# Island rubbish: gaining ground

Daily production expected to hit 1,000 tonnes in next five years; Bt530mn in Government funding sought to retrofit old incineration plant.

PHUKET'S new incineration plant went on-line earlier this month, but the island still faces a major challenge due to an ever-growing waste stream that is expected to reach 1,000 tonnes daily by 2017.

Prachoom Suriya, chief of Phuket City Municipality Environmental Division that is responsible for burning all of the island's combustible waste, told a meeting on Tuesday: "Right now the amount of trash produced on the island is about 640 tonnes a day; we expect this to increase to 1,000 tons over the next five years."

He was speaking to a gathering of factory operators, local administrators and representatives of community groups at the new plant, built at a cost of 940mn baht by project contractors PJT Technology.

Project Coordinator Kittisak Aphichatabut said a plan to begin backburning huge accumulations of waste stored in five landfills covering 120 rai behind the plant is unlikely to succeed unless additional incineration capacity is added.

The new plant, which comprises two burners, has a maximum burning capacity of 700 tonnes a day, not much higher than the current daily volume delivered: 640 tonnes per day. The plant also needs to be shut down for 45 days a year for maintenance, during which time using the landfill is the only option.

Mr Kittisak clarified that the proposed solution would not involve construction of a third incinerator, but rather redevelopment of the old incineration plant. The old plant was designed to house two burners with capacities of 250 tonnes/day each, but only housed a single burner.

Under a new 530mn baht plan already under consideration by Cabinet, the old plant would be fitted with two new burners. Once completed, the back-burning could begin in earnest and all five landfills would eventually be cleared after about five years' time, he said.

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# Boy, 6, drowns in wastewater pool

A YOUNG schoolboy who went missing on the morning of July 13 was found drowned in a water treatment pool at the Patong Municipality Water Treatment Plant later that day.

The child, six-year-old Yutthakarn "Marvin" Limtek, was staying at the home of his aunt Siriwan Noothong, near the water treatment plant off Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Road in central Patong.

Ms Siriwan said Marvin's father, Yutthana Limtek, 40, usually picked his son up early in the morning to take him to school, but was late that day.

Mr Yutthana became a single parent after his wife abandoned them about a year after Marvin was born, said Ms Siriwan.

Marvin went off to play near the treatment plant with an older boy. At around 10am the family realized he was missing.

A search for the boy started around 1pm.

Workers at the plant discovered the boy's shoes floating on the algae-covered water's sur-

meters in diameter.

They drained about half of the four-meter-deep pool so they could stand inside and search for

face of a treatment pool, 18 his body, which was recovered at around 2:30pm.

# More in custody for cop shooting

suspects wanted for the late-night shotgun shooting of a Chalong police officer in a live music venue last month.

The victim, officer Nikom Jeenyuen, received shotgun wounds to the neck, chest, stomach and arm in the June 19 shooting at Saraphanpleng Bar, a live music venue on Patak Road, about 300 meters from Chalong Circle.

One suspect, 28-year-old Suppanet Sukkaew of Surat Thani, was caught and promptly arrested in Karon the night of the shooting.

Checking up on the progress of the investigation, the Gazette learned on Monday that three of his accomplices are now in custody.

POLICE have arrested three more "Teng" Ritthinil, a 28-year-old also from Surat Thani, was arrested in his home town in that southern province on July 9.

> At 11pm on Friday, 33-year-old Wutthichai "Aod" Songsri from Trang and Nakhon Sawan native Khuanmuang Fuangfoong, also 33, surrendered themselves at Chalong Police Station.

> All four suspects currently in custody have denied the charges including attempted murder, weapons violations and obstruction of a law officer in the line of duty.

Officer Nikom has been discharged from Vachira Hospital and is now recovering at home.

# Tawee re-elected Karon Mayor

THE preliminary vote count in last Sunday's Karon Municipality elections showed incumbent Tawee Thongcham re-elected as Karon Mayor, with 2,388 votes from the 3,929 voters who showed up at the polls.

Mr Tawee's only opponent in the election, Narong Natang, secured 1,345 of the votes.

If approved, Sunday's result will secure Mr Tawee's third term as Karon's mayor.

Almost 73 per cent of the 5,391 eligible voters cast their ballots on Sunday. Of these, 60 chose the "no vote" option.

There were 136 spoiled ballots. Mr Tawee's team, Thong Thin Gao Na (Community Progress),

secured a clean sweep of all council seats in the Kata-Karon Voting District One.

The new council members are: Capt Jadet Wicharasorn, Sompotch Mooktieb, Anurak Jamklai. Jarun Srisawasdi, Sawat Patkor and Pornchai Faingam

Thong Thin Gao Na also secured five of the six council seats in Kata-Karon Voting District Two.

Mr Narong's party, Pracha Ruam Jai (United People), got their foot in the door with a single board member.

The District Two council members are: Kritsada Jaikeaw (Pracha Ruam Jai), Meechai Navin, Joranut Sanguanporn, Setthawut Thammawat, Piroj Sangkaew and Kanae Churak.

In accordance with the Election Act, the Election Commission in Bangkok now has 30 days to confirm the results, said Kittipong Thiengkunagrit, director of the Phuket Election Commission.





# Fisherman found at sea stabbed to death

POLICE believe the mutilated body of a man recovered in the waters off of the Rassada Fishing Port Tuesday morning is that of a Burmese fisherman.

At the scene, Por Phichainava Company Pier, police and Kusoldharm Foundation rescue workers found a large contingent of Burmese fishing industry workers staring at the body.

After rescue workers pulled the body from the water, police investigators counted 13 stab wounds to his chest, abdomen and head.

No form of identification was found on the dark-skinned body, the age of which was estimated at about 35 years.

The victim had an image of an eagle tattooed across his chest.

Police believe the time of death was about nine hours earlier.

"I presume the victim was a Burmese crew member aboard a fishing vessel. He was probably stabbed to death by an assailant, who then threw his body into the sea to conceal the evidence," said Lt Col Sien Kaewthong.

Police have launched an investigation to uncover the identity of the man and his assailant.

# Killer caught, Sunisa cremated

SUNISA "Nong Som" Saiyoy, 17, who was strangled to death by confessed killer Kittikhun Wonghajakk in her home on July 10, was cremated July 15 at Wat Tai.

Family members, classmates from Wichit Songkram School, along with Chalong Mayor Samran Jindapol and municipality council members attended the afternoon ceremony.

At the ceremony Khaneung Saiyoy, Nong Som's father, thanked the police for finding her killer so quickly.

"I'm still devastated at having lost my daughter in this way. I would like to advise everyone to take care of your loved ones, don't let them be alone – always make sure your house is secure," he said with tears in his eyes.

Nong Som, suffering from a headache on July 10 had stayed home while her parents went out to sell fruit. She was home alone when 28-year-old Kittikhun Wonghajak, high on drugs, broke into the house to rob, attempted to rape her and then killed her.

Immediately after the murder, police focused their investigation on known burglars in Phuket.

Kittikhun, recognized from an old case file by an officer was arrested with stolen property. When police searched his rented accommodation they found a variety of stolen objects; among them were items that matched the description of property reported missing from Ms Sunisa's house. Once family identified the stolen property, Kittikhun became the main suspect in the investigation.

The case against Kittikhun became airtight when it was discovered that the shoes he was wearing at the time of arrest were a perfect match to footprints discovered at the murder scene.

In his confession to the media

on July 12, Kittikhun said:

"On that day I took *ya ice* (crystal methamphetamine) and *ya bah* (meth in tablet form) before going to rob the house.

"My target was an empty house with no security system. I intended to break into the house and steal things. I broke into the victim's house and searched for stuff in two other rooms. Once I saw the victim in her room, I felt sexually aroused."

"When I saw her my first thought was to rape her, but I did not do it. So I left the house and headed back to my place, not realizing she was dead.

"I am so sorry for what I did. If it were possible, I would tell her that I never meant to kill her," he said. Security was heightened around Chalong on the morning of July 14, when police and the confessed drug-addicted killer re-enacted the crime. However, the large crowd got out of hand.

Chalong Police Deputy Superintendent Narong Laksanawimon explained that the re-enactment got out of control due to how quickly the crowd grew after the arrival of Kittikhun.

"When the first police team arrived at the scene there were only about 100 villagers there... But we still ordered 80 officers to come and help [with crowd control]. But when Kittikhun arrived a lot more villagers showed up to watch — most of them were angry and ready to attack him.

"Normally we would analyze the situation before the re-enactment. If there are more than 200 to 300 people, we would cancel it to ensure the safety of the suspect. But this time the number of people who came to watch quickly increased after the suspect arrived, and the situation got out of control."

"We cut the re-enactment short to get Kittikhun out safely," said Col Narong.

The aunt, who did not want her name to be reported, would like to see Kittikhun get the death penalty.

"I wish him dead. He doesn't deserve to live. He will harm other people as long as he remains alive. He is a thief; a career criminal," she said.

# National Parks Dept to charge resort owner with encroachment

THE owners of a Phuket beach resort project will likely face legal action for encroaching on national park land following an inspection of the site this week by the Director General of the Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation (DNP).

The resort is one of ten the agency will be investigating for possible land encroachment.

"In May I went to Nai Thon Beach and noticed the construction of the Pullman Phuket Arcadia Naithon Beach Resort up on the hill. I suspected the resort was being illegally built on the land. When I travelled back to Bangkok, I set up an inspection team to verify the resort's land-use documents," explained DNP Director-General Damrong Phidet.

During their investigation, Mr Damrong and his team discovered that 38 of the 39 rai used for the project was actually within the boundaries of the Sirinath National Park. However, three Chanote land title deeds issued to the resort for the use of 13 rai of the land had been approved by a former Sirinath National Park chief, who con-

firmed that the land specified was not inside the park.

"I thought I was going to have to take legal action against the former park chief, but after examining the land documents we realized that the owner asked for his permission to build the resort on land outside the park. When construction began, however, it was in a different area, that is protected land. Because of this, we will have to take legal action against the resort owner," he said.

When project developer

Wiranun Pitupakorn arrived on site during the inspection, he told Mr Damrong the resort had all the necessary land deeds and construction permits.

The legality of the construction has also been defended by Phuket Arcadia Co Ltd Executive Director Maitree Narukatpichai, Executive Director of Phuket Arcadia Ltd, which owns the Nai Thon resort.

Mr Damrong advised Mr Wiranun to bring the related documents to Tha Chat Chai Police Station, where a report of the alleged encroachment was already on file.

"We are now in the process of verifying Chanote title deeds of the remaining 25 rai of the resort," he

Pullman Phuket Arcadia Naithon Beach Resort is only the first of 10 hotels and resorts on Mr Damrong's list requiring land ownership verification. By his estimates, these projects collectively represent a minimum of 2 billion baht of investment.

