House of horror

Norwegian man confesses after decomposing body parts found in his basement

THE Norwegian man arrested on Tuesday after the decaying remains of a human body were found in his Phuket home has confessed to "accidentally killing" Rungnapa Suktong, his girlfriend of seven years.

Stein Havard Dokset, a 50year-old retired car dealer from Oslo, Norway, on Wednesday confessed to officers at Chalong Police Station.

"I did it, but it was an accident," he said.

"We had an argument. She pushed me and then I pushed her, and she fell down the stairs. I checked her pulse and she was not breathing... I didn't know what to do. I was scared so I hid her body," he told police.

Mr Dokset was arrested at his house off Soi Koktanode in Kata on Tuesday night when officers from Crime Suppression Division,

Sub Division 5, in Bangkok arrived in force along with Chalong Police and Phuket Provincial Police.

About 20 officers were involved in the raid, the *Phuket* Gazette was told.

The raid was coordinated after a tip-off from a Bangkok law firm who were working on a missing persons report filed by Mrs Rungnapa's family in Surat Thani two years ago.

She was last seen a month before her family reported her as missing, said Pol Col Atip Tannin, superintendent of Crime Suppression Division Subdivision 5, who led the raid on the home.


Inside the downstairs bathroom, which was locked, police found a plastic trash bin belonging to Karon Municipality.

Inside the bin police found pieces of flesh and a hip bone they believed were human. The flesh was so decayed that police could not learn any more details about their gruesome discovery.

The officers immediately dispatched the remains to Surat Thani for autopsy on Tuesday

The results returned on Wednesday confirmed their fears: the flesh and bone were human.

egnant mum, Aussie model among six killed in motorbike crashes

A family of three died when their motor-9:30pm on Tuesday. The accident occurred near the entrance to the Baan Wana housing estate on Srisoonthorn Road, about three kilometers west of the Heroines' Monument.

At the scene, Thalang Police found a crumpled motorbike and three bodies on the wet pavement.

Dead at the scene from multiple trauma injuries were 25-year-old Uttaradit native Suphat Punted and a boy aged about nine or 10, presumed to be his son.

Kusoldharm Foundation workers percycle was hit by a pick-up truck at about formed CPR on the only survivor, a woman in her 20s presumed to be the wife of the late Mr Suphat. She was alive when she reached Thalang Hospital, but died shortly thereafter. A preliminary examination of the body by medical staff found the woman was six or seven months pregnant.

Nearby the motorbike was a Nissan pickup on its side.

Police found the driver, a man in his 40s, among the crowd gathered at the

scene. Sensing the potential for danger among the growing crowd of locals who braved the rain to view the accident scene, they took the man into custody for his own protection as well as initial charging.

The driver did not flee the scene.

Thalang Police initially suspect that the driver of the motorbike, presumed to have been Mr Suphat, may have been at fault for pulling out of a side soi too quickly for the truck to brake in time.

No crash helmets were found at the scene, rescue workers said.

Rohingya deported

IMMIGRATION officials have confirmed that the Rohingya who landed on Nai Harn Beach on the morning of February 26 were returned to Burma.

Phuket Immigration Office Superintendent Panuwat Ruamrak said that all 90 taken into custody, including four boys aged 13, were Burmese and were detained at Chalong Police Station before being transferred to Ranong.

Ranong Immigration officer told the Phuket Gazette, "They arrived at Ranong Immigration Office the day after landing and have already been deported to Burma."

Chalong Police rounded up 90 of the starving Rohingya boat people who came ashore, but believed up to 12 more escaped

The Rohingya, all males, were on their way to Malaysia when they ran out of food and their wooden boat began to fall apart at sea, forcing them to come ashore at Nai Harn Beach before dawn. Their arrival was quickly reported to patrol police, who rounded up the men in separate groups of about 30, each in different parts of Nai Harn in Rawai.

Penniless, disoriented and unable to speak Thai, most of the men could do little but wait for their inevitable capture by police. Those captured were sent to

Chalong Police Station, where they gulped down drinking water and devoured fried chicken, bananas and sticky rice provided by the officers.

Communication with the men was a problem. One of their number, the only one who could speak Burmese, told police through an interpreter that they had set off 12 days ago in hope of reaching Malaysia.

The man said there were 102 people in the open boat, meaning that 12 remain unaccounted for.

The group ran out of food and water three days ago, the man said. Thirst, hunger and problems with the wooden vessel forced them ashore short of their goal. The landing was sadly reminiscent of a similar beaching a year ago, when 70 Rohingya were rounded up and eventually deported.

Their boat, about fifteen meters long and five meters across, appeared to have broken in half as it hit the beach.

Phuket Provincial Court launches night hearings

FACED with thousands of unresolved cases, Phuket Provincial Court launched a "night court" service on February 21 in an effort to reduce the backlog.

Phuket Court Acting Chief Justice Audthakarn Foojaroen and fellow justices have announced the night court hours, Monday to Friday from 4:30pm to 8:30pm.

The night court will hear two civil and petty criminal cases per day, and as many as 20 consumer complaint cases.

Four mediators will be on duty to try and settle disputes before they reach the courtroom floor, Justice Audthakarn said.

The Court will also begin hearing 10 cases daily on Saturdays and Sundays, starting this weekend.

These will include criminal cases, as well as civil cases involving property and inheritance disputes. The Court will hear the first five cases in a morning session starting at 9am, then adjourn until the afternoon session that begins at 1:30pm.

The unprecedented move stems from the fact that although Phuket already has the highest per capita litigation rate of any province in the south of Thailand, the increase in the number of new cases continues to grow.

On Saturday Lana O'Connell, a model from Australia's Gold Coast, was killed when the motorbike she was driving struck a motorbike with sidecar on Patak Road in Chalong at about 3:30am.


The impact caused the bike to veer across the centerline and collided with a motorbike coming in the opposite direction. Three others suffered minor injuries, including Ms O'Connell's partner Kenneth Trivett. Ms O'Connell was not wearing a crash helmet, rescue workers said.

A day earlier, Suphakit

Phachonroongrote, 17, was returning from his school when he lost control of his motorbike and hit the back of a pickup truck parked by the side of Srisoonthorn Road. The youth, not wearing a helmet, died instantly from the impact, rescue workers said.

Late on Sunday night, 40-yearold Phichit Masmalai was killed instantly when his motorbike slammed into a utility pole on Thepkrasattri Road in Koh Kaew, opposite the Isuzu showroom.

Rescue workers said there was no evidence that another vehicle was involved. Mr Phichit, an employee of the Sunwing Resort in

THE Royal Thai Air Force conducted high-speed flyovers of Phuket Town on Tuesday and Wednesday this week in order to test its radar installation atop the large hill Khao Mai Thao Sip Song, the island's highest point, in

Pregnant teenage Australian beaten, robbed by ladyboys

A PREGNANT Australian teenager was beaten and robbed by four ladyboys in Patong in the early hours of February 22.

The victim, 19-year-old "Bonnie May", asked that only her nickname be used out of fear or reprisal by the gang of ladyboys. They attacked her for no reason after she asked them for directions, she said.

"At about 1am I was walking alone back to my hotel from Soi Bangla and tried to make a shortcut through a small alley.

"I saw four ladyboys and I asked them the way to the main road. They were yelling something I did not understand, so I asked them again the way to the main road.

"Then they started to attack me, punching my arm, hitting my face, pulling my hair and kicking my back. I cried out that I was pregnant, but they did not listen. They kept attacking me. They were also touching my vagina and kicking my belly. They took my bag, which had an iPhone and camera inside, and pulled my gold ring off my finger," she said.

She had no cash on her at the ning away," she said.

time of the attack, Bonnie said.

"Three of them attacked me while the fourth was a lookout, telling people to keep away. There were a few people around, but nobody came to help," she added.

"They tried to cover my mouth to keep me quiet. Every time I made a noise they would slap my face, so I stopped moving, pretending I had given up. Then they kicked me a few times before run-

After the attack she rushed to the hotel where she was staying with her 24-year-old boyfriend. Bonnie said she could not remember the name of the street where the attack took place, but a source familiar with the case told the Gazette that it was near a popular nightclub on Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Road near the intersection at the east end of Soi Bangla.

Asked why she was walking alone at the time, she said she

Bangla while her boyfriend stayed at the hotel with a friend. "Our hotel is not far from Soi Bangla,"

The couple arrived at Patong Hospital at about 3:30pm the next day. An ambulance then transported Bonnie to Bangkok Hospital Phuket in Phuket Town.

Bonnie's greatest fear was that kicks to her stomach could have injured her unborn baby.

"They kicked my belly, and my belly did not move all day after that," she said.

Once the medical checkup was complete, Bonnie said her next stop would be Patong Police Station to file a complaint against her assailants.

"I can identify all four of them, especially the tall, skinny leader, who had long hair and a protruding jaw," she said.

Bonnie said she didn't think she would ever return to Phuket.

After a 40-minute evaluation by a hospital physician, Bonnie emerged from the examination with her boyfriend. "The fetus is fine and we are going to have a baby girl," she said, smiling.

A check of the registered owner of the gun confirmed that it belonged to Mrs Rungnapa.

Police officers then scoured the house for more clues, including a pump room. Believing that more remains might have been hidden in the septic tank, police ordered for the tank to be emptied.

A search of the tank's contents, however, revealed nothing other than the obvious.

Parichat Sriraksa, a 30-year-old cousin of Mrs Rungnapa, told the Gazette that Mrs Rungnapa worked as a maid in Patong.

