Tourist Court, holiday justice

Plan for tourist court garners praise, promises expedient resolution for visitors' legal troubles

THE move to establish a new series of Tourist Courts in Phuket and at other key vacation destinations in Thailand - including Bangkok, Pattaya, Chiang Mai, Phang Nga and Krabi – has received much support on the island.

Chanchai Duangjit, director of the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) Phuket office, gave his "absolute support" for the idea.

"This is a very good thing for tourists. Most tourists who come to Phuket are here only on a short holiday. They do not have much time to deal with a court trial," he said.

"This will allow tourists to have their cases heard in court much more quickly than now," Mr Chanchai added.

Australian honorary consul to Phuket Larry Cunningham praised the idea of a Tourist Court in Phuket as a very positive development, one that...

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

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Police tour de force scoops illegal guides

OFFICIALS continued their crackdown on illegal tour guides this week, arresting seven Thais working illegally as guides for Chinese tourists in Phuket and two Chinese nationals illegally operating tours from the heart of Phuket Town.

Of the seven illegal guides picked up by the Phuket Tourist Police on May 2, two were found in possession of ya ice (crystal methamphetamine), said Phuket Tourist Police Inspector Urumporn Koondejsumrit.

"The seven people arrested were Thai. They have all been charged with working as tour guides without being properly certified," Maj Urumporn said.

"Two of the seven have also been charged with possession of a category one drug," he added.

Tourist Police arrested the Chinese nationals in Phuket Town on May 5.

Maj Urumporn named the two men as Hung Jin Tia, also known as "Mr Tawan", 34, and Cao Jiandong, 40.

Accompanying Tourist Police in the raid on the men's tour kiosk on Phun Pol Road was Jakrit Janjit, Registrar of the Bureau of

Tourism Business and Guide Registration Phuket office.

"We seized a list of tour programs, a list of tourist customers and brochures of tourist attractions in Phuket, Krabi and Phang Nga that they organized tours to,' Maj Urumporn said.

The men were promptly taken to Phuket City Police Station and charged with working illegally as guides.

"They each face a fine of up to 100,000 baht or up to four years in prison," Maj Urumporn said.

After justice has been served,

they will be deported, he added.

"We are working together with other police officers to crack down on illegal guides in Phuket because they give Phuket a bad image," Maj Urumporn said.

The arrests follow a mass protest by legitimate, registered tour guides demanding the government take action against their illegal counterparts on April 29.

By law, only Thai nationals certified by the Professional Guide Association may be employed as tour guides in Thailand.

Shotgun blast ends beach party

A MAN enjoying a laid-back beach party with friends at Kalim, north of Patong Beach, on Monday night managed to push away a shotgun that was pointed at his head just Khatawut



Patong Hospital.

Sangngam, 23, was with friends when three men rode by on motorbikes, looked them over, and rode on.

"Five minutes later, they came back," Mr Khatawut told police.

"They said 'Who hurt my *nong* [younger brother/sister]?'

Then one of them pointed a

shotgun at my head. I pushed the barrel away just before it went off," Mr Khatawut said. "Then the man

turned the gun around and used the stock to hit me before it went off. Police question Mr Khutawat at in the face. When people started to

gather, the men left," he added.

Police questioned Mr Khatawut at the hospital, where he was being treated for a broken nose.

'We will continue questioning the witnesses. We suspect there is a dispute between the two groups," Lt Pattapee said.

Russians arrested in wakeboard park raid

Following the arrest of 35 Russians found allegedly working illegally in Patong nightclubs last week, three more Russians have been arrested at the tourist-popular Phuket Wake Park in Kathu.

Cherdsak Wisutthikul, from the Department of Employment in Bangkok, led a team of 20 officers to raid the wakeboard park at about 5:30pm on May 2.

Following a chaotic scene, allegedly including foreigners leaving the premises in a rush, the officers arrested and charged Russian national Oleg Lysinov, 47, with illegally hiring foreign workers.

Section 54 of the Alien Workers Act stipulates that any person found illegally hiring foreign workers is

liable to a fine of not more than 10,000 baht, in addition to a fine between 10,000 baht and 100,000 baht per illegal worker.

During the raids two Russian nationals, 27-year-old receptionist Julie Solovyeva and 29-year-old cashier Elena Bonkarenko, were arrested alongside marketing officer Dmitry Lee, who is originally from Kurdistan.

All three confessed to working without work permits. They each face a fine of between 2,000 baht and 100,000 baht, up to five years in prison, or both.

All four suspects were taken to Thung Thong Police Station for further investigation.

Mr Cherdsak, who is the director of the "Inspection and Job Seekers Protection Division", returned to Bangkok after the raid had concluded.

Brett Bean calls home

BRETT Bean, the American expat whose disappearance last November gained extensive press coverage, has contacted his family after 155 days of silence.

"It was a very brief call," his mother, Lynne Bean, told the *Gazette* this week.

"We still do not know where he is, but it was very good to hear his voice," she added.

"At least we know he is alive. There is still hope after 155 days," his father, Wayne Bean, said.

His parents reported Brett missing after he failed to make a flight home, leading to an island-wide manhunt.

Karon Police inspector Chana Suttimard confirmed that police had not removed any of Mr Bean's belongings from his rented bungalow. "If Brett Bean contacted his parents, the case is closed." Lt Col Chana said.

"We tried every way we could to find him," he said. "I would like to know why he disappeared."

Mr Bean, 43, lived and surfed in Phuket for six months of the year and was a ski instructor in the United States for six months.

Police found nothing suspicious in his rented bungalow at the time of his disappearance. Mr Bean's surfboard and passport were found inside, along with his driver's license, motorbike registration book and his bankbook

His motorbike was missing, as were his helmet, laptop computer and cell phone, as if he had just stepped out. – *Saran Mitrarat*

Island goes on dengue alert after Burmese girl, 6, dies

IN THE wake of a six-year-old Burmese girl dying from dengue fever after arriving on the island in April, the Phuket Provincial Health Office (PPHO) is urging everyone to bolster efforts to remove breeding grounds of disease-carrying mosquitoes.

The young girl was in Phuket for less than two weeks before she was admitted to Vachira Phuket Hospital on April 16, explained PPHO Deputy Chief Krit Sakulpat.

"She had been suffering from a fever for four days before she was admitted. She was kept in the Intensive Care Unit for two days before she died," Dr Krit said.

"The girl was living with her parents on the rubber plantation where they worked in Chalong," he added.

Dr Krit asked the press to help inform the public of dengue-prevention measures, such as the "333" dengue awareness campaign Governor Maitri Inthusut launched in Phuket last month.

"Under the campaign, villagers inspect areas around their homes,

check on residents who are showing symptoms of dengue fever, and remove water containers that can function as mosquito breeding grounds," Mr Krit said. The PPHO is also cooperating with other government offices to ensure that the news of the death of the Burmese girl and ways to prevent further deaths is spread

across the island.

"With students returning to school, it is especially important they are well informed about dengue prevention," he added.

Move to set up Tourist Court garners widespread support

...has been a long time coming.

"I think it would be an excellent idea for Phuket. I raised the idea with the Phuket Governor and the Chief of the Court four years ago. We were told at that time that Thai law would not allow a Tourist Court to be set up...

"I am pleased to see my idea from four years ago being acted on," he said.

"Having a Tourist Court in Phuket is very necessary because tourists who do even a small thing wrong have to stay such a long time," Mr Cunningham explained.

Among his most memorable examples, Mr Cunningham said, was a young Australian who was drunk and involved in a scuffle while on a night out.

"When the police arrived, he thought it would be funny to take the policeman's hat, put it on his head and dance around a bit. He was arrested and charged with theft at night.

"In the end he had to pay a 2,000-baht fine, but he had to wait one month for his case to be heard. While he was forced to stay here, he had to post bail, surrender his passport, pay peak-season rates to stay at a hotel and all his other living expenses. He lost his job back home and his air ticket became unusable," Mr Cunningham said.

"In total, extending his stay cost him more than AUS\$20,000," he noted.

Phuket Tourist Police Superintendent Yotsavee Pornperaparn said plainly, "Having the Tourist Court will be good for Phuket. If it does happen, tourists will save a lot of time during the court trial.

"In Phuket, there are a lot of cases that involve tourists, including jet-ski incidents and other tourist scams," Col Yotsavee pointed out.

"The shorter the trial is, the better it would be for tourists," he said.

The high praise for the pursuit of the new courts follows the announcement by Tourism Minister Somsak Pureesrisak earlier this week.

Mr Somsak said he had discussed the problem with Court of Justice officials and found that hearings involving tourists could be expedited by setting up a tourism litigation division and extending office hours.

The ministry agreed to reimburse overtime pay for judges and legal officials, he added.

Kuala Lumpur hits the brakes on 12-month non-immigrant B visas

THE Royal Thai Embassy of Kuala Lumpur, a popular visa run destination for Phuket expats, has confirmed that it is no longer issuing 12-month non-immigrant B visas.

Embassy official Orawan Heemmamhad confirmed that the embassy in the Malaysian capital stopped issuing 12-month business visas late last year.

"We issue only three-month non-immigrant B visas," she said.

The Royal Thai Consulate in Penang, however, has not changed their policy.

"We are still issuing 12-month non-immigrant B visas for applicants who have previously been issued a 12-month non-imm B visa and are applying for a new

one," said an official there.

"However, we will not grant a person a 12-month B visa if the person is applying for their first-ever 12-month non-imm B visa and there is less than six months left on their work permit.

Full-scale tsunami drill set for May 29

RESCUE services from Krabi, Phang Nga and Trang will join Phuket emergency firstresponders for three days of intensive training that will conclude with a full-scale tsunami response drill on May 29.

