Kata tuk-tuks to stand alone

■ Tuk-tuk and taxi drivers in Kata-Karon vow to protest new bus service

PRESSURE is mounting on the Kata-Karon taxi and tuktuk drivers who have declared outright they will protest if Phuket's new bus line, providing a hop-on, hop-off service between Phuket International Airport and Kata Beach, goes ahead.

Key figures representing about 90 per cent of tuk-tuk and taxi drivers in Patong confirmed this week they will stand aside if the provincial authorities support and approve the new bus service, and Karon Police, while sympathetic, urged drivers to consider the bigger picture.

Long known for using fear and intimidation as negotiation tactics, the drivers at the southern resort beaches of Kata and Karon on January 3 staged a blockade of the Karon beach road to protest Russian tour operators not using local drivers to transport tourists. Among the complaints were claims that the Russian tour operators were undercutting local tuk-tuk and taxi fares.

Their reputation this week remained intact after a promotional journey for the new bus service – from Provincial Hall in Phuket Town to the site of the proposed bus stop....

Booze-free water play zones set for Songkran

THE sale, purchase and consumption of alcohol will be banned on Patong's famous Soi Bangla for Songkran on April 12 as part of a slew of new measures being introduced to make Thai New Year festivities safer.

Phuket officials on Wednesday established six main "water play zones" - the only places where water play will be legal - and outlawed alcohol in those zones.

Alcohol may not be conveyed into the areas, sold in the areas, or consumed there.

The zones are as follows:

- Saphan Hin Park
- Kata-Karon beachfront
- Soi Bangla and Patong beach road - Kamala Park
- Surin Beach
- Sirinath National Park

Revelers caught drinking and driving will be charged, as will those found drinking alongside public roads.

Police will also charge people for throwing water "impolitely", for using colored water, and for touching women inappropriately when applying powder, said

In addition, police will be manning 15 checkpoints throughout Phuket during the Seven Days of Danger, April 11-17.

Water play areas are being set up on a national level, with zones set at the provincial governor's discretion, announced Deputy Interior Minister Chat Kuldilok on

Water play from the back of pickup trucks has also been forbidden at the national level.

"The number of road accidents during Songkran is much more than normal, so this year we have launched new road-safety plans," Mr Chat said.

...at Karon – was called off at the last minute on Wednesday after the organizers realized that Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut would not be on board for the trip.

Governor Maitri was busy attending a meeting to outline the alcohol-free water-play zones for Songkran, and to announce the dates of the annual Seven Days of Danger road-safety campaign for the upcoming holiday period.

Calling off the promotional journey may have been prudent, as only days earlier Sommart Homwan, president of the Kata-Karon Taxi and Tuk-tuk Driver's Co-operative, told the Gazette bluntly: "You run, we protest."

Mr Sommart said the bus services would directly affect local drivers' livelihoods. "If they are

going to run the airport bus service, we will surely stage a protest. The airport bus service will definitely affect us. They are going to steal our jobs," he said.

and head of the Patong Taxi Federation said, "I do not think our drivers will protest the airport

I believe our 500 members will surely understand if the Phuket Transportation Office explains to them clearly why the bus was approved and how it will be beneficial to the tourism of the island.

"We, Patong people, we are understanding. We live in a tourism destination. What we want is to develop our area to make it attractive to tourists and support the tourism economics of Phuket. We do not want to do anything that will tarnish Phuket's reputation," Mr Prab said.

Setthasak Buason, president of the Patong Taxi and Tuk-tuk Driver's Co-operative, admitted the bus service would greatly affect his members, but also said his drivers were willing to make the sacrifice for the greater good.

"I am sure our 300 members will not protest. If the provincial government approves it, that means it would be beneficial to Phuket as a whole. If the bus service is approved, that means our superiors believe it will bring more advantages than disadvantages to our community, so it will be a good thing," he explained.

However, Mr Setthasak said there were about 100 independent tuk-tuk and taxi drivers operating in Patong not accounted for by the main two co-operatives.

"I do not know how they will react," he said.





Teens survive high-speed crash

RUSSIAN student Vladislan Abrashko, 15, is out of the ICU at Phuket International hospital after the horrific motorcycle accident last Saturday that left him with a broken leg and Sevastan Lukashov, 16, with serious head injuries.

A cast covering his leg, Mr Abrashko was resting in his hospital room on Wednesday morning, accompanied by his father and Simon Meredith, Principal of the Secondary School at British International School – Phuket.

Mr Abrashko appeared to be comfortable, with his iPhone by his side, and told the *Gazette*, "I want to rest. I'm not ready to give any information yet."

The hospital declined to give an update on the condition of Mr Lukashov.

Meanwhile, the driver of the car involved in the collision, Wannakij Maneerat, was in hospital herself, complaining of pain, Wichit Police Sub Lt Somboon Malai told the *Gazette* Wednesday afternoon.

"She said she didn't have any wounds, but had internal pains," Lt Somboon told the *Gazette*.

The headmaster of BIS, Neil Richards MBE, issued a statement on Tuesday, saying in part: "The

school is assisting the parents of the boys as much as possible, and the thoughts and best wishes of our entire community are offered to them during this stressful period."

Meanwhile, sympathies for the two students poured out on Facebook.

Sasha Podgaetskaya posted,

"Pray for Vlad Abrashko and Sevastian Lukashov! They are now in International hospital. Vlad Abrashko broke his leg in 3 places, but he is ok and will get better soon. Sevastian Lukashov is now in coma, he had a 5 hour operation on his head. Especially pray for Sevastian Lukashov!"

Lesya Tyshchenko posted,

"That's horrible. Saw them today and felt so sorry for them. Hope they would get better soon. Praying for them."

The accident that sent all three to the hospital occurred at about 1pm on the bypass road.

"Ms Wannakij, 39, was driving her car southbound from [Tesco] Lotus. She slowed to turn right at the u-turn leading into Soi Bang Yai," Lt Somboon explained.

"As she was turning right, a big bike was heading north from Big C and the two collided. The impact sent the motorcycle 30 meters into a nearby Sino-Portuguese building, where it burst into flames, destroying the bike and damaging the building," he said.

Police found the boys 50 meters from the crash site, unconscious. Mr Abrashko's right leg was broken and he had a wound on his right knee. Mr Lukashov had also injured his right knee and was bleeding from both ears.

They were taken to nearby Phuket International Hospital.

The front of Ms Wannakij's Honda was extensively damaged, and both front airbags had deployed.

"Ms Wannakij's insurance will pay the hospital bills and also cover the damage to the Sino-Portuguese building," Lt Somboon said.

"Both youths are now at the Phuket International hospital. We will question them when they are better, and will then start negotiations with Mrs Wannakij," he added.

Phuket doctors unaffected by health care pay reform

THE Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO) today confirmed that the introduction of the new P4P "Pay for performance" system of calculating rural doctors' remuneration will not affect any public health care services in Phuket.

The news follows at least 146 doctors – among them 11 specialists –announcing they will resign their positions at public hospitals across the country in protest of the new P4P pay system.

The mass resignations follow weeks of protests in Bangkok.

"Previously, public medical workers in rural areas were granted allowances based on the remoteness of their posts and the number of years they had worked. Now the allowances are based on their workload," an officer at the PPHO explained.

However, "Under the Ministry of Health, no part of Phuket province is classified as a rural area, so the introduction of P4P does not affect us, and no medical staff in Phuket have resigned over this," the officer added.

Hotels warned to report foreign guests

HOTELS and other guest accommodation establishments across the island have until May 1 to start filing daily reports identifying their guests to Phuket Immigration before officers start raiding – and charging – the hotel operators.

The news follows Phuket Immigration Superintendent Sunchai Chokkajaykij laying down the law to his officers, ordering them to launch a campaign to get hotels, resorts and apartment residence operators to report the names of their foreign guests to the immigration office each day.

By law, hotel, apartment and resort owners and staff must re-

port the identity of each foreign guest to the immigration office within 24 hours of the guest checking in, Col Sunchai said.

"If they do not start filing the daily reports to us, they will be

fined up to 2,000 baht. If they know the foreigner is illegally in the country and still allow that foreigner to stay, they will be charged with harboring an illegal immigrant and face up to 10 years imprisonment," he warned.

Immigration officer Capt Angkarn Yasanop explained that hoteliers and staff can file the reports online at phuketimmigration. go.th.

To boost the number of hotels using the system, Capt Angkarn and fellow officers have started visiting venues across the island in person to explain the system to hotel management and staff.

Gov orders justice over land dispute arson attack

PHUKET Governor Maitri Inthusut has ordered the Chalong Police to take swift action in bringing to justice the three men seen setting homes ablaze in Chalong in the early hours of March 27.

Windy conditions helped the fire destroy three wooden houses in Soi Palai in just 30 minutes.

Sombat Suwit told the *Gazette* he had no time to lose in escaping the blaze. "It was too fast. I didn't have any time to grab anything from my house. Now I have nothing left."

Mr Sombat said he saw three men acting suspiciously nearby. "They took off on a motorcycle, but I cannot remember the license plate number," he added.

"I believe the fire was started over a land dispute. An investor claims to own the land we live on, but we have been living here for a long, long time," Mr Sombat said.

"There are many land ownership problems in Phuket and I want to see justice served in this case," Gov Maitri said.

Marine chief floats sea taxi idea

TO OFFER tourists another option in getting from Phuket Airport to Patong Beach, the chief of the Phuket Marine Office has proposed launching a "sea taxi" to ferry passengers down the island's west coast.

The project is called "From the boat to the plane", Chief Phuriphat Teerakulpisut told a meeting at the Phuket Treasury Office last week.

"Many tourists visit Phuket each year – last year we had around 9.5 million tourists. Currently, the only way to travel from Phuket Airport to other tourist attractions on the island is by car. Since the population is growing and more and more people are buying cars, the traffic is getting worse," he said.

"We want to help alleviate the traffic problem and offer tourists a better way of traveling by opening a boat route from the airport to Patong Beach," Mr Phuriphat said.

Considering the current state of Phuket's traffic congestion, Mr Phuriphat even ventured that passengers taking a boat from the

airport would reach Patong faster than they would if they travelled by car.

"Tourists will arrive at Patong Beach faster by boat because the distance is shorter," he observed.

"Traveling by car usually takes about an hour. In rush hour, it takes 90 minutes. But traveling by speedboat would take only 25 minutes, and by tour boat would be only 40 minutes," he sug-

gested.

"I think this project is a good idea. Phuket is growing and more transport options are needed. It will be more convenient, and more impressive, for tourists arriving on the island. They could save time while enjoying their trip," Mr Phuripat concluded.

"We could even add more routes from the airport to other places around the island," he added

Mr Phuriphat's sea taxi proposal was well received at the meeting, though the other attendees agreed that more research was needed before committing to the project.

Phuket Vice Governor Sommai Prijasilpa's support also came with a few riders.

"I agree with the idea, but the relevant officers have to learn more about the laws involved, such as local planning laws, if they are going to continue the project," she said.

Vice Governor Sommai also pointed out that the area where the pier will need to be built at the airport belongs to the Phuket branch of the national air traffic control authority, Aeronautical Radio of Thailand (Aerothai).

"So the construction of the pier might affect the safety of planes landing and taking off at the airport," she said.

"We also have to consider the current expansion of Phuket Airport. We have to discuss with Aerothai and the airport management [Airports of Thailand] to see if it is possible to move ahead with this project," V/Gov Sommai said.

Luckless fisherman lands baby crocodile

DECADES since a freshwater crocodile was last spotted in the wild on Phuket, a local fisherman accidentally landed a baby specimen while fishing in Srisoonthorn last week.

Khamchit Sangsuwan, 32, a resident in the neighboring district of Kathu, went fishing at Baan Bang Jo canal. After two hours of luckless angling, the end of his line suddenly started jerking and there was much splashing where it entered the water.

Thinking he had caught a large fish, Mr Khamchit reeled in the baby croc instead, about 80cm long and weighing about 2kg, just before dusk.

Excitement whipped through the village as people came running to see the animal, but from a safe distance.

"The villagers tied its mouth shut with rope because the crocodile tried to bite them," Thalang Police Deputy Superintendent Amnuay Kraiwutthianun.

"The crocodile was taken to Phuket Coastal Fisheries Research and Development Center in Wichit for safe keeping and for study," Lt Col Amnuay said.

Getting ready for the 'big dry'

Authorities lay out plans in case island's water reserves begin to evaporate after Phuket's driest first quarter in 10 years

THE forecast for isolated, scattered showers across Phuket during the run-up to the Songkran festival will offer little reprieve to the island's ongoing dry spell, which is Phuket's driest January-to-March period in a decade, experts have warned.

"The average rainfall during January to March over the past 10 years is 277.71mm, but this year we received only 63.3mm," said Phuket Meteorological Officer Suchart Yonchamroen.

