#### Phuket shrugs off fallout from Bangkok blasts

THE recent bombings in Bangkok have not resulted in cancellations of hotel bookings in Phuket and the island's tourism industry prospects for 2012 remain strong, the Phuket Tourist Association (PTA) has announced.

Barring a "major incident", Phuket can expect to have strong tourist arrival figures from both Europe and Asia throughout 2012, PTA President Jirayus Somboon told the *Gazette*.

Sustained and aggressive destination marketing, including roadshows to India, has resulted in continued growth in the Indian inbound market, he said.

Meanwhile, Tanan Tanphaibul, the head of the Phuket Real Estate Association (P-REA), has announced that Bangkok-based developers will generate as much as 30 billion baht into the local economy this year,

#### Hundreds of tourists struggle to get home after Air Australia collapse

SCORES of Australian tourists in Phuket have spent the past week scrambling to get home after the overnight collapse of Air Australia last Thursday.

Some tourists have spent up to AUS\$500 out of their own pockets so that they can return to work, study and other commitments. Many others simply did not have the cash and were forced to phone family and friends in Australia to come up with the funds to buy new flight tickets to get home.

"Our bags were already on the plane and we were about to board when they canceled the flight," said Trevor Moloney, 30.

"We were told they couldn't afford to pay the petrol bill," added his partner Caley Wilkinson.

The flight in question was scheduled to take off at 7:30pm.

Michaela Colahan, 19, arrived in Phuket with a party of female friends on February 3. "We had to get taxis back to Patong, but a lot of people stayed in the airport as they had no other choice," she said.

"They just said they couldn't put us up and said sorry for the inconvenience. They were not helpful at all." she added.

Phuket Airport Director Prathuang Sorngkam denied reports that stranded tourists were kicked out of the airport in the early hours of the morning. "The airport is open 24 hours. Some of the Australians stayed overnight at the airport. It's not true that anyone was kicked out of the airport," he told the *Gazette*.

Mr Moloney and Ms Wilkinson were lucky. "We got a room for a few hours to get some sleep before we came back to the airport. We couldn't get on to a computer to book another flight to fly home so we rang home to our families.

"We have now got a flight booked for tomorrow to go to Singapore for seven hours and then to Australia, so we will get home by Sunday night," Mr Moloney said.

"We have to spend a lot of money that the airline won't cover. Meanwhile, the insurance we have won't cover Air Australia," Ms Wilkinson added.

Australian national carrier Qantas and fellow Australian airline Jetstar stepped in to provide some relief. Qantas allowed stranded passengers with tickets to board their flights in Bangkok. Jetstar provided a special flight last Sunday and allowed stranded tourists with tickets to occupy spare seats on the airline's direct flights from Phuket to Australia.

Air Australia's creditors are reportedly facing losses in the tens of millions of Australian dollars. Australian newspapers reported that Turkish airline Atlasjet within days repossessed the A330 aircraft that was stranded on the tarmac in Phuket after a fuel supplier had refused to extend credit, prompting the airline to enter voluntary receivership.

Three other A330s and one A320 aircraft leased to Air Australia were expected to be repossessed by their owners by this weekend.

#### Prompong pushes for 10bn baht rail link

GOVERNMENT Spokesman Prompong Nopparit has voiced his support for a 10billion-baht extension of train lines from Surat Thani to just north of Phuket.

Currently, rail passengers and freight bound for Phuket can travel only as far south as Surat Thani.

The extension would be about 160 kilometers long, stretching from Keereerat District in Surat Thani province to Baan Thanoon in Phang Nga – or even as far south as the Sarasin Bridge.

Regardless of the final destination, the move to extend the rail network to support Phuket received his full backing, he said.

Mr Prompong made his announcement at a meeting of high-ranking officials held to finalize which projects will be presented to the Cabinet at their meeting in Phuket next month.

"I also suggest presenting the idea of lengthening the runway at Phuket Airport to the Cabinet. The 5.7bn baht budget to boost the airport's annual capacity to 12.5mn passengers by adding 15 more aircraft gates has already been approved. So

we should use this opportunity to present the runway extension scheme to Cabinet," he said.

Mr Prompong said he understood that what people really needed was improved public utilities and traffic infrastructure.

"Every April Phuket faces a water shortage. So we should think about an external water supply from Phang Nga and Krabi to support Phuket.

"Having a convenient transportation system and reliable public utilities will improve the lives of Andaman residents and support the tourism industry," he said.

#### Phi Phi suspect pleads not guilty

A THAI man accused of stabbing a British tourist on Phi Phi Island last year, pleaded "not guilty" to charges of attempted murder before Krabi Court on February 20.

The suspect, 23-year-old Hamed Poonyung, has been charged for the attempted murder of Nicholas Palmer, 23, during a beach party in October last year.

Mr Hamed appeared before Krabi Provincial Court for the second time Monday, when he pleaded "not guilty" to the charges.

Boontham Srisaeng, an official at the Krabi Provincial Prosecutor's Office, told the Gazette: "Mr Hamed denied the charges, so we have to investigate further and collect more evidence. Witnesses at the scene will be questioned for

more details about the event."

"I advised him to confess. Had he done so, he would only have been sentenced to five years in prison. If he is found guilty after our investigation, he will now face a sentence of 10 years to life in prison," he added.

# Chlorine gas cloud puts nine children in hospital

POWDERED chlorine being mistakenly mixed directly into a resort pool water treatment tank resulted in nine children under the age of fifteen being rushed to hospital last Saturday.

In addition to the nine young children 26 others, mostly tourists, were hospitalized.

Among them was 27-year-old Annika Ober Hrnic of Sweden, who is seven months pregnant.

Initial reports by media that an "explosion" at the Phuket Orchid Resort in Karon had caused "mass injuries" sparked quick action by local emergency workers.

On arriving at the scene, however, they quickly realized that there had been no explosion.

Tourists had reported the sound of the powdered chlorine rapidly expanding in the tank, causing several resonating booms.

Patong Hospital official Hathairat Rangsansarit told the Gazette that 37 people were rushed to Patong Hospital for immediate treatment for chlorine inhalation. All 37 victims were later transferred to Vachira Phuket Hospital, Bangkok Hospital Phuket or Phuket International Hospital.

As of Monday, all had been released with the exception of Mrs Hrnic, who remained under observation at Bangkok Hospital Phuket their daughter Laura had both albecause she is seven-months pregnant, Ms Hathairat confirmed.

"I believe this is worth the investment," he added.

From a wider perspective Mr Prompong noted that there were many projects outlined at the meeting that he would present to Cabinet.

They included the widening of a 200km stretch of the Petchkasem Highway to four lanes from Phang Nga to Chumphon at a cost of about 4bn baht and the addition of a new Prince of Songkla University campus on 300 rai (480 square

kilometers) of land in Phang Nga. "These are projects that will be

most advantageous to people in the Andaman region," Mr Prompong said.

Phuket Governor Augkaradacha, who chaired the meeting, announced that the Phuket projects that will be presented to Cabinet next month are the Airport-Phuket Town monorail, the Patong tunnel, the Phuket Airport expansion, the Convention and Exhibition Center, the Klong Koh Pee Road improvement project, the Central Festival

Phuket and Tesco Lotus Phuket underpasses and the Phuket Hospital expansion.

"The budgets for all these projects will be discussed at a later meeting," he added.

Present at the meeting were Phuket Senator Thanyarat Achariyachai, who is currently chairwoman of the Senate Committee on Tourism, as well as Phuket MP Raywat Areerob, Pheu Thai party list MP Kohkaew Pikulthong and representatives from Phang Nga, Krabi, Trang and Ranong.





#### Tremor hits Phang Nga, no damage reported

COASTAL residents of Takuapa District in Phang Nga were put on alert on Monday morning following a minor earthquake.

The localized tremor caused no damage.

Somkiat Intorrajan, director of the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation office in Phang Nga (DDPM-Phang Nga), said the 2.7-magnitude tremor hit at 3:48am and lasted just 10 seconds.

Initial analysis put the center near the village of Baan Bang Rak Nai in Khok Khian sub-district.

Residents of the area felt the tremor, but no injuries or damage were reported.

Provincial officials were told to monitor the situation and prepare to take measures in case the tremors were a foreshock of a larger event yet to come.

Officials who inspected the area discovered that the tremor failed to cause any panic among local residents.

