Buried secrets

Unearthed skeleton thought to be missing billionaire, victim of alleged Phuket killer

POLICE this week unearthed human remains underneath the Samui home of Hungarian national Gabor Nemeth, better known by the name on his Israeli passport, Moshe David. The decomposing skeleton is believed to

be all that remains of 39-year-old Hungarian

 Royal Place Condominium, Near Wat Samkong and Tesco Lotus, Phuket Town Daily Open 10:00 - 24:00 www.theninewineanddining.com billionaire Laszlo Csapai, who was last seen in February 2011.

The gruesome discovery has forced investigators to dig deeper into the mystery of why the billionaire was murdered, allegedly by Mr David, who already stands charged with the murder of Hungarian businessman Peter Reisz in Phuket in December last year.

Police began excavating underneath Mr David's villa in the expat-popular area of Bophut last Sunday following a tip-off from Hungarian police who were trying to locate Mr Csapai.

The bones were buried at a depth of about three meters in the villa's basement.

"The skull was broken and appeared to have been hit by a hard object," said Surat Thani Provincial Police Commander

Kiattipong Khaosum-ang.

Mr Csapai's family had reported him as missing to Hungarian police and hired a detective to find him, Maj Gen Kiattipong explained. The detective was able to locate a Hungar-

ian businessman who had worked with both Mr David and Mr Csapai, he added. The man was reported to the police and

brought in for questioning. "The man told police that Mr David killed

Mr Csapai and then asked him to help bury his body in the basement of his villa. "He also claimed that Mr David threatened to

kill him if he told anyone," Gen Kiattipong said. Hungarian police then contacted police in Samui to check if the bones were buried...

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Phuket airport security boosted after Boston marathon bombing

SECURITY at Phuket International Airport has been boosted in the wake of the Boston Marathon bombing which killed three and injured at least 180 last Monday. (See page 10).

Pongsak Semsant, caretaker president of Airports of Thailand (AOT), announced the security boost for all major AOT airports in Thailand, including Suvarnabhumi and Don Mueang in Bangkok, and Chiang Mai International Airport.

Phuket Airport Director Prathuang Sornkham told the Gazette on April 18, "We cannot reveal the details of the security measures, but we have closed some gates and entrances to make it easier for our guards to manage

the situation."

More officers and security guards are now on duty patrolling different areas of the airport, he said.

Three big bikers die speeding into curves

PHUKET'S Big Bike Week closed with two reported deaths; a third followed minutes later.

All three riders lost control of their bikes when they entered curves at high speed.

Only one man was wearing a helmet.

The first death occurred on the afternoon of April 18 just south of Phattalung when Malaysian Hasal Muhammad Bin Yunus, 45, en route to Phuket with a group of friends, crashed his Harley Davidson.

"They were riding quite fast as the road was empty. Mr Hasal lost control of his motorbike as he arrived at a curve," said Lt Boonthip Wunfai of the Khao Chaison Police.

"His bike slammed into a roadside post and he was thrown off. Mr Hasal was not wearing a helmet and died at the scene," Lt Boonthip said.

The second death occurred on the last morning of Big Bike Week as another group of Malaysian bikers set off for home.

Zhi Wei Loh, 29, crashed his Kawasaki big bike at the Baan Kor En curve on Thepkrasattri

"Mr Loh's friend said that as they arrived at the curve, Mr Loh, who was driving fast, lost control. He fell off his bike, rolled, and hit the road median," said Lt Thanom Thongpan of the Tah Chat Chai police.

"Mr Loh was wearing his helmet, but suffered a broken neck and died at the scene," he said.

The third man to die was 31vear-old British national Paul Anthony Ancell, who overshot a curve and crashed his 1000cc

Yamaha R1 into a roadside post on Chao Fa East Road near Wat Ladthiwanaram shortly after midnight on April 22.

"A patrol officer saw him riding back and forth at high speed several times," said Sub Lt Kraisorn Boonprasob of the Chalong Police.

"The man was not wearing a helmet. He suffered a cracked skull. broken neck and broken arms and died at the scene," he added.

Russian teen motorcyclist still in coma

VLAD Abrashko, the Russian student who was driving the motorbike involved in the high-speed accident on the bypass road almost a month ago has been discharged from hospital with a broken leg.

His passenger Sevastian Lukashov, however, remained comatose at Phuket International Hospital, a source close to the teens confirmed to the Gazette on April 18.

With Mr Abrashko now out of the hospital, police can continue with their investigation into the accident, Wichit Police Sub Lt Somboon Malai told the *Gazette*.

We are waiting for the rider of the motorbike to contact us and come to the station to give a statement," Lt Somboon said.

Opas Hutkarn, the insurance

representative for Wannakij Maneerat, the driver of the car involved in the accident, told the Gazette that he also needed to consult with Mr Abrashko before his firm could move ahead with providing financial assistance to the accident victims.

"At this stage, we still need someone who was involved with the motorbike to contact me to claim for damages. However, before we can do that, we have to wait for Mr Abrashko to give his statement to police," Mr Opas said.

"There is no need for both of the Russian teenagers to fully recover first; it's enough if only the driver of the motorbike gives a police statement," he added. – Saran Mitrarat

"We have sent the bones to the Institute of Forensic Medicine at Police General Hospital in Bangkok to determine if they are 'He also Mr Csapai's," Gen

Kiattipong said. "If they are, Mr David will be brought to Samui for question-

Teen masseuse tumbles from the fourth floor after argument

A 17-YEAR-OLD masseuse is in a coma after falling from the fourth floor of a building on April 22 following an argument with her boyfriend.

The young woman was discovered unconscious and severely injured on the ground behind the Phuket Town massage parlor where she worked, a Kusoldharm Foundation rescue worker told the Gazette.

Rescue workers administered emergency first aid before rushing the masseuse to Vachira Phuket Hospital.

A friend of the woman told the Gazette that the 17-year-old had argued with her boyfriend outside her room. The friend heard the boyfriend leave and heard the woman enter her own room alone.

"At about 4:50am we all heard a banging noise like something hard hitting the ground in the back of the building. We looked down from the window and saw her lying unconscious on the ground," said the friend.

The police are continuing to investigate the case.

Hope fades for finding executioners

Aldhouse:

CONFESSED killer Lee Aldhouse, sitting behind a glass divide that runs the length of the dingy visitor's room, gives his first interview from Phuket Prison exclusively to the *Phuket Gazette*. Andrew Scott reports.

LOOKING exhausted, Lee Aldhouse cut a lonely figure in his faded prison-issue overalls, surrounded by about 20 Thai inmates. He waited for the signal from the prison guard controlling the communication between visitors and inmates – a telephone – before picking up his receiver.

The first thing he said was, "I cannot talk about my impending court case, but we can discuss prison life."

Aldhouse faces charges of premeditated murder under Section 288 of the Thai Criminal Code for the slaying of former US Marine Dashawn Longfellow in 2010. The penalty for that charge is death or a term of imprisonment of 15 to 20 years, but the death penalty will not be considered as he has already confessed to stabbing Mr Longfellow.

Aldhouse has been in Phuket Provincial Prison since December last year, when he became the first person in over 100 years to be extradited from England to Thailand. He fled Thailand on August 17, 2010, three days after the murder of 23-year-old Longfellow, and was arrested upon his arrival at Heathrow Airport in London on an unrelated charge.

Before the one-on-one interview with Aldhouse this week, a prison official told the *Gazette* that was starting to adjust to life behind bars and had visits from friends every two weeks.

Speaking softly and calmly through the telephone with his gaze fixed forward, Aldhouse talked about his prison life. His expression changed only when the conversation turned to prison guards. He became uncomfortable, rubbing his head, neck and face compulsively and glancing around the room before looking straight on again.

PRISON LIFE

Aldhouse entered Phuket prison in shackles and chains and admits that he felt unsafe for the first few months. The tough guy persona he had spent years cultivating during his kickboxing career as "The Pitbull" worked against him in jail. He believes that when he fell ill, he wasn't allowed to get the medical treatment he felt he needed because of his image.

"The guards saw me as a tough Muay Thai boxer," he said.

Trying to come to grips with what was happening around him, he would take notes about daily life and the incidents that occurred in prison. This constant notetaking was a poignant reminder of his new life and what came with it – causing him great stress. Once he stopped chronicling everything that happened to him, he began to feel more at ease and slowly adjusted to his new surroundings.

"I have sort of acclimatized to life in prison. It's not a good thing, but I had to do it to get by with day-to-day life."

Aldhouse, originally from Birmingham, helps to pass his time in jail by training four Thai inmates

in amateur boxing.

"I was asked to do this only because of my fighting background and I have trained the boxers since day one here," he said.

The boxers don't have a gym as such, but they do have one punching bag and gloves. Training the boxers keeps Aldhouse busy and he spoke with a sense of pride about the tournament his boxers competed in on April 25 at Surat Thani Provincial Prison. Aldhouse doesn't box, but he enjoys the hands-on aspect of training the inmates.

THE BELLS

Aldhouse does his best to keep to himself in a cell that houses 33 other inmates, explaining in part why he looks so exhausted.

"I can't sleep at night because the guards ring a bell every 15 minutes, from 8pm to 6am every night."

P r i s o n Chief Rapin N i c h a n o n explained to the *Gazette* that the bells are standard procedure at prisons across Thailand.

"The guards ring the bells hourly from 9pm to 6am to let

their supervisor know that all is well. It takes about three minutes for all guards to ring in. This system is used in every prison in Thailand," he said.

The only contact Aldhouse has with the outside world is when his girlfriend and a few friends he made before he fled the country in 2010 come to visit him.

ANXIETY

Aldhouse doesn't send any mail to friends or relatives on the outside as he believes the guards will read it. The mere mention of the guards makes him squirm in his seat, and again he begins to rub his neck and his head.

"The guards have refused to give me my medication for anxiety for the last six weeks," he said.

"Prisoners are allowed medicine only if it has been prescribed by a doctor," Prison Chief Rapin explained.

"They cannot bring their own medicine into the prison and they cannot receive any medicine brought by relatives or friends without presenting to us a prescription from a doctor in Thailand," he said.

"Mr Aldhouse does not have a doctor's prescription and friends who visited him tried to bring him some medicine a few times. They told us it was for his illness, but we did not allow this because we are not sure if it is genuine medicine or drugs or other dangerous pills," he added.

Regardless, Chief Rapin called a doctor from Vachira Phuket Hospital to examine Aldhouse and confirm that medication was required.

"The doctor ordered an initial course of medication, but after that ran out Mr Aldhouse said he wanted more. The doctor, however, considers further medication unnecessary," he said.

A DIFFERENT VIEW

Seen through the glass, Aldhouse looked like a person who is starting to accept his fate and no longer sees the point in trying to cause a fuss.

He doesn't like the way the media have portrayed him and he doesn't understand why the press has chosen to show him in a bad light. Stories sur-

faced of Aldhouse smashing a flyscreen, fighting with other prisoners and making

unrealistic demands. "I don't want to be portrayed as an animal in the media. The stories about

food and special treatment are all lies."

He was at a loss to understand why people would make something up about him and he couldn't think of a reason when pushed on the subject. He gestured to the other Thai inmates in the room asking, "Why would I get special meals over them?"

TRIAL

Aldhouse is not due back in court again until August 10, and now that he seems to be coping with life in prison he didn't seem keen on being moved to a prison in Bangkok after his trial.

"I want to stay here... I don't want to go to a new prison and have to start from the beginning in a new prison environment," he said.

Phuket Prison was built 115 years ago and meant to house 800 prisoners, but today is home to more than 2,000 inmates.

As the allotted 15 minutes of visiting time drew to a close, Aldhouse asked if the *Gazette* would come back again and see him in a month or two, but not at 1pm on a Thursday, as that is when he holds a training session with his boxers.