"That is the lowest recorded rainfall for this period in 10 years," he added.

This year's early quarter contrasts with that of last year, when a record 541.8mm drenched the island, Mr Suchart noted.

As of Wednesday, the Thai Meteorological Department predicted only a 10-20% chance of drizzle across Phuket for the coming week, and the forecast was for temperatures to soar to 36°C.

The annual rains usually arrive in late April, but if they are late, the water situation for some parts of Phuket Town may be critical, Mr Suchart said.

Phuket Municipality Deputy Mayor Thavorn Jirapattanasophon said that water supplies for Phuket Town, Samkong, Chaofa and Sakdidet areas are enough to last until the end of April.

However, he urged residents to save water until the rains arrive, especially those living in the Chaofa and Sakdidet areas.

"These areas are supplied by the Suan Luang reservoir, and that reservoir is dry," he said.

"Normally when we do not have enough water in Suan Luang reservoir, we buy water from a private company. This year that company is selling some of its water reserves to the Provincial Waterworks Authority [PWA], so we won't be getting as much.

"I urge everyone to help conserve water or store water at home," he said.

If need be, affected areas in Phuket Town will be placed on water rations, Deputy Mayor Thavorn warned.

"If the situation becomes critical, we will reduce water pressure, ration the water so it is turned on and off at set times each day, and supply water to some areas with a water truck," he stated.

Mr Thavorn hoped that such drastic measures would not be necessary, as he has a backup plan of buying water from the PWA.

"We have signed a contract to buy water from the PWA, so if they have enough water we should have enough water too," he said.

PWA Manager Pisak Chonlayut confirmed to the *Gazette* that the water on hand in Bang Neaw Dum reservoir and at the Bang Wad Dam is enough to support Phuket Province until the rains arrive.

"Although there hasn't been much rain, we have enough water

to supply the whole province for three to four months," he said.

Mr Pisak is so confident of his water reserves that he told the *Gazette*, "Don't worry. We will have enough water to freely celebrate Songkran."

However, like Phuket Town Deputy Mayor Thavorn, Mr Pisak also has a backup plan.

"In the unlikely event that our water reserves aren't enough, we will buy more from Loch Palm and Chaofa reservoirs. We've already signed a contract with the owners of those supplies," he said.

"We have about 5.9 million cubic meters of water in Bang Niew Dum reservoir to support Thalang, Cherng Talay, Pa Khlok, Koh Sireh and Rassada. Last year at this time we had 7.2mn cubic meters.

"There are 2.9mn cubic meters at the Bang Wad Dam to support Phuket Town, Patong, Chalong and Rawai. Last year at this time there were 3.7 mn cubic meters.

"For the Kata and Karon areas, we have contracted a private company to supply desalinated sea water at a rate of about 12,000 cubic meters per day," he said.

Series of phone calls rescues Call of the wild answered at Mai Khao turtle release

THE Mai Khao Marine Turtle Foundation and JW Marriott Phuket Resort and Spa hosted the 4th Mai Khao Turtle Release on the afternoon of March 29.

The important annual event is organized to raise funds for, and awareness of, the plight of Phuket's critically endangered sea

Supported by the Phuket Marine Biological Center and the Royal Thai Navy, the event released rehabilitated green turtles back into the Andaman Sea.

Local officials, Phuket residents and resort staff enjoyed an afternoon of fun activities and light refreshments and witnessed the rewarding sight of the turtles entering their natural habitat.

Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut gave a speech highlighting the importance of the Mai Khao Marine Turtle Foundation before releasing the first turtle to scuttle across the sand.

In total, about 100 turtles were released.

Phuket's sea turtles face multiple threats and their numbers have been severely depleted in recent years.

Commercial fishing kills thousands of them every year. Many more die from eating or becoming trapped in plastic debris littering the ocean, not to mention entanglement in fishing nets and being hit by speedboats.

The work done by the Mai Khao Marine Turtle Foundation (founded by JW Marriott Phuket Resort & Spa), the Injured Turtle Rehabilitation Program (under the Phuket Marine Biological Center)



Rolling truck crushes owner against tree

A CONCRETE well ring vendor died in Thalang on March 27 after his crane truck rolled down a slope and one of the outriggers – arms used to stabilize the truck – crushed him against a coconut tree.

Thalang Police were notified that a man had died at a coconut plantation behind Baan Chumpoh Mosque in Pa Khlok at about 4pm.

"One of the villagers wanted to dig a well so he ordered three concrete well rings from Watthikorn Anukulpaiboon, 58," Lt Chatree said.

"Mr Watthikorn parked his truck and set out the outriggers on each side of the truck to hold it in position. He did not notice that he had parked the truck on a slope," he added.

After he finished unloading the concrete rings, the truck, now lighter without the rings on the back platform, lifted on its suspension and started to roll. Mr Watthikorn was dragged by the outrigger until it reached a coconut tree and stopped, Lt Chatree explained.

"Mr Watthikorn was crushed between the tree and the outrigger and died. The owner of the plantation and his staff saw the incident but they could not stop the truck or help Mr Watthikorn in time," he said.

Fugitive caught with M16

Man rams three checkpoints from Khao Lak to Phang Nga Town

A MURDER fugitive on the run for a decade was arrested in Phang Nga on March 28 after an armed drug binge ended with police shooting out his tyres.

It took about 30 officers to get him into custody.

Phonchai "Bao" Phetrit, from Trang, wanted by Ladprao Police in Bangkok on a murder warrant issued in 2003, was finally placed under arrest after he rammed through three checkpoints.

The pursuit began after police received reports of a man firing an M16 into the air at Baan Bang La On, north of Khao Lak Beach.

"Villagers said that after firing a gun into the air, he jumped into a pickup truck and sped off southward toward Khao Lak," Phang Nga Provincial Police Commander Chalit Kaewyarat said.

"He rammed through the Khao Lak police checkpoint, then headed to Tai Muang and broke through another checkpoint at the Lamkan Intersection, heading toward Phang Nga Town," he added.

Phonchai then rammed through another checkpoint at the Nop Pring T-junction, heading toward Phang Nga Town.

"We used a truck to block the

road in Thap Pud and gathered all the police officers we could muster from three police stations," Gen Chalit said.

"Seeing the roadblock and all the officers, he started to turn the pickup around, so our officers shot out his two front tyres," he added.

Police spent 20 minutes cau-

tiously persuading him to surrender.

In the pickup, they found the M-16 and two magazines containing 11 bullets, as well as a .357 Smith and Wesson revolver and bullets.

"We also seized black magic paraphernalia," Gen Chalit said.

"The suspect confessed that he took *ya ice* [crystal methamphet-

amine] the night before.

"He admitted that the guns belonged to him, but claimed he did not want to harm anyone. He said he carried them with him at all times because he believed that if he shot into the air, his pain, through black magic, would disappear," Gen Chalit said.

Ongoing trash fires cause evacuations on Koh Lanta

VILLAGERS on Koh Lanta have evacuated their homes because of respiratory problems caused by landfill garbage fires which local authorities say they are unable to control.

The villagers sought to publicize the trash burning problem about three weeks ago by appealing to the Krabi Press Club, saying that local authorities had ignored the issue.

On April 1, villagers again reported to the Krabi Press that smoke from the fire was in areas as far as two kilometers from the landfill.

"We reported our problem to the press last month, but we are still being ignored," said Wissanu Kokyai, a village headman in the area.

"About 10 households with babies have been

San Wachedi, president of the Saladan Tambon Administration Organization (OrBorTor), admitted the landfill area was his responsibility, but said, "It is beyond our authority to fix the problem."

"We tried to put out the fire with water, but it did not work because the landfill is too big.

"We will spread out the garbage and continue spraying water on it," Mr San said.

"I will take the problem to the district chief and Krabi governor to ask for help in resolving it," Mr San said.

Monk impersonator run out of town

A SHAMBOLIC fake monk recently attracted the suspicions of local people in Nakhon Ratchasima Province – and the attention of the police – by trying to collect alms in the afternoon.

Villagers called officers to investigate a man who claimed to be a monk but was improperly dressed, collected alms late and sometimes even asked for money instead of food.

At Phimai Irrigation Reservoir, police found the scruffy figure of Sawaeng Prasertnu, 36.

Mr Sawaeng was wearing a monk's inner garment and trousers – both completely different shades of brown – but had not wrapped himself in an outer robe, as Thai monks are required to do.

Mr Sawaeng told the officer he

had been a monk for one year already at a temple in Nakhon Phanom Province.

However, he couldn't remember the name of the monk he was studying under.

He said he was travelling around the country because he didn't like staying at the temple, preferring to move from place to place on his own.

Local villagers all told Lt Phonphawi the same thing: that the supposed monk showed up to collect alms in the late morning or even as late as 2-3pm.

Monks in Thailand usually collect alms in the early morning and do not eat after noon.

Sometimes Mr Sawaeng would even ask for money, saying that he did so because he was not allowed to accept food in the afternoon.

Officers decided to take Mr Sawaeng to a local temple but had to grab him by the legs to get him into their vehicle.

At the temple, the abbot was busy with a ceremony, so could not verify if Mr Sawaeng was a real monk.

Police settled for another solution: they drove him out of Phimai District and told him he would be arrested if he ever returned.

High-speed rail draws support, controversy

A GOVERNMENT bill to borrow some 2 trillion baht to finance massive infrastructure projects has sailed through its first reading in Parliament, bringing a highspeed rail link between Bangkok and Chiang Mai closer to reality.

But the plan came under fierce attack by the opposition, who claim it will leave the Thai people indebted for decades to come.

Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra was widely ridiculed on social media for promoting the plan by claiming the new fast links would allow farmers to transport produce without it rotting.

After two days of fierce debate, the bill authorizing the government to seek 2trn baht in off-budget loans passed easily on March 29 by 284 votes to 152 against.

The plan will entail upgrading the current rail network as well as building high-speed links between Bangkok and Chiang

Mai, Nakhon Ratchasima, Rayong and Hua Hin. The new routes are planned to be in place by 2020.

But Thailand will need to pay back 5trn baht once interest is taken into account, leading critics to claim the plan would bankrupt the country.

The Democrat Party claimed that tickets from Bangkok to Chiang Mai would cost as much as 2,000 baht, saying the plans would benefit only the rich. It also said the Pheu Thai Party was serving its vote base while punishing the people of the South by failing to include a line running to the Malaysian border.

Asked why the project could not be funded by running budget deficits, Finance Minister Kittiratt Na-Ranong said doing so would contradict government policy of running balanced budgets. Mr Kittiratt added that most of the funds would come from the domestic financial market, so the income from interest payments would end up in the pockets of the Thai people.



'I'm still alive' tweets Thaksin

FORMER Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra took to Twitter for the first time in more than a year last week to let his followers know he was still alive.

Mr Thaksin's comments came in response to a rumor spreading on social media that he had died in a car crash in Dubai.

In a sequence of tweets, Mr Thaksin, who lives in self-exile in the Arab state to avoid a two-year jail sentence for corruption, wrote:

"Please allow me to tweet and clarify that I am doing fine. There was no such accident as in the fabricated story. It's April 1, April Fools' Day," he said.

Meanwhile, Mr Thaksin's son Panthongtae made an April Fools' joke of his own, posting on Facebook that his father had returned to Thailand and had registered to run in Chiang Mai MP by-election.

Leaning tower of Pathum Thani

A NEW seven-story building under construction near Bangkok has been declared off-limits by officials after it started tilting at a perilous six-degree angle.

Public works officials with Khu Khot Municipality in Pathum Thani, who have jurisdiction over the site, inspected the apartment building behind the Zeer department store last Sunday night, *The Nation* reported.

They made the inspection after being hit by complaints from local residents. After visiting the building, they ordered that construction stop immediately.

Thanes Weerasiri, head of the Engineering Institute of Thailand, said the building had tilted at six degrees and should be demolished, or heightened and rebuilt.

The tilting was caused by the foundation not being solid enough,

and the stakes being unable to manage the total weight. Heightening of the building could cost the project owner the same amount of money needed to demolish and rebuild it, he said.

"Personally I think it should be

demolished and rebuilt," he said.

Signboards showing details of the project, including its owner, had been removed since the news emerged, except for one notice about the construction firm: Choke Charoen Co Ltd.

146 rural doctors to quit over P4P pay

THE Public Health Ministry's new medical salary system has prompted 146 doctors nationwide to resign from rural and urban hospitals, affecting medical services for people in local areas.

Some doctors have chosen to work at private hospitals after learning that the ministry's new medical salary system would cut their additional allowances, they say unfairly.

Among the doctors leaving the public healthcare system are 11 specialists who provide medical care for complicated conditions, according Dr Arak Wongworachart, a former president of the Rural Doctors Society.


To date, 3,425 doctors work at 723 rural hospitals across the country.

Under the Health Ministry's system – from April 1 this year – 614 of 736 rural hospitals nationwide will cut allowances, based

on remoteness, for their medical workers.

