions provided by witnesses, in the hope that it will assist in his capture.

The robber threatened two staff members at knife point. He forced Amnard Ponpramun, 27, to gag and bind his female workmate Wilaiwan Khao-ong, 22, with tape, then forcing him to open the safe.

The pair were closing up the booth at 8pm when the robbery occurred.

"We were opening the door to leave when a man pushed his way inside. He held a knife to my right waist," Mr Amnard said.

"He taped Wilaiwan's hands behind her back. He taped her ankles and mouth before forcing me with the knife to open the safe and hand over the money," he added.

Col Krittapad said the robber escaped with mixed currencies, including US dollars and euros, with a combined value of

He described the unidentified thief as a dark-skinned Thai man, about 180 centimeters tall, 20-25 years old who spoke in Southern Thai during the robbery.

"I have split my team into four groups to search for him. The sketch was compiled from CCTV camera images and descriptions from witnesses, so this should easily lead us to the robber," Col Krittapad said.

"Anyone who sees a man matching the description of the suspect is urged to call us on 085-300 0060," said Col Krittapad.

Officials move to lift landslide warning

IN A sign that the worst of the 2011 monsoon season may be over, Phuket authorities are preparing paperwork to revoke a landslide disaster warning for a section of the bypass road in Rassada.

The warning was put in place for a section of the bypass road northbound following heavy rains in October that caused a landslip.

The slide forced the evacuation of several businesses and raised fears of a greater disaster that could render the road impassable.

During a meeting at Phuket Provincial Hall on Monday, Chaiwat Taepee, the Chief Administrative Officer (Palad) at the Phuket Provincial Office, said the recent change in weather had dried out the soil in the area sufficiently to warrant lifting the warning.

Mr Chaiwat said Rassada Municipality officials had informed the Muang District Office that the danger had passed in the area, located behind the Adisak Trading Company and adjacent businesses on the bypass road.

However, the warning can be officially lifted only after the re-

quest has been approved by the Municipality seeking assistance in governor, who was represented at the meeting by Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM) Phuket office chief San Jantharawong and representatives of the Phuket Provincial Public Works and Town Planning Office.

Mr Chaiwat said he expects such approval to come "soon".

As for measures to shore up exposed soil in risk area to prevent a recurrence during the next rainy season, Mr Chaiwat said the owner of the land in question must present a written plan to Rassada order to ensure the safety of local residents.

Such a plan could only be approved with permission of the both Adisak Trading company and the owner of the hillside land behind the Adisak plot.

A local resident who is also an environmental engineer told the Gazette soon after the slide that hillside excavation for landfill had altered natural watercourses. It had also exposed soil and greatly compromised slope stability in the area.

Russian tourist dies at Kata

A RUSSIAN tourist died after being pulled from the water at Kata Beach last Sunday. Lt Tianchai Duangsuwan of the Chalong Police named the victim as Uriu Varnakov, age 57.

Uten Singsom, head of the Phuket Lifeguard Club, told the Gazette that a tourist spotted Mr Varnakov floating face down in thigh-deep water in front of the Club Med resort at about 10am.

"Some jet-ski operators nearby saw [this] and rushed to bring him back to shore," Mr Uten said.

"Club Med nurses, another lifeguard and I tried hard to save his life. We gave him CPR for about 30 minutes before an ambulance arrived and rushed him to Patong Hospital," he added.

Mr Varnakov was pronounced dead on arrival at the hospital.

Mr Uten said there had been no reports of people hearing Mr Varnakov shouting or signalling for help, although there were about 20 people in the water around him.

"Also, there were no strong currents or rip tides," he said

Travel expo draws thousands

THOUSANDS of visitors turned out for the opening day of the Andaman Travel Trade 2011 last

TAT Deputy Governor for International Marketing Juthaporn Rerngronasa, who chaired the opening, had in the run up to the event highlighted Brazil as an expanding market for inbound tourism.

In person at the show confirming Ms Juthaporn's assertion was Leonardo Capistrano, a representative from PMG Capital Marketing in Sao Paolo.

"This is my first time to Thailand. It is very nice to have this event. I can now get in touch with local hotels, local suppliers and local service providers.

"We expect to see more new hotels being represented at this event, such as hotels from the northern part of the island or different islands in this area, not just hotels from Patong," he said.

Army hands

POLICE in Kuraburi, Phang Nga province, have confirmed that 95 ethnic Rohingya who last Thursday morning landed on Koh Phra Thong, about 110km north of Phuket, have been handed over the Royal Thai Army.

However, all attempts by the Gazette to confirm with the Army the refugees' current whereabouts have failed.

"We received a call from villagers on the island saying that a boat full of Rohingya people had landed on the shore there, but by the time I got there the Army was already there," said Lt Col Akekachai Pueakmanee, Deputy Superintendent of Kuraburi Police Station.

'The Army had already assembled all 95 of them at the Tung Laong Pier on the mainland," he

Lt Col Akekachai did not specify how many of the refugees were men, women or children.

"An Army officer told us that all Rohingya of the 'captured' will be taken to the 2nd Infantry Battalion, 25th Military unit, Rattanarangson Camp, in Ratchakud District, Ranong province," he said.

95 Rohingya disappear into Pheu Thai to tackle local land corruption

PHEU Thai Party spokesman and party list MP Prompong Nopparit has vowed to raise specific instances of alleged land encroachment in Phuket with Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra.

Mr Prompong, currently vice president of the parliamentary anti-corruption committee, which includes Phuket Democrat MP Raywat Areerob, was in Phuket last Saturday to hear complaints about encroachment and corrupt government officials.

At a public meeting at Phuket Rajabaht University, Mr Prompong heard in person complaints of encroachment in Phuket, Phang Nga, Surat Thani and even on Koh Yao Noi in Phang Nga Bay.

Also at the meeting to hear the complaints were Department of Special Investigation (DSI) forest land specialist Lt Col Prawut Wongsrinin and Phuket National Resource and Environment Chief Chaipadung Promsawat.

Top among the complaints was - Chaiyot Yongcharoenchai | that Chanote title deeds had been

issued for national forest land, and that despite complaints having been lodged, such title deeds had yet to be revoked.

"The problem in each area seems to be the same. Land encroachment has been conducted through the illegal issuance of Chanote title deeds and nothing has been done by the relevant government offices," Mr Prompong said.

"Although local residents have petitioned the government to reclaim its land, and in some cases government officers have inspected and found said encroachment to be illegal, Chanote titles [for these areas] still have not been revoked," he added.

Mr Prompong cited complaints

of encroachment at Baan Kuku in Phuket's Rassada subdistrict, specifically on 50 rai of the Chee Lao mangrove forest beside the Tha Jeen canal, which separates Koh Sireh from Phuket.

He added that he had received complaints of 1,284 rai of mangrove forest being encroached on near the Santi Pattana community in Tambon Bangsawan, Prasaeng District, Surat Thani, and of a Chanote title covering 59.2 rai being issued for state land near Tai Muang in Phuket's neighboring province of Phang Nga.

There are a lot of 'influential people' who use nominees to own national park land, and I call this robbery.

"I will present all these problems at the party meeting, to related ministers and to Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra," Mr Prompong said.

"I will pass on the suggestion that the government office that is to revoke illegally issued Chanote [titles] must be different from the department that issues them," he

Phuket gets dedicated 'rape case' officer

PHUKET now has a female police officer dedicated to handling rape and sexual assault cases: Capt Nucharee Longkaew

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pekad Tantipong confirmed the news last Friday at the quarterly meeting of Phuket's honorary consuls and top officials on the island.

Maj Gen Pekad confirmed that Capt Nucharee, stationed at Phuket City Police Station, is on call to handle cases involving allegations of rape and sexual assault.

The news was much welcomed by British honorary consul Martin Carpenter and Australian honorary consul Larry Cunningham, who have both long championed a police "sex crime" unit being established on Phuket.

Mr Carpenter asked Maj Gen Pekad specifically how Capt Nucharee would be involved in handling reports of sex crimes.

Maj Gen Pekad replied, "She has the authority to go to any police station in Phuket to investigate sex crime cases, such as sexual assault in Patong.

"She will help with the handling of sex offense cases involving female tourists," he said.

Mr Cunningham praised the move, saying, "I would like to thank the commander for having an officer dedicated to these cases, especially considering the number of sexual assault cases in Patong.

"Also, in many incidents the victim of a sexual assault has to go home [to her home country] because there is no one she is comfortable talking to here," he

"So, hopefully, they will now feel comfortable talking to an officer who is going to push their cases, and the terrible men committing the crimes might think twice before they try to do it to anyone else," he added.

Tsunami Wall ready for remembrance

THE addition of a new section to the Tsunami Wall of Remembrance in Mai Khao has been completed in time for the upcoming memorial ceremony on December 26.

The original wall bore images of all the countries whose nationals had died in the 2004 tsunami.

However, planning permission to allow the construction of the new police building near the site meant that a new perimeter wall intersected the memorial wall.

The obstructed section listing three countries would have been unapproachable to those wishing to pay their respects.

The extension to the Wall of Remembrance has been finished," said Sakchai Limcharoen, Superintendent at Tah Chat Chai Police Station.

"The work included inscribing the names Argen-

tina, the Czech Republic and Egypt to the wall. Everything is now ready for the Remembrance of Tsunami Victims ceremony on December 26," he

The work involved removing the section of memorial wall isolated within the newly constructed police compound and rebuilding it at the other end of the existing memorial wall.