And with that, the phone line was cut off and the inmates filed through the single door back into the belly of the prison.

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Officials slap down dengue

Phuket Governor launches campaign to fight increase in dengue fever

THE Phuket Governor has branded his new strategy to combat the spread of dengue fever in Phuket with the lucky number 333, representing a sustained campaign of "three days, three weeks, three months".

After witnessing a sharp increase in the number of people contracting the disease in the past three months, Governor Maitri Inthusut on Monday called on communities across the island to step up the fight against dengue.

He also urged the Phuket Public Health Office and local authorities to keep an eye on the rapid spread of dengue fever in their areas.

"According to Health Office statistics, 323 people contracted dengue fever between January 1 and April 17 this year. The number is more than six times greater than the number of people who contracted dengue during the same period last year," he said.

"The infection rate [in Phuket during the period] was 93.6 per 100,000 inhabitants. One person has died so far," Gov Maitri said.

The rise in the number of dengue cases was most prevalent in Phuket's Thalang District, covering the north of the island, followed by Kathu District and Muang District, respectively, he added.

"To prevent the spread of dengue, local organizations must use the 'three days, three weeks, three months' strategy in their areas," the governor ordered.

Under the 333 campaign, local officials have three days to identify patients suspected of having dengue in their areas and have them brought to a hospital for treatment.

"If the doctor confirms the patient does indeed have dengue, then the village where the patient lives has three weeks to get rid of all possible sources of Aedes aegypti mosquito [which carries the disease]. This will continue for three months," Gov Maitri explained.

The three days of identifying possible dengue sufferers started on Wednesday and was set to

conclude on Friday.

"Public Health officers will check for people suspected of having dengue in every community," the governor said.

Phuket Public Health chief Bancha Kakong explained that symptoms of dengue fever can include severe headache, joint and

muscle pain, diarrhea, vomiting and skin rash, which may appear over the body three to four days after the onset of fever.

"More serious symptoms include bleeding from the nose, mouth, gums and under the skin," he said.

"There is no specific medical



treatment and no vaccine for

dengue infection. The best way to protect against dengue is to avoid mosquito bites," he added.

"See a doctor immediately if you think you may have dengue," he advised.

Dr Bancha explained that his officers will launch a dengue pub-

Still water tips to keep you dengue free

PHUKET Public Health Office Deputy Director Wiwat Seetamanotch makes it clear that the first line of defense in preventing dengue fever is preventing standing water.

Mr Wiwat, as well as Phuket Public Health chief Bancha Kakong, offered the following advice to Phuket residents.

• Throw out or cover all sources of unused standing water to prevent mosquitoes from laying eggs in them.

• Change the water in all containers every seven days.

• Clean water bowls and water containers regularly.

• Release guppies or other small fish into ponds to feed on mosquito larvae.

• Clean up areas around the house and throughout the community to make sure there are no unknown sources of standing water.

• Add Temefos to prevent mosquitoes from breeding. Temefos (brand name Abate) is an organophosphate larvicide used to treat water infested with disease-carrying insects, including mosquitoes, midges and black fly larvae.

lic-awareness campaign, starting with Thalang District, the hardest hit area in Phuket.

"We will explain to residents how to protect themselves from contracting dengue fever. Later, we will continue our campaign in Kathu and Muang Districts," he said.



Underpass lanes to open in 2014

TO ALLEVIATE the ongoing traffic tailbacks at the construction site of Phuket's first underpass, on the bypass road, the project managers will open all three lanes of the underpass early next year.

"So far, the underpass is 11 per cent complete. At the beginning of next year, it will be opened for road users," Department of Highways' Bureau of Bridge Construction engineer Itthiwat Kritsanawanich announced at a meeting on April 18.

"After we finish the underpass itself, we will begin the road works at the intersection," Mr Itthiwat said.

"First, we plan to close the two lanes northbound in front of Central Festival for renovation. At that time, we will open all three lanes of the underpass so northbound traffic can continue uninterrupted," he told the *Gazette*.

When we finish renovating the lanes in front of Central Festival, we will re-open the northbound lanes... and close the southbound lanes in front of HomeWorks.

"At that time, all southbound lanes

will be diverted to the underpass so southbound traffic can continue uninterrupted," Mr Itthiwat said. – Orawin Narabal

Motorbike arson continues to flare

TWO more motorbikes and the front of a small restaurant went up in flames in Phuket on Tuesday, bringing the total number of motorbikes scorched by arson since the beginning of March to nearly 30, say police.

At 2pm, Kamala Police received three reports of fires: two were of motorbikes ablaze and the third was of flames at the front of a small restaurant.

The first motorbike had a sidecar and was parked beside the Kamala-Patong road. The motorbike was completely destroyed, but the sidecar suffered minimal damage.

The second motorbike was parked opposite the construction site where the owner of the motorbike works, on the road between Kamala and Laem Singh.

Staff at a nearby hotel noticed the fire and rushed to extinguish it. The front fairings and other plastics were destroyed by the fire, but the rear of the motorbike suffered no damage.

The third fire was at a restaurant near Phuket FantaSea. Local firefighters arrived in time to put attack in Kamala and the other caught, the perpetrators were

out the blaze and save the restaurant; only the front section of the thatched roof was destroyed.

The three fires attracted the attention of the Phuket Provincial Police, who are conducting a joint investigation into the fires with Kamala Police special investigator Lt Col Nanon Pitakkultorn.

"So far 22 motorbikes have been damaged or destroyed by fire in Kathu alone. This includes the eight motorbikes burned at the Irawadee Ketho housing estate and the three fires in Kamala yesterday [April 22]," Kathu District Chief Weera Kerdsirimongkol said.

"Right now we are working intensely on the case of the eight motorbikes. Police are investigating suspects. We believe that a love affair may be the motivation for this crime," he added.

Phuket Provincial Police Commander Choti Chavalviwat told the Gazette that the spate of motorbike arson attacks in Phuket is becoming "serious".

"Since the beginning of March, nearly 30 motorbikes have been damaged or destroyed by fire. So far two suspects have been arrested, one in relation to an

CEO continues to dodge Tiger Disco fire charges

THE Phuket Chief Public Prosecutor's attempt to levy a series of charges against Tiger Group CEO Piya Isaramalai and Sara Entertainment Co Ltd after a fatal blaze killed four people at Patong's famous Tiger Disco nightclub on August 17 have been delayed for a second time.

"The charges were originally given the green light last month," Phuket Chief Public Prosecutor Chiengsean Panhya said.

Simultaneously with the prosecution's decision to move forward with the case, Legal Counsel for Tiger Discotheque, Thamrongsak Boonrak, submitted a letter asking the prosecution to re-think its charges before even taking the case to court.

"I have submitted a letter to the Phuket Public Prosecutor Office appealing for a 'fair investigation' to have the authorities reconsider charging us on the allegations of wrongdoing," Mr Thamrongsak said.



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Police delve into nervous men's pants in drug bust

POLICE stationed at a Thalang checkpoint discovered three packages of *ya ice* (crystal methamphetamine) after they delved into the pants of two "nervous" men last Friday.

Officers manning a checkpoint on Thepkrasattri Road in Srisoonthorn stopped Tossawat Meesukanukoon, 22 and Pasit Kittijaruensin, also 22, because they looked "suspiciously nervous" as they approached the checkpoint on their motorbike.

"We found three plastic bags of ya ice in the waist-

band of the driver's underwear," said Thalang Police Deputy Superintendent Amnuay Kraiwutthianun. The total weight of the drug was 0.88 grams.

The two men were arrested and taken to Thalang Police station.

"The men confessed to having bought about 5,000 baht of *ya ice*," said duty officer Patiwat Yodkwa.

"They were charged with possession of a Category 1 drug," Pol Capt Patiwat added.

Spirit demands villagers hail sporting events, attacks teens

THREE teenage female footballers recently found out that failing to pay respect to Thailand's capricious spirits can have strange and painful consequences.

On the hot afternoon of March 22, Supatcharaphon Bunprachuap, Surirat Thongsin and Kanda Yingchiao had just finished playing a football match at a field in Surin Province.

Suddenly, all three girls collapsed and started convulsing, writhing backwards and forwards. Their eyes were bulging as if they had gone insane.

Villagers crowded around the three and started massaging and fanning them.

Fortunately, a local masseur and practitioner of herbal medicine was present at the incident.

Mr Chian started chanting incantations in a bid to bring the girls out of their state.

After about half an hour, Kanda's state began to improve, though the other two just got worse.

Mr Chian then gave the two girls who had yet to recover a special potion made from a mixture of water and local herbs.

After drinking the concoction, Surirat screamed at the top of her voice for two minutes before collapsing asleep.

Eventually the girls fell asleep, before waking up and recovering.

But some residents of the village wanted to know why this strange occurrence had happened. They performed a spirit medium ceremony to ask the spirits.

Came the answer: the problem stemmed from Puphothong Shrine, just next to Ban Taphram Village.

The spirit of the shrine was apparently dissatisfied that nobody had gone to announce that the village was going to hold a sports competition.

Dead dugong discovery prompts villagers to take action

A DEAD dugong was found floating just off the coast of Koh Pu in Krabi by a local crab fisherman yesterday morning, prompting villagers to take action.

The young marine mammal was discovered with a long gash across its snout in front of the Baan Koh Pu village port and was dragged to shore by villagers before it was reported to the Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC).

This is the first report issued to the PMBC by the local residents, who were unaware that it was important to report such matters, explained the village Kamnan, Samran Raden. "This is at least the third one we have found dead since October last year," Mr Samran said. Before being notified of the possible death of at least two more dugong last year, Dr Kongkiat Kittiwattanawong, who heads the PMBC Endangered Species Unit, had already voiced concern over the dramatic rise in the number of dugong deaths in the region.

"The increase in deaths is a serious issue," Dr Kongkiat said earlier this year. "It's the highest number we've seen in the past 20 years."

Dr Kongkiat believes the deaths were caused by fishing equipment and boats, as a number of the animals had wounds consistent with those inflicted by the propeller blades of fishing boats.

Polluted water runs amok

HOTELS and businesses located along the canal that empties onto Bang Tao Beach will be inspected and forced to conform to wastewater-treatment standards, Government Spokesman Prompong Nopparit has announced.

The news follows the public exposure of dirty water in the canal that has caused a rash of health problems for tourists and local boatmen in the area, some of whom have been hospitalized for blood infections.

Government Spokesman Prompong and Phuket Vice Governor Somkiet Sangkhaosutthirak inspected three sites along the canal to see the pollution firsthand on Tuesday.

At the first site, near the Dalah Resort, Mr Prompong and his entourage of environmental experts found no dirty water in the area.

"At the next site, near Billy Bridge, the water started to get dirty. At the last site, near Bang Tao Bridge, two kilometers from the second site, the water was very dirty and smelly," Mr Prompong told the press.

"There are many hotels, restaurants, bars, car wash shops and houses near the second and third locations we visited. The dirty water from these sources has caused many people to have skin problems," he said.

"The long-term solution is to set up a wastewater-treatment system in the area. We are working on it and expect it to be operational within the next two years," he added.

Mr Prompong ordered the Cherng Talay Administrative Organization (*OrBorTor*) to set up a task force to inspect businesses along the canal to ensure that they have adequate wastewater-treatment tanks installed.

"If they do not, they will be told not to release wastewater into the canal. If they do not comply, we will press charges," he warned.

Mr Prompong also called on local villagers to not discharge untreated wastewater into the public waterway.

Akkarawat Hirunphun, director of the Phuket-based Regional Environmental Office 15, said tests conducted by his officers confirmed that the water in the canal at all three locations visited yesterday had average Biological Oxygen Demand (BOD) readings well over the legal standard.

"Almost all the fish in the canal have died," he said.

