New Year road toll 'worst in recent years'

THE annual 'Seven Days of Danger' road safety campaign drew to a close on Wednesday, marking one of the worst road toll records over the New Year long holiday for years.

Officials at the Phuket Office of the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM-Phuket) at the start of the campaign set a target tally of no more than four deaths this year. That target took a battering on Day One of the campaign with three people dying on Phuket's roads.

But not all was doom during the seven days, as Phuket enjoyed not one, but two days without a person dying on Phuket tarmac. See page 3 for our full report on the Seven Days of Danger road safety campaign in Phuket.

Death of young boy sparks safety blitz

THE death of seven-year-old Methee Khunsuinhu on Tuesday has prompted Rawai Municipality and lifeguards to introduce a range of safety measures at the popular swimming lagoon near Nai Harn Beach.

Methee, nicknamed "Shogun", was pulled unconscious from the lagoon by a foreign man at about 4:30pm on New Year's Eve.

He was pronounced dead after three days on life support in the intensive care unit at Vachira Phuket Hospital in Phuket Town.

Rachen Phuntarakit, chief administrative officer (Palad) at Rawai Municipality, told the Gazette that lifeguards at the beach have been given full discretion on which measures are be taken in response to Methee's death.

"Even if they want to ban people from swimming in the lagoon entirely, we would support it," he said.

However, Samart Chandee, chief lifeguard at Nai Harn Beach, confirmed that the lagoon, which is formed by water exiting the sluice gate that empties the neigh-

boring Nai Harn Lake, will stay open to bathers.

'We will install signs in Thai, English and Burmese warning parents to keep an eye on their children playing in and around the lagoon... We want to install several signs because just one big sign will not be effective," he said.

Also, the Phuket Lifeguard Club has already installed ropes with floats to section off safe areas within the lagoon where children will be allowed to swim.

Original reports indicate that Methee was pulled from the water in an area away from where most children play. "It was only

about chest height for an adult, but that is too deep for children, especially when they are left unsupervised," he said.

In addition, vendors operating stalls around the lagoon have walkie-talkies to contact lifeguards in case of an emergency.

Pub murder rings in New Year in Patong

owners turned deadly on New Year's Eve when one gunned down his rival outside a well-known Phuket pub just before dawn on New Year's Day.

Police by 15-year-old Rachain Noonpakdee, said a report in the Siangtai Daily local Thailanguage newspaper.

Rachain said that one of the "big brothers", 35-year-old Wirote "Baomee" Duangjan, was shot twice in the stomach by a man he identified only as Phi Kosit ("big brother Kosit").

Police rushed to the scene, outside a pub

Kor Road, named in the report by its old nickname Soi Tun, which literally translates as "Dead End Street".

Arriving at the scene police found only The shooting was reported to Patong bloodstains and broken shards of glass.

Mr Wirote had already been rushed to Patong Hospital for emergency treatment. From there he was later transferred to the better-equipped Vachira Phuket Hospital in Phuket Town, where he died.

Initial investigation by police revealed that the two men were very well-acquainted. They were both employed by the same unnamed business tycoon to oversee parts

Phuket Town underpass project to start this year

PHEU Thai MP and former Fi-Minister Suchart Thadathamrongvech on January 3 announced that work on the much-debated underpass at the Darasamut Intersection (also known as the Central Festival Intersection) will start this year.

The news was announced at a public meeting at the Phuket Community Hall, near Phuket Provincial Hall, in Phuket Town.

Sriyada Palimaphan, Secretary to the Minister of Social Development and Human Security and coordinator of the ministry's projects in Phuket, confirmed that Cabinet has approved the 600 million baht in funding required for

"The project will start this year. Once complete, the tunnel will open with three traffic lanes," she

Mrs Sriyada added that another underpass, planned for the nearby Samkong Intersection (also known as the Tesco Lotus Intersection), will have to wait.

"We should build both underpasses at the same time, but Prime Minister Yingluck first has to deal with the damage caused by the floods in Bangkok. We will continue to push for the Tesco underpass and I believe we will have the funding for it by next year," she said.

Although now performing a high-level ministerial function in Bangkok, Mrs Sriyada has a long history with Phuket. She represented Phuket as a Thai Rak Thai MP in the Thaksin administration after winning the seat with just over 8% of the electorate in Phuket Voting District 1. She also married the former prime minister's cousin Saravuth Shinawatra.

However, Phuket Provincial Highways Office chief Arun Sanae, who was not at the meeting, told the Phuket Gazette that if work on the underpass does start this year, it is likely to be late in the year.

The project will fall under the responsibility of the Ministry of Land Transport. First of all, they will have to find a construction company capable of undertaking the project. It will take some time to do that," he said.

'They should complete the bidding process and have selected a construction company for the project by the end of the year, but this takes time. There are many steps involved in starting work on a project like this," he told the Gazette.

The Gazette notes that in 2004, then-PM Thaksin rejected outright a proposal to build the same two underpasses at a combined cost of 800 million baht, saying that one tunnel long enough could be built for 600mn baht.

Incumbent Phuket MPs Anchalee Vanich Thepabutr and Raywat Areerob, both Democrats, were not present at the public meeting, either.

Baby saved from drowning

JUST a day after 7-year-old drowning victim Methee Khunsuinhu succumbed to injuries and passed away at Vachira Phuket Hospital, quick action by a foreign tourist today spared a toddler of a similar fate at the same beach.

Pawanrat Suetrong, age 19 months, was on a family outing to the swimming lagoon near Nai Harn Beach on January 4 when the near tragedy occurred.

Her mother, 31-year-old Wimon Sangjan, said she took Pawanrat, her two sisters aged four and nine, as well as her own 14-year-old brother to enjoy a day at the

She went to get the children some drinking water, leaving them

"Pawanrat suddenly began sinking into deeper water, then went under. The other children were in the same area, but they did not notice what was happening to her.

Fortunately, a foreign woman sprang into action, pulling her back onto the shore unconscious," she recounted.

"My daughter was put in a Kusoldham Foundation emergency rescue vehicle and rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital, but after five minutes she began throwing up and then regained consciousness," she said.

Pawanrat was kept in the hospital overnight for observation.

Mrs Wimol, who works in a Nai Harn restaurant, has lived with her family and other relatives in Chalong for five years.

He husband is currently back visiting their native Suphan Buri - Atchaa Khamlo province.





Truck slams into tour van

FOUR Russian tourists on their way to a Phuket magic show got a painful dose of reality on December 27, when the passenger van they were riding in collided with a delivery truck south of

The accident happened at about 7pm on Wiset Road in front of Le Meridien Phuket Beach Resort on the first day of the nationwide Seven Days if Danger road safety campaign.

While trying to avoid rear-ending a six-wheeled truck ahead, the delivery truck swerved across the center line and hit the passenger van, reportedly en route to a magic show on Soi Bangla in Patong.

The van came to rest in the middle of the road, while the truck slid into a roadside ditch.

Phuket Kusoldham Foundation rescue workers said that the minivan driver suffered a broken leg and three of the four Russians were rushed to Patong Hospital for emergency treatment.

New Year holiday road toll record takes a tumble

JANUARY 4 marked the last day of the "Seven Days of Danger" holiday road-safety campaign. With no fatalities recorded in Phuket the previous day, Day 6 of the campaign, the number of fatalities stood at six.

According to official figures from the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation Phuket Office (DDPM-Phuket) on the morning of the last day, Day 6 ended with nine serious injuries in eight reported accidents, but no deaths.

Among the injured was one foreigner, listed as Canadian national Daniel Frewing, age 63. Mr Frewing was driving fast without a helmet when he lost control of his motorbike on Sakdidet Road in Baan Borrae, Wichit, according to DDPM-Phuket notes of the accident. The Canadian was taken to Bangkok Hospital Phuket for treatment.

Of the eight accidents reported on day six, half were attributed to drunk driving. In these cases all of the victims were Thai males in

their 20s and 30s.

The youngest accident victim on the day was three-year-old Nassaroot Bandam, who fell from a motorbike driven by his father. The child was injured when his dangling feet got caught in the wheels, pulling him off the vehicle. The DDPM-Phuket log notes that

the boy was rushed to Thalang Hospital for emergency treatment and then referred to the betterequipped Bangkok Hosptial Phuket.

Day six's accidents bring the total to 66, with six fatalities and 70 people suffering injuries requiring hospitalization. So far during

the campaign, 44,125 vehicles have been pulled over for inspections at police checkpoints in Phuket, with 3,554 charges levied. Eighteen people have been charged with drunk driving since the campaign began.

Nationwide, the first five days of the campaign record 282 people killed and 2,783 injured in 2,544 traffic accidents, the Road Safety Center in Bangkok reported. Buri Ram remains the deadliest province with 16 fatalities, while Chaiyaphum was the only accident-free province.

Compared with last year, deaths were up by one, while injuries were down by 308 and accidents down by 337.

Chiang Rai had the most accidents at 95 while Nakhon Sawan was tops in injuries at 100. On Monday, January 2 alone, 41 people were killed and 401 injured in 377 road accidents.

"Three former volunteer beachguards now operate stalls near the lagoon. All three, like most vendors there, have walkietalkies to contact us in case anything happens," Mr Samart explained.

Also, lifeguards will step up patrols around the lagoon. "We cannot spare a lifeguard to be stationed by the lagoon full time. Right now we have the budget only for only two lifeguard stations on the beach, but I have already spread out our lifeguards over three stations on the beach so we can better respond in case of an emergency.

"What we will do, however, is have our lifeguards patrol the area more frequently than we have done," Mr Samart said.

"Each patrol takes about 10 minutes, and when one lifeguard returns to the lifeguard tent, the other starts walking the patrol again," Mr Samart explained.

"On January 1, at about 4:30pm, lifeguards had to pull a six-year-old girl from the water at same place in the lagoon where Methee was pulled out," he said.

On Wednesday, just one day after Methee succumbed to his injuries, lifguards had to rescue a one-year-old from the lagoon (see facing page).