Mr Damrong plans to conclude his investigation within a month.

# A glimpse

WHILE a project to create new recreational facilities on Khao Toh Seh in Phuket Town will give local residents a new place to relax and enjoy the views, some local residents fear that it will bring more people and garbage to the area.

They are also worried that authorities will cut down virgin forest to open up better views from the newly-constructed lookout points.

Gazette news editor Stephen Fein reports.

WORK on a project to upgrade complete, the entire road surface recreational facilities on Khao Toh Seh (Toh Seh Hill) got underway in mid-September 2011, when the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*), which is responsible for the narrow road up the hill, awarded a 19.6 million baht contract to Construction Exclusiveness Co Ltd. The Bangkok-based construction firm was given 300 days, until July 16 this year, to complete the project.

With that deadline looming, the Gazette visited the site one Sunday morning in early July to see if the project was nearing completion.

After a steep drive up from the start of Toh Seh Road,

opposite Phuket Provincial Hall, our first stop was the parking area at Toh Seh Shrine. Located next to a waterfall, the shrine is believed by some to be the abode of the spirits of three semilegendary Muslimsnicknamed Toh Seh Dum, Toh Seh Dang and Toh Seh Khaw - who first settled in

different parts of Phuket. Drinking water

from the waterfall is believed by some to be an elixir for the ailing.

make the trek up the hill every day.

From the shrine we began our walk up the hill to one of the seven project work sites: site number three, where we found workers busy surveying and preparing concrete forms.

Here, project supervisor Somyot Jiamkokgroud explained that the project comprises seven different "points". The first point is a widening of the road near the entrance to Wat Chaoreoen Sammanakit, at the base of the hill, to create more parking spaces for cars. The second point is about 800 meters uphill, near the small parking lot that serves both the shrine and the Green Forest Restaurant, which opened in 2010. Public bathrooms are being installed in this area, where we also saw what we assumed to be a black wild boar trotting about.

Mr Somyot said that when the work in all seven areas is

would be repaved and the sidewalk of interlocking paving stones would be repaired or replaced.

Asked about the July 16 deadline posted on a sign announcing the project, Mr Somyot said the OrBorJor had extended the work period due to the flooding last year.

Mr Somyot told the *Gazette* that point three would be an "activity point" with salas and a lookout point. However, there is as yet no view whatsoever, due to the thick vegetation surrounding it. Asked if clearing the surrounding jungle was part of his work scope he made it clear it was not. In fact, trees

> were being planted in the area by the company as part of its landscaping work.

The other four points further up were all complete or nearly complete, he said, so we continued to work our way up the hill, the top of which is home to broadcast towers.

Site four has two completed sala and several lookout points,

though again Fitness enthusiast "Aew" (dressed in the views yellow Phang Nga FC shirt) and friend are almost completely ob-

scured by thick vegetation. Just to the south of it, however, there is a verge where one can look out over Koh Sireh and the other islands of Phang Nga Bay.

At this point we talked to two woman who are among the hundreds of fitness enthusiasts who walk, jog or cycle up the hill.

"Aew", the owner of a business Phuket Town, said that her only concern about the project was that workers would cut down trees to improve the views from the lookout points, thus doing away with some of the last stands of virgin forest in Phuket Town. Others we spoke to shared similar concerns.

After more walking we reached Point 5, a shady area which was already home to an old "fitness park". Among the new facilities found here were three functioning bathrooms, several large platforms and several west-facing looking salas – again with little or no view due to thick vegetation.

In this area there is also an old sign explaining that *Khao Toh Seh* is a National Forest Reserve. The main access road is in Phuket Town, but most of the 550-rai park, established back in 1964, lies in Rassada subdistrict.

Point 6 further up is much the same: west-facing *salas* – but no view. We learned later that this would eventually become an "animal feeding" station for the many macaques and dogs that call the hill home. This is the area where most of the monkey feeding goes on.

Continuing uphill, we huffed and puffed our way though a large colony of primates up to Point 7, where we finally got to enjoy a truly spectacular and panoramic view from a large lookout point.

From here, one can look across a wide swath of Phuket Town from Saphan Hin to the south all the way to Samkong in the north. Clearly visible in the foreground are Vachira Hospital and Khao Rang behind it. As Toh Seh is twice the elevation of Khao Rang, it is also possible look right over it to see the Kamala Hills far in the distance, as well as Chalong Bay and the Big Buddha image high up in the Nakkerd Hills in Karon.

Remarkably, we had this lookout point all to ourselves.

After descending somewhat rubber-legged to the car, we called Anuphap Petchmeesri, one of three *OrBorJor* civil engineers overseeing construction, to ask about the project.

He explained that the *OrBorJor* had given the company a 180-day extension for the completion of the project, which is now expected to be done in October.

Asked about the felling of trees blocking what would otherwise be impressive views, he said "Those

trees are all on Forest Department land. They told us not to fell any trees if possible, just to trim lower branches that might be in the way."

Once word about the new lookouts gets out, there is bound to an upsurge of visitors and its inevitable result: garbage.

To this, Mr Anuphap said that the contractor is responsible for all solid waste removal during construction, after which time it would revert to his department.

Asked about the black pig spotted near the shrine, he said he didn't think it was a wild boar.

Currently, there is very little vehicular traffic on Khao Toh Seh Road, which is a good thing because it is only one lane wide and some real problems can result if two cars meet going different directions on the steep inclines.

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


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
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# **Deep Sea Port** inadequate for large ships

IN AN effort to kick-start the stalled Phuket Deep Sea Port expansion project, the head of the local Marine Department Office escorted representatives from two major cruise line companies to a meeting with Governor Tri Augkaradacha on July 12 to discuss the problems encountered by large ships using the facility.

Located at Cape Panwa, the deep sea port has long been criticized as too small to accommodate large vessels, both cargo and passenger, for docking.

Marine Department Region 5 chief Phuripat Theerakulpisuk said the two operators, Royal Caribbean Cruises and Princess Cruises, wanted to see the government get more involved in a project to lengthen the wharf and dredge the seabed offshore.

Chief Phuripat cited one example of a Royal Caribbean Cruise ship, measuring 312 meters long and 38m wide, that is forced to moor about four kilometers from the wharf and ferry its passengers ashore on smaller vessels.

"It's uncomfortable for passengers. I truly believe if the port were improved, there would be a lot more ships from across the world arriving on Phuket,"said Chief Phuripat.

"Chaophaya Terminal International Co Ltd, which manages the port, is working on a deep sea port development project in order to handle more cruise ships. The plan has been submitted to authorities and is under Environmental Im-Assessment (EIA) consideration process," Mr Phuripat explained.

# Illegal diesel funding separatist terrorism in southern provinces

CUSTOMS officials who seized over 200,000 liters of smuggled diesel fuel off Phuket on July 9 suspect the profits from such sales are likely being channeled to support terrorist activities.

"Customs have been cracking down on illegally imported goods, especially fuel, which is probably being used to support terrorism," said Rakob Srisupaat, Director of Investigation and Suppression Bureau, Customs Department at Phuket Customs Sea Port.

Mr Rakob made the comments at a press conference, two days after officers intercepted the 141tonne vessel Nok Nan Nam about 10 kilometers east of Koh Racha Noi at 3:30am.

The vessel was laden with about 230,000 liters of illegal diesel with an estimated black market value of approximately 6.9 million baht, the press was told.

The Burmese captain, Lin Au, and his six Burmese crew members were arrested.

"The suspects confessed that they were hired to smuggle fuel from Phuket to Ranong," said Di-

"They told us that the boat owner was Thai," he added.

The suspects have been charged for delivering goods with

the intention of defrauding the government by failure to pay taxes.

Nimit Sangampai, Director of Marine Investigation and Suppression Department Region 2, explained to the Gazette Mr Rakob's assertion at the press

conference about the profits from illegal diesel being used to support terrorist activities.

"We have confirmation from our source that some illegal diesel operators use their profits to fund terrorism in the South," he said.

"So far, we've identified one such team operating in Pattani. However, we have to crack down on all illegal goods operators to prevent such organizations from supporting terrorists," he added.

# Bt900,000 counterfeit luggage seized

CUSTOMS Department investigators on July 15 intercepted a shipment of counterfeit luggage with an estimated street value of more than 900,000 baht.

At a press conference held at Phuket Port Customs House the following day, Phuket Investigation and Suppression Unit chief Jaroen Chamnigarn revealed that 351 copies of famous brand-name suitcases and bags were recovered as a result of the operation.

The shipment was awaiting collection at the offices of a freight agency on the bypass road when officers moved in.

"We watched the shipping com-- *Kritsada Mueanhawong* | pany warehouse and waited for the consignment to arrive [by truck] When it did, we found it consisted of boxes wrapped in white sacks," chief Jaroen said.

"Inside we found counterfeit luggage, some the wheeled variety, others the bag type. All bore fake labels of famous brands".

The haul recovered 81 trolley cases in the styles of Louis Vuitton, Burberry, Gucci, and Mulberry, and a further 270 brand name hold-all copies in the styles of Louis Vuitton, Mulberry, Prada, Mont Blanc, Gucci and Chanel.

Figures released by Phuket Customs House show that from January 2011 to January this year, 24 consignments of counterfeit





Conditions eventually improved and the vessels were able to reach their destinations, with no reports of sinking or injury.

# Council member calls for justice after brother is beaten unconscious by 20 men

A RASSADA Municipality council member has called for a crackdown on loan sharks after his brother was attacked and brutally beaten by a group of armed men he claims were hired by illegal moneylenders.

Rassada Municipality council member Chainarong Pillavas and his brother Suthipong Pillavas, who claims to have been attacked by some 20 thugs hired by the loanshark, made a direct plea to the police during a press conference at Bangkok Hospital Phuket July 12.

"There are a lot of loan shark gangs in Phuket. They have no issue with physically attacking debtors; it doesnt matter if they are children or elderly people. I would like police to put a stop to this," said Mr Chainarong, who was a policeman himself before getting into politics years ago.

Mr Chainarong's younger brother, Mr Suthipong, described the attack that hospitalized him:

"On Wednesday [July 11] night, interest on a 30,000 baht loan taken at around 8pm, I was sitting in my shipyard in Phuket Town. Four bag men came to collect the loan sharks that offer desperate

out by one of my former employees. These are the kind of

people high-interest loans. They threaten violence against those who fail to pay off their debts or keep up the interest payments," said Mr Suthiong at the press conference.

"I asked them to postpone the workers payment because he had resigned, which made them furious.

"The gang left, but returned with more men, about 20 in total. They had guns and knives and sticks; they attacked me.