"She was Mr Dokset's girlfriend for seven years. They lived together in his house for six years," she said.

Mrs Rungnapa left Mr Dokset and started a relationship with a new boyfriend, a police officer in Patong. The policeman – who police at the time of going to press had yet to name - and Mrs Rungnapa married and had one son, but Mrs Rungnapa sent her son to stay with her family in Surat Thani, Miss Parichat explained.

Mrs Rungnapa, who on marriage stopped using her maiden name Ratsombat and assumed her policeman husband's family name Suktong, was reported missing one month after she left Mr Dokset, which was more than two years ago, said Miss Parichat.

'Rungnapa had two other sons, 12 and 14 years old. Both those sons are from her marriage from before she met Mr Dokset or the policeman," she said.

Those sons and more than 10 relatives from Surat Thani were at the house on Wednesday.

"We reported to the Patong Police before about Rungnapa missing," Miss Parichat said.

"We always suspected that she was murdered. We saw blood stains in her car when the bank came to repossess it after no payments were made since she went missing," she added.

"Patong police promised to take care of the case, but they didn't really take any action. So we decided to ask for help from the media and everyone we could possibly get. Finally we got Crime Suppression Division to help find my cousin," Miss Parichat said.

Honorary Consuls go through the motions

JET-ski scams, noise pollution in Patong and real estate rip-offs topped the issues raised by honorary consuls during their quarterly meeting with Phuket government officers on Monday.

The meeting was chaired by Phuket Vice Governor Sommai Prijasilpa, the first-ever person to chair the meeting in English.

The consuls' meeting was the first to be attended by a member of the United States diplomatic mission in Thailand, US Consulate-General Elizabeth Pratt.

Australian Consul Larry Cunningham raised the recurring problem of jet-ski scams with new Phuket Provincial Police Commander Chonasit Wattanavrangkul, who was also attending his first consuls' meeting.

Mr Cunningham asked the new commander if he was aware of iet-ski scams that include operators demanding compensation for pre-existing damage below the

water-line that is not visible to the eye when the jet-skis are rented out offshore.

When the renters return the jetskis to shore they are shown scratches and, in some cases, surrounded by as many as 20 "thugs" who intimidate them into agreeing to pay, Mr Cunningham said.

Maj Gen Chonasit said he was well aware of the situation after discussing it with the Phuket Governor. It was his understanding that most of the problems came from operators who did not take out insurance, he said.

Speaking through an interpreter, Maj Gen Chonasit said police "only have the power to enforce the law and look after tourists", but that they were often called upon to negotiate compensation agreements between renters and operators.

It was the responsibility of the local Marine Department Office to ensure that all jet-skis carried insurance, he said.

Both Mr Cunningham and British Honorary Consul Martin Carpenter raised the issue of uninsured jet-skis operating at both Surin and Laem Singh beaches, where current zoning regulations prohibit their use.

Phuripat Theerakulpisut, Chief of Phuket's Marine Office 5, told the consuls that the jet-ski insurance scheme had "solved the problem already", but that some ministerial regulations still needed to be amended so that the scheme could be better enforced.

TWO baby elephants seized in Phuket on Monday will be sent to an elephant reserve in the Northern Thailand province of Lampang.

The transfer of the two male baby elephants – Popeye and Joey follows officials from Bangkok arriving in Phuket earlier this month to investigate the origins of three baby elephants in Phuket.

On Monday, Popeye was seized at the ATV Sea View On Tour elephant camp on the hill to Phuket's famed Big Buddha image and Joey was taken into custody at the elephant camp operated by Laguna Excursions Ltd in Cherng Talay.

The two infant males were taken to Khao Phra Taew wildlife

reserve in Thalang, where they will be kept until they are transferred to the TECC in Lampang.

Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation (DNP) Chief Damrong Phidej and assistant national police chief Chalermkiat Sirworakan arrived at the ATV Sea View On Tour on Monday evening to over-

Both Popeye and Joey were both "rented" from the Pang Chang Sai Yok Elephant Park in Kanchanaburi, said Chief Damrong.

Popeye's mother was seized by DNP officials in a raid on the Sai Yok camp earlier this month and transferred to Lampang province along with 19 other elephants at the camp. Officials said that the camp did not have any documents to prove ownership of the animals.

"Subsequent investigation revealed that Popeye was rented out for one year, starting last August," said Mr Damrong, showing the actual rental contract to the Gazette reporter.

"Joey was also a rented out by

is the son of Pang Nong Paeng, who was also seized from the Sai Yok camp.

"The camp could not provide the identification cards for the mothers of Popeve or Joey, which indicates that the mothers were wild elephants. That would also classify the two baby elephants as wild," he added.

Meanwhile, investigations into the legality of the baby elephant at the Phuthai Souvenir Market in Chalong, one of the baby elephants investigated in the February 11 raids, have yet to conclude.

"They have the correct documents for the baby's mother, but we are still waiting for DNA tests to confirm whether or not the mother and the baby elephant are related." said Metee Meechai, di-DNP's Wildlife rector Preservation Division for Region

> 5, based in Nakhon Thammarat.

> Investigators will return to the four camps under investigation - Laguna Excursions Ltd in Cherng Talay, ATV Sea View On Tour in Chalong, Siam Safari in Chalong and At Hill Adventure Tour in Chalong - on March 16.

"The four camps have 37 elephants in total.

They have until March 16 to prepare the correct documents," said Chief Damrong.

"All four places we investigated were very cooperative. I have no problem with them renting elephants to show at their camps. But if there is no evidence to prove that the elephants are not legally registered, we have no choice but to seize them," he added.

However, Mr Methee warned, "If the camp owners do not have the right documents for the elephants, they will be punished and the elephants will also be handed over to the TECC.'

Legal prosecution will left to the local authorities to pursue, explained DNP officer Tassanes Petkong.

Col Watcharin Phusin, the superintendent of the regional Natural Resources and Environment Crime Suppression Division, told the *Gazette* that anyone found guilty in the investigation will get up to four years in jail, a 40,000 baht fine, or both, in accordance with Wildlife Preservation and Protection Act.

Pressuring the Phuket elephant

camps with further scrutiny were Phuket Forestry Department officers, who on Monday seized logs cut from protected trees on the hillside above the ATV Elephant Camp.

"We also found a backhoe at the site, but we did not find any workers on the hill, so we will work with Chalong Police to find the suspects," said Amnard Soikiew, the director of the Forestry Department's Protection and Suppression Division in Bangkok.

His department is also investigating the land titles for the sites occupied by the ATV camp, Siam Safari and At Hill Adventure Tours.

"According to our investigation, the owner of the ATV camp has only a *SorPorKor* document [for

the land in question], which was issued after the camp was established," Mr Amnard said.

SorPorKor documents, which are issued by the Forestry Department, allow the holder to use the land for agricultural purposes only.

"Meanwhile, the owners of Siam Safari and At Hill Adventure Tours do not have the right documents to prove they own the land. Their case will be sent to the court. If they claim the land belongs to them, they can prove it to the court," Mr Amnard said.

"If they are found to have no rights to the land, they will have to vacate the property," he said.



Beer Garden gutted by fire

THE owners of a beer garden that went up in flames in Phuket on February 26 are denying rumors that the blaze was set by a disgruntled former employee.

It took six fire engines about an hour to extinguish the fire that gutted the Kamala Beer Garden on the main road through Kamala.

Owners Chollada Nakballang, 31, and her Canadian boyfriend Greg Layton, 51, were asleep in a room upstairs in an adjacent house when they smelled smoke and tried to scramble to safety.

They found themselves trapped inside as a metal roll-up security door downstairs became stuck.

Ms Chollada was able to escape over a wall and Mr Layton escaped when a neighbor managed to tear away part of the metal door, creating an escape hole.

Phet Somnongwa, a 50-yearold masseuse at the nearby, said it took about 30 minutes for the first firefighters to arrive.

Mr Layton reviewed closed-circuit television images that clearly showed sparks from a nearby utility poll starting the fire.

The couple bought the beer garden about a month ago and did not have any insurance to cover the cost of the damages, which they estimated at about four to five

After about 20 minutes, by using a tow cable and brute manpower to turn the vehicle right way up, rescue workers managed to retrieve the vehicle.

Wheelchairs to tricycles

Rotary donations help mobilize disabled from Phuket to Phang Nga

THE lives of nine disabled people from Phuket and Phang Nga took a turn for the better on February 23 when they were given hightech wheelchair "pullers" donated by local and international chapters of Rotary International.

The handover ceremony, at Queen Sirkit Park, was presided over by Sanguan Kunaporn, head of the Rotary Club of Tongkah and a nominee for the governorship of Rotary District 3300.

Dr Sanguan, a world-renowned surgeon, said the handover was part of a larger 1.2-million-baht project to provide a total of 40 similar units to people unable to

The pullers, designed by Thammasat University engineering professor Dr Banyong Rungruengduayboon, effectively turn the users' original wheelchairs into tricycles that can reach speeds of up to 20 kilome-

three hours on a single charge.

When not needed, the 30,000baht devices can be easily detached and folded up for transport by car.

Also funding the project were the Rotary Foundation (USD 19,600) and Rotary District 6060 (USD 8,000) in Eastern Missouri, USA.

receive the devices are those who do not have the ability to walk, but retain upper body strength.

"There are about 250 disabled people who are needlessly immobilized in Phuket," he said.

"The devices will greatly increase their ability to travel Dr Sanguan said candidates to outside," Dr Sanguan added.

