Tsunami memorial services

MEMORIAL services to pay respects to those who died in the 2004 tsunami will start at 8am on December 26 with a multi-faith ceremony at the Tsunami Wall of Remembrance in Mai Khao.

Those who lost loved ones and people who live in the area will join with community leaders at the ceremony, which will include Buddhist, Muslim and Christian services," said Raywat Sombatthong of Mai Khao Administration Organization.

"The ceremony will end with the attendees laying flowers at the wall under the names of the countries that lost nationals in the 2004 tsunami here in Phuket," he added.

Police step up search for Facebook girl, 12

POLICE in Phuket have contacted their Bangkok counterparts for assistance in the now nationwide search for local schoolgirl Samudchaya "Nong Pin" Yanpunya, who disappeared more than two weeks ago.

Nong Pin, a 12-year-old student at the Baan Talad Neua School, was last seen leaving an internet cafe near the entrance to Soi Lor Rong in Phuket Town on the afternoon of December 6.

After subsequent questioning of teachers and friends proved fruitless, the girl's desperate mother Samruay Saenthaweesuk reported the disappearance to police.

She then visited the Phuket Reporters Club office at Phuket Provincial Hall to seek help from the public in locating her daughter.

With no leads forthcoming, she even turned to fortune tellers for information. One said she had runoff with a "rich tomboy", while the other said she was under the control of a local mah song spirit medium named "Dum".

Mrs Samruay fears her daughter, who went to live with her grandparents in Wichit, near

Phuket Town, after she and her husband broke up, may have been abducted by a predator who stalked her using the popular social networking website Facebook.

Like many Phuket youths, Nong Pin was a regular user of the world's most popular website. She told her grandparents she was going to the internet cafe that day to do homework, but it is strongly suspected her real intention was to communicate with friends through the site.

Given her enthusiasm for Facebook, it is disturbingly notable that activity on Nong Pin's Facebook account virtually ceased since her disappearance.

Mrs Samrauy, who only learned to use the site after her daughter's disappearance, said the only noticeable activity was the posting of an "avatar" photo on her "wall" last Sunday. Mrs Samruay said she thought the low-resolution image resembled her daughter, albeit with darker skin.

That same day a "friend request" to Nong Pin's Facebook page was accepted, but the new "friend" received no reply to her message to Nong Pin.

Friends at work told Mrs Samruay the avatar photo did not resemble her daughter, however, so she later accepted that she was likely a victim of "wishful thinking" driven by the need to know her daughter was still alive.

Following reports that a Phuket hotel security guard was arrested in Nakhon Sri Thammarat last weekend and charged with the rape of three girls he met on Facebook, Mrs Samruay contacted police to see if her daughter had fallen prey to the same predator.

No arrest warrant issued for MMA brawler: Police

Phuket hosts DMAT international rally

DISASTER medical assistance teams (DMAT) from across Thailand will pit their skills against DMAT teams from Japan, Korea and Sri Lanka first-ever International Medical Rally to be held at Sirinath National Park, Nai Yang, on December 23.

Taking part in the event are DMAT teams from Chiang Rai, Khon Kaen, Udon Thani, Nakorn Sri Thammarat, Krabi, Phang Nga and Phuket, explained Phuket Public Health Office (PPHO) chief Sak

"There will be 10 teams of five people in each in the competition," a fellow PPHO officer explained to the Gazette.

"Seven of the teams will be from Thailand. The others, from Japan, Korea and Sri Lanka, will also take part in the competition. They are all expert in disaster-response skills," she said.

"Ten stations will be set up in Sirinart National Park, where the

teams will have to respond to simulated emergencies such as assisting in delivering a baby, responding to a mass-injury accident, or dealing with a head injury sustained from the victim falling from high up," she said.

"We will have ambulances on site, but we do not want people to panic because it's just an exercise. We will post signs to tell people that the rally is on.

"Tourists are welcome to watch the competition," she added.

Driver charged over death of pregnant resort worker

THE driver of the six-wheeled truck that struck and killed 27year-old resort worker Arayada Budsayakul on the Patong beach road last month has been charged with reckless driving causing death.

Ms Arayada was four months pregnant when she died in the accident on November 8.

Lt Pathapee Srichai of Patong Police told the Gazette that the driver, Rattana Kumsin, 40, will face the criminal charge in court soon. "He has confessed to the charge. I am compiling the paperwork now to file with the court,"

Lt Patapee explained that Rattana was charged immediately after the incident, but the delay in processing the criminal charge came at the request of Ms Arayada's family.



Arayada Budsayakul, 27, died instantly in the accident. She was four months pregnant at the time.

They wanted Ms Arayada to be cremated first and for the family to discuss the incident with Mr Rattana before criminal charges were placed against him, Lt Patapee explained.

During discussions with the family, Mr Rattana agreed to pay 500,000 baht to the family.

One of the witnesses to the

accident told the Gazette, under the condition of anonymity, "The truck was packed with Burmese laborers. It clipped Arayada's motorbike while she was driving slowly in the left lane waiting for the truck to overtake her."

The motorbike fell to the ground, spilling Ms Arayada into the path of the truck's back wheels, he explained.

"As I was a witness to the accident, I went to the police station to give a statement. While I was there I saw the driver... He had just taken an alcohol breathalyser test," the witness said.

Mr Rattana, who did not flee the scene, was found not to be under the influence of alcohol and was released without bail, confirmed Lt Patapee.

'Drink spiking' thieves on the rise in Patong

TOURISTS visiting nightspots in Phuket should not leave their drinks unattended as there have been incidents of people having their drinks "spiked" with potent sedatives in recent weeks, Tourist Police volunteers have warned.

Frank Tomensen, Group Leader of the Phuket Tourist Police Foreign Volunteers in Patong, has instructed his patrol units to be on the lookout for victims who may appear impaired or disoriented.

While there is usually no lack of such people on any given night in Patong, "spiking victims" might display somewhat different behavior from those of classic alcohol inebriation, he explained.

In two recent cases, victims are thought to have had a "date rape drug", possibly gamma-hydroxybutyric acid (GHB), slipped into their drinks.

"In two incidents that we are aware of, the victim had an odorless and colorless substance added to their drink while at a bar on Soi Paradise.

"The effects take about 15-20 minutes to set in, rendering the victim helpless.

"In both cases it is known the victims were robbed," Mr Tomenson explained.

Patong hotel pays out robbed Aussie tourists

THE management of a Patong hotel this week paid about 150,000 baht in compensation to an Australian couple who claimed their room safe was robbed of 255,000

Australian tourist Jim Nagi, 44, said he first noticed cash missing from the safe in his hotel room at the Andaman Beach Suites Hotel in Patong on December 8.

"At first, I thought I lost about 700 Australian dollars from the \$12,000 that was in the safe, but I wasn't sure so I did not report it to the hotel," he told the Gazette.

"Later, on Monday [December 12], I tried to open the safe with the combination code. I tried twice, but I couldn't open it, so I went down to inform the receptionist, who used the master key to open the safe. That's when we found that \$7,500 had gone," he

He reported the theft to Patong Police that day, but had heard nothing since, he told the Gazette on Monday.

The couple, who checked in to the hotel on December 4, moved

into another room the next day.

The hotel owner agreed to pay the Aussie tourists half the \$7,500 after meeting the couple.

Mr Nagi's partner, Sharyna Wong, 30, said, "We first met the hotel manager on Saturday [December 10], and he implied that we made up the story so we could claim the money back on insur-

ance. I explained to him that if we claimed this on insurance, we would get only \$250 back.

"Besides, we came here for a holiday. We don't want to spend time making reports to the police and having discussions about this. It's a waste of our time," she said.

At the meeting, Thuwanan Peanawan, director of rooms at

the hotel, told Mr Nagi that the hotel management was "still not comfortable" with the incident and were questioning all staff, including maids and receptionists on duty around the time the money was reported stolen.

"It seems nobody knows anything about this," he said.

However, one of the hotel receptionists told the Gazette, "Mr Nagi brought people from outside to stay in the room without our permission and we are not sure whether one of them stole his money.'

During the meeting, it was discovered that the hotel CCTV security camera installed on the floor where the couple was staying was "misaligned".

"The CCTV camera was pointing too high. It could show the elevator doors opening and closing, but we couldn't even see if any people were inside. Besides, the CCTV camera showed just a part of that floor. We could not see who was using the staircase," Ms Wong told the Gazette.

The couple departed Phuket for Australia aboard a 6pm flight on Monday.

"While in Thailand, US citizens are subject to Thai law and must work within the Thai justice sys-

tem to resolve any legal issues. The US Embassy endeavors to ensure that US citizens in Thailand are afforded the same rights under Thai law as the citizens of any other country," she said.

Police assured her the cases were unrelated, she told the Gazette on Wednesday.

Phuket City Police Duty Officer Tada Sodarak told the Gazette the same day, "This case is one of the most difficult missing person cases we have faced. Normally when we are searching for someone, we track their movements by monitoring their mobile phone transmissions. Nong Pin has a mobile phone, but she did not bring it with her, so we can not track her," said Lt Tada.

He recently reported "no progress in the investigation" to his superiors in the case file, he admitted.

"Mrs Samruay informed us of people she thought Nong Pin might have run off with. After questioning, all were dismissed as persons of interest. We

reviewed video images from the CCTV camera of the Internet cafe where Nong Pin was last saw, but she left on her own," he added.

While stopping short of conjecturing over the possibility of abduction, Lt Tada said, "Nong Pin seems like a trouble child. Her parents separated, she spends most of her time away from family at the internet cafe [talking to friends in cyberspace].

"I understand how Mrs Samruay would feel as the mother. I have already contacted the police in Bangkok to help us search nationwide. I also informed all police investigators, asking them to be on the lookout and inform us if they find Nong Pin," he

Escape from Patong

French preteens back in France, role of Belgians revealed

THE two French girls who spent eight months on the streets of Phuket are now back in France, where they are undergoing evaluation by social workers.

The girls, 12-year-old Manel and her sister Chaima, 11, have been reunited with their paternal grandmother and are now in the care of French social services.