Mai Khao Administration Organization (OrBorTor) acting president Raywat Sombatthong said that Provincial Police Region 8 was in charge of the work on building the new part of the wall. Hence, responsibility for the new section falls to Provincial Police Region 8.

Mai Khao OrBorTor was not involved in construction of the new section, he said.

Phuket best for

A RECENT study has rated Phuket as the top province in Thailand for motorbike riders and passengers wearing helmets.

"Since we launched our '100 per cent helmet' campaign in 2010, Phuket has been chosen as a model province for motorcycle riders wearing helmets. We are the top province for wearing helmets," said Phuket Public Health Office (PPHO) Deputy Director Wiwat Seetamanotch.

Bangkok ranked second and Loei province third in the study, he added.

"In the past few months we have made more than 30,000 random stops and found that the number of people wearing helmets is continually increasing," he said.

The number of riders wearing helmets has risen from 30 per cent before the campaign to 90 per cent today, claimed Dr Wiwat.

The study also found that nearly 70 per cent of passengers wore helmets, he said, but added that the study found people were less inclined to wear helmets at night.



Phuket Townies were the 'best' for wearing helmets in all of Phuket.

Phuket City had the greatest percentage of people wearing helmets, followed by Kata and Patong.

"Thalang has the fewest people wearing helmets because Thalang is out of town. People leaving work from rubber plantations or farms don't wear helmets on the short trip home," Dr Wiwat said.

"We will continue to focus on teenagers to make them realize the importance of wearing helmets," he added.

Marine Office allows wearing helmets 70 more rental jet-skis

allow amnesty to jet-ski operators so that they can register 70 jetskis found operating illegally.

The move is aimed at ensuring all rental jet-skis in Phuket are covered by first-class insurance, Phuket Marine Office Chief Phuripat Theerakulpisut told the quarterly meeting of Phuket's honorary consuls last Friday,

"Since we started managing jetski rental operations in 2007, 219 jet-skis have been registered. However, we have found 70 jet-skis that are unregistered," Chief Phuripat told the consuls.

The Marine Office is not planning legal action against the offending jet-ski operators, but has instead asked them to cooperate with his office, he said.

"Also, the jet-skis will be registered for particular zones, which means that jet-skis being rented out in Patong cannot be used in other areas," he added.

Previously, jet-skis had to be registered with the Marine Office under the category of cruiser and

sports boat. "Under that system, there had been many problems with jet-ski insurance claims. So now we have created a category especially for jet-ski rental businesses. This system has been specifically designed for Phuket," explained Chief Phuripat.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Maj Gen Pekad Tantipong said that police had so far received about 40 reports of foreigners

damaging jet-skis. "So I would like tourists who have a disagreement with a jet-ski operator to go to the police. That will make it fair for both sides," he said.

Jet-ski insurance scams have long tarnished Phuket's reputation among tourists, with pressure from consuls and ambassadors placing Phuket's top officials squarely in the spotlight.

Bust reveals dope 'brick' hidden in woman's shorts

POLICE acting on a tip-off arrested two people for possession and intent to sell marijuana last week. One of the arrested was a woman who had a "brick" of marijuana stuffed into her shorts. The other was a man who was already wanted for dope charges.

After receiving the tip-off that "someone" was selling drugs at a block of rented rooms on Chao Fa East Road, Chalong Police set up a team of officers and staged a stakeout on November 21, explained Investigating officer Maj Jaran Bangprasert.

While the officers were keeping the building under surveillance, they noticed 22year-old Namtip Da-arboot sitting on a motorbike near a local karaoke bar, at about 10:30pm.

Considering the length of time she was waiting and how she was behaving, officers decided to introduce themselves and asked to search her.

To their surprise, officers found Namtip with a "brick" of dried marijuana, sealed and wrapped in brown paper, tucked into her shorts.

The officers arrested her for possession with intent to sell a Class 5 drug and seized the brick, which measured 5x16x4 centimeters, as evidence.

While police were discovering the brick in her pants, they no-

ticed a man lurking around the karaoke bar.

Believing the man was acting ispiciously they stopped him and identified him as Sombong Naoprai, 28.

Sombong already had a warrant issued for his arrest on charges of possession of a Class 5 drug, specifically marijuana, with intent to sell.

The warrant, issued on February 24, noted that Sombong was arrested near the same karaoke bar where he was arrested again on November 21.

Sombong is now in custody and will face due legal process, Maj Jaran said.

Spike thief arrested – again

POLICE early Tuesday morning arrested yet again one of six women charged in October with luring foreign tourists to hotel rooms, where they were drugged and subsequently robbed.

Suspect Suchada Yusuk, 29, was arrested on Soi Bangla at 3:30am.

"We had an investigation team tailing her. When she started acting suspiciously while walking along Soi Bangla, the officers stopped and searched her," said Maj Thammasan Boonsong.

Officers found in her bag five Alprazolam pills, eight Atarax pills and a small plastic bottle containing a green-colored liquid mixture of the drugs – the same concoction used in the October arrests and another similar bottle, but

'When we brought her in for questioning, she confessed that she used [Alprazolam] to drug foreigners to sleep. She put the mix in their drinks and then she stole their belongings," Maj Thammasan said.

"She always chose foreigners

on Soi Bangla [as her victims]," he added.

"We are not sure if she had already robbed someone as one of the bottles was empty. We are still investigating that aspect," Maj Thammasan said.

Suchada was presented in court on Tuesday to face a fresh charge of illegal possession of a prescription drug, he added.

Suchada's arrest came while she was out on bail after being arrested on October 31 with the five other women and charged with illegal possession of a prescription drug.

She was to present herself to Phuket Provincial Court on December 8.

Maj Thammasan explained that Suchada, who formally changed her first name from Wanpen about five months ago, was released on bail because she is a suspect in another robbery case in which foreigners were victimized.

Her alleged accomplice in that case, Jaruni Kanpol, is still at large.

Police hoped that releasing Suchada on bail would help lead them to Jaruni, said Maj Thammasan.

Suchada and Jaruni are suspected of using the same knockout drops to drug tourists and then rob them, he added.

Officers are also keeping tabs on the other women arrested in the October 31 bust.

"I have heard that some of them left Phuket, but we have seen some of the others still in Patong and we are keeping our eyes on them to make sure they don't do it again," he said.

None of the women are now working in bars, he noted.

"Even though some of them worked in bars on Soi Bangla, we did not reveal which bars they worked at. We would like to protect the reputation of those bars, especially since the tourists were not drugged on the premises," he

November 2 found the five other women guilty of illegal possession of a prescription drug, Maj Thammasan said.

Three were listed as: Kemporn Pooseedin, 45, from Maha Sarakham; Saeng Nuansri, 47, from Phuket; and Wanida Yusuk, 36, from Yasothon. Each were ordered to pay fines of 10,000

Supaporn Yusuk, 18, from Yasothon was fined 2,500 baht and Sukanya Jansong, 23, from Ubon Ratchathani was fined 1,000 baht.

As all five confessed to the charges, the court halved their fines, the Gazette was told.

All five have already paid their fines, the court confirmed.

Kemporn, Saeng and Wanida all appeared in court on Monday to faces charges of theft. They are scheduled to appear again on December 8.

Although the three women were remanded to Phuket Provincial Prison and later released on bail, Maj Thammasan explained that theft charges were filed against only these three women because victims had come forward and identified them in their complaints.



Inmates hope for amnesty

PHUKET prisoners on November 24 helped clean up Wat Charoen Samanakit, located behind Phuket Provincial Hall, in order to make merit for HM The King Bhumibol Adulyadej ahead of his 84th birthday on December 5.

"The 40 prisoners working today are among the 200 plus people asking for amnesty. I have already filed their names to request amnesty from HM the King. If nothing goes wrong, the approvals should be announced before December 5," said Phuket Prison Director Rapin Nichanon..

The efforts were part of a Ministry of Justice national project, from November 21 to December 5, to clean flood-affected areas and to help flood victims, Mr Rapin explained.

"If any community needs our help, please call us at 076-212104," he said.

Pracha survives, despite attacks and high waters

survived a censure debate in the House of Representatives after coming under heavy attack from the opposition Democrat Party for his handling of the flood crisis.

Mr Pracha won with a 273-188 majority vote, a tally that surprised few analysts, given that the coalition government controls 300 of the 500 seats in the lower house.

The justice minister was the sole target of the censure motion due to his role as head of the Flood Relief Operations Center (FROC).

The opposition accused him of running FROC based purely on nepotism. Democrat heavyweight Jurin Laksanawisit led the

JUSTICE Minister Pracha Promnok has attack, accusing Mr Pracha of grave failure to properly manage floodwater, human resources, money and flood-relief supplies, thus causing great damage to the country.

> Mr Pracha posed a threat of further damage should he continue to serve as head of FROC, Mr Jurin alleged.

> Mr Jurin also accused the justice minister of allowing politicians to interfere in officials' work, in violation of Articles 265 and 266 of the Constitution.

> Defending himself, Mr Pracha said the procurement of flood-relief supplies was done before FROC was established. He had evidence to back up his claim, he said.

Besides, Mr Pracha alleged, the Abhisit

government had procured relief supplies at higher prices than the Yingluck government had done.

