

• 'THIS TIME I DECIDED TO RUN TO YOU ASKING FOR HELP' Child exploitation caught in spotlight

Human-trafficking victim runs to the safety of Patong officials, only tip of the iceberg says children's rights agency

A 12-YEAR-OLD girl fleeing her captors to the safety of officials on Soi Bangla last week, has raised the ugly specter of Phuket becoming a prime human-trafficking and child-exploitation destination, according an international children's rights agency.

The girl, nicknamed "Aoi" to protect her identity, ran up to Patong Deputy Mayor Chairat Sukban and about 10 other officers on night patrol on December 11, saying that she and some of her friends had been taken away from their parents in Cambodia under the pretense that they would be trained as nannies for high-society families in Patong.

"After we got here, the men forced us to steal tourists' bags. We had to steal one or two times a night – they were always watching us, and if we didn't steal something, we weren't allowed to eat," Aoi said.

"They said they would attack our parents back home if we did not do what they said," she explained.

"The men said anytime we see Mr Chairat we must run away... This time I decided to run to you asking for help. I want to go home. I miss my parents."

Burmese worker exodus wins reprieve

THAI Labor Minister Phadermchai Sasomsub on Tuesday said he will ask the Cabinet next week to consider postponing foreign worker deportations for another three months as many could not conclude the nationality verification process by December 14.

The news follows the Phuket Provincial Employment Office (PPEO) chief warning that in line with the national policy, any migrant workers found in Phuket without having completed the nationality verification process will be deported.

"The deadline for migrant workers to complete the nationality verification process was extended by six months, from June 15 until December 14." PPEO chief Yaowapa Pibulpol said.

"During that time, migrant workers must have completed the nationality verification process and applied for permission to

legally work in Thailand. "Anyone found to have not completed this process, but who continues to work illegally after December 14 will be charged and deported, both Burmese workers and employers," she added.

Thai employers found hiring illegal migrant workers will be fined, Ms Yaowapa said.

Under the Alien Worker Act BE 2551, employers found hiring migrant workers who have not been issued valid work permits face a fine of 10,000 to 100,000 baht per illegal worker.

"We have yet to decide when and how we will enforce this, as we have yet to consult other agencies," she added.

National reports estimate that anywhere from 500,000 to 800,000 migrant workers in Thailand face being repatriated to Myanmar for failing to have completed nationality verification.

In Phuket, officials have for years estimated the number of Burmese working illegally on the island to be around 100,000.

In Bangkok, the Thai Chamber of Commerce last week called on authorities to extend the deadline for nationality verification.

"Otherwise, the country's export and economic growth will be adversely affected," chamber vice president Phumin Harinsut said, in reference to the fisheries and related industries that generate 150 billion baht in income from exports – Irfarn Jamdukor each year.



Brazen youths caught after bag snatch in front of police

THREE teenagers were arrested minutes after they snatched a bag from a Chinese tourist right in front of four Phuket police officers in a patrol pickup truck last Saturday night.

"The officers watched as the young men on a motorbike with no license plate approached the woman, Wang Ying, while she was walking by the side of the road with five friends near Phuket FantaSea," Kamala Police duty officer Somnerk Dumkew said.

"The boys [sic] stole her bag, but then noticed the police pickup behind them and sped off towards Patong," Capt Somnerk said.

The officers gave chase and

caught up with the youths about 700 meters down the road, where they had stopped to throw the bag into the bushes beside the road, Capt Somnerk explained. The three suspects – Sutthinan

Pathan and Chalermpong Nernsung, both 19, and a 14-yearold who cannot be named for legal reasons – were each charged with "bag snatching by use of motorbike", a specific charge particular to Thailand.

"They are now being held in custody at Phuket Provincial Court. It is up to the court whether or not to allow them to be released on bail," Capt Somnerk explained. – Atchaa Khamlo

Child rape case handed over to **Phuket Public** Prosecutor

THE Phuket Public Prosecutor will present charges after December 21 against a man who allegedly raped a 9-year-old girl in Mai Khao on October 7.

"This is a grave and serious case. We have no choice but to charge him to the full extent of the law," Public Prosecutor Atikun Puangprom said last Friday.

The lead investigator of the case, Lt Col Rassada Kluengwong, confirmed that the rape test results from Bangkok, as well as the police report were handed over to Mr Atikun.

"The whole case is now with the prosecutor's office," Col Rassada said.

"Once we arrested the suspect and filed the charge against him, we transferred him to Phuket Provincial Court," he said.

Col Rassada confirmed that the suspect was free on court bail.

"I am not sure how much the suspect posted for bail, but I heard it was about 300,000 baht. The option for bail was granted by the court," he explained.

"I had no part in that decision," he added.

Crane rips roof off Phuket tour van in Chalong

Patak Road in Chalong ripped the roof off a tour van transporting seven Russian tourists just after 9am on Tuesday. The west-bound tour van was about 200

The van was not overturned in the accident. However, all seven tourists, as well as the van driver and tour guide were immediately taken to hospital.

Two of the tourists and the tour guide were kept under observation overnight at

"They all have bruises to the body and are suffering back pain," a staffer at Phuket International Hospital confirmed on Wednesday. "They have been asked to remain in the

hospital until we run further tests" she added. Chalong Police Sub Lt Kraisorn Boonprasob explained that he had not charged anyone over the incident yet.

Prison launches inquest of alleged death beating

PHUKET Prison officials are investigating the death of a male inmate following a grieving widow alleging that her husband was beaten to death.

Prison guards found Pranom Duksukkaew, 48, dead from what they believed to be natural causes when they went to rouse the inmates at 6am on December 11. Pranom was serving a 16-year sentence for raping a minor, Phuket Provincial Prison Chief Rapin Nichanon told the Gazette.

Speaking to the press at Vachira Phuket Hospital morgue later that day, Mr Pranom's wife, Saiyuth Rakkarndee, 51, said she discovered her husband was dead only after she arrived at the prison to visit him.

"I arrived at the prison at about 8am, but I was told that Pranom had been found dead at around 6am and that his body had been brought here to Vachira Hospital,"

Mrs Saiyuth said.

"After I saw his body, I do not believe that he 'just died'. There were bruises all over his body; on

his legs, arms and chest. It looks as if he was beaten," she said. "I do not believe that he just died in his sleep, as I was told by

the prison officers," she added. Ms Saiyuth said that, after being incarcerated at the prison, her husband had difficulty communicating and had once complained of chest pains.

"During visits by myself and our relatives, Pranom could not speak properly and could not remember anybody. All he could tell me was that he had chest pains," she said. Prison Chief Rapin denied that

any assault took place. "I talked to our officers. They

swear that the man died naturally. There was no assault involved in the death," he said.

'When he arrived at the prison on December 3, he was already weak and suffering from alcoholism," Chief Rapin explained.

"We had nurses assigned to monitor his condition as he was not eating properly," he added.

"However, to ensure fairness, I have set up a committee to investigate the incident and to find out the truth," Mr Rapin said.

THE Karon Mayor has issued another warning to Kata-Karon seafood vendors with stalls set up along Kata Beach, making it clear that they will be charged with beach encroachment if they continue to ply their trade on public land.

The warning follows raids on beach touts led by Phuket Vice Governor Somkiet Sangkaosuttirak on November 28 – Loy Krathong.

"We have repeatedly warned them [beach food vendors] about setting up stalls and serving food along the beach. Each time we raid them, they pack up and leave – but they keep coming back," Karon Mayor Tawee Thongcham said.

"We needed the support of the provincial authorities to get them to stop, because we alone [Karon Municipality] do not have the authority to force them to move," he added.

Prapan Kanprasang, chief of the Damrongtham Center (provincial ombudsman's office) at Phuket Provincial Hall, confirmed that his office can do nothing to protect the beach vendors who are illegally setting up their stalls

"The raids on November 28 came after the Damrongtham Center received a complaint about the

seafood beach vendors. The complaint claimed that hotel guests in the area were not only being adversely affected by seafood barbecues on the beach, but also by fireworks, fire lanterns and fire dance shows on the beach," Mr Prapan said.

'On November 28, the operators were warned to immediately pull down their stalls and stop cooking seafood. We empowered Karon Municipality to remove the vendors. If the vendors persist, legal action will be taken against them," he added.

The move to evict seafood vendors from Kata and Karon beaches comes in the wake of a "beach cleanup" campaign that began softly last month.

"After issuing warnings, we fined many vendors, with each one facing a fine of up to 2,000 baht," Mayor Tawee said.

"However, some of them still came back to sell food on the beach... They refuse to move," he added.



After a recent scare that the Royal Thai Embassy in Kuala Lumpur had stopped issuing multi-entry non-immigrant Business ("B") visas, the Department of Consular Affairs head office in Bangkok, which coordinates policy for issuing visas at all Royal Thai Embassies around the world, confirmed to the Gazette there has been no formal change in policy.

"However, they will be more rict on issuing such visas," Naphaphatch Piromkit at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs headquarters said.

"There are several factors for which foreigners' applications for a multiple-entry non-imm B visa will be rejected. Nationals from a 'risk group of nations' will be required to return to their homeland to apply for the visa," she said.

However, Ms Naphaphatch declined to identify precisely which countries were among the "risk group of nations".

"Some foreigners keep return-

ing to apply for non-imm B visas, but then do not engage in business or take up employment after they enter Thailand. These people are likely to be denied non-imm B visas," Ms Naphaphatch explained.

"Thailand is now opening up to more foreigners, which is causing more problems. We must now be very strict," she added.

Officials at the Royal Thai Embassy in Kuala Lumpur declined to answer any questions about the issue, saying that only Somphong Kangthong, Minister Counselor at the embassy, could legitimately respond to formal questions.

Meanwhile, any stricter enforcement of the visa application rules seem to have had little to no effect at the Royal Thai Consulate in Penang.

However, foreigners making visa runs to Penang have informed the Gazette over past few months that a "letter from the Phuket Labor Office" must now accompany non-imm B applications.

Tsunami memorial shines on

THE Phuket community will honor those who died in the devastating tsunami that struck the island eight years ago with a ceremony at the Tsunami Memorial Wall in Mai Khao followed by the traditional "Light Up Phuket" candle-lighting ceremony on Patong Beach on December 26.

Thai official figures state that the tsunami killed 5,398 people and that more than 3,700 disappeared in the waves that struck Phuket in 2004.

In Phuket, hundreds of tourists, expats, local residents and migrant workers died or disappeared,

while in Phang Nga province, north of Phuket, the death toll numbered in the thousands.

The ceremony at the Tsunami Memorial Wall will start at around 8:30am, said Bussarakorn Saeurng, of the Mai Khao Tambon Administration Organization.

"The service will include Buddhist monks conducting a mass prayer, a Muslim service and a Christian service," explained Ms Bussarakorn.

"After the religious ceremonies, attendees will approach the wall to lay wreaths in memory of those who died," she added.

Over the years, the number of people attending the morning event

has fallen. "Last year only about 50 people turned up at the memorial wall to remember those lost to the waves in 2004," Ms Bussarakorn said.

At 6:30pm, the annual "Light Up Phuket" candle-lighting ceremony will be held on Patong Beach, where thousands of people turn out each year to dig holes in the sand and place lit candles within to remember tsunami victims. Before attendees are invited to place their lit candles in the sand,

the island's leading officials will hold a ceremony and deliver a few key speeches, offering words to remember tsunami victims by, explained Manop Leelasuthanon, Chief Administrative Officer of the

Phuket Provincial Administration Organization.