"Two men pointed guns at my head, while others hit me with wooden sticks and cut my chest and kicked me until I passed out. Then they were all gone."

A complaint was filed with the Phuket City Police by his brother Chainarong, who held the rank of Senior Sgt Maj when he left the Phuket City Police force.

"I wasnt even the one who had borrowed the money, but I am the one who was attacked," said Mr Suthipong, who admitted that he had vouched for the employee in

# Full budget for Chalong hospital project unlikely

THE mayor of Chalong handed a letter of complaint to Public Health Minister Witthaya Buranasiri for the ministry's failure to provide 186 million baht to upgrade Chalong hospital.

The financial package, provisionally agreed to by the Cabinet at the mobile meeting in March, was to turn "Chalong Health Promoting Station" into a 30-bed hospital, with ER facilities and accommodation.

In the letter presented to Mr Witthaya during a visit last week, Chalong Mayor Samran Jindapol asked for the budget request to upgrade the facility

# Existing limit for elephants registered on Phuket continually disregarded

TWO elephants were approved to work in Phuket this week, bringing the total number of registered pachyderms on the island to 190, which is 14 more than the existing limit set by the Provincial Office in 2003.

The increase in the number of elephants beyond the set limit was noted during the meeting by Phuket Provincial Livestock chief Weerasit Phutthipairote.

However, Phuket Vice Governor Somkiet Sangkaosuttirak appeared unworried.

"Since any elephant brought onto the island has to be approved by our committee first, I think things will be okay," V/Gov Somkiet said.

"The examination [of the elephant identification papers and future living conditions] will continue to be strict," he added.

The two new female elephants, Pooklook, aged five, and Thida, 10, will be performing at the Siam Niramit Phuket theater along with two other elephants already owned by the company.

The committee approved the elephants based on a review of their identification papers, which confirmed they were born in captivity and not taken from the wild. The committee also took into account several other factors about the future living conditions of the young elephants.

However, the committee plans to re-examine the elephants' identification documents on arrival in Phuket, as allegations of fraudulent identification papers for elephants has been rife across Thailand in recent years.

Pooklook and Thida, currently

living at Dream World amusement park in Bangkok, will be transferred to Phuket as soon as the Livestock Office has approved all the necessary documents, explained Santi Paengnukroh of Siam Niramit Phuket.

Wildlife activist Edwin Wiek, founder of the Wildlife Friends Foundation Thailand (WFFT), expressed concern that local officials showed so little concern for breaching regulations established by their own offices.

"It's typical. Any issues involving animals seem to be of no concern to officials these days," he said.

"I don't remember exactly why they came to this 190 limit, but I think it was because there was too much competition going on at the time and the animal welfare standards were pretty bad for the elephants as a result. If that's the rule, they should live up to the rule or change the bloody rule. They are just stepping over their rules on the spur of the moment, always coming up with an excuse."

The Dutchman said he was unaware of any legal cases brought against parties who had baby elephants seized during inspections on the island this year. "All of the cases were settled, which is outrageous. I can only ask from an animal welfare point of view that if these animals surpass 190 in number, how can officials ensure that their living standards will be okay?"

As for the documentation process, he said it was almost impossible to tell with certainty from identification papers if baby elephants were actually born in captivity or captured in the wild because the process does not involve DNA information.

Asked about the effectiveness of microchips, he said:

"Microchips can easily be taken out, either when the elephant is dead or you don't want it anymore. It's just that simple. It's like a license plate on a car. You can just take the screws out and put it on another car. If you don't have the chassis number, you can drive a stolen car forever. So the chassis number is the DNA of the elephant, and the microchip is the license plate," he said.

His own efforts to establish a more watertight system of ID cards, as is already in place in many countries, have so far found little resonance with Thai officialdom, he said.

However, he expects such a system to be introduced by the government itself in a few years time, probably before the next Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) conference, to be hosted in Thailand in 2013.

Mr Wiek said he plans to meet soon with Democrat Party officials interested in animal welfare laws.

He is also preparing to defend himself in Petchburi Court against criminal charges brought against him by the Department of National Parks (DNP).

The case followed a complaint by DNP Director-General Damrong Phidet, who said that he should be charged with "assisting in a crime" following a highlypublicized raid of the WFFT sanctuary in Phetchburi.

Mr Wiek views the raid and subsequent charges against him as a vendetta for an expose about the trade in baby elephants that led to the inspections early this year.

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# Hundreds of sea urchins beached by strong monsoon season waves

PHUKET Marine Biological Center (PMBC) officers took to the beach of Koh Lone in Rawai on Monday for a follow-up investigation into the deaths of hundreds of sea urchins washed ashore on July 14.

Only about 50 of the 400 fire urchins (*Astropyga Radiata*), also known as red urchins, were found alive by PMBC officers along a 200-meter stretch of the beach.

"We received a report from Koh Lone Moo 3 in Rawai that an unusually large number of sea urchins were found dead on the beach, so we immediately investigated," said Nipon Pongsuwan, a reef specialist at the PMBC.

"This morning, officers went to inspect the area again. This time, no new sea urchins were found washed ashore," said the

veteran marine biologist.

He went on to explain that the urchins were most likely washed ashore from their grassy, shallowwater habitat by the strong wind-driven winds of the monsoon season. However, there was some concern that the deaths could be linked to a decrease in the salinity of the water.

"We have yet to confirm if there has been a decrease in the salinity of their habitat. Freshwater usually only runs into that area during heavy rains. We are currently assuming that the sea urchins were washed ashore and died on the beach," he said.

This species of sea urchin is of particular importance to the seagrass environment because they function as "cleaners" in the ecosystem, Mr Nipon explained.

Local fishermen confirmed to PMBC officers that they often find this species of sea urchin beached during the monsoon season.

"This happened at about the same time last year," Mr Nipon said.

# The King recovers from rapid heartbeat, Royal duties postponed

HM KING Bhumibol Adulyadej has recovered from a rapid heartbeat and shaking right hand, though he will not be taking part in Royal Duties for some time.

A statement from the Royal Household Bureau said: "Doctors used X-rays to examine his brain and found a small amount of blood had percolated through the left side of the meninges [the membrane around the brain]."

After the condition was discovered last Thursday, HM The King was treated with intravenous medicine and the shaking stopped. By the next day, he was able to move his hand normally and his heartbeat and blood pressure had returned to normal.

The team of physicians recommended that His Majesty cancel all activities for a while

Agriculture Minister Teera Wongsamut said he had been informed by Deputy Lord Chamberlain Dissathorn Watcharothai that His Majesty had indefinitely postponed a previously planned trip to Khao Cha-ngum in Ratchaburi, where he had planned to inspect the progress of one of the many Royal Projects he has initiated.

# Eight killed in smuggler gun battle

THAI security forces killed eight suspected drug smugglers in a late night firefight on the border with Myanmar on Monday.

The force of police, soldiers and border patrol officers seized around 70kg of *ya ice* (crystal meth) and 550,000 *ya ba* (methamphetamine pills) in the incident.

The attack came after authorities received a tip-off that drug traffickers would attempt to smuggle narcotics into Thailand.

At around 4am in the mountains near the Thai-Myanmar border in Mae Sai district, the Thai authorities spotted 10 to12 men carrying bags walking towards the Thai side. Some were carrying firearms.

Police said the authorities shouted at them to stop, but instead the men opened fire on the Thai forces and tried to retreat. The gunfight lasted about 15 minutes.

The Thai authorities waited until dawn before moving in to check the scene. They found eight bodies and nine bags along with AK-47 assault rifles and 9mm handguns.

Recent years have seen a sharp increase in the amount of methamphetamine smuggled into Thailand; the drug is manufactured by rebel groups in Myanmar, such as the United Wa State Army, to fund their activities.

# American among political prisoners to gain freedom

A NUMBER of high-profile political prisoners have recently been released from Thai prisons, including 27 red-shirt detainees and Joe Gordon, an American convicted under the *lese majeste* laws.

Mr Gordon, who was born in Thailand but has US citizenship, was freed from Bangkok Remand Prison July 10 after receiving a Royal Pardon.

In December, the 55-year-old was sentenced to 2.5 years in prison for translating parts of a banned biography of HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej and posting them on his blog.

Unusually for a *lese majeste* conviction, Mr Gordon, born Lerpong Wichaikhammat, committed the crimes while living in the United States.

"We are very pleased that he has been granted a Royal Amnesty," US press attache Walter Braunohler said. "We have been urging the Thai authorities, both publicly and privately, to ensure that freedom of expression is respected."

Mr Gordon's release came amid anger in some circles over the death in custody of 61-yearold Amphon Tangnoppaku, another



lese majeste convict in Bangkok Remand Prison.

Meanwhile, several red-shirt detainees have been released from Laksi Temporary Detention Center after the Justice Ministry secured a 54 million baht bail fund for the purpose.

On June 26, 13 prisoners from Mukdahan Province were released from Laksi on bail of 2mn baht each.

The men were held for the burning of Mukdahan Provincial Hall in May 2010, as anti-government protests in Bangkok were being put down by security forces

Then on July 9, nine more suspects were released from Laksri. The men were also suspected of arson attacks related to the 2010 unrest. Their release was secured after the Justice Ministry provided 1mn baht bail for each suspect.

Earlier, five detainees from

Chiang Mai were released. The men were arrested in connection with an incident in 2009 in which a yellow-shirt supporter

was killed by rival red shirts.

Similar bail releases are being sought for some 20 red shirts still in custody at the Laksi facility.





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# Careful with Toh Seh Hill project

A PROJECT by the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (OrBorJor) to develop Toh Seh Hill as a recreational site is well-intentioned, and the Gazette hopes that the current OrBorJor as well as the administrations that follow it – are prepared to commit sufficient resources to ensure that the hill's natural charm is not despoiled by garbage, traffic snarls, and other problems that could stem from an expected increase in popularity due to its new attractions. [See news feature, pages 4-5]

At the moment, there are no apparent restrictions on vehicle access to Toh Seh Road, apart from those naturally imposed by the steep and narrow nature of the road itself. Thus far, that has been enough to keep most drivers from venturing up the hill.

All that could change very quickly, however, when profit-driven members of the Phuket taxi and tuk-tuk brigades realize there is a new cash cow primed for milking.

The Gazette hopes that once the project is completed the OrBorJor, which is responsible for the road, monitors changes in road use and considers restricting access to all but necessary vehicles, such as those involved in sanitation inside the park or others operated by employees of the television station broadcast towers atop the hill.

These television station drivers and others operating on the road will also need to drive more slowly to ensure that human corpses aren't added to the disturbingly high number of dead macaques and dogs that have been run over there in recent years.

