

Sea gypsies to stand ground

Rawai sea gypsies face forced relocation as court orders evictions

FEARING they will have nowhere to go if court-ordered evictions are carried out, villagers at the southern Phuket sea gypsy community in Rawai have steadfastly resolved to stay put.

"Our people have been living here for more than 200 years. Our homes once lined the length of the beach, but now we have only 19 rai to live on," said village elder Ngeam Dumrongkaset, 68.

Put Hadthong, 48, and his family refuse to move.

"We have nowhere to go. My family has been living here for more than 60 years. Although they say they have documents to prove who owns the land, this is the land of our ancestors. No matter what happens, I will stay here. I will die here," he said.

Mr Put learned of his eviction notice after his nephew handed him the court order when he returned from work one day in 2009.

"It was on the afternoon of March 21. I had just...

Fear delays launch of new airport bus

THE long-awaited and much supported Phuket Airport Bus Express - marking Phuket's first "hop onhop off" bus service from the airport to major tourist beaches along the west coast - will not be launched this month.

The news came at a provincial transport committee meeting at the Phuket Land Transportation Office (PLTO) on Tuesday led by ardent supporter of the new service, PLTO chief Teerayut Presertpol.

"I am worried that there will be attacks [on the bus drivers]," V/ Gov Chamroen explained to the meeting.

"I am especially worried about the tuk-tuk and taxi drivers in Kata-Karon," he added.

Asked whether the provincial government would allow the local tuk-tuk and taxi drivers, rather than the public, to decide whether or not Phuket would have the bus service, V/Gov Chamroen dodged the question, saying only that, "Phuket is still moving forward, but we will move forward cautiously."

Dates and venues for the public feedback meetings have yet to be set, but it was agreed that such meetings were to be held before May 15, Mr Teerayut said.

The committee will not meet again before that date, he added.

Pharmacy selling abortion **Bag snatcher accidentally** pills raided in police sting turns herself in to police

A PHARMACIST in central Phuket Town has been charged with illegally selling abortion pills in an undercover operation carried out by Ministry of Public Health officials.

A complaint filed directly to police in Bangkok resulted in the sting operation on the City Health Care pharmacy, on Dibuk Road, near the junction with Soi Romanee, on the afternoon of March 12.

"An officer who is three months pregnant entered the store and asked to buy abortion pills. The pharmacist gave her the pills and charged her 16,000 baht," Ministry of Health legal officer Chatree Pinyai explained.



Two dead in shootout

Tourist Police Officer seriously injured in gunfight, charged with murder

A PHUKET Tourist Police officer was charged with murder after he arrived at hospital, leaving two dead, gunned down in a housing estate near Phuket Town.

Sen Sgt Maj Pinchai Piyadilok was taken to hospital for gunshot wounds to his leg and stomach before police arrived at the scene, the Phuket Garden Ville housing estate.

Officers received reports of shots fired at the housing estate, near Phuket Rajabhat University, at 2:30am.

They arrived to find the body of Saran Chaithum, 26, leaning against the open door to the room. In the bed was the body of

Chalermpol Tripuk, 26.

Both were dead from gunshot wounds

Police found only one survivor at the scene, Natthapong Kaewkuanchum, 25.

"He had been shot three times in the chest," Phuket City Police

chief Col Sermphan Sirikong said. Mr Natthapong was rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital, Col Sermphan added. He too is recovering from surgery and had yet to be questioned by police as the Gazette went to print.

"In the room, we found two 9mm cartridges, two bullets and crushed kratom leaves on the floor," he said.

"We have questioned five of the neighbors, but none of them witnessed the incident," Col Sermphan said.

The alleged gunman, Sen Sgt Maj Pinchai, was transferred to Prince of Songkhla University Hospital in Haad Yai, after undergoing emergency surgery in Phuket.

Alleged child rapist denies all charges

A PHUKET shopkeeper accused of raping a 9-year-old girl in October has denied the charges against him, claiming that he struck the child to discipline her.

"The suspect claimed that he just wanted to discipline the girl because she was drawing on the wall of his house." Public Prosecutor Atikun Puangprom told the Gazette.

Mr Atikun explained that the suspect testified to striking the child.

"However, the details of the assault as described in the suspect's testimony are not to be revealed to the public," he said.

The suspect has been charged under Sections 277 and 279 of the Criminal Code. If found guilty, the man faces a 20,000-baht fine and 10 years in prison for sexual assault and a 40,000-baht fine and life in prison for the rape of a person under the age of 13.

"The suspect denied both charges," Mr Atikun said.

The suspect has been released on bail of 350,000 baht, a Phuket Provincial Court officer told the Gazette.

The trial will resume on November 19.

New driver found dead, pinned by bus door

driver whose body was found, still standing, pinned by the partially closed door of his own bus on Monday morning.

Phuket native Ekkarat Sarapol, 29, from Wichit, arrived and parked his Sawat Travel Company bus alongside other tour buses at the Phuket Boat Lagoon, north of Phuket Town, at 6am.

He was last seen alive at 7am by a security guard who saw him cleaning and preparing the bus to take guests to Phang Nga.

"Because he was out of clear sight, between other buses, his body was not discovered until 9:30am," Lt Jirawat Tancheun of Phuket City Police explained.

"We believe he pressed the button to close

POLICE are investigating the death of a bus the door, but slipped while walking down the stairs and was trapped by the closing door," Lt Jirawat said.

"His neck shows deep bruising caused by the force of the door. We believe that he suffocated, as his airway was blocked.

"He was stuck and could not call for help," he said.

"However, we will continue our investigation as other factors may be involved in the death," Lt Jirawat explained.

Mr Ekkarat started working with Sawat Travel as a tour bus driver only three days earlier, the Gazette was told.

"The bus is also new to the company, which acquired it a month ago," Lt Jirawat added. – Kritsada Mueanhawong

No wildfire warning, but alert remains

THE lack of rainfall across the island in recent weeks has yet to prompt the authorities to issue a wildfire warning for Phuket, but they have called for people to be vigilant as a precaution.

"We have not issued a fire warning as there are small packets of rain falling on scattered areas," Phuket Forest Protection and Fire Control Director Kejboon Leawtrakul said on Wednesday.

However, there is a danger of forest fires if, for example, people drop cigarette stubs in droughthit forest. That's why we have been handing out leaflets at Khao Phra Thaeo National Park several times a week," he added.

Satisfied with the explanation, Maj Gen Roy said, "The jet-ski operators provide a good service to tourists. Instructions are handed out to every tourist who rents one. However, I suggested they add Chinese to the instruction leaflets.

It would be very helpful to prevent any misunderstandings."

Gen Roy and his team of officers then continued their tour of Patong Beach, handing out tourist information leaflets as they strolled along the sand.

Phuket: national land probe model

A DEPUTY Ministry of Interior arrived in Phuket on Tuesday to launch a land title deed investigation with the aim of establishing Phuket as a role model for land probes.

"Many plots of land have been acquired through corrupt officials," Deputy Interior Minister Pracha Prasopdee told the Gazette.

"This investigation, commencing immediately and lasting 30 days, will establish Phuket as a role model for the rest of the country in how to deal with this problem."

"Due to the revenue Phuket generates for Thailand as a whole, the government corruption that has led to land encroachment on the island has come to the attention of Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra and the Ministry of the Interior," Mr Pracha said.

The 10 officers promised to spearhead the project with the cooperation of the Phuket Land Office, had, as of Tuesday, not yet arrived on the island.

"I received a letter today [March 18] from the Ministry of Interior that promised that 10 Ministry of Interior officers would take charge of the investigation, but the officers have yet to arrive," Phuket Land office chief Somyot Laochoo confirmed.

Mr Pracha explained that the ministry had identified almost 200,000 land documents (156,853 Chanote; 4,437 SorKor 1; 26,616 NorSor 3 Kor; 4,080

NorSor 3) issued for land in Phuket that is in prohibited areas according to the Thailand Land Code BE 2521.

"We are waiting for orders from the Ministry of Interior on which land title deeds will be investigated," Mr Somyot told the Gazette

The land investigation will focus on the construction of buildings on the steep hills in Kamala and along the beach, Mr Pracha said.

Mr Pracha also told the press that Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut had been assigned to take the reins on the issue of investigating land title deeds in Phuket.

"We do not want to harm anybody, but if the land documents are illegal we will take the land back," he added.

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Police deny bribe allegations, make reputation-saving arrest

A SENIOR Phuket City Police officer arrested a woman for tarnishing the name of the Royal Thai Police after she allegedly claimed to have paid him 400,000 baht in bribe money.

The news follows Duangporn Luesub, 36, arriving at Phuket City Police Station on Monday to discuss the issue with Phuket City Police Deputy Superintendent Prawit Engchuan, the sole case officer who is also the officer who allegedly received the bribe money.

Mrs Duangporn said she gave 400,000 baht to a woman who claimed she would use the money to bribe Lt Col Prawit to free Mrs Duangporn's husband from Phuket Prison, where he is being held for drug possession.

Col Prawit and fellow Phuket City Police officers arrested Mrs Duangporn's husband, Suwit Buaprom, on drug related charges on February 15.

Mrs Duangporn hired a lawyer to fight the charge.

"Later, a woman claiming to be a friend of the lawyer said she could help my husband, but she said I had to pay her 400,000 baht," Mrs Duangporn said.

"I did not have that much money at that time, so I agreed to her husband's release.

pay 20,000 baht that day. Later, I paid 80,000 baht more and recently I paid the remaining 300,000 baht," she said.

"Later, the lady called me again, asking for another 300,000 baht. I visited my husband in Phuket Prison and explained the story to him. He told me to stop paying the woman and to ask for our 400,000 baht back," she explained.

Mrs Duangporn called the woman and asked for her money back, but the woman allegedly said she had already paid all of it to Col Prawit and his fellow officers.

In response, Col Prawit yesterday defended the honor of the Royal Thai Police, saying they were corruption-free.

"We work with clean hands. We never accept or take bribes from anyone. What the woman who received the money claimed has created a bad image for Thai police," he said.

"We have arrested her and charged her with insulting an officer," he stated.

Col Prawit revealed the name of the woman arrested, but asked the media not to publicly reveal her identity while the case was in progress.

Runaway bus on Patong hill injuries 10, kills one motorist

ONE person is dead after a Phuket tour bus slammed into eight motorbikes and five cars on Patong Hill on March 15.

Athiwat Petchsai, 22, died after he was struck by the runaway bus in front of Wat Patong temple after the vehicle's brakes failed as it descended Patong Hill at about 7:30am.

The bus was en route from Phuket Town to pick up tourists staying at a hotel in Patong.

Ten others were reported injured, including the bus driver, Thammanoon Pinkongphan, 35.

Three of the injured were rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital in Phuket Town.

The remaining six were taken to Patong Hospital.

Mr Thammanoon was taken to Bangkok Hospital Phuket for treatment after he suffered injuries to his chest, knee and wrists when the tour bus plowed into the temple wall.