"The resignation of doctors and specialists from rural hospitals has seriously affected the medical services for people living in remote areas – meaning people will have to travel long distances to get treatment at hospitals in [their nearest] town," he said.

The total number of doctors who resigned from hospitals nationwide was calculated by the Rural Doctors Society during February and March, after the ministry initiated its plan to adjust the additional allowance for medical workers.

FUGITIVE WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange, holed up in London's Ecuadorian embassy for nine months, has appointed a highprofile opponent of Britain's monarchy to run his campaign for a seat in Australia's upper house of par-

Former Australian Republican Movement head and barrister Greg Barns said on Monday he would be campaign director for Assange's absentee bid for a Senate seat in Australia's September 14 election, which even if successful would not bring him any legal protection.

Prosecutors seek death penalty for Dark Knight shooter

PROSECUTORS in Colorado will seek the death penalty for accused movie theater gunman James Holmes in the slaying of 12 people during a showing of the Batman film The Dark Knight Rises, the lead prosecutor said in court this week.

Holmes, a 25-year-old former graduate student of neuroscience, is accused of opening fire inside a suburban Denver multiplex during a midnight screening of the movie last July in a rampage that ranked as one of the deadliest mass shootings in the United States.

Indian sex attacks cause drop in female tourists

A SURVEY of 1,200 tour operators across India has indicated that the number of female tourists has dropped by 35 percent in the past three months.

India's Associated Chambers of Commerce and Industry, which conducted the survey, on Monday attributed the fall to brutal sexual assaults that made international headlines in recent months.

Brazilian doctor charged with 7 murders, may have killed 300

A BRAZILIAN doctor who was charged with killing seven patients to free up beds in a hospital intensive care unit may have been responsible for as many as 300 deaths, according to a Health Ministry investigator.

Prosecutors said Dr Virginia Soares de Souza and her medical team administered muscle relaxing drugs to patients, then reduced their oxygen supply, causing them to die of asphyxia at the Evangelical Hospital in the southern city of Curitiba.

De Souza, a 56-year-old widow, was arrested last month and charged with seven counts of aggravated first degree murder. Three other doctors, three nurses and a physiotherapist who worked under De Souza have also been charged with murder.

Prosecutors said wiretaps of De Souza's phone conversations revealed her motive was to free up hospital beds for other patients.

'I want to clear the intensive care unit. It's making me itch," she said in one recording released to Brazilian media. "Unfortunately, our mission is to be go-betweens on the springboard to the next life," she added.

De Souza's lawyer, Elias Mattar Assad, said investigators misunderstood how an intensive care unit works and would prove De Souza's innocence.

More cases are expected to emerge as investigators comb through 1,700 medical records of patients who died in the past seven years at the hospital, where De Souza headed the intensive care unit.

"We already have more than 20 cases established, and there are nearly 300 more that we are looking into," Dr Mario Lobato, the chief investigator assigned by Brazil's Health Minister, The Evangelical Hospital



said on Brazil TV last Sunday.

If prosecutors prove that De Souza killed 300 patients, this could be one of the world's worst serial killings, rivaling the notorious case of Harold Shipman, the English doctor who was found to have killed at least 215 patients.

China downplays Korea tension

A SHOW of force by US stealth jets over the Korean Peninsula after talk of war by Pyongyang this week has caused only minor concern in China, a measure of Beijing's belief that the North is to blame for the tensions and that hostilities are not imminent.

The presence of US forces in places such as South Korea and Japan has long worried Beijing, feeding its fears that it is being surrounded and "contained" by Washington and its allies, especially following the US strategic

North Korea on Tuesday also announced plans to restart a nuclear reactor that has been closed since 2007, but emphasised it was seeking a deterrent capacity, rather than repeating recent threats to attack South Korea and the United States.

The state-owned KCNA news agency said North Korea would restart all nuclear facilities for both electricity and military uses.

The news prompted an immediate response from United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, who on Tuesday publicly stated the North Korea crisis had gone too far and urged dialogue and negotiation to resolve the situation.

"Nuclear threats are not a game. Aggressive rhetoric and military

posturing only result in counteractions, and fuel fear and instability," Ban said.

However, the flying of B-2 and F-22 stealth jets in joint exercises with South Korea, bringing US military might virtually to China's doorstep, has barely generated a response from Beijing except for a generic call for calm and restraint.

Last month's announcement that the US would strengthen its anti-missile defenses due to the North's threats also elicited only mild criticism from China.

"All these new actions from the US side are not targeted at China," said Ni Lexiong, a military expert at the Shanghai University of Political Science and Law.

Another well-connected Chinese military expert, speaking on condition of anonymity due to the sensitivity of discussing Chinese defense policy, said China believed the US presence in Korea acted

as a necessary restraint on troublesome Pyongyang, hence the lack of criticism from Beijing.

China has long been accustomed to living with its unpredictable "frenemy" neighbor, a country valued as a bulwark against the US and feared as a source of dangerous instability.

"It's not the first time North Korea has used such strong language. They often say this. I think they are probably playing a game. It's to do with what sort of person Kim Jong-un is, and his young age," said Jia Qingguo, an international relations professor at the elite Peking University.

"I really don't think they will resort to using their weapons.

Maj Gen (Rtd) Luo Yuan, one of China's most outspoken military figures, expressed a degree of sympathy with North Korea last week, writing that the country was only trying to push the international community to properly guarantee its security and wanted normal ties with Washington.

War was unlikely, Luo added.

"Once the joint US-South Korean exercises have finished and with birthday celebrations for [late founder of North Korea] Kim Ilsung imminent, the temperature will gradually cool and get back to the status quo of no war, no unification," he wrote.

Concerns remain for Mandela

SOUTH Africa's anti-apartheid hero Nelson Mandela, who is being treated in hospital for pneumonia, was visited by members

of his family on Monday after doctors had reported an improvement in his condition over the weekend.

A statement from South Africa's president said there was significant change" in the condition of the 94-year-old former president, who Nelson Mandela

has been in hospital since late Wednesday suffering from the recurrence of a lung infection.

"Former President Mandela is still in hospital where he is receiving treatment... He spent part of Family Day [Easter Monday] today with some members of his family," the statement from President Jacob Zuma's office said.

In their previous bulletin late on



Sunday, the medical team treating Mandela said he had a "restful day" and had shown further improvement after a procedure to drain excess fluid from around his lungs. Doctors had already said he was breathing without difficulty.

Mandela's latest

treatment is his third visit to hospital in four months, generating worldwide concern over the health of the revered statesman and Nobel Peace Prize laureate, who became South Africa's first black president in 1994.

B28bn worth of 20-baht notes to get exchanged

An initial lot of 200 million new banknotes began entering circulation since April 1

AS PART of the Bank of Thailand's (BoT) policy to make its banknotes more modern and user friendly, 4 billion baht worth of new series-16 20-baht banknotes are being put into circulation.

Until now, the Kingdom's lowest-value, yet most widely used banknotes have not been fraud-proof in synchronizing with electronic finance machines.

"The new design incorporates a range of advanced anti-counterfeit features to facilitate authentication by banknote sorting machines, vending machines and the general public, including visually impaired persons," Tongurai Limpiti, BoT deputy governor, explained last week at a press conference to launch the new banknotes.

Like the new 50-baht bank notes issued last year, the new 20 baht banknotes are marked with braille indicating the value of the note (the braille symbol 2 for 20-baht and 5 for 50-baht).

The new banknotes should now be available for exchange at commercial banks in Phuket and nationwide.

Ms Tongurai said that there are currently about 1.4 billion 20-baht banknotes in circulation (28 billion baht), which represents 35% of four billion – the total number of all types of banknotes in circulation.

Ms Tongurai said that within one year, the BoT will look to replace all series 15 notes, which have been in circulation for as much as 10 years.

She insisted that their would not be a shortage in 20-baht banknotes, adding that the base cost for each new banknote was only 80 satang, about 33% less than the series 15 average cost of 1.2 baht per banknote.

The series 16 banknote is still green, and will be the same size as its predecessor. Among the key security features are a watermark depicting the portrait of HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej alongside the number 20 clearly visible when viewed against the light.

"The portrait of King Rama IX in the Royal House of Chakri gown will be displayed on the front of the banknote. On the back will be the images of the royal statue of King Ramkhamhaeng.

"Another security feature is color-shift along the thread located on the back of the note. It is embedded inside the paper and partially emerges to the surface at regular intervals. Its color changes from green to magenta when viewed from different angles, Ms Tongurai explained.

Also, irregular shapes printed on both sides combine to form the numeral 20 when the note is held up to the light.

To help visually impaired people identify the new note, it features raised letters and numerals and two tactile marks in the shape of flowers, which represent the number 2 in braille.

The announcement of the new 20 baht banknote follows the issuing of a new 16 series 50-baht banknote last year.

The BoT will gradually replace all five types of series 15 banknotes – 20, 50, 100,

500 and 1000 notes, Ms Tongurai said.

She explained the reason for starting with 20 and 50 baht notes: "Since ATM machines don't use these banknotes, there has been negative impacts for the financial system as

well as [economic and disabled] minorities.

"The new series can be exchanged at commercial banks. The existing and previous series still remain legal tender, Ms Tongurai added.

Job fair expected to fill 30% of vacancies

OF THE 6,000 job vacancies offered through the "e-jobs@Phuket 2013" job fair held last weekend at Phuket Rajbhat University, only 118 positions were immediately filled, the *Gazette* has learned.

Phuket Provincial Employment Office chief Yawapa Pibulpol said that a total of 1,578 job applications were submitted.

Of these, she said that 548 were submitted at the fair itself, while the rest were submitted online leading up to the event.

The available positions – in Phuket, as well as in neighboring provinces such as Krabi and Phang Nga – were at more than 100 companies, including hotels, shopping malls, medical clinics and real estate businesses.

"The positions that were filled immediately were [examples of] perfect matches between employers and employees," Yawapa said.

"Before the fair launched, jobseekers could post their credentials online through our website and

employers could post details of their vacant positions. It saved time for both parties in finding their 'match' for the job," she added.

As for the remaining vacancies, she explained that employers still need to screen applicants through the interview process.

"We expect that by the end of this month, no less than 30% of the vacancies will be filled as a result of the job fair, as well as the continued processing of new applications through our website."

Asked to speculate on such a 'low match' ratio, Ms Yawapa said that a lot of the applicants were either over qualified for the available positions, or that benefits and salary did not meet the applicants' expectations.

She noted that many of the applicants were not necessarily unemployed, but were those who may have already been employed, but considering making a career change.

Ms Yawapa went on to give a break-down of the applicants' levels of education: More than half, 834 or 52.8% of applicants had a bachelors degree while only 12 (0.76%) had a masters degree; meanwhile, 240 or 15% of applicants had an advanced vocational diploma (in Thai, commonly denoted as *PorWorSor*").

Another 173 applicants, or 10.9% of the total, had either a general vocational diploma ("Por-WorChor") or technical diploma ("PorWorTor"); while 154 or 9.7% of applicants had obtained a high school diploma as their highest education credential, while another 94 or 5.9% applicants had a 9th grade (Mattayom 3) diploma.

Bangkok Motor Show expects record sales

DESPITE the conclusion of the for customers to qualify for the government's First Car Buyer First Car tax rebate. program at the end of last year, Nevertheless, the Vios subthe Bangkok International Motor compact is so popular that even Show is serving as a major auto extravaganza that is dramatically helping to boost auto sales.

Organizers of the motor show, which ends on Sunday (April 7) at Muangthong Thani, are confident that more than a record 60,000 orders could be placed at this year's event, which features a large number of new models and concept vehicles.

The biggest seller at the show is expected to be the new Toyota Vios, priced from 559,000 to 734,000 baht, after orders were "discreetly" accepted late last year

without the promotion, record sales are expected during the official launch period.

Apart from being the most popular model in Thailand, the Vios is also the best-selling Asean model, and 45,000 of these cars are expected to be exported to 86 countries each year.

Unfortunately, its 1.5-liter engine (109 horsepower and 141 Newton meters of torque) has been carried over from the previous model, but improvements have been made to the engine, which now passes Euro 4 emission standards.

ACCORDING to the World Travel and Tourism Council there are around 12.7 million hotel rooms around the world, and another 1.3 million are in development, half of them being built in the Middle East and Africa.

Bottled water is as common a sight in hotel rooms as thin-screen televisions and mass-produced art.

Given that hotels generally charge for bottled water, this represents an important revenue stream. But there is a negative side: hotels must deal with a flood of empty single-use plastic bottles.

In coastal areas, some plastic bottles invariably end up at sea, where they contribute to a marine pollution problem that is turning into a catastrophe for sea life. Shipping water also is costly, generates carbon emissions and most plastic bottles are made using virgin resin, derived from oil.

