Brazen gold shop thief back in Phuket

GOLD is considered lucky in the Far East, but for one gold shop thief its glitter has been sullied as he faces a possible lengthy prison sentence now that police caught up with "Golden Den", or 25-year-old Krittasak "Den" Heetkaew, as he is now known.

On June 4, 2011, a man wearing a Starbucks t-shirt and jeans entered the Thong Thanet gold shop at the Yee Teng complex on the corner of the Slaughterhouse Intersection in Phuket Town.

After posing as a customer, the man pulled out a replica handgun and threatened the shopowner Chantana Thanetthanasom.

Moving On On

After a year of bed care, last guest at famed hotel moved to hospital

AN ELDERLY German expat who has lived for the past 20 years at the On On Hotel in Phuket Town, famed as the Phuket hotel featured in the Leonardo DiCaprio film *The* Beach, has finally checked out.

Hans Georg Artur Maeter, 88, was transferred to Patong Hospital on Tuesday after hotel management could no longer stand by and watch him stay in his room, where he has been bedridden for the past year.

Phuket Tourist Police officers Sen Sgt Maj Wichai Boonruen and Sgt Payong Tipsombut received a call from the hotel owner, Anurak Tansiriroj, to assist in transferring Mr Maeter to hospital.

The officers arrived at the hotel on Phang Nga Road in Phuket Town at 12:30pm with a Swiss Tourist Police Volunteer and three officers from Patong Hospital, including Hospital Director Dr Phumin Silaphan.

They found the emaciated Mr Maeter lying on his hotel bed, covered with a blanket. After bathing Continued on page 5 | and dressing Mr Maeter, they assisted him into a wheelchair and helped him to an ambulance waiting below.

Mr Anurak, who is also the founder of Phuket International Hospital and the Czech Honorary Consul for Phuket, told the Phuket Gazette, "Mr Maeter could not get off the bed for a year. During that time our hotel maid cleaned his room brought him food and drink, but he could not eat much.

"He refused to go a hospital or stay anywhere else. He said he wanted to die here," he said.

"We contacted Mr Maeter's family in Germany and his friends in Phuket, but he declined any help from them," Mr Anurak added.

With a full renovation of the hotel scheduled to start on May 1, Mr Maeter was the last guest to check out.

"We couldn't leave him in the hotel. He needed to be moved to a hospital where he could receive proper care," Mr Anurak said.

Officers received a surprise while gathering Mr Maeter's belongings to take with him to hospital, Sen Sgt Maj Wichai said.

City Police chief transferred over underage nightlife staff

PHUKET City Police Superintendent Chote Chitchai has been removed from active duty pending an investigation into underage staff working at Phuket Town nightclubs.

Col Chote told the Gazette on Monday nat he received the instant transfer order last Saturday, May 5.

"I received the order from Phuket Provincial Police Commander Chonasit Wattanavrangkul on Saturday to transfer to Phuket Provincial Police Station as a special assignment for 30 days.

"Today is a public holiday. I will report o to Phuket Provincial Police Station tomor-

Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Sakchai Limcharoen has been installed as Phuket City Police Acting Superintendent during the 30-day period, Col Chote said.

Asked what reason was given for the immediate temporary transfer, Col Chote explained, "This is Maj Gen Chonasit's decision. I will be back as Phuket City Police Superintendent duty after the 30 days."

'This is just a temporary assignment... I have been ordered to 'tighten up' Phuket City Police Station," Col Sakchai told the Gazette.

He added that the move follows reports

row [Tuesday, May 8]," he told the Gazette. in the Thai-language media of underage staff being found working in nightlife venues in Phuket Town. The minimum legal age for a person to work in a licensed venue is 18 years of age.

"The Commander [Maj Gen Chonasit] sees this as very important. That's why I have been assigned this task," Col Sakchai said.

"I believe Col Chote will be re-instated and I will resume my normal duties at Phuket Provincial Station as soon as the investigation is complete.

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No lifeguards as surf danger season arrives

AS THE the southwest monsoon sets in and Phuket enters the most dangerous period for beach swimmers, the Phuket lifeguards have yet to return to their towers at popular tourist beaches along the west coast.

The news comes as the Gazette received confirmation that not a single company or organization bid for the government contract to provide lifeguard services at Phuket's beaches.

It was the second time that no one bid for the contract to provide life-saving services at Phuket's key tourist attractions since the previous agreement with the Phuket Lifeguard Club expired on April 2.

"We opened electronic bidding twice but received no bids from any organizations to provide lifeguard services. The second bidding process ended April 26," an officer at the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor) Tourism and Sports Department told the *Gazette*.

"We are now winding up the second round of electronic bidding. We will call in the lifeguard companies [who provided the lifeguard services previously] to see

if we can come to an agreement," she added.

Phuket Lifeguard Club President Prathaiyut "Nut" Chuayuan previously explained to the Gazette that the main areas of concern for the lifeguards were funding and a lack of support to develop professional training to ensure qualified lifeguards patrol the beaches.

"Last year was tough. We're exhausted and some of us want to take a rest. I think it would be fair if the OrBorJor opened the bidding process to others. But if

they can't find anyone to carry on the service, we will do it. Our top priority has always been public safety," he said.

However, the *OrBorJor* officer the Gazette spoke to said, "We are doing the best we can in accordance with official procedures. If we can come to an agreement, we will pass the new contract on for presidential approval.

"I don't think it will take longer than a month, but we can't promise a date of when lifeguards will be back on duty."

Police suspect arson in **District Office blaze**

POLICE are seeking a man seen running from the site of a predawn arson attack at the Thalang District Office compound at 4am on Wednesday.

Firefighters took 15 minutes to extinguish the blaze, with no people reported injured, but the fire destroyed a bamboo sala beside the old Thalang Community Hall.

As the sala has no electrical circuitry installed, officials believe the fire was deliberately set.

Security guard Boonsoong Boonchuay told the Gazette that he noticed the flames just after he reported in for his 4am shift. He

also saw a man in a balaclava running from the area.

The incident has been reported to Thalang District Security Division chief Siripong Leeprasit, Mr Boonsoong said.


Small aftershock spooks residents

AN AFTERSHOCK centered in Thalang struck at 4:54am on May 4, waking some residents with a loud bang, while others reported feeling nothing at all.

"The epicenter of the aftershock was at Latitude 8° 00' 36" N, Longitude 98° 21' 00" E. It was almost at the same location as the 4.3 quake on April 16," said Sophon Chaira, of the Thai Meteorological Department (TMD) Seismology Center in Bangkok.

"The small earthquake was just an aftershock from the earthquake on April 16. Our center recorded the aftershock at 4:54am, registering 2.3 on the Richter scale," he added.

The seismometer at the earthquake monitoring center set up in Srisoonthorn, which was the epi-

center of the April 16 quake, also recorded the aftershock.

"Our canter detected the aftershock at 4:54am. However, no one here could feel the tremors," said Srisoonthorn Municipality public relations officer Kanokthip Ganganon.

"Also, we have not received any phone calls or reports from Srisoonthorn residents about the quake or any reports of damage to houses," she said.

"But an officer from Thalang Police Station came here this morning [May 4] and he said he felt the quake at the police station while he was on duty," Ms Kanokthip added.

One resident in Baan Manik, in Srisoonthorn subdistrict, told the Gazette that the earthquake woke her family from their sleep.

"I was woken up by a loud bang. I wasn't sure whether it was a lighting strike or an earthquake, but then I felt the tremors. That confirmed what I heard was from an earthquake," she said.

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Policeman held for street killing

A PATONG police officer and his brother have both been charged with accessory to murder over a fatal shooting in Phuket Town's red-light district in the early hours of May 4.

Phuket City Police Deputy Superintendent Jamroon Plaiduang told the *Gazette* that the shooting occurred at about 2:30am in Phuket Town's infamous Phun Phol Soi 11.

Pol Cpl Rachaporn Semaksorn, currently serving at Patong Police Station, and his brother Dechaporn arrived in the narrow street and pulled up on the opposite side of the alley where 21-year-old Ekkasit Sangangam was sitting on his parked motorbike.

Mr Ekkasit walked over to Cpl Rachaporn and Dechaporn and began arguing with the both of them, said Col Jamroon.

Cpl Rachaporn, not in uniform and off-duty at the time, apparently pulled out his gun and shot Mr Ekkasit in the left eye, then

sped off on his motorbike.

"Cpl Rachaporn and his brother were arrested minutes later while riding along Wichit Songkram Road," said Col Jamroon.

Rescue workers from the nearby Kusoldharm Foundation, whose headquarters is only one street away, rushed Mr Ekkasit to Vachira Phuket Hospital, where he was pronounced dead on arrival.

"Cpl Rachaporn and Dechaporn were held here at Phuket City Police Station after their arrest, but they have now been transferred to the holding cells at Phuket Provincial Court," said Col Jamroon.

Both men have been initially charged with accessory to murder.

Police have yet to charge Cpl Rachaporn directly with the killing of Mr Ekkasit. Col Jamroon told the *Gazette* that police had yet to confirm whether or not the shooting was over a woman.

"There were no women present

when police arrived at the scene [early on May 4].

"However, we are still continuing our investigation into the incident," he said.

"While we were collecting his belongings, we found more than 100,000 baht in Thai baht and US dollar banknotes. We have already opened a bank account for him to keep his money safe in the bank.

"We also found a bankbook in his room showing that he has more than 1.2 million baht in his own bank account," Sen Sgt Maj Wichai said.

Mr Anurak has volunteered to keep Mr Maeter's belongings safe and to pay for his hospital treatment until the German Embassy in Bangkok is contacted and assists in making alternative arrangements, Sgt Payong explained.

A source familiar with the case said the Embassy was aware of the tragic situation, but could not intervene because no laws were broken.

Before Mr Maeter's debilitating condition set in, he returned home to Germany several times during his many years of stay at the hotel, Mr Anurak recalled.

"Later he was unable to go anywhere, so he stayed in the hotel all the time," he said.