The opposition also attacked Mr Pracha for his alleged role in the now-abandoned plan to bring former prime minister and Pheu Thai Party patron Thaksin Shinawatra back to Thailand by securing a Royal Pardon for

Mr Thaksin currently lives in exile to escape a two-year jail sentence after his 2008 conviction, which he claims was politically motivated.

Around 30,000 prisoners are expected to be released from jail to coincide with HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej's 84th birthday.

Debate rages on Article 112

AROUND THE nation

THE debate over Thailand's controversial lese majeste law, which bans criticism of the monarchy, reached fever pitch after a 61year-old man with cancer was recently sentenced to 20 years in jail for sending text messages deemed offensive to Her Majesty the Queen.

Last week the country's Information and Technology Minister Anudith Nakornthap also warned Facebook users they could be prosecuted for clicking "Like" on posts that insult the royal family.

On November 23, the Bangkok Criminal Court found Ampon Tangnoppakul guilty on four counts of violating Article 112 of the Criminal Code, which legally enshrines lese majeste, as well as the Computer Crimes Act.

The retired truck driver, whose family claims he loves His Majesty the King, was sentenced to four consecutive four-year sentences, totalling 20 years in jail.

In May 2010, Mr Ampon allegedly sent four text messages from

his cellphone to the personal secretary of Abhisit Vejjajiva, who was prime minister at the time.

The content of the messages, which cannot be repeated without breaking the *lese majeste* law, were deemed as disparaging to Her Majesty the Queen.

Mr Ampon denied sending the messages. He claimed that he was not in possession of the cellphone at the time and did not even know how to send text messages.

Benjamin Zawacki, Thailand researcher for human rights watchdog Amnesty International, condemned the verdict.

"Thailand has every right to have a (lese majeste) law, but its current form and usage place the country in contravention of its international legal obligations," Mr Zawacki told The Associated Press.

"Repression remains the order of the day in Thailand on freedom of expression, and Amphon is a political prisoner," he proclaimed.

Two days after the conviction, Information and Technology Minister Anudith Nakornthap said Facebook users could violate Article 112 by sharing or "liking" material posted on the popular

Mr Anudith recently told the media that the government had asked Facebook to remove more than 10,000 pages deemed offensive to the monarchy.

'We have informed Facebook and sought their assistance in deleting content which is offensive to our monarchy," he said.

One opposition Democrat MP, Mallika Boonmeetrakool, suggested that sites such as Facebook and YouTube be banned altogether to ensure Thais are not exposed to "offensive material", a highly controversial move given the popularity of social networking in Thailand.

However, on November 29 Abhisit Vejjajiva posted on his Facebook wall that the "Democratic party does not have a policy to turn off Facebook or Youtube [in Thailand]." A clear sign that the Democratic Party doesn't fully support Maillika's propsal of banning socail networking sites.

Article 112 mandates jail sentences of three to 15 years for anyone who insults the Thai King, Queen or heir to the throne, currently Crown Prince Vajiralongkorn.

'Flood crocs' cause panic

AS FLOODWATERS recede in Bangkok district of Sai Mai. Bangkok and surrounding areas, hard-pressed residents are having to deal with a new menace: crocodiles and highly poisonous snakes

The Thai Fisheries Department has dispatched special teams to deal with the reptiles, which escaped in their hundreds from farms across Central Thailand and are now menacing the population.

Twenty-three-year-old Anchalee Wannawet told the Associated Press she saw a meter-long crocodile with its jaws wide open sitting next to an outhouse one morning.


"I ran away, and it ran into there," she said, pointing towards the reedy swamp behind the construction site where she works in the northern

"I haven't dared to go to the bathroom since. I'm peeing in a can."

There are approximately 3 crocodile farms in Thailand. The creatures are bred for their meat, bones and skin, which is used to make luxury bags and other accessories.

The Fisheries Department is also fielding as many as 10 phone calls per day about snakes. Most of them concern pythons, though some are about very dangerous snakes like cobras and pit vipers.

This year's devastating floods have killed more than 600 people and brought Thailand's industrial centers to their knees.



Corrupting the land title chase

WHILE the Andaman Travel Trade 2011 expo was winding to a close at Phuket Rajabaht University last Saturday, tucked away in a small conference room in the Science and Technology faculty building on the same campus was none other than Pheu Thai Spokesman and party list MP Prompong Nopparit, who was holding a public hearing to receive complaints about government officials' inaction against the illegal issuance of land title deeds and encroachment by developers on government land.

Lucky it was that the Andaman Travel Trade delegates did not walk through the wrong door. It would be difficult to reconcile within the same brain the mixed messages of "Come enjoy your holiday in beautiful Phuket" with "We're so tired of government officials taking no action on the illegal issuance of land title deeds and encroachment that we're going to tell our prime minister."

Highlighted by Mr Prompong was that, according to statistics, over the past two years 10 million rai of forest land across the country had been destroyed through "acquisition".

Also noteworthy was the fact that no mention was made of the problem of foreigners "owning" land – well, "controlling" actually – through the use of nominees.

What screamed out as nonsense from the proceedings, however, was how officials were to "annul" or "revoke" so-called "illegally issued" Chanote title deeds. Using the term "improperly issued" would go a long way toward a clearer understanding of the problem.

To annul or revoke a document would substantiate that the holder at some point in time had some rights conferred by the document. But the land titles in question – even if issued by a government authority on the presumption that the information provided to them was true – were never valid.

The authorities will need to mark their records accordingly, but they certainly would not be annulling or revoking any rights the holder claimed to have had. They never had any in the first place.

Consider a person who claims to own a stolen car because the registration book was ratified by the Land Transportation Department. Once the true owner steps forward with evidence showing that he or she is the actual owner of the car, there would be no question as to the lack of rights of the person who thought he or she owned the car actually had.

Then last Saturday there was the odd assertion that the government officials who were to "revoke" the illegally issued Chanote titles be different from those who issued them – that is, Land Department officials. It's odd because we already have them. They're called the Royal Thai Police.

The last time the *Gazette* checked, fraud, deception and providing government officers with false information were all criminal charges.

Tourists neglecting to help stop crime


FIRST PERSON

I WANT foreign tourists who are victims of crimes in Phuket to cooperate with us when we investigate their cases, but they always rush back to their home countries after getting their stolen belongings back. This makes it impossible for police to press charges against the thieves as there isn't enough evidence to secure a conviction. Eventually the suspects will be released and return to the streets to take part in more crime.

Police request that tourists stay in Phuket for questioning, but usually they refuse, because they just want to return home. This is why police have not been able to remove thieves from Patong. On top of this, the tourists sometimes complain to the police when they don't get their things back quickly.

Many times police officers do catch the thieves with the stolen goods, but their victims don't want to become involved, so they avoid helping the police. Without victims we can not subject suspects to the full legal process. We are always arresting the same individuals. Mostly the thieves are lady boys working in Soi Bangla. We receive a report of a tourist being robbed once every week or two.

Another issue is that some tourists think that it's easy to find drugs

in Patong and then are tricked into buying fake drugs. For example, they buy fake marijuana made from the leaves of local plants such as Muntingia calabura Linn and Streblus asper Lour. Occasionally the foreigners get angry with the "drug" dealers, because they were tricked, and become violent. The dealers then simply report the foreigner's violent behavior to the police, because the tourist is not likely to be honest about the reason for his aggression. In the end the tourist only loses his money.

In reality, the idea that drugs are easy to come by in Patong is untrue. Our drug suppression team is constantly arresting drug dealers and seizing their contraband.

Now when it comes to tourists fighting with taxi and tuk tuk drivers, it nearly always involves drunken tourists and starts with something small, such as the fare for a ride or damage done to a ve-

Instead of resorting to violence, the tourist should wait for the police. The police will attempt to negotiate a solution. If they don't wait, with one party being drunk and the other not willing to give in, a fight will ensue. Other taxi drivers in the vicinity see this going on and step into assist their friend. Invariably this appears to onlookers as a mob of taxi drivers beating a tourist. Most of these altercations occur from 2-3am and nearly always with a drunk tourist.

A good example is when a drunken tourist is playing with a tuk-tuk or taxi and the vehicle ends up getting damaged. The driver asks for compensation, but the drunk tourist cannot speak coherently and the situation escalates into a violent confrontation. In circumstances such as this the tourist should just wait for the arrival of the police, so that they can peacefully negotiate a settlement.

Junta allowed to play

I WAS thrilled to watch the 26th SEA Games on TV. Watching my Thai friends excitedly support their fellow countrymen and women, in boxing, volleyball, weightlifting, penkat silat, football and other sports, was absoultely marvelous.

The same goes for Myanmar opening its doors to tourism. Do they actually think tourists are naive enough to believe that the income generated by tourism will actually be distributed among those who really earned it and

But as soon as I think this, I ask myself, how do we entice the junta to step up and start develop-

According to the law, construction cannot be conducted during the middle of the night. The law clarifies that working hours are from between 7am to 10pm.

Construction work continuing seven days a week and on holidays is permissible, because the law does not prohibit it.

However, if you can't stand the noise from the construction site, you can file a complaint with the local police and they can help you negotiate with the construction company.

Originally there was an issue with the high voltage electricity that was running through the power lines, which burnt out the street lights on both sides of Paklok Road. We know that it's not enough for four lanes of traffic, but we are waiting for the the lighting company we hired to build the street lights to take responsibility for the other side of the road.