A special guest at the ceremony was 14-year-old Nitcharee Peneakchanasak, who lost her legs in an accident in the Singapore mass transit system in April last year.

Miss Nitcharee, whose braverv has been an inspiration to people around the country, has since been fitted with prosthetic legs thanks to financial assistance from HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn.

Among the recipients at the event was 19-year-old Arisa Ratso, a student at Sukhothai Thammathirat Open University.

Despite her young age, Arisa has been in treatment for the condition for over a decade.

Praying lizard crashes life-renewal ceremony

A NINE-INCH gecko is the talk of the town in a village in the Northern province of Phayao this week – not for its size, which isn't exactly unusual, but for its piety.

On Monday, one of the village families invited a monk to their home to hold a Buddhist ceremony of renewal.

The ceremony was interrupted halfway through – when villagers noticed the gecko hanging from a beam on the ceiling of the house's

Khampan Suyata, 74, the owner of the house, said the whole family had gathered in the house at 7am for a life-renewal ritual in honor of himself and his 61-yearold wife Sri Suyata.

While carrying out the ceremony, they heard a clamor coming from



downstairs and ran down to find the unusual lizard.

The monk declared that the bizarre show of piety from the creature showed that the household was lucky.

Villagers who had come to join the ceremony said that just as the monk was sprinkling holy water on the heads of those taking part, they noticed that the gecko was stretching its neck out too.

With its back legs, the nine-inch lizard gripped a beam on the ceiling of the porch. It was holding its front legs in front of its chest in a prayer-like pose.

Ex-security guard pushed over the edge by ghosts

A FORMER security guard fell 10 floors to his death from his home after claiming he was being haunted and possessed by ghosts.

Khathayut Sukkhlum, 36, was fired from his job in Bangkok about three months prior to his death.

His broken body was discovered around 10am on February 17.

Witnesses said Mr Khathavu lost his job after his behavior became increasingly strange. He used to shake uncontrollably and say he was possessed.

Three days before his death he stood in front of the block shaking and telling passersby he had been possessed by a child's spirit.

Officers from Hua Mark Police Station have yet to establish the reason for Mr Khathayut's death.

Among the theories put forward is that he was being pursued by ghosts and leapt from the balcony to escape them.

Charter rewrite geenlighted

PARLIAMENT last week voted to establish a Constitution Drafting Assembly (CDA) to amend the current charter, a move many analysts believe could reignite the political conflict that has divided Thailand over the last half decade.

The ruling Pheu Thai Party is moving to rewrite the 2007 Constitution, which was approved in a referendum, but drafted during the rule of the military junta that ousted Thaksin Shinwatra in a coup in 2006.

Pheu Thai says the current charter is "undemocratic", while the opposition Democrat Party claims the party only wants to rewrite the Constitution to benefit Mr Thaksin, who lives abroad to escape a two-year prison sentence for corruption.

Mr Thaksin claims the 2008 conviction was politically motivated. The ruling party is expected to push for clauses that would absolve all participants in the recent political conflict of any convictions – a change critics claim is intended to allow Mr Thaksin to

return to Thailand a free man.

Following two days of debate, the Upper and Lower Houses of Parliament on February 24 jointly voted in favor of three bills that would allow the establishment of a CDA to rewrite the constitution.

"I hope the charter rewrite will heed the people's voice and meet their aspirations, leading to social acceptance and peace," said Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra.

The CDA will be comprised of 77 popularly elected provincial drafters and 22 elected by Parliament. The opposition claims the Pheu Thai Party, which controls Parliament, will fill the body with its own members.

Among the clauses of the Constitution that Pheu Thai will likely want to remove are those that spe-

cifically absolve the 2006 coupmakers of any wrongdoing.

Also likely to be targeted is a clause that allows the judiciary to dissolve any political party whose executives are found to have broken electoral laws.

The clause was used by Constitutional Court judges to dissolve both the Thai Rak Thai and People Power parties.

The Pheu Thai party has voiced criticism of the referendum on the 2007 charter, carried out while much of the country was under martial law. The ruling junta used government money to fund a vast propaganda campaign to promote the draft, while passing a law making it a criminal act to criticize it.

Many analysts believe the fresh redraft process could reignite violent political conflicts which Thailand has suffered since long before Thaksin's ouster.

"The military is increasingly alarmed over moves by the government to reduce its role, trim its influence and seed the senior command structure with Thaksin

Third suspect in Bangkok bombing faces questioning

THAI police are questioning a third Iranian man in connection with bomb blasts in Bangkok earlier this month that blew the legs off one suspected plotter and injured several Thais.

Madani Seyed Mehrded, one of three suspects arrested last week, remains in Immigration Police custody for overstaying his visa.

A couple, identified as Rahimi Radiraj and Mahbub Tasbehi, were released after questioning revealed they had no links to the blasts.

In addition, Saeib Morabi, who lost his legs, is still in hospital, while Mohammad Hazai, 42, is also in police custody.

Masoud Seda Ghatzadeh is now held by police in Malaysia, pending likely extradition to Thailand. Suspected bomb-maker Javad Nikkahfard is on the run and Rohanni Laila, suspected as being responsible for logistics, has reportedly returned to Iran.

Last Sunday evening, police raided the Nasa Vegas condominium in Bangkok's Hua Mark area, result-

THAI police are questioning a ing in the three most recent arrests.

Thai media reported that call logs showed Mr Mehdred, 33, had been in regular contact with the two suspects already in custody.

Police continue to investigate a series of mysterious stickers bearing the word "SEJEAL" that were found stuck on structures along a 1.5km route in Central Bangkok.

The media has speculated that the stickers, which were also found at the suspects' house in Ekkamai, were to be used to mark a route or identify points to attack.



Charlem claims ill, not drunk

CONTROVERSIAL Deputy Prime Minister Chalerm Yoobamrung is once again in the limelight, this time over allegations he was drunk during a parliamentary debate.

Mr Chalerm responded to the accusations from the opposition Democrat Party by claiming he was suffering from an "inner-ear problem" that made him sway as if intoxicated.

He also threatened to sue four newspapers that also made the claims, which surrounded his performance at the debate over constitutional amendments on the evening of February 24.

Mr Chalerm admitted he had been to a wedding reception beforehand, but claimed he had only had a couple of drinks.

The MP said he would be more than glad to answer to

parliamentary ethics panel.

During the debate, Mr Chalerm interrupted a 10-minute speech by opposition leader Abhisit Vejjajiva to claim he had breached Code 43 of the parliamentary regulations by talking about an issue irrelevant to the debate.

"If I were drunk, would I have known the specific code?" he asked

Democrat MP Rangsima Rodrassamee, however, claimed he was indeed intoxicated.

Mr Chalerm filed defamation complaints with police against *Thai Rath*, *Thai Post*, *Naew Na* and *Siam Rath* newspapers to defend his reputation.

Mr Chalerm said he would withdraw the complaint against *Thai Rath* if it clarified that the accusations came from Mrs Rangsima and not the paper.

Seeing the elephant in the room

THE United Nations estimates that the human population of planet Earth quietly surpassed the seven billion mark last October. As a result, humankind is putting ever more pressure on the environment that sustains us. In the process, we are also driving many other animal species into extinction, some before they are even recognized by science.

Few places on the planet could serve as a better showcase for the demise of native wildlife than Thailand, and Phuket is a particularly good example.

Recent events involving the country's national symbol, the elephant, have once again cast the international spotlight on Thailand, reinforcing its well-deserved reputation as an international laughing stock when it comes to wildlife preservation.

The raid earlier this month of a sanctuary for abused wildlife run by the Wildlife Friends of Thailand (WFFT) in Phetchaburi is a good case in point.

The raid followed a letter to the media by WFFT founder Edwin Wiek in which he challenged authorities to do their jobs by checking DNA records of baby elephants at tourist-oriented elephant camps to ensure they were properly registered as domestic.

His actions have already resulted in two unregistered baby elephants in Phuket slated for reunion with mothers, but his exposure of the issue also resulted in an unexpected backlash. His center was raided two weeks later by some 70 park rangers, including some in balaclavas, who removed many animals, including primates.

Although it may be a coincidence, the National Research Council of Thailand shortly thereafter announced its plan to establish the country's first "National Primate Research Center", a breeding facility in Saraburi costing 1.8bn baht. The research will have little to do with conservation. The stated objective is to provide subjects for medical testing of products based on Thai traditional medicines that researchers would eventually like to sell to a wider market.

The very idea of "wild elephant smuggling" would be comical if it weren't for the overwhelmingly sad reality that the multi-layered corruption of politicians, government officials and "influential figures" is allowing it to happen at a rate of up to 250 baby elephants a year, according to Mr Wiek's estimates.

It is hard to imagine a more difficult object to "smuggle" through a police or immigration checkpoint than a living, breathing pachyderm. Even a newborn like Pang Saifon, born in Rawai on Tuesday, hit the ground weighing 75 kilograms.

As it is inconceivable that elephants could somehow be smuggled onto the island through the Tah Chat Chai Police checkpoint, the only conclusion is that the relevant local officials know exactly what is going on with the elephants working on Phuket, but have done little to prevent enforce the regulations.

Giving back to an island community

FIRST PERSON

I GOT a job at the Phuket City Municipality water treatment plant when I moved down here. It didn't take long for my job to become a routine and I knew I needed something new to make my life worth living.

I figured out how to kill my boredom when I took a training course on firefighting provided by the Civil Defense Volunteer unit. After that one course, I signed up for more courses and finally I decided to be part of

the unit. I wish everyone could take part in charity work, but I know everyone is different. For those who can afford to make generous do-

nation, they could just do that. As long as you are giving something back to society that's good enough.