In response to local residents' claims that the Cherng Talay *OrBorTor* had failed to take any action to redress the pollution, Mr Akkarawat explained that he had been informed that the Cherng Talay *OrBorTor* had held a meeting to find a solution to the problem. "However, the Cherng Talay

OrBorTor did not talk about this

with the sub-district chief or village headmen in the area, so they did not know anything about what was being done," he said.

Vice Governor Somkiet told the press that he ordered the Cherng Talay *OrBorTor* to dredge the canal wider so that the water would flow unimpeded into the sea, giving bacteria less opportunity to develop to dangerous levels.

"I also ordered the Thalang District Office and Cherng Talay *OrBorTor* officers to invite the owners of restaurants, bars and hotels along the canal to meet and discuss possible solutions to the problem," he said.



Police pursuit nets drug suspect from pond

PHUKET City Police in hot pursuit of a drug suspect on April 18 finally arrested their man after hauling him out of a pond in Rassada.

Police were alerted to the suspect when officers at a checkpoint on Palian Road in Phuket Town saw a new Toyota Vios, still bearing red license plates, pull over just short of the checkpoint.

The officer's suspicions grew when they saw the driver get out of the vehicle and run off on foot.

Officers gave chase and reported the incident to police headquarters.

Phuket City Deputy Superintendent Chao Pormna quickly rallied

a team and cordoned off the area. Failing to find the suspect, they began a sweep through the residents' yards and pockets of uncleared undergrowth in the surrounding area.

Two hours later, the officers found 27-year-old Subthawee Srisuwan hiding in a pond.

After fishing him out of the water, officers found 10 pills of *ya bah* (methamphetamine) in the pockets of his wet shorts.

Police also searched the aban-

doned car and seized a .38mm handgun with five bullets and a bag containing 10 grams of *ya ice* (crystal methamphetamine).

Insurgents denounce talks

INSURGENTS in the Deep South are continuing to show defiance against ongoing peace talks with the Thai state, erecting banners across the region denouncing the negotiations.

They are also continuing to sew havoc, killing four bombdisposal officers and injuring six more in Narathiwat using a "rigged" bomb that exploded after it appeared to have been disarmed.

Anti-peace-talks cloth banners were discovered along roads in 45 locations in Narathiwat, 16 locations in Yala and five in Pattani on April 22.

The banners carried messages, in the local dialect of Malay, opposing the peace talks between the government and the Barisan



Revolusi Nasional (BRN), underway in Malaysia.

At one of the banner sites, a homemade gas cylinder bomb was discovered.

The cylinder, containing about 25 kilograms of explosives, was defused and taken to the barracks at the Marines Task Force 32 headquarters in Bacho district. There, an explosive ordnance disposal team attempted to open it in order to dispose of the materials inside. "When the cover was spread apart, two live wires moved towards each other and when they made contact it activated the direct detonation of the explosives," said Colonel Thaweesak Jantharasin, who is chief of the Army's bomb disposal operations in the Deep South.

Four explosive ordnance disposal technicians were instantly killed and six wounded in the blast.

The next peace dialogue between the Thai government and the BRN is scheduled to be held in Malaysian on April 29.

National Security Council (NSC) Secretary General Lt-Gen Paradorn Pattanatabut said the recent attacks and banners were the work of other insurgent groups aiming to prove their existence and who might want to join the upcoming peace talks.

Gen Paradorn said officials were coordinating with other insurgent groups in case they wanted to be part of the peace process.

"There might be more bombings until the next peace talks are held, but these will remain in restricted areas," the NSC chief said.

The BRN representatives are now engaged in talks with the Runda Kumpulan Kecil (RKK), another insurgent group active in Thailand's restive Deep South, over possible participation in the peace process, Gen Paradorn added.

Thailand's legal heroes return

THE Thai legal team responsible for presenting Thailand's claim to disputed land around Preah Vihear Temple has returned to The Kingdom after making its case at the International Court of justice in The Hague.

The team got a warm welcome from crowds of well-wishers when it arrived at Suvarnabhumi Airport on April 21 following a week of presentations arguing that Thailand has sovereignty over the disputed territory, rather than Cambodia.

In particular, a French-Romanian lawyer hired by the Thai government, Alina Miron, has become a hero in many Thais' eyes for her work on behalf of the nation.

Crowds held placards for Mrs Miron and the leader of the legal team, Virachai Plasai, on their arrival at the airport.

"Alina Miron: You Are Our Hero. We Love You," one read.

Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra voiced her gratitude to the team in a press conference following their return.

It will be many months before the ICJ rules on the dispute, which has seen deadly skirmishes between the two countries in recent years.

Captain still on the run after Pattaya speedboat collision

FOUR South Korean tourists, a South Korean guide and a Thai guide were seriously injured in a high-speed boat crash off Pattaya last week.

The drivers of both boats fled the scene of the accident on April 21, though one of them later arranged to hand himself into police.

Around 20 tourists and guides were aboard the *Kor Nongmai* 7 speedboat at the time of the collision with another speedboat, *Sor Khemthong*.

Police said evidence suggested that Sor Khemthong crashed into Kor Nongmai 7. However, witnesses said Kor Nongmai 7 collided with Sor Khemthong when it was refilling its fuel tank and not moving.

Sor Khemthong sustained serious damage, including a large hole on the port side.

Police said the driver of *Kor Nongmai* 7, Rung-arun Homlamduan, could not be located after the mishap.

The second driver, Amnuay Kladkhemthong, fled the scene, though he later contacted police to arrange for his surrender.

Fugitive on FBI's 10 Most Wanted list arrested

NICARAGUAN police said on Monday they had arrested a US man on the FBI's Ten Most Wanted list suspected of child pornography offenses, and handed him over to US officials for extradition.

The suspect, former Washington schoolteacher Eric Justin Toth, was arrested on April 20 in Esteli, a city some 150 km north of Managua.

Up to 500 feared dead in Damascus suburb offensive

AT LEAST 109 people have been documented as killed and up to 400 more are likely to have died in an almost week-long offensive by forces loyal to Syrian President Bashar al-Assad on a rebellious Damascus suburb, opposition activists said.

If the accounts are confirmed, the killings in the mainly Sunni Muslim suburb of Jdeidet al-Fadel would amount to one of the bloodiest episodes of the twoyear-old uprising against Assad.

EU lifts Myanmar sanctions despite **HRW** concerns

THE European Union agreed on Monday to lift all sanctions on Myanmar, except for an arms embargo, despite a Human Rights Watch report which accused authorities of complicity in the mass killing of Muslims in the west of the country last year.

PROSECUTORS formally charged Dzhokhar Tsarnaev with the bombings at the Boston Marathon in a hearing held on Monday in his hospital room, accusing him of crimes that carry the possibility of the death penalty.

The 19-year-old ethnic Chechen can be seen in video taken by security cameras placing a backpack near the finish line of the world-renowned race last Monday, the criminal complaint said, alleging he acted in concert with his older brother, who was killed during a shootout with police early Friday.

The brothers carried two backpacks containing pressure cooker bombs that ripped through the crowd near the finish line, killing three people and wounding more than 200, the complaint said.

Dzhokhar Tsarnaev told investigators in his hospital room that he and his brother acted alone, without any help, according to reports by CNN and the New York Times. He said his older brother was the driving force behind the bombings, CNN reported. The Times said Tsarnaev admitted to investigators to being involved in planting the bombs.

Tsarnaev was captured late last Friday after a massive manhunt. He was hospitalized with what the criminal complaint said were gunshot wounds to his head, neck, legs and hand.

Tsarnaev was charged with using a weapon of mass destruction and with malicious destruction of property resulting in death. Each count carries the possibility of the death penalty if he is convicted.

More charges are likely, legal experts said. The 10-page complaint did not

mention a motive, leaving that as one of the mysteries of the investigation.

According to a transcript of the bedside legal proceeding, the teenager, mostly unable to speak due to his injuries, nodded when questioned by federal Magistrate Judge Marianne Bowler, who asked him if he could answer questions and could follow what was happening.

Asked by the magistrate if he could afford a lawyer, Tsarnaev said "No." Three public defenders, appointed by the court, were in the room. They did not peared on TV screens and websites

respond to requests seeking comment afterward.

A sworn FBI statement in support of the criminal complaint revealed the recollection of a man whose car was hijacked by the brothers while they tried to escape on Thursday night.

"Did you hear about the Boston explosion?" one of the brothers is said to have told the carjack victim. "I did that."

Tsarnaev's capture capped a tense 26 hours after the FBI released the first pictures of the two bombing suspects, still unidentified, last Thursday.

Five hours after their faces ap-

around the world, the brothers shot and killed a university policeman, carjacked a Mercedes and sought to evade police by hurling bombs during a shootout in a Boston suburb, police said.

Tamerlan Tsarnaev, 26, was shot in an exchange of gunfire with police and run over by his younger brother, police said. Dzhokhar later abandoned the car and fled on foot, evading police for nearly 20 more hours until he was found bleeding, hiding in a boat.

On Monday, Boston-area hospitals were still treating at least 48 people, with at least two listed in critical condition.

Canadian police thwart terrorist plot to target passenger train in Toronto area

CANADIAN police said on Monday they had arrested and charged two men with plotting to derail a Toronto-area passenger train in an operation they say was backed by al Qaeda elements in Iran.

"Had this plot been carried out, it would have resulted in innocent people being killed or seriously injured," said Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) official James Malizia.

The RCMP said it had arrested Chiheb Esseghaier, 30, of Montreal, and Raed Jaser, 35, of Toronto in connection with the plot, which authorities said was not linked to last week's Boston Marathon bombings.

Neither is a Canadian citizen, and police did not reveal their nationalities. Two sources following the investigation said one of the two was Tunisian.

Canada's spy agency has long

expressed concern about the possibility that disgruntled and radicalized Canadians could attack targets at home and abroad.

Police gave few details about the alleged plotters, but said a tip from the Muslim community had helped their year-long investigation.

Mr Esseghaier has been a do toral student at the Institut National de la Recherche Scientifique near Montreal since 2010 and was about midway through his degree, the school said.

A bail hearing for the two will take place in Toronto on Tuesday morning.

Mr Malizia said there was no indication that the planned attacks, which police described as the first known al Qaeda- backed plot on Canadian soil, were state-sponsored.

US officials said the attack would have targeted a rail line between New York and Toronto.

Canadian police said only that the plot involved a VIA train route in the Toronto area. VIA is Canada's equivalent of Amtrak and operates passenger rail services on track owned primarily by Canadian National Railway Co.

Mr Malizia said the RCMP believed the two had the capacity and intent to carry out the attack, but there was no imminent threat to the public, passengers, or infrastructure.



US tax regime: comply or else...

Al A US tax seminar held last month at the Holiday Inn, Patong, by the American Chamber of Commerce (AMCHAM) Phuket Chapter, American income earners and business operators were given a comprehensive update about the US tax regime's reporting requirements and regulations.

Two previous articles about the seminar – published in the Business section of the *Phuket Gazette* on March 23 and 30 – covered the Foreign Earned Income (FEI) exclusion, foreign tax credits and other related reporting requirements such as the Foreign Bank Account Reporting (FBAR).

This article will cover the reporting requirements for foreign held assets, as well as investments in foreign corporations.

The seminar's keynote speaker, John Andes, a US CPA and Thai-American partner with the Bangkok-based accounting firm KMPG Phoomchai Tax Ltd, covered a number of forms that Americans living or investing abroad should be aware of.

"Form 8938 must be filed by US persons with any interest in a Specified Foreign Financial Assets (SFFA), if the aggregate value of such SFFA exceeds certain thresholds," US

For single persons, or those married but filing separately, the SFFA threshold is at least US\$200,000 aggregate at year's end or at least \$300,00 any time during the year.

For married persons filing jointly, the thresholds are double.