The rescue crews will draw up response plans on May 27-28 and stage a full-scale tsunami evacuation drill on May 29, starting at 8:30am, Phuket Vice Governor Chamroen Tipayapongtada said.

"The exercise will simulate a large earthquake striking off the coast of Sumatra, off western Indonesia," he explained, adding that the simulation will be held in the Chong Pak Pra channel, the narrow strip of water at the north end of the island separating Phuket from the mainland.

The rescue teams will also draw up and rehearse evacuation drills simulating an earthquake directly affecting Phuket.

V/Gov Chamroen pointed out that the 4.3 Richter earthquake that rattled central Phuket on April 16 last year highlighted Phuket's vulnerability to earthquakes.

"The most recent earthquakes along our West Coast have happened along the Klong Marui fault off Phuket, and last year was the first time the coast was the epicenter of an earthquake," he said.

"The exercise will make Phuket safer and reduce anxiety over what would happen if we were struck by such disasters," he - Kritsada Meuanhawong

Bright solution to dark water

Governor's strategy offers breath of fresh air to raw sewage woes

AFTER inspecting the site in Rassada where highly polluted wastewater is pumped directly into the Bang Yai Canal in Phuket Town (reported as the Phuket Gazette's page one story on April 20), Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut has drawn up a plan to solve the problem.

Before doing so, Governor Maitri broadened his scope of appraisal and inspected drainage ditches behind the Radio of Thailand official residences near Phuket Rajabhat University.

"We found water in the area released by local residents. It was dirty and smelly and pumped directly into the Bang Yai Canal," Governor Maitri said.

The Governor's two-step solution starts with dredging the drainage ditches and lining them with cement.

"We also need to oxygenate the water by aerating it – to create the right environment for the microorganisms in the water that consume bacteria and help to clean the water," he said.

"To deal with the bad smell, we will put EM balls [Effective Microorganism balls] and EM water into the ditches," he said.

In addition, to alleviate flooding problems, Rassada Municipality will increase the

size of their sewer pipes from 1.2 to 1.5 meters to improve water flow, he added.

The second phase of the project is a campaign to convince the restaurants, companies and residents in the area to install their own wastewater treatment tanks to help reduce the average biological oxygen demand (BOD) in the water, he said.

The BOD, a key indicator of water quality, was recently measured at 54 in the Bang Yai Canal; the standard average is

"Officials will check up on wastewater treatment at factories, housing estates and other sites in the area in order to help solve this environmental issue," he added.

Local government to splash out B60mn on flood defense

PHUKET Provincial Administrative Organization (PPAO) President Paiboon Upatising has pledged to spend 60 million baht on flood-defense projects across the island.

The news comes as the annual monsoon winds from the northeast swing around to start bringing rain from the southwest.

"We will support all projects from every local administration," said Mr Paiboon.

'The budget is ready to be allocated to finalized projects in each local area. Patong Municipality has already prepared its plan and will be the first to receive financial support," he added.

Mr Paiboon explained that the Patong project was to install a floodgate along the Pak Bang Canal to prevent floods at high tide.

Other projects included widening and reinforcing the banks of the Bang Yai Canal in Phuket City;

dredging canals in Koh Kaew; and upgrading the storm drains from the Chao Fa Thani housing estate in Chalong.

In the north of the island, work will begin on upgrading the canals in the Baan Don area in Thepkrasattri subdistrict, Mr Paiboon added

"We will never ignore these problems. We will set a meeting at a later date to follow up on the results of the projects," he said.

The news came days before Phuket was soaked by an overnight deluge on Monday and heavy rains flooded parts of Ao Nang and Krabi Town.

Officers at the Meteorological Department in Phuket forecast that although the rains on Monday were heavy, there was no need to fear floods or landslides in Phuket until at least the end of the month.

Minister pledges to push port plan

THE Minister of Tourism and Sports, in Phuket to inspect the Deep Sea Port last Saturday, has pledged to push forward the 100-million-baht plan to expand Phuket's key port facility.

"I will raise the issue with the Minister of Transportation," Somsak Pureesrisak said.

Joining Mr Somsak in his visit to Phuket was Tourism of Thailand (TAT) Governor Suraphon Svetasreni.

The plans to expand the port so it can berth two large cruise liners simultaneously have been mired for two years for failing to pass the required environmental impact assessment (EIA) evaluation.

Sophon Muangprathub, Director of Chaophaya Terminal International Co Ltd, which has the government concession to operate Songkhla and Phuket Ports, explained to Minister Somsak the history of the Deep Sea Port expansion project.

"We've been working on passing the EIA for two years, but every time we submit the redrafted plans we are asked to fix another problem," Mr Sophon said.

"Please help us push forward the plan," he urged.

Mr Sophon explained that the project includes extending the dock by 60 meters so two large ships can berth at the same time,

as well as building new facilities to receive tourists disembarking and expanding the parking lots at the site.

The project would take no more than 13 months to complete once it passed its EIA requirements, he said.

Mr Sophon explained that the Deep Sea Port was originally designed to serve cargo ships only.

"The dock is 360m long, which can accommodate only two ships, each not longer than 173m long, at the same time.

"The problem is that bigger to support I ships are now coming to the port, as it could.

especially cruise liners. So far the biggest one has been 270m long, which does not leave enough room for another ship," Mr Sophon explained.

"Cruise liners are given priority to dock at the port, even if it means forcing a cargo ship that is halfway through loading or unloading to move offshore," he added.

Phuket Marine Office Chief Phuripat Theerakulpisut voiced his support for the expansion plan.

"The port is currently not able to support Phuket tourism as well as it could

"The facility needs to be developed," he explained.

Minister Somsak agreed with the plan presented to him.

"Phuket needs to be able to support more cruise liners so more of them can dock here and stay for more than just a day trip," he said.

"We have to identify which departments we must discuss this with so we can push forward the plan.

"On May 10, I have a meeting with the Minister of Transportation, and this plan will be raised," Minister Somsak yowed.

Standard licenses to bolster drive for tourist safety

TOURISTS will need to have a valid international driver's license to rent cars and motorbikes, the Minister of Tourism and Sports announced last Saturday.


The news came as Minister Somsak Pureesrisak sifted through a slew of issues facing the tourism industry in Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi at a meeting at the Radisson Blu Plaza Resort Phuket at Panwa Beach.

"I have discussed the situation with the Phuket Land Transportation Office and they will take charge from here," Mr Somsak said.

"This is for tourists' own good, because they will be protected by law if they are in a road accident," he explained.

At the meeting, Phuket MP Anchalee Vanich Thepabutr called for Phuket to have better-developed infrastructure.

"Phuket still needs to develop a mass-transportation system and sufficient public utilities as well as adjust much of its infrastructure to support the growing number of tourists visiting the island," MP Anchalee said. – *Kritsada Mueanhawong*

Coral seller faces up to 4 years and 40,000 baht fine

POLICE arrested a man for selling pieces of dead coral at the popular Saphan Hin Park in Phuket Town on May 3.

Acting on a tip-off, officers moved in and arrested Suphachok Worramatamart, 37.

Marine Police Region 8 Deputy Superintendent Lt Col Prasert Srikunrat led the raid, joined by Thanet Munnoy, chief of the Department of Marine and Coastal Resources (DMCR) Phuket office.

"We found 13 bracelets made from dead coral and 27 other pieces of dead coral in the shop," Col Prasert said.

"We asked to see Mr Suphachok's license for possessing the coral, but he could not provide one," he said.

Mr Suphachok was charged with illegal possession of a wild-life item protected under the Wildlife Preservation and Protection Act BE 2535 (1992).

"He faces a fine of up to 40,000 baht or up to four years in prison," Col Prasert said.

Five extra lifeguard towers called for; budget not likely to increase

THE Phuket Provincial Administrative Organization (PPAO) is pushing to get extra lifeguard watchtowers set up at five tourist-popular beaches on Phuket's west coast.

The move comes as the contract with the Phuket Lifeguard Club expires at the end of this month, coinciding with the regular arrival of the annual rainy season, when the island's beaches claim tourists' lives each year.

"With everyone's safety as our priority, we are planning to increase the number of lifeguard stations from 33 to 38 this year," said Kanyarat Senrung, an officer at the PPAO's Tourism Department.

"The five additional stations will be at Kata, Kata Noi, Karon, Patong and Kamala beaches," Ms Kanyarat said.

"Although the terms of the contract to be offered to the Phuket Lifeguard Club have yet to be finalized, at this stage it looks like the budget offered will be the same as last year," she added.

Phuket Lifeguard Club President Prathaiyut "Nut" Chuayuan said the five new lifeguard stations was news to him, but he welcomed the move.

"It's a good thing. It would make the beaches safer for tourists," he said.

Mr Prathaiyut could not promise that his organization would continue providing lifeguards if the club were presented with the same

budget as last year but had to man five extra stations.

"I would have to talk to our members first and see the conditions offered, but I personally would like to come to some arrangement to make this happen," he said.

Highlighting the danger of Phuket's surf during the southwest monsoon, two tourists drowned while the lifeguards were not at their posts last May.

Ms Kanyarat today described the critical service the Phuket lifeguards provide.

"From May 28, 2012 through April 27, 2013, the lifeguards res-

cued 882 people – that is, 156 Thais and 726 foreigners – from the surf," she said.

However, despite the good work of the guards, 14 people drowned during the period.

"Nine people drowned while

"Nine people drowned while lifeguards were on duty [from 9am to 7pm] and five people drowned outside the duty hours," she said.