Iotorbikes take island heat, arson suspected

A SERIES of suspected arson attacks on burning on the side of Pha Hin Tang Road. motorbikes in Phuket last week has police scrambling to identify the culprits.

"We suspect the bikes were set on fire by a single gang of teenagers out to cause trouble," Phuket's top cop, Provincial Police Commander Choti Chavalviwat, told the Gazette.

"I have already assigned a joint police force from Kamala, Kathu and Cherng Talay police stations to investigate the cases," Gen Choti said. The first incident occurred in the parking

area at the popular Laem Singh Beach on March 12, in which four bikes were found blazing at around 4pm.

Later that evening another bike was found

The most recent motorbike to suffer burning rubber was discovered on March 13 at 3pm along the Kathu-Koh Kaew Road, not far

from the Phuket Mining Museum. About 200 meters from that motorbike, Lt Sawas Pholon of the Thung Thong Police and his team discovered a five-liter container of petrol hidden in the grass. Also not far away, police found a helmet.

"All the evidence was gathered to check for finger prints," Lt Sawas said.

Locals told police that the motorbike was owned by a gardener in the area.

Police swoop on gambling den

A JOINT police raid on a house in Phuket Town on March 14 netted 22 gamblers playing the popular "shrimp-fish-giant water bugflower" board game.

Officers led by Lt Col Prawit Engchuan of Phuket City Police joined teams from the Phuket Provincial Police and Wichit Police in the raid of the shophouse, about 100 meters from Surakul Stadium, at 11:50pm.

Police seized 8,660 baht cash, six bet markers for 10,400 baht, 30 bet markers for 1,040 baht, gambling debt log books, and other gambling paraphernalia, including the board game.

"Our team of investigators learned the location of the gambling den from our informants. Players used the back door of the house to enter and exit the venue," Col Prawit said.

"All 22 people were charged with gambling," he added.

Sombat Issalolarn, 70, who identified himself as the owner of the house, was charged with providing a venue for illegal gambling.

Settaphat Nilkomol was charged with being a dealer for illegal gambling.

"Police arrested every person and seized all gambling property found at the venue. The suspects were taken to Phuket City Police Station to be charged, and then handed over to Wichit Police for further investigation," he added.

Leatherback turtles: hatching a plot for the future Of the five species of turtle that live in the THE beach at Khao Lampi – Hat Thai Mueang

National Park has been full of life over the past month with 339 baby leatherback turtles becoming extinct, he added. hatching from five protected nests in the area.

"We are still watching two more nests expected to hatch soon," park chief Witoon Detpramuanphol told the Gazette.

In the past, enormous leatherback turtles weighing as much as 360 kilograms would lay a total of 400 to 500 nests along the beaches of Phang Nga and Phuket (see page 18). Now, however, there are less than 10 nests a year, explained Dr Kongkiat Kittiwattanawong, head of the Endangered Species Unit at the Phuket Marine Biological Center.

Andaman, leatherbacks are the closest to "Only about one in 1,000 baby leatherbacks

survive to adulthood," Dr Kongkiat pointed out. To protect the dwindling population of leatherbacks in the Andaman region, Dr Kongkiat asked people to not remove turtle eggs from

nests and not disturb the turtle-nesting areas. "In the nesting season many turtles come ashore or close to shore. If anybody notices them please, do not disturb them; if you are a fisherman, and one is caught in your net, please free it and return it to the sea," he said.

No monkeying around

Russian couple caught touting pig-tailed macaques on Koh Kai Nok

A RUSSIAN couple were arrested at a tourist sight-seeing island off Phuket on March 14 after they were caught charging tourists to have their photos taken with pigtailed macaques, a protected species in Thailand.

Andrey Belov, 31, and Ekaterina Denisovich, 22 were arrested by Natural Resources and Environmental Crime Suppression Division (NED) officers led by Lt Col Kongkaj Phunoknium.

"We went to Koh Kai Nok and saw Mr Belov and Ms Denisovich carrying three pig-tailed macaques, asking tourists if they wanted to have their photos taken with them,' Col Kongkaj explained.

"We asked to see their passports and documents to prove they were in legal possession of the macaques. They told us they did not have the documents with them, but the documents were back in their rented room in Kata," he said.

After placing the two Russians in custody, the officers entertained the couple's claim and escorted them back to Phuket.

"We took them to their room in Kata. They showed us the health record books for each of the three

macaques and a document proving the monkeys had been fitted with microchips.

"However, they could not explain to us what information was logged on the microchips. They said they were given the monkeys by a Russian friend.

"They also could not show us

any official documents proving that they had the legal right to have the animals in their possession," he explained.

The couple were held overnight at Phuket City Station and departed the next morning for Koh Yao Noi, where they will be charged with possession of a protected species without a permit. If found guilty, Mr Belov and Ms Denisovich each face a fine of up to 40,000 baht or up to four years imprisonment, or both, Col Kongkaj explained.

"The monkeys will be sent to a wildlife reserve in Phang Nga," he added.

...come home from work. My nephew said officers had delivered a court order requesting that I attend court two months later. It was then that I learned the land I have been living on my entire life apparently belongs to Mr Piyawat Sa-Ngeamkul," he said.

"People living in seven other houses also received the court order," Mr Put added.

After five court appearances, the court finally – on February 28 this year - ordered the villagers to vacate the land.

Mr Put placed his faith on the **Rights and Liberties Protection** Department under the Ministry of Justice to provide help.

director-general of the Rights and Liberties Protection Department, and a team of officers held a meeting with about 300 villagers on March 16 to discuss the issue.

"We wanted them to know that we are working with other departments to come up with a reasonable solution," Col Narat said.

Immediately after meeting the villagers in Rawai, Col Narat led a meeting at Phuket Provincial Hall to highlight the sea gypsies' plight.


"The Ministry of Interior, the Department of Special Investigation and the Royal Thai Police are cooperating to find a way to fight the claims, and to find a lawyer to represent the sea gypsies," Col Narat told the meeting.

"Our officers will be reviewing maps, historical photos and conducting interviews to prove that the Rawai sea gypsies have been living in the area for generations," he added.

Mr Put hopes the efforts pay off. "They told us they will set up a meeting in Bangkok to discuss our problem. After that they will come back to tell us what they have agreed," he said.

"We have nowhere else to go."

Thai woman gives birth to something egg-straordinary

A WOMAN in Nakhon Sri Thammarat province claims to have given birth to an egg.

Sopharat Phantharak, 36, has placed the miraculous object on a pedestal lined with white cloth and is inviting local villagers to come and pay their respects to it.

Mrs Sopharat, who is already a mother of four, claims that before the miraculous nativity she had a strange dream in which an angel gave her the egg, as well as the white cloth.

Now, local villagers are flocking to her house to see the miracle, with many of them prostrating themselves in front of the egg, which looks just like that of a chicken.

Mrs Sopharat has also placed a silver tray next to the object for villagers to leave money and gain merit.

Police officers are investigating Mrs Sopharat to see if they can charge her with fraud.

Kitti Rattanasombat, the director of Tha Sala Hospital said that "normal people don't give birth to eggs".

Mr Kitti admitted that abnormal births were possible, but added that giving birth to a "duck egg, chicken egg or reptile egg" certainly did not happen.

This was more likely to be due to someone making up stories to get attention, he said.

Superintendent Suthep Kosakul of Tha Sala Police Station said officers had examined the egg and confirmed it was a chicken egg with "nothing special" about it.

Most villagers who saw the egg did not believe it was the result of Mrs Sopharat giving birth.

Some said that if the object had been a lump of flesh of some sort, they might have believed it – but not a chicken egg.

QUEER Triple homicide suspect caught news at popular Phuket visa-run pier

POLICE have arrested the prime suspect wanted for a triple homicide over a land conflict in Phang Nga.

After nearly three months on the run, Somsak Wongsri, 49, was arrested in Ranong on Tuesday.

He was wanted for the execution of Prajuab Choojit, 24; Sarawut Boonklin, 31; and Somboon Kimtin, 69, who was the father of popular Thai country music singer "Ice R Siam".

The executions took place in a rubber plantation in Takuapa district on December 22.

"After he killed the three men, he went to Ranong where he was in hiding until he was arrested by police on Tuesday, at 7pm,' Police Region 8 Commander Yongyuth Charoenwanit told a press conference in Surat Thani on March 14.

Somsak was arrested at Ranong's Saphan Pla Pier, well

known among Phuket long-stay tourists and expats as the jumpoff point for visa runs to Myanmar. "He was attempting to leave Thailand," Lt Gen Yongyuth said. "The suspect has been charged

with murder, possession of an illegal firearm and ammunition, and carrying an illegal firearm in a public place," the general added. Somsak remained silent throughout the press conference.

"He told police in his statement that he was involved in a conflict with the three men over access to his land. The access crossed land belonging to the three men," Gen Yongyuth explained.

"The suspect will present information only in court, which he has the right to do. He has the right to remain silent," Gen Yongyuth reminded the press.

"Somsak has been denied police bail because his actions have been classified as a form of heinous crime," Gen Yongyuth added.

During the press conference, Ice R Siam pleaded with Somsak, asking why he killed her father, but Somsak remained silent.

After the press conference, police escorted Somsak to the rubber plantation in Takuapa to re-enact the crime.

Dog-lovers pounce on 'round up strays' policy vincial Livestock Office chief

THE current Phuket Gazette online poll asking whether or not stray dogs should be rounded up and taken off Phuket's streets has stirred the island's dog-loving community into a frenzy.

The poll, launched March 7, offered respondents the following options:

- No, the focus shouldn't be on the dogs but on the people who feed them and perpetuate their existence.

The poll followed Phuket Pro-

Weerasit Puthipairoj, 58, calling for all stray dogs to be humanely collected off the streets and taken to the Livestock Office's dog shelter in Thailand. John Dalley of the Soi Dog

Foundation issued a missive, calling for Phuket dog-lovers to vote in the poll and to cast their votes in favor of sterilization (see page 19).

"The poll contains no options for the ONLY scientifically proven (and humane) method of stray animal population control in SE Asia, this being sterilization. The closest option to an informed and intelligent answer is the fourth one ("No, there's no need to collect them, they're not a big problem in Phuket.") and I encourage you to take a moment and vote for this option," Mr Dalley said.

Yaowapha: The replacement PM?

SPECULATION is rife that the Pheu Thai Party fears Yingluck Shinawatra may be forced to step down as prime minister soon and is preparing for her older sister Yaowapha to take her place.

PM Yingluck is currently under investigation by the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) over her alleged concealment of assets when she took the office as prime minister in 2011.

At the same time, Mrs Yaowapha is preparing to stand in a by-election for Chiang Mai Constituency 3 after the sudden resignation of incumbent Pheu Thai member Kasem Nimmolrat.