Tourist Police said Mr Maeter was staying legally in Phuket on a one-year visa.

Despite his condition, Mr Maeter managed to obtain a new passport from the German Embassy with an issue date of February 12 this year. The passport lists his place and time of birth as the city of Stettin, Germany in 1923. The town, now known as Szczecin, lies in Poland's Baltic region.

The On On Hotel, which at 85 years old is reputedly the oldest hotel in operation in Phuket, will undergo renovation work into next year, said Mr Anurak.

"We will hand over the operations to another Thai hotel operator, but the name and style of the On On Hotel will remain the same," Mr Anurak said.

The renovations will see an upgrade in the style and comfort, as well as an increase in the number of rooms, he said.

"However, we will have to increase the room rates a little bit to ensure the prices keep pace with current times," Mr Anurak said.



Patong Hill road slides again

THE rainy season arrived in force last Saturday and is already taking its toll, causing a landslide along a stretch of Patong Hill road that the Highways Department was hoping to shore up by year's end.

Sampawat Wannasangkam of the Patong Municipality Department of Disaster Mitigation and Prevention said his office received a report of the slide at around 9am.

As an emergency measure his office coordinated with Patong Police in erecting a barricade to alert motorists to the danger.

"We are going to contact the Phuket Highway Office see what step to take next," he said.

The deluges over May 4-5 caused minor flooding over low-lying roads and caused strife for at least two dive boats.

Speed radar voted most helpful project

PHUKET Gazette readers overwhelmingly think the installation of radar speed cameras to monitor road traffic and automatically fine violators will be the most helpful of six projects recently approved for Phuket by Cabinet, according to our most recent online poll.

In the poll launched March 23, readers were asked which of six projects approved by Cabinet during the "Mobile Cabinet Meeting", headed by Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra, would do most to help the province.

More than half of all the readers who voted (52.8%) thought that the 17-million-baht project to install a network of radar speed cameras would be the most beneficial.

The second most popular choice, at 21%, was 'Improvements to Chao Fa East Road': 20mn baht.

Third, at 16.5%, was "Monkey

cheek" reservoirs to supply the Phuket City Waterworks authority: 25mn baht.

Fourth, at 4.5%, was a water pipeline from Baan Bangjo to Phuket International Airport: 24.8mn baht.

Fifth, at 3.6%, was Marine navigation lighting system improvements: 17.3mn baht.

Sixth, at 1.6%, was development of Baan Phraya Wichit Songkram historical site: 9.1mn

The speed camera project was the top choice among all three demographics. Almost three-quarters (72%) of tourists chose this option, followed by 57% of Thais and 47% of local foreign residents.

Local foreign residents were far more likely (27%) to opt for improvements to Chao Fa East Road than their Thai counterparts (11%) or tourists (7%).

Phuket Town cables going underground

PHASE two of the project to remove the unsightly cables that have been obscuring the classic Sino-Portuguese shopfronts along the streets of Old Phuket Town for decades continues this Saturday when workers will pull down the power poles along Deebuk Road.

The removal of the power poles on Deebuk Road this Saturday follows the removal of overhead power cables and the corresponding power poles on Krabi Road last weekend.

The Phuket Provincial Electricity Authority (PEA) completed phase one of the project along Thalang Road in late 2010 and planned to start phase two in March 2011.

Although the project suffered delays, the PEA has now finished laying underground cables along Krabi and Deebuk Roads, and has since started partial work on the section of Thepkrasattri Road that passes through the area.

The second phase of the project will cost about 39 million baht in total, with PEA putting up 26mn baht and Phuket City Municipality allotting another 13mn baht to see the project finished.

"After the PEA removes all of the power poles, Phuket City Municipality will take care of the road. We will repair the road surface back to normal as soon as possible," Kraingsak Chuchartphong, director of the Phuket City Municipality Public Works Division told the Gazette.

"The PEA informed us that they will come to remove the power poles on Deebuk road this com-

ing Saturday [May 12]. As soon as the PEA have done with their part, we will go to take care of ours," he said.

Despite nearly everything going to plan so far, the underground section along Thepkrasattri Road has been put on hold while an unforeseen problem is resolved.

The problem lies with the concentration of existing telephone cables in that area that feed into the main telephone exchange

"Work on installing the cables underground from the Tua Poh furniture store at the Thaew Nam Intersection to Aram Bridge on Phuket Road is still underway," said Mr Kraingsak.

"It will take a while before we can proceed with installing the electrical cables in that area underground, so to prevent traffic congestion in the meantime we have filled in the road excavation to allow traffic to pass until the telephone cable issue is sorted out," he said.

Reaction to the completion of phase one was generally positive, but locals reported the traffic congestion as "terrible" while the work was underway.

Hitman cop killer A TRULY OCEAN VIEW. THE GEM OF PATONG By Atchaa Khamlo

PHUKET City Police on Monday arrested an alleged hit-man and cop killer wanted in connection with two murders last year, one in Phuket and one in Trang.

Samut "Moot" Keukgong, 44, was arrested by Phuket City Police at about 3:30pm at a snooker hall in Rassada, said the Phuket City Police report.

Mr Samut signed a statement denying a charge of premeditated murder in the first case, claiming that he was acting in self-defense when he killed Sompong "Jack" Inchao-na outside his home in Rassada Village 3 on March 24 last year.

After his 18-year-old son was chased back to his home in Soi Saithong by four men yelling threats, he confronted the group, one of whom was Mr Sompong, he told police.


"I was furious. I went into the house and got a knife. My son

followed me back outside. I told the men to go away, but one of them kept kicking the gate, trying to get inside," he said.

"Mr Sompong and I fought. I am not entirely sure what happened, but I ended up stabbing the man several times," Mr Samut told police.

Ms Chantana, recognizing that the weapon was a fake, produced her own "real" handgun. Unfortunately Mr Krittasak was quick enough to snatch it from her hands and continue the robbery.

With gold necklaces and cash valued at 6 million baht in hand, Mr Krittasak fled the scene on a Honda motorcycle, which was later found parked in a housing estate in Wichit. Police inquiries at the time showed that the getaway bike had been rented in Patong and further questioning of residents revealed that Mr Krittasak had been collected by a blue Ford. Despite a police islandwide cordon, Mr Krittasak made good his escape.

However, his liberty lasted only 11 months. On May 4, Bangkok Police knocked on his door. A search found enough incriminating evidence - stolen gold, a .38 revolver with ammunition and clothing Mr Krittasak wore during robberies – to ensure his arrest.

Mr Krittasak was taken to Region 8 Police Headquarters in Surat Thani, where he was quickly put on display to the media.

Region 8 Police Commander Lt Gen Santi Pensute said of Mr Krittasak, "He would pick gold shops with poor security measures and that were near intersections, because it was easier to get away... He always planned his escape route before committing the robbery."

At a police-organized press conference, Mr Krittasak admitted to robbing four gold shops. The first in Bangkok in December 2008, followed by another two during 2010, also in Bangkok. Mr Krittasak's last foray was to Phuket. All combined Mr Krittasak claims that the value of the loot amounted to about 11.5mn baht, most of which remains unaccounted for.

It was during the third robbery when things went wrong and a shopkeeper was shot, injured in a

struggle for the .38 revolver that the employee had produced.

"I am sorry for what I have done and didn't mean to harm anyone. The only reason the shopkeeper was injured was because the gun fired by itself," Mr Krittasak said at the press conference.

"I always knew I would be caught in the end," he added.

The gold was sold and the money used on what he described as "luxury living". Good natured throughout all public appearances since his arrest, Mr Krittasak postured his hands with a wai and apologized to the shop owners when they came to identify him.

"I will be a good man when get out," he said. "If I had a chance to enter the Buddhist monkhood, I wouldn't leave it."

A large crowd gathered at the Yee Teng complex in Phuket Town on May 6 to watch the re-enactment of the Thong Thanet gold shop robbery. Once again the suspect gave the owners of the family-run business an apologetic wai upon entering the shop.

Ms Chantana told Gazette, "I am glad police finally caught the bandit. We lost 221 baht-weight in gold, a value of about 6 million baht. Only about 10 baht-weight of gold was returned, a value of about 200,000 baht. Recovery of the remainder is now in the hands of the criminal justice system."

The shop rewarded the police who tracked down and arrested "Golden Den" with 100,000 baht

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All safe after dive boat rescue

STORM weather cracked the hull of a dive boat as it was returning to Phuket last weekend, forcing the captain to ground the vessel and call for assistance.

None of the 16 people on board were reported as suffering any injuries in the incident.

Narong Chaimo, general manager of Kamala Dive Center, who organized the dive tour, said in a public statement that at about 4:30pm on May 4 the captain of the *Parapis 7* sent a distress call to the Royal Thai Navy, Marine Police, speedboat operators and nearby dive boats.

The first boat to render assistance was from Andaman Ocean Safaris, with tour leader and dive instructor Niklas Komradsval on board.

"Our boat and the Kamala Dive Center boat [rented from and operated by Aloha] made the second dive on the lee side of Phi Phi Lei Island because of the wind," said Mr Komradsval.

"When we rounded the island, we started to run into some bigger

waves. But the size of the wave wasn't the problem, it was the frequency of the waves," he added.

About 35 minutes later, Mr Komradsval received the *Parapis* 7 distress call. Before we got there we saw smoke rising from the boat, so that meant the engine was under the water, he explained.

"We took about 25 minutes to safely get to their boat. By then, their engine had failed. So we had to send seven of our instructors into the water with floatation devices to help everyone over to our boat," he said.

"For what I saw, they were doing the right thing. They went

into the shallow area near Gai Island, which immediately put everyone into safety. They were on the lee side of the island, so by the time we transported the people to our boat we were in flat water," Mr Komradsval explained.

David Minnaar, owner of Andaman Ocean Safaris, said the

incident highlighted water safety concerns.

"It was such an unfortunate event... It was just a combination of freak wave and wrong angle of the boat," Mr Minnaar said.