A forward-thinking hospitality executive decided to rectify the wastefulness of single-use plastic bottles at his luxury hotel properties: Sonu Shivdasani banned the import and sale of the bottles at his Soneva resorts in 2008.

Instead, the company filters, bottles and sells its own water onsite, in bottles that are then collected and reused. This eliminates the emissions associated with transporting bottled water

into the resorts, located in the Maldives and Thailand.

Startup Whole World Water (WWW), which officially launched on World Water Day, March 22, is hoping to bring the practice of onsite water treatment and bottling to the wider hospitality industry.

The effort is the work of Karena Albers and Jenifer Willig.

While Whole World Water is being established as a for-profit, member-based venture for resorts, it has also created the Whole World Water Fund, a charitable organization, through which all participating resorts contribute 10 per cent of their proceeds from the water sales. The fund, administered by Climate Care, will then use the funds to develop water treatment infrastructures in communities around participating resorts.

"We all have to ask ourselves, when did we get bamboozled into drinking bottled water? But we did. It became the thing to do, especially at high-end resorts,' Albers says.

She says that Whole World Water is "trying to get people up to speed on what we need to do to protect natural resources."

That said, Albers and Willig believe they will be more successful if they give consumers a better option to plastic-bottled water rather than trying to immediately

force a change of habit.

The hope is that consumers will come to find the Whole World Water option a more chic, appealing one. At the same time, perhaps they'll start to think differently about single-use plastic bottles.

Just as local food has captured the attention of travelers, so can water - as long as it is clean and safe. "We're in a big movement over local food," Albers says. "Why did water get taken out of that equation? Why shouldn't water be local? We will get local water councils cognizant of the fact that municipal water has every right to be as clean as bottled water.'

WWW has already engaged nearly 20 high-end resorts, including Banyan Tree Hotels, Branson's

Virgin Hotels, Sovena and three Ritz Carlton properties.

These member companies, and others that join in the future, must agree to three basic conditions: paying a US\$1,000 annual membership fee (this covers marketing and promotional expenses); installing a secondary water filtering system to further purify the hotel's tap water and then bottle it in the WWW glass bottle, which is later collected and reused; and donating 10 per cent of water bottle sales to the Whole World Water Fund.

Banning sales of single-use branded plastic water bottles from third parties is not a membership requirement. "We are not mandating that they can't sell bottled water in plastic," Willig says, "We have to walk before we can run."

WWW claims hotels and resorts can boost their own revenue by becoming their own water vendors. Based on a case study, the company says switching to onsite bottling can increase a hotel's profits from bottled water by around 22 per cent, since the filtration systems are relatively inexpensive. Plus, the resorts can cut shipments of bottled water by using the onsite system, thereby reducing their carbon footprints and waste generated.

Albers and Willig believe they can attract enough members to WWW to raise \$1bn each year for the Whole World Water Fund, to help the estimated 1 billion people around the world who lack access to clean, safe water sources.

Live by the sword, die by the sword

THEY came, they spent, they left. That pretty much sums up the great Russian tropical cold war of this the high tourism season.

Over the past month or so I embarked on a research project to try to learn more about the surge of visitors from the former USSR to the island of Phuket.

Not content to simply put one nationality under the microscope I wanted to grab a shovel and dig deeper into this mysterious world of the emerging Eastern European outbound market.

So many numbers so little time. Taking a step back and trying not to fall over any sleeping dogs, in 2012 the estimated overseas visitor draw to Southeast Asian countries topped 88 million, with 1.8 million Russians falling into immigration lines across the region. Thailand drew 1.3 million with roughly 452,000 coming to Phuket.

Looking beyond the numbers, is the fact that 80 per cent of these travellers come during high season from October to April and the bottleneck at Phuket International Airport has increasingly become a house of chaos. Toss in the language barriers, tour bus mania and an entirely new dynamic to the legacy of the tourism market, and the result has been a sharp local backlash.

For a number of years now the island's hotel rooms have been

multiplying at a faster pace than imaginable. Local investors have tripped into true blue love affair with the prospect of owning a hotel. One by one, these "same same" properties have risen from hills, valleys, flatlands and beaches.

Despite a series of political hijinks, the country has become an accidental economic success story. Government agencies such as the TAT have rejoiced with nearly religious fervor about year on year double digit growth figures. (Note to naysayers, no doubt they have learned well from their American cousins on Wall Street so don't blame the

Thais on this one).

Asia's rising middle class, mounting consumerism and low-cost airlines (that are the new buses of the sky) are rolling out more and more travellers. The beast of success now sits at our own dinner table, with an empty plate and is hungrily giving us the eye.

Suddenly Phuket's collective face is covered in sweat, with a pulse beating like a jackrabbit, and terror starts creeping into the equation. How did this happen? The roads choked with traffic, failing infrastructure and crowds everywhere you go.

As in all things unexpected, next comes the blame game and we are suddenly adrift in the present day, where suspicion, stress, envy and greed are all trying to plunge out through the in door.

One topic of my local debate is the concept of zero baht tourism. This conspiracy theory somehow conjures up the notion that there is some secret tunnel running underneath the island to other countries and a Full Monty money train is running nonstop exporting cash elsewhere.

This of course is utter nonsense and those who are inclined to believe it need to return home to their caves before dinosaur feeding time. Last year, Russians brought over 35 billion baht in tourism earnings to this island, and the vast majority of it stayed in the local economy.

Over the past few months we have been looking at the tourism twins of Bali and Phuket. While this island has continued to post growth, the Indonesian counterpart is faltering. Again, look no further then flat trading numbers of Eastern Europeans to our southern shores and it all adds up. The East is the now West, at least for the moment.

Is mass tourism the end of

Phuket? Absolutely not, we are only at the beginning of the story but some prankster at life's bookstore tore out the last page and we have no idea what the ending will be. What is relevant is to take time to have a forward-looking view of the island's number one economic indicator – tourism.

Master planning, zoning and

addressing infrastructure issues would seem a far more intelligent reaction to the unfolding drama than a dead-end witch hunt.

Is more better? You will have to be the judge of that.

Central bank fears bubble

THE BANK of Thailand (BoT) might reel in the real estate market after detecting some hot spots, especially in the condominium segment for units priced under 3 million baht.

"A restriction on banks for 0% interest rates is one of the measures to control the market. But the central bank will have other measures such as tightening the loan-to-value ratio from 90% for condominiums to 85 or 80 % if it believes that the condo market shows signs of speculation and may form a bubble in the near future," a source said yesterday.

A team has been sent to meet with the top 10 listed property firms to ask them about the residential market, he said.

The main question concerns the supply and demand situation, as concern grows over indicators of a glut in the market. But most developers believe that the market still has demand to absorb the supply and that the market is still stable without any bubbles.

They admit that some locations may be subject to speculation, but say that does not change the overall property market.

The central bank may not impose any measures on the public but will use internal guidance such as asking banks to rein in lending. They may be asked to report project loans over 200 million baht or to raise the credit score threshold for approving mortgage loans. These are some ways to control the property market without creating any panic.

In 2011, buyers of condos were required to make a down payment of 10% of a unit's value and in 2012 buyers of low-rise residences, both townhouses and single family homes, had to deposit 5%.

Prasert Taedullayasatit, chief business officer of Pruksa Real Estate Plc, said he would meet with the BoT on Friday. It was normal that the authorities will need more information from developers about market sentiment and the size of both supply and demand. This is better for the BoT before launching more measures to control the market.

Srettha Thavisin, president of Sansiri Plc, said he met with the BoT team last week and gave them market data, including the sizes of both supply and demand. The company also showed the team its market research studies. When the company goes into new locations it has to have the information to support its expansion plan.

"They asked if a drop in the loan-to-value ratio to 85% or 80% will impact the market. I said that will impact directly on buyers of residences priced lower than 2mn baht because they do not have enough savings to make a down payment. This will not support low-income people in owning a home." he said.

"In my view the property sector does not have a bubble," he said.

For example, Sansiri now limits sales to its customers. If they want to buy more than five units, the company will not sell them to them. This is one of the measures to reduce speculators in the market, he said.

Chatchai Payuhanaveechai, executive vice president of Kasikornbank, said that if the BoT does not want banks to offer a zero interest rate to customers, then KBank will follow that policy, because it is the responsibility of the central bank to manage the country's risk.

"However, we believe that the property market now is different from 1997 because most property firms and commercial banks have restraints on launches and provide loans for customers based on credit scores.

"When we look in more detail we see less non-performing loans from mortgage loans compared with other loans, so we believe that the real estate market now does not face a bubble. But we have to be careful in some locations," he said.

The BoT will also talk with banks about their campaigns for home loans featuring a 0% interest rate as part of its annual visit to the executives of the banks.

Ruchukorn Siriyodhin, assistant governor for the Financial Institutions

Policy Group, said banks can launch this kind of zero-rate campaign but they have to clearly inform prospective customers about the effective interest rates throughout the loan term to give them complete information for decision-making.

The central bank has been monitoring the banking industry and found that their lending has met the standard and that their non-performing loans (NPLs) have not increased. Bankers said they have been informing home loan customers about the effective rates after the 0% rate ends. The central bank raised this concern to prod the banks into being more cautious about bubbles in the property sector, they said.

I've gotten free weekends from my reward travel. Those rewards come in handy for an expat that has to make a visa run and is looking to save money. Phuket currently has 1,117 hotels listed on Agoda ranging in price from US\$20 to \$1,800 dollars per night.

Priceline.com operates as a one-stop online destination to serve all your travel needs. You can book flights, hotels, car rentals, vacation packages and cruise trips. The company's Agoda.com provides hotel reviews and lets you know the key attractions for each city before you book.

Personally, I use Agoda.com only for booking hotels. My last trip to Kuala Lumpur found me too busy to book a room in advance. I had the taxi take me to Bukit Bintang and drop me off in front of some moderately priced hotels. At the desk the price was \$90 per night. Standing at the front counter I went online, which took me three minutes, and booked the same room on Agoda for \$52. A 42% savings! The desk clerk had a big smile on his face as I handed him my reservation number.

Actually the best part about Priceline has been the stock performance. Over the past eight years, the stock has risen an astounding 3,000%. I have owned it since 2007 and it has been my best performer after Netflix. I

still think the stock is going higher and here's why: the company is best positioned among the online travel companies

for the international market.

- Priceline.com is acquiring the US travel software company Kayak.com
- The company is trading with a cheap forward P/E (price/earnings) of 15 and has a 35% operating margin
- Priceline has \$103 per share in cash the stock is trading above both the 50 and 200 day moving averages

The technical picture looks great. Priceline.com gained over 50% in 2012 and has been forming a quiet consolidation for 12 months. Often leadership stocks will post strong price gains (50 to 100%)

heading higher once again.

The one uncertainty overhanging the stock is Europe. Many analysts are worried that Europe may stay in recession longer than expected. The recovery that many had hoped for this year has yet to materialize. Uncertainty with the recent Italian elections and Cyprus bailout aren't helping to calm markets either.

I'm not as concerned as others though, considering the company has weathered the storm very well for the past five years that Europe has been in crisis. Bookings in Europe have been rather consistent and considering that only 25% of the European hotel market is online, there's plenty of room for growth. Priceline has less than 10% of total hotel bookings in Europe. There's considerable room for growth in Europe and people are still traveling to Europe and making hotel reservations.

Besides penetrating the European hotel market further, the fastest growth for

Budgeting tips and concerns for expats

BECOMING and remaining an expat will require careful budgeting to avoid potential minefields or serious financial problems down the road. With that in mind, here are concerns or tips to keep in mind to help you avoid blowing a hole in your expat budget:

Track your living expenses

Most personal finance software like newer versions of Quicken will have a multi-currency function to track living expenses in any currency along with fluctuating exchange rates. If you have just become an expat, it would be a good idea to record every single living expense or transaction you incur (especially any banking or money transfer fees) for the first few months using such software so you can plan a more accurate expat budget moving forward.

Learn local price trends

It's a good idea to live on a very tight expat budget for the first few months after becoming an expat and to use that time to learn about local prices and when the best time to buy something is. For example:

prices tend to rise in Thailand during the tourism high season while countries that celebrate Chinese New Year may have sales up until the celebrations and big prices increases right after that

Live (well) below your means

The days of cushy expat assignments where all housing and schooling fees are covered, defined pension plans and even stable employment with annual cost of living adjustments are increasingly becoming distant memories - meaning living well

below your means now may help you live a comfortable lifestyle in the future should your financial circumstances suddenly change.

Budget for inflation

Developing countries like Thailand tend to have much higher rates of inflation than developed Western countries. Ask yourself if you could realistically afford a hypothetical 5% or even 10% across the board annual increase in your current living expenses for items like food and housing. In addition, don't forget that some

living expenses, like the cost of health insurance as you get older, will be subject to much higher rates of inflation or annual price jumps.