Mr Kasem, who won the seat last year, cited ill health among his reasons for stepping down last month. Mr Kasem is a close associate of the Shinawatra family, serving as "chauffeur" to Mrs Yaowapha and aide to her daughter Chinnicha.

Mrs Yaowapha, who held the seat herself until she was banned from politics for five years during the recent political crisis, is seen as a shoe-in to take the seat back again.



Rumors are rife that Mrs Yaowapha is being moved into position in the House of Representatives in order to replace Yingluck as prime minister in case she is forced to step down following an unfavorable NACC ruling.

According to financial statements that PM Yingluck submitted to the NACC when she became an MP and prime minister, her husband, Anusorn Amornchat, held 4.01 million shares in Ad Index Co Ltd. Each share was worth 10 baht.

PM Yingluck also stated that she had given 30 million baht to the firm in 2006 as a loan. However, the company's records show no evidence of any such loans until 2007.

Pheu Thai Party spokesman Prompong Nopparit recently commented on the matter. He

played down the case as frivolous, even though the NACC ruling, if unfavorable, could lead to the suspension of the prime minister, pending a judicial review.

Some observers were not convinced, however.

"Yaowapa's rush to grab a House seat after the expiry of her ban suddenly makes sense," wrote political commentator Avudh Panananda in a recent column in The Nation.

"The party spokesman might be right that his ruling party is not grooming a replacement for Yingluck. But the Shinawatra clan is bracing for all possible contingencies.'

Mr Avudh went on to slam the Shinawatra family for wasting public money.

"The clan's interest comes, obviously, before that of the country. To ensure the continuity of Shinawatra control, taxpayers will have to dole out at least 10mn baht for organizing the by-election."

Monarchy broadcast sparks controversy

A ROW has broken out over the cancellation - and subsequent broadcast – of the final episode of a controversial five-part debate on the status of the Thai monarchy on public broadcaster ThaiPBS.

The final part of the series, which featured a debate between Thammasat University academic Somsak Jeamteerasakul and social critic Sulak Sivaraksa, was scheduled to be broadcast on March 15.

But after about 20 monarchy loyalists protested outside the station's office on the afternoon before the broadcast, the final episode was replaced with a taped episode of the Tob Jote program on a different subject.

Station management explained that it had decided to delay showing the episode over concerns for the safety of its staff as well as fears the program may have been causing "social divisions".

In protest against the decision, host Pinyo Traisuriyathamma said



Defense contractor arrested for handing over information on nuclear weapons

A US defense contractor in Hawaii has been arrested on charges of passing national defense secrets, including classified information about nuclear weapons, to a Chinese woman with whom he was romantically involved, authorities said on Monday.

New Pope's simple style signals shift in Catholicism's tone

WITH every day the newly election Pope Francis reigns, his style reveals more contrasts with his predecessor Benedict in ways that amount to an unspoken criticism of how

the retired pontiff conducted his papacy. The enthusiasm former Cardinal Jorge Bergoglio has sparked among Catholics by approaching the job like a parish priest rather than a papal monarch points to a yearning for a leader the Church has not seen since the charismatic Pope John Paul II.

Seven days are a short time to judge a papacy on, but the approval for Francis seems to show this is closer to what many Catholics want in a pope. Italians frequently note with approval that he reminds them of the

popular Pope John XXIII (1958 to 1963).

"This is a new breeze of fresh air that is blowing through the Church and the name of that breeze is Francis," Cardinal Leonardo Sandri, a fellow Argentine, told Reuters.

"This is a call to humility and service to others that will mark his papacy," he said after the inaugural Mass.

Referring to Benedict's election in 2005, in which Francis was the runner-up, Italian theologian Massimo Faggioli said, "Bergoglio represents the road not taken eight years ago.

"Benedict is a great theologian, but being pope is not about being a theologian," he said. - Reuters

Syrian rebels, Damascus trade allegations of 'chemical attack'

SYRIA'S government and rebels accused each other of launching a deadly chemical attack near the northern city of Aleppo on Tuesday in what would, if confirmed, be the first use of such weapons in the two-year-old conflict.

Syria's information minister said rebels had fired a rocket carrying chemical agents that killed 16 people and wounded 86. State television said later the death toll had risen to 25.

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, which monitors the conflict using a network of contacts in Syria, put the number of dead at 26, including 16 soldiers.

A Reuters photographer said victims he had visited in Aleppo hospitals were suffering breathing problems and that people had said they could smell chlorine after the attack.

"I saw mostly women and children," said the photographer, who cannot be named for his own safety.

"They said that people were suffocating in the streets and the air smelt strongly of chlorine."

The photographer quoted victims

hospital and the al-Rajaa hospital as saying: "People were dying in the streets and in their houses.'

President Bashar al-Assad, battling a two-year-old uprising against his rule, is widely believed to have a chemical arsenal.

Syrian officials have neither confirmed nor denied this, but have said that if it existed it would be used to defend against foreign aggression, not against Syrians. There have been no previous reports of chemical weapons in

the hands of insurgents.

Information Minister Omran al-Zoabi said rebels fired a rocket with chemical weapons at the town of Khan al-Assal, southwest of Aleppo, in what he called a "dangerous escalation".

He said the rocket had been launched from Aleppo's southeastern district of Nairab, part of which is rebel-held.

But a senior rebel commander, Qassim Saadeddine, who is also a spokesman for the Higher Military Council in Aleppo, denied this, blaming President Assad's forces for the alleged chemical strike.

"We were hearing reports from early this morning about a regime attack on Khan al-Assal, and we believe they fired a Scud with chemical agents," he told Reuters by telephone from Aleppo.

US President Barack Obama, who has resisted overt military intervention in Syria's two-year-old civil war, has warned President Assad that any use of chemical weapons would be a "red line".

Israel has threatened military action if any chemical weapons were diverted to the Syrian- and Iranian-backed Lebanese Shi'ite movement Hezbollah.

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Bombs kill nearly 60 on date of Iraq invasion anniversary

MORE than a dozen car bombs and suicide blasts tore through Shi'ite Muslim districts in the Iraqi capital Baghdad and other areas on Tuesday, killing nearly 60 people on the 10th anniversary of the USled invasion that ousted Saddam Hussein.

Sunni Islamist insurgents linked to al Qaeda are regaining ground in Iraq, invigorated by the war next door in Syria and have stepped up attacks on Shi'ite targets in an attempt to provoke a wider sectarian confrontation.

The Iraq war began on March 20, 2003, with US air strikes in Baghdad.

Now a decade after US and Western troops swept Saddam

You can run, but you can't hide

American citizens earning income in Thailand prepare to report to 'Uncle Sam'

IN LIGHT of the ongoing 'federal fiscal fiasco' in Washington DC, the US tax regime is looking to grow its global revenue pool, with American expats residing in places like Phuket high on the list to be scrutinized.

Last week, a small group of American taxpayers gathered in Phuket for an informative yet dreaded update seminar about the latest income reporting and tax filing requirements for US citizens earning income abroad.

Sponsored by the Phuket chapter of the American Chamber of Commerce (AMCHAM) at the Holiday Inn, Patong, the seminar was presented by international tax specialist John Andes, a US CPA and Thai-American partner with the Bangkok-based accounting firm KMPG Phoomchai Tax Ltd.

Mr Andes reiterated that all American citizens, regardless of their domicile or residency status, are required to file US income tax returns annually, report world-wide income and disclose certain information about foreign investments.

Americans residing overseas who have earned income – no matter how or where they were paid – have two primary options to consider when trying to reduce their US tax obligations.

FOREIGN EARNED INCOME

Qualified individuals can claim the foreign earned income (FEI) exclusion by filing form 2555, which is filed with Form 1040. Almost all US taxpayers residing outside the US will need to file paper returns.

The IRS center in which to send the forms will differ depend-

ing on whether there is a payment due or not. This information is

explained in the form 1040 instructions, or through the tax software or tax preparer. In order to elect the

FEI exclusion, US citizens or permanent residents (green card holders) must qualify by meeting three criteria.

The first is to pass either the *bona fide* residence test, or alternatively, the physical presence test.


To pass the *bona fide* residence test, a US taxpayer must have lived in a foreign country for an uninterrupted period that includes an entire tax year (January 1 – December 31).

This test also requires that the taxpayer did not claim to be a non-resident of the foreign country of residence for its tax purposes.

Slightly more flexible, the physical presence test requires the taxpayer to be physically present in a foreign country (or countries) for 330 full days during any consecutive 12-month period – though not necessarily in the same calendar year.

In addition to passing one of the above tests, the taxpayer must have changed his tax home from the US to the foreign country, and if the foreign country has an income tax, the taxpayer's earned income must be subject to that country's income tax.

Mr Andes noted that the annual ceiling – the maximum amount of FEI that can be excluded – is \$95,100 for the 2012 tax year, and will increase to \$97,600 for the 2013 tax year.

He went on to address the so-called statute of limitations on how far back the IRS is authorized to conduct a tax audit.

"There is a three year statute of limitations for the IRS to audit a tax return. The statute of limitations is six years if the taxpayer omits additional gross income in excess of 25% of the amount of gross income stated in the tax return filed with the IRS.

"The important thing to remember is that in order to evoke the statute of limitations, you need to file the required tax return and information returns."

"If you fail to comply [by not filing] and they [the IRS] decide to investigate you, then there is no statute of limitations to be evoked. This means that the IRS can audit you as far back as it wants."

FOREIGN TAX CREDIT

Another option for American taxpayers to consider when looking to reduce their US tax obligation is to claim a foreign tax credit for foreign income taxes paid or accrued on income taxable in the foreign country and the US. This credit, designed

to avoid double taxation, cannot be claimed against income that was excluded from US taxation through the FEI exclusion.

"The foreign tax credit reduces actual US tax on a dollar-to-dollar basis; a deduction for foreign taxes only reduces income subject to tax," he said.

Whether to elect an FEI exclusion or claim a tax credit depends on if the taxpayer's non-US tax home is in a high tax jurisdiction (which varies depending on income bracket) such as Thailand or countries in the European Union.

"If you are in a high tax rate jurisdiction, meaning you are paying taxes at a higher rate in the foreign jurisdiction than you would in the US, then it makes more sense to forgo or revoke the FEI exclusion election," he said.

John added that once an FEI exclusion is elected, it remains in effect for all subsequent years unless revoked. However, once

revoked, it cannot be re-elected before the sixth year following the year the revocation was effective, unless the taxpayer obtains the IRS Commissioner's consent, he warned.

US taxpayers who are living abroad on the general tax filing deadline of April 15 get an automatic extension of two months to file. The taxpayer can file for an additional four month extension (total six months, or by October), using form 4868.

If, however, the taxpayer has an amount owing to the IRS, he must pay that amount by April 15. The extension is only an extension to file, not to pay.

In a future issue, we'll go over the reporting requirements for foreign assets and investments, as well as other tax developments.

