# Mega-projects in sight

PM Yingluck to 'shower gifts' on the people of Phuket and the Andaman region

WITH the Thai Cabinet meeting to be held in Phuket this coming Monday and Tuesday, Transport Minister Jarupong Ruangsuwan has promised that the 180-million-baht elevated road over a mangrove forest at Saphan Hin will be presented to Cabinet for approval.

Mr Jarupong even guaranteed that the Klong Koh Pee road project will become a reality during Yingluck Shinawatra's term as prime minister.

"PM Yingluck plans to 'shower gifts' on the people of Phuket and the Andaman region by approving many important projects, especially the Klong Koh Pee road project that Phuket people have been waiting for 15 years," Mr Jarupong said.

"This project will definitely happen in this government's term. The underpass project at Darasamut intersection will be another present that PM Yingluck wants to give to Phuket people in order to solve the traffic problem," he added.

The Klong Koh Pee elevated road is expected to alleviate inbound traffic from the south of

the island into Phuket Town. The project was strongly supported by Wichai Phraisa-ngop during his term as Phuket Governor. Mr Wichai is now a senator.

The project, to be carried out by the Department Of Rural Roads, would see a 600-meter four-lane road traversing mangroves via a "bridge" three meters high and 510 meters long. The road is to include a bicycle lane and pedestrian walkway.

As all mangrove forests in Thailand are protected, projects to build anything on or over a mangrove forest must first receive special permission from Cabinet on the condition that the project is of exceptional "public benefit".

Joining Mr Jarupong in Phuket last Saturday was Prapat Chongsanguan, a former Governor of Bangkok's Mass Rapid Transit Continued on page 3

# Lifeguards vow to stay on the beaches

PHUKET's lifeguards have vowed they will continue to patrol the beaches despite funding under their current contract with Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor) ending on April 2.

On Monday, Phuket Lifeguard Club President Prathaiyut "Nut" Chuayuan told the Gazette that he had received no information from the *OrBorJor* as to what is to happen next.

"I believe the *OrBorJor* will open bidding to anyone interested in providing the service, but we have yet to decide if we want to renew the contract," he said.

"Last year was tough. We're exhausted and some of us want to take a rest. I think it



would be fair if the *OrBor*-

Jor opened the bidding process to others, but if they can't find anyone to carry on the service, we will do it. Our top priority has always been public safety," he added.


Uten Singsom, head of the Phuket Life-

guard Club at Kata-Karon, said, "It all depends on the *OrBorJor*. We have to return the equipment when the contract ends. With no equipment we can't work."

Mr Uten highlighted the dangers of the ming monsoon season.

"The weather has changed. Last weekend we sent six tourists to hospital when big waves struck," he said.

"I am worried that with the coming monsoon season, if there are no lifeguards on the beaches, tourists will be at risk. Even with lifeguards on duty 10 people drowned in this area last year," Mr Uten added.

# Making a go of it

# OrBorJor election becomes a two-horse race

CHAYOT Wisartpong from Pa Khlok has been confirmed as the only candidate to contest the April 7 Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) presidential election against former president Paiboon Upatising.

Mr Chayot arrived at Phuket Community Hall with his supporters to register with the Phuket Election Commission on March 9 – the last day to register.

A teacher in Phuket, a Master of Ceremonies at events and an *OrBorJor* adviser from May 2011 to February 2012, Mr Chayot admitted this was going to be a very short campaign, but said he knew the right people and technology to make it happen.

"I believe in democracy. I was paying close attention to the election since the first day of enrollment. Up until the last day no one apart from candidate number one [Mr Paiboon] had enrolled, so I decided to register as a candidate," he told the *Gazette*.

"I have always been ready to sacrifice myself to public service and I believe I am trusted by the public," he added.

Concerning the issues he believes need addressing, Mr Chayot said, "The first problem that needs to be fixed is the traffic. The next

thing is the lack of educational facilities. Education is not being supported as it should be.

"The voice of the people is also very important. I will involve everyone in my work, especially religious people. This is important, because religion encourages people to act positively," he added.

On how he will conduct his campaign given such a short time before the polls open Mr Chayot said that he believed canvasing door to door was not a viable option.

"I will use technology to help, especially the telephone," he said.

One person who has spared himself the frantic political maneuvering was long-term Phuket political player Wisut Santikul.

The former *OrBorJor* Deputy President and MP candidate, changed his mind at the last minute.

Mr Wisut arrived at the hall at 9am armed with the required enrollment documents, but elected not to submit them.

"I am sorry for everyone that I did not enroll. I wish I could have been a candidate in a fair field.
"I think it is unfair to ask other

"I think it is unfair to ask other candidates to run a campaign in 20 days," said Mr Wisut.

Mr Wisut plans to wait until he sees a better opportunity to contest the *OrBorJor* presidency and believes that local government administrations could learn lessons from how this election has been "mishandled".

# Convention Center on the skids

EFFORTS to build a world-class convention and exhibition center in Phuket remain mired in red tape, and a recent visit to the proposed project site by two Government advisers raises little hope that the work will begin any time soon – if ever.

The latest twist in the decadesold saga came with a visit to the proposed project site in Mai Khao March 6 by Wuttipong Chaisaeng, adviser to Deputy Prime Minister and Interior Minister Yongyuth Wichaidit, and Dr Boon Wanasin, president of the advisory committee for deputy prime ministers.

The pair said that specialists from the National Environment Board (NEB) would meet on March 16 to review the details and that Cabinet would reject the

project outright if it were deemed to have adverse effects on the environment.

Originally funding for the 2.6 billion-baht project, to cover over 100 rai on the island's northern tip, was approved by the Democratled government that fell in May.

# Tourist electrocuted at resort

THE electrocution of 45-year-old Russian tourist Fedor Samsonov at a high-end Phuket resort on March 7 has prompted an investigation by police and a full-scale safety inspection of the resort's electrical system.

"This is very tragic and we feel very much for the family," said Lars Ydmark of resort management company Tri-Asia, which manages the Dewa Karon Beach Resort.

The incident was caused by an unsecured wire on the bridge over the pool, he explained.

"There were never any wires in the pool," he added.

Chalong Police Deputy Superintendent Boonlert Onklang arrived at the resort with rescue workers

from the Phuket Ruamjai Kupai foundation after receiving the report at 8:30pm.

"A section of power cables was exposed, which we believe caused

the incident," said Chalong Police Acting Superintendent Sirisak Wasasiri.

Mr Samsonov, wearing his swimming trunks, grabbed the metal rail of a footbridge over the pool, and suffered a fatal electric shock, said Col Sirisak.

Restaurant Manager Surasak Phetsut, 33, rushed to his aid and tried to pull Mr Samsonov from the rail, but he too suffered an electric shock and fell face down into the pool.

A hospital staffer at Vachira Phuket Hospital in Phuket Town confirmed to the *Gazette* that Mr Surasak is conscious and talking.

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# Dirty land deals uncovered

A PROBE into the issuance of land title deeds in Phuket has uncovered a history of widespread encroachment into protected forest areas and identified government officials as playing the key role in facilitating the theft of state property.

Public Sector Anti-Corruption Commission secretary-general Dusadee Arayawuth, in Phuket as part of the investigation, last Friday told the press his office had identified "hundreds of rai" of land valued at billions of baht that fell into private hands through collusion with government officials.

Joining Pol Col Dusadee in his Phuket investigation was Chote Trachu, permanent secretary of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment.

Among the land plots identified were two parcels totaling 15 rai in the Nakalay area of Kamala, just north of the Patong border. Both plots had been issued Chanote titles based on SorKor 1 papers, which are issued by the government to confirm a holder's claim of having occupied the land.

However after inspection, the Chanote titles were found to have been issued based on SorKor 1 papers representing a different or smaller plot. The method of deceit is

commonly known by Thais as the "Flying SorKor 1" ruse, explained Col Dusadee.

"The 15 rai was sold for 200 million baht. On the SorKor 1, the northern boundary of the plot was next to a field, but in reality it is next to a large hill," he said.

That irregularity prompted further investigation to check all the boundaries and compare them with the SorKor 1.

"None of the property boundaries in reality matched the description on the SorKor 1," Col Dusadee said.

Two other plots at Nakalay – of 8 rai and 19 rai – were issued *Chanote* titles in 1994.

"The land is worth 200 million baht. If a resort were built there, it would be worth a billion baht," said Col Dusadee.

Any Chanote deeds issued in such cases must have been approved by the Kathu District Chief, an official of the Kathu Land Office and an officer at the Department of Forestry Phuket Office at the time, he explained.

"We are still investigating the people involved," he said. "If we find that any of these officials have been involved in illegally issuing land titles, we will press criminal charges against them."

Of particular interest to the investigators were *Chanote* titles issued for a 45-rai plot in a "Class C" protected forest in the Ka-

Two Chanote titles covering a total of 15 rai were issued in the name of a former deputy governor of Phuket, said Col

However, he did not specify the year the deeds were issued or identify which 'former deputy governor" took possession.

Despite the severity of the charges, no mention of what would be done to reclaim the land was made at the conference.

Authority who is now assistant to the transport minister.

Also present were Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha, Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwansupana and Phuket MP Raywat Areerob.

