Sydictive Element vaults hurdles, gets approval for massive New Year's party on Surin Beach

By Orawin Narabal

THE "Paris Hilton" New Year beach bash organized by Sydictive Element on Surin Beach has, after strong opposition, finally been approved, local officials confirmed to the Gazette.

The approval came after Sydictive Element assured the local government that they will take care of three key areas of concern, Ma-ann Samran, president of the Cherng Talay Tambon Administration Organization (OrBorTor) explained.

"They guaranteed that they will be responsible for public safety and drug control; maintaining cleanliness on the beach; and they will extend assistance to beach vendors to ensure their livelihoods do not suffer," he said on Tuesday.

"They have not told me how they are going to deal with all these problems... They just said they will manage them," said Mr Ma-ann.

The news follows representatives from Sydictive Element meeting Phuket Marine Office chief Phuripat Theerakulpisut to explain how they intended to deal with a raft of issues.

Those negotiations were successful.

"I have given my permission for the party to go ahead," Mr Phuripat told the Gazette. "They [the party organizers] presented their plan to deal with the problems of having such a large party, and I was satisfied...

SHORTLY after the body of Peter Reisz was tentatively identified the Gazette was contacted by a woman claiming to be the slain man's Vietnamese girlfriend.

This week, the woman, who asked not to be named in fear of compromising her safety, flew into Phuket to giver her statement to police.

In her statement she claims that Samui Police and officials at the Hungarian embassy in Bangkok were aware of death threats being made against Mr Reisz, but failed to act appropriately on them.



find Brett Bean, her 43-year-old son who failed to make a flight home to Los Angeles on November 27. She also posted a 50,000baht reward for information that leads to her son being found.

Brett was last seen by a neighbor in Karon, on Phuket's southwest coast, on November 25.

Brett is 6 foot 2 inches tall and has a tattoo on his right thigh and another on his left forearm

On Tuesday, Mrs Bean was asked to visit Karon Police Station to try to identify the man who used her son's ATM card on two occasions after his disappearance.

Karon Police inspector Chana Suttimard said that Mrs Bean was unsure whether the man caught on the CCTV film was her son

"Mrs Bean said that while the man looked like her son, she could not positively confirm it, as the man in the film wore a motorbike helmet during the transactions,"

Mrs Bean asked police to allow her to send the files to her husband, Wayne, so he could attempt to identify the man.

Col Chana revealed that Brett's ATM card was used to withdraw 2,000 baht in Patong on November 27. It was used again on December

from an ATM in Chalong.

"On both occasions the man wore a motorbike helmet with the visor up while making the transactions. After using the ATM in Patong, he entered the 7-Eleven, but kept his helmet on.

The unidentified man was caught on camera riding a motorbike that matched the description of Brett Bean's missing motorbike. However, CCTV did not capture the number on the plate, Col Chana

> "Everything was in order. There were no signs of a struggle," said Maj Worapong Prom-in of the Chalong Police.

> Mr Bean's surfboard and passport were found in the bungalow, along with his driver's license, motorbike registration book and his bankbook. However, his laptop, mobile phone, helmet and motorbike were missing.

"Everything looked like Mr Bean had just stepped out," Maj Worapong said.

North Korean native found dead

A RUSSIAN national, born in North Korea, was found dead in his rented apartment room in Rawai on Monday evening.

Police identified the man as "Khe Konstantin", 46.

The unclothed body of Mr Konstantin, 46, was found faceup on the floor by the apartment owner, Kanchana Navamachit, after she unlocked the room to access the air-conditioning unit.

The last Ms Kanchana had seen the Russian national was about a week earlier, she told the

Hungarians nabbed for execution

POLICE have arrested both Hungarian nationals who stand accused of executing Hungarian businessman Peter Reisz. The body of Mr Reisz was found partially wrapped in a black plastic bag with hands bound in a rubber plantation in Kathu on November 29.

The prime suspect in the murder, Hungarian-Israeli dual national Moshe David, was caught by police in the MBK shopping mall in Bangkok on December 5. Region 8 Commander Gen Yongyuth Charoenwanit announced to the press the next day that Mr David had confessed to police to killing Mr Reisz in a fit of rage.

Two days after the announcement, Gyorgy Lajos Kvalka, 48, unable to stand the pressure, turned himself into Samui Police.

Mr Kvalka was named on the arrest warrant obtained by Thung Thong Police as "Kvalka Lajos Gyoergy".

"He [Mr Kvalka] saw that police had arrested Mr David. He could not stand the pressure, so he turned himself in," said Tourist Police Commander Roy Ingpairoj.

Though implicated by Mr David in the killing of Mr Reisz, Mr Kvalka has denied taking any direct action in the murder.

"Mr Gyoergy [sic] told police that he did not kill Mr Reisz. He said he was only with Mr David while the killing took place," Maj Gen Roy explained.

Mr David's motive to the killing was pinned down during initial police questioning as he claimed that Mr Reisz had swindled him out of land and properties worth a total value of about 15 million baht, explained Gen Yongyuth.

After allegedly cheating Mr David out of the properties, Mr Reisz absconded to Phuket.

"Mr David and his Hungarian friend Mr Kvalka followed Mr Reisz to Phuket. They called Mr Reisz to meet them at a house that Mr David had rented for two days," Gen Yongyuth explained.

"However, they did not sort the problem out at the meeting. A serious fight broke out in which Mr Reisz was killed," Gen Yonyuth said.

During the re-enactment of the crime, set into motion before Mr

Kvalka handed himself into police, Mr David was silent in front of reporters.

The re-enactment took place at a well-known housing develop-

ment off Wichit Songkram Road on December 7.

Wearing a balaclava and under escort by about 30 police officers, Mr David spent about 30 minutes in the rented home before exiting it with a black plastic trash bag similar to the bag Mr Reisz's body was found in.

The next stop in the re-enactment was the rubber plantation where Mr David, finally removed the balaclava, which he had previously worn when in front of the

"Having dumped the body, Mr David and Mr Kvalka then drove Mr Reisz's white pickup truck back to Koh Samui. The pair attempted to sell the truck, but failed, and abandoned it in Bophut," explained Gen Yongyuth.

"Mr Kvalka was transferred to Thung Thong Police Station for further questioning," Gen Roy explained.

In the meantime, Mr David is being held at the detention cells at Phuket Immigration.

The Gazette notes that although Mr David is being consistently identified by police as Israeli national Moshe David, he is a dual national and also carried a Hungarian passport issued in the name Gabor Nemeth.

Tour van driver in lethal crash to face charges

TUAN Russala Samae, the tour van driver involved in the fatal crash that killed 9-year-old Kunnarree Lattuada-Lancini on November 29, has been discharged from the Vachira Phuket Hospital.

He was scheduled to present himself at Chalong Police Station on Thursday [December 13] to be charged with reckless driving causing death, Sub Lt Kraisorn Boonprasop told the Gazette on Tuesday.

"The suspect will be charged with reckless driving causing death. I have informed Tuan Russala and the tour company [that he worked for] to make sure he presents himself. If he doesn't, we will issue a summons for him," Lt Kraisorn said.

Mr Tuan Russala was released from hospital after recovering from injuries sustained in the crash, a head-on collision with a

Reisz's girlfriend lashes out

A WOMAN close to Hungarian murder victim Peter Reisz has given her statement to Phuket Police, claiming that Samui Police and officials at the Hungarian embassy in Bangkok were aware of death threats being made against Mr Reisz, but failed to act appropriately on them.

The woman, a Vietnamese national who asked not to be named in fear of compromising her safety, said she was Mr Reisz's girlfriend. "I met Peter in June. I went to see him on Koh Samui at the end of June," she explained.

Peter then travelled to Vietnam in July for about 10 days, in September for about a week, and the third – and last time – from early October to October 30, said the woman.

"When I was on Koh Samui around the middle of August, there was a guy calling him on the phone many times. It seemed like a quarrel.

"Peter told me it was a Hungarian guy named David [prime suspect Moshe David] living on Koh Samui. Peter lent David money, the equivalent to US\$170,000 [about 5.2 million baht], with David's property used as security [for the loan].

David explained again how he in-

At that time, Mr Reisz was already preparing to leave Thailand to live in Vietnam. "In early September, Peter left Thailand for Vietnam. He wanted to live in Vietnam with me. It had nothing to do with David," she said.

During Mr Reisz's last trip to Vietnam, he received a recording from his friend Buda in which Mr

Hanging suicide blamed on drugs, fear of prison

THE mother of a 29-year-old man found hanged at his family home in Thalang on December 7 has told police that fear of serving three years in prison may have prompted her son to commit suicide.

Saksan Saeng-aroon, a cousin of Srisoonthorn Municipality council member Manit Jitjamnong, was found by his mother, Chompu Saeng-aroon, hanging by the neck by a sarong tied to crossbeam at the back of the family home in Srisoonthorn.

A grief-stricken Ms Chompu called out to neighbors for help and Mr Saksan was rushed to Thalang Hospital, but doctors there pronounced him dead at about 3pm.

Ms Chompu told the police that Mr Saksan, a motorbike mechanic, was out on bail after being handed down a three-year suspended sentence by the Phuket Provincial Court for a minor drugs charge.

Her son may have decided to end his life after a conversation over lunch when she warned him that the expense of fighting his drug case may not be worth it, she explained.

"Soon after that, maybe because of the stress of the facing having to serve a prison sentence, he walked out behind the house," Ms Chompu said.

Realizing that her son had been out at the back of the house for a long time, she went out to check on him, and found him hanged from the crossbeam.

Staff at Thalang Hospital released Mr Saksan's body to his immediate family after a police investigation headed by Thalang Police duty officer Lt Patiwat Yodkhuan.