Budget for emergencies

Emergencies for an expat can mean everything from something medical related requiring a medical evacuation to being forced to relocate home. In particular, you will need to have a much bigger emergency fund to cover the possibility (no matter how remote it might appear) that you will need to return home permanently and reestablish your life there - a potentially expensive endeavor the longer you have been away.

Budget for the loss of government entitlements and for taxes

British expat pensioners have for years complained about frozen pensions after moving abroad while Americans generally need to be a state resident (with a physical address) to qualify for unemployment compensation, work for an American company (or work in a country with a US

tax treaty) to ensure their income is included in future Social Security payment calculations and are taxed on their worldwide income. Likewise, few (if any) western countries will pay disability or pay for medical care to an expat citizen while they live abroad. This means you need to be aware of what government entitlements you stand to loose out on when you move abroad (along with any taxes you may still be subject to) and you will need to budget extra for insurance or be prepared by saving more money.

Protect your credit score

Many international banks and financial institutions will do a credit check on you back home or abroad before they decide to do business with you - meaning any late payments or unpaid bills you skipped out on paying will come back to haunt you in the future even if you are now living it up somewhere else. Protect your credit score and your reputation at home and abroad by making sure your bills are paid on - Don Freeman

Forever at the mafia's mercy

THE proposal by the chief of the Phuket Marine Office to launch a "sea taxi" to ferry passengers between Patong and Phuket International Airport deserves credit for innovation, but appears somewhat impractical.

There can be no doubt that visiting tourists need – and fully deserve – better public transport options between Phuket Airport and west coast resort destinations. The fact that Phuket Town enjoys not only an Airport Bus service but also the *Po Thong* "pink bus" service is just one reflection of a sad reality: that Phuket's resort areas have developed a reputation among tourists – both foreign and domestic – for being mafia-controlled, rip-off destinations.

No segment of the local economy has done more to earn this dubious distinction than the tuk-tuk and taxi syndicates, which through collusion and thuggish self-entitlement make taxi fares on the island the highest in the country.

The solution to this problem is to deal with root causes head on, rather than try to "work around" them. The "sea taxi" appears somewhat like a tacit admission that these syndicates are, and will always be, here to stay – with tourists forever at their mercy.

We are unwilling to concede this point. Change is not only possible, but fully supported by the vast majority of island residents and visiting tourists who are sick and tired of the status quo. By analogy, if the island's tourism economy were compared with a car, the current situation would be like driving around with the emergency brake engaged. It is a huge drag on an economy that, for the most part, offers excellent value.

It always helps to try and view the issue through the eyes of the end user, the visiting tourist. Sadly, this does not seems to be understood by many of our elected officials and Bangkok-appointed bureaucrats.

Many tourists who touch down at Phuket International Airport arrive deprived of sleep and burdened with baggage after long flights and all the hassles related to Customs and Immigration, security, and so on. All they want to do is get to their hotels safely, at a reasonable rate.

We doubt many of them would be keen to board a vessel for a half-hour speedboat ride during the monsoon rains. After all, many people are prone to seasickness. Unanswered questions include where they would disembark, as the temporary pier in Patong is only moored there a few months of the year. The idea would also open the possibility of an unprecedented maritime disaster if one of the boats were to sink.

The solutions to Phuket transport woes are self-evident: buses, *songthaew*, metered taxis and perhaps light rail. The time for change is long overdue; all that is required is leadership and courage.



Shelter and training for those with HIV

FIRST PERSON

PHUKET is always in the top-five provinces in Thailand in terms of numbers of people with HIV and AIDS. People come and go on the island, which makes it hard to control the disease.

The main goals of our foundation are to provide help to HIV-affected mothers and their children, destigmatize HIV through educational outreach programs and teach about safe sex.

The biggest challenge we face is finding funding: to support the women and children who live in our house, the children in the 170 families we serve across the is-

land and our educational outreach programs.

Our house can accommodate 40 people. Right now we have 22 children and 10 women staying here. The children are either HIV-affected or orphans of people with AIDS who passed

away. Children can live in the house until age 18. Normally, women can live here for a maximum of six months, but in some cases, if they have nowhere to go or can't live by themselves, they stay longer.

Although we provide housing, the best situation is for HIVaffected people to live with their families in their own neighborhoods or villages, and have as normal a life as possible.



Daoroong 'Joojee' Rodsamnam, 49, from Bangkok, has been project

manager for the Life Home Project Foundation, a shelter for HIVpositive mothers and their children, for seven years.

Here, she talks about HIV in Phuket, the goals and challenges of the Foundation and what motivated her to work there.

doesn't accept HIV-positive people. This is partly because years ago, in a campaign to stop HIV, the government portrayed it as disgusting and scary. The campaign was successful, but it left people afraid of HIV.

Some families reject their relatives who are HIV-positive, so we try to teach them that people with HIV can live in the same house with other people.

Actually, it's not easy to get HIV in a daily-life setting. As you may know, the virus is transmitted by the transfer of blood, semen, pre-ejaculate,

vaginal fluid or breast milk.

The children who stay with us go to regular schools across the island, but because of the stigma, they cannot tell anyone at school they have HIV.

Our goal is for everyone to understand that HIV-positive people can live normally in society with other people.

Another thing I am worried about in Phuket is teenagers get-Unfortunately, Thai society still ting HIV at younger ages. Some are as young as 12 years old. They get it from having unprotected sex.

I want everyone to understand that having safe sex is very important. Using condoms is the only way to protect yourself from getting HIV.

I never planned to do this job. I came to Phuket intending to start my own business, but I have yet

I met the foundation founders, Jose Luis Guy Cano and Helen Fellon-Wood, and they asked me to work with them overseeing the construction of the foundation house. I was going to work with them for three months. I'm still here seven years later.

It was my children that made me stay - they are teenagers, and I felt that if I didn't do something good for society, that somehow bad luck would come to them. So I decided to work with the foundation to prevent HIV and to support anyone who had it.

We are fortunate to get free HIV drugs from the government through Vachira Phuket Hospital but we are grateful for donations of money, clothes or toiletries directly to our house. Information about us including our bank account number is available on our website: Lifehomeproject.org.



Water solutions

Many places on this planet, including Phuket, are going through one of the driest spells of the last decade.

My home state of Colorado is no exception.

Denver, the state's capital, last week declared a stage-two drought situation, based on a scale in which four is an emergency.

With its two prime reservoirs at 59% and 73% capacity, (sound familiar?) the city's waterworks estimate that it needs to conserve 16 billion gallons to avoid graduating to a stage three situation by next year.

Indeed, the situation – in Denver and in Phuket – seems dire.

Yet on at least 10 occasions over the last three months – during this supposed drought - I've been caught in traffic behind a provincial water truck whose sole purpose is to spray water on the road.

Take a walk up Tor Sae hill in Phuket Town for some exercise, and you may be forced to move aside for the water truck on its daily rounds, spraying tens of thousands of liters of water to clear off the human litter and spoiled organic leftovers that the monkeys there didn't want to eat.

In the neighborhood near my office, water trucks regularly cruise through cleaning up the dirt piles and spills from construction of new subdivisions in the area.

But it's not really the construction crews taking responsibility,

but rather, you and I – taxpayers - who ensure that our island's trusty water trucks can keep things 'clean and orderly'.

We should be taking advantage of our ideal tropical location.

First we should continue to promote and invest in rain collection during the wet months.

Then, let's sell off all these water trucks. A chain-gang of well behaved prisoners with some cheap bags and brooms is one idea to keep Tor Sae hill, among other places, nice and clean.

Phuket Immigration Officer Lt Col Napat Nusen replies:

As soon as the couple sign the divorce paper, the non-immigrant O visa will be invalid. The foreign man must come to the immigration office to inform us that he is no longer married. He will need to bring his passport and his copy

of the divorce paper, plus photocopies.

We do not have a set time frame within which the foreigner must report this to us, but please ask him to report to us as soon as

After his permit-to-stay has been cancelled, we will give him seven days to exit the country.

If he still wants to live in Thailand, he has to leave the country and apply for another type of visa.


If the foreigner wants to marry another Thai woman, he has to obtain a new non-immigrant O visa from a Thai embassy or consulate abroad before we can issue him a 12-month permit-to-stay.

Life & style Thailand's paradisal prison

KOH Tarutao, one of Thailand's southern most islands, is located off the coast of Satun province. The island is

situated close to the Adang-Rawi archipelago in the Andaman Sea, close to the famed Lipe Island and just a few kilometers north of Langkawi island, which is part of Malaysia. Koh Tarutao boasts some of the most secluded and pristine beaches of Thailand. Much of the island is still largely covered by dense tropical rainforest.

Tarutao's unspoiled nature and whitesandy beaches have become the stuff of legends among back packers and tourists looking for the next virgin paradise in the tropics. Few tourists, however, would want to sully their ideal imagery by thinking

about the island's fearsome past. The truth is Tarutao island was not always the welcoming paradise it is today.

In fact, for several decades since the 1930s, the island served as a penal colony to incarcerate the hardest criminals and political prisoners of Thailand.

The story of Tarutao as an island prison began in 1937 when the department of corrections decided to commission a survey of suitable islands that could be turned into a penal colony. The chosen island had to be situated as far away from Bangkok as possible. The surveyors chose Tarutao.

It was a large and isolated island in the Andaman Sea. It was far away from the capital and any civilization and its distance from the mainland made it extremely difficult for prisoners to escape. It was the perfect site.

Construction of the prison began in June 1937 using inmates from nearby prisons on the mainland. When the facility was finished a year later, it was named the Tarutao Vocational Training Settlement. The first inmates arrived in June 1938. Some of them were hardened criminals, transferred from Bangkok's overcrowded prisons. By June 1939, the island was home to around 2,000 of the country's most notorious prisoners.

The facilities on Tarutao, including the offices, the prison building, the kitchen and the prisoners' training center were constructed out of locally available wood and palm leaves. Shabby as they were, the real barriers to escape came from the natural surroundings of the island. Rough seas and strong waves extended for miles out with no end in sight and there were

chilling rumors that the surrounding waters were infested with sharks. It was enough to discourage most of

the prisoners from trying to escape.

The years that led up to the Second World War were extremely unstable for Thai politics. The absolute monarchy had been brought down in 1932. The first civilian government that replaced it was short-lived and the military seized power not long after that. The royalists on the other hand were fighting to regain control of what they had lost since 1932. It was a time when several different factions were vying for power. During this time many political dissidents were also sent to Tarutao to be incarcerated along with the common criminals.

In September 1939, around 70 political

prisoners were moved from Bang Khwang prison in Bangkok to Tarutao Island. Of the political prisoners that were sent to Tarutao, some were high profile political prisoners.

Many were plotters of failed coups, royalists and fallen army commanders. Others


were journalists, professionals and civilians who spoke out against the ruling regime. Political prisoners were given their own compound on the island, under open prison conditions and away from actual criminals.

In October 1939, five political prisoners managed to escape from Tarutao Island. It was reported that a local fisherman and coffee shop owner named Mee had used a small sailboat to ship himself, his family and five political prisoners from Tarutao to Langkawi.


Since they were allowed to roam freely, the prisoners often frequented Mee's coffee shop. The five escapees were Phraya Sarapai Pipat, who was a naval captain and former politician; Phraya Suraphan Senee, an army colonel and former governor of Ratchaburi; Louis Kiriwat, a newspaper editor; Chalam Liampetrat, a lawyer and Khun Arkaney Rattagarn, a railroad engineer.

Phraya Suraphan was one of the high profile political prisoners that had been sent to Tarutao. He was arrested after the bloody Bowaradet Rebellion of 1933, when Prince Bowaradet led a royalist rebellion to recapture Bangkok from the civilian government. The rebellion failed. Phraya Suraphan, who at that time was the governor of Ratchaburi, was arrested for his alleged role in helping the rebels.

Phraya Suraphan had promised Mee a

reward of 5,000 baht if he helped them escape from Tarutao Island.

Phraya's wife smuggled the money into Tarutao and gave it to Mee in advance. When Mee, his family and the five escapees reached Langkawi, they claimed political asylum in Malaysia and never returned to Thailand again.

The incident was an embarrassment to the Thai ruling party at that time and the Tarutao prison governor was reprimanded for his negligence. However, he was allowed to remain at his post when it became clear that the prisoners were never going to return to Thailand again.

In December 1941, the Japanese invaded

Thailand and the Second World War was brought to Southeast Asia. During this period and right up to the end of the war, the history of Tarutao Island would take an even more peculiar course.

When chaos breaks out from the war and the island's prisoners are forgotten, the inmates of Tarutao band together for their own survival. Tarutao Island's history during the Second World War continues in the next Looking Back column.

shared Thai/Cambodian history

DOZENS of Thai and Cambodian children participated in a recent joint-research project, which taught students their shared cultural roots.

Though a borderline separates their countries, these young Asean citizens have learned that the border is for official reasons only.