Meanwhile, the Gazette has been informed of the important role played by two Belgian men in securing the girls' return to France.

One of the Belgians, who asked that his name be withheld, was at Patong Police Station on November 18 for a drunk-driving offence when he met the father of the girls in a holding cell.

The father gave the Belgian his mother's number and asked him to call her and inform her of the girls' situation.

Back in Belgium, the man called the grandmother, and one of his own relatives living in the Nai Harn area, to ask for assistance.

Chaima was living in a Patong guesthouse, while the more independent Manel divided her time between Kamala in the day and Soi Bangla by night.

The grandmother wired the Belgian 20,000 baht to pay for unpaid hotel bills in order to get back the passports of the two girls, which were being withheld in lieu of payment.

He turned this money over to

French Consul Pierre Blondel, who worked with Tourist Police to get the passports back. Chaima, her passport recovered, flew out in early December with the consent of her father, who signed a consent form from a Bangkok Prison.

Manel was finally spotted on Soi Crocodile by Tourist Police Volunteers on the night of December 8 and flown home a few days later. Both flights were courtesy of the French government.

The grandmother told the Belgians that she was furious with her son for squandering an inheritance of almost a million baht during his eight-month stay in Phuket and for neglecting his daughters.

The grandmother said she had no intention of sending him any more money. At last report he was still in a Bangkok prison cell, unable to come up with the funds to pay the court-ordered fine for his drug conviction.

"The mother won't pay his return fare to Europe or anything else, so he could be in Thailand for a long time," the Belgian said.

Battle to kill off polio intensifies

THE PHUKET office of the World Vision Foundation in Thailand, operating under the Supanimit Foundation, last week stepped up its anti-polio campaign, in line with the World Health Organization (WHO) push to eradicate the debilitating disease.

Supanimit Foundation workers, joined by Phuket Provincial Public Health Office officials, targeted Burmese communities in and around Phuket Town and elsewhere around Phuket.

The anti-polio task force which also included many members from Phuket Rotary clubs divided into three main teams to cover Phuket Town, Kathu and Thalang, explained Surachet Thummanon, an officer with the Supanimit Foundation.

"The Phuket City team divided into two groups. Myself and two Burmese officers from the Front Social Network [FSN] covered the Rassada community, Saphan Hin and behind the main branch of Super Cheap.

"The other teams, which also

included FSN workers, covered areas outside of Phuket Town," he explained.

"My team administered antipolio vaccines to more than 180 kids in three communities," Mr Surachet added.

Although the teams started their rounds at 7am, many Burmese children were not at home because their parents took their children with them to work.

"We will return in the evening to cover the rest of the children,' Mr Surachet said.

The teams will continue their anti-polio campaign in Phuket on January 18, he added.

Port project gets push from Cabinet

DEPUTY Minister of Transport Kittisakdi Hathasongkorh on December 16, vowed to support plans to expand Phuket's Deep Sea Port, which have run aground over its environmental impact assessment (EIA) report.

At a meeting at the Deep Sea Port, Phuket Marine Office Chief Phuripat Theerakulpisut explained to Mr Kittisakdi that his office had been working for more than a year on having the EIA passed.

"The EIA does not seem to be working. It has caused a lot of problems," he said.

Wathanachai Raunglertpanyakul, director of Chaophaya Terminal International Co Ltd, which has the government concession to operate Songkhla and Phuket Ports, said not one local resident has agreed with the Phuket expansion project.

"The residents are afraid that the runoff from the construction and extra activity will affect the water so much that it will affect them making a living. Not one person has agreed with the project, and so the EIA has not

been approved," he said.

Mr Wathanachai explained that the project, which was reported to cost more than 100 million baht, includes extending the dock by 60 meters so two large ships can dock at the same time.

"This involves dredging about 4,000 square meters of underwater earth. We will also install two large mooring poles in the bay,"

Mr Wathanachai explained that the dock is 360 meters long, which can accommodate only two ships, each not longer than 173 meters long, at the same time.

The problem is that bigger ships are now coming to the port, especially cruise liners. So far the biggest one has been 270 meters long, which does not leave enough room for another ship," Mr Wathanachai explained.

In keeping his commitment to support the local community, Mr Wathanachai said that cruise liners were given priority to dock at the port, even if it meant forcing a cargo ship that is halfway through loading or unloading to move offshore.

"We earn just over 100,000 baht

each time a cruise liner docks here, but we earn about 500,000 baht from each rubber cargo ship that uses the port and we earn from 1mn to 1.5mn baht from wood cargo ships," he said.

This causes problems for the owners of the goods being transported because it delays how long they must pay to use the ship, which can cost up to US\$30,000 a day, he said.

"I'm afraid if this continues, no cargo ships would come to the port," Mr Wathanachai said.

Another problem was that government concession contracts were for periods of five years only.

"We have had the contract to run the port from the Treasury Department since 1988. The first concession was for 10 years, but since then each contract has been for only five years, which does

not leave us enough time to invest in big projects," he said.

After hearing the issues currently hindering development of the port, Mr Kittisakdi said he agreed with the plans to expand the port's capacity.

"I will present this to Cabinet and support it. As Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra is supporting investment, I do not think this would be impossible," he said.

TB outbreak sparks call for migrant crackdown

AN OUTBREAK of tuberculosis that has hospitalized nearly 60 Burmese workers has prompted the Phuket Immigration chief to call for a more integrated approach to tracking their growing numbers

Phuket Immigration Superintendent Panuwat Ruamrak said problems arise from the nature of the island's labor-intensive construction industry, which causes workers to jump from project to project and change employers frequently.

"Currently each department keeps its own statistics. We need to have a more efficient database, because over the next five to 10 years the numbers are going to increase a lot," he said.

"Another thing that concerns me is that over the

past three months, 57 foreign workers have been sent to us after having been diagnosed with tuberculosis (TB)," he said.

Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Chamnan Pannabon said, "In 2010, we deported 242 migrant workers in a total of 246 reported cases. In 2011, we deported 226 workers in 130 cases. We do not know exact number of foreign migrant workers in Phuket, but we are still able to handle them. The situation is under control," he said.

"On the positive side, they help us in terms of [coping with] the labor shortage. However, it has also caused some social problems since we lack an

DETECTIVE Nucharee Longkaew, 27, of Phuket City Police Station, recently tasked with the formidable job of interviewing female victims of sex crimes in Phuket Province, is now ready to start her challenging duty.

Despite having received no specialized training for dealing with traumatized women, who may have been violently abused

or raped, Capt Nucharee is confident that her police training, character and experience is equal to the task. Another positive being that, as a women, she can empathize with the victims.

As reported previously by the *Gazette*,

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Pekad Tantipong, informed the honorary consuls at their quarterly meeting, that he had appointed Capt Nucharee to investigate "sensitive" crimes, notably sexual abuse and rape against women.

"The official letter arrived about a month ago, however, as yet

there have not been any sensitive cases that require my skills," Capt Nucharee told the *Gazette* this week.

"Not only will I investigate rape cases, but also other cases where a victim doesn't want to speak to a male police officer, such as domestic violence cases," she said, adding that her remit extends to taking statements from the children of foreigners, a particularly difficult interviewing scenario.

However, in her new role she will only assist in such cases, not actually take over the role of lead investigator.

"I will only be interviewing the victims. Other aspects of the investigation, including the collection of evidence, remains the

remit of the relevant police station's investigating officers," she said.

As with most policing agencies worldwide, there is a set procedure for crossing interdepartmental boundaries. The Phuket police are no different.

"Officers from police districts outside of Phuket Town will have

to contact [Phuket Provincial Police chief] Cdr Pekad, who will send a letter authorizing me to interview the victim.

"According to the regulations, I have to get the order from the commander before I can investigate cases in other justifications," said Capt Nucharee.

In reality the process will be much shorter. "A request for my involvement is likely to come by telephone. Cdr Pekad believes that the necessity of a formal letter before I can react is a waste of time. A formal letter requesting assistance can be a retrospective action.

"Also, if the incident occurs within the Muang Police District, no authority is needed," she said.

Should a woman want to report a crime, but is reluctant to talk in front of male officers, she can request to speak with Capt Nucharee.

"The investigating officer will contact Cdr Pekad directly, who will task me to attend the investigation," she said.

Capt Nucharee explained that such interviews are likely to be

conducted at the police station where the complaint was lodged.

"However, I'm quite prepared to visit victims in hospital if necessary. Otherwise the victim will be interviewed in a private room with only those officers necessary. They might include another female officer and a translator provided by the prosecutor or a consul.

"I'm glad to help in these cases and now that we have a female officer dedicated to them I want women not to be afraid to report crimes," she said.

Yvon Van Eyersen cremated in Phuket

He then slipped into a coma before being declared brain dead by doctors

Acting on his final wishes, Yvon's vital organs were removed from his body and donated.

Khon Kaen crazy nicking knickers

POLICE in Khon Kaen nabbed a thief with an unusual haul last week – more than 1,000 pairs of used women's underwear.

The kinky culprit, Pathanin Kawikul, 26, told officers he used the undergarments – which he stole over a period of more than five years – for sexual gratification.

Police were alerted to Mr Pathanin's bizarre activities when Phornphat Saetiao, 25, complained that a young man had stolen a pair of her underwear from her room in downtown Khon Kaen before fleeing on a scooter.

The suspect admitted that he stole Ms Phornphat's underwear.

He led the officers into a deserted house next door, where officers were surprised to find Mr Pathanin's gargantuan underwear collection.

The suspect had enough pairs of ladies' panties to fill three sacks. Most had been worn – and were unwashed.

Police took Mr Pathanin into custody.

The suspect told police that he only stole used underwear and that he used it for masturbation. He said he had been doing so for more than five years.

Mrs Charoenphorn said her son had graduated from university and was soon to receive his bachelor's degree. However, she had noticed some strange behavior in her son over the past three years, she said.

Mr Pathanin liked to cut his fingers with a knife and watch the blood flow over his hands as if he could not feel pain, she said.

He also liked to spend large amounts of time in his room on his own.