Because the problem happened while the lights were still insured we have claimed compensation for the damages. We've also asked them to repair the street lights soon, but the company hasn't responded to our request. Now we have to keep waiting. On top of this, the electrical wires were stolen from the dark side of the road."

Further noting the growth of international and domestic buyer markets, Martin Holmes, General Manager of exhibitor Lee Marine, agreed:

"There are more and more people coming to the island and wanting to get into boating. We are seeing more overseas customers, particularly from Russia. But there is also growth in the number of Thai nationals purchasing yachts."

Wage hikes postponed to April

THE Cabinet on Monday approved the postponement until April 1 of the controversial 300 baht daily minimum wage hike in Phuket, Bangkok, and five other provinces.

The decision to postpone from the initial target of January 1 was made in light of the recent flooding, which has dealt a body blow to the manufacturing sector in much of the country.

With an expected recovery period of three to six months, the delay will help minimize the burden on flood-affected businesses, the cabinet was told.

The wage increase will be piloted in Phuket, Bangkok, Samut Prakan, Nakhon Pathom, Nonthaburi, Pathum Thani and Samut Sakhon, said Labor Minister Phadermchai Sasomsap, who proposed the delay.

With the exception of Phuket, all of the pilot provinces have been heavily affected by the floods.

The wage rise in Phuket, which currently has highest daily minimum wage nationwide at 221 baht, represents an increase of 35.7 per cent.

For Bangkok and its five neighboring provinces, all with a minimum wage of 215 baht per day, the increase will equate to a 39.5 per cent increase.

As for the remaining 70 provinces, the increase rate of 39.5 per cent would be applied in 2012, the cabinet confirmed.

Based on this rate, the minimum wage will vary across the country. For example the rate in Chonburi would be 274 baht, 270 baht in Chachoengsao and Saraburi, 266 baht in Ayutthaya, 257 baht in Krabi, 256 baht in Nakhon Ratchasima and Prachin Buri, and 254 baht in Lop Buri.

A universal increase to 300 baht, as promised by the Pheu Thai Party as a pillar of its successful election campaign platform, would be applied across the board starting on January 1, 2013.

Korean tour operators to partner with Phuket

KOREAN honorary consul warned local officials to prepare for an influx of Korean tourism operators coming to set up shop in Phuket.

"More Korean company owners are looking at moving their operations to Phuket because of the floods in Bangkok. Phuket is considered as much safer," he said.

"Many Korean businesses will join Thai operators to form partnerships," he added.

Finally seeing the light

A brief history and look into the future of digital media marketing in Phuket

COMMUTERS in Phuket have witnessed a gradual upgrade in roadside scenery over the last few years. Advertising and media communications are steadily evolving, and as such, many will have noticed traditional print billboards gradually being replaced with animated, digital versions at various traffic junctions across the island.

Indeed, the emergence of Light Emitting Diode (LED) technology represents a sign of the times – a flicker of hope that the island may finally be ready to escape from the commercial 'Dark Age' characterized by the billboard clutter along

While traffic in cities like Las Vegas, Tokyo, Hong Kong and Bangkok has been long accustomed to the sight of LED-powered marketing, Phuket's first roadside-digital billboard was erected only about two years ago at the Yee Teng Complex intersection in Phuket Town.

This new-media advertising benchmark was the initiative of Chaluckkamol Fuengchan, Managing Director of software development firm Boonsoong Technology Co Ltd.

Miss Chaluckkamol, who also heads media consultancy Phebe5 Co Ltd, talked exclusively with the Phuket Gazette about the various challenges and opportunities she has observed in implementing media innovation in Phuket.

"My primary goal was to bring something new to Phuket that would help push the island forward. As we had experienced much success with LED billboards in Bangkok already, I saw a lot of potential for LED media in the Phuket market," she said.

Miss Chaluckkamol soon learned that Phuket was a world away from Bangkok.

"Since installing that initial LED billboard, several new players have emerged with LED signs in Phuket Town and Patong," she said.

In spite of the rising trend, she doesn't think that LED advertising is ready to boom in Phuket.

"Most companies in Phuket are

Unlike in Bangkok, local companies have limited advertising budgets, some none at all. Since the local economy is dependent on the tourism sector and dictated by seasonal revenue, cash flow is not steady year round.

"This makes it difficult for a media business to prosper, because you have to deal with a lot of short-term contracts. Moreover, this business requires knowhow for installing and maintaining the technology, in addition to designing and programming the interactive content, which calls for more time and capital than traditional media," she continues.

"Most companies here still prefer to use traditional print billboards and posters because they are cheaper and easier to put up. Anyone can make a sign and place it along any road here," she adds.

When asked about the increased risk of traffic accidents posed by animated roadside media, Miss Chaluckkamol pointed out that her LED billboards are placed at traffic junctions, and thus target stopped traffic.

"We've not had any reports or complaints of accidents caused as a result of our LED billboards," she said.

"When stopped at a light for 100 seconds or more, people are more likely to pay attention without causing danger to other drivers. This is not the case with roadside media that targets moving traffic.

"In our initial research at the Yee Teng complex intersection, 59 per cent of drivers that we surveyed had paid attention [to the LED billboard], and were able to retain what they'd seen," she said.

Miss Chaluckkamol went on to outline various advantages of digital media, such as flexibility and strategic targeting.

"It's pretty simple to make instant changes to a message remotely from an iPad. Timing and location are other key factors to consider. For example, our LED billboard at the Yee Teng complex junction runs spot loops between 5.30am to 10.30pm and is ideal for targeting commuters heading to the market and work in the morning.

In contrast, loops at the Weerapong – Hongsyok junction run from 6am to midnight. This location is more advantageous for targeting evening commuters such as those heading to Phuket Town's entertainment zone," she said.

As for the future of LED media in Phuket, Miss Chaluckkamol said she has had to adjust her strategy.

"After realizing that selling spot ads on billboards cannot sustain itself as a stand-alone [business], I've had to diversify my approach," she said.

She went on to share details about plans to launch an even newer marketing medium to Phuket's business-to-consumer markets. Shifting focus from outdoor to indoor markets, she reveals her latest product, soon to be launched in Phuket.

"Interactive media stations can effectively target specific markets. With the latest technology, this device can scan ones facial shape to determine if a user is male or female, for example, and then display tailored content," she said.

She explained that she is currently working out contract details with Central Festival and the Phuket International Airport.

"In addition to business-to-consumer functions, this kind of device is also ideal at government and education institutions to perform regular functions such as scanning and printing documents," she added.

Kings Cup Regatta to generate B600mn

THIS year's Kings Cup Regatta is expected to rake in 600 million baht for the island.

Presiding over a press conference to promote this year's event, Phuket Governor Tri Aukaradacha last week said that preparations are exceeding that of last year's edition.

Noting that last year's affair generated about 550 million baht in revenue, he said he expected the amount to increase in this year's version, which will draw more than 1,000 competitors from 35 countries aboard more that 170 boats. In all, more than 10,000 participants – sailors and spectators are expected to participate in the event, which will once again be held from December 3 to 10 off Kata and Karon beaches on Phuket's west coast.

Leading up to the event, Karon Deputy Mayor Sompong Darbpetch said that Karon municipality will be organizing a street fair at Kata beach from November 30 to December 5. The fair will stretch 600 meters from the area from in front of the Kata-Karon Municipality office to Club Med Hotel.

In addition to stage performances, there will be 40 booths selling local products in addition to 50 booths selling One Tambon One Product (OTOP) products from across Thailand, Mr Sompong said.

Now entering its 25th year, this year's race will be in celebration HM King Bhumibhol's auspicious 7th cycle birthday, when the revered monarch turns 84 years of age.

Need for speed

FROM time to time, I get messages from people who have looked at the Phuket Internet Speed Reporting site (PhuketInternetSpeed.com) and wonder why we're measuring international download speeds, using one specific test (DSLReports) to one destination, Los Angeles. Here's a typical comment:

this test runs to Los Angeles? I'm ond delay in the broadcast when happy. My torrents download fast, and video streams without any problems. When I run the test my I nternet ence. And your ISP only has to Service Provider recommends, or the test on one of the Thai web sites, I get speeds very close to what I 'm pay- international data pipes to handle ing for -8 to 10 Mbps download, one live stream. and 1 to 2 Mbps upload. What's wrong with just taking my I nternet ommend Service Provider's word for it?

First and foremost, there's absolutely nothing wrong with

running one of the other tests. Just be aware of the fact that the speed you'll see is more indicative of the speed to Bangkok than the speed overseas. Even if the test site says

you're going to New York or Berlin or Singapore, the speed you see on the meter has a higher correlation with your domestic speed than your international speed. That isn't necessarily bad. Let me explain.

The test we're using now, at dslreports.com/speedtest?flash=1, is specifically designed so it can't be cached inside Thailand. Caching is a technique for copying data from overseas and storing it here in Thailand, so the Internet Service Provider doesn't have to pay for a lot of overseas access.