Andaman Ocean Safaris cancelled their last dive scheduled for the day after retrieving the tourists and crew, to give them enough time to slowly and safely make it back to Phuket and so they could also assist Southern Siam Divers, who were in need of an extra bilge pump.

Everyone was already on board Andaman Ocean Safaris boat by the time the Phuket Marine Police arrived at 6:20pm.

"If we can see evidence that the ship has been checked regularly, its passed inspections and its documentation in order then there most likely won't be any charges filed against the company," said Lt Jeerayuth Onthong of the Phuket Marine Police.

All necessary safety equipment was on board, said Mr Narong in his statement.

The incident is now under the investigation process by Muang Krabi Police station



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Tsunami aid center targeted by arson gang a third time

FIRE broke out at the Austria-Phuket Community Center in Phuket Town on the night of May 4, the second blaze there in less than 24 hours.

Police suspect teenagers, who they believe likely broke into the building to take drugs, were responsible for starting both fires.

Phuket City Police at 9:10pm received a report of the fire from residents in the densely-populated area, to the east of Phuket Town.

By the time Phuket City Police arrived at the scene, they found Phuket City Municipality firefighters assisted by Kusoldharm Foundation workers putting out the blaze, which broke out in a large storage room.

It only took firefighters 10 minutes to bring the flames under control. Subsequent inspection revealed damage to tables, chairs, public relations signs and part of the ceiling.

The cause of the blaze has yet to be fully investigated, but police found drug paraphernalia, including a pipe used to smoke *ya ice* (crystal methamphetamine), at the scene of the fire that broke out at the center just 20 hours earlier, damaging the women's restroom on the second floor.

On that occasion Phuket City Police and other officers rushed to the scene, where they met up with Rassada Community Volunteer Police and Kusoldharm Rescue Foundation workers, who

had already successfully doused the blaze with fire extinguishers.

Local residents told police they teenagers enter the building before the fire broke out on May 3.

The fire at the center was the third in recent weeks. The first, on April 21, caused minor damage to another storage room.

The Austria-Phuket Community Center was set up in the aftermath of the 2004 tsunami to serve as a child care center, a basic health care center linked to the nursery, a handicraft center, a public library, a skills training center and a public park for the impoverished .community living in the area.

Andaman Provinces dig in to combat coastal erosion

PHUKET has joined an Andamanwide project spearheaded by the Prince of Songkla University (PSU) Haad Yai Campus to combat coastal erosion throughout the region.

At the recent sea gypsy Loy Reua ceremony at Laem Tukkae last weekend, newly-elected Rassada Mayor Phudit Ruksarag explained to the Gazette that Rassada Municipality was working with the PSU Haad Yai Campus and an informal organization dedicated to combating coastal erosion throughout Southern Thailand.

"I have already sent our plan for rebuilding the Laem Tukkae seawall to the PSU for them to study as it needs specialist input. This didn't happen with the previous seawall and it didn't last," he said.

Large waves brought on by the wet-season monsoon last year damaged homes at the small sea gypsy community, forcing villagers to seek refuge with family members or even sleep outdoors.

At least eight houses suffered damage, altogether home to 53 people.

This year, Mayor Phudit expects that employing outside assistance will push the project cost to about 30 million baht, as opposed to 17mn baht for the old seawall, which fell apart within months.

"We need to study factors such as wave action and the specific environment as it needs a unique design. It's not only about building the wall, after deciding on a plan we need to hold a public hearing to ensure villagers agree with it," Mayor Phudit said.

Sawad Samukpong, one of the

members of the informal group formed to combat coastal erosion, explained to the Gazette that a previous plan to stave off coastal erosion throughout the South was drawn up, but never implemented.

Now his team intends to put a pilot plan into practice in a few locations to see how it works to prevent further coastal erosion.

"Phuket suffers serious coastal erosion at Bang Tao Beach in Kamala, at Rawai, at Nai Yang Beach and at the Laem Tukkae sea gypsy village on Koh Sireh," he said.

To facilitate input into the new plan, a large seminar was scheduled to be held at the Katina Hotel in Phuket Town on Thursday this

week to discuss and decide on a general practical plan to combat coastal erosion along the Andaman coast, he added.

The seminar, organized by Department of Marine and Coastal Resources and PSU Phuket Campus, is the direct result of Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra raising coastal erosion as a topic of concern at the mobile Cabinet meeting in Phuket in March.

At that Cabinet meeting, the Engineering Faculty at the PSU Haad Yai Campus was assigned to co-ordinate the drawing up of the six-province plan.

"Attending that seminar will be provincial and local government representatives from the Andaman provinces and the relevant NGOs [non-governmental organizations]," Mr Sawad said.

"After the seminar in Phuket, we will hold smaller, area-specific meetings in the Andaman provinces of Ranong, Phang Nga, Krabi, Trang, Satun and Phuket," said Mr Sawad.

"We will also study all the damage points because those places have different sets of problems. Once that is done we can then put the pilot plan into action in specific locations, and after that request the budget to carry out the full plan," he added.

Red Cross on the prowl for more blood

THE Phuket Regional Blood Center (RBC) has stepped up its mobile blood collection campaign as blood stocks are dangerously low following the annual Songkran Festival last month, which resulted in a surge in road accidents in the region.

The Phuket RBC, run by the Thai Red Cross Society, is responsible for collection of blood stocks in Phang Nga, Krabi, Trang, Satun and Ranong as well as Phuket.

Kanda Thawonnila, a Thai Red Cross official who works at the center in Saphan Hin, said the RBC will conduct 29 mobile collection campaigns this month to restore stocks to acceptable levels.

Especially needed are donations of A+ and B+ blood types.

The RBC also values donations of rhesus-negative blood types, which are far less common among Thais than Caucasians. However, stocks of negative blood are currently adequate, Ms Kanda said.

Staff at the mobile collection held at Big C Supercenter told the Gazette that they received a good response, with more than 30 donors rolling up their sleeves to help others in need.

Mr Boy (not his real name) said he bought a small bottle of olive oil and used a syringe to inject it into the skin of his penis because he wished it were bigger.

But it soon became infected, started to sting and became swollen, with a large wound in the side.

Mr Boy said that urinating became very painful and his penis could no longer become erect, forcing him to go to a hospital to seek treatment.

The teenager said that the practice had become popular with boys in his area, though most of them did not know about the potential side effects.

A doctor at the hospital where Mr Boy is being treated said his condition was now reaching a critical stage.

The doctor said it was no longer possible to return Mr Boy's penis to its normal state as many of the skin cells had been destroyed.

Factory blasts reignite conflict

AROUND THE nation

AN EXPLOSION at the Map Ta Phut industrial estate in Rayong has killed 12 and refueled a longrunning conflict between industrialists and local residents over the safety of the facilities located at the site.

Most of those killed were employees at the chemical factory run by Bangkok Synthetics Co (BST), where the blast took place on the afternoon of May 5.

In response to the explosion, which also injured more than 100 people, Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra set up a committee to probe whether the accident had resulted in chemical contamination of the surrounding area.

The day after the blast, the premier visited the scene as well as injured workers in Rayong Hospital.

Rayong Governor Seni Jittakasem said the authorities were able to prevent severe chemical leakage, but added that residents' eyes and skin were still at risk [from residual vapor].

A local community action group, the Eastern People's Network, said it planned to file lawsuits against BST over the accident.

The network is also calling for the operating licence of Aditya Birla Chemicals to be withdrawn following a chemical leak at its Map Ta Phut factory on Sunday.

Suthi Atchasai, leader of the Eastern People's Network, said a meeting with Map Ta Phut villagers would be held to sound out their opinions about the filing of lawsuits.

"The company's directors and executives must be held fully responsible for this," he said, adding that the incident was the result of non-compliance with safety measures, which had rocked investor confidence and caused pain and suffering among the families of the

The Map Ta Phut estate has long been a source of controversy.

Over the last decade, the estate has been the subject of numerous protests by local residents' groups

who claimed that its petrochemical factories had caused thousands of local residents to develop cancer.

The Eastern People's Network was among several groups that filed a lawsuit against the estate with the Administrative Court, which in 2009 ruled to suspend 76 projects for one year pending

The move forced the Abhisit Vejjajiva-led government to respond to the groups' demands, which included the establishment of an Independent Health and Environmental Committee as well as the introduction of further safety measures.

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Lese majeste convict 'Uncle SMS' dies, 61

AN ELDERLY man serving one of the harshest sentences ever imposed for insulting the monarchy has died.

Amphon "Ah Kong" Tangnoppaku, whose nickname means "grandfather" in Chinese, was handed down a 20-year sentence in November last year on charges of committing lese majeste.

The 61-year-old, who was known to be battling mouth cancer, died at 9am on May 8 after being sent to the prison hospital from Bangkok Remand Prison.

Corrections Department chief Suchart Wongananchai said Mr Amphon had been suffering from stomach pain since May 4.

Mr Suchart added that he was waiting for the results of an autopsy

to confirm the cause of death.

Mr Amphon's lawyer, Anon Ampa of Rassadornprasong Law Office, said on his Facebook page that it was believed Mr Amphon had died from cancer.

He was arrested on August 3, 2010 and convicted on November 23 last year.

Mr Anon recently withdrew his client's appeal, as the elderly man wished to ask for a royal pardon.

Mr Amphon's conviction was based on allegations that he sent four text messages disparaging HM Queen Sirikit to a cellphone belonging to an assistant of former premier Abhisit Vejjajiva. The crime led the media to nickname him "Uncle SMS".

Several activists have claimed

that there was little evidence to prove Mr Amphon had sent the messages and that he did not even know how to send a text message.

Workers plunge to death

THREE workers fell to their them to fall. deaths from Thailand's tallest building on May 7 after a cable supporting the platform they were standing on snapped.

Two other men, who were also on the platform, survived after clinging to it until they were rescued from the 68th floor of the 89-story Baiyoke Tower II building.