The family had already taken Mr Pathanin to a mental hospital, where he had been given medicine, but his condition had not improved, she said.

Row errupts over Thaksin passport

THE government may have a fresh legal battle on its hands after the Foreign Ministry reissued fugitive ex-prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra a passport.

Opposition leader Abhisit Vejjajiva, whose government revoked Mr Thaksin's travel privileges following his conviction on corruption charges in 2008, said the Democrat Party was considering suing senior officials involved in returning the passport, claiming the move broke ministry regulations.

The affair "would mark the beginning of the end" for Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra's government, he added.

After being pressured by the opposition, the government last week admitted that Mr Thaksin was issued a passport on October 26, at the height of this year's flood crisis.

Mr Thaksin requested the passport on October 25 and collected it at the Royal Thai Embassy in

nation

Abu Dhabi, the Foreign Ministry said.

"This normal passport has nothing to do with extradition or whether [or not] he's innocent, but only his nationality," said ministry spokesman Thani Thongphakdi.

"No government agency, including the police, judiciary and Interior Ministry, opposed the reissue of Thaksin's passport," he added.

But the Democrat Party slammed the government for issuing a passport to a convicted criminal.

Two weeks ago, Foreign Minister Surapong Tovichakchaikul had told reporters that Mr Thaksin would receive his passport "very soon", even though the ex-premier had already received the document, the party pointed out.

Democrat spokesman Chavanond Intarakomalyasut accused Mr Surapong of lying to the public. Mr Thani countered that the minister had merely been uninformed about the situation.

Mr Chavanond also said that the issuing of the document had broken a ministerial regulation prohibiting the issuance of a passport to a person with a criminal conviction.

In a seething editorial, *The Nation* daily newspaper said the move meant Thailand had "emerged from the flood waters to go straight into the political fire".

"One side will say Thaksin is still a criminal convict, thus the covert stunt that took advantage of a nation in flood panic was not just a betrayal, but an act of contempt for the country's rule of law," the paper said.

Mr Thaksin remains a highly

polarizing figure in Thailand, loved by the rural poor of the North and Northeast, but loathed by much of the Thai establishment.

In 2008, the Criminal Court convicted him of conflict of interest for signing off on a land deal involving his life when he was prime minister. He fled Thailand

to escape the two-year jail sentence resulting from the conviction, which he said was politically motivated.

He currently lives in Dubai and travels on a Montenegrin passport. The former telecoms billionaire has a number of investments in African mining concerns.

Ladyboy hostesses reach for the skies

THAILAND's first transsexual air hostesses took to the skies earlier this month, serving customers on a flight from Bangkok to Surat Thani for new airline PC Air.

The airline made headlines earlier this year when it announced it would be the first carrier in Thailand to accept applications for air stewardess positions from transsexuals, more commonly referred to as "ladyboys", or *katoey* in Thai.

PC Air, whose name derives from the initials of owner Peter Chan, said it prides itself on its equal opportunities policy.

One of the new transgender recruits, 22-year-old Tanyarat Jirapatpakorn, told Reuters that the move signified "the beginning of the acceptance of transsexuals in Thailand, giving the opportunity for us to work in various fields...

"Maybe in the future we can get any job that transsexuals never did

THAILAND's first transsexual air before, such as police, soldiers or hostesses took to the skies earlier even pilots," she said.

Levels of acceptance of transsexuals in Thailand are already recognized as among the highest in the world, with ladyboys a common sight in shops and the service industries.

Mr Chan said that the new recruits were fully trained according to aviation standards and that they "might provide better service because they understand both males and females".

The airline, which specializes in charter flights, has also hired 19 female and seven male attendants.

The qualifications for the ladyboy hostesses were the same as for females in that they were required to talk and walk like women, the airline said.

PC Air runs domestic flights, as well as international services to Asian destinations including Japan and Korea.

'Da Torpedo' gets 15 years

IN THE third high-profile conviction for lese majeste in a month, leading red-shirt activist Daranee Chanchoengsilpakul, known as "Da Torpedo", was sentenced to 15 years in jail for defaming the monarchy.

Mrs Daranee was arrested in July 2008 over the content of three fiery speeches she made at redshirt rallies that year.

The verdict followed the previous 18-year sentence she was handed in August 2009, which could not be enforced because she filed an appeal against the closed-door trial.

In her petition, Mrs Daranee demanded that the Constitution Court provide a legal interpreta-

tion of the trial, claiming it was unconstitutional.

The Constitution Court ruled in February that the confidential trial was not unconstitutional but ordered that the previous sentence be revoked and the case be tried again relying on the same testimonies.

After hearing the latest verdict, Mrs Daranee said she would not appeal because she did not believe in the Thai judicial system

She added that she would not seek a royal pardon. either.

Last month, 61-year-old Amphon Tangnoppaku was sentenced to 20 years in jail for sending offensive SMS messages about Her Majesty the Queen.

Mr Amphon, who has cancer, was accused of sending the four offending text messages to a personal secretary of former premier Abhisit Vejjajiva in May last year.



Taking a gamble on tour cruises

WITH Phuket's Deep Sea Port being targeted for a huge upgrade (see page 6) and existing tourism industry infrastructure, the island has great untapped potential in the global cruise ship industry – not just as a port of call but also as a port to call home.

Mention the words "cruise ship" and "Phuket", and most readers will conjure up memories of the disgraceful blockading by taxi drivers in recent years of the Phuket Deep Sea Port, the only logical location in Phuket to develop a cruise ship port on the island.

Many cruise ship operators in the region currently drop anchor off Patong, where a floating pier is moored in the high season, the only time weather permits. This is a shame because cruise ship tourism is potentially a lucrative year-round proposition for Phuket, which has a virtually unbeatable array of onshore activities to offer visitors. These ports-of-call also encourage first-time visitors to return to explore further – and spend more money.

Unfortunately, the Deep Sea Port is too far from Patong, Phuket Town or popular destinations to make them very attractive to cruise ship passengers, who typically enjoy only a morning or afternoon in port. As such, unless the current transport situation can be vastly improved, its appeal will largely remain limited to all but military vessels on extended R&R visits.

Upgrading the facilities at the port to accommodate Thai-flagged cruise ships is one concept than has until now been given little or no attention in the local press. As a major regional port, the port already has most of the infrastructure needed, including a petrochemical tank farm and container facility, to provision even the largest seagoing vessels. There is also a great deal of public land available for expansion.

One area of particular interest should be casino gambling, which remains illegal in Thailand and its territorial waters. Most cruise vessels worldwide have casinos on board, allowing punters to enjoy games of chance while in international waters.

Many arguments have been put forward asserting that casinos being illegal in Thailand not only costs the nation untold billions in lost revenue to casinos set up along its borders, but also perpetuates an underground industry in the country that fuels state-sector corruption while undermining the democratic process by financing vote-buying. Estimates by the The National Economic and Social Advisory Council have put the scale as high as 800 billion baht annually.

Establishment in Phuket of "casino cruises" of the type already popular in many other parts of the globe would not only be a logical first step to the development of Phuket as a regional hub for the cruise ship industry, but would serve as a boon to the economy and an elegant way around the queasiness of our legislators when it comes to legalized gambling on our shores.

Burmese in frontline in battle against polio

First PERSON

AS A Burmese person, I am very glad to have the chance to help other Burmese, but it really doesnt matter if you are Thai, Burmese or Mon; there is no need to be racist, especially when dealing with illnesses.

I had been working as a laborer in Koh Sireh for seven years before I heard that the World Vision Foundation of Thailand (WVFT) Phuket office, operating through the Supanimit Foundation, needed Burmese employees. I applied for the job and got it. I have been working for them ever since.

There are about 10 Burmese working at the foundation. We are called the Front Social Network.

I work as an officer's assistant at both the foundation and Vachira Phuket Hospital. I'm at the hospital on Tuesday and Friday and I work at the foundation on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday.

At the foundation I translate and help officers prepare whatever is needed for Burmese in the prenatal, Tuberculosis (TB) and human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) departments. I also help administer polio vaccines. Burmese workers are the real target of the WVFT Phuket's efforts.

The pre-natal clinic is open every Monday at the foundation and we usually receive more than 30 Burmese women every Monday.

I also am an assistant in the prenatal and TB departments in

some Burmese people cant speak Thai, so they need a translator for the patients. This is an example of the cooperation between the foundation and the hospital, as both places are working together on the TB clinic.

I am willing to help anyone, not just Burmese. When I work at the hospital there are more than 90 patients per day and only eight or nine of them are Burmese.

Sometimes I go out with WVFT Phuket teams to visit Burmese Vachira Phuket Hospital, because communities and camps to explain how they can protect themselves from HIV and to give them some basic information about TB, which is done under Global Fund Round six and eight programs.

In my spare time I take Thai classes at the hospital and I search for Burmese workers suspected of having TB, such as someone who has been coughing for more than 14 days.

I am glad to work with WVFT Phuket. I have a job, earn money and meanwhile I enrich my life by helping people.

Tesco Lotus captures 'moral' high ground

You must meet the same visa requirements as everyone else. You must first be living in Thailand and have the necessary funds in a Thai bank account [to get the visa].

Superyacht industry flourishing

MIGRATORY birds aren't the only ones moving south to escape plummeting temperatures in the northern hemisphere. South Asia is rapidly becoming the preferred winter destination for owners of superyachts - motor yachts in excess of 30 meters or 100 feet.

Indeed, an increasing number of these luxurious leisure ships can be sighted off the shores and islands across the South Pacific and Andaman Seas, with Phuket as a focal point.

"The number of superyachts being transported to Phuket for the winter season is up 25 per cent from last year," said Bas Nederpelt, Director of Sales for De Vries, one of two ship yards in Holland where world-renowned Feadship yachts are constructed.

"Due to increased fuel costs and the perceived threat of piracy, among other factors, it's becoming more common for owners to ship their vessel for long distances via dock transport, and then fly to their destination," he added.

tor of Asia Pacific Superyachts, a co-sponsor of the Asia Superyacht Rendezvous, concurred Charles Dwyer with Bas that increased awareness and infrastruc-

ture, the wide availability of resources and services, and the general sense of security are the main factors influencing the continued growth and prosperity of the local yachting industry.