The entourage also conducted site inspections for the underpass projects at the Darasamut intersection (at Central Festival Phuket), at the Samkong intersection (at Tesco Lotus on the bypass road), and at the Bang Khu intersection where the bypass road joins Thepkrasattri Road.

The delegation then retired to Phuket Provincial Hall to discuss other major infrastructure projects already underway or under consideration and scheduled to be put before Cabinet for funding approval.

"We need to improve Phuket Airport to be able to handle 12.5 million people a year. Currently, Phuket Airport can handle 6.5 million tourists a year. We will need to increase the number of bays for large aircraft from 15 to 25, and add another 30 bays for smaller aircraft. The project will be completed in 2013," said Mr Jarupong.

"The cargo building, airplane maintenance building and new international terminal will be finished

by April 2014. The renovation of the existing domestic terminal will be completed by early 2015. We will also conduct a study on how to make the runway able to handle 25 flights per hour," he added.

Mr Jarupong also targeted projects that are likely to have a significant effect on Phuket's development.

"Transportation links between the airport and Phuket Town as well as other tourist attractions will also be developed," he said.

"The Deep Sea Port will be upgraded to accommodate two large cruise liners. Chalong Pier will be developed, under the budget of 200 million baht, to become the one-stop service point for all

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yachts sailing in and out of Patong. It's a five-kilometer road Phuket," Mr Jarupong said.

On roads, Highways Department Director-General Wanchai Phaklak explained that his office had three main projects underway to help alleviate traffic woes: an underpass at Darasamut intersection, an underpass at Samkong intersection and an underpass at Bang Khu intersection.

Department Of Rural Roads Director-General Chatchai Thipsunaree added, "We will improve the Kathu - Nakoh road that leads 13 kilometers to the Kathu Mining Museum.

'For the Klong Koh Pee road project, we will seek Cabinet for permission to build the bridge over the mangrove forest.

'We are also carrying out an environmental-impact study on the new road between Chalong to

starting from the Luangpu Supha Temple in Chalong.

"Once the study has been completed, we will propose the project to the Cabinet to seek permission permission to build the road through protected forest there," he added.

Mr Prapat, Assistant to the Transport Minister, returned the discussion back to what he called Phuket's two "dream" projects: the light-rail network and the Patong Tunnel.

"Both are really big projects that need foreign investment. We will have to further discuss the funding issues.

"If these projects do go ahead, we will use Phuket as a model for mega-project investments in other major tourist towns," Mr Prapat

# Black taxi drivers given ultimatum

PHUKET Airport Director Prathuang Sornkham and Wantha Phummararossukontha, Assistant Director of Phuket Provincial Transport Office (PPTO), have warned illegal taxi drivers to obtain the correct license plate or face stiff fines.

Mr Wantha said action was being taken because many passengers complained of overcharging by "black plate" taxi drivers.

"To protect passengers, we will be conducting checks for illegal taxis. For the first two weeks offenders will receive a warning," he said. "After two weeks, anyone operating a taxi without the correct license will be fined 2,000 baht."

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# Bus Terminal 2 scheduled Will more to open 'after Songkran'

**THE Administrative Court** in Nakhon Sri Thammarat has thrown out a complaint against work on the new turning in front of Phuket Bus Terminal 2, which the Land Transport Office hopes to have in operation shortly after the upcoming Songkran holiday.

Phuket Land Transport Office [PLTO] chief Teerayut Prasertpol received a call from the court last Friday inform-

ing him of the ruling, which clears the last hurdle to the opening of the terminal that was completed 27 months ago at a cost of 128 million baht.

"An official written summary is expected to arrive in Phuket next week," he said.

"The Administrative Court dismissed a complaint filed by Bussaya Lianudom, wife of former Rassada Mayor Suratin Lianudom, charging that creating a turning in front of Phuket Bus Terminal 2 would endanger her home and its residents, as well

increase the likelihood of road accidents in the area," he said.

"On February 28, she accused the Department of Highways and the head of its Phuket Office with working illegally on the project and requested that the Court order a work stoppage until the Court ruled on the case," he said.

However, by the time the Court received the complaint. Workers from subcontracting firm the Chaiyakorn Company appeared at the site around dawn on February 25 and quickly got to work on the 3-million-baht project.

A stretch of median strip, as well as shade trees that once covered it, were gone before the Court even had a chance of considering issuing a stoppage order.

Mr Bussaya's complaint charged that some 400 buses a day would pull out of the terminal using the new turning, most between the hours of 5am and midnight.

The buses would spew fumes near her home as they went through their lower gears, creating a great deal of noise pollution in the process, she wrote.

The turning would also increase danger to pedestrians trying to cross the road due to decreased visibility, while attracting scores of tuk-tuks, taxis and other service vehicles, she charged.

The complaint also charged that buses might endanger vehicles traveling southbound because the access road to the terminal is sloped.

PATONG Mayor Pian Keesin has publicly declared his stand on the need for Patong to be become a Special Administrative Zone.

His call for the administrative change received much support at a public meeting held recently to present and explain the concept to local residents and business people.

The meeting was coordinated through Patong Municipality and the Bangkokbased Community Organizations Development Institute (CODI), an independent public organization under the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security.

The hearing also followed Government Spokesman  $P\; r\; o\; m\; p\; o\; n\; g$ Nopparit publicly announcing his support for the change during a recent visit to Phuket.

"For the long term, Patong should apply to be a special administrative area for tourism, just

like Pattaya. That will make it easier to manage all the local problems without going through the Ministry of Interior," Mr Prompong told

At the meeting, held at Phuket the Gracelands Resort & Spa on March 7, Mayor Pian fired the first salvo, strongly advocating for Phuket's leading resort town to have more self-governing authority.

"Patong should have the ability to fully manage itself, to manage the money that it collects and how that money is spent on developthe conference.

"I am not happy with the way Patong is currently administered. We have 16,000 people registered as living in Patong, but we have more 100,000 people living here," he added.

Mayor Pian explained that under the current rules for allocation

> of government funding, budgets are allocated to cater to the number of people registered as living in an area.

They are not allocated according to the actual number of people living there.

"It's not fair. We generate so much money for the economy, but we get so little budget funding from the central government because of the way the budgets are allocated.


"If we were a special administrative zone like Bangkok and Pattaya, would collect enough money to develop ourselves [without having to ask

Bangkok for funding]," he said.

"Patong, and Phuket, generate a lot of money for the country. I understand that the central government has to take care of other provinces, but the government seems to forget that Phuket is facing many problems with development.

"If things continue as they are, Phuket will become like Pattaya 20 years ago," he warned.

A recent press release quoting statistics from the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) claimed that Phuket contributes 137 billion baht to Thailand's tourism indus-





try revenue, accounting for around 30% of the total tourism income in Thailand.

Tourism is the critical business in Patong, and Patong Entertain-

ment Business Association (PEBA) President Weerawit Kurasombat echoed Mayor Pian's comments.

"Patong has grown so fast. The current form of administration cannot manage Patong's development problems.

"Patong contributes so much

money to the economy and pays make sure we have good, honso much tax to the central government, but gets so little money in charge to make sure the right

"If Patong became a special administrative zone, we could collect our own tax and use it to develop the city," he said.

> The Phuket Chamber of Commerce representative Jalan Sungsarn, however, cautioned that making Patong a special administrativezone alone was not enough to ensure good management of the town.

"We need to est, trustworthy, reliable people decisions are made and to get things done. Otherwise making Patong a special administration zone will make no difference at all," he said.

Patong people will be taking up that challenge later this year, when they go to the polls to elect a new Patong Mayor and Municipal Council. A date has yet to be set for the Patong election, but under election law Mayor Pian will not be allowed to enter, as he is currently completing his second consecutive term.

Dr Jatupong Kaewsai, Chief Administrative Officer (Palad) at Kathu District Office, also posed the question whether a change in the form of administration would solve Patong's problems.

"Patong has developed very quickly, with so many problems. There should be more focus on Patong developmental problems.

"We should ask ourselves why the current form of administration is not working and what would the benefits be of Patong becoming a special administrative zone. Would this solve all of Patong's problems? I don't think so. A special administrative zone is not the way to solve all the problems." he said.

Rachin Thongmakkul of the Patong Hotel Association disagreed. He called for more self-regulation, arguing it would be more responsive to Patong's needs.

"We fully agree with Patong becoming a special administrative zone. It would go a long way toward helping to resolve all the negative aspects that affects tourists who come here.

"For example, Patong should have a genuine Tourist Service Center. Also, we could set up a one-stop shop for all government services instead of business operators having to go to 10 different offices to get all the paperwork they need," he said.

Suthen Chaovalit, director of

the Human Resource Development and Management Institute in Bangkok, voiced his support for the change, adding that now was the right time to push for it.

"The time is right, right now. The government supports the change and the AEC 2015 [Asean Economic Community] is approaching.

"Thailand is aiming to lead the Asean nations as the tourism and aviation hubs for the region. This will help us achieve that goal," Mr Suthep said.

Local residents at the meeting who the Gazette spoke to all voiced their support.

They will have the chance to express their opinions and to propose what they want at the next public meeting on Patong becoming a special administrative zone. That meeting will be held expressly to gather public feedback, explained Mayor Pian.

At the time of going to press, a date and venue had yet to be set for that meeting.



# Police recover bumper haul

POLICE are urging residents in Chalong whose houses have been robbed recently to come forward and claim items recovered after the arrest of two suspects landed more than 100 stolen goods.