Rattled yachting community remembers life of local sailor

FRIENDS of Leslie Beasley, who was found dead on a yacht moored in Chalong Bay on December 23, have told the *Gazette* about their shock and sadness over the local sailor's death.

Mr Beasley was looking after the yacht for the owner, who is currently overseas. His body was discovered after the owner had repeatedly failed to contact him about the condition of the yacht, explained Brent McInnes of the Phuket Cruising Yacht Club.

Mr Beasley was found dead three days before his 69th birth-day. Police deem the death a suicide, though the circumstances surrounding it have sent unerving ripples through Phuket's yachting community.

Mr Beasley's body was found with a hose from an oxygen cylinder connected to a plastic bag placed over his head.

"Les lived on Phuket for at least seven years. He was a yacht caretaker and had done work as a boat surveyor," Mr McInnes said.

"He used to come in once a month. He pretty much kept to

himself. He wasn't a gossip monger, but he wasn't a recluse.

"Les was my neighbor for a time and I was fortunate to sail with him on a few occasions," said Justine Bristow.

"I'm not sure how he was with his male friends, but with me he was always a true gentleman. Gentle, knowledgeable and passionate about the ocean.

"I can't actually believe this has happened, but I'm sure that this was not some spur of the moment decision as he always struck me as a very thoughtful and purposeful man," she said.

"I talked to him just the other day. He wanted to tie up his dinghy in front of the yacht club. I said he could just pull it up onto the beach and we'd keep an eye on it, but he said, 'I think I just don't have the strength to pull it [back] off the beach," said Mr McInnes.

Reports from throughout the local yachting fraternity indicate that Mr Beasley may have been suffering from a long battle with pancreatic cancer.

Caring for

HUMANITY has historically held a deep-seeded fear of death. That fear is often intensified when in strange or unknown surroundings.

Most people feel comfortable knowing that when their time comes friends or family will be there for them. But what if there is nobody? What happens to those with no known identity?

The Gazette's Chutharat Plerin reports.

THE unidentified body of a Caucasian male, recovered from the sea south of Phuket last month, was finally laid to rest on December 14.

The red-haired foreigner, dressed only in a black singlet and gray shorts, was discovered by the crew of Thai fishing boat *Sor Naja* as it sailed between Racha Yai Island and Koh Hei on November 4

Chalong Police together with Phuket Ruamjai Foundation res-

cue workers rendezvoused with the *Sor Naja* to recovered the body from the sea. At the time rescue workers assessed that the man might have been about 45 years old.



obvious signs of injury, they speculated that he probably drowned.

Once on dry land, "Red Hair"

was transferred to the morgue at Vachira Phuket Hospital. Meanwhile, police started the often-difficult task of ascertaining his identify, the first step toward contacting relatives who might then arrive and claim the body.

In this case, putting a name to the deceased was difficult from the start as the corpse was found without any identification whatsoever. A review of missing person reports turned up nothing and after laying in the mortuary for a month and a half, it was determined that all lines of inquiry were exhausted. At this point case officer Nitikorn Rawang of the Chalong Police authorized the release of the body to Phuket Kusoldharm Foundation workers for burial

With no known relatives or next of kin to prepare Red Hair for his

final journey, Kusoldharm Foundation staff performed a small funeral ceremony before interring his remains at Mai Khao Cemetery.

Religious beliefs aside, for many of us there is an underlying fear of

Protected snakes seized

A FRUIT seller has been caught smuggling protected snakes onto Koh Lanta in Krabi province, across Phang Nga Bay from Phuket.

Pin Sangduk, 43, was found with eight live snakes stuffed into fertilizer sacks in the back of his pickup truck, which was otherwise loaded with fruit.

Mr Pin was caught when Sgt Maj Terdsak Rakdaeng of Koh Lanta Police pulled him over and searched his pickup at a checkpoint on Tuesday.

In the sacks were six gold-

ringed cat snakes, one Malayan bridle snake and one python.

Sgt Maj Terdsak called Suwat Suksiri, head of the local protected national park Thung Thale Non-Hunting Area, and confirmed that all of the snakes were protected species in Thailand.

Mr Pin told Sgt Maj Terdsak that he was not aware that the snakes were protected.

"I sell fruit at markets on Koh Lanta. I bought these fruits in Nakhon Sri Thammarat. Before I returned to Koh Lanta, my friend who lives in Trang province asked me to take the snakes to a snake show place [on Koh Lanta]. I had no idea that they are protected animals," said Mr Pin.

Mr Pin was taken to Koh Lanta Police Station for further questioning.

A report of the find was drawn up in accordance with the Wildlife Preservation and Protection Act, B.E. 2535 (1992), but Mr Pin has yet to be charged with any offenses.

The death of a tourist can turn a nice holiday into a sad task indeed for a fellow traveler or family member who has to make final arrangements.

In the case of an expat, it is most often the local community that steps in to help, with individuals and sometimes entire groups often going far beyond the call of duty to provide their loved one with a fitting send-off. Even a lone tourist, if identified, usually has the services of an honorary consul to offer advice to relatives concerning repatriation of the body.

But what of Red Hair and other "unknowns" who die in Phuket? How are their remains dealt with? In almost every case they will ultimately find their way to the

Vachira Hospital morgue.

The Vachira morgue can store up to14 bodies at any one time. The bodies of Thai nationals are kept for a week. More often than not, relatives will claim the body within that time. With the bodies of foreign nationals, the holding period may be up to one month. Although not equipped to conduct full autopsies, Vachira staff will conduct a post-mortem examination if requested by police. Often this also involves taking DNA samples to assist in the identification process. In cases where the police require a full autopsy to be carried out, the bodies are sent to Police Region 8 Headquarters in Surat Thani.

If a patient has died in hospital,

relatives are usually easy to contact and hospital staff can complete this on their own. Unidentified bodies can be problematic, however. The issue faced by hospital authorities on how to dispose of such remains is a matter of primacy.

In circumstances where bodies have been brought in by law enforcement officers, the police have the responsibility for contacting relatives, or in the case of foreigners, the relevant diplomatic mission. Bodies, even if they were patients, are considered "unclaimed" if no relatives can be found.

Vachira Hospital keeps a close eye on the number of unidentified bodies in storage at the mortuary.

Once they have several bodies coming to the end of the typical holding period, staff contact the Kusoldharm Foundation to arrange for collection and burial. This is not only for unidentified bodies, but also those that relatives have decided, for whatever reason, to leave with the hospital.

So what happens when the hospital and police decide the time has come for the body to be disposed of? The Kusoldharm Foundation doesn't maintain a fixed collection schedule, but they will respond to requests from any island hospital. The bodies that the Kusoldharm claim are taken to the Mai Khao Cemetery, near to the Phuket Tsunami Wall of Remembrance, for burial.

Kusoldharm workers place the coffins in proper graves to prevent them being disturbed by wild animals or the elements. The graves are laid out in lines, each numbered to identify the body should anyone come forward at a later date to claim a relative. It is a duty that the Kusoldharm workers perform with dignity and

"We have a small ceremony during which we follow the Chinese rituals and burn silver and gold paper at the grave site," Kusoldharm worker Kritsada Suwannaroj told the *Phuket Gazette*.

"In my two years of experience, I have never seen anyone come to claim a buried body. Although once, relatives did come to see us. We were about to exhume the body, but they didn't think they could bear to see it. So we left it in situ and the relatives had a ceremony there at the grave," said Mr Kritsada.

Eventually the graveyard will fill to capacity. When a thousand unclaimed bodies have amassed, the Kusoldharm will exhume them en masse and hold a ceremony before cremating all of the remains, as it has done at other graveyards many times before. After that, new corpses will be buried in the now-vacant graveyard ... starting with grave site number one.

So Red Hair will be remembered, even if who he was, where he came from or how he died is never known. So Rest in Peace Red Hair.





Marine police join safety efforts

EVEN as the Seven Days of Danger road-safety campaign continued across Phuket, the Marine Police were joining the effort on the water by stepping up safety checks and deploying vessels to conduct 24-hour operations.

The move came as Phuket struggles to accommodate the huge influx of tourists who have arrived during the island's "peak season" in tourism, a period that begins just before Christmas and continues into the New Year.

As was usual for that time of year, the *Gazette* received reports of near 100 per cent occupancy at hotels and other forms of tourist accommodation located along Phuket's west coast, especially in the prime tourist beach areas of Patong, Karon and Kata.

To cope with the rising number of people who like to avoid the crowds by heading out to the islands in Phang Nga Bay, including Phi Phi and Koh Yao, extra boat services have been launched at Rassada Pier on the east side of Phuket Town.

Lt Col Rittee Phao Phan, commanding officer of the

Phuket-based Marine Police Region 8, launched the water-safety campaign by leading a team of Marine Police officers to the Rassada Pier to deliver water-safety advice to operators and hand out safety brochures to tourists traveling to the nearby islands.

"Phuket Marine Police are re-

sponsible for the waters around Phuket and some areas of Phang Nga Bay. Passenger safety is our priority. This means ensuring there are no overloaded boats on the water and every passenger is wearing a life jacket," Lt Col Rittee said. Marine Police had been as-

Marine Police had been assigned to look after tourists during

the New Year festivities 24 hours a day, even providing a 24-hour telephone hotline service, which operated until January 5.

The Marine Police ensured tourists' safety using inflatable dinghies and Marine Police vessel Khun Pum [Tor 814] to patrol around Rassada Pier.

Phuket Red Cross Fair underway

SCORES of people are expected to turn out on January 7 for the final night of the Phuket Red Cross Fair in Phuket Town, with many people among the huge crowd hoping to win the top prize in the popular lucky draw: a brand-new Honda City car.

The draw for the grand prize will be held on the Central Stage at 10pm on the closing night of the fair.

The 11-day fair, being held at the Central Stage Area at Saphan Hin, was declared officially underway by Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha, who handed out 50 wheelchairs to disabled people and 88 scholarships to students from poor families on December 31.