"We have many similar beliefs and rituals. We just call them by different names," a Thai student said during a recent trip to Siem Reap.

Nattaphong Kliangkoksung, a Mathayom 4 student from Nakhon Ratchasima, said it was only when he met his Cambodian peers that he found the similarities between the two cultures.

Wipa Phutthong, who hails from the Tuppraya Pittaya School in Sa Kaew's Khok Sung district, said, for instance, the 'praying for rain' ritual in Thailand is called "Nang Maew Khor Fon", while in Cambodia it is "Hae Pla Zon Puea Khor Fon".

This Thai student speaks fluent Cambodian because she grew up in a border village where people speak both languages.

The youngsters, Wipa and Nattapong, were part of the Asean Youth Research Programme (Thai-Khmer), which comes under the Heritage Education Programme for Students: Khmer-Thai Students Seminar Siem Reap Angkor project.

Financed by the TRF, the project aims to engage youngsters in learning the history of both countries, in the hope that shared cultural roots will enhance ties between the two nations. especially since the recent quarrel over the ancient Preah Vihear Temple. "This journey into [our] shared cultural roots will foster good understanding," says Tej Bunnag, a former Thai foreign minister, about the TRF-financed project. He expects the project to cover Laos, Vietnam and Myanmar - Chularat Saengpassa


This is not to mention the surgery's equipment, including modern Italian dental units and equally streamlined oral surgery equipment. Neatness is the key.

From fetid to fragrant

SHAKESPEARE'S father, John, was fined for digging a "midden" in front of his neighbor's house. Very unneighborly. Today the word has almost vanished from the English language as modern sanitation systems have replaced the foul cesspits of vestervear.

But make no mistake, a "midden" is neither pleasant to behold nor smell. Originally a hole in the ground, a dump for household refuse, shells or more likely human feces, the advent of rudimentary plumbing later meant that sewage could flow fitfully down a barely hidden pipe and discharge its fetid effluent in the surrounding soil – away from the house. That arrangement would have allowed Mr Shakespeare to get away with it.

Of course, "middens" are still part and parcel of life in Third World slums, but I was unprepared for one in the middle of an "expat's" garden here in Phuket. After all, we supposedly live in a world where septic tanks or communal waste water systems



are the norm. You would be surprised ... there are lots of these cesspits on this paradisal island.

And the danger to underground water tables that supply our wells is a very real one.

Raw sewage, like fresh manure,

is hostile to plant growth. It is estimated that one gram of human feces contains one trillion bacteria.

But once microorganisms start to degrade and break down this material into less complex compounds, things start to improve. This process is aided by contact with soil; this filters out many pathogens.

Once health hazards diminish, the stench from the midden disappears, and sturdy plants can begin to colonize its borders.

The roots of these plants in turn absorb many toxic elements. Happily, our "expat" friend had done his level best to minimize the impact of this "midden" by planting herbs and especially basil around its edges.

Herbs are part and parcel of any and every Thai garden. They are one of the first things to be planted - as essential to Thai cooking as turmeric is to Spanish paella, garlic to Provençale aioli, or nutmeg to English rice pudding. The only decision is where to grow them – assuming you have a typical garden.

One school of thought favors a kitchen garden or herbarium where all your herbs can flourish

Unarguably, this is a highly convenient arrangement. However, it has one key drawback, namely that herbs don't all enjoy the same conditions.

Pepper, for example, does best in shady, moist conditions whereas chili needs plenty of sun to crop heavily. Lemon grass enjoys a dry environment, ginger plenty of water.

My "horses for courses" view takes account of these different cultural requirements, with my herbs dotted around the garden in company with their flowering fellows. In this way, you can select a suitably marshy spot for your ginger, or a dryer one for your lemon grass.

Basil, as my friend's efforts attest, can be put anywhere. In fact, it may well take the prize for being the easiest of all herbs to grow. It crops up, unannounced in my scruffy lawn, and takes uncomplainingly to life unobtrusive star.

Known as bai horapa in Thailand, it has intensely aromatic, dark green leaves and purplish stems and flower heads. There are other varieties: holy basil (gapow) has narrower leaves and needs to be cooked to release its full panoply of aromas. Lemon basil (bai manglak), which exudes the delicious scent of lemons, has pale green, slightly hairy foliage and generally makes a smaller plant.

All these varieties are both easy to grow and to propagate from cuttings. Simply put some stems in moist soil and within days they will have taken root. After all, if they can put up with a "midden", they are unlikely to be fazed by much....

Tip of the Week Mulching



IT IS almost two years since we talked in these columns about mulching. Very relevant in today's rainless conditions when the soil is in danger of drying out completely.

Mulching is the use of material to cover soil surfaces such as flower beds. Spread evenly up to a depth of two inches to allow some air and water through.

The process provides insulation from the full glare of the sun, prevents erosion in downpours, helps the retention of moisture in the earth, and inhibits weed growth.

The best mulches are organic: for example, coconut fiber or coir dust (the cheapest, and readily available), compost, or shredded bark. Not dead leaves though, which in this climate are rarely utilized by earthworms to create humus.

Moreover, they may harbor disease. Better to use them in a compost heap where the heat will destroy potentially harmful bacteria.

Leaving his native England for the South Pacific and Australasia, Chef Ephraim was part of the opening team of Bracu Restaurant in New Zealand as chef de cuisine, and extended his stay down-under thereafter at the Lizard Island Barrier Reef Resort.

A world traveller, in Europe Chef Ephraim completed courses at Mugaritz in Spain and at the Saint James in Bordeaux before expanding his culinary experiences throughout Asia.

At the famed Ubud Mozaic Restaurant Gastronomique he embraced the philosophy of Chef Chris Salans in the use of Bali's freshest ingredients and has been a key asset in creating the Mozaic modern Balinese cuisine, which is being presented at the Trisara tonight.

While awaiting the arrival of the other fortunate guests I nibble on a foie gras and fresh mango toast and chat with the relaxed and friendly Chef James about the Mozaic philosophy.

"I am quality driven and enjoy giving

guests something they've never eaten before. Each dish features fresh local ingredients, utilizing an

abundance of regional flavors, spices and herbs. In Phuket, for example, I found some similar ingredients to Bali but there were subtle differences in taste, and in some cases the ingredients were hard to find, curry leaves for example..." he said before leaving to personally greet arriving guests.

At table we eagerly await the signature bold and innovative Mozaic-style of cooking and are treated first to Balinese spiced Alaskan King crab salad, served with ogen melon, cucumber, avocado and baby

> coriander - light zesty and full of flavor.

Next up is the butter-seared, deep ocean lobster enhanced with black truffle espuma, tapioca and Spanish pata negra ham tuiles. Rich and interesting in texture.

More foie gras is arrives next, this time

with crumbled cocoa, fresh raspberries and black olive powder. Heads around our intimate seaside table nod in approval.

The pièce de résistance comes in the shape of a slow-roasted lamb loin from New Zealand served on the bone and flavored with salted lemon and sprinkled with crunchy toasted spices and fresh curry leaf infusions [so he did find curry leaves in Phuket]. The pumpkin purée adds a colorful splash to this wonderful dish that leaves a warm spicy afterburn on the lips. I put this out with a cool Pinot noir.

To end a perfect meal Valrhona chocolate mousse is combined with local green peppercorn gel and Thai lemon basil gelato. Divine.

Petits fours and Vittoria Coffee round up the evening and we all burst into applause as Chef James descends the stairs to meet us.

I leave Trisara knowing that a little piece of paradise in Phuket is still possible if you put together the right ingredients.

Measuring (actual) internet speed



OVER the years we've had a lot of ups and downs with the Phuket Internet Speed reporting site, phuketinternetspeed.com. We've gathered 30,000 speed tests from around the island, from almost 900 computer users, covering nearly 100 different internet packages. That makes Phuket Internet Speed, by far, as best I know, the largest community-based independent speed reporting site on the internet.

Our emphasis has always been on single-threaded international download speeds. You may well argue that single-thread international download speeds aren't as important as they once were, and you'd be right.

Many people in Phuket now use torrents to download movies, music, and other files that they just can't get in Thailand. Torrents employ multiple streams, frequently to different countries they pull pieces of a file from any available resource, then re-assemble the file once the pieces have been downloaded. If somebody

who's broadcasting a torrent is located in Thailand, chances are good you'll be pulling some parts of the file from inside Thailand.

Browsers are getting good enough to pull down some files in multiple threads. Single threading is still the most common way of getting files, at least to a first approximation, but multiple threading download managers are becoming much more common.

All of the Internet Service Providers (ISPs) in Phuket now cache sites so, for example, if you think you're watching a direct feed of the Rugby World Cup, you aren't: the ISP brings one copy of the live feed of the Rugby World Cup to Bangkok, and the feed that goes out to subscribers in Thailand actually originates in Bangkok, delayed by just a fraction of a second. It's so fast that you wouldn't notice, but the caching approach saves the ISPs a huge amount of (expensive!) bandwidth outside the country. The caching is automatic, part of a software package the ISP buys, and generally works well.

Many of the major websites now have servers mirrored in Singapore, and the web site owners pay for dedicated fast lines from Bangkok to Singapore. So if you check your Gmail (from Google) or play a YouTube video (also from Google), you aren't actually hopping to a server in the US or Europe. Your connection actually goes to Bangkok, then Singapore over a very fast (and usually reliable) dedicated line. Bottom line: if you're working on a Microsoft, Google, Amazon, or Akamai website, your domestic inside-Thailand speed is very close to the speed you'll see on-screen. The balancing on the back end where your Gmail mail, say, gets synced with backup copies all over the world – happens internationally at the blink of an eye. Perhaps a leisurely blink, but it's so fast you'll never notice.

Over the years, international download speeds have become less significant. They're primarily a concern when you're going to websites that don't have many viewers inside Thailand, or when you're downloading files that aren't very popular in Thailand. At the same time, domestic download speeds have become more important, because they frequently reflect what you actually experience.

Unfortunately the speed tests offered by ISPs (primarily based on an engine built by a company named OOKLA, such as speedtest.net) are hard-wired to give you the fastest possible result, with little compensation for reality.

The Phuket Internet Speed reporting site has drawn interest from many different organizations, most notably Google, which has an ongoing effort to improve internet access across the globe.

Some of the interest we've drawn, though, hasn't been good. Starting in October last year, two of Phuket's ISPs started cheating on the test regime we were using. All of Phuket's ISPs "throttle" international access – with very rare exceptions, they intentionally slow down any attempt by customers to go outside of Thailand. The cheating ISPs found a way to "poke a hole" through the speed throttling, when customers were going to the specific websites that we used for the speed test. As a result, speed tests that Phuket people have posted since October need to be examined

we finally discovered that the ISPs were cheating on all of the test sites, except one – the one in Parsippany, New Jersey. Heaven only knows why they missed Parsippany, but at least as of this writing, our old test regime still gives valid results when run to Parsippany.

That said, I've switched internet speed testing site to testmy.net for my own personal use, and I suggest you do the same. None of the ISPs are cheating on this site - in fact, it isn't clear if they 'can' cheat in the same way, because the location of the test seems to change. Which suits our needs perfectly.

The site has an additional advantage: it will run automatic, periodic speed tests, then gather and display the results. That helps me keep track of when my line is working well, and when it goes to the dogs.

Here's how to set up automatic testing on testmy.net:

1) Go to testmy.net. In the upper right corner, click Create Account. Follow the instructions to create a new account, either a completely new account (which I recommend), or by logging on with an existing Facebook, Twitter, or Google+ account.

2) When you've jumped through the hoops, click in the upper right corner to Sign In. On the top bar, click Auto Test.

3) Up at the top, click on the link that says Server Selection (it's in a nearly illegible blue). Choose one of the offered servers. I use the one in Dallas, but you may prefer one of the others. Testmy.net will remember your choice. Once again, click Auto Test.

4) Select the button marked 'Combined'. On the right, you can run the test as many times as you

for 100 times (or four days). (Note: if you're running on a 3G line, you probably don't want to burn through your data allowance by running a lot of tests.) Click the button marked 'Min Download Size' and choose a good-sized test regimen – I usually run 3 MB. Similarly, click the Min Upload Size button and pick a significant test – I use 1 MB.


5) Click the button marked 'Start Automatic Test'. The test runs immediately, and you see the result.

6) Don't do anything. As long as your browser is running, and it has a tab open to the testmy.net site, the testmy.net program will run tests for as long as you've specified. If you click on Your Results in the upper right, then choose your login name, you'll see a graph like the one in the screen shot on this page.


7) From time to time, drop by phuketinternetspeed.com and post some of your results! That's the easiest way to see what other people are experiencing.

EARLY in the New Year I woke up to the stunning realization that "When I'm 64" wasn't just the title of a Beatles hit, but in my case had become a statement of reality. In a lather of vitamin supplements and desperation I set out to discover whether there was in fact a Fountain of Youth in Phuket.