Police chief calls for officers to use smart phones, rolling checkpoints

THE 48 Royal Thai Police officers installed in their new positions in Phuket last week were ordered to boost their public image and their effectiveness by staging "rolling checkpoints" and using smart phones.

The news was handed down by Phuket Provincial Police Commander Choti Chavalviwat at a ceremony at Provincial Police headquarters in Phuket Town on December 7.

In a frank explanation of how his police officers should conduct their work, Maj Gen Choti ordered the officers to assist in the current campaign to bring the total number of taxis and tuk-tuks operating on the island under regulation and to specifically focus on cases that involved tourists and foreigners, whether they be victims or suspects.

"Police should be strong and disciplined in their investigations in order to deliver justice to the people. Police also need to look clean and tidy, especially when they go out to perform their duties. They should wear police

uniforms to engender trust from the public," he said.

Gen Choti also installed the superintendents of Phuket's two new police precincts – in Karon and Wichit.

Former Chalong Police chief Col Sirisak Wasasiri was assigned to the position of police chief of Karon, and Lt Col Chaowalit

Petsripia, formerly the Deputy Superintendent of Khok Kloy Police Station in Phang Nga, was installed as the first Superintendent of Wichit Police Station.

Lt Col Krittapad Dejintorrasorn from Provincial Police Region 8 headquarters in Surat Thani returns to Phuket as the Chalong Superintendent. Col Krittapad had previously served as the Chalong police chief, and was the police chief that launched the manhunt for murder fugitive Lee Aldhouse two years ago, but at that time he was known as Wichit Intorrasorn.

The two new police precincts were officially formed on Thursday. Although the new police stations have yet to be built, officers in Karon, a popular tourist beach area, and in Wichit, a heavy residential area, are using their temporary offices as their headquarters in the meantime.

Gen Choti highlighted that officers should make good use of smart phones in performing their day-to-day duties.

"In emergencies, they could send photos related to the case by phone," he said.

Regarding the static road checkpoints police regularly set up around the island, Gen Choti pointed out that the checkpoints could be moved to improve their effectiveness.

"They don't need to be set up for hours; only 30 minutes should be enough, then they should be moved to other places," he said.

Bleak prospects for new airport bus services

WITH three new bus routes up for grabs to serve Phuket International Airport, only one company has been brave enough to step forward and collect an information pack in order to apply for the government tender.

Phuket Land Transport Office (PLTO) chief Teerayut Prasertpol said that the bidding opened on four new routes, all ratified and approved by the Ministry of Transport in Bangkok, on November 12

Three of the routes on offer are from the airport to Rawai; to Patong and Kata; and to Kamala. The fourth route is from Phuket Town

WITH three new bus routes up for grabs to and Patong, but via a different route than the serve Phuket International Airport, only one current long-running service.

"At this stage I cannot reveal who picked up the project information from us, but I can say that they have yet to submit a bid for any of the routes," Mr Teerayut said.

"Anyone interested in providing bus services from the airport can collect the project information from us until December 26," he added.

Mr Teerayut pointed out last year that no companies had applied to provide such bus services due to fear of violent reprisals by taxi and tuk-tuk drivers

Laguna Phuket issues statement over baby elephants seized in island raids

THE management at Laguna Resorts & Hotels, which operates the five-hotel resort complex on Phuket's west coast, have issued a statement about the baby elephant "Joey", which was seized in raids in Phuket in February.

Ziya Birkan, Deputy Managing Director at Laguna Resorts & Hotels, wrote in the statement:

"We're very pleased the authorities have resolved the question of Joey's parentage through DNA testing, but obviously disappointed he won't be able to return here to his former role as a popular and much-loved member of our Laguna Phuket family.

"Joey was acquired by us in good faith after we carried out exhaustive due diligence, receiving written confirmations he was legally registered and obtained through necessary regulations.

"Now that has been proven not to be the case, we hope the authorities will continue to use DNA

testing to thoroughly investigate the legality of elephants.

"The well being and welfare of our elephants at Laguna Phuket's Elephant Camp is paramount to us. The camp has been inspected and approved by Richard Lair, chief adviser to the Thai Elephant Conservation Centre."

Of the two other baby elephants seized in Phuket in February, the infant pachyderm seized from the Phu Thai Souvenir Market in Chalong was identified by the DNA test results to be the offspring of a legally registered mother at a camp in Saiyoke Elephant Park in Kanchanaburi.

"The young elephant will be returned to the Phu Thai owners," Col Watcharin Phusit, Superintendent of the Regional Natural Resources and Environment Crime Suppression Division, confirmed to the *Gazette*.

However, the DNA test results from the baby elephant seized from the ATV@Hill Adventure Tour camp, on the road to the Big Buddha image in Chalong, showed otherwise.

"The DNA test results prove that the youngster is directly related to a wild female elephant seized at Kaeng Krachan wildlife park in Kanchanaburi province," Col Watcharin said.



Expat sailor Stafford Steer dies of cancer

ONE of Phuket's longest-staying expats and best-known personalities in the local yachting community, Stafford Steer from Australia, died last Saturday after a brief battle with cancer.

He was 71 years old.

Stafford arrived in Phuket from Cairns, in Queensland, Australia, in 1992 on board the sailing catamaran No Fixed Address, which he and fellow Phuket sailing icon Mark Pescott built together.

Stafford went on to win the Mulithull class in the Phuket King's Cup Regatta that same year.

He is also likely the only expat sailor in Phuket to have a sailing hazard named after him, a semisubmarine rock off Cape Panwa that Stafford ran aground on with No Fixed Address years ago.

The event became local sailing legend and a photo marking the occasion for years was on proud display on the "Wall of Fame" at Jimmy's Lighthouse by Chalong Bay. The hazard is now called "Stafford's Rock".

Aso affectionately known as "Spike", Stafford was wellknown for running the Mike's Bikes visa run company for years before embarking on a venture to establish the Phuket Sport & Tennis Club in Rawai.

Brent Mcinnes of the Phuket Cruising Yacht Club marked on the club's Facebook page: "Stafford, not one to leave anything half done, married Pat in the last week

of his life after living together for more than 16 years.

"Stafford was a man you could depend on for support when the chips were down. He didn't suffer fools well. He completed all tasks he took on and was a good source for advice on many levels.

"He is survived by his wife Pat and a son and daughter in Australia... You now have time to rest, Stafford." - Phuket Gazette

Abhisit sees red over charges

nation

THE Democrat Party is crying foul after the announcement that former prime minister Abhisit Vejjajiva and his deputy Suthep Thaugsuban are to be charged with murder for their alleged part in the death of a protester during the 2010 red-shirt protests.

Critics claim the move, announced by Department of Special Investigations chief Tharit Pengdit, is aimed at forcing the party to accept the government's proposed reconciliation bill, which would include an amnesty for all parties involved in Thailand's recent political conflict.

But others have hailed the development as a step in the right direction: towards justice for the people who died in the protest and an end to the country's long-standing culture of impunity.

The prosecution became

possible after a recent court ruling that taxi driver Phan Kamkong had been shot dead by military personnel during the crackdown on the 2010 protest.

At the time, Mr Abhisit was prime minister while Mr Suthep was head of the Center for the Resolution of the Emergency Situation (CRES), the ad-hoc committee established to deal with the protest, which shut down part of Bangkok's commercial center for two months.

At a press conference last week, the two men claimed the aim of the charges was to push the Democrats into accepting an amnesty that would exonerate the Pheu Thai Party's exiled patron, Thaksin Shinawatra.

The pair said they would never accept any deal that allowed Mr Thaksin to get away with his alleged crimes.

"I insist that wrongdoers must be brought to justice and will fight the case based on facts," said Mr Abhisit. "I will not join the process to absolve people who cheated the country. I'll accept my fate even if the judicial

process lands me in jail or gets me executed, but I will not whitewash the wrongdoings of cheaters."

The development comes at a time of renewed talk of constitutional amendment.

Writing in *The Nation*, commentator Avudh Panananda said

the aim of the prosecution was to create "courtroom drama" and distract attention from the government's actions.

"With two key Democrats being tried, the coalition leaders hope for leverage to keep the opposition at bay during the turbulent time when the Constitution is rewritten next year," he wrote.

Mr Avudh noted that the prosecution could be positioned as a way to deflect the attentions of the International Criminal Court, which some government figures are pushing to investigate the 2010 killings.

Thailand slips in corruption index

THAILAND has slipped eight places in Transparency International's Corruption Perceptions Index, now sharing 88th place with Malawi, Morocco, Zambia, Swaziland, and the South American nation of Suriname.

National Anti-Corruption Commissioner Wicha Mahakun said Thailand's problem was the country's politicians and public servants.

The country needs more "clean" people working in public administration, he told *The Nation*.

"Thailand has a lot of policyenabled corruption, bribes, cronies as well as patron-clients," Mr Wicha said. "Politicians intervene in bureaucratic reshuffles, so that bureaucrats need to be subject to politicians."

Mr Wicha lamented Thailand's group with these Afr new placing in the 176-country list tries," Mr Wicha said.

Se-Ed lands in anti-gay hot water

BOOKSELLER and publisher Se-Ed has found itself in a furor after a leaked memo suggested the company wanted to ban the depiction of homosexual relationships in the books it sold.

The scandal surfaced after a memo containing minutes of an internal meeting was leaked to six of the company's business partners.

"Entries submitted for review by the publisher should not contain homosexual relationships," the memo said.


After human rights advocates

raised objections, the company claimed the problem was the result of a "misunderstanding".

"In fact, our intention was to prevent pornographic content," said Wiroj Lakkhanaadisorn, an executive at Se-Ed.

Se-Ed had never had any policy that discriminated against people based on sexual orientation or that violated human rights, he added.