The fair has long proved very popular among tourists and residents, each year attracting tens of thousands of visitors from across Phuket.

Hundreds of stalls sell local delicacies, knickknacks, clothing and a huge variety of other items, while entertainment is provided by activities and performances from some of Thailand's top celebrities.

However, without doubt one of the biggest attractions over the years has been the lucky draw.

"I come here every year and I always buy a ticket for the Red Cross lottery. I hope to win the grand prize," local resident Saowapa Nathi-ngam told the *Phuket Gazette*.

"Although I have never won, at least I know that all the money I paid for my ticket will be used for charity," she added.

In addition to a brand-new Honda City car being this year's top prize, other prizes include a motorcycle, gold necklaces, refrigerators, televisions and much more.

Burglar caught with stolen amulets

PHUKET City Police on December 28 arrested a serial thief caught with stolen religious objects, jewelry and other items.

Police Superintendent Chote Chitchai said Wichit resident Eakkat Tipmart, 29, had confessed to burglarizing the Phuket town apartment of Saengduan Chaigma.

The incident at Ms Saengduan's apartment was just the latest burglary in a string of similar thefts, Col Chote said.

Ms Saengduan, 39, reported to police on December 27 that her room at Somboon Apart-

ments in Phuket Town had been burglarized.

A subsequent investigation and a search of Mr Eakkat's apartment in Talad Nua recovered about 100 items that the police suspect were stolen, including Buddhist amulets and other religious images, watches, necklaces, bracelets, rings, mobile phones and computers.

Mr Eakkat was charged with burglary after police compiled evidence from his apartment and CCTV footage.

"Eakkat confessed that he drove to Ms Saengduan's apartment at Soi Imchit, off Chao Fa West Road, by motorbike and stole many of her things," said Col Chote.

Phuket Town residents who believe that they might also have been victims of Mr Eakkat burglaries should contact the Phuket City Police to identify and reclaim their property.

New Year's Tragedy

A NEW Year's Eve celebration went horribly wrong for one family on Koh Samet after a woman shot three bullets into the air to mark the start of 2012.

As Rampha Suphasi, 48, lowered her gun it accidentally discharged again, hitting her husband Thanakit Suphasi in the chest.

Mr Thanakit, also 48, promptly fell down dead.

Police arrived at the scene, the family's Saengthian Beach Resort, around 20 minutes later. They found Mr Thanakit's body lying on the bloodied sand.

Standing nearby was Mrs Rampha, still holding the .22-caliber pistol that killed her husband. Lying nearby were four cartridges.

Mrs Rampha told police that she and her husband had eaten dinner on the beach to celebrate the arrival of the New Year.

After their meal, they waited for the countdown to midnight. When the moment came, Mrs Rampha picked up her gun and

shot three bullets into the sky.

Mrs Rampha told police that when she lowered the gun, it went off, hitting her husband in the chest.

Mrs Rampha insisted that it was an accident, saying they "had never had any arguments whatsoever".

The police charged her with the killing and plan to investigate further to establish whether it was intentional or through negligence.

They will question the couple's relatives to determine if the husband and his self-made widow were actually on good terms.

Police will also conduct forensic tests and examine the bullet trajectories to establish the credibility of Mrs Rampha's story.

Balcony fall kills Russian

A RUSSIAN tourist died in a fall from an interior balcony at a holiday rental home in Kathu, central Phuket, early December 31.

Thung Thong Police received a report at 2:45am that Russian tourist Anton Oleynikov, 32, had died in the fall at the private residence at Loch Palm.

Police Duty Officer Chana Suttimard said that Mr Oleynikov and his friends had rented the large home where he had occupied an upstairs room.

At the time of writing it was unclear what activities Mr Oleynikov was participating in before his fall or if they were directly related to his fatal accident.

The body is now at Patong Hospital awaiting medical examination.

Police have informed the Russian Embassy of the incident.

Call to revise Article 112

THE head of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Thailand (TRCT) Kanit Na Nakorn has called for amendments to be made to Thailand's lese majeste law, which mandates prison terms for anyone found guilty of insulting the monarchy.

Mr Kanit said changes should be made to the law to prevent further social divisions.

The announcment came just days after Army chief Gen Prayuth Chan-ocha said Thais who opposed the law should leave the country.

Mr Kanit said certain elements were invoking Article 112 for selfserving reasons.

At the same time, some have argued that Article 112 stifles their freedom of expression, he said.

"The TRCT has taken up the challenge of reviewing the *lese* majeste clause with the hope of bringing about reconciliation," Mr Kanit said.

The TRCT was set up in July 2010 by former premier Abhisit Vejjajiva in the wake of protests by anti-government "red shirts" that left 92 people dead.

The mandate of the commission is to identify the causes of the con-

flict and take measures to promote long-term reconciliation in Thailand.

The TRCT did not support the abolishment of Article 112, saying that would be "inappropriate to Thai society," Mr Kanit said.


However, the current situation was not sustainable, he said.

Analysts have noted that lese majeste charges, which can be filed by any member of the public, have soared in recent years as Thailand's current political conflict has grown in intensity.

Instead, the TRCT is proposing that the royally-appointed Lord Chamberlain be able to decide whether such charges were warranted — or should be dropped.

The maximum punishment should also be reduced from 15 years to seven years, with the minimum sentence reduced to zero, the panel said.

Mr Kanit said he had forwarded the proposals to Prime Minister

Yingluck Shinawatra for the government's consideration.

Despite the recommendations of the TRCT, there remain powerful elements of Thai society that oppose any reform of the law.

Last month Army chief Gen Prayuth said that activists who opposed Article 112 "must go and live in foreign countries," AFP reported.

"It is not appropriate to discuss this. Personally I will do my part for national security in protecting (the monarchy)," he told reporters.

Members of the current Pheu Thai Party-led government, including deputy premier Chalerm Yoobamrung, have also expressed opposition to amending the law.

MP surrenders to local police

A DEMOCRAT Party MP accused of shooting a rival politician to death has surrendered to police, denying charges of premeditated murder.

Samut Sakhon representative Khanchit Thapsuwan is accused of shooting Udon Kraiwatnussorn, former president of the province's Provincial Administration Organization, eight times at a gas station on Christmas Day before fleeing the scene.

Mr Khanchit reported to a police training unit on December 27 in neighboring Nakhon Pathom.

In contrast to widespread reports that Mr Khanchit and Mr Udon had argued publicly on many occasions, Mr Khanchit's father Anek, a Democrat veteran, said he was not aware of his son having any political feuds.

Mr Khanchit was questioned by police for one hour before being released.

By law, an MP cannot be held on criminal charges while Parliament is in session unless MPs vote to revoke his or her immunity. A letter has been submitted requesting the House to revoke Mr Khanchit's immunity.

Cambodia offers exchange for jailed political activists

CAMBODIA has refused a request by Thai Foreign Minister Surapong Tovichakchaikul for early release of two high-profile Thai political activists, but has raised the unprecedented possibility of a prisoner exchange.

In a visit to Phnom Penh last week, Mr Surapong requested that Veera Somkwamkid and Ratree Pipatanapaiboon be granted royal pardons.

The pair are serving sentences of eight and six years respectively after being arrested for "spying and trespassing" in Cambodian territory in late 2010.

Mr Veera is a leader of the rightwing Thai Patriots Network group affiliated with the "yellow-shirt" People's Alliance for Democracy, while Mrs Ratree is his assistant.

They were among seven Thais arrested in the border area during a period of high tensions between the two neighbors. The group, which also included seated Democrat MP Panich Vikitsreth, were allegedly in the area to inspect the ongoing border demarcation process.

Thailand's lethal roads not a secret

THE UK's Channel 4 recently aired a documentary entitled *The Undocumented Dangers of Thailand's Roads*.

The *Gazette* praises Channel 4 for putting the issue in potential tourists' minds precisely when needed: just before the start of the recently-completed "Seven Days of Danger" road-safety campaign.

However, it was disheartening to hear the account of Brighton-based solicitor Rachel Cooper, whose son Felix died in Thailand when the bus he was travelling on collided with a truck.

"We have looked at the guidebooks and we have looked at the Foreign Office website and there are just no warnings," Channel 4 News reported her saying.

Sympathy must go to any parent who loses a child, but no one who has looked into the issue in any depth could claim that the lethality of Thai roads is a hidden secret.

The fact is that hardly a day goes by without the *Gazette* reporting the loss of yet another life on a Phuket roadway. Likewise, the British Foreign Office does indeed carry warnings about travel by road in Thailand. These are plainly posted in the Travel Advice section of its website.

As recently as November 18, British Ambassador to Thailand Asif Ahmad specifically called for Britons to beware of Thailand's deadly roads.

Amb Ahmad could not have made his plea any clearer, starting his address with: "According to the Royal Thai Police, in 2010, there were 83,261 reported road traffic accidents in Thailand resulting in 7,468 fatalities plus 14,646 injuries and 3,544 serious injuries.

"Also in 2010 about 10% of all deaths of British nationals in Thailand were due to road traffic accidents. So far this year 17 British nationals have died in road traffic accidents in Thailand and a further 36 have been seriously injured."

Little can be done to comfort a grieving mother, and few would deny Ms Cooper whatever catharsis she can find through her comments. The fact remains, however, that the warnings she has denied existed were there all along.

It seems nothing short of a sharp shock will bring the message home to people visiting Phuket: not just the British, but all nationalities

No one expects the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) to post a billboard right in front of the Arrivals Hall at the airport depicting images of the carnage suffered on Phuket roads.

However, considering the continuing loss of life and the fact that even a university-qualified solicitor in the UK says she saw no warnings of how dangerous it is to travel on Thailand's roads, perhaps the time has come for the TAT to finally consider it.