Takuapa District Chief Siriphat Phattanakul said he put coastal residents on alert as he was not immediately sure whether the event was just a small localized event or the effects of a larger earthquake further away.

# 'I'm not the bad guy'

#### Alleged assassination mastermind surrenders, claims innocence

PHUKET businessman Atsadakorn "Pod" Seedokbuab, wanted by police as the alleged mastermind behind the assassination of Phuket newsman Wisut "Ae Inside" Tangwitthayaporn last month, surrendered to police on February 12.

Mr Atsadakorn, owner of KPP Cable TV and a vice president of the Phuket Chamber of Commerce, flatly denied any involvement and was quickly released after posting 3.4 million baht bail bond with Phuket Provincial Court.

"I had nothing to do with it. I knew Ae very well. When he joined the red shirt protests in Bangkok, he called and asked me for money. I gave it to him. I supported him," Mr Atsadakorn told the press at Phuket City Police Station.

"We had a good, close relationship. Why would I kill him?" he asked.

Mr Atsadakorn denied knowing fellow suspect Noppadol "Pae" Praisri, arrested by police in Chaam as the alleged getaway driver for alleged gunman Tossaporn Ketkaew.

However, Mr Atsadakorn admitted to knowing the fourth suspect, 48-year-old Somkuan

friend. I once hired him to operate a digger at a construction site at one of my developments, but I do not know where he is now,"

His delay in presenting himself to police stemmed from the fact that he was in Burma on business and only learnt he was wanted in Phuket upon returning to Bangkok, Mr Atsadakorn said.

"I have surrendered to police so I can clear my name. I assure you that I had nothing to do with the murder. I don't know why I was dragged into this," he added.

Mr Atsadakorn confirmed to the press that he did take umbrage over comments published by Mr Wisut in the final issue of his political journal *Inside Phuket*.

The comments refer to an unnamed media business owner who received sexual favors from a certain woman in return for protection for her unspecified "bad deeds".

Mr Atsadakorn denied having sex with the woman, saying he was a married man. "I used to do some bad things, but I have cleaned myself up. I will never do those things again," he said.

His surrender did not depend on his being granted immediate bail, as was widely reported, Mr Atsadakorn said.

"Today I surrender to the police, I am willing to accept whatever actions the police want to take from here," he added.

# Murder fugitive Aldhouse wins right to appeal in UK

THE return to Phuket of fugitive British murder suspect Lee Aldhouse remains on hold, as the kickboxer has won the right to appeal an extradition order, the UK media has reported.

Lee Aldhouse, 27, fled Thailand after he allegedly stabbed American Deshawn Longfellow to death in August 2010. He was later arrested at Heathrow Airport on an unrelated charge when he tried to re-enter the UK.

The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) in Bangkok, citing the volume of evidence in the case, moved quickly to request the extradition of Mr Aldhouse. The OAG assured the British Government that Aldhouse would not face the death penalty if convicted.

However, despite British Home Secretary Theresa May previously claiming Aldhouse "had forfeited his right" to appeal extradition, two senior judges have now ruled his complaints were "far from frivolous" and allowed him to press ahead with his High Court challenge, according to a report by the *Birmingham Mail*.

Mr Aldhouse has argued his extradition should be blocked because conditions in Thai jails breach Article 3 of the Human Rights Convention, which prohibits "inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment", said the report.

"Whichever way the issue might

go, it is far from a frivolous one... The issues are of sufficient importance and arguability for it to be only just that the appeal be heard. Accordingly, we find against the Government of Thailand and Home Secretary on this preliminary issue." one of the justices wrote.



#### Paiboon resigns to allow snap election

PAIBOON Upatising has resigned his position as president of the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) so elections can be held before April 20.

"My term as president was scheduled to end on April 20, and elections must be held within 60 days of the end of term," Mr Paiboon told a press conference on February 16.

That meant that *OrBorJor* elections would have been held around the middle of June, but going to the polls early would give the

*OrBorJor* enough time to form a council and ensure that major administration tasks continue smoothly, Mr Paiboon said.

He cited the example of the *OrBorJor* hospital in Rassada needing to have contracts renewed. "We should have a new council by May to continue the contracts, otherwise the hospital will have to close. Also, the budget for the next fiscal year must be filed by October, or else there will be delays in securing funding for major projects," he explained.

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# More CCTVs for safety Underpass

GOVERNMENT spokesman Prompong Nopparit was back in Phuket on February 19 to launch a new tourist safety campaign that will see a rapid expansion in the number of closed-circuit television cameras (CCTV) in Patong and other popular tourist destinations.

The purpose of Mr Prompong's latest visit was to launch a nationwide "500,000 eyeballs for tourist safety and security" campaign. Phuket will serve as the pilot province for the campaign, which will subsequently spread to other tourist destinations, he said.

Accompanying Mr Prompong on his tour of Soi Bangla were Preechavude Keesin, in his capacity as chairman of the Patong Municipality Community Groups Association, and Patong Entertainment Business Association (PEBA) President Weerawit Kurasombat.

Both men presented to Mr Prompong a document assuring the readiness of their respective groups to join the campaign, a key of which is to have business operators take the lead in installing CCTV cameras to boost surveillance.

Mr Prompong, who oversees the Andaman region for the Pheu Thai Government, said the visit to

Phuket follows an order by Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra in the aftermath of the recent bomb explosions in Bangkok.

His mission is to quell fears about tourist safety in the region and enlist local business operators and residents in ensuring tourist safety and preventing similar incidents from occurring here, he said.

The name of the campaign stems from the fact that Phuket has a population of 250,000 people listed on house registration forms, which calculates to 500,000 eyeballs, Mr Prompong said.

The goal is to expand surveillance capacity to "full coverage"

by installing cameras not only in front of local business operators establishments, but also behind and in nearby areas of high risk, Mr Prompong said.

He estimated that some 10,000 cameras would be needed to reach the goal in Phuket.

Patong currently has "very few" [government-installed] CCTV cameras and some of these do not function properly. Only 18 of these units are confirmed to be operational, he said.

He had already discussed the need for more CCTV coverage with Phuket officials and intends to ask PM Yingluck to fund CCTV expansion in other tourist destinations including Chiang Mai and Pattaya, he said.

As it would take too long to wait for central government budget approval and disbursal of funds, the private sector is the key to increasing coverage, he said.

Mr Weerawit said his PEBA members have already encouraged staff to look out for the safety of tourists, but agreed that an expansion of CCTV coverage in risk areas would further improve safety and security.

OFFICIALS last week unveiled at a public hearing proposed plans for an underpass that is to be built at the Bang Khu Intersection.

The move raised hopes that traffic congestion at the critical junction will finally ease, but also raised concerns that the tailbacks at the Koh Kaew Intersection down the road would worsen. The Gazette's Chaiyot Yongcharoenchai reports.

**HIGHWAYS** Department officials last week presented to local residents their preferred option for a two-lane underpass at the Bang Khu Intersection, north of Phuket Town. The news received mixed reviews, as the initial proposal was

to build a flyover at the busy juncwhich tion, handles nearly all traffic to and from the airport.

Krabi Office of Highways Deputy Director Lerd Padchawee chaired the public hearing at the Boat Lagoon Hotel conference room. It was the second meeting with local residents to gather feedback on their perceptions and

input on the project. At the first public hearing, held in August last year, the idea of an overpass being the solution was discussed. However, following research, an underpass is now the

favored plan. Weerawat Deeprasertwong, project manager of consulting firm Epsilon Co Ltd, explained, "We came up with six designs, including overpass and underpass options. In the end it was an underpass design that best met all criteria and scored much higher than the others.

"A two-lane underpass is the preferred design. It's the perfect

solution for heavy traffic," he said.

"Vehicles heading southbound Thepkrasattri Road towards Patong will follow the curve right to traffic lights at the Bang Khu Intersection with the bypass road.

"Vehicles from Patong on the bypass road travelling Phuket Town, will also have to

wait for traffic lights before turning right and following the curve onto Thepkrasattri Road," he said.

"The underpass will be straight along Thepkrasattri Road and used by traffic going from Phuket Town to the airport.

"Vehicles from the airport heading to Phuket Town will use the straight road at street level with no traffic lights," he added.

"The underpass will be open to allow as much natural light as possible. The section covered by the road will be permanently illuminated.

"We will also install automatic pumps to remove excess water during the rainy season," Mr Weerawat explained.