"The lifeguards do their job," Ms Kanyarat said, defending their efforts. "Those who drowned did so because of a pre-existing medical condition. Some of them were also drunk," she added.

Ms Kanyarat urged everyone to

observe the surf warning flags.

"Red flags mean 'No Swimming'. They are posted to inform people of dangerous currents, submerged rocks and other threats that lurk offshore," she said.

"A yellow flag indicates the area is not supervised by lifeguards, but one may swim with caution; yellow and red flags tell swimmers that lifeguards are keeping watch over the area between the yellow-red flags," Ms Kanyarat explained.

"People should swim only when the yellow-red flags are displayed, and only between those flags," she said.

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Hi-so thieves served time before

POLICE have confirmed that a couple accused of breaking-and-entering robberies at nine high-end hotels and resorts on Phuket are convicts fresh out of prison.

Ritthimeth "Q" Singhaumpai, 33, and Sasithorn Seekam, 22, who were arrested on May 1, served time for breaking into a car and stealing valuables in 2011, Somsak Tongkliang of the Patong Police told the *Gazette*.

The arrests came after officers began following the couple, whose black Mercedes E200 sports sedan was the same make and model and had the same license number as the one caught on CCTV at many of the resorts where robberies had occurred.

The Mercedes caught on CCTV was white – the couple had covered it completely with black stickers, explained Karon Deputy Superintendent Sophon Borrirak.

"Police recovered 79 items from the car, including a Sony digital camera; 44 pieces of jewelry; 11 watches; three iPods and five Mastercard debit cards.

"They also seized 3,090 euros, 44,710 baht, US\$10,000 dollars, AUS\$6,215 and nominal amounts in other currencies," said Lt Col Sophon

Mr Ritthimeth is accused of robbing guest rooms in resorts at Karon, Kata and Patong.

"The CCTV footage from the hotels shows a white Mercedes E200 with the same license plates arriving at the hotels at about the same time the robberies occurred," Col Sophon said.

During questioning, Mr Ritthimeth claimed he was the son of a well-known official and directed police to a sticker on the windscreen of his car marking the '24th Session of Parliament, 362 MPs', Col Sophon said.

Police have confirmed that the sticker is a fake.

Mr Ritthimeth was charged with

breaking and entering private property and committing theft at night.

Ms Sasithorn was charged with receiving stolen property.

Police are still investigating whether or not Mr Ritthimeth was involved in any other recent hotel robberies in Phuket.

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

Immigration chief 'concerned' over Rohingya refugees

IMMIGRATION Bureau Commissioner Pharnu Kerdlarpphon, in Phuket on April 30 for a closeddoor meeting of high-ranking officials, has expressed his concern over the growing number of Rohingya refugees being detained in Thailand.

"The number of Rohingya entering the country is worrying. We are now detaining 1,936 Rohingya across the country, including 399 boys and 304 girls,' Gen Pharnu told the press.

"Immigration Police shelters in the South have no more room for refugees. We had to transfer some of the refugees to immigration shelters elsewhere in the Kingdom," he said.

The refugees' detention in Thailand is intended to be only temporary, he cautioned.

"The shelters are supposed to be only for temporary detention before illegal immigrants are deported, but in the case of the Rohingya, we cannot really deport them because their home country [Myanmar] does not welcome them," Gen Pharnu said.

"The Thai Government is in discussions with other countries to find a place the refugees can be transferred to.

"I have been assured that the Rohingya will be treated in a way that meets internationalstandards," he added.

Elephant raids return

Livestock chief denies tourism is driving elephant-trafficking network

THE head of the Phuket Livestock Office has refuted allegations that tourism is the driving force behind an elephant-trafficking network that is allegedly supplying pachyderms so they can carry tourists on jungle tours.

The news comes after an elephant camp on Big Buddha hill was raided in the wake of 66 possibly illegal trekking elephants coming under investigation in Phang Nga last week.

'We were assigned by the Central Investigation Bureau to search for illegal elephants in Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi," explained Maj Gen Sriwara Rangsitprahmkul, who led the raid along with Col Watcharin Phusit from the Regional Natural Resources and Environment Crime Suppression Division.

"We have received reports that an elephant-trafficking network is operating in Phuket – the situation has become critical," Gen Sriwara

However, Phuket Provincial Livestock Chief Weerasit Phutthipairote, who joined the raids, has refuted such reports.

"I believe the elephants in Phuket are not the product of an illegal-trading network, because the companies in Phuket use them

for trekking tours and performances," he explained.

"However, I cannot comment any further on the possibility of an illegal-elephant trading network in Phuket [serving other purposes]," he added.

During the raid on Tuesday, the

investigation team identified 10 elephants at the camp they believe may have been illegally taken from

Officers seized one elephant identification microchip and nine elephant registration documents, which Gen Sriwara said would be handed over to the Phuket Provincial Livestock Office.

Chief Weerasit explained that his office would establish whether or not the microchip and registration documents were forgeries.

The camp, which police refused to name, was targeted because it has a record of exchanging elephants with one of the camps raided in Phang Nga, explained Chief Weerasit.

Similar raids plagued several Phuket elephant camps last year, and DNA samples were taken to determine whether the baby pachyderms owned by the companies were the offspring of a wild elephant seized in illegal captivity in the renowned Kaeng Krachan wildlife park in



Loan shark, henchmen netted in raid

CRIME Suppression Division officers arrested a loan shark and his six henchmen in a raid on a house in Thalang district late Monday afternoon.

Led by Maj Roongsak Maichandee and armed with a search warrant, the officers entered a house in Ban Muang Mai, off Thepkrasattri Road, and arrested Yutthana "Tum" Dorkjan, 31, for running a loan shark operation under the name Tum Credit.

The officers also arrested Surasak Tongyam, 19, from Uthai Thani; Artin Samit, 24, from Nakhon Nayok; Akekapong Rongharnkaew, 20, from Chiang Rai; Supakorn Polyium, 28, from Roi Et; Somkiat Sonmaneechoti, 28, from Nakhon Pathom; and Yutthapong Buanam, 28, from Phetchaburi.

"The six men went out onto the streets and into neighborhoods to find new customers, and collect payments," Maj Roongsak said.

"They collected 20 per cent in-

terest per month. The maximum rate to be charged on loans is set by law at 15 per cent per month," he explained.

Police seized 107,000 baht cash, 19 debtor record books, business cards, two bankbooks, 15 mobile phones, one iPad, one laptop, five motorbikes, two cars and seven jackets emblazoned with

the Tum Credit logo.

Officers also seized one semiautomatic handgun.

"They were all charged with operating and assisting an illegal loan business and charging illegal interest rates. They have all confessed to the charges against them," he stated.

Deep South drive-by kills six

SIX civilians were massacred in the Deep South province of Yala in a drive-by shooting on May 1.

A two-year-old boy was among the dead.

Witnesses said that four men dressed like Army rangers pulled up on two motorcycles and opened fire on a crowd of civilians outside a grocery store.

Store owner Watcharin Nuansai, 34, lost her husband and 2-year-old son in the attack.

Ms Watcharin told Isra News Agency she would leave Yala for her hometown of Buri Ram in the Northeast since she no longer had anything keeping her in the South.

"My husband told me every day that he wanted to move to Buri Ram... but we couldn't do that," she said. "We didn't have enough money to start a new life there. So, we had to continue to live and work here, even though we feared death"

"Now, I've lost both my husband and son. Right after I finish their funeral rites here, I will definitely migrate to Buri Ram. I don't want others in my family to be killed," she said.

Mrs Watcharin was lucky to survive the attack herself. She had

just gone to the restroom to take a bath when the shooting started.

"I heard loud gunfire so I rushed to see what was going on. I saw smoke and heard the gunfire again, so I went back to hide in the restroom. Then, authorities took me to hide in an area at the back of my house, as they feared more attacks," she said.

Khuha Muk Community leader Rakchai Suwan said the recent attack was severer than previous incidents.

"Many of us are now extra cautious when going out. Some people have even moved away," he added.

Another resident, Suwan Panboonleu, urged the insurgents to stop the attacks and join others in assisting Thailand's development.

Meanwhile, National Security Council chief Paradorn Pattanatabut said the attack was not related to ongoing peace talks

in Malaysia between the Thai government and one insurgent group, the Barisan Revolusi Nasional (BRN). Mr Paradorn claimed the shooting was "an act of revenge" carried out by "extremists" and he affirmed that the talks would continue.

Thai officials investigated over GT200s

THE Department of Special Investigation (DSI) is investigating officials from 13 government agencies that bought fake drug and explosive detectors, following the imprisonment of the British man who invented them.

Jim McCormick, 57, was sentenced to 10 years in jail for selling the fraudulent devices to agencies around the world.

Thai agencies spent at least 1.13 billion baht on 1,358 GT200 and Alpha 6 units, both of which have been revealed as completely ineffectual at substance detection.

The Royal Thai Army, which was assigned to dispose of bombs in the Deep South when the insurgency initially took grip there, was in dire need of bomb detectors that could detect explosives from a distance.

After learning that the Air Force's Explosive Ordnance Disposal unit possessed the GT200 detectors, the Army tested the device and bought 541 GT200s in 2008-09 – the largest lot ever bought by Thai security agencies.

Ministry threatens online clamp down over 'defamatory' PM Yingluck cartoon

THE MINISTRY of Information and Communications Technology (MICT) is threatening to shut down websites that recently carried allegedly defamatory messages about Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra.

MICT Minister Anudith Nakornthap made the threats in response to comments made online by Thai Rath cartoonist Somchai Rachawat.