He added, "Superyacht owners are starting to get bored with the same old waters. In the summer, they're in the Mediterranean and then go to the Caribbean for the

winter, then back to the Mediterranean and so forth, for years on end. At the same time, people are realizing that Asia provides many new cruising grounds. Phuket, Koh Samui, Bali, Sri Lanka, Langkawi, the Maldives and Bali are all part of, and due to benefit from, this shift," he said.

Asked whether any competition destinations in the region are a threat to Phuket, Mr Dwyer pointed out that unlike other industries, destinations feed one another in the yachting industry. "Sailors starting in Bali will ultimately continue to Singapore and then up to Langkawi and Phuket, and it works both ways. They always end up coming to Phuket, but the region as a whole benefits," he explained.

Both Charles and Bas agreed that "red tape" is the biggest hurdle for future growth. Charles elaborated. "When compared with places like China, Phuket and Thailand are a lot more lax with regulations. And it is for this reason that Phuket stands to benefit tremendously from the expanding Chinese high end market, who are buying yachts and bringing them to Phuket to cruise.

"However, Thailand marine officials should reconsider its regulations."

He continued, "For example, a boat owner needs a special generator or pump that is only made in Europe. Instead of having it shipped to Thailand where it would be subject to a heavy import duty, what many will do is have it shipped to Langkawi, duty free and have it installed there.

"And while they're there they will of course get duty free fuel and other things before coming to Phuket.

While Thailand was looking to get the import duty, not only did they not get it, but they lost out on the jobs for the 10 people it would have took to install the equipment. Penny wise, pound foolish. Some officials have overlooked what this industry can contribute to the local economy."

Phuket's Happy Air relaunches services

BOUTIQUE carrier Happy Air resumed services last week for flights from Bangkok to Ranong, but the airline still has not set a date to resume its Phuket - Haad Yai service. office at Suvarnabhumi Airport in Bangkok, Happy Air sales and marketing representative Onkanya Chaisit said thrice-weekly (Friday,

Speaking from the company's Sunday, Wednesday) flights between Bangkok and Ranong resumed on December 16.

Ranong is a popular destination among "visa runners" and Bangkok residents who like to gamble, as it is the jump off point to the Andaman Club Casino resort on the Burmese island of Thahtay Kyun.

Happy Air resumed service from Suvarnabhumi to Mae Hong Son, Mae Sod and Nan on December 23. These services are offered on the carrier's small fleet of Saab turboprop aircraft, Ms Onkanya added.

The carrier would like to resume its Phuket - Haad Yai route, but as yet has not set a specific date.

"Perhaps some time next year," Ms Onkanya said.

There is currently no direct service linking Phuket and Haad Yai, the two largest international airports in the south of Thailand. - Stephen Fein

Weeding out hype in a health-conscious market

HEALTH and environment are two buzzwords that are being heard a lot nowadays across the globe and Phuket is no exception.

Health-conscious segments of local markets continue to grow and an increasing number of producers are looking to exploit this consumer base. What was once a niche market has turned into an 'eco green everything' fad.

Indeed, many consumers, producers and suppliers, will struggle to explain the difference between 'organic' and 'chemical-free', among other things.

In an exclusive interview with the Phuket Gazette, Martin H.J. Smetsers, Managing Director of Pura Organic Foods Limited, shed some light on the topic.

"The Thai government is trying to stimulate organic farming but unfortunately, clarity is still a major issue," said Martin, whose company is a leading organic food distributor in Phuket and southern Thailand,

"The term 'chemical-free' cannot be compared to organic farming as chemicals are used from the time of seeding until a short period before harvest, when the use stops. The chemicals and pesticides used 'disappear' during this final period. However, since chemicals were used for 90 % of the growth period, such produce is subject to damage and other alterations in taste, color, shape, size and nutritional value," he explained.

"I've seen a study that states that non-organic food has lost 50 per cent of its nutritional values over the last 50 years and in order to get the same nutritional value that our grandparents did 50 years ago we must eat twice as much today. With Organic produce this

is less the case," he added.

From its base in Thalang, Martin explained that Pura Organic supplies a wide array of fresh and truly organic produce to hotels, resorts and restaurants in Phuket and the southern region.

With a focus on high-quality organic produce, it distributes vegetables such as kale, green long beans, red long beans, Chinese radish, lettuce, pak choy, all kinds of lettuce, wild rocket, regular rocket and winged peas; herbs, including four different kinds of basils and coriander; and fruits such as papaya, pineapple, passion fruit, longan and mangosteen; in addition to organic dairy products such as



milk (cow, buffalo and goat) and cheese, eggs and chicken.

"In total, Pura now carries over 800 organic products. One of our main local suppliers is the Thanyamundra Organic Farm in Surat Thani, next to Khao Sok National Park," Martin said, noting that the organic farm is certified under the Agricultural Certification of Thailand (ACT) standard.

"This particular farm is on a 60 rai parcel of land located about two hours north of Phuket, and is attached to the 10-rai Thanyamundra Organic Resort which was recently chosen by Agoda as one of Asia's Top 10 Eco-Boutiques," he said.

"As our associate, the farm sells us their entire harvest, which we then distribute throughout the south, mostly in Phuket," he explained.

While the company sources a lot of its fresh produce locally, its entire supply network comprises a total of 40 sources nationwide including those in Surat Thani, Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Nakhon Ratchasima and Mae Hong Son provinces, Mr Smetsers added.

"Pura has had some problems due to a logistic issue caused by the recent flooding, but since our main product lines are fresh produce, most of this is flown directly into Phuket from all over Thailand," he said.

Martin went on to explain that while official certification and reputation is important, it cannot be relied on unconditionally.


"We initially believe and trust our organic sources, but try to make it a point to personally visit their production and distribution facilities to see if they meet Pura's quality requirements," he said.

"Over the past 14 months, we have taken some products with certified organic sources off our list simply because after visiting the farm we didn't feel comfortable with the quality and standard observed," he added.

"On the other hand we feel very proud to carry products from noncertified sources who have shown us comfortable levels of organic correctness. Pura Organic Foods Ltd is very willing to help the small farmer who makes an effort to be organic and whose efforts are often pressured by unfair trade practices," he added.

Martin himself has been eating organic food for over 20 years and said he has not had to take a single day off for sick leave.

Pura Organic will soon open its new shop and office at 66/20 Moo 7, Thepkasattri in Thalang, on the 402 between the Thanyapura entrance and the Shell Station. For more information, see W: puraorganic.org Phuket Gazette



IN THE wake of consumer item shortages resulting from recent flooding, the Phuket Gazette conducted a poll about the significance of alcohol pricing to the local tourism industry.

Over 57% of respondents believe reasonably-priced alcohol is either important or even critical to Phuket's attractiveness as a tourist destination.

The island suffered a shortage of certain alcoholic beverages after floods in central Thailand disrupted operations at production facilities and distribution networks.

Overall, 28% voted reasonably-priced alcohol was "critical", while 29.4% voted it as "important" - the most popular response overall

More than 25% said reasonably-priced alcohol was not important, as alcohol was only an "add-on" for people living in Phuket or here on holiday. The least popular response, at 17%, was that having reasonably-priced was not important at all "because many people enjoy Phuket without alcohol"

While 62% of both tourists and local foreign residents felt affordable booze as critical or important, more than 70% of Thai nationals said reasonablypriced alcohol was not important to Phuket.

Biz owners agree with wage hikes

MORE than 70 % of 5,381 Phuket found employment," he said. business owners surveyed by the Phuket Provincial Labor Office said they agree to the minimum wage being raised to 300 baht per day.

The news was announced last week at a meeting of Phuket officials including Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha, Phuket Provincial Labor Office Chief Suttipong Saisakares, Phuket Provincial Commercial Affairs acting Chief Jarus Phetpakdee and representatives of employers and employees.

"Hotel owners would like to introduce the increase gradually, and would like to see more qualified employees working in the tourism industry," Chief Suttipong said.

"From January to [the end of] November this year, there were more than 42,000 persons who registered with the Labor Office as seeking work.

"Of those, 33,763 persons were de-registered as they had already

Although he described the unemployment situation in Phuket as in a constant state of flux, "depending on the tourism season", Chief Suttipong said that employers had reported that the unemployment rate had fallen in Phuket in general.

Workers representative Wichit Dasantad said, "Increasing the minimum wage to 300 baht a day should not be a problem, as the Phuket economy is continually growing, especially the tourism in-

Increasing the minimum wage in Phuket would attract more workers to the province, which would help alleviate the current labor shortage in the job market,

The minimum wage in Phuket is set to be increased from 220 baht to 300 baht per day on April - Warisa Temram

Is Phuket cheaper?

HARDLY a day passes when somebody doesn't ask me, "Woody, should I buy a laptop (phone, desktop computer, iPad, printer, camera, TV) here in Phuket, or is it cheaper in the US (or Bangkok, Singapore, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Seoul, Europe)?"

Once upon a time, it was relatively easy to answer that question. Times have changed.

Three or four years ago, prices in Bangkok – particularly Panthip Plaza – ran about 15 per cent cheaper than Phuket. You could find individual fluctuations from time to time, but there was a definite increase in prices here in Phuket, for just about everything, from paper to laptops, phones to scanners.

Those price differences have largely evaporated. Bangkok computer retailers, such as JIB Computer, now have branches in Phuket, and the Phuket shops charge the same prices as in Bangkok's Panthip Plaza. Some even use the same price sheets. Other low-margin retailers, particularly in the basement of Big C and on or near Phang Nga Road in Phuket Town, have kept up.

For consumer electronics, Power Buy isn't the cheapest in Thailand, but it's close. Other Bangkok chains also sell at the same price here as in Bangkok. It's rare that you'll find anything significantly cheaper in Bangkok - although the selection is greater at Panthip.