As part of the proceedings, students from Phuket Rajabhat University will stage appropriate live performances, he said.

"After the formal ceremonies are complete, people will be invited to place their candles in the sand along the beach," Mr Manop added.

Disaster center launches warning app

THE National Disaster Warning Center (NDWC) launched a mobile phone application this month that allows iPhone and Android phone users to receive instant notifications of any tsunami alerts and warnings.

The "app" was launched on the online Apple App Store for iPhones and iPads on December 11, with an Android version launched on the Android Market on December 14, explained NDWC public relations officer Prasert Kunneang.

"This application is fully operational, but we are continually updating the code, so users need to maintain updates when they become available," he said.

Once people have downloaded and installed the app, they will



receive up-to-date notifications of natural disasters and phenomena around the world.

"After registering as users [via the app's "login"], people can set which phenomena they want to receive notifications of, including earthquakes and storms in the

region, as well as tsunami alerts and tsunami warnings issued by

the NDWC," Mr Prasert said. "Users can also report natural disasters to us in real time by using the 'Push to Talk' function and selecting 'Voice over IP [VOIP]," Mr Prasert explained.

"The application will help us to quickly broadcast news about natural disasters from the NDWC to users and help facilitate coordination between the NDWC and relevant disaster-response organizations," he added.

Although the app is currently available in the Thai language only, Mr Prasert said that an English version is expected to be launched next month.

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In brief... French couple struck by tree

FRENCH tourists Thierry Tiguer, 65, and Catherine Arsaut, 55, were struck down by a falling tree while enjoying a scenic motorbike ride along the road from Patong to Kamala last Saturday.

Mr Tiguer suffered only slight injuries in the crash, but Ms Arsaut suffered a head injury. Both were rushed to Patong Hospital, then transferred to Bangkok Hospital Phuket in Phuket Town.

"Mrs Arsaut suffered an injury to her jaw and to her right arm. She has to stay in the hospital for further treatment," a Bangkok Hospital nurse said on Monday.

Pirate goods suffer death by road roller

PHUKET Customs destroyed pirated goods worth an estimated 29 million baht on December 12. Fake copies of designer brandname purses, sunglasses, shoes and mobile phones were among the items destroyed.

"The 9,762 items destroyed are from 44 closed cases related to pirated goods. They were seized on Phuket between October 2011 and September 2012," said Thai Customs Director-General Benja Luicharoen.

The counterfeit items were destroyed through a variety of methods, including destruction by hammer and knife, as well as mass destruction by way of a road roller.

Scythe robber arrested after bag-snatch nab

POLICE have arrested the man who allegedly robbed a 7-Eleven in Thalang with a scythe earlier this year.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Choti Chavalviwat said Winai Soimuea, 26, also confessed to returning to rob the same 7-Eleven two more times: in November and again only weeks ago.

Mr Winai was arrested after snatching a French tourist's bag near Wat Thepnimit temple in Wichit, Maj Gen Choti explained.

MMA fighter steps forward over 'fractured' penis injury

MMA fighter Ray Elbe has come forward about the penis injury he suffered in his Kuala Lumpur condo earlier this month.

Ray, who founded and for years ran the MMA program at Phuket's renowned Tiger Muay Thai training camp in Chalong, urged all men who suffer a similar injury to immediately seek treatment.

"I came forward about this injury because I want people to understand the significance of the emergency. The more I researched this on Google the more I found that many men do not seek treatment immediately.

"Some guys get to the point that there is no repair because they're embarrassed. They don't want to go to the emergency room right away," he said.

"I want to thank my girlfriend for how she handled the situation. We handled it the best we could, considering the outcome," Ray added.

Ray is recovering well, albeit still with a catheter. "The doctor expects a full recovery. The side that was torn was the side opposite the one that supplies the blood," he told the *Gazette* on Tuesday.

Following a checkup on Wednesday, Ray said he now hopes the catheter will be removed during his next scheduled checkup on December 26.

Recounting the incident that caused the injury, Ray explained that he was having intercourse with his girlfriend on top.

"It came out at the top and as she came down, it ended up breaking – fracturing – my penis.

"I tore the urinary tract, tore some membrane. You can imagine the shock and the horror that was going on – jumping up from an intimate moment, blood shooting out of my groin.

"I immediately tried to run to the shower and felt myself losing consciousness.

"I tried to walk back to the bed, at which point I collapsed – knocking myself out, giving myself 10 stitches and fracturing a couple of teeth. I came to on the ground and saw myself in a pool of blood. I immediately crawled along the floor to the bed and elevated my feet and placed a towel over my groin. "My girlfriend was frantic. Here we are in a foreign country where most people don't speak English. We had to call the security attendant, who called the Malaysian equivalent of 911.

"While we were waiting for the ambulance to arrive, there we were with all the security guards standing around us," he recalled.

Speaking of his recovery since the ordeal, Ray admitted it had been a distinct test of character.

"As a process, it's been terrible spending my 30th birthday like this. For those who've been making jokes – it's funny. I know it's funny, I've been making jokes, too.

"But [for] those who have sent compassionate emails and words of concern, I just wanted you to know that it's really appreciated," he said.

"Keeping it safe during sex isn't just wearing a condom," he added.

Over the years, several top UFC fighters, including Jon Fitch, Jake Shields and Phil

Baroni, have trained at Tiger Muay Thai in Phuket.

The training camp's connection with UFC also includes Ray appearing on the UFC's reality TV series *The Ultimate Fighter*.

When his recovery permits, Ray will join Ole Laursen at the Legacy Gym in Boracay, the Philippines.

"Anyone who trained with me in Phuket is welcome to reunite," he said.

EMPIRE POOLS PHUKET In illegal palm plantation raid

SEVERAL high-ranking Phang Nga officials have been implicated in the operation of an illegal 16-rai palm plantation raided by officers on December 14 after the site was deemed to be encroaching on protected park land.

More than 70 officers cleared 420 palm trees in the raid.

The offensive targeted a district border area at the tourist-popular Ton Pariwat Wildlife Conservation Area, north of Phang Nga Town.

"The land is allegedly owned [sic] by investors from Phang Nga and neighboring provinces and involves some high-ranking Phang Nga officials," Kapong District Chief Prakob Thaweesri said.

"However, under the National Reserved Forest Act, BE 2507 (1964), the occupation of the land [in question] is illegal as it is inside the Ton Pariwat Wildlife Conservation Area," he said.

Saman Chainarong, deputy commander of Phang Nga Provincial Police, said his officers were working with associated agencies in their search for the alleged transgressors.

"We will take stern legal action against them, as well as the government officers who were involved in producing the landownership documents for that plot," he said.

The colonel pointed out that over the past five years his officers had taken action against almost 1,000 cases of encroachment onto the Ton Pariwat Wildlife park. – *Kritsada Mueanhawong*

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

Hope floats of turtles' return

A SECOND clutch of leatherback turtle eggs was discovered on Tai Muang Beach in Phang Nga, north of Phuket, within eight days, raising hopes that turtles are returning to their traditional nesting sites along the Andaman Coast.

Park officers discovered the nest on December 11 after a leatherback turtle was spotted laying eggs on the beach on December 3.

"We found 109 eggs in the nest, but we did not see the mother," said park officer Witoon Detpramuanphol. "The good eggs have been transferred to a safe place. We expect them to hatch in about 60 days."

It is the first time these turtles have been spotted laying eggs at the beach since January 2010. – *Kritsada Mueanhawong*

GLOBAL celebrity Paris Hilton will not be attending the three-day New Year beach party originally slated to be held on Surin Beach from December 30 to sunrise on January 1.

The news of Ms Hilton's imminent no-show at the event came in an email from her lawyer sent to the *Phuket Gazette* clarifying that Ms Hilton's name was not to be used in any promotion of the event other than the event's launch in Bangkok on October 22.

The glamor-gilded launch was covered and broadcast across the world by global media agencies.

However, Glenn "GG" Gulino, Esq of g2 entertainment wrote in his email, "Your rights to use her name ended weeks ago and since you cancelled her NYE appearance you cannot use her name. Thank you."

As the *Gazette* at no time invited or cancelled Ms Hilton's attendance to the party, *Gazette* editors were left to believe the

email was intended to be sent to the party organizers. At the time this issue went to press, Mr Gulino and party organizers Sydictive Element, despite many attempts by the *Gazette* to clarify the situation, had yet to confirm this.

While the Paris Hilton mystery

was unravelling, Sydictive Element also had yet to respond to reports that the beach party will be moved to Patong.


At last report, Sydictive Element had been granted approval by local authorities to hold the party at Surin Beach – after weeks of strong opposition from some local residents and businesses, but a mixed response from others.

Patong Deputy Mayor Chairat Sukban told the *Gazette* on Wednesday, "The party organizer had a talk with Phuket Vice Governor Sommai Prijasilpa yesterday [December 18] about moving the party from Surin Beach to Patong Beach.

"I have no idea right now if it is going to be held in Patong because we still have to discuss with other local organizations and agencies," he said.

"Usually, when we arrange concerts or performances, they must be free of charge. So how can you set up a restricted area and charge people for entry when you are using public land? How can you stop people from entering the beach when the beach is public?" he asked.

"Just imagine the idea of closing Patong Beach. I feel it would be very difficult and I think it is a very 'big' idea," Mr Chairat added.

Agencies launch campaign against human traffickers active in Patong

Aoi had been arrested on Soi Bangla many times. However, every time she was arrested, a Vietnamese man claiming to be her father would show up and take her away, explained Mr Chairat.

"Many Vietnamese and Cambodians are involved the alien-beggar scams, and we are sure that the group of men that were holding Aoi [captive] are Vietnamese," he added.

Patong Police Superintendent Chiraphat Pochanaphan on Wednesday told the *Gazette* that his officers were searching for Aoi's imposter father. However, Col Chiraphat gave no name or description of the man.

"We are now searching for the man who claimed to be her father... Patong Police are coordinating with Social Development and Welfare officers in the search for him," he said.

"At this stage, this is the only information I can reveal," he added.

An officer at the Social Development and Welfare Phuket office told the *Gazette* on Wednesday that Aoi was now safe and under the department's care and protection program.

"Officers are now working on sending her back home to Cambodia. I don't know how long this will take. We can only take good care of her and coordinate with the relevant authorities on getting her home," she said.

However, the welfare officer also said she could not comment on what action was being undertaken to fur-

ther protect other children at risk on the streets of Patong.

The silence on the issue has prompted at least one children's rights organization to speak out, warning that Aoi's flee to safety might be the tip of the iceberg once the Asean Economic Community (AEC) comes into effect in 2015 with its expanded allowances for worker migration.

"I was not previously aware of this particular story [regarding Aoi]. However, children selling flowers are found at tourist destinations all over Thailand," Nutthawut Buaprathum, a lawyer at the Center for the Protection of Children's Rights Foundation (CPCRF), said.

"What I want to know is what are they actually doing about it.

"I wonder if the police are taking serious action on further investigating the case, or whether they just let the children go after the 'parents' show up," he added. Mr Nutthawut expressed grave concern about the impact the AEC will have on Phuket. "The Asian Economic Community is coming. I wonder how the government will handle this issue. Phuket is a top tourist destination that already attracts child-exploitation gangs that force children to work as beggars and street peddlers.