The news comes after Phuket Provincial Police Commander Chonasit Wattanavrangkul presided over a press conference at Chalong Police Station on March 12, held to present Thawatchai Tipyotin, 42, and Jenjira Artharn, 25, both from Phuket.

The two are charged with theft at night, illegal possession of a firearm and ammunition, carrying a firearm in a public place and resisting arrest.

Chalong Police Deputy Superintendent Boonlert Onklang led officers to an apartment in Phuket Town where Thawatchai and Jenjira were arrested.

In the apartment officers found recovered by police.

one .38 handgun, eight bullets, a Road in Karon. handmade gun and 104 stolen As Thawatch items, including Buddha amulets, a sword, clothes, boxing gloves, watches, cameras and other items.

The suspects confessed to robbing eight houses in Chalong and another in Thalang, he said.

"Chalong Police had received reports from foreigners that their homes had been robbed," he said.

The couple were nearly caught on March 7, when a patrol officer saw the couple riding along Patak

As Thawatchai and Jenjira and the motorbike matched a description wanted by the police, the officer stopped them at the entrance to Patak Road Soi 16.

The couple fought the officer and finally Jenjira pulled a gun and threatened to shoot the officer if he did not let them go.

The couple left the motorbike behind and ran off on foot.

Under the motorbike seat, the officer found the license plate. He also found a wig and a cap.

Later that same night, police received a report that Noppra Pirapada was threatened at gunpoint to hand over his motorbike.

The couple sped off toward Karon Circle, but apparently failed to negotiate the curve in front of Karon Temple.

Picking themselves up off the ground, Thawatchai and Jenjira then forced 52-year-old passing motorist Suwannee Tipnoo to

hand over her motorbike.

However, while getting on the motorbike, the gun accidentally fired, shooting Thawatchai in the right leg, Jenjira told police.

Although he had just been shot, Thawatchai opened the throttle and sped off toward Patong with Jenjira sitting behind.

At the press conference Monthicha Mooksri said that she saw Thawatchai and Jenjira walking away from her home in Rawai on February 19.

"I ran after them and I grabbed my laptop back, but they took off with my iPad and 4,000 baht cash," she said.

# Body lotion bust reveals bike and drug gang

TWO shoplifters caught at a 7-Eleven store were later found to be involved in the theft of seven motorbikes and were dealers of ya ice (crystal methamphetamine), police announced on March 9.

Staff at the 7-Eleven store near Phuket International Airport informed police that a man and woman were caught on the store's CCTV system stealing items from the shop.

Police arrived and detained Daorueng Budda and Tawan Dechjirachoti, both 28, for possession of five stolen bottles of Nivea lotion.

During questioning, Mr Tawan admitted that he had also stolen motorbikes to pay for drugs, said

Acting on that information, Tah Chat Chai Police set up a "sting" operation, with plainclothes police officers posing as drug buyers.

At an unreported location in Rassada, police arrested a third member of the gang, Suphachai Wareesri, 28. Mr Suphachai was found in possession of two bags of ya ice, four stolen motorbikes and 7,000 baht in cash.

Another three motorbikes were recovered after Mr Tawan admitted stealing them from Thalang and Phuket City areas.

All were charged with theft, receiving stolen property and selling drugs.

# **Immigration** tops list of 'most worn-out complaint' in Phuket poll

GRIPING about immigration requirements is overwhelmingly the topic readers are most tired of hearing foreigners complain about, according to the most recent Phuket Gazette Readers' Poll.

A total of 1,982 readers took part, which ran from February 17 until March 8.

Readers were asked: "Which of the following topics are you most tired of hearing foreigners in Phuket complain about?"

Overall, 61.4% answered "Immigration requirements", almost four times as many as the second most popular choice "tuk-tuks, taxis" at 15.6%.

Less popular choices were "local driving habits" (8.6%), "overpriced alcohol" (5%) and "double-pricing" (5%). The least popular was "jet-skis" (4.4%).

A breakdown by demographic revealed some interesting trends.

Those who identified themselves as "local foreign residents" (71%) overwhelmingly identified immigration requirements" as the most irksome common complaint.

In contrast, Thais were more likely to opt for "tuk-tuks, taxis" (40%) or "local driving habits" (33%), with "immigration requirements" coming in third at 12%.

Among tourists, "tuk-tuks, taxis" was the most popular choice at 38%, followed by "jetskis" (16%) and "immigration requirements" (14%).

Perhaps ironically, the poll itself became a topic of complaint among many in the Readers' Forum.

# 'Rape' video increases tension in Deep South

A VIDEO of a Thai soldier having sex with a 16-year-old Muslim girl in the Deep South province of Pattani has caused outrage among local people and led to the arrests of two privates on gang-rape charges.

The incident led to a protest in neighboring Yala province by more than 300 students, who demanded an investigation into the case and justice for the girl and her family.

The clip showed Pvt Winai Klangwichai, 21, having intercourse with the girl. While the victim does not appear to struggle, she attempts to hide her face.

The video was filmed by Pvt Somyos Jantharaphut, who is heard shouting encouragements at his friend. Pvt Somyos forwarded the clip to friends, who distributed it more widely.

The two privates handed themselves in to police on March 6.

They are being charged with gang rape and separating a minor from her parents, without their consent, for molestation purposes.

While the age of consent according to the Thai Criminal Code was 15, a later amendment made it an offense to have sex with a person under the age of 18.

The suspects are being detained at Inkhayuthaboriharn military camp in Pattani pending trial.

The case has sparked outrage among local residents, who rallied at Yala Rajabhat University to demand a "fair" investigation.

They also demanded justice for other victims of army abuses. The

The Emergency Decree was extended for another 60 days for the 27th time on March 13.

# Compensation for killed protest victim

THAILAND will offer US\$250,000 (about 7.6 million baht) compensation to the family of a Japanese cameraman who was shot dead during the red-shirt protests of 2010.

The country will also send a letter of condolence to the relatives of Hiroyuki Muramoto, who died on April 10, one of the most violent days of the protests.

"The letter is issued on behalf of the Thai prime minister to Hiroyuki's family and to inform them of the compensation they are entitled to receive like others," Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra told reporters, as quoted by AFP.

Mrs Yingluck made the announcement before embarking on an official trip to, among other things, assure Japanese companies that Thailand was taking the necessary steps to prevent similar catastrophes to the flooding last year.

The premier said her itinerary was too busy to visit Mr Muramoto's family during the visit.

# Yellow-shirts call off street protests

THE People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD) has called off its planned street protests against the government's constitutional reform program – with conditions.

The decision was announced at a peaceful rally at Bangkok's Lumpini Park on March 9, during which several PAD yellow-shirt leaders took to the stage.

Chief among them was Sondhi Limthongkul, who told the crowd of about 3,000 that he would continue to battle former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra, who lives abroad to escape a two-year jail sentence for corruption.

Last month, Bangkok Criminal Court found Mr Sondhi guilty of securities fraud, sentencing him to 20 years in jail. He was granted bail.

The decision by the PAD to shelve threatened street protests

was made on two conditions: that proposed constitutional amendments do not change the status of the monarchy, and that they do not result in an amnesty for Mr Thaksin.





# Digging up dirt to clear a path

CYNICS may see the effort by the Office of the Public Sector Anti-Corruption Commission (PACC) to investigate officials who allegedly colluded with investors to steal state land in Phuket as just the latest in a series of politically-inspired witch hunts. However, we should hold out hope for any effort to expose corruption, especially when elected officials and "civil servants" are among the alleged perpetrators.

The history of land rights in Phuket has been like Pandora's Box. Corruption and collusion have been consistently powerful forces, so much so that most of the abuses will never be exposed. We have experienced many times what can happen to those who try to bring them to light.

This space is far too limited to list all the scandals involving land rights issues in Phuket over the years, but the net result is a landscape of vast inequity. On one hand are families that began to amass fortunes in the tin-mining era and have since parlayed their holdings to become fabulously wealthy with huge landholdings at the advent of the tourism industry and ensuing real estate boom.

At the other end are poor communities such as the sea gypsies, who have lived in certain seaside areas for generations, yet find themselves at the mercy Bangkok-based investors who appear out of nowhere with state-issued deeds and marching orders.

The 2,000 families in the Soi Kingkaew community of Rassada now fear mass eviction following the shocking presentation of a *SorKor 1* paper, reportedly issued over 80 years ago.

This case highlights some of the absurd realities that have developed on the ground in Phuket over the years. Soi Kingkaew, once a vast expanse of verdant mangrove forest, is still nominally protected as such by the state. This is despite the fact that most of the land in dispute is now home to little more than a shanty town.

Rounding out the irony is the fact these very same people who encroached on the mangroves in the first place are now donning the environmentalist mantle in telling the holder of the antique *SorKor 1* he cannot exercise his claim to the land because it is, or at least once was, protected mangrove forest.

The *Gazette* will closely follow the work of the PACC. We don't expect all the abuses of the past to be addressed, but will remember that after the curious Pandora opened the box letting loose all of the evils in the world at least one thing remained inside: hope.

If we can finally begin holding at least some officials accountable, perhaps we can gradually start moving away from a dark past to a brighter future.

# No complaints, but ready to head home

# First PERSON

AS A Burmese worker you don't want to complain to the authorities, because you don't want to create problems with anyone in Thailand.