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B85mn rubberized road in Krabi to bounce up prices

ANTICIPATING the construction of Thailand's first rubberized asphalt highway, the Deputy Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives (MAC) led a survey team to inspect a total of 17 kilometers of road in Krabi's Ao Luek district. Aimed at increasing the value of domestically produced rubber over the long term, and thus stabilize rubber prices, the proposed pilot project is expected to utilize a budget of 85 million baht.

Joining Deputy Minister Yuthapong Charassatian on the inspection was Krabi Governor Prasit Osathanon, Krabi Provincial Administration Organization President Somsak Kittitorrakul and other MAC and related officers.

Mr Yuthapong, who is also the leader on the working subcommittee of national strategy to increase the value of Thai rubber, said: "Rubber and rubber products are fundamentally important for Thailand's export market, as they generate a lot of income.

"However, the [raw] rubber and rubber products that we export are mostly raw materials, or otherwise simple and basic products. Thus, we are missing out on opportunities to earn more income from more value-added [products], he added

"A long term solution is to add more value to rubber products. So, we are pushing for rubber to be The route inspected was state used in the country as a composite ingredient to mix with asphalt [a semi-solid form of petroleum] in road construction," he explained.

"We chose this area to be a pilot because it has a primary road with many rubber plantations around the area and nearby. The road is under the responsibility of the Krabi Highways office [administered out of Surat Thani]," he said.

There are about 5,300 vehicles per day passing through the area, of which about 500 are heavy trucks, Mr Yuthapong said.

From this point, the project team will estimate expenses and present the final plan to the Natural Rubber Policy Committee.

We expect the project to cost about 85mn baht. The road could be used for about 10 years [before needing to be replaced], and

MANY expats living in Thailand are probably familiar with Malaysia to the south, but they may not be familiar with Malaysia as a potential investment option through the iShares MSCI Malaysia Index Fund ETF (EWM). Additionally, upcoming elections down there could bring about major changes and impact the ETF's performance.

WHY MALAYSIAN ETF?

Malaysia benefits by its location in the heart of Southeast Asia, but away from the Ring of Fire, and its threat of natural disasters.

For those reasons, along with

a skilled English speaking workforce, Malaysia and especially Penang, has become a

major electronics manufacturing hub that's now even more on the radar of manufacturing companies as an alternative to increasingly expensive China.

Moreover, floods (past, and ne persisting threat of future ones) in Thailand and natural disasters elsewhere have spurred renewed interest in Malaysia.

In addition, the Southeast Asian country likely had 5% or so economic growth last year and this figure could rise in the future as the economies of both China (Malaysia's largest trading partner) and the United States show signs of recovery.

Malaysia's currency also tends to be relatively stable as it's not free floating. Instead, it's carefully managed to prevent large swings in value.

Finally, as a more liberal Muslim country, Malaysia is popular with tourists and students from the Middle East, plus the country has made an effort to position itself as an Islamic banking and finance hub.

COMING CHALLENGES

However, Malaysia is not without its share of problems, which investors need to be aware of. With a population that is approximately 60% Muslim Malay, 23% Chinese and 7% Indian, Malaysia's minorities who tend to dominate the professional and entrepreneurial classes - are increasingly resentful about affirmative action policies that benefit the Muslim Malay majority.

Meanwhile, educated urban middle class Malays and their more conservative religious counterparts in the northern states are unhappy about corruption, and are also demanding other changes.

The Barisan Nasional (BN) coalition, which has ruled Malaysia for over 54 years, must hold elections by June 27th and their failure to gain a two thirds majority in parliament after the 2008 elections came as a shock to them and for investors as well.

The opposition led by Anwar bin Ibrahim (who was once jailed for corruption and has faced two controversial trials over sodomy accusations) is expected to mount the toughest challenge yet faced by the ruling coalition.

AN OPPORTUNITY

At the end of last year, the iShares MSCI Malaysia Index Fund ETF, which tracks the MSCI Malaysia Index, had an expense ratio of 0.51%, a 12 month yield of 1.58% and gave investors a return of 13.61% for the year. EWM also had a 15.48% three year return, a 6.45% five year return, a 14.68% 10 year return and a 3.49% return since inception.

The Malaysian stock market has long since recovered from the Global Recession in 2008 and should continue to perform well as the US economic recovery takes hold.

Short-term Malaysia will likely experience volatility but looking out longer term the Malaysian ETF should still be a steady market performer for investors.



Land prices double upcountry

THE expansion by leading property firms of their investment in the provinces during the course of last year has resulted in land prices doubling in many areas.

The main provinces and areas subject to the expansion drive are Rayong, Chiang Mai, Khon Kaen, Udon Thani, Phuket, Pattaya, Hat Yai and Khao Yai.

Preecha Ariyanon, managing director of Term Sup Group, a developer in Rayong, said the price of land along the province's Sukhumvit Road had increased from an average of 20 million baht per rai (0.16 hectare) two years ago to 40mn baht now.

Land in Pluak Deang district has also doubled in the same period, to an average of 10mn baht per rai.

Local developers are, however, able to compete with the property companies from Bangkok that have expanded into the province, as they had acquired their land before prices started to surge, he said.

For example, Term Sup Group holds more than 4,000 rai in Rayong province, which is valued at an average cost that is still below 20mn baht per rai.

As a result, the company can develop residential projects at a lower cost than new competitors in the local market.

Yesterday, the company introduced a 1 billion baht condominium project, the Wisdom Grandiose Condo, comprising 330 keys, with units priced from 1.6mn baht.

The units will each have 30 sqm of utility space.

Term Sup Group also plans a townhouse project worth between 1.6bn and 2bn baht as its next launch, Preecha added.

Rayong province has recently seen the launch of 10 condominium projects with a combined 1,000 units, worth 4bn baht in total.

One of the projects is a development by Sansiri, which has launched the 600mn baht condo, Nernpra, which will have 328 units.

Low-rise housing is another new market for listed property firms expanding their investment in Rayong.

The Confidence, a subsidiary of Quality Houses, has introduced the 660mn baht Casa Seaside Rayong detached-housing project, while Lalin Property has launched a similar project worth 600mn baht.

Udon Thani province has also seen land prices rising sharply, from an average of 20mn per rai on Pho Sri Road two years ago to between 30mn and 40mn baht now.

This is down to leading developers Sansiri, Asian Property Development, LPN Development, Land & Houses and Supalai all having shown interest in expanding their

Meanwhile, land prices in Phuket and Songkhla have also soared from 2010 levels due to rising residential demand, said Business Housing Association president Issara Boonyoung.

The average price in Phuket rose from 20mn baht per rai to 40mn baht during the period, which like other examples noted, was due to a number of Bangkok and local property firms expanding their investments

Thanawat Poolsil, president of the Songkhla Real Estate Association, said demand for the development of residential projects was focused on two Songkhla districts: Hat Yai and Sadao.

The price of land in Haad Yai has risen by an average of 10 per cent a year and is now about 50mn baht per rai, while Sadao district has witnessed a similar annual rise to 10mn baht, he said. *-The Nation*



Life & style Lock down your mobile devices

IN NEW York City, the crime rate has been slowly, steadily decreasing every year for the past 15 years.

Until last year. In 2012, there were 3,484 more major crimes reported than in 2011 – and 3,890 more thefts of iPhones and iPads. Stolen iPhones and iPads are reversing a long-standing decline in major crimes.

The situation in

Phuket is no better. I get questions all the time from people who want to know how to track their stolen iPhone, or iPad – or Android phone or tablet. The short answer: it's easy to do before the device gets swiped, but impossible (or at least extremely difficult) to do afterwards.

If you have an iPhone or an iPad, now would be a very good time to

turn on Apple's "Find My iPhone" support. The free Find My iPhone app lets you use another iPhone or iPad to pinpoint your missing phone on a map. There are also ways to protect private data; display a message reading "bring my phone back or I'll tell my uncle Soprano"; play a sound at full volume for a few minutes even if the phone was set to silent (a convenient way to locate the missing phone if you're in earshot) and remotely lock your phone or pad. Here's how to turn on Find My

iPhone.

First, make sure you're running the latest version of iOS. Find My iPhone is available in iOS version 5 or later.

Second, sign up for iCloud by tapping Settings, iCloud. You need to set up an Apple ID, which is just an email address and password. That same Apple ID will work with the iCloud web site at icloud.com. You can also use the same Apple ID in the iTunes Store and the App Store.

Third, tap iTunes and install the Find My iPhone app. It'll take a couple of minutes to download and install.

Fourth, when the app is ready, tap Settings, iCloud, Find My iPhone. Then tap Allow to turn on Find My iPhone tracking. That's all it takes. As long as your phone is connected to the internet, it's being tracked.

If you lose your iPhone or iPad, or it's stolen, finding it is easy:

First, with any web browser, go to icloud.com/find.

Second, sign in with your Apple ID and password. Third, click on the Find My

iPhone button.

Fourth, if you have more than one iOS device (say, both an



iPhone and a couple of iPads), you have to choose which device you want to track. And that's all it takes. If your

phone or tablet is online, it'll

appear with a green dot next to the name of the device. If it's offline, you see a red dot. Tap on a device that's online and the last location of the device will show up on a location map. Unfortunately, the location isn't updated in real time, but it does get refreshed every few minutes.

You can send the phone a message, if you like, or play that blasting sound. If your iPhone or iPad is offline, you can set an option to have an email sent to vou when the device gets re-connected to the internet.

That same web application –

the one at icloud.com/find – also works for tracking some Macs, using an app build into OS X 10.7.2 and later, called Find My Mac. All you have to do, in order to activate Find My Mac on a Mac, is to open the iCloud pane of

System Preferences and verify your Apple ID and password. Wait for your ID to be verified, then check the box marked Use Find My Mac. Click Next, then click Allow. You'll have to use an account with administrator access to your Mac.

There are several analogous programs on the Android side

of the fence. The bestreviewed app I've seen is called Where's My Droid. Like Find My iPhone, this app will ring even a silenced phone, retrieve the GPS coordinates of the phone and link it to Google Maps. It will also password protect your phone to make it more difficult to wipe it or root it, and Where's My Droid will notify you if the SIM card or phone number

gets changed. Where's My Droid Pro (US\$4) adds the ability to take pictures with the phone or tablet's camera, and send them to you; remotely lock the device; wipe the phone or tablet's SD card or all of the data on the device.

You can download it on Google Play.

But how do you find your Android phone/tablet if you didn't have the foresight to install and activate one of these apps? In my experience, it can be done, if you're lucky.

Plan B – only available for Android – locates your lost phone/tablet by using cell towers and GPS. It sends the location of your phone to your Gmail inbox. I've seen Plan B in use, in the US, and results are spotty. I don't know if it will work in Thailand. It, too, is available on Google Play.

A word of warning. If you do manage to find your phone, DON'T go after the thief yourself. The web is full of horror stories of people who confronted iThieves, and ended up dead or worse. You may have trouble locating a policeman who understands Find My iPhone, here in Phuket, but then again you may be surprised – more than a few local gendarmes use the program themselves.

