Karon Beach touts hit hard

Walking touts along Karon, Kata Beaches face imminent legal action as raids continue

THE Mayor of Kata-Karon Municipality this week ramped up his campaign to clear all walking touts from the beaches and beachfront roads in the popular tourist areas of Kata

Municipality officers targeted the illegal beach touts during the Loy Krathong festival, which was observed by millions of Thais across the country on Wednesday.

The beach-cleanup campaign began softly last month with the municipality issuing warning letters to beach food vendors in the area, including those selling food at beachfront roadside stalls or from motorbikes with sidecars. Mayor Tawee told the Gazette on Tuesday.

"After issuing the warning, we fined many vendors, rith each one facing a fine of up to 2,000 baht," he said

"However, some of them came back to sell food on the beach. Three vendors in particular are always there. They're not going anywhere," he added.

The disrespect for the law earned all mobile vendors a series of raids by municipal officers evicting them from their usual stomping grounds on November 1...



Police appeal to identify body

POLICE are appealing to the public for help in identifying a body of a man found floating off Koh Racha Yai on November 23.

The body was reportedly spotted and first reported by a passing recreational dive boat.

Police believed the deceased man, dressed only in underwear, may be a foreigner based on the heavy bone structure.

Lt Wuttiwat Liangboonjinda of the Phuket City Police described the body as that of a middle-aged male, about 172 centimeters tall, with a tattoo on the inside of his right forearm.

Officers were unable to determine what the image was.

"We believe the corpse had been in the water for several days because of the state of decay," Lt Wuttiwat told the *Gazette*, but added that it was unlikely to have been more than 10 days.

"We have checked with hotels and resorts on Koh Racha Yai, but none reported any missing guests. One possibility is that the man died elsewhere and drifted with the currents.

"We have contacted every police station in Phuket, requesting that they check with the hotels and resorts in their area to see if they have any missing guests," Lt Wuttiwat explained.

Prosecutor readies charges over Tiger Disco fire deaths

THE Phuket Public Prosecutor's Office is in the final stage of preparing its case against the operators of Tiger Discotheque over the fire that broke out at the Patong nightclub on August 17.

The popular night venue on Patong's Soi Bangla erupted into flames just before 4am, while hundreds of patrons were still inside.

Four people died in the inferno, including two tourists.

"We are now checking our documents to make sure we have a good legal case to present in court," Phuket Chief Public Prosecutor Chiengsean Panhya told the *Gazette* on Monday.

However, he added that his office was still waiting for more evidence to bolster its case. "We are waiting on more witness statements to be provided by Patong Police before we can make the final decision on which charges to pursue and to make sure our case is strong," he said.

Patong Police Superintendent Chiraphat Pochanaphan told the *Gazette* that the key parts of the investigation had been completed.

"The main part of the investigation has been done and submitted to the Public Prosecutor, including the gathering of evidence regarding the electrical short that started the fire," he said.

Col Chiraphat added that his officers were also gathering witness statements related to the club trading after hours.

"The Public Prosecutor asked us to get more specific witness statements detailing exactly what time the club was open. Many witnesses have already testified that the club was open after hours, but none of them said exactly what time the club was open," he said.

"We expect to have those witness statements ready soon and we will hand them over to the Public Prosecutor as soon as we have them," Col Chiraphat added.

Thamrongsak Boonrak, Legal Counsel for Tiger Discotheque,

confirmed to the *Gazette* that police have charged Tiger Group CEO Piya Isaramalai and Sara Entertainment Co Ltd, the company that runs Tiger Discotheque, with negligence causing death and physical and mental injury to others and with trading after hours.

"I have submitted a letter to the Public Prosecutor appealing for a fair investigation into any allegations of wrongdoing, which include claims relating to trading after hours, the electrical short [that experts believe started the fire], flammable materials used throughout the nightclub and modification of the building's structure," he said.

Aldhouse in Phuket this weekend

BRITISH national Lee Aldhouse, wanted in Phuket for the stabbing murder of former US Marine Dashawn Longfellow in August 2010, will be extradited from the UK and will arrive in Phuket on Saturday (December 1).

New Scotland Yard confirmed to the *Gazette* on Tuesday that Aldhouse "was arrested on a provisional extradition warrant on 24 September 2012 and appeared at Westminster Magistrates' Court that afternoon where he was remanded in custody to re-appear at the court on the 30 September 2010."

Aldhouse, also known by his kickboxing nickname "The Pitbull", will arrive at Phuket International Airport about 7pm,

said Chalong Police Superintendent Sirisak Wasasiri.

Chalong Police will form part of the police protection unit assigned to transfer Aldhouse from the airport, he added.

"We have received official notice to escort Mr Aldhouse from

the airport, where he will be arriving at about 7pm. At this stage, that is all we know," Col Sirisak said on Tuesday.

Aldhouse, now 30, successfully fled Thailand after he allegedly stabbed Longfellow to death in August 2010. He was later arrested at Heathrow Airport on an unrelated charge when he tried to re-enter the UK.

The Office of the Attorney General in Bangkok, citing a preponderance of evidence in the case, moved quickly to request the extradition of Mr Aldhouse.

The OAG assured the British Government that he would not face the death penalty if convicted.

EIGHT people were injured last Sunday when a pickup converted into a small bus flipped onto its side while descending Karon Hill.

Phuket City Police Capt Thada Sodarak told the Gazette that the accident occurred at about 10am near the sharp "Sator Curve" while the vehicle was descending the hill heading towards Chalong Circle.

Officers arrived at the scene to find a white Isuzu pickup emblazoned with "Phuket Big Buddha Association" lying on its side.

"Not far from the vehicle we found the driver and seven passengers," Capt Thada said.

"The pickup was heading from Karon to the Big Buddha. The driver could not control the vehicle in the wet conditions and it flipped over," he said.

Big Buddha pickup flips Ambulance delay fears

Hospitals worry underpass construction will affect response times

STAFF at Phuket International Hospital and officers from the Phuket City Police Traffic Division are working together to come up with viable routes for ambulances to make sure they can get patients to the facility in an emergency during rush hour.

The news follows project contractor Italian-Thai Development Co placing concrete blocks on the inside lanes of the north side of the Darasamuth Intersection on November 23 so that work on the 600-million-baht underpass could begin.

"We are seriously concerned about the underpass roadwork causing delays in ambulances reaching the hospital during rush hour," a senior manager at Phuket International Hospital told the Gazette.

"This is a big issue. We have to ensure direct access to the hospital while the underpass is under construction. We have two ways that ambulances can bring patients: the bypass road [Chalermprakiat Ror IX Road], where the construction is, and Bang Yai Road [which

runs behind the hospital and the Big C shopping center]."

Narong Kittiphongwiwat, Chief Inspector of the Phuket City Police Traffic Division, also rated the issue as high priority.

"This is an important issue that we have to handle. The Phuket Highways Office and the contractor have already consulted with us on coming up with a solution.

"We must add more traffic

police officers to regulate traffic flow through the junction during the construction," he said.

"Also, people should learn which other routes to take in order to avoid adding to traffic congestion at the intersection," he

Narongrit Havarungsi, Director at Bangkok Hospital Phuket, said that his staff were monitoring the effect the underpass roadwork is having on traffic in the area and ambulance response times, but at this stage - and due to the hospital's location - were not considering the issue critical.

"We are keeping an eye on how the traffic will affect us in case it becomes an issue in the future. However, we are not overly concerned at this stage and have yet to adjust any operational policies related to this," he said.

Mobile touts targeted in Karon, Kata Beach raids

Mayor Tawee explained that vendors may continue to sell fruit on the beach and massage operators would remain unaffected.

However, Chief Administrative Officer of Karon Municipality Weerasak Anakewongsawad said that all mobile beach touts had to clear out.

Mayor Tawee said he had support from the officials at Provincial Hall to carry out the campaign (see page 6).

"Officials from the Provincial Office, Chalong Police and Karon Municipality will conduct joint raids in a big cleanup of the area," he said.

"After the raids, we will discuss with Provincial Hall officials what the permanent rules for Karon beach vendors will be so we can avoid further problems and be fair to everyone so that beach vendors will still be able to make a living," Mayor Tawee added.

Krabi gang yet to stand trial

THE two youngsters charged with the vicious attack on a British couple on holiday in Krabi last month have yet to stand trial.

Lt Col Niwat Pimket of the Ao Nang Police, who is the leading investigator into the attack on British tourists Jack Cole and April Clifton, told the Gazette that both teenagers had been presented in court and charged with gang-attack causing serious injury and carrying a knife as a weapon in public, but the pair had yet to stand

"I expect to receive the documents, which detail the 17-year-old's background, soon;

then his case can be tried in court." said Col Niwat on November 23.

The case against the other teenager charged over the attack, Anusorn Kullak, 18, is ready, but his trial must wait as the charges

against the two men have been presented to the court to be heard as the same case, Col Niwat explained.

The news follows Mr Cole and Ms Clifton appearing in an in-depth report in leading UK newspaper The Sun. The report stated that, "They were found guilty and jailed for three and ten years respectively. Three others have been arrested, but so far there have been no more convictions."

However, Col Niwat explained that only two suspects were charged, let alone tried, as Mr Cole could positively identify only two of his assailants.



Paris Hilton beach party still battling for approval

PRESSURE is building on event organizer Sydictive Element to win over local authorities in order to gain approval for the three-day New Year Phuket beach party announced by Paris Hilton in Bangkok last month.

Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut told the Gazette on November 22 that he had reservations about the depth of the effort and resources being committed to make sure that such a large-scale event does not adversely affect local residents and businesses.

"In my opinion, the organizer must explore the small details, not just the overall picture. Identify exactly what the impact will be on the environment with regard to noise and how the locals are affected. Perhaps the organizers could consider down-sizing the party, as managing 50,000 people is a tall order," he said.

However, he also said he would

give his approval if all the key me regarding this event. stakeholders who will be affected by the party agreed to the event.

"I'm very much the middleman in this issue. I've had hotel owners, local government and other business operators coming to see

"They should sort the problem out themselves. I have tasked President [of the Cherng Talay OrBorTor] Ma-ann [Samran] to get this resolved and inform me of the result," he said.

Hoteliers at Surin Beach petitioned the governor on November 6 to cancel the party, claiming that just the announcement of the party alone had cost them 8 million baht in room cancellations.

Meanwhile, Ma-ann Samran has yet to be convinced that the party would be a positive development for Surin Beach. "I have talked to villagers in the area and my concern is the damage to the local environment, especially the trash that will have to be cleaned up after the party," he told the Gazette last Friday.

In light of the controversy surrounding the event, the Phuket Gazette ran a two-week online poll, asking "Should Phuket host mega-event beach parties such as the Paris Hilton mega New Year Party at Surin Beach?"

The poll closed on Tuesday, with more than 83% of the 3,489 respondents voting, "No – Never. Events such as this do Phuket tourism more harm than good."

Mystery drugs suspected in tourist death

POLICE suspect unbranded drugs may have contributed to the death of a British tourist whose body was discovered in his resort guest room on Tuesday morning.

The man, a 64-year-old British national, was found dead by his female companion in the couple's room at a resort at Nai Thon Beach at about 9am.

"At the scene, we found several unidentified medicines in the room. We have sent these for testing to determine precisely what the drugs are," said Pol Capt Prakorp Boonkwan.