For the past 20 years I have been working in Thailand and have not been back to Burma. Both my parents passed away while I was working here. For many years I had jobs in Ranong working on fishing boats and construction sites. I can lay bricks, paint or carry out glazing work.

The worst employment I had was when they didn't pay me for almost a month. However, I didn't complain to the authorities. In the end I left and went to work for another employer.

Before I came to Thailand I was a rice farmer and worked on fishing boats in Burma. The wages were very low and I was unable to support my family. I decided to leave. At that time the police were not strict on immigrants entering Thailand.

I met my wife years ago in Phuket while working in a field. Her husband had passed away leaving her with two children back in Burma. She has only been home to visit once in the eight years. Her daughter is 13 years old and her son is 10. I have only seen photos of them, but I think of them as my own. We call them once a month and sometimes they call us, but we don't talk too long as in-

ternational calls are expensive.

My current employer treats me very well because I'm here legally. Here in Phuket I earn more than 300 baht per day and I have the right to go to a government hospital and pay only 30 baht for treatment. We transfer some money back to our family in Burma. If there is someone we know well who is going to Ranong

we give them the money to exchange and deposit in the bank.

My wife and I are planing to go back to Burma in another two years, but it depends on how much we manage to save. We are trying to save enough money to build our own house in Burma. My wife already has a plot of land, so hopefully we will have enough money go home and build a house.

# Phuket climbing: no rocks, no walls


PHUKET is surrounded by worldclass rock climbing. Koh Phi Phi, Koh Yao Noi and, without a doubt, Krabi all have stunning geological edifices.

The first glimpse of the landscape of Krabi, with its enormous limestone cliffs, and towers rising out of the jungle like the half-buried limbs of the titans, is inspirational – an almost spiritual moment for a climber. Yet here in Phuket, there is nothing. But who is to blame for this lack of geological creativity? As much as I would like to point a finger at the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor), the tuktuk mafia or even the "certain individuals that cannot be named", it wouldn't be very fair.

But as Phuket continues to evolve into the training grounds for top-notch athletes, there is no excuse for not having a climbing wall somewhere among the circus of tourist attractions and training centers.

For many climbers, Phuket is the most logical place to call home. There's the ease of finding a job, there's the infrastructure, and of course, there's its relative position to world-class climbing craigs. However, there are no training grounds on the island, making it nearly impossible for Phuket climbers to get the necessary training to rack up first ascents on all the beautiful climbs in their neighbor's backyard.

There have been several attempts to establish climbing walls in Phuket. One ill-conceived idea joined a climbing wall with a bar, which reminded me of the archery range inside a bar complex in

# Phuritat Theerakulpisut, Marine Office Director replies:

According to Marine Department Regulations, longtail boats are allowed to produce noise up to 100 A-weighted decibels.

Generally, longtail boats will have a four-stroke engine, which doesn't cause too much noise, but some drivers switch to a Kubota engine and also modify the exhaust pipe, because they believe that it will make the boat faster – those modifications produce more noise. However, Marine Department staff will measure the noise level every year.

specified. However, some trees are protected.

Our office is open Monday-Friday from 8:30am to 4:30pm.

# Limited companies spike

ISLAND officials have registered a decline in business dissolutions coupled with a rise in new limited liability companies (Co Ltd).

Figures from the Department of Business Development (DBD) show that only 16 company dissolutions were filed in the province in February, 2012, a 46.6% drop from the previous month (30).

Compared to 31 dissolutions in February 2011, the year-on-year (y-o-y) decrease equates to 48.3%.

Meanwhile, Phuket's DBD office last month processed registrations for 157 new companies, including 141 Co Ltd and 16 limited partnership (LP) entities.

Although exactly the same number of new company registrations were reported in Feb-

ruary 2011, Co Ltd registrations this February rose by 10.1% y-o-y (from 128) while lp registrations dropped by 44.8% (from 29) over the same period.

Month-on-month (m-o-m), registrations for new Co Ltd in Phuket jumped 21.5% from 116, while the number of new LP dropped 23.8% from 21 filed in January 2011.

The total number of dissolutions on the island decreased by 46.6% m-o-m, with failed Co Ltd ventures dropping by 60% down to only 10 from 25 the previous month.

A stabilizing economy is also apparent on the national scale, with all of last month's new companies having combined worth of 30bn baht.

Speaking recently at a press conference in Nonthaburi, Deputy Minister of Commerce Siriwat Kajornprasart outlined

national business registration trends in February, 2012.


He highlighted that 5,747 new companies were registered across Thailand, with 2,100 of these made in Bangkok and 3,647 in the provinces.

Registered capital of all the new companies have a combined worth of 29.7bn baht, while dissolved companies were valued at about 3.6bn baht.

All in, there are a total of 501,749 businesses registered nationwide, including Co Ltd, LP, and ordinary partnership entitites.

In addition to 920 Public Companies, the total number of registered businesses in Thailand is now 502,669.

Of these, 17,846 are in Phuket, which comprises 13,745 Co Ltd, 4,078 LP and 23 ordinary partnerships.



More than three quarters of businesses on the island are limited companies (Co Ltd).

A DBD registrar has confirmed with the Phuket Gazette that there are currently no public companies registered in Phuket.





Investment opportunities are expanding: Dr Pakorn Peetathawatchai

**INVESTORS** in Phuket became privy to invaluable financial advice at the island's inaugural investment extravaganza hosted by the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) on Saturday.

Organized in collaboration with the Phuket Chamber of Commerce, Phuket Federation of Industries and the Phuket Bankers Association, it was the first time for "SET in the city" to be held in Phuket.

The event was held at the Royal Phuket City Hotel in Phuket Town, and featured a seminar led by eminent speakers from the forefront of the investment sector, in addition to investment advice booths of 20 major financial institutions.

The event's slogan was: "Shares for making money, derivatives for making profit, funds to administer savings for Phuket residents"

Dr Pakorn Peetathawatchai, SET Chief Marketing Officer, outlined the reasons for bringing the thoroughfare to Phuket.

"Phuket has the third largest deposits' client base in the Southern region, and SET trading on the island is valued as much as 2 to 3 billion baht.

"More importantly, Phuket is experiencing high economic growth. We believe that coming here and giving knowledge about investment will benefit Phuket residents greatly."

SET's stated aim is to continue to promote savings and investment in Bangkok and the provinces, he explained.

"The financial and investment world is changing much, now with many more options for administering finances.

"It is necessary to inform the public, savers and investors to know, understand and be able to access and apply investments to be consistent with their lives.

The goal of SET is to present this information for the maximum benefit of businesses and the community," he said.

Doctor Pakorn explained that the event emphasized on "analyzing the economy and direction of investment, shares, gold and combined funds" as well as "picking out the money making shares, groups and categories"

He went on to say: "Investing depends on the state of the economy of which both external and internal factors will affect the investment. Making decisions come with high risks so you have to look at all sides and diversify your investments.

"Whatever one decides to invest in, it is important that you do your homework and ensure that the direction [of the investment] is ideal.

Phuket's was the second investment promotion activity led by SET this year, following their booth at the Money Expo in Haad Yai last month, while five more events are scheduled this year including two in Bangkok, one in Chiang Mai, Udon Thani and Nakhon Ratchasima.

# SET in the city Home debts swelling

PROPERTY loans in Phuket in 2011 spiked by 20% year-onyear, figures from the Bank of Thailand (BoT) have revealed.

Citing those figures, Bangkok Bank's chairman on planning for Phuket, Phang-Nga and Krabi, Somchai Pikulthong, said: "Statistics from BoT's Southern branch show that there was a total of 11.7 billion baht in property loans in 2010.

"In 2011, loans totaled 14.06 billion baht, 2.36 billion baht more than the previous year.

"We expect that there will be more loans in 2012 since there are a number of new real estate projects being developed.

Most of the new projects are being launched by major Bangkok developers such as Sansiri, Pruksa and Supalai, and targeting the medium income buyers of homes

under 5mn baht, he said.

Satchaphol Tongsom, board member of the Phuket Real Estate Association agrees.

The low and mid range market will to continue to grow, and the market for homes priced 8 to 12mn baht will also grow, while the market for homes priced more than 20mn baht will

struggle, he said.

P-REA President Tanan Tanphaibul said: "Though demand among the [affluent] foreigner market group has declined, the property sector has benefited from some other favorable factors, namely with the Russian market gaining momentum."

Another trend he highlighted is the decline in developing villas in excess of the one million dollar (30mn baht) bracket on islands off Phuket.

Instead, developers have shifted to building hotels and rental options instead, he said.

"This is because it is more difficult to reach the target groups [of expensive villas] and so the developers have had to adjust their approach to meet the circumstances of the market.

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# The next iPad is here



THE cat's out of the bag, and at this very moment the first "new" iPads are on store shelves in the US, Australia, Canada, UK, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Singapore and Switzerland. While you may think of it as an iPad 3.0, at this point the official name is "The New iPad." Apple hasn't yet set a price for the new iPad in Thailand, nor have they announced when it will be available.

Concomitantly, Apple dropped the retail price of the iPad 2 by US\$100 in the US, so it now costs US\$399. Apple Thailand's lowered the price of the iPad 2, too, but not as much: the base 16 GB, WiFi only iPad 2 now lists for 13,500 baht (about US\$440), including free delivery in Thailand. You can order yours online at store.apple.com.