Mr Wiroj explained that Se-Education now planned to include rating labels on books.



Egypt army given right to make arrests over referendum

THE Egyptian government has given the military the authority to arrest civilians to help safeguard a constitutional referendum planned for Saturday, the official gazette said.

The order, which a presidential official and military source confirmed appeared in the gazette late on Sunday, said the military would support and coordinate with police to protect "vital institutions" temporarily until the referendum result.

The decree gave army officers the right to conduct arrests and transfer detainees to prosecutors.

Man killed, bombs hit holiday homes on Corsica

A MAN was killed and bombs caused damage to around 20 holiday homes in a spate of overnight violence in Corsica ahead of the French Mediterranean island's national identity day last Saturday.

Investigative sources said a 32-year-old man who claimed to be a member of the National Front for the Liberation of Corsica (FLNC) was arrested in the town of Calvi on December 7, when explosives were found in his car just before the violence erupted. Another 32-year-old man was found shot dead in his car during the violence.

In brief... Philippines believes Japan is balance to China ambitions

A STRONGER Japan would act as a counterbalance to the military rise of China, something that is worrying smaller Asian nations as tensions grow over conflicting territorial claims in the region, the Philippines said on Monday.

Rivals claims to the South China Sea, and its likely oil and gas wealth, have made it Asia's biggest potential flashpoint. China claims the largest area, putting it at loggerheads in particular in recent months with Vietnam and the Philippines.

Other claimants are Taiwan, Brunei and Malaysia.

"[We are looking for Japan] to support the peaceful process of resolving the issues here and to be one of the partners as far as security alliances and partnership is concerned," Foreign Ministry spokesman Raul Hernandez said in a statement.

He said no one country has the capacity to address the security requirements of the region, and it is in the Philippines' interest to have stronger alliances.

The comments echo those of Foreign Minister Albert del Rosario in an interview with the

Financial Times newspaper published on Monday, when he said that Japan "could be a significant balancing factor."

The dispute is testing the unity of the 10-nation Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and also dragged the United States into the debate just as it is pushing to raise an already strong military profile in the region.

On Tuesday, the Philippines will hold strategic talks with the United States, its closest security ally, on ways to strengthen their alliance, including increasing

rotational presence of US forces in its former colony.

Carlos Sorreta, foreign ministry assistant secretary for American affairs, said the increased US presence in Asia and Pacific region "sends the right signal that states must behave in a reasonable and lawful way".

Last week, Vietnam claimed that Chinese fishing boats sabotaged one of its oil and gas research vessels, while the Philippines and China were involved in a two-month-long standoff earlier this year at Scarborough Shoal near the Philippine coast.

Adding to tension, authorities in China's Hainan island have passed laws allowing police to search vessels deemed to be operating illegally in what it considers its Hainan's waters, drawing protests from its neighbors and concern from the United States.

Asked about the Philippine comments on Japan as a balancing force, China's foreign ministry said the idea of "containment" was out of date.

"Now it's no longer the era of the Cold War. The issue of one country containing another one does not exist," spokesman Hong Lei told a regular briefing.

Arabs offer Palestine US\$100mn a month 'safety net'

ARAB states agreed to provide the Palestinian Authority with a US\$100 million monthly "financial safety net" to help President Mahmoud Abbas's government cope with an economic crisis after the United Nations granted de facto statehood to Palestine.

Israel has responded to the November 29 UN vote by ordering 3,000 Jewish settler homes be built in the occupied West Bank and announced it would hold back payments of customs duties it collects on behalf of the Palestinians to pay an outstanding electricity bill.

In a statement on December 9 after a meeting in Doha, Arab foreign ministers called for the immediate implementation of a resolution passed at an Arab summit in Baghdad in March, which called for the provision of a US\$100 million monthly safety net.

The statement did not give details of how the money would be paid or who would pay, but Arab League Secretary-General Nabil Elaraby said a mechanism has been agreed.

"The mechanism is that the

chair of the committee (Qatar) and the secretary-general will contact each country with the exact amount they have to pay," Elaraby told Reuters after the meeting. "I said I want an answer in 15 days,"

Israel and the United States opposed the UN General Assembly's upgrade of Palestine's status to "non-member state", saying Abbas should instead resume peace talks that collapsed in 2010 over Israeli settlementbuilding.

US trade-human rights link tests American-Russian ties

THE US Senate's passage of election, it could have been the cap Putin and Barack Obama to improve relations since their elections.

Obama, who launched a "reset" in relations with Russia less than four years ago, is likely to sign the law even though Moscow sees it as "aggressively unfriendly." Damage to US-Russian relations is all but inevitable.

legislation to punish Russians who on a period during which he violate human rights is the first big signed a landmark nuclear arms test of the resolve of Vladimir deal with Moscow and helped usher Russia into the World Trade Organization after an 18-year membership bid.

Instead, Moscow is furious over the human rights portion of the bill, an unmistakable message to Putin of displeasure with the treatment of Russians who dare challenge the authorities.

"[Putin] does not intend to make relations worse, and for this reason the effects of this legislation will be limited," said Dmitry Trenin, director of the Carnegie Moscow Centre think tank.

SUSTAINABILITY is perhaps the most overused buzz word at present. Increasingly over the past several years, stake holders in the tourism and hospitality sectors have added momentum to the dialogue about saving the environment through the implementation of 'green practices'.

When it comes down to actually taking action and making all of the necessary investments, however, few have delivered.

Beyond changing a few light bulbs and installing energy saving switch timers, there is still so much more that can be done if not for the sake of reducing overheads and thus increasing profitability, then certainly for embracing the true essence of sustainability.

During a recent interview with the Gazette, Martin Hauke, a composting specialist based in Phuket, said that waste management is one of the most overlooked factors in the effort to achieve environmental sustainability. Overlooked not only by local residents and government officials, but by business operators too.

"It just baffles me when I see people burning a pile of leaves in their yard. This material can be separated and composted or just used as a mulch around shrubs and trees, and has so many more benefits. Instead, it is wasted, much to the dismay of the environment."

Martin, a German national, is the inventor of the Mobile Aerated Floor, or MAF, an innovative and efficient composting system that has been utilized in a number of commercial scale projects across the globe.

"When compared to conventional composting, the MAF System is up to 30 % more efficient in terms of speed and requires only a third of the area and much less energy. And of course, the setup does not have to be fixed to one space," he says.

Having fallen in love with Phuket over the last decade, Martin decided to establish his German company's assembly base in Thalang.

"Currently, we only export our system's components to overseas clients. These include mostly large scale, commercial projects in Germany, the United Kingdom and Australia, among others."

Although, business volume and demand is sufficient on the global market, Martin says he is keen to penetrate the local market in the near future.

"We are currently designing prototypes for small and medium scale projects on and off Phuket. One of our main targets will be hotels and resorts, and especially properties that are remote and off the grid.

"The fact is that it is still cheaper up front for businesses

[on the grid] to throw away or burn their waste, whereas it is difficult for them to quantify the returns from recycling and composting.

"These returns aren't always immediate, and one of our biggest challenges is to inform and demonstrate to individuals and businesses, that there are more practical and responsible solutions to waste management."

Martin said that, in addition to residents and businesses, he is also pursuing a dialogue with the local government.

"We are looking to support initiatives that improve Phuket's sustainability as a whole. One burning issue that affects everyone is in regards to the two incinerators. As I understand it, they are now operating close to capacity...

We operate an 'Adventure Golf' course, which is not the same as a 'Mini Golf' course. Mini Golf, also commonly known as 'Putt Putt' golf usually has courses with fantasy-like themes and

obstacles, such as the classic clown's mouth, or windmill house, for example. Our course is a full, 59-par 18-hole golf course, designed to depict a real golf course, but on a miniature scale.

Each hole is unique and has varying levels of challenge.

However, we quickly found that many people did not know about Adventure Golf, but knew about Mini Golf. Thus, we decided to add the word 'Mini' to the name so people can get a better idea.

At full capacity, there can be up to 72 golfers playing at once – with four at each

Other than golf, what services do you offer?

"Off-Course" is our attached, threestar, family restaurant and bar, which can accommodate about 130 sitting guests or up to 200 mingling guests.

The idea of it is to offer good food at a good value. We don't want people to leave saying "that was good, but expensive". We do serve some Thai dishes, but our specialization is mostly western food, especially pizza and burgers.

Due to popular demand, we even started to do pizza delivery to nearby locations. Our facilities are ideal to cater to private events.

Who are your target groups?

When we first launched, we were aiming mostly for tourists, especially the family segment. However, heading into the second year, we decided to broaden our target to focus more on locals and residents, but not just families. Though

kids will always enjoy this activity, we were happy to see that even adults could enjoy themselves.

This opened up the door to many other marketing opportunities. For instance, we can host events for small-and-mediumsized groups. These include birthday parties, staff parties and even incentives meetings.

What marketing challenges have you faced in your first year?

The main challenge has been to inform people we are here. A big part of it is just getting our name out there. People who know what Adventure Golf is, especially the tourists, will come if they know we're here. However, it's more difficult to For more visit: phuketadventureminigolf.com

persuade and convince others, especially locals, who don't really know or understand what Adventure Golf is.

Even once they do come, say for a staff party, some of them are still hesitant to try it out because they think it will be hard or not fun, or especially with many Thai girls, who have that "it's not for me" attitude.

However, once they try, they always enjoy themselves. Another thing we've observed is the different types of preferences among Thai and foreign groups.

Foreign groups tend to enjoy doing activities more, where as Thais groups tend to put more emphasis on the eating part.



Govt considering aiding SMEs

THE Finance and Labor ministries agreed recently to consider a new proposal that would help small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) cope with the increase of minimum wage.

The measures are initially expected to cost the government 50 billion baht over the next three years.