"I can see that government officers would like to pretend that Phuket is not a human-trafficking destination because it will affect tourism and might even prompt international pressure from other countries. But if the government does not take serious action on this, there will be a lot more of these people coming in the next three years – and the problem will only get worse," he said.

Deputy Mayor Chairat, who is often seen personally patrolling the streets of Patong, told the *Gazette* that the role of municipality officers in taking action against such gangs of street peddlers was limited.

"This issue is not only about children selling flowers on the street, but involves human trafficking. We have passed news of this to the police, Social Development and Welfare officers and senior officers at Provincial Hall senior officers know about this as well," Mr Chairat said.

"If we catch a child unaccompanied on the streets and we take them in, there is nothing we can do if the child tells us that the person who comes to claim them is their parent, uncle, aunt or other form of guardian," he said.

Teachers executed in Deep South

THE education system in Thailand's restive Deep South has reached a crisis point after more shootings of teachers forced the closure of about 1,300 schools earlier this month.

New York-based rights group Human Rights Watch (HRW) on Monday issued a statement calling for an end to the killings.

"Insurgents in southern Thailand who execute teachers show utter depravity and disregard for humanity," said Brad Adams, HRW Asia director. "These attacks harm not only teachers and schools, but the Muslim students, their families, and the broader Muslim community the insurgents claim to represent."

In the latest attack, on December 11, suspected insurgents burst into a school in Pattani Province and executed two teachers during their lunch hour.

The murders prompted the closure of 1,300 schools in Pattani, Yala, Narathiwat and four districts of Songkhla for two days, on December 13 and 14. Schools re-opened on Monday, with a new set of security measures in place, though many teachers continued to fear for their safety. "We will see whether the improved safety measures can protect teachers' lives," Southern Border Provinces Administration Centre (SBPAC) chair Boonsom Thongsriprai said.

A leaflet campaign promising more violence against teachers has ensured nerves remain frayed.

The leaflets, which were not signed by any group, read "The war is not yet over, don't count the teachers' corpses yet", AFP reported.

Over the past six weeks, suspected insurgents have killed an additional three teachers and wounded another three. They also set fire to a school.

Sanguan Intarak, chairman of Narathiwat Teachers' Federation, said at least 14 Buddhist teachers working in Narathiwat's schools had applied for transfer out of the area in recent weeks.

However, the requested transfers could not be granted because of possible effects on students and teaching schedules.

Altogether 157 teachers have been killed in the far south since January 2004, when militants stole more than 300 rifles from an army depot, sparking a crackdown on the region's long-simmering separatist movement that led to an escalation in violence.

Govt moving forward on charter amendment

THE government has announced plans to move forward with the amendment of the Constitution, which will include a referendum as ordered by the Constitution Court in July.

The process to amend the charter is likely to stir fresh political conflict, given the opposition by the Democrat Party.

Interior Minister Jarupong Ruangsuwan last week outlined the government's road map for holding a referendum preceding, the third and final reading of the charter-amendment bill.

"The referendum, to be held as per the verdict of the Constitution Court, is the best option for defusing the conflict over the rewriting of the Constitution," he said.

Democrat leader Abhisit Vejjajiva, meanwhile, in an open letter on his Facebook page, said the public should jointly overcome the political obstacle posed by former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra's need to stay above the law. This has

blocked the country from moving forward, he said.

"Therefore I would like to call on the public to jointly reject the public referendum that Thaksin's sister [Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra] is planning," he wrote.



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Dog lovers protest pooch killer

ANIMAL lovers staged a protest at the house of a German man who allegedly stabbed a golden retriever to death last month after attacking his rottweiler.

Alfred Gatt, 65, is suing the owners of the dog he killed for 300,000 baht because the retriever bit him.

Police summoned the pensioner and the retriever's owners, Petty Officer First Class Kampol Nuansilpa and his wife Wilawan, after the incident. They charged Mr Gatt with causing loss of property. On December 15, about 20 people from a group called "A Call for Animal Rights Thailand" held

a protest outside Mr Gatt's house. They condemned him for killing the retriever, calling for him to go back to Germany and to get his mental health checked.

They protesters said it was unfair for Mr Gatt to seek such a large sum of compensation after brutally killing the dog.

South Africans charged with ANC bomb plot

FOUR white South Africans were charged with treason on Tuesday over a suspected plot to bomb a conference of the ruling African National Congress (ANC) and execute President Jacob Zuma and other top government officials.

State prosecutor Shaun Abrahams said the men wanted to establish an independent Boer nation and that they were planning an assault on the ANC mass meeting now under way in the city.

Honduras passes law to purge police of corruption

HONDURAS, congress passed a law on Tuesday to purge the police of corruption.

The law will require officers to undertake lie detector tests, drug screening and a probe of their personal wealth to determine if they can remain in the police force.

Ireland to revamp abortion laws after woman's death

LAWS allowing limited access to abortion will be introduced in Ireland, the only EU member state that bans the procedure, following the death of a woman who was refused a termination, the government said on Tuesday.

Schools re-open in Newtown after 26 killed in US massacre

MOST students returned to school in the devastated US community of Newtown on Tuesday for the first time since a gunman's rampage killed 26 people in an elementary school, reviving the gun control debate in Washington.

Breaking its silence for the first time since the shootings, the powerful gun industry lobby, the National Rifle Association (NRA), said it was "shocked, saddened and heartbroken" and was "prepared to offer meaningful contributions" to prevent such massacres.

Sandy Hook Elementary, where Adam Lanza gunned down 20 6and 7-year-olds and six adults on Friday, remained closed. It was a crime scene on Tuesday, with police coming and going past a line of 26 Christmas trees, one for each victim. The trees were decorated with ornaments, stuffed animals and balloons in the school colors of green and white.

The rest of Newtown's schools re-opened with grief counselors and police present, while two families buried their children.

The massacre prompted some Republican lawmakers to open the door to a national debate about gun control, a small sign of easing in Washington's entrenched reluctance to seriously consider new federal restrictions.

The NRA uses political pressure against individual lawmakers and

others to press for loosening constraints on gun sales and ownership across the US while

11 times. He also shot and killed his mother before driving to the school, and then killed himself.

Police have warned it could take months to wrap up the investigation, which was set back because Lanza smashed his computer's hard drive, preventing police from retrieving any data, The New York Times reported.

A day after the first two children were buried, funerals took place on Tuesday for James Mattioli and Jessica Rekos. Each

was 6 years old. Funerals or remembrances were scheduled for six victims on December 19.

"I think most Republicans are willing to have a very, very serious conversation about what this means and taking a second look at what the Second Amendment means in the 21st century," said Ohio Republican Steve LaTourette.

That amendment to the US Constitution guarantees the right of Americans to bear arms.

Ghana's future depends on resources

GHANA'S recently elected president, John Dramani Mahama, said on Tuesday he will press foreign energy and mining firms for more revenue during his new term, won in elections he said proved the strength of democracy in the West African state.


He said the cocoa, oil and goldexporting country would respect existing contracts, but would seek to convince companies to agree changes to boost the state take from taxes and royalties.

"There is a lot of work to do in the next four years to consolidate Ghana's transition into a middleincome country, and that's where I will focus." he told Reuters in an interview.

"We're partners in this and we abide by all international agreements we've signed," he said.

President Mahama - who served as vice president to John Atta Mills and replaced Mills after his death in July – narrowly beat his opposition rival Nana Akufo-Addo in December 7 polls plagued by technical problems and marred by an opposition allegation the results were rigged.

But observers praised the vote as free and fair, and lauded Ghanaians for remaining peaceful -

burnishing the country's record as an bastion of stability in a region known for coups and civil wars.

President Mahama said the election made Ghana an "example for the rest for the continent" - in stark contrast to crisis-stricken regional neighbors, such as Mali and the Ivory Coast.

"I don't think Ghana can get into the kind of fratricidal conflict that we've seen elsewhere," he said.

"Because of the stability of our politics and security, and also be-

cause of the stable macroeconomic environment, I think that (Ghana) is attractive to investors," he said.

Ghana was Africa's fastestgrowing economy in 2011, its first full year of oil production from the offshore Jubilee field operated by British-based firm Tullow Oil, earning it a reputation as a "growth gem".

President Mahama said he would seek to leverage the country's appeal to wrest better terms from resource companies.

President Mahama said he expects new oil fields to come online by late 2014 or early 2015, further brightening the outlook for production in one of Africa's newest oil exporters.

Ghana was reviewing a contract with Chinese firm Sinopec to build a US\$700 million processing plant for natural gas after widespread criticism of the project's cost. The plant is meant to come online next year, he said.

Ghana is in the midst of discussions with gold-mining companies to improve terms. Mahama said the state was seeking to loosen up so-called "stability agreements" held by some firms that lock in royalty and tax rates. – Reuters

Preserving the Pearl of the Andaman with the Katathani Beach Resort, who are in the business of environmental sustainability

PHUKET'S own Katathani Beach Resort continues to lead sustainability efforts, having set the benchmark through its active and effective pursuance of the economically sustainable Triple Bottom Line, the "Three P's" supporting "People, Planet and Profit" with conservation-related savings exceeding US\$1.2 million for the previous year.

To find out exactly how the locally-rooted, luxury development saved more than 37 million baht through such initiatives the *Phuket* Gazette paid a visit to the 525 key beach front property. Hotel Executive Jacob G Ritter was keen to share the resort's green secrets:

"With large hotels having more than 500 guest rooms; water whether for showering, toilets, cleaning or landscaping represents one of the biggest opportunities to conserve."

Immune from the island's shortages of this needed resource, Katathani utilizes its own 18million-liter capacity rainwater reservoir situated

behind the resort.

Through the utilization of some 120 mn liters of water from the on-site reservoir, Katathani and The Shore are able to fulfill nearly all of their day-today water needs with a calculated savings of over 8.5 mn baht annually.

Moreover, internal water recycling

and waste water treatment initiatives permit the resort to save another 182.5 mn liters yearly, which is yielding an additional 15.5 mn baht in estimated savings.

"Our water treatment plant is also integrated with the local community's waste water grid in which we treat an additional 10.9 mn liters equating to nearly a million baht in savings [for the community]," Jacob said.

Through such diligent utility, millions of liters of water that would have otherwise been a strain on the island's over-capacity water grid.

However, the property is not completely water independent.

"The water we treat is mainly for irrigating our organic tropical gardens and is not potable.

"Therefore we source safe drinking water from outside although we are constantly evaluating the possibilities of processing and certifying our own drinking water in the near future."

On the subject of water, the company also saved more than 5

mn baht through its fully integrated solar water heating system, which is powered by some 200 solar thermal panels.

"The water treatment plant was an investment of about 2-3 mn baht, with the ROI (Return on Investment) period in our case being very insignificant due to the heavy volume our resort requires and presence of the reservoir."

He added that as part of its in-house water treatment and production initiatives, the resort produces about 90 to 95% of its own cleaning chemicals through locally sourced bio-degradable and organic agents processed from fruit peel wastes on site.