Also, I am happy to report that Apple dealers in Phuket are no longer forcing iPad 2 buyers to pay for a third-party accessory with every iPad 2 they purchase. I'm still smarting over that.

If you want 3G service to go along with the iPad 2, Apple will sell the 16 GB 3G + WiFi version to you for 17,500 baht (about US\$570, compared to US\$529 in the US), but you can probably find a better deal at AIS or TrueMove, if you're willing to commit to a year of 3G service.

I've had about a hundred people ask me if they should get the "new" iPad. The short answer is: probably yes, especially if you don't already own an iPad, or if you have an iPad 1.

Like a hundred million other people, I'll probably end up buying a new iPad, even though I already own an iPad 2.

Here's why...

First, the screen's four times as dense as the iPad 2's. You can call it a "retina display" if you want, but the new iPad runs its screen at 2048 x 1536 pixels, which is the same density as the gorgeous iPhone 4s screen. If you want to see the difference, just

put an iPhone 4s next to an iPad 2. There's a very noticeable improvement — and it'll be even more stunning with movies, apps and games that take advantage of the higher resolution.

Or you can think of it this way. There are lots and lots of "high definition" TVs in Phuket right now that don't even come close to the new iPad's resolution. CNET's tablet reviewer Donald Bell says, "Let's be clear, here. Not only does the new iPad's QXGA screen wreck your expectations for

Granted, if you're reading books, the Kindle's e-Ink technology is easier on the eyes because of its backlit display. But in the world of tablets, the retina display is king, no question about it.

I rhapsodized over that camera in my Live Wire column two weeks ago, and for good reason: it's better than the best pointand-shoot cameras from a couple of years ago, better than the best last-generation video cameras, and almost as good as the best point-and-shoots on the market now. I know it looks weird taking photos with an iPad. But with the new iPad, I'll snap with abandon, and won't worry about what people think. With 5 megapixels, anti-shake technology, and the ability to shoot good quality full 1080p high definition videos, the only thing I'm lacking is an exter-



# A mortgage in the UK

HOUSING prices in the UK have suffered a dramatic fall over the past few years and banks have made it harder for first-time buyers. To put it bluntly, banks have made it harder for any buyer getting on the housing ladder when prices are low.

Although UK housing prices are expected to make a steady recovery over the next few years and investors who dipped their toes at the right time to make a healthy profit from this, there is a threat.

Interest rates in the UK have remained at an historic low, but some major banks are beginning to increase lending rates, and this is bad news for many UK home owners.

The Bank of England (BoE) Base Rate hasn't changed. It's still at 0.5%. In fact, the central bank's most recent move was to loosen monetary policy with another round of quantative easing. There are no indications that the BoE will raise interest rates anytime soon, so why are the private sector banks starting the raise mortgage rates?

Halifax is raising its standard variable rate (SVR) to 3.99% from 3.5% on May 1. That doesn't sound like much, and in the big scheme of things it isn't. It's about £40 per month extra on a £150,000 repayment mortgage.

According to the website this is is money. Co.uk, roughly 850,000 borrowers will see their payments rise.

Santander and RBS/Natwest have raised some of their rates, too. And what's significant here – for now, at least – isn't the amount of money: It's the direction of the rate change.

We have to remember that the BoE Base rate is incidental. What matters is how much banks charge to lend money. It has become more expensive for banks to raise money in the wholesale markets in recent months, although it has eased off in recent weeks. It's also getting more expensive to raise money from savers. Fed up with inflation eating their cash savings, people are increasingly investing, rather than saving.

That's risky of course, but it's a direct result of BoE policy. People are doing what the Bank wants them to do. The trouble is, once savers have made that psychological jump, it means banks have to work harder to attract them back.

One particular line that banks like to use in situations like this is, "We are just passing the costs

on." Rubbish. Banks have to make a profit, too. As Halifax had one of the lower SVRs, this move merely brought it more in line with its rivals. So it makes sense, from the bank's point of view, to improve its margins where the market will bear it.

This makes life a little harder for marginal customers. Many customers would have stayed on the marginal rates, pretty much because they can't afford to go anywhere else.

Some reports suggest that as many as one in six borrowers regularly have problems meeting their payments. So this could be the final straw for some, especially if unemployment continues to rise. House repossessions in the UK in 2011 were just above 36,000 and I expect this number to rise.

Over the longer term, property seems to be a good investment as mortgages become more expensive and those all important first steps on the housing ladder become harder and harder. This all bodes well for the rental market.

If you own a home in the UK and you are on a standard variable rate, don't be shocked if your mortgage payments become a little bit more expensive.

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# Kids are doing it for themselves

AS PART of its philosophy to teach young Thai students the importance of self-sufficiency and respect for the environment, the Yaowawit Boarding School and Lodge has developed a model agricultural project which demonstrates the fundamentals of independence for small farmers.

Located in the middle of a Phang Nga jungle, far away from the glamor of international tourism or even modern Thai life, the Yaowawit School, was founded by a German philanthropist and an American architect with the support of Princess Maha Chakri Siridhorn and the Thai government.

The school is home to 120 students, from four to 18 years, who are accepted from around Phang Nga based on their financial and personal needs. Some are survivors of the 2004 tsunami and all come from fractured homes where one or both of their parents are dead or missing.

Sabine Kraus is the Project Manager for Yaowawit.

"Our goal is for these children to develop their personal inner resources and to become productive members of their society. Our teaching stresses the importance of being responsible

for one's own actions as well as one's effect on the local environment. We have developed the 10 Station Learning Center so the students can see how to make organic foods in a way that does not harm the environment,"

With the help for committed volunteers, Christian von Aufess and Addy Ukhatarn, the Yaowawit School has taken a large portion of their 120-rai piece of land to develop agricultural products.

"We are constantly under pressure to raise funds to continue our operations. We are hoping that by growing most of our own foods, we can become self-suf-

ficient. We are currently able to get some revenue from rice cultivation and palm oil production, but it is not enough," said Sabine.

To create needed revenue, the school has added six rooms which are rented to visiting groups or tourists who want to help the school and explore the surrounding beauty. They are also developing products based on what they produce at the farm such as massage oils and organic drinks made from Thai fruits and herbs.

Students learn how to make organic fertilizers from vegetable scraps and rotting organic materials. A station with water pumps, pow-

ered by students who pedal bicycles, is connected to a canal bringing water directly onto fields of vegetables. Recycling is core to the program. Learning to be innovative with objects that most people would throw away, the students decorate old shoes and helmets as planters for young vegetables or flowers.

There are 10 different stations in the project designed to create a self-sustaining farm. The fish pond was seeded with 2,000 small catfish that are being raised to sell in the local community market as well as for use in students' meals in the school restaurant.

"For our school to become more self-reliant we need the participation of local and international sponsors. We are fortunate to receive support from the Swiss Education Group, the German Embassy and a few corporate and individual sponsors, but we still need the help of the community and people who can donate their time or some funds to keep our school in operation. We invite people to sponsor a child for only 2,000 baht a month or to volunteer their skills in art, dance, sports, etc to share with our students," said Sabine.

A rare piece of document dated from around 1785 explained this process. It was mandated that tin revenues from Junk Ceylon and nearby towns, as well as merchandise imported from eastern India had to be transported to the capital on a regular basis.

18<sup>th</sup> century Siamese merchants used a route that started from Takua-Pa, a town just north of Junk Ceylon. Travelers and caravans would then pass through Khao Sok in Surat Thani, an area that is covered with thick tropical

rain forest and steep hills even today. The caravans would have to penetrate the tropical jungle until they reached the Thaphanom canal. From there government officials would arrange for the goods to be taken to Chaiya. The cargo of tin and other goods would then be transported by small boats sailing along a collection of small rivers and canals until it reached the Siamese capital in the central plains. Since the Ayutthaya period and up until 1785, the trail

> had also been used by merchants to transport goods to the capital and who wished to avoid sailing all the way around the Malay Peninsular to reach the Bay of Bengal.

In order to ship tin revenues from Junk Ceylon to the capital, the governor of Thalang would arrange to send the cargo up to Takua-Thung. The governor of Takua-Thung

would then arrange to forward the goods to Takua-Pa so that it could be transported along the trail.

The overland route was used for many reasons. It was an old route that had been used for many years by merchants, since the ancient days when Takua-Pa, or Takola as it was then called, was still a thriving trade center. A network of deep canals had been dug so that merchandise could be transported by large boats to different towns. The town of Chaiya on the Kra Isthmus was also a

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popular stop for merchants and traders. Using this route was hard, considering merchants had to transport their heavy cargo for miles overland through harsh terrain. But it remained the preferred route because sailing around the Malay peninsular was considered even more dangerous. Storms have, in the past, wrecked countless ships and opportunistic pirates infested the sea trade routes.

However in 1785, the Burmese invaded Siam and war broke out between the two kingdoms. Whilst Junk Ceylon managed to fend off the invaders, the ancient land route to the capital that had been used for centuries was cut off by Burmese troops that had taken over parts of the isthmus. It soon became impossible to transport tin and other revenues from Junk Ceylon to the capital since major towns like Takua-Pa, Takua-Thung, Chaiya and Chumporn had fallen under Burmese control. Stocks of tin, fabrics from India and an array of weaponry bound for the capital began to pile up at the Khao Sok pass for years. Much of the cargo was lost, damaged or stolen during this time.