I can't afford to make big monetary donations, but I can, and I want to, devote all my time to my volunteer work.

By nature I like to help others. Even before I got my training I helped a lot of people who were in road accidents. But before the class I wasn't properly trained, so I didn't know how to really help them – all I could do to help was call an ambulance or the police and help direct traffic.



Arnon Chuenchom, 44, is originally from Nakhon Si Thammarat. He moved to Phuket in 1993 with his wife. He came to here to work and earn a better living for himself and his family, but he is now dedicating all of his free time to helping people on the island as a Civil Defense Volunteer.

to help people and make a difference in their lives. Being altruistic like this is important. Just knowing that the people we helped are safe makes me happy.

My main job at the water treatment plant is a shift job, which means sometime I start work in the morning, sometimes in the afternoon and sometimes in the evenings, but no matter when I finish work, I always make time to carry out my responsibilities as a volunteer.

The Phuket City Municipality Civil Defense Volunteers are going to launch a 'rapid rescue' team. I am one of the people with enough training to qualify for the team. Once the budget for the unit is approved, I will volunteer to convert my own truck into a rescue truck.

My family doesn't understand why I do the volunteer work. They are always asking me why I do it if there is no money. I have explained to them that money doesn't always pay for happiness.

Helping people who are in need brings much more happiness than money.

Helmets: a documentary

A FEW weeks ago over breakfast, I was discussing with a friend the reoccurring argument over which group of motorbike riders wears helmets the least, Thais or foreign-

Talk to a policeman and he'll tell you its the tourists. Speak with the expats and many will cite the young Thais as the worst offenders. Whichever side one takes it's obvious to most that the statistics are fundamentally flawed due to the method of testing. Figures would appear to be compiled by police manning occasional check points along major roads. The savvy non-helmet wearing community often have enough warning of the impending check to don their anti-fine protection or perform a nonchalant u-turn thus avoiding the rat-trap.

In the interest of science, we decided to conduct an experiment while having breakfast. Armed with the latest G3 smart technogadget my co-conspirator captured five minutes of traffic passing us along Sai Yuan Road near Da Vinci.

In that time 61 motorbikes passed, 62 if you count the blond pushing hers. Of those vehicles 47 were single drivers; 9 carrying one passenger; 2 carrying two passengers and 3 with sidecars.

Of the 61 drivers only 30 had opted for wearing a helmet (less than 50 per cent). Passengers performed better with eight of the 13 (8/13) wearing helmets.

So far as gender and ethnicity fair, the break-down for motorbike drivers not wearing helmets was as follows: Thai males (7/14), foreign males (13/32) a total of 20/ 46. Females in this category were Thai (10/12), foreigners (1/3) a total of 11/15.

Looking at the statistics another way 17/25 Thais failed to don hel-

mets as opposed to 14/36 foreigners. Feel free to draw your own conclusions.

Not only is parking there dangerous, but it can also cause traffic congestion issues.

If we find cars parked there we will issue tickets and the offenders will have to pay a 300-baht fine.

Yesterday, my friends and I nicipal, Internal Activities Department head, replies:

> By law, any beach that meets the ocean water is considered a public beach. No one has the right to charge for use of public land.

> Even though Freedom Beach is a public beach, the area's geographic features are unique in that it can be difficult to access. The easiest way to access the beach is by longtail boat, though it can also be reached by road. The tricky part of using the road is that the only entrance is not on public land, so it is possible that you would have to pay the land owner

If you travel by longtail boat, however, there should not be any entrance fee. You might have to pay a fee for a beach chair or to use the bathroom, but not an entrance fee for the beach.

I have not been notified of the problem of people collecting fees at a public beach, but it is unacceptable. No one has the legal right to collect money as an entrance fee. I would recommend anyone who encounters this problem to come to our office to file a complaint.

This issue needs to be ad-

dressed as soon as possible since it affects the image of tourism, especially in Patong. Please come to our office and fill out the form, so we can coordinate an investigation for the problem.

Boaters' weekend market to launch

PHUKET Boat Lagoon will launch a new weekend market catering to boat owners on the weekend starting Saturday, March 10.

The Weekend Boat Market is the brainchild of Boon Yongsakul, a member of the Phuket Boat Lagoon management team and a descendant of Phuket Boat Lagoon founder Kanit Yongsakul.

The main concept of the market is a new shopping and trade market focusing on boats and marine equipment, Mr Boon explained.

It will also hold garage sales and feature a garden food park.

Luxury auto dealer projects 25% growth

HIGHLIGHTING the European high-end car market's upward trend in Phuket, a major luxury car dealer has set its sales target to be 25% higher than last year.

Sureeporn Udompolvanich, CEO of TSL Auto Corporation Co Ltd, revealed that the company was able to sell 800 cars in 2011 with a 15% increase in total revenue when compared to 2010.

Alien laborer deadline gets extension

MORE than 20,000 unregistered national verification process. migrant workers in Phuket now have until mid-June to register with the government, thanks to a Cabinet resolution earlier this month extending the deadline by five months.

The extension gives employers time to obtain two-year work permits for unregistered alien workers from Burma, Laos and Cambodia, said Phuket Provincial Employment Office Chief Noppadol Ployudee.

Workers whose permits were set to expire on January 20 or February 28 now have until June 14 to extend them, but their employer needs to request the new permits and submit documents by April 12 to begin their employees

Any workers who fail to complete the verification process by June 14 will not be allowed to work after that date, he said.

As an added incentive, alien workers who apply for permits and complete the verification process before June 15 will be eligible for 500 baht visas to reenter the country, Mr Noppadol said.

After the deadline, the visa fee will return to the normal rate of 2,000 baht, he said.

Mr Noppadol explained the new deadline to employers at a meeting attended by about 60 people at the Phuket Merlin Hotel on Tuesday.

Topics covered at the meeting included other issues affecting

employers hiring low-wage foreign workers, such as the social security services registered workers would be eligible to receive.

Attendees were told that there are 10,700 employers in Phuket that employ a total of 62,183 alien workers. These break down as follows: 38,287 holders of permits

who have completed the verification process; 859 holders of permits under a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Thailand and their home countries; 2,479 holders of existing permits who have yet to complete the verification process; 20,588 new applicants who must complete the verification process by June 14.

Mr Noppadol said the Thai government is holding discussions with Laos and Cambodia to allow their nationals to work in Thailand under an MoU agreement, doing away with the need for national verification.

However, the date when formal talks on the issue would take place have yet to be announced, he said.

Mr Noppadol said there are now 72 companies in the country registered with the Ministry of Labor to act as agents to help the employers complete the complicated process of legalizing alien workers.

In addition, the Burmese government has set up verification centers in five more provinces: Chiang Mai, Samut Sakhon, Samut Prakan, Surat Thani and Bangkok.

In addition to the original three located in Ranong, Tak and Chiang Rai, this brings the national network to eight, he said.

Nationwide, more than a million workers from the three countries must complete verification by the June 14 deadline.

Shutter island



THIS week I'm going to change topic a bit. At the Computer Clinics we used to talk about all sorts of technology, including TVs, tablet computers, cameras and phones – much to the chagrin of several Windows die-hards.

The simple fact is that all of the technology is converging, with more-powerful and more-mobile computer chips making all sorts of magic possible. This year will see a stunning array of new devices, including Windows 8 running on tablets – real tablets, thin ones, without fans, the kind that work with finger gestures and sell for less than US\$500, (maybe less).

How fast is the technology changing? Let me give you an example. Yesterday I had a chance to take a day trip to Khao Karos, a little-known, but spectacular mangrove forest with soaring karsts, caves, wildlife, and prehistoric paintings. It's near Krabi, about an hour from the north end of Phuket – if you can find it. We took a long-tail boat – and three cameras: my trusty Canon IXUS 870 IS Point & Shoot, a Flip MinoHD video camera, and my wife's new camera, which I'll discuss later.

Three years ago, the Canon IXUS 870 IS was one of the top rated Point & Shoots according to trustedreviews.com, November 2008, "the new Digital IXUS 870 IS, a slim and stylish 10.0-megapixel, 4x zoom ultra-compact with optical image stabilization and a 28mm wide-angle lens... a superbly well made and very attractive

luxury ultra-compact with excellent performance, a useful zoom range, an outstandingly good LCD monitor and superb image quality... The only downsides are its slightly awkward handling, an underpowered flash and the relatively high price." I bought it in Hong Kong for about US\$300.

About 18 months ago, with a new baby on the way, I decided to get a video camera. I settled on the Cisco Flip MinoHD with 8 GB of memory. PC Mag.com had this to say in September, 2010: "Very good video quality. Thin, light design. Easy to operate. Simple software for managing videos. HDMI output for watching videos on an HDTV." I bought it in the States for USD230 and had it shipped out here.

All three of the phones take videos. The Flip doesn't take stills, but you can easily "grab" a high definition frame from any of the videos.

I've been taking photos with all three cameras, but never really had an opportunity to compare them. This time was different.

The trip to Khao Karos proved an excellent testing ground for the cameras. Shooting videos from a long-tail boat tests the living daylights out of image stabilization. Taking stills in various lighting conditions (see the shot on this page) showed me color balance, and fill flash (not on the Flip) helped compensate for high contrast situations. Out on the water, we moved in and out of caves, often crossing from very dark regions to bright sunlight in a matter of seconds.