The men were installing an advertising billboard when the tragedy occurred. The platform reportedly tilted sharply, causing

The men's bodies were found on an outdoor mini-golf driving range on the 18th floor, next to a swimming pool on the 20th floor and on a 36th floor balcony.


Police spokesman Thamarak Reungdit told AFP that the two survivors suffered only minor injuries and were being treated in hospital.

"A forensic team will investigate how it happened and whether or not the platform was overloaded," he said.

Maj Gen Anuchai Lekbamrung, a deputy chief of the Bangkok Metropolitan Police, later told MCOT that the platform had broken because it was carrying five people, over its rated capacity.

Standing at 304 meters in height, The Baiyoke Tower II is a distinctive feature of the Bangkok skyline.

Needed: Common sense, not seawalls

FUNDING for projects to "combat" erosion along the Andaman coast through construction of seawalls, jetties and similar structures would be better spent on environmentally-sound projects like sand-dune stabilization, mangrove reforestation and better enforcement of laws that regulate shoreline construction.

Trying to conquer the forces of time and tide is the quintessential exercise in futility. This is especially true along Phuket's western coastline, with its strong southwest monsoon season currents and pounding wave action.

A child building a sandcastle on a beach quickly learns a lesson that seems to elude many government officials. Even a sea turtle, with its tiny brain, knows it needs to get well above the high-tide mark to safely lay its eggs.

Yet here in Phuket, we continue to see one money-wasting project after another built too close to shore. Crumbling seawalls create an eyesore and are a public danger along many popular tourist beaches. The politicians who authorize spending for these projects are apparently less concerned with the long-term prospects of containing the sea than the immediate short-term benefits to individuals.

A 17-million-baht seawall built to protect the sea gypsy community at Laem Tukkae on Koh Sireh in Rassada didn't last a single monsoon season, yet officials there are already planning a replacement structure that will cost about twice as much (see page 7). Let's hope the sea gypsies pass on some of their knowledge about the sea to the academics and politicians during the public-hearing process.

Perhaps the best example of our inability to accept the power of sea currents is the ill-fated Coral Reef Squadron, a collection of decommissioned aircraft sunk in Bang Tao Bay a few years ago to serve as a recreational dive site.

Despite being chained to huge concrete blocks, the sunken aircraft were quickly swept away during their first monsoon season. Bits of their remains have reportedly been spotted as far north as Ranong.

Our elected leaders persist in a fallacious, tin-mining-era mentality insofar as the sea is concerned. A well-known local politician once even seriously suggested a few years back that the runway at Phuket International Airport be extended out into the sea off Mai Khao Beach, so that larger aircraft could land there. Good grief.

Whether one accepts or rejects the idea that mankind's activities are responsible for the current rise in sea levels, the fact that they are rising is not in dispute. We need to accept this reality and show the sea the due respect that our ancestors did.

We should enjoy the coastline for what it is, an ever-changing interface between land and sea – not a battleground in a Man versus Nature war.

Creating a family to call your own

THE problem the LGBT community has in Phuket is the same problem that LGBT have all over Thailand – discrimination by the public and the government, and alienation from their families.

In fact, things are better for people in the LGBT community in Phuket, Pattaya, Bangkok and Chiang Mai than they are elsewhere, because there is a higher level of tolerance towards gays.

In tourist centers, people can become anonymous. It's easier for members of the LGBT community to work in the tourism industry and live in a way that doesn't directly conflict with the more traditional Thai family values.

Of course there are exceptions, but many Thais who adhere to Thai core family values don't accept gays.

Many members of the gay community here have not come out to their families. So, when I put pictures of a nice party on Facebook, I have to block their faces, despite nothing really happening – it's just because they are there.

Some of there parents find brides for them, so they go away and have a little grandson, only after they have done what is expected of them do they return to our community. This is because in Thailand [with no social security safety net] this is the only way they can guarantee they will be taken care of when they get old. They take care of their families now, but [if they don't have a family of their own] who will take

care of them when they get older?

Actually, lots of them don't expect to get old. I've have attended more funeral services in the fours years I've been here than I have anywhere else during my life.

The lack of family support for members of the LGBT community is one of the reasons that this year we themed our gay pride event "Join Our Family". We need the support of each other just as much as we need to be recognized as members of society in general. We didn't volunteer to be gay, we were born this way.

Even local members of our community struggle to accept themselves. Many of them believe that they were reincarnated gay as a punishment for a past life, which is one reason Thai society also struggles to accept them.

They miss the point. This is a learning experience. If they don't except the situation, they can't learn

from it. They should be happy.

However, there will be a tipping point. Just look at how the gay community was treated in Holland 30 or 40 years ago. And look at how they are recognized today.

The reasons for playing the songs are many, but the result are the same, "check bin krap". Of course there are places that have some great music, sometimes live music as well.



Bulk boat transport services lift off

WITH Monsoon May's merciless wind and weather shifts comes the official end of another bustling winter cruising season in Phuket – the center of Southeast Asia's booming yachting scene.

Like clockwork, a number of luxury yachts are vacating local berths and off to the calm, conventional summer cruising grounds of the Mediterranean Sea.


"They'll be back," exclaimed Chris Jongerius, owner of Andaman Sea Club Co Ltd, a local chartering outfit that was recently appointed Thailand agent and service partner of Sevenstar Yacht Transport.

Speaking exclusively to the *Gazette* aboard a dingy floating afoot a massive freighter anchored offshore from Ao Po Marina in Pa Khlok, Chris elaborates: "After the summer in Europe, they [the yachts and crew] will complete the round-the-world cycle, heading either to the Caribbean or ultimately back to South Asia by September."

Several feet from the dinghy, a 10-ton, 48-foot Catamaran was being lifted out of the water – to be fastened onto the deck of the industrial freighter.

"We'll load four yachts here, and the freighter will continue onto Colombo, Sri Lanka to load three more yachts before continuing on to Turkey," Chris explained, noting that the largest of the yachts to be transported weighs about 260 tons.

Chris, a seasoned Dutch seafarer who was a fisherman in Spain before relocating to Phuket seven years ago, went on

to talk about the advantages of shipping over traditional methods.

"There are many factors in considering whether it is even practical to sail or motor a yacht on an extended voyage.

"The ongoing threat of piracy is one major concern of many clients, but even if there were no threat, we'd still retain at least half of our clients.

"A lot of yachts aren't seaworthy, and newly built yachts will always be shipped to international clients.

"It's a lot like buying a new car. You wouldn't expect someone to drive it thousands of kilometers for delivery, because then it would be second hand.

"On top of safety and security, the costs and time required for long voyages can be

quite high once you take into account fuel, crew, maintenance and other needed repairs that might arise," Chris explained.

Indeed, an increasing number of boat owners are opting to skip out on such hassles, and Phuket is positioned well to cash in on an ensuing boom in Asia.

"We provide full insurance coverage for all our boats through Pantaenius, and a level of service that is unmatched – very important in this business.

"Many of our clients also live aboard their vessel. So we're not only transporting their yacht but their home as well. "Such clients need more reassurance than your typical clients. They need to know that their prized possession will be taken care of

"It's not just about transporting boats. This sector has a large multiplier effect on the local economy. . .

"We outsource work to local workforce whenever possible," Chris added.

Import car hub in the works

GM of a major luxury automobile importer reveals local business plans and ambitions

SINCE officially opening their Phuket showroom in February, TSL Auto Corporation reports steady, promising growth, with its luxury vehicle import market share expanding rapidly.

Speaking exclusively with the *Phuket Gazette*, branch GM Anek Tipparak talked about the Bangkok-headquartered firm's business and expansion plans for the local market and beyond.

"We chose Phuket for our fourth branch, the first outside of Bangkok, because there is high potential for grey-market automobile imports here," he said.

With its first three branches maintaining a stronghold on the Bangkok market, the company has similar ambitions for the South.

"In our first year in Phuket, we aim to sell 240 to 250 cars, or about 20 vehicles per month," he revealed.

As for TSL's five year plan, Anek said that the premiere auto importer aims to make its Phuket branch a hub for the entire Southern region.

"We've sold about 25 cars since the official grand opening of the Phuket show room.

"Even though this is below our projected monthly target, this is acceptable as we realize that we are new players in the market. Starting up is always slower.

"The important thing is that sales has grown each month and we expect this trend to continue," he said.


Going on to talk about target groups, Anek revealed that his company's current client base is comprised of about 70% Thais and 30% foreigners.

"We have observed that Koreans and Russians are two key groups here, but initially our marketing will not focus on any particular nationality group, but rather the general high income bracket with high spending potential," he said.

As for his view on competition, Anek

went on to talk about his firm's competitive advantage and key selling point.

"I'd say 90% of luxury automobile importers in Thailand don't offer the full package in terms of fully integrated products and service.

"Many companies can import and sell you the cars, but lack the expertise and resources to service vehicles at a satisfactory or high standard. "Luxury automobiles often have specific copyrights on their technology, components and parts, which require specialized knowledge and tools."

"For example, the wheels of a Mercedes Benz have specialized lug nuts which call for special wrench made by Mercedes.

"Without the proper tools and stock, it's difficult to work on an automobile

properly, which results in delays in service," he explained.

Between the company's supply lines and stockrooms in Phuket and Bangkok, TSL is equipped to source authentic parts and service the most popular luxury brands. It also has channels to source tools and parts for rare models as well.

Another example Anek highlighted was paint.

"Suppose a silver Benz SLK is involved in an accident and needs touch-up work.

"Authentic paint for luxury cars is highly specialized and the producers have specific codes to identify each color.

"Most body shops don't carry the correct paint, but may try to replicate the silver color by mixing different generic paints.

"The end result won't be the same and you will notice the difference.

Going on to address key marketing trends, Anek said, "This business is concerned mostly with European and Japanese cars

"Right now, our supply ratio of European to Japanese cars is about 60 to 40%.

"With last year's natural disasters in both Japan and Thailand affecting supply chains, the ratio of Japanese has declined this year.

"However, this can change. A key aspect of a good business strategy is to be flexible and always monitor and be aware of trends.

