Saving Nai Yang beach

PHUKET Provincial Land Chief Sithichai Promachati expressed his concern at the lack of progress and general decline in efforts to prevent land encroachment during a Phuket Provincial Government Land Encroachment Solution Committee meeting on December 6.

"I would like to bring the Nai Yang beach encroachment issue to the attention of this meeting because it has become so prevalent that during a recent visit, I could barely see the beach," he said.

Chief Sithichai went onto request that the committee support his intention to maintain a clear area from the road to Nai Yang beach.

"I will authorize the use of law enforcement against those who encroach into this protected area. But, I can't do it all myself. I would ask you all to act together to bring back public properties," Chief Sithichai added.

victim left stranded A RUSSIAN tourist suffered multiple breaks to his leg and a fractured pelvis when his leg was sliced open by a parasail speed-

boat off Kata Beach last Friday. Nikolai Nefedov, 52, now faces escalating medical bills that have jeopardized his scheduled return home.

Mr Nefedov, and witnesses, said he was snorkeling with friends in shallow waters when he was run over by a parasail speedboat used to tow thrill-seeking tourists.

The Russian tried to dive under to avoid being hit, but was struck in the leg by the propeller, sustaining multiple broken bones and deep lacerations.

The driver of the speedboat stopped and ferried him ashore, before promptly fleeing the scene.

"All I could remember was that the number of the speedboat was N18," he told the Gazette from his room at Vachira Phuket Hospital on Wednesday.

Mr Nefedov, who does not speak English, was sharing the room at the government-run hospital with 30 other patients. He was transferred to the facility after learning that his treatment at the privately-run Phuket Interna-

tional Hospital would not be covered by his insurance provider, the Russian arm of international underwriter ERV.

Despite the severity of his injuries, Mr Nikolai was cleared to

leave the hospital on Thursday to catch his return flight to Russia but only after his bill was paid. Mr Nefedov had hoped his tour

company and travel insurance provider would come to his rescue, but as this edition went to print time was fast running out.

An officer with the Vachira Phuket International Department told the Gazette on Wednesday, "The doctors have cleared him to fly out tomorrow, but only if he flies lying down the whole way and is accompanied by medical staff.

"His left leg is broken in many places and his pelvis is broken as well," she said.



Sak Tanchaikul announced on December 1 – World AIDS Day. "This year the slogan is 'Get-

ting to Zero'," said Dr Sak. He pointed out that the top 10 provinces in Thailand for contracting the disease were, respectively, Phayao, Chanthaburi, Phuket, Samut Prakarn, Kanjanaburi, Singburi, Ranong, Srisaket, Ayudhaya and Bangkok.

"The Health Office and other government departments are holding activities to educate people about AIDS and other sex-communicable diseases - and about condom usage," said Dr Sak.

Officials conducted publicawareness activities at three popular locations in and around Phuket Town, he said. Patong Municipality held activities on Soi Bangla, at the Jungceylon shopping complex and other places around Patong. Municipal officers

handed out condoms and leaflets to educate people - Thais and foreigners – so they realize how important safe sex is, said Dr Sak.

Phuket HIV/Aids rate

The health chief pointed out that, at least according to statistics, the incidence of AIDS was on the decline in Phuket, though he added that the most at-risk group were

people 25 to 39 years old.

"According to a report compiled from data from government and private agencies, from 1989 to November 30 this year 7,393 people in Phuket have been reported as having HIV.

"Of those, 1,936 people have died," he said.

Thai Army provide boat for deported Rohingya

THE 95 Rohingya migrants detained by elements of the 2nd Infantry Battalion after landing on Koh Phra Thong, Phang Nga, on November 24, have been deported in a boat provided by the Royal Thai Army, the *Phuket Gazette* has been told.

After they being detained by the military, the migrants were mustered on the Tung Laong Pier, before being transported to the 25th Military Unit facility, Rattanarangson Camp in Ratchakud District, Ranong province.

On November 25, all 95 Rohingya were escorted back to the Andaman coast.

A military source involved in the deportation told the Gazette, "As per standard procedure, we kept them for only one night and then we escorted them back to the Andaman Coast the next day.

"We felt bad for this group but there was nothing much we could do. However, we provided them with enough food and water to last for 10 days.

"We also gave them 60 baht each. I realize it's not much, but it was the best we could do," he said.

"As is usual in these circumstances, after landing the Rohingya damaged the boat they had travelled in to prevent being repatriated," said the source.

"We are aware of the practice of migrants [damaging] the boat on arrival. So this time we donated

a boat with a motor so they could continue their journey," he said.

"We also provided enough gasoline for them to reach their destination," he said, though declining to name where the Rohingya said their intended destination was.

The Rohingya were towed out to sea and released "on the water", said the source.

He added that the migrants were not returned to Myanmar territorial waters because "they are not welcome there".

He said could not divulge any more information, such as whether or not the Rohingya were released on the open ocean or escorted elsewhere. "It is a matter of national security," he said.

Phuket Prison population to plummet 10%

PHUKET: More than 200 inmates at Phuket Provincial Prison will soon be back on the streets following the Royal Pardon decreed by His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej on the occasion of his 84th birthday on December 5.

Phuket Provincial Prison Director Rapin Nichanon said prison officials were still reviewing the paperwork and could not give an exact figure on how many inmates would be released by the pardon. However, he was sure that the final figure would exceed 200.

The mass pardon could not have come at a better time for the prison facility. The current Phuket Prison population is at an all-time high of about 1,700 inmates, he said.

This is far more than double its design capacity of 700.

A release of 200 prisoners would represent an 11.7 per cent drop in the prison population.

The first batch of 143 pardoned inmates will walk out of the 109year-old facility between 8am and 9am on Thursday, said chief Rapin.

No appeal in Fanelli case

THE Phuket Public Prosecutor's Office will not file an appeal over the sentence handed down in the case of convicted murderer Ronald Fanelli, the Gazette has learned.

Fanelli, a former US Navy officer, was on November 1 convicted of the June 2010 stabbing murder of Wanphen Pienjai, a hostess at the Sweethearts Bar in Kata.

Fanelli was sentenced to 20 years' imprisonment on charges of premeditated murder and an additional six months for trying to conceal Ms Pienjai's body.

Given his confession, the Court halved the sentence to 10 years and three months, as is customary in the Thai judicial system.

The prosecution and defense teams were both given until December 1 to appeal. Despite earlier indications that the prosecution would appeal for a stiffer sentence, Phuket Deputy Public Prosecutor Permgiart Bunsung said that the decision had been made to let the sentence stand.

Mr Permgiart, who prosecuted the case, said he has been informed by Fanelli's lawyer that

she would not appeal the guilty verdict.

The case file has now been forwarded to Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha for final approval, he said.

"If he approves our decision not to appeal, the case will be closed and Fanelli will serve the 10 year, three month sentence.

"If he does not approve, the case will be forwarded to the At-

torney General's Office in Bangkok for a final ruling," he said.

"The decision now rests with the governor, who is not subject to any deadline," he said.

Mr Permgiat explained that the Public Prosecutor must have the governor's approval in every case that the prosecutors do not want to appeal, no matter how trivial the case may be.

If Governor Tri approves, Fanelli will serve the 10 years. 3 months, minus time already served. This works out to a release date in mid-October 2020.

The Gazette has thus far been unable to reach Fanelli's lawyer to get a comment on whether Mr Fanelli would seek a transfer from the overcrowded Phuket Prison to another facility in Thailand, or to try and seek deportation to serve out his sentence in the US.

Transfer out of Phuket Prison would likely be welcomed by Fanelli. During a brief interview shortly before the ruling, he told the Gazette that he had survived an attempt on his life as he slept in his overcrowded dormitory.

During the interview he said he was getting "more and more used to" prison life with each passing day, but that he had a lot of "headaches", mostly from other foreign inmates.

Asked about the overcrowding problem, he said he had respect for the wardens who had to do their best to deal with every convict assigned to the facility by the Court.

"They don't know what the solution is. Nobody does," he said.

Marine Office to set up water safety center

THE Phuket Marine Department office will step up inspections at piers and marinas on the island to boost tourist safety during the upcoming New Year holiday period.

Phuripat Theerakulpisut, chief of the Marine Department Region 5 office, said his agency expects a large influx of tourists over the upcoming holiday period and will also open a water safety center at his agency's office in Wichit.

The inspections will include popular ferry piers, such as those at Chalong Bay, Rassada Harbor, Klong Thajeen, Ao Por, Bangrong and the Boat Lagoon, he said.

Officers will be looking for violations of safety regulations and ways to improve transport efficiency to outlying islands such as

It is not only the fault of the speedboat driver, but the city authorities as well who cannot for some reasons set up some conditions or restrictions for jet-skis and speedboats near the beaches.

"The [issue] is not to punish the [speedboat] driver, but to prevent such accidents from happening again, so that all people – including tourists – can relax without having to worry about their health."

As such, any legal action against the speedboat operator will have to begin with a criminal complaint filed on behalf of Mr Nefedov, who will hardly be in

condition any time soon to make the trip to Chalong Police Station to file the complaint himself. Daughter Ilya also expressed concern about where her mother would stay after missing her return flight to stay at the hospital by her husband's side.

To see if there had been any progress in apprehending the operator of "Speedboat N18" or asking him to help pay the Russian's mounting medical bills, the *Gazette* visited Chalong Police Station, which has jurisdiction over Kata Beach.

A check of the incident report book for December 2 revealed no report of an accident at Kata Beach that day.

Teens arrested for stabbing, robbing

AUSTRIAN tourist Rupert Wilhelmstatter is recovering from a punctured lung and other injuries sustained in a brutal robbery attack by four knife-wielding youths in Patong on Tuesday.