"Last year we produced and used about 24,000 liters of our own green, bio-degradable, organic soaps for cleaning purposes. This equated to about 600,000 baht in savings. In addition to this, the hotel saved another 4 mn baht in energy initiatives. Such initiatives included replacing 1,584 incandescent bulbs with energy-efficient LED lights (200,000 baht), air conditioning efficiency upgrades

(3 mn baht) and on-site production of biodiesel fuel (460,800 baht). Finally, various

waste management initiatives, which embody the fundamental three Rs – reduce, reuse and recycle – have yielded an additional 3 mn baht in annual savings.

In 2008, Katathani was the first hotel

in Asia to win the esteemed Gold Status Award from the non-profit European Travelife organization. This accolade needs to be renewed every two years following detailed audits by foreign inspectors looking at the resort's environmental and social initiatives.

The hotel's environmentally responsible practices were also recently recognized with an "Umwelt Champion" (German for "environmental champion") the Katathani saves hundreds of award from Europe's largest travel agency, TUI.

Such new plaques add to the hotel's growing list of notable green achievements including the; Kuoni Green Planet Award, Green Leaf, ISO 14001, Apollo, Zero Waste Award and Thailand Tourism Award among others.

After formally presenting Jacob with the latest Umwelt Champion plaque, TUI Service Manager in Phuket, Petra Glockner remarked:

"In evaluating the hotels, we're not focusing so much on financial savings... Katathani proves savings from environmental responsibility, although we're looking at the

bigger picture. Thus, we survey the guests, the hotel staff, and surrounding community while looking at the Travelife Audit results."

Miss Petra explained that TUI has been monitoring and evaluating partner hotels in Phuket for more than two decades. She noted that in addition to Katathani, the prize was also awarded to the Dusit Thani Laguna this year.

"We have been awarding this prize to hotels since 1997. Hotels have to apply for it via TUI and Travelife, who developed the criteria with responsible tourism experts representing major European tour organizations" she added.

In addition to surveying hotels, the selection process also includes guest questionnaires.



"That survey compliments the on-site audits consisting of extensive checklists for scoring by the hotel and then an independent, international inspector based in the United Kingdom."

Ambassador urges signing of new US trade partnership

IN THE wake of US President Barack Obama's recent visit to Thailand, the Kingdom's ambassador to Washington is stressing the need for Thailand to act fast and cash in on the United States' renewed focus on East Asia.

"The US aims mainly to promote trade and investment with the region at this time when the European Union is declining and China's influence is rising, and Thailand is in a good position to attract American investors.

"Promoting trade and investment can be in the mutual interest of both countries," said Thai ambassador to the USA Chaiyong Satjipanon.

Obama's invitation for Thailand to join the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), which already has 12 countries in the Asia-Pacific region including the US, has raised fears that Thailand's economy might be at risk. Also, concerns that closer ties with the US would cause a rift in Sino-Thai relations linger.

But ambassador Chaiyong says these worries were over reactions.

"Both the US and China are happy with us. With China, we're bonded by people and location. The US, though far away from us, considers us as an old ally. Promoting trade and investment is in [our] mutual interest," he said.

Starting in the middle of next month, the Commerce Ministry will lead a delegation to the US to discuss bilateral issues under the Trade and Investment Framework Agreement. The Foreign Affairs Ministry will play an assisting role.

According to the ambassador,

with China's growing assertiveness in East Asia and America's "unrealistic" engagement in the economically stagnant EU through the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, the US feels the necessity to strengthen its relations with East Asia, particularly Asean, to promote trade and investment as well as "American values" such as democracy and human rights.

While China has established a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) with ASEAN, the EU has opened talks on similar pacts with a number of ASEAN members including Thailand. In this scenario, Thailand stands to benefit as a key member of ASEAN.

"Based on the current growth pace, China's GDP could double within eight years. The US can't afford to be left behind. In this region, it has an FTA only with Singapore," Chaiyong said.

Regionally, while Thailand is an old ally, Singapore is viewed by Washington as a strategic ally and Myanmar's role is still in the future, as the reopening process will take time. Another approach is designed for Indonesia, a source of resources as well as being the biggest market among Asean countries.

Refocusing on East Asia has been hailed as an initiative of Kurt Campbell, the influential US assistant secretary of state for East Asia. He was the one who influenced the US policy towards Myanmar, which led to lifting of sanctions.

In the ambassador's view, in his second term as president, Obama is likely to focus more on promoting trade and investment, to ensure

food and energy security.

A university in Maryland recently came up with research to identify potential areas in Thailand for American investors and vice versa. A few Thai companies already invest in the US, including Thai Union Frozen Products. Land & Houses has also recently started buying properties state-side.

While the United States is a major buyer of Thai shrimp, Walmart, the world's largest retailer, now imports furniture from Thailand for its outlets. Meanwhile, the US is confident that high-technology products will boost its exports.

On the energy front, the US has recently found success with the fracking technique to extract shale gas, and it is believed by some that this new energy source will force down global gas prices. At present, the gas is available only to FTA partners, mostly its South American neighbors.

"It is a big question on how to place an old ally like Thailand in a position to benefit from this," said ambassador Chaiyong. "Things in the US move so fast. We have to catch up. Our officers [at the embassy] also have to work fast."

He said Obama's visit signaled US confidence and strong support for Thailand's democratic system. In addition, the visit raised the profile of Asean. He added that a number of American politicians were keen on Asia and they very much welcomed meetings with Asian people.

He also foresees another visit by the US president, noting Obama's remark that "next time, I'll come with Michelle", referring to his wife.

Posco divests 10% in Thai venture

POSCO has sold a large stake – 779.57 million shares or about 10% of the paid-up capital of Posco-Thainox – to Chalermchai Mahagitsiri at 1.35 baht per share, the company reported to the Stock Exchange of Thailand recently.

According to the deal, Posco's share in Posco-Thainox will reduce from 79.53% to 69.53%.

Hyatt signs new management deal

HYATT Hotels Corporation has signed a management agreement with Pioneer Property Co (PPC), a Bangkok-based real estate firm, for a new Hyatt Place hotel to be located in the heart of the Thai capital.

Hyatt Place Bangkok, Sukhumvit, which will offer 220 guest rooms and seven studio suites, will join the recently announced Hyatt Regency Bangkok, Sukhumvit, also expected to open in 2017.

"As the capital, principal city and economic center of Thailand, Bangkok is strategically important for both business and leisure travelers and we are grateful to have the opportunity to introduce Hyatt Place to this part of the world," said Ratnesh Verma, senior vice president, real estate and development, Asia Pacific, Hyatt Hotels and Resorts.

Tourism: Investing in human capital

THAILAND should put more importance on investing in human capital and not just in the "hardware" of the tourism industry, if it wants to secure sustainable development and remain a leader in this field, says Martin Craigs, chief executive officer of the Pacific Asia Travel Association (PATA).

It's easy to build the hardware of the tourism industry – airports and hotels, for example. But given the boom in tourism and its key role as a driver of the economy, Thailand is facing a labor shortage. Still, this is not yet a major problem when compared with other nations in Asia, he said.

Labor shortages have become common across Asia. China is one example, where it is creating a big headache for the fast-growing tourism industry. Meanwhile in the Philippines, although it produces more than 26,000 graduates to serve the industry annually, 90% of those graduates choose to go overseas. Craigs said Thailand should promote foreign languages to students.

"The evidence is clear that there are large numbers of Russian tourists pouring into the Kingdom, but there are not enough Russianspeaking locals to take care of them," he said.

He raised the example of Chanin Donavanik, CEO of Dusit Thani. He said Chanin had done a "great" job introducing professional graduates to the industry, and not only to run his hotel chain. This helps secure the industry in the long run, and also promotes regional development.

Craigs says producing professionals for the hospitality industry is the focus of PATA. It intends to help train people from different fields to apply their professions in the tourism industry. The organization now offers four classes per year, each with 36 people for a one-week training program.

"The free flow of skilled labor from the opening of the ASEAN Economic Community (AEC) in 2015 may not solve the shortage. To the contrary, it could create new problems, as the integration of the European Union did in the beginning. So opening up the region was not a panacea," he said.

But Craigs is confident that Thailand will maintain its leadership after 2015. Clearly, the country is more advanced than its rivals in hotel facilities and attracts the largest number of foreign tourists in the region, he added.

"It is not essential for Thailand to construct manmade projects as a magnet to lure foreign tourists. In fact, the country can sell itself naturally, with both social and cultural aspects of the Thai way of life, beyond the unique natural beauty seen nationwide. – *The Nation*

A home for the holidays

'TIS the season, here on the sunny island of Phuket yet again. I'm not quite sure exactly when the vanishing point starts to loom over life's passage.

Could it be 40? That's well and truly passed like the aftertaste of one of those deadly tequila shooters that often ends a long night of social drinking. You can always recall those under the file named "bad ideas".

Or do things start to ramp up once you pass that other midcentury milestone? Been there, done that. My mind drifts off a bit, not unlike one of those summers spent on a water colored palatial lake, with wooden sailboats gently revolving to destinations unknown. Blown along by fuzzy velveteen winds.

Suddenly my mind is about to burst, crying out "get me out of here". This was never my life.

My own journey bears a resemblance to an episode of the Simpsons, blending in some chaotic trauma-induced swerves, dives, climbs and ultimately ending up on a non-English language channel's travel and lifestyle programing.

It's all "lost in translation" and even subtitles can't explain the inexplicable.

Growing up in a suburban California neighborhood, my wanderlust came hard and young. Money or not, my parents always travelled from as early as I can remember.

Be it station wagon, or one of those amazing flying machines, which are larger than life when you stare at them with a child's eyes.

Leaving home in my teens with a bad attitude, no money and a fatal sense of adventure, which took many a wrong turn, the one thing I could always count on was that out there, far away, was a home.

More importantly, were my parents who never quite understood what it was that drove me away, but always welcomed me back with unquestioning love.

Whenever you pair up people,

there tends to be a brew of personalities and emotions. Good, bad, ugly and seemingly fragile. Yet they stayed together for longer than I have walked the Earth to this day.

My father still remains an unanswered question in so many ways. And my mom, who had the heart of a lion and spirit of a Scotsman, was just too hard not to end up in a bitter conflict. Not weekly or daily. I'm talking hourly.

My moves kept multiplying in distance, from the metropolitan city of Hollywood nearby, to the mountains of Reno, wilds of Wyoming, Alaskan wilderness and on to Hawaii.

A mounting number of Christmases were missed in rapid succession, though phone calls were made and cards exchanged. We were just a small family and my sister's path kept her close to home, never venturing far. She, to this day, deserves more credit for the vast amount of worry and strife I caused all.

Some 28 years ago I decided that the world wasn't flat, and Hawaii wasn't exotic enough – I needed more. First into the Pacific Islands and onto Asia. I've lived in more countries than I care to remember, though the last 11 years have been spent in Phuket. Finally a lifeless ordinary found a second home.

It's been ten years since I made a trip home with my new wife for Christmas with my parents and my sister's family. That trip gave me my last living memory of my father who passed away less than a month later. A cold December evening, with a decided chill for California, together with a quick hug and mumbled words still linger in my mind's eye.

What was never said, now never will be. After the event my sister and I were talking over old times and she mentioned how every year, when the family would gather, my dad would always wrap some presents and say perhaps this year I just might be home for the holidays.

Life remains as cruel as it is kind. Less than three short years passed and I found myself sitting with my mother in her doctor's office as he mournfully

gave her the final ultimatum wrap up your affairs you have six months left at most.