Look at it this way: if you and 100 other people inside Thailand are watching the F1 finals, live, over an internet connection, it makes no sense at all for TOT or CAT or True or 3BB to grab 101 copies of the live broadcast and hook each one up to a single customer. It makes a



lot more sense for the ISP to cache the broadcast here in Thailand – copy it onto a computer in Bangkok, say, and then dole out the signal domestically. Woody, why should I care how fast There's a tiny fraction of a secit goes through a cache, but you would never notice the differpay a fraction of the cost, because they're only using the expensive

There's a reason why your Internet Service Provider wants you to believe the speed tests

provided at speedtest1.totbb.net, bangkok.speedtest.thaivisa.com, speedtest.3bb.co.th or speedtest.trueinternet.co.th.

They're all based on the OOKLA speed test engine, and they all show lightning-fast speeds to Bangkok – even if you can't even get a page in Europe or North America to open.

So why are international data speeds necessarily superior to domestic speeds? The short answer is they aren't.

Some people spend almost all of their time using web sites that are located inside Thailand. Many more people spend much of their time on Google sites (including YouTube and Gmail), Microsoft (Hotmail), Facebook, Yahoo and others. Even though those sites aren't located inside

Thailand, they're hooked up through dedicated high speed connections.

If you look at the detail in the official Internet connection spaghetti chart at is.gd/rFboLy, you will find that Microsoft has direct, dedicated connections from Bangkok to the US, Singapore, and Hong Kong. Google goes direct to Singapore and Malaysia. Facebook connects straight to Singapore. Akamai, which is the largest independent web host in the world, has a direct connection from Bangkok to Hong Kong. Yahoo/ Softbank also have dedicated connections to their own servers.

The net result: if you spend most of your time on Facebook, YouTube, Google, Yahoo and/or Hotmail, you're more constrained by domestic speeds than international speeds.

Similarly, if you download torrents (or use other file-sharing software), the source of the torrents may be located inside Thailand or outside Thailand, or possibly a little of both. Torrents typically get downloaded in 10 or more separate data streams, so you may be constrained by domestic speeds, or international speeds, or an unpredictable and irreproducible combination of both.

Why do we track international download speeds on the speed reporting site? The first reason, obviously, is that many people in Phuket spend a large part of their time working with internet servers located outside of Thailand. But there's more to it than that.

The speed of a single download data stream gives a more-or-less replicable benchline for measuring how well our internet's running. By keeping track of how fast things are running day-to-day, we can spot real screw-ups, and warn people about them. For example, two weeks ago in my Live Wire column I traced the demise of TOT's Fiber 2U Optic service, and pinpointed a major drop in international speeds at the beginning of October. If it

weren't for all of the speed reports prior to that collapse, and the many reports since, there's no way we could've isolated the problem.


The information's there on the site for anyone to see. TOT may well bring its Fiber 2U service back to the levels we saw earlier this year. If they do, the numbers on the site will start rising again. If they don't, potential customers can take a look at the speeds and decide if the service is right for them.

What to do if you're happy with the speeds you're getting? There's an old saying in the computer industry that I take as gospel: Ain't broke, don't fix. You may be spending most of your time using domestic connections, or one-hopshy of domestic connections, and not even realize it. Good on ya.

But whatever you do, please keep reporting your speeds on the speed reporting site. That way we can keep track of how things should be working, and blow the whistle if something starts heading south. Crowd-sourced speed reporting really works, if you'll pitch in and help a little bit.

Wave goodbye to Wave

GOOGLE has announced that it is dropping seven more products in an effort to simplify its range of services. The out-of-season "spring clean" brings an end to services including Google Wave, Knol and Google Gears and is the third time that the US firm has announced a cull of several of its products at the same time after they had failed to take off.

Google announced the move in its official blog. "We're in the process of shutting a number of products which haven't had the impact we'd hoped for, integrating others as features into our broader product efforts, and ending several which have shown us a different path forward," said Urs Holzle, Google's vice president of operations.

The seven latest products earmarked for the chop are as follows: Google Wave – an attempt to combine email and instant messaging for real-time collaboration; Google Bookmarks List – a service which allowed users to share bookmarks with friends; Google Friends Connect – allowed webmasters to add social features to their sites by embedding a snippet of code; Google Gears – much-hyped effort to maintain web browser functionality when working offline; Google Search Timeline – a graph of historical query results; Knol - a Wikipedia-style project, which aimed to improve web content; Renewable Energy Cheaper than Coal – a project which aimed to find ways to improve solar power.

Google had previously an-



nounced its plans to kill off some of the projects on the list and has now given details about when the switch-offs will occur.

Some experts think that Google is streamlining in order to concentrate on its Facebook rival Google+ which gained 10 million users within the first 16 days after its private launch, and 40 million within the first 100 days, making it the fastest-growing social network in the history of the web.

Are structured notes bad deals?

IF YOU are not familiar with structured notes, they are usually dressed up to look like a very good deal, offering either exposure to risky markets with minimized downside or fixed-coupon rates higher than one can get in traditional fixed-income assets.

They usually have the name of a big bank to increase the feeling of safety, and also quite common is some form of a "guarantee".

Unfortunately, there have been no advances in economic theory that only a select, elite few financial advisers are aware of. There is in fact still no such thing as a free lunch, yet people love to fool themselves into believing that they can get the upside of the stock or gold markets without facing the downside risk.

In my opinion almost the entire structured-note market is nothing more than a response for people's desire for something for nothing.

Why would a bank take your money, invest it into the stock market, then pay you back all of your capital if things go bad? Despite what one may think after the recent debacle of the subprime crisis, banks are not in

the business of losing money.

If one reads the fine print on most capital guarantees, they are misleading to say the least. Usually the protection is limited to only minor downside moves. If things really go bad, the hit is always taken by the purchaser of the notes – that's you.

A different way they sometimes structure them is to simply move the money into zero coupon bonds once a certain loss is taken, which locks the money up for many years and it's something any investor could do on his own anyway. It is old fashioned smoke and mirrors.

If things go great, the issuers of structured notes really make a fortune. They have used your money to make a gamble which, when it pays off, they take the lion's share of.

Often you will see a note tied to a few stock market indexes, with a fixed coupon of something like 12%. This sounds great when banks are only paying 3% on a pound sterling one-year deposit. Yet if these indexes rise dramatically, you still only see your 12%. If the markets crash, well, go re-read the above paragraph on who suffers the loss – you.


The only time when notes make sense in terms of risk/reward based on probabilities are when they are tied to an index which has been beaten down recently and they have many observation dates per year to be called in on (this greatly increases the chances of you getting a better return than the indexes provided over a short period of time).

One still needs to consider the credit rating of the bank behind the note as well.

The basic financial premise that one cannot get a return without taking a risk is something one cannot get around.

One may be able to find investments that yield a higher expected return for a certain level of risk but only to a certain extent.

If you want to limit your downside risk you can quantify maximum losses in an asset and have a stop




NO FREE LUNCHES: The structured note market is a response to people hoping to get money for nothing. Photo: Gavin Schaefer

loss, or diversify, but you cannot quadruple the return on a fixed deposit and have a "real" capital guarantee at the same time.

Of course people always want to believe in the things they want, and many banks have no ethical qualms about selling people that dream.

Reiki healer John Campbell is turning his attention to someplace new - Phuket.

The bearded 49-year-old, once dubbed the "Hairy Healer", towers at six-foot five inches yet he is softly spoken and exudes a calming tell-me-your-secrets aura.

He has always been a clairvoyant, as he believes everyone is on some level, but picked it up professionally 15 years ago. He's been a Reiki healer for the past 9 years.

Hoping he can pass on some of his healing powers to Phuket people John has now made the island his home.

We wouldn't bet against him. He is renowned for making people burst into tears – before he's even uttered a word.

He said this mostly happened when he was performing clairvoyant shows in the Algarve, Portugul. And also by local men who were having relationship "issues".

Author of two books – *Attune yourself* to Reiki and The Dream Key – John is also a sought after TV personality in Australia, his second home.

He is the first to admit he's lived an unorthodox life.

He left Tyneside, England, in 1985 at age 22, working as an electrician in a shipyard, and bound for Australia in search of travel

But after a horrific motorcycle accident left him with a crushed foot, doctors told John he

Hellbent on finding a way to help him walk, he turned his attention to alternative therapies.

"I lost my trade overnight. I couldn't even climb a ladder anymore. It was a very sad time for me," he said.

After being introduced to Reiki, John started to see improvements. After six years was back to full health.

His path set, he began his career as a clairvoyant and Reiki healer.

Today, about 70 per cent of his Reiki sessions are done online, but he also wants to teach in person in Phuket.

John is full of suprises. He's an honorary Aboriginal elder in his former home city Adelaide. His healing powers have helped young offenders, cancer patients and a diverse range of people from many backgrounds all over the world.

He once "sensed" one of his female clients would come into a six figure sum of money.

A few weeks later he received a bizarre phone call from an anonymous and hysterical woman screaming down the line.

"I told her to calm down and phone back. She did, and it turned out it was my client. Her brother had just won £ 3.7 million on the lottery. He gave her half a million...she then started screaming again," he said.

Chef Puwin's career started at age 16 with no experience in cooking but plenty of passion.

"I always found the art of cooking fascinating. I was born and raised in a Chinese-Hainanese family, and cooking is what we are known for.

I grew up seeing family members that were good at cooking and I wanted to carry on my family's heritage," said Chef Puwin.

"My passion for cooking led me to apply for a job at Narai Hotel in Bangkok when I was 16 years old. Back then, in 1969, there were no cooking schools in Thailand. If you wanted to learn about cooking, you had to learn it from a big hotel," he said.