In addition to this, certain US persons who are shareholders, officers or director of a foreign corporation (any juristic entity) may be required to file form 5471, which covers 'Investment in Certain Foreign Corporations'.

He said that there are four categories required to file this form, but generally, this is required to be filed by any US citizen or resident that is a director or officer of a non-US company, which has at least one

> Form 5471 is required for any shareholder of a non-US company who acquires or disposes of a significant amounts of shares in the non-US company. Also, form 5471 is required where, under certain circumstances, American shareholders control more than 50% of a non-US company's shares, either by value or voting rights.

> Failure to file forms 8938 and 5471 can carry a penalty of \$10,000 per incident, and in the case of form 5471, also pose potential loss of foreign tax credits.

FORMS, FORMS AND MORE FORMS

In addition to the 8938 and 5471 forms, American investors may also need to report other types of foreign investments such as a non-US partnership (form 8865) or disregarded entities (form 8858).

Moreover, US taxpayers must report if they are an owner of a foreign trust, as well as if they had any

> transactions with foreign trusts, ownership of foreign trusts and gifts or bequests from foreign individuals (form 3520 or 3520-A for owners).

Even investments in non-US companies that generate passive income may be subject to additional reporting. In some cases, where an American shareholder receives a dividend from a Passive Foreign Investment Company (PFIC), the shareholder may need to report his investment and income on form 8621.

A PFIC is determined by meet-

ing one of two tests. The first test is met if at least 75% of the non-US company's gross income is passive income, (interest, dividends, rent, royalty and/or capital gain income). The second test is met if at least 50% of the company's assets have generated or are expected to generate passive income.

Cash (generating interest income), buildings and land held for lease (generating rental income), for example, would be considered passive assets.

The tax on dividends received from a PFIC, under certain circumstances, can be very costly to the shareholder. In addition to the normal income tax, there could be additional liabilities imposed on the taxpayer. The additional liabilities may be avoided by making certain elections. This is a very complex area of tax law, which may unknowingly affect many investors in Thailand, especially those who invest in companies that own and rent real estate.

BANK SANCTIONS

Starting in 2014, as a result of the US Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act (FATCA), non-US banks, brokerages, mutual funds, asset managers and insurance providers will begin required .' reporting of information on many of their US account holders or else face stiff US withholding taxes on USsourced income.

Financial institutions, if they elect to comply, must disclose information about accounts held by US persons, which have an aggregate value of at least \$50,000 during the year.

Financial institutions that do not comply will be assessed a 30% withholding tax on dividend and interest income and on the proceeds from the sale of assets paid from the US.

The burden of FATCA is on the non-US financial institutions to comply. Indirectly, though, there may be a backlash to American in-

vestors and depositors if the financial institutions start to reject new accounts for Americans or ask existing American customers to discontinue their accounts.

CHANGES FROM 2013

The 2013 year introduced some changes to the taxation of American individual taxpayers.

Many of the "Bush tax cuts" stayed in effect after sunsetting in 2012, but there is now the addition of a 39.6% tax bracket for ordinary taxable income greater than \$400,000 for single filers and \$450,000 for joint filers. A 20% tax bracket was introduced in 2013 for long-term capital gains for these high income earners also.

In addition to these new tax brackets, FATCA imposes limitations on high income taxpayers in regards to certain itemized deductions, such as mortgage interest, state income tax, property tax and charitable donations. Deductions are lost at the rate of 3% of Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) in excess of \$250,000 for single filers and \$300,000 for joint filers. Also, medical expenses are deductible to the extent that they exceed 10% of AGI – previously 7.5%.

There will also be a phase-out of the personal exemption. Normally, the personal exemption is \$3,900, but the exemption is reduced 2% for each \$2,500 that your AGI exceeds the AGI threshold for deductions.

There is now a 3.8% surtax on unearned (investment) income ap-

plicable to those taxpayers with modified AGI greater than \$200,000 for single filers and \$250,000 for joint filers.

Medicare taxes will also increase. For those subject to Medicare tax deductions, the tax rate will increase from 1.45% to 2.35% on wages over \$200,000 for single filers and \$250,000 for joint filers. There will also be a new 0.9% Medicare tax introduced for these higher income earners.

On a positive note, the estate and gift tax law changes were welcomed by many taxpayers. The estate tax rate was reduced from 55% to 40%, and the lifetime exclusion was adjusted to \$5.12 million for 2013. The annual gift tax exclusion increased from \$13,000 to \$14,000 for 2013.

CONCLUSION

These developments, as well as those described in previous articles, only focus on US federal income tax. Some taxpayers living abroad may also be liable to state and local income taxes. Clearly, the US federal tax rules are ever-changing and as complex as ever. For most taxpayers living abroad, the reporting requirements are manageable, but for many, complex tax calculations, difficulty in reporting information and not being aware of changes to the existing tax laws will cause them to seek assistance either from professional tax advisors or from the IRS directly. - Phuket Gazette

CPAll acquires Siam Makro

LAST week's 188.8 billion baht takeover of Siam Makro will allow CP All to open new cashand-carry centers worldwide, except in India.

CP All is a retail arm of agrifood giant, Charoen Pokphand Group, which is also the thirdlargest operator of 7-Eleven convenience stores in the world.

Korsak Chairasmisak, CP All CEO said that the deal, which took only 10 days to negotiate, comes with the right for his firm to open cash-and-carry wholesale centers

under the Makro name anywhere in the world outside of India.

However, he said that the immediate focus on expanding Makro stores will be in Asean countries, especially Laos and Vietnam, as well as China.

The company will also cash in on Siam Makro's strategic growth in the local hotel, restaurant and catering industry.

"We expect economic growth and civilization to come into the region along with the AEC, which is in contrast to Europe and the US, which are facing a recession." Demand is strong for Thai

products in many neighboring markets including Laos, Cambodia, Vietnam and Myanmar, and Siam Makro will open up those markets, Mr Korsak said.

"For 7-Eleven, we only have a license for the Kingdom. We plan to expand from about 6,700 stores in the Kingdom to 10,000 within five to six years. However, Siam Makro will be our business arm in expanding cash-and-carry centers overseas," he said. – *The Nation*



Replicating your life savings

THE new hot sector for technology investors is in the rapidly growing 3D printer business. 3D printing is the process of mak-

ing a three-dimensional solid object of virtually any shape from a digital model. 3D printers use a 3D CAD (Computer Aided Design) file to create objects using a sequential layering process. This technology is used in jewelry; footwear; industrial design; architecture; engineering and construction, automotive, aerospace, the dental and medical industries; education; geographic information systems; civil engineering and many other fields.

My first introduction to 3D printing came in 1997, working as a mechanical engineer, while printing out of plastic the first pros-

thetic limb for a below-the-knee amputee. The purpose was to manufacture a cost-effective prosthetic limb from a digital scan of the patients remaining leg. At the time it was cutting edge technology but new advances have come a long way

since 1997. Last month, surgeons for the first time used 3D printing to completely replace damaged bone in a patient needing a skull replacement. 75% of the patient's skull was successfully replaced with 3D-printed material. The uses of this technology are endless.

Imagine if you had a glue gun with a mixture of polyethylene and candle wax and wanted to make a toy frog for your daughter. The only way you could really do it is by building the object layer by layer. That is what 3D printing is and this is exactly what happened to S Scott Crump in Minnesota. Scott did make that toy frog for his daughter and started the company Stratasys to automate the 3D printing process.

The Process

The process begins with taking virtual blueprints from CAD and "slicing" them into digital cross-sections for the machine to use as a guideline for printing. Material is then layered until a 3D model has been "printed". These layers of material are fused together to create the final shape. What this allows for is to create an object of any shape or geometric feature. This is known as rapid prototyping.



There are several rapid prototyping techniques and companies using this technology, but they all use the basic five step process.

1) Create a CAD model of the design; 2) Convert the CAD model to STL format; 3) Slice the STL file into thin cross-sectional layers; 4) Construct the model one layer atop another; 5) Clean and finish the model

Stratasys Ltd. (SSYS)

Stratasys Ltd is the company that Scott Crump created in building the toy frog for his daughter. It now has a US\$2.81 billion market cap and is currently trading at \$73.25 per share. The company has a forward P/E (price/ earnings ratio) of 29.42, which is quite cheap

for a company in such a fastgrowing sector. Of the seven analysts that follow the stock, one has it rated a "Strong Buy", two a "Buy" and four a "Hold". The

52-week range on the stock is \$33.52 to \$92.30. The stock has had an impressive run this year, up 200% in past 12 months. I would hold off on purchasing at current levels and wait for a

market correction to buy in at a lower price.

Dassault Systemes SA (DASTY)

Dassault Systemes is the largest company in the sector with a market cap of \$14.32bn. The stock is currently trading at \$115.77, just shy of its 52-week high of \$117.90. Dassault is in the strongest position of the companies with 3D printing technology. The company has a forward P/E of 20.90 with a strong return on equity of 15.18% and operating margins of 24.70%. The company is sitting on \$1.71bn in cash. I do like the stock, but it has had a good run off its 52week low of \$84.17. I advise investors to wait for a pullback, just like with Stratasys.

The ExOne Company (XONE)

The ExOne Company is a new Initial Public Offering (IPO) in the 3D printing sector. The company came public just last month and jumped over 47% on its first day of trading from its offering price of \$18. They raised \$95 million from their IPO. The stock is currently trading at \$30.74 and lutionized the way parts are engineered and freemancapital@gmail.com.

has a market cap of \$393 million. ExOne's 3D printer is unique in that the

customer can print in the material that they desire. Their competitors require that the customer print in plastic. Currently Ford, Boeing and Caterpillar are using ExOne's printers. The company has a backlog of orders for their printers and I look for growth to continue.

Even though the stock is much higher than its recent IPO price of \$18, this is one my favorite stocks in the sector. It has the lowest market cap compared to the other companies in the 3D printer business and I think it has the most room for growth and upside potential. ExOne is focusing solely on large industrial users with significant resources rather than consumers. The company will grow revenues not only from new orders for machines, but from servicing the printers and selling parts. ExOne currently is deriving 2/3of its revenues from its services business.

Overall Assessment

Rapid prototyping technology has revo-

designed. Don't expect to find 3D printers on the shelf at Power Buy in Phuket this week, however, the 3D printer is finally coming to the consumer level. 3D Systems (NYSE: DDD) has a home-based printer for a starting price of US\$1,299. But this printer can only print an object the size of a basketball and can only print in one color. Companies and universities are now the main users of 3D printing but remember the first personal computer began in the same way before hitting the consumer level. The 3D printing business has major potential for growth. The sector is volatile and is not for the risk adverse but for long-term investors, the sector holds tremendous potential.

The last time the markets were here

Island Investor By David Mayes

I RECENTLY read a report that had a comparative list of statistics from the last time the stock markets were up at these levels, which was just before the crash at the start of the financial crisis. Early this march. the DOW reached a previous high level of 14164.5 and then surpassed that level. I thought it might be helpful to share this info, as it really does get you thinking about what is actually behind the market right now. These statistics deal with America but I think if you looked at the UK it would not be a very different picture. If you looked at Europe it could be even scarier.

For instance GDP growth was 2.5% as opposed to 1.6% in the US the last time the DOW was at these levels. There were about half the total number of unemployed, and the


number of Americans living on food stamps has jumped from about 27 million to 47 million. This doesn't seem like the kind of environment a stock market rally would thrive in, but then again maybe it is all about future expectations.

The US debt as a portion of GDP was 38%, now it has grown to 74%. The balance sheet of the Fed has grown from just under 1 trillion to over 3 trillion USD. Unless getting further into debt is practical common financial advice, it doesn't appear the current policy decisions are going to lead to much except inevitable inflation from all of that printing. The credit rating of the USA was AAA last time markets were here, now only AA+.