While there is limited parking near the Khao Toh Seh Shrine, about half-way up the hill, the prospect of the area becoming a popular tourist attraction, similar to the "Big Buddha" peak in the Nakkerd Hills in Karon and Rang Hill in Phuket Town, is a cause of considerable concern, especially among the many people who use Khao Toh Seh to get their daily exercise in a quiet and shady, natural setting. Their numbers include many OrBorJor staff and other government workers who work at offices in the government quarter at the base of the hill.

It appears inevitable that some time before the end of the year workers will head to the hill, chainsaws in hand, to remove vegetation that is currently blocking what would otherwise be scenic views from the new lookout points.

The Gazette only hopes that this effort will be overseen with great discretion; the hill is not only the last major reserve for native, virgin forest in the area, but also serves as a much needed lung for the urban sprawl that has engulfed the surrounding greater Phuket Town area.

As more and more of the island is covered with concrete and bitumen, now is the time to end encroachment on state land once and for all and ensure that all of the island's remaining stands of virgin forests are preserved for future generations.

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

# Sustainable development | Slow down on applause derives from cooperation

# First PERSON

MY DOCTORAL research is on the sustainable development of Phuket. It focuses on how to apply scientific knowledge and systems-based thinking to environmental management. It doesn't support any political or commercial agenda, and it doesn't say whether becoming a self-administrative province is good or bad for Phuket.

People within Phuket's society fall into three groups: Those who don't know what problems they are facing; those who do know, but don't think they can do anything about them; and those who know and want to do something about them, but lack the means or opportunity to affect change.

We need a mechanism that will engage the people, providing them with tools that will allow them to interact with people who have similar ideas and goals.

But where do we start? Ideally, the catalyst should be those who are affected by the problem. It could be villagers, businessmen, officials, educators or even students who recognize problems and want to participate in the solutions.

Nowadays, we have modern technology to communicate. We can use social media as a tool to pass on news or ideas to the community. I believe in the power of the masses, and believe that if every group works together, the sustainable development process

in Phuket can happen rapidly.

Villagers are an effective source of power, since they live in the community and face the development issues of the island on a daily basis. If we let them participate by sharing their ideas and opinions, we might be able to discover long-term solution. To listen and work together with them, and to give them the information necessary to solve these problems – this is the real meaning of participation.

To solve a problem it's necessary for villagers, government departments, the educational elite and private sectors of the community to brainstorm solutions together, without trying to pin the blame on each other.

The media plays an important role too. If they report what is happening and how big a problem is, people will take it seriously.

However, sustainable development efforts can be a double-edged sword. Implemented wisely, they can benefit the community, but if we don't have a viable plan, there will be trouble. This is particularly true of projects which have purely economic goals. Often these endeavors have unintentional negative consequences. This happens because community leaders or project planners weren't quite sure about what was truly required for the project or the exact impact it would have on a community. This can be prevented by the community participating in the project planning. With real cooperation, the true problems will become self-evident.

As Phuket is constantly evolving, I'm not sure how to measure the success of sustainable development efforts. However, greater enthusiasm shown by the people participating in the decision making process concerning environmental or social development is one way of telling whether or not we are progressing in a positive direction.

That's all that matters. We have no issue answering that and providing the paperwork to back up our verbal statement.

Based on the good feedback we've received, we expect a lot of members to join the competition in Phuket.

The Governor went on to emphasize that Phuket province gives great importance to hospitality.

As for accommodation, Gov Tri pointed out that the island has more than 1,000 hotels with tens of thousands of rooms available.

He is also positive that facilities, space, logistics and security will all be sufficient for the event.

With Kata and Karon stretching a length of 4.5 kilometers, and Patong Beach nearly 14 kilometers, there will be enough

room to organize all 17 categories of sport.

In addition to regulating traffic, the province will make safety and security a main priority. Since Phuket is a world renown destination, anything that happens here has an instant impact [on reputation]. So, I will ensure that there are sufficient resources for authorities to do their jobs and provide the utmost convenience for participants, he concluded.

# Transit investors eye light rail

A THAI-AUSTRALIAN consortium was the latest multi-national delegation to express interest in constructing the Phuket masstransit, light-rail project, which Cabinet gave provisional approval for at the mobile Cabinet meeting in Phuket in March.

Thai Rail Tech company representative Sirichai Prasertwaree and Neil Heaton, general manager of the Hong Kong branch of United Group Limited (UGL), on July 10 met with Phuket Vice Governor Sommai Prijasilpa at Provincial Hall to discuss the mass-transit project.

Mr Sirichai said "UGL is interested in the mass-transit project, therefore we are here for discussions and get more information concerning the project."

'I was informed by V/Gov Sommai that the project is under the responsibility of the Ministry of Transport. We have yet to decide what our investment will be," he said.

Mr Heaton added: "A railway from Phuket Airport to Phuket Town is both possible and suitable for Phuket. I think tourists like this kind of transportation. However, perhaps an elevated train is the better option in Phuket Town since roads there can not be expanded."

# Beckoning Belgium's best brews

The global financial and economic crises has stunted if not crippled a number of industries. Despite this, consumer demand for premium import products is increasing steadily. One of Thailand's largest beer importers recently expanded into Phuket. Here, their new regional manager, Olivier Dubios, has a Q&A session with the Gazette, delving into marketing strategies, tactics, targets and tools.

# Phuket Gazette: How long have you been operating in Phuket and Southern Thailand?

Olivier Dubois: In 2009, I was living in Krabi and there I bought a company called Golden Paradise - it was previously owned by a German man. We were importing both German and Belgian beers and one of our main suppliers was Belgian Beverage Asia Co Ltd (BBA). By 2011, BBA was expanding and wanted to open a regional branch in Phuket. They offered me the position as regional manager. Since BBA is the biggest Belgian beer importer in the country, if not the biggest beer importer overall, I saw a golden opportunity. So, I decided to dissolve Golden Paradise and accept the offer to work for BBA. We opened our office in Phuket in November, last year.

# PG: Which areas does the Phuket office cover?

OD: We cover the entire Southern region south of Prachuap Khiri Khan province. About 90% of our focus now is on Phuket, though we do have some clients in Krabi, Koh Samui, Koh Phi Phi and Khao Lak. In the near future, we are planning to expand into other lucrative markets in the South.

## PG: How about your product range?

OD: We have almost 50 products in total. Three of these are ciders, while the rest are premium Belgian beers. We have lagers, pilsners, fruit beers, Trappists, Belgian Abbey, double, triple, quadruple, Champagne beer, wheat beer (Belgian white beer) and vintage, among others. Our product list is not random, and each product was strategically selected based on research and expert consultation in Belgium.

PG: Who are your main target groups? OD: We are a bulk supplier and deal exclusively with resort, restaurant and bar owners, but not supermarkets. We have three main target groups. The first one is obvious: Belgian bar and restaurant owners, who already have an awareness and demand for our products. This is not a large group, though, and it did not take long for us to cover this group. The second group is the high-end Thai market. This group has an appreciation for premium, imported products, and the trend is growing gradually. The third group is the hi-end hotels and resorts. We are currently negotiating contracts with some five star hotels such as Centara Group, Marriot, Trisara and

Indigo Pearl. Eventually we aim for this group to make up 60% of our clients.

#### PG: Why not supermarkets?

OD: We supply premium products for niche markets, not the mass market. We are not competing with local beers, and we also don't want to create internal competition among our clients. Moreover, part of the quality aspect of Belgian beers is the actual drinking experience, which includes using the proper glass. If someone can buy it in the super market and drink it on the street, it takes away from the intended experience and thus quality as well.

# PG: How's the business going now?

OD: BBA has been a pioneer in importing high quality beverages, the fruit beer or ciders for example became our top selling products only a few months after being launched. Demand for quality products are growing strongly, on both domestic and outbound levels. And therefore, multiplying our company digits year on year. It has gotten to the point where demand is starting to outstrip supply. This means we have to be very selective of our new clients.


# PG: Can you tell us about your marketing strategy and tactics?

OD: Phuket is an increasingly volatile market, and we always have to be weary of new competition. As for developing our marketing tools, we are currently upgrading our website to include Thai. However, Thailand in general is not so internet savvy. Most locals aren't really keen to use the company website, and we still get more orders via fax, phone, SMS and even Facebook. I still depend on conventional marketing tactics such as 'door-to-door' sales and buzz from word-of-mouth. We do have one special marketing tool - a product in fact. It's called no-label beer and it allows a business to create its own beer brand. In other words, it's a great branding tool that is invaluable as the battle for customers intensifies day by day. This product is a nice way to dissociate ones establishment from its competitors.

# PTT most fortunate Thai firm

THAILAND'S PTT Plc's Fortune 500 ranking rose sharply from 128th to 95th, thanks to a huge revenue increase from the previous year.

Pailin Chuchottaworn, the company's president and CEO, said that the higher ranking demonstrates PTT's potential in strengthening national energy security and assures local and foreign investors of Thailand's economic strength.

"This ranking clearly reflects the fact that PTT has become a truly international corporation," he told The Nation.

In 2011, PTT's consolidated revenue expanded 33% from the previous year to US\$ 79.69 billion while the net profit rose 31.9% to US\$ 3.456 billion.

Top of the list is Exxon Mobil, whose shares rose by 20% and profits surged by 35% to \$41.1 billion in 2011 and revenues jumped 28 per cent to \$452.9 billion. Chevron is second on the list, with \$26.895 billion in profits.

# Faster and closer, but not for us



INVESTORS are lined up, and ground is about to be broken on the Asia Pacific Gateway, the fastest, slickest submarine data cable ever constructed. And it's coming to Thailand.

While most underwater data cables in the Pacific end up in the US, this one's different. It starts in Malaysia, travels 10,400 kilometers (more than 6,000 miles) to Japan, and hits almost every major seaside country along the way - Singapore, Vietnam, Hong Kong, Taiwan, China, and Korea.

Oh, and it will also land just down the road from here in Songkhla. But it won't go straight to the US.

investors – who have put down a total of US\$ 450 million so far expect a huge increase in internet traffic inside Asia. Explosive growth.

With the addition of major server farms in Asia - Google, Akamai, Microsoft, Amazon, and many others - and a nearly exponential increase in Asian demand for social networking sites such as Facebook and China's Renren, Sina Weibo and Tencent, there are a whole lot of bits flying. Consider that roughly 250 million people in China use social networking sites regularly.

The number of internet users in Europe and North America has been increasing slowly for the past couple of years. The number of internet users in China. India and Southeast Asia has been going up by hundreds of millions of people per year.

Saturation in Asia is nowhere in sight.

How fast is the line? Total transfer speed is rated at just under 7 terabytes second, which is one of the fastest cables ever laid. It'd take about 30 seconds transmit the entire contents of the US Library of Congress over that line -

By putting a very high speed or all of Wikipedia in one second.