"There were not many five-star

hotels in Bangkok back then either, but the Narai Hotel was one of the few. I first worked as a trainee chef and learnt much during my time there. I have to thank the executive chef at that time who give me such a valuable opportunity," he added.

Chef Puwin worked in many departments of the hotel, gaining a lot of experience.

"From trainee chef, I was promoted to Coffee Cook with my main responsibility to prepare all the hot beverages for the coffee breaks for the conferences held at the hotel," said Chef Puwin.

After doing that for two years, I moved to the Cold Kitchen section, where I learnt all about salads. I didn't know much about vegetables and herbs from western countries because we only had local vegetables in the market. Carrots, beetroots and rosemary were things I had never even seen until I started working there," he added.

"I worked for the Narai Hotel for 7 years and experienced all parts of the kitchen – cold, hot, and bakery before moving to work in Pattaya. Then I was contracted to a hotel in Saudi Arabia. I decided to go, because I wanted to experience another country," he said.

After that one great door opened, there were many other paths available to Chef Puwin.

"I worked in Saudi Arabia for two years then returned to Bangkok before being contacted by a hotel in Japan. From Japan, I eventually came back to work in Thailand," explained Chef Puwin.

"At this point I was a Sous Chef. I felt it was time for me to give something back, so I offered to teach cooking at some career training centers. I had had so many experiences that I wanted to share with others interested in the culinary arts," said Chef Puwin.

Although proud of all the things he did in his life, there was one experience he will never forget. He was the first Thai Chef to prepare a meal for Michael Jackson. The hotel he worked for in Bangkok had a Chef Exchange Program, and he was in Malaysia when Michael Jackson held a world tour concert

Cooking may seem like just the food preparation for some, but Chef Puwin sees it differently. "For me, cooking is more like art. Being a chef back in 1970 taught me one important thing: we didn't add

MSG or other artificial ingredients back then. The food tasted good, because we added one special ingredient: heart," said Chef Puwin.

"It's like eating the food my mother prepared. She prepared all the meals with heart, making sure everything she added was good and healthy. I feel the same way when I prepare food. Besides all the fresh ingredients and high quality products I use. I always make sure that I prepare every dish as if I were cooking for my own family. I guess you can call it as 'food from the heart'," he explained.

"Hygienic, fresh ingredients are also another key to my cooking. My signature dish is fusion seafood. I have added the taste of Thai food and twisted it with some western ingredients. My salmon steak is the most exceptional dish," he beams.

Tortured Hemingway

PAUL Hendrickson, a veteran journalist at times we have lost all sense of who the the Washington Post, has written books on people involved in the Vietnam war and the civil rights movement. His first book, Seminarian, is a favorite of mine because I was a Catholic seminarian too and emphasize with

his insights about the long-term effects such rigorous training has on character.

His latest book is Hemingway's Boat

(Alfred A Knopf, New York, 2011, 530pp). Hendrickson uses the famous writer's 38foot fishing boat, Pilar, as a scaffolding to erect a sympathetic narrative about Ernest's tortured life. The subtitle is "Everything He Loved in Life, and Lost, 1934-1961" and the cover photo is of a mid-thirties Hemingway at sea, bare-chested, rod and reel in hand, grinning off to the side.

For all many dreary academic tomes on Ernest Hemingway, Hendrickson's point is that the writer's great joy was fishing, especially for marlin, and this often brought out the best in him. Hendrickson sums up his purpose in the prologue:

"Ernest Hemingway has been examined by so many scholars and memoirists and respected biographers and hangers-on and pretenders and doctoral students desperate for a dissertation topic that I feel someman really was. It's as if each new Hemingway book by each new Hemingway "expert" wishes to contradict the last, which is one reason why I have been determined to try to anchor a Hemingway narrative, to

> ground it, in something that once existed in the world that still exists in its way just as he had once existed in the world. Indeed, I hoped to find

people who were once on that boat, who had had their own deep relationship with her, and tell their stories, too. And I have found them, both the living and the dead."

He devotes entire chapters to two: Arnold Samuelson and Walter Houk.

In 1934, just out of college and infatuated with Hemingway, Samuelson turns up at Hemingway's door in Key West and winds up spending a year crewing on his new boat in Key West and Cuba. At his death five decades later, an eccentric loner in a small Texas town, Samuelson left behind an admiring memoir of his year with Hemingway and Hendrickson eagerly plumbs it for a portrait of the man in his prime.


A young American diplomat in Havana in 1951, Walter Houk was the fiancée of Hemingway's secretary Nita Jensen. Hemingway hosted their wedding and

showed them much kindness. Hendrickson came across articles that Houk had written for specialist journals and interviewed him many times at his retirement home in California. Here is Houk on Hemingway:

"It was a hugely positive experience to be around him, for those several years in the fifties, getting to go out on his boat and all the rest. . . He wanted to help us out with our lives. The vultures have long ago gathered around the Hemingway corpse and rendered their judgment. But their judgment's wrong; at least it's incomplete. I don't think the terrible vile side defines him; It was a facet of his character. He was a

great man with great faults. We should not allow the faults to overshadow the accomplishments . . . He's Gulliver surrounded by Lilliputians. He threatens all the little academics sitting at their computers. Somehow or other you've got to try to help rescue him from all that."


Hendrickson mentions that Houk had often urged him "to try to help rescue Hemingway from his seemingly set-in-stone image of immortal writer and immortal bitch of a human being".

To some extent he succeeds. But he also uses Pilar and "the fisherman" as an excuse, amid gaudy rhetorical flourishes, to wander down many an exotic pathway. He often makes a fool of himself as much as the academic pedants whom he mocks.

Meandering, self-indulgent and much too long, Hemingway's Boat still, from time to time, brings forth the real man behind the myth: the fishing captain happy at the helm of the flying bridge of Pilar. And for that we should be grateful.

The Legend of Dark Fiber

DARK Fiber is every telecom executive's nightmare. "When the internet works, fiber optic cables light up but when it is down or is unused it is known as 'dark fiber' and that's not good news." says Gary Crause. He's an ex- telecoms expert whose office, at the entrance of Boat Lagoon, is next to Telecom company 3BB where rolls of dark cable are stored. But that is not the the dark fiber of our story.

Gary is also known as Dr Fugly and he has a dark secret – he creates disco music in his spare time with Boy@Heart and BB Queen, known collectively as Dark Fiber and our story is about them and their lair which is called Legend Music.

Gary Crause, his wife Debbie and their son Blaze relocated to Phuket two years ago from Johannesburg, South Africa, bringing with them the Legend Music name which encompasses the studio, publishing company and record label.

The Dark Fiber project started just over a year ago when local songstress Bonnie Anderson came in to make a blues record.

At about that time Donna Summer (Yes, the real Donna Summer) booked the studio for rehearsals, which prompted Gary to write some songs for her on the off chance she would ask for some.

"Bonnie's blues recordings did not really gel nor did some jazz stuff we did but I really loved Bonnie's voice so we called her in to sing a disco song called *I Love To Dance* on the demo that we would present to Donna Summer," said Gary.

Although Donna Summer did not come into the studio in person her entire entourage arrived in an articulated lorry. They stripped down the studio and replaced it with their own equipment including lighting and two huge consoles. Twelve hours later they all left and went on to play at The Amanpuri with The Pointer Sisters.

"Meanwhile I had been working with an Estonian DJ called Triim laying down disco tracks. She wanted to record *House Of The Rising Sun* with Bonnie and when Triim left the island we found we had two disco songs on our hands," said Gary

At about this time, songwriter and sound engineer Rob Cooke noticed the Legend Music sign and walked in through the door guitar in hand. Up until this point the band project was called BB Queen and Dr Fugly but obviously with the addition of Rob they needed a new name for both the band and for Rob who became Boy@Heart.

Dark Fiber was a name Gary had wanted to use for a long time as a song title. Rob and Gary both come from a telecoms background and were familiar with the negative telecoms' dark fiber which but Bonnie also thought the name sounded cool and mysterious.

Together the trio recorded an album called *Fibrate*, on Legend's own label, which they define as Indie Disco music. It is available on iTunes and ReverbNation where it currently holds the number one spot for Phuket.

Gary believes that most music is downloaded nowadays and has focused on this emerging global market. Even the album's artwork is specifically designed for PCs and MP3 players, and in keeping with the digital trend some music is available in two formats; a long version and a radio edit (available for free download).

Through social media Dark Fiber now has a massive international presence and is, for example, very popular in Gary's old stomping ground of South Africa.

However, they often need to put their own music project on hold while they deal with paying clients such as Pat Savage, who recently released *Wind and Fire*, touted as being "the best biker record ever made,"

The six-piece Torgney Sandgren blues band from Sweden also recorded a live album at the studio before last year's Phuket International Blues Festival.

Another success story is that of 13-yearold PIA student, Teisha Jones, who came in to Legend to record some cover versions, but had some half-songs of her own she was working on. She left with five original songs on a demo and an AR contact in Australia, where she now lives with her family.

Gary is pleased with the amount of talented musicians on the island, many of whom can be called in at a moment's notice, such as when he recently recorded the anthem *Shine A Loving Light* to aid Japanese tsunami victims.