Somehow in those dark hours, I was lucky enough to pay it down, if only a fraction, a minuscule, a few grains of times' own sand. Crossing the Pacific Ocean from Phuket to Los Angeles came fast and furious, as time doesn't stand still. No matter how much you wish it to be, or pray to whatever spirit is at work in the universe.

That clock on the wall just started ticking slower and slower despite four trips across the ocean and this time there were the moments to say what needed to be said. Not big life-changing thoughts, or one absolutely defining moment. We strung together a chain of our shared lifetime of small remembrances, sharing meals and time outdoors in the sun just talking.

On a Friday in late afternoon, two days before Christmas, I was outside riding my bike. My sister and wife were at the house and a nurse was on call as we'd chosen to let my mother die in her own home. A strange feeling came over me as I cut the trip short, and headed back quickly. While night was close to falling we stood with our mother holding her hands as she passed on to a better place.

A few weeks later, I was sleeping in the bed where I had dreamt those wild adventures as a boy for the very last time. There was no going back, the emotional slipstream was almost too much to take. This part of the passage would end the next day, and there was no longer a home left to come to ever again.

Reflecting on the past, present and future with my own house, wife and two children in Phuket, I'm struck by just how many of us here have travelled through life's circle. Through the joys, sorrows, misadventures and even the everyday to this island place that so many of us call home for the holidays.



The worst expat investing mistakes

LIVING in Thailand can be a dream come true for many expatriates, but as someone who has resided in Thailand since 2008, I have also seen it become a nightmare for unwary expats their investments. In contrast, who make all-too-common investment mistakes. Luckily, a properly thought out investment plan can help you avoid making the following big mistakes:

1) Understand risk verses return and diversification

Many investors just look at an individual investment's return and do not understand that a high return could mean a high risk for losses.

Likewise, many investors are also tempted to have too much of their investment portfolio concentrated, rather than diversifying their investments across multiple asset classes and sectors – including those that might not be Currency fluctutation in the baht to dollar "hot" at the moment.

Ideally, investors should have a portfolio with investments spread around because this will produce a much higher overall return in the long-term, and also reduce the risk of large losses.

2) Understand the impact of investment fees

Expatriates in Thailand are often paying investment fees far beyond what they need to be paying, because they have invested in a managed fund or in offshore investment products that come with high upfront fees (often 5% or more), annual fees of around 2% and a sales commission when they are sold.

When these high investment fees are considered with taxes, inflation and currency fluctuations, expatriates can easily be left with little to no return on

many Exchange-Traded Funds (ETFs) have no extra commissions beyond normal brokerage transaction costs and come with average annual expenses of just 0.49%. The average stock mutual fund costs investors 1.57% in annual fees.



exchange rate over the last month.

3) Be sure that you consider inflation

Many expats in Thailand come from countries where interest rates are near zero, in part because of low inflation.

However, and as an emerging market, Thailand's inflation rate since the year 2000 has ranged from -4.4% to as high as 9.2%, with the average annual rate being 2.7%.

This means at a minimum, expatriates here will need to achieve an after fee and after tax investment return of 2.7% on their investments just to maintain their current standard of living.

And, if Certificate of Deposits (CDs) don't yield that much back home, expatriates will need to find another way to ensure that their income at least keeps pace with Thailand's rate of inflation.

4) Factor in currency risk Those who intend to reside in Thailand on a permanent basis need to be aware that over the past decade, the Thai baht has appreciated approximately 28.75% against the US dollar, 43.67% against the GBP and 20.14% against the Euro.

If the Thai baht continues to appreciate, or should Thailand decide to toughen the requirements for retirement visas, many expatriates could be forced to either cut their living expenses or worse - they will need to leave the country.

To avoid currency mismatch between income and expenses, expatriates need to think beyond investments located in their home country or denominated in their home currency.

Fortunately, there are investments that invest in foreign currencies, which can offset the risks associated with having an income in a home currency that is depreciating against the baht.

5) Seek out proper professional advice

Expats living in Thailand should consult with insurance, legal, tax and investment professionals who have expertise regarding such matters here in Thailand and in their respective home countries.

Getting good professional advice will be all the more critical for expatriates who have family both in Thailand and in their home countries.

Getting tax advice will be especially critical for American and Canadian expatriates in light of specific tax rules.

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Plus Property gets boost from Sansiri market success

SANSIRI subsidiary Plus Property, a real-estate management and brokerage company, targets growth of at least 20 per cent next year, against expected 2012 income of 650 million baht.

The unit's revenue surge is due to Sansiri's strong growth, which is expected to continue next year, according to Apichart Chutrakul, chief executive of both Plus Property and Sansiri.

Sansiri targets presales of 42 billion baht this year and 50 bn baht in 2013.

"The main driver of Sansiri's business growth next year will come from our new residential projects upcountry, which will account for about 30 per cent of our presales worth 42 bn baht this year," he said.

Up to 90 per cent of the property management business of Plus Property comes from Sansiri's residential projects, which will total some 140 by year-end.

This business has generated about 33 per cent of the subsidiary's revenue this year. "Our property management will focus on Sansiri's residential projects because we want to create the best after-sales service for our customers," says Apichart.

"This is a value-added service for our residential projects," said the chief executive. The property management service will add rentals for holiday business to its portfolio next year, serving customers who

SANSIRI subsidiary Plus Property, a real-estate management and brokerage and for rental purposes.

The additional service will generate a return of 6 to 10 per cent a year for customers opening up their homes for rental, depending on the location, Apichart added.

Meanwhile, up to 50 per cent of Plus Property's agency and brokerage portfolio comes from Sansiri's residential projects, and the rest from other property firms. The company now has 16,000 units under management nationwide, worth about 50 bn baht total.

This business has generated around 49 per cent of its revenue this year. The next-largest revenue contributor is the management of commercial buildings. Some 3 million square meters of buildings across the country have generated about 18 per cent of this year's income.

"Plus Property has had revenue growth of 29 per cent this year thanks to our parent company's business growth," noted Apichart.

The company is substantially increasing its staff to support next year's predicted 20 per cent growth, he added.

The number of employees at Plus Property will rise from the current 1,300 to 1,560 during the course of the year. "Staff are the key to driving our business growth in the long term," he concluded. – *The Nation*

Family, the best defense against technology risks

WITH the holiday season upon us, we would like to encourage all of our readers to take a few moments to pause and reflect on how lucky we are to live in this incredible age of technology.

Technology is perhaps the most notorious of double-edged swords. Shakespeare wrote famously in *Hamlet* that "...there is nothing either good or bad, but thinking makes it so."

That statement reflects a healthy skepticism, but it might be a difficult task to sell the idea that guns are "neither good nor bad" to the residents of Newtown, Connecticut, many of whom had to bury their beloved young children last week (see page 10).

The incomprehensible murder of 26 people – mostly kindergarten students – at a school in that town continues to shock the planet. Most of the civilized world is united in disbelief at how easily

Most of the civilized world is united in disbelief at how easily US citizens, including the mentally-deranged, can acquire the kind of arsenals needed to carry out attacks like this and the others that came before it.

The continuing incidence of random mass murders has also caused many to question the role of the media in reporting on such events. As impractical as it may be, some have even suggested that traditional media should somehow conspire to "play down" or even stop reporting such events in order to deny potential mass murderers the "attention" they are said to be seeking when carrying out these attacks.

Despite the planet's unsustainable rise in population growth, we are nevertheless slowly developing a global popular culture based largely on the Internet. Quite often the trends are harmless memes, like "planking" or dancing "Gangnam style", but in many cases they can be dangerous, if not outright deadly. "Cyberbullying" resulting in suicide, the empowerment of pedophilia rings, child abductions and the spread of bomb-making technology are just a few of the results that can arise when the nefarious become Internet-enabled.

Here in Phuket, the case of Samudchaya "Nong Pin" Yanpunya, who was only 12 years old at the time she went missing from an internet café early last year, is just one example. Her mother fears she may have been abducted by someone she met online during a Facebook session – though her true fate remains a mystery.

It might be easy to dismiss mass murder attacks as an internal problem for the US, but the reality is that the disease is spreading to Europe and China, through the Internet, of course, And we have all the ingredients right here in Thailand for similar tragedies to occur – most notably the wide-open access to black-market firearms and the ease with which so many citizens are influenced by others, as manifest in the spread of drugs, corruption and the spontaneous formation of mobs.

As is so often the case, the first, best and maybe the only line of defense against these and so many other social ills is good parenting. With that in mind, the *Gazette* would like to extend the warmest of holiday wishes to all of our readers and their families.

When will there be an end to the carnage on Phuket's roads?

Righteous road rage

DRIVING my son to school, I witnessed the carnage of the horrific crash involving a minivan and a pickup in which a young girl of nine was killed and other children injured. It was a bright sunny morning, the road was dry and it was early enough that traffic was relatively free flowing. Perfect driving conditions.

If this were an isolated incident there would be no point in me writing this, but this is not the first accident I have seen in Phuket, nor unfortunately will it be the last, and the fact that a young girl died on her way to school brings the insanity of it all into sharp focus.

How have we come to this? A few decades ago, Phuket was a sleepy tropical island with very few cars and those that were here, mostly Suzuki Caribians, bumped along dirt roads at a slow and dusty pace.

Then mass tourism arrived and suddenly buses, vans and tuk-tuks were everywhere, shuttling tourists between hotels, shops and the airport. Tourists have no choice but to take them, as public transport here is pretty much non-existent. That we have so many of these vans is not the problem in itself, as it is testament to how well tourism is doing in Phuket

island, generally do so at great speed. There is no respect for other road users; I cannot count the number of times they speed up behind me and flash me out of the way. An amber street light is an invitation to speed up even more, and the worst of it all is that such behavior goes unpunished. Add to the mix a huge number of motorcycles, stray dogs, lumbering trucks and cement mixers, and the insanity of driving at speed on these congested roads is all too obvious.

When my mother informed me that she was popping something small into the post for Christmas, she did warn me not to get too exited.

However, when it arrived I still felt like a little boy on Christmas morning - until I was rudely told that I would have to pay 800 baht import duty.

I argued and stomped, but it was to no avail and so I stumped up the cash. I opened my present (beautifully wrapped in gold paper) and it was a London 2012 t-shirt with the £5 sale sticker still on it!

My point is this: I have no problem paying import duty if I am importing something, but who decided that I should pay 800 baht? How was it decided? Why can I not contest the amount? And perhaps more importantly, does Thailand really need to raise import duty off Christmas presents? Nick Robinson Phuket Town

Pacharatida Sukjit, an officer at the Thai Post office in Phuket Town, replies:

The Customs Department determines the rate of import duty to be imposed on each item imported to Thailand - and ev-

ery item imported is subject to import duty. Passara Soontavareerit, an officer at **Phuket Customs House, replies:**

Each item imported is charged a different rate of tax according to what type of good it is and its condition. In your case of importing a shirt, the import duty alone is 60 percent of the value deemed by the officer reviewing the article for importation.

However, other fees and surcharges, some of them set amounts, are levied in determining the value of the goods as landed in Thailand. Then Excise Tax and Value-Added Tax (VAT) are calculated based on the value as landed.

All these taxes, duties and surcharges are added together to determine the full rate of import duty that you have to pay.