The man's body was found lying on the bed and there were no signs of a struggle in the room, he added.

"The body will be sent to the Institute of Forensic Medicine at Police General Hospital in Bangkok in order to determine the cause of death," explained Capt Prakorp.

'We will continue our investigation, but we will have to wait for the test results before we can confirm the cause of death," he

Police not to post response to 'Evil man from Krabi'

KRABI Provincial Police will not post any further video response to the "Evil man from Krabi" YouTube music video, which accused them of dereliction of duty in the case of the rape of a Dutch tourist.

The original video response posted by the police was in Thai only and has subsequently been taken down.

"I have discussed the matter with Krabi Governor Prasit Osathanon and other officials and we agree that it would be counterproductive to post any 'The Truth From Krabi' video on YouTube," Krabi Provincial Police Commander Nantadech Yoinuan told the Gazette on Monday.

The video "The Truth From Krabi" was posted on YouTube as Krabi Police's response to the accusations by the father of the tourist reportedly raped while on holiday at Ao Nang, across Phang Nga Bay from Phuket.

The video explained why the cused was released on bail and what progress had been made in the case so far.

Krabi Police, after meeting with provincial officials including Governor Prasit, also considered posting an English-language version of the video.

However, they have now changed their minds.

Gen Nantadech told the Gazette that the "Evil man from Krabi" video had not stopped tourists from visiting Krabi, despite a leading local tourism figure saying the video had already cost the local industry income through room

booking cancellations.

"Given the current situation, we don't believe that posting a response will have any positive effect," he added.

Gen Nantadech explained that Thailand's laws are different from those of other countries.

"In Thailand, once police have ollected all evidence, questioned witnesses and the suspect has surrendered himself, the police hand him over to the public prosecutor and provincial courts.

"Whether or not he will be released on bail is firmly under the court's jurisdiction. He has the right to apply for bail," he said.

"In the 'Evil man' video, it says that the police 'easily' released the suspect. Absolutely not. It was the judge who granted bail. The police were not involved with that final decision," Gen Nantadech explained.

Protesters home after rally

THE hundreds of Phuket protesters who joined the Pitak Siam anti-government rally in Bangkok [see page 9] last weekend have arrived home safe in Phuket.

Concerns were raised on November 24 when police officers enforcing a cordon around the protest site at the Royal Plaza fired tear gas into the crowd and clashes between the protesters and police ensued.

Police Spokesman Maj Gen Piya Uthayo went on national television later that night to explain that the scuffles broke out after police responded to efforts by the protesters to break through the police ranks lined up to force rally attendees to parade along the mandated route to the protest site

An eye-witness account published by the Gazette partner publication *The Nation* reported that demonstrators were told to confront police by unknown members of the crowd with a

Apharat Chartchutikumjorn, the Pitak Siam coordinator for

Phuket, confirmed to the Gazette last Sunday afternoon that none of the Phuket contingent was injured in the scuffles.

"Some Phuket supporters suffered eye irritation from the tear gas, but fortunately none of us suffered any serious injuries," she

"Also, none of the Phuket protesters at the rally were detained by police. And all the supporters who were detained were released after we agreed to end the rally," she explained.

Ms Apharat said that the protest leader General Boonlert Kaewprasit called off the rally because he saw that the number of protesters was gradually becoming fewer and fewer.

"They were being blocked off [from reaching the protest site] by police officers," said Ms Apharat.

"Gen Boonlert was also worried that the situation might become more violent because he was told by some authorities that if the protesters insisted on staying, the officers would take stronger measures, as well as cut off the electricity and water.

Since then, normalcy has returned to the capital.

barriers on the nine roads where public access had been restricted.

Despite the protest not achieving its objective, Ms Apharat was happy to be back in Phuket.

'Although we were not successful, I am happy that we have arrived home safe," she said.

Some analysts reported that the handling of the protest was likely to have made Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra's administration stronger and boosted public confidence in her leadership.

Patong hotel fall survivor out of intensive care

TWO weeks after falling from the 18th floor of a Patong hotel, a 39year-old Australian tourist was moved from the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) to an orthopedic ward at Vachira Phuket Hospital this week.

The man, originally from Sydney, suffered broken ribs, a punctured lung and serious injuries to his left leg when he fell from the balcony adjoining his room at the Royal Paradise Hotel & Spa in Patong.

A spokesperson for the hospital's International Department told the Gazette on Monday that the Australian was breathing unaided and had been taken off life-support equipment.

"He still cannot sit, but responds well to stimuli and can eat and speak normally. However, he will need treatment for at least a month to allow the multiple fractures to start to heal," she said.

The spokesperson added that although the man is now on his own, his sister had visited and remained with him for three days before she returned to Australia.

Rawai councilor death prompts by-election

THE death of councilor Samart Piman in September led to San Changlek being elected councilor to Rawai Municipality after a close by-election on November 18.

According to the preliminary count, Mr San received 895 votes, just 32 votes more than those cast in favor of Sommai Yukunakorn, his only rival for the Ward 1 seat on the Rawai Municipal Council.

Commission Director

Kittipong Thiengkunakrit told the Gazette that 1,884 voters turned out at the polls.

"Of all the votes cast, 1,758 ballots were valid, 54 were 'spoiled votes' and 72 people chose the 'No Vote' option," said cilor for Rawai Ward 1. Mr Kittipong.

The council seat was designated vacant after Samart Piman died in a road accident on September 14, he explained.



Teacher's helper suspended over smack claim

A FEMALE teaching assistant at Koh Kaew Child Development Center has been suspended pending an investigation over a mother's claim that the assistant slapped her 4-year-old son in the face.

Ratkaphat Tonnum, 41, mother of the student at the center of the incident, told the *Gazette* that she had originally filed a complaint with the Koh Kaew Tambon Administrative Organization (*OrBorTor*).

Having not heard of any progress, on November 22 she filed a separate complaint with Prapan Kanprasang, the chief of the Phuket Damrongtham Center (provincial ombudsman's office) at Provincial Hall.

Ms Ratkaphat recounted the incident, which allegedly occurred on November 14.

"After my son had returned home from school I noticed a red mark on his cheek. After badgering him for about 20 minutes, he finally told me that he was slapped by a teaching assistant at school," Ms Ratkaphat explained.

In response to the allegations, Koh Kaew *OrBorTor* council president Khuakiet Chitkhua told the *Gazette* that he was taking action.

"If the allegation proves to be true, her employment will be terminated," said Mr Khuakiet.

Vice governor targets slew of beach management woes

PHUKET Vice Governor Chamroen Tipayapongtada has ordered every municipality and local administrative organization on the island to report all of their beach related issues.

The move is an attempt to redress a slew of problems ranging from floating lanterns affecting air traffic at Phuket Airport to illegal beach vendors counter-suing officials as a "stall tactic".

The news follows a meeting at Provincial Hall on November 19, where Vice Governor Chamroen heard a long and varied list of complaints by local authorities.


Beach encroachment was identified as a key issue at Laem Singh, Surin, Nai Yang and Yanui beaches.

Fireworks and floating lanterns – the latter especially enjoyed by tourists and celebrants during the annual Loy Krathong Festival, held this year on Wednesday – were identified as another source of complaint.

"The use of fireworks and floating lanterns must be restricted. I would like to permit such activities only for special celebrations," said Karon Deputy Mayor Itthiporn Sangkaew.

The complaint by Deputy Mayor Itthiporn follows Winai Chidchiew, the chief of Karon Subdistrict (Kamnan), being accused of allegedly threatening municipal officers into allowing firework displays to be held late at night in Karon.

"Also, tuk-tuks and taxis in the popular tourist beach areas of Kata and Karon need constant supervision and steps need to be

taken to stave off damage to the environment," Mr Itthiporn added.

Concern was raised that hotels in Sakoo and at Mai Khao, on Phuket's northwestern shore, allowed guests to set alight the floating lanterns and fireworks, releasing them skyward, potential affecting air traffic arriving at Phuket International Airport.

As a result, it was requested that such activities be banned from being held within a six-kilometer radius of the airport to ensure air traffic is not affected, and that the Provincial Office issue a formal notice to hotels in the area.

Winai Dechanupap, of the Sakoo Tambon Administrative Organization (*OrBorTor*), raised another troubling issue: illegal

beach vendors counter-suing local authorities as a delaying tactic to allow them to continue trading until their case is heard in

"More beach vendors have set up stalls on Nai Yang Beach. We are trying to stop them, but it seems they want to present their cases in court. The process of a judge hearing the case can take years, thus allowing them to continue to operate their businesses until the judge hands down a decision," Mr Winai explained.

An officer from Rawai Municipality explained that Rawai Mayor Aroon Solos is currently facing legal action for Rawai Municipality attempting to repair a badly damaged section of footpath that

was washed away by strong waves over the years.

"The mayor is being sued by a developer who claims to own the land," the officer said.

Concerns were also raised about untreated wastewater being piped into the sea at Yanui and Nai Harn Beaches, and at Koh Racha Yai Island – all three of which are popular swimming and snorkeling locations for tourists.

V/Gov Chamroen gave all local authorities until November 30 to file their list of complaints.

"Then we will discuss what action to take and we will dedicate one beach as a 'pilot beach' to launch a beach management project," he said.



Kata Reef roped off for safety

A REEF line has been installed around the North Kata Reef to protect swimmers, scuba divers and snorkelers from boat traffic and to prevent damage to the reef.

Staff from the Marine Safety Center in Kata and volunteers from the environmental conservation organization Go Eco Phuket joined forces with local government agencies to complete the task.

"It's important that we set the buoy line out at the beginning of each high season in order to keep the jet-skis, longtail boats and speedboats from damaging it, and to prevent them from colliding with divers and snorkelers," Go Eco Phuket member Joe Blasy told the *Gazette*.

"Much of Kata Reef lies just a few centimeters below the surface at low tide. We have secured 10 mooring lines in six to 10 meters of water," he explained.

Bouy lines were strung between the 10 mooring lines in order to clearly mark off the reef area.



Marine Safety Center personnel (pictured) were widely praised for their assistance. 'We couldn't have done it without them,' said Ms Leach.

Jet-skis and longtail boat operators were briefed to steer clear of the buoy lines at a meeting, explained Go Eco Phuket organizer Kerry Leach.

"There is now an area where tourists can enjoy the reef without being scared to death of boat traffic," she said.

Mr Blasy explained that the Go Eco Phuket marine conservation group had many more projects in various stages of progress (see page 38).

"We have a lot of ideas on which direction to take Go Eco Phuket, including but not limited to education of Thai youths on the importance of conservation and environmental consciousnesses, fishing net 'buy-back' programs and even sinking more artificial reefs in the area," he said.

Krabi police silence noisy exhaust pipes

KRABI Police destroyed more than 600 illegal motorbike exhaust pipes seized during police checks in September.

At a ceremony on November 20 to mark the culmination of a campaign entitled "Youths join together: ride motorbikes without modified exhaust pipes", Krabi Governor Prasit Osathanon and Krabi Police Commander Nantadech Yoinuan witnessed the crushing of the impounded modified exhaust pipes.

"The destruction of these pipes is part of a greater Royal Thai Police campaign to stamp out illegal [exhaust] pipe modifications," said Maj Gen Nantadech.