So now, while you're thinking about it, go get all of your mobile devices signed up.

Draining Phuket turtle power

IT WOULD be difficult to find a more depressing issue than the plight of the various sea turtle species that face extinction in local waters, some of which are also at risk of disappearing from the planet completely (see news page 6).

Sea turtles are an integral, but fast disappearing, part of Phuket's natural heritage. Older generations of Thais will remember the numerous Thai films that featured footage of huge female leatherback sea turtles lumbering ashore to nest on the island's west coast beaches, making Phuket's name virtually synonymous across the nation with these ancient and amazing creatures.

Fast forward a few decades to 2013, when virtually any sea turtle nesting on a Phuket beach, regardless of the species, is considered newsworthy. The simple fact is that the island's beaches - and offshore waters - render existence for these reptiles almost impossible.

This comes despite the fact that most sea turtle species far predate mankind and have a remarkable reproductive strategy that factors in huge losses of hatchlings to an array of predators, including sea birds, canines and - it goes without saying - man.

The leatherback in particular dates back some 110 million years, according to fossil records. This evolutionary staying power indicates a well-honed biological design, provided that its natural habitat is not compromised – but it is.

We are all, each and every one of us, culpable for all of the plastic garbage that finds its way into the sea and ends up killing these animals, which mistakenly take the rubbish as their natural prey. But ingestion of improperly disposed plastic is only one of the threats these creatures face.

Another factor in their demise is unsustainable commercial fishing practices, such as drift gill nets, which can entangle sea turtles or deprive them of their natural prey. Thailand, despite being a party to various accords aimed at protecting sea turtles, is notoriously bad at protecting them and is abashedly engaged in the rape of the seas in general, including inside its territorial waters and even marine national parks.

Thai fishing fleets typically consist of desperately poor migrants whose day-to-day struggle to survive seems to preclude the luxury of consideration for other forms of living beings. The Thai captains of these vessels need an overwhelming intervention and change of outlook if there can be any hope for sea turtles in our waters.

Sadly, we live on an island where even the most common sense laws, such as the illegality of driving on the wrong side of the road are brazenly flouted.

It is hard to find any hope on the sea turtle issue; it will be sad indeed if these ancient sea turtle species go extinct in our lifetimes, but we will only have ourselves to blame.

Keep the hounds out of the pound

IN response to Dr Weerasit's comments ['Feed stray dogs? Barking mad...', First Person, March 9-15 issue of the Phuket Gazette], Soi Dog Foundation never has and never will pay anybody to feed stray dogs. SDF only supplies food to temples that care for large numbers of dogs.

Soi Dog Foundation sterilizes large numbers of animals, (nearly 50,000 in the past nine years).

As Dr Weerasit is new to Phuket, he may be unaware of the huge numbers of stray dogs on Phuket nine years ago and the fact that the problem was spiraling out of control. In June 2012 SDF started its PUP program (Prevent Unwanted Puppies).

This program, which will run initially for two years, sees us holding mobile clinics systematically across the island, working in close cooperation with the island's local administrations, all of whom share our view that mass sterilization of both owned and stray animals is the only longterm solution in a country where euthanasia is officially not allowed.

The target is to sterilize 20,000 dogs over the initial two years. If 80% of animals in an area are sterilized, then the population will decrease. That is a fact.

Removing sterilized dogs and dumping them in the dog pound is actually counterproductive.

Dogs are territorial by nature and keep other dogs out of their areas. Removing sterilized dogs simply opens up the area to new dogs that may not be sterilized and should be taken to the dog pound

Here, Mr Dalley replies to Phuket Livestock Chief Weerasit Putthipairoj's public

policy that strays should be rounded up from Phuket's streets and taken to the shelter in Thalang for care.

the problem starts all over again.

This view is shared by Dr Weerasit's superiors in Bangkok, where years of incarcerating stray dogs in huge dog pounds has had absolutely no effect on the stray population. The Livestock Department is now moving towards mass sterilization in the capital as they can see it is the only solution.

Dr Weerasit's claim that Phuket is rabies-free is extremely dangerous since the Phuket Livestock Department allows unvaccinated dogs and puppies from other provinces, where rabies is endemic, to pour onto the island for sale at markets.

It is illegal in Thailand to transport unvaccinated dogs across provinces. Most puppies sold in Phuket come from breeders elsewhere and unsold puppies are inevitably dumped, fueling the stray dog problem and increasing the risk of rabies being introduced. Dr. Weerasit did not mention

how he will stop these dogs from coming onto the island. The statement that all stray dogs

in Thalang is in itself barking mad. The Livestock Office in Phuket admits it does not have the budget to take care of the dogs and the dog shelter has a capacity of 400 animals. Dogs are only fed when food is available. To put all Phuket's stray and unregistered dogs into the pound would require that they be stacked several deep.

SDF has offered to vaccinate and sterilize all the dogs in the pound as well as treat the many injured dogs. We have been denied access and reports from those who have visited there describe it as nothing more than a death camp - furthermore, puppies are being born on site.

The pound should be closed to new arrivals, the existing dogs be wherever possible adopted and the remainder SDF would care for. The pound should then be closed and demolished as for such a place to exist is a blot on Phuket and it serves no useful purpose.

We no longer require you to bring photos because we have a camera that transfers photos directly onto the new licenses.

Kraisorn Boonprasop, Superintendent, Phuket Immigration Office, replies:

To be issued a letter confirming your address, just show us your Thai driver's license. If you have not changed your address, this will suffice.

However, if you do not have a driver's license or you have changed your address, you will need to bring your passport and the lease or rental agreement of the place where you live.

You will also need to bring a copy of the house registration document (tabien baan) for the house that you live in.

The fee for an address confirmation letter is 300 baht.

real estate are showcased.



IN AN age when the rich and super rich are getting wealthier, what exactly are they spending their hard earned money on?

Property, cars, jewelry and paintings have always been popular items, but superyachts, now more than ever, are seen by the affluent as the 'gold standard' of making a statement with wealth.

The world's largest superyacht, Project Azzam, is currently under construction and once she's completed, this megayacht is expected to be a staggering 180 meters – vessels over 24m are generally classed as superyachts.

Such a grand superyacht is out of financial reach for most people, but for those wanting to invest in a standard-sized superyacht, the Phuket Gazette spoke to Stephen Crone, a professional yacht captain and manager of yacht management company Acronautic Pty Ltd, to find out how.

Phuket Gazette: Which companies provide a yacht selling service to potential clients in Thailand/Phuket?

Stephen Crone: Yacht brokerage is a global business and typically a supervacht (a boat over 24m) that is for sale would be marketed internationally, hence, when searching for a broker simply consider the company that you feel is the most professional or easiest to communicate with. Once you have identified a suitable broker, outline your requirements and budget and they should present you with a few options to consider. Due to the size and range of most modern supervachts, their location is not so relevant as they can be easily relocated to your preferred anchorage or marina.

What sort of licenses, paperwork does a potential owner need to have?

Most vessels over 24m, the size where a boat becomes a superyacht, are governed by a particular yacht registry. This size of yacht typically has a professional crew, and depending on the usage, the yacht registry will be influenced by the required qualifications of that crew. It is quite rare for the

vacht owner to actually have any formal license to operate the vessel.

If someone wants to buy a yacht without the help of a specialist company is this possible? If so, how hard is it to do?

Purchasing a yacht is quite similar to purchasing a house, normally a process of inspecting the yacht to check the build quality, current condition and whether any repairs or maintenance are required prior to settlement of the transaction. This inspection should be carried out by an industry professional and the report is used for insurance purposes and general knowledge of the condition of what you are purchasing. It would certainly be possible to negotiate a purchase directly with a vendor, however, we discourage this due to the risks involved - similar to a property purchase.

What are the key factors to consider when buying a yacht?

Certainly the most important factor to consider is a yacht's current condition. Salt water environments are particularly harsh and if components such as electronics, metals and exposed materials are not maintained properly they deteriorate very quickly. Annual maintenance costs should also be considered, as the expenses can add up very quickly. Typically 10 per cent of the value of the yacht is a good gauge to budget on the annual operating expenses. It is a good idea to contract an independent yacht consultant to provide professional advice on a yacht purchase. A yacht broker is normally biased towards the vendor that is paying them, a consultant or client representative typically works with the yacht purchaser's best interests in mind.

How does a potential owner get involved in the building process, design and layout of his/her new superyacht?

Building a yacht can be one of the most satisfying elements of yachting and many owners have a great pride in ownership and particularly if they have contributed to the design. Any boat broker or a specialist yacht consultant can assist in researching and present a shipyard to build a customdesigned yacht. Typically a client representative is employed by the yacht owner to oversee the build and ensure that it meets the desired requirements upon delivery.

Once the yacht has been purchased how will the owner source crew?

There are many crew agents specializing in crew placement, AYC Superyacht Recruitment is the leader in recruitment throughout Southeast Asia and have assisted many yachts in Phuket. Crew can be sourced locally or internationally. It is important that the most appropriate crew are selected for the vessel because they are the link to providing a great yachting experience.

How easy is it to find a place to berth the yacht, arrange sea trials and survey the boat?

Berthing a yacht of this size is becoming more and more difficult, particularly in Phuket where options are limited to a few marinas. Sea trials and surveys are relatively easy to arrange through any reputable yacht brokerage. Here in Phuket there are several surveyors and Jimmy Watt from Siam Surveyors is one of the most recognized. Jim is a qualified Marine Surveyor and can provide reports for insurance, pre-purchase or just for safety's sake.

How easy is it to find a second hand yacht to buy?

Similar to searching for a home, vachts are advertised on the internet through sales websites and also glossy magazines. Boat International is one of the more recognized sources to initiate a search, as many brokerage companies use this as a central advertising solution since it displays one of the largest databases of yachts for sale.

Is it easy to charter a newly purchased yacht?

Chartering a yacht is a great way to generate some income to cover the annual expenses. Prior to accepting paying guests, a yacht must meet particular safety and manning requirements. It is best to outline

the intent to charter your vessel to your broker so that a vessel can be selected which would meet those requirements. It can be very difficult to modify a vessel for charter that has not been designed for that purpose.

How much do sales brokers charge?

This depends largely on the company and brokerage fees can be negotiated, but the typical fee is paid by the vendor and is in the range of 2-5 per cent.

What sort of legal procedures will a new owner have to go through?

Insurance, registration and commercial compliance if chartering. Customs should also be considered if relocating a vessel or changing the port of registry.

Gordon Fernandes is the genial general manager of Asia Pacific Superyachts in Phuket. Some might think that hobnobbing with millionaires and looking after their ocean-going toys is one of Phuket's most enviable jobs. But, as he explains, it's not all "plain sailing".

THE high-octane world of visiting super yachts and their superwealthy owners is the one in which Gordon Fernandes, the Phuket GM of Asia Pacific Superyachts, plies his daily trade, providing a onestop-shop "concierge service" that caters to every possible need of visiting mega-craft and the superwealthy elite who populate them when they call into the beguiling waters of the Andaman.