Lost treasure and an ancient trade highway to the Siamese capital

TOWARDS the end of the 18th century, trade and logistics was a tough business. Phuket, or Junk Ceylon, during that time was rich in tin, a semi-precious metal that was highly sought after by European and Indian traders. Tin mining was therefore an important source of revenue for the island. Because tin mines in Junk Ceylon were considered government property, a large chunk of trade revenue had to be sent to the capital on a regular basis.

In a time long before banks and money transfers, revenue collected in the form of silver, gold or bartered goods had to be physically transported to the capital to be handed over to the King.

A rare document dated around 1785 explained this process.

It was mandated that tin revenues from Junk Cevlon and nearby towns, as well as merchandise imported from eastern India had to be transported to the capital on a regular basis.

In the 18th century Siamese merchants used a route that started from Takua-Pa, a town just north of Junk Ceylon. Travelers and caravans would then pass through Khao Sok in Surat Thani, an area that is covered with thick tropical rain forest and steep hills even today. The caravans would have to penetrate the tropical jungle to get to Thaphanom canal. From there government officials would arrange for the goods to be taken to Chaiya. The cargo of tin and other goods would then be transported by small boats sailing along a connection

of small rivers and canals until it reached the Siamese capital in the central plains. Up until 1785, the trail had been used by merchants to transport goods to the capital since the Ayutthaya period. It was also used by traders who wished to avoid sailing all the way around the Malay Peninsular to reach the Bay of Bengal.

In order to ship tin revenues from Junk Ceylon to the capital, the governor of Thalang would arrange to send the cargo up to Takua-Thung. The governor of Takua-Thung would then arrange to forward the goods to Takua-Pa so that it could be transported along the trail.

The overland route was used for many reasons. It was an old route that had been used for years by merchants, since the ancient days when Takua-Pa, or as it was called, Takola, was still a thriving trade center. A network of deep canals had been dug so that merchandise could be transported by large boats to different towns. The town of Chaiya on the Kra

Isthmus was also a popular stop for merchants and traders.

Using this route was hard, considering merchants had to transport their heavy cargo for miles overland through harsh terrain. But it remained the preferred route because sailing around the Malay peninsular was considered even more dangerous.

Storms would wreck countless ships and opportunistic pirates infested the sea trade routes.

However in 1785, the Burmese invaded Siam and war broke out between the two Kingdoms. Whilst Junk Ceylon managed to fend off the invaders, the ancient land route to the capital that had been used for centuries was cut off by Burmese troops that had taken over parts of the isthmus.

It soon became impossible to transport tin and other revenues from Junk Ceylon to the capital since major towns like Takua-Pa, Takua-Thung, Chaiya and Chumporn had fallen under Burmese control. Stocks of tin, fabrics from India and an array of weaponry bound for the capital began to pile up at the Khao Sok pass for years. Much of the cargo was lost, damaged or stolen during this time.

After the war, King Rama I wanted to establish a new trade route from the south to Bangkok. He asked Phraya Surintharaja, a high ranking noble, to find a new shipment route that would connect the coastal towns on the south-west with the capital. Phraya Surintharaja was the governor of eight coastal towns in the south of Siam, including Thalang (Junk Ceylon), Takua-Pa and Takua-Thung, so he knew the geography of the area quite well. These towns made up a major part of the old route. The arrival of the Portuguese, Dutch and English also meant that sea voyages were becoming safer and more advanced and can be utilized to a greater extent.

Initially Phraya Surintharaja was asked by King Rama I come to Bangkok to meet with him. There the King told him that a high ranking minister had just passed away and that he wanted Phraya Surintharaja to take the vacant position. Although highly honored, Phraya Surintharaja did not want to stay in Bangkok and told the King that he'd lead a happier life if he was allowed to remain the King's viceroy in the southern coastal towns.

In return, he promised King Rama I that he would open a new trade route that would connect the southern towns of Siam with Bangkok. The King agreed and Phraya Surintharaja set out to plan the new route. He asked the King to grant him the use of ten elephants from Nakhon Si Thammarat and another ten from Chaiya, in addition to a large workforce that will be recruited from the nearby villages. The King approved of his request and the large project to clear a new route to Bangkok was underway.

The new route that Phraya Surintharaja built was a much needed replacement to the old one that had been in use for centuries. Using the new route, it only took three days for goods to reach Bangkok from the south.

The journey was also much easier and less prone to sudden flash floods that had in the past destroyed a lot of precious cargo. The new route not only allowed for easier transportation of imports and revenue to the capital, it also made the administration of southern provinces easier and more effective.

The Portuguese and Siam

IN 1961, then 'Charge d'Affaires' of Portugal in Thailand, Mr Inácio Rebello de Andrade wrote a 92 page essay on the Portuguese presence in Siam, which he called "Os Portugueses e o Siao no Contexto da Peninsula da Indochina" (The Portuguese and Siam in the context of the Indochina Peninsula).

His preoccupation throughout the text was to underline links between events in Siam and what was occurring at the time in the neighboring countries. The

original typescript of that essay is preserved at the Siam Society's Library where it was found, fifty years later, by the current Ambassador of Portugal

to Thailand Dr Jorge Torres-Pereira who is proposing to revisit the theme and underlying approach.

Dr Torres-Pereira, who joined the Portuguese Diplomatic Service in 1987, has been immersed full time in "Portuketology" (Portuguese in Phuket) since his arrival in Thailand at the end of 2010, with objective of energizing the Commemorations of 500 years of diplomatic relations between Thailand and Portugal. - Phuket Gazette

PHUKET-born Piyarat "Jiab" Kulvanich grew up in a typically extended Thai family. Within the circle of relatives, friends and neighbors, she remembers that there was a strong community spirit where everyone looked out for each other.

"My aim is not commercial but to share this extraordinary product that is based on local wisdom. The spa is also a place where I meet up with friends and relatives. This, and the charity work I do give me that sense of community and belonging that I grew up with."

LAST week I talked about the best-known internet speed measuring web sites - not the ones your Internet Service Provider (ISP)

sets up and gooses to show impossible scores, but the sites that are internationally recognized as providing a reasonable indication of the speed your line actually delivers.

Some of you wrote to me and said that you don't care about your internet speed. I think that's great: if you don't mind missing out on news broadcasts and sports shows, YouTube and Skype, then I salute you and envy your isolation. But I'd also note in passing that in a few short years, it'll be possible to watch all of your favorite TV shows over a fast connection, for a tiny fraction of what TV costs now. You'll also be missing out on interactive college courses and free international phone calls – and a thousand other applications that nobody's dreamed up yet.

Others wrote to me and said that their internet connection is just fine, thank you very much, and if I'm having trouble with mine, I should have the phone company check and see what's wrong with my line - instead of whining about it in the *Gazette*. That, too, is an admirable position to take, but I'm not just whining about my lines (I have four - including 3G – and always recommend at least two, from different service providers). I'm also whining about the lines attached to hundreds of additional internet customers on the island.

Speed's important for most people. My two-year-old has been learning some English language phrases lately. His latest: "The internet is very slow." It's a refrain he invokes when YouTube doesn't play his Gor-Gai video, or the Gigglebellies. The internet's become an important part of many lives.

Last week I left you with an agonizing dilemma: the four internationally-best-known speed testing sites, when accessed from



Phuket, give wildly different results. In my case, using a True 10 Mbps (megabits per second) ADSL line, I

saw everything from 9 Mbps in tests to Los Angeles on OOKLA's Speedtest.net, down to 1.6 Mbps on DSLReports' test to LA.

I tried using a different line – a nominal 10 Mbps 3BB line – and the speeds were all a little slower, but not by much. On any single line, the speeds stayed consistent, regardless of which computer I was using (including a Mac), which operating system (Windows 8, Windows 7, OS X), or which browser (IE, Chrome, Firefox, Safari).


To further confound matters, when I run a "ping" test on the OOKLA Speedtest.net to Los Angeles, I get a result that shows the ping is running faster than the speed of light. Perhaps True and 3BB have had consultations with Dr Einstein, but I rather doubt they've figured out how to make an internet connection run faster than light.

It gets worse. If I use a downloader with multiple concurrent threads - basically different download sessions, all mashed over the same ADSL line – I get 9 Mbps, consistent with OOKLA. Which is inconsistent with Einsteinian physics.

I still have no explanation – and can't recommend one testing site over another.

Phuket isn't unique in having inconsistent speed test results. Even the US Federal Communication Commission, which has a huge vested interest in monitoring broadband speed, have basically thrown up their hands and refused to choose one testing site over another. Right now they're hop-scotching between Speedtest.com and MLab, unwilling to commit to one or the other, and unable to offer a third alternative.

There are more anomalies in Phuket. A friend of mine, let's call him "Khun Roger",

downloads lots of torrents at night. I won't justify his torrent predilection, except to note that he can't see the movies he wants to see in Phuket, can't read books he wants to read, can't listen to or buy music he wants to hear, so he turns to the pirate sites.

Khun Roger has a 3BB ADSL connection, and he's been tracking his actual download speeds closely with a piece of software called NetMeter. NetMeter watches the data coming into the computer; it doesn't try to measure how fast the line can go, it just counts as the data comes in.

What Khun Roger has found is that his 3BB line gives him about 1.2 Mbps until midnight, and then at precisely midnight, the download speed goes up to 12 Mbps. For whatever reason, 3BB is throttling his line until midnight, every night, and then suddenly increases his bandwidth by a factor of ten.

It isn't clear to me if this is a throttling performed on Khun Roger alone, or if it's indicative of 3BB download speeds (or at least torrent download speeds) in general. But the effect is very striking – and quite replicable, on the nights when he kept track in September and October.

Here's another anomaly.

When TOT rolled out its Fiber 2U service, many of us were ecstatic. At last, we figured, we'd be able to get fast fiber speeds for about 1,500 baht/month.

And we did. For a while. But on October 7, 2011, quite suddenly, the average Fiber 2U

international speeds dropped by about 80 per cent. One day, we were seeing 8 to 10 Mbps. The next day it was down to 1 or maybe 2 Mbps. The speeds have never gone back up.

As a result, the TOT Fiber 2U service, which was once the fastest internet in Phuket, is now just barely keeping up with ADSL lines that cost half as much.

My guess is that somebody flipped a switch in Bangkok – that up until that fateful day in October 2011, the Fiber 2U lines had access to unthrottled international access. Then somebody decided they better toss the Fiber 2U international lines in with the ADSL lines. As a result, it's very hard to recommend that people spend twice as much on TOT Fiber 2U as a plain-vanilla ADSL line.

A VETERAN journalist on the Asian beat, Tom Vater certainly knows Cambodia. In the crime novel The Cambodian Book of the Dead (Crime Wave Press, Hong Kong, 2012, 287pp), his descriptions of Phnom Penh, Kep and Siem Reap are spot on.

The hero is Maier (no first name) who grew up in East Germany under the communist government, where he worked as a foreign correspondent in East Europe. He

slipped over to the West before the Berlin Wall fell and became a war correspondent for a German news agency for the next decade.

This career ended when his Cambodian colleague Hort was killed by a Khmer Rouge mortar shell. Maier then became a detective for a Hamburg agency that specializes in taking on international cases.

The case he is on now brings him back to Cambodia.