Mr Wilhelmstatter, in his early 50s, was returning by motorbike to his hotel in Patong at 1:45pm when the attack occurred. He was returning from Paradise Beach, at the southern end of Patong Bay.

The gang members, on two motorbikes, approached the Austrian with one bike on each side.

The youngest gang member, aged 13, kicked out at Mr Wilhelmstatter's motorbike, causing him to crash. Mr Wilhelmstatter fought back from the ground, but was stabbed and suffered a punctured lung. The gang then robbed him of 200 baht before making their getaway.

Mr Wilhelmstatter was taken to Patong Hospital for emergency

treatment, then transferred to the better-equipped Bangkok Hospital in Phuket Town. A source at the privately-run facility confirmed Mr Wilhelmstatter is in the intensive care unit, but declined to give further details.

Police investigating the incident did not need to travel far to make the first arrests. At an address on Ratchapatanusorn Road, just around the corner from Patong Police Station, they arrested two youths aged 13 and 14 at about 5:30pm.

A search of the premises revealed a sheathed knife and one motorbike, both items suspected of being used in the robbery. After eyewitnesses to the attack identified the two boys, the teens were taken to Patong Police Station.

The information obtained during questioning led to the arrest of a third youth, aged 15, at a house on Thaweewong Road, where police recovered the other motorbike believed to have been used in the attack.

A fourth member of the gang, the one believed to have stabbed Mr Wilhelmstatter, remains atlarge.

Subsequent questioning of the gang members revealed they had been involved in at least two other recent robberies using similar methods.

A 13-year-old member of the gang confessed that on November 30 he and four others robbed a tourist near Tri Trang Beach on

Muen Ngern Road, not far from the location of Tuesday's attack. At about 5:30pm that day, he and an older boy struck an unidentified foreign man with a wooden club, forcing him off his motorbike. They then threatened him with a knife, robbing him of 200 baht before speeding off.

The boy also confessed that on the afternoon of December 3 he and four others drove motorbikes to Paradise Beach where they attacked two tourists aboard a single motorbike. They robbed the pair at knife-point, getting away with a camera, a smart phone and 7,000 baht in cash.

The 13-year-old admitted to kicking or hitting the tourists to force them from their motorbikes, but denied stabbing Mr Wilhelmstatter.

The youths spent the 200 baht taken from Mr Wilhelmstatter to buy snacks, he said.

Yacht Haven staff praised for averting marina blaze

HEROIC action by staff at the had not been seated long when Yacht Haven Marina has been praised for minimizing the damage to surrounding vessels by towing a 70-foot power boat on fire safely out to deeper water on Tuesday night.

No injuries were reported. Australian yachtsman Mark Ainscough who witnessed the events recounted, "It was opening night for the new owners of the Haven Restaurant, that overlooks Yacht Haven Marina... We



another boat owner explained there was a boat on fire on D Jetty.

"Ten minutes later we saw a huge tower of flames and black smoke. It appeared to be getting out of control and looked like it would spread to neighboring boats at any moment. We were all getting ready to throw the lines and get out, as fire can travel fast along floating timber jetties.

Urgent call for foreign blood

THE Phuket Regional Blood Center is urgently calling for blood donations from foreigners to restock supplies of blood types common among foreigners.

"We are asking for Rh-negative blood because this is the tourism high season. Many foreigners come to Phuket at this time of year, and each year many of them are involved in accidents. They will need this blood," said Pornthip Rattajak, acting director of the center.

Specifically, the Phuket Blood Bank is looking for donations of blood types: O-negative, A-negative and AB-negative.

"To boost the number of donations by foreigners, the Phuket Immigration Office will host a special blood donation drive on December 7.

Donations will be accepted from 9am to 3pm.

Land grab in spotlight

Government Spokesman Prompong returns to inspect mangrove encroachment

PHEU Thai Party spokesman and party list MP Prompong Nopparit, who is also the vice president of the parliamentary anti-corruption committee, returned to Phuket last Saturday to inspect alleged encroachment on a protected mangrove forest in Rassada.

The inspection visit follows Mr Prompong heading a public meeting at Phuket Rajabhat University on November 26.

At the meeting, Mr Prompong vowed to bring to Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra's attention the serious cases of encroachment on government land, notably cases that officials have failed to act on.

At the mangrove forest site in Rassada, Mr Prompong was shown a large sign posted at the site highlighting the areas claimed to be owned by a person who was identified only as a "local politician".

To indicate the lack of action by officials over the years, underneath the the map on the sign are the words "5 Governments, 4 Governors, 3 District Chiefs, 1 Land Office Chief".

"The local villagers reported this case to the Administrative

Court in Nakhon Sri Thammarat, but there has still been no action," said Mr Prompong.

"I believe this case involves many departments and the investigation process will take a long time, but it is a good thing that local villagers are working together in order to have public land reclaimed," he said.

Anucha Ardhan, vice president

of Baan Kuku Mangrove Forest Conservation Group, has long asserted that the land in question was declared protected national forest in 1978. But in 2007 "some people" arrived and fenced off a more than 50 rai, posting signs saying: "Private Property, Do not enter."

The claim was made using a title deed naming a "local politician" as

the owner of the land since 1978, he said.

Frustrated by years of fighting for officials to reclaim the land, the villagers petitioned Her Majesty Queen Sirikit, who bestowed protection for much of the forest by deeming it protected under Royal Patronage.

However, today more than 29 rai of the forest remains fenced off as if it were private property, which Mr Anucha says has been cleared in the center, away from view from the fence.

"I have learnt from the local villagers that the land in this area cannot be legally owned by anyone," said Mr Prompong.

"The Land Office cannot issue a deed to anyone for land in national protected forests. Which means the document that the 'local politician' has was illegally issued," he added.

"I will address the issue at the Pheu Thai Party meeting and we will try to find the best solution to this problem. The illegal actions have to stop and I will not let those who break the law get away without any penalty," he added.

Police ramp up student road safety

OFFICERS at Kathu Police Station on Tuesday stepped up their campaign to have students at Kathu Witthaya School use the pedestrian bridge instead of risking life and limb by crossing the busy road in front of the school.

Tung Tong Police Superintendent Col Kraitong Chantongbai told the *Gazette* that nearly every day he receives reports of students being involved in accidents or narrowly escaping serious injuries while crossing the road.

"Ever since I moved to Tung Thong Police Station, I have continually received reports about students involved in accidents

while crossing the road under the bridge.

"We would like the students to use the bridge. It's much safer, especially when the school finishes and many people come to pick up the students," he said. The campaign is a collaborative effort by Tung Tong Police, Kathu Municipality and Kathu Witthaya School, Col Kraitong explained.

Aekachai Nulong, a teacher at Kathu Witthaya, said, "We have a new main gate at the school that is only about 10 meters from the pedestrian bridge."

"Also, we will have two teachers on duty standing at the new gate to make sure students use the bridge instead of crossing the road," he said.

Col Kraitong said Kathu Municipality has been requested to repaint and add a roof to the bridge to encourage students to use it.

Unidentified foreigner's body heading for the grave soon

THE body of the foreign man found floating in the sea south of Phuket last month will be buried at the Mai Khao Cemetery if it remains unidentified, the *Gazette* has been told.

The corpse is currently being held at Vachira Phuket Hospital in Phuket Town.

Tenured professor dies in tragic snorkling incident

UNIVERSITY of Massachusetts political science Associate Professor Jalal Alamgir, 41, has died after being pulled from the water while snorkeling at Yanui Beach last Saturday.

"Jalal Alamgir was a most gentle, perceptive, sensitive colleague and friend," the *Boston Globe* reported University of Massachusetts Winston Langley as saying in a statement.

"He was a devoted and creative teacher, who made the discipline of international relations not only understandable to students, but also pertinent to their daily concerns.

"He kept questions of social justice foremost in his scholarly and teaching contributions, and endeavored to make the third world, and Asia in particular, accessible and relevant not only to world politics but also to US policy," he said.

Prof Alamgir, a native of Bangladesh, received tenure at the



University last year. He earned a doctorate from Brown University in 2000 and studied democratization, the interaction between economic globalization and representational politics, international relations, South Asian politics, and

Jula Nontree, chief lifeguard for Kata, Karon, Nai Harn and Patong Beaches, told the *Gazette* he was notified of the incident at 2:50pm.

"When I arrived, lifeguards at Yanui Beach were already performing CPR on the man," he said.

"The lifeguards first saw him when he was being pulled from the water by two male tourists. They [the tourists] said they found the man floating face down while he was snorkeling," Mr Jula said.

An ambulance from the Phuket Tourist Rescue Center, based near Chalong Pier, arrived about 20 minutes later and rushed Prof Alamgir to Phuket International Hospital.

"I went with him in the ambulance. We continued CPR all the way to the hospital, but he did not regain consciousness [in the ambulance] and I could not detect a pulse from him without us continuing CPR," said Mr Jula.

Booze is 'critical' to Phuket: Poll


MORE than 57% of respondents to a *Phuket Gazette* poll said reasonably-priced alcohol is either "important" or even "critical" to Phuket as an international tourist destination.

The poll was launched in the wake of Phuket suffering a shortage of alcoholic beverages brought on after floods disrupted production facilities and operations of major producers and distributors of alcoholic drinks in Thailand.

Of the respondents, 28% voted reasonably priced alcohol was "critical", while 29.4% voted it as "important".

More than 25% said reasonably priced alcohol was not important as alcohol was only an add-on for people living in or on holiday in Phuket, and 17% said it was not important at all as many people enjoy Phuket without alcohol.

While 62% of both tourists and local foreign residents voted affordable booze as critical or important to Phuket, only 29% of Thai nationals who took part in the poll believed likewise.

Officials get rolling with Disabled People's Day

THE Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) held an event last Friday to mark International Day for Persons with Disabilities, observed by the United Nations and countries around the world on December 3.