#### **TAILBACKS**

Kuakiat Jitkua, president of the Koh Kaew Tambon Administration Organization (OrBorTor) voiced his concerns over the siting of the project. "Why build the underpass at that intersection. The worst area for traffic on Thepkrasattri Road is the Koh Kaew Intersection [the next set of traffic lights just north of the junction]. Will you consider building one there too?

"Also, will you allow motorcycles to also use the underpass?" he asked.

"It could be very dangerous."

This concern was echoed by Phuket City Police Traffic Deputy Superintendent Chalermchai Hernsawat.

In response, Arun Sanae, chief of the Highways Department Phuket Office, said the study had identified the Bang Khu junction as the priority. "Furthermore, there are insufficient funds to build another underpass," he said.

"However, I will dedicate one lane for motorcycles to go through the underpass safely," he said.

"We haven't decided the exact location for the ends of the underpass or how long the underpass will be. However, the project will budgeted from 400 to 500 million baht," he added.

#### TROUBLE AT MARKET

Another concern raised was that motorists travelling north through the junction will exit the underpass right where local vendors currently

set up a small roadside market every morning. "They have complained that sales have dropped drastically since the Highways Dept marked the curb red and white, as a clearway [no stopping]. Can you at least paint the curb yellow and white to allow temporary parking?" asked Mr Kuakiat.

To this Mr Arun replied, "We will consider providing temporary parking zones along the street."

He explained that the plans include expanding Thepkrasattri Road to four lanes each way for 1.5km from the Bang Khu intersection to the Koh Kaew traffic lights, which have become notorious for tailbacks, night and day.

However, Mr Arun said that the Koh Kaew lights will stay. "We are looking into how to change the timing in order to minimize the congestion," he said.

"I also suggest the Koh Kaew OrBorTor provide a special parking lot for the market vendors and their customers," Mr Arun added.

In closing the meeting, Epsilon consultant Mr Weerawat explained that a third and final public hearing will be held at the Mongkolwittaya School in Baan Sapam, just south of the Bang Khu Intersection, on March 1.

"That meeting will be smaller and will primarily involve food vendors and other local residents directly affected by the project," Mr Weerawat said.

The project committee will announce the final plan by the end of March, he added.

#### **Defrocked for** drugs and prostitutes

A SEX-CRAZED monk in Lamphun has been defrocked and charged by police for allegedly selling *ya bah* (methamphetamine) to local teenagers.

Phra Phichat In-wan of Wat Rongkutai spent much of his drug profits on prostitutes that he had sex with on temple grounds, according to police. The disgraced clergyman kept the bra and panties of the women as souvenirs.

Officers arrested Phra Phichat, 24, after he purchased ya bah pills.

In his possession, police found 90 *ya bah* pills, two mobile phones and 14,000 baht.

Officers escorted the monk to his temple, where they carried out a search of his sleeping quarters.

There they discovered a large number of pornographic DVDs and four sets of bras and panties.

They took him to the chief of the local Sangha (monks' association) in Pasang subdistrict in Lamphun to be defrocked.

They then took him to Pasang Police Station for questioning and charged him with possession of drugs with intent sell.

Phra Phichat told officers that he sold the pills to local teenagers for 200 baht each.

He used the money to shop, go out and, on five occasions, pay for the services of prostitutes – whom he brought back to his temple quarters for sex, he said.

After the encounters were over he always asked for the women's panties and bra as a souvenir, the former monk said.

# **QUEER** Beach battle saga continues

THE battle to keep Phuket beaches free of illegal vendors continues to be a pitched one, with each small advance seemingly followed by a setback.

In the latest development, four local residents have set up small restaurants on the sands of Kata Beach with low-to-the-ground Japanese-style dining tables selling grilled and barbecued meats every evening starting at dusk.

Orders by Karon Municipality for the vendors to vacate the site have gone unheeded, the vendors arguing that as local residents they have the right to make a living on the beach.

A different group of local residents complained about the restaurants to the Damrongtham Center at Phuket Provincial Hall, which serves as the Phuket ombudsman's office.

Municipal workers ordered the operators to leave, but they stayed and continued to cite their right to make a living. At last report Damrongtham Center officials were trying to find a solution.

Karon Municipality is responsible for administration at three beaches: the three-kilometer Karon Beach as well as Kata and Kata Noi beaches, both one-kilometer long.

It uses a tripartite committee comprising municipal officers,

the business owners and their staff in order to maintain order and cleanliness at the beach and resolve disputes between operators. Three different kinds of businesses fall under the committee's administration: beach chair and umbrella rental; massage; and vending operations.

A total of 20 such businesses are registered with the municipality.

The system worked in the past, when only local people were involved and everyone followed the rules, Karon Mayor Tawee said.

Current problems at the beaches stem largely from an influx of people not native to Phuket, including people who have relocated from Pattaya as well as foreigners, including a group of about 10 Cambodians, he said.

These vendors roam the beaches, annoying foreign tourists by selling items such as sunglasses that they source for just 50 baht a pair and sell for 1,000 baht or more, Mayor Tawee added.

Efforts to fine violators have done little to stop the practice because the maximum fine the municipality can issue in such cases is just 2,000 baht, he said.

In cases involving foreigners, the relevant police agencies would be called in, Mayor Tawee

### ncient artifacts unearthed in Krabi

A TROVE of ancient artifacts unearthed in Krabi recently could be up to 3,000 years old, Fine Arts Department Office experts have

Supoj Matbutra, village headman of Baan Khao Ngam, in Baan Klang subdistrict, Ao Luek, said residents discovered the relics about a month ago while excavating the rich soil in the area for use as fertilizer.

They found numerous artifacts near Pha Khao Ngam, a hill and cliff formation at the center of the village. The area has been marked a "no entry zone" to protect the site from looters.

Inside the protected area is a

pile of earthenware, hundreds of big animal bones and exoticallyshaped objects carved from stalagmites and stalactites.

"Some [items] were damaged, but others were in perfect condition. They also uncovered a stone axe, assorted tools, and a large number of beads," Mr Supoj said.

After, the Krabi Provincial Culture Office and 15th Regional Office of Fine Arts in Phuket investigated the find, they informed Mr Sopoj that the artifacts likely dated back at least 3,000 years.

The investigating teams told Mr Supoj that the area was one of the best-preserved ancient settlement sites in the Andaman region.

#### Readers vote Patong Carnival as Phuket's number one free funfair

THE annual Patong Carnival is Phuket's top free funfair according to a recent readers' poll by the Phuket Gazette.

The two-week poll, launched late last month, asked readers, "Which of the following annuallystaged free events do you most enjoy?"

Patong Carnival ranked as the top response, garnering 59.7% of votes overall.

The Old Phuket Town Festival ranked second with 16.2% of the votes, followed by the Phuket Vegetarian Festival, which scored 12.6% of the votes.

Losing out were the annual Wat Chalong Fair (5.1%), the Phuket Local Food Fair (3.6%) and the Phuket Red Cross Fair (2.8%).

Thai nationals who took part in the poll were divided in their top choice. They ranked the Patong Carnival and the Old Phuket Town Festival equally at the top, with

each scoring 33% of the votes,.

Thais voted the Phuket Vegetarian Festival as a close "third", with 29% of the votes.

Local foreign residents were more decisive in declaring Patong's week-long party as their top choice. The annual event garnered 64% of foreigners' votes, followed by the Old Phuket Town Festival (16%) and the Phuket Vegetarian Festival (10%).

### opposed to **Deep South** insurgency

MALAYSIAN Prime Minister Najib Razak told Thai premier Yingluck Shinawatra that his country opposed the insurgency in the Muslim-majority Deep South of Thailand. The statement came during a one-day visit by Mrs Yingluck to Kuala Lumpur last week.

Speaking at a press conference, MP Najib said there was a "need to find a long-term and durable peaceful solution in the south (of Thailand)," the Malaysian Insider reported.

"We both agree this is a domestic matter for Thailand and people in the south must not seek for a separate state," he said. "They must reject violence and extremism. They must be loyal Thai citizens and loyal to the King of Thailand."

Thailand has in the past accused Malaysia of training insurgents before sending them over the border, an accusation that the southern neighbor has

# Najib Razak Hunt on for bomb suspects

A MANHUNT is underway for suspected conspirators in a failed bomb plot believed to have targeted Israeli diplomats in Bangkok.

The botched operation, resulting in three explosions in central Bangkok on February 14, has led Thailand to consider whether its "open door" visa policy has made the country a haven for terrorists.

