Public sector Anti-Corruption Commission drops investigation into government officials illegally issuing land titles across Phuket

THE investigation by the Public sector Anti-Corruption Commission (PACC) into allegedly illegally issued land titles covering more than 500 rai of land in Phuket has silently been dropped.

The PACC, set up specifically to fight corruption among government officials, quietly dropped the probe into hundreds of Phuket land titles just days after Col Dusadee Arayawuth, who had initiated the investigation, was transferred to the Ministry of Justice on October 1 last year, the Gazette recently discovered.

Among the land titles being investigated were land ownership documents for prime beachfront real estate north of Patong Beach and choice plots along a golf course in Kathu.

One plot under investigation is said to be located in a protected forest. The title for the plot was approved by a former Phuket vice governor and seven officers from related agencies. A hillside resort is now operating on the

In the investigation into the hillside resort, Col Dusadee issued a press release naming 16 officers from a variety of government agencies deemed responsible for abusing their positions in the case. Among those listed were officers of the Phuket Land Office, Kathu District Office and Forestry Department.

With the PACC now dropping the inquest, not a single government officer allegedly involved in the illegal issuance of land titles in Phuket...

German tourist dies after fall on rocks at Khao Lak

A GERMAN tourist with a heart condition fell on some rocks and drowned at Khao Lak last week.

Mr Oberle Ovegov, 57, had spent the morning of January 31 playing in the water with his wife. At about 2:30pm, as he was walking on some flat rocks that extend into the sea at Khukkhak, he became dizzy and fell, said Khao Lak Police Inspector Anan Kuaboonkaew.

Mr Ovegov apparently suffered from a heart condition that may have prompted his dizziness and fall. Lt Col Anan explained.

"He landed between the rocks and the sea, and waves repeatedly hit him and slammed him into the

rock," he added.

A group of Thais and foreigners worked to free him for 30 minutes, but by the time they got him out he had drowned, Col Arun said. - Kritsada Mueanhawong



Fugitive 'Denny' Knudsen arrested on breach of bail

WANTED Danish national Dennis Mark Knudsen, 24, has been arrested by Phuket Police.

Mr Knudsen was wanted for breaking bail conditions after he failed to appear at Phuket Provincial Court on January 22.

The court hearing was to resolve a dispute between Mr Knudsen and Australians John Cohen and Adam Shea about a "big bike" worth about 300,000 baht.

Mr Knudsen's failure to appear in court prompted Mr Cohen and Mr Shea to make a "pre-emptive strike" and hunt down the Danish national. That day, the Australians opened fire on Mr Knudsen on Soi Sansabai, near Patong's renowned nightlife district on Soi Bangla, accidentally wounding two German tourists in the process.

However, Mr Cohen and Mr Shea failed to hit their target: Denny Knudsen.

"Mr Knudsen was arrested in another part of the island yesterday [Sunday, February 3]," Patong Police Superintendent Chiraphat Pochanaphan confirmed to the Gazette on Monday.

"He has broken bail conditions set by the court and is now back in the court's custody," he added.

The Gazette received unconfirmed reports that Mr Knudsen was arrested in Phuket after he trashed a hotel room in the Chalong area. Before going on the run last month, he reportedly trashed another hotel room in Patong to the tune of about 80,000 baht.

"Our investigation focuses only on the shooting incident," Lt Col Akanit said. "We have arrested the two suspects [Mr Cohen and Mr Shea] and we have their statements. We are now ready

Kata jet-ski operator denies taking 'anchor swing' at tourist's head

A JET-SKI operator who crushed a tourist's motorcycle helmet and, witnesses say, swung a boat anchor at him has been found and agreed to pay for the helmet.

However, the jet-ski operator denied that he tried to attack the

Karon Police are calling for the tourist to present himself to receive compensation for his damaged helmet.

A witness to the incident that took place on Monday explained to the Gazette that the jet-ski operator had mounted his jet-skis onto a trailer and was towing them off the beach just before sundown when the wheels of the trailer ran over the German man's belongings on the sand.

"The German man had his sunglasses and a few other things damaged, but all he wanted was for the jet-ski operator to pay for the broken motorbike helmet, which belonged to a rental shop," the witness said.

"The beach boy refused and they had an argument... After a while, the German man gave up and

started walking away, but the boy picked up a small anchor from the trailer and ran after him," he added.

"It wasn't until a woman saw what was happening and screamed that the German man looked back and saw the boy coming at him with the anchor. The German started running at the same time the boy swung the anchor at him. The anchor missed his head by about half a meter," said the witness.

The German ran down onto the beach, and the jet-ski operator gave chase.

"When the boy realized that

everyone on the beach was staring at him, he turned and walked away," the witness said.

Police at first appealed for the public's help in identifying the operator, but after the German tourist described him, were able to locate him and bring him in to

"The boy was born and raised in Phuket," said Col Werawat Juntharavijit, the newly installed Superintendent of the Karon Police.

The jet-ski operator admitted that he had pulled his trailer over the German's belongings, and that they had argued, but he denied trying to attack him, Col Werawat said.

"He agreed to compensate the tourist for the helmet," he added.

Although the German tourist reported the incident at the Karon Police station, police say they do not have his name because he left in a rush.

Col Werawat asked anyone with information about the German man to contact Karon Police Station at 076 396393.

Prison guard shooter nabbed in traffic stop

A RANDOM stop of two men at a checkpoint in Phuket Town on the night of January 31 netted police drugs, guns and a man wanted since last year for attempted murder of a Phuket Prison guard and alleged theft of the guard's 3 million baht.

Police stopped Narongsak Dang-ngam, 36, and Nikom Srisoi, 45, at checkpoint on Soi Surin 3, at about 11:30pm.

Police found a .357 handgun in Mr Narongsak's pants pocket and 25 grams of ya ice (crystal methamphetamine) in the pickup.

The two men were taken to Phuket City Police Station and charged with drug and gun possession. While processing the arrest, police discovered Mr Narongsak was wanted on an outstanding arrest warrant for assault with intent to kill.

On June 27 last year, Narongsak is alleged to have shot prison officer Darunun Teepapan near Wat Chalong and robbed him of 3 million baht, Lt Col Prawit Engchua of Phuket City Police explained.

Police searched the men's shared room on Surin Road and found 1,626 pills of ya bah (methamphetamine) under the bathroom

Fight for Racha goes on

After eight months, villagers hope island beauty can be saved

THE ongoing struggle to protect the beauty and environmental health of the tourist-popular Racha Yai Island, about 25 kilometers south of Phuket, continued on Tuesday in a meeting with Vice Governor Sommai Prijasilpa.

Santi Chandi, representative of Racha Yai residents, asked the vice governor to solve the problems she had promised to solve at a meeting in May 2012.

At that meeting, environmentalists told V/Gov Sommai that Koh Racha faced environmental damage due to some resort owners improperly disposing of trash and wastewater. They also complained that resort developers were cutting down trees in forests on the island.

V/Gov Sommai promised to have environmental protection measures in place within two

Six months later, Mr Santi filed a formal complaint asserting government inaction.

On Tuesday, Mr Santi tried again, urging the government to take action to protect the island.

He also added a new complaint to the list, one already familiar to Phuket residents: foreigners taking local jobs.

Mr Santi cited Chinese and Korean operators promoting diving for non-divers, in which tourists don a helmet attached to an oxygen supply tube in order to go helmet diving.

"These operators used to hire local longtail boats, but now they have their own longtail boats and don't rent from us anymore.

"And they are hurting our local dive operators by stealing their customers," Mr Santi said.

He asked responsible officers to investigate the issue.

solutions to the island's problems had been slow in coming. "I will order departments who are responsible for these problems to check and fix them," she said.

Officers were to conduct an inspection of Koh Racha on Thursday and propose solutions directly to V/Gov Sommai "in order to move Koh Racha forward".

Full-scale tsunami drill not to be sounded in Russian

PHUKET's annual full-scale tsunami evacuation drill will be held at Karon Beach on February 21, but the tsunami warning messages will not be announced in Russian.

The drill will be held in two stages, at 9:30am and 1pm, in order to test different emergency response teams and their response times, with all relevant agencies taking part under the co-ordinated command of the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation Phuket office (DDPM-Phuket)

To announce the drill, the normal tsunami warning and cancellation messages will be played, DDPM-Phuket chief San Jantharawong confirmed to the Gazette.

However, the messages will not be broadcast in Russian. As previously reported by the Gazette, the tsunami warning message and the cancellation message are announced in Thai, English, German, Chinese and Japanese.

The lack of Russian language in the tsunami warning messages has raised serious concerns among many of Phuket's leading tourism figures. The absence is glaring since Russia is now the second-largest source market for tourists visiting Phuket.

To prevent confusion like that which followed the tsunami scare on April 11 last year, when the warning towers along the Andaman seaboard sounded the alarm to evacuate, officers will tomorrow begin erecting signs in Thai and English to announce the drill, Mr

"I talked with Karon Municipality today, asking them to help announce the drill to local residents and tourists in the area. We will also post signs and have sound trucks announce the drill in Thai and English," he added.

"The new Secretary-General, Pokpiboon Potranun, shut down the 'Special Operations Unit' set up by Col Dusadee to carry out the investigation into land titles being illegally issued in Phuket," the government officer told the Pol Lt Gen Wirote Pao-in (center) Phuket Gazette on condition of anonymity.

"The order to close the special operations unit, order number 45/ 55, was announced on October 10, 2012," he said.

"I have no idea why this decision was made. I just have to follow the order," he added.

The officer said that among the plots that will no longer be investigated were:

- 65 rai at Freedom Beach, south of Patong
- 300 rai in a protected forest area in the Kamala Hills
 - 3 rai in Kalim

- 30 rai on the border of Kamala and Kalim subdistricts
- 45 rai at Baan Nakalay, in Ka-

- Koh Sireh - 20 rai near King Rama IX Park (Suan Luang) in Phuket Town

While in Phuket conducting his investigation in August 2012, Col Dusadee told the Gazette that the PACC would "investigate every single plot [suspected of being illegal], especially any land owned by, or involving any former or current government officials."

"No matter how high ranking they are," he said, "if they are found guilty of encroaching on [or assisting others to encroach on] public land they will be prosecuted without exception."

Col Dusadee was transferred 43 days later.





Crackdown on nominee shareholders

A TEAM of investigators from Bangkok will be in Phuket soon to help local officials probe businesses with foreign owners that are suspected of using nominee shareholders, Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut announced on Tuesday.

About 3,700 "foreign-owned" business are registered in Phuket, explained Department of Business Development Phuket office chief Nimit Kangkajit at the meeting.

least 51 per cent of the shares of any business, and foreigners will be limited to only holding 49 per cent," Mr Nimit "However, we

will be sending out teams to check laundry services and tour van whether any Thai nominees are being used.'

In addition to any businesses suspected of being run with the help of Thai nominees, investigations will be launched into all businesses with foreign owners across the island engaging in pro-

fessions reserved for Thais only, Governor Maitri explained.

"I have ordered that three teams, each headed by a Phuket vice governor and comprising officers from a variety of relevant departments, inspect 'foreignowned' businesses in all three Phuket districts: Muang, Kathu and Thalang," Governor Maitri

These businesses will be examined to establish whether or not they are engaging in any of the work reserved for Thais only, explained Phuket Provincial

> Employment Office (PPEO) chief Yawapa Pibulpol.

"Activities we are especially concerned about are guiding services,

operations, as well as timeshare sales," Ms Yawapa said.

Already during the recent crackdown, instigated by a taxi mob in Bang Tao on January 28, five companies with foreign owners were found breaching regulations and were fined, Ms

Yawapa added.

Governor Maitri also explained that the teams will be encouraging locals to report any information that might lead to identifying companies with foreign owners that are breaking laws in The Kingdom.