"The day aims to promote a better understanding of disability issues with a focus on the rights of persons with disabilities and the gains to be derived from the integration of persons with disabilities into every aspect of the political, social, economic and cultural life of their communities," said Phuket Provincial Chief Administrative Officer Chaiwat Taepee.

To mark the occasion at the Phuket Rajabhat University grand hall yesterday, local government officers arranged a variety of activities, including exhibitions to educate people about disabled persons as well as providing assistance in law, careers, education and a mini-job fair.

Also available for disabled persons, their families, friends and visitors were free haircuts, a lucky draw and free food and drink for the entire day.

"Under our 'Phuket Care' program, we provide care for disabled persons and patients who have chronic diseases at their homes so they can have a better life, and we educate their families about how to take care of their loved ones correctly," he said.

"In 2011, we spent more than 10 million baht through the project on providing support for 450 patients in Phuket and providing devices that these patients can use," he added.

"We believe it is very important to look after these patients and give them opportunities," Mr Soratham said.

The United States criticises recent lese majeste rulings

THE United States says it is "troubled" by recent court rulings in Thailand, claiming sentences handed down to Thai citizens for *lese majeste* – insulting the monarchy – were at odds with the fundemental right to freedom of expression.

The unusual statement criticising the US's closest regional ally comes in the wake of a 20-year sentence handed down to 61-year-old grandfather Ampon Tangnoppakul on November 23.

Mr Ampon, was convicted under Article 112 of sending four text messages disparaging of Her Majesty the Queen to the cellphone of a secretary to former premier Abhisit Vejjajiva in May last year.

State Department spokeswoman for East Asia, Darragh Paradiso, said the United States had the utmost respect for the Thai monarchy, but added that the US was "troubled by recent prosecutions and court decisions that are not consistent with international standards of freedom of expression." In a recent statement, New York-based

rights watchdog Human Rights Watch condemned the verdict, calling the severity of the sentence "shocking".

The verdict "illustrates the misuse by successive Thai governments of laws intended to protect the monarchy," the group said.

"The new government seems to be responding to questions about its loyalty to the monarchy by filing countless *lese* *majeste* charges," said Brad Adams, Asia director at Human Rights Watch.

The current Pheu Thai Party-led government, affiliated with exiled former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra, has vowed to crack down hard on *lese majeste*. Mr Thaksin's critics have long accused him of being insufficiently loyal to the monarchy, leading analysts to suspect the new government is attempting to burnish its royalist credentials.

Bangkok dry by New Year

THE floods that have devastated huge swathes of Central Thailand in recent months are receding, with Bangkok expected to be completely dry by the end of the year.

Weera Wongsaengnak, head of the Flood Relief Operations Center (FROC)'s water drainage panel, said the crisis was nearly over, as there were fewer and fewer flooded areas.

Water in the northern and eastern parts of the capital was limited to designated flood-retention fields, he said.

Mr Weera admitted that the situation in western Bangkok remained worrying. The bowl-shaped area would take longer than east-



ern Bangkok to dry, while canals linking the area with the Tha Chin River still had high water levels.

Officials would try to dry the area by December 15, or by year's end at the latest, while the FROC would continue to hold weekly meetings to assess the water situation in affected provinces, he added.

Meanwhile, Deputy Prime Min-

ister and Commerce Minister Kittirat Na Ranong last week said more than 90% of factories shut down by the floods would resume operations by the end of December. Several of the country's largest industrial parks have been inundated, forcing the closure of facilities run by blue-chip firms including Toyota, Honda and Canon.

The World Bank has estimated that value of the damage at US\$45 billion, with recovery and reconstruction costing US\$25 billion.

Convicts receive a second chance

HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej pardoned 26,000 convicts in a traditional gesture marking his 84th birthday on December 5.

Former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra's name was notably not on the list of those being pardoned. Mr Thaksin lives in Dubai to escape a two-year jail sentence he received in 2008 for abuse of power in a land deal with his wife.

The government is believed to have considered drafting pardon criteria that would have benefited Mr Thaksin, but backed down after a strong outcry from the political opposition.

The royal decree was drawn up by the current government and based on one issued last year.

In a statement published in the *Royal Gazette*, His Majesty said the convicts should be given a second chance.




An inmate who hoped for a pardon.

Rein in the beach cowboys

GIVEN the events that have occurred in Phuket in recent weeks, it is difficult to ascertain which is the greater maritime threat: natural phenomena such as the rough monsoon season seas that claim the lives of scores of overconfident swimmers every year – or what ensues when winds subside, seas calm and seasonal beach business operators return to the water with the same reckless abandon we are accustomed to seeing on our roads.

In the latest catastrophe, the holiday of Russian tourist Nikolai Nefedov (see News pages) came to a horrific end last Friday afternoon, when he was struck off Kata Beach by the propeller of a speedboat used to tow thrill-seeking tourists parasailing.

The incident re-exposed long-standing problems with the actions of the many cowboys who operate beach businesses on the island with little or no regulation, and about the same allotment of common sense.

Mr Nefedov was reportedly a strong swimmer who attempted to dive to subsurface safety. While this may have saved his life, it did not spare him from having his leg broken and partially severed.

The fact that he was among a group of swimmers in shallow water clearly indicates that the speedboat failed to even use a spotter while underway and the boat operator was reportedly alone at the time of the incident. Even worse, he was reluctant to stop and assist the Russian aboard.

Then, after dropping his victim on the beach, he promptly and predictably fled the scene.

Writing from Russia, Mr Nefedov's daughter Ilya contacted the Gazette asking us "to trace the development of the incident in order to avoid similar accidents" in the future. The wording of the request suggests a level of disbelief that such a tragedy could happen in a world-class tourist destination.

Sadly, this was not a case of breached safety protocols or a multiple breakdowns of redundant systems. In fact, the lack of clear markings as to where vessels can approach shore on most popular beaches, coupled with an almost complete lack of oversight and enforcement, makes it difficult to believe that such tragedies do not occur far more often than they do.

It is very important that the authorities find and charge with negligence the operator of the speedboat that struck Mr Nefedov – without requiring Mr Nefedov to leave his hospital bed to travel to Chalong Police Station to file a complaint in person.

Once the police have received the complaint, they need to set up moorings clearly delineating designated swim zones and then fine violators, as is quite sensibly the case at virtually every other beach tourism destination in the world.



Drawing a strong line | A natural failing against encroachment at sustainability

I CAN clearly see the major land issues facing Phuket. The biggest problem that Phuket has to deal with is encroachment on public land. The solution is justice.

The thing about the issue is that you have the right to the property or you don't. If you don't have the right you must leave the land. On the other hand, if you have the right to the land you must legally prove it.

If everyone followed the law there wouldn't be any problems. The law covers the responsibilities of each department. I believe if every department in Phuket were to use their power according to the law then everything would be as it should.

The protection of public land must be taken care of by several departments, not

just one. Different public lands fall under the jurisdiction and responsibility of different departments, however most types of pub-

lic land are covered by laws overseen by the Phuket Provincial Land Office.

For example, some public land is taken care of by the district chief or local administration office (OrBorTor). But the way the law dealing with the land is used is controlled by the Phuket Provincial Land Office, which means we





An officer at the Driving License Section of the Phuket Land Transport Office replies: By law people who suffer color blindness are not permitted to hold a driver's license.

However, occasionally color

blindness can be caused by temporary factors, such as a lack of sleep.

If you are unsure about your condition, you should have a color perception examination. These can be done at the Phuket Land Transport Office before 9am Monday to Friday.

Motorbike import for personal use

I want to import my 150 cc motorbike from my home country into Thailand.

What documents are required Rossco and what department do I need to contact?

> What are the steps I need to take? Andy

A Ministry of Commerce, Department of Foreign Trade officer replies:

A person may import only one motorbike into Thailand for personal use.

To import a motorbike into Thailand, solely for personal use, you must meet all of the following criteria:

If you are a foreigner, you must have been living in Thailand for more than one year with either a B or O Non-Immigrant Visa.

- You must have owned the motorbike for more than one year and six months in your home country. This will be determined by the registered date of ownership and the date of the motorcycles arrival in Thailand.

- You must have had a drivers license issued by your home country for the entire period that you were using the motorbike in that country.

You must have the following documents prepared:

- Original passport and photocopy of every page with your verified signature.

- Original ownership documents for the motorbike and a photocopy with your verified signature.

- If you are working in Thailand, you must have your work permit and a photocopy of every page with your verified signature.

- If you have a retirement visa, you must have documents issued from your home country that verifies your income.

- A lease agreement or a docu-

ment that verifies your address in Thailand.

- If you are married to a Thai person you must properly prepare your spouses identification card and his/her house registration. You must have copies of these documents with verified signatures.

- A bank guarantee statement, which is less than three months old. - photos of every view of the motorbike.

- photos of you with the motorbike.

Please come and visit us in person, as you will have to fill out the application form, which cannot be downloaded from our website.

After you have submitted the proper documents to us, please do not ship your motorbike to Thailand, because we cannot estimate how long it will take to process your request. We only have a few officers who take care of this process and submit the request to the Ministry of Commerce.

If the motorbike arrives before your request has been approved you will have to pay a parking fee starting on the day if its arrival in Thailand.

Speedboat operator club to set industry standards

THE island's speedboat transport and tour sector is set to reach a benchmark this month with the establishment of a 24hour boating queue and issuing of standardized fares at various piers across Phuket.

To immediately affect piers at Ao Chalong, Koh Sireh, Bang Roang and Boat Lagoon, the unprecedented initiative is being spearheaded by the recently formed Koh Yao Speedboat Club.

Club President Damras "Tony" Plookmaidee told the Phuket Gazette that the move aims to set a standard in Phuket's fragmented sea transport and touring industry.