Dealing with Phuket's high season dark side

First PERSON

WE AT the Phuket Tourist Police Volunteers Club Patong deal with many interesting cases, the most recent being Manel's, the missing French girl we found. We receive daily reports of tourists having issues with jet-ski operators, tuktuk drivers, hotels, motorbikes, as well as getting robbed and cheated. This includes cases where tourists make bogus reports to the police.

We deal with both big and small cases, but I always remind our volunteers that our job isn't to solve the big cases, but to help with the small ones, things that we can quickly clear up.

The biggest problem we face now is timeshare scams. I have been actively fighting them for three years and they are still difficult issues to resolve.

The first timeshare problem I encountered concerned a couple who were sitting on the beach when a man selling timeshares gave them a coupon. They were then tricked into thinking they had won a week's stay in a hotel chain. As a result, they signed a contract and agreed to pay 20 per cent of the cost upfront to cover a fee the man was charging, as well as maintenance. The company then charged their credit card 3,600 AUS dollars.

The couple came to us and we contacted the timeshare company, who said it was a mistake made

by their new secretary and canceled the contract. The couple recovered most of the money, but not all of it.

Another worrying development is aggressive ladyboys. They used to be nice, but for the last three years I have been receiving reports of ladyboys attacking and stealing from tourists.

A new threat is from a group of ladyboys using a scanner to copy tourists' credit cards. With the copied credit cards they buy gold from one shop and then sell it to another. They steal credit cards while tourists are being careless and then pass it through a portable scanner before putting it back. They are so fast that most tourists don't even notice.

I would like tourists visiting Phuket not to believe everything they hear. I don't want them to think everyone they meet is honest and won't steal from them.

Leaving valuables unguarded for even a minute is an opportunity for someone, Thai or foreign, to steal them. Tourists in Thailand have to be smart and do things as they would at home, such as wearing a helmet, driving on the correct side of the road and not driving

The most important thing is to never give your passport to anyone, even if it's to rent a motorbike

Tourists shouldn't think Thai people are stupid. They need to treat them with the same respect as they treat people in their home countries.

We want tourists in Phuket to be peaceful and have fun. Not act like cowboys or commandos.

Tourists shouldn't bargain too much. Occasionally it's best to pay the taxi fare, because the irritation it causes is better than the bigger problem they may get into.

I would like people visiting Thailand to enjoy their holiday. Many people visit Thailand every year and 95 per cent of them are very happy with their trip, it's just 5 per cent that have problems.

The pad thai restaurant you thought was home

WHAT does it mean to be a "regular" at a Phuket restaurant? As a new expat on the island I sure can't tell you, but maybe a month ago I think I would have tried.

Whatever its past meaning was, I am positive it doesn't last through the high season, unless you have the cash or reputation to back it up.

It's comforting to be a regular somewhere. There is the daily recognition that you exist as an individual, somehow different from the crowds. Restaurants and cafes become second homes to people for this very reason.

I show up at 8:45pm to the same "cheapy" that I always do for dinner and take my usual seat in a plastic-red chair facing the road. It's hard not to hide a guilty smile after ordering pad thai – again, perhaps for the fourth night in a row.

Happily I tuck the food away without worrying about the price. I don't need to ask, or see if the price is on the menu. I wouldn't ask my mum how much for dinner, cause I already know it's free. I know the price, that's part of being a regular.

"40 baht," the restaurant owner said. "High season," she explained.

That's only five baht more than usual and the food is worth it, but there is a uncomfortable feeling as the cook slams me back into the masses. The five baht hike is a simple reminder of the bottom line; a reminder of the fact that in reality I'm no more special at the place than the couple who stopped in for a bite before heading out to Phi Phi.

My feelings on this have nothing to do with the money. It's the desire to be recognized as somehow different.

Last week a troop of co-workers and I headed down the road to a nicer restaurant for lunch – it

How to get social with a club

I am interested in putting together a social club and I would like to know if I am required to register the club. If so, where does one register?

If we are not registered can we legally have occasional parties and competitions to generate money for club development?

What about having annual membership fees, shirt sales and so on? Would the club have to pay taxes? Would this be different if we were a registered social club?

Is it necessary that committee members have work permits?

Not For Profit Chalong

Suksan Siangeak, Muang Phuket district Administrative Officer (Palad), replies:

Anyone can start a social club and it doesn't need to be registered, as long as you don't disturb other people. If you can take care of each other within the club there won't be a problem.

Since you don't have to register the club it doesn't matter if club members have work permits or not. You will be allowed to sell club products and charge membership fees, but only as long as you take care of each other and don't disturb anyone else.

If you are a foreigner and you want to register an official social club, then you must be qualified. The exact qualifications are dependent on the size and activities of your proposed club. Of course, once you have registered you must detail your club's income to the Revenue Department to see if it is necessary to pay taxes.

You are welcome to come into the Phuket District Office and talk with us in person to explain the purpose of your club and get the details of the qualifications necessary for your case. 

Climate change to raise cost of living

BAD weather could send food prices skyrocketing and drive up the cost of living for consumers in Thailand this year.

Vatchari Vimooktayon, director-general of the Internal Trade Department (DIT), warned that crop damage from natural disasters could cause food-price inflation in the region, as domestic supplies would be

The government's high subsidies for agricultural goods will also cause higher crop prices and markups in some food prices this year, she noted.

To prepare for unexpected situations and production fluctuations, the DIT, under the Ministry of Commerce, will call for some manufacturers to hold buffer stocks of certain staples including palm oil, rice, sugar and canned fish, for example.

However, the department is confident that the prices of other consumer goods will be under control this year, thanks to higher competition and the expectation that fuel prices will remain stable.

The ministry also plans to change some products on its price-control list this year.

It will withdraw soap, shampoo, dish washing detergent, yogurt beverages, garlic, instant coffee and paper napkins.

Meanwhile, farm equipment and service fees for agricultural business will be added as part of a strategy to ensure low production costs for farmers.

Currently, 41 products are on the price-control list, including rice, cooking oil, milk and student uniforms.

Year-end events inject B370mn into economy

A NUMBER of large events held in Phuket during the final month of 2011 are expected to have generated as much as 370 million baht in revenue, government officials were told recently.

The news was announced at a meeting last week at Phuket Provincial Hall.

Chaired by Phuket Governor Tri Aukaradacha, the meeting was attended by representatives from various government departments.

Buayan Suwanmanee, Director of the Phuket Office of Tourism and Sports, lauded collaborative efforts between private and public sector groups in generating the income.

"We our pleased with the outcome of these events," Mr Buayan said, going on to highlight Phuket's money makers in December.

"Three thousand tourists participated in the Phuket World Musiq Festival from December 2 to 5. Organized by the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization, this event generated approximately 4mn baht," he said.

'The 25th Phuket King's Cup Regatta from December 3 to 10 drew 170 competing boats and about 1,000 tourists, generating about 51.5mn baht," he continued.

Six thousand tourists participated in the 131st commemoration ceremony for Admiral Krom Luang Chumphon Khet Udomsak, revered among Thais as the Father of the Royal Thai Navy, said Mr Buavan.

"Held from December 9 to 19 at the Krom Luang Chumphon Shrine at Saphan Hin, the event generated about 8mn baht," he said.

Patong Carnival, held from December 15 to 20, generated 85 million baht and attracted about

20,000 tourists, he noted.

However, the largest event for the month – in terms of expected turnout and revenue generated was the province's New Year countdown festival, he added.

"Colorful Phuket Countdown 2012 was held from December 29 to 31. Our expected target was revenue or tourists the event drew.

Help wanted: abled disabled

WITH the Phuket labor shortage reaching critical levels, authorities are encouraging employers to hire more disabled workers and are advising large organizations that they are legally required to do so.

Officials from Phuket Provincial Office, Phuket Provincial Employment Office and the Human Development and Security Office recently held a meeting at the Phuket Merlin Hotel to inform employers about the subject.

Phuket Provincial Employment Office Chief Noppadol Ployudee said the meeting was to explain to employers about the law relating to the employment of the handicapped persons, as well as highlighting the many advantages of employing them.

Mr Noppadol also discussed the duties of the Labor Ministry relating to 'The Persons with Disabilities' Quality of Life Promotion Act of 2007.

Particularly relevant are Article

33, on the proportion of disabled employees an employer must hire, and Article 35, which concerns providing access to disabled people and catering to their needs in retail stores and other businesses.

The Labor Ministry has a budget to promote awareness of and adherence to these laws. It will target 220 places of work in Phuket that employ more than 100 people and are consequently bound by terms of the 2007 Act.

The Phuket Provincial Employ-

ment Office itself has five disabled people among its staff.

Taking advantage of Phuket's disabled workforce could help ease the island's labor shortage, which Bhuritt Maswongsa, a vice president of the Phuket Tourist Association, recently called "critical".

"The lack of hotel employees has now reached a crisis point with 3,000 to 4,000 unfilled positions," he told the Gazette in a recent interview.

Peak season tourism spike sees limited hotel vacancy

OCCUPANCY rates at hotels along Phuket beaches have averaged more than 90 per cent during the current peak period and are expected to remain at or near capacity well into 2012, the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) has announced.

Bangornrat Shinaprayoon, head of the TAT regional office in Phuket Town, said the island's tourism sector is bustling not only because it is the high season, but also thanks to an increased number of direct flights to Phuket launched in 2011.

Popular destinations including Patong Beach, Karon Beach, Rawai Beach, Chalong Temple and Phromthep Cape have been packed with tourists during the current long holiday period, she noted.

Many hotels in Patong and Karon were turning away guests over the New Year period, despite a decline in arrivals from traditional source markets in Europe due to the finan-

cial situation there, she said.

"Domestic tourism is down overall because of the recent flooding crisis. Most of the Thais that did come to Phuket [in 2011] came to visit friends and family," she said.

Fortunately, the decline in both Thai and European arrivals has been more than offset by an increase in the number of visitors from the Middle East, India and other parts of Asia throughout 2011, she said.

She expects these markets to continue to perform well in 2012, even during the tourism low season that typically begins in May.