Mrs Yingluck is suing Mr Somchai for allegedly posting photographs of the premier giving a recent speech in Mongolia along with the message: "Please understand that prostitutes are not bad women. Prostitutes only sell their bodies, but a bad woman has been wandering around trying to sell the country."

Mr Anudith urged anyone who found offensive messages on the internet to report them so they

could be "immediately removed".

He added that if the intention was to defame the prime minister, the website could be shut down and the persons responsible prosecuted under Article 326 of the Criminal Act, which could lead to one year in prison and a fine of

20,000 baht or both.

National Human Rights commissioner Niran Pitakwatchara said that Mr Anudith's threats were a violation of the basic rights of Thai citizens and that the right to criticize was a foundation of democracy.

Miss Maxim contestant ejected for drug use video

A CONTESTANT has been ejected from the Miss Maxim Beauty Pageant after a video surfaced on YouTube apparently showing her teaching a three-year-old boy to inhale illegal drugs.

Kwanjai Khempradub, 20, had made it to the last 20 contestants in the competition before the video surfaced.

In it, she appears to help the boy to snort ketamine – known as "wa k" in Thei

known as "ya k" in Thai – using a banknote.

Mrs Kwanjai later told police the substance was harmless white powder, not actually illegal drugs.

"Posting such a clip on YouTube is a violation of the Computer Crime Act because it shows others how to abuse an illicit substance," Technology Crime Suppression Division chief Pisit Pao-in said.

A preliminary urine test on Mrs Kwanjai turned up negative, as did tests on the boy and his mother, who also appeared in the video.

Mrs Kwanjai said she was

sorry for what had happened and admitted she did it for fun. She said she was not involved with illicit drugs anymore and the test results confirmed that.

Cheap food plans to prove costly for India's government

INDIA may soon pass a new law to give millions more people cheap food, fulfilling an election promise of the ruling Congress party that could cost about \$US 23 billion a year and take a third of annual grain production.

The National Food Security Bill, which aims to feed 70 per cent of the population, could widen India's already swollen budget deficit next year, increasing the risk to its coveted investment-grade status.

Bank of China Ltd closes account of North Korean exchange bank

BANK of China Ltd has shut the account of North Korea's main foreign exchange bank, which was hit with US sanctions in March after Washington accused it of helping finance Pyongyang's nuclear weapons programme.

The state-run Foreign Trade Bank had been told its transactions had been halted and its account closed, Bank of China, the country's biggest foreign exchange bank, said in a statement on Tuesday.

Abducted American women discovered alive, years later

THREE American women newly freed from a decade-long kidnapping ordeal huddled privately with loved ones on Tuesday as police scoured the Cleveland house where the captives had been held for clues to how their confinement went unnoticed for so long.

Three brothers were arrested as suspects shortly after Monday evening's rescue of the women and are expected to be formally charged soon. One of them, Ariel Castro, 52, a former school bus driver and owner of the house, was thought to live there alone.

The women, believed to have been abducted separately from the surrounding neighborhood and held prisoner for years, were found alive together by a neighbor who was alerted by cries for help coming from the house.

He broke through the door to rescue one of the women, Amanda Berry, whose 2003 disappearance as a teenager was widely publicized in the local media, and helped her place a frantic emergency call to authorities.

"Help me! I'm Amanda Berry... I've been kidnapped and I've been missing for 10 years and I'm here.

I'm free now," Ms Berry can be heard saying in a recording of the call released by police.

Found with Ms Berry, now 27, was her 6-year-old daughter, conceived and born during her captivity, and two other women -Gina DeJesus, 23, who vanished at age 14 in 2004, and Michelle Knight, 32, who was 20 years old when she went missing in 2002.

immediately. Two brothers, Pedro Castro, 54, and Onil Casto, 50, were taken into custody a short time later.

Police have not said what role each man is suspected of playing in the case, but Ms Berry named Mr Castro in her 911 call as the man from whom she was trying to escape.

Initial euphoria in Cleveland over Mr Castro was arrested almost the women's rescue soon gave way

to questions about why their captivity went undetected, despite what neighbors said were a number of suspicious or disturbing incidents at the house.

"We didn't search hard enough. She was right under our nose the whole time," said Angel Arroyo, a church pastor who had handed out flyers of DeJesus in the neighborhood where she ultimately surfaced.

Other notorious child abductions in which missing person was discovered alive

• Jaycee Dugard was kidnapped in June 1991 in the United States at age 11 and remained missing for more than 18 years. She was discovered after her abductor, Phillip Craig Garrido, brought her to a parole office in California along with two daughters fathered by him, aged 11 and 15 at the time.

In June 2011 he was sentenced to 431 years imprisonment.


• Elizabeth Smart was abducted from her bedroom in an affluent suburb of Salt Lake City, Utah, in March, 2003, at age 14. She was found nine months later only a few miles from her home. Brian David Mitchell and Wanda Ileen Barzee were indicted for her kidnapping. They were initially found unfit to stand trial but were later convicted. The abduction and recovery were the subject of a movie and a book.

• Natascha Kampusch was abducted at the age of 10 in March 1998 on her way to school in Vienna, Austria and held for more than eight years in a secret cellar in the small town of Strasshof until she escaped in 2006. Her kidnapper, Wolfgang Priklopil, 44, committed suicide the same day. Ms Kampusch later wrote a book about her experience.

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Opposition leader decries Malaysian election results

MALAYSIA'S government accused opposition leader Anwar Ibrahim of "fomenting division" and planning to cause unrest at a rally to protest alleged vote fraud following his defeat in the national election on May 5

Mr Anwar calleded the rally to present what he says is evidence of widespread fraud in the election that handed victory, with a weakened parliamentary majority, to the long-ruling Barisan Nasional

Tens of thousands of supporters were expected to attend the event on Wednesday as the Gazette went to print, despite a police warning that the opposition had not acquired the necessary permission.

"Anwar has deliberately refused to apply for permission for his protest, and deliberately chosen a

Without explicitly banning the rally, police said in a statement they

'Fake tourists' in the crosshairs

Immigration police chief asks local tour companies for help to net more illegal foreigners

THE 'top brass' of Thailand's Immigration Bureau has asked for cooperation from local tour businesses to report any suspicious foreign clients suspected of conducting illegal activities.

Immigration Bureau Commissioner Pharnu Kerdlarpphon was in Phuket last week for a closeddoor meeting of high-ranking officials. Lt Gen Pharnu's visit to Phuket on Tuesday, April 30, was to head a meeting tabled to discuss the bureau's 'working policy' at which Phuket's own immigration superintendent did not attend.

Following the meeting, Gen Pharnu told the press "At the moment, the number of tourists using Phuket airport's services is about 17,000 people per day, of directors of Airports of Thai-profit of 6.499 billion baht.

"It's quite crowded in the terminals. So, we've provided [additional] officials for tourists' convenience.

"In the future the airport will be expanded which will resolve the [over] crowded issue.

Asia-Pacific consumers more green conscious

ALL over the world, much has been said and reported about green issues and the impact of climate change over the years.

The latest findings in a GfK "Green Gauge Global" survey reveal that over 7 in 10 consumers globally, as well as in the Asia Pacific region, are concerned about environmental pollution and a similar proportion (67%) view global warming as a concern.

Green Gauge Global is in its fourth reporting year and is part of the Roper Reports Worldwide consumer trends study. GfK polled over 37,500 consumers aged 15 and above, across 25 countries, including eight from Asia Pacific (Australia, China, India, Indonesia, Japan, South Korea, Taiwan and Thailand), where respondents were surveyed on their attitudes, behavior and values across a range of topics.

This year, additional reports for Singapore, Malaysia and Vietnam will be available as well.

"Green Gauge Global findings reflect environmental pollution being on par with issues like

educational quality," observed Jodie Roberts, Regional Director for GfK Consumer Trends.

"It is interesting to note that concern for pollution tends to be higher in emerging markets like China where environmental degradation is much more visible."

Although the majority of consumers are concerned about global warming, 3 in 5 (60%) consumers in the Asia Pacific region said they

would do more for the environment but they don't know how.

This sentiment appears to be more prominent in the developing countries, especially China and India. Meanwhile, consumers who seem more equipped on how to contribute to the environment are from Australia and Taiwan.

However, there is a surfacing trend of emerging markets starting to take the lead in some green attitudes over the past few years. Developing countries in Asia

Pacific are more likely to conserve energy and water at home, as compared to their counterparts in the developed countries.

Among established markets, it's worth highlighting that in Taiwan, concern about the environment is consistent with their behaviors.

In fact Taiwan is the most active country in the region when it comes to environmental behaviors. For instance, 94 % of Taiwanese consumers recycle frequently, making them the highest proportion amongst all other countries in the world.

"The level of awareness, attitude and green behavior is different across countries and largely depends on many factors, from infrastructure within the country, experience of natural disasters, efforts by the local government and the companies within countries and so forth," highlighted Roberts.

"One particularly noteworthy observation is the fact that consumers globally are increasingly expecting corporations to do their

part to address the environment."

Across the region, three-quarters of respondents agreed that it is important that companies take environmentally responsible actions such as using environmentally friendly materials. Sentiments are especially strong in Indonesia, Taiwan and India.

"It is important for companies to understand the reasons behind consumers wanting to go 'green', which aside from altruism, could stem from other motivations such as saving money and even showing their social status - a behavior particularly apparent in Asia," said Roberts.

"We live in an era where companies are evaluated not just on their products and services but also how socially responsible they are perceived to be, and this will have a great impact on their business performance going forward," she concluded.

BoT survey: prices expected to rise

Some business operators could raise their product prices in the current quarter, given higher fuel costs and wages, while an expected increase in foreign orders points to an export recovery, according to a recent survey by the Bank of Thailand (BoT).