"Informal queues and pricing agreements have been attempted here before, but they were always unsuccessful because operators would change their prices anyway. This time is different because we're making it official," he said.

that each operator gets a fair share of [new] business. However, operators will still have the rights to their existing customer base," he said.

As for proposed hiring rates, club member Opas Jitnawi noted that on offer are three sizes of speedboats with one, two and three engines.

"The rates differ with each route depending on the destination and speedboat size. For example a single engine speedboat carrying no more than 12 passengers to Phang Nga will cost 13,000 baht per day [round trip].

"A larger vessel with two engines that can take up to 25 passengers is 18,000 baht. The largest class of boat with three engines, capable of seating 40 can be hired for 27,000 baht.

"The routes go from Phuket to various destinations such as Phang Nga, Koh Yao, Koh Phi Phi, Koh Similan and Koh Racha.

"Our boats will pick up passengers at Bang Rong Pier in Pa Klok, the Boat Lagoon Marina, Jianwanit Pier in Koh Sireh and Chalong Pier." Opas explained.

Meanwhile, Tony said that the exact pricing and queuing details will be confirmed and finalized after December 10.

"We will be holding a meeting on December 10 in which speedboat operators from all over Phuket will be participating – not just our club," he said.

"For this meeting, we've also invited the Director of the [Natural] Resources Department to consult with.

"We want to keep the opportunity open for local operators to be part of this movement," he said, noting that most 'local' speedboat operators had left behind careers in fishery and rubber farming.

Marketing pros call for clarity in 'Brand Phuket'

THE Greater Phuket chapter of the American Chamber of Commerce (AMCHAM) last Wednesday held constructive discussions about the evolution, direction and future of "Brand Phuket".

This year's fourth AMCHAM meeting, held at the Anantara Resort in Mai Khao, featured talks about the island's brand fueled by inspirational presentations from marketing communications expert David Johnson and brand guru David Keen.

Also in attendance were dozens of hospitality and property industry representatives, in addition to public relations, marketing and media practitioners from Phuket, Bangkok and the Asian region.

The evening's intellectual hors d'oeuvres were dished out by Managing Director of C9 Hotelworks, Bill Barnett, who set the stage with his signature rhetoric.

"Can Brand Phuket can stand out from Brand Thailand – are the two intrinsically involved, or is Brand Phuket its own vehicle?" he asked.

"There's lots of controversy that Phuket is going to be run over by mass tourism, creating a difficult situation for many of us here. Though we want to welcome prosperity, at the same time this is our home ... "

Following Bill's stimulating introduction, David Johnson, Managing Director of Bangkokbased consultancy Delivering Asia, proceeded with his presentation about media and communications management.

Mr Johnson stressed the importance of creating, disseminating and monitoring clear and consistent key messages, using both traditional and new media landscapes, in order to build and maintain the island's brand.

"With so many voices that all have different agendas, it's really important that we strive toward a collective marketing approach that we are all singing from the same hymn book," he said.

Noting that the world now lives in an age of continuously evolving communications in which news – bad and good – travels instantaneously Mr Johnson outlined some effective media management approaches.

One of his suggestions involved seeking brand partnerships with respected, reliable and authoritative content brands, such as National Geographic and Lonely Planet.

He pointed out effectiveness in creating engaging narration or "local stories" that feature local faces and homegrown brand ambassadors. With this approach, he argues, you can position the brand to actively target specific segments of the market.

A key point of his speech ad-

dressed the need to have a media strategy that aimed to "influence" the market by fostering reciprocal dialogues that "start or change the conversation".

He argued that the traditional strategy of employing "persuasion" - common to television, newspapers and magazines – is no longer enough because it is linear, while today's audiences require active engagement.

"In promoting destination brands, social media is one channel that cannot be ignored," he continued.

"Channels such as Facebook, Twitter and Youtube are invaluable tools for launching innovative viral campaigns that can communicate the intended key messages and create 'brand buzz', getting people to talk about Phuket with the right positioning," he said.

Building on the themes of consistency and uniformity, Quo Global CEO David Keen posed some very important questions to Phuket's players and promoters.

Declining to use the microphone, Mr Keen was heard loud and clear across the conference room in what was a thought-provoking and entertaining speech.

He questioned whether Brand Phuket should continue to be tated by market forces (demand) as has been the case since the

destination emerged in the mid 1970s, or if it was now time for a change.

Mr Keen was keen to suggest that it is indeed time for Phuket to develop a unified strategy that aims to develop and drive the brand and the market - not the other way around.

After pitching various examples of effective strategies employed by other destination brands such as Bali, Pattaya and Bhutan, he went on to emphasize necessary steps that Brand Phuket must accomplish in order to prosper.

Though failing to offer an answer of his own, Mr Keen's point was nonetheless clear: It is impossible to promote, sell or market that which you have not yet defined.

Following the presentations was a session of networking drinks, courtesy of the resort, which Bill Barnett was keen to point is owned by one of Thailand's wealthiest men, Minor Corp CEO Bill Heinecke.


The informal mingling provided an ample opportunity for the Phuket Gazette to speak exclusively with both Davids.

Delving beyond Phuket, David Keen told the Gazette that he doesn't fully agree with the move to promote 'Brand Andaman', as appears to be a strategy of the current government.

"Brand Andaman sounds sexy, but it could be misleading and confusing for the market since the Andaman is a vast sea – and not necessarily a specific destination within Thailand," he said.

David Johnson agreed. "It's better to build on what you have. Phuket is already a well known brand around the world.

"We should develop it fully before we start broadening the scope," he said.



New Big C open



Big C Supercenter Plc last weekend held ceremonies for the grand opening of Big C Market on Thepkrasattri Road, near the Rajabhat Phuket University junction.

According to a report on the Phuket Office of Commercial Affairs website, the facility was built on a 2,500 square meter plot under a construction budget of 125 million baht.

The supermarket stocks more than 15,000 items and employs a total of 90 staff. It is the 12th 'Junior Big C' in the nation, and one of only two in the Southern region. The other is located in Phang Nga province.

Big C operations in Phuket include the 'Big C Supercenter' on the Bypass Road and 'Big C Extra' attached to Jungceylon shopping mall in Patong.



Reusing passwords is an expensive bad habit



HERE'S a question I see with alarming frequency:

Woody, somebody just broke into my Hotmail account. The creep sent messages out to everybody in my Hotmail address book, saying I was in the hospital and needed money sent to me (by Western Union) immediately. What can I do about it?

You've been hacked, and there's precious little that can be done. Let me get to that part in a second. First, I want to talk about how you got hacked in the first place – and dole out some advice to people in Phuket that can keep creeps from getting into their Hotmail (or Facebook, Twitter, PayPal or bank) accounts.

There are hundreds of ways bad guys can get your password. You already know about many of them - writing down your password on a sticky note and putting it on your laptop, for example. Telling your password to your spouse or best friend, who loaned it to someone who really needed it, like, right now.

Using a patently obvious password doesn't help – if your name is Yingluck Shinawatra or Barack Obama, and your password is yingluck or President, well, you gotta expect somebody's going to figure it out. (Both Yingluck and Barack have had their Twitter accounts hacked, probably because they used simple passwords.)

Using one of a bunch of very common passwords is similarly very dumb. As explained in an InfoWorld article, the 25 most common passwords stick out like a sore thumb: password, 123456, 12345678, qwerty, abc123, monkey, 1234567, letmein, trustno1, dragon, baseball, 111111, iloveyou, master, sunshine, ashley, bailey, passw0rd, shadow, 123123,

654321, superman, qazwsx, michael, football. Use any of those and any pimply teenager in Kazbukistan with ten minutes to kill can break into your account.

There's a worse form of password abuse, though, and it can cost you a lot of money. You need to be very, very careful to keep from reusing your email password. Consider this worst-case scenario, which we saw unfold here in Thailand a couple of months ago.

Let's say my Gmail address is woodyleonhard@gmail.com (it is) and my Gmail password is gotcha (it isn't). Like you, I log on to dozens of web sites every day. I signed up for an account at a newspaper site (not this one), so I can post comments in their forums and get email updates on the news.

Let's call this newspaper site ThaiDailyPlanet.com. The site asks me to provide my email address, and a password. I give them my email address, woodyleonhard@gmail.com. I'm lazy (I am), so instead of using a different password, I just re-use my Gmail password, gotcha.

ThaiDailyPlanet.com's webmasters may be good at many things – their jobs depend on keeping the news posted and updated, and looking good - but they aren't security experts. The system that stores people's email addresses and passwords is protected very well, using the latest SQLServer technology, but the admins don't bother to encrypt user IDs and passwords before storing them. That means my user ID and password are sitting on a disk somewhere on ThaiDailyPlanet's server, and they're just plain text.

Fast forward a few months, or years and some creep in Los Angeles downloads this new hacking program that's supposed to be able to break into SQLServer databases.

He doesn't have a clue how it was built, and can just barely figure out how to use the hacking program, but he goes surfing the internet, looking for SQLServer databases that don't have a specific, recent security patch installed.

Sure enough, he bumps into ThaiDailyPlanet.com, and discovers that their SQLServer database doesn't have this security patch yet. He turns the hacking program on ThaiDailyPlanet's servers, and in the course of an hour or two, downloads five thousand email addresses and passwords, including woody*leonhard@gmail.com* and *gotcha*.

This particular creep has the self-esteem of a gutted catfish, so he goes bragging to other people on creepy forums that he's broken into this big, bad database, and made off with 5,000 email addresses and passwords. To strut his stuff, he posts the addresses and passwords on an open data web site, inviting his creepy friends to go look.

Within hours, hundreds of people have downloaded the stolen email addresses and passwords. Some of them have IQs above dishwater level, so they go poking and prodding. Sure enough, dozens of them find out that they can log on to Gmail with woodyleonhard@gmail.com and gotcha.