In the end, looking at the results, there's absolutely no question that my wife has the best camera of the bunch. The autofocus and image stabilization on the 8MP camera work a treat. It takes full HD

(1080p) videos, and the detail is simply breathtaking. Changing the focus point only takes a touch. When you take a shot, the screen's back and ready for action in a fraction of a second. For both stills and videos, my wife's camera came out on top, time and time again. Of course, it costs a bit more than the other cameras,

By now you may have guessed that my wife's camera comes with a few other features that you don't normally associate with a camera. Like, oh, I don't know, a telephone and 3G internet, email, Facebook, free long distance phone calls and SMSs, a music player, a video player, and full access to the Apple AppStore. Her camera is an iPhone 4S, and I'd put the camera quality up against just about any moderately-priced camera on the market.

I'm not the only one. Geek.com has a convincing side-by-side comparison between an iPhone 4S and a 21 MP Canon EOS 5D Mark II (US\$3,200 or so depending on lens; is.gd/ziFuUP). Ars Technica has a lengthy comparison between an iPhone 4S, a Samsung Galaxy SII, a Canon 20D and an Olympus XZ-1.

Don't get me wrong. The iPhone 4S isn't in the same league as a full-bore Canon EOS 5D, or a Hasselblad but it's a very capable camera – ignoring the phone for the moment – that's easy to carry around and a treat to use.

The price? If you get it in Thailand with either TrueMove or AIS service, the iPhone 4S currently lists at 16,900 baht (roughly USD550). Last week, TrueMove announced that it was cutting prices "up to 50%" for people who want to buy new iPhones,

if they are currently True Visions (satellite TV, formerly known as UBC) or True Online (ADSL, DOCSIS) customers. You have to pay for seven months of service up front, and commit to paying for TrueMove service for 18 months (at 899 baht per month), but the price of the iPhone 4S has dropped to 13,500 baht, or US\$445.

If I sound like an irrepressible Apple ad copywriter, I apologize. That wasn't my intent with this article. What I'm trying to do is convince you that times are changing, rapidly, and it's in your own best interest to stay on top of the changes. The camera business has changed irreversibly.

Do increasingly capable cameras on iPhones and Android phones – not to mention tablets – mean that the Point & Shoot camera market is dead? Not necessarily. But the major camera manufacturers have cut back on the number of new models. Last

November, the number of Point & Shoot cameras sold declined by 18 per cent, year-to-year.

Keep an eye on where the technology's headed. The baht you save may be your own.

Indonesia: Asia's new rising star

FOR many of us expats, our Asian paradise has sheltered many of us from the financial woes being experienced back home by family and friends.

Asian markets, though not totally immune to European debt levels and the impending push for White House power, have been fairly resilient over the last few years and have provided steady economic growth and a view that Asia is still the place to be if you are looking to expand a business or if you wish to put your feet up and relax upon retirement.

For the savvy investor a few well placed investments within the Asian markets, even in troubled times would have still meant significant upsides and portfolio growth. Can this last forever? Obviously nothing lasts forever, but while we can of a strong Asian market place and

try and forget about the economic troubles of less fortunate geographical regions, as they say, "let's make hay while the sun shines".

We can look at places like Latin America and especially Brazil, and even though there has been an economic slow down, high interest rates and good investment opportunities mean that this is still an attractive proposition for investors.

Not to be out done, we don't have to look too far over our shores to see we have our own emerging economic powerhouse in our midst. Casting a glance at our Indonesian counterparts, we get a glimpse at what is very fast becoming an investment draw.

We only have to take a look at what is happening in the economy. While the rest of Asia is slowing down, Indonesia's economy has posted its fastest growth for 15 years. In 2011 GDP grew by 6.49%, the best year since before the Asian crisis. That compares favourably to slowing rates in big regional neighbors such as China and India.

Indonesia's success is very much a home grown story, domestic consumption and investment has enabled it to grow faster than neighbors such as Singapore, whose economies are more dependent on global trade flows and therefore more vulnerable to slowing export demand. If we look at the stats, more than 60% of Indonesias £442bn economy is generated by domestic consumption and exports are worth around 25%. Only a fifth of these exports go directly to Europe or America making Indonesia less susceptible to the European crisis than many other Asian countries.

Like most exotic markets, its stock exchange suffers when investors lose their appetites for risk based investments, the rise of the Indonesian Rupiah is not certain too.

There are definitely more plusses than negatives when looking at the Indonesian market, but you would need to be able to stomach the risks involved with this.

Surin stunt show simply sensational

HUNDREDS of tourists and locals craned their gaze skyward last Saturday for a breathtaking airplane stunt show.

Phuket-daredevil-pilot Les Vorosmarthy executed precision aerobatic maneuvers at some moments just a few dozen meters above the choppy Surin Beach surf.

Diving without water

Diving

DIVERS take water for granted, be it mucky water, cold water, beautiful Phuket water or even pool water. We presume there will be water when we dive. So my last dive, a "dry" dive at 18 meters in a sub-aquatic safety services (SSS) recompression chamber, was a novelty.

Recompression chambers, also

known as hyperbaric chambers, have been used to treat a variety ailments since the 1600s. By the 1930s the US Navy was successfully using hyperbaric oxytherapy gen (HBO) to treat deep-sea divers for decompression illnesses (DCI).

DCI, or "the bends", is a key ingredient to most dive horror stories. There is the mental image of a diver panick-

ing and bolting for the surface. As they rise, the pressure from the water above slackens and nitrogen bubbles in their blood and tissue begins to rapidly expand. On the surface the diver, in extreme pain, has skin that crackles to the touch and the fatty tissue around their hips and stomach starts to "marble".

In reality very few DCI cases

are anything like this. Often symptoms of DCI are so minor that they are ignored for days and easily treated in a recompression chamber. Why in some cases certain individuals suffer from DCI and others don't, despite both of them having followed the dive plan and having "good dives", is unclear to scientists.

Luckily, DCI is rare enough that in a sport with millions of participants, not every dive professional has had experience dealing with it. So as part of the

On tric charge, are a fire risk under pressure), me and three "dive buddies" pile into the chamber with a SSS Recompression Chamber Network Assistant.

Once into the main room of the chamber the door behind us was securely shut. It's cramped quarters for five guys, but once situated on the two beds the assistant flicks a switch and gives the go-

ahead to start the dive.

Immediately there is an uncomfortable pressure on our ears. The depth gauge's needle hovers at six feet. We're constantly having to equalize, despite our slow descent.

Coupled with the pressure in ours ears is the heat. The little chamber feels like a sauna. It isn't a stifling heat, but it's uncomfortable. The heat isn't from our bodies, but from the active air molecules being packed more densely as we descend.

We pause our descent and the air in the chamber is flushed, cooling the room and thankfully sweeping a little body odor out with it

With the chamber air feeling fresher, we make our final descent to 18 meters.

Bottom time: a sheet is dragged across the inside of the chamber door as a screen and the projector outside starts playing the World War Two submarine film, U-571, to enhance the ambiance.

Snacks, cookies, are passed through the medical lock, which is also used to pass paperwork to the patients.

About 15 minutes into the movie, it's time to start our ascent. It's a much shorter dive than the four-hour dives that most patients receive as part of their treatment.

Back on the surface and slightly disappointed that I didn't get to breath 100 per cent oxygen like a patient, I tried to figure out if this were the sort of dive I could log in my book or not.

In focus Breaking the school barrier

SEVEN intrepid stand-up paddlers will take to their boards on March 13 to navigate the 90 miles around Phuket over five days. The circumnavigation of Phuket is to raise funds to build a school for impoverished children in the Rassada Port area, on the east side of Phuket Town.

The port area is well known as one of the poorest areas on the island. Most of the jobs at the port are taken by Burmese migrants, as no one else will do them or live in the unsanitary conditions there.

Sister Lakana from charity organization The Good Shepherd Sisters has for years worked tirelessly to help the migrants who live in these poor conditions. She noticed some children were left at the Burmese camp during the day, while their parents were at work. Without supervision, they sometimes got hurt, or worse still, fell prey to physical or sexual abuse.

"Many of the Burmese migrants living in the area are in Phuket legally, but as their children are not able to read or write Thai, they are not able to join the Thai school system," Sister Lakana explained.

To keep the children safe, Sister Lakana started a daycare center while their parents worked. A local Thai landlady donated a small area measuring 10 x 5 meters, a concrete block was put on the floor and makeshift walls of fishing net created around it.

The center opened in August 2010 and 20 children were quickly registered there.

Word soon spread. "By January 2011, there were 115 children - ranging from two to 14 years old – registered at the center. Some had never been to school before," said Sister Lakana.

However, the "school" remains seriously underresourced. "Eight

grade levels share the small space of two rooms. There are no tables or chairs. The children sit on the floor and are provided with the minimum of pencil and paper.

"The students, however, love the simple place and they cram into the limited area with big smiles on their faces, eager to use this opportunity to learn and improve their lives," Sister Lakana said.

All school expenses including teachers salaries have come from fund-raising events and private donations. Monthly expenses total about 80,000 baht a month.

"This also includes a Thai nurse who visits the school, as well as local Burmese camps, tending to the sick, who are not allowed to be treated in the local hospitals," said Sister Lakana.

The drive now is to raise funds to build a community center with classrooms for the kids. The local Thai community has seen the work that Sister Lakana and her volunteers do at the school. They have recently come together to donate a small piece of land.