Following complaints by locals that foreigners were snatching their jobs, the Phuket Employment

Office has revealed that 8,635 foreigners in the province currently have work permits. Most of them are from the United Kingdom and are working in tourism.

Ms Yawapa explained that Phuket was a tourist city, hence its economy depended on hotels, resorts, accessory shops and restaurants.

Of the 8,635 foreigners with

work permits, she said British had nationals the number highest with 1,169, followed by 668 Filipinos, 646 Russians and 554 French

Ms Yawapa said the foreign contingent comprised 2,559 managing directors, 2,452 committee chairpersons, 1,423 office workers, 644 teachers, 439 high-level executives, 182 trainees and 936 others.

In line with new government policy, the Phuket office was applying stricter criteria in issuing work permits, said Ms Yawapa.

Following locals' complaints that foreigners, particularly Russians, were taking their jobs, police in January found 12 foreigners working in violation of the law. Several were working without a permit, while others were working in professions or locations not covered by their permits.

She said her officials had also publicized information that the foreigners were not permitted to work in certain professions, such as tour guide, masseur or laundry person. Those caught violating these restrictions face a 5,000-baht fine.

Land grab stopped by police, title deed

PLANS by local residents to develop over 100 rai of land in Chalong that they claim is theirs ground to a halt last week after more than 60 police officers arrived to support the apparent owner, who produced a title deed as proof of ownership.

The alleged owner, Prajit Hongyok, met fierce opposition from villagers as he rebuffed their claims that the property was an unowned "wasteland".

More than 50 villagers gathered to prevent Phuket Land Office officers from surveying the site, a plot of more than 100 rai near the old Chao Fa mine in Soi Song Kun, in the Klong Mudong area, on January 31.

It took a total of 60 officers and the land title deed to calm the mob, who were concerned that their efforts to develop the property over the past several years, which includes the construction of 10 homes, would be dashed.

'The land is part of an old mine; it has been abandoned for decades. So we've claimed more than 100 rai of the land and built 10 houses on the property," one villager told the Gazette.

"We have even worked on the access road – it used to be only a walkway that cars couldn't use," he said.

"I just ask that the proper authorities step forward and prove that the land is legally owned," he

Afraid that development had already gone too far and that perhaps waiting any longer would cause a bigger issue down the road, Mr Prajit requested that the Phuket Land Office survey the property.

"I requested the survey because I was told that the villagers were encroaching on my land, building houses and had even removed one of the markers used to establish the property's boundary line," Mr Prajit said.

"I'm having the plots resurveyed to confirm which is my land and to make sure the villagers know that the land is owned," he said.

"I'm not trying to pick on anyone. I just want to protect my ownership rights for land that I have legally owned for decades," he added.

Mr Prajit also voiced concern over rumors of villagers having already divided the land into plots and verbally selling it.

Corruption suspected in police housing projects

THE Department of Special Investigation (DSI) Director-General, Tharit Pengdit, arrived in Phuket recently as part of his investigation into the stalled construction of 163 police housing apartment blocks across the country.

With him was Government Spokesman Prompong Nopparit, who is also vice president of a parliamentary anti-corruption committee set up by Pheu Thai.

"We will be looking at the delay in construction and will also determine whether corruption is involved, said Mr Tharit, adding that the case had attracted the attention of national police chief Adul Sangsingkaew.

Mr Prompong described the project as "wrong from the beginning."

"Only one company bid on this project, PCC Development and Construction Co Ltd," he said. "The bidding process looks suspicious."

Mr Tharit and Mr Prompong met Phuket Provincial Police Commander Choti Chavalviwat and police senior officers to discuss the incomplete construction of three housing blocks to provide accommodation for officers serving at Thung Thong, Patong, and Thalang police stations.

"I received complaints from police officers in Phuket about financial hardship because rent in Phuket is quite expensive and they have been waiting for the police

housing for a long time," Mr Prompong said.

This is not the first time the construction has come under scrutiny.

Gen Choti said that construction began on the three apartment blocks in April 2010 at a budget of 68.1 million baht. The original deadline was June 24, 2011.

On March 15, 2012, the construction was still not finished and Region 8 Police in Surat Thani ordered the construction stopped. "We received the order to stop the construction because they wanted to make sure it was up to code," Gen Choti said.

"After the building was checked, we received permission to resume construction," he said.

"Region 8 Police gave the contractor 293 more days to complete the project. Later, they were given an additional 360 days," he explained.

However, after March 2012, the contractor never resumed work.

Russian language courses to counter growing discord

THE Russian Federation's Deputy Honorary Consul in Phuket, Santi Udomkiratak, called for Russian language classes to be taught in Phuket as a long-term solution to the anti-Russian sentiment spreading rapidly across the island.

"Lack of Russian language skills is a big part of the Russian issue here, and it's been a problem for a very long time," Mr Santi said.

"There are very few Thai people who can speak good Russian. That's why Russian companies have to hire Russian people to work, which upsets Thais," he said.

The Russian Federation is pushing for cooperation between British International School

 Phuket (BIS), which has Russian teachers, and the Prince of Songkla University (PSU)
 Phuket Campus to start a Russian-language minor, Mr Santi explained.

The minor would require students to study Russian from their first through fourth years.

A minimum of 40 students would be required to make the minor program viable.

"The Thai lack of Russian language skills has been a problem for years. It will take time to resolve it," Mr Santi said.

A LOCAL tour van driver has received high praise from the Phuket governor for returning 124,000 baht and US\$433 that an tourist left Indonesian behind in his tour van.

Sarawut Sompan, 24, works for the Sai Lom Club of tour van operators in Chalong. On the night of January 31, he picked up two tourists, Indonesian and Thai, at the Phuket Merlin Hotel in Phuket Town and took them to Phuket International Airport.

"After dropping them at the airport, I drove back home," Mr Sarawut said.

"When I arrived home and cleaned the van, I noticed a King Power Duty Free bag on the passenger front seat, so I opened it and found the cash and two bankbooks inside.

"I got the number of the two tourists and called them. They were about to board their plane so I couldn't return the money to them. They asked me to transfer it to them later," he said.

The money belonged to the Indonesian tourist, who offered the van driver a reward of 3,000 baht for returning it.

"I accepted only 2,000 baht," Mr Sarawut said.

Mr Sarawut has been praised by Governor Maitri Inthusut and Chalong Mayor Samran Jindaphol, who awarded him with a certificate.

Gov Maitri, who also planned to give him a certificate, described Mr Sarawut as "a good person who is a good model for Phuket."

Navy will help Rohingya 'get where they want to go'

THE Phuket-based Commander of the Third Naval Area, Vice Admiral Taratorn Kajitsuwan, publicly affirmed on February 1 the role of the Royal Thai Navy in handling the huge influx of Rohingya refugees landing along the Andaman coast.

Speaking at the Phuket Merlin Hotel in Phuket Town, V/Adm Taratorn said the Navy aims to provide humanitarian assistance to the refugees, who are fleeing violent persecution in their native Rakhine State in Myanmar.

"We have to take good care of them according to the international treaties that we have signed with other nations, such as human rights laws. We will provide them with

assistance and help them to continue to the country they want to travel to," he told members of the national media.

"According to this year's statistics, the number of Rohingya refugees coming to Thailand is higher than last year. The Third Naval Area command has to increase its patrols," he added.

Acknowledging the role of human traffickers in assisting Rohingya fleeing Myanmar, V/Adm Taratorn said "We consider this one of the big problems that affects internal security. We are trying to find stronger measures to deal with it."

Newborn among Rohingya crowding refugee shelters

A BABY born during the voyage was among the boatload of 110 Rohingya refugees who made landfall in the Surin Islands in Phang Nga province on January 30, causing officials to scramble to find accomodations for them.

The refugees were taken to the Khura Buri Shelter, but Chief Manit pleaded for help and support from the government.

"More than 500 Rohingya have arrived in Phang Nga in just one month. We cannot accommodate almost triple occupancy.





FCCT in row over Somyot

THE Foreign Correspondents Club of Thailand (FCCT) has found itself at the center of a row after last month's conviction of activist Somyot Prueksakasemsuk on charges of lese majeste, reported Asiancorrespondent.com.

Many of the club's members had wanted the FCCT to make a statement condemning the conviction, though at a panel discussion on the subject on January 31 club president Nirmal Ghosh announced it would do no such thing.

Mr Ghosh, a correspondent for *The Straits Times*, told the audience that the FCCT was a "club", not an "association" and that it would be inappropriate for it to comment on such a sensitive subject.

Participating in the debate at the club's Bangkok premises were Mr Somyot's wife Sukunya; *Prachatai* news website editor Chiranuch Premchaiporn; and activist Tul Sitthisomwong.

Leading the online charge against the FCCT's silence was journalist Andrew MacGregor Marshall, a well-known critic of the lese majeste law.

Mr Marshall, who lives in Singapore, pointed out that the club's own website stated that "the main goal of the FCCT and its members is to promote and protect the rights of the press in Thailand and across Asia" and that it "advocates press freedom as a cornerstone of civil society in emerging democracies..."



Security measures tightened ahead of Chinese New Year

IN ANTICIPATION of tourists from Malaysia flocking across the border for Chinese New Year celebrations, Narathiwat authorities have increased safety measures.

Narathiwat Governor Apinun Suetananuwong ordered the combined forces in 13 districts of the province to increase their security measures to prevent any possible attempts to instigate unrest in the Deep South province during the Chinese New Year celebrations.

During this period, Chinese in Malaysia

often cross the border to celebrate the event, particularly in Sungai Kolok, which is home to a shrine of the Toh Moh Goddess.

The governor ordered special protection for the entire district in addition to Narathiwat municipality, which has a large Thai-Chinese community.

Police were told to keep a close watch and to screen vehicles after being tipped-off that four stolen vehicles would most likely be used in car bomb attacks in the restive province.

Critics cry foul over treatment of Poh 'Godfather of the East'

nation

THE arrest of infamous provincial godfather Somchai Khunpluem, "Kamnan Poh", after seven years on the run has raised serious questions about political corruption in Thailand.

Days after his arrest, Mr Somchai, 76, was transferred from Bangkok to Chon Buri Central Prison, a transfer process that usually takes years for the Department of Corrections to process. He has since been moved out of the prison to a local hospital.

Mr Somchai, the so-called "Godfather of the East" who went on the run to avoid sentences of more than 30 years for murder and corruption, was arrested on January 30 while on his way home from Bangkok's Samitivej Hospital, where he was receiving treatment.

In June 2004, he was sentenced to 25 years for orchestrating the murder of a rival. In another case, he was convicted of corruption, earning another five years and four months of jail time.

Mr Somchai had been hiding out in a house in Chon Buri, his home province where his family

remains highly influential. Of his sons, Sonthaya Khunpluem is now culture minister; Wittaya Khunpluem, is president of Chon Buri's Provincial Administrative Organization; Itthiphol Khunpluem is mayor of Pattaya; and Narongchai Khunpluem is mayor of Saensuk District.

Records showed Mr Somchai had sought treatment at Samitivej Hospital under the false name Kim Sae Tang for symptoms related to his nerves, heart, gastrointestinal tract and eyesight since April 22 last year.

"We got a tip-off that he visited doctors at Samitivej Hospital's Srinakarin branch and he travelled between his home and the hospital using a black van," a source at the Crime Suppression Bureau told *The Nation*. He was caught on the Latkrabang tollway gate, on his way back to Chon Buri, where he is now being held.

Observers were quick to level charges of double standards – and question the wisdom of housing such a powerful figure in his home province.

His transfer to Chon Buri took place after Kobkiat Kasiwiwat, the deputy director general of the Corrections Department, had said that his condition and status as a influential local figure would be taken into consideration before any decision could be made.