If you used the line to stream music, you'd get about 120,000 hours of music per second.

If the routers and switches are all upgraded, using current technology, the line should be able to hit 100 TBps, almost 15 times faster than its initial configuration.

A STREAMER'S DREAM: With speeds of almost 7 terabytes per second, the Asia-Pacific Gateway will allow eight countries along the North Pacific's western border to share funny cat pictures faster than ever before.

That's 1.8 million hours of audio recordings per second.

In a surprise move last week. Facebook announced that it had invested in the Asia Pacific Gateway project. As far as anyone knows, this is the first time Facebook has bought into a backbone cable.

Google's been doing it for years, simultaneously increasing bandwidth for internet users all over the world, ensuring good connections for its own servers, and turning a healthy profit at the same time. But this is a first for Facebook.

Other major investors: China Telecom and China Unicom (two of the biggest phone companies in the world) China Mobile, LG Uplus, NTT Communications, StarHub, Vietnam Post & Telecom. That makes for a bit of

a strained relationship, because Facebook is still banned in China.

The major contractor is Malaysia's Time dotCom, which is the parent company of Global Transit. NEC is supplying most of the material and technology.

The APG has been in the planning stages for a long time; the investors first started talking in May, 2009. The main impediment to getting the agreement together: finding investors... and China. The APG didn't get landing rights in China until last December.

I've looked all over the web, and can't find any reference to Thailand's plans for the Songkhla connection.

Last year, Thailand completed a major connection in Songkhla on the TIS (Thailand-Indonesia-Singapore) underwater fiber

cable.

That line runs from Songkhla to Singapore and then Bataam. It has a capacity of 30 gigabits per second, which is just a tiny fraction of the amount of traffic the APG will carry. It's my understanding that the TIS line in Songkhla feeds directly into the major switches in Bangrak. There's no direct link to Phuket, or anywhere in the south.

Songkhla is also in the plans for the Southeast Asia Japan Cable, or SJC, a 10,700 km, 15 terabits per second underwater fiber cable

running through Japan, China, Hong Kong, the Philippines, Brunei, Indonesia and Singapore. Google is a major investor in the SJC. Construction on the cable started in April 2011, and it's planned to be onstream in the second half of 2013. (15 terabits is about onequarter as fast as the APG's 7 terabytes per second.)


I think it's unlikely that we'll get a direct link to the Songkhla APG or SJC drop points from Phuket.

We'll no doubt have to contend with (and get throttled by) the internet service providers' facilities in Bangrak. Even so, the additional bandwidth means that Thailand's not going to run out of data pipes soon.

Current plans put the AGP online in the third quarter of 2014. The people behind the cable have a good track record, so it's likely that we'll have significantly more international capacity by the middle of 2013, and a whole lot more at the end of 2014 – as long as our Internet Service Providers are willing to pay for access.

# The alternative gold rush

# **Island Investor**

WITH all the economic strife the world has seen over the past 12 months, I feel as if I've turned into a portrayer of doom. So, I'm taking the doom gloves off and jumping on the feel good train, which seems to have hit the European markets this last couple of weeks.

I'm not saying that the problems have gone, far from it, but at least wheels have been put in motion that should stabilize the financial markets in the short term.

The Eurozone's agreement to further prop up the banking system has given us a small respite from all too familiar financial ruin stories.

However, one thing has come to my attention. Even through all this economic turmoil there are still a few decent bets out there that could potentially turn out a satisfactory profit.

The meteoric rise of the price of Gold over the last few years has been nothing short of astounding – however a correction does seem to be underway. Even though the price of Gold has risen sharply, one area that hasn't had the same turbo charged boost is the Gold mining companies. This now is beginning to look like a very attractive area for investment.

The graph on the right shows an example of how a selection of Gold mining companies have further lagged behind the physical gold price, and thus, this in itself provides an opportunity for

significant rises.

Gold mining stocks have taken a real hammering recently and there are clearly some valid reasons why you should be cautious about gold companies. Many of the major mining companies made a stupid decision a few years ago to hedge their reserves, by selling gold futures (contracts to deliver a certain amount of gold in the future). This locked them out of rising prices.


Also, Asian demand for gold, one of the key drivers of the soaring price, could be hit if China makes it harder to buy gold, or India imposes a rumoured tax on jewellery.

All this aside however, it would seem that since April, gold mining stocks, like other mining industry stocks, have underperformed the underlying metal.

In our view, this kind of under-performance is only partly explained by stock-specific issues and by a general trend towards higher industry costs. Despite rising industry costs, we have seen expanding margins in the gold industry, leading to significant improvements in return on equity for gold miners for the first time in many years.

There is an expected rebound in gold mining equities, as the gap between equities and the underlying metal has widened to unsustainable levels. Gold mining stocks are showing very attractive valuation fundamentals, with the market apparently ignoring current gold prices.

These attractive valuation fundamentals could herald an excellent buying opportunity in general. A potential near term re-rating of up to 20%, particularly for the

larger gold players.

This is one area I'll certainly be keeping a close eye on, and in my view could potentially be a wise choice in helping a flagging portfolio get back on track.

Doctor's orders: Eat dark chocolate

Chocolate makes you happy and you may feel even happier to know that a bar of dark chocolate can actually help prevent cardiovascular diseases.

SCIENTISTS have known for a long time about the protective effects of this "magic food" on atherosclerosis (hardening of the arteries). I call it "magic food" because the full official name of the main component in dark chocolate is Theobroma Cocoa or "Food of God" - from the Greek words theo (God) and

broma (drink). Supposedly, cocoa has been considered for a long time beneficial for its effects on improving heart function,

artery disease, reducing insulin resistance, lowering blood pressure, and much more. The theory behind the serendipity of dark chocolate is its bioactive flavonoid substances particularly their subclass, the

This food has a long history. The cocoa drink is one of the common beverages among a particular tribe in Panama. The Kuna Indians, islanders near the Panama Canal, habitually drink more than 4 to 5 cups of "unprocessed" cocoa every day. Surprisingly, most of the Kuna Indians have never had hypertension or cardiovascular disease. However, when

City, there were higher incidences of hypertension. This indicates that the normal blood pressure in this specific population should not be the result of their strong genetics per se, but the relevant lifestyles and environments instead. This fact underscores the importance of the "unprocessed" natural cocoa as a health food.

The above finding triggered

some researchers to delve more into what is behind the chocolate serendipity. A lot of evidence points to a group of substances called flavanols.

In fact, the cardiovascular protective effect of a dark chocolate bar depends on how many flavanol compounds are within that bar. This means that just the darkness of chocolate should not automatically imply it has cardio protective properties.

Without enough flavanol content, eating the seemingly dark chocolate is futile for your health. Also, it is possible that cocoa may lose many of its flavanols during the manufacturing process before becoming commercial chocolate bars – the ones which contain sugar and milk in addition to just cocoa. Actually, it is the difference between the processed and

renders the commercial chocolate less beneficial to cardiovascular

But what are these "magic" flavanol compounds?

Flavanols are a subset of a larger family of substances called flavonoids, which can be found in many "healthy-heart" beverages

such as tea and red wine. It is these flavanol compounds that give chocolate a bitter taste which is why most manufacturers try to process natural cocoa into a sweet confection that virtually destroys these compounds.

Flavanol rich compounds exert their effects via the mechanism involving nitric oxide production. Nitric oxide (NO) has long been known for its strong antiatherosclerotic activity on the vascular wall. One of

NO is to prevent platelet aggregadysfunction – the precondition for chance for atheromatous plaque clinical trials. atherosclerotic development.

Therefore, in theory, dark chocolate, which is high in flavanol compounds, should mitigate atherosclerotic cardiovascular risks by reducing oxidative stress in the cardiovascular system.

Actual clinical benefits of flavonoids are mundane and have been published for more than two decades. In 2008 cardiovascular research, found protective effects of cocoa on cardiovascular disease through antioxidant mechanisms and inhibitory action against thrombin on the vascular wall. One study showed dark chocolate improves coronary vascular functions, increases the diameter of coronary arteries and reduces platelet aggregation via its antioxidant properties.

Abnormal platelet function is a hallmark of atherosclerotic disease

A mere percentage of high cocoa content, say more than 50 per cent, has nothing to do with the actual amount of flavanols at all. One should not rely only on the cocoa percentage in the chocolate for its cardiovascular preventive effects. We need to stress more the percentage of the

> actual compounds – the flavanols. In particular, the Kuna Indians living in Panama City who consume commercial chocolate have a normal incidence of hypertension similar to other populations around the globe; in stark contrast to those who continue to consume natural cocoa with Its extraordinarily high flavanols.

# From Yala to 'la la la'

# Phuket-based diva, and recent Thailand's Got Talent sensation tells her story to the *Phuket Gazette*.

WARUNEE 'Gig' Suwannurak is no ordinary singer. Her powerful delivery of Pink's (rendition of) What's Up in the first round of Thailand's Got Talent competition received a rapturous applause from the spellbound audience.

One of the three judges proclaimed: "This woman will go on to win."

Within hours of the show, word spread like wildfire about the talent of this unassuming 32-year-old woman from the South who had little education.

The TGT organizers clearly wanted to play on Warunee's humble background to capture the audience's imagination. And the ploy worked. The subsequent short clip of her performance posted by fans on YouTube warranted as many as two million views within one week.

Her overnight success didn't last very long. In the weeks that followed, the blogosphere began to dig up her past tabloid style.

They quickly found out that she had a farang boyfriend and that she had been abroad, (as a picture of her frolicking in the Danish snow showed) and began to question if she was the poor girl they made her out to be.

"I kept myself in for a few days because I couldn't face the world," she says, and proceeds to tell her side of the story.

Born and raised in Yala, Warunee left school at the age of 12 and spent a large part of her teenage years working as a cleaner; her parents couldn't afford to pay school fees for all their five children.

Having always been a keen singer, Warunee found her voice at the age of 18 when she joined a small band that performed in hotels and bars along the border town of Betong in Narathiwat province.

Though understanding little English, she did try her hand at singing English songs by

mimicking the sounds made by other singers, at first with disastrous results.

"I was so embarrassed I promised myself to learn English," she recalls.

A failed marriage and one daughter later, Warunee came to Phuket with another band in 2008. The income from singing in hotels and bars, she recalls, was sporadic at best.

But Phuket may have proved to be her blessing. Things were looking up when she met her Danish partner Soeren, and her new life came complete with a nice house with a pool and zippy little car.

"My life changed after meeting Soeren. I couldn't ask for a better partner. He is very supportive of my singing.

The accusations that I am well-to-do were not exactly true. I may live a better lifestyle now but I don't own all these material comforts. What's more, my father still works as a construction worker."