"Our marketing and sales strategy depends a lot on the availability of new products. When there are new models and technology on the market, sales will be self driven

"But in years when there is not as many new products, like this year for instance, our strategy shifts to a promotional approach.

Asked about current promotions Anek said that his firm is offering free service membership until the end of May.

"Usually we won't accept members who bought from other dealers, but for this limited time we will," he said.

Thai biomass boom

SUGAR giant Mitr Phol's alternative fuel division is the fastest growing sector of its power business, says Suwat Kamolpanus who heads the firm's three bioenergy units.

Biomass now accounts for 675 megawatts, or 80 %, of renewable sources in Thailand. This amount is set to quadruple by the next decade.

Currently, 84 plants produce biomass fuel. The plants are almost evenly split between small power producers (SPP) that generate more than 10MW and very small power producers (VSPP) that produce less than 10MW.

Total production should rise to 2,828MW from 374 plants in coming years, Mr Suwat projected.

This sharp growth is possible because of strong support from the Ministry of Energy, he says. "Biomass has a positive impact on the environment. It generates cleaner air, solid waste is recycled and green house emissions are cut," Suwat adds.

Mitr Phol's Dan Chang biomass plant in Suphan Buri province showcases its success. Dan Chang produces 65 MW while another Mitr Phol plant, Phu Khieo Bio-Energy, generates 75 MW.

The power business is projected to generate 2 billion baht in revenue this year, with another 1.5bn baht next year when new units are operational. The business is profitable because the plants are built near the source and it owns the feedstock.

It also has the economy of scale and strong financial support. Mitr Phol is also investing about 3.7bn baht in new renewable projects including a solar farm.

The Ministry of Energy is speeding up its program to replace imported fuel with local energy sources. Dr Twarath Sutabutr, Deputy Director General for Alternative Energy Development and Efficiency, says the country should replace about 25% of its fossil fuel in 10 years.

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Lock down Facebook now



I HAVE friends who figure that Facebook is some sort of fad that is going away soon. They'd rather be drawn and quartered than put anything on Facebook. "You lose your privacy," they say. "I don't see any need for it."

I'm reminded of telephone company executive in Thailand who said that nobody will ever need more than 256K bits per second download speed, but that's another story.

Facebook has become an important part of the daily routine of hundreds of millions of people, and it claims just under one billion registered users. It's been credited with starting revolutions. It's certainly a good source of news – almost as good as Twitter - if you choose your sources carefully.

Facebook has fundamentally changed the way families interact, more so than any other invention since the telephone. It's altered the way people work.

Facebook has even eaten into email, for heaven's sake. Email usage has gone down in the past couple of years because Facebook's one-to-many nature reduces the need for email messages.

To me, that's incredible. I sent my first email message in 1977 and it boggles my mind that so many people prefer Facebook to email. But that's how it is. I'm tempted to stand up and bellow a chorus from Dylan's The Times They Are A-Changin'.

You can ignore Facebook, if you want, but some day your kids or grandkids or the young whippersnappers in the nursing home are going to ask why dad or grandpa or Uncle Fuddyduddy doesn't get off his duff and get with the system.

It's the same argument we all had with Luddites about typewritten letters and faxes a couple of decades ago. Facebook and its ilk are the future, like it or not. Which brings us to the topic of privacy.

Once upon a time, Facebook

privacy settings were comical. Not so now.

Last November, the US Federal Trade Commission came to an agreement with Facebook, where control over privacy became a key feature, privacy warnings became mandatory, and Facebook agreed

to regular privacy audits over the next 20 years.

Here are eight steps every Facebook user should take, to lock down their settings:

Step 1. Log on to Facebook, click the down-wedge on the far upper right (next to Home) and choose Privacy Settings.

Step 2. Read about how you can control the privacy of each item

In my case, I can decide for each item that I put on Facebook, at the time I post it, whether the item (message, photo, whatever) should be visible to Everybody, to Family, to Friends, to Close Friends, only to people located in or near Patong, people who graduated from the same university I went to, and so on. There's a lot of flexibility, and it's easy to get to, every time you

make a post.

Step 3. Consider how much privacy you want on "default" posts – posts made where you either don't want to mess around with the fine detail I mentioned in Step 2, or the posts you make when you're using an app that doesn't support the fine detail. For maximum flexibility, click the Custom button and choose your recipients, block lists, your location, etc.

Step 4. In the heading How You Connect, click Edit Settings and consider whether you want to keep your personal information searchable. Do you want to let people search for you using your email address or phone number? Who can send you Friend requests, and who can send you messages. Click

Step 5. In Timeline and Tagging,

think about who should be able to see your timeline, and who should be able to post new items to it.

You can also choose to review posts tagged with your name, before they go on your timeline (recommended), review tags that have been put on

your timeline before they are visible (also recommended).

Facebook has a scary feature that tags uploaded photos with your name if the Facebook face recognition program identifies you.

Unless you change the setting in this part of the Privacy options, that automatic tagging only takes place on photos uploaded by your Friends. You can turn that feature off here, if face recognition gives you the heebie jeebies.

Step 6. This is where you get to turn off all of those apps that are following your movements on Facebook. I found one – RockMelt Beta – that had my permission to use my email address and post on my behalf. Mea culpa. I must have clicked something in a weaker (or more harried) moment. So I turned it off: on the Apps you use list, click

Edit Settings, then on the right, next to the app, just click X.

One really important improvement to this report: it shows you when the linked apps have accessed your account. So, for example, I can tell that TripAdvisor (I log onwith my Facebook ID) last looked at my email address yesterday and looked at my "Likes" last week.

In the same location, you can also control specifically which information is shared with apps your name, your Friends list, Birthday, Photos, Current City, and so on. Click Edit Settings under the heading How People Bring Your Info into Apps They use.

Step 7. Click Back to Privacy, and consider whether you would like to limit the people who can view your past posts, or if you want to block specific people and apps.

As you can see, Facebook's privacy settings are extensive, and more than a little hard to understand.

For basic privacy, judicious use of the privacy drop-down list when you post – limiting posts to Friends or Family, for example – gives you a lot of control.

Tie that in with dropping any apps you don't use and Facebook doesn't sap your privacy as badly as it once did. Go through all of the settings and you can fine-tune it to your heart's content.

That's precisely correct: if you ever get any email asking you to click on a link, ignore it and type the link into your browser's address bar by yourself, or go there using a Favorites or Bookmark that you've already

Earlier security warning messages from SCB advised that you use a firewall and antivirus programs, neither of which would have helped prevent

or ameliorate this kind of phishing As recently as last month, SCB

was sending out messages with hot click-through links. One for "SCB Exchange Booth" invited you to click on the message to apply for a credit card. In February, SCB sent out an

ad for a high yield investment also with a clickthrough link. I hope they've learned a lesson, and will stop putting links on their email messages.

For those of you with a tendency to cluck about TIT, note that my small town bank in the US still sends out messages with click-through links. I'm writing about them in my next book. The noose tightens on UK pensions

LET us take a trip back in time to November of last year and an article I wrote regarding QROPS (Qualifying Recognized Overseas Pension Schemes).

It is worth quickly glancing over the benefits and negatives of this as new legislation that has come into force will no doubt affect many retirees and expats that hold a UK pension scheme and have are afoot to stem the flow of pension

no plans to return to those wind and rain battered shores.

A QROPS gives you the ability to transfer any UK pension plan offshore, the main benefits of this are:

payable on income received if you do not retire in the UK

• No death tax is applied

upon death (currently 55% in the UK) • The ability to pass your pension fund to your beneficiaries upon death

• Enhanced pension commencement lump sum (up to 30%).

And the negatives would be:

- Any final salary status is lost
- The pension fund is dependent on fund performance
- Fees on QROPS tend to be higher than on normal pension schemes.

No doubt many expats have benefited from this type of scheme and, if we take a look at the figures, they are becoming more popular:

- 121.5 million in 2007
- 471 million in 2010
- 500 million + expected in 2012.

This poses a problem for the UK treasury. In a time when austerity measures are unpopular at home, where do you look for extra income to help prop up the UK economy? The amount being transferred into QROPS schemes is not exactly pocket change, is it?

So what will happen in the future?

A QROPS remains a very attractive proposition for many expats with UK-based pensions and, certainly, there many benefits to this. As the HMRC tries to plug the gap of outgoing pension funds there is no doubt that many QROPS locations will come under scrutiny.

Why is Malta different to Guernsey? The answer is double taxation. Malta has around 60 double taxation agreements with European countries, which bodes

well for the future and provides us with a solid location for QROPS benefits, so all is not lost

There should be no doubt, however, that the noose is definitely tightening around the QROPS industry and, if this is the right scheme for you, it should be taken advantage of sooner rather than later.

Head of Early Years Gemma Sloan said, "We are using this building until the international building is constructed on the hill behind the current school," she added, "Eventually there will be three distinct areas. When all buildings are complete parents will have direct access to each of the buildings."

The new Kathu campus is equipped with state of the art facilities such as music, drama and dance rooms, a classical-style theater and an impressive library of books imported from educational publishers in the UK.

Staff Member at KIS Lennard Kolthof said, "We have a whole school community approach towards reading. Parents can take books home and children read on a daily basis one on one with a teacher." All teachers at KIS are qualified to teach in their home country. "In fact, a few of us are also finishing our master's degrees in education. We are working fulltime and already have our credentials." said Kolthof. To support activity-based learning the new campus has a covered professional astroturf football pitch. When

fully completed there will be tennis courts, basketball courts, football fields and a big activity field.

Head of Primary Years Nicola Chokkuea said about mental maths tests, "We try and extend each child to the best of their ability. We give them questions and have them think about what calculations need to be done. It could be times tables or addition or describing a shape." The whole school community at Kajonkiet has approximately 2,000 students with all programs combined. The international school started last year with twenty or so

students and has since doubled its enrollment. KIS currently provides a Thai Program, an ESC (English Special Class), EP and an International School. The International School is taught exclusively in English, with the exception of Thai & Chinese courses.