While all of these in my opinion are reasons to be very wary of the markets at these levels, there is one indicator that I noticed which could mean this rally still has some legs. Consumer confidence was 99.5% back then, whereas it is only at 69.6% now. This is a contrarian indicator as the market tops usually coincide with tops in confidence.

Another interesting statistic is that a ten year government bond yielded 4.64% before the last crash and today it only yields 1.89%. This could be a big part of the reason why markets are rising, as investors are searching for alternatives to such low yields. Unfortunately my big fear is that they will all get stung with money that most likely belongs in the lower risk assets. It is a damned if you, damned if you don't kind of situation for many. This is especially true if you live in Thailand and have seen the triple whammy effects of low yields, a strengthening Thai Baht and high local inflation.

One method of attempting to mitigate the risk of the current market without completely sitting on the sidelines is to counterbalance any stock market holdings with asset classes which performed

positively during the last crashes. CTAs did extremely well, and there other alternatives as well. I would be very careful about being over exposed on the downside of the stock market given the ugly pictures the economic numbers still paint. Thanks to David Conway from Jupiter for compiling these.

Head of airport expects arrivals to exceed 10.5mn

THE director of Phuket International Airport (HKT) expects passenger arrivals to exceed 10.5 million by the end of this year, with related profits expected to be no less than two billion baht.

HKT director Prathuang Sornkham said that the airport is fully prepared to provide increased conveniences for passengers ahead of the its 5 billion baht expansion project, due for completion by 2015.

A number of upgrades currently underway will enable the airport to comfortably handle the target of 12.5mn passengers per year.

Mr Prathuang said that passengers coming to Phuket during this period, just ahead of the rainy season (which up until only recently, was traditionally considered tourism's 'dry season') have increased by 12% over the same period last year.

He noted that the average arrival rate is now around 34,000 to 35,000 passengers a day,

compared to this time last year, when there were about 28,000 arrivals per day.

He added that HKT's profit in 2012 was about 1.85bn baht, up 300mn baht from 2011.

Meanwhile, he expects the airport's profit by the end of 2013 to be around 2bn baht, most of which will be generated by passengers and airlines.

Mr Prathuang explained that such profit derives from rental fees and taxes paid by airlines and other retailers based at the airport, but does not factor in the spending or expenditures of tourists once they leave the airport.

In response to the increasing passenger load ahead of 2015, HKT has already added a new x-ray machine at the check-in counters, bringing the total now to four machines.


Also, the airport has doubled the amount of x-ray machines in the airplane boarding area, up to eight from four, previously.



He went on to confirm that a new warehouse is currently under construction and will be completed in about eight to ten months.

The construction of five new airplane stands is also underway, which will increase the total from 15 to 20 stands. These are expected to be ready for use by the end of 2014, he said.

Small appliances see big growth in SE Asia

THE Small Domestic Appliances (SDA) markets in Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, Vietnam and Thailand grew by nearly 6% in value over a recent 12-month period, when compared to the same period the previous year.

SDA sales in the five markets, tracked from February 2012 to March 2013, had a combined value of more than US\$804 million.

The survey by GFK, one of the world's largest research companies, compared sales figures for SDA units including food preparation appliances, irons, rice cookers and vacuum cleaners.

According to GfK retail audit findings, the growth in overall value was a result of consumers buying nearly 1.6 million more SDAs compared to the previous year.

All five markets registered incremental value growth in the range of 1 to 12%, with Thailand exhibiting the strongest jump, followed by Indonesia at 8%.

According to the study, Thailand is also the country with the highest consumption level as consumers spent more than \$235 mn on over 9mn units of these appliances, contributing to nearly a third (30%) in value and volume of the combined SDA market in the region.

'The increasing affluence of households, on top of the rising need for convenience, has brought about an upgrading phenomenon which we are witnessing especially in developing countries," noted Jasmine Lim, Account Director for Home & Lifestyle in GfK Asia.

"In recent times, our findings have shown escalating sales of higher-end appliances – an indication that consumers have greater purchasing power and are switching from buying basic models to the more sophisticated product ranges."

European brands are registering a rising presence in four of the five countries with one in every three food preparation appliances, vacuum cleaners and irons sold in the region being of continental origin.

Among all the SDAs tracked, rice cookers were the region's most purchased appliances by consumers.

Over 13.8mn units were sold in the last 12 months, 860,000 units more than a year ago.

Generating more than \$355 mn in sales, this appliance is also biggest in terms of market worth. It is however the vacuum cleaner segment which experienced the greatest volume growth of 8%, driven by Indonesia and Thailand whose respective markets saw intensified volume sales by 23 and 17%, respectively.

"Thanks to the Chinese New Year celebrations across the region, performance of the small domestic appliances sector soared in the first two months of this year as more rice cookers, food preparation appliances and vacuum cleaners were purchased to help households with their cooking and This has made European spring cleaning during this

"The uptrend for SDA products is likely to continue, driven especially by strong demand in the region's developing markets," said Lim. "A generally positive performance throughout last year and the sustained growth

momentum reflected in the first two months of this year present an optimistic outlook for this sector, which is anticipated to remain in healthy territory in the months ahead," Lim concluded.

10% of businesses could shut down if baht strengthens

ONE tenth of enterprises could close down this year if the baht strengthens to 27 to 27.9 against the US dollar, according to a survey released last week by the University of the Thai Chamber of Commerce (UTCC).

Based on the UTCC survey of 600 business respondents, under its worst-case scenario of the baht appreciating to 27-27.9 to the

greenback, 12.4/5 of enterprises would lay off laborers.

If the baht strengthened to 28-28.9, 4.8% of enterprises said they would shut down operations, while 9.3% would lay off employees.

Thanavath Phonvichai, director to the UTCC's Economic and Business Forecasting Centre, said continued appreciation of the baht would hurt not only the export sector, but also the overall economy.

Meanwhile, the Federation of the Thai Industries (FTI) submitted to the Finance Ministry and the Bank of Thailand its proposed relief measures for exporters and small and medium-sized enterprises in light of the baht's appreciation.

The federation will be requesting them to manage the currency's stability, put in place capital-

management measures and promote exchange-rate risk management among business operators.

The FTI is also asking the central bank to slash the policy interest rate to at least 2% to help discourage capital inflows. The policy rate currently stands at 2.75%, compared with a maximum of 0.25% in the US and 0.1% in Japan.

Last week, the dean of Tham-

masat University's Economics Faculty, Bhanupong Nidhiprabha, urged the Monetary Policy Committee to call an urgent meeting on the baht.

The UTCC has estimated that 99,776 businesses, mostly small and micro-sized, had already closed down because of the rise in the minimum wage to 300 baht a day. - The Nation


famous picture of dogs playing cards. She was loaded but her interior design bordered on an episode from the Beverly Hillbillies.

but white, off-white or the ubiq-



RECENT speculation that Thailand's real estate market is on the verge of collapsing, is far from the current reality, the head of a major real estate services firm has insisted.

The President of the Agency for Real Estate Affairs Company Limited (AREA), Dr Sopon Pornchokchai, PhD, has once again shunned news report warnings of an imminent property bubble burst.

Dr Sopon said that such reports, which have been circulating in the media over the last few weeks, may wrongly influence and affect decisions of potential home buyers, investors, developers, financial institutions and even policy makers in the government.

He insisted that not only are such reports invalidated, but on the contrary, he said that the Kingdom's real estate outlook is quite good. He went on to outline the following three points:

• In the Bangkok real estate market, the total number of accommodation units (including condominiums, town-homes and other common house formats) sold last year was 107,412, which was more than the amount of brand new units sold (102,080). Dr Sopon added that there are currently 128,934 units still on the market in the capital and that such units should be off the market within 12 months.

• Likewise, of the above number, 65,215 of the total units sold were condominium units, 62,548 of which were brand new. Dr Sopon said that there are still 40,853 condo units on the market, which should be sold within seven months.

•As reported in the *Phuket Gazette* property section last week, Thailand's up-

country condominium market has also seen strong sales. In Phuket, there are currently 15,500 units in total, of which only 25% are still on the market and are expected to be sold within only 2.3 months. Likewise, a quarter of Pattaya's 122,500 condos, as well as Hua Hin's/ Cha-ahm's 17,600 condos are still on the market, but are expected to be off of it within a little over five months and 2.7 months, respectively. About 29% of Chiang Mai's 10,700 condos are for sale, with an expected 'sale-by' window of 1.5 months, and of Khon Kaen's 5,500 units, 22% have yet to be sold, but should be sold in less than a month.

Dr Sopon added that AREA has spoken with about 100 real estate agencies and consultancies from throughout the Asean region, and that the general perception of the real estate market is optimistic ahead of the 2015 Asean Economic Community (AEC).

And while he was adamant that buyers, speculators and investors need not worry about a bubble, he warned that banks and other financial institutions should be careful about issuing loans in the amount equal to, nearly equal to, or more than the value of the property, explaining that such 'easy financing' policies could make banks vulnerable.

Dr Sopon also echoed his previous suggestions, as reported in the *Gazette* last week, for the government to draft and enforce mandatory regulations on developers accepting down payments for unbuilt property.

Thailand's Escrow Act of 2551 (2008 CE) doesn't require a contract be drafted

CE) doesn't require a contract be drafted specifically about the down payment. Dr Sopon argued that since it is up to the parties whether they wanted to be

the parties whether they wanted to be bound by contract, most developers didn't offer such a contract, and instead used their reputation or track record in lieu of such a guarantee.

"Down payment protection guarantees should be mandatory and not left up to the will of developers," he said. Operating since 1994, AREA is one of

Home on the range

PARTICIPANTS in popular online forums indicate that long-time expatriate residents of Phuket tend to decry the changes that have transformed the island over the past two decades, yet fail to appreciate many of the positive developments that have taken place over the same period.

In this space since 1994, we have chronicled, criticized and editorialized – often in futility – about the ongoing, poorly-regulated "development" of the island.

While we are committed to keeping our esteemed readers informed about issues that continue to degrade the island's increasingly urban landscape, we would also be remiss not to recognize some of the positive aspects associated with these changes.

Perhaps one of the best "reality checks" in this regard is when the time comes to answer first-time visitors to the island who ask the simple, yet loaded, question: "So what is there to do here?"

Twenty years ago the answer would have been simple: hang out by the beach, enjoy a cold beer and the scenery, perhaps take part in the nascent nightlife scene at the time.

Fast forward to 2013 and the same question is of almost the same complexity as the query: "What is the meaning of life?" Apart from Winter Olympic sports, there is very little that is

not "on the menu" in Phuket these days. Gastronomes can enjoy not only the best Thai cuisine, but a range of authentic international cuisines unrivaled in any resort destination in the world: Russian, Korean, Japanese, Italian... the list is virtually endless.

"Range" is the operative word here, and it applies to far more than food and beverage. In terms of accommodation, Phuket has everything to meet the needs of visitors ranging from backpackers to criminals on the lam all the way to international celebrities seeking a private getaway retreat.

If there is another resort destination that can host a Gay Pride Week back-to-back with a Big Bike Week, all coming off the worldrenowned Songkran Festival, we would like to know about it.

Where else can US servicemen come for "shore leave" and walk side-by-side with Muslim families from the Middle East and busloads of Chinese package tourists, with no known reports of hostility there among?

Apart from the nightlife possibilities, which are too diverse to mention in this space, the recreational attractions are almost endless. From golfing to go-carting, bungy jumping to boogie boarding, there are few pursuits Phuket cannot accommodate.

The opening of the Thanyapura resort complex in Thalang has also established Phuket as one of the few locations in the world where world-class athletes and national sports teams can come and focus on training with first-class accommodations.