"If there are no problems, the tourism sector will continue to thrive in 2012. Besides the New Year celebrations, more Asian tourists will be arriving at the end of January to celebrate the Chinese New Year holiday," she said.

Soi Bangla tops PG poll

SOI Bangla is the number one "must see" tourist attraction in Phuket, according to the results of a recent *Phuket Gazette* online survey.

On December 6, the Gazette posted the following statement and question online: Phuket has so many tourist attractions that most visitors to the island do not have enough time to see them all during their stays. Given this fact, which of the following Phuket tourist attractions would you rank as the number one "must see" on the island?

Of five attractions, in addition to a "none of the above" option, Patong's lively pedestrian street Soi Bangla topped the poll, receiving 26.1 % of all votes.

The "Big Buddha" image came in second with 24.3% of all votes, followed by the Chalong Temple (18.2%), Laem Phromthep (16.8%), and Old Phuket Town (5.2%).

In a breakdown by demographic, Soi Bangla was the most popular attraction chosen among both Thais (41%) and local foreign residents (29%) who responded.


However, only 11% of those who identified themselves as tourists or visitors to Phuket chose the infamous walking street. The most popular replies in this demographic were the Big Buddha image (32%), followed by more traditional destinations Chalong Temple (26%) and the Laem Phromthep scenic vista.

Despite a great deal of improvement in recent years, such as the opening of the new fresh market and the burying of power cables underground, Old Phuket Town fared poorly among all three groups. Its vote tally of 5.2% vote was even less than the "none of the above" option, which received 9.3% of the vote.

While the Big Buddha was the second most popular choice for Thais (20%) and local expats (21%),



Investment up in 2011

DESPITE last year's flooding – arguably the most economically devastating catastrophe in Thailand's history – Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) skyrocketed in 2011, the Board of Investment (BOI) announced last week.

BOI secretary-general Atchaka Sibunruang revealed that the combined value of FDI project applications in 2011 was more than 390 billion baht, a 67% rise from 187.75bn baht the previous year.

The BOI received about 1,020 FDI applications throughout the year, equating to an increase of 18% from the previous year, she said.

She noted that the combined value of all BOI applications in 2011 was 663 billion baht, exceeding its annual target of 500 billion baht.

BOI applications in 2010 were valued at about 412bn baht, she added.

Of this year's projects, investments in the service and infrastructure sectors had the highest value at 251.1bn baht, an

increase of 80 % from 139.7bn baht in 2010, she said.

Meanwhile, the BOI's board of directors has approved the promotion of investment in factories affected by the flooding and for industrial estates in general.

Over 660 factories in floodhit areas are eligible for new incentives in the form of tax exemption extensions.

About 800 companies, whose BOI privileges have already expired, will not be eligible, however.

The maximum benefit of the new incentives is an extension of a corporate-tax exemption for up to eight years, and the the measures will cause a tax revenue loss of up to 12 bn baht per annum, she noted.

Qualified factories can enjoy tax exemptions of between 50 to 150 per cent of their investment value for two, four, five, and eight year periods, she said.

The incentives aim to ease the burden factories face in the rehabilitation and recovery process.

Recovering after New Year




CONTINUING my series where I try to answer the computer questions I hear most frequently here in Phuket, this week I'll tackle a question I hear over and over again around Christmas and New Year: "How do I recover photos or video I've deleted?"

People tend to take a lot of pictures around the end of the year, and all too frequently they delete pictures on the camera or video recorder that they really want to keep. Sometimes the photos go poof because the owner's working with a new camera. Sometimes inexperienced people – little people, in particular – start messing around with things. Sometimes (and I'll raise my hand here) your thumb is just bigger than the little buttons, and a simple slipped push knocks out a great photo.

Whatever your excuse... er, reason... if you've deleted one or more photos or videos on a camera, all is not lost. I've written in this column before about

"undeleting" pictures from a camera - bringing back deleted pictures when you're sure they're gone forever. Invariably I get dozens of re- KEEP COOL: in this case all is lost. sponses from



First things first: if you've accidentally deleted pictures on a camera, DON'T USE THE **CAMERA**. Don't turn it on. Don't plug it into your computer. If the memory card is already out of the camera, don't put it back in the camera. In short: chill. Read the rest of this column before you try anything.

Of all the Windows tricks I've encountered over the years, this one has saved so many people, so many times, that you should seriously consider cutting out this column and stuffing it in your camera bag.

If you accidentally delete pictures on a digital camera, Windows can help you get them back. The method isn't entirely foolproof but if you just deleted the shots of little Billy taking his first steps, and you didn't keep a backup, there is hope. Best of all, there's a photo undelete utility that works almost all the time and it doesn't cost a satang.

Cameras don't have fancy file systems. They use plain, old, simple FAT – the File Allocation Table approach pioneered in the original version of DOS, about a hundred years ago. (Bill Gates wrote much of the original code for FAT.) Camera FAT works with memory cards much like DOS FAT worked with floppy disks and, later, those gigantic 2 MB hard drives.

While FAT has few redeeming social values, one of its great virtues lies in the way that it deletes files. Er. Um. Actually, in the way it *doesn't* delete files. Cameras (via FAT) divvy up their memory card space into fixed-size chunks. When you take a picture, the camera grabs enough unused chunks of the

memory card to hold the picture, transfers the picture from camera's computer to the and card, marks chunks of memory as be-

When you tell your camera to delete a picture, it doesn't really delete anything. It just changes the first character of the file name to a reserved character that signifies, in effect, "the next time you need a chunk of memory, you can use all of the chunks that used to belong to this picture." The camera continues to use all of the memory on your memory card. When it runs out of room, it goes back and looks for chunks that have been marked as being available for re-use.

That's why you don't want to do anything to your camera or its memory card until you're

ready to retrieve the "deleted" pictures - the ones that haven't really been deleted at all. If you mess around with mother nature, you may over-write parts of good (but "deleted") pictures with new pictures. You can see

the effect of over-writing part of one picture with another in the photo

File undelete programs take advantage of the fact that the data - your picture – isn't actually deleted until the camera needs to re-use the space on the memory card. With a bit of luck, you can recover pictures that you took a long, long time ago.

Here's how to get the pictures back:

1. Don not use the camera! More precisely, don't use the memory card that holds the pictures. Every time you use the memory card – on some cameras, every time you stick the memory card back in the camera - you stand the chance of over-writing some of your old pictures (as seen here on the right).

2. Download *Recuva* (pronounced "recover" **TOO LATE:** Using the camera again can overwrite. the downloaded file to install the program. In Vista, Windows 7 and Windows 8 (yes, it runs in the Windows 8 test versions), vou may need to right-click the file and choose Run as Administrator. The installer takes a

nothing can be written to the card, and put it in the card reader. If you don't have a card reader, attach the camera to your PC. In either case, if Windows pops up and offers to do something for you (such as copying the files

It's that easy.

Life & style Take the art – leave the real antiques here

A DISPUTE about the export of art and religious objects between the Thalang National Museum and a Phuket shop was tentatively set to rest after a meeting on December 15.

The museum's concerns that there was a risk of valuable national treasures being illegally exported from Thailand was looked into during the meeting headed by Vice Phuket Governor Somkiet Sangkaosutthirak.

The parties seeking mediation were Vanvilai Limsuepehua and Sumate Kangsaprudtikul, owners of a Patong shop, specializing in antiques and objects of art, and Sukkamol Wongsawan and Kreethapol Yokjaroen, curators of the Thalang National Museum.

The curators were concerned about religious objects being exported, which they said is a sensitive issue to Thai Buddhists. However the shop owners were seeking permission from the Vice Governor to export their Buddhist art objects.

Ending the meeting Vice Governor Somkiet gave his permission for the shop owners to export the Buddha statues in question, but did ask the couple to consider selling other art objects instead of religious items. He also emphasized that the

curators must continue to carefully examine artifacts before they were sent abroad.

The Thalang National Museum curator Kreethapol Yokjaroen told the Phuket Gazette, "Foreigners want to take Buddhist art objects out the country almost as soon as they buy them. However, we have to examine them to ensure they are not ancient and that they have the correct documentation to allow them to be exported from Thailand."

"Previously, the process would take about two weeks to complete. However, with a number of government officials and examining committee members being transferred this year, the process is now taking about three weeks," Mr Kreethapol said.

"Permission is only granted for complete Buddhist religious items. Export permission will not be given for fragments of Buddhist objects or those carved from tree roots," he added.

Fragments of Buddhist statues are prohibited from export because of a history in Thailand of looters removing the heads from statues in archaeological sites and selling them. Buddha carvings crafted from tree roots are also banned from being exported due to them being considered sacrilegious by devout Buddhists. Rootwood coming from under the ground is considered unfit material for the full image of Buddha. In addition to this there is rarely enough wood from the roots to make a complete Buddha carving, also many of the trees that would be used are preserved in Thailand.

The committee, responsible for controlling the export of antiques, consists of the Director of the 15th Regional Office of Fine Arts Phuket, two archaeologist professors, a senior technique artisan and the head of Thalang National Museum. The Phuket Governor, who presides over the committee once matters have reached an advanced stage, makes the final decision on whether or not an object can be exported.

Speaking about his work Mr Kreethapol said, "Up to this point we've not discovered any authentic relics. Mainly we see imitations of ancient artifacts produced anytime from the Ayutthaya period (circa 1867) to now."


"When we have completed our part of the process, the permission documentation is sent to the Provincial Office for their action. Finally, it goes to The Fine Art Department for approval. Only then can the object be taken out of Thailand," he said.

Currently, there are 42 shops in Phuket licensed to deal antiques. Collectively they export about a hundred art objects every year, Mr Kreethapol added.

Ms Vanvilai, whose shop has been open for more than 10 years and exported Buddhist art items for seven, explained, "Our Thai artists are professional Buddhist artists. I don't want to see these skills lost. If they are, Thailand will lose out to China, which is also producing this art form."