Quintin Clover, who came up with the idea of literally paddling around Phuket for charity, was quickly joined by Tal Derhy, Nathan Chilcott, Tim Campbell, Andrew "Easy" Eadie, Luke Remmers and Arend Moelich.

"We will start at Skyla's Beach House on Kamala Beach and turn left [south] in the very early hours

of Tuesday morning. We will be aiming to appear over the horizon five days later for the Welcome Home Party and fundraiser for the school," said Quintin.

"The hardest day will be Day Three, when our muscles will be aching, but we have allowed extra time just in case bad weather forces us to stop early for a day," he explained.

The crew have been in training for months. "I am on the water for about five hours every Saturday, covering about 30 kilometers. On weekdays, because of work, I do 45 minutes of hard paddling four mornings a week," said Quintin.

Although the crew will have a

support boat provided by Jim at Phuket-based Stand Up Paddle Thai, the trickiest part will be going under the bridges at the north end of the island.

"We will be going through the channel during a rising tide nearing a full moon, which should help push us through," explained Ouintin.

Confident his crew will complete the challenge and accomplished their objective, Quintin hopes the event will become an annual one.

"I have been speaking with the potential developers of the school and there is now an option whereby we can get a school and community center built for 5.2 million baht, as opposed to the initial 9mn baht," Quintin said.

However, he added, "The price would fall further if someone stepped in to sponsor things like the plumbing and so on."


The money raised will also go towards providing transport for the kids so they can get safely to and from the school, he added.

"At the fundraiser at Skyla's Beach House on March 18 we will have raffles and fun activities for the kids, and also a treasure chest in which people can donate all sorts of household items as well as toys for the kids," Quintin said.

Making a dog's dimner of it



A WHILE back I wrote an article on the benefits of a raw diet for your dogs and while the debate still rages among veterinarians, food manufacturers and the dogs themselves – I thought I'd leave that to one side and focus on some of the dog foods now available here in Phuket.

if I can answer that for you.

Earthborn

This is one of the top dog food brands available globally at the moment and is available in Phuket in a few varieties. The food is grain free which is perfect for dogs with allergies and also has a higher calorie count. What this means is that you can feed your dog less, and he's still getting what he needs as the food contains virtually no fillers and is easily digestible. The kibble itself is meat based, using a notable amount of fish, poultry and bison meals as its main sources of protein. It also contains chelated

minerals which, are essential minerals that have been chemically attached to the protein, making the food easier to absorb. Chelated minerals are usually found in the higher quality dog foods.

The grain free versions available here are Primitive Natural (PN) and Coastal Catch (CC) the former having more meat content as opposed to the fish content of the latter. One key difference is the protein count of these foods, which for PN is a

> whopping 38% and 32% for CC. This is fine for a high energy dog that gets lots (and I mean lots) of exercise but if Fido isn't getting out a lot each and every

through some of the brands and see day, you are going to have a very wired dog on your hands if you're feeding him this stuff!

> The other two versions available are the Adult Vantage (AV) and Ocean Fusion (OF), both of which have a protein count of around 22%, which is adequate for the average dog. These two products are not grain-free, but are also made from high quality ingredients including chicken or fish meal.

Pinnacle

Another top range dry food available here in Phuket although not the full range and not the grain free versions. Looking down the list of ingredients, one could be

overly picky as it often contains canola oil which is often regarded as an unhealthy fat, but that aside, it all looks good and like Earthborn, there are no "red flag" items in the list of ingredients.

Interestingly the Duck and Potato version mentions duck meal and actual duck as its first two ingredients - however the actual duck product is largely water and most of the moisture is lost in the cooking process.

Across the holistic Pinnacle range available here, they all contain approximately 26% protein and 14% fat which is about average. The group is primarily a plant-based dry dog food which uses a moderate amount of poultry or fish meals as its main sources of protein.

Avoderm

One of the key components, and also talking points, about Avoderm, is its use of avocado, which has been noted by a vocal majority to be of harm, perhaps even fatal, to dogs. Indeed the RSPCA, ASPCA, ADPT and other organizations have all expressed concern – however, the key detail is this:

The leaves, bark, and stems from the avocado tree - essentially everything but the avocado fruit itself, can apparently be harmful to dogs. However, none

of these parts are used in the dog food, only the fruit which is used for oil and meal content. There is also no indication by anyone that avocado oil or meal is in anyway harmful – quite the opposite, they are amazingly good for you and loaded with fibre and nutrients.

Again, being picky, we could highlight the inclusion of tomato pomace to their ingredient list which is essentially a by-product of processed tomatoes, but other than that, it all seems okay. Across the range, Avoderm has a slightly higher protein concentration that Pinnacle at 29% with fat levels around 11% – all again fine for your average dog.

Overall

All three dog foods listed here are quality foods and I'd have no problem recommending any of them to anyone - it's essentially about preference. But a point to remember between grain free and other food versions is this. Dogs can assimilate grains, including corn, barley and oats, but grains provide mostly carbohydrate and only have limited protein profiles. Any extra carbohydrate intake, above the needs of the dog, will prompt internal enzyme factors to store the extra carbs as fat.

Conversely, give the same dog the extra protein, and it is excreted through the kidneys and not stored as fat. So do the math – which is better, food with grain or without? Often people go for the cheapest dog food, or the one "they" think sounds the best - like rabbit stew. However, how many dogs in Phuket have ever seen a rabbit, let alone hunted one down and eaten it?

It's your call, obviously, you can do your own research, but ultimately your dog will tell you. If they seem sharp and alert with clear eyes and a great looking coat, their food is likely to be helping them. If they appear downcast, lethargic and not at their peak – try changing their food.

Life & style Keeping an 'i' on the prize

In the Classroom

THE requirements for getting hired as a foreign teacher in Thailand are incredibly low. Degrees and TEFL certificates are bandied about but not truly required in many schools.

With Thailand's low standards come low salaries, lower expectations and the profession's ugly stereotype: the backpacker teacher. Typically transient, the backpacker uses their classroom as a means to a paycheck before

picking up and disappearing into the wind.

But before we start painting Phuket's pedagogical picture with a broader brush, it should be said that there are

dedicated foreigners looking to become better teachers and one qualification from the University of Nottingham is becoming a popular option: the PGCEi.

TEACHING LEARNING: Phuket candidates

may need to take the course in Bangkok.

Similar to a Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE), the "i" stands for "international". According to Nottingham's prospectus, the course is, "a part-time, distance learning programme of professional enrichment for educators working in countries other than the UK."

That last bit is important because unlike a PGCE, the PGCEi cannot be used to gain Britain's qualified teacher status (QTS).

The PGCEi is a relatively new course, as Dr. Paul Thompson, Director of Nottingham's Masters Studies explained, "The total number of graduates since the course was launched in February 2008 is something like 600. We are recruiting around 230 students a year."

one with a bachelor's degree who has access to a classroom, a computer and the internet. Those without degrees are also considered but applicants are required to produce an extended personal statement which details their suitability for postgraduate study.

Priced at GBP 2,900 (138,400 baht), the course begins with a threeday induction session at one of Nottingham's half-dozen venues worldwide. Phuket's participants typically attend in Bangkok or Kuala Lumpur.

PGCEi Tutor, Dr. Lucy Cooker told the Gazette, "As far as I'm

> aware, the Bangkok cohort was the largest last October we had 66 people enroll."

T h e course is divided into four modules. Each is worth 15 credits and


assessed through a 3,000-word essay. Qualifying credits can be applied towards earning a postgraduate diploma (120 credits), a master's degree (180 credits) and even a doctorate in Education.

"No one has failed. We only accept people if we think they are able to succeed. It wouldn't be fair to take their money if we felt otherwise," said Cooker.

Having recently earned her PGCEi, Darasamuth teacher Jules Devitto reported, "The course was quite flexible in that I could take it in a direction that I was interested in when writing my assignments.

It was very theory based so it didn't help me in practical ways such as lesson planning or preparing materials. But it did help me to consider a variety of ways in which my students learn and also consider techniques for behavior management and assessing students' work."

Summarizing why the PGCEi The course is open to any- is becoming so popular, Devitto

stated, "Moving back to the UK for a year wasn't really a financial option for me. The PGCEi seemed like the perfect opportunity to get my PGCE whilst still working and teaching in Thailand. I am now going on to work at an international school in Shanghai in August; I wouldn't have been qualified to do this without the PGCEi.'

The PGCEi is not only for the British. American, Ryan Meinhart is teaching at Konjonkiet and is currently studying his second module.

"My school offered to subsidize my course but I would have had to commit to them for two years so I declined. Once I finish, my school will increase my monthly salary by 6,000 baht," stated Meinhart.

In addition to the financial benefits, it's quite possible that the PGCEi and its subsequent Diploma in Education will exempt teachers who lack Education degrees from having to take the Teachers' Counsel of Thailand's Professional Knowledge tests. However, at the time of publication no TCT official was able to confirm the accuracy of this.

Affordable, convenient and widely recognized, Nottingham's PGCEi seems a great option for career development.

Deserved or not, Phuket's poor reputation amongst its teachers might just improve upon the backs of these professionally minded educators, rather than continually suffering from the antics of their backpacking "colleagues".

Captain Watana Thinphanga

CAPTAIN Watana Thinphanga is something of a smooth operator. He speaks softly, his demeanor calm and collected with no jarring notes about him. In short, he exudes the air of confidence of someone fully in control of his and, as we will discover, other people's destiny.

It is hardly surprising to learn that, until 2009, Captain Watana was working as commanding pilot for Thai Airways International. At that top seat, he was in charge of 200-million dollar aircrafts and the lives of over 300 passengers.