According to a statement from the central bank, "the three-month confidence index for product selling prices stays above 50, reflecting the likelihood that operators will raise their prices following increases in the prices of raw materials and fuel, as well as in wages."

Similarly, based on the BoT's information exchange with operators, many of the surveyed businesses planned to raise their product prices gradually over the course of the year.

The property sector may boost prices due to higher costs of land and construction materials, taking into account demand and purchasing power, the survey found.

However, some businesses, such as processed-food exporters and transport providers, may not be able to increase their prices this year due to their yearly contract terms.

The survey was conducted on 198 business chiefs across the nation during the first quarter.

The monthly business-confidence survey, meanwhile, was conducted on 1,010 companies.

The survey found that exports could do well in the coming months, given the fact that the three-month foreign purchasing-order index stood above 50. An index above 50 means operators remain confident of gaining foreign orders in the next three months. However, the appreciation of the baht remains a risk to export performance.



A perfect 'short-time' for sailors

Riverside marina in Krabi Town welcomes influx of boats

SAILING smoothly through its second year of operations, the Krabi River Marina (KRM) recently added a second restaurant to its portfolio – a small albeit significant indicator of the Phang Nga Bay's marine and leisure industry's continuous growth.

One of the main selling points of the newly opened Terrace pub and restaurant, KRM's second eatery after the Marina Villa, will be live music and rejuvenating refreshments in a coastal riverside atmosphere.

"Our targets include yachtees making a brief shore-stop before continuing on their exploration of Phang Nga Bay," explained Wityanan of Thai Water Craft LP, the developer of KPM.

"That's the main difference with us and other local marinas. We're more oriented towards temporary docking for yachts, who may need to refill on supplies, or just take a rest, but don't plan to stay more than a day or two."

KRM offers protected berths for boats measuring up to 80 feet in length with a maximum draft of three meters at low tide. All in, the 6,000 square-meter docking area provides berths for 40 to 45 boats, depending on the size.

The marina is ideally located along the Krabi River, just a few minutes drive to the center of town – about a kilometer, or a 20-minute boat-ride from Phang Nga Bay proper.

Convenient access to the marina is available 24 hours a day, especially at night thanks to the illuminated navigation channel. There are no tidal restrictions and the water is calm all year round.

The vista from the berths is very picturesque with unspoiled natural bush, traditional fishing villages and mountain views. Aside from a 7-11 on site, other supermarkets for re-provisioning, as well as the local market, are also within walking distance.

Private transportation or land-

based tour services are available from the marina office. Car hire and motorbike hire can be arranged, as well as taxis to Krabi airport or bus station if required.

Marina facilities include boat refueling and repair services, laundry service, 220 volts shore plug-in power, water connections, hot showers and other amenities such as WiFi internet for marina guests, a clubhouse and about 10 private shops in total.

The Terrace licensed restaurant serves both Thai and western food at very reasonable prices, with an extensive cocktail menu and happy-hour from 5 to 6pm.

"We offer a secure place for locals and foreigners on a chartered or personal boats, who plan to stay a day or two, or longer.

"We also cater to weddings, organizations, tourists and foreigners who are staying in or visiting Krabi, Phuket and nearby provinces.

"In front of the marina is the expansive Thara public park, where

clients can run, walk, cycle and can feel like they're in their own home without a bunch of big buildings surrounding them," he said.

Asked about the investment, Mr Wityanan said that his firm has put about 70 million baht into the project, not including land costs.

"As this is part of Thara Park,

the land is owned by the King."

Thai Water Craft also operate a number of jetty-service businesses in Phuket, namely off Cape Panwa and Surin Beach, among others.

Phuket firm to co-develop superyacht facility in BKK

PHUKET based, Yacht Solutions (YS) has signed a memorandum of understanding with Bangkok's Italthai Marine (ITM), agreeing to create Thailand's first dedicated superyacht facility just south of Bangkok. This joint venture brings together Thailand's largest and most established shipbuilding company, ITM, with one of Thailand's most reputable and experienced superyacht refit companies, YS.

Dubbed 'Yacht Solutions at Italthai Marine', the new facility is being set up in response to the demand for more superyacht refit and repair facilities in the Asian region – from both owners of superyachts based in Asia and those travelling from Europe and the Americas.

Located near the mouth of the Chao Phraya River in Samut Prakarn, just south of Bangkok, and easy to navigate to from the Gulf of Thailand, Italthai Marine provides the perfect site for such a facility. Its location, with convenient access to the Thai capital, and only 45 minutes from Suvarnabhumi International Airport (the transiting hub of Southeast Asia) is ideal because it is extremely appealing to owners, captains and crew due to the vast range of crew facilities close to hand. This deep water facility was needed by Yacht Solutions to cater for larger refit and build projects as well as shorter emergency and maintenance projects.

Speaking to the *Gazette*, YS Managing Director, Gareth Twist, elaborated on the reasons why Bangkok was the ideal choice for establishing such a dedicated superyacht facility, and not Phuket.

"There [in Bangkok], we can handle yachts as big as 95 meters long, up to 20 meters wide and weighing as much as 3,500 tonnes, whereas in Phuket, we can only handle [superyachts that measure] up to 45-50 meters long, 10 meters wide and weighing up to 260 tonnes."

Asked if there are any plans or ambitions to build a similar high-capacity facility in Phuket in the near future, Gareth responded: "Definitely. We've got the funds and plans to build such a yard in Phuket, but acquiring the ideal piece of land, with good deep water access, has been an obstacle.

Meanwhile, Gareth's brother, Simon Twist, has relocated from Phuket to the Thai capital as part of the latest partnership with Italthai Marine.

"As a major yachting hub, Phuket has a good yachting skill base, and this is our strength... We will continue to send personnel, who will be groomed in Phuket, before going up to Bangkok."

Gareth went on to highlight the growth that his company and the island's industry, overall, has seen in the past year. Currently, more than 90% of his firm's business is dealing with superyachts. This is compared to last year, when only abut 60-70% of the business came from such large vessels, he said.

"In the past year, some 60 superyachts came through Phuket. Of these, Yacht Solutions worked on about 16... Our business volume from superyachts has grown three-fold and we expect the industry to continue to see strong growth," he said.

Yacht Solutions at Italthai Marine will utilize a 112,000 square meter facility offering full ship building and repair capabilities plus a bonded warehouse and in-house design office. The facility is ISO 9001:2000 rated and boasts a lifting capacity up to 95 meters and 3,500 tonnes. It has access to two 115 meter dry docks, 300 meter alongside berthing, a floating dock up to 160 meters and 5000 tonnes lift capacity, making this the largest superyacht repair facility in Southeast Asia.

"We have been in the marine refit and repair business in Thailand for over 10 years and we have been looking for a deep water facility for the last two years," said Gareth.

"We are very excited to be at Italthai

Marine as this is the perfect site for us. Yacht Solutions at Italthai Marine expands our superyacht capabilities for hauling-out, and opens up a great yard option for any resident yachts and superyachts passing through the Gulf of Thailand.

"This facility is accessible to all of Southeast Asia being less than 800 miles from Singapore. We are very excited with this partnership as it offers a natural progression for our business."

The superyacht industry in Asia is growing and recent trends show that there has been a year-on-year increase in the number of superyachts, either in the region or transiting through the region. Yacht Solutions at Italthai Marine is very keen to attract those yachts to this new facility in Thailand for planned or emergency refits, repairs or conversion work.

Khao Lak hotel rooms to double

THE hotel industry in Phang Nga province's tourist destination of Khao Lak will more than double from 9,000 guestrooms this year to 20,000 in five years.

Sompong Dowpiset, the owner of Casa de la Flora, a luxury boutique resort, told *The Nation* last week that the influx of foreign tourists will be a key driver, rising from 8,000 to more than 10,000 in 2014.

"Hotel developers here should not follow the trend of international chains. They should look for ways to design a concept that fits the area, which is rich in unspoiled and natural resources and the simple lifestyles of local people. A hotel should have its own character and sell 'Thainess'," he said.

Sompong, who is cofounder of Boontavorn, a major sanitary ware distributor, said the firm plans to construct two hotels to capture specific groups, but declined to disclose the investment. One of them is La Sella, which will target families, while the other one is undergoing a feasibility study as a place for a vaca-

tion and medical stay at the same time.
Possibly, elderly Western tourists will be one of the potential markets.

In Western culture, most retirees live alone, while in Asia, they stay with their family under the care of their children. Sompong plans to approach his foreign friends, who are retired doctors in the USA, to work here.

"With the tourism business booming, all parties in Khao Lak should work more closely to secure its sustainable development,

focusing on tourism infrastructure like wastewater treatment facilities and human security systems.

"The area should not follow the business models of Phuket or Pattaya for long-term growth, as these two resort cities seem to be plagued with problems ranging from the environment to crime and congestion.

"Khao Lak is clearly positioned as an eco-tourism destination. It has no need to become bigger. It is a holiday haven for foreign tourists from Europe, Australia, the UK, and German-speaking countries.

The stronger baht and economic troubles in Europe have not hurt the tourism scene here; it has rebounded com-

pletely from the deadly tsunami of December 2004," he said.

"For the national tourism strategy, the government should promote in selective markets globally rather than all of them and make its policy clear which group of foreign travellers will get the most attention.

"In Phuket, German and regular European tourists have disappeared because of the invasion of Russian visitors," he added.

THESE days, everywhere you turn, the news is focused on Phuket fever. From soaring airport arrival numbers and surging hotel occupancy rates to, of course, the sordid underbelly of mass tourism. But the resort destination known as 'Greater Phuket' is no 'one trick pony'. Nearby Khao Lak has certainly been kicking up its heels lately as Fortuna's wheel of fortune has hit winning streaks.