Maier is hired by the heiress to a coffee fortune to report on her only son and induce him to come home. Rolf Muller-Overbeck is running a dive shop in the seaside town of Kep in the south of Cambodia. He is also involved with a beautiful Cambodian woman named Kaley.

On the flight to Phnom Penh, Maier provides a thumbnail history of Cambodia: medieval empire, French colony, an independent nation under Prince Sihanouk, the American B-52 bombings, the terror of the Khmer Rouge, the Vietnamese invasion:

"Finally, UNTAC, the United Nations Transitional Authority of Cambodia, had shown up, organized elections of sorts and

had then fled the burnt out, tired country as quickly as possible."

Maier surveys his fellow plane passengers now: "Young, selfconfident backpackers in search of post-war adventures, a French tour group in search of temples and a few old men in search of

women, or children, or anything else that would be available in hell for a few dollars, had replaced the soldiers and gangsters who alone dared to fly into Phnom Penh a few years earlier."

In Phnom Penh, Maier heads for the Foreign Correspondents Club of Cambodia and his description of the

riverside Sisowat Quay is brilliant as well as everyone's favorite late night dive of choice, The Heart of Darkness, throbbing with disco music and wreathed in clouds of marijuana smoke.

He runs into an old flame, Carissa Stevenson, a Kiwi reporter from the UNTAC days, who leads him to meet Pete, an English wide-boy, who is Rolf's partner in the Kep dive shop. With him at a table are Tep, a former Khmer Rouge general, and his murderous son who actually does plug an obstreperous bar customer that night.

The scene then shifts to Kep. Maier meets Rolf and accompanies him on a drive trip to Koh Tonsay or Rabbit Island.

There is a magnificent description of sharks eating a corpse, which has been recently deposited on the seafloor with his feet tied to stones.

Rolf knows who the victim is, it's Sambat, the co-founder with his twin sister of an orphanage in Kampot.

We're nearly a third of the way into the book now and the plot loses its wheels.

There's the mysterious Kaley who may be a reincarnated malevolent spirit; a mysterious German, "The White Spider", with a Nazi and Yugoslav Communist past who had been an adviser to General Tep and the Khmer Rouge, and a mysterious Russian, Vladimir, who is holed up in the old French hill resort of Bokor, an old, fat homosexual giant alcoholic who may possibly be a world-class professional assassin.

All these are jumbled together in a plot of increasing complexity and absurdity. Maier is captured, drugged and tortured not once, not twice but three times.

The story also moves, absurdly, to an ancient temple in the Angkor Wat complex, hundreds of miles to the north, the

headquarters for a cadre of crophaired teenage orphan girls clad in black pajamas and rubber-tire sandals, who have been trained as Khmer Rouge-style killers. There are heaps of bloody explosions and large dollops of violence and torture porn.

The novel, which had begun

with such style and promise degenerates into a ridiculous shambles, amid much pretentious verbiage about how Cambodia is cursed, doomed and riddled with ghosts.

It is cursed by one seemingly skilled writer who actually turns out to be a hack.



So when word got out that Marco Westmass, a renowned vegetarian chef from The Hague, was breezing into town and putting on some swank dinners at Boathouse and Trisara, to showcase his justly

And lo, there's the great man himself, serving up some pretty meaty gin and tonics at RE KÁ TA's upstairs bar on Kata Beach. The growing queue at the bar testifies to the fact that SWEET: A colorful dessert.

the evening's punters would much prefer a good slug of gin to the bubbly prosciutto bottles standing forlorn to the side like so many rejected suitors.

THE holiday season is here and the Phuket geese are getting nervous. But tropical heat and looking good on the island's beaches may require something a little lighter than all that turkey and Christmas pudding. As an alternative consider a Holiday Season dinner comprised of the local creepy-crawlies that many Phuketians love to eat.

The Locust Eaters

Insects are full of protein. A few of decades ago a large swarm of locusts blew clear across the Indian Ocean and started munching on Thai crops. Scientists recommended that the farmers start eating the locusts in turn.

Fair's only fair, if an insect eats your dinner, the law of Karma almost mandates that you turn him into dinner in return thereby ensuring that what goes around comes around.

Thais have been enjoying locusts ever since. In Phuket you can buy a bag of *tukataen* – fried locusts with dipping sauce. In fact these days they're considered a bit of a delicacy and are pricey.

When eating your locust, pull off the hind legs, which are rather prickly. The rest is nice and crunchy and goes well with a cold beer... in fact the more cold beer you drink, the better they taste.

As Smooth as Silk

The life cycle of the silk worm involves a couple of months incarnated as a feeding machine, in the form of a caterpillar, munching on Mulberry leaves. Once gorged, they spin a cocoon of silk around themselves and go into their pupa stage for a nice long sleep.

This is when you pounce.

Silk farmers dump the cocoons into boiling water and boil off the silk. This doesn't bother the worms as they are undergoing the "big change" and inside are just basically biological soup.

After skimming off the silk, the farmers are left with the pupae which look rather like a grubby Nike running shoe, about a quarter of an inch long.

Stir fry them quickly and serve hot. The outside is slightly chewy, but

the inside tastes like a fine egg yolk and makes an excellent appetizer.

Beetle Bailey

A lot of insects eaten in Phuket are fried. Simply drop your creepy crawlies into a saucepan with a little oil, chili and garlic and hold it over the heat, giving an occasional shake to ensure that they are evenly cooked. When the last one stops kicking, it's time to eat. This is a good way to eat *meng*

kanoon, chunky little brown beetles that emerge at beginning of the season every

> years or so. Catching them is easy. During the day they burrow into the ground, but at night they

emerge to feast on foliage. Take a flashlight and shine it on bushes and you'll see the beetles because their eyes reflect the light with a lovely golden glow.

Most will then make a beeline, or a 'beetle line', for the light and can be easily harvested. They take only a couple of minutes to fry, but pull off their wing casings before eating as these are hard and have rather sharp edges.

Termite Time

Swarming termites erupt during the rainy season from huge underground nests and come in a variety of sizes, with the prized specimens having a massive wingspan of up to two inches. To catch flying termites place a bowl of water under the light on your balcony.

Many of the termites, thinking that they have seen the moon, will dive straight into the water. The next morning separate the termites from their wings and you'll end up with a very tasty meal. Fry 'em up and chow 'em down.

If you want to eat ants with your pasta, try the abundant red ones found in Phuket. These deserve to be eaten, as they're the blighters that drop from vegetation onto unwary passersby and try to bite a piece off their body to carry back to their nests.

You need to collect a lot of ants for a good feed, so go hunting for their nests. These are fairly easy to spot hanging off branches.

Approach the nest with a bucket

and a sharp pair of scissors. Very carefully (unless you enjoy being bitten by ants) position the bucket below the nest and snip it away from the branch so that it drops into the water.

Quickly stir the water with the stick to break up the nest and

drown the ants. Leave it for a while, as even drowning ants have a remarkable ability to bite! You'll probably find lots of little white blobs mixed in with the ants. These are their eggs and are also highly edible.

Red ants are best eaten as *larb*, a Laotian style specialty, also found in northeastern Thailand. Mix the ants with mint, chilies, fish sauce and lime then add course-ground toasted rice. The whole mess is

chopped up very finely and served with sticky rice.

The result will not be an ant-iclimax!

Everybody gets a leg

Tarantulas are mega-spiders that have a leg span of up to four inches and live in holes in the ground. Experts can tease the spiders out of their holes and quickly grab them. They're actually a lot less venomous than their scorpion cousins and have plenty of meat on them.

Scorpions have less meat and of course, an outer carapace, but once cooked are harmless and so can be gulped down sting and all. Mmmm...

munchy, crunchy and with plenty of roughage!

All joking aside, one of the great benefits of


eating insects and arachnids, as some locals do in Phuket, is that they contain a very high concentration of protein.

If you can get your head around the aesthetics of their consumption, you are actually dining on a very healthy food group indeed.

So as an alternative to all that turkey and Christmas pudding, consider giving the "Bugger's Diet" a try during the this festive season.

Gardening **By Patrick Campbell**

"SAY it with flowers" is a popular mantra of the florist business.

And for most occasions and certainly for most ladies, a romantic bouquet of roses or lilies speaks louder than words.

For Christmas though, and for the keen gardener, something a bit more practical is the order of the day.

Indoor potted plants are always a sensible choice. They can grace the festive table and afterwards be transferred outdoors. The number one choice world-wide is what Thais refer to as kistmas, a euphorbia called poinsettia, which has huge red (sometimes yellow, green or cream-colored) leaves, which are in fact bracts. Euphorbia *pulcherrima*, are now appearing

everywhere in plant nurseries and can be kept indoors, provided it is not in a draught - air-conditioning will cause both bracts and leaves to drop. Put outside, it will require some protection from the full tropical sun, but in the right conditions can become a small tree.

Like the holly and mistletoe of Christian myth, the poinsettia is associated with religion. Legend has it that a poor Mexican girl, unable to provide a Christmas gift for her local church, gathered weeds and placed them outside the building. Miraculously, they blossomed and became poinsettias. Of course the vivid hue is also associated with the blood of Christ.

Another American native is the Jerusalem cherry. As a child, I remember we always had one at Poinsettias make the perfect Christmas gift. Photo: davidd Christmas. A member of the solanum family (think potatoes and tomatoes), it is an excellent

choice as a seasonal present and has masses of large, glossy, round berries in shades of green, yellow and orange. As a small plant with deep green leaves, maybe eighteen inches high, it makes an attrac-

tive table decoration. Don't over water, since this will result in leaf and berry loss, but do mist occasionally with a spray. Whether the Jerusalem cherry will translate after-

wards to your garden is open to question, but I would suggest filtered sunlight or semi-shade.

Need a Christmas tree? My third, more ambitious gift suggestion, is the Norfolk Island pine. As befits a conifer from the South Pacific, it grows well in Phuket. With its conical shape and layers of horizontal and profusely needled branches, it looks like an exotic Christmas tree and will tolerate life in a container. You will find young potted specimens in local nurseries. I bought a small one years ago; it now stands about three meters tall.

Re-potted once, it would still do service as a Christmas tree if I had the strength to carry it indoors.

I am not a fan, but you might want to consider artificial flowers as a seasonal gift. Their quality has certainly improved beyond measure in recent years. The Index store, for example, has a huge range, from neat pots of tulips, proteus, zinnias and the like, to large single- stemmed versions of delphiniums, lilies and sunflowers. If you prefer the real thing but want longevity, try dried arrangements of lotus seed-heads, teasles or straw flowers.

fleshy berry (mulberry), a drupe with a hard interior pit or stone such as a mangosteen, lansium or langsart, rambudan, to a pome (think apples, guavas), There are also nuts with a hard outer shell such as coconuts, and legumes which produce pods (tama*rind, sator, senna*). Oddly, the peanut is a legume. Not all are edible and a few are toxic: for example the drupe of thevetiana (yellow oleander).



A rendezvous with Feadship

The Phuket Gazette was lucky enough to catch up with Bas Nederpelt of Feadship recently to talk about the success of the recent Superyacht Rendezvous and his company's commitment to the event.

Why do you continually support the Asia Superyacht **Rendezvous?**

Feadship started to support the event because we thought it was a nice initiative 11 years ago. We felt that this would become a developing market for yachts.

Recently we have been really pleased that we aligned ourselves with this event as this is the most successful region for superyachts.