By comparison, Bangkok tends to be a little more expensive than Hong Kong, Taipei, Seoul, or even occasionally Singapore. Five years ago, I flew to Hong Kong to buy a gorgeous 30-inch monitor, and saved enough to pay for the plane fare. That just wouldn't happen to-

day. Specific brand name items might run 10 per cent cheaper in Hong Kong or Singapore – but at the same time, other items run 5 to 10 per cent more (I'm looking at you, Dell). I've come to the conclusion that going out of the country just isn't worth the airfare, lugging the hardware, dealing with customs, or worrying about the warranty.

The one place where you can consistently find lower prices is the US. I can hear the guffaws all the way out here. But it's true: on some items, particularly expensive big-name items which are cheaper in the US than just about anywhere in the world.

One big exception is Apple. The iPad 2 (16 GB with 3G) costs US\$629 in the US. The same rig in Phuket goes for 19,900 baht, which is about US\$637 at current exchange rates. The warranty is identical so there's no reason to buy an iPad outside of Thailand.

If things are frequently cheaper in the US, it immediately raises the question: how much cheaper? I've found two web sites that tell you not only how much items sell for in the US (and some in Europe). They also show you the price history, so you can see where prices have been, and possibly get an idea of where they're headed. Everybody wondering if they pay too much here for a specific piece of electronics should hop over to both sites and see how well local prices stack up.

The first site, camelegg.com, tracks prices at Newegg - one of the pre-eminent online electronics retailers in the US – that sells computers and computer equipment, of course, but also televisions, cameras, kitchen appliances, refrigerators, washers, calculators, shredders, BBQ grills, bug zappers and popcorn machines.

The second site, Decide.com, also tracks prices and shows you historical graphs, but it has two additional twists. Firstly, the database at Decide.com is enormous and covers hundreds of competing stores. Secondly, the people behind the site have put together some fancy programming - aided by human observers – and they make an educated guess on whether it's better to buy something now, or to wait and see if something better is coming down the track.


Let me show you how this works. Say you're in the market for a new DSLR camera. You've looked around and settled on a Canon EOS 600D with an 18-55 mm Canon EF-S IS II lens. You can find that camera at several locations in Phuket (the cheapest I found was 29,900 baht). If you go to Decide.com, you'll see that the camera - known as an EOS Rebel T3i in the US – can be bought for US\$655 (about 20,500 baht) from a lesser-known mass retailer and up to US\$708 at B&H (a reputable mass retailer with a long track record). Prices in Europe are higher.

The Decide.com web site recommends that you go ahead and buy it now, because of an anticipated price increase of up to \$60 in the next two weeks.

Flipping over to camelegg.com, you'll see that Newegg lists it for \$899 right now, but seven weeks ago it was at \$849. I'd be willing to bet that the price will come down at Newegg after Christmas.

Conclusion: you can save 7,800 baht by buying the camera at B&H in the US – providing you can get it here without incurring any shipping charges or customs duties. If you want to buy it from Newegg, the price in the US is only 1,900 baht cheaper than it is here.

No, I didn't end up buying the camera but I sure felt better about prices in Phuket after looking at comparable prices in the US.

Prices can work the other way around, by the way: living in Phuket can have advantages, in a strange way. If you follow me on Twitter (@PhuketLiveWire), you saw a warning about skyrocketing hard drive prices that I published in InfoWorld several days before the big spike arrived. In the US, and around the world, the price of large hard drives just about tripled in the course of a couple of weeks, in late October.

If you were looking for a hard drive about that time, and you saw my tweet, you could've run out to one of the many retailers in Phuket and picked up a hard drive at something close to the original price. The folks in Phuket didn't follow the sudden worldwide rise in prices for 24 to 48 hours after they'd hit worldwide.

Google's top ten searches of 2011

At number eight a Japanese script search for TEPCO (owners of the Fukushima Daiichi power plant) were the first non-Latin term to make it to the global fastest-rising list while Apple founder the late Steve Jobs and iPad 2 placed 9th and 10th, respectively.

The list of fastest-falling Google searches search terms whose popularity plummeted in 2011 was topped by Myspace, a social networking pioneer that has been eclipsed by the likes of Facebook and Google+. The fastest-falling list also included Hi5, another social networking site and Baidu, a Chinese search engine.

British yacht designer Jody Chapman visited Phuket to attend the recent Asia Superyacht Rendezvous

BORN into a family of architects in England, it is hardly surprising that Jody Chapman became interested in product design and eventually graduated with an Honors degree in Industrial Design from the University of Brunel in Surrey.

He later went to work for the luxury car manufacturer, Austin Martin, where he used his design talents on the V8 Vantage. Jody also worked with a team of engineers who produced Jaguar and Landrover models.

After six years, he decided that he wanted to work in a smaller company where his own design ideas could be realized. He joined a firm, as project manager, that designed boats built around the world. Jody explains that he has tried to draw inspiration from sources other than superyachts and often cites automotive cues. His favorite ever car is a P4 Ferrari which he claims "is a near perfect icon where performance has been interpreted by artists and craftsmen".

"I believe many of the innovations in world class cruising and racing will occur in Asia so I have moved my design studio to Singapore," he explained. "Europeans are building their yachts in Asia due to the much lower construction costs whereas Asians are looking for yachts in Europe as they are more brand conscious. I hope to be able to offer bespoke interiors and exteriors to both markets."

Jody plans to bring innovation and his creative personal vision to yacht design in the region.

"I'm incorporating Asian design concepts sucha as feng shui and regional building materials like bamboo. moveable screens and open spaces to update interior spaces on yachts. The quality of light is incredible in

Southeast Asia and I'm intrigued about using it in my design vocabulary," he continues. "I think that yacht design tends to lag behind the innovations in architecture. So I'm hoping that the dynamic economies of Asia will be a good place for my design

"Design and construction of yachts can happen

with teams working from a variety of locations. Each part of the design process can be made from a separate studio that must coordinate with the owner or their representative. The whole process can be very bureaucratic and challenging. I believe I can simplify the process of design and

construction and speed up the entire process in getting a finished product to the client," said Jody.

With a background in and a passion for architecture Jody has always felt that yacht design has a tendency to lag behind and a lot can be learned from contemporary Asian interior design. One of his recent favorites is that of President's Design award winner 26 Cable Road by ip:li architects in Singapore.

From his new studio, Seventy Seven Design, in Singapore, Jody plans to act as the conduit for Chinese and East Asians who want a stylish and competitive racing or

pleasure yacht. He also plans to diversify his design work into creating fresh interiors for corporate jets.

"I like to work with clients who have an open mind and are interested in looking to the future of design. I expect to be very busy," said a smiling Jody.





THE first annual ThinkDesign Art Festival will be held from December 27 - 30, at the Royal Phuket Marina and will showcase the talents of over 150 visual and performing artists from Thailand and around the world.

This is the largest gathering of creativity on the island since the Phuket Andaman Painting Exhibitions held over ten years ago.

Michael Earle, an American architect who has extensive work experience in Spain and Dubai, is the producer for this inaugural ThinkDesign Art Festival.

"Since I moved to Phuket and

began producing ThinkDesign magazine, I've become aware of how much talent there is in the local art community. I've also noticed that there is little contact between this great local art and the expat community whose homes have large wall spaces. I'm hoping that this festival will open a dialogue whereby the international residents and visitors will embrace the talent produced both on Phuket and in Thailand."

Michael has spent months exploring the galleries and ateliers of painters, sculptors and poets on Phuket. The result is a festival that will highlight a large collection of traditional painting



Life & style Christmas in the chamber

Diving

THOUGH only some divers know all the words to the Twelve Days of Christmas, every diver has heard or knows by heart a couple horror stories of "getting the

From our training and bar room chat we get the the picture of a panicking diver disregarding protocol and bolting for the surface. As they shoot towards fresh air, the nitrogen accumulated in their tissue during the dive turns into rapidly expanding bubbles, possibly headed straight for the brain.

Those scenarios are extraordinarily rare, and though the exact causes of decompression illness (DCI), also known as "the bends", and the formation of nitrogen bubbles isn't completely understood, the cure, a treatment in a hyperbaric chamber, is right here in Phuket, but that's really not the place to spend your holidays.

"It's not so much [about] messing up," said Patrick Schindler, Operations Co-coordinator for the hyperbaric chamber at Phuket International Hospital.

"People say, 'You can't be 'bent' you followed your computer, followed your tables; your dive was good.' That doesn't matter so much," Patrick explained.

Each person is different and without researchers getting proper funding it's not possible to fully understand why bubbles develop

in some individuals and not others, or why some people who do develop bubbles have symptoms and some don't.

Many dive professionals have only a superficial understanding of DCI, due to its rarity, yet they are expected to teach it to the members of the dive community. This is one of the reasons Patrick offers his time to educate them and the general public about DCI and hyperbaric chamber procedures. The next five day seminar will be held in either April or May.

The hyperbaric chamber at Phuket International Hospital is only one of four chambers in Phuket, serving the entire west coast of Thailand. What the white-WWIIsubmarine looking contraption, or more precisely, pressure vessel for human occupancy, does is increase the air pressure around a person while they breathe 100 per cent oxygen. This increases the amount of oxygen that can be absorbed by the body, which helps eliminate the nitrogen in the patient's system.

Most DCI cases that are handled at the Phuket International Hospital are the less serious ones. Sometimes people show up a couple days after diving and have lost sensation in their pinky finger or are suffering from persistent joint pain, one of the many places bubbles can accumulate.

"Denial is the biggest issue for all illnesses. People just go back to whatever island they were on and come to Phuket the next day or even later," Patrick said.

People make up excuses for

skin rashes and many of the symptoms of DCI. They often explain the rashes as unnoticed encounters with jellyfish or a sudden allergic reaction to

neoprene.

Avoiding the obvious fact that the rashes have developed only on their abdomen or hips, which were covered by the wetsuit as well as other parts of their bodies and thus unlikely to come into contact with marine stingers.

> Many of these symptoms of DCI can disappear in a couple of hours or over-night, often al-

lowing divers to justify getting back in the water the next day, instead of following up on the issue by consulting

Service (SSS) Recompression Chamber Network or a doctor who fully understands DCI and its symptoms.