That's only part of the story. If I used the same username and password on my PayPal account, it'll be gone in a New York minute. With a hundred monkeys pounding on keyboards, my Bank of America, Scottrade and Kasikornbank accounts could get drained the same way – if I used the same user name and password that's on my Gmail account. And of course I'd be ordering champagne and caviar on eBay, for delivery to Los Angeles. It could all happen in a few minutes, and I'd never be any the wiser.

More than that, some banking sites let you request a "forgotten" password by providing the correct email address. One of those monkeys no doubt would try the "Forgot my password" on a hundred wellknown financial sites, and possibly

come up with something. With access to my mail account, they'd have all the details they need.

Bottom line: don't re-use your email account's password! And be very careful about recycling passwords in general.

Back to the original question: there's basically nothing you can do about a hacked email account. If you can still get in, you should change your password immediately, of course, but the cow's already out of the barn. It happens so often that the major mail providers (Hotmail, Gmail and Yahoo Mail) have web sites set up with advice about how to cope with the problem, but the bottom line is that there's basically nothing you can do.

YOUTUBE has revamped its website putting channels at the core of the service but many members remain unconvinced.

A channel is a curated list of video clips chosen by a specific YouTube member or celebrity and Google claims the refresh "will improve your life on YouTube".

Channels from broadcasters, including the BBC and Channel 4, are also promoted.

Channels are now displayed in a central column on the site's home page thus resembling news feeds on social networks such as Facebook or Google+.

Experts say the redesign may mean people spend longer on the site, but some users have attacked the change and within 17 hours of going 'live' 6,703 members had clicked the "dislike" button compared to 2,280 who had clicked "like".

Google, who own the site, has said on a blog that the new design "focused on helping you discover a broader range of entertainment", but added there might be "further tweaks" depending on members' feedback.

It highlighted the fact that the site now offered deeper integration with Google+ and Facebook, helping members to see what their friends were sharing without leaving YouTube's site.

Google is also in the process of launching around 100 channels curated by celebrities and other well-known content providers. The firm is investing tens of millions of dollars into the project expected to launch next year.

Google said the site already attracts over 3 billion clip views per day. Company watchers believe the revamp will help make the site more "sticky".keeping people longer on their site.

Eighteen year property cycle

and some of us will soon be heading back to colder climes to enjoy the festive period with our loved ones. Many of you will remain in Asia enjoying your Christmas dinner in a tropical climate whilst for those of us jetting back to the UK we hope to be able to put aside the economic woes

that are sweeping the region and enjoy a well earned break. It has been some time

since my last visit to UK

shores and things have changed significantly in the past 12 months primarily due to the financial constraints that many are suffering under. Let's not forget that it is not all doom and gloom though as from every crisis that we are forced to contend comes at least one opportunity for prosperity.

So with my Santa moniker firmly undertaken I wanted to bring at least a little cheer and good news to expatriates in Phuket and beyond. What could this be you may wonder? Well when I say the UK property market many may be reluctant to agree, but if we scratch beneath the surface we can find some nuggets of joy that could prove extremely profitable in years to come.

As with all aspects of life and financial asset classes the UK property market moves

THE holiday season is fast approaching in cycles and after speaking to friends and former colleagues in the industry I have undertaken some research. We all know that the UK is witnessing steady declines in overall value and when harnessed with banks squeezing us on finances, you could be well within your rights to look at me blankly when sug-

gesting this represents an area of opportunity. For those doubters, please stay with me and I will reveal all!

In short we are talking about using property as an investment. Let's take emotion out of the equation and focus on the income and growth opportunities that many expatriates could feast themselves on thanks to the UK property market. To highlight this let's look at the 18 year UK property cycle:

The UK goes through incredibly consistent property cycles of around 18 years, where prices climb broadly for 14 years and then decline for 4 years, before starting the cycle all over again.

1974 – 1992. With the stock market

2011 - 2029? OK, so let's look at the UK housing market this way. As mortgage lending is at an all time low, how do you make that all important first step up the property ladder? You rent your property. The UK rental market is currently in very high demand and this presents an opportunity. Housing prices are low and rental demand is high. This means that over the medium to long term you could potentially receive capital appreciation and an income yield of anywhere between 5-10%.



Suvich Prechaharn

SUVICH Prechaharn, the owner of the Thai restaurant D-Phuket, was born into a family of restaurateurs. His parents own Dairy Queen, an establishment famous for introducing court-style Thai food and a range of ice creams in the 1960s.

From a young age, Suvich helped in the family restaurant and was particularly adept at using the ice cream machine. At that time, Dairy Queen was situated inside the campus of Kasetsart University, where Suvich eventually went on to study engineering. HRH Chulabhorn, who studied at the same institution, was a regular customer. Suvich was assigned to attend the Princess who had a strict diet to follow.

"It would be inappropriate for me to claim to be the Princess' friend. Let's just say that her kindness and dedication are an endless inspiration to me," Suvich said.

Later. Suvich studied in the US and obtained an MBA in International Business Administration. He then joined the Thai Farmers Bank (TFB) as part of their "think-tank" where he was responsible for designing a radical blueprint to overhaul their banking operations. This design helped staffing increases, service efficiency, credit policy and international expansion.

His career at TFB was cut short when he was diagnosed with hepatitis B, and a brush with death made him consider life's purpose. He en-



tered the monkhood for three months, during which time he practised Vipasana and immersed himself in Buddhism. This period would give him a new sense of purpose. No more was he the ambitious and driven businessman striving for excellence with every project he touched.

Still, the entrepreneur in him was always at work, and in the early 2000s Suvich experimented with making soft-serve ice cream as oppoosed the more popular hard ice cream.

After some market research and a workshop in Italy, he started anew, this time using local fruits and herbs as the main ingredients. His proudest moment was when he came up with the unique custard apple (noina) flavour. More delectable flavours followed, as well as the creation of Bonito Ice Cream. The name pays homage to Spanish and Portuguese influences on Thai sweets (kanom) -200 years ago.

Suvich spotted a niche in the Phuket resaturant market while holidaying on the island with his family. There was a lack of the Bangkokstyle food he grew up with, and so

he opened D-Phuket in Samkong last year. The restauramt serves authentic Thai food and healthy ice cream. Panarat, Suvich's wife, manages the restaurant while he takes charge of supplying his signature ice cream to hotels and restaurants on Phuket.

Suvich designed and decorated the restaurant's interior himslf which exudes the cosiness of a family kitchen, with coffee, tea, internet connection, and of course good food.

In setting up D-Phuket, Suvich was inspired by his mother who, according to him, "was a real entrepreneur, and one with a social conscience".

"My mother had respect for both her workers and customers. She created a homely space serving tasty food without caring too much about money. I want to follow her example," he said.

To ensure the authenticity of his mother's signature dishes, Suvich brought with him a 60year-old chef who has been with the family for 40 years.

A successful businessman with a loving wife and a daughter, Suvich never loses sight of what is important to him – the observance of Buddhist spirituality.

"My philosophy in life is to be true to oneself and honest to others. People will love you for these qualities, not because you are clever or rich," says the 54-yearold proprietor.



Through the gun smoke of Wyatt Earp's wild life

Books By James Eckardt

TO US youngsters of the American Baby Boom, Wyatt Earp appeared an unlikely Wild West hero.

The Life and Legend of Wyatt Earp debuted on TV in 1955 and featured a dandy in a frock coat, florid silk vest and foppish flatbrimmed hat.

The life of the frontier marshal had already been filmed in John Ford's great My Darling Clementine star-

ring Henry Fonda and The Gunfight at the O.K. Corral with Burt Lancaster and Kirk Douglas. More recent incarnations of the Tombstone lawman have been played by Kevin Kostner and Kurt Russell.

Jeff Guinn's book The Last Gunfight (Simon & Schuster,

Wyatt Earp Circa 1881 New York, 2011, 392 pp) is the latest in a long line of books and articles about October Virgil and Morgan Earp along with Doc Holliday squared off against the four cowboys of the Clanton

dead. The book's subtitle promises "The Real Story of the Shootout at the O.K. Corral".

For one thing, the shootout happened a half block away from the O.K. Corral in a vacant lot off Tombstone's main drag, Fremont Street. For another, though the Earps were lawmen and the cowboys petty rustlers, the fight was

that went back for months as previous accounts have suggested. The cowboys were actually on their way out of town, but tempers were frayed. Ike and Tom Clanton had been pistolwhipped for carrying firearms that morning by Wyatt Earp, and nearly everyone was

badly hungover. The focus, of course, is on Wyatt 26, 1881, the day when Wyatt, Earp. While his two brothers were wounded in the gunfight and Morgan was later killed and Virgil crippled for life, Wyatt emerged un-

and McLaury clans, leaving three scathed and even rounded up a posse to kill three of the gang that had shot his brothers.

He escaped into a life of wandering that took him throughout the West, to Alaska and finally Los Angeles where he befriended such early cowboy movie stars as William S. Hart and Tom Mix. He died in 1928 at the age of 80, too soon to cash in on his fame.

The big question raised is: did he deserve all the hype?

He certainly had a checkered youth. He was arrested for being a horse thief in Oklahoma and a pimp in a floating bordello in Peoria, Illinois. He descended into alcoholism after the death of his first wife. But he stopped drinking and picked himself up as a buffalo hunter. He was tall and strong and utterly fearless when he stumbled into his first lawman's job in Wichita, Kansas.

These were the days of the long cattle drives from Texas to rail heads in Kansas. He achieved his first measure of dime novel fame further along the train line in Dodge City along with his brothers and Bat Masterson.

The Earp family were in a con-

stant search for wealth and social respectability. It didn't help that all the brothers lived with common law wives who were former prostitutes, nor that saloons and gambling were their economic mainstays.