Yes, Phuket has it all – with one notable exception. At the risk of sounding like a broken record, all the island needs is a safe, reasonably-priced public transport system to tie the whole thing together as a perfect tourist destination package. Authorities: please take note – and take action.

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

EVERYONE with a romantic partner wants to live together and be recognized as a couple. A marriage license ensures that recognition. It says that a couple have chosen each other as partners joined in marriage. For same-sex couples, it would show that we are not different from other couples.

The marriage license bestows societal respect and it is important for official processes.

Everyone wants the same rights as everyone else under Thai law; however, there are several rights that rank as most important that same-sex couples should be granted.

For example, if I am incapacitated in an accident and I have to undergo a critical operation, my partner would be able to make decisions for me and authorize the surgery. I have heard of many cases where a partner has been unable to do this because they didn't have the legal right, they didn't have a license proving they were the patient's life partner.

Another aspect is communal rights conferred to man and wife. Government officers can claim medical expenses for their spouses and family. They can also claim child-education expenses and other benefits. If same-sex couples could be legally married, they would have these rights too.

Marriage licenses also help when couples separate. When different-sex couples divorce, the law guarantees certain rights to each partner. Without this, the entire process is relegated to negotiation.

The institution of marriage symbolizes two people choosing to live together, to share their ideas and rights with each other, and mar-

riage is a symbol of the beginning of a new life.

This is true for all couples, including same-sex partners. They too want a partner to love, cherish and care for. We have the same minds, the same feelings and the same attitudes towards our chosen partners as other couples.

Marriage is very important to me.

There is growing momentum in Thailand for same-sex couples to be married, especially in Phuket, but there are no rules or laws that legally uphold a gay wedding ceremony.

The move in Thailand to consider making same-sex marriage legal is very good news and should be introduced as quickly as possible. We are waiting to have the same rights as everyone else in the country.

The law can help everyone understand that we are not different from other people. We can all work and live together in harmony.

I think that everyone in the LGBT (lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender) community and the LGBT support associations have a critical role to play in making

same-sex marriages a reality.

There are associations in many cities across the country to help same-sex couples cope with difficulties in living in society, such as Andaman Power, located in Phuket, and the Rainbow Sky Association of Thailand, which is based in Bangkok.

In the past, it was very difficult to make Phuket people understand who I am. People would not even give me the chance to have a normal job. But Phuket has now transformed into a more open society because Phuket is now more multicultural and more international in its outlook.

People now understand who I am and they are ready to accept that people in the LGBT community can work and do everything else just as well as anyone else. Having the legal support of same-

sex marriages would help people to reach a new level of acceptance and understanding. I would like people to open their

minds and accept us and give us a chance just like other people because we are "same same, not different."

IN THE three months since it opened, the NINE Wine Bar and Bistro, tucked away in a cozy corner at the Royal Place, has brought a fresh new dining treat to Phuket.

For those of you who fly past the Tesco Lotus intersection to enter the bypass road speedway, try and slow down a bit and you'll see the entrance to the Royal Place, a high end condo and commercial project, which is quickly becoming the center of Phuket City's uptown.

The NINE is the type of restaurant you'll find in Bangkok's better upscale hotels.

Chic interiors mixed with a big cocktail and wine list and an international assortment of cuisine. It's a great place for the island's emerging sophisticated smart casual set. It opens at 10am and closes late at night.

The menu has been created by a team of Thai food experts, including Chef Songwut "Sean" Sumala who was named Thailand's top chef in the Thai IRON Chef competition at the end of January, where he was featured on Thai television Channel 7.

Chef Sean trained in Sydney and worked at the notable Salt Restaurant for a number of years, before returning to Thailand to act as executive chef for Centre Hotel in the capital's Chinatown district.

"For NINE, I have designed a menu that has many influences. I call the cuisine, contemporary, modern food, with influences from my kitchen experience in Australia. There are many cultures in Sydney, each bringing their own influence to the dining table. I have brought these to NINE for Phuket residents and visitors to enjoy."

In addition to a full menu that is evenly divided between Thai and European tastes, Chef Sean, creates a NINE degustation menu each month, a five-course culinary experience, which shows off his talents in the kitchen. This degustation menu changes and is modestly priced at just 999 baht.

To give a sample of how he mixes flavors and concepts, the recent special menu started with the freshest fine de Claire oysters, flown from France and still alive when they arrive at the NINE kitchen. My dining partner said he could taste the Atlantic Ocean as the oyster slid around his mouth.

Chef Sean then offered a tuna tartar with soy glaze and two varieties of luscious caviar highlighted with real gold leaf as a starter. He also provided grilled calamari, which resembled a small young octopus garnished with cherry tomato and a garlic crumb.

The menu got off to a roaring start and was calmed by a soft and sensuous broad bean puree with tasty bits of real crab meat for added flavor. The pace of the meal again raced ahead with a delectable duck confit salad, which once more showed off the chef's talent for creating impeccable French cuisine.

Portions were modest but generous and prepared the diner for a choice of main course. On offer were either succulent grilled lamb loin or large pieces of mixed seafood marinated in Provencal sauce. Strawberry gelato for dessert left the palate fresh.

"Our menu is broad and international but we prefer to give a focus to fresh seafood as we are on an island surrounded by a great wealth of choice of tastes from the sea," said Visut Rattanakul, one of NINE's owners.

There's a substantial wine list logically ordered by price. A diner can decide on their wine budget for a meal and then find an international selection in that section.

The main European menu features grilled snow fish, roasted rack of lamb, grilled rock lobster and grilled sea bass with mango salsa, each for under 400 baht. There's a wide choice of pizza and pasta for 219 baht and a nice menu of intriguing paninis and sandwiches. Most of the traditional Thai dishes are priced at 99 baht making NINE an affordable stop for lunch.

While the dining experience exceeds what is normally available around Phuket Town, just sitting in the comfort and beauty of NINE's designer interior is a treat. Black and orange colors with Sino-Portuguese tiles and design motifs, give this restaurant a real Phuket feeling. Even the bathrooms provide for a happy surprise.

I asked Jiragun Wongtunsi, NINE's manager how they chose the name.

"Well", he said, "Nine is a lucky number for Thais. But more importantly, we wanted to honor our King, who is the ninth King of the Chakri dynasty."

AT THE photo session prior to our interview, Prapa Hemmin looks dazzling in an electric blue dress and matching necklace. Still, she apologizes, "Sorry if I don't look my best today. I am in the middle of an important project, the nature of which keeps me awake at night and the fatigue is ruining my complexion.'

As Director of Sales of MICE & Corporate Events for Laguna Phuket, the island's premier resort on Bang Tao Beach, Prapa has reason to be anxious about her work.

MICE – short for Meetings, Incentives, Conferences and Exhibitions – forms the core of the tourism industry's corporate sector and brings thousands of travelers to Phuket each year.

Last year alone, Prapa remembers, Laguna Phuket was host to no less than 15,000 such tourists.

So while still waiting for that to happen, Prapa enjoys her multifaceted work experience at Laguna. Talking about the Phuket Triathlon, the most famous sporting event organized yearly by Laguna, sponsored by the *Phuket* Gazette, her eyes light up in excitement. She was there during its inception ten years ago when participants numbered around 300. Last year, the number of athletes taking part rose to 1,200.

"I am very proud to be part of Laguna Triathlon," says Prapa. "Not only is the job exciting but I also get to rub shoulders with top sports personalities worldwide. I remember well the Triathlon champion Belinda Granger who's always friendly. Local athletes too have made an impression and some have become good friends. Every year, I look forward to

"A" IS for arbitrary – which is what the articles that follow will inevitably be. How else to describe in the same breath, an array of plants as different as acalypha (also known as the red cat's tail) and the golden allamanda. "A" also represents excellence, so I hope the ensuing choice of plants will reflect that principle. In fact one is instantly spoilt for choice: there are so many plants whose names begin with "A" that they will certainly exceed the scope of one article. And that is without taking account of annuals, a class of plant often under-represented in books on tropical gardening.

The reason for this lack is not hard to find: in temperate climes, many plants only last one year because of the harsh winters, or are taken up and cosseted after flowering to be re-planted the following spring. Clearly, in a climate where the mean temperature rarely drops below the mid-twenties, annuals are often classified as perennials, since they can last several years.

For instance, if you are lucky enough to cultivate geraniums




(*pelargoniums*) successfully in Phuket, they will grow for years and produce large bushy clumps. On the other hand, the globe amaranth or gomphrena globosa, really is an herbaceous annual, even in the tropics, and will sprawl and look messy as it goes past its sell-by date. Better to get rid of the plant and sow again from seed. Nonetheless, with its dense magenta blooms, which last a long time and are often used in Thai floral displays, it is an annual I would not be without.

Other annuals you will encounter here include the *helianthus* brigade. Perhaps the largest and certainly the most spectacular of annuals, the seeds of sunflowers have long been used as a source of oil and as a delectable snack. It is occasionally grown here commercially, but its chief virtue for the gardener resides in its massive golden flower heads, which sit atop stalks that may be anything up to 14 feet in height. Sunflowers need a rich soil and plenty of water to give their considerable best. But they look dramatic at the back of flower beds or placed along a wall. And nowadays, there are cultivars in shades of red (moulin rouge) and other varieties with many-headed stems. Again easy to grow from seed.

The African marigold (*tagetes*) is another showy herbaceous annual. Again best grown from readily available packeted seed, tagetes comes in shades of gold, yellow, orange or even white. It has an upright habit, attractive, pinnate (herb-like leaves) and is an ideal bedding plant, since its crimped double blooms are produced more-or-less continually. The smaller French marigold was developed in France, but in fact all tagetes hail from the Americas. An additional bonus: they are said to deter insect pests including parasitic worms.

Like the African marigold, impatiens (or 'busy lizzie') is an annual that can straddle both temperate conditions and the hothouse environment of the tropics. Specimens grew happily in a sheltered spot in my London

garden; suitably cosseted, they will thrive here too. At present, most garden centers have them on display in hanging baskets or pots, where their multicolored, daisy-like flowers - pink, white, purple and red – look very appealing. But the containers should not be allowed to dry out, for the plants will quickly wilt, nor should they be exposed to the full glare of the tropical sun. A naturalized variety, balsamina,

with very fleshy stems, grows wild in Phuket. More upright than the cultivated safari varieties, it has purplish-pink or less commonly scarlet flowers.

Ah! We are still on the letter "A". Next week will be the turn of the shrubs and small trees.

Tip of the Week Leafy logic: The survival stakes

LEAVES come in many shapes, forms and sizes. They are normally made up of a flat, ribbed blade, either narrow (ixora, bamboo) through to very broad versions (fan palm, alocasia), though there are many variations on this theme. Most conventional leaves are broadly oval in shape (mango, allamanda) but some trees have needle-like leaves (casuarina, Norfolk island pine); others have frond-like foliage

(foxtail palm) or fern-like leaves arranged as two rows of small leaflets along a central axis (cassia, delonix regia).

Leaves offer important clues to a plant's needs. They are the means whereby a plant transpires (a process akin to sweating), and loses water through its pores or stomata. This process is essential for the plant's growth and survival. These pores are mainly on the undersides of leaves.

The new wave general

GENERAL David Petraeus is justly famous for introducing a sophisticated counterinsurgency strategy in Iraq that averted a catastrophic civil war and led to an orderly American withdrawal. Previously, American troops had been stationed in huge forts from which they would venture forth in under-armored vehicles, which fell prey again and again to roadside bombs. Petraeus introduced a badly needed surge of troops, stationed them among the local populace, bought off Sunni tribes that had become disaffected by the excesses of Al-Qaeda, and introduced vital community services that flourished in a new atmosphere of security. Moving on to a one-year assignment in Afghanistan, Petraeus became the leading exemplar of a new wave of generals, highly educated, creative and focused on protecting civilian populations from fanatical insurgents.