Over the past 18 months a number of bright new international class hotels have come into the market, including Beyond, Sensi Mar, Casa de la Flora, Sands by Katathani, Mai and the Best Western Premier Southsea.

While Phuket is already edging closer and closer to the major milestone of 50,000 registered hotel rooms, Khao Lak currently sits at 6,334. Supply between 2011 through 2013 has increased by 1,578 new rooms, but today, the pipeline of new properties has dried up. Phuket on the other hand, has well over 20 new hotels coming up and the number is continuing to rise unabated.

One notable new entry, which will debut in July, is the SENTIDO Graceland which will offer 338 rooms and villas at a beachfront location. With the popularity of Graceland's other Phuket hotel,

expect this latest offering to be full come high season. For those of you who don't know the SENTIDO brand, this is an affiliate of Thomas Cook and is a franchise hospitality group mainly focused on Southern Europe and the Mediterranean with 44 hotels in its system.

During my recent visit to Khao Lak I was able to catch up with Ty Collins, general manager of the the JW Marriott. His comments on the trade were extremely positive, with the JW posting a substantial rise in occupancy between 2011 and 2012. Aside from legacy markets such as Germany; Austria; Switzerland; Scandinavia and the UK, an emerging trend is groups from China and Korea.

While traditionally Khao Lak has been confined to just two seasons – high (including peak) and low, this year a shoulder season is emerging in April and again in October. When I was there in late April, a good number of properties were still fully booked.

For a long time, the conundrum for Khao Lak hotels has been how to make the money during high season and not to spend it during low season. The shorter low season is assisting properties in stabilizing their annual trading figures. Michael Vorderleitner, who has been GM at the successful Ramada resort for over three years, says that during July and August more

Australians are coming – as are MICE groups.

At present, one clear difference between Phuket and Khao Lak – besides the lack of masses of sun lounges or the whining noise of jet skies at the latter – is that very little Eastern European

business has gone north. Speaking to some local hoteliers, they voiced the opinion that many of the legacy western European wholesalers have continued

to pressure hotels not to mix markets, and that this has left Khao Lak a bit out of step with broader market trends.

Today Khao Lak is still highly leveraged in the legacy markets, as the world shifts to the short haul Asian markets and emerging sectors; the question is

how can it make the transition. Certainly the new SENTIDO Graceland could be a game changer. While there remain questions over year round opportunity, given that the nearby Similan islands are closed from May to October and there is little retail,

one has to believe that as hotels see increased trading, the range of attractions will develop in parellel.

I am reminded how Kata and

Karon were for years mired in Eurocentric trading and how the impact of new markets and short -haul travel changed all this. Heading to the Le Meridien I met with Ruud Hulscher and Steven Roberto, both familiar faces in Phuket hospitality who now work at the resort. Both pointed out the

many Asian faces in the lobby and said the market is moving and starting to attract a new demographic of tourists. Perhaps the most positive sign was that many of the area's successful hotels are now moving rates higher for the upcoming 2013/2014 high season in November.

Wrapping up my trip, it is clear that Khao Lak is changing, with the central resort area being pushed north up to the Bangsak area, which is where larger land plots exist. In the future the trek north of internationally branded properties will surely follow a similar trend as Phuket.

As I was about to get in my car for the drive home, I had one last glimpse of the setting sun and serene beach, where nary a beach lounger could be seen, nor the roar of a jet ski heard and for just a moment the world all made sense.

Real estate investment on the rise

DIRECT commercial real estate investment globally reached a milestone in the first quarter of 2013, with the highest Q1 global transaction volume recorded since 2008, according to Jones Lang LaSalle's latest Global Capital Flows report.

Volumes came in at US\$105 billion for Q1 2013, with all three regions surveyed witnessing growth year-on-year, as the weight of money chasing real estate has increased significantly.


A total of US\$27 billion was invested directly in Asia Pacific commercial real estate in Q1 2013, which is on par with Q4 of last year, but up 26 per cent on the first quarter of 2012.

Asia Pacific was the only region not to see a decline in volumes transacted compared to O4 of 2012.

An increased proportion of transaction volumes in the Asia Pacific region in the first quarter was made up of domestic deals (\$20bn), with cross border investment (\$7bn) down 24% year-on-year and down 11% quarter-on-quarter.

Stuart Crow, head of Asia Pacific capital markets at Jones Lang LaSalle said: "Continued quantitative easing globally is increasing liquidity and reducing the cost of debt in Asia Pacific, which is making real estate assets more accessible to investors within Asia Pacific."

He continued: "We maintain our expectation of an increase in transaction volumes in Asia Pacific to \$110bn for 2013, which will be about 12% up on last year, and we think that Japan is going to be the 'one to watch' this year. We expect a lift in investment activity in the country, as positive signs are emerging following announcements about

stimulus measures targeted at reflating the Japanese economy."

Investors from Asia Pacific maintained their preference for European investment during the first quarter, particularly the biggest, most liquid cities of Paris and London, concentrating on office and hotel assets. The \$2.6bn spent outside the region is 45 % higher than this time last year.

Alistair Meadows, director, International Capital Group Asia Pacific, Jones Lang LaSalle commented: "New capital continues to emerge from Asia Pacific that is aggressively targeting global cities, especially London and New York. The sources of this capital are increasingly Chinese sovereign wealth funds (SWFs) and insurance companies as well as pension funds from Korea and Malaysia.

Core office assets in gateway cities remain the favored targets, making up 50% of global cross-border activity."

Four Asia Pacific countries featured in the ten largest markets globally in Q1 this year,

Japan, China, Hong Kong and Australia.

Domestic investors accounted for the lion's share of investment in all except China, reflecting a trend seen across the region in the past quarter, as investment from investors within the region has increased.

Five Asia Pacific cities made the top ten most active cities globally, with Tokyo maintaining its number three spot (\$5.9bn), Hong Kong ranked fifth (\$3.3bn), Shanghai ranked sixth (\$2.4bn) and Singapore ranked ninth (\$1.9bn). – *Phuket Gazette/JLL*

BKK Green City plan approved

Gold plunges to 33 year low

THE PAST month has not been kind to anyone who has bought gold recently. With a nearly 9% loss since its Janu-

ary peak, and nearly 14% from last September's, of late, the precious metal has been anything but.

Last week it had its largest one-day percentage decline since February 28, 1983. For the past 20 months, the price of gold has failed to make a new high since peaking in 2011. With all the hype surrounding gold, gold ATMs (yes they have ATMs to buy gold directly), and my phone ringing at least five times a month from people wanting to buy gold, it appears to have topped and the neckline is now broken. There has been a mania as gold climbed higher and higher. The worst part for holders of gold is that it doesn't even pay a dividend.

I consider gold to be a 'fear trade'. When the investing herd or crowd is scared they buy the shiny stuff because they feel better, since it is tangible. Look at the chart above and notice the price of gold took off on a 10-year spurt right after the dot-com bubble burst in the year 2000 (Fear 1), then when the 9-11 terror attacks occurred (Fear 2). When hurricane Katrina hit the US (Fear 3) and the Great Recession in 2008 (Fear 4), gold climbed the 'fear index'. Note that during this 11year run, the US stock market went sideways and consolidated its gains after a strong run from 1975 to 2000.

In 2010, I taught a series of investment courses at Khun Woody's Sandwich Shoppe in Phuket. For two years now I have been telling clients and people to avoid all gold exposure. All the while, I've been saying that gold had peaked and investors need to increase their stock exposure. The bull market in stocks began in 2008 and we are just now entering a period of increased optimism. This will bring in a period of good feelings where investors return to the stock market. They'll begin to buy and move cash out of the bomb shelter (gold and cash) and into funds and take risks. The 'fear' or gold trade is now dead and a great bull run in stocks has begun.

Gold price fluctuation is nothing more than a graph of fear. When investors begin to feel good about investing in stocks and the economy in general this 'fear index' will decline, as we are now seeing since 2011. Gold investors are panicking and now we have seen a drop below critical support levels. I expect gold to lag equities for many years to come and global stocks to move much higher.

When the bull market in stocks began in 1980, stocks rose for 20 years as we climbed the excitement, thrill and euphoria stages. During this same time the price of gold went sideways and did nothing for 20 years. I expect a similar hibernation for gold now.


A large reason for the recent bull run in gold prices had been the development of the ETF for gold. It allowed investors to buy gold like a stock. As money went into this ETF, more and more gold was bought, pushing up the price. Now that many of these investors have been burned with their gold holdings, look for gold to continue to sell off as investors in these ETFs unload their gold holdings.

With the clear break down last week, gold is not a wise investment for your portfolio. Stock, funds and equities should be bought now. The US stock market is now on the verge of breaking out to new highs after consolidating for 12 long years. I will be an aggressive buyer of US and global stocks and funds in the weeks ahead. The decline in gold is a welcome sign that there is less global fear.

There is increased optimism about global economies and that is good for stocks. Any rally in the price of gold is to be sold into. I suggest anyone holding gold to exit now before prices go much lower. TBank loan's boom

THANACHART Bank's lending to small and medium-sized enterprises this year has a good chance of exceeding the target of 90 billion baht. Lending in the first four months of 2013 is already 84bn baht against year's target of 90 bn baht.

This is thanks to its business plan for the remaining months of the year to finance university student apartments and aggressively pursue auto-related business.