"None of the Earps were flawless saints, but they also were not shady characters who lucked into heroic places in Western history," the author notes.

"What they did do, Wyatt especially, was exaggerate their accomplishments and completely ignore anything in their past that reflected badly on them. In this, they were typical of men of their time and men today."

The Earps moved to the silver mining town of Tombstone, Arizona, in 1881 and took up jobs in law enforcement and saloon operations. The town elite were Republicans; the surrounding ranchers were Democrats, many former Confederates. The "cowboys", as they were called, rustled cattle in nearby Mexico and occasionally robbed stagecoaches. In Tombstone they came up against the Earps.

"The cowboys might not mind living rough most of the time, but they also wanted to indulge their hedonistic tendencies.

What was the use of having illgotten gains if they couldn't be spent having riotous fun?" The fun ended badly: death for the cowboys, exile for the Earps and Doc Holliday.

Book briefs

The Banjax Arrest

THIS is a traditional and very strong science fiction novel.

The plot is set in the distant future with humanity having spread across many star systems and made contact with various other intelligent life forms. Humans have interbred with some of these galactic races while others have been reduced to benign subservience.

Baron Banjax is the character around which the story revolves. He is not really an aristocrat – he bought his title. But he is an immensely wealthy half-human who made his fortune from planetary waste disposal. He is retired to a strange but habitable moon which he owns, and where he rules by virtue of feudal ownership and as a leading devotee of the new faith of Bo-Go_Max.

He might have been left there forever, except for the discovery of a mass of financial and business improprieties that force the authorities to issue an arrest warrant and send in a police mission to arrest him. With these police officers is Troy Pace, whose rich and well-connected father apparently thinks the Baron's moon is just the sort of place where he can recover from a big head injury.

But going further than this with a plot description would deprive the reader of some unexpected and well-paced surprises. We have an

increasingly bizarre chief suspect half Marlon Brando, half Robert Maxwell. We have a very slippery cult leader, and a slightly sinister young stowaway. Above all perhaps, we have a moon that is progressively turning from paradise into a ball of unstable rock.

The character with whom we are supposed to identify with most is poor Troy with his head injury. However, Croman the cult leader is a fraud and a chancer, but is very strongly drawn, and has just the right degree of moral ambiguity to make one wonder who would play him best in a film adaptation. Gary Oldman or possibly John Malkevich with his English accent. But this is drifting off the subject.

This is a very good first novel, and readers will look forward to many more from its author.

WHILE Thailand is internationally recognized for its cuisine, it is not generally famous for its fine wines, but Monsoon Valley wines are trying to change that preconception.

At a Monsoon Valley wine dinner held at the Ruen Thai restaurant in the Dusit Thani, Laguna on December 1, German winemaker Kathrin Puff presented the best award winning wines from the Hua Hin Hills vineyard.

She was also here to compete in the triathlon, and jokingly claimed to be getting her electrolytes from her daily tipple.

The wines had been expertly matched with fusion Thai food to enhance the flavors of both.

The sumptuous meal designed by Executive Chef Silvano Amolini started off with Tiger prawns topped with a ginger flavored mango-chili salsa. The wine chosen was a Monsoon Valley Colombard 2011. The wine was dry with citrus notes and a good match with the plump prawns.

Next on the menu was delicious pan-roasted Tasmanian salmon sashimi with a Hoi sin sauce sabayon. This was paired with a Monsoon Valley white shiraz that resemble a rose in color, but not in taste. There were no tannins

present which made for a crisp acidic partner to the fabulous salmon.

A Shiraz 2010 was served up with sliced *magret* of duck served with sesame crusted potatoes and tangy vegetable salad drizzled with a Mekong enhanced straw mushroom sauce - divine.

The special bottle of the night was next with a rare 2008 Cuvée de Siam Rouge. This wine won a gold medal at the International Wine Challenge in Vienna, Austria and was the only bottle of the evening that used an old fashioned cork.

The wine was vinified 500-liter oak barrels and this is apparent in the complex taste.

To fully bring out the flavors our chef produced a marinated lamb chop served with a red curry sauce, chick peas and cous cous.

For those who love sweet dessert wines the 20% Monsoon Valley Muscat 2010 takes some beating and seemed very popular with Thai diners.

This wine was paired with a lemon grass parfait with rose apple compote and a sorbet made from the same wine.

Dubbed "new latitude wines" these daring wines may yet prove to be a challenge to both old and new world wines and do go rather well with Thai cuisine.

LAST month the Gazette ran a headline that read, "Phuket schools relax rules for hiring English teachers".

The opening sentence of that story read, "The Phuket Primary Education Area Office has relaxed the requirements for foreigners to be hired as Englishlanguage teachers at government schools in Phuket."

Almost immediately after publishing the story, optimistic job seekers flooded the Gazette's office with questions asking which schools on Phuket were hiring and where to go about applying for vacancies.

Considering the article's content, who could have blamed them? Unfortunately, the reality of the situation is that no official change has occurred in terms of a relaxation of requirements.

In the article, Phuket Primary Education Area Office Director (PPEAO) Jian Thongnoon is quoted saying, "Ideally, we have to hire teachers specifically trained to teach in English. Just hiring native English speakers is not really worth it because these people do not have teaching skills. However, in the meantime we will have to hire teachers who just have English skills until we can find qualified teachers who have both English and English-teaching skills."

Yet it's the Teachers' Council of Thailand (Krurusapha) that sets requirements for foreign teachers' qualifications and their policy on this issue has remained constant since 2006:

Applicants who do not possess a degree in education, or a In the Classroom By Eric Haeg

degree and a license to teach "from abroad" must pass the TCT's Professional Knowledge Tests - of which there are four.

In the meanwhile, applicants' employers may request exemptions after applicants have attended the Thai Language, Culture and Ethics course and registered to take the first of the TCT's exams. Then and only then are teachers provided with a two-year provisional teaching permit.

So while it's understandable that the average reader might have taken Director Jian's comment, "we will have to hire teachers who just have English skills" as a relaxation for more basic regulations such as a university degree, that simply is not the case.

Applicants who do not hold degrees are still routinely turned away before being granted interviews. Of course teachers without degrees are working in Phuket's school, but in those cases, schools are working around the laws, not relaxing them.

Another potentially misleading statement suggested, "Schools in Phuket Town are struggling to attract native English speakers as teachers." Director Jian suggested the PPEAO needed 50 teachers and still another quote from Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor) President Paiboon Upatising read, "We have been announcing that we need English

teachers, but there have been very few applications."

If Phuket's OrBorJor is struggling to attract teacher applicants, it's certainly not due to a lack of foreign teachers looking to work. Nearly every month, Phuket's numerous TEFL training course providers graduate a plethora of certified job seekers who have degrees. These teachers look on job boards, they look in the papers, they routinely ask teachers who are already employed if they know of any jobs going. Yet the overwhelming feeling amongst job seekers is that positions are full.

Rather than suggesting Phuket Town is struggling to attract teachers, it would seem Phuket's schools are struggling to communicate their vacancies.

Ajarn.com's job board only lists openings at Kajonkiet, Phuket's classified ads list only sporadic vacancies and the word-of-mouth openings have dried up since the most recent hiring push in September.

The article also went on to report that one reason for the staff shortage was that teachers were applying for early retirement. These vacancies will more than likely be filled by Thais working under a different salary structure (a lower salary with considerable benefits reserved for Thais) or actually reserved for Thai government officials working as teachers (kru kharajagarn).

So while Phuket has plenty of qualified teacher applicants, it's the schools themselves that must do more to ensure they're reaching their intended audience. Until schools find the means with which to meet this end, schools will continue to go without teachers and teachers will continue to go without jobs.

Flood worries in Bangkok

MANY foreign English teachers in Bangkok and central Thailand face an uncertain and unsettling few months because of the floodwaters, which ravaged areas such as Ayutthaya and Pathum Thani as well as Bangkok according the ajarn.com website.

For many schools the new school term should have begun in the first week of November, but was delayed indefinitely, leaving teachers completely in the dark as to whether they'll even get paid for what is shaping up to be a long period of inactivity.

The situation is particularly distressing for those waiting to start a new job. On the ajarn Facebook page, one teacher wrote that he was due to start a teaching position at a new school on October 31st. The school contacted him to say that the floods had caused them to postpone the first day of term until the 7th of November then the 14th and so on. This teacher was lucky inasmuch as he was given lesson preparation and

worksheets to do from the comfort of his home, but that wasn't the same story for everyone. Many teachers just have to play a waiting game.

It's even worse for those not in the country. They are waiting with suitcase packed, ready to leave for the airport – only to have the school tell you "please don't come now - we're under water" This has happened to one teacher whose three-week break in the USA turned into six and he still has no idea when his school will be open for business. "I've already switched my flight back to Thailand twice. The second time as I was about to leave for the airport. It's all incredibly frustrating'

Even after all the floodwater has receded, there are going to be gigantic clean-up operations necessary to get the schools ready to re-open.

The biggest worry for many teachers of course is are they going to get paid for the downtime? Worrying times indeed.

Diving

THE descent line disappeared below us after we splashed in above the Sea Charter, one of the few diveable wrecks off the coast of Khao Lak.

There is a long moment between when we leave the sunny surface of the Andaman sea and the first hint of the ship's shadow blackening the blue water below us. In that moment I found myself clearing my ears again and going back over the dive briefing, reviewing all the details of the wreck that Markus Hippel, the manager at Sea Bees Khao Lak, had gone over last night.

The wreck is a cargo ship about 80 meters long lying on its starboard side with its cargo of teak wood still on board. The ship had departed with its cargo from Burma in August 2009 heading for Vietnam, but was caught in bad weather and ended up on the sandy sea floor 38 meters from the surface, not far from the recreational depth dive limit of 40 meters.