YouTube removes 'insulting' SNL Thai sex sketch

YOUTUBE has taken down a clip of a sketch from the US comedy show Saturday Night Live following a formal request by the Thai Culture Ministry.

The clip, a fake ad for languagelearning software Rosetta Stone, depicted a variety of nerdy American men saying they were learning Thai, implying this was in preparation for sex trips to The Kingdom.

Many Westerners using social platforms, such as Twitter and Facebook, seemed to have agreed that the targets of the humorous sketch were the male users of the language-learning software.

But many Thais felt differently. The YouTube page was inundated with comments from angry Thai viewers believing the show was mocking Thailand, couching it as little more than a sex tourism destination.


While some merely expressed hurt or anger, others went further, threatening violence against the US Embassy and even President Barack Obama.

One user, calling himself Mr EEEkane412, repeatedly posted the phrases "I'm going to bomb the U.S. Embassy in Thailand" and "I will kill Barackn Obama" [sic].

Others directed their fury at Rosetta Stone, believing the sketch to be a genuine commercial for the company's Thai language software.

The Thai government itself eventually waded into the issue.

Culture Minister Sonthaya Khunpluem demanded the clip be

removed from the site.



Kuwait: Will back free speech but must protect emir

KUWAIT supports free speech but must act against illegal comments made about the Gulf state's ruler, the government said on Monday, after a Twitter user was jailed for five years.

A Kuwaiti court sentenced a man to prison for insulting the emir on the social networking site, a rights lawyer and news websites said, in the latest prosecution for criticism of authorities via social media.

THE Vatican's new sexual crimes prosecutor on Tuesday acknowledged that the US media "did a service" to the Catholic Church through its aggressive reporting on child abuse that helped the Church "confront the truth".

Pacific Tsunami kills at least five people in Solomon Islands

A POWERFUL 8.0 magnitude earthquake set off a tsunami that killed at least five people in a remote part of the Solomon Islands on Wednesday and triggered evacuations across the South Pacific.

More than three dozen aftershocks up to magnitude 6.6 rocked the region in the hours after the quake, the US Geological Survey said.

Disease spreads as Syria drug shortages and casualties grow

DIRTY water diseases are spreading in Syria, compounding the problems of hospitals that are perilously short of medicine and doctors after nearly two years of fighting, the World Health Organization (WHO) said on Tuesday.

The Health Ministry has run out of trauma treatments made in factories in rebel areas to help the increasing numbers of burn victims and wounded civilians in intensive care units, it said.

That is assuming patients can reach treatment in the first place. Many surgeons have fled, many hospitals are closed and most ambulances are either damaged or are being used by both sides as a clandestine way to transport fighters, the WHO said.

"The biggest concern for us is the breakdown of the water and sanitation system and the increasing numbers of waterborne diseases," WHO representative Elisabeth Hoff told a news briefing about the deteriorating health situation on the ground.

Hepatitis A, a viral liver disease that can cause explosive epidemics, has been reported in Aleppo, Idlib – where there has been intense fighting – and some crowded shelters for the homeless in the capital, she said by telephone from Damascus.

Aid groups have had to start using alternatives to purify

water because the import of chlorine gas has been banned over fears it could be misused as a chemical weapon.

"The problem is chlorine gas is a chemical that can harm populations if it is not used correctly," Hoff added.

The UN Children's Fund, UNICEF, began importing sodium hydrochloride, a liquid used for water purification, via Jordan on February 3, spokeswoman Marixie Mercado told the same briefing.

Heavy fighting between the forces of President Bashar al-Assad and rebels trying to topple him could swell the ranks of the 4 million who already need urgent assistance in Syria and 2 million internally displaced in the past two years.

"The catastrophic humanitarian

crisis continues to deepen," Jens Laerke, spokesman of the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, told the briefing.

"We are operating mostly out of government-controlled areas, that doesn't mean we don't deliver in opposition-controlled areas. Frontlines are changing, it is fluid situation," he said.

China bans ads for expensive gifts in anti-corruption push

CHINESE radio and television stations are to ban advertisements for expensive gifts such as watches, rare stamps and gold coins, the Xinhua state news agency said on Wednesday, as part of a push by the government to crack down on extravagance and waste.

Such advertisements had "publicized incorrect values and helped create a bad social ethos", the State Administration of Radio, Film and Television (SARFT) said in a release, Xinhua said.

The ban comes after repeated calls from Xi Jinping, China's president-in-waiting, for a renewed fight against graft. But it could take a toll on luxury product manufacturers who advertise on Chinese television and radio.

Makers of expensive Chinese liquors including Kweichow Moutai Co Ltd and Wuliangye Yibin Co Ltd routinely dominate the annual ad auction at China's official television network, CCTV.

Producers of the fiery Chinese liquor known as *baijiu* were hit in December by an official ban on alcohol at military

events. High-end bottles of the grain-based liquor can cost thousands of yuan.

The crackdown on corruption has also hit jewellery retailers hard, especially after high-end watches became a symbol of graft.

Hengdeli and Emperor Watch and Jewellery are among the biggest watch retailers in China and both of their shares were down on Wednesday.

"Watches and liquor have been influenced by government policies and have been pulled down by a change in leadership," Rupert Hoogewerf, the founder of Hurun Report, told Reuters last month.

Xi said in a speech on January 22 that targeting the "flies", or lowly people involved in corruption, was just as important as going after the "tigers", or top officials.

Xi has warned that a failure to weed out corruption and extravagance would put the ruling Communist Party's survival in jeopardy.

Xi is due to take over as president at an annual meeting of parliament in March.

Inflation up for Chinese NY

B300 minimum daily wage cited as just one of the factors in rising produce prices in February

THE head of the Department of Internal Trade (DIT) Phuket Office said that the 300 baht daily minimum wage has contributed to market inflation ahead of the Chinese New Year festivities.

DIT-Phuket Chief Supacha Bunthalit told the Gazette that increased wages directly increase base costs for farmers, suppliers and

'Of course it [the minimum wage rise] is one factor that will affect prices for the end users - the consumers," she said.

However, Ms Supacha added that another important factor that needs to be considered is the fundamental market rule of 'supply and demand': "Due to the Chinese New Year, there has been an increased demand, and thus reduced supply of many types of produce in the market, which is another reason why prices have increased."

Asked if prices would drop again after the Chinese New Year, Ms Supacha responded: "There is no way we can tell at this point. It all depends on the vendors, their supplies and the demand for produce," she emphasized.

Earlier this week, the Gazette reported that a market vendor at the busy Kaset Market in Phuket Town had told the Phuket Governor that the new minimum wage, effective nationwide as of January 1, was forcing vendors to pass on price hikes of fresh produce.

Governor Maitri Inthusut last week led officers to inspect food prices at the fresh market, located behind the Robinson department store in Phuket Town.

The purpose of the visit was to ensure against gouging ahead of the Chinese New Year festivities, which begin on February 10.

During his walk-through of the market, Governor Maitri noted that vegetable prices were on the rise. "Most vegetables have jumped 5 to 10 baht. Kale and Chinese kale were 25 baht per kilogram, now they are 35 baht per kilo," he remarked.

"Fruit prices are increasing, too - especially oranges, as they are believed to be auspicious during Chinese New Year. Oranges are now 5 baht more a kilo. They were 75 baht, but are now 80 baht per kilogram. The price of green apples has also jumped, to 18 baht each; before they were 15 baht apiece,"

Gov Maitri predicted the prices of other fruits to follow suit, notably fruits used as auspicious offerings during Chinese New Year ceremonies, such as bananas, pears and grapes

To this, fruit vendor Sakorn Ngarnwongpanit countered, "So far, only orange and apple prices have increased for the coming Chinese New Year, but it is like this every year – prices rise in response to rising demand."

Non-vegans have also been hit by rising meat prices, the governor noted.

"Pork has increased by 10 baht, and is now 130 baht per kilogram, but the price of chicken has yet to increase," Governor Maitri said.

Pork vendor Choompol Sae-Ng blamed the 300-baht minimum daily wage set by the government as the reason for the price of raw meat

"A lot of people are complaining about the price of food going up, and saying that they have to buy it even if the prices go up. But it is because of the 300-baht minimum wage set by the government. The cost of production has increased,

and so have the prices," he said.

Mr Choompol warned that further price rises may be on their way, and that vendors will be forced to pass on to consumers any markups made by produce suppliers.

"We are keeping an eye on the prices. If pig farms raise their prices, then we will have to raise ours, too," he said.

RELIEF AHEAD

While many consumers' pocket books, if not food pantries, will take a major blow during the festivities, there is some relief on the way.

The DIT-Phuket Office announced that the Phuket City District (Amphoe Muang) will be holding its annual 'cheap goods' fair from February 28 to March 3.

Dubbed by the government the "Blue Flag Fair", this once-a-year, district-level flea market will be held this year in the area of Sripuwanat Park in Wichit, located opposite of the Laem Chan health clinic in Wichit sub-district of Phuket Town.

Popular among low-to-medium income households, as well as food vendors the island over, the fair will host a select number of vendors selling food, clothes and other consumer goods at below-marketvalue prices.

DIT-Phuket chief Supacha Bunthalit told the Gazette that this year's fair will feature a total of 34 tents with 70 booths in total.

"The vendors will be selling all kinds of living essentials, including eggs, chicken, vegetables, coffee, rice, fruit and many others.

"The goods aren't necessarily subsidized by the government, but the vendors who register with us all agree to reduce their prices by 10 to 20% from the central price [reccomendations], "she explained.

Ms Supacha noted that this year's fair is slightly smaller than last year's, which was held in July and attracted about 80 vendors.

"Our [Blue Flag Fair] budget allocation this year was reduced

by about 20 to 30%. We used to get 100,000 baht per fair, per district. Now we only get 70,000 to 80,000 baht to sponsor each fair. I'm not sure the reason why the budget was cut, as Phuket is still one of the most expensive provinces to live in..."

Chief Supacha noted that the Blue Flag Fair for Kathu district was held last month, while the respective fair for Thalang district is scheduled to be held in April.

"People looking to reduce the high cost-of-living burden should not miss out. Also, we are still accepting vendor registrations from anybody who is willing to sell daily essential goods for 10 to 20% lower than the central price... Approved vendors can reserve a booth free of charge for the entirety of the three day event." - Phuket Gazette

Phuket absorbs langsat surplus

THE island's supply of langsat (Lansium domesticum) has increased by 10 tonnes over the past few weeks due to a lateseason harvest surplus in and near Thailand's Deep South.

Since mid-January, several agriculture groups from Yala, Songkhla and Phatthalung have travelled to Phuket to sell the fruit wholesale, with the Phuket Office of Commercial Affairs (POCA) serving as their central distribution point.

POCA Director Prakong Rukwong told the *Gazette* that his office had permitted the merchants to temporarily set up shop on its yard – just across the street from the Seng Ho book store in Phuket Town - as part of a collaboration with the respective Commercial Affairs offices in the three provinces.

"Due to the surplus, markets throughout the South have become flooded with langsat. Some agricultural groups have asked for our help

to distribute the fruit in Phuket," Director Prakong explained.

Mr Prakong said that Phuket was considered an ideal place for two main reasons: the province's relatively higher spending power, and the fact that langsat is not grown in Phuket.

He added that the POCA would only be allowing the distributors to use its yard on a temporary basis, and that their stay wouldn't extend beyond the end of February.

"Another reason why we're supporting them [groups from Yala, Songkhla and Phatthalung is



because they've had trouble distributing... Merchants are increasingly hesitant to travel to the South due to the unrest down there."

Mr Prakong revealed that most of the current langsat batch came from fruit sorting centers in Yala's Ban Nung Sata and Songkhla's Saba Yoi districts.

He pointed out that langsat from Yala are particularly popular throughout the country, and call for a higher price in the market.