After targeting outstanding SME loans of 90bn baht for the entire year, the figure in the first four months alone reached 84bn baht, said Jiratchayuth Amyongka, head of SME banking. TBank adjusted its SME portfolio last year by moving some customers to corporate loans to set a strategy to advance the SME segment. He said the board had given the green light to the SME banking division to provide loans for universitystudent apartments in the country's education hubs.

TBank conducted a study in this field and found that the supply of student apartments was insufficient, he said. The number of new university students increases by 10 per cent a year, and new accommodation for them is not keeping pace.

"We will provide loans to apartment developers based in education hubs. In the northern region, potential locations are around Chiang Mai University and Pavap University. In the Northeast, apartments near Khon Kaen University are the focus," he said.

The lending will be divided into two types. First is project financing to apartment developers, for which sales teams from TBank in Bangkok will help teams in provincial branches. Second is working capital, for which

provincial sales teams can approve loans themselves through the scorecard system. Workingcapital loans will provide a credit line of up to 10mn baht, while the figure will be above 10mn baht for project financing; for which apartment developers will require annual turnover of 600mn baht.

Jiratchayuth said the bank would add two business-centre branches to the five currently operating to support lending to SMEs in the provinces.

Another key strategy this year is auto-related business, which also will help strengthen SME lending. TBank is already the leader in installment lending, and other auto-related businesses such as garages will be the focus as well. He said such businesses had good potential to service vehicles purchased under last year's firstcar tax-break scheme.

RECENT talk of establishing a special court to fast-track legal cases involving foreign visitors (see page 1) raises some interesting issues, but at the end of the day is unlikely to result in little more than that: just talk.

The reasons put forward to establish such a court are probably well-intended and certainly easy enough to understand. Thailand's tourism industry is a key generator of revenue, probably the main reason behind the baht's sustained resurgence against most other major foreign currencies since the dark days of the "Tom Yum Kung" financial crisis that befell much of the region in 1997.

Due to Thailand's enduring attractiveness to foreign visitors, the baht continues to inch closer to the fixed 25 baht to US\$1 exchange rate that was in place for many years before that economic collapse.

Since 1997, Thailand's attractiveness and good value for money have been more than enough to offset any number of negative factors that might deter foreigners from considering the Kingdom as their destination of choice: political instability, including rioting; arson attacks and shooting murders on the streets of Bangkok; one of Asia's deadliest ethnic insurgencies in the Deep South provinces of Yala, Pattani and Narathiwat; unprecedented flooding and other natural and man-made disasters.

The number of crises that the Thai tourism industry has managed to overcome over the past two decades is now far too extensive to list on a tourist-oriented T-shirt of the kind that appeared on the streets of Patong after the 2004 tsunami disaster. The momentum of the Thai tourism juggernaut is reflected in the Ministry of Tourism and Sports' bold prediction of a recordbreaking tourist arrival figure of 24 million by the end of 2013.

Of course the sheer number of foreign visitors makes it inevitable that ever more tourists will end up in the last place they would ever choose when planning their perfect Thai holiday: entangled in the Kindom's notoriously slow criminal justice system, where some cases can linger for over a decade before resolution — a time period very different from that typically meted out in the form of "permits to stay" granted to foreign tourists by Immigration.

The main reason that a tourist court will never happen is simple: bureaucratic inertia. It is easy for the Tourism and Sports Minister to say that having one would be nice, but getting monolithic institutions like the Justice Ministry and Royal Thai Police to take action without any real economic inducements seems unlikely indeed.

For this reason we will place the Tourism Court in the same file with so many other tourism related, pie-in-the-sky projects that have never come to fruition: the Phuket International Convention Center, "Monkey Island" and of course a safe and reasonably-priced public transport system.

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

Using CCTV to prevent hotel crime, not solve it

FIRST PERSON

MORE than ten hotel and resort robberies were carried out in the last three months - this is a serious problem that needs solutions.

Owners of resorts and hotels can't just sit back and expect the police to take care of this problem.

The number of tourists visiting Phuket is growing every year, but the number of police officers is not changing, which makes it more difficult for them to guarantee the safety of all of our guests and their belongings.

Officers are doing their best, but people in the hospitality industry need to make efforts to boost their security as well.

For example, when they experience re-occurring crimes, they need to figure out how to close the loopholes in their security systems.

The best way for hotels to close these loopholes and protect their guests is to proactively and effectively use CCTV.

Usually CCTV cameras are checked after a robbery takes place, when really the focus should be on crime prevention.

Using CCTV footage to track down a thief is hard work, especially because thieves know they need to obscure their faces by wearing masks, glasses or

I have actually seen CCTV footage where a brazen thief waved to the camera.

Instead of checking the CCTV footage after a robbery, hotels should have security guards constantly monitoring the cameras. This way, guards would be able

to spot suspicious people who have gotten into a hotel and could notify other guards to keep an eye on the person, possibly stopping a crime before it happens.

You can never be sure when a crime will happen, so even when everything seems normal, constantly and diligently monitoring CCTV is essential.

After a successful robbery, thieves know more about a hotel's security system. They know the weak points in the system, and they know that the CCTV cameras aren't being monitored.

We need to be smart and careful when designing hotel and resort security systems.

We need to think of the situation from a thief's perspective.

It's important for us to try and imagine how he will conduct a robbery so we can take steps ahead of time to prevent them.

In addition to using technology like CCTV, hotel staff should keep an eye on suspicious guests or situations.

Guards especially should be careful and observant. But really, all hotel staff should take note of all guests who act strangely, even those who visit the hotel often or seem wealthy – a person that does not look like a thief might be the most dangerous person in the lobby.

Sometimes criminals will pretend to be tourists or officers, so hotel staff must be alert at all

Staff should not just keep an eye on guests, they should also keep watch over their colleagues.

If they know other staff members well, they will be able to spot a co-worker acting suspi-

By simply keeping an eye on each other they can help prevent inside jobs.

The last security concern that hotels should look at is infrastructure.

Hotels should not have any dark areas or CCTV blind spots that would allow thieves to easily commit crimes.

By having the proper infrastructure, CCTV coverage and diligent staff, hotels can boost the level of safety they provide to guests – the key is to be proactive in crime prevention.

Is my deposit safe in a Thai bank?

Deposits in banks in my country are guaranteed by the government up to US\$250,000.

If I deposit money in a Thai bank, is it guaranteed? If so, up to what amount?

An officer at the Bank of Thailand replies:

Money deposited in Thai banks is guaranteed by law as follows:

- Up to 50 million baht on all deposits from August 11, 2012 to August 10, 2015
- Up to 25 million baht on all deposits from August 11, 2015 to August 10, 2016
- Up to 1 million baht on all deposits from August 11, 2016 onwards

This coverage applies to 36

Thai banks as listed on the Deposit Protection Agency website.

All deposits at the following state-owned banks are 100 per cent guaranteed:

- Bank of Agriculture and Agricultural Co-operatives
- Government Savings Bank
- Government Housing Bank • Islamic Bank of Thailand

The guarantee of large depos its was introduced after the European financial crisis in 2009 in order to boost confidence and encourage investors to use Thai banking institutions.

Guarantees are now slowly being returned to pre-crisis levels.

Coverage is being removed for deposits of more than one million baht because, according to our statistics, 98.5 per cent of accounts at Thai banks have balances of less than one million baht.

Any deposits exceeding the amounts listed above can be claimed during the liquidation process.

When you may refuse a police search Recently I was again stopped by police close to my house and

searched. They went through my pockets, wallet, my motorcycle and frisked me as well. It is a very unpleasant experience.

What are my rights under these circumstances? Can I refuse the search? Can I demand representation?

Phuket City Police chief Col Sermphan Sirikong replies:

No person can refuse to be searched by an officer at a checkpoint.

The Royal Thai Police are empowered by a Cabinet resolution and through the Internal Security Operations Command to set up checkpoints and search people.

We do not need a warrant from

the court to search people at checkpoints in any public area because the checkpoint serves to protect public safety.

Werapong Khaokhawong, an officer at the Ministry of Justice's Rights and Liberties **Protection Department Phuket** Office, replies:

It is very important to cooper-

ate with police conducting searches. They do so to improve public safety and to prevent crime

Also, Section 138 of Thailand's Penal Code states that anyone obstructing an officer in the exercise of his functions faces a vear in prison, a fine of 2,000 baht or both.

However, if you are not in a public area and a person identifies himself as a law enforcement officer and asks to search you, you have the right to ask that person to show you identification to confirm he is indeed a law enforcement official.

You also have the right to ask to see the warrant empowering that officer to search you.

If he can not present the correct identification and search warrant, you have the right to refuse to be searched.



The Art of food

On the Menu

WHEN checking in on Facebook one often comes across photographs of food; meals about to be consumed at restaurants and in homes. With the advent of 'smart phones' it seems everyone now has a camera ready to snap a shot of their dinner or their cat or even their cat's dinner.

Among my Facebook friends is local artist Jayda Ponlid who posts photos of food regularly, interspersed with images of her artwork. These photos show large quantities of food being prepared and while finding out why this was so, I became a regular visitor to

her 'Kitchen of Love'.

Jayda, is a very popular and very active person and uses the social network to inform her 2,300-plus followers of her daily activities.

So when her fiance, Thiwa Wa Singha, lovingly cooked traditional Thai specialties for her, using only the freshest and most authentic ingredients she posted photos of

these offerings online. Immediately some of her friends and fans wanted the recipes and even asked if she could send some of the beautifully prepared food to them to taste. When one particularly well-heeled fan in Bangkok pleaded that she share this food, stating that money was no object, Jayda looked into the possibilities of sending food to the capital and decided to treat this as an art project. Her first dish, a pineapple fried rice, was flown to the capital for 1000 baht a box including delivery.