After the war, King Rama I wanted to establish a new trade route from the South to Bangkok. He asked Phraya Surintharaja, a high ranking noble to find a new shipping route that would connect the south-west coastal towns with the capital. Phraya Surintharaja was the governor of eight coastal towns in the south of Siam, including Thalang (Junk Ceylon), Takua-Pa and Takua-Thung, so he knew the geography of the area quite well. These towns made up a major part of the old route. The arrival of the Portuguese, Dutch and English also meant that sea voyages were becoming safer and more advanced and were utilized to a greater extent.

Initially Phraya Surintharaja was asked by King Rama I come to Bangkok to meet with him. There the king told him that a high ranking minister had just passed away and that he wanted Phraya Surintharaja to take the vacant position. Although highly honored, Phraya Surintharaja did not want to stay in Bangkok and he told the king that he would lead a happier life if he was allowed to remain as the king's viceroy in the southern coastal towns. In return, he promised King Rama I that he would open a new trade route that would connect the southern towns of Siam with Bangkok. The king agreed and Phraya Surintharaja set out to plan the new route. He asked the king to grant him the use of ten elephants from Nakhon-Si-Thammarat and another ten from Chaiya, in addition to a large workforce that he recruited from the nearby villages. The king approved of his request and the large project to clear a new route to Bangkok was underway.

The new route that Phraya Surintharaja built was a much needed replacement to the old one that had been in use for centuries. Using the new route, it only took three days for goods to reach Bangkok from the south. The journey was also much easier and less prone to sudden flash floods that had in the past destroyed a lot of precious cargo. The new route not only allowed for easier transportation to the capital, it also made the administration of the southern provinces easier and more effective.

# **Diving**

THERE was a sinking feeling in my stomach as raya's dive boat approached Hin Musang, better known as Shark Point. Casually floating not more than a kilometer away from our splash-in point were two ragged looking commercial fishing boats. Rumors and grumbles that Shark Point's namesake sighting, leopard sharks,

were becoming a rarity began to take on some merit.

Because of their unique and prominent large black spots, as well as their hardiness, leopard sharks are a favorite for private commercial aquariums. Not only are they sought by aquarium enthusiasts, they are also caught for food, a popular dish by all accounts. Sadly, some Phuket divers have claimed to see leopard sharks on board fishing boats around Shark Point.

Leopard sharks tend to remain within particular areas, rarely undertaking long journeys to other suitable habi-

tats, which makes the rumors of their declining presence at Shark Point all the more unsettling.

However, like all dive trips, there are no guarantees of what you are going to see once underwater. A little nervously, my group

jumps first and quickly descends onto one of the three major pinnacles of Shark Point.

I feel like Alice in Wonderland. Shark Point is everything a tropical dive site should be – a total wonderland of marine life. The "need" to see a leopard shark begins to evaporate as giant gorgonian seafans gently wave in the current, beckoning us around the decorated limestone pinnacle, which rises out of the sandy seafloor like a petrified Christmas tree.

Juvenile butterfly fish flutter among the corals, as schools of blue and yellow sergeant majorfish stormed forward.

Following our raya divemaster we peek into the bowl of a rustyred giant barrel sponge. Motionless at the bottom was a gnarly scorpion fish, not the only master of disguise that we bumped into on the dive.

Everywhere we looked, the seafloor was alive. False clownfish, not as funny as the real thing, danced around sea anemones. Moorish idols, Indian cushion starfish, bubble anemones and coral banded cleaner shrimp dotted the landscape.

Curious about every nook and cranny of the reef, I float less than a meter above the sea floor. The

desire to see a leopard shark is completely washed away by the beauty of the site.

Time, like air, goes fast when you're having fun, so in what felt like no time we were due for a safety-stop.

We stop in a forest of pink soft corals, atop of one of the pinnacles. While waiting, we start a search of the brilliantly colored corals for seahorses, but our three minutes quickly expires and we are forced to surface.

Back on board there is a twinge of jealousy as the other dive group starts talking about the two-meter leopard shark they spotted. However, the condolence package wasn't so bad and the silver lining of course is that Shark Point still has its

namesake, even if they are a bit more rare this high season.



THERE are places in the world where the roar of big bikes coming towards town spells trouble, but here in Phuket that sound heralds good news as it means that Big Bike Week is here again and that business is as booming as the engines.

Heading into its 18th year, the event will take place between April 6 to 8, just before the Songkran festival kicks off and, like the bikes themselves, has become bigger and better each year.

Back in 1995 the Phuket Riders Club and the Immortals Thailand Club decided to organize a group ride with motorcycle riders from Bangkok and tourists from Malaysia, Singapore and the USA.

That original ride involved around 150 big bikes with about 300 visitors and has grown over

Organizers of Phuket Bike Week 2012 believe this year's event will attract well over 6,000 big bikes to the island, and along with the annual Songkran Festival, inject at least 600 million baht into the economy. This year they have the added support of many Phuket officials and the festival is being organized collectively by Phuket Province, Patong Municipality, the Phuket Big Bike Club, the Phuket Riders Club and Ride Thailand magazine.

Boasting 450 members, Phuket has 36 motorcycle clubs in all with the Phuket Riders Club being the largest with 24 members.

# Seven's heaven for our Lady Pie

AFTER last year's successful involvement with the rugby world's premier 7s tournament, Phuket's Lady Pie can claim world renown and will once again fill more appreciative bellies with their themed and delicious fare at the 2012 event that starts on March 23.

Now in their sixth year of operation in Cherng Talay, Lady Pie owners Susan and Harry Usher are thrilled with another opportunity to promote Phuket•fs growing international culinary reputation in the world arena, or at the Hong Kong Stadium at least, with their range of crusty puff pastries.

A few facts and figures for academic digestion suggest this is a 'takeaway' of mammoth proportion that goes some way to satisfy the appetites of over 120,000 players and spectators, who will enjoy one of the world's top annual sporting events.

Four aptly named types of pie will complement the gallons and gallons of alcohol traditionally quaffed at the 7s, with the Aussie Beef Ruck, Chicken and Mushroom Maul and the Steak and Kidney Scrum providing vital sustenance for rugby and pie enthusiasts over three days of guaranteed revelry.

As this paper went to print, 5,500 Aussie pies, 2,000 chicken and mushroom pies and 840 steak and kidney pies were being prepared for the global feast and the following details what literally

goes into fulfilling an order of this

The weight of minced beef required is 220kg, while beef alone weighs in at 50kg. Over 4kg of kidneys are needed in addition to 72kg of chicken and the 45kg of vegetables. All the fillings dealt with, Lady Pie's tireless staff then prepares 420kg of puff pastry and 620kg of short crust pastry.

It's evident that the pies are a source of pride for Susan, but she is quick to admit it's her staff that make it all possible.

"If it wasn't for my girls we wouldn't be in this position," said Susan. "They work so hard to get everything done on time. Some of the preparation is very precise and can only be done by eye. Due to weight restrictions on the flights we have a tolerance of just half a kilo per 20kg container, but they get it right every time. Absolutely fantastic, they're brilliant," she added.

While discussing the Hong Kong 7s, Susan kindly offered a new addition to the menu for our delectation in the form of sticky hot cross buns.

It will be Easter on Phuket all year round now and with Lady Pie on our doorstep it's easy to taste a little of the atmosphere Hong Kong will enjoy tackling next week.



# The big picture of global horror

IN LIBRARIES and book stores, not shelves but entire bookcases are devoted to World War II and the American Civil War. Therefore, a one volume history of each fills a crying need.

The American Civil War has Battle Cry of Freedom by James M. McPherson. Now World War II has Inferno (Alfred A Knopf, New York, 2011, 729pp) by Max Hastings, subtitled "The World at War 1939-1945".

Hastings brings a magisterial authority to the subject, having written eight previous military histories of the war.

He is blunt on the subject of generals. A nutshell explanation of the Confederate's initial success in the Civil War is that they had good generals and the Union had bad. Similarly he is unafraid to assert that the Germans had good generals – Manstein, Guderian, Rommel, Kesselring – and the British and Americans bad: the entire brass of the early days of the war and much of the later.

He calls General Douglas

MacArthur a "vain glorious blowhard". His campaign to retake the Philippines was strategically unnecessary, but his machine rolled over the powers in Washington. "MacArthur was distinguished by the splendor of his self-image as a

warlord, which it suited his nation to indulge, rather than by gifts as a battlefield commander.

Gurkhas and the New Zealanders – on frontal attacks on Monte Cassino out of sheer personal lust for glory for the

conquest of Rome. Lust for glory was also the main reason behind British general Bernard Montgomery's failure of the Arnhem campaign, "The British comm a n d e r s charged with executing it, notably Lt.General Frederick "boy" Browning, displayed shameful incompetence and merited dismissal with ignominy rather than the

honors they received in a classic British propaganda operation intended to dignify disaster."

> The American generals Bradley and Hodges were mediocrities at best. Patton alone merits qualified praise: "In pursuit, he displayed an inspiration and energy rare among Allied generals, but in hard fighting, his army fared no better than those of his peers."