KIS has waived its entrance fee to celebrate the new campus. The offer applies to parents who enroll their child before June 30, 2012.



no guests. "We had a 250 room hotel and we had no guests, not one. So, I got the troops together and I said we have two choices; either we close the hotel or we take a salary cut and try to survive. So we all agreed we'd take a salary cut, everybody got

paid fifty per cent of what they did before. And we did local parties. We had brainstorming sessions and held different parties every night.

Each night we had a ball and we survived. Once business came back we paid back everybody who took a salary cut what we owed them and we survived."



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Local airports slipping down world ranking

AIRPORTS used to be necessary evils for air travellers. Barn like, full of sullen immigration and customs officials, lax security measures, outrageously expensive food and little to keep people amused.

Today, airports are proud brand carrying gateways for the cities they service. Modern designs, efficient security and shopping paradises make the experience as enjoyable and painless as possible.

So the annual airport ranking awards by SKYTRAX, a Britishbased aviation consultancy, are an important indicator of how airport authorities around the world are meeting travellers' increasingly demanding expectations.

Thailand, including Phuket, is unfortunately not rising to the challenge as well as its Asian neighbors which occupy the first three places in the world's best

airports rankings, and six of the top 10. The top five are Incheon International Airport, South Korea; Singapore Changi Airport; Hong Kong International Airport; Kuala Lumpur Interna-

tional Airport and Beijing Capital International Airport, with Central Japan International Airport in tenth

Bangkok's Suvarnabhumi Airport fell to 25th from 13th in last year's rankings.

Phuket, which is too small to warrant a ranking did score 5.2 out of 10 from 21 reviews recorded by SKYTRAX, but they were a decidedly mixed bag, with complaints about immigration lines, the cleanliness, size, age and taxis, combined with positive comments about how friendly and nice it was with reasonably priced food and drink, and no

One piece of good news for Bangkok was that the Novotel Suvarnabhumi Bangkok Hotel near the airport was ranked fifth in the world's best airport hotel awards, with Hong Kong's Regal Airport Hotel in first place. Unfortunately, Thailand's famous image as a shopping Mecca did not transfer to its airports, but Singapore, Hong Kong and Seoul were 3rd, 4th and 5th

respectively, with London Heathrow Airport at the top.

So, what do rankings like these mean for Thailand, and particularly Phuket, where passenger arrivals are projected to reach 6 million by 2014?

is already beyond its planned capacity of 45 million, so authorities are reopening the ancient Don Muang Airport across town for low-cost carriers to relieve the burden. A planned expansion is still at least five years away from completion, by which time arrivals are projected to reach 60 million a year.

In Phuket, a 5 billion baht re-

vamp is under way to meet the increased numbers, but this will not be complete for some time.

In the meantime the Airports Authority of Thailand, which runs Thailand's major airports, is taking stop-gap measures to buy time.

To measure how competitive airports are becoming for Thailand, just consider that in China almost 100 new airports are planned to be built by 2020, bringing the number to around 244.

Despite difficult economic times, world tourism numbers continue to grow, increasing by 4 per cent to 980 million passengers in 2011. So, Thailand should take heed of the lessons learned by not planning ahead at Suvarnabhumi and, to a lesser degree Phuket.

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Etihad-airberlin linkage

THE financial merger of Abu Dhabi-based Etihad Airways with Germany's airberlin, which directly services Phuket, foreshadows increased servicing of the island and the continued focus of Middle Eastern airlines on Phuket as a destination. Ras Al Khamah [RAK] a lowcost carrier based in the United Arab Emirates, is another new airline servicing Bangkok.

As of March, there were 140 scheduled flights a week between Thailand and 11 countries in the Middle East: Emirates. These are serviced by Qatar Airways, Gulf Air, Etihad Airways, Kuwait Airways, Oman Air, Iran Air, Royal Jordanian Airlines, Egypt Air, Mahan Air, Turkish Airlines, Bangkok Airways and Thai Airways International.

The Etihad-airberlin connection is important for Phuket. It means airberlin is able launch a new route between Abu Dhabi and Phuket, offering an all-year-round service. Normally airberlin only services

Phuket during the high season through flights from Munich and Berlin. Etihad is now the largest single shareholder in airberlin, Europe's sixth biggest carrier.

Middle Eastern tourists have high purchasing power, a long average length of stay and don't mind coming to Phuket during the wet season for the shopping, entertainment and medical treatment. Middle Eastern arrivals to Thailand in 2011 were up almost 5.9 percent to 603,227, mainly from the UAE, Kuwait and Egypt.

The Etihad-airberlin connections through Abu Dhabi and Bangkok should see visitors from Abu Dhabi increase that number considerably in the coming years.

THE krast topography and stunning beach-side limestone edifices of Krabi once again played host to the Krabi Rock and Fire International Contest on April 28 and 29.

The 2012 event, organized by the Krabi Rock Climbing Club and the Tourism Authority of Thailand, is designed to highlight Railey and Ton Sai as world-class rock climbing destinations.

The contest was composed of three different events this year, each with their own prize purse: lead climbing marathon (60,000 baht), deep-water soloing (45,000 baht) and a fire contest (16,000 baht).

Each of the three competitions were independently registered for, so the rock climbing gurus weren't forced to play with fire and the fire spinners could keep there feet on the ground.

Stunning weather on the first day of the event left all 24 teams of climbers out in the sun for parts of the lead climbing marathon.

With 50 routes selected for the competition on just five of the prominent climbing walls in Railey, there was plenty of rock for the two-member teams to attack.

Teams were awarded points for each route successfully scaled. Points were dependent on the difficulty level of the route, which ranged from 6a to 8a on the French climbing scale, and how many penalties were committed during the climb. All falls; takes; improper use of quickdraws, bolts, slings and fixed protection; or any

other actions the judge deemed inappropriate, were penalized.

Points for routes ranged from a 6a being worth 10 points, to a 8a being worth 195 points. Penalties resulted in the deduction of points.

Given the difficulty level of the majority of the routes, this was clearly an event geared towards the upper Of States sails through the extension echelon climbers. But despite the big

money and the serious nature of the event, climbers raved about the positive and encouraging attitudes of the judges. Unlike the intimidating, stony-faced judges, found elsewhere, the Thai judges, while remaining impartial, were just as vocal as the crowd, when they saw a climber push through a tough crux on a route.

Team FlipFlop, with Theo Valla (France) and Samual Butler Cody (USA), sacked all fifty available

routes took first place.

In second place was Nolan Edward-Barnwell (South Africa) and Jonas Lars Guran-Wallin (Sweden), and rounding out the marathon lead climbing podium were Urs Christian Schonenberger and Barbara Schonenberger (Switzerland).

The evening festivities started up after dark on Railey West Beach with the fire competition (see Your Phuket, page 26).

The deep-water soloing (climbing without rope or protection over deep water) event had a slow start the next day, but eventually climbers were taken out to Railey Bay Resort's barge, anchored close to three selected deep-water soloing routes on Sunset Wall. Music blasting from the barge created the perfect party mood for competitors

and crowd alike. Each climber had five minutes to attempt each of the routes, which ranged from 10 to 25 meters in height. Once completed they had 30 more seconds to jump from the cliff, or they lost half the points gained during the climb.

The most impressive performance on the final route was by Urs Christian Schonenberger

(Switzerland), who ended up taking first place in the event.

of the route "Up To You" (7c) on

Pra-nang Beach Wall.

Urs, a banker who has spent the last 20 months on a aroundthe-world trip, spoke with the Phuket Gazette about deep-water soloing and the competition.

"This was the first time for me that I really did deep-water soloing like that. I tried it once in a little bit in Croatia, but... not on such good cliffs. This area is a good combination of holidays and climbing," he said.

Harry Claud Larkins (Australia) finished second in the men's category and Thatthana Raksachat (Thailand) finished third.

Unlike the marathon climbing

event, women competed in their own category for the deep-water soloing event and Pratthana Raksachat (Thailand) and Alessandra Pescosta (Italy) took first and second spots respectively.

If you have a guilty pleasure what would it be?


I think I do...food! Any food, I love food. But, unfortunately, I cannot gorge on it anymore.

Life & style Vietnamese, please

UP UNTIL recently, Phuket-based lovers of Vietnamese food had to trek into town, near the bus station, to sample this very special cuisine at Je t'aime. It's a pleasant enough setting and the food there is good, but the environment is far from being inspiring.

Therefore the opening of its sister restaurant, Memtrio, in Kathu, over a year ago is a welcome change from that drab situation. Featuring smart and spacious indoor and garden dining spaces, Memtrio is fronted by a well-tended garden next to a

small parking lot with no coaches in sight.

The walkway leads to a pleasant patio lined with glasstopped tables and faux rattan chairs.

Inside, the loft-like area has lots of glass windows and a high ceiling, which lends a light and airy feel to the whole place.

A grand piano dominates one corner of the room, and two small but comfortable sofas another. The center of the room is the domain of a glass table large enough to accommodate a party of ten. The distressed-yellow wall is lined with copies of paintings by the French masters and blackboards with the chalked-in menu of the day. Together with two full wine shelves, all these elements combine to give a believable semblance of a French bistro.

Memtrio's menu offers extensive Vietnamese fare, keeping to the same formula that has proved successful at Je t'aime - fresh ingredients, great taste and beautiful presentation. In addition, there are Thai and European dishes to be had, which, after a casual glance at the menu, look like a respectable offering. However, today we are focusing on what the parent restaurant was famous for - the authentic Vietnamese dishes.

Vietnamese food is typified by the extensive use of fresh herbs both in the cooking and as an indispensable side dish. These herbs are selected based on their strong aroma and pungency. Eating Vietnamese food is fun too, featuring all kinds of wrappings and dippings. Either lettuce leaves or thin rice noodle are used as wraps or parcels, into which go all kinds of barbecued meat and some more leaves.