Krabi City Traffic Police officer Piyarat Buakhao, who is in charge of the project locally, said that many youths created excessive noise by fitting non-standard exhaust pipes to their motorbikes.

"Some youths handed over the illegal pipes to police. Other modified pipes were confiscated after arrests. We will carry on with checks for illegal pipes to put a stop to the noise pollution they cause." Lt Col Piyarat said.

Hard Rock Cafe says thanks to first responders

THE Hard Rock Cafe Phuket celebrated "Thanksgiving" by inviting 20 firemen for a Thanksgiving lunch at their venue.

These were the first responders from Patong Municipality Fire Department who assisted with the Hard Rock Cafe patio fire that took place on October 18 causing only superficial damage.

The firefighting team, led by Visit Mathasoontornpoj, general administration officer of Patong

Municipality, was able to enjoy a traditional Thanksgiving meal and a memorabilia tour by Hard Rock's Acting General Manager, Roland Nicolich.

The patio itself was re-opened on November 8 with a live performance by the Rock Evolutions band, who are on stage nightly.

It is not known whether they performed the Talking Heads classic Burning Down The House.

PHUKET Governor Maitri Inthusut in an exclusive interview with the Gazette on November 22 revealed his personal philosophy in handling the high-level decisions and complicated issues that Phuket faces as a resort province.


"This is my seventh week as the Governor of Phuket and the Phuket Gazette is the first English-language publication I have had a chance to talk to exclusively,"he said.

Friendly, open and focused on people broadening their perspectives in order to better achieve their goals – including happiness Governor Maitri explained that he adhered to several key principles that he calls his "Seven Wonders".

So deeply does Governor Maitri believe in these fundamental approaches to work and life that he has published a book entitled Seven Wonders: learning how to develop your career potential.

"The seven strategies altogether focus on being aware of your environment. You must know what is going on; you must 'know all around'," he said.

"First, you must know the people who surround you - the - Kritsada Mueanhawong | people you work with. Second,

you must know what those people do, and what they are responsible for achieving. That way you know who to approach directly in order to fix problems," Governor Maitri explained.

The third wonder was "Know How", he added. "You have to know the rules, processes and how to push forward within the organization," Governor Maitri said.

"The fourth strategy is 'Know When'. You must know when to 'knock on the door' to have problems fixed.

"The fifth strategy is called

'Give & Take Management', followed by 'Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats' [SWOT] management. The more you know people's strengths and weaknesses, the better you can manage them," he said.

The final strategy Governor Maitri has branded as "Charm management".

"You must know how to manage yourself to be charming so people want to talk to you. This way they come close to you and feel at ease when they talk to you," he explained.

"These are just some of the philosophies I use in performing my work as governor, but anyone can employ these strategies to improve their lives.

"I have found that these truths provide genuine benefits. I applied them during my time as governor in Trang and Phayao provinces they worked well. I am now adjusting these strategies to apply them here in Phuket. I am sure they will work well here, too," Governor Maitri said.

"I have handed copies of the book to officers here, so anyone can take this advice and use it in their working lives. There are many good things in the book, which can make everyone happy," he added.

'Mad scientist' Elon Musk aims for a Phuket-sized city on Mars

ELON Musk, the billionaire founder and CEO of private spaceflight company SpaceX, has unveiled plans to build a colony on Mars that would accommodate around 80,000 people and occupy as much real estate as the size of Phuket Town, Gizmodo reported on their website.

NASA landed the Curiosity Rover on Mars earlier this year, but Musk is already talking plans. Initially, the company would send about 10 people at a time aboard a huge reusable rocket powered by liquid oxygen and methane.

The first arrivals' top priority would be to see if living on the Red Planet is viable - probably as the Mars equivalent of conducting an Environmental Impact Assessment at Saphan Hin.

The colonizers would need tons of equipment, including

construction materials to build transparent domes to cover the newly built "shophouses" that will be pressurized to allow them to grow crops, as well as machines

that will produce fertilizer.

It would appear that Musk is thinking about "sustainability", a concept that that Phuket authorities are really only just getting to grips with. "On Mars, you can start a self-sustaining civilization and grow it into something really big." Musk told an audience at the Royal Aeronautical Society in London on November 16.

The whole plan is estimated to cost US\$36 billion which, Musk hopes to be funded jointly by SpaceX and the US government. Eventually, he hopes to offer to taxi passengers to Mars at US\$500,000 a ticket.

That said, he didn't mention how he would deal with the inevitable queue at immigration, taxis from the spaceport and hawkers trying to sell you a madeto-measure Armani spacesuit.

Anti-government rally fails

LAST weekend's anti-government protest by Pitak Siam ended in failure on the day it started, with leader Gen Boonlert Kaewprasit calling off the rally on Saturday evening and declaring that the group had "lost to evil".

The declaration came after some 137 people had been arrested, many in possession of weapons. Many more were injured by tear gas as police tried to prevent protesters pushing through barricades.

Two police officers were seriously injured.

The government took a hard line on the protest, invoking the Internal Security Act that gave security forces more powers to suppress the demonstration.

Police estimated the number of protesters at 20,000, while organizers put the figure at 50,000. Earlier, Gen Boonlert had vowed the protest would draw 1 million people.

Gen Boonlert said he called off the protest because the number of participants was smaller than expected, *The Nation* reported.

All over the country, supporters

nation

of the protest were blocked from travelling along the main roadsto Bangkok, such as Phetchakasem, Sukhumvit and Phaholyothin, he said.

He added that he was concerned about the well-being of protesters after police fired tear-gas canisters at them. He claimed that signs of bullets having been fired were also found at the protest site.

Gen Boonlert said he would not lead such a street demonstration again.

"General Boonlert is already dead. I have lost to evil," he said in an emotional announcement on the protest's main stage.

All 137 protesters arrested were later released, with the exception of one man detained for allegedly driving the truck that hit and seriously injured a police officer.

Both Pitak Siam and the authorities have since traded accusations over the protest.

While Pitak Siam claims the

government had broken agreements to let the "peaceful and democratic" protest take place, the government claims that the group

had attempted to incite violence with the intention of provoking the Army into staging a coup to restore order.

Dems target govt in no-confidence debate

ALMOST as soon as Pitak Siam's attempt to oust the government ended, the Democrat Party launched its own bid to fell the Yingluck Shinawatra administration – this time by more democratic means.

November 25 saw the first session of a three-day no-confidence debate in which the opposition launched attacks on major government figures, including Deputy Prime Minister Chalerm Yoobamrung, Defence Minister Sukumpol Suwanatat and Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra herself.

With the government controlling three-fifths of the seats in Thailand's lower house, it was never likely to lose the vote. However, the debates were an opportunity for the opposition to attempt to damage the current administration's credibility.

Particularly heated were exchanges between Mr Chalerm and maverick MP Chuwit Kamolvisit, *The Nation* reported.

Former brothel tycoon Mr Chuwit implied that Mr Chalerm, who oversees the Royal Thai Police, had taken bribes from gambling den owners.

Surapong moves on with ICC

FOREIGN Minister Surapong Towichukchaikul is pushing forward with his bid to have the International Criminal Court (ICC) investigate the deaths during the 2010 red-shirt protests.

Mr Surapong was due to meet on Thursday with representatives of relevant agencies to discuss giving the ICC jurisdiction over the issue.


He hopes to allow the international court to take cases against the previous administration of Abhisit Vejjajiva relating to the deaths of 98 people, mostly during crackdowns on April 10

and May 19, 2010.

He said the recognition would not be tantamount to losing the country's court sovereignty because the ICC would not interfere in cases that could be handled by Thai Criminal Court.

"We want to speed up the issue because we don't want to see more coups and more undemocratic actions or killings of Thais," Mr Surapong said.

Meanwhile, a Criminal Court inquest concluded on Monday that a red-shirt protester was killed by bullets fired by soldiers.



Gaza thanks Iran for war rockets

GAZANS offered public thanks to Iran on Tuesday for helping them in this month's conflict against Israel, when Iranian-made missiles were fired out of the Palestinian enclave towards Jerusalem and Tel Aviv.

"Thank you Iran", said large billboards on three major road junctions in the Gaza Strip – the first time there has been such public acknowledgment of Iran's role in the arming of Islamic militants in the tiny territory.

The message was written in Arabic, English, Hebrew and Farsi.

Call for return of **Red Army scrolls**

HUNGARIAN Jews have asked Russia to return scrolls and valuable religious items looted by Nazis and the Red Army during World War II. Their claim has received public support from the Budapest government.

Up to 400 Torah scrolls and thousands of vestments, crowns and other articles are being held in museums and storage in Russia, said Slomo Koves, executive rabbi of the Unified Hungarian Jewish Congregation.

Yuan, me: US

THE Obama administration said on Tuesday that China's currency remained "significantly undervalued," but stopped short of labeling the world's second-biggest economy a currency manipulator.

Although Beijing controls the pace at which the yuan can rise, the US Treasury said in a congressionally mandated semi-annual report that China did not meet the legal requirements to be deemed a currency manipulator.

In brief... Arafat assassination woes spark exhumation probe

FORENSIC experts took samples from Yasser Arafat's corpse in the West Bank on Tuesday, trying to determine if he was murdered with the hard-to-trace radioactive poison, polonium.

Palestinians witnessed the funeral of their hero and long-time leader eight years ago, but conspiracy theories surrounding his death have never been laid to rest.

Many are convinced their icon was the victim of assassination by Israeli agents, and may have been poisoned wittingly or unwittingly by a Palestinian. They may remain convinced of that, whatever the outcome of this autopsy.

Arafat's body was uncovered in the grave and samples removed without moving the corpse. The tomb was resealed in hours and wreaths placed by Palestinian leaders including Prime Minister Salam Fayyad.

The head of the Palestinian investigation committee, Tawfiq Tirawi, said the procedure went smoothly. A Palestinian medical team took samples and gave them to each of the Swiss, French and Russian forensic teams.

"We need proof in order to find those who are behind this assassination and take it to the ICC [International Criminal Court]," he

"Israel is occupying our land, and assassinations are not new, they have committed several, publicly and secretly... what's to stop them from assassinating Abu Ammar [Arafat]?"

French magistrates in August opened a murder inquiry into

Arafat's death in Paris in 2004, after a Swiss institute said it had discovered high levels of polonium on clothing of his which was supplied by his widow, Suha, for a television documentary.

'The state of the body was exactly what you would expect to find for someone who has been buried for eight years," Health Minister Hani Abdeen told a news conference. "There was nothing out of the ordinary."

Jordanian doctor Abdullah al Bashir, head of the Palestinian medical committee, said about 20 samples were taken and analysis would take at least three months.

"In order to do these analyses, to check, cross-check and double cross-check, it will take several months and I don't think we'll have anything tangible available before March or April next year," said Darcy Christen, spokesman for Lausanne University Hospital in Switzerland that carried out the original tests on Arafat's clothes.

Arafat was always a freedom fighter to Palestinians, but a terrorist to Israelis first and a partner for peace only later. He led the bid for a Palestinian state through years of war and peacemaking, then died in a French hospital aged 75 after a short, mysterious illness.

No autopsy was carried out at the time, at the request of Suha, and French doctors who treated him said they were unable to determine the cause of death.

But allegations of foul play surfaced immediately. Arafat had enemies among his own people, but many Palestinians pointed the finger at Israel, which confined the leader to his West Bank headquarters in Ramallah for the final two and a half years of his life, after a Palestinian uprising erupted.