The old proposal had 27 assistance measures, but that was cut down to 23 in the new proposal's current form.

The ministries will consider four key measures: reducing the monthly contribution to the Social Security Fund to 2% for both the employer and employee for three years; chopping the tax deduction at source from 3% to 1.5% for both big corporations and SMEs; partially subsidizing the SMEs in 70 provinces for three years through 2017 at the rates of 75%, 50% and 25% of the wage difference; and cutting the service charge for hotel rooms from 80 baht to 40 baht per year, which is directly collected under the Interior Ministry's law.

Earlier, both sides were far apart on the proposal. For instance, the government rejected the measure to reduce the monthly social

After the meeting with the two ministries, Vallop Vitanakorn, head of the wage-hike solution panel, stressed that measures were focused on SMEs. Only the tax deduction 'at source' included other corporations. However, the government already planned to reduce that tax.

The meeting also considered conditions and methods of implementation for the measures. It

If the two ministries accept the committee's new proposal, it will be forwarded to the Joint Public Private Committee and then to the Cabinet for final approval.

The proposal is designed to create a win-win situation for SMEs and the government in the long run.

For instance, the Finance Ministry will enjoy tax collections starting in the second year of the program, registered SMEs increases as does the tax base. The Labor Ministry will also draw more SMEs into its social security scheme.



Understanding your fund's 'duration'

AS I have written extensively about the dangers of bond funds in the current environment, it is worth mentioning a

standard measurement used to determine a 3 year bond will not usually change by approximately how sensitive a bond portfolio or fund is to interest rate increases.

Don't let the word duration fool vou: what the measurement actually means is, the approximate decrease in value for a 1% increase in interest rates.

It is called duration because it was originally calculated as a weighted average of the times to maturity for all of the bonds in a portfolio.

This is now called 'average maturity' and the two together are a good way of comparing bond funds in today's environment. Most bond funds will have these both on their fact sheets, and if they don't you should avoid them until you can find them out.

If you look solely at the recent track record of two funds and compare, you may be in for big trouble in the future.

If one fund has averaged ten percent with duration of 2.5 while another has averaged 12% but with duration of 8, the first fund offers a much better trade-off between risk and reward. If interest rates go up by 2%, the second portfolio will lose approximately 16% while the first would lose about 5%.

Duration is also only an approximation

because it assumes the **Island Investor** yield curve shift is parallel, which is not usually **David Mayes** the case. In English that

> means interests rates for the same amount as they will for a ten year bond or a twenty year one.

The lower interest rates are at the start, and the greater the overall move in interest rates, the larger the error is likely to be.


> You will likely find most bond funds holding large portions of debt from safe governments in the developed world will usually fall into one of two categories right now. They eiher don't make any money or they have a high duration and are thus very risky when inevitably, the interest rates return to normal levels.

One place where one can find decent yields with lower duration is in some globally diversified bond funds that are very light weight in the developed world.

Interest rates are not rock bottom in many places and thus you can earn a little money. Of course the trade off here is that the fund faces exchange risk relative to each of the bonds it is holding.

Some funds do a very good job of managing this however, and I am currently a fan of two funds run by Franklin Templeton.

The two funds I like are their Global Total Return Fund and Global Bond Fund. They aren't going to make money every year, but historically they tend to do very



Parking management not 'The Impossible'

RISING property prices, poor public planning and a dire lack of public transport options have combined to leave Phuket with a lack of public parking in some of its most densely-settled areas.

In few places is the problem more acute than in shopping center parking garages. While some are better than others, the traffic nightmare that persists in some, during peak hours, indicates that the prevailing logic is "never turn away a customer" – even when the garage itself is already dangerously beyond capacity.

Viewing the situation through a more cynical prism, perhaps the management logic is that allowing multi-dimensional gridlock to persist is the perfect way to create a "captive market".

Whether the situation is the result of incompetence or greed, we ask operators of these facilities to reconsider the impact on consumers, who can and will go elsewhere.

Tales of parking garage woe are common in popular blog sites, but these are probably just the tip of the iceberg.

This editorial writer has already suffered ruination of two shopping trips this month as the result of garage mismanagement. The first involved getting trapped in the basement of a parking garage at a large retail complex in Patong for 45 minutes, all of which was spent jockeying for position with other drivers – all angry, aggressive and desperate to make an exit. Worse, staff there refused to open a second available exit to alleviate the problem, even for customers holding free parking vouchers, because "the computer there is broke", we were told.

A week later we arrived at a well-known mall in Muang District with tickets in hand for the movie *The Impossible*, only to miss almost half of the film because someone had given up, parked illegally, pulled the key from the ignition, and abandoned his vehicle in the midst of the impenetrable gridlock.

That the parking facility in question already employs one ill-tempered man to maneuver about the garage with a car forklift says a great deal about the number of people who do the exact same thing – simply give up and abandon ship.

The *Phuket Gazette* fails to understand how such situations are allowed to develop or persist. Each garage has a finite number of spaces and computer-equipped staff at both entrances and exits to monitor the number of passing vehicles. Even if the employees' reasoning abilities have been severely compromised by exposure to carbon monoxide, it should be simple enough to program a computer to automatically drop a gate at the entrance and post a sign reading "Sorry, parking lot full. No entry" after a certain, safe number of cars has been reached.

As some malls appear unwilling or unable to properly manage their parking facilities, the *Gazette* calls upon the Phuket Provincial Office and other relevant agencies to better enforce existing safety regulations, to ensure that the retailers do a better job of acting in their customers' – and therefore their own – best interests.



Just slow down

I SIMPLY want motorists in Phuket to stop speeding. By slowing down and obeying traffic laws many unnecessary accidents will be avoided, and lives saved.

The need to slow down is especially necessary at the Kor En curve in Thalang. There was a serious accident there last year that killed a four-year-old boy [Anupong Sae-Yu] and his aunt [Malai Kaewkluan].

In the wake of the tragic accident, we have installed a range of road-safety measures at that curve. Those safety measures have helped to reduce the accident rate on that particular stretch of road; probably by about 40 per cent.

However, local residents want the number of accidents on the curve down to zero. So we are trying everything we can to minimize the number of accidents on that particularly dangerous section of road.

One measure we took was installing plastic traffic poles to separate the lanes as motorists rounded the bend, which helped encourage motorists to slow down while passing through.

We also spent about one million baht on resurfacing a 400-meter southbound section of the road with a high-grade surface that reduces the centrifugal force of the moving vehicles and increases tyre adhesion to the road.

We have seen that using this "high-stick" road surface has been very successful in reducing the number of accidents at some very dangerous curves in Phang Nga. We will do the same to the northbound lane at the Kor En curve next year.

We have also installed a series of speed bumps – at one kilometer, 500 meters, 300 and 200 meters before the curve – costing more than 100,000 baht.



Samak Luedwonghad, 45, has been making Thailand's roads safer for 23 years, and is currently the Phuket Highways Office Director. Before he moved to Phuket in February, he had worked for the Department of Rural Roads' Bureau of Bridge Construction for 10 years and served more than five years as the head project engineer of the Phichit Bridge Construction and Maintenance Center in Phichit province.

Here, he pleads for Phuket motorists to slow down, which will reduce the number of accidents and in turn save lives.

However, these are all only temporary measures. We have held several discussions with Phuket Vice Governor Chamroen Tipayapongtada and related officers, including the local village headman, about what needs to be done to make this curve safer. We will meet again to assess how effective these temporary measures have been and to decide whether or not any further action needs to be taken.

The Department of Highways' Bureau of Highway Safety has collected information and observed traffic passing through the curve so it can come up with a permanent plan to improve road safety at that particular location.

We have presented our information on the effects of the temporary safety measures we have established to those who will draw up the permanent safety plan. We are now waiting for their response.

One of the long-term solutions we initially thought we would be

able to pursue is acquiring the land adjacent to the curve so we could reduce the sharpness of the bend.

However, we now know that we will not be able to do this, so we are trying to curb the number of accidents at the curve with the limited solutions at our disposal.

One idea that arose from our discussions with Vice Governor Chamroen was to erect an illuminated sign above the road so motorists would get into the correct lanes before starting to take the curve. This way, trucks with trailers, cars and motorbikes would all be in the correct lanes before rounding the curve.

However, installing such a sign is not a cheap solution. It would probably cost more than five million baht. We will have to wait for the 2014 fiscal year before we can get the budget to move that project forward. We still need to present the project report and the budget request to the Department of Highways head office in Bangkok first.

Spinning your wheels for traffic solutions

CYCLING has long been a favorite past time of people living in the West. The freedom of jumping on a bicycle and exploring the area you live in while keeping fit at the same time appeals to young and old alike.

Most cities and towns in European countries have designated cycle ways and clear markings on roads that only cyclists are allowed to pedal along.

But the danger of cycling on the road is still apparent in these countries, as Olympic Gold medalist and Tour de France winner, Bradley Wiggins, found out recently as he was knocked off his bike by a white van and suffered a broken rib.

To help curb the traffic problem in London, the Mayor, Boris Johnson implemented a cycle hire scheme offering 6,000 bikes from 405 docking stations across the city. This scheme allows people in London to use the bikes for short journeys in the capital. City Hall in Bangkok recently unveiled a similar bike-rental service for the Siam Square area to encourage Bangkokians to cycle short distances. European cities such as Paris, Barcelona and Amsterdam are full of cyclists.

It is clear to see that the popularity of cycling on Phuket is on the rise. In areas such as Phuket Town or one of the quieter beach

towns, you would imagine a bike rental service would be a success. And with increasing traffic congestion on the island, a bike rental service would be a great way to get locals and expats on their bike. The major downfall, as Bradley Wiggins found out, is road safety. Phuket's roads are dangerous enough in a car or on a motorbike, but if the scheme is used within the confines of a town where the roads are not so dangerous, cyclists will feel safer.