As with other Southeast Asian cuisine. dipping sauces are an indispensable part of any meal, and here at Memtrio two kinds of sauces are served - one sweet and the other savorv.

Crafting your own 'morsel' can be as cre-

ative or as plain as you like: include or leave out certain herbs or meats, use just one sauce or a mixture of the two. The combination is endless but you should aim for a layer of flavors and let

the fusion of tastes explode in your mouth. Vietnamese spring rolls abound at Memtrio. A good introduction would be the crab-meat-filled spring rolls (180 baht). The difference between these and the Chinese version lies in the wrap, the former using dampened rice paper which yields a chewy but nevertheless crisp texture. There's also another healthy version of fresh spring

> filling of herbs and meat. For a contrast in texture, try Vietnamese Pancakes (140 baht), whose crispy crêpelike envelopes are filled with cooked prawn, pork, mung beans, and fresh bean sprouts. This dish is so tasty (and pretty too) that there's no need to add sauce of any kind.

> rolls (120 baht) that include the same

Charcoal-grilled pork (180 baht) exudes the unmistakable aroma of the lemongrass used in the marinade, among other ingredients. Served with rice noodles and two kinds of sauce, this is a favorite lunchtime fare in Vietnam. It is eaten in the same way as everything else – with lots of fresh herbs.

What could have been a very exciting dish - Fried minced shrimp wrapped around a

sugar cane stick (200 baht) – turns out to be a little disappointing with the shrimp cake being a little 'pasty.' However the saving grace comes in the form of the beautifully presented Chocolate Panna Cotta in orange sauce with, we suspect, lots of Grand Marnier!

The staff here are attentive and courteous and Memtrio is smart enough for a business lunch but also laid-back enough for family gatherings. Most of its clientele seem to hail from the nearby Phuket Country Club. European and Thai dishes on the menu look quite respectable too. But that's for another time.

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All adrift in a life-less boat

YOU wouldn't expect that a novel that takes place almost wholly at sea could be so dry. Charlotte Rogan's first novel *The* Lifeboat (Little Brown and Company, New York, 2012, 279pp) might have been a stirring tale of survival at sea among a small cast of characters adrift on a lifeboat in the Atlantic. Instead it is curiously lifeless, its characters ter to the west. In the distance bloodless and its plot

maddeningly vague.

sinking of the Titanic, getting underway, the passenger liner Em-

press Alexandria, en route from London to New York, suffers a mysterious explosion. Survivors are crammed into a few lifeboats. One is commanded by able seaman John Hardie. Of the 39 survivors aboard his 23-foot lifeboat, 19 will die over the next three weeks.

In the Prologue, one survivor, Grace Winter, is on trial for murder, along with two other women, Ursula Grant and Hannah West.

"I was twenty-two years old," she writes. "I had been married for ten weeks and a widow for over six."

At the urging of her lawyers, Grace Winter writes an account of her ordeal at sea. This has the advantage of producing some fine simple descriptive prose.



She remains content with the existential lesson of the lifeboat, concluding: "I feel both lucky and unlucky about it, suffused with a sort of happiness as it has opened up a whole new world to me, one quite devoid of dependence on other people, devoid even of the fear of death and belief in God...."

YOU can bet there is going to be a huge hoo-hah about Tim Burton's new Depp-star remake. Based on a late sixties "cult" (i.e. people who love it also think Clint Eastwood reached his peek in Rawhide) TV show, Dark Shadows the movie tells the story of the undead Depp coming to terms with the modern world and Michelle Pfeiffer.

The hoo-hah is going to take the form of complaints that the TV series was not a comedy, but so what? The original was also not in color. Is anyone complaining about that?

In fact, the TV show was a daytime soap opera about ghosts, zombies, werewolves and the like that wasn't actually supposed to be about the supernatural at all. Take another look at it: it's downright

Still, Hollywood has a fairly bad rep when it comes to remaking TV shows as big budget movies. Look at how Ben Stiller "ruined" Starsky and Hutch.

In this case, however, we have Tim Burton directing and he has never met a story that couldn't be improved with a bit of nostril flaring from Johnny Depp.

The Rum Diaries star is cast as Barnabas Collins, an 18th-century playboy turned vampire, who has quite literally returned from the grave to save his family's fortunes.

The modern Collinses are a dysfunctional breed led by Pfeiffer and her off-the-wall hubby, Jonny Lee Miller. Jackie Earle Haley also gets to chew some scenery as the vampire's Renfield-esque assistant.

That it takes a 200-year-old vam-



pire to straighten out a 21st-century family is Burton bashing home the point that modern life is totally screwed up.

There are a bunch of sub-plots, including a hunt for the witch (Eva Green) who gave Barnabas his fangs, but they really don't matter. Enjoy it for what it's meant to be: a wild Burtonion gothic romp with JD quite literally vamping it up.

Suteichok Tossapornchaipluk

SUTEICHOK "Pang" Tossapornchaipluk keeps a daily journal. A typical page entry reads: "It's a lovely day, the temperature is about 27° C. Mizuna looks fresh in the morning sun and is happy to see me."

The Mizuna that Suteichok is referring to is a lettuce by the name of Mizuna Cos flourishing in the greenhouse that is part of his company Natural Green on Chao Fah Road West. Engineer turned agriculturist Suteichok always had a 'green finger'. From a young age, he would pot about in the family's tiny garden in Samkong, planting enough greens and herbs to feed the whole family.

After a short career in the construction sector, Suteichok spotted a niche market that would turn his passion into a profitable trade. In 2001, having done the prerequisite market research. Suteichok established a 4-rai hydroponic (growing plants in water and without soil) farm, producing and selling a variety of lettuce and other greens that, until then, were unavailable on Phuket.

Suteichoke explains: "Hydroponic farming has a shorter growth cycle of about 45 days, yet yields higher crops than the traditional earth-bound method. The crops contain an equal amount of nutrients as the usual plants but it is less labor-intensive and requires few chemicals, if any." At one point it seemed that all the hotels and res-

taurants on the island were his customers and Naturally Green grew from strength to strength. In April this year, Suteichok expanded his venture to include a new store to accommodate retail clients who were beginning to frequent his tiny former outlet near his Chao Fah Road West farm. The new space is modern, lovingly designed and partly built by Suteichok himself, who, judging from the unique furniture to be found, is also a skilled craftsman. In the future, he says, there will be a café and salad bar serving healthy sandwiches and juices. A covered walkway will allow guests to visit the nearby greenhouse.

Suteichok is a researcher as well as an agriculturist. The two disciplines, he says, complement each other. As the technology of hydroponic farming is relatively new in the country, he learns from trial and error. He believes research and notekeeping are an indispensable part of ongoing investigation and experimentation. Now considered an expert in the field, Suteichok travels the country to give talks and share his knowledge with interested parties for free. Despite this, he says the government does not support him and fails to support its agrarian population.

"I am not very endearing to the officials because I openly criticize their way of working," he reveals. One of the reason he fervently keeps notes of farming processes is partly because he wants to create a database of research papers for posterity. This information, he says, will be shared with anyone who is interested in giving innovative farming a try. Part of him believes that farming communities have to create strong ties and work together independently, not relying on government support.

"If help comes, it's all well and good. But it's most likely not coming," he shrugs. By his own admission, Suteichok is part of that eccentric breed of gardeners who talk to their crops. Very soon, he says, he will leave the business side in the capable hands of his younger brother because he wants to get back to tending his 'beloved' vegetables.

"To me they are more than vegetables. They will complain if the workers have been heavy-handed with them or if I neglect them for too long. I am very attached to them, in a way I can't describe. Government officials say I am mad and even my close friends think I am 'a goner,' but I don't actually care," says 34-year old Suteichok.

SITTING on a big, red AirAsia flying cigar on the way back to Phuket from Bali, the silence of my mobile phone is comforting.

Budget airlines in the region have yet to install on-board Wi-Fi and the deep blue skies remain one of the last great getaways of the mind. That will change sooner rather than later, without a doubt.

A week in Bali has flown by like a speeding bullet. News on the ground had surfing legend Kelly Slater tweeting around the world that if the island didn't do something about the rising tide of floating garbage then riding the waves may become a thing of the past.

Hotels in Kuta, Legian and Seminyak remain under scrutiny for flushing waste directly into the sea. A crumbling infrastructure of public utilities is finding its task a mission impossible.

For all the gridlocked traffic, motorcycle mayhem and development, Bali still remains a happy place for me. Whether it's the more temperate climate, or the hospitable Balinese culture and art, it continues to somehow define the word 'exotic' for many.

Rarely a day passes when hotel staff or taxi drivers do not say warmly – thank you for coming to the island and please come back. I can't recall the last time I heard this in Phuket. 

Island condo, villa rental demand spikes

ACCOMMODATION rentals in Phuket are seeing strong demand from both Thais and foreigners, resulting in the launch of a number of new budget condominiums.

Knight Frank Phuket Director Nattha Kapapana said that condos are springing up in many parts of the island.

Most of them offer rental return guarantees of 6 per cent per

Some projects in Patong offer this rate for three years, while another project in Karon offers [the return] for as much as nine years, she said.

Prices of studio units range from 3 to 5 million baht, and are estimated to be able to yield daily rental rates of about 3,800 to 4,800 baht during the high season, from November to April, whereas the rate during the low season is forecast at 1,500 baht per day.

Despite the sluggish European economy, Phuket attracts people from around the world and has always been a popular choice for holidaymakers, and more of them are choosing to rent private villas instead of staying in hotels, Nattha insisted.

There was a big improvement in rental demand for Phuket villas and condominiums during the high season last year, he noted

He added that this time around, lessees are coming from a greater variety of places, with Hong Kong and Singapore expatriates, Russians, Koreans and Indians joining Europeans as key arrivals.