Police suspect as many as six Iranian citizens in the plot, believed by many analysts to be part of a campaign of attacks against Israeli targets around the world amid escalating tensions between the two Middle Eastern states.

Authorities were alerted to the plot when a bomb went off at a house on Soi Pridi Banomyong 36 in the Ekkamai area of Bangkok. Three suspects emerged from the building. The third, identified as Iranian national Saeid Morabi, appeared to be injured.

Mr Morabi then went on a bomb-

ing rampage, throwing explosives at a taxi that refused to take him and an approaching police officer.

The second bomb reportedly bounced off a tree and exploded, blowing his legs off. Graphic footage of the legless Morabi quickly circulated on the internet. Four Thais were wounded in the blasts.

The other two suspects fled. Mohammad Kharzei was arrested at Suvarnabhumi Airport. Masoud Sedaghatzadeh was arrested in Malaysia. The suspects face charges including possession of explosives, attempted murder, attempted murder of a policeman and causing explosions that damaged property.

Thailand's police chief Gen Priewpan Dhammapong said the men had plotted to kill Israeli diplomats. "I can tell you that the target was specific and aimed at Israeli diplomatic staff," he said, as quoted by Associated Press.

At least three other suspects are sought.

The Interior Ministry has instructed governors of provinces with popular tourist attractions to impose stricter security measures, especially in areas where Israelis, Iranians or those from the Middle East reside or gather.

Provincial authorities have been ordered to implement the measures discreetly to avoid panicking foreigners and affecting tourism.

#### **Elphant whistle-blower** raided and investigated

THE founder of an animal sanctuary in Phetchaburi alleges he has been the victim of several days of harassment and intimidation because he spoke out against elephant poaching in Thai national parks.

Edwin Wiek said scores of officers from the National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation Department, more than 30 of them armed, showed up at his Wildlife Friends Foundation Thailand (WFFT) sanctuary demanding he prove he had legal custody of many of the 450 animals in his care.

His wife Jansaeng Sangnanork was arrested and 13 of the animals were taken away.

Mr Wiek claims the searches, which took place over five days, amounted to a campaign of harassment designed to silence him.

Last month Mr Wiek wrote an open letter to the Thai media alleging that high-ranking government officials, politicians and businessmen were involved in smuggling baby elephants to tourism camps.

In an op-ed for Phuket Gazette sister paper The Nation on January 24, Wiek claimed that "Baby elephants are being taken out of the jungle in Thailand at any cost... and 'tamed' through week-long torture rituals to break their spirit"

"I challenge them [government official or politician] to visit the elephant camps in Ayutthaya, Pattaya, Hua Hin, Samui, Chiang Mai, Phuket or anywhere else in the country, and force the owners of all elephants of up to 20 years of age to allow a DNA check on their animals," he went on. "That would verify whether young elephants really are the offspring of their alleged 'mothers'."

The challenge was taken up in Phuket with the results for three of the baby elephants on the island expected to be released after the Gazette goes to press.



# Truth is not a PR option

SINCE Phuket's emergence as a tourist destination in the 1980s, the island has maintained a remarkable ability to attract foreign visitors – through good times and bad. Apart from the 2004 tsunami disaster, few other events – locally, nationally or globally – have been able to buck the trend in any appreciable way.

Despite an endless series of "tourism threatening" issues over the years, arrival figures continue to grow and grow. Expecting the trend to continue, industry leaders are now grappling with ways to get even more people here. Airport runway expansion and high-speed rail links are the latest projects talked about.

But regardless of Phuket's tourism industry's ability to shrug off all but the most catastrophic events, local leaders and their counterparts on the national stage continue to view each and every development with eyes so narrowly fixed on the prism of "tourism" that they sometimes lose sight of the big picture – often embarrassing themselves in the process.

Official reaction by some members of the military to the bungling exploits of a group of would-be Iranian terrorists on Valentine's Day is a case in point. Rather than deal with what transpired in a transparent and factual manner, the reaction to downplay events was almost Pavlovian. Some military officials even suggested that the bombs were "too small" to serve as real implements of terror.

This version of events would be a hard sell to anyone unfortunate enough to have been in the vicinity at the time. A better tack would have been to note how quick police rounded up suspects, or even point out how the "terrorists" were somehow unable to obtain firearms, if assassination in fact was their motive.

Coming just four days and hours of global media coverage later, the accidental release of a cloud of chlorine gas at poolside at a resort in Karon couldn't have come at a worse time.

The words "blast" and "bomb", incorrectly used by some media outlets to describe how the release occurred, were picked up by news agencies around the world.

The resort manager took appropriate action in trying to get across the message that no explosion occurred and that some media reports were sensationalist and misleading.

However, telling the media that "nothing happened" and "nobody was really injured" went beyond downplaying events: it was

Only time will tell whether the resulting lack of consumer trust could be more damaging to the resort's business than the shortterm irritation to eyes, nose and throats some guests suffered.

# Society is creating young drug users

I'VE been working for the civil service for more than 30 years and from the start was involved with preventing youngsters from getting hooked on drugs.

Before becoming Chief of Phuket Muang district in January 2010, I served as a district chief in both Krabi and Phang Nga.

Drug abuse is a nationwide problem and I've been tasked to crackdown on it in Phuket. Drugs are a problem everywhere, even in protected environments such as schools and prisons. This is not acceptable.

It's our social system that is creating younger drug users. When being rich is accepted by society as the number one priority, selling drugs is seen as the quickest way to achieve it.

Those involved believe it's an easy job with good benefits, which is why teenagers are frequently targeted and recruited to help increase the distribution and consumption of drugs.

I coordinate with the Semarak Center, as they look after the interests of children who habitually skip school, run away from home or have run-ins with the police. The Semarak officers have their own methods, however, anytime they need assistance I'm willing to help.

A child's behavior is a parent's responsibility. If we catch children with drugs we will meet with their

problem. If we catch the same child three times, the parents are likely to be punished.

When we catch teenagers we try to find out where other youths go to take drugs and where they are buying them.

I work alongside public health officers as well. If they want to search a drug store at night I can go with them as a representative of the Narcotics Control Board (NCB), as I don't need a court order to conduct a search.

The youth drug-misuse issue has to be coordinated. It's got to involve government departments, home, school and the private sector. Anyone in the business of dealing with children and teenagers during and after school should be involved. I am talking about places teenagers hangout, like game centers and entertainment parents and teachers to discuss the business taking responsibility,

rather than only thinking of them-

There are even locations that function as 'open houses' so kids can try out drugs for free. They [those holding the open house] boil kratom leaves and give away ya ice (crystal methamphetamine) or ya ba (methamphetamine). This is how they trick the kids into being their future customers.

In the past ya ice was sold in relatively large packages. You needed thousands of baht to get it, but now it's divided up and sold in much small amounts. Teenagers are able to buy a hit for just a few hundred baht.

I want parents to care for their children and spend time with them. Of course they have to earn money to support their family, but they must not forget that their children should be their number one priority.

## Patong naughty child syndrome

IN A resort area like Patong, which depends on tourism for its income, closing-hours are more about the public and their needs during their short stay in 'Paradise' than about stringent laws and policing.

When you don't mind earning your living from tourists you need to put up with a certain amount of inconvenience.

The effort should not be in enforcing closing-hours, but in enforcing behavior and other laws. Friendly, helpful policing and the supervision of bars and clubs is the way to go.

If an individual bar or club is creating a problem outside what would be considered reasonably acceptable, then they are the ones who should have their hours shortened, which is better than a blanket closure of all bars. Knowing others will be staying open is an encouragement for them to police themselves, rather than be closed.

#### Wichit Inorrasorn, Chalong Police Superintendent, replies:

In this specific case we do not have enough information to know if these were real police

The first thing you should do in this kind of situation is ask to see the 'officers' official identification. It does not matter what department they claim they are from, it is your civil right to ask them to present the card. If they are real officers and sincere in their intentions they will show it

Also ask them why they want access to your property and if they have a court issued search warrant to do so. Asking to see the search warrant is also one of your

If they do not want to tell you why they need to enter your house or do not have a court issued search warrent immediately call the police.

Police normally have a search warrant when they are taking action in a case, though there are some circumstances where the police do not need one, such as when a suspect has escaped into

Another time the police do not need a search warrent is when

Yes, it is RVP Co Ltd, which was set up in 1997 following a new law that required all motorists to carry compulsory insurance.