"The next day, feeling better they return to their holiday diving. First dive - okay, second dive okay and then, sha-pow! They get three times worse," explained Patrick.

Despite being on a stunningly beautiful island for the holiday season and participating in an activity with a reaonable safety record, divers shouldn't neglect to call the SSS Recompression Chamber Network on +66 810 819000 if they have any concerns or show any signs of DCI.





Quick Facts:

- Neurological symptoms after dives, which can included mood swings, dizziness, muscle weakness, problems with balance and coordination, memory loss, confusion, hearing and sight issues are serious signs of DCI
- "Marbling" over the abdomen can also be a sign of a

Part two of Russell's delve into doggie dilemmas



IN PART one of our look at Canine Separation Anxiety we identified some of the many reasons and symptoms for its onset, so here in part two, we'll look at various ways of treating it.

However, it's important to note that you should always consult a canine behaviorist first so that problem behavior can be correctly identified prior to implementing a modification program. There's no point trying to modify separation anxiety if that's not really the issue.

Now separation anxiety, can be tricky and in truth, can be annoying. To add insult to injury, many owners want to yell at or punish their dog for the excessive vocalization, or other behavior associated with the anxiety, but this can make the problem worse by increasing the dog's need for social contact developing what's called Learned Helplessness.

Feeling nervous? Okay, here's the science bit: The nervous system is responsible for behavior and is divided into two sections: the central nervous system (brain and spinal cord) and the peripheral nervous system (nerves and some sensory organs). The nervous system works closely with the endocrine system, which is responsible for chemical coordination in the body.

The nervous system conveys information from one place to another by neurons or nerve cells. Chemical secretions called neurotransmitters travel from one cell to another. They contain and convey information. Some of the more important neurotransmitters are dopamine, norepinephrine and serotonin. Got that?

Dopamine is involved in motor coordination and reaction time. A deficiency can cause inability to learn, irritability, anxiety and a decline in endorphins (a dog's natural pain killer). Dopamine influences the brain's pleasure center and a decline in this neurotransmitter can result in a diminished positive feeling.

Norepinephrine is related to adrenaline. It is responsible for your dog's energy level. A depletion of this can cause your dog to shut down and display signs of lethargy and depression.

Serotonin regulates mood, pain and arousal levels. Low levels of

serotonin can result in aggression, impaired learning, anxiety and obsessive behavior.

Now, when a dog becomes overstressed the nervous system releases norepinephrine and dopamine, which causes a suspension of the part of the brain responsible for learning and higher thought process, previous learning, impulse control and social inhibition. Previously learned coping mechanisms may become inaccessible which can provoke species-typical coping mechanisms (chewing, digging, urinating/defecating, vocalizing). Addressing the problem

There are a number of ways to treat separation or isolation anxiety, and in many cases it's largely a combination of a number of them - but remember, all dogs are different so consult a canine behaviorist first.

Pharmacology:

A major contribution to the treatment of separation anxiety is a drug called clomicalm, which helps by increasing the serotonin levels in the brain which in turn decreases the level of fear, stress and anxiety experienced by the dog. But lots of people aren't keen on taking antidepressants themselves, let alone giving it to their dogs.

Nutritional Intervention:

Stress puts greater nutritional demands on your dog so if your dog is not currently eating a high quality dog food then you could consider a change. Lower quality dog foods frequently contain a large quantity of corn which is also thought to decrease the level of serotonin in the brain (although I'm not a nutritionist, so don't quote me.)

Mental Stimulation:

Possibly the best way to help your dog, is to encourage active participation and focused enjoyment of something. You can increase mental stimulation in your dog by feeding part of his meal in a fun ball or hide portions of his meal around the house when you leave. One of the best ways to stimulate your dog mentally, is obedience training.

Physical Stimulation:

A tired dog is a well behaved dog. Exercise stimulates the production of serotonin and is a way for your dog to release all of his energy appropriately. When you start exercising your dog start out slow and increase the amount of time and the level of the exercise. You know your dog, so you'll know what's too much and

what's not enough, but it is a good idea to have your dog examined by a veterinarian first to make sure there are no issues that may have an impact on your exercise program such as obesity, arthritis, hip dysplasia, etc.

Second Dog Syndrome:

Dogs are social animals and are generally happiest when in the presence of other dogs. Many people believe that getting another dog will treat the current dog's anxiety, but that often backfires and can actually increase the stress on your current dog. In many separation anxiety cases, the dog has developed a hyper-attachment to humans, so another dog makes no difference.

Scent Item:

Providing your dog with a soft item that smells like the attachment object or person can sometimes help in minor cases. The best way to accomplish this is by wearing a t-shirt to bed and leaving it with your dog in the morning when you leave.

Here one minute, gone the next:

For the first 15-20 minutes after you arrive home or before you leave completely ignore your dog.

This means no eye contact, no speaking, and no fast, noisy activity. The goal is to reduce the contrast between your presence and absence. If there is damage or mess in the house, ignore the dog and simply go about cleaning up. Do not punish your dog!

Remember, this is not your dog's fault and he is not acting this way to get back at you for leaving him. Treatment for Separation or Isolation Anxiety takes time, patience and lots of work but you can make a difference.

Books

THERE is a large and growing shelf of books about Theodore Roosevelt, most recently James Morris's acclaimed biographical trilogy.

National Geographic writer Candice Millard has taken a different tack, concentrating on his last great adventure in The River of Doubt (Anchor Books, New York, 2006, 416pp). Subtitled "Theodore Roosevelt's Darkest Journey" this is the tale of his descent in 1914 down the wild and uncharted Rio Duvida, or River of Doubt, in the middle of the Brazilian Amazon. The source of the river had previously been discovered by Brazil's legendary explorer Candido Rondon. Now the two men proposed to map its length northward through a unknown gauntlet of rapids, waterfalls, whirlpools and hostile Indians.

Roosevelt's trip to South America had originally been conceived as a leisurely junket, a lucrative speech tour culminating in a ride down the known branches of the Amazon. Instead, Rondon proposed a voyage of real discovery and Roosevelt eagerly accepted.

Just to reach the river took a month of hard slogging through the Brazilian uplands in a massive safari train reminiscent of Roosevelt's celebrated hunting trip to Africa after he had left the White House. He was obliged to shed most of the men and gear for the final trek, leaving a crew of 22 dangerously short of food. Backing up the two co-commanders of the Roosevelt-Rondon Scientific Expedition were two strong and able young men: Rondon's lieutenant Joao Lyra and Roosevelt's son Kermit who had accompanied him on the African safari. Kermit had learned Portuguese while engineering in Brazil and he and Lyra would provide the strong

young backs in the forefront of the heavy work of portaging their dugouts up the raging river.

The obstacles were formidable. "Even in an age when great feats of discovery were almost commonplace, a descent of the River of Doubt would be audacious. Not only was the river unmapped - its length and direction unknown and each whirlpool, rapid, and wa-

terfall a sudden and potentially deadly surprise - but it coursed through a dense, tangled jungle that had a dark history of destroying the men who hoped to map it." Two Indian tribes lived on the east

and west banks of the river. They would remain hostile to white people until the late 1960s. They chose, however, not to attack the little group of interlopers, but to keep them under observation and take the gifts of steel knives and hatchets they left behind. Only Rondon's favorite hunting dog was killed by a five-foot poisoned arrow.

"As the journey wore on, the Amazonian jungle, which had never seemed welcoming, had begun to feel not just dark and dangerous, but inescapably oppressive," the author writes of the group's plummeting morale. "It was a sensation that most outsiders who plunged into that dense, inscrutable wilderness experienced, and it left behind an indelible, almost violent impression."

By the end of six weeks, Roosevelt was near death from malaria and an old leg injury that had become badly infected. He would lose 55 pounds, or a quarter of his body weight. He was often delirious. For Roosevelt, the expedition was becoming an ordeal of inhuman proportions, testing his strength and resolve as nothing he had encountered in a lifetime of self-imposed physical challenges.

Half-starved, riddled with malaria and dysentery, weakened by overwork and swarms of bloodsucking insects, the expedition members fought their way up the river till salvation appeared n the form of a rubber-tapper's hut.

In the end they would travel 1,000 kilometers of a river that Rondon renamed the Rio Roosevelt. A major tributary was renamed the Rio Kermit. An Amazonian state three times the size of England was eventually named Rondonia. The legendary explorer would live until he was 91, though his young lieutenant Lyra would drown in the rapids of another river in 1916. Broken in health, Roosevelt would die three years later, at 61. His son Kermit, the young scion of so much talent, energy and discipline, would descend into depression and alcoholism and kill himself in wartime Alaska in 1943.

Canice Millard tells this sad tale with the urgency and suspense of a thriller. Finally, it is a harrowing tribute to the desperate courage of heroes.





An impossible sequel

The IMF is shut down when it's implicated in the bombing of the Kremlin, causing Ethan Hunt and his new team to go rogue in order to clear their organization's name.

But the story line pales in value to the astonishing action feats which includes Tom Cruise scaling Dubai's Burj Khalifa, the tallest building in the world, with a gigantic sandstorm rolling in on the horizon.

This is Bird's first venture into live-action films after working with Pixar's blockbuster animations, and he certainly knows how to think big.

Almost 30 minutes of the film was shot with 70mm IMAX cameras giving Bird takes every conceivable advantage of the extra clarity and oversized frame to build excitement – which he does with a thumping soundtrack.

Simon Pegg (Paul and Shaun Of The Dead) provides the comic relief, as he and Cruise sneak into the Kremlin using gadgetry that would put James Bond's tech team to shame. Paula Patton brings poise and warmth to the requisite spy-babe role, and Jeremy Renner (The Hurt Locker), plays a charming data analyst with a secret.

Simple yet effective stunts, such as Cruise leaping onto a moving van are beautifully filmed, and despite Cruise nearing 50, he plays a convincing action hero.

Mission: Impossible - Ghost Protocol throws in a couple of nice surprises in its final minutes, which leaves you wanting more impossible missions from Bird soon. - Phuket Gazette

Pranee Sakulpipatana

ANY recently renewed interest in traditional Phuket culture can simply be attributed to the dedicated work of one woman, the vice-president of the Thai Peranakan Association (TPA), Pranee Sakulpipatana.