So she continues to sing in bars and nightclubs around the island and goes to adult education classes all the while nursing a desire to become a professional singer.

Her first real break came in April, when she passed the first round audition for 2012 Thailand's Got Talent. She is now among 36 finalists who will battle it out for the semifinal later this month.

This time, she will sing Adele's famous Rolling in the Deep. She is working very hard to get the pronunciation right and also trying to learn the meaning of the lyrics.

"I will need all the votes from the people of Phuket. I am nervous but deep down I so want to win. My dream is to become a respectable, professional singer. If I win I still want to buy that house for my parents." The semifinal will be aired live on July 29.

# Raise up your glasses (and your expectations)

RECENTLY, the owner of the Wine Lovers wine shop in Chalong asked me to assist at a wine tasting with a different twist. Instead of comparing the merits of the wines, we were to compare the oblige. We were then to pour the various merits of the wine glasses themselves – a "glass" tasting.

On the table in front of us were a clear plastic cup and five numbered wine glasses, each a different shape and size, and . Four of the glasses contained wine - two reds, two whites.

We were first instructed to taste a rather good Riesling from glass number two - no problems there and happy to **LUXURY**

was outstanding.

The Riedel family business has been making glasses for over 250 years, with 11 generations keeping it going from strength to strength.

More than 50 years ago Professor Claus Riedel first recognized that the bouquet, taste, balance and finish of wines were somehow affected by the shape of the glass from which they were consumed and thus began his pioneering work to

create glasses that match and complement specific wines and spirits.

In the late 1950s, Riedel

started to produce glasses which, at that time, were a design revolution, made according to the Bauhaus principle of form following function.

As our experiment continued we discovered that the Riedel glasses gave each wine variety more depth and a better balance than when served in the standard 'joker' glass or the dreaded plastic cup.

Riedel's VP of sales and marketing (Asia), Frantz Dumey, then told us to pour the different wines into different Riedel glasses that were not specific to the wine we were tasting – in this case the Pinot Noir into the Chardonnay glass.

Again the wine's taste was completely altered, thus proving again that Riedel glasses did indeed improve the wine's taste. The wine displayed completely different characteristics when served in mismatched glasses.

Frantz Dumey explained why the glasses were different from each other: "Each varietal has a different DNA, so if the wine is acidic, like a Pinot Noir from Burgundy, then you would not want the wine to flow to the acidic sensors of your palate you'd want it on the sweet part to get more balance. Likewise, if you had a Cabernet Sauvignon, which is more tannic, you would not want the wine to flow over the tongue in the same way. A wine's bouquet, taste, balance and finish are all affected by the shape of the glass it is consumed from. Also 'size matters', and the volume of air present affects the taste as well."

When asked how one could recognize a Riedel glass from another brand he pointed to the small engraving at the base of each glass. A distinctive Riedel signature is now featured on the base of all hand-made products made in Austria. The machineblown version has a the Riedel name engraved with a modern typography.

No longer a skeptic I now own a set of these glasses which are only available at selected department stores and shops (Central Festival and Wine Lovers in Phuket).

With the price of a good bottle of wine being what it is here, it made sense to me to invest in the very equipment that will do it justice. Oh, and by the way, forget what I wrote earlier. This is an experiment you really should try at home.

# Life & style The other way around

A Phuket resident's holiday in mother Russia

MY wife and I flew to Russia to see British rockers Queen live in concert and to visit Moscow and St Petersburg, with a 40<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary trip thrown in.

St Petersburg, the world's northernmost major city, is a beautiful, historic city with only 35 rain free days a year. Situated in Russia's far north-west, temperatures range between [7-15C] in June, the start of Russia's brief summer. The St Petersburg summer lasts only about three months before the autumn Arctic winds breeze in. The temperature in Moscow was better [27C], but can reach -40C in winter. However, Russia does have marvellously long summer twilights, something sadly missing from Phuket because of its geographical location.

Phuket's "summer" season reaches temperatures of 28-30C and judging by how busy our flight back was, many Russians still come here in their summer, our "winter".

The stunning Summer Palace,

or "The Hermitage" in St Petersburg, is a beautiful former imperial home of the Czars dating back to the 15th Century; a living museum brimming with Renoirs, Goyas, Picassos, gilded ceilings and echoes of Russia's rich, violent and tragic history. It is a wonder of the world.


The Summer Palace and the Kremlin in Moscow are absolute 'must visits'. Phuket's Bangla Road by comparison is a miss. Phuket has a number of wats and the Big Buddha, but for culture vultures Russia wins hands down. Not that all Russians come here for the cultural experience - beaches, babes and body rubs are more like it.


The Russians would appreciate Phuket's more relaxed [although not always successful, as locals know] approach to security. We stayed in a ritzy area in Moscow and felt pretty safe. But pick pocketing is rife in the major cities. Security guards are everywhere, usually middle aged men smoking and looking totally bored. Thai security guards in comparison don't look so bored but may be asleep. An over zealous security guard politely ordered us to stop taking a perfectly innocent photograph of a site close to a restaurant. Russians are a particularly suspicious lot compared to the more open minded Thais. A suspected hangover from the not lamented Communist days.

So, the burning question is do Russians act the same way in their home country as they do as tourists on Phuket? Not much. Smiling, it seems, unlike the Thais, is not a major past time in Russia. Also, some Russian tourists here unfortunately have reputations as vodka swigging room wreckers. In Russia we saw some vodka swigging in the streets, but no more drinking in public than any other big city. It is more the Russian brusque manner, impatience to get things done and the harshness of the language that, if you like, impacts the sensibilities.

But, like most people who are asked for help by a lost looking tourist, Russians are helpful, if abrupt. Their directions technique is a little like the Thais, a finger pointing vaguely to a direction on the compass and then you are on your own. Certainly signage in Thailand is better than in Russia. Try the Moscow underground and see if you emerge three days later! No English, all in indecipherable Russian. Even the local media were urging the addition of English names.

Living conditions between Russians and Thais on Phuket are very different too. The vast majority of Russians live in drab, multi-storied slabs of apartment

blocks. Very Stalinist era, some of them. The traditional open windowed, cool Phuket houses surrounded by lush tropical vegetation must look awfully inviting to your average Muscovite or Petersburger (yes, that's what they're called).

So what type of Russian can afford to come here? We observed an abundance of conspicuous wealth - if the array of very expensive cars was an indication. There is a vibrant middle class born out of the oil and gas boom of recent years. Even prices at a local "hot" restaurant matched the top class five-star hotel prices on Phuket. These, you would think, are the staple Russian tourists to Phuket. In fact, while the upper middle class may stay at Phuket's five-

star hotels, many Russians on the Thai Airways plane coming home indicated a far broader section of Russian society. Not all Russian tourists are wealthy.

How is Phuket promoted to the Russians? The only evidence of Phuket tourism we saw throughout our stay was a beautiful beach scene on a poster on the wall of one of Moscow's trendiest and most expensive restaurants advertising Anantara Hotels. Outside the restaurant, Harley Davidsons, Maseratis, and Mercedes were parked as the beautiful people took Sunday lunch. Excellent targeted marketing by Anantara. I am sure the Tourism Authority of Thailand is doing other things, but this was publicity for an up-market Phuket resort chain at its best.

BEING that this is one of the most powerful guns in the world and it would blow your head clean off, you've gotta ask yourself one question, "Do I feel lucky?"

"Well do ya...punk?

This dialogue runs through my mind, over and over again as a flurries of flying paintballs go whizzing past my head.

We had gone for a day of paintball fun at the Phuket Shooting Range in Chalong and came away with the very real sensation of having been in a war zone.

Now, this wasn't exactly real war correspondence per se, but it was about as close as I think I'd like to get in the near future.

We were given red "referee" jer-

seys by the staff, in order to be thus none of us were truly safe. identified as 'non-combatants', while shooting photographs during the battles. The red shirts didn't set us apart from the chaos.

We followed a group of five players, two tourists, who were on leave from a school in Cheltenham, England, and three locals. They played several games of "free for all" (whichever team kills all of the other team wins) three to one side and two to the other.

Before the action started referees sprayed us down with mosquito repellent for safety, given the recent cases of Dengue fever.

If you haven't seen paintball played up close, most of the time people are just hiding behind a barrel, hanging on for dear life and shooting sporadically in between. Slowly a head peaks up from behind the fence and..."bang".

Chang learned a valuable lesson early on that he shouldn't run out into the open. The only quote we got from him was, "I'm shot, I'm shot...stop shooting me already (expletive)!"

The cost of play is around 900 baht for 50 paintballs and 590 baht for each additional set of 50 paintballs. The downside to me seemed the amount of ammunition you get.

The few times I played back home in America it was more on the order of 250 paintballs per session. Other than that, the guides were pretty knowledgeable and the lower amount of ammunition requires players to aim more accurately and conserve.

If you are going to play paintball it's best with a larger group according to the operators - around 6-12 people. Also, know that paintballs DO hurt when they hit you. At the shooting range they provide you with a mesh covering over your midsection but you will no doubt come away with a few welts.

All in all it's a great way to spend Sunday off with your friends. What's better than shooting at your mate – knowing it can't hurt him that bad?

CAROLE King is a 70-year-old grandmother with four adult children from two of her four husbands.

For the 25 million people who bought her classic 1971 album Tapestry she will always be the 29year-old hippie chick on the record cover, posed with her cat on the sunlit windowsill of her home in Laurel Canyon, the LA haven for musicians in the 1960s.

But her roots as a pop music composer went back to Brooklyn in the 1950s. She was one of

those impossibly bright Jewish kids hooked on radio disc jockey Alan Freed and his Saturday rock shows at the old Paramount Theater.

She knew Paul Simon and Neil Sedaka

when they were kids. She was still in high school when she began pounding out hit songs on a Tin Pan Alley piano with husband-to-be Gerry Goffin.

When her husband cracked up, she uprooted herself to Los Angeles as a single mom where, under the tutelage of James

Taylor, she began singing in front of an audience. Tapestry won four Grammies, including Album of the Year.

Now we have Carole King's memoir, A Natural Woman (Grand Central Publishing, New York, 2012, 488pp). She began writing it in 2000. The results – short chapters like songs clumsily hooked together and jumping from subject to subject – are mixed.

"Magical...? Transformative ...? Timeless...? Adjectives fall short. It was as if I were playing an extension of myself. Every time I thought of a chord

or note that I wanted James to play or sing at that moment, he was already there. Our musical vocabulary was the same, and we found that we had an impeccable vocal blend. Piano, guitar, chords, notes and vocal harmonies rolled around each other like puppies playing in a pile of newly cut grass."