"We are doing two things here. We are maintaining jobs for Thai people and preserving our artistic cultural heritage," she added.

Ms Vancilai explained that the most famous places for producing Buddhist art in Thailand are items, we always tell buyers that than the 2,000 baht ours start at."

Tha Phra Chan, Bangkok and Chiang Mai. Tha Phra Chan is well known for the forging of bronze objects and Chaing Mai is best known for its Buddhist paintings, sculptures and carvings.

"Most our clients are foreigners. Before we sell and export

the art is not ancient, it's an imitation of ancient art. I always examine objects coming into our shop to make sure that we are not accepting original antiques or ancient relics," she said.

"Besides," she added, "real ancient items would fetch a lot more

Hogan's hues of a brighter future

HAVING enjoyed a tour of the newly refurbished Angsana Laguna Phuket resort it was suggested by general manager, Mr Jerry John, with a certain degree of pride that the kids club was worthy of particular attention.

While on holidays, every parent appreciates facilities for their children that provide entertainment, are secure and well attended. Angsana's kids club subscribes to these fundamentals, but goes a country mile beyond to give their young guests a wealth of experiences within safe surrounds.

Apart from the solid climbing structures on cushioned flooring, the hi-tech interior with interactive gaming, library and a restaurant dedicated to kids cuisine, a unique aspect to the gated club is the art center.

Walking into the colorful environment we are greeted by Australian artist, Christopher Hogan, who extends a paint-blotted hand of vibrant colors matched by those that awash his apron.

Christopher is a world-renowned artist recognized for his unique abstract paintings and has also been Artist-in-Residence at the Laguna Phuket Summer Family Festivals, where he staged art classes for local schoolchildren and helped raise thousands of baht for Laguna Phuket's community programs.

Currently he holds court over the artistic development of children visiting Angsana with their parents and truth be told, many of the parents as well.

Unlike an art room where children are left to splash and splatter, there is a distinct atmosphere of focus amongst the young artists, interrupted only by the odd request for more paint, another brush or subtle approval for their work in progress.

Rather than offering a class that puts in a few hours for kids, Christopher has a wonderful ability to communicate concepts and the joy in producing a work of art of which the children can be genuinely proud.

It is this skill and with the artistic talent that Christopher sees in local children which has driven a collaboration between him and Angsana to produce a large mural which, with hands on involvement from the public, will generate funds to support school and university art scholarships for Thai youngsters.

"This scholarship could help offer a career in fields such as painting, sculpture, graphic design, interior design and ultimately

could work toward gaining employment within the organization mentoring these selected children," said Christopher.

"With my numerous visits to Thailand and in particular, Phuket, I have taught my art enrichment program at several local schools and many of the children have responded very well to my style of teaching," Christopher added.

"My involvement has expanded over the past two years, with my visits to local schools to conduct art classes in contemporary abstract painting. I teach them a new way of 'seeing'," Christopher explained.

Christopher's work with the resort's corporate and social responsibility (CSR) objectives is part of a combined effort to gather resources so that the work continues to benefit both the children and the community.

"I am finding more and more that the enthusiasm of these local children is rewarding them with producing some excellent examples of artworks with just a few lessons, so I can only imagine what heights we can achieve with a dedicated program in the arts for these young people," he said.

The 14 square meter mural, which when completed will feature in the resort's lobby, is divided into 350 individual tiles and each one bought will then be painted under the guidance of Christopher to be then added

Life & style Marut Lekphet

MARUT Lekpet's appearance is not something you'd expect from a head doctor at a district hospital. Quiet and pensive, his demeanour belies the fact that, at the age of 33, this GP already has a string of literary and artistic achievements behind him.

At Prunai Health Promotion Hospital in Koh Yao Yai, a small island in Pang Nga Bay, Marut and his small medical team tend to the health of the 5000-strong community of Prunai District.

In 2009, when there was a need to replace the 30-year-old inpatient building, Marut was responsible for sourcing architects willing to work with the villagers to design a patientfriendly space that would embrace the traditional ways of life of this close-knitted community.

Expected to be completed in early 2012, the new wing will include a dedicated maternity ward with a wood-fire sauna making up traditional postpartum care. There will also be a prayer room, a community kitchen, a herb garden, and a visitors' social area.

A champion of integrative medicine, Marut admits that he relishes the idea of a hospital designed by the very people who use it.

"I trained in one of the best hospitals in Thailand and the place was downright depressing, and exclusive. In rural areas such as this one we can't deny that the rituals of

birth, illness, and death invariably involve the whole community. Here, if the patient so wishes, we welcome families, healers, and even midwives who may come in to tend to the infirm or perform certain rites of passage. I believe that every hospital should have the facilities to include the patients' support system."

At the weekend Marut ferries back to Phuket, where a different reality awaits. No more hospital gowns and stethoscopes, but the world of books, movies and art. On Thalang Road, Marut runs a bookshop, that doubles up as a an art gallery and screening space for rare movies. The small but vibrant Phuket Literary Club, to which he belongs, meets here regularly and its all-southern members are very keen to make their voice heard in the Thai literally circle.

Marut's love of reading and writing began when he was still in primary school. As a teenager he contributed regularly to the weekly Thai political and literary magazine Matichon. His collection of short stories Ordinary Magic – or Mek Sek Kluen in Thai - won the coveted 2006 Thai Independent Book Award, and earlier this year, his short story Mother's Land also bagged the Thai Parliament Prize for Political Literature.

Apart from writing, Marut also produces short, experimental films. Many have been shown at festivals across Europe and Asia, but not in Thailand where the content, he says, might be too controversial for some.

To the question of how he manages to reconcile his scientific medical work with his artistic pursuits, he answers:

"I don't look at my full-time work as science. It's all about creativity. When I diagnose a patient I create a 'family file' so I can tell at one glance that a male patient with unexplained symptoms has just had a second baby, his diabetic mother has missed her repeated prescriptions, and his first child has not yet been vaccinated. This is why it's great to be a country doctor - you can take your time with the patients."


Marut has many creative projects in the offing: he is editing a collection of short stories by local writers to be published later this year, and has just had a small show of his artwork comprising small-scale installations. He's also tried his hand at producing a feature film. It's true he has a full-time job, but lack of time is never an impediment to this energetic and multi-talented GP.



The Boy Wonder's sad decline

THE 1960s were Tom Wolfe's decade, the stage upon which the founder of the New Journalism strutted with The Electric Kool Aid Test.

The 1970s belonged to Hunter Thompson and the Gonzo journalism of Fear and Loathing in Los Angeles. Wolfe eventually turned to turgid meta-fiction and Thompson to shameless potboilers.

But the 1980s saw the rise of P.J. O'Rourke and his globe-girdling Holidays in Hell in which he wrote about El Salvador, Gaza, Belfast, the Philippines, et al.

Formerly a writer of broad burlesques for The National Lampoon, O'Rourke's breakthrough was a huge gut-busting travel article for Harper's about his descent down the Danube on a Soviet cruise ship packed with old obtuse American lefties. This established his signature style of satire from the Right.

He followed this up with his Iraq war reportage in Give War a Chance but then gave up on war for armchair pontificating.

He as much as acknowledges this slide into domestic mediocrity with the title of his most recent book Holidays in Heck (Atlantic Monthly Press, New York, 2011, 265pp), subtitled "A Former War Correspondent Experiences Frightening Vacation Fun". Here the stars are his wife and his three small children and what they did for fun at home in New Hampshire and on trips to Ohio, Washington D.C. and Hong

While his former methodology was to put himself into a horrible foreign situation and write something funny about it, now he strains for humor from the

mundane. It's a big come down. Still, he hasn't lost his sense of

humor entirely. He has great fun with the rich, whether they are foxhunting in England, quail hunting in South Carolina or travelling with a Republican tour group to the Galapagos Islands. Here is his reflection on Charles Darwin's historic visit aboard the Beagle.

"Anyway, when the Beagle arrived in the Galapagos, Darwin perhaps after a heavy lunch of giant tortoise and beer – formulated

his theory of evolution, which may be restated for Republicans as: If you're slow and edible and I have a gun, the situation will evolve."

And the piece on foxhunting allows him to slip in the line: "There are no atheists in foxhunts."

And on the subject of quail hunting, he mentions that his wife re-

gards birds as "air lizards, icky velociraptors in bad boas."

"I, on the other hand, love birds. I spend a lot of money every year and travel thousands of miles for my love of birds. I trudge across acres of muddy fields, push through tangles of

forest underbrush, and hunker in swamps at dawn simply to find birds - and kill them. Call it tough love."


But most of this book is just shameless filler served up from paid junkets, puff pieces on the new Airbus A380, the aircraft carrier Theodore Roosevelt, the tourist island of Guadalupe. He excoriates the bad art of the Venice Biennale but this is too easy, it's like clubbing baby seals.

Incongruously enough, sited in the midst of all this drivel are three superb pieces of reportage based on trips he took to China and Kyrgyzstan in 2006. He does much of China on riverboat and

> Kyrgyzstan entirely by horseback.

"Not only didn't I know what I was doing, I didn't know where I was doing it . . . Even by the standards of outer space, Kyrgyzstan is remote. If something happened to my horse it would be shot. For me. medical the treatment wouldn't be that sophisticated.

"Furthermore, there were blond hairs all over my clothes and luggage. How would I explain this to my redheaded wife? I had a love affair in Kyrgyzstan. Not only that, but with a male. His legs are beautiful. And he has four of them."

Four years later, he travels to Kabul in "The Seventy-Two Hour Afghan Expert". Here he does what every fly-by hack does and stitches together a dozen interviews into a glib story. For the real story you'd have to ask real war correspon-

dents like Dexter Filkins and Sebastian Junger.

That P.J. O'Rourke has retreated to plush domesticity is his choice, but the books he writes suffer accordingly. I miss the old O'Rourke as seen fleetingly in China and Kyrgyzstan.

AFTER the book and seen the 1979 TV series starring Sir Alec Guinness, now here is the film version of Tinker, Tailor, Soldier, Spy.