The studio is not only about recording music, however. When Phuket-based film-maker Shane Magnier needed a song for the soundtrack of his recent film *Perfect Day*, he turned to Gary. The film, featuring Irish actors Patrick Bergin (*Patriot Games*) and Pat Kinevane (*King Arthur*) also needed

production work.

Another famous actor Liev Shreiver (*Wolverine, Salt*) booked the studio while here on holiday, to do sports voice overs for HBO. "This was very interesting as we used a plug-in called Source-Connect that enabled us to record simultaneously here in Phuket and in New York where the director was," says Gary.

But back to Dark Fiber and future projects. Gary tells us they are now working on a Dark Fiber Christmas single and a Dark Fiber version of *Shine A Loving Light*. They may they even leave their lair to bring Dark Fiber into the light by performing live and that is good news.



Thangchai explains that he moved to Phuket because he could only make 2,000 - 3.000 baht a month in Chiang Rai. Now he sends money back to his family every two weeks.

Thangchai explains that he works everyday of the week, usually from 2pm to 5am.

"I only work – everything is for the children," he said.


His daughter is five and talks to him on the phone when he calls home, while the newest member of Thongchai's family is a six-month old boy.

He hopes that both the girl and boy will attend law school.

Sometime this December Thangchai will be returning to Chiang Rai to bring his family to Phuket.

"I think they will be happy here. A family should stay together, not separate. Separate is no good," he said.

Thangchai explains he will have to work on the King's Birthday, December 5, but he will get to talk to his children on the phone.







LET'S face it, hotel management is not exactly rocket science, irrespective of what your friendly global hotel chain may say. Meet, greet, smile, provide a bed and a meal, and of course, don't forget to ask if your guest consumed anything from the minibar as they check out.

It is almost like having a rela-

tive or friend stay over at your own home, except don't expect Uncle Ned to tip you or harangue about the soggy Belgian waffles on TripAdvisor.

I do love the mini-bar analogy. One of my friends constantly uses it as an example of how hotels get things wrong, like that golden, memorable moment in time as you are about to leave the hotel – and suddenly it feels like a waterboarding session with some intelligence agency.

Hotels have been around

longer than airlines. Remember Jesus, Mary, and Joseph shacked up in that rustic desert eco-lodge many moons ago?

More than a few years ago airlines somehow managed to get the upper edge on innovation. Let's take what used to be called "yield management" but today is "revenue management". Same thing, different tag.

On airplanes, the last person to book a ticket pays the most,

while in hotels the late night arrival is likely to shell out the least. Airlines have long been champions of dynamic rates and religiously tracking supply demand and curves.

Hotels seem to be content with morning briefings. The only other enterprise I know who utilize this type of dawn group hug is the military and, com-

ing from the US, I won't comment ever they can. Of course there on this oxymoronic term "military intelligence".

Klong Krata reservoir project delayed by rain

WORK on Phuket's third major reservoir is behind schedule, but officials expect the Klong Krata project in Chalong to be completed on schedule by January next year.

Project engineer Nattakom Nookhom of the Region 15 Irrigation Office in Surat Thani said rain has put the work significantly behind schedule.

"According to the work schedule we should be near the half way mark, but actual construction is only at 39% due to intermittent rain, which continues to slow the excavation and grouting work now underway," he said.

"Anyway, we try to work as quickly as possible complete the project by scheduled completion date and I am sure we will do it in time," he said.

The construction contract is for 900 days, from August 10, 2010 to January 25, 2012.

The project, with a 449-million-baht budget from the Irrigation Department, comprises a earthen and rock dam 23 meters high and 927 meters across, a spillway, control room and other facilities.

Upon completion, the reservoir should be able to store about 4.1 million cubic meters of water. It will also be the first Irrigation Department reservoir in Muang District. Phuket's two existing large reservoirs are located in Kathu (Bangwad Reservoir) and Thalang (Bang Neaw Dum Reservoir).



The Provincial Water Authority hopes to eventually connect all three supply sources through a network of pipes in order to improve service in the areas under its jurisdiction, a consultant hired by the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization told the *Gazette* in October.

Acacia acinacea



ASK any Australian gardener about the Acacia and they will either look puzzled, or reply: "Aw, you mean a wattle, mate".

And they should know, because these ornamental trees come mostly from Oz. To confuse things further, the Acacia used to be classified in the genus of Mimosa, and in Mediterranean regions is still referred to by this name. In Thailand it is known as kratin-narong.

It is a huge genus, with over 1200 species of which 900 or so are natives of Australia."Rare Plants", a commercial web-site, sells more than fifty varieties.

Most wattles are large shrubs or small trees, so they fit nicely into our current category. But some are definitely not suitable for a Phuket garden, notably "thorn trees" of the African grasslands. Such trees

are characterized by flat-topped crowns, and spines so large and sharp they deter even the hungriest browser.

All pretty hardy, acacias are legumes, so they have the knack of producing their own nitrogen by taking it from the air and convert-

ing it to soil nitrogen, the most valuable of plant nutrients.

This means that acacias can not only survive in poor conditions, but can help improve soil quality, thus making them useful

for restoring vegetation on denuded

Not only are they useful, but they are also ornamental. Most varieties produce spectacular masses of small flowers densely crowded into globular heads, the

features the golden wattle.

stamens more conspicuous than the tiny petals.


When on display, they provide a brilliant show of golden yellow blossom. A few have white or cream inflorescences, but the vast majority are indeed golden. Unsurprisingly, they are much in

> demand among florists.

> Most Acacias come from subtropical and semi-arid regions, so they require well-drained soil. However, Phuket's fully exposed sun may be a bit much, so

planting in semi-shade is recommended. If you want to cultivate one in a pot, make sure there is sand in the mix.

Where to start? Acacia acinacea, more a shapely shrub than tree, has attractive arching



branches, and the familiar, dramatic globular heads of golden flowers. Hence its common reference in Australia, "gold-dust wattle". Acacia adunca is larger up to twenty feet tall with sweetly scented ballshaped flowers borne on long sprays. Smaller varieties include Amoena, which has pale yellow blooms on short but dramatic sprays, and the bushy cincinnata. Hickory wattle Buxifolia, or boxleaf wattle, occurs naturally along the eastern Australian coast, and is perhaps the most widely grown of all. Its grey-green foliage consists of many small leaflets.

But the variation in leaf shape throughout the genus is enormous, ranging from feathered to round and crescent shaped. Also varying is range of size from dwarf and prostrate to full-sized trees.

What all wattles do have in common is the capacity to produce bean-like seed pods; it is from these seeds that new saplings are normally propagated.

There are a few things to remember about Acacias. Most of them are fast growing, and in some environments, they have become invasive. Some are whoppers: the black wattle (decurrens) will reach fifty feet, Acacia mangium is bigger. So choose an acacia which will not end up dominating your garden. Unless, of course, you have a palatial acreage.

Wattles do not take kindly to hard pruning, since this causes gum exudation, and opens the way for insect and fungal attack. Leaf fall is more-or-less continuous. And bear in mind that these are shrubs and trees from dry environments. Over-watering is not something they appreciate. After all, like the rest of us, they will have to cope with the rainy season.



Tip of the week: Monsoon gardening

Phuket, by virtue of its topography has largely escaped flooding. But the impact on vegetation is marked.

Everywhere the soil is thoroughly saturated. Trees are making more and more leaves, and garden plants are lush and green, especially those grown primarily for their foliage.

But many shrubs are not blooming as freely as usual, namely, oleanders and bougainvilleas, as well as such potted plants as euphorbias (crown of thorns), adeniums (desert rose) and pereskias (wax rose).

Remember to reduce watering to a minimum, especially with potted specimens. If the mix in your

containers is already moist, leave well alone.

And empty excess water from the saucer under the pot. Remember that container plants are more likely to die from sodden soil which encourages root rot than from under-watering.

AT AROUND noon last Sunday, Tim Haddon with his son Thomas, crossed the Laguna PhuketTriathlon finish line and was engulfed by a rapturous and emotional welcome from dedicated Tri Tim supporters.

Witnessing the scene, one couldn't help but feel a sense of pride. For here is a father and a husband who has suffered two heart attacks, lives with type II diabetes and has achieved a goal that many thought impossible.

The goal that Tim and Darren Hancock, general manager of Royal Phuket Marina gym, set wasn't just to finish the LPT, but to drastically improve one life in the hope that oth-

ers may be inspired to change their lives, no matter how negative their situation seems.

Speaking to the Gazette on Mon-

day at RPM's Les Anges restaurant, both Tim and Darren were understandably elated, but even with the success of their journey so far there was an air of "this isn't finished – this is just the start".

"I really can't believe the race is over. I have done what I had set out to do. It was the best weekend of my life," said Tim.

"However, it wasn't just about the race. Finishing the LPT was a vindication of the time and effort invested in the lead up to it. It was all these hours of training that have improved my health and now constitute a lifestyle change. Importantly, that change has become sustainable which was always the focus" added Tim.

Darren explained that the process of extracting Tim from his sedentary lifestyle was difficult, but once he understood how and why diet and exercise pieced together, a dedicated student appeared.

"He really didn't comprehend why he was training. At the start, he would put in the hours hoping for results to come out of nowhere.

I knew he had to be educated about exercise and life," said Darren.

Tim agreed that he didn't know what he was doing at the start, but now admits he can be heard discussing diets and training techniques – even offering exercise advice to people.