Dubbed as the "Phuket local historian", an articulate Ajarn Pranee, as she is known to Phuketians, explains that the TPA exists as a body to revive the traditions of the Chinese people who settled here over two hundred years ago and whose influences have made Phuket what it is today.

"Peranakan" is a Malay word meaning "descendant". It is used in reference to the Chinese immigrants of the 16th Century who settled along the Malay Straits, married indigenous peoples and embraced local customs. However, they fiercely adhered to their roots and identity. Local traditions such as ancestor worship, Chinese New Year, and vegetarianism are some of the legacies left by these people. In Peranakan communities, the men are called Babas, and the women Nyonyas. In Phuket, Peranakans prefer to be called collectively as *Babas*.

"I believe that the real Chinese are overseas Chinese. Even though we don't speak the language, we preserve and honor our ancestral traditions, more so than those in mainland China. Those people have been diluted by modernization and the Cultural Revolution," she said.

Belonging to the Baba lineage her-

self, Ajarn Pranee grew up in a family of textile merchants on Thalang Road. "I loved it there, surrounded as it was with merchant shops full with yards of beautiful batiks and fine European laces. I used to listen to my grandmother's advice to women buying dresses for special occasions. My grandmother was a treasure trove of local knowledge. I find it a shame to let that disappear with time," said Ajarn Pranee.

Ajarn Pranee's strong urge to revive Peranakan culture in Phuket encouraged her to seek help from local politicians, among them Phuket MP Anchalee Wanich, who became the founding president of the TPA.

Although the enterprise started small, Ajarn Pranee wasted no time in creating networks locally and abroad. Realizing that Phuket *Babas* were only part of the bigger picture of Peranakan communities in Singapore, Indonesia and Malaysia – Pranee and her associates, attended numerous symposiums and seminars, each time more inspired than ever to match the work of the TPA to standards of its southeast Asian counterparts.

In a drive to publicize the Phuket *Baba* culture and raise awareness in Thai people, the TPA organizes a series of cultural activities. Thalang Road in Phuket old town, with its distinct Sino-European architecture, has become home to numerous Peranakan events; weddings; fashion shows; Chinese New Year celebrations and mock-ups of open air markets of the past.

Ajarn Pranee has become the ambassador of Phuket *Baba* culture and has spread her mission even farther afield. She has written numerous articles for magazines and has published a book titled *Window into a Phuket Baba Wedding*, both in Thai and English.

But a woman's work is never done. In the offing is a plan to construct a *Baba* museum in the old town, using the old Chartered Bank building to showcase banking businesses from the early part of the 20th Century and the life experiences of a local *Baba* woman. Although funding is still being sought, Ajarn Pranee is hopeful that the museum could open in early 2012.

Fiercely proud of her heritage, Ajarn Pranee practices what she preaches. "My friends and I try to wear *Baba* outfits (batik skirt and a lacy blouse) everyday. Mind you, nowadays it has become quite a fashion statement even among the younger generation," she says proudly.



Floods won't harm Phuket construction sector: P-REA

Tanan Tanphaibul, President of the Phuket Real Estate Association, said members had worried that massive government-funded reconstruction of parts of Bangkok and the Central Plains region might have a negative impact on the building industry on Phuket by siphoning away material and labor supplies.

To learn more, they invited several

speakers to their "Phuket Real Estate Trends Following the 2011 Disaster" seminar, held at the Royal Phuket City Hotel

The members were reassured following a talk by Theerasak Svetsila, sales and service director of Siam Cement's distribution firm SCG Network Management, who forecast a 10.8 per cent increase in construction industry revenue nationwide to over 900 billion baht, much of it led by government mega-projects.

Mr Tanan said there were still concerns of a labor shortage in the central region


that could lure workers north. Many lowwage workers from Burma had fled home during the inundation and it was still unclear if and when they would return, and in what numbers.

Assoc Prof Manop Pongsathat of the Chulalongkorn University Faculty of Architecture said the floods could spur greater numbers of wealthy Bangkok residents to buy second homes in tourist destinations such as Phuket because many believe that this year's flooding would not be the last.

Rambutan: Looks and tastes great

OF THE glorious trees that grace our island gardens, there are many small varieties that are considered ornamentals primarily on account of their decorative blossom.

These include the flame bean (brownea or sok phuang), the erythrina (thong lang or coral tree), the abutilon or Chinese lantern, and the orchid tree (bauhinia or chong ko).

Of course, a complete list would be much more extensive, but for my money, none of these should disappoint the gardener who wants both color and verdant foliage.

But there are many small trees

grown here not so much for their looks as for their usefulness. Indeed, more traditional Thai gardens tended to emphasize such trees because of their obvious value as a food source.

Again, the choice is large, but the first tree to come to mind is the rambutan, or nephelium, a fruiting species that fits neatly into our size category since it reaches a height of only three or four meters.

The rambutan originates from the Malay peninsula, so it is perfectly at home and is extremely popular here. In fact, Thailand is the

world's leading producer of rambutans, especially the area around Surat Thani.

The distinctive reddish-green rounded fruit are covered with fleshy, pliable spines, and look a bit like sweet chestnuts. Rambutans suddenly appear in huge mounds at markets and on supermarket shelves at this time of the year. The rind peels off easily to reveal sweet, white, translucent flesh, sometimes slightly acidic, which encases a glossy brown seed. Delicious.

The tree itself is attractive enough to be popular in gardens. It has evergreen leaves, a rounded crown and blooms with white flower clusters. When it bears its abundant, colorful fruit, this tropical species looks good.

The floods this year have destroyed many commercial orchards in Thailand. As a conse-

> quence, the rambutan has not been as widely available as usual. Although rambutan trees can be grown from the large seeds inside each fruit, the fruit from trees

grown from seeds tend to taste sour, thus seedlings are normally propagated from grafts.

However, it should be easy enough to find a herpmaphroditic (both male and female) container plant in your local nursery in order to produce the goods.

So why not grow one yourself in your own patch? Your Thai neighbors will certainly be impressed.







The Italian connection: match-fixing scandal

CRISTIANO Doni, former Italy and Atalanta midfielder has been arrested along with 17 others, by Italian prosecutor Roberto Di Martino in connection with match-fixing and betting accusations.

Di Martino claims evidence shows contact with criminal groups organized across the globe, from Eastern Europe, South America to Singapore. One suspect arrested stated that the match-fixing had been occurring for 10 years, Di Martino said.

The investigation follows the Italian Football Federation's disciplinary committee actions who banned several players, including Doni in August this year.

Atalanta matches in Serie B were those looked at, although three Serie A matches involving other clubs at the same time were also examined by the committee's investigation, named "Last Bet".

In a similar scandal Juventus

were regulated to the Serie B five years ago, while points penalties were also handed to Lazio, AC Milan, Fiorentina and Reggina for attempting to influence refereeing appointments. – *Phuket Gazette*

Sport Southern regional rivalry set for Division One next season

TWO more Southern Thai football teams, Krabi FC and Pattalung FC, will join FC Phuket in Thai Premier League Division One next season, following the conclusion of the 2011 Division 2 Champions League promotion playoffs last weekend.

Another Southern side, Songkhla FC, is also likely to remain in the first division.

At the climax of a thrilling twomonth campaign, Krabi's promotion was sealed with a lastminute goal in a do-or-die match last Saturday night against promotion contenders Rayong FC.

In front of a standing-roomonly crowd at Krabi Provincial Stadium, the Andaman Eagles' equalizer came only moments after Rayong FC scored the game's first goal – at 89 minutes.

What appeared to be the *coup* de grace came on a perfectly weighted goal line shot from Rayong's Tinnapop Srisatit, whose celebrations concluded with him prostrating himself in front of a sizable contingent of estatic supporters in the visiting stands.

Had the score remained 1-0 to

the referee's final whistle, Rayong would have redeemed their failed campaign for promotion last year, while Krabi would have had to start from scratch again next year in the Division 2 southern region

However, as fate would dictate, the home crowd's 'silence of defeat', coupled with the visiting stands' roaring victory celebrations, were premature.

But even as scores of grimfaced Krabi fans were filing out to beat traffic, the Eagles mounted an intense and sustained attack. Several corner kicks were finally rewarded, with a goal deflected off the head of Thaweephong Charoenroob and finished off by Ghana import Bernard Linford.

Celebrations in Thailand's South lasted through Sunday, when the Southern league runners up, Pattalung sealed promotion with a 2-0 win over Bangkok region league champs Kasetsart University.

Meanwhile, FC Phuket, unable to get promoted or be relegated from Division 1, drew 2-2 in their match on Saturday in Bangkok against last-placed Thai Honda FC.

twice in the first half, during which all the match goals were scored. Poramut Krongborisut drew first blood in the 23rd minute. This was answered 10 minutes later by Thai Honda's Suntin Anukool.

Niran Panthong scored in the 38th minute to put Phuket up 2-1, but Suntin struck again with his second just four minutes later. Despite Thai Honda's desperate efforts, the score remained 2-2 to the end of the match.

With only two matches remaining, the draw was not enough for Thai Honda to escape relegation.

The second team to seal relegation to Division 2 next season was RBAC FC, who suffered a 5-0 pummeling at the cleats of PTT Rayong on Sunday.

The other two relegations spots are undecided, with the likes of Chiangmai FC, Samutprakan Customs United, Bangkok FC, Air Force United, CT Chanthaburi, Suphanburi and JW Rangsit among the sides that could find themselves in Division 2 next season.

In addition to Krabi and Pattalung, Nakhon Ratchasima FC and Ratchaburi FC were also promoted to Division 1. The two southern teams are scheduled for a Division 2 third-place match at 6pm on Christmas Day, to be held at the neutral Trang Central Sports stadium in Trang Town.

Meanwhile, the Division 2 championship match between the Korat Swat Cats and the Ratchaburi Dragons will be held on Christmas Eve, at 6pm at the

Ayutthaya Cen-Sports tral Stadium.