It is a masterful re-telling of John le Carré's seminal work about British espionage during the Cold War. George Smiley (played majestically by Gary Oldman), is an intelligence officer who has been brought out of forced retirement to track down a Soviet 'mole' in the highest echelons of the British Secret Intelligence Service. Aided by Peter Guillam (Bendedict Cumberbatch), Smiley sets about uncovering the mole without the knowledge of Percy

Alleline (Toby Jones) and his deputies Bill Haydon (Colin Firth), Roy Bland (Ciarán Hinds) and Toby Esterhase (David Dencik) the Tinker, Tailor, Soldier, Spy of the book (codenames assigned by Control. Head of British Secret Service).

The director, Tomas Alfredson, imbues his first English language feature with scenes that are heavy with period atmosphere and

drama using the best British actors around today.

The screenwriters, Peter Straughan and the late Bridget O'Connor, have also done an exceptional job in condensing down this complicated Cold War thriller into a classic two hour potboiler without losing any of its exposition, characters, and plotting. John le Carré fans are well served.

IN THIS so-called "New Age" of raw food fads, organic salads and whole grain sustainability sometimes it is necessary to go all out for what all macho real-red-meateaters really crave – a great big juicy steak. We hear there is a new steak venue on the island and as part of our New Year celebrations my male colleague and I, both confirmed carnivores, go in search of that elusive rarity – the perfect steak.

Following an extensive US\$30 million refurbishment, the Angsana Laguna Phuket, now the flagship property of Angsana Hotels & Resorts worldwide, occupies the site of the former Sheraton Grande Laguna Phuket.

The refreshed and restyled resort offers a variety of dining options, from Market Place, the resort's all-day dining venue; Baan Talay and Loy Krathong, serving sunset cocktails and Asian tapas; Canal Bakery, which serves fresh baked pastries, sandwiches and and those healthy PC salads and juices to the Bodega & Grill, featuring premium char-grilled steaks, roasted fish and seafood which is where we have come to find the object our meat obsession.

Featuring the best of Italian and Mediterranean cuisine in an elegant indoor or al fresco setting the Bodega & Grill is situated on a picturesquely landscaped patio overlooking the lagoon but we are not here for the view and given the task ahead we opt for the air conditioned comfort indoors.

Executive Chef Mirko Cappa with over 20 years of culinary experience, is the perfect accomplice in our bloodthirsty quest. Having established what we are looking for and gauging our impressive combined body mass index he recommends we plump for the signature Tomahawk (9,375 baht) a generous 1.2 kilogram hunk of Jackcreek wagyu beef designed to accommodate

three to four "normal" diners.

Chef Mirko then proceeds to question us on our predilections pertaining to sauces, side dishes and the most important question of all "How rare do you want it"? Explaining that the meat is presented on a large cast iron skillet resting on a wooden platter he recommends that we choose slightly under our optimal expectation as the meat will continue cooking a little while we eat.

After negotiation we all decide on medium rare to rare but with more emphasis on the rare. This is first time I have ordered a bespoke steak, but then this piece of tender meat was grain fed for up to 500 days so deserves only the utmost respect. By this time our own juices are flowing and to keep us from chewing the table cloth we are offered an exquisite selection of hors d'oeuvres washed down with a beautiful Italian Chardonnay. There was an oyster served in a Margarita (I will never be able to eat an oyster any other way again), pan-fried foie gras with caramelized apple, a duo of salmon and tuna tartare and a salt cod and crab croquette – all fantastic.

At this point we are joined by Bastien Giannetti who will manage the Angsana Beach Club due to open in March. On being told by his fellow countryman and colleague of the wise choice we have made with regards to our bespoke main course, Bastien joins our hedonistic conspiracy and suggests we "Let the meat determine the wine and not the other way around."

We do not argue and are proffered a special selection 2009 La Volte from Tucanny which is light but with just enough tannins to cut through our rich reward.

Angsana is great place to eat and these two professionals really offer the full package when it comes to gastronomic pampering. "If you love meat you must try our signature Beach Club Steak

Tartar once we open" he says angsana.com

as he leaves us to our food.

Bodega & Grill also specializes in authentic homemade pastas, risottos and paellas as well as roasted fish and seafood prepared in a woodfired oven, but we will have to return another time for that as our mission here is focused on red meat.

A short while later as our steak arrives sizzling on it's platter. A long rib bone juts out of the juicy flesh giving it the shape and size of an axe or indeed a tomahawk.

This steak with a marbling factor of 7/9 is so tender we do not even need a steak knife to cut into it as it melts under an average blade.

If there was a competition for the most delicious steak on Phuket then the hefty Bodega & Grill *Tomahawk* would probably win hands down. But we will return to try that Beach Club Porterhouse Tartar.

Life & style No Reservations: the life of a hotel English teacher

TUCKED away on the idyllic white sand beach of Kata Noi, a very chilled out and softly-spoken Jacob Ritter works as a communications specialist and English teacher for the Katathani Beach Resort.

Flanked by palm trees and with an ocean sunset behind him, Ritter sat down with the *Gazette* to share his insight into the luxurious life of a hotel English teacher.

So Jacob, what were you doing prior to working for the Katathani?

I taught physical education at a private school in Bangkok for a while. Then I moved back to Phuket to teach English, tai chi and yoga at Phuket's largest university; I've also done some holistic training at local heath resorts.

How did you find the job?

Actually, my girlfriend found it for me on a Thai-language website called *phuketall.com*.

Describe your average day.

In the low season I do a lot of teaching – usually six hours a day because that's when the staff has time for English lessons. In the high season, there's less teaching and I have more communications work such as writing executive managers' emails and marketing materials. Specifically, I do public relations work for the hotel's environmental projects, of which there are many.

How do you set up your classes?

Classes are set up by department because language levels are often similar within each department. We try to see each class for 8-10 hours each week. I write

most of the lessons, but department heads will also have some requests to suit each department's needs. I work six days a week five are for class time and one is for lesson planning.

Does the hotel supply you with teaching resources?

Yes, we have employee manuals that the hotel owner designed. In addition to these, I've added a lot of my own materials, as well as some materials from past teachers.

What is the most important aspect of language learning for your hotel's staff?

Listening. If they can't listen and understand the guest, then there's going to be a problem.

What is your approach to teaching Thai students?


I try to maintain a relaxed and light-hearted atmosphere in class. Lessons shouldn't be a chore so English becomes something fun for student and they have a positive experience. When you're too serious, it can turn off the flow of learning.

Do you have any discipline problems?

I haven't really had any problems. My students have to approach this like a job; no one wants to cause problems.

Is the job what you expected it to be when you got hired?

It's a bit more dynamic. It demands certain things of me beyond

teaching English so I'm learning a lot too. I do more than I thought I would and that's been a pleasant surprise.

What is the most difficult aspect of your job?

The cultural differences can be challenging and standard expectations for employees are different from those in my home country. Yet other cultural differences also help to create the best aspect of my job. We are here in

a Thai beach resort and everything is quite easygoing so I can't complain.

What's one thing about your job that you would change?

My six-day work week. In my opinion, the long work week can affect overall performance.

What are some of the perks of working for a luxury resort?

I get to attend cocktail parties with hotel guests; I have accommodation in a manager's suite on the beach and utilities are paid for. Also, housekeeping, laundry, meals, hotel discounts and use of hotel's facilities are all included in my salary package.

What should someone seeking a position like yours expect in terms of salary?

At least 30-35 thousand with the perks I mentioned before. Without the benefits and perks, at least 45 thousand, but I know of some hotels here offering less.



Back to school

THE Thai Ministry of Education has sent over two million books to flood-hit schools in 65 provinces across the country, according to Thai News Agency.

Education Minister Woravat Auapinyakul recently presided over a ceremony to release a caravan of 2.27mn books, donated by Suksapan Panich (a state-owned enterprise responsible for producing and distributing school books).

The school books, worth some 251mn baht are to be delivered to flood-affected schools in 65 provinces under the supervision of his ministry's Office of the Basic Education Commission and Office of the Non-Formal and Informal Education by Jan 31, 2012.

Fourteen billion baht's worth of books and learning equipment in more than 2,600 schools were damaged by the recent floods.

The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) has also donated basic school supplies or "School in a Box" kits as part of the agency's policy to

support global students' continual learning despite natural disasters or wars, said UNICEF representative for Thailand, Tomoo Hozumi.

Containing notebooks, pencils, pens, maps and other learning tools, up to 2,500 kits were delivered to students in 1,300 schools in 39 floodaffected provinces.

The kits will enable flood-affected Thai students to be ready for their new semester this month, even though their school buildings were recently damaged by floodwater.


Hozumi also said that UNICEF has budgeted US\$1.2mn to support flood-affected children and their families in Thailand.

John Eramanis, who added special effects and magic to the Danze Fantasy productions.


Over the past thirty years, they have mounted magic and dance spectaculars around Europe, Australia and Asia.





Dollar set to rise against Thai baht

STANDARD Chartered Bangkok Thailand is forecasting the appreciation of the US dollar against Thai currency of up to 32.5 baht in the first quarter of 2012.

Scribing the way to a clear handover

ONCE your dream home has been built, the builder or seller may require a swift inspection of the property and acceptance that all construction work has been completed. This is often the case as the acceptance of the construction works is typically the last hurdle making final payment due.

However, buyers normally want a physical due diligence performed on the property to verify that all construction work has been completed as agreed to, in good workmanship, free from defects that can be time consuming to correct and thereby "delay" the final payment.

These conflicting interests should be addressed under the agreements signed by the buyer and the seller or builder. Such agreements should provide the relevant parties with a guideline for the handover procedure and a clear understanding of their responsibilities in this procedure.

Typically, such handovers commence with a completion notice sent by the seller or builder to the buyer stating completion of the construction and providing the buyer with the possibility to inspect the construction works.