The real question I kept asking myself as I followed the line down was: what is the wreck like now? It's the question every diver asks before the wreck appears. Even a wreck as young as this one was bound to have started to break apart and become a haven for sea life.


The night before, Markus had explained that Khao Lak wasn't known for it's wreck diving, being in fact the premier jump-off location for liveaboards heading to the Similan Islands.

"People are coming to dive the Similan Islands, because it's one of the 10 best dive sites in the world." he said in a light German accent.

He went on to explain that many of the divers that booked with Sea Bees got on board with one of the two liveaboard trips they offered. However, tomorrow we would be taking a day trip out in the beautiful teak hulled Run*away* to do a little wreck diving.

The nervousness of diving with Nitrox, instead of compressed air, which I hadn't done in some time, was mostly calmed by Andrea Filippazzi, an Italian dive instructor new to the Sea Bees team, and it totally dissipated once the wreck came into view. With the wreck in front of me I knew the extra bottom time granted by the Nitrox wasn't to be taken for granted.

We swam down, past the wreck's silty hull to the vertical lying deck, with Andrea confidently leading the way. The wreck is shallow enough that there wasn't an eerie stillness to it. In fact, it was bustling with life. We dipped into the bowels of the hull, keeping our heads down to avoid the maraud of sharp oyster shells already cemented to the ship. Long beautiful timbers of teak passed

below us and then we were out into the open water again.

Snagged fishing nets hung around the wreck's tower like shredded sails. Slowly we worked against the mild current towards the stern of the ship to see the enormous propeller still above the sand.

After 32 minutes of bottom time and our safety stop I was ecstatic to have just been aboard the Sea Charter. A pleasant drowsiness set in after we had a delicious German style lunch. I closed my eyes and started diving the Sea Charter again, wondering what it would have been like to slide past the broken glass of the ship's tower window and find what mysteries lurked inside.

Dive insurance

ISSUE: I have several questions concerning the Bureau of Tourism and Guide Registration demands for me to increase the insurance premium for my dive company. Originally I was asked to increase my premium from 7,000 baht to 22,000 baht and I did that.

Now, however, I am being asked to pay a premium of 72,000 baht.

Every time I am told I have submitted everything the goalposts

move. I have the following questions: What are the premiums based

on? Katekeow Angchoun, the underwriter for non-motors at Viriyah Insurance, Phuket Branch, replies:

The premium is based on the assessed risk of the activity and the potential costs to the insurance company.

In general, premiums for scuba diving are higher than other tourism activities because scuba diving is considered a high-risk activity.

Is there a fixed insurance company that I have to use or can I choose my own?

Pivasuda Sukcharoen replies: You can use an insurance company of your choice. It is your responsibility to carefully check the conditions before you sign a policy.

Why are the premiums so high? Piyasuda Sukcharoen replies:

Before, we had set insurance payouts to be a minimum of 200,000 baht in case of death, and minimum 100,000 baht in case of an accident.

This changed in March 24, 2010 to a minimum 1 million baht in case of death, and a minimum 500,000 baht in case of an accident.

We have changed the payments because the Tourism and Guide Registration Committee agreed that 200,000 baht was not valuable enough for one life, 1 million baht is not either, but at least the committee has set a higher payout.

Is this policy consistently applied to dive operators in Thailand?

Piyasuda Sukcharoen replies: These regulations cover all types of tourism businesses throughout Thailand, including diving.

Who are the beneficiaries of the commission on these exorbitant insurance premiums?


Katekeow Angchoun replies:

Like all commissions on insurance policies, the commission on these policies go to the insurance agent.

If divers are encouraged to have their own dive insurance, because they are responsible for their own dive, why do dive operators have to pay for client insurance?

Piyasuda Sukcharoen replies: The Bureau of Tourism and Guide Registration, under the Department of Tourism [in Bangkok], has issued a regulation that requires all tourism businesses to register with the office.

One of the required documents is personal accident insurance for your customers and guides.





I was recently asked to offer my advice about landscaping the entrance area to an up-scale estate. After studying photographs of the site area and making a long list of possible plants, I paid a visit to my favorite nursery to discuss tactics, availability and prices with the

Thai owner. She knows what she is talking about as her garden center has been responsible for planning and maintaining a number of landscape projects in southern Phuket. Anyway, among other things we were discussing flowering shrubs and trees and she expressed surprise that my list contained no bauhinia (orchid tree).

I knew why. One planted years before had taken ages to settle and

Bauhinia forficata or butterfly bush is perfect for a patio. had finally given up the ghost. But she insisted the orchid tree was both easy to grow and quick to develop. Furthermore, on my initial visit to the resort in question, I noted a number of orchid trees in full flower along the road from Patong to Kamala. It is a real favorite elsewhere too, for example in Hawaii and many parts of California. So, despite my negative experience, the bauhinia definitely deserves an honorable mention in these columns.

> The genus is large with well over 200 species, including both vine and dwarf varieties. Most are confined to the tropics. The most spectacular and desirable small tree is blakeana (Hong Kong orchid tree), so named because it is the floral emblem of Hong Kong. Often grown as a shrub, this cultivar possesses the unusual, heart-shaped, twin-lobed leaf which characterizes the entire genus - grey green in this case. However, the real attraction resides in the large, scented, paper-thin, five-petalled, purple, magenta or maroon flowers. They do indeed resemble orchids and are profusely borne on terminal sprays, or in the leaf axils. And they are large - maybe five inches across. If allowed to grow into a

mature tree, blakeana can reach twenty feet, but is not likely to aspire to such heights in Phuket. This variety, unlike many of the cultivars, is reliably evergreen and can be pruned to encourage a denser and more shapely form. But it is sterile and needs to be propagated from cuttings.

Bauhinia forficata is a somewhat smaller tree and shares the common name of butterfly bush with the buddleia. Native to Brazil, it has a short trunk, spreading canopy and smaller orchid-like flowers that vary from white to pale pink. A good choice for a patio, it is coldhardier than *blakeana*, but that means it is not as good in consistently hot climates such as ours. Galpinii is sometimes referred to as the red bauhinia, since it has brick-red or orange flowers that look as spectacular as any bougainvillea. However, like the bougainvillea, it is thorny and sprawls somewhat, so it is better against a wall, especially if trained as an espalier. Lunarioides is

smaller with tiny round leaves and white flowers that bloom several times during the year.

The most frequently planted bauhinia is variegata: indeed this was the aforementioned variety growing at the side of the mountain road north from Patong. It is often cultivated as a manystemmed shrub, but if staked and pruned, becomes an attractive tree up to thirty feet in height.

Downsides? Not many it would seem. Best cultivated in slighty acid soil and full sun; it dislikes salt-laden wind. Moreover, as a legume (caesalpinia), all bauhinias produce masses of messy pods after blooming. Trim them off to improve appearance and speed up new growth. Ideally, bauhinias like a cool spell (which they are unlikely to get here), but they are both easy-going and flamboyant. Not a bad combination.

Tip of the week

Local use of chemical controls

THERE is an increasing and dis- sprayed indiscriminately to turbing trend in Phuket and it concerns the use of herbicides.

Drive along any road and you will see the evidence -ugly and unsightly patches of dead or dying vegetation.

Chemical controls are definitely not recommended and certainly not for use in gardens where you grow fruit or vegetables. Beyond the risks they pose to health and the wider environment, cheap ones are often non-selective.

control weeds or undergrowth in larger areas, they will damage or kill all desirable plants in the vicinity, including native wild flowers. Worse, their effects will persist in the soil for long periods.

If you must use them, consult the label to ensure that they are appropriately selective – whether they work on narrow-leaved, grass-like plants or on broad leaved ones. Better still, don't use them. Hoe When these herbicides are or hand weeds out instead.

Sport Spain retain cup

The defeat left Argentina still without their name inscribed on the cup

Nadal, the current world number two, despite breaking serve to win the opening game, seemed distracted and started very poorly in the first set. Argentina's Juan Martin Del Potro commanded the Spaniard's serve and took the next six games consecutively.

Nadal came out in the second set with all guns blazing, much to the delight of the home crowd, winning 6-4. After this turnaround, there only looked to be one winner, with Del Potro, who lost on day one in a five hour marathon to David Ferrer, rapidly tiring.

Nadal, whose opponent offered little resistance in the third, took the set 6-1. The fourth was a completely different affair with Del Porto taking 10 points in a row and finally breaking Nadal's serve to even the set at four games each.

However home advantage

played its part, and the partisan crowd ably supporting their hero, watched Nadal dig deep and attack. Taking the set to a tie-break, Nadal ran out a comfortable victor 7-0 to secure the set and match. Del Potro, after seeing another opportunity slip away, left the court in tears.

After the match Nadal confirmed that due to his hectic schedule, inclusive of his Olympic appearance, he would not be defending his Davis Cup tittle in 2012. "Today is one of the most

emotional days of my career," said Nadal.

RAPIDLY approaching the halfway stage the Premiership could offer early seasonal opportunities.

Chelsea, and Drogba in particular, eased the pressure on their manager, André Villas-Boas by taking three points from Newcastle Utd last week. The Blues also secured a last 16 berth in the Champions league by defeating Valencia, but are set to face a dominant Manchester City on Monday evening.

Should Chelsea lose they would be 13 points adrift of the leaders, and hand a psychological boost to leaders Manchester City.

West Brom have home advantage over bottom placed Wigan, who were crushed 0-4 by Arsenal, and with limited attacking

options, Wigan manager Roberto Martinez needs to resolve his goalscoring inabilities rapidly.

Bolton have Aston Villa coming to the Reebok Stadium which presents a chance to climb out of the relegation zone with Villa's recent poor record of one point out of a possible nine from a draw with Premiership new boys, Swansea City who have Fulham visiting.