Using Phuket Town as a model, if bike stations were put in at various points throughout the town, tourists, locals and expats could make use of the service to get from point A to Z. For example, pick a bike up at a docking station close to Surakul Stadium and then enjoy a leisurely cycle to a docking station on Krabi Road. Wander around the OldTtown for a bit, pick up a bike from the docking station on Thalang Road and head to a docking station at Saphan Hin. If there were a number of docking stations spread throughout the area people could explore at their own pace and keep fit.

not permanently allot a berth to an individual.

However, we are working on establishing more moorings at the southern half of the island.

In order to protect the coral reefs, we have just spent 5.8 million baht installing 300 moorings off the east coast of Phuket. So far that includes 200 in Chalong Bay with another 100 planned for Ao Por.

We tentatively plan to install more, but it will take time, as we have to apply for the funds.

White knuckle ride in a black taxi

A few weeks ago our flight from Bangkok was late. It did not arrive on Phuket until after midnight. With no meter taxis available, we had to deal with the several private taxis that were hassling us for business.

Their fares to Kata were 1,800 baht upwards. We normally pay between 500 and 700 baht, but we finally had to accept the offer of a taxi who also wanted to give his friend a lift home.

Before setting off, the driver's friend intended to sit in the front seat on top of our suitcase since there was no room elsewhere to sit. We said "no" and off we went without him.

Our taxi driver drove at 140 kilometers per hour all the way, including through red lights, until he finally stopped to buy gas, at which point I told him to slow down.

He did, and only drove at 120kmh while sending a text message to someone.

I also noticed a car license plate in the seat pocket in the back. Maybe he was now using his private license plate?

Is there any control at the airport on who gives you a ride after office hours? What action do the Phuket officials recommend we take if our flight is delayed next time we come to Phuket?

Frequent flyer Phuket

Attayaporn Sukchatree, a Taxi Complaint Service officer replies:

We are working with the authorities to get rid of illegal taxis operating from the airport. Until that time, I suggest that you use careful judgment before getting into any car.

Recently, the regulations for taxis were changed. Now legal taxis must display stickers on both sides of the vehicle detailing the taxi's number, owner's name in English and Thai, and the complaint phone line number: 1584.

If you believe you have been badly treated or overcharged, you can call either 1584 or the Taxi Meter Association on 076-202 171 and make a report.

Jantima Chaipibal, an officer of The Taxi Meter Association replies:

Our company operates a taxi service at the airport from 7am to 1am daily. Outside of those times there may be taxis around, but it is not guaranteed.

You can recognize our company's drivers by their dress. They wear white shirts and black trousers.

His vision was to create a health center of sorts. So, together with his wife Dr Nongtanan, a dentist by trade but also a qualified practitioner of Thai herbal medicine and

aromatherapy, Tachapon set out to make his dream come true.

Having opened a health shop in town, followed by a small spa with five beds (that quickly expanded to 14 beds after it had become popular with Japanese tourists), Sukko Cultural Spa was born in 2008.

Inspired by and named after the 13th Century Thai empire Sukhothai, Sukko Spa was built in the style of the Kingdom itself, only on a smaller scale. The spa lobby, a raised pavilion with a central pool and exquisite murals flanked by graceful colonnades, is redolent of a royal palace.

Part of the charm of Sukko is the inclusion of an ancient form of Thai martial art (Muay Chaiya) and traditional stretching (rue sri dat ton). Regular yoga classes are on the offer and taught by a certified Ashtanga Yoga teacher.

All spa treatments and products are formulated by Tachapon's wife Dr Nongtanan who also designs Sukko signature massage therapy. The resort acquires its organic herbs from trusted growers

around the region in a drive to support small-scale farming.

Extolling the virtues of the era, Tachapon says:

"Sukhothai was the golden age, not only for art and literature but also the time when ayurveda (Hindu traditional medicine) from India was fully assimilated by the Thais. Admittedly, there is very little written evidence of local traditional medicine, but I do believe that it is the combination of Indian Ayurveda, Chinese practices and local wisdom."

"At Sukko Spa, we aim to touch all the senses. And that's why we design beautiful surroundings, select only choice music and offer wholesome food, aroma and massage therapy. The idea is to create an oasis of wellbeing within Phuket."

Since its opening six years ago, Sukko Spa has won many awards from the spa industry's regulating bodies. But the ardent health pioneer Tachapon will not rest on his laurels.

"In the future, we'd like to see Sukko becoming a fully-fledged medical clinic with certified herbalists and doctors using therapeutic massage therapy as part of the regimen. But for now, the focus is on raising the standards of Thai herbs so that they become certified drugs in their own right," concludes Tachapon.

Life & style Stumbling at high speeds



PEOPLE frequently ask me, what's the best internet connection in Phuket? The short answer is... there's no way to know for sure. Much depends on your exact location, and luck.

Over the years I have run a free speed reporting site, PhuketInternetSpeed.com, which is an attempt at quantifying the real-world internet international download speeds here in Phuket.

For quite some time, we had pretty good luck nailing down which providers were the fastest, which had intermittent problems, and which just weren't in the running. With 30,000 individually reported measurements, running through the data divulged some worthwhile results.

Now, I'm not so sure.

The most recent problem started when TOT and 3BB found a way to skew our tests: we were all using a specific test to a location in Los Angeles. First TOT, and later 3BB, found ways to boost the results on that test, without noticeably improving their general service levels. We've tried to bob around a bit, testing to a different location, and using different tests, but the results have been spotty.

There's a more fundamental problem.

Almost all internet speed-testing sites measure how long it takes to download one file over one connection from a webserver to your PC. Depending on where and how you download most files, that might be an accurate reflection of how well your internet connection is working for you. Or maybe not.

For example, all major browsers have download accelerators built in. (Free, third-party accel-

typically download files over two or more connections — often without telling you that you're using multiple simultaneous download threads. That makes it impossible to predict whether an accelerator is

delivering a faster download over a given internet connection and how much faster that delivery might be.

Torrents take multiple data streams as an article of faith. So your typical internet speed test probably won't provide an accurate measure of torrent download speeds, which

can depend on mostly uncontrollable factors such as the number of sites (or seeds) offering the file for download and the speeds of those seeding sites. More than that, downloading torrents in Thailand has the added unpredictability of the location of the seeds: if the file's being offered inside Thailand, it'll go faster than a file outside of Thailand.

All of the Internet Service

Providers (ISPs) in Phuket serve up popular webpages more quickly by caching pages on their local servers.

If, say, 1,000 Internet users in Phuket are watching a Formula 1 race in Monte Carlo, the ISP

> doesn't have to move 1,000 identical sets of bits from Monte Carlo to Phuket.

Instead, one stream of bits flows from the Monte Carlo race to Bangkok, and 1,000 streams flow to Phuket.

That saves the ISP money by reducing the international bandwidth they need to provide. It also speeds

things up for us customers. The caching takes place in the blink of an eye.

Caching is great for many reasons, but if you're trying to measure your typical Internet speed, it can gum up the results. Some internet speed tests check for something called latency or ping time: it's the time necessary to move one packet of data from your computer, to the destination and back. When a latency/ping test comes in faster than the speed of light, either there's something fishy going on or your ISP has learned how to exploit a wormhole.

Here's an example. Light travels at 186,000 miles per second, but in typical fiber it's closer to 130,000 miles per second. The distance from Phuket to Los Angeles is about 8,300 miles. Real internet connections never travel as fast as the speed of light – there are switches and all sorts of intermediate disruptions. But the very fastest "ping" from Phuket to Los Angeles should take at least (2 * 8,300)/130,000 = 0.128 seconds, or 128 milliseconds.

If you're near a computer, try running the speed test at speedtest.net. I just got a ping run of 62 msec. Although the people at OOKLA, who run the speedtest.net site, assure me that their test can't be cached, at least that part of the test is being cached. Either that, or True has figured out how to move bits faster than the speed of light. The speedtest site says my download speed is about 9 Megabits per second, which is quite respectable for a 10 Mbps True ADSL line.

By contrast, the DSLReports speed test reports my ping to the Los Angeles server at 248 msec – a thoroughly credible number. But DSLReports says my downloads run about 1.6 to 1.8 Mbps, or onefifth as fast as OOKLA reports.

Here's the clincher. If I run a full-out download, with multiple streams of data to a very, very fast server in the US, I can hit just about 9 Mbps.

It gets worse. When I use MLab's Network Diagnostic Tool, I get 7.3 Mbps.

When I run the Visualware test, I get 1.9 Mbps.

So which is it? Am I really getting 9 Mbps (OOKLA/ Speedtest), 1.6 Mbps (DSLReports), 7.3 (MLabs), 1.9 (Visualware) – or something else entirely?

I struggled with that question when I was writing my latest Top Story for Windows Secrets Newsletter and I didn't come up

with a definitive answer. Each of the sites produces different results. Remarkably, they're all replicable: I get just about the same speeds regardless of which computer I

operating system, which browser. The main variation I see is from day to day, and hour to hour.

A friend of mine has been watching his download speeds, too, very carefully. He's discovered that his downloads peak every night about midnight: at 11:59 pm, he's getting 2 or 3 Mbps, or even less, then at 12:01 am, he's up to 9 or 10 Mbps. And that happens every night, like clockwork.

Next week I'll tell you how the US government is handling dichotomies like this one – yes, the Feds see the same sort of speed differences that we see here in Phuket, although that midnight spike is unique as far as I can tell. Next week I'll also step you through a few methods for trying to track down what's happening to your line.