Israel denies killing him. Its leader at the time, Ariel Sharon, now lies in a coma from which he is expected never to awake. Israel invited the Palestinian leadership to release all Arafat's medical records, which were never made public following his death and still have not been opened.



Bangaldesh mourns factory fire victims

BANGLADESH officials said on Tuesday that a fire that killed 111 textile workers was sabotage as protesters took to the streets for a second day and garment factories across the world's second biggest clothes exporter stopped work to mourn.

The fire, the country's ever industrial blaze, broke out on November 24 and consumed a multi-storey building of a Tazreen Fashions factory. More than 150 workers were injured.

The fire has put a spotlight on global retailers that source clothes from Bangladesh, where some workers are paid as little as US\$37 a month.

Interior Minister Mohiuddin Khan Alamgir said a preliminary inquiry indicated the fire was the result of arson. He promised to bring the culprits to justice.

"We are finding out as of now

who exactly the saboteurs are and all culprits will be brought to book," Alamgir said.

Earlier, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said she suspected the fire was an act of sabotage, but she did not identify any suspect or say why she thought the cause might have been arson.

Commerce chief: economy grew by 5%

PHUKET Commerce Office (PCO) chief Prakong Rukwong said that Phuket's economy had expanded in the first nine months of 2012.

According to a report published on the PCO website, Mr Prakong based his assessment on an observation that supply in the services and tourism sectors had increased, at the same time that demand in the investment sector, namely in corporate operations and consumerism in the private sector, was also on the up.

In the first nine months of the year, Phuket customs recored a total of 1,945,887 passengers,

representing a year-on-year (y-oy) increase of 5.62% from the same period last year.

This figure includes 1,799,216 well as another 146,671 passen-

passengers who entered the island at Phuket airport, which he said was a 2.02% decline, y-o-y, as gers who came via boat or yacht, a rise of 4.45% y-o-y. New hotel investments in the

first nine months of the year slumped y-o-y, he said.

Only two new hotels were granted building permits in accordance with hotel construction laws, half that of last year.

Likewise, new Board of Investment approved projects also declined, with a total of four projects in Phuket being approved during the period, down from five in the same period last year.

purchases in the third quarter boosted the financial results of most of Thailand's top 10 listed property firms over the same quarter of last year.

As a result, financial performance in the first nine months also improved, though some firms did report reductions in revenue and net profit in the first nine months.

However, these firms are expected to report full-year gains as they have a number of projects in the construction process, which are scheduled to be transferred to customers before the year-end.

Pruksa Real Estate reported revenue of 18.77 billion baht, up 0.26%, and net profit of 2.63bn baht, up 7.3% over the first three quarters of 2011. As such, the company ranks as the market leader in terms of revenue during this period.

Land & Houses reported revenue of 17.47bn baht and net profit 4.13bn baht in the first nine months, up 5.05% and 5.89% respectively. The company ranked second in terms of revenue but surpassed Pruksa in net profit.

Sansiri showed revenue of 16.01bn baht and a net profit of 1.2bn baht, up 24% and 26% respectively. The company also had presales worth 26.34bn baht in the

first nine months. It targets presales of 42bn baht for the full year.

Quality Houses reported revenue of 9.54bn baht and a net profit of 1.66bn baht, up 16.19% and 107.5% respectively.

Asian Property Development reported revenue of 10.78bn baht in the first nine months, down by 0.9% year-on-year. However, net profit, recorded at 1.42bn baht, was up by 18.33%.

Property Perfect recorded revenue of 6.49bn baht in the period, up 2.04%, while net profit was down 49% to 238.99 million baht.

SC Asset Corporation reported declines in both revenue and net profit, to 4.49bn baht and 511mn baht. Those figures were down 22.78% and 46.16% from the first three quarters of last year.

Supalai also suffered declines. Revenue was down 42.62% to 5.95bn and net profit down 48.91 % to 1.18bn baht.

LPN Development reported revenue of 6.37bn baht and net profit 982.63mn baht, down by 43.92% and 47.02% respectively.

Sansiri president Srettha Thavisin said that the company had seen presales worth 31.01bn baht since the beginning of the year and targeted 42bn baht for all of 2012.

The company has 12 condominium projects that will be transferred to buyers during the remainder of the year worth 15.3bn baht. This will drive its 2012 revenue to 26bn baht

LPN Development managing director Opas Sripayak said it

would deliver 7bn baht worth of condos in the current quarter. This will boost its presales to achieve this year's target of 10bn baht.

A survey by *The Nation* found that at least 50bn baht's worth of homes would be transferred to buyers this quarter, by both listed

and non-listed firms.

Sansiri will transfer at least 15bn baht's worth, LPN Development about 7bn baht, Asia Property Development about 6.4bn baht, SC Asset Corp about 4bn baht, and Pruksa Real Estate about 5bn baht. – *The Nation*

Bonding with your portfolio

Island Investor

PEOPLE usually think of bonds as safe investments, although I have written before about the dangers that are not so obvious to investors.

The reason they can be dangerous in a low interest rate environment, such as we are in now, is because as interest rates rise, the market value of a bond or portfolio of bonds drops, and you can lose principal if you need to sell them. One way to avoid this risk is to buy shorter maturity bonds and hold them until they mature.

When looking at bond quotes you will notice that there are several yields quoted. In an environment such as this, you need to make sure you use the 'yield to maturity'. If you use 'coupon yield' or 'current yield' you may be in for a big shock when you get less than your principal back at maturity.

Coupon yield is simply the percentage return based on the face value of the bond. So a 10% coupon on a US\$1,000 bond would be \$100 per year. However, when you buy the bond it is often trading at a premium in an environment such as we are in now, let's say

\$1,100 to use easy numbers.

Thus, you lose \$100 at maturity because you only get \$1,000 back, so your total return, or annual yield to maturity, will be less than the 10% quoted coupon rate. The \$100 annual payment you receive is also actually less than 10% for you, because you paid \$1,100. The current yield also faces a similar problem

caused by the fact that you are getting back less principle than you put in.

Of course, if interest rates are higher than normal, bonds will often sell at a discount. If you purchased the same bond in the previous example for \$900 vou would not only receive more than 10% per annum from the annual \$100 payment, but upon maturity you would receive an extra \$100 back in principle.

Yield to maturity is the calcu-

lation that takes all of these considerations into account and tells you what you will receive per annum in percentage terms, assuming you hold the bond until maturity based on the price you would actually pay for it today. You don't need to know how to calculate it, as it should be included in the quotation for any bond offered to you. If it isn't, make sure you ask for it before making a decision.

The important thing to understand is, if you need to see the bond prior to maturity, you are not likely to receive the same yield, as you may make a loss on the principle if interest rates in the market have gone up. If you are five years away from maturity and inflation becomes an issue, you are also at risk of losing purchasing power as you cannot take advantage of rising interest rates.

One more risk to be aware of is, if you buy bonds denominated in a foreign currency, you could potentially lose more on the exchange rate than you gain from the higher yield (of course this could theoretically go in your favor too).

Motoring misery

AS WORK on the 600-million-baht underpass at the Central Festival Phuket intersection gets underway, mounting concern among commuters now turns to seeking out ways to cope with what promises to be a whole new level of motoring misery.

Government agencies, including traffic police, have freely admitted that work on the project, scheduled for completion in mid-October 2014, is expected to cause unprecedented traffic jams.

Unfortunately, their advice "to devise alternative routes to avoid the area" will come as little help to the many thousands of people who live, work and study in the area.

Traffic flow is now reduced to only two lanes each way – if no parked cars block the left outside lane in front of the Central Festival shopping complex – a situation that is expected to prevail throughout much of the two-year construction period.

Pleading for patience, authorities have effectively told the public that the short-term pain will justify the long-term gain.

About this, the *Phuket Gazette* maintains some very serious doubts. For a start, two years will seem more like an eternity to parents who try to get their children safely by car to the two schools located in the immediate vicinity: the Darasamuth and Wichit Songkram schools. There are many other large school complexes nearby that will likewise be seriously affected: HeadStart, Phuket Tai Hua and Kajonkietsuksa, to name just a few.

Many of these parents will be forced to leave their cars at home and take to the streets by motorbike. As is always the case in any sample among motorbike riders in Phuket, a certain percentage of these will inevitably be injured or killed in road accidents.

Tens of thousands of workers at many hundreds of retail outlets in the area will also suffer, as will unsuspecting tourists who find themselves entrapped in the gridlock.

Indeed, tourists will now face the prospect of having much of their holiday time swindled by the ever-increasing traffic problem – in addition to the norm of being ripped off by overpriced taxis.

The entire project appears to have a very serious design flaw. Those travelling east-west through the junction will eventually see some benefit, but the much larger volume of traffic north-south along Chao Fa West Road will find that the underpass does little to help them. This is because the underpass does not address the main cause of all the current congestion in the area: the bottleneck just south of Wichit Songkram School, where Chao Fa West abruptly reduces to just one-and-a-half lanes in each direction.

When the project is finally completed, expect traffic congestion in this area to persist – if not worsen – as ever more vehicles pour in from the completed underpass and other directions. For now, however, motorists may for the first time find themselves frozen in tailbacks with nothing but concrete walls to view and polluted air to breathe. Perhaps that might be a good time for them to contemplate the intentions of the architects of public transport deprivation on Phuket, and to reflect upon the reasons for the inability of so many successive governments to rectify it.

Safety first, with urban growth a close second

LETTER FROM THE GOVERNOR

PHUKET is a small place, but it bears has a huge responsibility. I see seven distinct management issues in Phuket. All are connected and all need fixing.

With the tourism industry growing at 10 per cent per year, the safety of tourists and residents must be our top priority.

Phuket already has more than 2,400 closed-circuit television (CCTV) systems and there are plans to increase that by another 2,000 publicly accessible CCTV systems across the island. Having more CCTV will make people feel safer and help police to arrest criminals.

Another important issue in Phuket is the vast number of complaints over land ownership and the very high price of land. All of these cases are complicated. So far as the business of unlawful issuance of title deeds by officials; well, I'll being taking care of that. Concerning the matter of land ownership, please understand that the legal process does take time to complete.

The third issue that concerns me is the island's traffic. We are currently trying to add alternative routes to get around the island. The Darasamuth [Central Festival] underpass started on Friday, November 23. The next project will be the Tesco Lotus intersection and by the end of this month we will have selected the project contractor for that project. Following on from those projects are the Bang Khu Intersection and the Klong Koh Pee flyover project.



Maitri Inthusut arrived on the island to take up the position of Governor of Phuket on October 8.

With a master's degree in political science from Thammasat University, he joined the National Security Council, rising to the position of NSC Secretary-General, before taking up the position of Chief Secretary for Secretariat of the Cabinet.

He has also served as Governor for the provinces of Trang and Phayao. Here, in his inaugural 'Letter from the Governer', he identifies his top issues for the island and why they are important for Phuket's future.

My final concern is one of consumer protection, including scams targeting tourists. Phuket has the Damrongtham Center to receive complaints from people and it's working very well.

What has impressed me during my first seven weeks as governor is the strong bonds between the private sector, non-governmental organizations and local government. So many good projects that benefit society have been undertaken by this cooperation.