"Commercial flying is not as fun and exciting as many would believe. The responsibility is so great and the whole operation is extremely stressful. Plus there are rules – you always have to make sure that passengers are comfortable, you know, the "smooth-as-silk" stuff. From the cockpit, you have to know when to duck, dive or go around bad patches of weather so that the people in the back don't vomit. Please don't laugh. That's exactly what they say at pre-flight briefing - 'don't make people puke'."

'Working like that is nerve racking, but in my experience passengers get sick anyway, not from motion, but because they are nervous about flying. And alcohol doesn't help," advises Captain Watana with a smile.

thrived under pressure, saying: "It's an exhilarating experience having about 300 control buttons in front of you, all of which you have to know by heart. At 10 or 20 thousand feet in the air, there's no room for mistakes. It's multi-tasking at the highest level. And yes, it's an adrenalin-pumping situation and you can get high from it."


The most advanced aircraft Captain Watana has ever flown was the Boeing 777, the first to incorporate the 'fly by wire' technology (referring to the fiber optic line that runs through the length of the body and the wingspan of the aircraft). For Captain Watana, this was simply the most 'responsive flying machine around'.

Captain Watana spent the first 10 years of his childhood in Phuket before his family moved to Bangkok. There, he graduated with a degree in engineering and joined Thai Airways International in 1975 as a training pilot. It was not long before he became the first pilot flying what was considered the top aircraft of that time – the Airbus. Captain Watana is married to proud father of two daughters, both of whom graduated from Oxford University. One is now working with the Royal project for environment protection, whose remit includes the province of Phuket.

Having retired in 2009, Captain Watana is happy to be back in Phuket acting as president of the Phuket Flying Club in Pa Khlok. There, he teaches light aircraft flying to 50 or so club members, and is keen to promote what he terms General Aviation (GA) as a worthwhile sport and recreation. GA, he says, has a small role to play in the area of environmental protection.

"Our members are asked to report any environmental anomalies they see from the air such as mangrove encroachment and the destruction of water sources for example. We even engage in rescue operations as well, unofficially that is. Only the other day, someone called us to help looking for a friend who he thought was lost at sea. Luckily, it turned out to be a false alarm."

For now, Captain Watana enjoys flying again, without any stress this time. "Flying should be about freedom and GA can give you that. It's fun and accessible. I'd like to see more young people engaging in this sport. My passion used to be flying, but now it is all about opening doors to flying for pleasure."

The hotel owners' great debate: Is it better to buy or to build?

DECISIONS, decisions. Our lives often revolve around them like a lotus in a whirlpool. In through the

'out' door and out through the 'in'. Or just 'smash and grab' like some random jewelry heist.

But wait, we have a topic, and rolling into 2012 it has never been more relevant. Hotels coming into the market place in Phuket have historically been a

rare and endangered breed.

Perhaps like some hooded rainforest owl who has found its way onto the menu in a host of Chinese restaurants. Frankly speaking, I don't like the odds on the owl.

Shakespeare was said to utter the catchphrase "To be or not to be?" Prospective hotel buyers stuck in the waiting game are faced with the question to "buy or build?"

It's a long line, boredom often sets in. Angst. Anyone who has tried to line up at Phuket airport immigration lately in tandem with a string of charter flights to Snow land can attest to the edgy panic.

Sweaty palms, racing heartbeat, is it a heart attack? And who is Ivan?

The current lineup of hospitality assets range from Mövenpick Resort in Karon, the former Courtyard by Marriott located city center Patong, and the Evason Rawai.

All allowing purchasers to get in the market fast. Cash in on the tourism boom and become a striker versus a beach warmer in the hotel Olympics.

Agents such as Jones Lang LaSalle Hotels, CBRE Thailand and others are issuing press releases on glowing prospects faster than the trees can be cut down in Myanmar to make the paper.

Hotel buying can be compared to high stakes poker. Different strategies for the mixed bag of players. Owner/operators, private equity and conglomerates are just a few of the split personalities.

In the trade we categorize by what is called an investment horizon, though in local lingo in the entertainment district you could classify these into short time or long time holds.

For financial institutions or funds existing assets represent sound cash flow, low development risk and in today's topsy turvey world, stabilized returns. More venturesome groups look at upside exercises renovation, branding, and repositioning. Ultimately a mid-term holding period is taken with the ultimate end game of selling at a premium.

Of course, you have other groups looking to build portfolios, grow management groups or else the lucrative set of individuals who just want to own a hotel as part of a larger collection of trophies.

The truth is, buying over existing hotels can be a minefield. There are two basic deal structures, either purchasing a company along with its liabilities or else just the raw asset.

In the case of the former, this includes taking over existing staff, possible debt or legal impediments and all manner of items that are often overlooked.

Straight asset deals are easier, but fall into the minority of transactions given tax implications on a gain versus a simple share purchase.

Overseas buyers face an even greater hurdle if the project is not BOI (Thailand's Board of Investment) approved for 100 per cent foreign ownership. Options include joint ventures, leasehold or a property fund.

Rope in the unknown costs of capital improvements once you start looking in ceilings and evaluating physical plant machinery and all of a sudden that upgrade is well over budget.

Given the current market conditions with the availability of debt to developers, one has to say any hotel asset needs to critically studied to see if it may just be better to start all over again. Build new and don't inherit the sins of the father.


Again, stress, distress and vulture capital continues to circle over the playing field, and look for opportunity. But it never stops amazing me, with the availability of land, why some prospective hotel owners don't simply do the math and start fresh.

Yes, there are exceptions and big picture thinking for larger investors but as a whole the debate on buy vs build needs careful consideration and planning. There is no fast track to success in either regime so do your homework.

Either or neither very may well be the best course of action.

As for that owl, it's probably best it stay hidden in the tree tops.

Lai Thai receives its EIA approval

THE Lai Thai Luxury Apartments has announced that the project has been granted approval from the Thai Office of Natural Resources and Environmental Policy and Planning, following a lengthy Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA).

Thailand recently implemented tough new EIA regulations, that went into effect on July 1. 2011:

•Any project with a surface area of more than 4000 square meters or comprising more than 80 units must now comply with rules designed to limit its environmental and social impact. Assessment criteria include building height, green area, waste management and safety regulations.

•The regulations specify that buildings must be no more than four stories in height, and must have at least 40 per cent of green space.

• A minimum number of parking spaces is required, and traffic flow must provide access for emergency vehicles

• Proper security must also be provided and, in the case of The Lai Thai, 30 CCTV cameras are installed throughout the project.

• Water drainage and erosion studies must be completed and waste treatment is strictly regulated and approval of water and electrical needs is required from the provincial authorities.

• The project must also be wheelchair accessible and fire safety standards must


The EIA process requires several inspec-

tions and can take up to one year for approval. Now that clearance has been given, work on the infrastructure has begun, with the main piling work due to start in April.


The project has a completion date scheduled for the third quarter of 2013.



Vistas of paradise



IT IS always a great pleasure to be invited to a Phuket home, and to be asked for advice about aspects of the garden. This week's visit proved predictably pleasurable and the upshot, hardly surprising - was a decision to write about the experience.

The original intention had been to advise about pot plants but, as often happens on these occasions, it turned into a discussion about many aspects of an ongoing horticultural projects.



property. Perched on a precipitous hillside, and with panoramic views over Chalong Bay, the newly built, four storey terraced property literally follows the contours of the ravine. Flanked by walls on each side, the structure forms three

sides of a rectangle with a central, shaded area open to the sky.

All three balconies face the ultramarine waters of the island dotted bay, the lowest terrace home to a swimming pool, and the two upper patios paved with pleasant terracotta tiles.

Here, said my guide, is where we start. He pointed to huge, sculptural clay pots which matched the floor and which flanked the white front walls. I al-

ways think it's a good idea to have more than one kind of inhabitant in large containers; here tall wright is a religiosas at the center of each pot were flanked by white flowering ixoras. Both are evergreen

shrubs and both were in flower, with the pendulous blooms of the *wrightia* delivering their sweet fragrance. But more pots were required to form a colorful screen across the front of the two balconies. And obviously shrubs able to

take the noon-day glare would be needed

Suggestions included Crown of Thorns (euphorbias), available in cerise, white and salmon pink and in large and small flowering cultivars, and Desert Rose (adeniums), which can now be found in beautiful shades of brilliant red as well as deep pink. These are reliable, year round bloomers, require little attention and do well in pots. The only snag is that they are slowglowing, so you might want to either put several in one pot, or add plants such as ixoras, or variegated foliage plants such as Crotons (codiaeum) which come in a huge range of color combinations. The Umbrella Tree (Schefflera) is one tough cookie, and looks great in a pot, as does Orange Jasmine (murraya paniculata) with its strongly scented white flowers.

On the lower terrace were a number of potted golden cane palms. A few were going brownish-yellow before their time, the victims of over-zealous watering. Better dried out or transplanted to the main garden.

The actual garden is on a steep slope with forty or fifty steps from

top to bottom, and high walls to mark the boundaries on each side. So the original garden designer sensibly chose trees and shrubs that could cope with limited sun and moisture, and with Phuket soil that is thin and lacking nutrients. Some plantings have been real success stories: there are numerous fish-tail and wine palms, to provide a verdant screen down both sides of the property, with huge hanging, beaded inflorescences like chain mail.