Foreigners are treated equally under the scheme. Although a private company, operating under a government concession, the RVP is generally known by foreigners simply as the "government insurance office".

In the event of an accident resulting in the death of the rider, passenger or plaintiff, RVP will pay 200,000 baht. However, the amount decreases to 35,000 baht if the rider is deemed to have caused the accident. We will also pay 15,000 baht to cover medical

BANGKOK-based developers will be plowng as much as 30 billion baht into the local economy this year, the head of Phuket Real Estate Association (P-REA) has announced.

# Chinese gov eyes light rail

A STATE enterprise from the People's Republic of China is the latest party to express interest in investing in Phuket's light-rail project.

An administration and engineering team from Mashucon Co Ltd announced the news last week in a meeting with Phuket Governor Tri Augaradacha at Provincial Hall.

Executive Chairman Nopphon Tansakul told the governor that his team came on behalf of the Shanghai Association of International & Technological Cooperation, a Chinese state enterprise based in Shanghai.

"The Chinese government is interested in Phuket's light-rail project. Our company has been assigned to meet the Phuket Governor and to relay that we [Mashucon company on behalf of the Chinese government] are ready to support the project, whether in terms of financial investment, technology or personnel," Mr Nopphon said.

"We will conduct new surveys and designs for the entire project. Shanghai is

prepared to offer its full support if Phuket approves of us proceeding with the light-rail project," he said.

"The results of the study conducted several years ago is outdated, and the technology has since changed," he added.

"For a [new] detailed study, we expect to use a budget of US\$3 million, or about

100mn baht, and we expect the entire project to take about five years to complete.

"Since the Chinese and Thai governments have close relations, the Chinese government is prepared and delighted to invest in mass transit and infrastructure

that under their proposal two companies under the Shanghai Association of International Economic & Technological Cooperation will lead the investment.

Although he did not name the companies, Mr Suwichien

did reveal that they included a multinational company from Canada and another company from Beijing.

As for the type of technology and electric train, he said that a swift and modern train similar to those used in Bangkok would be ideal for Phuket.

"The train can incorporate both elevated and underground designs in order to not disturb Phuket's beautiful environment," he said.

Gov Tri said, "About 13 to 14 companies, mostly from China and Korea, have made proposals to develop the light rail in Phuket. Each of the companies have high investment potential, so choosing the company is the next step.

"Phuket province will give its final approval of the project at a Cabinet meeting scheduled to take place in Phuket on March 19-20.

"The project needs to be a modern mass-transit system in order to solve Phuket's traffic congestion problems and provide one more transport option to residents and tourists.

Phuket province previously hired consultants to conduct a study, which resulted in the outlined seven routes. Two of these are most urgent, including the Phuket Airport to Chalong Circle and the Phuket Town to Patong routes, he said.

"Since the budget would be at least 10 billion baht, the province needs the private sector to invest in it," Gov Tri said.

# Dodgy land deals top list of consumer complaints

LAND deals gone awry and property developers not building according to contract have topped the list of complaints filed at the Phuket Consumer Protection Office so far this year.

The news came earlier this week as Phuket Vice Governor Somkiet Sangkaosutthirak chaired a meeting to review the 29 complaints filed at the Phuket Office of the Consumer Protection Board (OCPB) since October 1 last year.

"Eighteen of the 29 complaints have been resolved, with consumers receiving more than 800,000 baht in compensation," Vice Governor Somkiet told the press.

Most of the cases involved land, real estate and consumer products, said V/Gov Somkiet.

"Most of the complaints were mediated," he said, adding that the remaining 11 complaints

were still under review.

Three of the complaints have been forwarded to the Consumer Protection Board main office in Bangkok for further action.

In comparison, The Phuket OCPB received 60 complaints

during the previous "fiscal year", from October 1, 2010 to September 30, 2011.

"Most of those related to land and properties disputes, too" said V/Gov Somkiet.

The OCP Phuket successfully

mediated 45 complaints in 2010-2011, while 13 remain under review.

In total, the office successfully managed to secure more than 2.7 million baht being paid out to customers they believed were treated unfairly during the period.

V/Gov Somkiet called on the Phuket OCPB to hold public meetings more often in order to help reduce the number of complaints.

"We are more than happy to allow media to publish this issue in order to let other people see that it is not right to break the law and that the Office of Consumer Protection Board takes all complaints seriously," he said.

"Many business owners were sued because they did not follow the rules and regulations enforced by the Office of Consumer Protection Board," he added.

# Booming despite blasts

THE recent bombings in Bangkok will not have significant negative impacts on the island's tourism industry, the Phuket Tourist Association (PTA) has announced.

Phuket can expect to have strong tourist arrival figures from both Europe and Asia throughout 2012, PTA President Jirayus Somboon told the *Gazette*.

Sustained and aggressive destination marketing has been reinforced by recent roadshows in India and Taiwan, while campaigns are planned for Japan, the Philippines and Germany, he said.

The recent bombings by Iranian nationals in Bangkok could have a small short-term psychological effect on tourist confidence in Phuket, but the long-term outlook is positive, he said.

The perpetrators were after specific targets and not members of the general population or tourists. People understand that it could happen anywhere, he explained.

Nevertheless, authorities have stepped up security in key areas including popular tourist destinations and Phuket Airport, he assured.



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# An update on international download speeds in Phuket

TIME for an update on how Phuket's doing for real world, measured international internet speeds. I'm not talking about the advertised 10 megabits or 100 megabits-per-second lines that only exist in marketing drivel and a few internet service provider's fantasies. I'm talking about speeds that you and I are measuring, in the wild, right here, every day.

The short headline: we're doing well, but you can waste a lot of money if you aren't careful.

The crowdsourced internet speed site, PhuketInternetSpeed.com, is unique in all of Asia, I believe. Hundreds of people all over the island have signed up, and take a minute or so to measure and post their international internet download speeds. We all use the same test, to the same location, so the results are more-or-less replicable. The graph you see on this page is indicative of the 3,000 observations that were posted between November 1, 2011 and February 19, 2012.

I say "indicative" because there are a few gotchas, which I'll describe below.

First, I downloaded the database. You can download the entire database, too, any time – just click on the link that says Download. There are more than 25,000 recorded observations.

Then, I removed items that were obviously not intended for this analysis - mostly measured download speeds to Bangkok, conducted by people who are using the ISP's speed test sites and other sites hosted by a company called OOKLA. As I've explained before any test you run that uses the OOKLA speed test engine is really just going to Bangkok, even if you think it's going to London or Oslo or Madrid.

I also took out a fair number of tests conducted from places other than Phuket. It's interesting to see how people in Bangkok and other upcountry locations are doing with the same internet service providers, but they aren't included in these figures.

I also removed the "0" posts – ones that indicate the service my published reports. Island

wasn't working at the time. We're still seeing sporadic outages, but most of them are local (for example, a telephone pole gets whacked by a car). The widespread outages involve wireless services, and they're not common.

Then I tallied up the average download speeds reported for the most popular internet service packages, with one exception. I didn't include any reports for 3BB. Why? Because 3BB has gone to great pains to make its speed test results in our tests faster than their typical international speeds.

If you look at the data, here's what you'll see:

The first two speeds reported are wireless. AIS's "3G" HSPA system continues to deliver the fastest 3G international download speeds on the island, at about 1,000 Kbps. TrueMove-H shows disappointing results, around 800 Kbps. Why disappointing? The technology TrueMove uses, called HSPA+, is capable of running much faster than AIS's HSPA. Unfortunately, True isn't working hard enough (or spending enough money) to open up its international data lines. Yet another case of bigger and better technology getting knee-capped by inadequate infrastructure.

There are two more wireless services offered in Phuket: DTAC HSPA+ and CAT's new HSPA+. We've had very few reported speeds from DTAC and CAT connections, but the few we've seen have been very good. Both TrueMove and DTAC use the CAT towers and equipment, so it's likely that more data points will make DTAC and CAT look more like TrueMove, and less like AIS.

CAT's old EV-DO wireless system is still kicking at around 600 Kbps (not on the graph). There are lots of old EV-DO customers on the island, but you can't buy it any more. CAT's much more interested in selling you a new 3G+ account.

The next two speeds are new to

Technology's reputation for reliability is quite good though their international download speeds, averaging 900 Kbps, aren't anything to write home about. Rawai Cable, at 400 Kbps, is the slowest land line in this report. We don't have enough data from Patong's PA Cable to draw a comparison, but I believe both use CAT as their internet supplier.