In these days of extraordinary global wealth, tumultuous stock markets, and rock and showbiz millionaires it's all a bit confusing keeping abreast of what exactly constitutes a supervacht. Not that long ago, in simpler, gentler times, there was a general consensus that supervacht heaven kicked in once you had 24 meters of beautiful megayacht lulling beneath your hand-stitched deck loafers. These days the cognoscenti talk about thirty or even forty meters as the defining mark of entry into this elite club, in order to keep out the hoi polloi and blatant arrivistes. Then there's the perennial question of whether big really is better in the world of superyacht envy, or should pure style and class overrule crass considerations of size?

The average construction price of these babies is around thirty million US dollars with a permanent crew in the teens and it can cost four thousand US dollars a day just to run the generators. So, if you have to ask whether you can afford to join this elite club... you definitely can't!

The writer and avid social climber F Scott Fitzgerald once



remarked to Ernest Hemingway that "The rich are different from you and me."

"Yes," replied 'Papa', a man not known for wasting words, "they have more money." So, as Gordon and I sat down over a glass of wine, I asked him if the Super Rich really were different from the rest of us.

"I have been doing this job for 15 years now and I have faced many very challenging requests from our clients that have taxed us to the ultimate degree. For example, there was the owner whose son wanted a live, baby elephant on board to celebrate his 10th birthday. We found an elephant and a mahout who was willing to have it taken on board the yacht, but then I started thinking about the logistics of putting "Dumbo" on the tender and using the boat's crane to lift it on board. I mean, what happens if a baby elephant swinging about over the sea between tender and yacht becomes... shall we say agitated? We eventually decided it was probably not too smart an idea and that "Dumbo" wasn't really meant to be a flying elephant after all.

Then there was the owner's dog that only ate Russian Beluga caviar. Well, we couldn't find any in "Little Old Phuket" at that time, but we eventually found some Iranian Osetra caviar in Bangkok and rushed it down. Unfortunately the snooty mutt knew the difference and refused to eat it! Eventually we



managed to "borrow" some Beluga from the owner of another boat, who thought it was all hilarious, and we finally got "Fido" to eat.

The problem is that with great wealth, whether inherited or selfmade, comes an intense sense of entitlement. They want anything on Earth and they want it now and they will not tolerate not having it. So, that's my job, which as you can probably tell can often be stressful. I've had owners demand live Canadian lobsters or foie gras from the top London suppliers. In the old days, Phuket wasn't that sophisticated and so I've had to run around to the top restaurants on the island and pay their prices to get such things, because the yacht owners want it NOW!"

How is the market changing these days I asked?

"At one end of the market there are a lot of superyachts for sale these days and some people are hurting.

At the other end, the supersuperyachts are getting even bigger with some of the Russian oligarchs boasting 120 meters at the waterline with a crew of forty-plus!

Also technology is everywhere and that has made a demanding clientele even more impatient. If we don't respond to them within the hour, they go elsewhere to get services. Mine is now a 24/7 on call existence and my iPhone is permanently switched on."


And what of the changes in Phuket with regard to providing what the super-wealthy are seeking nowadays?

Says Gordon, "The arrival of all the new Beach Clubs has given our clients an on-shore environment in which they feel at home, but for many of the super-rich their yacht is still their (floating) castle and they stay on board. Also our region's natural environment is still very appealing to people who are bored with the Med and the Caribbean, with newer areas like the Mergui Archipelago and the Andaman Islands having great appeal."

Clearly Phuket still holds great appeal to the superyacht club and "Champagne" Charlie Dwyer who is a veteran America's Cup sailor and skipper of the 116-foot *Yanneke Too* remarks, "We've sailed all around the world and everywhere we go the owners say 'this is beautiful, in fact it's almost as beautiful as Phuket""

And Adam Frost the founder of South East Asian Liveaboards makes the point, "The Thai people offer great hospitality. Combined with breathtaking scenery and superb facilities, there's simply no better place to enjoy the luxury yachting lifestyle."

Clearly Gordon's life of receiving midnight calls with bizarre demands from his wealthy clients is not going to end any time soon.



"After they know the problems, they will adjust themselves before the changes come. They can't wait until the changes affect them," Chulalongkorn University Vice President and Assoc Prof Pornpote Piumsomboon said at a recent seminar on improving the capacity and quality of universities ahead of the AEC.

The seminar was held at the National Institute of Development Administration by the International Institute for Trade and Development and was attended by representatives of universities and several educational institutes.

Pornpote said students had to learn to create questions, find answers on their own and prove if the answers worked or not. "This would improve their thinking skills, which are necessary at present." He added that by doing so, students would discover how to seek knowledge by themselves from research-based learning and learn to adjust to changes.

Educating the AEC

On the other hand, Pornpote challenged lecturers to change the way they teach – from passing on knowledge to students directly to providing support as facilitators to help them find the answers.

Former Education Minister Prof Wijit Srisa-arn urged higher education institutions to educate students more about Asean in an attempt to upgrade the quality of their courses and increase capability.

"You should not only establish an Asean studies center at your campuses, but should include information and knowledge about Asean in general education subjects for bachelor's degree students. This will help with students' awareness, recognition and adjustment to be graduates of Asean.'

Sivika Mekthavatchaikul, who is part of a subcommittee that studies institutions' readiness for the AEC, wanted universities to gather information and knowledge about

Asean from agencies at Foreign and Commerce Ministries and pass them on to students in their general education subjects.

To prepare Thai graduates to enjoy wider work markets in Asean, taking up international cooperative education in other Asean countries is good preparation and higher education institutions could do this immediately, Wijit said.

"Suranaree University of Technology has taken four or five years to gain acceptance from industry by having its students do internships for a semester as part of cooperative education," he said.

'Students interning in other Asean countries would learn the way to work and how to work with people in other countries and be ready to work in Asean."

Wijit and former secretarygeneral Sumate Yamnoon said higher education would have to move in harmony with those in other countries in the region to support students' mobility. They needed to improve quality standards and work together.

Thai English lowest of Asean nations

WITH TOEFL [Test of English as Economic Community (AEC). a Foreign Language] scores averaging at 489, Thai students' proficiency in the English language appears to be the lowest in the off in 2015. The seminar was Asean region.

In order to overcome this, academics are urging universities to seriously start strengthening students' English-language skills by making it a working language at their campuses.

"While, Thais' average TOEFL score stands at about 450; [students from] Laos, Cambodia and Myanmar have averaged around 500. Malaysia and Singapore were even higher at approximately 550 on average," Sriwika Mekthavatchaikul said at a seminar on improving the capacity and quality of universities ahead of the Asean

She is part of a subcommittee that studies institutions' readiness for the AEC, which kicks held at the National Institute of Development Administration by the Inter-national Institute for Trade and Development and attended by representatives from universities and several educational institutes.

Sriwika advised lecturers to make English the first language in campuses and start using technical terms more often while lecturing. Former education minister Prof Wijit Srisa-arn said usually English is included in university curriculum and accounts for at least six credits, and some universities had technical English courses, but that was not enough.

"It is necessary for us to promote the use of English and learn how to use the language with people from other Asean countries," Wijit said.

Life & style Uamporn Schori

"A FITTING title for my profile might be 'Return to the motherland after a 25-year sojourn in Switzerland'," suggests Uamporn Schori at the start of our interview.

Two and a half decades seems like a long time, but for Uamporn, who has kept strong ties with her "motherland" by ways of charity work for needy school children here, time is immaterial.

Approaching 60 this year, Uamporn has been living a rich and eventful life. Born and raised as a Muslim in Phang Nga to educated parents who had a penchant for the performing arts, Uamporn was the only child of her six siblings to inherit a love of dancing and singing from an early age.

"My policeman father was an excellent rong geng dancer (who performs a traditional Muslim dance practiced widely in the southern provinces) and my mother, a teacher and former Miss Phang Nga runner-up, had a beautiful voice. They inspired me and instilled a love of performing," recalls Uamporn.

Aspiring to follow in her mother's footsteps, Uamporn trained at Suan Sunantha Teaching College in Bangkok. She taught for seven years in Phang Nga but gave up after academic life proved too stifling for her creative bent. That and a failed marriage, Uamporn, now a single mother, turned to singing as a way to earn a living, a career that was



frowned upon by her relatives.

"I just didn't see why using my talent as a singer to earn an honest living was so bad," protests Uamporn. But the stigma attached to such nocturnal professions, together with pressure from her family became a constant strain. Luckily, salvation came in the form of a kind Swiss gentleman who proposed marriage. She moved with him to Biel, Switzerland, where she stayed for 25 years.

There, Uamporn became a "cultural social worker" helping Thais in and around Bern by interpreting for them at clinics, schools, registrar offices and the court.

In a charitable move, Uamporn and husband Rolfe established the "Association of Thai Arts and Culture", which aims to promote awareness of Thai values and raise funds for children in Thailand.

With contributions from Swiss individuals and money made from the Association's yearly cultural events, the organization raised about half a million baht each year. Uamporn, who visited Thailand

annually, made it her mission to

personally select schools and children worthy of support. The funds went towards school fees, uniforms and educational materials.

"No expenses were deducted from the money raised. "This charity work meant so much to me and combined the two things I love most - performing arts and education," says Uamporn, a tireless philanthropist who did this every year until her retirement to Thailand in 2012.

Two months ago, Uamporn became a proud owner of a wedding gown rental business called "Sitimariam" (her Muslim name). Inside this small Rawai store, bejeweled bridal gowns of all cultures - Malay, Thai, Indonesian and Peranakan – vie for attention.

One tiny corner displays Uamporn's dancer costume and headdress, a testament to her skills as a traditional dance teacher. She is available to dance at cultural events and will teach this art to young people or interested adults.

Though still in its early days, Sitimariam has managed to garner interest from expats and tourists who come in to pick up souvenirs, order a tailor-made Baba dress, or just browse. Business aside, Uamporn still believes there's room for more charity work, once the shop's up and running, that is.

For Uamporn, a new chapter of life has just begun. She has made it back to her homeland.



The *Gazette* interviews an Israeli pro wakeboarder at Asia's first and only clockwise cable-ski park

AS THE final hours of daylight waned in the sky, I pulled my rusty old BMW up to the ridge of a tin mine-turned-lake, home to Anthem Wake Park, across from Wat Manik in Cherng Talay.

Pausing but for a moment to study the deep blue water, the lake was both tranquil and alive.

However, this tranquil introduction was soon interrupted by a Japanese pro wakeboarder who attempted a massive aerial maneuver on the lake trying to land 'that big trick'. He smacked the water with a deafening thud.

It was then that I knew cable wakeboarding wasn't going to be as easy as some people make it look. Construction on the park began in December of last year and took only a few months to complete. Anthem has six posts erected at 120 degree angles to give the rider a smooth transition from tower to tower and is 11.5 meters tall (the height of a cable line affects its tension and overall feel).