For tourists who intend to visit Phuket, we are all ready to welcome you. Phuket is improving for the better. Soon there will be no longer be "tourism low seasons" in Phuket, as you can visit us anytime of the year. Once you've visited Phuket, I'm confident that you'll be impressed and that we will see you again.

When brown becomes clear

AFTER reading the ongoing stories about the "Evil Man from Krabi" YouTube video and the bungled response from the Royal Thai Police in the bayside province there, I cannot help but think how the police officers involved in the case are being targeted by outlandish Western cynicism.

The Dutch father who posted the video has every right to be outraged. His daughter has suffered a horrific ordeal and the perpetrators must be brought to justice.

Yet, the police have replied openly to the accusations that the suspect was released on "police bail" with one of the clearest answers one would ever expect to hear in Thailand: they didn't, it was the provincial court that released the suspect on bail despite police arguing against it.

It doesn't get much clearer

The same goes for the terrible story about the British couple Jack Cole and April Clifton on holiday in Ao Nang – the same area where the Dutch woman was allegedly raped - being subjected to a vicious attack by gang of teenagers.

It was heartening to hear that the leading police officer investigating that case was "exasperated" that he was powerless to do anything about the attempted rape allegations. Imagine a police officer being told about a heinous crime and having the suspects in custody, but not being able to press charges for that specific crime because the victim him or herself has not substantiated the claim by simply telling police? A horrible position to be in.

If Mr Cole and Ms Clifton wanted to amend their "complaint" with the police, they have had certainly enough time to do so. Apparently, they haven't.

So, with just these two cases in mind, where in the Western world would reporters have direct access to the actual officer

I have a company that is based in Phuket, but my work requires that I am able to work in other provinces. What do I need to do in order to prevent any issues with my work permit occurring while working away from Phuket?

You do not need to get a new work permit to work in another province. If you have a company based in Phuket then you should get your work permit here. To work in other provinces you need to visit the Phuket Employment Office to add the "other work places" to your work permit. We

When a Burmese workers' camp springs up, why is the electricity always supplied by thin white wires supported by a single pole? Is this electricity piggybacked off someone else's power supply, and does that person pay?

Is this the best way to supply lectricity to the Burmese work ers? If so, who pays for the electricity they use?

It is very dangerous and a serious threat to man and beast alike. Come and see the camps just after Supalai Hills, the camp opposite the power substation on Thepkrasattri Road and various other camps around the island.

Department, replies:

When installing power supply to a Burmese workers' camp, PPEA officers connect the power supply wire to the nearest large power pole. If you see any connections you suspect may be illegal, please call the PPEA Operations & Maintenance Department at 076-210379 and we will check it out.

I have not heard of any cases of Burmese construction camps stealing electricity from their neighbors. What they always do is have the construction company contact us to provide a temporary electricity meter to be used during the construction at the site. The company will rent the meter from us.

The company has to show our officers the construction area and the employment contact or construction contract. Our officers will check the documents and examine the area where the power is going to be supplied. They then will install the power meter at or near the camp, and connect the power supply cable to the nearest large power pole.

The construction company is held responsible for paying for the electricity used. The fee is "triple rate" – around 5 to 6 baht per unit.

The company also has to pay a deposit for the meter. The deposit is refunded when meter is

YAOWAWIT School and Lodge is getting greener with a new solar PV field donated by solar solution and service provider Conergy, The Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany to Thailand and freight-forwarding company Logwin Air + Ocean (Thailand) Ltd.

The school celebrated the installation with a presentation to students, faculty and the community.

"We were very happy when we heard about the opportunity to install a solar panel field in Yaowawit, since it will not only give our students the opportunity to learn about how solar energy functions, but it will reduce our energy costs for the next 25 years.

"The Yaowawit School is very grateful for this generous donation. We are proud to be the first school in the Phang Nga province, maybe even in all of Thailand, to have its own solar panel field.

"We will do our best to make it a learning center for both our students and those in the neighboring communities and it will serve as a role model for others," said Yaowawit School headmaster Kunchana Mailaeaid.

With the launch, the Yaowawit School will have 324 solar modules adjacent to the school covering nearly 476 square meters

and producing 227,400 watts of power per day. Construction on the solar field began in June this year. The school anticipates using the energy to operate lights, air-conditioning, computers and other appliances and reduce its energy cost by 50 per cent.

The Yaowawit solar installation is the result of a partnership between the German government and German private enterprise.

The Yaowawit School and Lodge is a private charitable boarding school, which started educating students in 2006 and was inaugurated by Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Sakri Sirindhorn.

Currently, the school educates and provides shelter to 110 students, that come from very poor and broken families or suffered consequences from the 2004 tsunami.

The school teaches students life skills, such as English, hospitality and farming, in order to be able to break the circle of poverty.

The school's aim is to one day become self-sufficient by leveraging the small lodge and the 70 rai large farm.

Today the school still depends on donations and sponsorship and offers many programs to help supporters get involved.

Suwit Pattamakanthin

A NOTED Danish marine biologist once called him a "formidable conchologist," but Suwit "Jom" Pattamakanthin, the man behind the establishment of Phuket's first seashell museum, refuses to be labeled as such.

"I am nothing of the sort, and I am not a dealer either," says Suwit, who prefers to be known by his nickname.

We'll just settle on the title "collector." But Jom is also a naturalist, entrepreneur, artist and writer, whose life happens to evolve around the study, classification and collection of seashells.

Having set up three museums devoted to this species alone, Jom and his family hold an extensive collection of shells from around the world, including some rare pieces that have a market value in the thousands of dollars.

Jom inherited his love for seashells from his father who, as a supplier of marine aquarium fish in the 1970s, developed a deep appreciation for the species.

" My father used to say that if you understand shells, you will understand the world. And I don't think he was too far off from the truth," muses Jom.

His father, Jom says, has laid the foundation for the kind of life he leads today and the quest to continue his legacy has taken Jom far and wide. He travels the world to source rare shells, attend

conferences on the subject, network and make friends with like-minded people. He has visited many exotic coasts; Mauritius; the Seychelles; the Philippines; Indonesia; Sri Lanka; India and Africa. He has been cheated, mugged, robbed, and almost died, all in the name of seashells.

"Shells are a big deal for me, having opened up and enriched my life no end. My wife complains that I spend more time with seashells than with her," he chuckles.

His passion for seashells has inspired him to publish his adventures in the form of a short diary complete with drawings and delicate watercolors.

Having handed over the management of the Phuket Seashell Museum in Rawai to his uncle. Jom opened two smaller exhibition spaces for exotic shells, one in Bangkok and another in Jungceylon in Patong in 2010.

However, he admits that a shopping mall doesn't exactly provide the ideal space to display his precious collection. He is rethinking his approach and is now in the process of finding a more suitable space to house his rare pieces.

He reveals: "I'd like to create a space that will not only show off the beauty of shells but also highlight their rich social and cultural associations. In ancient times, shells were used as part of architecture, jewelry and as a form of money. They were important enough to be put in the burial ground for the dead to use in the afterlife."

An immense project by any standard, but Jom is undaunted. His extensive knowledge and his museum experience will stand him in good stead for the task ahead.

But before that, he has another quest to complete. Ever since he was a boy, one unique shell species has captured his imagination, cypraea moneta linnaeus, used widely as money in the old days. However, in its exceptional form – comprising a raised, curled rim on porcelain-like yellow and white skin - the species is considered the king of all shells.

Over time, two have come Jom's way. Now he is on a mission to acquire a third, which he believes to be the last of the lot. The search will take him to New Caledonia and will cost him a lot. though he refuses to reveal its market value.

"Decidedly it's a lot of money but the complete collection will prove invaluable for our future museum," says the 36-year-old.

Phuket and ignorance about SSI

Diving

THERE are almost a hundred dive training agencies in the world. Over a dozen specialize in cave diving, even more in technical diving, but the market is dominated by recreational dive training agencies. Even the second largest agency in the world is hardly more than a name to many divers on the island.

Scuba Schools International (better known simply as SSI) has grown in leaps and bounds in Thailand over the last eight years increasing their market shares by around 40 per cent year on year.

Despite this, it has only a fledgling grip on Phuket, leaving many divers unsure and unaware of the program's core philosophies and practices.

With SSI holding its biennial Global Meeting of Area Office on Phuket in November, and opening up an office in Chalong in December, it is obvious that basking in pure ignorance of the institution is no longer possible.

In an exclusive interview with the Director of SSI Southeast Asia, Gary Hawkins, the Phuket Gazette has been able to get a better idea of what SSI is all about.

Phuket Gazette: Gary, I have heard a lot about SSI recently, but honestly, still don't have a firm grip of what it's all about. So, what is SSI?

Gary Hawkins: It started 40 years ago in the US. Initially it was set up to service retailing dive centers, as opposed to the other large [diving certification] organization that went towards doing an association of diving instructors. So, from the very

beginning we've always had a philosophy that we'll only deal with full-service dive centers. In return we get a lot more retail sales going on in dive stores. Divers who own equipment are proven to generally continue diving, and our philosophy is to train all divers to always take advantage of full-service dive centers, whether it be for taking vacations... buying equipment or just for further education.

We are currently the fastest growing agency on the planet... As an agency we are very inventive, for example, we brought out the first instructional DVD, and were the first ones to bring out online learning.

And what we are bringing out in January-Feburary will also be a first.



It is a much more modern approach to education. At the moment a lot of people in the diving industry are saying they have gone digital in some way shape or form. And right now what that actually means is that [they] save [costs] and [have]

That's not going digital, that's distributing PDFs. The road we've already started to go down is making it a full digital interactive experience... The accessibility of our materials will also be huge. Because it means any mobile device, any computer, anyone anywhere can actually access their materials. What's revolutionary about it is how we are going to distribute that, and how we are





they add on top to do local conditions environmental challenges... And that is also brought about by our core philosophy that we will only teach real-world skills that work under the worst possible conditions. So the most common statement

I get from instructors crossing over to us is that 'SSI allows me to teach how I've always taught without breaking standards'. And it's just common sense to us. So flexibility in training. The rest is customer

service, encouraging people to travel and giving the ultimate diving experience is how we call it – rather than just teaching diving.

In modern terms we have phone apps that are free of charge. Customers always have their certification with them, so there is

no more lost card. [The apps also have] all the hand signals and all the dive tables on there... including open manuals that are free.

What is the range of dive certifications on offer at SSI?

Everything from messing around in the swimming pool, Try Scuba, right the way up to training instructors. As far as specialties are concerned, we have all the core specialties. For example, rescue, deep, night, navigation, boat, a lot of unique specialties, a lot of environmental based specialties. It's growing all the time basically.

I know specifically in Thailand, language has been a huge hurdle for many Thai divers wanting to break into the ranks of the professionals, what languages are SSI texts available in?

We do have Thai language texts. That was a challenge, but we've done it. Also, in December we are going to have Thai online learning. So for the entire Thai market it will be free of charge. So they can go online, and basically study for their open water in their own language. That's full interactive experience. There is a minimum of 27 but I know for a fact there are 38 languages planned. We stock 27 languages for most of our core products.

What weaknesses do vou see SSI having as an agency?