While the likes of Buriram FC and Chainat FC will both bid farewell to Division 1 after only a single season - having each clinched early promotion to the elite Sponsor Thai Premier FC Phuket's Kone Adama league – the third (green) and Jonathan Matijas

their two games - against Buriram and Airforce United.

If Chula United can not win or draw, PTT Rayong will be promoted if it can win each of its three remaining matches, against Bangkok FC, Customs United and Thai Honda – or win two and draw one, considering its superior Goal Difference over Chula.

Songkhla FC have an even thinner margin of hope that would require them winning all four of their remaining matches, against Thai Honda, Rajpracha, Bangkok FC and Customs United, and only hope that both BB Chula United and PTT Rayong do not exceed 60 points while each depreciating in their goal difference ratios.

Such overwhelming odds will likely see the Southern Fighting Bulls remain in Division One next season with Phuket, Krabi and Pattalung along with 14 other teams from around the nation.

At the time of going to press, Phuket

hosting Suphanburi FC at Surakul Stadium. For results of that match, check the Phuket Gazette online.

The Southern Sea Kirin's next match will be on Christmas Day against Air Force United at Surakul Stadium. Kickoff is set for 6pm.

Westwood wins at Amata Spring

LEE Westwood claimed the inaugural Thailand Golf Championship and a US\$158,000 prize purse last Sunday at the Amata Spring Country Club in Chonburi.

The 38-year-old from England fired a three-under-par 69 in the final round to defeat South Africa's Charl Schwartzel by seven shots following a four-shot overnight lead.

Westwood's 22-under-par 266 aggregate total, fourth victory of 2011 and 37th career now moves him up to second place on the World Golf Ranking table.

Masters champion Schwartzel narrowed the lead down to three shots on the back nine with an eagle on the 11th hole, but a bogey on 14 ended his challenge as

Westwood cruised home.

A career low of 60 in the opening round and a 64 on the second day matched the Asian Tour's 36-hole record of 20-under-par, but a 73 on day three put paid to any further heroics in the Asian Tour's final tournament of the 2011 season.

"It means a lot. Any win does. It's special this week because of the difficulty of the golf course, and whom I was up against over the weekend. Charl [Schwartzel] is the Masters champion and he's had a great year. Twenty under after two rounds, it's yours to lose really with an 11 shot lead. There was pressure involved," said Westwood.

The way I putted on the back nine was great. It means a lot, gives me a

lot of confidence. I've been working on this for the past four or five weeks and it was time to hole some of these under pressure," he said.

Schwartzel lamented his bogey on 14, but admitted he was up against an inspired opponent.

"I pulled him back to within three shots after 11 holes. It felt pretty good especially against a player like Lee. He made two great birdies on 12 and 13. I had a very bad lie on 14 and made bogey. That was a big swing there. If it wasn't for Lee, I would have probably won the tournament," said the 27-year-old.

Michael Thompson of the United States claimed third place while local Thai star Chawalit Plaphol finished tied fourth to emerge as the

top Asian finisher alongside England's Simon Dyson on 276.

It was a day of drama for the Tour hopefuls with South African Keith Horne securing 61st place on the Order of Merit to claim the final Tour card for 2012 ahead of Filipino teenager Miguel Tabuena by a mere US\$250. Dutchman Guido Van Der Valk jumped from 83rd to 59th after finishing a creditable sixth with a 73.

Olympic kayak berth a first for Thailand

BORN in Germany, canoeist Husslein Hermann Ludwig, is the latest Thai athlete to make the cut for the London Olympics next year.

The 26-year-old finished second in the men's kayak slalom in the recent Asian Canoeing Championships in Sichuan, China, giving the Rowing and Canoeing Association of Thailand (RCAT) their first-ever Olympic berth in kayaking.

"We sent six Thai athletes to the Asian meet, which ended on Monday, but only Ludwig made it through. The championships served as the Asian Olympic qualification tournament," said Captain Parat Rattanachiayaphan, the RCAT's assistant general secretary.

"This marks the first time in our history that a Thai kayaker will compete at the Olympics. We plan to send him to England beforehand to prepare.

"The Games organisers have given competitors the green light to sharpen their skills at the venue. By training at the actual competing venue, Ludwig can get acquainted with local conditions.

Last year, he finished fourth in the Guangzhou Asian Games and he now carries the RCAT's medal hopes at the Olympics."

Ludwig, who is training under a Slovenian coach, becomes the 19th Thai athlete to qualify for next year's London Olympics.

He joins one athlete each from archery, athletics and skeet & trap shooting, two swimmers, three each from the boxing and taekwondo associations and seven weightlifters.

5th Para Games title for Thailand



THAILAND fell 17 short of their target of 140 gold medals yesterday but underlined their regional supremacy in the 6th Asean Para Games, in Solo, Indonesia.

On the final day of the five-day biennial sports tournament for the disabled, Thailand stretched their domination to a fifth overall title in succession.

Hosts Malaysia captured the overall crown at the inaugural Games in 2001 but since then, Thailand have won every edition

- 2003 in Hanoi, 2005 in Manila, 2008 in Nakhon Ratchasima and 2010 in Kuala Lumpur, where they fought tooth and nail for a huge haul of 157 gold medals.

Along with their 123 golds this year, Thailand collected 96 silver and 73 bronze medals.

More than 1,500 athletes from 11 countries took part in the Games, vying for a total of 422 gold medals and the overall crown.

The Burmese capital of Naypydaw will host the next episode, in 2013. – *The Nation*

Sport Laguna take top spot after demolition of the Leopards

LAST year's Island Furniture T20 champions Laguna faced the dynamic youth team of the Leopards in the season's sixth match and the final league encounter of 2011 at the Alan Cooke Ground (ACG) on Sunday.

A convincing victory was needed by Laguna if they were to move to top of the table going into the new year. The Leopards are of course competing for league honors, but their focus is on honing their match play in readiness for the 2012 National Youth Games cricket competition being hosted at the ACG.

Unfortunately, the Leopards' match experience on Sunday was reduced to that of spectator and a lesson in batting. Laguna scored 329 runs from their allocated 40 overs and with that total set a new ground record.

An unbeaten 84 from Andrew Cole was the highlight of a comfortable Laguna innings which was helped by loose bowling from the Leopards that in the end cost 64 wides and 11 no balls.

If the Leopards bowling was costly their batting proved inexpensive to the Laguna bowling attack with the young guns trudging off the pitch, all out after just 10.3 overs.

Matters could have been a lot worse had Laguna not removed their opening bowlers early on with Val Guiraud (2 wickets for 4 runs) and Sami Ullah (5 wickets for 2 runs including a hat-trick), both of whom decimated the Leopards in the opening 4 overs which presented a remarkable scoreboard showing 7 runs for 7 wickets.

The Leopards got off to a flying start after being put into bat by Laguna when AF Uphama dismissed youth team coach and Laguna opener, Bill Stahmer, with the second ball of the first over from a delightful in-swinging delivery.

Compared to a jubilant Leopards side Laguna were visibly stunned, but opener Damian Clowes (51) playing his first match of the season, took charge and worked a credible half century. Darren Shaw (39), who replaced Stahmer, and Clowes went on to post a solid 122 run partnership backing each other well between the wickets which gave Laguna the base for their record innings.

At the 10 over interval, Laguna were 43 for 1 wicket, but had the Leopards held their catches both Clowes and Shaw could have been back in the pavilion much earlier.

Nineteen overs went by after the first wicket before Clowes was eventually dismissed with the score on 123. Andrew Cole came in at number four and showed his repertoire of strokes by despatching loose deliveries to all sections of the ACG.

Shaw's wicket fell in the 27th over with the score on 168 and Cole was joined by Mario Piazza (42) whose efforts helped provide an 85 run partnership. Piazza and his unorthodox batting style immediately gored into the Leopards bowling attack, slashing for boundaries at every opportunity.

By the third interval, Laguna were 198 runs for 3 wickets and aiming for a total of 250, but Cole had other plans. Within eight overs Cole and a flurry of other batsmen amassed another 100 runs to shoot past the 300 mark with Sami Ullah, also appearing in his first league match of the season, notably chipping in with a quick fire 25 from just 10 balls.

With the last ball of the Leopards innings delivered, Laguna had rocketed to 329 runs for the loss of 7 wickets and new batting record. Pick of the bowlers for the Leopards were AF Uphama (1 for 31 from 8 overs) and TP Suttiprapha (1 for 38 from 8 overs).

Three exhausting hours in the field clearly took its toll on the Leopards, reflected by opener and

captain, PM Suriya being clean bowled by Laguna's 16-year-old speed demon, Valentine Guiraud, in the first over.

Sami Ullah supported Guiraud from the opposite end and trapped opener, TM Suttiprapha lbw and then demolished the stumps of PA Mahthong to compound the Leopards collective misery and fatigue.

Guiraud continued his onslaught of accuracy and pace in the third over by clean bowling AB Kaewliporn, but it was the fourth over that proved utterly calamitous for the Leopards. Ullah spared not an ounce of reserve and decimated the Leopards middle order. By the end of the over, wickets taken had matched runs scored at 7 for 7 which also included a hattrick and no runs scored off the bat.

Umpiring official, John King, had his Sunday lounge turn into a workout, having to update the scoreboard

with the continuous loss of wickets. Mercy was shown by Laguna captain, Sameer Kahn with the introduction of leg-spinner, Darren Shaw in the fifth over.

With the opening speedsters removed from the bowling attack, the Leopards managed to push the score along and were 9 wickets down for 38 runs at the completion of 10 overs. Batsman "First" (8) came in last for the Leopards, but with their fate already sealed they could only add one run before finally yielding at 39 runs all out after 10.3 overs. Laguna's best bowlers were Sami Ullah (5 wick-

ets for 2 runs) and Valentine Guiraud (2 wickets for 4 runs).

Man of the match was Andrew Cole, with Sami Ullah claiming second spot and and Damian Clowes taking third.

The comprehensive win puts Laguna on top of the league table with the Village, each having 12 points.