Then, in 1977, she retreated to the wilds of Idaho with Rick Evers, her abusive third husband who would eventually die of a cocaine overdose.

She spent three winters in a snowed in cabin. In the end, music brought her back to New York City and she went back on tour.


"I climbed up on the piano to propel the band as they increased the intensity of the Big Rock Ending, then I gave them a cutoff by jumping off the piano. That was so much fun it should have been illegal."

But the dull patches in this saga come to overwhelm the whole.

Do we really need a whole chapter about her tiresome Indian swami? Do we need a chapter devoted to her favorite charities? Or another to her protracted lawsuit to keep the road on her Idaho ranch private?

Health food, yoga, home schooling, a goat for milk – the hippie chick ethos is complete. There's nothing wrong with this except it makes for deadly boring reading.

In the concert scene that concludes her memoir, she reminds

herself that the audience's applause isn't only for her.

"They're clapping for significant events in their own lives that have little to do with me – falling in love, marching for peace, dancing at friends' weddings, serving in Vietnam or the Peace Corps, losing a parent, conceiving a child, going through a difficult divorce - passages for

which my songs happened to be the soundtrack. I'm surprised to see so many audience members in their thirties and forties, but it's my contemporaries who are most enthusiastic in celebration of our shared history and individual survival."

That pretty much says it all. Carole King is a voice limited to a soon-to-be-bygone generation.

# **Premchit Prateap Na Thalang**

PREMCHIT Prateap Na Thalang hails from a historic and illustrious Phuket family that counts the two famed heroines -Thao Thep Kasatri and Thao Sri Suntorn, who led a small group of men to save Thalang from the invading Burmese army in 1785 - as their own. When the first farang working for the British East India Company set foot on Phuket, it was these very same people who traded precious wood, spices, aromatic oils and herbs with them.

Over time, Premchit's ancestors accumulated expertise and knowledge of the nutritional and medicinal properties of indigenous plants, and passed this heritage down to their descendants.

Premchit, 46, the attractive woman behind Na Thalang Secret Restaurant, talks passionately about her love and appreciation for exotic rainforest plants and her ancestral cuisine. Growing up in Phang Nga, Premchit says she often accompanied her father – a knowledgeable traditional herbalist – on foraging trips into the nearby rainforest as early as age five.

"I am not quite sure why my father picked me over the other ten siblings. It was a kind of grudge to begin with, but then the outings started to grow on me, turning into adventures during which I learned forest survival skills such as where to find potable water and how to

distinguish edible plants from poisonous ones."

Coming back from the rainforest, her mother would in turn teach Premchit how to prepare and transform the forest bounty into ambrosia and elixir, all the while instilling in the young girl the virtues and properties of aromatic, edible and medicinal flora.

Those valuable lessons in the ancient techniques of alchemy and suffusing plants so that dishes derived from them nourish the body and feed the mind, stayed firmly planted in Premchit's psyche. She longed to share this very special cuisine with others.

After finishing her degree in English and seven years working as a branch manager for an international food company in Bangkok, during which time she was sent for training in Chicago, Premchit and her Australian husband came upon a very special enterprise.

"I was always pestering Norman about my wish to open a restaurant, but he remained unconvinced. Then eventually he came up with the idea of a mobile secret restaurant. This concept is being practiced in many big cities around the world

where chefs serve special dinners at different venues that are usually not in actual restaurants. Everything is kept secret to add the element of surprise - the menu, guest list and the venue," explains Premchit.

The couple organized a dozen Na Thalang Secret Dinners in Bangkok to great success, and since the family moved to Phuket earlier this year, they have been hosting Na Thalang Secret Dinners island-wide.

At present, diners have a chance to try out Premchit's ancestral southern Siamese cuisine at Aleenta, Sala and Trisara resorts, and at exclusive dinners in private residences.

Dishes served at Na Thalang Secret Dinners are designed by Premchit to reflect the southern flavors enjoyed by her forebears going as far back as 200 years. The menu is different each time but one similarity remains: the use of wild and fresh ingredients from the local rainforest and the sea, cooked according to Premchit's secret ancestral recipes. The sumptuous six-course dinner menu usually includes canapés, old-fashioned and tonifying aperitifs, entrées and dessert, all paired with a suitable choice of wine.

"Prepare to be transported back in time and experience unique cuisine fused with wild aromas and distinct flavors. This is genuine southern Siamese food as you have never tasted before," promises Premchit.





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# The men who cried wolf

SOMETIMES I lie awake in the early morning and reflect upon life. The older I get, it seems, the harder it is to find the zone – that magic spot where the night is whisked away like a welcome mat being pulled out from under your feet, and there you stand at dawn.

Of course the big sleep will come soon enough, so frankly speaking, I'm grateful just to wake up alive on most days.

These days, those anxious nighttime hours are often spent dwelling on the state of things in Phuket and even the entire landscape of Thailand.

I'm not sure where the tipping point was, as in the early years all my time and energy was spent chasing women and fast times. I miss the simplicity of that agenda, as it was all about living in the present.

Unfortunately, running a business and having responsibility means looking towards the future. For more years than I can recall I've remained a seasoned optimist about the island, albeit at times slipping onto the bar stool of dark humor and what some would call cynicism.

Though critics often write to me about the latter, they are often European and perhaps are not familiar with a Coen Brothers mentality. The English appreciate dark humor, so I'm not sure about what's gone wrong on the continent. Let's leave that for another time.

Lately the headlines are blaring out about yet another land



scandal up in Nai Thon Beach, over the soon-to-open, upscale, Pullman Arcadia Resort. Photo opportunities abound of men in uniform as news helicopters fly in the sky and there's the click, click, click of media.

What is it about the sensationalism and ultimately the doomsday of land problems that make headlines here? For me the entire deluge of stories simply made me yawn, but again I'm a tainted cynic at heart.

Over the years the prophecy of the grim reaper's imminent stranglehold over large-scale revocation of land titles, throwing foreign property owners to the wolves, and in general just stirring up the pot of uncertainty, has not followed a straight line but more like a dance session. Going from a tango up to galloping across the floor in a flash of excitement.

About a decade ago, when I worked at Laguna Phuket, both the local newspapers and the Bangkok press raged on about illegal land titles at the destination estate. The last time I checked, the multiple hotel and real estate structures are still standing.

While islanders and close followers of all things Thai understand the drill, what is missed is the damage these political grandstanding events do to quality investments in Phuket

by overseas and institutional investors.

Often my nights are filled with horror, as I look at a future where the island is driven to an urban cluster of concrete structures, endless rows of shophouses, shoebox condos and same-same three star hotels.

While we tout ourselves as a world-class destination, have we pulled off the expressway for a quick snooze?

A few weeks ago, I attended a real estate conference in Jakarta where the mood was positive and sentiment strong, as was attendance from a wide variety of investors. What's so different these days between Indonesia and Thailand?

It's always good to understand the Thai perspective and

during a meeting in Bangkok with a former national political advisor and leading businessperson I probed into exactly what the state of the nation is at present.

In a pragmatic way, the gentleman responded that the country's political landscape was making a dramatic transformation from the old to the new. He said this would take time and thought that the next 3-4 years would still be pegged as a work in progress.

Not exactly what I wanted to hear, but it gave insight into the way of doing business here. It's a long-term proposal; stay calm, don't over react and in reality you are a passenger rather than the captain of your own destiny.

Business in Thailand somehow

manages to find its way forward, perhaps akin to a blind man in a closet, realizing there is no door out, but just figuring out what's inside the enclosed space.

We can apply our own values, rage against the machine and raise our voices about what is desperately needed to be done to solidly increase business and infrastructure issues in Phuket. But the reality is, the island remains a small part of something larger and perhaps even more arcane.

A work in progress? Perhaps or perhaps not. I'm not sure my nights are going to be filled with sleep anytime soon.

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# Office market poised to take off with AEC

# In brief...

DEMAND for office space in Thailand has increased by an average of 10 per cent annually.

The surge was cited to an increase in foreign investors looking to do business in Thailand and other Asian countries, as well as the country's economic growth.

The Asian Economic Community (AEC) is expected to start in 2015 and Thailand is in a strong position to become the base for offices of foreign interests expanding in the region.

Companies will choose Thailand as their base to do business in Laos, Cambodia and Myanmar because of the superior infrastructure available to them in Thailand compared to other countries, claims Alisawasa Pattanathabutr, Managing Director of CB Richard Ellis.

Collier International Thailand and Jones Lang LaSalle also both

think Thailand is an appealing market for those looking to obtain office space and conduct business within the AEC.

The relatively low rental rates in the Kingdom have allowed occupiers to upgrade, as well as expand into space in the most desirable locations.

However, opportunities to do so will become increasingly scarce in the coming years.

Office space is not the only market improving in Thailand. The condominium market is starting to pick up after suffering stunted growth due to the financial crisis of the West in 2008.


Demand for luxury condominiums priced over 120,000 baht per square metre is recovering, with domestic buyers accounting for 87 per cent of buyers this year.

# From Middle East to Far East

# The number of Middle Eastern tourists visiting Phuket reaches a record high

NATTHA Kahapana, director of property advisor Knight Frank Phuket, says that wealthy Middle Eastern citizens generally escape the blistering summers of their countries by embarking on tours of Europe's premier destinations but that trend is changing.

In recent years their company has seen growth of Middle Eastern leisure travelers in Thailand, vacationing in Bangkok, Pattaya and Phuket. This year, their numbers have surged to a record high.

In Phuket, they are enjoying all that the island has to offer, and readily shopping for familysized pool villas. Several luxury residential projects have rolled out the red carpet for them.

To fulfill the lifestyles of such

clients, infrastructure, facilities and amenities are carefully planned for many projects, including the huge 70-rai (11hectare) complex in Nai Thon.

Phuket investors that have kept projects on hold since 2008 are now starting to revive and re-launch them to capture the demand of both new and existing clients. The market appears to have gained new life.

Besides Middle Eastern buyers, investors from South Africa have flocked to Phuket to buy into residential projects.

Various hotel projects have also changed hands. For example, a subsidiary of Singaporean firm LC Development recently acquired the former Evason Phuket and Bon Resort. Also, the

Mövenpick Resort Karon Beach was sold by Kingdom Hotel Investments to Malaysia's TA Global for US\$ 90.2 million (2.87 billion baht).

In November, French hotel chain Accor Group will open a hotel on Nai Thon Beach. Named the Pullman (not the same as the Pullman Phuket Arcadia Nai Thon Beach), the property boasts 277 rooms and a ballroom that can accommodate up to 250 people, an attractive feature for meetings and conventions. Also, the Nikki Beach Hotel and Spa will be launched in Layan, near the bustling Laguna area.