The TOT numbers reinforce what I recently wrote about TOT's apparent throttling of all of its international data lines at the same speed. That Live Wire column explained why it isn't worth paying extra for expensive TOT fiber optic lines if you're using the internet primarily for international access. In fact, TOT still seems to be throttling all of its lines at the same speed.

More than any other ISP, TOT has come up with a plethora of packages, promotions and prices. At this moment, as best I can tell, they don't offer a 4 Mbps or 8 Mbps or 10 Mbps package - all of which have been discontinued - but they do offer 6, 7, 9, 12, and 15 Mbps packages. Apparently consumers are being switched from one package to the next without being notified.

In our island-wide tests, there's very little difference among the TOT ADSL packages: all of them deliver about 1,200 Mbps on international downloads. The wireless/wired AirMax Winet package is doing quite well, at 1,400 Kbps, if you're trying to get a connection inside the areas where it's available.

TOT is now advertising a High Speed 2 package rated at 7 Mbps for 390 baht per month. Our speed tests show it's running about 800 Kbps, which isn't bad at all for the price. Of course, if the package proves popular, TOT may start throttling the cheapie package. But if they're throttling all of the other packages at the same rate, maybe they'll just let the 7 Mbps package get swept up

by the same broom.

The biggest disappointment continues to be TOT's Fiber Optic line. Back in May, we were seeing download speeds in the 10,000 and above range. Now it's down to 1,200 Kbps average international download, and there's very little difference between the 10Mbps/1Mbps package (at 1,490 baht per month), the 20 Mbps/2Mbps package (at 2,420 baht per month), and the "Corporate" versions of both of those packages (5,290 baht and up). It's worth emphasizing that the speeds to Bangkok are very fast, from what I've seen. But if most of your work is with international sites, there's very little difference between a 2,420 baht Fiber 2U line and a 390 baht one.

True's 10 Mbps ADSL line continues to offer good speeds, 1,500 Kbps on average, at a decent price. True's Ultra DOCSIS – the service that's delivered over coax cables, like TV, is holding its own at about 1,200 Kbps, but it isn't available everywhere.

If you aren't yet reporting your

internet speeds, join us! The only way we can all keep tabs on the internet situation in Phuket is if everybody – yes, even those of you with 390 baht/month lines – take a few minutes every day to check and post your speed. The cases must be almost guaranteed to be settled, otherwise the insurance company will not underwrite the policy. The fund also has an average of about 1,500 loans out at one time, which means their portfolio of loans is highly diversified. Because the term of each loan is usually less than 12 months, this ensures basically the entire portfolio turns over evrepaid leads to extremely consistent returns for the fund. The standard deviation of returns is less than half a percent. This is even more remarkable given that the fund has averaged almost 12% per annum in its short existence (it is just over two years old).

The best part about this fund is that it is non-correlated with the financial markets and the world economy. I personally believe a 10% holding in just any portfolio provides an excellent buffer against falling stock markets or rising interest rates. I would not go too heavy into this fund as it has a short track record and is still a single fund manager, but I do believe there is not a risk profile out there for which this fund is not appropriate (with the exception of the cash under the

mattress crowd).

The fund is available with a minimum investment of £12,500 through an offshore portfolio bond, and is very liquid. It deals monthly with a 30-day notice period. While it is run out of the UK and is based in pounds sterling, there are also USD and EUR tranches available. In a market such as we are currently in where bank deposits are paying virtually nothing in interest, a small allocation in this fund can give a nice little extra bit of return to your portfolio without taking an excessive amount of risk.

Alastair Carthew tackles former French international rugby player Gérard Bertrand about how his career in sport and now wine have pressed on his success.

A FRENCHMAN who enjoys wine and rugby is nothing unusual, but a former international player launching his own award winning wines on Phuket is certainly worth our attention. Alastair Carthew speaks exclusively to Gérard Bertrand who was recently represented on the island to promote his labels and discuss the Mediterranean art de vivre or art of life.

Gérard Bertrand was born into wine and rugby and has excelled at both. Capped twice for France against Italy and Russia as a strapping loose forward, he also led the Paris-based Stade Français team in the 1993-1994 season and played for Narbonne, the French commune in which he was raised as a child for several years.

Gérard's family were vintners in the Corbières region of Southern France, which also happens to be the heart of the country's rugby and he explains how his love of rugby has determined his ideas on wine.

"Rugby has influenced my wine philosophy through the senses of celebration and sharing, as well as the team spirit," Gérard said.

"There is a real synergy between rugby and wine, especially in the South of France because the values are very close, especially the conviviality, art of life and social ties," he added.

His rugby heroes? Jean Pierre Rives, a fellow loose forward and the legendary Serge Blanco, arguably the best fullback to play the game who played 93 times for France.

But how does a rugby player make the transition from the bottom of a scrum and crunching tackles, to the delicate art range of white and red wines. Thailand, of winemaking?

"For me wine was not a change of profession as I was raised in this world next to my father, with whom I made my first harvest at the age of 10. Besides, my father told me that year, 'You are lucky. At 60 years old you will have 50 years of experience'," he recalls.

Gérard has grown his wine business into six wine estates totalling 880 acres of vines on about 2,000 acres of land that range from the Mediterranean Sea to hills high up in the Pyrenees Mountains bordering France and Spain.

Fresh from winning the 2011 European Winery of the Year awarded by the prestigious Wine Enthusiast Magazine, Gérard is bringing his experience to Phuket with a

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# Life & style Cot those Les Paul blues

AS THIS newspaper hits the stands the 7<sup>th</sup> Phuket International Blues Rock Festival is primed and ready to rock at their new venue in Laguna, Phuket.

The two-day festival takes months of tireless preparation, by organizer Andy Andersen and his team, to get dozens of musicians and their instruments to the gig on time.

Take for example the last minute issue of Irish female rocker Gráinne Duffy's guitar a Gibson Les Paul – which she was told needed its own seat if it were to travel in the cabin all the way from her home in Ireland.

Gazette features editor Neil Quail, also from that emerald isle, contacted Gráinne this week to find out what happened.

"I tried to bring my guitar to Phuket, but unfortunately the airline does not allow carry on instruments unless you buy a seat which was too expensive. I used to use a Strat for my live gigs but a few years ago I was given a gift of a beautiful Gibson Les Paul for Christmas and I fell in love with it - the sound, the sustain, the feel and resonance – everything about it reminds me of Peter Green and I have never looked back since." Gráinne told Neil.

"If I had not got a Les Paul in Phuket it would have been a little harder for me to get my feel across. Although I still love to play a Strat I think it just might have felt a little different on another type of guitar but thankfully I am very lucky that one has been made available for me to play so thank you! I'm looking forward to playing for all the festival goers in Phuket!" she added.

The guitar she is borrowing had similar problems in getting to Phuket from France as recounted by Gazette desk editor and co-MC of the event Marc Mulloy.

"We bought the guitar in France in August for my son Paul and needed a special dispensation from the airline to bring it onboard. When we heard that Gráinne needed a Les Paul for her set we did not hesitate in lending it, given that we are also Irish and that we understand why she feels a Les Paul is different to other guitars. This guitar is already lucky, having only ever been played by Paul since new, it has enabled him to become an accomplished musician. Having someone of Gráinne's caliber playing it will only add to its luck and value – a sort of baptism."

Sixteen-year-old Paul Mulloy will himself be making his debut at the festival with local blues outfit "Rockin' Angels" on Friday night. Band leader, Rockin'Pat, who runs the "Rockin' Angels Blues Café" in Phuket Town told the Gazette "I always try to encourage young musicians when I can, especially if they love to play the blues. This year we have two very talented Phuket youngsters on stage with us and they add some good, fiery energy to the set."

Gráinne Duffy will make her own Phuket debut just before New Orleans headliner Chris Thomas King takes to the stage on Saturday night. King has sold more records and appeared in more successful movies than any other blues artist this century and will also be passing on his knowledge to youngsters at a special workshop at British In-

ternational School (BIS) on Monday February 27.

With 12 acts from 10 different countries making this year's festival the biggest and best to date, and with all musicians and instruments in place it's now up to the people of Phuket to support the event by turning up in great numbers.

Meanwhile, the musicians have already prepared their own 'great numbers' for a weekend of fantastic music which will also be broadcast around the world by festival presenter 91.5FM.