The seller or builder should at-

tend the buyer's inspection and assist with preparing a concise inspection report itemizing defects or non-conformities and stipulating a date by when these will be rectified. This report should be issued in two identical sets and signed by both parties.

Some buyers may not be familiar with construction matters and therefore want to appoint a surveyor or building engineer to assist with the process. A builder or seller should have no problem with a buyer hiring such professional assistance.

Nevertheless, it is advisable to clarify under the relevant agreements that the buyer shall have the right to appoint a representative who may make site inspections during construction and assist with the handover.

Sometimes these agreements also allow for an independent inspector to be appointed, with approval by both the seller and buyer, to settle disputes over defects. In these cases, the agreements may stipulate that the inspector's decision shall be final and binding, and can have the party found at fault pay any expenses involved in appointing such inspector and correcting the defect (if any).

Furthermore, it should be understood that the inspection and subsequent handover shall not be deemed as a buyer's acceptance that the completed property is free from defects. The acceptance should take place after all detected defects have been repaired and such rectification acknowledged in writing.

If a seller or builder fails to make good all defects or non-conformities within a reasonable time frame, the parties' agreements should provide for appropriate remedy in favor of the buyer. This could include a right to reject acceptance of the property and to withhold outstanding payments until all defects are fully rectified.

In addition, the buyer could be provided with a right to appoint a third-party contractor to complete the construction work and make good all defects at the expense of the seller or builder.

To summarize, it is highly recommended for both the seller and the buyer of a property to





agree on clear handover procedures, hence providing both parties with a guideline regarding their responsibilities existing in connection therewith.

This should minimize the risk of a dispute and the problems that soon follow.

Growing plants indoors and outdoors in water

WHEN I first came to Thailand, I was, like everyone else from colder climes, astounded by the sheer range of plant life.

Even more amazing was the way nature not only coped, but actually thrives in these hot, humid conditions some of which seemed downright alien: smoggy air, poor soil, periods with either burning sun or bucketing rain. The very first night I spent in a Phuket hotel, there were vases and glasses attached to the walls with flourishing green plants cascading down their sides.

After all the struggles of trying to grow house plants in so-called temperate climes, this was a real eye-opener. A lesson once learned is one never forgotten. Nowadays, the bathrooms in my house have philodendrons or dracaenas to add a fresh dash of greenery, all grown with the absolute minimum of fuss.

Which brings us to a reader's query. He asks which plants can be grown in water? The question is not only which, but where?

Outdoors is one thing: indoors quite another. Let's start outdoors. Of course, we all know about water lilies (nympheas) and lotuses (nelumbo nucifera). Lilies, now available in brilliant deep colors, grow splendidly in plastic pots in fish ponds, or in wide terra-cotta containers that give the round floating leaves plenty of room: lotuses are better in a large, narrow-necked vase from which their long elegant stems topped by parasol-like leaves and dramatic blooms can be seen to best advantage.

However, there are plenty of other less well known water denizens, better known for their foliage than their flowers; for example the pickerel weed (pontederia) which has long dark stems and dark green heart-shaped leaves, or the larger (up to five or six feet) water canna (thalia) which has long, erect woody stalks which may be deep red or green. The elegant oval leaves grow at the tips.

The water canna is particularly popular with Thais as a front yard specimen. Papyrus (cyperus) is



another excellent choice, with its sculptural bright green stems and circular crowns of narrow, grasslike leaves. It looks the part in a vase or deepish pond.

Remember though that these are all essentially outdoor plants and sunworshippers. Moreover, they all have roots in the soil at the bottom of your water-filled pot or pond which will need feeding from time to time with fertilizer tablets. And they require to be grown in that special clinging mud that is sold, already moistened, at plant nurseries in white plastic bags. Marsh plants, if you like.

Plants grown in water-filled containers indoors are usually not water-based at all, but they will adapt to these very different conditions, since they can tolerate low levels of sunlight, and have roots that can survive in a condition of permanent wetness. In general these are bog dwellers, or plants that prefer shade and moist surroundings.

Put them in ceramic or glass receptacles (readily available) that are flat on one side and can be fastened to a wall. They can be cuttings, or already rooted. With rooted specimens, carefully wash the soil off first.

Plants that should respond to this treatment include the lucky bamboo (dracaena sanderiana), which is often marketed in this way, some philodendrons, possibly alocasias, and anthuriums.

Try them out and see. That's half the fun.



MANCHESTER City took full advantage of a Pepe Reina error on a blustery night to secure a comfortable 3-0 win over Liverpool at the Etihad Stadium.

Sergio Aguero was the benefactor of the Reina blunder, and with Yaya Toure heading high into the net from a David Silva corner doubled the Blue's advantage before the half-time break.

Even with an equal share of possession and more shots on target, the Reds lacked any real bite in attack until late with efforts from Stewart Downing and substitute Steven Gerrard.

Joe Hart rarely looked troubled in Man City's goal dealing with the visitor's attentions confidently.

Liverpool who have confirmed that they will not appeal the eight match ban handed to Luis Suarez for racially abusing Manchester United defender Patrice Evra, sorely missed his services.

James Milner wrapped up proceedings with pure power from the penalty spot, after Toure was brought down by Martin Skrtel while Man City's manager Roberto Mancini waved an imaginary red card at the incident.

Perhaps Mancini was looking for

redress after the harsh dismissal of Gareth Barry for two bookable offenses, who will now miss the FA Cup 3rd round tie with arch-rivals Manchester United.

Tottenham Hotspur meanwhile kept up the pressure on the league leaders by grinding out a victory over lowly West Bromwich Albion.

West Brom manager Roy Hodgson's formation of 4-5-1 from the off clearly showed he was intent on gaining a precious point for premiership survival.

It almost worked until excellent work by Gareth Bale and Rafael van der Vaart set-up Jermain Defoe on the hour mark. Turning on the spot, Defoe poked the ball past Ben Foster despite four players surrounding him just outside the defenders' sixyard box.

Arsenal also have a tricky tie against Npower Championship outfit, Leeds United.


Currently just outside the playoff zone, the Whites will enjoy the distraction of the Cup after a torrid festive period, picking-up only three points out of a possible 12.

December

Entries exceed for King's Cup and LPT



Laguna's week long triathlon festival ended in December with Massimo Cigana from Italy winning the men's title for a record third time and Radka Vodickva from the Czech Republic taking the women's crown. A week later at Laguna, Michael Raelert of Germany won the men's Ironman 70.3 Asia Pacific triathlon title and Melissa Rollison from Australia took the women's honor. Annissa Flynn posted three wins and a second palce on the Asian Surfing Competition Pro Calender which put her in second place for overall tour results in 2011. The 25th King's Cup Regatta had it's largest competitive fleet entered with first place eventually going to *Team Premeier*, skippered by Hannes Weimer. FC Phuket's season fizzled out and may result in the club's dissolution.

Cheering banned at final FC Phuket home match

AN APPEAL by FC Phuket to be allowed to play their last home match of the season at Surakul Stadium has been approved by the Football Association of Thailand (FAT), but under the bizarre proviso that home-side fans will not be allowed to cheer their team on.

"Fans will only be allowed to sit still. There can be no wearing of FC Phuket shirts or other gear, no singing or chanting, no drumming, no cheering the team on whatsoever. This is in order not to put pressure on the Bangkok FC's players," Assistant Coach Apichart Mosika told the Gazette during the team's first post-holiday training session at the stadium.

The appeal followed a ruling by the FAT board that the team lost its right to host the match following their December 21 home loss to Suphanburi FC, after which the referee, surrounded by a contingent of furious FC Phuket supporters, was obstructed from leaving the pitch until he reluctantly offered an apology.

That rulling said Phuket would have to find a neutral pitch for the

FC Phuket successfully argued that this was unfair because the ban affected their last home game of the season, when it should have been applied to the following match, which was against Air Force United on December 25.

Meanwhile, ten players took part in Monday's workout, including a surprise showing by goalkeeper Jonathan "John" Matijas, whose contract with the team expired on December 31.

"This is my last day here. Tomorrow I will fly to Bangkok to look for a new team. Anyway, I will come back here for vacation for sure," the Frenchman said.

Though only joining the team in July, John's signature mohawk hair cut, pretty boy poses and superman diving saves quickly accumulated him a following in Phuket.

All good things must come to end eventually, and John had to bid his final farewell to Phuket fans.

In a post on the team's fan club Facebook page wall, he wrote, "I spent a magical half-of-a-season with you. When you came watching our games you came with your heart, when you met us anywhere you talked to us with your heart. FC Phuket fan club, when you live, you do it with your heart. That's exactly why I played every minute with my heart too. You are great supporters and amazing persons too! I'm gonna miss you all and hope to come back some day. When FC Phuket becomes a big team, it will be a pleasure if I can be on your side then. Goodbye my supporters."

Also at Monday's workout were two Nigerian players looking to catch the attention of the FC Phuket coaching staff.

Oniovokukor Akpos Joseph, 26, just ended a contract with Phayao FC in the Division 2 Regional League, while his friend Ike Michael, 27, two years ago played with Prachinburi FC, which at the time was in Division 1.

Saturday's opponent Bangkok FC are currently in 12th place in the table, three spots below FC Phuket. The season for both sides is drawing to a close. Phuket's final game is an away match against league runners up, Chainat FC. Bangkok finish on the same day, hosting Chiangmai FC.

Those that are left of the Southern Sea Kirin will be looking for some payback after Bangkok FC crushed them 5-2 in their first encounter in Bangkok in April last year.

That match was called six minutes short of time when a high-powered squall hit the pitch. It was later discussed that, in order to save on expenses, the final

six minutes be played in Phuket before Saturday's match.

However, FC Phuket later conceded the 5-2 defeat, thus eliminating the even more bizarre scenario of fans being able to cheer as normal during six minutes, then having to suffer in silence during the more important 90-minute match that would follow.

With cheering by Phuket fan's banned, and many core players gone, it could turn out to be a


strange finale indeed.