Rental periods range from three days to one or two months depending on nationality. Europeans prefer to stay longer, for at least a month, whereas Asians choose to stay on a weekly ba-

Last year, there was a significant increase in inquiries for rental accommodation on the island. This coincided with the growth of tourist arrivals in Phuket. There were about 4.2mn passenger arrivals at Phuket International Airport in

The Russian influx has picked up momentum every year. With competitive destinations like Egypt and Turkey becoming politically unstable, it seems that Thailand resort destinations such as Phuket will continue to attract visitors and investors from Russia.

The average length of stay by Russian tourists is about two weeks. Koreans generally stay for four to seven days and mostly prefer Bang Tao beach.

The rental rate varies by unit size, unit type, facilities and amenities of the project as well as the location.

A three-bedroom villa with usable area of 242 square meters in the Laguna area costs about US\$ 1,000 to 1,250 (31,000 to 38,600 baht per night during the peak season.

The rental rate of a project in Kamala is US\$ 2,000 per night for a four-bedroom villa with usable area of 950sqm on a land plot of about 1 rai (1,600sqm).

Seeing red



THE past few months have witnessed a change in the normal weather patterns for Thailand. Parts of the North have been exceptionally hot and dry.

The incineration of rubbish, and widespread slash and burn activity has hardly helped. But here in the South, we have had more precipitation during a season habitually associated with a parched and dehydrated land-scape.

We hardly needed the ritual of Songkran to invoke the rain gods and bring the downpours – both natural and man-made. Gardens were already lush and verdant, the trees across the road from my house, usually brown, sere and lifeless by April, had scarcely paused for breath.

For the gardener, this has been mostly a blessing: less watering of borders and container plants, less sprinkling of lawns.

In the case of plants that thrive in desert conditions, they have produced fewer flowers, and more lush greenery.

The only shrubs actually to succumb in my patch have been potted adeniums (desert roses) and euphorbias (crown of thorns), which I discovered all too late were being enthusiastically watered by another hand after the rains had already done their work.

These plants hold moisture in their swollen stems to see them through lengthy droughts. This year, they had no need of human aid. Several literally dropped their leaves – never a good sign – and then gave up the ghost.

Tough shrubs such as oleanders and wax roses (*pereskias*) also failed to produce their usual crop of blooms. But for the rest it was business as usual.

Of course, gardeners rely on colorful flowers to make an impact.

Leaving aside the numerous red foliage plants such as *dracaenas* and *bromeliads*, or the bi-annual russet leaves of the sea almond, red is, along with yellow, the dominant primary color in any Thai flower border.

Oddly, blue is not so common. But red, in its numerous guises of cerise, crimson, magenta, scarlet, carmine or vermilion certainly is.

Right now, it is the turn of flame trees, Rangoon creepers, red and orange *ixoras*, and *cordias* to show off their colorful wares.

So red is our theme for the next few weeks. Let's begin with a plant that has been given little space in these columns recently: the hibiscus, a shrub that brightens gardens from Bali to Brazil.

It is not just red; there are pink, yellow, purple and white hybrids

too. The generic hue is red, however, and some of the most magnificent cultivars of *rosasinensis* are a luminous scarlet or deep crimson, hence such evocative names as *Toreador* or Brilliant.

Rosa-sinensis is everywhere in Phuket. A shrub up to five meters tall, it is much used as a screen or hedge. The wide, symmetrical trumpet-shaped blooms, which vary in size from a couple of centimeters to twelve or more, are ephemeral and last only one day.

But the hibiscus will flower so profusely in the right conditions that you rarely see a specimen without any floral accompaniment. The leaves are large, ovate or lobed, and one attractive variety often used for low hedges has variegated, pink-flushed foliage.

So what are the snags? Well,

rosa-sinensis is surprisingly susceptible to fungal and mealy-bug attacks, and is quite picky about its location. Full sun and a decent supply of moisture are mandatory if it is to flower well. It can become leggy and sometimes drops its leaves. Pruning is therefore recommended.

There are two other varieties, *schizopetalus*, which is always scarlet, and *mutabilis*, which as

its name implies, changes color during the blooming period. Both are quite different in appearance from rosasinensis, and, in my garden at least, fare better. Their turn – and they deserve it – will come next week.

Tip of the week

Looking after your topsoil

SOIL supports the growth of plants and gives them access to water, nutrients and air. Most roots grow in the uppermost layer or topsoil. This layer, which in Phuket is often thin or even non-existent after construction, is biologically active, and is directly affected by the weather.


Improving your topsoil has the most beneficial effect on plant health. It contains about 50 % pore spaces filled with air and variable amounts of water depending on the rainfall, about 45% minerals (mostly rock particles) and 5% organic matter including roots, decaying leaves and stems, materials added by gardeners and soil-dwelling organisms.

Worms normally inhabit this layer and help to enrich the organic content by recycling dead leaves and converting them into humus. Dead leaves left to decompose in the tropics can become a haven for bugs and harmful bacteria.

Manchester City manager Roberto Mancini finally conceded that the title is their's for the taking after Gnegneri Yaya Touré netted twice against Newcastle, to edge tantalizingly close to that elusive top-flight title.

So will the Football Association be delivering the trophy to Etihad or to Old Trafford?

It would be great to see the City fans' misery ended after 44 years in the wilderness, however the


> footballing gods can be cruel and the Blues will need to be at their best.

Testing times

SO TESTING at Mugello is over and we are ready for the next Grand Prix (GP). People are asking why F1 takes a week to test when it could fit-in an extra GP.

One reason is that testing provides lots of the thrills of a GP at a fraction of the cost for fans, and they turned up to watch. Of course it's not cheap for the teams.

In the 1970s, Bernie Ecclestone rear-

ranged F1's commercial rights, and transformed the sport into a billiondollar business. Previously circuit owners controlled the income of the ated with each

individually, however Ecclestone persuaded the teams to "hunt as a pack". He offered F1 to circuit owners as a package. In return almost all are required to surrender trackside advertising. The result is that most circuits require state funding to be viable.

Why is Mugello not on the F1 GP calendar? Perhaps even more interestingly, why

are the mundane Spanish circuits included?

Spain is at the heart of Europe's financial crisis, and it is hard to explain why they keep subsidizing lacklustre tracks. The new French President may not be willing to subsidize the mooted French GP either.

Silverstone failed in its talks with potential Qatari investors that would enable it to upgrade, and the Nurburgring operators face

eviction over rent arrears. So some of the great circuits look shaky.

The F1 series originated with the pre-war European Grands Prix. The "formula" is the rules which all

cars must meet. F1 was a new formula agreed during 1946, with the first race that year. The first World Championship race was held at Silverstone in 1950. A championship for constructors followed in 1958.

Spanish Grands Prix have been held at six circuits, remarkable for a minor racing nation with uninspiring circuits.

But like it or not, the circus is now en route to Barcelona for the Circuit de Catalunya, the most over studied track of the year. So many teams test here that every nuance of every corner is recorded in exquisite detail in the databases of every team engineer. Expect no surprises. Why is this not the test track?

So who should we look for at Barcelona? Lotus looks remarkably well placed to provide a fifth race winner in the first five races. The car has been remarkably consistent, even if Romain

Grosjean has not. They look the team to beat after dominating the last two days at Mugello, and have promised a raft of improvements at Barcelona.

And the others will be trying hard; McLaren, Red Bull, Mercedes, and Ferrari. And watch the midfield. The teams there are starting to demand to be taken seriously. The green light is at 7pm Sunday if you want to watch the race live. The forecast at the moment is for rain, which would add spice.

FA cup, Warlords prevail

FC PHUKET became the first Thai club this season to concede their FA Cup campaign without even putting up a fight, forfeiting their opening match, an away fixture scheduled for Wednesday against Division 2 upstarts Trat FC.

The decision, announced by team executives on Tuesday, follows the Southern Sea Kirin losing 1-0 to the Saraburi FC Warlords in league play on Saturday afternoon at Surakul Stadium.

An early goal by Saraburi's Panuwat Promyen was all that was needed to secure the win and move his side past FC Phuket in the league table after eight weeks of play in Thai Yamaha 1 league.

Despite the early deficit, a determined FC Phuket dominated possession throughout much of the match and developed a number of good opportunities to

equalize, but failed to convert.

Commendable drives by Phuket's Ibrahim Kanoute, Seongwon Byeon, Watcharapong Jun-ngam and Porimat Krongborisut kept the pressure on Saraburi's defenses high, bringing the crowd, capped at just over 1,100, to its toes with a number of shots on goal.

However, Saraburi's composed backs, finely coordinated by keeper Chanchai Yuanchit, denied Phuket from equalizing.

The loss plummets Phuket to 17th in the 18-team bracket, with just 7 points from a single win, four draws, and three losses.

Saraburi moved into 14th place

Phuket returns to league action this Sunday with an away match against Southern region rivals, the Pattalung FC Swiftlets.

Kick off for that match, to be played at Pattalung Central Sports Stadium, will be at 6pm.

LAST year's CAT Regional Futsal Tournament champions Phuket United have been assured financial support from "Phuket's father", in a gesture that will ensure the team can compete in the prestigious Thailand Futsal League (TFL) for the upcoming season.

Club administrators met with Phuket Governor Tri Augaradacha at his office on Tuesday.

Their first agenda was to appoint

Gov Tri as the club's Honorary President, a gesture which was followed by discussions about sponsorship and budget matters.

Phuket United acting club president Preechawut Keesin told Gov Tri that the team does not have an up-to-standard facility to stage home matches, adding that the 4,000 spectator capacity gym at Sapan Hin in Phuket Town, which the team has used in the past, is ideal.

However, the team has yet to receive permission from the Phuket City Municipality, who own and control the facility, he said.

"The city municipality administrators' terms are up this month, and as a result we have been unable to obtain any confirmation from them," he said, adding that the 2012-2013 season is set to commence in July, and finish in March of next year.

Preechawut added that while some potential sponsors have come forward to support the club for the upcoming season, it will not be sufficient for the season's budget.

Thus, the team needs supplemental support from the province to provide access to a facility that meets the league's requirements.

THE European tour finally returned home for the Reale Seguros Open del Espana at Real club de golf de Sevilla this week.