The weakness is a double-edged sword, which is also our strength. Specifically here in Phuket, it's killing me. That weakness is that we don't allow individual instructors from a business perspective. If we allowed the independent instructor who works out of [his or her] home to do business with us, without affiliating with a full-service dive center, our market share in Phuket would just (snaps) double overnight. And I know that, because I'm talking with these guys. So that business-wise is a weakness, but it's also our strength. If we did do that then it would be much easier for us to get market penetration... In an established market it's a strength.

We simply don't have the volume... that we need to cope with the growth that we currently have... it's a weakness, because I can't go into a store and say, 'Here are 50 instructors, choose'. From an instructor's point of view it's a huge plus. Because we will personally place them in jobs. As quick as we get them they get employed.

3G WiFi offerings in Phuket

IN THE first installment of this series, I talked about the general state of internet connections in Phuket. Last week, I covered the current offerings in land lines, with TOT Fiber 2U 10 Mega bits per second (Mbps) representing the best bang for your baht (sometimes; 1,500 baht/month), True DOCSIS "Ultra" coming in second (if you can get it; 599 bt/mo or 1,299 bt/ mo for a moderately faster line), then TOT's WiNet hybrid wirelessto-your-home (599 bt/mo), and finally all of the ADSL lines, which are generally indistinguishable from one another, and run 599 bt/mo.

While you'll find advertisements for 20 Mbps or even 100 Mbps land lines in Phuket, it's rare that we get a line that clocks much more than 2 or 3 Mbps consistently, judging by international single-threaded downloads (see: phuketinternetspeed.com). Lately, even some of the Fiber 2U lines have slowed down to the point where they're indistinguishable from plain-vanilla ADSL lines.

A speed of 2 to 3 Mbps isn't bad: it'll keep a Skype video connection going, and you'll be able to see YouTube and other low definition video sources without much dropping or pausing. But, if you want to stream high definition TV, particularly if it isn't cached in Bangkok, chances are awfully good that you'll be disappointed with any line in Phuket.

This week I want to take a look at 3G wireless offerings in Phuket. I hate the term 3G because anybody can sell anything and call it "3G". In Phuket, we had one telephone company that used the term 3G for a wireless internet service that's not even close to the commonly accepted definition of 3G. That service is gone now, so I guess it makes a little bit of sense to talk about 3G in Phuket. I'll begrudgingly follow the common parlance.

If you don't understand the difference between 3G and WiFi, you aren't alone. Many of the people who sell 3G and WiFi in Phuket don't know the difference either. If you need a primer, I went over the main factors in my May 25 Live Wire column last year.

When you start looking at wireless connections, one of the first bits of terminology you'll find is "3.9G". Saints preserve us. Since there's no real definition of 3G, you can rest comfortable in the knowledge that there's even less of a definition for 3.9G. It's all marketing flim-flammery.

In Thailand, the term 3G is synonymous with HSPA wireless technology. If you pay for 3G, what you're actually getting is HSPA. There's a greatly improved version of HSPA called HSPA+, and that's what TOT calls 3.9G.



While HSPA+, in theory, should run almost twice as fast as HSPA, the fact is that TOT hasn't built out its infrastructure to support faster speeds. We rarely see 3.9G HSPA+ connections running any faster than 3G HSPA.

And all the fluff about 42 Mbps - the advertised speed for some 3G services in Phuket – it's drivel. Utter fantasy. The technology may be theoretically capable of running 42 Mbps, in a lab. Our measured speeds out in the field here typically come in between 0.6 and 1.2 Mbps – and that's both 3G and 3.9G. The speed varies greatly depending on your physical location: Phuket isn't blanketed with 3G towers. If you get a slower connection, expect to have trouble connecting with Skype. If you get a faster connection, you can certainly watch YouTube

videos on a phone or low quality tablet, but you may see a lot of drops and stutters on a 10-inch tablet, including the iPad.

Last week I talked about the dearth of information on the web about land lines: you can't go to a vendor's site, click a button or two, and see a full list of what's offered and how much it costs. Same with wireless services. To get the latest prices, you need to physically go to a shop and ask.

One of the enduring, endearing features of 3G in Phuket is that the Thai government hasn't figured out what it's doing with 3G. As a direct result, not all 3G phones/tablets/USB dongles will work on a specific carrier's channels. You should take your phone (tablet, dongle) with you when you buy a 3G package, and make sure that it's working before you leave the shop.

Here are my recommendations for 3G package vendors, in order:

CAT My Click has a new HSPA+ network that isn't really new. It's the old TrueMove-H network, which was bought and built by True subsidiaries, but then under terms of the obligatory contract reverted back to CAT. The big advantage? CAT sells the service for about half of what the other 3G companies charge: 590 baht per month.

Like all of the 3G vendors, CAT advertises that its package is "unlimited" but that's ridiculous. Every "unlimited" package, regardless of vendor, has a limit to the amount of data you can download in a month – some 2 GB, some 3 GB, at least one has 4 GB, and after you download the maximum amount, your speed is cut back so severely you'll think you're using a tin can and string. Most people can get by with 2 or 3 GB per month, but only if they use the 3G connection for viewing YouTube videos or checking Facebook or email. Heavier use – including tethering a computer to your phone – will no doubt blow through the data cap in much less than a month.

TrueMove-H and DTAC both use the CAT network. As far as I can tell, all three networks work equally well (or poorly, depending on your location). The main difference: CAT is half the price of the other two. You may find that one of the three has a deal that you can use – a discount on

the iPhone 5, say, or a Samsung Note II.

Sometimes True runs a discount on 3G when you buy TrueVision (formerly UBC) satellite TV service. But when it comes to the 3G network, they're all the same.

AIS uses the TOT network. While CAT has had 3G service and towers in Phuket for years, TOT is a

relative newcomer.

Although they seem to have good coverage, neither CAT nor TOT publish detailed maps that reliably tell you where their

services drop off. As a result, you may find that either AIS/TOT or CAT/True/DTAC provide stronger signals in your particular location.


Prices are subject to change without notice – heaven knows the web pages won't be updated – but as things stand right now, the wireless line speeds from all of the vendors are pretty close to identical, and CAT has a big advantage on price.

Next week I'll step you through the procedures involved in getting a new internet connection.

freshest seasonal ingredients acquired by artisan growers in the Montreal region. I started at Toque as an intern and left as 'Executive Sous-Chef'.'

Cheryl arrived on Phuket earlier this year and was faced with a rather simple clubhouse building. 


His answer was received with a standing ovation lasting ages and it entitled him to receive a case of 25 year old Eldorado rum for his answer.

Life & style Marginal Choices Plants for a marshy environment

THERE has been lots of hot air expended about marginals during the run-up to the

American presidential election. In political terms, "marginals" are states where a few key votes may swing all the seats either in a Republican or Democratic direction. In the case of Florida, all 28 members elected to Congress. Marginals can be very important.

In the world of flora, marginals have different connotations. True, they exist in *marginal* situations, straddling the divide between land and water, plants that flourish in shallow water, or mud, or in soil that is more-or-less permanently moist.

More crucially, they normally grow, as the name suggests, at the margins or fringes of expanses of water – lakes, rivers, even your

domestic fish Gardening pond. And normally they are not By Patrick Campbell "floaters" such as

lilies (nympheas) or water hyacinths, but erect growers with tall, stiff stems and foliage. In fact, the waxy, emersed leaves only tend repel water, but utilize light in the way of terrestrial plants, photosynthesizing in the same manner.

These plants can also be grown in pots, but preferably with more mud than water, in order to simulate their natural marshy habitat. And they will need feeding. It is worth dividing these marginals into two groups: those that need to have their feet permanently in shallow water or saturated soil; and those (canna lilies, for instance) that can put up with somewhat drier conditions for short periods: for example when pond levels temporarily recede.

In the former category, you might include the eponymous lotus, though in natural conditions, it does tend to spread out across entire lakes, and certainly the varieties of cyperus mentioned in earlier articles. Tall and graceful, the Egyptian papyrus will enhance the appearance of any water garden. At least one variety can be cultivated in temperate regions, so if you still have a residence outside the tropics, it is worth thanking about.

The papyrus, with its cylindrical stems, is actually a sedge. Like the rush family, of which the bulrush (typha angustifolia) is the best known and most widely distributed, both rushes and sedges are familiar waterside plants in temperate regions, useful because they fringe the margins of lakes, streams and rivers. Look out for them. Some varieties also grow here.

One, (juncus variegata) a variegated form known as the gold strike rush, has beautiful vellow stripes along the length of its narrow leaves. I have not seen it in garden centers, but it is worth prospecting for. Sedges tend to be characterized by hollow, hairless, circular stems, rushes more often have flat, spathe-like leaves. Both sprout from rhizomes beneath the surface of the water, and can cope with infertile soils including sandy ones.

With conventional irises, one is in the realm of plants, as with marsh-loving canna lilies or calocasias, that may survive without constant moisture. Not the case though with water irises, which come from wetland habitats, and prefer permanently water-logged soil. They have large, attractive, tri-sepaled flowers which droop – hence the blooms are called "falls" – and they come in a huge range of colors (iris means rainbow).

Moreover, they are vigorous growers, some producing blooms as tall as two meters in height. As with all these plants, they are good for containers, but will need feeding with fertilizer tablets placed in the mud.

Many varieties have been developed in the southern USA: for example, "Black Gamecock" a deep purple Louisiana hybrid; others, more familiar to Europeans, include the yellow flag iris (pseudocorus). Like sedges and rushes, they are generally temperate or sub-tropical; whether they can tolerate conditions here is open to speculation.

Tip of the Week

What's in a name?

AS FAR as plants are concerned, quite a lot. They have common English names and Thai equivalents, but also botanical names – usually two Latinate words with the second epithet providing useful information about such matters as growth habit, type of foliage, size or shape of blooms, or even medicinal properties. Tonguetwisting they may be, but these botanical names are recognized the world over by many horticulturalists. Worth remembering.

For example *fragrans* means sweet

refer to abundant and large flowerers. Rotundifolia suggests round leaves, variegata bi-colored foliage. Nocturnum implies a night flowerer, mutabilis blooms that change color. Japonica revealsa of Japanese origin, chinensis a Chinese one. Every so often these epithets, which are linked to the plant's name – the first word – contain surprising information.

In the case of allamanda Allamanda cathartica cathartica, the second word shows that this climber can be used as a

purgative (cathartic). Or once was... smelling, *floribunda* and *grandiflora* respectively

ROBERT A. CARO THE YEARS OF LYNDON JOHNSON THE PASSAGE OF POWER

LITERARY LEGEND: Robert A Caro (below) has managed to win almost every prestigious award for historical biographies that exist.



Tale of a titan

THE historian Robert A Caro has won just about every literary award that it is possible to win. His debut biography in 1974 was *The Power Broker: Robert Moses and the Fall of New York.* The urban planner (and destroyer) changed the face of New York, for better or ill, while never holding an elective office. This is a story of raw political power.

And what better subject for raw political power than Lyndon Johnson? Caro has been working on a five volume biography of the former US president for nearly 40 years until the overall title *The Years of Lyndon Johnson*.

The fourth volume of the series is *The Passage of Power* (Alfred A Knopf, New York, 2012, 712pp) and covers the years 1958 to 1964, ranging from Johnson's six years as Democratic Majority Leader during which time he wielded unprecedented power as the Master of the Senate.

But his ultimate ambition was to become President, one that he constantly pronounced as a boy. He was also deathly afraid of humiliation, of becoming the failure that his father was, and this prevented him from contesting the 1960 primaries that saw John F Kennedy advance to the Democratic nomination in the convention at Los Angeles.