Altogether, he estimated that the surplus being distributed in Phuket is about 10 tonnes.

Speaking to the Gazette at the POCA, a merchant from Yala who called himself "Ying Ming", said that he had travelled to Phuket earlier this week with a group of six.

"Our daily expenses, including food and lodging, are about 1,000 baht per day," he said.

The langsat bunches are divided into three grades - A, B and C with prices ranging from 30 to 60 baht per kilogram, depending on the grade and amount.

Asked about the market response in Phuket, he said that langsat are particularly popular among Thai, Chinese and Korean buyers.

'Westerners don't seem to have the same preference for langsat, but perhaps they're not as familiar with it."

Known in Thai as "long gong", langsat is often confused with another similar fruit, longan (Dimocarpus longan), which is called "lum yai" in Thai.

Not in front of the children

Thailand-focused study finds that doing 'home work' isn't necesarilly a healthy choice

WHILE working from home might seem like a practical option for workers in Thailand wanting to cut commutes and spend more time on their personal lives, the reality is somewhat different.

According to a survey conducted by Regus, the world's largest provider of flexible workplaces, six in ten respondents who work from home in Thailand revealed that they're regularly put off by their kids or family demanding attention.

And that's not the only thing getting in the way: bad posture as a result of working at makeshift home offices - affecting a fifth of workers – could lead to serious health problems later on. Poor internet connections, no access to office equipment and even having to deal with pets are also said to be disrupting homeworkers' productivity levels.

These are some of the key findings of a global survey by Regus, which was based on interviews with more than 24,000 business-people from over 90 countries.

clearly affect your concentration and productivity," says Filippo Sarti, Regus Asia CEO. "Employees are naturally keen to benefit from flexible working practices, so they can avoid lengthy commutes, and work the hours that suit them in order to improve their work-life balance.

"But these findings suggest that a professional environment close to home is preferable to actual home-working, so as to avoid strain on families, to project a professional image, and to improve overall productivity."

The survey found that the three biggest issues for home-workers in Thailand are: children or family demanding attention (62%); difficulties accessing office equipment (48%) and not having access to sensitive company documents (45%).

There are also important health related issues; 19% of respondents complain of bad posture at home due to their unsuitable home office arrangements - good posture is critical to ensuring that

> Altogether, there was a total of 15 different issues identified as obstacles to productively working from home.

> Sarti continues: "Working from home is becoming increasingly popular but as more people experience it, many are also discovering the downsides. Personal life needs to adapt to the professional activities that are taking place and that's not always easy.

> "In addition to our survey findings, there are reports of home-workers feeling lonely, alienated and cut off from colleagues. It seems that office 'face-time' also plays an important role in helping workers secure promotions, with employees that work from home being overlooked even in firms that actively encourage staff to work from home at least occasionally.

"But more worrying still is the fact that one in five of our respondents complain that their posture is affected by improvised own office arrangements in the home. Bad posture can result in serious health problems such as repetitive strain injury

operators are hopeful that more tourists will go on vacation and room occupancy will expand impressively this year.

The Thai Hotel Association (THA) President Surapong Techaruvichit said last week that, in 2012, the country's tourism industry appeared promising, with more than 22 million foreign tourist arrivals recorded, which equates

THE Kingdom's hotel business to a 15% year-on-year increase.

Mr Surapong stated that last year there were two countries with traveler numbers exceeding two million - China and Malaysia. At the same time, there were four countries with more than a million holidaymakers in Thailand last year, including Japan, Russia, India and South Korea.

In terms of spending, the THA President said that Chinese trav-

elers were the biggest spenders, spending an estimated 104.5 billion baht. They were followed by Russian and Austrian holidaymakers, who spent 82.4 and 62.7bn baht, respectively.

All in, it is estimated that the Thai tourism industry earned over 960bn baht from overseas holidaymakers last year.

Based on the impressive records in 2012, Mr Surapong is hopeful

that the hotel occupancy in 2013 Also, see related story, 'Hotel boom' will further expand by at least 5% more than in 2012, when the occupancy rate stood at 64.9%.

Meanwhile, Vice President of Thai Airways International Chalongchai Hiranyalekha predicts that around 67 million travelers will arrive or depart from Suvarnabhumi and Don Mueang airports this year.

Japanese tourism reps ask for tsunami recovery advice

TOURISM officials from the Japanese prefecture of Fukuoka were recently in Phuket to consult with provincial officials and local business leaders about posttsunami tourism revival strategies

Presiding over the meeting was huket Vice Governor Sommai Prijasilpa, who gave reception to Mr Toshio Yoshimura – Chairman of the Federation of Fukuoka Prefecture Assembly members of Japan-Thailand Friendship – and an accompanying party.

Mr Toshio's party were particularly interested in approaches to managing the affected destination's negative image and handling other rumors and media that contribute to that image following a disaster like the tsunami that affected Phuket at the end of 2004.

Also attending the meeting were Chanchai Doungjit, the director of

the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) Phuket office; Somboon Jirayut, consultant to the Phuket Tourist Association (PTA), Sarayuth Mallam, PTA vice president and Panomphon Thammchatniyom, president of the Professional Tourist Guide

Chanchai said that the TAT office in Fukuoka had asked to collaborate with the TAT Phuket office to hold the meeting with officials from Fukuoka, who visited Thailand from January 21-26 under the "Japan-Thailand Friendship Visiting Thailand" program.

He explained that the Japanese officials were seeking ways to enhance and improve their tourism revival campaign following the tsunami and nuclear disasters that affected the prefecture in 2011.

He added that the meeting also served to tighten relations between Phuket and Fukuoka.

Chanchai claimed that more than 10,000 Japanese tourists visit Phuket annually, and that direct flights between Phuket and Fukuoka were a possibility in the - Phuket Gazette future.

Beat inflation with a low-risk return

ONE fund that I have recently been putting into portfolios is the Freehold Income Trust (FIT), which invests in

ground rents. Ground rents are a relic of feudal Britain, which can now be bought and sold like any other asset.

They are extremely safe income-yielding alternative investments, since the holder of ground rent could theoretically repossess a property worth much more than the ground rent itself, if the payments were not made.

Ground rents are such a safe haven because generally they are extremely over-collateralized. For example, a flat worth 200,000 Pound Sterling may be required to pay a ground rent of 100 Pound Sterling per year. Obviously they are not going to risk losing their flat by not paying such a trivial amount.

The bulk of the ground rents held in the fund have periodic inflation-based uplifts in yield, which protect this fund from the interest rate risk that most fixed income type of investments are vulnerable to in today's low rate environment. Many fixed interest investments, especially bond funds, stand to lose a lot of principal when interests eventually do rise. Thus, I am always looking for alternatives and this fund does a very good job of balancing risks.

It isn't the type of fund which is going to excite you as it only returns about 6% with yields as low as they are now,

but there are many reasons why this should be included in a portfolio.

The first is that it can provide a steady return

and has very low volatility. A second reason is that it provides diversification into another asset class, which is not correlated to other traditional asset classes such as stocks and bonds. There can also be capital gains on the ground rents themselves, although typically not large, and

of course there could theoretically be a loss as well, however unlikely.

The FIT fund has been running for 19 years and has a very consistent track record, delivering positive inflation beating returns every year.

It was originally started by the bank Close Brothers and was recently sold off. It is now run by Alpha Real Capital.

I was originally hesitant to recommend ground rent funds because I couldn't quite get my head around their valuation formulas, and thought there might be some risks I wasn't seeing. One of the major risks I do see with a fund such as this: if investors were to make a run (withdraw their money simultaneously), the secondary market for ground rents might not be liquid enough to meet the stated liquidity terms of the fund.

The fund is available for very low minimum investment levels and is available on the platforms of most offshore providers. I believe for as little as one thousand Pounds Sterling, through an offshore



bond, or five thousand Pound Sterling as a direct investment, you can gain exposure to this very safe alternative asset class. If you are looking for a safe income stream that is better than what the banks are paying in interest, this fund may just be able to help you out a bit. Travel summit votes on key issues

THE nation's pre-eminent gathering of tourism and travel industry experts has concluded that while Thailand looks headed for its best year for tourist numbers and revenues ever, action to legalise gaming, improve infrastructure and attract 'quality' travellers was urgently needed ahead of moves to introduce the ASEAN Economic Community (AEC).

More than 350 tourism industry movers and shakers attended the Thailand Tourism Forum at the InterContinental Bangkok recently, voting on key issues facing the industry and setting alarm bells ringing about Thailand's long-term competitiveness in the region.

Bill Barnett, co-organizer of the forum and Managing Director of C9 Hotelworks, said that over 60 per cent of respondents at the event who participated in the Thailand Tourism Index survey believed legal casinos would be an important factor in Thailand remaining competitive with other economic and tourist powers in the region.

"Thailand tourism needs to study very carefully the issue of gaming and other demand generators to attain sustained volume growth," he said. "There is a very real risk of us slipping behind places like Singapore and Macau in terms of visibility, branding and revenues. Thailand is also facing a glut of hotel rooms, so we need big draw cards like casinos as key drivers of demand."

More than 80 per cent of those voting agreed that Thailand was now staring down the barrel of an oversupply of rooms and that urgent action was required.

Keynote speakers and notables at the forum included Dillip Rajakarier (Minor

Hotel Group), Chanin Donavanik (Dusit Hotels and Resorts), Peter Henley (Onyx Hospitality and Hotels), Robert Hecker (Horwath HTL), Paul Logan (InterContinental Hotels Group), Jonas Ogren (STR Global), David Keen (Quo Global) and John Koldowski (PATA).

Mr Barnett said: "Thailand Tourism Forum – 2013 (TTF) is the country's first report card on the state of the industry and an opportunity to look beyond the numbers at how tourism performance can affect a country's entire economy."

The Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) has announced aims to achieve 24.5 million international visitors in 2013, following a 15 per cent increase from 2011 to 2012, which earned the country over 965 billion baht.

Among the top-10 source countries for international visitors, China stays at the top, followed by Malaysia, Japan, Russia, South

Korea, India, Laos, Australia, the United Kingdom and Singapore.

Mr Barnett said mass tourism was the 'elephant in the room': "As Wall Street learned, nothing grows forever. Thailand needs to learn the lessons of a volatile trading environment and focus on developing stronger infrastructure and perhaps temper growth targets and create more healthy segmentation than simply more, more, more."

Mr Barnett said the Asean Economic Community (AEC) was undoubtedly a 'game-changer', and would accelerate the impetus that had been building for a less divided Asean ever since the global financial crisis thrust Thailand and the region onto the world stage in 1997.

"Regional travel has been a key tourism storyline over the past four years with sustained growth," he said.

"The AEC will only create a stronger fundamental for this going forward. Boosted

by rising low-cost airline carriers and a growing middle class, we expect this trend to dominate the market during this decade."

The AEC comprises the economic integration of all 10 ASEAN member states by 2015, with the goals of creating a single market and production base.

Calls for legal casinos began in earnest last year, when CP Group boss and multibillionaire Dhanin Chearavanont called for casino licences to be issued for Chiang Mai, Phuket and Pattaya and warned that Thailand was slipping behind regional rivals and allowing 'underground businesses and dark powers' to flourish by not taking control of the lucrative gaming sector.

Mr Barnett said more freedom of travel and likely single-issue visas for the entire AEC region also raised security issues for travellers and nations but was not reason to be too pessimistic.

"The Euro-zone has effectively handled this for an extended time and I believe with appropriate technology and increased cooperation between intelligence services and police in ASEAN that risk can be mitigated. Ultimately, the benefits far outweigh the downside."