In 1967 Paul McCartney famously sang; "When I get older, losing my hair, many years from now," and we children of the '60s laughed our heads off. We thought he was being deeply ironic!

Being 64 was something one's parents and grandparents did. It was never going to happen to us and so we scoffed at such a ludicrously huge number being applied to the years someone had actually inhabited this mortal coil.

But the problem with not dying young and handsome, as Mick, Keith, Rod and Eric will tell you, is getting old and wrinkly. And so, here we/I am, no longer in the peace, love and drugs '60s but in the arthritis, incontinence and amnesia sixties and wondering where it all went so horribly wrong.

Now that I actually am 64 it no longer seems ironic or funny. Rather being . . . well . . . "old" is another one of those burdens that staying alive imposes upon us. It's just another new challenge that has to be met with courage, fortitude and a well-stocked wine cellar.

With this in view I decided I wasn't going to take this lying down. So, with much huffing and puffing I got up... and when I'd eventually found my spectacles . . . set off to have a chat with one of the world's top age gurus Doctor Michael Klentze, who just happens to spend a good deal of time at the Integrative Health Center at Thanyapura

Sports and Leisure complex, in the north-east of Phuket.

The good doctor is a walking advertisement for the successful management of aging; being a robust and handsome man of 65 who seems to radiate good health.

We sat down in DiVine – the restaurant at the heart of Thanyapura, which also seems to radiate good health. Fit young people bustled about looking energetic and muscular . . . this was getting embarrassing.

I asked Dr Klentze if this getting old business was inevitable. Sadly, he said it was. Nature designed us to reproduce and then die. BUT the good news is that we can manage aging, to live longer, with more vitality and indeed happiness, by making some relatively simple behavioral choices. It all starts with the brain.

He said that the very ideas we have about ourselves, the concepts we carry in our minds, dictate our behaviors. Think young, optimistically and positively and you will start to become exactly those things by behaving that way.

Every day we make choices (about how we age in particular) regarding activity, diet, social engagement, love and purpose. These things are not genetically pre-set, but are malleable and subject to our control. All we have to do is take charge of aging, don't just lie down.

I asked the good doctor what I had to do to stay as young and happy as possible despite the passing years. Could he give me a short list of simple rules to capture this Fountain of Youth? Obviously, the list had to be short as my memory is now largely a thing of the past, and also simple because I can't understand anything complex anymore.

Here's what he recommended:

1) Eliminate self-destructive behaviors

This is the first step to preventing disease and meeting your later years with vitality and good health. The health toll of destructive behaviors such as smoking and excessive eating and drinking do not necessarily manifest for many years, but you must stop all these immediately.

2) Eat well

Up to 70 per cent of health derives from what you put in your body, while exercise and stress comprise the rest of the equation. The food you select to fuel your body is the single most powerful choice you'll ever make for your health. As we age our cells become more vulnerable. The best thing you can do is fuel your body with whole, fresh, nutritionally-dense food. Eat the right fats, plenty of quality, clean protein, and copious organic vegetables. Avoid anything processed, fried, packaged, reconstituted, refined, or high in worthless carbohydrates. Cut down on calories overall, eat lots of small meals each day and drink plenty of water.

3) Exercise

Much of "aging" is essentially tissue wasting. The phrase "use it or lose it" is true. Your muscles weaken, your bones shed their valuable osseous material – which also compromises your immunity and mental capacity. Exercise isn't about being ripped or sexy it's simply a necessary component of functioning as a human being. Most of our health conditions are diseases of sloth. If you are tired or lacking in energy, barring a specific condition or hormonal imbalance, it's likely you aren't active enough.

4) Manage stress

The common "symptoms" of

aging – high blood pressure, heart disease, adrenal fatigue, wrinkles, loss of sex drive, loss of energy, poor memory – are not really symptoms of aging at all. They're symptoms of stress and poor lifestyle choices. Do everything you can to eliminate every type of stress in your life.

5) Think young – stay connected

Your life is a precious gift, but "thinking young" is more than staying positive and being interested in current trends and world events. As long as you are alive and taking every intelligent step to get the most from your body and your life, you are young. Living itself is the ultimate Fountain of Youth. Observe the play and curiosity of children and don't lose that spirit.

6) Get enough rest

Quality sleep is critical to cell repair and regeneration and can


drastically affect your lifespan and your well being and unfortunately many in Phuket get less than the necessary eight hours of quality sleep each night.

7) Take prudent supplements

Like it or not, our food supply is not always sufficient for providing all the available tools to fight oxidation and stress or reduce our risk of diseases.

Do your best to provide your body with the freshest, most nutritious food you can. But you can augment this with prudent supplementation. A powerful antioxidant multivitamin and a fish oil supplement are worthwhile.

Personally, I think that all Professor Klentze's advice makes very good sense and I intend to do my best to follow his suggestions. How this works out, only time will tell, but assuming I can still type a few years from now, I'll let you know how I get on.







International Sport EPL teams looking to the future

WHETHER by design, necessity, selfinterest or because of all three, nurturing youngsters has become fashionable for England's elite with no expense spared in the hunt for the new Wayne Rooney or Steven Gerrard.

The length and breadth of the country, scouts from top clubs are hoovering up promising footballers barely old enough to tie their bootlaces in a bid to unearth the 30 million pounds treasures of the future.

Plucked from park pitches often as young as seven or eight and fed into the youth system, those who survive the annual culls are rewarded at 16 with two-year contracts in state-of-the-art academies where all their needs are met.

Manchester City, arguably the world's richest club, have the financial muscle to buy any player but, with UEFA's financial fair play rules now kicking in, are also ploughing 100 million pounds into training facilities for their fledgling kids.

The Premier League is pumping 350 million pounds into its Elite Player Performance Plan (EPPP) - a new blueprint for the academy system that has been around since 1998.

The mission statement is to create "more and better home-grown players", like Manchester United striker Rooney, a product of Evertons' youth system, and Liverpool midfielder Gerrard, using a network of 120 leading coaches working with 4,500 more at 96 professional clubs.

Some top-flight teams, West Ham United and Aston Villa to name but two, argue they have been doing that for years already while Manchester United are still enjoying the last fruits of a golden youth team assembled before the Premier League changed the landscape forever.

For others, spiraling transfer fees and a fresh directive from European soccer's ruling body UEFA whereby clubs must reduce their spending on player wages and transfer fees, means the spotlight is now on the newly-revamped academy system.

"When you strip it down to its most fundamental, the EPPP is about creating an environment where a local boy, developed at his local club from eight or nine, can go on to pull on a first-team shirt of the club that he has grown up at," said the Premier League's director of youth Ged Roddy.

At any given time 9,000 boys are in the academy system although only a tiny fraction will make it as pros.

with those attaining Category One status receiving the most funding and, to the frustration of the clubs further down the pyramid, inevitably getting to cherry-pick the best players.

Villa's new Category One status means they are obliged to spend a minimum of 1.5 million pounds on developing players with 775,000 pounds coming from the Premier League.

A Category Four academy will only get 100,000 pounds.

West Ham's school of excellence, which has also attained the top status, is overseen by Tony Carr who in more than 30 years with the club has launched the careers of numerous Premier League title winners, Champions League winners and England internationals.

He said whatever the EPPP promises, the key to its success is home-grown players get a chance to play first-team football something he fears could be undermined by scouting networks identifying players from France, Spain and beyond.

Arsenal's Under-18 and Under-21 squads contain players born in Argentina, Macedonia, Switzerland, Spain and Germany – and that is just among the defenders.

"The most important thing of all is when they are 18 or 19 they have an opportunity to play and I think coming to a club like West Ham there is that opportunity," Carr

"Maybe the bigger clubs are chasing bigger fish in terms of Champions League and Premier League titles so the younger boys Academies are rated from one to four coming through don't get an opportunity.

"I would like to see the percentage of British players increasing in the Premier League because the knock-on effect is a stronger national side."

Carr, whose success stories include Chelsea's Frank Lampard, Manchester United duo Rio Ferdinand and Michael Carrick and Tottenham Hotspur's Jermain Defoe, said clubs can even fulfil their UEFAenforced 'home-grown' quota with players from abroad.

"You can bring in a Spaniard at 15 and if he stays in the youth system for three years he is classed as home-grown," Carr said.

"It's a bit of a cheat in that respect but we are not in that market."

Critics say the system is too weighted in favor of the big clubs who can afford to set up Category One academies and therefore, under another rule change, can recruit nationally from the age of 12 compared to the '90-minute traveling time'. regulation the rest are bound by.


A Category Four academy would still require 100,000 pounds of investment – a sum an increasing amount of lower division teams struggle to justify particularly in light of a change to the rules on compensation should a player get poached.

Whereas previously a tribunal would fix a fee, smaller clubs now receive a small initial payment and only enjoy a significant windfall should the player become a Premier League regular – 150,000 pounds for every 10 games.

"A brazen attempt by the Premier League's wealthy elite to cherry-pick the best youngsters from Football League

clubs," was how Crystal Palace chairman Steve Parrish described the EPPP when it was launched.

While it may have its critics, the Premier League is determined the EPPP will gradually raise the percentage of Britishborn players and improve the overall quality in the top tiers of English football.

At the start of the season 62 percent of footballers listed in the Premier League squads were non-British whereas in Spain's La Liga the percentage of non-domestic players was less than 40.

Villa are bucking the trend and their young first-team squad is bulging with players who have come through the academy such as Ciaran Clark, Barry Bannan and Marc Albrighton.

The club's academy boss Bryan Jones believes the EPPP bodes well for the next generation.

"The new system will create greater access to players and we will remain fully committed to creating the right environment in which they can strive to excel," he said.

The process may be slow and City's football development executive Patrick Vieira offered words of caution.

'Barcelona have been doing it for the last 35 years and we have just been doing it for a few years. We are a long, long way behind," said the former France midfielder.

FIFA approves GoalControl

FIFA has approved the appointment of licensed GLT providers who participated in GoalControl GmbH as the official provider of goal-line technology for the Confederations Cup in Brazil this year, world soccer's governing body said on Tuesday.

GoalControl will also be used for the World Cup in Brazil in 2014 "provided that the performance of the system during this year's Festival of Champions meets all necessary FIFA requirements".

FIFA approved the use of technology to see if a ball has crossed the goal-line last year following a number of controversial incidents.

The Germany-based company, which uses 14 high-speed cameras around the pitch as part of its GoalControl-4D system, was selected ahead of the three other FIFA-

the tender," FIFA said in a statement.

"While all four companies had previously met the stringent technical requirements of the FIFA Quality Programme, the final decision was based on criteria relating more specifically to the tournaments in Brazil, including the company's ability to adapt to local conditions and the compatibility of each GLT system in relation to FIFA match operations."

FIFA said the use of GoalControl-4D in Brazil was subject to a final installation test at each stadium.

Goal-line technology was used at the Club World Cup in Japan at the end of last year.

Clarke has stomach for fight

AUSTRALIAN cricketing prospects have rarely looked bleaker than when Michael Clarke took over the test captaincy after the last Ashes series but only an outand-out optimist would declare the outlook that much brighter two vears on.

While his personal stock has risen inexorably on the back of a torrent of runs, Clarke's Australia could hardly be said to be looking ready, willing and able to contest back-to-back test series against England this year.

At the weekend, Clarke celebrated the second anniversary of his appointment as Australia's 43rd test captain with a night in hospital suffering from gastroenteritis.

If the illness was a lingering reminder of the recent tour of India, it was not the only unpleasantness to accompany him back from the sub-continent.

The 4-0 test drubbing not only once again exposed the frailties of the Australian batting but also featured off-field problems, most notably when four players were dropped for not performing a post-match assignment.

Clarke pugnaciously defended the "homework-gate" exclusions as necessary to foster the team ethic required to fulfil the ambition he starkly laid out two years ago - to become number one ranked team in all forms of the game.

The Australians flirted with taking the top test ranking off South Africa in their home series at the end of last year but ultimately went down 1-0 to the Proteas. They are currently ranked fourth.

Clarke will have plenty of time to reflect on how much progress has been made over the last two years in the next seven to 10 weeks as he recovers from hamstring and lower back injuries that ruled him out of the final test in India.

What he probably did not anticipate when he succeeded Ricky Ponting was defending his team against the accusation that they were the worst Australian side to ever take the field.

"All of us understand our performances over the last four tests were not acceptable," he wrote in a column for an Australian website this week.

"But, that said, we are only a couple of months removed from advancing to within one test match of taking the number one ranking from South Africa.

"That suggests all is not lost and talk of us being the worst Australian team in history is a bit harsh. One bad tour doesn't define a squad and I'm confident we can take the fight to England."

Clarke singled out the performances of batsmen Phil Hughes, Ed Cowan and Steve Smith as positives to come out of the tour, along with the work rate of seamers such as James Pattinson, Peter Siddle and Mitchell Starc.