To win Texas and other southern states, Kennedy tapped Johnson as his running mate. Liberals, labor chiefs, civil rights leaders and, most of all Robert Kennedy, were appalled and adamantly opposed. Bobby made no less than three trips to Johnson's hotel room to dissuade him from accepting the offer. Bobby hated Johnson.

Yet Johnson was not merely a master politician, capable of stealing an election when necessary. He was also a sincere believer in the causes of fighting poverty and

promoting civil rights. Robert Kennedy's character was no less complex than Johnson's.

"Bobby Kennedy's behavior during the Cuban Missile Crisis had not been the first indication that behind the Torquemada glower, the prosecutor's jabbing fist, the insistence that all surren-

ders be unconditional that made the adjective 'ruthless' an apt description no matter how deeply he resented it, beneath an idealization of his father, the need to attain his approbation, which seemed to be a constant motivation in his life – that beneath all this, there was something more, something quite different, within Robert Francis Kennedy."

The above sentence is typical of Robert A Caro, the lofty Augustan tone, the orotund and serpentine sentences. It's a kind

of writing that has largely gone out of style in English prose and can be a delight to read.

Caro's prose is, however, overwrought and repetitious and all of his books would benefit from editorial pruning. However, he has attained such a lofty literary eminence that no one seems to have the temerity to try.

Caro details exhaustively how Attorney General Robert Kennedy tormented Johnson while he languished in the powerless office of the Vice President.


Then came John Kennedy's assassination in Dallas on November 22, 1963.

Johnson showed impeccable leadership in the chaotic transition, including a tour de force speech before the joint houses of Congress. He was now back

as Master of the Senate and began pushing through all the long-stalled Kennedy programs for tax cuts, education and, most of all, civil rights.

Johnson's Voting Rights Act in August 1965 would enfranchise American blacks and change the face of political power forever. Johnson would bestride Congress like a titan, until his downfall over the Vietnam war in 1968.

Caro is 77-years-old. Each of his books about Johnson took around a decade to write. Let's hope he's around at 87 to present the final volume of Johnson's presidential years.

Life & style Father of the Nation

ON December 5, HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej, or King Rama IX of the Chakri Dynasty, the longest reigning Thai monarch, will turn 85 years old.

Looking back in time, the circumstances surrounding HM King Bhumibol's 1946 ascension to the throne couldn't have been more remarkable.

Born the second son to Prince Mahidol of Songkhla, the brother of King Prachadhipok (Rama VII), neither the King nor his elder brother Ananda Mahidol were in any way expected to be part of the long line of the Chakri Dynasty that had ruled Siam since 1782.

His father, Prince Mahidol na Songkhla, was the heir presumptive but when he passed away and the childless King Prachadhipok died in 1935, the crown was, by law of ascension, bestowed on Bhumibol's elder brother Ananda when he was 9-years-old.

However, when King Ananda died in 1946, the crown was once more passed on, this time to his younger brother, the present King Bhumibol. He was 18 then.

HM King Bhumibol returned to Switzerland, where he had lived since then, to study law and political science and his uncle, Rangsit, Prince of Chainat, was appointed Prince Regent. HM the King returned to Thailand in 1950, when his coronation took place. His full name – Bhumibol Adulyadej - means 'The Strength of the Land: Incomparable Power'.

The King is a great achiever. He has been called the revolutionary king, the reformist king, the development king, the jazz king (he has composed no less than fifty songs), and the people's engineer. To the Thais however, he is known fondly as "the Father of the Nation," or Por Luang. Indeed, his birthday is also celebrated as a Father's Day in Thailand.

Having a lifelong interest in agriculture, the King has developed agriculture-related projects that include soil management, drought and flood mitigation, and wastewater management, among others.

A gifted inventor, the King has engineered modern and cost effective machines to solve difficult farming and environmental situations such as the Royal Rain and the aerator for polluted water, for example.

But for the Thais, he is most renowned for his philosophy of Sufficiency Theory or setsakit por pieng, that he proposed to the nation during the economic crisis in the late 1990s.

Sufficiency Theory advocates a livelihood of moderation and a development model based on small incremental steps devoid of high risks or speculations.

Giving a definition, the King says: ".. Self Sufficiency doesn't

mean each family has to grow their own food or weave their own clothes. That is too extreme. In fact, it could mean wealth as long as the money earned is not the result of exploitation of others.."

During the two decades of its application, setsakit por pieng has become the byword for many Thais who genuinely embrace the concept and successfully apply it to their lives.

While the foreign press is happy to point out that King Bhumibol's wealth based on assets held by the Crown Property Bureau (oblivious to the fact that the resources of the Crown are passed on from monarch to monarch, and don't belong to the King alone). As for the argument that

Sufficiency Theory flies in the face of the King's wealth, many farmers up and down the country will tell you otherwise.

Thamrong Jaibut, farmer and member of Khao Hin Sorn Development Education Centre, says:

sources and do not exploit others. We lead simple and economical lives. When we are focused, wisdom comes. The King's theory is not only applicable to farming but to other areas of life as well. It actually teaches us that to sustain our livelihood, we must also be good citizens. The result of

the Sufficiency Theory is that small communities can be the building blocks of a secured nation."1

In 2006, on the 60^{th} anniversary of his rule, the Unites Nations Development Programme (UNDP) presented to HM King Bhumibol the first Human Development Lifetime Achievement Award in recognition for his tireless work.

In his speech accompanying the presentation, UNDP's then Secretary General Kofi Annan credited the King with "Extraordinary contribution to human development," and called him "the world's Development

King, who reached out to the poorest and the most vulnerable people of Thailand regardless of their

status, ethnicity or religion."

Since 2005, HM The King has been residing at Siriraj Hospital due to health issues. This has in no way prevented him from doing his "duty", as he still receives government and foreign dignitaries, reads, writes and plans more development

As preparations to celebrate HM The King's birthday are underway in Bangkok and throughout the country, and his songs are being played in schools, government offices and even shopping malls, the whole nation looks forward to his customary appearance and speech at Ananta Samakhom Throne Hall in the Grand Palace on December 5.

The Thai people hope that in this time of fragmented and partisan politics, a father's words may help ease anxieties, erase doubts and confirm beliefs. Most of all, they hope that HM The King will work his usual magic and through his speech unite the nation once and for all.

Tiger would like more major success

TWELVE months after ending a two-year victory drought at the tournament he hosts, Tiger Woods is excited about his prospects for 2013 as he prepares to defend his World Challenge title this week.

His one-shot triumph over fellow American Zach Johnson at last year's World Challenge set the tone for a successful 2012 PGA Tour campaign highlighted by three wins, the only disappointment being his continued barren run in the majors.

"I'm very excited because last year at this point in time I was still not quite where I wanted to be physically," Woods, who has battled assorted knee injuries during his career, told reporters at Sherwood Country Club on Tuesday.

"This year has been fantastic in that regard. I've felt good. I've played a full schedule for the first time in a very long time, and I'm just very pleased with what I've done overall with my game.

"At the outset of the year I didn't really putt well. Towards the end of the year I really started putting well. My short game has really come around... I am becoming more consistent."

Woods won his 72nd PGA Tour title at the Arnold Palmer Invitational in March, then followed up with victories at the Memorial tournament and AT&T National.

However, he has not triumphed in the majors since the 2008 US Open at Torrey Pines and has set his sights on removing that blemish from his otherwise glittering record during his 2013 campaign.

"I've had some really nice years, some really good years in there, but winning a major championship just takes it to a whole new level," said Woods, who will celebrate his 37th birthday next month.

"I know how it feels when you win a major championship, and it feels incredible. It lasts with you, and that's something that I would like to have happen again.

"That's something I haven't done since '08 so it's something I'm hoping I can do next year."

Woods has fond memories of his World Challenge victory last year at Sherwood where he birdied the last two holes to snatch a one-shot win from Johnson.

"I hadn't won in a little bit there, and it

was nice to not only win but to go head-tohead against Zach and to do it the way I did," the 14-times major champion said. "I

"Against a guy like Zach, he's not going to go away. That really started the year off for me on a positive note, and consequently I ended up winning three times this year.

"But there are always things we need to work on, and this off-season we have a list of things we want to get done. That'll start probably a couple of weeks after this event."

Woods, who has been working with coach Sean Foley on the fourth swing change of his professional career, faces a strong field this week in the US\$5 million invitational event.

Among the 18 players competing at Sherwood are US Open winner Webb Simpson, 2012 FedExCup champion Brandt Snedeker and Ryder Cup player Ian Poulter of England


Thailand motor through in Suzuki Cup

THAILAND qualified for the semi finals of the AFF Suzuki Cup after an emphatic 4-0 victory over Burma.

A hat trick from Teerasil Dangda and a headed goal from substitute Apipoo Suntornpanavej eased Thailand to victory on Tuesday night at Rajamangala Stadium, Bangkok. The victory put them at the top of Group A with maximum points after two games.

THE Vestas Sailrocket 2 broke the world sailing 500-meter speed record three times in a week at Walvis Bay, Namibia in November. Australian Paul Larsen piloted the Vestas Sailrocket 2 and he is a familiar face to sailors in Phuket as Davinci' brought Paul out to skipper Davinci' catamaran in the Multi Hull Class sailing regatta at Phuket Race Week in 2011.

Paul and his team initially broke the record on November 16 when Sailrocket 2 reached an average speed of 59.23 knots smashing the original record of 55.65 knots set by kite surfer Rob Douglas. They then raised the record to 65.45 knots with a peak speed of 68 knots.

The record was ratified by the World Speed Sailing Record Council (WSSRC) and is open to all water borne sailing craft, from kite surfers to maxi multihulls.

Vestas Sailrocket 2 was launched in April

this year in East Cowes, Isle of Wight, UK. She was then shipped to Namibia where initial trials, system checks and low to medium speed sailing up to speeds of 40 knots, were carried out over six

Paul told the *Phuket Gazette* last year why Walvis Bay is a great location,

'We chose Walvis Bay in Namibia for the wind conditions in the area that spill out from the headland and coastal dunes – ideal for our requirements.

"A massive amount of power is generated by using the speed of the boat itself to make more wind. I start off at 90 degrees to my course with a good wind and as the boat accelerates, the wind created by the boat speed is added to natural wind. It's like being able to convert a strong breeze of 32kph into a gale force of 80kph," he said.

Martial arts maniacs

LAST week at the Underwood Art Factory, as storms swept the island in waves, alternating intense heat with thick humidity, half a dozen Phuketians took part in a two-day self defense and weapons training seminar.

Taught by Mr Mark Stewart, an American who has toured the world teaching self defense for several decades, many of the seminar's techniques are those used by law enforcement and military professionals.

The event attracted people of all skill levels and combined parts of Bruce Lee's personal martial art

'Jett Kune Do' with the Filipino art of Kali (sword/knife fighting).

Have you ever thought about what you would do if someone attacked you or your loved ones with a weapon? Probably not, since most of us don't ever plan to be in such a situation. But, what if? Wouldn't it be nice to know basic ways to disarm and/or avoid that person?

These 'what if' scenarious are what the seminar addressed.