But the original question – which internet service is best remains unsolved, and I don't have a good way of making measurements that can be replicated across the island. (In the best of all possible worlds, the testing method would be something that regular everyday internet customers could perform.) If you have an idea, or a testing method that isn't well known, I'd sure like to hear from you! Shoot me email.

NBTC may revoke 3G bids

THE National Broadcasting and Telecommunications Commission (NBTC) has threatened to revoke the 3G) licenses for any of the three bid winners who refuse to lower mobile service fees by 15-20 per cent, a commission executive said.

So... you've got a baby on the way

HAVING a baby is (apparently) a wonderful moment in one's life. However, I've also heard that it can be quite stressful, emotional and very tiring. But, for those of you who also have dogs in the house, vou need to think about them too. You are right to be concerned about your dog sniffing around the new addition. Just think of all those bugs, infections and nasty bacteria that a dog can catch from an un-vaccinated toddler.

Bringing your new baby home must be quite exciting. If I had to wait 9 months for my XBOX 360 to be delivered, I'd be super excited come the big day myself. Of course, having a new addition to your household, and an uneducated, totally dependent one at that, brings with it a myriad of changes to your normal routine - and therefore to your dog's routine.

Amidst all the excitement of bringing home your new baby, your dog may end up sharing most of the anxiety and less of the fun. There's quite a bit that can be done with your dog to make the new transition easier, and with nine months to go, you've got time on your side.

The calm before the storm

It's no surprise that your dog needs to adjust to the idea of having a baby around the house because frankly, so do you. A baby will bring about changes in your routine, unfamiliar noises, less recreational time and increased stress. The first thing to think about is what kind of exposure your dog has already had to children and animals?

How did he react? What kind of experience was it? It's worth consulting a canine behaviorist to assess your dog too. Don't mistake dog "breed" for safety.



Sure, some dogs are advertised as "great with kids and babies" but all dogs are different, and if there's any chance he could react badly to a new baby – you need to know before it happens.

Start preparing your dog by getting him used to you holding something in your arms whilst going about normal routines. Dolls that makes realistic baby sounds are easily available at shops. You can also take him to the area where your new born will sleep or play and reward him for being calm.

If you have already bought your push-chair, take it on walks with you as if it's totally normal and allow your dog to get used to it. Exposing your dog to lots of children and babies of all ages in a safe and positive manner will also help him to learn that he can be calm and controlled amidst the commotion. Again, a behaviorist can help you further.

New baby boot camp

Having your dog enrolled in obedience training prior to the baby's arrival should be given serious consideration as you will all benefit tremendously. You'll truly appreciate the added benefits of having a dog that will sit, lie down, go to place, leave it, or settle down, all on command.

However, without the benefit of training, you need to be aware of your dogs limitations and be guarded not to "shut him out" just because he won't sit for you. You can still have a calm, baby-loving dog, but you need to manage it.

Temple cats die of flu

THE initial probe into the deaths of several cats abandoned at a temple in Angthong revealed that they died of cat flu, a provincial livestock official said recently.

Livestock development official

Krissana Komonchan said the remaining cats at Wat Khao Kaew in Pho Thong district, which appeared to have symptoms, were given antibiotic injections. No cure is available for feline influenza and all that can be done is to treat the symptoms.

Krissana said the public should not worry, as the disease is not transmissible to humans. This illness is caused by a virus that is spread via the saliva to unvaccinated cats or dogs in poor health. The spread of the virus at the temple was the result of a lack of hygiene and the crowded living conditions of the animals.

Krissana said he would confirm the diagnoses by sending saliva for laboratory testing. The results are expected in eight to 10 days.



New aviation 'liberalization' of manufacturing

A NEW government initiative to allow foreign investors to hold 70 per cent or more of a company manufacturing aviation parts will help promote the country as a regional repair center of the industry, says an executive at Thai Airways International.

Danuj Bunnag, executive vice president of THAI's commercial department, welcomed the plan and said it would help strengthen Thailand's performance in the region in this competitive industry.

"Thanks to its strategic location, Thailand has long been an important nation in the region for the aviation industry. It has become a major center for airlines to connect their flights between other cities," said Mr Danuj.

"Therefore, if the Kingdom offers a repair service center, it is more likely that airlines will see Thailand as a 'one-stop' operation. This allows them to service and maintain their flight-connection hubs at the same time, which will boost the local economy."

Thailand has long tried to promote itself as a regional repair hub. However, it has lacked in terms of facilities, especially aviation parts for different sizes of aircraft.

The Cabinet, as initiated by Transport Minister Chatchart Sithipan, agreed last month on a draft act to replace the one that has governed this issue since 1954. It will be considered by the House of Representatives in the hope that it will help consolidate the country as an aviation hub in the countdown to the formation of the Asean Economic Community (AEC) in 2015.

The new law would allow foreign investors to hold a 70 per cent stake in a company in this field, and 100 per cent if they are required to utilize high technology for production. Controlling a 70 per cent stake in the operation is also in line with the AEC agreement on aviation-industry liberalization.

Currently, foreign investors can hold only a 49 per cent stake in a company. This is not an attractive incentive and affects job creation for local people.

The government hopes to use this move to back the construction of an industrial park for aviation-parts production as well. However, some regulatory barriers exist in regard to the Board of Investment and will have to be removed, especially the regulation that requires declaration of sensitive business information to the agency. - Phuket Gazette

AFTER 79 years of service to Thailand, British Airways (BA) says it still sees the Kingdom as an important market because more executives, especially from small and medium-sized enter-

prises (SMEs), will fly out to ink business deals.

The airline will use its strong network to connect local businessmen not only to its home base in London, but also to other parts of the world, especially the US, said Sriram Narayan, BA manager for Thailand, Cambodia and Vietnam.

His company is part of the International Airlines Group (IAG), which also operates Iberia and BMI airlines. IAG is one of the world's largest airline

groups with 398 aircraft flying to 200 destinations and carrying more than 50 million passengers each year.

It is the third largest group in Europe and the sixth largest in the world in terms of revenue.

The company operates the only

daily Bangkok-London flight. Narayan declined to reveal the cabin factor, but said it is doing "well". The firm claims to have advantages over rivals in pricing, onboard service and food quality, but most importantly the flight is non-stop, which makes

it easier to connect to other parts of the world. And students can get discounted fares.

Airline representatives say they are looking forward to the Asean Economic Community (AEC) in 2015, which should stimulate regional traffic. The airline is working with Bangkok Airways via code-sharing to help its London passengers connect to domestic and regional destinations.

BA will also look for an "opportunity" to launch their own direct flight from London to the Thai region if the right time comes.

> Worldwide, it operates 755 flights per day, with 152 destinations and carries 32 million passengers per year. Asia is a growing market for the company, which is launching a new route to Seoul from London.

Even though Southeast Asia offers more opportunity, BA says it has kept a balance for all markets to minimize its business risk at a time of economic uncertainty worldwide.

firm is trying to strengthen its brand globally, including in Thailand, under the motto, "To Fly. To Serve".

The airline has committed to spending over 250 million baht on customer products and services over the next five years.

The Dominican Republic "wreck" complete with ancient pieces of broken amphora pottery, ballast stones, cannons and other artifacts from the period, was developed as an underwater museum exhibit available to those with the desire to explore this underwater world and see what a "virgin" Spanish

galleon wreck might look like.

The idea of a turning a submerged cultural resource into an underwater museum is at the forefront how we think about artificial reefs the next important development for Phuket diving.

As the tourism industry in Phuket continues to skyrocket, "land people" worry $about\ the\ infra-$ The reef squadron (top) did not last structure: roads, long, unlike the tyres in Florida water, electricity, and the preserva-

tion of steep jungle slopes and mangroves. But for "underwater people" such as divers and snorkelers, it's hard not to also fret over our precious reefs.

The dive industry in Phuket, with quality diving from a paradise island that an airline jet can land on, is booming. The increase in the number of divers from around the world using Phuket as a base for their first exploration of the underwater world or using it as a jump off point to the Similan Islands is creating mounting pressure on the island's marine ecosystems.

Because of this pressure, it is no wonder that organizations such as Go Eco Phuket are scrambling to find suitable solutions through the creation of artificial reefs. The Royal Thai Navy has already donated two decommissioned vessels to Go Eco Phuket to be

scuttled and sunk.

A different approach to artificial reefs landed on the blackboard last year, as start up company Reef Worlds, specializing in highly stylized artificial reefs, designed by some of the same artists that worked on the sets of Lord of the Rings and Avatar, started working with a couple resorts in Phuket in

However, unless done well, these artificial reefs can simply float away, as did the Phuket "Coral Reef Squadron" did, not so many years ago. Though the efforts of sinking the 10 military aircraft might have ended in naught, with rumors of the submerged crafts "flying" as far north as Burma, they did not wreak the same havoc as another failed artificial reef project launched in the United States in the 1970s.

government-backed The community "Osborne Reef" project consisted of dumping and attempting to tie down over 2 million used vehicle tyres as the superstructure for an artificial reef. Shortly after the project was finished the tyres like Phuket's aircraft tore free from their chains. Unlike the aircraft, the tyres have destroyed and continue to destroy natural reefs and other marine ecosystems in the Gulf of Mexico.

The importance of artificial reefs in the future of diving in Phuket, and around the world, is undeniable.

The technology and momentum is there to take us beyond the reefs we know, into a world of concepts, living on the edge of our imaginations. These substrates can become home to the corals we love and the mega and macro fauna that makes us smile to the point that water leaks in around our regulators.

But to do so, without having our reefs take-off into the unknown or destroy those familiar reefs we love, it is important to take a long look back at the history of artificial reefs, so that we can have a better understanding of what resources we have now, and what direction we should set our compass for.