Lower down are several elegant foxtail palms, and the attractive green foliage of Lady Palms (rhapsis). Other large trees enjoying the sea-air are calabashes: their open habit allows shrubs - heliconias, for example - to flourish beneath., These include several exotic cultivars such as collinsiana. Zingibers are represented not only by a bed of Costus near the access road, but by the striking torch ginger (etlingera

elatior) with its massive waxy red bracts. An exciting sight in Phuket.

The central area is surrounded by high walls on three sides. Devoid of much sunlight, with little top soil and sloping precipitously, it presents a real challenge. At the moist base, a row of dark green foliage plants are doing well, but the whole area would benefit from terracing of low stone or natural brick walls to retain both moisture and the soil amendments - top soil, compost and fertilizer - which need to be added.

Then you can begin to think about installing shade loving plants: ferns such as *asplenium*, *aglaonemas*, *philodendron*, and *anthuriums*.

Tip of the week

Growing annuals

ANNUALS germinate, grow, set seed and die, all within the course of a year, thereby providing a splash of rapid and vivid color They are normally grown from seed. You can collect your own seeds when you dead-head flowers (which encourages more flowering), but ensure that the seeds are dry and fully mature. Annuals you might consider in Phuket include cockscomb (celosias), cosmos daisies, sunflowers (helianthus), and African marigolds (tagetes). Some can be bought as packeted seeds, and should be sown either in prepared open ground, or better still in containers where their progress can be monitored. You can also buy annuals in small pots which you should water thoroughly. Keep the soil moist, but not soggy: annuals have shallow root systems, but because they grow quickly, they need moisture and nutrients. Personal favorites include zinnias, magenta globe amaranths (gomphrena globosa) and the low-growing and multi-hued rose moss (portulaca).





International Sport PHUKET GAZETTE 43 Wales claim triple crown title

DESPITE predictions of a walkover by Wales when they met England last weekend in the RBS Six Nations, the game and result were anything but.

Wales started the brighter of the two, and could have gone over within two minutes of the kick off. However, David Strettle's saving tap tackle was just enough to fell George North who had been given space from quick ball from a Welsh line-out.

England's defense weathered the early onslaught, and even had some good fortune as Leigh Halfpenny sliced a straight forward penalty kick.

England fought back and put the first points on the board through Owen Farrell, one of seven English players in their maiden outing at Twickenham.

The game was played at a blistering pace with bruising tackles, try saving blocks and accurate kicking to the half time whistle with England holding a slight advantage, 9-6.

The action continued in the same vein on the resumption until Wales' Rhys Priestland attempted clearance was charged down, and was subsequently yellow carded for a deliberate off-side when England looked certain to gain the first try of the encounter after recycling the ball quickly. Farrell fired the penalty over to extend the English lead.

Unlike Welsh teams of the past, they dealt with the one-man disadvantage professionally stifling their opponent's attacks and even closed the gap when Halfpenny kicked another three points. Priestland returned to the fray, his team unpenalized.

Halfpenny brought Wales level with his fourth penalty score, and with four minutes left on the clock Scott Williams ripped the ball from England's Courtney Lawes, punted forward and gathered a fortunate bounce to touch down between the posts. Halfpenny converted easily to take the lead 19-12.

England charged down the field from the restart and after two line-outs on the Welsh try line, Strettle went over in the corner. The referee referred to the fourth official. Inconclusive came the response, and with the ball declared 'dead' despite a penalty outstanding, the referee blew time and Wales had their 20th Triple Crown.

In the other matches Ireland ran out comfortable winners 42-10 over Italy, while Scotland's brave efforts came to nought losing 17-23 to France at Murrayfield.


LIVERPOOL FC collected their first piece of silverware since their FA Cup victory six years ago.

headed home from close range, and Robin van Persie, who had already hit the post, leveled the scores with a stunning finish.





Sport Believe to achieve

Professional golfer Lindsay Renolds speaks exclusively to the Gazette about his chosen career and how Phuket continues to feature in his plans.



Parents are crucial to the success of any young athlete and it's clear from the way Lindsay speaks of his that their influence played an important part in making a career decision.

"My parents never pushed or forced me into anything - that's why I improved so much - everything I did regarding golf, I wanted to do. There's a big difference between pushing and supporting. They supported the one thing that can't be taught to people - a drive to succeed, and that's what is inside me," he said in a determined tone.

Bizarrely, our interview was interrupted at this point when Lindsay and Jeff were reunited having not seen each other for six years. It was wonderful to see the two old friends meet again while the pride in Jeff's words and voice was obvious.

"I've always said Lindsay would be a great player.

It was just a matter of time. I kept telling his Dad that this is one of the kids that has it. I've never seen anyone with the physical talent that he has. He's tour quality right now, but it takes a couple of years to get comfortable. He's got such confidence in his game and it's so exciting to see that young kid grow up to become what he is

today," said Jeff. Earning a scholarship to Coastal California University gave Lindsay the opportunity to play college golf tournaments which he suggests is the best route for any aspiring golfer. The tournaments took him all around the world, while his college room mate was none other than current PGA star Dustin Johnson.

After a few years at amateur level Lindsay decided to turn pro in 2009. It was a big decision to make considering the pressure to succeed and secure a tour place is made even more difficult with the depth of players that exists on the professional circuit. Now on the Asian Tour, he sees his profesprospects sional growing.

"Obviously this is a huge opportunity for me to play a lot of tournaments this year. I had a lot of trouble finding events last year, but this year I will be playing on four different tours. The Asian Tour being the strongest and best one, but also on Asian Development Tour, PGA Thailand, All Thai-

beginner to being not bad and land Tour, and MENA Tour based in the Middle East," he said.

> Golf is a dynamic sport, always changing and exploiting technologies and it's very much an individual's game. At the same time, many see golf as the perfect socializing or networking activity. But what aspects keep Lindsay's interest keen?

> "I like the fact that golf is an individual sport. Everything you do, all the mistakes you make, it's entirely up to you. If you work hard you will get the results you want. If you don't work hard, don't expect to do well," he advises.

> "Yes, golf has changed so much, even in the few years that I've been playing. It's a combination of mechanics, science and feel, but it's definitely more of a science now. Machines and computers suggest a player has to alter a body position by four degrees. It's difficult to change by that margin – what does four degrees feel like?" he asks with a smile.

> Lindsay has recently revamped his swing with coach Andrew Rice in an effort to improve his game which is clearly not bad, but if he's going to challenge the top players he admits certain adjustments have to be made.

> "I changed my swing a lot a few months ago and I remember thinking I felt like a beginner again. Everything felt completely different, but I stuck with it, worked hard and it has paid off," he said.

> From professionals down to the lowly weekend hacker, everyone has good days and bad days on the course. Lindsay of course is no different, but it's interesting to learn of his unique game psychology.

"If you believe and trust – it will work. On days when I'm not playing well, I go back to what the

> club face is doing, back to the basics of trying to feel the club face throughout my swing. At the end of the day if the ball is going left the club face is turning left and vice versa. That's how basic I keep it. You'd be surprised by how many golfers think that because they hit it left it's because of their backswing. When you're

playing a round of golf the last thing you want to do is think too much about you're back swing," said Lindsay.

"I still play bad shots, but I keep it positive by thinking about that perfect shot I played earlier. Once I have a swing thought, I don't back out. It shows a lack of self-confidence to change. If I have a bad tournament I get out there and work harder to improve," he added.

How to steel the mind dealt with, what are Lindsay's immediate career goals?

"For the Asian Tour, simply to have a victory. It's a high goal for someone who has just made it on tour, and who is playing in his first full season as a pro, but it is possible. I believe it can be done, and that's one of the keys to

reaching your goals – to believe and keep working hard – you will achieve" he said. "On the Asian tour, the top 60 on the money

list at the end of the year get to stay on the tour the following year. If you win however, not only are you exempt for two years years, but it also allows you to play in all the big events, which are co-sanctioned with the European Tour. That in itself just opens up more doors to have a chance to get your European Tour Card," Lindsay expalined.

"Ultimately the PGA is every golfers dream. But I love Asia. I'm keen to base myself here in Phuket or Dubai and play on the European Tour and Asian tour. I just like the lifestyle and the weather here," he added.

Lindsay was at Laguna to practice and not wanting to take up any more of his time, two final questions were put forward. As a professional and seeing the wealth of golfing talent that Asia has to offer, what advice would he give young players with hopes of following in his path?

"Playing in as many tournaments as possible is very important. It's alot different than playing with friends. Also, they should focus more on what the ball is doing rather than what their swing is doing. Work on aspects such as fade, draw and trajectory," he said.

Like any golfer, Lindsay has his favorite courses both here and abroad so where does this professional player go to enjoy a round?

"On Phuket, Blue Canyon is one of the toughest courses I have ever played in the world, but I also enjoy Laguna and Red Mountain – two great courses. My favorite course, though, is Loch Lomond in Scotland, just because of its location, by a lake and its perfect condition," he enthused.

Lindsay is off to Kuala Lumpur for the Asian Development Tour on March 8. We join Phuket in wishing him all the best and the Gazette will update readers on his results over the coming months.

Lomas impress at Bangkok 10s

THE Phuket Lomas recently participated in the two-day Bangkok Youth Rugby 10s tournament at Pattana International School with great performances from both the U12 and U16 teams in their respective divisions.

On the first day of competition the Lomas U16s faced cup favourites CIMB Cobra from Malaysia. Two wins from two, but the Lomas toughest challenge was yet to come, and that in the form of Bangkok Lions. The Lomas took an early lead with two unconverted tries that drove the Lions into a response. At 10-5 the game hung in the balance, but the Lomas held on for a deserved win.