"Basically Bruce Lee created Jeet Kune Do (better known as JKD) about 1967. JKD in Cantonese means, 'Way

of the intercepting fist'," says Stewart to half a dozen students standing at attention. "What he sought to do was simplify combat into its highest level by doing what he called 'stopping them at the gate'.

Stewart explains that it essentially

means not having to block an attack and then return a blow, thus fighting a war of attrition. JKD teaches followers to stop someone from getting close enough to your body to attack you by attacking them first, using offense as defense.

Two days and six hours later, students said they were beginning to feel the brunt of the

lengthy workout. Not to be deterred in the least, local Dubstep, DJ, Matt Rogers said, "I really feel like we've all bonded over the last two days. I wish we could keep it going."

Stewart is off traveling again but says he'll be doing online training beginning in the new year. He currently instructs at seminars all over the world - including in Bangkok and Pattaya.

A Wild day at Laguna triathlon

THE Laguna Phuket Triathlon (LPT) was held last Sunday and nearly 700 athletes from across the world gathered on Bang Tao beach close to the Dusit Thani Hotel for the 6.30 am start.

The first leg of the triathlon was a 1.8-kilometer swim in the sea and across the lagoon towards the transition area, where the athletes then jumped on their bikes and set off on a 55km bike ride up the coast towards Nai Yang and back down to Laguna passing through Thalang and Cherng Talay.

After the grueling, hilly bike ride, a 12km run through the Laguna complex lay in store for the athletes, before finally finishing to the cheers of the gathered spectators and the vocal MC Whit Raymond urging them across the finish line.

On the Saturday before the Triathlon, race organizers, sponsors and some elite athletes gathered at the Banyan Tree Hotel for a press conference. Last year's men's winner Massimo Cigana and last year's women's winner Radka Vodickova were joined by Chris McCormack, Chris Lieto and Belinda Granger.

The friendly press conference gave event sponsors, Thai Airways

and TAT, the chance to talk about the Triathlon along with Debbie Dionysius, AVP Destination Marketing and the elite athletes. Chris McCormack was making his debut at Laguna Phuket Triathlon and the superstar of the sport jokingly said that the reason it has taken him so long to compete is because he is lazy and a hopeless organizer. Belinda Granger, who competed in her 10th Laguna Triathlon last weekend, said: "When I did the race in 2001 it was the most amazing race I had ever done and a lot of pros now see it as their bucket list race."

Defending men's champion Massimo Cigana told those gathered that he was excited to race again at Laguna but he was feeling a bit sick.

Women's champion Radka Vodickova believes the LPT is the best experience out of all the races and Chris Lieto talked

about his passion for the 'More Than Sport' foundation and how he wants to help the 'Fully Booked' learning campaign while in Phuket.

The men's event was won by Swiss Olympian Ruedi Wild, making his debut at the Laguna Phuket Triathlon, in just under two and a half hours.

In the women's field it was another Olympian, Radka Vodickova of the Czech Republic, who triumphed with her third Laguna Phuket title to bring heartbreak for Australian Belinda Granger, the fellow two-time Champion also vying for Triple Crown in her 10th appearance at the event.

Wild finished in 2:29:22, with a swim of 23:06; bike of 1:22:29; and run of 41:22, he was followed home in second place by Germany's Tim Meyer in 2:29:3, with Alberto Cassadei of Italy third in 2:31:42.

But it was a disappointing day for defending champion and three-time title holder Massimo Cigana, who could only manage fourth place in 2:33:41. Lieto finished seventh in 2:40:29 and legendary two-time Ironman World Champion Chris McCormack of Australia finished eighth in 2:45:44.

Radka Vodickova finished first in 2:50:41 with a swim of 24:16; bike of 1:34:11; and run of 49:43. Granger followed her home in 2:57:14, and Edith Niederfringer of Italy was the third woman in, with a time of 2:58:49.

Top amateur male finisher was Ben Greenfield of the USA, who took ninth position with 2:47:02 and the top amateur female was Nickey Barnard of South Africa who finished in 3:10:44 the 67th overall to take the fourth women's place.

Top Thai male finisher was Jaray Jearanai who finished 17th in 2:52.15; and top Thai female was Nampetch Porntharukcharoen the 280th overall in 3:40:10.

The relay section was won by Tabitubbies of the UK in 2:49:48, with Outrigger Laguna Phuket second in 2:59:25 and another Thai team, AJ Bruckner, third in 3:12:05.

Lieto, McCormack and Cigana will have a chance for revenge this weekend when they race the Ironman 70.3 Laguna Phuket against Wild and some 150 other athletes who raced last weekend at the LPT.

Ironman 70.3 is on Sunday December 2, at Laguna. The competition consists of a 1.9km swim, a 90.1km bike ride and a 21.1km run. The athletes cover a total distance of 113.1km (70.3 miles).

On Your Bike for Rich

TRIATHLETE Richard Holland set out on his bike in the early hours of October 11 in Dubai to train for the upcoming Laguna Phuket Ironman 70.3, when he was hit from behind by a car. He sustained multiple life threatening injuries, including broken ribs, punctured lungs, a fractured sternum, fractured right fibula, and severe injuries to his brain. This tragic accident left Rich in a coma and thus he cannot compete in the upcoming Ironman 70.3 as planned.

To show their support and spread the appeal for Rich and cycling safety, several of his friends and fellow athletes from Dubai (and around the globe) will be competing in the Ironman event in his honor. They, and anyone else who would like to show their support, will be donning 'Back On Your Bike' wrist bands. The Back On Your Bike campaign has been established to raise money for Rich's

The campaign hopes to raise a minimum of US\$1.7 million. Given the uncertainty of Rich's recovery period, this target is based on calculations from his first month of treatment and the projected amount of rehabilitation treatment he requires. This amount was validated by information available from the DANA Foundation, which calculates the lifetime expense of a coma patient to be between US\$600,000 and US\$1.88mn.

Reachable fund raising goals have been set for the various stages of Rich's recovery process. The first fund raising target is \$150,000 to cover his immediate medical costs and the next few months of rehabilitation. The target will be adjusted as more is learnt about Rich's recovery prospects.

Rich and his friends planned to celebrate his 30th birthday while in Thailand (Rich turns 30 on November 30). Rest assured that his friends and fellow triathletes will celebrate in his honor.

Pearl outshined by Capitals

Phuket United fall 3-5 to Bangkok Futsal Club in Thailand Futsal Premier League home debut

THE island's professional five-aside soccer club fell 3-5 to Bangkok FC, in an intense match-up in Phuket Town last Saturday.

Played in front of nearly 1,000 spectators at Phuket's 4,000-seat Indoor Sports Complex in Saphan Hin, the match was both sides' third match of the 30-fixture, GMM Sport Thailand Futsal Premier League (TFPL) 2012-2013 season.

Marking the Andaman Pearl's home debut in the elite TFPL, the match opened with both sides enjoying equal attacking pressure.

It was the visitors who broke the ice, three-quarters of the way into the first half, with Nawin Rattana-wongsawat scoring on the 15th minute.

Capitalizing on the Bangkok momentum, Thawit Kingkaeo doubled his side's lead a minute later, while Pratchaya Srimanta found the back of the net two minutes after that.

Stunned, the Andaman Pearl regrouped and in the final minute of the half, Brazilian import Jackson Santos made good of an assist from his comrade Rogerio Moreira to put Phuket on the board with a beautiful strike from the left wing.

Down 1-3, Phuket came out of

the locker room ever-determined to level the score.

Cheering from the vocal crowd intensified as Phuket increased pressure on the ball.

Bangkok's defences were tight, and their keeper Katawut maintained good positioning for the most part.

Phuket finally got their break on the 33rd minute with a long shot out by Nattapong Buachai, bringing the score 2-3 and much of the crowd to their feet.

Bangkok found themselves in foul-trouble, having reached the five foul limit. Had they fouled again, Phuket would have had a penalty kick – but that never happened.

With the clock winding down, Phuket employed a strategic 'power play' formation, bringing their keeper out of the net to help on the attack.

However, the tactic proved to work in favor of the visitors, who managed to capitalize on the vulnerable Phuket defense to score two consecutive goals by Phubet Kongthong and Warut Wung Sammma-al on counter attacks.

With the score 5-2 to the visitors, Phuket pushed on, and Moreira scored from the right wing in the final seconds of the match to bring the final score 3-5.

Speaking to the *Gazette* after the match, Bangkok coach Wisaan

Maiwichit said: "It was a fun game. As the away-team, we had to be patient and bear with the pressure... Phuket fans were quite vocal. The fans have a part and can affect the result, but I'm satisfied with how my team kept with it to win..."

Phuket Head Coach Suphol Sena-peng was regretful: "In the second half, we had many chances to come back, especially when the score was 3-2, and we had momentum. However, we couldn't finish, and a few mistakes in the end cost us this game."



Phuket's next match is an away fixture to be played on December 8 against Surat Thani.

Thailand football tourneys, Phuket's own Bang Jo United U11s were invited by Thai Premier League club, Bangkok Glass FC and the Football Association of Thailand (FAT) to visit Bangkok last week.

Bang Jo toured Bangkok Glass' home ground, Leo Stadium, watched the Futsal World Cup and played a match against the Thai National Champions U12 squad from Bangkok Christian College.

It was the first trip to Thailand's capital for ten out of the fifteen Bang Jo kids. The team was greeted at Leo Stadium by coaches

The kids were given a tour of the football pitch, owners boxes, journalist zone, teams' locker room, executive offices, fitness facilities and the training field.

Once the tour had finished, FAT arranged for a van to take the kids to the Huamark Indoor Arena to watch Paraguay play Portugal and Japan against Ukraine in the FIFA Futsal World Cup second round.

Nine year old Bang Jo striker Faad Thaksin exclaimed after the games: "I never thought I would have a chance to see the Futsal World Cup. That was the most fun I've ever invited back again the next night to watch Russia and Argentina play.

The following day saw a high intensity 7 v 7 friendly match between Bang Jo United and national champions Bangkok Christian College youth squad.

The game was attended by scouts from the Thai national team and various Thai Premier League team representatives.

Although the Phuket side fielded players ranging from seven to eleven years old, they still held their own against the much stronger and older side from Bangkok.

Islanders name new head coach

PHUKET FC introduced their newly-signed head coach to the media last Saturday.

Paniphon "Tu" Kerdyaem, a former coach of Thai Premier League team, Army United, fills the vacancy left by Anurak "June" Srikerd, who coached the struggling team in the final six matches of last season. On loan from premier league, Pamuk Achiryachai and Coach Tu. Bangkok Glass, Coach June



could not continue with Phuket despite pleads from fans and team executives for him to lead the team in the 2013 season.

The new coach, Tu, has coached several division-2 regional teams including Kasetsart University FC, Loei City and Chachoengsao FC.

Most recently, he helped Army United finish runners up in this year's Thai FA Cup, losing to Buriram United in the final. Under his leadership, BGFC finished in 10th place of the 18-team elite league.

Coach Tu remarked: "I consider [myself] lucky... As soon as Army United canceled my contract, Phuket FC contacted me. Then I met with the club president, Pamuk Achiriyachai who told me all about the team's plans and goals for next season.

"I promise to the Phuket people that my team and I will give it our everything to meet the goal of getting the team promoted to the Thai league." A spokesperson from Phuket FC said that the club's budget next season will be between 40 and 60 million baht. - Steven Layne