Has the yachting potential for this region been fully realized?

One of the reasons we joined is that we love the region and knew that it had to develop. I think the potential will grow exponentially now and we are seeing a lot more yachts.

There are five or six Feadships in this region, including the three that attended the Superyacht Rendezvous - more than any other year. Many people from Europe who can't go to the Caribbean for winter look to this region, and Phuket is an unavoidable stop.

Is this why you chose Phuket to hold this event?

Phuket is better equipped than other areas in this region to host this event. Cruising in this area is different as it is more adventurous in a way and the rewards are huge as you have the Andaman islands, Burma and

other exciting destinations nearby. yacht offer? The people here are so nice, there's excellent food and the supplies are here.

It is very different to the Caribbean, which is the most popular cruising ground in winter, but there are now too many yachts and people and less to be discovered.

How did you start out at **Feadship?**

I joined them five years ago. Before that, I was in the industry for five years. At some stage in a career it is great to be able to join the best builder. Feadship is an international company that sells worldwide. It is nice to sell a product where every deal, client and project are different.

How do you brand the Feadship name?

Feadship was the first to start superyacht building, well over a 100 years ago. The brand as such was created in 1949 after the Second World War. There was no demand in Europe at this time so we went to the US.

The present name was created to cater to the American market, which has been our most successful market

Now we are a strong player, hopefully the leader in custombuilt motor yachts from 35 to over a hundred meters. We started selling in Asia 20 years ago and now we hope to sell a lot more.

What can you tell me about Steve Job's vacht Venus?

Nothing. We never disclose information about our clients.

Feadship unveiled *Relativity* at the Monaco Boat Show. Why choose a design for Albert Einstein and what does the

At Feadship we like to be an innovative player and six or seven years ago we started spending a lot of time and effort with our design teams and naval architects and all that was in-house. We have the biggest naval architecture office in the world. We challenge them every year to come up with an original idea.

Although we don't normally make a concept for a client - we normally show them ideas and directions – this year we decided to create an idea for a client.

It was difficult as we had to imagine a client who was no longer alive and someone who really changed many markets and thoughts. So we came up with this idea of creating a design for Albert Einstein.

What does the boat feature?

It features a floating platform so that Einstein and his fellow great thinkers can enjoy spending time on the yacht. It has a dedicated deck for thinkers and families. There are lots of areas to help with thinking possibilities.

There are always the techniaspects. Our guys came up with a very green propulsion package and in the end we decided to stay away from hydrogen and we came up with a green propulsion system that saves over 30 per cent in fuel.

Who do you plan to do a yacht for next year?

I sincerely don't know. We instructed our guys two weeks ago to develop an idea. What is nice about these concepts is that they are rarely adopted 100 per cent. We make things that could never work but we also make

things that do.

A few years ago we introduced a new propulsion concept, which we are now building for the first time, and also design concepts are adopted on certain projects. These concepts are there to inspire us and our clients to come up with a more advanced product.


What do like about the **Superyacht Rendezvous?**


We want to keep it almost the same as it's spot on. It's a gathering of clients and people active in the industry and those who promote the industry in all their different roles.



BARCELONA secured the futures of leading players Lionel Messi, Xavi and Carles Puyol with renewed contracts on Tuesday.

World Player of the Year Messi's deal has been extended by two years to June 30, 2018, which ties him until he is 31, the La Liga leaders said in a statement.

The 34-year-old Puyol, the club's captain, has agreed a threeyear extension to June 30, 2016, which would effectively see the Spanish international through to the end of his playing career at 38.

Xavi's existing deal ran until June 2016 depending on appearances but the 32-year-old midfielder's new contract would now end then regardless of the number of times he played, Barca added.

The new contracts will be signed in the coming weeks.

"It is with great satisfaction that the board are able to bring continuity to this successful project with the renewed deals for Xavi, Puvol and Messi," Barcelona director Toni Freixa told a news conference.

'Puvol. Messi and Xavi are three basic pillars. It was essential to have our principal figures tied to the club.

"The buy-out clauses remain the same until there is a financial improvement."

Offering Messi a further two years indicates how important the Argentine is to the club and ensures they secure his services

over the peak of his playing career, injury permitting.

At 25, Messi has already set a number of club scoring records and is favorite to win a fourth World Player of the Year award next month.

He has been the top scorer in the world's highest-profile club competition, the Champions League, for four years in a row, and hit the headlines recently as he racked up his 90th goal in 2012 for club and country.

Barca built their team around the fleet-footed forward over four trophy-filled seasons under coach Pep Guardiola until he stepped aside last May, and the transition to former number two Tito Vilanova has failed to upset 'the flea's' rhythm.

Messi has already scored 25 goals in 16 La Liga games this season, the latest being a double against second-placed Atletico Madrid in a 4-1 victory on Sunday which left Barca clear at the top, and 13 points ahead of their great title rivals Real Madrid.

Puyol has been a central figure at the heart of the Barca defence for more than a decade, famous for his commitment and aggression. His return after a string of injuries has settled a backline that looked distinctly shaky earlier in the campaign.

Speaking at a news conference on Monday, Puyol said: "I want to play until I am 40. I want to continue playing... but when it doesn't

feel right I will stop whether I have a contract in place or not."

Like Puyol and Messi, playmaker Xavi is a product of the club's acclaimed youth academy, and has pulled the strings in midfield for more than a decade.

With Cesc Fabregas settling into the side more, and the talented Thiago Alcantara emerging, Spanish international Xavi has increased competition for his place but remains a vital part of Vilanova's plans.

victory.



Sport Year of the 'Celtic Tiger'

RORY McIlroy's dominance on both sides of the Atlantic and the clearest hint yet at the exciting potential in China were the biggest storylines in what may prove to be a truly transformational golfing year in 2012.

The coronation of McIlroy as the game's leading player was confirmed in sensational fashion when the exciting Northern Irishman cruised to his second major title by a record eight shots in the PGA Championship at Kiawah Island in August.

Dubbed 'Boy Wonder' in his homeland for the past decade, McIlroy fully justified his other nickname of the 'Celtic Tiger' as he ended the year being showered with virtually every accolade available to him.

He followed in the footsteps of Luke Donald when he became the second player to win the money list titles in both Europe and the United States and he strengthened his position as world number one with an extraordinary run of form.

Long regarded as heir-apparent to Tiger Woods as the game's greatest player, McIlroy has smoothly taken over that role while Woods, despite triumphing three times on the 2012 PGA Tour in a welcome return to winning ways, has had to take a back seat.

The 23-year-old McIlroy is almost certain to be a dominant figure in golf for at least another decade but 14-year-old Chinese Guan Tianlang gave a strong indication of the likely impact from his part of the world well beyond that time frame.

Guan ensured he would become the youngest player ever to compete at the Masters by winning the Asia-Pacific Amateur Championship last month, tantalizing proof of the vast golfing potential in the Chinese market.

The world's most populous nation had celebrated another coup just five months earlier when Shanshan Feng, 22, clinched the LPGA Championship by two shots in Rochester, New York to become the first person from mainland China to win a women's major.

Remarkably, Feng was born just five years after the first golf course was opened in China.

There were several other highlights during 2012 with Bubba Watson producing arguably the shot of the year to win the Masters in a two-way playoff and Ernie Els ending a decade-long drought in the majors to claim his second British Open.

The belly putter was also thrust into the limelight when Webb Simpson, at the US Open, and Els, at Royal Lytham, joined 2011 PGA Championship winner Keegan

Bradley as the only players to triumph in the majors using a long putter.

That trend, coupled with the growing number of younger golfers opting to anchor putters to their chin, chest or belly, prompted golf's rule makers last month to propose a ban on the technique, which could come into effect by 2016.

However, McIlrov's stellar play around the world gave golf fans their most stirring memories in 2012.

He recorded four wins on the US circuit among 10 top-10s in just 16 starts before ending the season being named the PGA of America Player of the Year, the PGA Tour's Player of the Year and winner of the Vardon Trophy for the lowest scoring average.

McIlroy clinched the Arnold Palmer Award as the PGA Tour's leading money winner, with earnings of US\$8,047,952, and was delighted to follow that up with the European Tour order of merit with two events remaining.

"Winning a second major already made it a fabulous season, but then to follow Luke in becoming number one in both Europe and the States is the icing on the cake after a fabulous season," he said.

Hardly surprisingly, McIlroy finished his 2012 campaign on a triumphant note when he won the European Tour's season-ending DP World Tour Championship by two shots in Dubai last month.

wanted to end it in real style," he said after spectacularly making birdies on the last five holes to close with a 66.

While the richly talented McIlroy is a gifted shot-maker, left-hander Watson delivered the 'blow' of the year with a miraculous escape from pine straw to win the Masters in a playoff with South African Louis Oosthuizen in April.

On the second extra hole, the long-hitting American ended up well right and deep in the tree line off the tee from where he had a narrow avenue to the green.

Undaunted, Watson struck a stunning hook off the pine straw with a gap wedge, his ball bending 40 yards in the air to settle 10 feet from the pin before he claimed his first major victory with a two-putt par.

"I got in these trees and hit a crazy shot," said Watson, a self-taught golfer who learned the game by hitting wiffle balls around his house. "I just hooked it up there and somehow it nestled close to the hole."

In June, Watson's good friend and fellow American Simpson clinched his first major title with a nerve-jangling one-shot victory at the US Open after overhauling overnight leaders Jim Furyk and Graeme McDowell.

The following month, 42-year-old South African Els won the British Open at Royal Lytham by one stroke from Adam Scott after the Australian agonizingly bogeyed the last four holes.

Unquestionably the greatest comeback "I didn't want the year to just tail off, I of the year, and perhaps of all time in golf,

came at the Ryder Cup in September when Europe overhauled a deficit of 10-6 going into the final day to beat the United States by 14-1/2 points to 13-1/2.

Inspired by the spirit of the late Seve Ballesteros, Europe sent out their best players early and rode a wave of blue numbers to retain the trophy when Germany's Martin Kaymer defeated Steve Stricker one up.

"Seve will always be present with this team," a teary-eyed European captain Jose Maria Olazabal said of his fellow Spaniard, friend and mentor. "He was a big factor for this event, for the European side."

That same month, South Korean Shin Ji-yai romped to a nine-stroke victory at the Women's British Open at Royal Liverpool in England to complete a stunning Asian sweep of the year's four women's majors.

Shin's compatriot Yoo Sun-young won the Kraft Nabisco Championship in a playoff at Rancho Mirage in April and Choi Na-yeon, also of South Korea, claimed her first major title by four shots at the US Women's Open in Kohler, Wisconsin in July.

the captain will recover from his hamstring injury for the Melbourne test, which begins on December 26, but Tasmanian Hilfenhaus's side strain means he will miss out.

Mitchell Johnson, who should replace Hilfenhaus in the starting line-up, and Usman Khawaja, brought in as backup for Clarke, were withdrawn from matches in the domestic Twenty20 league when they were called up to the test squad.

"We feel the test match on

but said that a F1 Grand Prix in Thailand would stir up huge potential public interest in motor sport.

However, Tin says he would prefer a permanent F1 track for any future Thailand Grand Prix, rather that the street circuit that is currently being mooted for 2014.

Despite the TNT bowlers giving it their all, Imtiyaz Mushtaq led