Paula Broadwell's hagiography of the general *All In: The Education of General David Petraeus* (Penguin Books, New York, 2012, 394pp) began as a PhD thesis. Like Patraeus, Broadwell graduated from West Point, specialized in counter-insurgency theory and excelled as a physical fitness devotee.


Their relationship was cemented by their first six mile run together. She was encouraged by her publisher to "go big" with her book: turning it into a best seller with the help of her co-author Vernon Loeb, a Washington Post editor who had been embedded with Petraeus' 101st Airborne division during the 2003 invasion of Iraq.

The result is a nonacademic tome that still manages to be boring: leaden, repetitious and replete with military boilerplate. There are huge chunks of in-house hyperventilated praise for the ambitious soldier, longwinded congressional testimony and complex theoretical screeds.

The structure of the narrative does make a stab at liveliness. The book opens with Petraeus

taking over the Afghan command from his talented and driven protegee Stanley McChrystal in the wake of a Rolling Stone profile that revealed McChystal's contempt for the Obama administration. The story then moves backwards and forwards through the events of Petraeus' career. Son of a Dutch merchant marine captain, Petraeus grew up in a small town near West

Petraeus was next tasked in 2004 to train and equip the Iraqi military and police forces from scratch, a monumental task which he compared to "building the world's largest aircraft, while in flight, while it's being designed, and while it's

Point and excelled at the being shot at".

So successful was he at this task that President George W Bush eventually appointed him to overall command in Iraq. At a meeting in the White House, Bush described the "surge" as a "double down strategy". Petraeus replied: "This isn't double down, Mr President. It's all in."

Despite skeptics, the strategy succeeded and led to President Obama appointing him to the next big challenge of Afghanistan. Broadwell spent a year in Afghanistan and enjoyed unparalleled access, following closely the anti-Taliban campaigns of three of the general's top subordinates. Her descriptions of individual firefights and overall strategy are superb.

The book ends with Petraeus taking the oath as CIA Director in 2011. Ironically, he lasted only a year in the job, forced to resign when emails came to light that revealed an extramarital affair with none other than Paula Broadwell.

Nonetheless, Petraeus has forever changed the thinking of the American military. Broadwell may be biased, but it's difficult to dispute her assertion: "Far beyond his influence on the institutions and commands in Iraq and Afghanistan, Petraeus left an indelible mark on the next generation of military leaders as a role model of a soldier-scholar-statesman."

Low-tech heaven

IT IS perhaps a little known fact that residents of Phuket, the island renowned for its sandy beaches and crystal clear water, are always on the lookout for a holiday getaway somewhere else. The reasons? Increasingly crowded beaches and expensive hotels that offer little value for money.

So when a friend told us about a tenthotel on an isolated beach on a small island off the east coast of Phuket, we decided to give it a try.

A 30-minute, blustery long-tail boat ride from Ao Po took us to Naka Yai Island. It may sound like a cliche, but the empty beach and the sight of a few basic tents tucked only yards away from the sea, made it feel like we were in for a kind of Robinson Crusoe-style adventure.

The canvas tents, each measuring 3x3 meters, are cool and airy thanks to the mosquito-net openings. Two single mattresses occupy each side of the room, with a space left in the middle serving as a night table of sorts. And that's it. You hang your clothes on the two chairs in front of the tent and there's a bucket of water to wash your sandy feet before entering the tent.

The bathrooms, situated behind the tents and far enough away for privacy, are a similar affair and take the shape of small sheds equipped with Asian-style dip-and-splash facilities.

We spent the afternoon exploring the beach and swam in the warm and sheltered sea, which is perfect for families with young children. Late afternoon we went exploring and crossed a verdant path to the other side of the island, where a contrasting landscape awaited us: a rocky and windy shore with a ghostly glimpse of the limestone karsts of Pang Nga Bay behind.

Having admired the sunset with a few pre-dinner drinks (we made a note to bring some wine with us next time as the establishment only serves beer), we proceeded to a long table decked out in simple but carefully chosen dinnerware and illuminated with oil lamps and lit candles.

The food itself was a revelation: fresh local crabs and grilled prawns with Thai lemon sauce, lightly steamed whole fish, a mixed salad of fresh leaves and seeds laced with real vinaigrette (a rare commodity among Thai establishments), served with fried rice and sauted pumpkin pieces. At night when the generator goes off at 9pm, oil lamps illuminated the path back to the tents.

Naka Camp Resort, which opened only two months ago, is managed by husband and wife team Nopporn and Ubolwan Muangnoi, who told us, "Everything here is low-tech – no electricity nor running water. We try to be as green as possible by managing and reusing our resources.

"Guests are encouraged to help by using less water, preserving torchlight batteries and taking back their recyclable garbage."

The morning stroll to the right of the beach revealed a small Muslim village housing thirty families. There's a tiny and modest mosque and a quaint little school. People here used to fish for a living but increasingly give that up to work in tourism – operating ferry boats or staffing in nearby hotels.

A stay at Naka Camp will cost 850 baht

per person per night. This includes breakfast and a seafood dinner. But hurry. This is a promotional rate and will inevitably go up soon.

A man from the village told us of a plush resort situated just round the corner, which is disconnected from this beach by a

wooded promontory. It costs, he said, around 18,000 baht a night. This is just so that you know you have a choice.

yber-crime law being revised

THE Electronic Transactions Development Agency (ETDA) has launched the process of reforming the country's computer crime law and expects new legislation to be announced within the next three years.

Surangkana Wayuparb, chief executive officer of the ETDA, said the law, which was implemented five years ago, still leaves problems about cyber-crime and the cyber-environment, and people are concerned about the balance between freedom of speech and the exercise of authority to maintain the right to privacy.

The ETDA expects its draft revision of the computer crime law to be completed in the next six months. The agency will then conduct a further public hearing before submitting the draft for the Cabinet's approval.

The CEO added that the agency had established focus groups covering five areas: freedom of speech; law enforcement; consumers and victims; hard-core security versus professional security; and evaluation and revision of computer crime law in order to balance and develop the law to protect against threats.

Information security in Thailand is at a worrying level, she added, as Thai organisations also have less understanding than their regional peers about the need to invest in this area.

"The agency has developed a lab to provide knowledge to the police to improve their understanding of digital evidence and solve the problem of law enforcement," said CEO Surangkana.

The overall revision of computer crime law will include the development of best practice and a code of conduct in order to create the right balance between public liberty and the right to protection and privacy, she said.

The agency will announce an authentication framework to protect users by asking them to provide their ID number when entering a public domain on the


nology, especially computers, to

Internet.

facilitate their activities. However, since the enforcement of the law five years ago, there have been requests from several sectors for a review of the principles and the addition of issues not covered in the original legislation.

The ETDA was established as an academic agency with the key mission of enhancing the value of electronic transactions to drive the economy and to improve people's quality of life.

Thailand has three laws – the computer crime law, the e-transaction law and the data protection law - related to information technology and cyber security. They are variously under amendment and/or subject to approval for implementation and enforcement. – The Nation

MEMBERS of the Phuket Darkroom Club (PDC) will have their first exhibition of black and white photography at the Chalermraja Cultural Centre, Phuket Town from May 1-14. The works on display are portraits of heritage and culture that capture the love Phuketians have for their home, through the lens of a black and white camera.

Audiences will enjoy rare beauties and the charms of more than 50 selective and refined works from PDC members.

Among the displays are old and rare photos of Phuket taken by admiring local photographers. Some of these pictures have not yet been published anywhere else before. Photos include their majesties the King and Queen visiting Phuket in 1959, aerial views of the island, slice of life portraits, historic architecture and old tin mining photos. All of the featured photos have been made using an authentic darkroom process, which is hard to find in the modern era. Participants will have the opportunity to see brilliant black and white film photos from masters who have honed their craft and refined their works exclusively to join the event. The PDC was founded in March 2012 by a small but devoted group of black and white film photography enthusiasts, who use a small darkroom in the back office of Rijira's kitchen supplier as a rendezvous point for members' gatherings. There they exchange experiences and passions about

the monochrome world, and sometimes carry on conversations late into the night in the tiny darkroom, while developing and exposing film.

The club was unofficially started in Phuket back in 2010 by two gentlemen who share a passion for black and white photography – Kettepon Rijiranuwat (Sak) and Achitrawit Churmung (Loong). The two men shared a dream of building a top quality darkroom in Phuket, which could be used for black and white film and print development, to enjoy as a hobby.

Unlike digital photography, whose popularity has rapidly increased, black and white film photography is gradually disappearing.

Not even one black and white film development shop can be found in Phuket Town. Sak and Loong found that having the chance to use a proper darkroom is inspiring and a huge encouragement for anyone, particularly, black and white film beginners. This was the start of the PDC.

It wouldn't be a perfect picture

for the PDC until Jose joined. Jose Louise Gay, a former Spanish consular official in Phuket shared the same passion. He had crossed paths with Sak and Loong during his years of service and they became good friends. Jose bought a small shop-house in Soi Soon-Uthis and converted it into his residence, us-

ing part of the space to store a sizeable archive of glass plate negatives he purchased at auction from Liang-Eiw studio, before it was shut down several years ago. With the patronage of Jose, a corner of his shop-house was given to Sak and Loong to build their first darkroom and to fulfill their dreams. When Jose relocated to New Zealand a year later,

the darkroom moved to a new home, which is attached to Rijira's office nowadays.

In March 2012, a third member, Prapas Kianpotiramared AKA 'Tard' joined the group and they decided to officially form the PDC. They use Facebook as a channel for communicating with members and regularly post quotes from famous black and white film photographers, useful techniques, tips and photos shot by members. The club has also conducted a basic black and white film photography course after which more members joined the group.

To date, PDC has more than a dozen active members in Phuket who meet regularly to go out on photo shoots and return to the PDC office to develop film and make prints. Several black and white photography courses were organized for members over the past year to explore black and white film photography and darkroom knowledge. The PDC currently has more than 200 friends and members on Facebook and numbers are increasing.







THE arrival of the clay court season always throws up some surprises. Many players have taken an extended break from the game, others are adjusting to the vagaries of the slower surface.

No such problems for a renascent Rafael Nadal who defeated an in-form Juan del Potro in the Paribas Open final at Indian Wells. Apparently it did not matter which kind of ball he was hitting. He even broke par on millionaire owner Larry Ellison's private golf course. Remarkable for a man who had spent nearly eight months out with a career-threatening knee injury.

Unsurprisingly, he came to the Monte Carlo Masters as the bookmakers' favorite. Having won the title on eight occasions and, in the process, won 47 successive matches, Rafa had always proved invincible on the red clay of the Principality. It was his kingdom.

But Monte Carlo's show court, framed by an azure Mediterranean, and adorned by the glitterati of fashion and film, has a habit of throwing up surprises. Andy Murray, fresh from a victory over David Ferrer at Miami, and newly elevated to the position of number two player in the world, abjectly



surrendered to Stanislas Wawrinka need to get better at." (1-6 2-6) after a performance littered with mistakes -28 in all. As he ruefully admitted:

"I started making some errors and ... hitting the ball shorter. There are things I need to work on [on] this surface ... that I

He has two weeks to address his problems – including an erratic serve – before the next joust in Madrid.

Novak Djokovic, the world number one, fared much better: his only taxing encounter on his way to the Monaco final a three set af-

fair with Russian Mikhail Youzhny. Like Murray, he confessed to teething troubles with the new surface, saying "My clay movements are still not at the maximum. But I'm slowly getting into it." But then Novak is a master of understatement.

Rafa's progress to the final was

majestic. Only Jo-Wilfred Tsonga came close to taking a set off a man whose ground strokes, especially his clubbing, top-spin forehand, were back to their remorseless best.