Whereas Ponting during his reign as captain was not on the selection panel and therefore able to shrug off, or even share, media incredulity at mismanagement of players, Clarke has no such luxury.

Along with South African coach Mickey Arthur, Clarke is part of the four-man panel and must take his share of responsibility.

Leaving aside "homeworkgate", the most baffling decision in India was to drop spinner Nathan Lyon from the Hyderabad test, which Australia lost by an innings and 135 runs.

Although Lyon is not, and would never claim to be, another Shane Warne, he has been a solid test bowler and returned to take nine wickets in the final match in Delhi - a "good reward for effort" according to Clarke.

Still, if the India tour was the nadir for the Clarke-led Australia team, there have been plenty of highlights too.

Clarke, who turned 32 on Tuesday, has led the team to 12 wins, six defeats and five draws in 23 tests.

There have been series sweeps of India (4-0) and Sri Lanka (3-0) at home, series wins in West Indies and Sri Lanka as well as a 1-1 draw in an extraordinary series in South Africa.

There has also been his own remarkable form since he took the job, 2,533 test runs at an average of 68.45 with one triple century, three double centuries and five other hundreds.

Clarke repeatedly, and apparently genuinely, trots out the line that he would trade all his runs for victories for his team.

And, as Ponting discovered to his cost after three Ashes defeats, Australian captains will only ultimately be defined by how they fare against England.

"Everyone in Australian cricket knows how much the Ashes means to the country and we will do everything within our power to turn the ship around after our disappointing tour of India," he wrote in his column.

"The players know how big the next 12 months are and it is still our aim to win back the urn and make Australia proud." - Reuters

National must stay unique

SAFETY and welfare should always be a priority in jumps racing but the Grand National must remain a test of horse and jockey and not lose its unique character, according to Aintree racecourse chief John Baker.

The deaths of two horses during last year's race and two in 2011 brought equine safety into focus and prompted an official inquiry amid calls by animal welfare groups for the National, first run in 1839 and now with an estimated global television audience of 600 million, to be banned.

A number of modifications were subsequently recommended, with the organizers making alterations to iconic fences such as the notorious Becher's Brook.

"They (the National fences) still need jumping, they still need respect and it remains a challenge for horse and jockey which is what it should be," Baker, overseeing his first National on Saturday, told Reuters.

According to British Horse racing Authority figures, 10 horses have been fatally injured in the Grand National since 2000.

We have made some hugely significant changes in terms of safety and welfare of the Grand National and we need to be saying: 'We are proud of what we

have done'," Baker said.

"This is the greatest race in the less Crisp in a thrilling finish. world, those fences still need to be respected... we've maintained that, we're very strong in that the distance of the race is unique, the number of runners is unique and we need to retain the character of the Grand National.

We have to get the balance right from protecting that uniqueness and character and moving with the times and trying to make sure that safety and welfare is on top of our agenda."

Saturday's race is the 40th anniversary of Red Rum's first of three Aintree National triumphs. That day in 1973, the horse trained by Ginger McCain, beat the luck-

"It's been going since 1839 for a reason. People love it. It's a hugely exciting race with some fantastic stories. That's what we need to be promoting and talking about on Saturday," Baker said.

The risks jump jockeys take every day were brought into focus at the Cheltenham Festival last month when Irish amateur JT McNamara suffered a serious neck injury in a fall which has left him paralyzed.

Baker said it was "impossible" to completely eliminate risk from the sport.

"In a sport like this, any athlete is at risk of injury at any time. All

everybody wants at any race meeting, not just the Grand National, is for the horses and jockeys to come back safely.

"Racing needs to take responsibility on itself to promote that fact all year round and not just wait for the National to become defensive about it."

Baker hopes that the 40 jockeys who will saddle up for Saturday's National will heed advice from Aintree and the Professional Jockeys Association to curb their speed in what is usually a helter-skelter cavalry charge to the first fence.

"Racing as a whole and everybody involved in the National needs to realize how important this race is to jump racing so everyone involved needs to take some responsibility for it and, for the jockeys, speed is obviously an element to that," he said.

Horses will parade for a shorter time before the race while the start has been moved further away from the stands in a bid to create a calmer atmosphere.

"The run to the first fence is still a relatively long one. We just hope that when the tape goes up that those jockeys will be in a calmer frame of mind," Baker said.

China's Sun set

CHINA'S double Olympic gold medalist Sun Yang has mended fences with his coach and laid down a marker ahead of this year's World Championships by winning the 400 meter freestyle at the National Swimming Championships, local media reported.

Sun finished nearly four seconds ahead of his nearest rival at the meet on Monday and will look to improve steadily ahead of the July 19 to August 4 World Championship in Barcelona.

Powell hamstrung

FORMER 100 meters world record holder Asafa Powell has been forced to withdraw from his first meeting since last year's Olympic final because of a hamstring injury, Athletics Australia said on Tuesday.

The 30-year-old Jamaican, who has run the 100m in less than 10 seconds more times than any other sprinter, was scheduled to race at the IAAF World Challenge in Melbourne on Saturday.

Powell suffered a groin injury in the Olympic final in London last vear and trailed home last as his compatriots Usain Bolt and Yohan Blake won gold and silver.

April 6 - 12, 2013 Sport AFF Suzuki Cup 2014 venue chosen

SINGAPORE and Vietnam will jointly host the 2014 AFF Suzuki Cup, the ASEAN Football Federation said on April 3.

Speaking at the press conference before the start of the 2013 AFF Awards in Pahang, Malaysia, Duli Yang Teramat Mulia Tengku Abdullah ibni Sultan Ahmad Shah, the deputy president of the Football Association of Malaysia and vice-president of the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) executive committee, revealed that the competition will be jointly hosted again.

The competition will be held in Vietnam and Singapore," announced Tengku Abdullah.

Singapore, who claimed a record fourth title when they beat Thailand over two legs in the final in December, will host group matches at their new Sports Hub stadium, which is expected to be completed in 12 months time.

Vietnam will host games at the MyDinh National Stadium, where they won their only title in 2008.

This will be Singapore's third time as hosts having last jointly hosted the competition in 2007 with Thailand, where they were crowned victors.

The inaugural competition was held in Singapore in 1996.

Vietnam have also hosted the competition twice before, in 1998 and jointly in 2004 with Malaysia.

Tengku Abdullah also revealed that the qualification process will be scrapped for the 2014 edition.

'We will revise the format of the competition whereby it will involve all countries without any qualifications," he added.

For previous editions, the lower-ranked Asean teams participated in a short qualifier to reach the final tournament of eight teams.

The biennial Suzuki Cup features eight Southeast Asia teams split into two groups, with the top two from each contesting home and away leg semi-finals and finals.

Ariya claims maiden win

GOLFER Ariya Jutanugarn was haunted by the memory of her Honda LPGA meltdown on Sunday, before she banished the ghosts to capture her maiden professional title at the Lalla Meryem Cup in Agadir, Morocco.

The Thai teenager was cruising with a three-stroke lead over American Beth Allen after 14 holes, when she hit trouble with a double bogey on the fifth hole, where Allen birdied. All of a sudden Ariya was revisited by her nightmare at the Siam Country Club Pattaya Old Course, where she squandered a two-stroke lead and stumbled to a triple bogey on 18 to hand the victory to Park Inbee of South Korea.

"I had a flashback, because it [the Pattaya meltdown] also happened on a par-5 hole. But I tried not to be consumed by that because I was still leading and there were three more holes to go for birdies," said the 17-year-old rookie from Bangkok. Ariya duly bounced back to fire her final birdie on the 17th and finally vanquish the ghosts along with Allen, who lost her chance to catch the Thai after a bogey on the 16th. Ariya took the title by three strokes after carding a total 14-under-par 270 at the par-71 Golf de l'Ocean.

Ariya, who won the Ladies European Tour (LET) qualifying tournament in Marrakech in December, again displayed her remarkable talent in recovering from a stroke behind overnight leader Charley Hull to earn a three-shot victory, with rounds of 69, 67, 67 and 67.

This was only her fourth start on the

LET and adds to her growing reputation as one of the new generation of stars in women's golf. As well as her runners-up place in the Honda LPGA Thailand, she also finished fourth at the HSBC Champions in Singapore.

The win moves the Thai to the top of the LET's Order of Merit and up to 42nd in the world rankings.

When asked how she would spend her winner's cheque, she replied: "It's all for my dad! I'm going to keep playing on the European Tour and I hope to win some more."

However she said she would keep hold of the ornate diamond-encrusted purse which she was also given as a prize.

THAILAND trounced underdogs the Philippines 4-0 in their final encounter of the round-robin preliminaries on Sunday to cruise into the semifinals of the US\$1-million Axiata Cup, the world's richest mixed team badminton tournament.

The final day of the preliminaries saw defending champions Indonesia thrash Europe 3-1 and Malaysia outclass Asia 3-1. Singapore crushed Vietnam 4-0 but both sides failed to make the cut for the semifinals.

Against the inexperienced Philippines, the Thai squad was represented by Tanongsak Saensomboonsuk and Busana Ongbamrungpan in the men's and women's singles rubbers.

Busanan, current world No 18 and winner at last year's Malaysian Open Grand Prix Gold, got Thailand off to a great start with a win despite facing a stiff challenge from Filipina Malvinne Alcala, the world No 302. After winning the first game with ease 21-7, Busanan struggled to hit form to go down 17-21 in the second. The tie-breaker became a hard-fought thriller as both players mixed thundering smashes with dainty drop-shots. The Thai girls fared better to win the closely-contested decider 23-21. It

was a similar script in the men's singles with world No 24 Tanongsak given a hard time by Antonio Benjamin Gadi, currently ranked 459 in the world. However, the All-England semi-finalist covered the court well, went on the attack and beat the in-form Filipino 21-19 22-20 21-19.

In the mixed doubles, Thailand's Songphon Anugritayawon and Kunchala Voravichitchaikul outclassed Phillip J Escueta and Bianca Y Carlos 21-19 21-17 to stretch the lead to 3-0.

World No 12 and last year's Singapore Open winner Boonsak Ponsana partnered Sudket Prapakamol to trounce Paul J Vivas and Peter G Magnaye 21-18 21-15 in the men's doubles and complete a clean sweep for Thailand.

Indonesia stayed at the top of the overall standings with 22 points, followed by Malaysia and Thailand with 21 points. Due to their better points won/lost ratio, Malaysia finished second and Thailand third. Asia finished fourth with 16 points.

Fifth to eighth overall were Europe, Singapore, Vietnam and the Philippines with 14, 11, 5 and 2 points respectively.

PHUKET FC sit near the top of the Yamaha League One (YL1) table early in the 2013 season thanks to their latest victory, away to the Thai Tobacco Monopoly (TTM) football club.

Played on March 31, under a warm, late-afternoon sun at Thephasadin Stadium in downtown Bangkok, the match was both side's fourth of the 34-fixture season.

As the waning sun still illuminated much of the pitch at 4pm, the game kicked off to the delight of about 450 spectators, including at least 100 diehard Phuket fans, many of whom had endured 18 hours on two different buses to come to the match.

The Phuket FC Hulk's fan-club chartered bus broke down at 1am the previous night in Chaiya district in Surat Thani, about 300 kilometers outside of Phuket.

By 3am, a replacement bus finally arrived and the fans safely arrived at Bangkok by Sunday afternoon, with just enough time for lunch and a stroll round MBK before kickoff.

In order to stay on track for their goal of promotion to the Thai Premier League, Phuket fans and players expected a certain win, but TTM had different ideas.

Phuket's early attacking attempts, mostly through Luiz "Dudu" Purcino and Geoffrey Doumeng were no match for TTM's Cameroonian defensive midfielder, Jacques Nguemaleu, as well as their Japanese keeper, Shota Wada, who was always readily alert.

The late day Bangkok heat must have affected both sides attacking game as TTM's forward duo of Yugoslavian born Brit, Vigan Qehaja and Korean Hongyoul Yoo were unable to find the back of the net either, despite many shots.

Both sides went into their locker rooms at half time scoreless.

The visitors came out for the second half looking the more determined of the two sides.

Phuket's travel weary fans had to wait until the 80th minute to be sated by a goal, with midfielder Kritsada Sakaeo scoring from a free kick far out near the touchline on the right wing.

TTM Lopburi intensified the pressure late in the game, and despite several commendable attempts were unable to find the equalizer.

Phuket's defenders and goalie had a tough but clean game, particularly stalwart keeper Kampon, who is also a reserve keeper for the Thailand national Southeast Asian Games squad.

Key defenders, Nenebi Slyvester and Sato Yusuke also deserve credit for thwarting several TTM attacks.


With the win, Phuket moved into 2nd place of the 18-team league. The win was their first on the road and second overall after beating Si Racha 3-1 the week prior, following their initial two draws.

Meanwhile, TTM linger in last place having only secured one point in their first four matches.