Director of the US Navy's Pacific

campaign Admiral Nimitz, in 1942

In contrast, he esteems highly the naval and air force commanders. "The outstanding General Mark Clark in Italy personality of the Japanese war


squandered his best troops – the was Nimitz, who directed the U.S. Navy's Pacific campaign with cool confidence and judgment, often displaying brilliance, especially in the exploitation of

> intelligence. Spruance showed himself the ablest fleet commander at sea." In contrast, after many initial successes, the Japanese admirals showed nothing but dullness and timidity.

But the high command of the war forms only a very tiny portion Hastings' sweeping vision. The bulk of the book is made up of the personal stories of the people on the

ground, from infantrymen and civilians. His point is that the war was a force that swept away normal lives and tested everyone in varying degrees of horror. It is this vast human mosaic that forms the beating heart of the book.

The most important corrective is that the war was really fought on the Russian front. A mere half dozen divisions were fielded by each side in the North African campaign. By contrast, the Russians fielded 200 divisions on their front. Three quarters of their tankers were killed. Of seven million taken prisoner by the Germans, only three million survived. Total deaths topped 27 million with 16 million civilians. The Russian generals were successful simply by throwing millions into bloody

frontal attacks.

"The advancing Soviet legions resembled no other army the world had ever seen: a mingling of old and new, Europe and Asia, high intelligence and brutish ignorance, ideology and patriotism, technological sophistication and the most primitive transport and equipment. T-34s. artillery and katyusha rocket launchers were followed by jeeps and Studebaker and Dodge trucks supplied under lend-lease, then by shaggy ponies and columns of horsemen, farm carts and trudging peasants from the remote republics of Central Asia, clad in foot cloths and rags of uniforms. Drunkenness was endemic."

So was mass rape and looting. Europe was plunged back into medieval horrors. Japanese civil-

ians suffered mass murder from the sky. Hastings concludes:

"Among citizens of modern democracies to whom serious hardship and collective peril are unknown, the tribulations that hundreds of millions endured between 1939 and 1945 are almost beyond comprehension.

Allied victory did not bring universal peace, prosperity, justice or freedom; it brought merely a portion of those things to some fraction of those who had taken part.

All that seems certain is that Allied victory saved the world from a much worse fate that would have followed the triumph of German and Japan. With this knowledge, seekers after virtue and truth must be content."

# The Grey

THE survivalist movie *The Grey* pits a half-dozen or so oil-rig rough necks against a den of wolves, and writer/director Joe Carnahan's portrayal of that elemental struggle for survival breathes new life into the genre by being unusually thoughtful and philosophical.

Carnahan brings an unexpected sobriety to the proceedings by introducing Ottway (Neeson) as a deeply troubled man who has lost his will and purpose to live.

Liam Neeson is a sharpshooter who has seen his fair share of killing over the years now makes his living protecting the riggers in the Alaskan wilderness, but can't figure out why he's now safeguarding men he describes as "unfit for mankind".

Their fundamental struggle is told with unvarnished clarity, and Carnahan's attention to the little details in every scene makes the journey thoroughly mesmerising every step of the way.

# Life & style Kiat Eksilapa

SUCCESSFUL IT businessman Kiat Eksilapa fell in love with classical guitar when he was young. Growing up in a family of music lovers – his father played the guitar and his younger brother the flute. Kiat went on to study music at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok.

At 22, he won an audition to study at the prestigious Conservatory of Music Óscar Esplá in Spain, where musical virtuosos from all over the world converge.

"Spain is the home of the classical guitar, the best in the world," Kiat explains.

"Music was an important part of the great Spanish civilization during the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> Centuries, the *Siglo* Cde Oro ("golden age"). At that time, artists, musicians and writers the world over met there to bask in the air of creativity. And that was how my music maestro there put it: 'Submerge yourselves in the fountain of civilization.' For five years I lived and breathed music. You couldn't help it: it was so much part of life there.

"The Spaniards not only play music, but they speak it as well on a daily basis. Do you know that the musical term allegro doesn't actually mean fast but describes a state of being – joyous and lively?"

Having graduated from the Conservatorio, Kiat returned to Thailand and briefly taught music

in Bangkok. He realized then that "submerging in music" was not an option in the real world and decided to enter the world of academia and become a fellow researcher at the Lund University in Sweden. His subject: late renaissance and baroque music. The research lasted four years.

Back in Phuket in the the early 1990s, Kiat set up IT-Access, the first company to offer technical solutions for businesses in Phuket needing computer systems. As the company prospered, music, as it were, was put on the back burner.

Not until 14 years later Kiat could rekindle his passion. He opened PianoPros in 2008 to sell and rent pianos and other musical instruments, but with a loftier idea - to fuel interest and appreciation of classical music among young Thais and to integrate this into the existing education system.

On this he lobbied hard to be accepted as representative and examination center of the noted British musical institution ABRSM

(Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music).

"My idea is to develop a full and workable teachers' training program to expand music education in this country by working with schools, colleges and universities. I realize that the scope is huge and I have a lot of work ahead of me. But I have a capable partner (in Bangkok) who is also in the music business and who has a large network we can deploy," he says.

"This is not about money and profits but more about giving back to society, a practice in social awareness. I have always wanted to do this and this is it," says Kiat, his eyes brighten with excitement.

To the question of how he reconciles the two seemingly different disciplines, music and IT, Kiat answers, "Music is abstract and so is science. There's quite a bit of mathematics in music and it's a well-known fact that physicists in particular appreciates classical music because they understand it so well. To me the two are just branches of the same tree."

Kiat is married to Ruedee, also from Phuket, and have a 10-yearold daughter named Aria. It seems that for the moment his personal life, professional work, and his passion are all playing to the cheerful tempo of allegro. No staccato notes here.

THE direction of property design on the island was intimately examined last week by a panel of international designers to kick off discussions at the latest meeting of the American Chamber of Commerce (AMCHAM) Greater Phuket chapter.

Hosted at Royal Phuket Marina, the Design Evolution Workshop featured brief presentations from Adrian McCarroll of Original Vision, Clint Nagata of Bangkok's Blink Design Group and noted designer of the Twinpalms resort, Martin Palleros.

Mediated by Scott Gorsuch of the Leisure Design Group, the panel of three were challenged and stimulated with a series of questions - some difficult and some simple – about the past, present and future of the island's and region's property design scene.

While the presentations and Q & A session highlighted some of the island's design milestones, lingering opportunities and challenges, the climax came with the final, billion dollar question.

CEO of C9Hotelworks, Bill

Barnett, asked the panel to do what has previously never been satisfactorily done: Define Phuket.

Phuket is eclectic, answers Adrian, whose latest projects include Kata Rocks, along with luxury estates Samsara and Sava, in addition to his firm conducting master planning for the 1000 rai Thai Muang project (Phang Nga) of Hong Kong billionaire Richard Li.

"It's difficult to define a style about an island so diverse as Phuket," he admitted, "It is a holiday destination as it is also business destination."

It's an indoor and outdoor experience, he states concisely and confidently.

"People coming here love the idea to be able to be in their swim wear, or walk about their home or yard in the nude, said Adrian.

Adrian's answer reinforced these points in his presentation, in which he emphasized the importance of incorporating pre-existing and underlying environmental factors into the design process.

Next to address the question, Clint Negata said: "I would call it lifestyle tropical architecture. It's about balancing the tropics and the

outdoors. We all have different definitions.'

Clint's Blink Design Group is the interior designer behind the upscale resort Regent Panwa, and has also contributed its creative input to a number of luxury brands in Thailand and Bali including Conrad, Hilton, Jumeriah, Langham Place, Le Meridien, Sheraton, Westin, Banyan Tree, The Venetian and The Luxury Collection.

Last but certainly not least, Martin, who is known for his work on Baan Yamu and the ultra-residence Villa Mayavee on Kamala's Millionaires' Mile answered: "It's not so much about the style as it's about the Phuket experience.

Phuket is about the sea and relationships we have with the sea, he said.

Like Adrian and Clint, Martin also believes that pre-existing and indigenous factors must be considered and incorporated into design.

Asked about which natural materials will play a significant role in Phuket's trial to be more sustainable, unique and innovative, Martin said to look out for bamboo, of which he believes is set to take the island by storm.

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# Move over Phuket here comes Samui

Phuket's neighbouring resort island of Koh Samui is catching up in the tourism property stakes.



IT MAY come as a surprise to some readers, but Thailand does have another resort island on the upswing by the name of Koh Samui.

Phuket may get more ink spilled about it be it good, bad or sensational as do other seaside leisure spots named Pattaya and Hua Hin, but what about that spot over in the gulf?

Samui's tourism's screenplay seems oddly reminiscent of that epic journey from small rural fishing village with the early adopters being backpackers then somewhere down the line tcomes some nicer bungalows, a hotel or two and the next thing you know the party is in full swing.

Hotel chains, largish resorts and upscale offerings have turned an infant into a full-blown adult. Pump up the volume, take some steroids and a fast track spurt often ensues.

Numbers in tourism remain


meaningful. It's a grade card on how the sector is performing and often a reality check on what's gone right or else what's gone very wrong.

Koh Samui suffered a marked decline during the global financial crises, with its traditional long haul visitors evaporating into thin air. Phuket was able to cope better with the change, with a shift to more Asian visitors, with sustained increases in lowcost carrier flights.

Now everyone could fly... and they did, but to Phuket and not to Koh Samui.