Life & style House and Garden Gift-wrapped for gardeners

GARDEN tools. Ah...Hardly romantic, but, even at Christmas, likely to be appreciated by the hands-on horticulturalist.

At the risk of sounding sexist, more for the men in your life. A simple choice would be a pair of secateurs.

It doesn't matter if the intended recipient has a pair – she can always keep another pair handy in the car. Think of all those opportunities you have had for snipping a twig or two from a roadside shrub or tree.

I have gone through five pairs since I came to Phuket - a reflection of both my own proclivities and of the tool's variable quality. You can go for the anvil type or the much commoner bypass style, which operates like scissors. But remember the cheap ones are unlikely to stay the course. 'Spring' and get a sturdy bypass pair for 229 baht.

Oh, and speaking of cheap pressies, garden gloves with



leather palms at 39 baht will take some beating. When recently cutting down a bougainvillea that had, characteristically, outgrown its surroundings, I ended up with plenty of scratches. Gloves would have helped.

Another stocking filler might come in the shape of a garden sprayer. You can use one with a simple trigger mechanism, but a better choice is a hand-pumped compression sprayer, usually holding a liter or two of liquid, which allows you to mix small amounts of chemicals, and thus avoid waste. It's useful both for "misting" indoor plants and for applying pesticides. Available for 89 baht, it is, like the other items, on sale at Home Pro, Chalong, or as they tend to say, "at good stores everywhere."

In the tropics, one quickly

realizes that pruning, trimming and cutting are the inevitable consequence of growing plants, especially woody ones, which take off like an express once they are established. And secateurs are only good for small branches. Anything over half an inch is likely to need something stronger.

Something more robust inevitably means something larger or more cumbrous. Not easy to gift-wrap. Loppers, for instance, are going to be two or three feet in length.

Nonetheless, they are an essential in the Phuket gardener's armory: the long handles offer far more leverage than secateurs, and they have the additional merit of enabling you to cut among thorny branches without losing too much blood. Look for a shock-absorber below the pivot point. Prices range from 200 to 600 baht.

Hedge shears are better for rapid trimming of shrubs and hedges. Some have serrations or notches in one blade, which can hold thicker



survive the rain and humidity of the tropics. Photo: Mike Carroll

branches while you cut. For small areas of grass, go for a strimmer.

A bow saw will tackle those tasks that even shears or a lopper cannot manage. It's a better choice than a conventional saw because it is less likely to get stuck during the cutting process, and has a blade which can easily be replaced for about 100 baht. Cost 250 baht and upwards, complete with disposable blade. All these tools will need some maintenance: the odd spray with WD 40 will inhibit rust.

If you want to offer a present that is less palpably destructive, think about small digging and planting tools. A trowel is always handy, both for transplanting seedlings and for removing weeds.

A longer handle may suit people who have difficulty in bending down. A small fork serves a similar function. Now available in hard-wearing plastic, the best ones are still made of stainless steel. Available for 77 baht. The same applies to long-handled spades, forks and rakes. The better the quality, the more likely the implement is to survive in a climate where the elements usually win.

The presents are getting bigger every year. And we haven't even got to wheel-barrows and mowers...


Go nuts with coconuts

MOST coconut palms (cocos nucifera) are too big for the average Phuket garden.

If you want a solitary but manageable variety, the foxtail palm (wodyetia), with its smooth trunk and neat, feathery fronds, is a better bet.

But coconut palms are readily available, cost next to nothing, grow easily and are ideal for larger acreages, or when planted to form an avenue of trees. Silhou-

they look magnificent.

There is another reason for growing them. I am not thinking of their source, though Thai dishes rely heavily on coconut milk, or of the use of leaves for thatching, or even of the durable timber. Wolfe goes after blood

Books

By James Eckardt

TOM Wolfe made his name with four collections of magazine stories published in rapid succession between 1965 and 1970 that chronicled the wild 1960s in hyperventilated prose, replete with ellipses, italics and... exclamation points! These grandiose 'New Journalism' stylistic tics have persisted throughout the decades. Wolfe is now 81.

But give him credit for honest, dogged only 5'7" but is such a mass of gym-built

research. His book about the first American astronauts, The Right Stuff, took him nearly a decade. He turned to fiction in 1987 with Bonfire of the Vanities, a novel about high finance, low crime and racial tensions in New York City.

He knows his New York well, having worked for the Herald Tribune throughout 1960s.

The novel was a commercial and critical success. His second novel, A Man in Full, was set in Atlanta and

was much less so, elegantly panned by no less than John Updike in *The New Yorker*.

in Miami is riveting.

Norman Mailer and John Irving piled on. Unfazed, Wolfe dubbed them "the Three Stooges" and in an essay entitled Stalking the Billion Footed Beast called for his kind of street-reportage novel over more high-toned 'literary' ones.

He's back with a bang in Back to Blood (Jonathan Cape, London, 2012, 704pp). The

city this time is Miami, where wealth and power are squabbled over by Cubans, Anglos, African Americans, Haitians, Jews, Russians ... Half the city are recent immigrants. Muses the WASP editor of the Miami Herald: "Did one segment of them, the Cubans, control the city politically – Cuban mayor, Cuban department heads, Cuban cops, Cuban cops, and more Cuban cops, 60 per cent of the force now Cubans, plus 10 per cent other Latins, 18 per cent American

blacks, and only 12 per cent Anglo?" The moral center of the novel is a Cuban cop named Nestor Camacho. He is

> For this he is pilloried by his family and also the entire Cuban community because the refugee had not yet set foot on American soil to claim legal sanctuary.


> Next he subdues a 6'5", black, crack dealer who was in the process of strangling sergeant.

But a videotape of him shouting abuse at the fallen giant has

gone viral on YouTube, enraging Miami's black community. Camacho is forced to surrender his badge and gun.

"Who is he going to offend next?", the Cuban mayor wonders. "The Haitians?"

Yes, the Haitians. Ghislaine Lantier is a fair-skinned Haitian, a student at the University of Miami, daughter of a French professor. A volunteer social worker, she was minding children inside the crack

house when Camacho brought down the drug dealer. She now asks him for help with her brother who is getting involved with a Haitian gang in high school.

Meanwhile, his girlfriend Magdalena Otero, a nurse, has left him for her boss, Dr Norman Lewis, a blond, Anglo psychiatrist who specializes in porn addiction.

He proves to be a sex addict himself and a shameless social climber who reaches the peak of Miami society when he meets Sergei Korolyov, the handsome Russian oligarch who has donated US\$ 70 million of modern Russian art to the Miami museum, causing a grateful city to rename it the Korolyov Museum. Magdalena falls for him and dumps the doctor.

Korolyov doesn't know it, but Camacho

is about to offend the Russian community.

Miami is infested with all kinds of lowlife, but the good guys in this novel are Camacho, the big, black police chief Cyrus Booker and the little Anglo newspaper reporter John Smith. They are all forced into stark moral choices between material advancement and their own sense of manhood.

Wolfe's stylistic tics can become boring and repetitious but his sense of the city turns this novel into a sweeping epic. A Marine Police speedboat, a multi-yacht orgy, a Cuban bakery, a family pig roast, a crack house, a Russian nightclub, a ritzy art show, a Jewish nursing home... all fit into Wolfe's breathless orbit and the reader is grateful to be taken for the ride.

I'll be back: Pacquiao

THOUGH bruised and battered, Manny Pacquiao said he felt "fine" on Sunday after his sensational sixth-round knockout by Mexican Juan Manuel Marquez and promised his fans he would return to the ring.

There had been speculation the 33-yearold Pacquiao might consider retirement after losing for a second time in his last three bouts but the Filipino southpaw made it clear he would be back to compete after taking a well-earned break.

"To all my fans, I would like to thank you for your prayers and assure you that I am fine," Pacquiao said in a statement just hours after his stunning defeat in a nontitle welterweight bout in front of a sellout crowd at the MGM Grand Garden Arena.

"I am looking forward to a nice rest and then I will be back to fight. On behalf of (his wife) Jinkee and our family we would like to wish everyone a joyous Christmas and a happy and healthy new year."

Pacquiao, who had won twice and drawn once in his three previous meetings with Marquez, was floored by a thunderous right by the counter-punching Mexican with just one second left in the sixth round of a high-energy bout.

The Filipino was also knocked down in the third round but fears of a possible concussion were put to rest after a precautionary CT (computed tomography) scan at nearby University Medical Center hospital after the fight ended.

"The results were negative," said Michael Koncz, Pacquiao's advisor. "We were in and out in just over an hour and Manny was in excellent spirits."

Both fighters had much to prove in their heavily anticipated fourth showdown.

Marquez was determined to set the record straight after firmly believing he had been "robbed" by the judges' verdicts in their three previous fights while Pacquiao was eager to prove his powers had not diminished with age.

The Filipino had delivered a below-par performance against Marquez 13 months ago when he narrowly retained his WBO welterweight title with a controversial majority decision that was greeted by loud booing from disgruntled Marquez fans.

Pacquiao's preparations for that fight were hampered by various distractions, including marital difficulties, but he has since patched up his relationship with his wife and become a much more disciplined boxer after giving up his former pastimes of cockfighting, gambling nightclubbing.

In June, however, Pacquiao lost on a hotly disputed split decision to American Timothy Bradley, his first defeat since he was beaten by Erik Morales in Las Vegas

With his ego bruised and his stature diminished, the Filipino set his sights on bold vindication against Marquez, but once again he fell short in his bid.

"I want to congratulate Juan Manuel," said Pacquiao, who slipped to 54-5-2 with 38 knockouts. "I have no excuses. It was a good fight and he deserved the victory. I think boxing fans who watched us were winners too.'

Pacquiao's stunning loss has almost certainly written off any chance of a long awaited mega-fight between the Filipino and American Floyd Mayweather Jr, and he is now much more likely to take on Marquez for a fifth time.