Mike Batchelor, managing director, Investment Sales, Jones Lang LaSalle Hotels & Hospitality Group and a keynote speaker at the conference, said Bangkok was expected to replace Phuket as Thailand's hospitality investment hot spot, with the new Real Estate Investment Trust (REIT) law likely to lead to an increase in property transactions, bolstered by increasing levels of international investment as global economies recover.

PACC it all in Phuket

THIS week's exclusive lead story about the decision by the Public-sector Anti Corruption Commission (PACC) to shelve its investigation into encroachment cases here in Phuket comes as a disappointment – but not much of a surprise.

Phuket has a long history of land probes, all of which are motivated by political forces. In the 1990s, wealthy Phuket families were found to have been issued land title deeds on plots designated under the Ministry of Agriculture's *SorPorKor* program, intended to make degraded state land available for use by landless farmers. The political scandal led to the collapse of the coalition government led by then-Democrat party leader Chuan Leekpai.

Fast forward a decade to 2003, when then-Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra was at the zenith of his power. This was the same period in which his Thai Rak Thai party launched another onslaught of probes related to the *SorPorKor* project in Phuket, one of the power bases of the rival Democrats.

With Thaksin effectively having regained power in 2011, did it really come as any surprise that Phuket would once again become the focus of a land probe? The real mystery is why the PACC's "Special Operations Unit" – its "fangs" – were quietly removed last October. Perhaps former PACC head Col Dussadee Arayawuth simply did too good a job during his 43 days in office. In the end, exposing so many high-ranking civil servants for [alleged] corruption may have turned out to be less expedient than doing the same to political rivals.

The sad part is that few if any of these land "probes" are actually launched with the true intention of seeing stolen state land returned to its rightful owners. This, coupled with the fact that we live in a country where politics can turn upside down overnight with a coup, and court cases can take decades to resolve, is why they are so seldom successful.

Official corruption involving land has a long history here in Phuket. Some of the island's wealthiest people come from families whose ancestors were granted tin mining concessions. When the mining finished, they threw up coconut trees and claimed they were farming it, rather than returning it to the state, as required by law. None of this could have been accomplished without paying backhanders to the bureaucrats of the time.

The initial enthusiasm generated by the PACC probe makes even sadder the reality that there remains no effective barrier to encroachment leveraged by official corruption. It strikes us as ironic that encroaching on state land remains such a "rich man/poor man" game. That is to say, only the very rich and very poor seem able to get away with it. Those of us in the middle, who pay taxes and follow the law, can only sit by and watch as our hillsides are denuded and our mangrove forests destroyed.



Stop Russian to allegations

MOST of the problems we have to deal with are from Russian tourists, who come to Phuket because it is very cheap and they don't need a visa to come here.

Nearly 140,000 Russians visit our island every year. They only pay about 40,000 baht to a tour company in Russia who then takes care of almost everything for them: hotel, food and transportation. Because of this, their monetary injections into the local communities is limited. However, they are still spending some money when they are here.

The problems they cause are usually centered around road accidents and fights brought about through excessive drinking.

I accept that most Russians like to drink – in fact, they drink a lot. They probably forget that it's closer to 30 degrees Celsius in Thailand, not the below-freezing temperatures of Russia that they are used to drinking in.

The Russian investors who are putting money into Phuket are not a problem for the island; they seem to be causing very few issues. There is a substantial Russian community of about 5,000 expat residents on Phuket. There is a Russian community in Sai Yuan that doesn't cause anybody trouble. They get along very well with the locals in the area.

I fully support the government cracking down on anyone who is working illegally in Phuket. Tourists cannot work, and those doing so must be dealt with properly.

sian tour counters seems to be a little skewed, as these companies hire Thai staff and use raw materials from Thailand, so not all of the financial gains being made are going to Russians.

In reality, the tension between local taxi drivers and Russians in the Bang Tao area has been there for a long time, and has been brought up at Phuket consul meetings many times. Nonetheless, we've yet to find a permanent

Cultural differences may be responsible for some of the tensions between Thais and Russians. For Russians it might not be as easy to smile or be friendly as it is for Thais

In any case, the situation in Phuket is better than in Pattaya. We are free from Russian mafia here – they aren't collecting protection money here as they do over there.

Hard to swallow

NO ONE likes being ripped off. Phuket, like many popular tourist destinations, has its fair share of scams, so living here year-round can be frustrating unless you have mastered the language.

During my daily lunch break I often drive to a nearby shopping center to order a quick and filling meal at the food court there. I usually order the same thing; a *massaman* curry with vegetables and a fried egg on the side.

This costs between 60 to 65 baht, depending on who is serving. The fluctuating five baht makes little difference to me.

However, familiarity breeds contempt and on occasion I have seen the 65 turn to 75, but again shrugged it off, ate and left.

One of my colleagues, who is fluent in Thai, would never stand for this and has on many occasions questioned the bill, at this and at other establishments. While he was away recently I ordered the usual, then wandered over to the drinks counter to order something to wash down my delicious curry.

The lady announced I had only five baht of credit left on my card. I looked at the crumpled receipt in my other hand, and saw that I had been charged 95 baht.

Within a few weeks I found myself at the food court again and deliberately ordered my meal from another outlet. I walked past the conniving *massaman* vendors, but sat in full view of them.

It felt great. I was vindicated. The small amount of money involved was not important, but the moral victory was. I now eat regularly at their stall again, the food tastes great and it now only ever costs me 60 baht.

Choosing a passport for dual-citizen Thai children travelling

I am Australian. My girlfriend is Thai. Our son was born in Thailand. He is Thai and also has Australian citizenship. Our son has an Australian passport, but does not have a Thai passport. Can he travel and use his Australian passport to leave Thailand? Or does he need to have two passports to leave?

Also what parental consent does his mother need to give for him to travel? A handwritten letter of consent?

Siriporn Tantipanyathep, chief of the Phuket Passport office, replies:

On leaving Thailand, your child



Leave and enter on the same ID.

must present only one passport. It could be a Thai passport or an Australian passport, but it must be only one.

To avoid any confusion with Immigration officers when exiting the country, make sure you have a copy of the child's birth certificate on hand to present at Immigration. There is no need to present the child's ID card.

A person under 20 years old exiting Thailand alone must have written consent signed by both parents to leave the country.

Owning a car on a tourist visa

I am married to a Thai and we own our own house in Udon. As I work abroad, I have not applied for a residence permit, I just come home one month every three months. Can I buy a car in my name even though I am basically on a tourist visa?

GW in Asia

Titima Yukuntorn, chief of the Vehicle Registration Unit at the Phuket Provincial Transport Office, replies:

Yes, a foreigner can be the legally registered owner of a car in Thailand while staying in the country on a tourist visa.

To register a car in your name in Phuket, you need to bring to our office your passport and signed photocopies of the face Send us your queries and we'll ask the right people to respond to them.

You must also bring the original and a signed photocopy of an official letter from your local Immigration office confirming your registered address.

The rest of the documentation is the responsibility of the car company.

For more information, contact the Phuket Provincial Transport Office at 076-211019 or 076-214929 Monday to Friday, from 8:30am to 4:30pm.

An officer at the Phuket Immigration Office replies:

For a foreigner living in Phuket to be issued a letter confirming your registered address, you need to bring to our office your passport and two photos (1 inch).

The registered owner of your house, whether it be yourself or your wife – or both – must also come to our office and present formal identification (Thai ID card or passport) and the house registration document (tabien baan) for the house you live in.



THE most important festival in the Chinese calendar, Chinese New Year is celebrated on the 15th day of the first lunar month. The Chinese calendar is based on the movements of the moon, as opposed to the Gregorian calendar, which follows the cycle of the sun. This year, Chinese New Year falls on February 10, and marks the beginning of the year of the water snake.

Also known in China as the Spring Festival, this is also a time of renewal, when houses, including family altars, are cleansed or rearranged, distant relatives meet up for a festive meal and deceased ancestors are remembered by way of offering food, spirit and flowers.

The actual celebration varies from country to country but anything between three to eight days is the normal affair. The first three days are the most important. This is when families gather together, prepare delicious meals using the best ingredients they can afford. The feast is first offered to the ancestors and the spirit of the land. The family then enjoys a meal together. It is customary to wear new clothes – red being a lucky color - and to be on one's best behavior (which means no swearing). After

the feast, a profusion of firecrackers are lit to announce to the ancestors and deities that the mortals' duties have been done and that the gods must keep their side of the bargain and ensure that all are blessed with good luck and prosperity in the year to come.

Year of the Snake

The Chinese horoscope is divided into 12 cycles, represented by animals, which in turn symbolize different traits and characteristics. Following on from the Dragon sign in 2012, this is the year of the Water Snake. According to the Chinese people, snakes are associated with food and abundance, thus some astrologers have already predicted 2013 to be an excellent year for commerce and industry. This is, they say, when music and literature will experience a renaissance, and romance and courtship will be aplenty.

If you are born in the year of the Water Snake, you are intuitive, introspective and a refined individual. You are graceful and exciting but there's also a dark side to your character as you tend to give in to jealousy and vindictiveness when wronged.

Chinese New Year, Valentine's Day to inject B2bn into Phuket economy

MORE than 300,000 tourists are expected to visit Phuket this month for Valentine's Day and Chinese New Year, altogether providing a boost of more than 2 billion baht to the Phuket economy.

Chanchai Duangjit, director of the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) Phuket office, told the Phuket Gazette that tourists from China make up the majority of hotel bookings for the period.

"The bulk of the remaining bookings are by tourists from Russia and Australia, and European countries such as Germany, Sweden and England," Mr Chanchai explained.

Overall room bookings for February are currently at about 80 per cent capacity, continuing the high occupancy rates of December and January, Mr Chanchai said.

"Hotels in beach areas such as Cape Panwa, Kata, Karon, Patong, Surin and Kamala are 75% to 80% booked, and the occupancy rates in Phuket Town are reported at about 70% to 75%," he said.

Last year, Phuket TAT office Director Bangornrat Shinaprayoon estimated that Chinese New Year alone would generate 900 million baht for the local economy. - Phuket Gazette

Valentine's Day

St Valentine's Day is surrounded by legends through the ages. From fanciful myths to bizarre truths, the Gazette explores some of the origins of this red letter day.

ACCORDING to classics professor Noel Lenski of the University of Boulder Colorado, the lovers' holiday traces its roots to a raucous annual Roman festival where men stripped naked, used goat - or dog-skin whips, and spanked young maidens in the hopes of increasing their fertility.

The annual pagan celebration, called Lupercalia, was held every year on February 15 and remained wildly popular well into the fifth century AD - at least 150 years after emperor Constantine declared Christianity the official religion of the Roman Empire.

"It [was] clearly very popular, even in an environment where the [ancient] Christians were trying to close it down," Lenski said. "So there's reason to think that the Christians might instead have said, 'OK, we'll just call this a Christian festival'."The

St Valentine. Two men with the name became possible. Valentine – born generations apart – were executed around the date of February 14.

According to legend, around 197 AD, Roman Emperor Claudius II, seeking to bolster his army, forbade young men to marry. The first Valentine, it is said, despised the ban, performing marriages in secret. He was subsequently executed.

Three hundred years after the death of Jesus Christ, in the year AD 289, Roman emperors continued to demand that everyone believe in the old gods. Valentine, a Christian priest, had been thrown in prison for his teachings. On February 14, the second Valentine was beheaded, not only because he was a Christian, but also because he had allegedly performed a miracle. He is

said to have cured the jailer's daughter of blindness. The night before he was executed, he wrote the jailer's daughter a farewell letter, signing it "From Your Valentine".

While it's not known whether the legend is true, Lenski said, "It may be a convenient explanation for a Christian version of what happened at Lupercalia."In AD 496 Saint Pope Gelasius I declared February 14 "Valentine's Day" in honor of the Christian martyrs.

The passing of love-notes becomes popular around the 18th Century in England, a precursor to the St Valentine's Day card as

we know it today.