Our island has continued to post record high visitor arrivals, embracing a numbers game up and up into the sky. But one clear trend in the post-sub-primeworld has been domestic hotel investors crowding into a single phone booth.

More precisely everyone in Thailand apparently wants to own a hotel and a surprising number pony up and cash and crank out bed factories. But upscale luxury hotels were either too capital intensive or the right

type of land is beyond the reach of most of these 'would be Donald Trumps'.

Patong has forged ahead and an increasing urban sprawl of vague, forgettable properties have shot up not only there, but in every single corner of the island.

Here is where the paths separated with Samui which is seeing developments and brands such as Four Seasons, W, Conrad, InterContinental and Le Meridien crop up.

According to our market research and analysis the influx of upscale hotels is turning the tables and shifting the market place. Last year Koh Samui saw average room rates soar by 16 per cent compared to the previous year and occupancy was hitting a high note with 6% growth.

Meanwhile airlift patterns compound average growth rates over the past five years (2007 to 2011) show a respectable 7% rise. Foreign travelers continue to dominate the scene and this has been a godsend as the combination of highly sought after quality hotels and emphasis as a boutique destination is resonating with upscale travelers.

Talk to many hoteliers who provide feedback from guests and they and the travel trade claim that an increasing number of visitors say "smaller is better" when high pitch Wall Street business comparing Samui and Phuket. A slower pace, less in-your-face offerings and an exciting portfolio of accommodation.

While we've replayed the airlift scenario into Samui as part

our neighbor is that a slowdown in the development sector now means only 513 more rooms are on the medium term horizon.

If we were on one of those television sessions we'd be buzzing about a return to trading fundamentals or stabilizing the supply and demand situation.

In easy terms, the end result means if visitors continue at sustainable numbers, rates and

> occupancy could very well have a bright outlook.

Ōf course there are other issues - such as the long term absence of a new airport, straining infrastructure and a gorilla in the room with all of those, now elderly, hotels built on the climb up the ladder, now becoming marginalized.

Times change, taste and décor

don't remain static and how to fill those rooms in a boutique setting remains challenging. But to sum it up, Koh Samui is back on the radar and it's a welcome return to form.





Gardening

ONE of the first , if not the first thing to consider when creating a new garden or re-vamping an old one, is to work out which plants do well in your locale. There are more micro-climates around than you or I realize – even in Phuket. So it's a good idea to do some homework in your area, and discover which garden plants are successful and why.

Let's take one distant example. A friend of mine has an English wood that is

carpeted with wild primroses every March. A mile away, another friend can't get any primroses to grow for love nor money, even though conditions appear similar. Why? Who knows . But an educated guess would probably link the disparity to soil quality, and the availability of suitable nutrients and moisture in the earth. Primroses need little sun, but plenty of water and an acidic soil. Plants only naturalize when conditions are right.

Switch 7000 miles to Phuket... The owner of an island spa has just camouflaged a bare, sun-drenched wall with some new shrubs. He has chosen pairs of wrightia religiosa, ylang ylang, bauhinia blakeana (Hong Kong orchid tree), magnolia champaca, and, at each end, fiddle-woods (citherexylum).

There are already mature ylang ylang vines draped over the trellis outside the sauna, already a row of wrightias flourishing in shade behind the relaxation area, a single magnolia champaca set in a grassy area. These same species are doing well in their new environment, having already shown that soil conditions in the spa are conducive to their particular needs. And the newly planted wrightias are not phased by the remorseless sun, since they are shrubs that will tolerate most conditions - except bone-dry soil. The tulip trees, magnolias and fiddlewoods, used to sunny aspects, are also doing well. Interestingly, all these species are thriving in other gardens in the vicinity.

So the spa people have, quite

literally, done their homework in choosing shrubs and small trees appropriate for the location. Furthermore, the new plants have been regularly watered and mulched, and a raised ridge of soil forming a circle round each one has ensured its retention..

A second matter to consider with a new planting is the size and the growth habit of your new

charges. For example, the ylang ylang (cananga odorata) is technically a vine,

and will eventually need support. In time, maybe, it can be attached to the adjacent wall. The tulip trees and champacas will eventually reach fifteen to twenty feet and will stand on their own. No problem. Always a good choice. So too the fiddlewoods, the fastest growing, and ultimately the largest of this quintet. Sensibly they have been placed at each end of the wall, so that they will not crowd out their smaller brethren .The wrightias are perhaps the most surprising selection, since they are small shrubs, rarely more than six feet in height, and usually used as screens or hedges.. Still, they will doubtless prove effective understorey shrubs once the others get into their stride.

I almost forgot. All these varieties produce beautiful blooms: the orchid tree, the largest and most exotic purple flowers, the champaca attractive cream or pale yellow flowers. The fiddlewood blossoms abundantly, producing long spikes of tiny white blooms, ylang ylang has distinctive deep yellow, incurved petals, and wrightia has clusters of delicate drooping white blooms.

Oh, and one other very relevant thing.... All these shrubs and trees, with the exception of the scentless bauhinia, exude the most delightful fragrance. And in the setting of a spa, that is surely the most important consideration of all...

### Whose your money on?

**EXACTLY 10 Premiership games** remain for all teams as we go into this weekend's action, and pundits around the world will make their predictions for the title, fourth spot and the relegation positions.

Of course the first thing to look at is who will face who during the final stretch.

The next thing to considered is the list of injured players the clubs are carrying. Will they return to action before the season's climax? And team's current form.

Some commentators may look at the previous year's positions, both the final standings, and that of March 2011. Some will look at New Year's day rankings and its psychological impact, let's call that the "Fergie factor".

The "Fergie factor" has it in this writer's view, with only City to contend with out of the top seven, his past performance at critical times, no major injury worries and players like Paul Scholes and Ryan Giggs who have done it before to assist. Prediction: Champions.

### Lomas learn from the best

Rugby World Cup winning coach Bob Dwyer and former Leicester Tigers elite performance director Mike Pennistone staged the first of three coaching clinics in association with Phuket's rugby development program at TSLC last weekend.

IT WAS the second international rugby match I had ever attended. With just under four minutes to go, Irish flanker Gordon Hamilton took a pass from Jack Clarke and charged for the Australian try line. Outpacing the great David Campese and shrugging off a last-ditch tackle by Bob Egerton, Hamilton went over for one of the most memorable tries in Irish rugby.

I remember the transition from tion of Phuket thunderous euphoria to utter silence and back to revelry again as Ralph Keyes kicked the conversion to put Ireland 18-15 ahead. Two minutes later, however, Michael Lynagh scored for Australia to dash Irish hopes of an historic win.

The year was 1991 and Ireland had just lost to Australia in the rugby world cup quarter-final. The Wallabies would go on to win the title, beating England in the final to claim their first world cup.

Guiding Australia to glory that year was Bob Dwyer and nearly 21 years later, on Phuket, I got to speak with the man who orchestrated my disappointment and that of thousands of other Irish rugby fans.

Bob was on the island as part of a tri-series of coaching clinics being held at Thanyapura Sports and Leisure Club (TSLC) in association with the Phuket Lomas and the Asia Center Foundation to help with the development of rugby union on the island.



"Then it became a desire to show people who didn't have a background in rugby that you can play good rugby with just attention to detail in the simple things about the game," Bob added.

"I guess I have an insatiable thirst for knowledge about the game. I can't

not watch a game. If I'm walking past a ground and I see an under 10s game, I've got to stop and watch. If I see a women's senior game, I've got to stop and watch, a school team practicing – I stop

"My drive is always to see the game played well. I'm certain I am a much better coach than I was 20 years ago when Australia won the world cup with me as

different animal and requires a more complex process that is not easily transferred.

"Our philosophy of coaching is that you can't succeed without accurate technique, but accurate technique means nothing if you can't apply it in a pressure situation. Application of technique under pressure develops a skill. Applica-

tion of that skill to a game situation is the art of playing the game properly," said Bob.

"We want to see the coaches do three things; teach the technique, move the technique forward into developing a skill, apply that technique to a game and let the

players play to see how much they rugby hopefuls from the man who grasp and learn from their mistakes," he added.

in the heat.

Given that there are three clinics scheduled over the coming months, I asked Bob what he expected from the initial meetings and practical work.

"The real intention of the first workshop is for the coaches to. gain an understanding of what we believe is the correct methodology of being able to transfer play from the practice ground to the playing pitch and we think we have a very good method for ensuring that transfer occurs and we wanted to see if the coaches fully understood that, and most of them did," he said.

Aside from the coaches, Bob had an opportunity to see Phuket's youth players in action during the sessions and he seemed quite impressed with their abilities.

"The catch and pass skills of the kids are pretty good, at least as good as their Australian counterparts. The only thing they're lacking is consistent competition,"

Bob said.

M i k e Pennistone added to that, remarking that the player's movements reminded him of young Brazilian footballers. Not a bad compliment for the youngsters.

And final words of hope and promise to Phuket's young

helped crush my own brief youthful anticipation of victory some 20 years ago:

"I want to show that you don't have to be a great player to play great rugby. If you're a great player and play great rugby then that's something extraordinary. But that's rare," Bob said

We look forward to Bob and Mike's return and the Gazette will feature more wisdom and expertise from their work with Phuket's rugby fraternity in the coming weeks.