"We're always gonna have riders coming through," says Rebecca Lek, Anthem Wake Park's director of sales. "This is the first cable park in Asia running on a clockwise cable. A lot of [riders] only know their home cable, which is probably counterclockwise.

"That's the thing about cable rats," adds Rebecca through a sheepish grin. "If you know that somewhere has one of the best cable parks in the world, you're gonna go there to say 'OK, check. Done.' People who are not used to [the clockwise] direction can improve their overall proficiency as a rider."

Another unique feature of the new park is its Sesitec 2.0 cable system, which allows beginners to try wakeboarding without fear of being dragged long distances by the cable or having it pull them too quickly.

The 2.0 line is run by an operator who manipulates the line so that you have a chance to gain footing and become comfortable on the board before trying the main line at speed.

Rebecca was kind enough to allow me a test run on the track, starting off on what I call the "kiddy cable" (the 2.0 line) and later graduating to the "big boy cable" after testing my mettle. It was great fun and if you've had any experience wakeboarding or water skiing I'm sure it will be a breeze. While I've never done either of those things, I do have good balance from surfing for several years, which helped me with the mechanics of the board.

While testing the track, I had the chance to catch up with a current wakeboarding legend, 27-year-old Israeli pro wake boarder Lior Sofer.

"This is my tenth year riding now. I started because when we were young we would take family trips to the North [of Israel] and my friend who used to own a boat would tow us with a boogie board and one day they said, 'Hey, let's put the kid on skis'," says Lior.

The culture of riders at Anthem reminds of my early days learning to surf. The whole crowd is very supportive and cheers loudly whenever you do something right – even if it's just standing up for the first time. Conversely, is a spectator sport and everyone watches as you go. So, when you wipe out, you can be assured that everyone saw and the collective groan is audible as it's happening. I felt fine immediately after wakeboarding but was so sore the next day that I found it hard to lift my arms higher than my chest.

I also experienced something I lovingly call "the walk of shame". That's what you have to do if you wipe out on the far side of the lake, where you'll need to swim to the dock, then walk a few hundred meters back around to the launch. Along the walk you're surrounded by beautiful nature and given the chance to reflect upon what went wrong (in my case it was hubris).

Rates are two hours for 400 baht, four hours for 600 baht, or an all-day-pass for 750 baht, making it much more affordable than some other parks. The owners of Anthem say it has become a

popular attraction for local schoolchildren from schools such as PIA, BIS and Kajonkiet and it is also a hit among professional riders, especially during the low season.

A group of Japanese pro riders have recently made Anthem their temporary home because in Japan they no longer have a cable park. This is also the case in Israel where the only park has been shut down for six months to undergo repairs.

Plans to keep Anthem moving forward include a new clubhouse, to be constructed on the ridge overlooking the park, which the owners say will help contribute to the overall social experience of the park. There are even plans to add on-site bungalows, which would extend riders' stays sometime in the next few years.

Professionals from the Philippines and the UK will be in training at the park over the next few weeks in anticipation of Anthem's official grand opening in July.

"It's a big difference [going clockwise]," says Lior, who is sponsored by Monster energy drinks. "In the US you drive on the right, here you drive on the left. It's the same thing when riding a board.

Rebecca, along with Khun Yok, the park's managing director, say having Lior and other pro riders around helps to inspire local kids to reach greater heights.


"We feel that Lior is such a great rider and he has a lot of huge events around the world and for him to come to Phuket to ride. The kids here love him. Every weekend they say 'Where's Lior? We want to see him ride'. It's kind of inspirational for them to see. They learn and see the tricks that he does and think... 'hmm OK, let's try this'."

Asked what advice he would give someone just beginning the sport Lior says: "First of all it's fun. It's not scary, you don't get injured frequently. You look at pro riders who take it to the extreme and you think it's scary, but that's just because they took it to an extreme. Anyone can do it, it's just water. It's something everybody can do, from age nine to 70."

Khun Yok adds that Anthem will be the staging ground for wakeboarding competition during the 2015 Asian Beach Games and will also help host water-slalom.

Located three kilometers from the Heroines' Monument, towards Laguna, turn left into the gate for Wat Manik. Anthem Wake Park is open daily from 9am to 6:30pm. The best time to come is late afternoon, as the weather cools.

Despite being fastest in testing, I said I would be surprised if Mercedes managed a podium finish in Australia. Hamilton finished 5th, well off the pace, particularly in straight line speed, and Nico Rosberg DNF. They are likely to stay mediocre in Sepang.

I tipped Kimi Räikkönen for a podium position. He won of course. Lotus demonstrated perfect tyre management, and made a two-stop strategy work when others, notably Mercedes, failed.

The Iceman's penultimate lap was pointedly the fastest lap of the race, on tyres that were 22 laps old. On this showing, I would tip Kimi to revisit the podium in Sepang. I understand that Kimi griped at having to rise early for Q2 and Q3, delayed from Saturday by the stormy weather in Melbourne. If so, he had clearly recovered his good humor by the time he won.

The Constructors' Championship scoreboard shows Ferrari top with 30 points, Lotus 26, Red Bull 23, Mercedes and Force India 10 and McLaren 2. There were five rookies in Melbourne

and no bad incidents. Max Chilton, who finished 17th for Marussia, looks like he belongs in F1. He's a classic driver to watch in the future. He had to stop for a wing change after a kiss with Van der Garde early in the race. Look to him to make midfield in Sepang.

Sepang will be hotter than Melbourne and better suited to the tyres. There is always a likelihood of rain to add spice to strategy which may help the best drivers. So it would be no surprise to see a podium of Kimi, Alonso and a wild card. Vettel, Massa, Webber and Sutil may all be in with a shout. Last year a rank outsider made the podium, and might have won, so who knows?

Qualifying for the Malaysian GP starts at 3pm on Saturday, and the race is at the same time on Sunday. Watch both with me!

Lampard defends Rio

FRANK Lampard understands Rio Ferdinand's reasons for pulling out of the squad for England's forthcoming World Cup qualifiers and said his former West Ham United teammate remains one of the best defenders in the Premier League.

Ferdinand's withdrawal from the squad on medical grounds on Monday has provided the main talking point ahead of Friday's match in San Marino, with British newspapers labeling the situation a "farce" and a "humiliation" for coach Roy Hodgson.

Premier League chairman Dave Richards joined the debate, saying Ferdinand's pull-out, a couple of days after saying he would join the squad, brought the game into "disrepute".

Lampard said he still relished turning out for his country but respected Ferdinand's decision to opt out because of the need to manage a long-term back complaint.

"I was sorry for him and the team. He's been in fantastic form but the important thing is now we're here, we get the results we need," Lampard told a news conference on Tuesday.

There are no personal issues, it's about results now. When you're 30 or more you have to maintain yourself differently," Lampard said at the team's headquarters in Burton.

"Rio has picked up a couple of injuries earlier in his career and he's kept on top of himself."

With Lampard's Chelsea team mate John Terry no longer available for England and several pull-outs on top of Ferdinand's Uturn, England are lacking experienced personnel in the center of their defense.

England, who are second in Group H and face leaders Montenegro on March 20, could do with Ferdinand's experience for the tough trip.

Lampard believes Ferdinand, who has 81 caps, could still appear for England again but insists the absence of several players through injury would allow others to step up.

"[Rio's] a top drawer player, he is not finished, you could see that with his performances against Madrid, he is a top performer and at the minute is one of the top defenders in the Premier League," Lampard said.

"These are moments you need a strong squad. You lose two, three or four in the same position and that would test any country, but this is a time for those young players to stand up. I believe in the squad and the players we've got in there.

'Sometimes little things like this make the squad focus even more."

While Ferdinand's international future is under a cloud, Lampard, with 94 caps, has set his sights on joining Steven Gerrard and Ashley Cole in England's 100-club.

"You know it won't go on forever and I appreciate playing for my country more than ever, he said. "If I get to 100, I will be very proud.

"I really don't know if Rio will play for England again. I know he is a very determined and professional lad...but I've known great England players to retire from international football at 29 or 30 if it benefits their career."

THE most unpredictable Six Nations Championship of recent years ended with yet more surprises: Wales as champions and France, tipped at the start as possible winners, holders of the 'wooden spoon'.

On the final, decisive Saturday, the shocks continued as Italy, this year's surprise packet, beat a lack-luster Ireland, clearly hampered by an appalling run of injuries and three yellow cards on the day. At a vociferous Stadio Olympico, Italy experienced a brief hiccup while their talismanic captain Parisse was dispatched to the sin-bin, but stormed back to record a convincing victory. Declan Kidney's role as Irish coach will come under intense scrutiny.

But the England vs Wales game was the one everyone was talking up, with England needing a win to achieve the coveted Grand Slam and Wales requiring victory by seven points to deprive them of the championship. It was also the ultimate audition for places on the Lions tour to Australia. The pre-match hype, with George North the Welsh wing, calling for a "blood bath" was predictably frenetic, with more sober critics just favoring Wales. And so it turned out, though the manner of the Welsh victory, by thirty points to three, was more than the most passionate Welshman could have hoped for.

From the first scrum, England were under the cosh, penalized at almost every put-in by the Australian referee. It was a significant omen. The team, for once

Indeed their whole back line, apart from fly-half, is likely to make the trip. Wales lost their first game. But how things can change in one short championship.

Nadal, Sharapova win Indian Wells

RAFA Nadal added another triumphant chapter to his remarkable comeback when he came from a set and 0-2 down to beat Juan Martin Del Potro of Argentina 4-6 6-3 6-4 in the BNP Paribas Open final on March 17.

The Spanish left-hander, who was sidelined for seven months last year with a left knee injury, overcame a gritty challenge from the hard-hitting Argentine to win a record 22nd ATP Masters title, and a third at Indian Wells.

Fifth seed Nadal broke Del Potro in the third game of the final set and, after his opponent had saved three match points in the ninth, served out to seal victory after an absorbing final that lasted two hours 29 minutes.

"I started the match playing fantastic, then Del Potro started playing a little more aggressive," 11-time grand slam champion Nadal, who moved fluently during the match, said courtside after hugging his opponent at the net.

"In my opinion, I tried to change too early against his forehand. I was plaving much too aggressive for my game. When I was able to calm myself, I began to play better. I started to play a little bit slower. My movement was unbelievable.

It was Nadal's 53rd ATP singles title, his third of the year after appearing in four successive finals, and his first on a hard-court surface since Tokyo in 2010.

The Spaniard made an impressive start, holding serve after a

marathon first game where he controlled a series of protracted baseline rallies, then breaking Del Potro in the second, though it took him four break points.

Nadal surprisingly failed to hold in the fifth after dictating almost every rally, losing the game when 2009 US Open champion Del Potro blasted a backhand crosscourt winner with his service return.