Early examples were made of lace and paper. In 1797, The Young Man's Valentine Writer published, suggesting appropriate rhymes and messages, and as postal services became much more affordable, the

church attributed the festival to the legend of anonymous St Valentine's Day card

By the early 19th Century, Valentine's Day cards had become so popular that factories started to produce them en masse. Following the English tradition, Esther Howland of Worcester, Massachusetts, starts producing cards – using the newly available and much cheaper paper lace – in the United States.

Whatever the odd mixture of origins, St Valentine's Day is now a day for sweethearts. It is a day when you show your loved one that you care. Send some candy or perhaps roses, the flower of love to your sweetheart. Most people send a card. According to The Telegraph, an estimated 1 billion St Valentine's Day cards will be sent worldwide this year, making it the second most card-heavy celebration after Christmas. - Phuket Gazette

Woody's laws for land lines



IN THE past four editions of *Live* Wire, I've been talking about the things you need to consider if you want to get a good internet connection in Phuket. Believe me, it ain't easy. I'm moving to Kathu shortly, and the kind of problems I'm having are no doubt indicative of the kind you'll have, the next time you need a new internet connection - or you get fed up with your current package.

Last week I talked about getting wireless "3G" service for my phones, tablets, and the like. I also talked about setting up most phones so they'll hook into the 3G network, then let computers connect to the internet over the phone, using a standard WiFi connection. The process is called "tethering" and it's very simple on my Galaxy Note II, and my wife's iPhone 4GS.

If your phone or tablet doesn't have a tethering capability (not all of them do), you can buy a MyFi box, to set up a WiFi hotspot

using a 3G account. Very powerful stuff - and decent (if not spectacular) speeds with all of the Phuket 3G carriers. The big downside? All of the 3G connections are capped - you can download 3 or 4 or 5 GB of data in a month (roughly 1 GB = 1 hour of highdefinition TV), after which your speed gets throttled back to the tortoise spectrum.

This week, I'm going to delve into getting a land line. And I'll start by letting you in on a handful of hard-andfast laws that apply to every land line here in Phuket.

Keep in mind that there are three good reasons for wanting a land line: they're usually (but not always) faster than 3G; they're usually (but not always) cheaper than 3G; and they don't have those data caps that plague 3G wireless internet access – not just in Thailand, mind you, but increasingly all over the world.

Which leads us to the first law of land lines: If you aren't going through very much data – you use email, go web surfing, run maybe a few YouTube videos every day, Skype in moderation - don't bother with a land line. They're more trouble than they're worth. Read last week's Live Wire, choose a 3G provider, and buy a dongle if you need one - the internet can plug right into your desktop or notebook or ultrabook computer, with a simple USB dongle. No wires required.

On the other hand, if your needs are too weighty for a 3G connection, it's time to start schlepping.

The second law of land lines is: Never get one. Get two. Internet lines in Phuket go down all the time. Even the most reli-

one line from their "modem" to your router, and all of your computers will work off that one link to the internet. When the second

internet service provider comes to install their line, tell them the same thing. They'll hook up one wire from their "modem" to your router. From that point on, when one of the lines goes down, reach around to your router, pull out the plug to the dead line's modem, and stick it in your spare modem.

That's called "hot swapping" - which sounds way cool, but it's really very simple.

The third law of land lines: You never really know. Just because the

guy down the street has a good (or bad) line, that doesn't mean you will too. There are just too many variables.

I keep a close watch on phuketinternetspeed.com to see how people are faring with downloads all over the island. But their experiences aren't necessarily predictive. The numbers on the site are good for broad, general analysis, I think. But they aren't definitive for any one location.

The fourth law of land lines: The price you pay may have no bearing whatsoever on the speed you see.

There are dozens of reasons why that's true, but the main one is that the internet service providers don't have a lot of control over some parts of service levels (hourly loading, for example), and the parts that they do have control over (additional overseas bandwidth, for one) are expensive to fix. Thus, you see weird situations like the TOT Fiber 2U service delivering roughly the same international speed as a lowly TOT ADSL line, at less than half the price.

The fifth law of land lines: The technician won't show up when you expect. That's true all over the world, I'm told, except for the Google Fiber techs in Kansas City, USA. Remember that the tech isn't supposed to install a line all the way to your computer. They're only responsible for getting the line to your property. While most techs will go the extra mile and get your hardware hooked up, it'd be nice if you gave them some extra folding money, a cup of ice water, a cookie, and a thank you.


The sixth law of land lines: *The* times they are a-changin'. "The first one now will later be last." Technology's changing quickly, and some internet service providers are keeping up, while others fall by the wayside.

If you aren't happy with the line you have now, get a different one. Chances are good you'll pay less than you paid a couple of years ago – and you might just get a faster line.

Next week, I'll step you through the process of elimination that I went through to get new land lines into my house.

able lines that I've had (and I've gone through dozens of them) just plain fail from time to time, and there's nothing you can do about it. Call the provider and you'll get all sorts of fanciful explanations as to why a line has gone down - but 99 times out of a hundred, the person talking to you on the phone doesn't have the slightest idea why it's down, and nobody tells him or her anything about anything.

Instead, get two different lines, from two different providers. Then set up your routers so it's easy to unplug one line and plug in the other. If you aren't sure how to do that, go to your favorite computer shop and ask to buy a plain, cheap router. Shouldn't cost more than 1,000 baht. Plug all of your computers into the router. Then when the technician comes to install your new internet line, tell him that you want to plug their "modem" into your router.



Life & style A communal recovery from the myths of DCS

Diving

RECOVERED from her diving accident, Nicole still combs through the details of the day, searching for the tiny factors that might have contributed to the serious case of neurological decompression sickness (DCS Type II) she faced a year and half ago after a 22-meter dive in the Similan National Park.

Unless it's a ruthless horror story about DCS, where a diver clearly did something wrong, many of us squirm when talking about getting "bent". Though few will admit it, judgment is passed on those who have suffered from DCS. There is a fundamental assumption that a diver "must have done something wrong to get bent" – but most haven't.

The rules we follow - not working out after diving, getting a full night's sleep and following conservative dive profiles – are all designed to minimize the risk of DCS so that we can enjoy the beautiful wonders below the water's surface. Nonetheless these risks can never be entirely eliminated.

Nicole, an experienced diver with over 200 logged dives since 1994, did not surpass her decompression limits, she did not ascend too quickly or skip her safety-stop - she made her third dive of the day on Barracuda Point well within the limits of what is reasonable.

"We went down to 22 meters and came slowly up to 10 meters, stayed between eight meters and 10 meters for a while, and then did the safety stop at five meters and came up to the surface. Our total dive time was 47 minutes," Nicole recalls.

Looking back at the day, Nicole

remembers the heat and a mild headache before splashing in, perhaps signs that she should have sat the dive out... but almost every diver is regularly willing to jump without feeling "100 per cent". A little hot from a wetsuit, a little nauseous from seasickness, the symptoms and justifications go on.

"I just had a mild headache, but it was a very hot day. So we stayed in the shade and drank a lot of water," Nicole explained.

"Some inexperienced divers told me that they were diving and had no problems, so I must have done something wrong. Experienced divers don't think that it was my fault - they know that sometimes 'it just happens' and that it can happen to anyone," Nicole said.

Groups have systematically ostracized those things and situations they don't understand, often fearfully casting them into the realm of myth – divers are no exception. However, as we continue to explore our world above and below the surface, our understanding of it grows and we are able to shed the baggage of myth and see the world for what it is. As happened to Nicole and countless others (there is no single organization that provides DCS statistics or data), DCS can take hold of a diver without a clear single factor to isolate and avoid.

Despite years of research, our understanding of the tiny microscopic bubbles that cause DCS still lives in the world of theory.

"The current thinking is that bubbles exist to some degree in the body after all dives. If the bubbles are few and small, they have no effect, but if they are plentiful, their volume can be large enough to cause decompression sickness," explains the PADI Encyclopedia of Recreational Diving.

Most scientists, though not all, are fairly sure that these tiny microscopic bubbles are created within our supersaturated tissues after a dive, through a process known as nucleation. What they are less confident about is what factors will increase the rate at which these bubbles are produced and what combination of factors will take an individual diver beyond the limit of safe diving.

Seven months later, after hours of being treated in a hyperbaric chamber in Phuket, Nicole stood on the dive platform of a boat in Egypt – cleared to dive.

"Standing on the boat platform my heart was beating like it was going to explode. I was asking myself, 'will something happen again when I go underwater?"" Nicole said."I wanted to dive, it was just three seconds away."

Nicole, after suffering from a severe case of neurological DCS, took the plunge, and again joined the ranks of recreational divers and explorers around the world.

Posing with starfish poses eco-problems

TOURISTS visiting marine parks or diving sites have been advised to stop picking up starfish to take photos and later sharing the shots online, a Bangkok seminar on wildlife conservation was told recently.

Prince of Songkla University lecturer on marine wildlife Sak-anant Plathong said this practice was usually encouraged by tour guides and rangers stationed at marine parks. He added that fish food was also openly sold at several marine parks, a practice that was either allegedly supported by park rangers or one which they turned a blind eye to. He warned that feeding certain types of fish would alter natural characteristics important for their survival, and would also affect the area's ecological balance.

"Posting pictures with starfish has now become a trend on social media, especially among Thais and Asian tourists," Sak-anant said.

"Westerners seem to have a better understanding about nature conservation and are more respectful to wildlife," he added.

Manophas Huamuangkaew, director-general of the Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation, confirmed that tour companies and tour guides would be asked to discourage tourists from picking up starfish and that the sale of fish food at national parks would also be discouraged.



Local bands: global battle



Get your act together and your band could be one of the lucky winners of this once in a lifetime competition coming to Phuket

THE Global Battle of the Bands (GBOB) – one of the world's largest independent music competitions – is coming to Phuket to give local bands the chance to perform original songs at the first regional final, which

Phuket Town, March 15.

Now in its 9^{th} year, with entries from over 30 countries, GBOB has come to the Kingdom for the very first time. Competition is open to all ages and across all musical styles:

the only requirements are that each band have at least one Thai national and perform original material - no cover songs allowed.

GBOB Thailand offers lucky musicians the opportunity of a lifetime – reaching a national audience, with concerts in Phuket, Pattaya, Bangkok and Chiang Mai. GBOB regional winners and runners-up will go on to the national grand final at Central World Bangkok.

Bangkok will host this year's world final in December where bands will compete for a first prize worth US\$100,000. The event was held in Australia last year and London in 2011, so it's truly an international event.

GBOB Thailand winners also win cash and prizes worth more than 250,000 baht.

Thailand's panel of judges includes Grammy-nominated

producer Chris Craker; musician, producer and vocal trainer Mam (Sao Sao Sao Band) and Phuket's-own homegrown hero 'Dome' Pakorn Lum – all of whom will pick Thailand's representative for the worldwide final.

"So far, fourteen bands have entered from Phuket, mostly of will be held at the H20 Pub in the metal genre and mostly

Mom Tri's Villa Royale is showcasing Mom Tri Devakul's new exhibition 'Beauty in Dissolution'. Here Mom Tri describes his Art in his own words:

OVER 40 years ago I had the pleasure of walking the nearly virgin beaches of Kata and Kata Noi.

On the beautiful white sand there was nothing but young hippies and objects washed up by the monsoon waves. Beach combing was my favorite pastime. Pieces of brightly colored wood fascinated me the most. Reds, blues, greens, yellows, oranges, even blacks and whites, bleached by the sun, washed by the sea, were scattered everywhere by the waves. Some were works of art in themselves. Others I gathered and turned into sculptural creations.

Only two months ago I found three large red/orange pieces that I have combined into a new creation for you to see.