There were those that didn't believe Tim could finish a triathlon nor understood why he chose to put himself under such pressure both physically and mentally by publiscizing his progress.

Darren explained that these pressures also played on his mind at the beginning.

"It wasn't that I knew Tim could do it - he needed to do it, and that became part of his self-

> drive. He needed change his life before his life stopped," said

Darren. "I spoke to

Debbie Dionysius before we began the Tri Tim project I was concerned that the whole of Phuket following his training may have had an adverse effect," said Darren.

Tim was quick to interject at this point with his reasoning as to why having his preparations made public knowledge helped in a way.

"Fear is a wonderful motivator. Fear of failing got me up in the morning and drove me to keep my training schedule. Knowing I had people supporting me was fantastic, but that fear of those that doubted I could succeed being proved right was also a powerful incentive," Tim said.

Thousands have participated in the LPT over its 18 year history and many don't get to enjoy the scenic aspect of the course. But Tim's race was different. After all the hours of training and as the big day was beckoned, Tim's mind set was to enjoy the experience.

"I had no idea where I'd be in terms of my preparation, but on the eve of the race I thought to myself, 'it doesn't get better than this' and I wanted to get out on the start line," Tim remembers.

"The swim course was fine, despite looking up a few times and feeling the markers weren't getting closer. I loved the bike course. I didn't stop once and was talking to people during the ride," Tim said through a big grin.

The strategy and timing was perfect. Darren indicated the last rest phase and from there Tim jogged home joined by his son for the last stretch while Darren peeled off to let his charge enjoy the celebrations.

Watching Tim cross the line with his son was an amazing feeling," Darren said.

Tim completed the LPT in just over five and a half hours, but he is certain that can be improved.

"I could have gone harder, but there was no point in murdering myself. I just enjoyed the encouragement people shouted out to me. I finished second last in my age group so you can be as bad as I am, but cross the finish line and celebrate. Its a fantastic community. Who wouldn't want to be involved in that everyday," enthused Tim.

So what's next for Tri Tim and Darren Hancock? Tim suggested that come February, Darren will be out trawling for his next victim for change by triathlon.

For Tim, the triathlon bug has well and truly got hold.

"I really want to get out there again soon. If I could join a team and do the swim course for the Ironman 70.3 (December 4), I'd get on that ferry and do it all again. I really want to be part of the Ironman event," said Tim.

Tim's life has completely changed for the good and he can call himself a triathlete. He may not be where he dreams of being now that his aspirations have grown, but he never dreamed of being where he is today.

Final words from Triathlete Tim. "I'll tell you right here that next year I'm going to break the five hour mark - and you can quote me on that."

Sport Sport Legends reign at LPT

ITALIAN Massimo Cigana successfully defended his 2010 Laguna Phuket Triathlon (LPT) title on Sunday making him the first man to win three times at the "Race of Legends".

Anative of Venice, Cigana sauntered across the finish line in a time of 02:32:51 which was 2 minutes and 35 seconds faster than his 2010 winning time, but 1 minute and 5 seconds slower than his winning time in 2007.

Coming out of the water in 11th place and nearly three and half minutes behind the leaders, Cigana showed his strength in the saddle and ripped past the field to start his run over six minutes ahead of the chasing athletes.

The gap on Cigana was closed by only two minutes by the time he crossed the line after the 12km run for his history making third title.

Speaking to the Phuket Gazette, a very composed Cigana expressed satisfaction with his race.

"My bike split time (01:18:46) was good and that's where I needed to make the difference. My ankle injury didn't flare up on the run, so I'm very happy to have won my third title," he said.

Alberto Cassadei was in first place after the 1.8km swim which he completed in 24 minutes and 21 seconds. However, he dropped into second after Cigana powered

past him on the bike course and held the runners-up place finishing four minutes behind his compatriot in a time of 02:36:56.

Romain Guillame from France pushed Cassadei all the way to the line, but couldn't close the gap, taking third in all three disciplines and third overall 12 seconds behind the Italian in a time of 02:37:0.

Radka Vodickova of the Czech Republic would won her second title in a time of 02:54:18 ahead of Belinda Granger of Australia who finished in 02:57:33. Katja Rabe of Germany finished in third with a time of 02:59:17.

Granger also hoped to achieve another victory to become a three-time champion having won in 2010 and 2008. Vodickova, the 2009 LPT champion and a member of her Czech Olympic team, found Granger keeping pace during the swim early stages of the bike course before pulling away to finish three minutes ahead at the finish.

Amateur Cindi Bannick of the USA had a race to remember, snatching fourth place and top amateur position in the women's field with a time of 3:00:15 - just one second ahead of Italian professional Edith Niederfriniger.

Jaray Jearani of Phuket, the first Thai to compete at both the Ironman 70.3 and Ironman World Championships, finished 28th in a time of 2:59:38. Nampetch Porntharukchairoen was the first Thai female to finish in a time of 3:57:37.

Phuket's Ironman 70.3 brings in the champs

CURRENT Ironman 70.3 World Champion Melissa Rollison will participate in the Ironman 70.3 Asia-Pacific Championship at Laguna Phuket on December 4 – in addition to a stellar line-up of elite professional triathletes heading to the island.

Rollison, of Australia, completed her first Ironman 70.3-distance race in September 2010 and in just 12 months, has gone on to claim three 70.3 series titles, as well as the prestigious World Championship trophy.

A former steeplechase runner, Rollison took up cycling to maintain her fitness during bouts of running-related injuries. This inevitably led to her first triathlon.

Rollison finished third in last year's inaugural Asia-Pacific Championship race, but her World Ironman 70.3 winner and talented Championship title-win in September in Las Vegas proves she is a force to be reckoned with.

She is set to face off against reigning champion Caroline Steffen of Switzerland who has confirmed she will be coming back to Phuket to defend her 2010 title. More than 950 athletes, including 31 pros and nine relay teams, are now registered for the Ironman 70.3 Asia-Pacific Championship.

Other international pros that will compete for top honors include 2011 Laguna Phuket Triathlon champions Massimo Cigana of Italy and Australia's Belinda Granger;2011 Ironman 70.3 world champion runner-up Chris Lieto; 10-time Ironman New Zealand Champion Cameron Brown; 2011

up-and-comer Paul Matthews; and 2010 ITU Long Distance World Champion Silvain Sudrie.

Professional athletes will compete for a slice of the US\$75,000 prize purse, as well as 30 qualifying slots for the 2012 Ford Ironman World Championship in Kailua-Kona, Hawaii and 45 slots for the 2012 Marine Corps Ironman 70.3 World Championship in Las Vegas.

The Asia-Pacific Championship at Laguna is one of only a small number of worldwide Ironman 70.3 triathlons offering 2012 Kona and Las Vega slots for winners of age group categories.Laguna Triathlon Director, Debbie Dionysius, says, "We're thrilled to have such a star-studded line-up at this year's Ironman 70.3 Asia-Pacific Championship. - Phuket Gazette

Fellow Hong Kong racer Sam Chan also returns on his TP52 *FreeFire*, looking to improve on his third-place overall finish last year.

Missing from the starting lineup, however, is defending champion Ray Roberts and his Evolution Racing crew.

ors from around the world to compete at Kata Beach in Asia's largest regatta.

With strong representation from ASEAN and a growing number of sailors from China taking part, more than 35 nationalities will race in a diverse fleet of craft, dinghies take to the start line on from Olympic classes to kiteboards to the super-high tech "grand prix" racing boats.

Famed for being Asia's largest big boat regatta, the King's Cup was founded in 1987 with a mixed fleet of dinghies, boards and keelboats. "The Regatta" began as a special tribute to His Majesty the King's Fifth Cycle, or 60th birthday," said Kevin Whitcraft, President of the Organizing Committee of the Phuket King's Cup Regatta.

"It has grown to become the Series has grown from strength-

tested sailing event in Asia. Phuket King's Cup competitors enjoy champagne sailing conditions, the beautiful Andaman Sea backdrop, a series of exciting race locations and the famous beachfront parties."

2011 expects to see up to 50 December 3 for a three-day series. Joining them on December 5 will be more than 100 keelboats and multihulls, plus for the very first time 20 kiteboards. The total sailing fleet is expected to be over 170 water-going vessels.

The dinghies will race over three days, from December 3-5, and the keelboats, multihulls and kiteboards will race over five days on December 5-7, 9 and 10, with the Thursday being a reserve day.

In 2009, dinghies were reintroduced to the regatta lineup after a hiatus. This led the Organizing Committee to create the Phuket Dinghy Series in 2010 – a threeevent series preceding the Phuket King's Cup Regatta. The Dinghy

For the first time in the Cup's history, the organizers, together with the Kiteboard Tour Asia, have introduced a Kiteboard Class this year. An invitation-only class for 20 kiteboarders, the regatta welcomes pros from the world tour as well as several regional champions, including two-time Asian Champion Narapichit "Yo" Pudla from Thailand.

"Our Quarter Centenary year sees the widest diversity in terms of registered vessels taking part in the Regatta," explained Whitcraft. "2011 will comprise catamarans, keelboats, kiteboards, dinghies and international racing boats all competing for honors across racing and cruising categories.

"It is a testament to the extraordinary appeal of this classic race that we see such a broad mix of entrants for the Phuket King's Cup. The regatta also connects people from across the world, with representatives from every continent taking part," he - Phuket Gazette