# Taking the Pisonia



THE Phuket Gazette is certainly living up to its status as an international newspaper. Bernard King from Auckland in New Zealand, no less, wonders if I can send him some pisonia seeds.

He writes: "I am a disciple of growing tropical plants in a cool country. I have managed to grow a small mango tree that is bearing fruits. I saw your Gazette article about the lettuce tree. I have tried for a long time to find some seeds... and hope you can help me."

There are difficulties but not, I hope, insurmountable ones. One is that while pisonia (also known as the lettuce or moonlight tree) is widely distributed, it grows principally in tropical regions of the world. The species (grandis) is particularly common on most of the island groups in the Indian and South Pacific Oceans, even thriving on coral keys and atolls. In the right environment, it can reach eighty feet.

That familiarity with the sea and with saltladen winds, bred into its genes over eons,

probably explains why the cultivar alba does well in Phuket. particularly in the Rawai and Nai Harn areas.

The second problem concerns the seeds. In the case of grandis, they are fertile alright, produced inside elongated fruits that come in various sizes. The hairs on the fruits are sticky – hence the name of "bird-lime LEAFY: Pisonia Alba. tree" - and some- Photo:JM Garg.

times trap insects and small animals. They even stick to the feathers of birds, and seeds are often dispersed in this way.

But sadly they are a bit of a gamble: they must be planted when fresh; otherwise they will not germinate reliably. Moreover, although alba is the cultivar with the most dramatic leaves, it has fewer flowers and does not always produce seeding fruits.

Bernard has the answer to the first issue; he tells me he possesses a green-

> house where he assures me, pisonia will produce its characteristic yellowish green foliage. Yes, we are still on the topic of yellow shrubs and pisonia alba, along with newer varieties of duranta repens or pigeon berry, which have the showiest golden leaves of any of the plants mentioned in these columns. But the leaves of *pisonia* are much larger, up to a foot across and have a delicate, almost translucent appearance.

As for the second problem, I shall have to track down a flowering tree in the area, check to see if it has any fruits, and beg a few. Then the seeds will have to be sent, post-

haste, to the Antipodes. Speaking personally, I have had little success with the lettuce tree. It needs some acidity in the soil and good drainage. I tried it in partial shade where it seemed unhappy.

Bear in mind, too, that although it is a relative of the extremely tough and spiny bougainvillea, the grey branches are brittle and the leaves will be at their golden best only in full sun.

Other foliage plants tend to be intermittently yellow. Dracaena fragrans, one of the most popular and hardy of Asian plants, comes in many colors but one, *reflexa*, has brilliant yellow margins to its leaves. It does especially well in pots and can manage for long periods with little or no watering. Sun is no problem.

Both schefflera and dieffenbachia hybrids, under-storey plants that prefer shady conditions, sometimes sport bold yellow stripes or blotches, and there are forms of codiaeum (croton) which produce golden

# Tree tip

WHEN planning your garden, consider how tall your trees will become. Big fruiting trees such as tamarind, mango, and sataw will quickly outgrow the average plot. So you are better off with trees of a manageable size.

Remember too, that the majority of tropical trees are evergreen, equipped with tough and often attractive glossy leaves that can withstand the heat of the day. They provide deeper pockets of shade for understorey shrubs, better cover and insulation for the walls of your house.

In temperate climes, most trees are deciduous: they start with a burst of new spring foliage (and often blossom), and then remain in leaf until late in the season when the leaves fall, revealing bare limbs.

In the tropics, fewer trees are seasonally deciduous. They tend to shed some leaves in dry conditions to minimize moisture loss, so they seldom look skeletal.

The latest developments come at the height of a week marked by three back to back losses.

Following their defeat to Krabi at home last week, the Islanders immediately hit the road to play their Toyota League Cup second round match against Division Samutprakarn United.

In that midweek match, Phuket were narrowly defeated 4-3 PTT Rayong's lovely cheerleaders in penalty shoot-out

following a 1-1 score line after 120 min-mediately with three tough matches in his first utes of play.

Following such a disappointing result, a battered Phuket squad traveled to the heart of the Kingdom's natural gas industry to take on PTT Rayong.

Going into the match placed 6th of the 18team league, PTT Rayong "Fire Power" were hungry for victory following a squandered firefight 5-3 a week earlier with Ratchaburi Mitrphol "Dragons".

Tired from travel, Phuket were also without key midfielder Marcios Santos, who had to serve a one match suspension for accumulating four yellow cards.

And while it is said that money can not buy everything, it certainly can buy one a strong football team, and Thailand's only Fortune 500 company's team demonstrated this to the dismay of Phuket on Saturday.

In front of a crowd of 2,139 exuberant, red and blue shirted fans, PTT Rayong's Thanongsak Promdad opened and closed the goal fest with goals in the 20th and 94th minutes, bringing his season tally to six.

Also exploiting Phuket's vulnerable defenses was PTT's leading scorer Naret Kabkrikeaw on 26 minutes, scoring his 8<sup>th</sup> of the season.

Also joining in the feeding frenzy were Adisak Srikumpang, scoring on 33 minutes, his fifth, as well as Cameroonian import Ebako

#### Quiksilver adds five-time world champion Stephanie Gilmore to Phuket's 2012 lineup

MONSOON season is back and you know what that means – the Quiksilver Thailand Surf Competition will soon return to Phuket. This year features an all new, star-studded lineup.

More than 300 surfers from all over the world are expected to participate in the event, which will be held from September 12-15 at Patong Beach.

The competition is organized by QS Retail (Thailand) Limited.

Commenting on the level of talent this year, local surf guru Mike Schnider, of long-standing Kata Beach surf-staple, Nautilus Dive & Surf said: "There are some people coming from other countries this year and competition could get a lot tougher than before."

A few of the countries represented at the event will include Australia, the USA, Taiwan, South Korea, Japan, Indonesia, Malaysia, Hong Kong, the Philippines, the Maldives and of course, Thailand.

One favorite to stand atop the leaders board is Phuket's own Anissa Flynn, 14, who currently leads the Asian Surfing Championship (ASC) women's tour.

Flynn may face real competition this year in the form of five-time womens ASP World Tour champion Stephanie "Happy" Gilmore, 23, who has announced her entry into the event.

"This is an Asian thing," says Michael Flynn, Anissa Flynn's father and manager, "So, if Stephanie Gilmore wins this competition and Anni comes in second that'll still put her atop the Asian tour in points.

"Just going into a final with Stephanie is a win," he added.

After a recent meeting with Phuket Governor Tri Augkaradacha at Provincial Hall, Surached

Mungthong, General Manager of QS Retail said, "This year is going to be very special. Stephanie Gilmore, the Australian pro-surfer will compete in the event and is also going to be in our fashion show."

The competition will have five divisions including mens shortboard, womens shortboard, open-long board, masters (for over 35-years-old) and grommet division (not over 16-years-old).

The Quiksilver tournament is the largest surf competition in Thailand – now in its fourth year.

The mens division may be over before it gets started if some of last year's Quiksilversponsored Balinese surfers return. Their presence meant locals in the men's division had little chance.

The longboard and grommet divisions are where locals stand the most chance of victory. Khun "Golf", a local sponsored by Tony of Nautilus Surf & Dive, nearly won the longboard division last year, coming in 2<sup>nd</sup>. He'll be competing again this year.

As for the groms, Anissa Flynn looks hard to beat, but she may be challenged by some skillful boys, since that division is unisex.

Gilmore's experience as a big wave rider will undoubtedly play to her advantage if waves end up in the 2-4 meter range – as they've been lately. Local surfers are hoping for smaller waves in order to hang on against foreign competitors who have more experience riding larger surf.

"You never know what will happen, being unlucky can happen to anyone," says Schnider with a chuckle, "Last year there was a woman pro surfer sponsored by Ripcurl who was eliminated early on just because she didn't get any good waves."

There will also be performances by the Quiksilver Team Riders, a

## Five years on: The Multihull Regatta

COMMODORE Peter Dyer and Capt Mike Fallows stand on the bow of the Ocean Blue awash in the noonday sun, laughing, and reminiscing about an old, shared friend, they refer to simply as "Rocky".

Rocky was a professional boxer from back in the good ol' days. He is irrelevant to this story, except to say convey the atmosphere of a tight-nit sailing community, such as the one in Phuket.

Now, any day sailing is a good day. Even more so when there's a regatta, and still more when that Regatta finds itself blessed with agreeable weather, fine company and stiff competition.

This was the case recently during the 5<sup>th</sup> annual three-day Multihull Regatta, staged from Ao Chalong Yacht Club.

We set sail from Chalong pier at 10:30 am for the 11am start. The press sailed aboard the "Ocean Blue", a powered twin catamaran less than a year old, owned by Capt Mike Fallows – a relative newcomer to Phuket waters.

The regatta hosted two competing classes, the Firefly 850 Sport, in which five boats competed, and Multihull, in which four competed .

Yachts in attendance included local staples such as Da Vinci, Miss Saigon and Niña who were challenged by several international contenders.

Of the foreign competitors (boats not based in Phuket) there was Twin Sharks from England, Frog from Shanghai and Dyer Straits (foreign only because of the Australian crew imported specifically for the event).

Commenting on his boat Dyer Straits, which came in second behind Hanz Rahmann's Voodoo in the Firefly 850 Sport division, event organizer Peter Dyer said: "I think maybe they had too much brain-power on the boat.

"Perhaps they overcomplicated it a bit. It seems to me that they've been in some unusual places during the competition."

Mr Dyer refers to the somewhat unorthodox tactics of his crew, such as jibing close to Koh Lan whilst other competitors remained on steady course around the island.

However, it must be said that second isn't so bad, and if the crew comes together they will have a real shot at Cape Panwa Phuket Raceweek 2012, from July 18-22.

Also in that division, Moto Inzi, Frog and Twin Sharks took third, fourth and fifth respectively.

In the Multihull division Da Vinci clinched the top spot, maintaining its dominance over all three days. Miss Saigon came in second, followed by Niña and Sweet Chariot respectively.

In terms of sailing in Phuket, the Multihull Regatta marks the week before Phuket Raceweek – one of the largest sailing com-

petitions in Asia, and gives boats a chance to work out the bugs before the big show.

Event attendance saw a steep decline this year, from more than twenty boats last year to nine this year.

"We've struggled with two things this year," says Mr Dyer, "There has been so much rainfall lately that at least five boats were unable to participate because they were in for repairs.

"The second thing has been economics. Many people have gone back to work this year. It's not something limited to this regatta, I think we'll see it next week [during Raceweek] as well," he added.

Many of the boats that sailed in the Multihull competition will also compete in Cape Panwa Phuket Raceweek 2012.

This event was sponsored by the *Phuket Gazette*.