Of course I realized years ago that these beautiful pieces of wood were the remains of former fishing boats that had gone through the process of ageing, which I like to refer to as 'dissolution'.

As I mentioned, on those virgin beaches were also hippies - young and beautiful people in their early twenties doing nothing but enjoying life. In most cases they wore practically nothing while swimming, sunning, dancing and so on. As an artist I enjoyed looking at them. I was inspired to create many sculptures celebrating their beauty and lifestyle. I also became acquainted with many. Many continued to come back to Phuket for years,

expanding and contracting even falling apart, just like the colorful pieces of fishing boats for which I combed the beaches.

With this revelation, I began to look at human bodies as being composed of hundreds of pieces of different shapes that had begun at conception and gradually come together in the early twenties as the bodies of my young hippies.

And just as those boats had gradually broken apart and washed up on the beach for me to collect, their body pieces also began to separate almost as soon as they came together. It began as a mere hint, but eventually, no matter how hard we try to prevent it, it becomes full dissolution.

These hanging sculptures were exhibited in my "Bodies on the Beach" show a year ago. Those tight bodies now return in various states of dissolution, from the first hint to the final stage.

I find beauty even in dissolution. - Mom Tri Devakul

Quality time with a Modern Family

AS OUR world gets smaller by the day, the definition of 'family' grows wider by the minute. Gone are the platonic families of old the Brady Bunch and the Cosbys – replaced by a gay couple, international adoption, divorce and recent immigrants – the *Modern Family*.

Modern Family is an American sitcom on ABC filmed in 'mockumentary' fashion (where characters frequently speak directly to the camera), which chronicles the evolving nature of family relationships and how we interact in today's day and age.

James Parker, writing in the Atlantic magazine says: "The American family... is after all, an acutely self-conscious and self-interrogating unit: How does one 'parent'? Who does what, which 'role'?

'Modern Family taps right into all this, the cameras that lurch through its three households produce the sensation of a wild and shaky experiment, recorded for purposes educational or scientific."

The show follows traditional, aging tough guy and patriarch Jay Pritchett and family, which includes his ridiculously hot Latina second wife, Gloria, and her son, his two children and their families.

Jay's daughter, Claire, and her husband Phil, have three children. Jay's son, Mitchell, who's gay, lives with his partner Cameron and their adopted Vietnamese baby,

Lily. The connections between this extended family are layered but on-screen chemistry makes the story easy to follow.

The show premiered on September 23, 2009 to 12.6 million viewers, and has since gone on to win several awards, including an Emmy for 'Outstanding Comedy Series' in each of the past three years and a Golden Globe Award for 'Best Television Series - Musical or Comedy'.

Created by writers Christopher Lloyd and Steve Levitan, who also worked on Yes Dear and Just Shoot *Me!*, the series is one of the most critically acclaimed and profitable on network television.

While the humor is silly at times, intricate character narratives and swift comedic timing move the plot along with Freudian ease. It's rare nowadays, that a series is both entertaining and appropriate for the whole family - young and old - but *Modern* Family makes it look effortless.

As with most family sitcoms, insightful observations are drawn in each episode and, over and over again, the show's writers will have you saying, "that's true". Here is a pearl of wisdom from Gloria, who struggles to overcome the stereotype of being labeled a trophy wife:

"Maybe we are the way we are because of the people we're with. Or maybe, we just pick the people we need. However it works, when

you find that someone, you should never let them go."

In addition to the heart-felt moments that recap each episode, insidiously hilarious moments of situational comedy abound. Take this excerpt from season 3, episode 18: Gay couple Cameron (in full clown costume) and Mitchell are discussing attending the funeral of 'Cam's' inspirational teacher at clown college, professor ringmaster Al Uzielli:

Cam: "For several years, I was one-half of the renowned clown duo Fizbo & Lewis. We were huge."

Mitchell: "At children's parties." Cam: "Anyway, I disbanded the group shortly after I met Mitchell. It's hard to have a relationship and a clown career. That's the reason there are so many single clowns."

Mitchell: "Just one of the reasons."

Cam: "Anyway, Lewis hasn't spoken to me since. He's still bitter, and I don't blame him. It's kind of like I broke up The Beatles."

Mitchell: "Of children's parties."

The show is suitable for all ages, but contains raunchy adult humor wrapped in metaphor and timing that children will gloss right over. Read what former male cheerleader and husband Phil Dunphy has to say about powerful women:

"I'll admit it. I'm turned on by powerful women. Michelle Obama, Oprah, Condolezza Rice, Serena Williams... wait a minute."

Do yourself a favor and the next

One more head for the chopping block

IN my last column, I reviewed Hilary Mantel's extraordinary novel Wolf Hall, winner of the 2009 Man Booker Prize, which chronicled the rise of Thomas Cromwell from a blacksmith's son to trusted advisor to King Henry VIII. Three years later, Mantel won a second Man Booker Prize for her sequel Bring Up the Bodies (Henry Holt and Company, New York 2012, 410pp).

The first novel ends with the beheading of the scholar Thomas More, former Lord Chancellor,

for the crime of staying loyal to the papacy after Henry VIII broke away from the Catholic Church to marry his second wife Anne Boleyn. The second novel ends with the beheading of Anne Boleyn. Cromwell played a central role in both these cases, despite his great friendship with Thomas More and at least grudging admiration for Anne Boleyn.

Cromwell is a fascinating character, rough, scholarly, humorous, pragmatic, cunning and, above all, loyal to his king. And why not?

"You cannot see Henry and

not be amazed," Mantel writes. "Each time you see him you are struck afresh by him, as if it were the first time: a massive man, bullnecked, his hair receding, face fleshing out; blue eyes, and a small mouth that is almost coy. His height is six feet three inches, and every inch bespeaks power. His carriage, his person, are magnificent; his rages are terrifying, his vows and curses, his molten tears."

The King can also be a companion, but later on in the novel, Cromwell reflects: "You can be merry with the King, you can share a joke with him. But as Thomas More used to say, it's like sporting with a tamed lion. You tousle its mane and pull its ears, but all the time you're thinking, those claws, those claws, those claws."

Equally forceful is Anne Boleyn, educated in the French court, charming, manipulative and resolute in her pursuit of the English crown. Henry is besotted with her but she resists all his overtures until she is assured of marriage. She

The breakthrough comes through the word of a youthful page who accuses four courtiers of adultery with the queen. These four had once taken part in a public burlesque depicting Cardinal Thomas Wolsey, Cromwell's first mentor, being dragged in his scarlet robes to hell. Resides celebrating the death of Cromwell's beloved father figure, the four had often mocked Cromwell for his lowly birth. He has no compunctions toward sending them to the gallows.

Yet he does have compunctions about his legal indictment of the queen. "He has seen beautiful indictments, not a word wasted. This was not one: the phrases jostled and frotted, nudged and spilled, ugly in content and ugly in form. The design against Anne is unhallowed in its gestation, untimely in its delivery, a mass of tissue born shapeless." Anne Boleyn is executed

in the spring of 1536, in the midst of turbulent times, of religious wars and unshackled thought, a time when kings still jousted with knights, heretics were burned at the stake and traitors were hung, drawn and quartered. A French swordsman separates Anne's head from her body and she approaches her death with exemplary grace and courage.

As the novel ends, Cromwell is raised to an earldom. He is immensely rich and most of the nobles of the land owe him money. His trusted protegees - son Gregory, adopted son Rafe Saddler, and nephew Richard Cromwell advance from one vastly profitable scheme to another.

Yet, in historical fact, Cromwell will be beheaded for treason, on flimsy charges, in only four more years. The will of a king is both fickle and all-powerful. This notion would not be challenged for another century until the advent of Richard Cromwell's greatgrandson Oliver. Then it would be royal heads that rolled.

But for Thomas Cromwell's last years we must await the third novel of Hilary Mantel's trilogy in the sort of glorious prose that only she can muster.

Mixing and matching container plants

EVERY so often, readers pose questions which prompt other reflections, and ultimately require a fuller response than a

mere email allows. Here is a recent, partly paraphrased example:

A Kata apartment dweller has a sunny communal balcony, at present adorned with boxes of bougainvilleas. She says that some people would like to exchange these for purple flowers instead. The attached pictures reveal boxes of what look like coleus plants. The reader adds that while she prefers the bougainvilleas, it might be possible to have "these purple flowers, if not too much care is needed to keep them looking nice".

Well, variety is the spice of life, as they say. But personally, I would at least retain the bougainvilleas, if only because they are hardy, flower for much of the year, especially if given fertilizer, and love a sunny aspect. Some of the newer cultivars are spectacularly colorful.

Coleus, now usually referred to as part

of the solenostemon genus, is a completely different kettle of fish, a foliage plant first and foremost, and originally

grown mainly as a house plant in temperate regions. An unusual plant with sharply contrasting leaf colors, they range from almost black, through purple and deep red to green and yellow.

The leaves are toothed and surprisingly thin – very like a nettle in shape and texture. Effective when mixed together in a pot (or box) to enhance their pronounced color variations, they are soft-stemmed perennials, a characteristic which means they wilt easily when deprived of water, and will probably need to be replaced after three years or so.

The solenostemon will, moreover, need daily watering in hot weather; indeed a position in full sun may produce leaf scorch. Protection afforded by taller shrubs such as bougainvilleas may be one solution in an exposed tropical environment such as a sun-drenched balcony.

Solenostemons are somewhat disease prone, especially to mealy bugs and downy mildew. And remember to pinch out growing tips if you want to encourage a bushier plant.

Personally, I would be inclined to mix up your existing container plants, perhaps with crotons (codiaeum) with their spectacular deeply veined leaves, usually yellow and bright green, but often suffused with orange and red. These are hardier than solenostemons, will grow much taller, and have large, shiny, leathery leaves.

Or maybe cordylines, which are now available in rich shades of magenta as well as green and crimson. Both of these species are erect, single stemmed plants, will tolerate full sun and require relatively little maintenance.

Dracaenas, with elegant, curved, sword-shaped leaves are very easy to grow in containers.

Of course, you could go for flowering plants that adapt to life in constricted spaces say pink or red adeniums, which as

desert plants need hardly any moisture, dwarf tabernaemontana, which are evergreen, bushy, and have masses of scented white flowers, or even the highly fashionable but water-loving ruellia. Known as the three o'clock plant, it loses its delicate, violet flowers by mid afternoon, but it is very eye-catching.

One caveat occurs to me. If you have extended boxes as opposed to separate ceramic pots, you are going to need soil conditions suitable for all their occupants. In other words, you cannot put, say, a moisture loving ruellia next to an adenium, since the fleshy stems of the desert rose will rot if watered more than once a week.

On the other hand, too little moisture and the *ruellia* will wilt.

So mix and match by all means, but remember that some arranged plant marriages will not enjoy the experience. What's new...

Tip of the Week

Garden pests: mosquitoes

AS we all know to our cost, mosquitoes are person pests, not plant predators. There is, however, a connection with gardens, since the males feed solely on pollen and nectar. The female anopheles is the villainess of the piece, sucking blood in order to nourish her eggs, which she will then deposit in stagnant water. If you have pot plants immersed in water or boast a lily pond, make sure you have a few small fish, such as guppies, to eat the writhing larvae. Mosquitoes are most active in the early morning and late afternoon, just the time when

it is cool enough to work in the garden. Murphy's Law. Fortunately malaria is almost unknown here, but another variety of mosquito, aedes Egyptiae can transmit dengue fever. Some plants are believed to deter the insect -African marigold, garlic, jasmine, lavender – but the evidence is largely anecdotal.

International Sport Ravens overpower 49ers

THE Baltimore Ravens survived a furious second-half rally by San Francisco and a momentum-sapping power outage at the Superdome to defeat the gritty 49ers 34-31 in the Super Bowl XLVII on February 3.