Growing in confidence and continually attacking with his forehand, the towering Argentine again broke Nadal in the ninth when his opponent blasted a forehand long. Del Potro then held serve to take

the first set in 54 minutes. An out-of-sorts Nadal failed to hold in the first game of the

second set, trailing 30-40 after a blistering forehand pass by the Argentine and then netting a fore-

hand to give Del Potro the break.

The next four games went with serve before Nadal, urged on by roars of "Rafa, Rafa, Rafa" that echoed around the Stadium Court, broke Del Potro in the sixth when the Argentine hit a forehand long.

The Argentine survived three breaks points before holding serve in an energy-sapping first game in the final set but he failed to hold in the third as the Spaniard crunched a forehand winner down the line to lead 2-1.

There was no way back from there for Del Potro, who had upset world number three Andy Murray in the quarter-finals and top-ranked Novak Djokovic in the last four.

He did well to save three match points after going 0-40 down on serve in the ninth before holding, but Nadal served out for victory

in the 10th, needing only one more match point to add a third Indian Wells title to his previous wins in 2007 and 2009.

Maria Sharapova played aggressively from the start to win her first title since last year's French Open with a 6-2 6-2 demolition of Caroline Wozniacki in the BNP Paribas Open final on March 17.

In a showdown between two former world number ones, the second-seeded Russian overpowered the Dane with a ruthless display. breaking her twice in each set to seal victory in one hour 21 minutes.

Sharapova was in attack mode throughout with an array of deep ground strokes and superb serving to claim her second title at Indian Wells after winning for the first time in 2006.

The 25-year-old Russian ended

the match in champion style with a 109 mph service winner before raising both arms skywards in celebration.

"What makes it so special is when you end up as the champion, that's why I am smiling," a beaming Sharapova said courtside after extending her run of at least one WTA title each year since 2003.

"It was a tough match, a tough battle, and there were a lot of games that went to deuce and a lot of long games.

"They could have easily swung the other way, especially some opportunities she had in that second set. But I always felt like I was a foot ahead, especially with the breaks. I was able to serve well today, and that helped me."

Prayad finally wins the Thailand Open

HUA Hin resident Prayad Marksaeng ended a five-year title drought in great style, firing a superb 64 in the final round to beat Australia's Scott Strange by two strokes to capture the US\$1 million (29mn baht) Thailand Open at Thana City Golf & Sports Club on March 17.

The 47-year-old said at the beginning of the tournament that the par 72, 6,966-yard layout, designed by Greg Norman, isn't very challenging. But, he was nowhere near the leaders in the last three days until making his move on the final day. Starting three shots behind leader Lucas Lee, the Thai sprinkled his round with nine birdies against just one bogey on the fifth and signed off in style with a winning 24-under 264.

"I had no pressure going into the final day as I was not the leader. I started well with three birdies and I kept the momentum going. I was pretty relaxed playing alongside Simon Yates [who is also based in Hua Hin]," said Prayad, who received a winner's cheque of US\$180,000 (5.2mn baht).

Prayad savoured the taste of an international trophy after a gap of five years. His last triumph came in the JGTO series, the Dunlop Phoenix Tournament in Japan in November 2008. By winning the Thailand Open, he became the third Thai to win the trophy, presented on behalf of His Majesty the King, after Suthep Meesawat in 1991 and Boonchu Ruangkit twice in 1992 and 2004.

"After I birdied on the 16th I knew I had the chance. I'm so proud to win this trophy of His Majesty the King. I would like to dedicate this victory to all the Thai people and I'm happy it belongs to a Thai," said Prayad, who has 10 international victories, six on the Asian Tour and four on the Japan Tour.

When asked how he felt, an emotional Prayad just said, "I'm happy." With his voice trembling, the Thai was simply too

overwhelmed to continue the post match interview. He later celebrated his long awaited international victory by jumping into the pond on the 18th hole. His 24-under equalled the tournament's record set by defending champion Chris Wood at the Suwan Golf Club last year.

"My goal from now is to have better results on the Japan Tour." said Pravad whose three previous Japan Tour victories came in 2008. He flew to Kuala Lumpur on March 18 to enter the European Tour sanctioned Maybank Malaysian Open.

While Prayad was hot on his heels, overnight leader Lee and strong contenders Mu Hu of China and defending champion Wood were pretty poor. Lee hit a 73 and had to settle with 18-under-par 270, Hu and Wood carded a 70 each for a 268 which placed them at tied fourth along with South Korea's Jung-gon Hwang, Min-gyu Cho, David McKenzie

Australia and Scotland's Simon Yates. Prayad's only main rival at the later stage

of the final round was Australian Strange who was trailing him by just one stroke going into the final hole. But the 2009 OneAsia No 1 hit his second shot into the bunker and had to finish with a bogey and a 67 for a total 22-under 266 for second, one ahead of compatriot Nick Cullen, with a 267

Last year's Asian Tour No 1 Thaworn Wiratchant saved the best for last as he carded a 63 for a four-day total of 18-under 270 to land at joint 12th along with Lucas Lee, South Korea's Kyoung-hoon Lee and Do-hoon Kim, Japan's Daisuke Maruyama, Kazuhiro Yamashita and Australia's Brad Kennedy and David Smail.

"I was putting very well today. 18 under is quite a good score and I think this week's field gives me some idea about how competitive the Japan Tour is," said Thaworn, who will play the next OneAsia series in Indonesia next week.

To create local interest in the sport, beach volleyball clinics and an inter-schools tournament will be held alongside the main event. - Phuket Gazette

Archers set their sights on Phuket

THE front lawn of the Blue Elephant restaurant in Phuket Town hosted a press conference held by the Phuket Archery Club on March 16, to announce the 3rd Phuket Archery Open, to be held April 6.

The organizer of the competition, Montree Thammakij, outlined the event saying: "We have 11 types of competition and 57 trophies, along with medals and certificates, which will be handed out by Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut.

"The object of this project is to improve [archers] skills through actual experience," he said.

The competition will have three categories; Recurve Bow, Compound Bow and Traditional Bow, over distances of 10, 18 and 30 meters. Each category will be split into three age groups: under-12 years, under-18 years and 18 and over. There will also be a team competition.

President of Phuket Archery Club, Bandit Santikul, noted that the club has some very skilled members in its ranks.

"We were founded about three years ago and [have since] sent our archers to participate in competitions around Thailand."

Narin Tantangtrong [boy's junior], won 3rd place using a Recurve Bow at an archery competition in the capital in September of 2012.

A Phuket Archery Club team finished 4th (Compound Bow men's general) at the 41st National Games held in Chiang Mai in December 2012, which was the first time archery was included in that competition.

Pann Tantangtrong won 2nd place (boy's under-12 years old) using a Recurve Bow at the recent Kasetsart Archery Competition, in January 2013.

The registration deadline for the Phuket Archery Open is March 31. The competition will be held at the Blue Elephant restaurant in Phuket Town on April 6.

The 3rd Phuket Archery Open schedule is below:

1-5pm: Team competition and the final round

5-6pm: Prize giving and closing ceremony by Saroj Angkanapilas, president of the Sport Association of Phuket

AFTER securing a first win of the season in their last match, the Village were confident of another successful outing against the current league leaders, Patong, who went down in their last match to Jabudays.

With only 3 points separating the top four teams, a win for the Village, last season's runners up, would put them back in contention, whereas a win for Patong would advance them one step closer to securing a finals berth. The Village posted a good score of 193-6 batting first. However, Patong eventually ran out comfortable winners, reaching their target scoring 196-7 in the 28th over.

After winning the toss, Patong put the Village into bat. The Village looked very determined to survive the initial 10 overs without loss, with Mark Roberts (25) and Craig Murphy (24) putting on a decent opening stand, until Roberts fell just two balls before drinks with the score on 38.

Martin Platts (11) then joined Murphy advancing the scoreboard to 54 runs before he was dismissed. However, Murphy and Martin Foster (32) then put on a useful 46 run partnership before Murphy lost his wicket in the 23rd over. Foster was joined by Danny Taylor (39), who combined for a 48 run partnership to take the score to 148, until Foster was bowled shortly before the 30 over drinks break.

Mark Whetton (15) and Mark Ashman (12 not out) also provided valuable contributions to enable the Village to reach their highest innings total this season with 193 runs after 35 overs. Pick of the bowlers for Patong were Kishor Jhagta (0 for 13 from 7 overs) and Dave Watson (2 for 37).

After the lunch break, Patong set out to chase down the Village total. However, they got off to a shaky start, losing three early wickets for only 28 runs and the Village had their tails up, hopeful of an upset. However, Patrick Morton (78) and Neil Quail (32) combined for a match winning 94 run partnership before Quail fell shortly before the 20 over drinks break with the score on 122.

Patong captain, Anthony Van Blerk (15) then joined Morton to advance the score to 151 runs for the loss of five wickets before he was dismissed. The Village desperately needed to take wickets as Patong were speeding along at a run rate of seven runs per over. They eventually claimed the prized scalp of Morton in the 25th over with the score on 171. However, Manish Sadarangani (21 not out) brought Patong home to victory in the 28th over. Pick of the bowlers for the Village were Craig Patterson (3 for 51). Tom Gordon (2 for 31) and Craig Murphy (2 for 45).

Patong have now extended their lead at the top of the table.

On Sunday, March 24, Patong take on the undefeated Laguna, who, with two matches in hand, will be looking to advance up the table. – Phuket Gazette

THE Southern Sea Warriors won their first Thailand Yamaha One League (YL1) game of the season, beating Suzuki Si Racha FC 3-1 in front of about 4,200 fans at Surakul Stadium last Saturday.

Last season, Phuket lost both of its YL1 league matches - home and away - against the Suzuki Si Racha 'Blue Marlins', but this year, the tide seems to have turned.

Phuket FC attacked Si Racha from the kickoff and their early pressure paid off in the 8th minute when Geoffrey Doumeng capitalized on a blocked shot by Sakareya Kolae to loft the ball over the keeper and into the goal from 10 yards out.

Phuket looked to be playing a 4-4-1-1 formation with the tireless Luiz "Dudu" Purcino chasing every pass in the final third, with Geoffrey Doumeng playing just behind him.

This blossoming partnership was a constant threat to Si Racha and in the 18th minute Dudu used his blistering pace to latch onto a through pass on the right and slip the ball under the advancing keeper from the just inside the box.

After the second goal, Phuket FC sat back and took the pressure off Si Racha, who capitalized on this by pulling a goal back when

Sutjarit Chantakol rose the highest to win a header from a corner in the 43^{rd} minute.

The half time team talk revitalized Phuket and they started the second half in the same manner they started the first.

Geoffrey Doumeng, who was the game's man of the match, was at the heart of every attack for Phuket and his composure on the ball and eye for a pass caused Si Racha a lot of problems.

Phuket's third goal was scored by Dudu converting a misplaced shot by Doumeng past Si Racha's goal keeper.

The Southern SeaWarriors first win of the season moved them up to third in the league on five points. Si Racha are bottom of the league with only one point from three games.

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








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