# Battle of the Eco-Warriors

#### **Books**

By James Eckardt

T.C. BOYLE is the hardest working man in the literary business. Like the late Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn, he writes seven days a week, and it shows.

He has written 13 novels and nine collections of short stories. His first two novels – *Water Music* and *Budding Prospects* – are about the 18<sup>th</sup> century African explorations of Mungo Park and contemporary marijuana growers in northern California. They rank among the two funniest novels ever written in the English language.

His subsequent novels are biographies of famous figures like John Harvey Kellogg, Frank Lloyd Wright and Alfred Kinsey or ecological doomsday tracts about the clash of man and nature. They lack the wild humor of his early novels, but are graced with Boyle's limpid, onrushing, extravagant literary style. Whatever he writes is a good read.

Like many of his novels, his newest takes place in Santa Barbara, California. Specifically, most of the action of *When the Killing's Done* (Viking, New York, 2011, 369pp) takes place in the northern Channel Islands, Anacapa and Santa Cruz, called the Galapagos of North America.

The novel opens with a young married couple, Till and Beverly Boyd, on a weekend fishing trip to Anacapa in their newly refurbished cabin cruiser. The year is 1946. Tilden is a veteran of the Pacific War and along for the trip is Warren, Tilden's ex-Marine brother. The boat sinks in a storm and Boyle's description of Beverly's fight against the elements is brilliant and harrowing.

At the time, Beverly was pregnant with her daughter, who would later marry a Japanese American fisherman and have a daughter of her own, Alma Boyd Takesue. She would grow up to become a National Park Service biologist with a mission to eradicate the rats that have overrun Anacapa to the detriment of native species of birds. In this she is fiercely opposed by the ecological warriors

of the Friends for the Protection of Animals (FPA), led by Dave LaJoy, semi-retired owner of four home-entertainment stores and new convert to ecological purity. An irascible misanthrope, here he is walking down a Santa Barbara street after making a big public scene at his habitual breakfast restaurant:


"He's walking now, striding along in his business-as-usual gait, forty-two years old and as fit as the gym, Dr Reiser's Lotensin and blood thinners can make him, ignoring the cars lined up at the light with their wipers clapping and the exhaust coiling out of their tailpipes in the last petrochemical gasp of the black stuff pooled up under layers of shale in Saudi Arabia and Nigeria and Venezuela, the death of the earth, the death of everything, smelling crushed worm, rotting leaf and the wet acidic failure of the newspapers stuck to the sidewalk where the Mexicans tossed them short of the house stoops and storefronts in the grim, desperate hour before dawn."

You can see how this style will do well to describe the upcoming battles over the next stage of the National Parks campaign: ridding the island of Santa Cruz's feral pigs. In protest, Dave LaJoy plots of his own infestation of raccoons and rattlesnakes.

Oddly enough, the biologist and the protest leader are alike in that they find their only moments of peace amid the solitary beauty of the islands. They share this with their lovers, Alma with Tim Sickafoose, a fellow biologist, and Dave LaJoy with Anise Reed, a Joan Baez-type folksinger who spent four and a half of her early teenage years with her mother Rita, a fellow musician and singer, on an isolated sheep farm on Santa Cruz.

They all love the islands and will fight over them until five lives are lost. In the end, Alma, abandoned by her lover Tim, brings her newborn daughter in celebration to Santa Cruz Island just as Rita is returning to her old sheep ranch to scatter the ashes of her own daughter. Through ancient Indians, Spanish seafarers, Italian vintners, American sheepherders, shipwrecked rats, feral hogs, the Channel Islands abide forever. The novel ends:

"The grass stirs. The moon sinks into the water. Night on Santa Cruz Island, night immemorial."

This silent film is an absolute marvel – charming, witty, surprising, moving, clever and beautiful.

The cinematography is ravishing in luminous black and white. The musical score is both subtle and dramatic, when called for, and the screenplay toys with the conventions of the silent era, paying homage to some of the greatest films of the first two or three decades of cinema history.

The acting is flawless and *The Artist* deserves a wide audience and all sorts of awards. If there was an Oscar for best animal performance, the dog in *The Artist* should receive a lifetime achievement award for its role alone.

A film definitely not to be missed and a film to watch again and again.

# Jirawan Sirimas

THAI boxing, ballroom dancing and Buddhism may not at first seem to have much in common, but for dance teacher Jirawan Sirimas, who was also a teenage boxing champion, there is a very strong link.

"For me the three disciplines work in the same way. You need focus and have the willpower to succeed, and when you do, they give you such a high," Jirawan explained.

Jirawan, who grew up in Nakhon Sri Thamarat, was drawn to Buddhism at an early age. Dancing and boxing was a way of raising money for the temple her family attended.

"I started boxing at age 11 and was given the nom de guerre of 'Sopha Srinakorn'. The second name [Srinakorn] was given to show allegiance to my boxing camp," she recalled.

Groomed to fight and fight she did, either as highlights to temple fairs or in proper boxing matches. At age 16, she arrived on Phuket to fight against a local hopeful.

"I dare say, it was the first ever women's boxing match in Phuket. It took place near the Pearl Hotel in town and there were lots of foreigners watching, who stuffed wads of money in my shorts as a way of 'egging' me on and I did win that match. You see, I never lost. I had superb footwork, fatal with my knees and one high kick to the neck could knock

my opponent out," Jirawan said.

She was indeed both formidable and fearsome. Her name was known throughout the Southern provinces as the girl boxing prodigy. However, it is obvious now that she is not so proud of her achievements.

"Thai boxing is such a brutal sport and I still find it hard to believe that I practiced it in the name of religion. When I turned 35, I came down with unexplainable pains in my stomach and knees. It must be karma. I have hurt many people, now the wheel has turned on me," she reflected.

Jirawan gave up boxing when she turned 18 while studying at a college in Yala. She later taught physical education (PE) at the Prince of Songkhla University where she designed courses that combined dance and exercise routines, the content of which was later used as a model for PE teacher training courses in Thailand.

Her love of dance rekindled, Jirawan left the world of academia and turned to her first love. She studied a variety of styles such as jazz and ballet, but fell in love with ballroom. Jirawan sought and trained with many international champions here and abroad, and even had a stint in Missouri, US, training at a renowned dance studio there.

Back home in Thailand, she started to win many prizes and was later appointed dance adjudicator by the UK Dance Council. In 2007, she opened 'The Art of Dance' studio at the Courtyard on Chao Fah Road, where she teaches ballroom dancing to adults and schoolchildren.

A perfectionist at heart, Jirawan reveals that her profession is one born of love, not profit.

"We don't make a lot of money here because I want to teach dance from basics. It takes longer and most people don't have the patience. The students who end up with me are those who really love and appreciate dance as an art form," she said.

The 50-year old Jirawan is single and intends to stay so. Apart from teaching dance, her time is spent working for religious causes. Her boxing gloves are hung up for good, but she still looks after local Buddhist communities, and being devout to her beliefs, she meditates, prays, and make merits regularly.

"It must be something to do with my past life that draws me to Buddhism. I cannot escape. It's in my system, my karma," Jirawan said sincerely.







# PROPERTY Bangla Mall set Gazette to open its doors

TOURISTS and residents out for a stroll on the island's infamous pedestrian street, Soi Bangla, will soon be privy to yet one more considerable shopping venue, with the Bangla Mall set to open its doors next month.

Official launch plans were announced by the project's developer Phuket Creation Co Ltd last Friday at a press conference at the Kee Resort, just a short stroll from the center of Bangla and the site of the project, which is currently undergoing its final touches.

The 300 million baht, outdoor-indoor mini-mall will officially open its doors to the public on March 18, announced Phuket Creation President Sompong Doapisad.

"We weren't initially planning to open the mall so soon but since all of the units sold out well ahead of our expectations, we've moved the opening date forward," he said.

The project will feature a total of 102 units ranging from 20 to 250 square meters, situated on two stories and a basement, with total built up area of 5,800 sqm.

Mr Sompong explained that the units comprise 24 regular shops, 18 "mini plazas", eight corner shops and 52 kiosks.

Some of the major tenants include a Phuket FantaSea souvenir shop; a 7-Eleven, a Bangkok Bank branch; a KFC; a Boots pharmacy and a Bata shoe store.

Another highly anticipated tenant is the Bangkok Burger Company. This will be the country's second branch following the success of the inaugural Thong Lor branch in the capital.