Liverpool's 11-game unbeaten run ended on Monday evening with a 0-1 loss to Fulham made worse for the Reds by Luis Suarez making a finger-gesture at full time which will be investigated by the FA.

Suarez is already facing a racism charge which leaves Dalglish in a quandry over his star striker.

TIGER Woods recorded his first win in two years at the Chevron World Challenge and climbed back up to 21st in the world rankings.

Played at Sherwood Country Club in Thousand Oaks, California, Woods demonstrated he still has the killer instinct when needed.

Whilst not competing against the strongest of fields, Woods saw off fellow American Zach Johnson to lift the trophy and the take the winner's purse of US\$1.2 million.

Woods, trailing by one shot approaching the 17th green, holed a 15-foot birdie to bring the scores level. Johnson then failed in his birdie attempt on the 18th, leaving

Woods a six-foot-birdie opportunity to hole-out and secure his first win since the BMW Championship title in September 2009.

A delighted and somewhat relieved Woods said "It feels great. I've been in contention twice this year, which is not very often. I had the lead at the Masters on the back nine and had a chance at the Aussie Open, so that's my third time with a chance to win.'

If a fully fit Tiger Woods, can exploit this victory and regain consistent form he enjoyed before his private life made the headlines, the 35-year old will pose a major threat for 2012.

A sublime player, with his trademark back-heel, Socrates gave more to game than most with "joga bonito" ("beautiful game") the philosophy of freeflowing attacking football.



FC PHUKET lost their third home game of the season on Sunday, going down 2 - 0 to a determined Chanthaburi FC side.

The evening match was played in front of a smaller-than-expected crowd of about 2,400 fans at Surakul Stadium, and followed heavy showers that left the pitch waterlogged for the duration of the match.

With balanced possession in the two halves, both sides saw a handful of scoring chances. But it was the Chanthaburi FC "Hares" that drew first blood on 36 minutes, when Rattaphon Sae-tan jumped on a loose ball in the penalty area and drilled it into the top corner of the near post to put his side up 1-0 - alead they took into halftime.

FC Phuket kept up the pressure in the second half, but were unable to find the back of the net as the end of regulation time drew near.

Following several near-scoring efforts, Phuket's best opportunity for an equalizer came when they were awarded a penalty kick with just five minutes left. Poramut "Mut" Krongborisut was blatantly fouled in the penalty area, but the



subsequent spot kick, taken by defender Wirachrote Junteng, was brilliantly deflected by the diving Chanthaburi keeper Pichet "Killer Rabbit" Traiphumi.

Clinging to their advantage, several Hares found themselves playing dead on the pitch as the clock expired – antics that resulted in five minutes of injury time being added.

Any hopes the Southern Sea Kirin entertained to equalize were extinguished just moments into injury time, when Chanthaburi's Ivorian-import Labi Aymard won a footrace

– to seal the victory 2-0 for the Hares.

The result moves Chanthaburi (9 wins, 7 draws and 14 losses) up two spots to 11th place, out of the relegation zone, for now.

Recent wins by Buriram (1^{st}) , Chainat (2nd), Chula United (3rd) and PTT Rayong (4th) and Songkhla (5th) further shed doubt on Phuket's prospects for promotion next season.

NEIL Pryde is sailing his Welbourn 52 Hi Fi in the IRC Zero Class of the 25th Phuket King's Cup.

Pryde has won the King's Cup four times in the top racing division; the first time in 1998, then in 2001, 2004 and again in 2009 and he is looking for a record fifth win in 2011.

At 72 years of age, Neil Pryde is a stalwart of the Phuket King's Cup and of Asian sailing.

Pryde, a New Zealand born sailor, has been in Asia for almost 50 years. He is the Managing Director of Pryde Group, an assemblage of companies with roots in manufacturing, sports branding and worldwide distribution.

He started sailing at 10 years of age in Auckland in the P Class, and after early success campaigned ahead of the Rome Olympics in 1960, but just missed out on selection.

In 1963, Pryde began working for sail maker Rolly Tasker. A chartered accountant by profession, he worked with Rolly until 1970 and then set up his own company making sails for yachts.

"Until 1991 we were in Hong Kong and we then moved to China. We were actually pretty big at that stage and in peak times in the 80's we were making well over 300,000 windsurfing sails a year," said Pryde.

By the mid 80s they were the world leader in windsurfing sails and still are today.

"We noticed that kiteboarding was starting to cut into the windsurfing market. I met Pete Carina, a real icon in the sport and in 2000 we bought all the rights to his name for kitesurfing products and Pete came to work for us. He did the marketing and product direction and we went in to the kitesurfing business,"

"Windsurfing is shrinking, but kitesurfing is definitely growing by probably five per cent a year.

"Kitesurfing is a great travel sport. The stuff is so portable that you can put your gear in your backpack and your board under your arm and basically go anywhere.

"It's interesting to see the kiteboarders here at the King's Cup and I will watch their progress with interest.

"But I just love sailing here in Asia. The standard of racing here is pretty damn good and that's why we are seeing more and more very good sailors here from around the world," Pryde said.

The touring side from India were due to play in Bangkok, but the recent floods encouraged them to move their schedule south to Phuket's ACG.


A decisive 10-wicket victory for the Phuket side on Friday in a T20 match seemed to inspire the Viceroys in Saturday's 40 over encounter.

Sport Sport **Raelert and Rollison rock** Laguna Phuket Ironman

ASK any athlete who has experienced the Phuket Ironman 70.3 Asia-Pacific course and they will describe the routes as challenging.

Downpours on Sunday morning endeavored to make this challenge decidedly more hazardous with decreased visibility and the dreaded surface water which, we know can turn Phuket roads into virtual ice rinks.

Despite the conditions, Michael Raelert of Germany and Melissa Rollison from Australia proved their worth as two of the best triathletes currently on the Ironman 70.3 circuit by claiming their first victories on Phuket.

As dawn broke over the island, 1,117 athletes representing 58 countries gathered on the beach in front of the Laguna resort complex before starting the 1.9km swim that would take them through open seas and freshwater lagoon routes.

First out of the water was Briton Daniel Halksworth just one second ahead of pre-race favorite and 2010 Ironman 70.3 champion Raelert, who in turn was leading the chasing group of American Matt Reed and Australians David Dellow and Paul Matthews.

One minute after the top Pro men got out of the lagoon, the Pro women began their exit from the water with Amanda Stevens from the USA building a 90-second lead over Ruth Nivon Machoud of Switzerland and last weekend's Laguna Phuket Triathlon (LPT) winner Radka Vodickova from the Czech Republic a further 30 seconds behind the Swiss.

By this point the rain was in play and athletes took to the bike course with caution. The conditions would adversely affect split times and unfortunately cause retirements through accidents and mechanical problems.

At the 10km mark Dellow had taken the lead and was being

chased by Matthews, Raelert and Reed. In the women's race. Stevens had extended her lead by another minute, but current Ironman 70.3 world Champion Rollison was in pursuit and had shot into second place having been sixth out of the water.

Raelert and Dellows were in a share of the lead at the 20km point, but this also marked the end of American Chris Lieto's race after a fall and long slide left him with severe road rash on his right elbow and he was forced to retire.

Lead group positions had changed dramatically by the 30km mark. Dellows and Raelert were in fourth and fifth respectively while the Australian trio of Matthews, Paul Ambrose and Timothy James Reed had snatched the front places.

Just before the halfway mark, Rollison took the lead from Stevens and continued to put distance between her and the rest of the field who were being led by Natascha Badmann of Switzerland, and last week's LPT runner up Belinda Granger.

A frenzy of Australians at the

end of the bike course saw Ambrose, Dellow, Matthews, Cunningham and Joshua McHugh all go into transition two (T2) within 17 seconds of each other behind Raelert.

Rollison was the first woman out on the run course followed by six-

time-Ironman world champion. Badmann. Treacherous

conditions for cyclists became an ideal running environment with cloud cover keeping temperatures low for the runners. In the end,

both Raelert and Rollison

dominated the run course to finish well ahead of their chasing groups and secure the US\$12,000 top prize. Raelert crossed the finish line nearly six minutes ahead of Cunningham and Matthews to set a new course record of 3:51:36.

Raelert was completely enamored by the event and local support.



"This is just a fantastic event. Even with the rain coming down, the people were still lining the roads to cheer us on. This really encouraged all of us," she said.

Conditions on the bike course were incredible. It was dark with torrential rain. We had to slow

down, but that meant I could relax a bit before the run. My arms got a good work out keeping control of the bike. After the injury setbacks of this season, it's great to finish in a high note Raelert during the wet bike course and with a

> good win and I'm sure this will help springboard next season," Raelert added.

> It was a good day for Australia, with five Australians among the top eight men's prize positions and three in the women's top eight, including Rollison

Rollison slaughtered the field be-

hind her finishing nearly 14 minutes ahead of the 44-year-old Badmann and maintained her unbeaten Ironman 70.3 2011 record with her first victory on Phuket in a time of 4:17:01. Vodickova reclaimed third place from Lidbury during the run despite suffering from a knee injury.

Massimo Cigana, LPT triple champion and crowd favorite finished sixth in a time of 4:01:54.

Phuket's rising triathlete star Jaray Jearanai was the first Thai to finish in a personal best time of 4:38:38 on his home course. Top Thai female was Nampetch Porntharukcharoen in 6:22:28.

The day was also a triumph for the oldest competitor, 79-year-old Hiromu Inada of Japan, who finished in 6:42:01.

The Laguna Phuket 2011 Ironman 70.3 field competed for a total US\$75,000 pro purse, championship points, as well as 45 and 30 prestigious age group slots awarded for the 2012 Ironman 70.3 and Ironman World Championships, respectively. The Phuket Gazette and PGTV