A Super Bowl-record 108-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by Jacoby Jones to open the second half gave the Ravens a 28-6 lead but the 49ers quickly scored 17 straight points after a 35-minute power outage and nearly pulled off a stunning comeback.

"Both teams had to deal with it," Ravens coach John Harbaugh said of the power outage. "They dealt with it better, obviously. They were able to turn the momentum of the game."

Trailing 34-29, the 49ers marched down to the Ravens' seven-yard line but failed to score on four tries, surrendering the ball on downs at the five-yard line with 1:42 remaining.

Baltimore used up the clock and on the fourth down, punter Sam Koch ran out of the end zone for a safety with four seconds left.

Joe Flacco, the game's Most Valuable Player, completed 22 of 33 passes for 287 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions to lead the Ravens to their first title since the 2000 season.

"We don't make anything easy," said Flacco, who has guided the Ravens to the playoffs in each of his five NFL seasons. "It was a hard-fought game on both sides.

We gave the country a pretty good game to watch. Not to our liking necessarily but that's the way it goes sometimes and that's the way we do things."

Baltimore's lead evaporated because the

Colin Kaepernick, suddenly found the form that made him one of the league's most dangerous big-play threats.

Despite a shaky first half, Kaepernick completed 16 of 28 passes for 302 yards and a touchdown. He also ran for 62 yards and a 15-yard touchdown on seven carries to finish behind Frank Gore (110 yards) as the 49ers' second-leading ground gainer.

Kaepernick's rushing score with 2:57 left cut the Baltimore lead to 31-29 but his pass on the two-point conversion attempt was incomplete.

A 38-yard field goal by Justin Tucker with 4:19 left in the game hiked the Ravens' lead to 34-29, setting the stage for what could have been a Super Bowl-record comeback by the 49ers.

But the Ravens' defense, anchored by retiring future Hall of Fame linebacker Ray Lewis, came up big when it had to, with a goal-line stand that handed the 49ers' franchise its first Super Bowl loss after five victories.

"I made too many mistakes for us to win," Kaepernick said softly.


"Our guys battled, they competed," said 49ers coach Jim Harbaugh, who also lost the Super Bowl of sibling rivalry because his brother John coaches the Ravens.

"We got a spark and we weren't going to look back after that. We battled right to the brink of winning."

Baltimore linebacker Terrell Suggs said it was the "ultimate cake" to allow Lewis, a 13-time Pro Bowler and the team's inspirational leader, to go out a winner.

"There will never be another leader like him and we sent him out like his brothers,' he said. "His legacy will go untainted."

Ravens tight end Dennis Pitta, who 49ers' talented second-year quarterback, caught four passes for 26 yards and a

touchdown, said the power outage, which left half of the overheard lights in the Superdome out, "felt like an hour."

'We lost a lot of momentum and, credit to them, they came storming back and played tremendous. But this team continued to fight and never quit... Didn't make it easy, but it was fun."

Baltimore was outscored 25-6 after the lights went out and the raucous pro-Ravens crowd, which had brought a Mardi Grasstyle celebration from nearby Bourbon Street into the Superdome, got eerily quiet.

Ravens wide receiver Torrey Smith blamed Beyonce's rockin' halftime show for his team's meltdown.

"Beyonce must have been good – she took all of the power with her when she

left the stage," he joked. "It was tough. But we had to deal with the same thing that San Francisco had to. And they responded well."

Lewis said his children will be his top priority in retirement.

"Daddy gets to come home now," he said. "I get to chase them. They aren't going to like me being home all the time. This is the most ultimate feeling ever.

"This is the way you do it. No other way to go out and end a career."

The Ravens' John Harbaugh said it was troubling to shake hands with his brother on the field after the game.

"The meeting with Jim in the middle was probably the most difficult thing I have ever been associated with in my life," he said. "I am proud of him." - Reuters

Global football scam exposed

HUNDREDS of soccer matches have been fixed in a global betting scam run from Singapore, police said on February 4, in a blow to the image of the world's most popular sport and a multibillion dollar industry.

About 680 suspicious matches, including qualifying games for the World Cup and European Championships, and the Champions League for top European club sides, have been identified in an inquiry by European police forces, the European anti-crime agency Europol, and national prosecutors.

"This is a sad day for European football," said Rob Wainwright, director of Europol. "This is now an integrity issue for football. Those responsible for running the games should hear the warnings."

The matches in question were played between 2008 and 2011, the investigators said. About 380 of the suspicious matches were played in Europe, and a further 300 were identified in Africa, Asia and Latin America.

Last year the head of an anticorruption watchdog estimated that US\$1 trillion was gambled on sport each year - or US\$3 billion a day with most coming from Asia and wagered on soccer matches.

A German investigator described a network involving couriers ferrying bribes around the world, paying off players and referees in the fixing, which involved about 425 corrupt officials, players and serious criminals in 15 countries.

"We have evidence for 150 of these cases, and the operations were run out of Singapore with bribes of up to 100,000 Euros paid per match," said Friedhelm Althans, chief Rob Wainwright, director of Europol. investigator

for police in the German city of

German investigators said international matches were implicated as were games in Turkey, Germany, Switzerland, Belgium, Croatia, Austria, Hungary, Bosnia, Slovenia and Canada. Suspicious games had also been identified in Africa, Asia and Latin America.

Fourteen people have already been convicted in Germany in connection with the investigation.

Investigators said no names of players or clubs would be released while the investigation proceeded. However, the fixing also included top flight national league matches in several European countries, as well as two Champions League

matches, including one played Britain.

England's Football Association said it was not aware of any "credible reports into suspicious Champions League

fixtures in England."

Investigators described how gang members immediately subordinate to the Singapore-based leader of a worldwide network were each tasked with maintaining contacts with corrupt players and officials in their parts of the world.

Laszlo Angeli, a Hungarian prosecutor, gave an example of how the scam worked. "The Hungarian member, who was immediately

below the Singapore head, was in touch with Hungarian referees who could then attempt to swing matches at which they officiated around the world," he said.

Accomplices would then place bets on the internet or by phone with bookmakers in Asia, where bets that would be illegal in Europe were accepted. "One fixed match might involve up to 50 suspects in 10 countries on separate continents," said Althans.





International Sport Italy upset France in Six Nations

ITALY produced a stunning allround performance to shock France 23-18 at the Stadio Olimpico on February 3 and blast the Six Nations wide open.

More usually contenders for the competition's wooden spoon, Italy proved their victory over the French two seasons ago was no fluke as they defended well and took their chances against the 2011 World Cup runners-up.

Tries from captain Sergio Parisse and Martin Castrogiovanni, plus 10 points from man-of-thematch Luciano Orquera and three from substitute Kris Burton led them to victory, just their third ever over the French.

France were far from their best and despite tries from Louis Picamoles and Benjamin Fall and eight points from a rejuvenated Frederick Michalak, they were deservedly beaten by Jacques Brunel's effervescent side.

England produced a four-try performance full of energy, aggression and ambition to get their Six Nations campaign underway with an impressive and highly entertaining 38-18 win over Scotland at Twickenham on February 2.

Tries for Chris Ashton, debutant center Billy Twelvetrees, Geoff Parling, Danny Care and another superb all-round performance by flyhalf Owen Farrell, helped contribute to England's supremacy against a Scotland side who battled well.

The visitors had their bright moments but never looked likely to end their 30-year winless streak in the stadium.


None of the England squad were born the last time Scotland won at Twickenham and the 1983 victory was only their second in the last 75 years in west London.

Scotland had won only two of their last 15 Six Nations games and their last outing was a home defeat by Tonga that led to the resignation of coach Andy Robinson.

England, by contrast, were coming off a remarkable 38-21 victory over New Zealand two months ago and brimming with confidence.

Brian O'Driscoll's return inspired Ireland to a Six Nations victory over holders Wales on Saturday.

The Irish hung on to win 30-22 after a second-half onslaught

from last season's grand slam winners came up short.

The former captain, who missed the November internationals and has hardly played since the 2011 World Cup because of injury, created one try and scored another as the Irish threatened to run riot when they took a 30-3 lead to howls of derision at the Millennium Stadium.

Wales, who since winning a third grand slam in eight tournaments last March have lost eight matches in a row, came to life in the second half.

Ireland buckled, their penalty count grew, and referee Romain Poite's patience wore thin as he brandished two yellow cards at the men in green.

An energized Wales pierced hole after hole, ran in three tries of their own, and only valiant defence and spurned chances prevented a complete collapse.

It was a relieved Ireland who greeted the final whistle, with

captain Jamie Heaslip, who has taken the armband from O'Driscoll, admitting: "there was nothing left in the tank".

RAFAEL Nadal made a successful comeback after a seven-month injury absence with victory in the first round of the Chilean Open doubles on February 5.

The former world number one and Argentine partner Juan Monaco overpowered secondseeded Czechs Frantisek Cermak and Lukas Dlouhy 6-3 6-2 in 65 minutes at the Pacific coastal city of Vina del March.

Spanish left-hander Nadal had been out with a knee problem since losing to Czech Lukas Rosol in the second round at Wimbledon in June.

"It's a good feeling to be back. We'll see how the knee reacts," Nadal told a news conference. "The moment and the surfaces were the right ones and playing for the first time in this country was a great opportunity.

"Playing doubles is less aggressive, so we'll see how things go tomorrow in singles," he added after he and Monaco had taken advantage of four of their seven chances to break the Czechs' service.

The 26-year-old's planned return at the end of last year was delayed due to illness but he will compete on his favorite clay surface at three Latin American events this month.

On February 6, Nadal played a second-round singles match against Argentine qualifier Federico Delbonis.

After the Chile tournament he will compete at the Brazil Open in Sao Paulo next week and the Mexico Open in Acapulco from February 25. - Reuters

Mercedes Formula one testing goes up in flames

MERCEDES called a halt to their ning Brawn GP team in 2009. first day of 2013 Formula One testing on Tuesday after Nico Rosberg stopped on track with an electrical problem and flames flaring briefly around the back of his car.

The team said the gremlins would be fixed before Lewis Hamilton, the 2008 world champion, made his test debut with them on February 6.

"After identifying the cause of the problem, we will not be running again today while parts are modified ready for tomorrow," Mercedes said on their Twitter feed.

"The part which requires modification is the wiring loom where the electrical fault originated this morning."

Mercedes were fifth overall last season and have struggled to impose themselves since taking over the world championship-win-

Rosberg completed 14 laps at the Jerez circuit in the F1 W04 car that he and Briton Hamilton, who has moved from McLaren, unveiled to the world at the Spanish circuit on Monday.

Despite the lack of running, the German said his first impressions were "very good, very positive".

"I can guarantee it will be a big step forward, but of course everybody else is also moving forward and we're hoping that we've closed the gap," he told reporters outside the Mercedes hospitality area.

"Last year it was nearly more than a second...and we have to get closer for sure and we will, we will get closer," added the son of 1982 champion Keke.

"I think they've given us a

good base now and it's up to us make the most of it here, find all the problems as we've done today and also improve it and feed back to the factory what are the main things that are still holding us back, what are the main things they need to keep working on."

Rosberg, starting his fourth season with the British-based team, said it was too early to say whether the car was quick enough but it was enjoyable to drive and the balance was good.

Rosberg, who won in China last year, said he was sure the team could be competitive and dismissed a suggestion that the focus might quickly turn to 2014, when the regulations undergo a major change.

being more consistent through the year. Not like last year where we started OK and then completely

"Improvement would also be a very OK car through the whole season with a win or two maybe. What we need is progress, we need to move forward and go through the season thinking now we are on the right track to become the best."

The 2013 season starts with the Australia Grand Prix on March 17.

TNT played Laguna Cricket Club for 35) the major contributors. TNT's batting innings came to close in the 35th over with the score on 166.