Thus, the dramatic stage was set for yet another encounter between the two preeminent players of the younger generation. Nadal's record on clay, his new lease of life, above all his historic Monte Carlo domination, suggested he would win.

But the tournament had one more surprise in store. Djokovic started the final like a man on a mission, striking the ball flat and early and with such authority that even the arch retriever Nadal could only watch as the winners sped past him. The first five games went to Djokovic before the persevering Nadal managed to claw back two games. Too little, too late.

The second set was much closer as Djokovic's erstwhile flawless backhand coughed up a few unforced errors, but the tie break was won conclusively (7-1) by the Serb. Game, set and match (6-2, 7-6). Novak had broken Nadal's cherished record at his favorite tournament.

Provided he stays fit and focused, Djokovic will take some beating this year.

Premier League roundup

MANCHESTER United claimed their 20th top-flight league title last weekend with their 3-0 win over Aston Villa at Old Trafford. A first half Robin Van Persie hat trick sealed the win for United and ensured that the Premier League title went back to Old Trafford with four games of the season left.

Last season's champions, Manchester City, lost 3-1 away to Tottenham Hotspur, meaning that United only needed three points to be crowned champions.

Van Persie opened the scoring in the second minute to ease the nerves and increase the level of expectation at Old Trafford. The Dutch striker then added two more goals before halftime, including running on to meet a searching 30-yard pass from Wayne Rooney that he volleyed from the edge of the box on his left foot past a helpless Guzan in the Villa goal.

Manchester United have won the Premier League 13 times and Ryan Giggs has featured in all of those campaigns. Ominously, Alex Ferguson claims that Giggs may have a few more years left at the top level. Claiming this season's Premier League title makes up for the heartache Ferguson and his team suffered on the last day of last season, when Sergio Aguero latched on to a pass from Mario Balotelli – the only assist of Balotelli's eventful City career – to score the winner against QPR, with the last kick of the game to win the Premier League. Ferguson made sure this season's title race did not go down to the wire when he purchased Van Persie for 24 million pounds sterling from Arsenal last summer. The Dutch striker's goals have been key to their success. His 24 league goals this season are more than strikers Wayne Rooney (12), Javier Hernandez (8) and Danny Welbeck (1) combined.

Luis Suarez was the center of attention again in Liverpool's game against Chelsea. The Uruguayan striker conceded a penalty that Eden Hazard converted to put Chelsea 2-1 in front, Suarez then scored a 97th-minute headed equalizer to claim a draw for Liverpool. In between these incidents, Suarez was involved in a tussle with Branislav Ivanovic in the Chelsea box that resulted in Suarez biting Ivanovic's arm. The referee missed the incident but the FA have charged Suarez with violent conduct which he has accepted, but he doesn't feel that he should get a ban longer than three games as the match officials missed the incident.

Arsenal's push for third place continued with a 1-0 win at Fulham. Defender Per Mertesacker was the unlikely scorer in an unconvincing win that finished with both teams down to 10 men. Steve Sidwell was sent off for Fulham in the first half for a dangerous tackle and Giroud was dismissed in the last minute of the game.

Paolo Di Canio continued Sunderland's resurrection with a 1-0 win over Everton that pretty much ended David Moye's team's hopes for European qualification.

Stoke's 2-0 away win at QPR helped move them away from the bottom three and all but doomed QPR to relegation. Peter Crouch, who Harry Redknapp has signed for two of his previous clubs, put Stoke in the lead just before halftime and a Jon Walter's penalty in the 77th minute sealed the victory.

International Sport In with the old for Australia

THE shallow depth of Australia's cricketing stocks were exposed on Wednesday with selectors forced to recall two 35-year-olds in an attempt to wrest back the Ashes from England in July.

Veteran wicketkeeper Brad Haddin, who was dumped last year, and top-order batsman Chris Rogers, who had played just one test in 2008, were named in a 16-man squad for the first of back-to-back Ashes series against England.

Haddin will reclaim the vice-captaincy from Shane Watson, who relinquished the post earlier this week but still made the Ashes squad as a batting all-rounder, while the uncapped James Faulkner was named the bowling all-rounder.

"The most impressive thing about Brad is that he ... continues to put form on the board," Australia captain Michael Clarke told a news conference in Sydney on April 24.

"His leadership and his experience will play a large part in this group ... the best teams in the world have a good mix of youth and experience and I think this squad of 16 has that mix.

"I'm confident that we have a

good group of players that can learn from each other."

Australia's planning and confidence to regain the Ashes from Alastair Cook's side when the first game begins at Trent Bridge in Nottingham on July 10 suffered a massive dent last month when they were hammered 4-0 in the test series in India.

Australia's lack of experience was ruthlessly exposed in India last month, a result that forced Clarke to defend the team on Wednesday when asked if it was the weakest Ashes side ever selected.

"Since I've taken over the captaincy of the Australian cricket team I think I've heard that every tour so this will be no different," Clarke added.

"I think we will always pay our respects to the English team.

"They are a very strong team, playing in their own back yard they are even stronger so there's no doubt about that but I think with this squad we have the talent, the experience and the youth to go over there and have success.

"Now, our goal playing for Australia every time we walk out onto the field is to win every game you play and this tour will be no different."

Chairman of selectors John Inverarity conceded earlier this month the Australian side were lacking in batting depth, which had probably tipped the selectors in Rogers' favor.

The 35-year-old, who made 19 runs on debut against India in 2008, had produced strong domestic form while playing firstclass cricket in England over the last few seasons.

"We believed that Chris Rogers was very deserving of selection ... but with Michael and Ricky going there is a gap in experience and Chris fills that," Inverarity said.

'He has scored, I think, nearly 20,000 first class runs ... and he has performed in (English) conditions."

Haddin's recall was less of a surprise and had been widely predicted by local media earlier on Wednesday.

The 35-year-old had been dumped from the test team last year when he returned from a tour of West Indies because his daughter had fallen ill.

Matthew Wade was promoted in his stead and had seemingly sealed the berth for the long term as the selectors looked to focus on younger players in an effort to regain the Ashes.

A poor run with the bat and behind the stumps on turning wickets in India, however, put pressure on the 25-year-old Wade, which was not helped when he suffered a leg injury and was replaced by Haddin in the third test in Mohali.

Inverarity said Haddin's experience against England - his career average is 35.50 in 44 tests but 45.57 against England in nine matches – had swung the selection as the first choice wicketkeeperbatsman on the Ashes tour "about a week ago", though Wade was still

panel," Inverarity said. "Brad is the man for the Ashes, but Matthew remains very highly regarded."

An equal Rugby World Cup

TOP-tier rugby nations will not play all of their 2015 World Cup pool matches on weekends in order to give smaller nations a more balanced program, the International Rugby Board has said.

"Yes, that does mean that," IRB chief executive Brett Gosper told reporters in Wellington when asked if the top-tier nations like New Zealand, England and France would face a similar schedule as teams like Samoa, Fiji and Japan.

"We think in the next World Cup schedule, that will be announced very soon in late April or early May, there is a very strong fairness in terms of the times of rest periods.

"It will be the same for all teams. Far more equal. Completely equal," he added. Second-tier nations have been forced to

have a condensed schedule at previous World Cup tournaments, with broadcasters requiring the top-tier nations to play at the weekends, thus ensuring bumper television viewing figures.

Japan were required to play all four of their Pool A games at the 2011 World Cup in 17 days.


Hosts New Zealand and beaten finalists France, both in the same pool, had a week between each of their group games.

The scheduling, however, created greater controversy for Samoa, who played Wales in Hamilton just four days after their first game of the tournament.

Wales, by contrast, had a week to prepare and beat the Pacific Island side 17-10.

Samoa also played 2007 World Cup winners South Africa just five days after their match against Fiji, losing 13-5 to the Springboks and falling out of quarter-finals contention.

Samoa center Eliota Fuimaono-Sapolu took to the social media network Twitter to



labeling it as "unjust" and akin to "apartheid" and "slavery".

Fuimaono-Sapolu later apologized for his outburst but stood by his assertion that the schedule was unfair.

New Zealand Rugby Union (NZRU) chief executive Steve Tew said his organization was in full support of the schedule as the top-tier nations had requested a more equitable draw.

"We asked for it after the last World Cup," Tew said.

"We thought it was unjust that the small unions play in a pinnacle event with a shorter rest period than we played our games."

Several of the smaller nations were also hampered by players being unavailable for the 2011 World Cup, with reports later

sure on them not to play at the tournament. Gosper, however, said a meeting had been held with club representatives to ensure that 'regulation nine' – governing the release of players for international duty would be upheld.

"We take it very seriously, both for the integrity of the international game but also for the individual player to represent his country," Gosper added.

"We had a meeting very recently to make sure that regulation nine would be enforced in a very robust way.

"They (the clubs) stated that they feel it is very important and they will operate in that way in the future."

Philadelphia Olympic bid

In brief...

PHILADELPHIA is exploring a bid to host the 2024 Olympic Games, Mayor Michael Nutter said on Monday.

Nutter was responding to a letter from the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) sent to 35 cities across the country seeking potential host cities for the international sporting event.

"The Philadelphia region has enthusiastically embraced the prospect of bidding on and hosting a future Olympic Games, and we look forward with great anticipation to the opportunity to work with the USOC on this project," Nutter said in a statement.

The last time the United States hosted the Olympics was in 1996 in Atlanta.

Ryder Cup stars reunited

EUROPE'S triumphant Ryder Cup team will be reunited on home soil for the first time when all 12 players and captain Jose Maria Olazabal compete in next month's PGA Championship at Wentworth.

"It will be great to have the team back together," world number two Rory McIlroy said in a news release on recently.

"It was such a special Ryder Cup, one that will have a special place in history, and I don't think anyone associated with that team will ever get tired of celebrating it."

United States were 10-6 up going into the last day of the biennial event at the Medinah Country Club in Illinois in September but the Europeans staged a remarkable comeback to win by 14 1/2 points to 13 1/2.

Australian triathletes win Samui Triathlon

AUSTRALIAN triathletes Atkinson Courtney and Melissa Hauschildt won the men's and women's titles in the 4 million baht Samui Triathlon on April 21.

More than 200 competitors from 22 countries took part in the grueling 4 kilometer swim, 122.65km cycle ride and 30km run. The total distance of 156.65km was reportedly the longest ever in an Asia Pacific triathlon meet.

A duathlon featuring a 40km bike ride and a 10km run was also held on the day. Both races kicked off at the Hansa Hotel beachfront and culminated at Ban Thon in Samui Island.

Atkinson, who was 18th in the 2012 London Olympics, took an even six hours for his victory and earned 800,000 baht in prize money.

"The competition route here is very difficult." said Atkinson, who was making his debut in the event.

Second and third in the men's race went to Allen Ben of Australia and Spanish Marcel Zamora Perez respectively.

Hauschildt led the women across the finish line in six hours, 10 minutes, followed by Australian Liz Blatchford and last year's champion Caroline Steffen of Switzerland.

"I never thought I could win [here] but finally I did it," said the 2011 Ironman 70.3 World Champion. Hauschildt claimed 500,000 baht in prize money.

Koh Samui Mayor Ramnet Jaikwang said he was keen on raising the profile of the

race to international standards to help promote tourism in the province. He said that in the future the island may have to divert traffic to facilitate the competition.

Vijit Sithinavin, president of Triathlon Association, said he was eying an expansion of the competition on two levels - in Asia and global, "We may have to shut down the island [for bigger competitions]" he said.

The triathlon was organized by Koh Samui, the Ministry of Tourism and Sports, the Tourism Authority of Thailand, Thai Airways, Singha Corporation and Bangkok Airways, and was followed by a global TV audience via Euro Sport, Sports Plus and TV5 Monde, with local channels also covering the action. - The Nation

The Thai player, who has no ITF ranking, played in her quarterfinal match on April 18.