There will also be a mobile phone and IT device booth zone, similar to the ones currently found in Central Festival and Jungceylon, and as one would expect, many of the tenants will be selling souvenirs to the multitudes of tourists expected.



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

# New residential market demand is generated by wealthy Asians

A property boon on Phuket is being experienced with affluent Asian 'tourists' leading the way, according to property firm Knight Frank.

DEMAND in Phuket's residential and property markets is growing among wealthy Asian "tourists", leading property consultancy Knight Frank Thailand has reported.

Knight Frank's latest research was conducted in light of the Airport Authority of Thailand reporting that Phuket International Airport had welcomed 20% more passengers in 2011.

Statistics showed that 4.2 million arrivals had been counted at the airport last year, compared to only 3.5mn in the previous year, with most of the new arrivals being Chinese, Koreans and Russians.

Speaking on this trend, Nattha Kahapana, Director of Knight Frank Phuket said that Phuket seems to be becoming more and more of a "legendary resort destination" in the Asia Pacific.

"Many hotels were fully booked by Korean and Chinese travelers over the Lunar New Year period. The year of the Dragon [this year] will be the year of Asian tourists, especially those from Korea, China and Singapore," Mr Nattha said.

Also, we will see many more Indian tourists coming to Phuket. For the Indian market, wedding groups are one market

to look out for," he said.

Meanwhile, he said that "honeymooners" remain the dominant Korean tourist market for Phuket.

Indonesia is another high-potential tourist-source market with huge opportunities for Phuket, as they tend to enjoy Thai cuisine, shopping, golfing and other relaxing activities, Mr Nattha noted.

Knight Frank Thailand's research suggests that the wave of new tourists coming to Phuket are generating much of the increased property demand.

Wealthy Asians are now a strong buying force for both condominiums and villas in Phuket, Mr Nattha said.

During January, there were 187 new villa units among three projects, bringing the total number of units on the market to 1,972, he said.

Of the new villas, only 13 were targeting the luxury segment (built in the 'Millionaire's Mile' in Kamala), while the other 174 units largely targeted the middle income segment, and thus are more affordable to Asians, he said.

Coconut Island showed particular promise with 26 of 32 new villa units there, ranging from 2 to 6 million baht, reportedly being sold off plan.

Contributing to the market success there, Mr Nattha said that the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) had made passage to the island safer and more convenient for residents and tourists by building a new 170 by 3-meter concrete pier.

"We will see the launching of many luxury villa projects all across the island this year. For instance, Laguna's 'The Odyssey' project, which is of mixed-use including retail, villa and condominium units. Another huge project, with about 134 villa units, is situated at Ao Por on Phuket's East Coast.

The island's luxury condominium mar-

ket is also growing quickly. During January this year, the Eden Oasis completed its second phase which includes 11 units. The 2- bedroom units are priced between 4.9 to 8mn baht a unit.

Meanwhile, 783 condominium units targeting locals in Kathu and Phuket Town were also launched in January.

Mr Nattha concluded that this year's new condominium supply will target wealthy Asians with prices ranging between 3 to 8mn baht per unit, whereas villas will target European, Australian and Scandinavians who can afford prices in excess of 20mn baht per unit.





# Brimming with bromeliads

MOST people in Europe encounter their first *bromeliad*, without ever realizing its collective name as a fruit that tastes deliciously different, and can be eaten fresh or canned. But the pineapple is only one member, and indeed the *only* edible member, of a family of plants that comprises more than 3,000 varieties.

Among bromeliads grown solely for their good looks, the *aechmea* is perhaps the best known; it has been cultivated as a house plant in temperate climes for at least 150 years. Unsurprising, when one considers its dramatic appearance and its capacity to survive in low light conditions.

What makes the aechmea so distinctive is both its foliage and its floral arrangement. The spathe-shaped leaves, grey-green and cross-banded with silver, form a neat, water-tight rosette, allowing a reservoir of rain-water to accumulate at the center. Fasciata, the most widely grown cultivar, has these characteristic leaves and from the central cup sprouts a cluster of rosypink bracts in which nestle pale blue flowers that change to deep rose. No wonder the Victorians loved its exotic appeal – a plant like none other in the Old World.

Nowadays, there are the inevitable hybrids. Foster's Favorite, smaller in scope, has bright red, lacquered leaves about a foot long, "Royal Wine" has an open rosette of green leathery leaves that are burgundy red beneath. It has drooping clusters of orange and blue flowers. However, in the tropics, these cultivars are mainly grown outdoor, and primarily for their foliage. Thus they can be found in good garden centers, suspended in small pots with little soil beyond a handful of coconut fiber or bark. They are becoming more popular as adornments on trellises or tree branches, much in the way that orchids are employed.

In fact, bromeliads have

plenty in common with orchids: both are mainly epiphytic, and both come from the tropical rainforest, where they grow in the forks of trees and even on rocky outcrops beneath the canopy. Both are among the most widely patterned and colored plants in the world and both survive, precariously, by collecting detritus such as bird droppings that fall from trees and by absorbing the organic matter contained in rain.

It has been estimated that as many as 170,000 bromeliads of various kinds may inhabit one hectare of tropical woodland. Furthermore, their tiny reservoirs are home to species of tree frog, salamanders, and even, in Jamaica, to a species of small crab. A whole micro-universe.

There are many varieties in addition to the aechmea and its relatives. The largest, puya Raimondi, may grow to four meters with a flower spike up to ten meters. At the other end of the scale is Spanish moss (tillandsia) which hangs profusely from trees and cables in the American South. Other widely cultivated general include bilbergia and neoregelia. They may be orth considering next time.

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# Sport Sport MCC deliver Phuket a cricket masterclass

CRICKET'S bible, the Wisden Almanac, may not record the result of Marylebone Cricket Club's (MCC) match against the Phuket Cricket Group (PCG) select XI, but February 16 will long live in the memory of those that were at the ACG that day.

Despite arriving the previous night from the cold conditions in Old Blighty, the MCC team showed no signs of jet-lag and immediately turned up the heat on the PCG.

It should be noted that with an active membership of more than 5,000 players, it's not unusual for an MCC touring squad to begin a match having never played together as a team, as was the case for the team that landed on Phuket.

The occasion itself was not lost on Phuket's sporting fraternity with an impressive support turnout for a school day. Packed with ACG patrons, the viewing gallery heaved in expectation of an exciting match. All that the crowd missed was fish and chips with champagne – the standard fare of Lords itself.

Having won the toss, PCG invited MCC to bat first and could only watch admirably as the visitors dynamically drove, professionally paddled, cleverly cut, expertly edged and beautifully battered the best Phuket could bowl at them. After 20 overs, MCC had hiked their run rate to almost 10 per over, giving them a total of 193 for 5 wickets.

MCC lost opener Will Rist (11) to a superb diving catch in front of first slip by PCG keeper Dean Noble in the fifth over. Fellow opener Rich Brown (31), who in fact played in Phuket's Island Furniture League several years ago, but now plays his cricket for Templepatrick in North-

ern Ireland, was run out by Neil Quail after he slipped and fell attempting a second run in the ninth over with the score on 76.

A valuable contribution from Arif Mahmood (31) ended when he topedged a ball from Sameer Khan to Seemant Raju at cover, who entertained the crowd with a juggling act before securing the catch.

With only 89 runs on the board at the halfway mark, PCG could have been forgiven for thinking they had contained the mighty MCC, but the arrival and eventual 88-run partnership between Joe Shuttle (31 not out) and Alun Thomas (61 from 28 balls) put paid to any delusions of success the local boys may have formed.

Thomas, in particular, was merciless. Timing, power and technique were in perfect symmetry, as he collected five 6s and four 4s, with his first 6 remarkably coming off nothing more than a forward defensive shot. The young Welshman's quiet demeanor had worried his coach and captain earlier that morning, but his performance at the ACG certainly instilled confidence amongst his team for the rest of their tour.

However, credit must go to young Val Guiraud, who kept his chin up in facing such a formidable opponent and with the very last ball of the innings beat Thomas for pace and accuracy to take a memorable and deserved scalp. Pick of the bowlers for Phuket were Guiraud (2 for 31) and Khan (2 for 32).

Undoubtedly, the chase was going to be difficult for PCG and on seeing the pace of MCC's opening attack; the task became that of damage limitation.

Despite this, PCG went on the offensive determined to put on a show for their supporters. Vice captain and opener Bill Stahmer (3)