"Yes, why not? It's a good fight," said the Filipino, who has won world titles in an unprecedented eight weight divisions.

"If you give us a chance, we'll fight again."

Michel Platini against the introduction of technology

UEFA President Michel Platini million to the grassroots and remains ardently opposed to the use of goal-line technology, which is being employed by FIFA for the first time at the Club World Cup, and he said on Tuesday the money would be better spent developing the game.

The technology was employed in last Thursday's Club World Cup curtain raiser between Sanfrecce Hiroshima and Auckland City in Yokohama as soccer's governing body FIFA finally answered calls for it to join the 21st century.

While once-sceptical FIFA President Sepp Blatter changed his mind after a series of controversial decisions in high-profile matches, Platini is not for turning.

The Frenchman, in Kuala Lumpur to sign a Memorandum of Understanding with the Asian Football Confederation on cooperation, delivered a blunt "No" when asked by reporters if he would follow Blatter's lead.

"It is not a question of goalline technology, it is a question of technology," he said. "Where do you begin with the technology and where do you end with the technology?

"To put goal-line technology in our competitions is 50 million Euros (US\$ 64.63 million) in five years. I prefer to give the 50

development in football than to put 50 million into technology for perhaps one or two goals per year."

Hawk-eye, widely used in cricket and tennis, and GoalRef, which uses a microchip in the ball and low magnetic waves around the goal, are being used at venues in Toyota and Yokohama.

FIFA will analyze the results and could use one of the systems at the Confederations Cup in Brazil next year.

Platini, who is in favor of deploying extra officials instead of technology to help make decisions, will have the opportunity to discuss the issue with Blatter and the rest of the FIFA executive committee at a meeting in Tokyo on Friday.

"We supported the additional referees that is now accepted by the international board, and with the referee one meter from the line I think if he has good glasses he can see if the ball is inside the goal or outside," he said.

While Platini is resisting calls to introduce technology, the 57-yearold has been responsible for sweeping changes in soccer since becoming UEFA president in 2007, a position he was reelected to unopposed last year.

He introduced 'Financial Fair

Play' rules in an effort to curb overspending by European clubs, and offered more automatic places in the lucrative Champions League group stage for domestic champions.

Platini has also said UEFA has put fans first with its radical decision to stage Euro 2020 in cities across Europe rather than one or two host countries.

Criticism of the plan was premature, he said on Tuesday.

'The idea was decided, there is nothing else. Now we will create committees to think about what could be the best idea for what we have to do in the eight years before Euro (2020)."

The first half of the season was perhaps the most exciting ever. We saw seven different winners in seven races, at the end of which Lewis Hamilton led by just 2 points. Then Fernando Alonso won twice, and Hamilton once. Alonso had a 34 point lead, but anyone could win.

Then McLaren won three races, and Sebastian Vettel took four races on the trot. Vettel was in the lead by 13 points. It had slipped into a dreadful predictability.

The season blazed back to life for the last three races. In Abu Dhabi, Kimi Räikkönen won for Lotus. Vettel's lead dropped to 10 points over Alonso. The USA GP was sensational. Hamilton won, but Vettel took second with Alonso third, setting up a dramatic championship decider in Brazil. Jenson Button won the last race, but it was about Alonso and Vettel. Vettel scraped in with a 3 point win.

McLaren's errors defined 2012. In Australia they looked invincible.

In Malaysia, a terrible pit-stop cost Hamilton the race. In China, they took second and third after Hamilton received a

five-place penalty for a gearbox change.

Bahrain, Hamilton finished eighth, after awful pit stops, and Button retired with differential problems.

Hamilton took his third pole in Spain, but was sent to the back of the grid for insufficient fuel. He won in Canada, but in the European,

British and German GPs went out in collisions. He won in Hungary and Italy. In Belgium he went out in another collision, but Button took the win.

Rumors were rife that Hamilton wanted to leave. In Singapore, Hamilton's gearbox cost him the race. Button came second again. In Korea, Button retired after a

collision and Hamilton had a jinxed race to finish tenth. In Abu Dhabi, Hamilton retired from the lead with a fuel pressure problem, but won in the USA. Button won in Brazil, and Hamilton retired after a collision.

McLaren started and finished with the best cars on the track, but errors from the Immaculate Team cost them the season. and Hamilton.

Rule changes hit Red Bull hardest. It was Bahrain before the car started performing.

Mark Webber won in Monaco and Britain, but it was Spain before Red Bull looked dominant, where an alternator failure cost Vettel

victory.

Vettel lucked out in Singapore as Hamilton's gearbox failed, then a technical upgrade enabled him to win in Japan, Korea and India.

McLaren fought back to top car, but by then Red Bull only needed to THRILLS AND SPILLS: Grosjean and Alonso beat Ferrari.

> Ferrari started with a substandard car and the best driver of 2012. Alonso stole an opportunistic win in Malaysia, and was in the top three. In Spain, Alonso became the first repeat winner. He won again in Germany, and his lead was 40 points after Hungary. But Ferrari's development lagged. Red Bull's didn't.

When Ferrari lost in India, 2012 was all

for Red Bull to lose.

In Bahrain, Canada and Hungary Lotus had the best car. Räikkönen should have hunted Vettel in Bahrain, and Grosjean would have won in Spain but for a faulty alternator. Finally the only Räikkönen victory was Abu Dhabi.

Mercedes started well with Nico Rosberg's win in China. He was strong in Bahrain, and finished second in Monaco. After that, Mercedes lagged in development, and never threatened again. Michael Schumacher's abysmal season was relieved only by Spain.

Sauber produced a wonderful car. It prefers fast tracks, but is kind to tyres. In Malaysia and Italy, Sergio Perez came second. Then he signed to join McLaren for 2013 and did nothing thereafter.

Kamui Kobayashi was unlucky to get only one podium finish. He has lost his seat for 2013 to Nico Hülkenberg.

Force India did well. Hülkenberg got the higher points because the team split strategies. Williams had their best car in years, with Spain giving Pastor Maldonado their first victory since 2004.

Toro Rosso looked promising, but did not deliver. Caterham and Marussia did not make progress. HRT is for sale.

Bernie Ecclestone is 82. In 2012 he remarried, was the subject of a UK tax enquiry and a German bribery case with knockons in the USA. His proposed F1 IPO was canceled. At the end of the season he had a row with Ferrari. Will Bernie ever retire?



BLUE skies and consistent winds marked the final day of the 2012 Phuket King's Cup Regatta in fitting style as teams and their boats assembled at the start line in a final bid to resolve their class contests.

Some classes had effectively completed on December 7, but most delivered a thrilling final day of action.

Frank Pong and his Jelik team powered home in first place of the IRC Zero class, ahead of Thai team Won Ma Rang. Less than three minutes separated them at the close with the Hong Kong team eventually coming out on top after a week-long battle.

Jelik has been raced at and won the Phuket King's Cup Regatta before, in 2007.

"We decided last night just to have a good clean race and keep out of trouble. Won Ma Rang crossed ahead of us, but we picked up more wind on the opposite side. It was a close race, but we had a point-score advantage going into the final round," said Pong.

"I have to say, Won Ma Rang has really come forward compared to two years ago. They practice hard and have great people. We're both here every year, and I've been here four or five times with

this boat. It's been four years since our last win! We've been blessed with six perfect days – even the reserve day had good wind. Deservedly, the Phuket King's Cup is itself the King of Regattas in Asia," he

Ma Rang, said, "The conditions were great for racing, and it was is my 25th Regatta, so I know the race well and always expect a strong challenge. The crew will be the same next year when we return. Our next race is in the Singapore Straits so we will prepare for that now."

Steve Manning's Walawala 2 team performed very strongly in the final IRC1 clash, finishing first by three minutes.

However, the victory wasn't enough as David Fuller's Ichi Ban team took overall honors by four points with Foxy Lady 6 finishing second.

In IRC2, the second *Ichi Ban* team lead by Matt Allen was also victorious. Royal Thai Navy 1, with former Thai national sailor Wiwat Poonpat at the helm, came in second by six points.

Royal Thai Navy 2, skippered by Commander Peera Sagurtam, finished the week in fourth place.

In Platu One Design class, there was a week-long contest between Thailand's Tuay Lek and three Japanese boats.

final race, skippering The Beaver to take the win, with Tuay Lek coming home in second.

cut out for him after qualifying didn't go to plan and he was forced to start the races in 15th position. Commenting on his qualifying, Young said that maximizing the tyres on the MRF Formula 2000 cars was proving difficult:

"I knew we had made a gain with the setup compared to the last round, but in qualifying I didn't quite get the new set of tyres to operate at their maximum and I actually went slower than in free practice when we were using an older set of rubber.

"It was quite strange but I was more confident to be racing on a used set of tyres and that meant I could fight my way through the field and gain positions in the races as I knew we had some speed in the bank."

Young is adamant that he will

take another step forward and be pushing even closer to the front of the grid in the upcoming races.

"This is a hugely competitive field, with drivers who have driven GP3, GP2, Formula 2 and even Formula 1 cars this year, and after having so much time off from racing before this MRF championship began, I feel I'm beginning to claw my way back towards the front.

To be breaking into the top ten out of 18 cars is a massive confidence boost and I know I can mix it up in the front. With the same amount of preparation as the top guys, I believe I will then be able to battle with them. I am showing that I'm getting faster and faster with more seat time, so I just want to keep the upwards trend in the results on a roll and again back up what I said previously by making another big improvement."







For anyone wanting to end the year by acquiring international art that will make a collector jealous, then **Soul of Asia** at Plaza Surin is surely the place to shop.

Eric grew up in a Dutch household that valued the traditional artists of his country.