A year on, their 'Kitchen of Love' now sends out orders all over Thailand. Her regular clients include famous Thai movie and TV stars, singers and even royalty, but Jayda insists that she does not do this only for money and limits the orders to 29 people a day which is the maximum amount Jayda and her fiance can cope with, in order to add the magic ingredient that has people ordering weeks in advance. That ingredient is love.

'When my fiance started cooking for me I enjoyed it so much that I pretended I couldn't cook. He is an artist like myself and each dish was made with such feeling that eventually I had to own up that I also knew how to cook and then cooked for him." said Jayda.

> Between them they now have 85 recipes and each time they cook they put all their heart and creativity into the meals, with music in the background and a few dance moves thrown in for measure.

"My mother taught me how to cook when I was very young; it was always a happy time. She used to sing while cooking and explained to

me how she imagined how happy people would be when they tasted her food. Maybe these are old fashioned values, but nowadays people just don't take the time to prepare delicious food and eat together as a family" explains Jayda as she places three huge plates of their 'crab meat spaghetti' on the table in front of us. The generous portions are delicious and packed with huge chunks of crab - more than I have ever had at any traditional restaurant.

Jayda notices my delight and explains that in order to get 25

kilos of crab meat she needs to buy 100 kilos of fresh crab at auction and hires sea gypsies to carefully decorticate the fragile meat. It is this attention to detail and the fact that she is at the fresh market at 4am that I am now tasting and I begin to understand why they limit orders to 29. Given the hours and quality ingredients that go into each dish, prices (which range from 650 to 1,500 baht a dish) are very reasonable.

Phuket customers must make their order online before midnight on Thursday and collect the still-warm prepared food on Friday between 5-10pm. I have done this a few times and have run into a few local celebs, including the owner of a famous five-star resort, arriving at the same time.

Customers from the rest of Thailand get their orders in from Monday to Wednesday and through a complex system of delivery - involving airplanes, motorcycles and dry ice – receive their 'food parcel' at home as can be seen by the photos of happy recipients on her Facebook page.

What started out as a three-week art project has now turned into a thriving business, yet Jayda still finds time to take care of her eight dogs; three kids; art gallery and teaching projects.


And her personal favorite dish? "That would have to be our Andaman Salad because of the colors and taste. In with the multicolored salad leaves are crab meat, fish, shrimp, seaweed, oysters, shrimp roe and lemon. A feast for the eyes and the palate and a real

taste of Phuket." she enthuses.

As for future projects Jayda and her fiance have a couple of exhibitions coming up in Bangkok and Taiwan, then plan to instate an intimate single table concept in their own garden where a bespoke romantic evening meal is prepared while the pampered guests chat among the rose bushes knowing that they are the only patrons that evening receiving 100 per cent attention.

Such an evening can only be found at the unique and aptly named 'Kitchen of Love'.

WHEN Bupa Health Insurance opened its first regional office in Phuket more than a decade ago, its business profile was featured in a short article in the *Phuket Gazette*.

Thirteen years on, the man who was there at the company's inception still heads its operation with unwavering commitment. He is Bupa's Southern Regional Manager, Chiravut "Woody" Kornjarungkiat.

Woody, as he prefers to be called, has seen a significant 20fold growth in the company's turnover, but he will be the first to tell you that his role is about more than just net profit, it's also about offering choice in health care to the general public.

"Although we provide private medical insurance, Bupa is a notfor-profit organization. There are no shareholders to take care of, so everything the company earns is reinvested in its operation. It's more of an association than a company, if you like. That's why it's called a 'provident association'," explains the soft-spoken Woody.

Before the 1990s, there was virtually no form of medical insurance other than that offered by the government. Woody was confident that Bupa products would provide the missing link in the Thai health care landscape, and he was right. The success of Bupa, he says, stems from the fact that more and more people want access to the modern medical technology available in private hospitals.

For those who think that private insurance is expensive, Woody observes that "we are going through a period of 'medical inflation', where new medical technologies are pushing up treatment costs. The net profit made by companies like Bupa is very small. What we should do instead is consider this to be a pool of resource for the community in the area of health care".

Although Woody believes everyone should have private medical insurance if they can afford it, he never takes an aggressive approach to sales. "Virtually all my clients are walk-ins, usually expats, but now more and more Thais are subscribing to our services. Having access to quality health care has become more important than ever."

Woody, 47, hails from Chumporn Province and is married to Pannaree Na Nakorn, he also holds a degree in political science from Thammasart University. Woody says that he had always wanted to work with the community and be part of the government civil service, but over time his direction changed.

"I realized that people who called themselves civil servants were actually more interested in wielding their power than looking after the public. I wanted no part in it," he says.

So he went to America and enrolled in an MBA at San Francisco State University. After graduating, he travelled across the country, getting to know its people and, being a keen sportsman, engaged in many sports such as diving, golf and windsurfing.

He later developed a passion for golf and has been practicing it continuously. Having achieved a handicap of 10, Woody fell prey to a shoulder injury and had to undergo a corrective operation. He is now back in action and his ambition is to bring down his handicap to a single figure; as well as turn pro.

"It's still not too late for me to be a senior pro," he says.

Apart from keeping his body healthy, Woody practices meditation regularly. Having studied meditation at the Willpower Institute in Phuket, he is now the institute's speaker and meditation trainer and he teaches meditation twice a month.

"There's no point in exercising only your body, the mind has to be strong too. You can achieve that through meditation," he says

Buddhists believe life is constant suffering. You cannot stop the cycle of birth, growing old, getting ill, and dying, but you can live life with certain amount of mindfulness. Good medical insurance helps, too," he says with a smile.



AIS 3G claims 800,000 users

ADVANCED Info Service (AIS) claimed earlier this week that it had secured 800,000 users for its 3G-2.1GHz cellular service since its soft launch last month.

All of the 800,000 new users have to use call forwarding to AIS's subsidiary Advanced Wireless Network (AWN) because the number-portability capacity of all five operators is limited to 40,000 cases per day.

Somchai Letsuttiwong, chief marketing officer, said 1.7 million AIS users had applied to migrate to AWN. All of them are expected to be moved over to the thirdgeneration service on the 2.1 gigahertz spectrum this month.

AIS kicked off its 3G-2.1GHz service recently for the general public. It is targeting 10 million customers, both old and new, for the new service by year-end.

Hui weng Cheong, chief operating officer, said AIS had set a 70 billion baht budget for network expansion over a few years. It has about 5,000 base stations in main cities in 20 provinces in every region throughout the country. Every month at least 800 base stations will be installed to ensure coverage for 77 provinces this year and full coverage countrywide by next year.

Also, AIS recently launched a variety promotion package starting at 299 baht per month for 100 minutes of free calls and 500 megabits per second of throughput.

Somehai said some of AIS's packages might offer greater value in terms of services, such as faster data speed, and of applications, which account for more than a 15 per cent surplus from existing promotions.

"All new promotional packages are discounted more than 15 per cent from existing 2G service promotions," he said.

This week the National Broadasting and Telecommunications Commission (NBTC) asked all three 3G-2.1GHz operators to offer a 15 per cent discount for all new users.

Takorn Tantasit, secretarygeneral of the NBTC, said all of the new 3G licensees had to comply with the commission's regulations on reducing their package prices. It will monitor them to check if they are following the regulation. Violators will be sent a warning letter. Repeat offenders will be fined and eventually ordered to cease operations.

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Life & style Running the gamut from A to A

WHEN I hit upon the not so original idea of listing an ABC of tropical plants suitable for Phuket's gardens, I accepted the

fact that there would inevitably be some overlap with previous articles. Just a different kind of taxonomy. But what I hadn't bargained for was the sheer volume of relevant plants. Uamporn Veesommia's cryptically named "Plant Materials in Thailand", the ultimate reference work on the subject has – including cultivars - no fewer than 1320 entries and the letter A alone has nearly 120 photographs of listed specimens. Of course, many are unsuitable for your average garden – forest trees, rarely seen or temperamental hybrids and so on, but the range is still impressive.

Some are therefore going to get only a brief mention, others none at all. The acid test, as always, will be - is it suitable for your Phuket garden?"

In the last ABC of plants, prominence was given to the varieties of allamanda (yellow cathartica) and dusky pink blanchetti, to popular annuals and to acalypha wilkesiana (red cat's tail). I did not include the large genus of acacias, or the giant alocasia whose enormous spade-shaped leaves are such a feature of Aglaia odorata or Chinese rice. Photo: Nampung marshy woodland

everywhere in Phuket. Or the most popular of all foliage shade plants, the aglaonema, which is now displayed in nurseries in shades ranging from silver and green to mottled pink.

Aglaia odorata is a bushy shrub, up to two meters tall and also known as the Chinese rice or perfume plant. A relative rarity here, I have a slow growing specimen in a large pot. With small globose and scented yellow flowers and glossy green foliage, it is a rewarding but temperamental shrub. Perhaps it is best used alone as a specimen plant. The adenium (desert rose or *chuan chom*) has received frequent treatment in these columns – after all, the fleshy trunked shrub has something of a




cult following amongst makes an ideal container plant for a sunny aspect. Among climbers, two

hardy souls merit special mention. One, the coral vine (antigonum leptopus or phuang chomphu) is a sturdy evergreen climber which needs no support, since it uses tendrils to attach itself to surfaces. With its masses of tiny deep pink flowers (one name is "hearts on a chain") it will quickly cover areas of bare wall or trellis and will tolerate dry conditions. Naturalized in parts of the island, it is a good choice for the inexperienced gardener. So too argyreia nervosa (in Thailand pak rabaat), a variety of morning glory which also spreads rapidly and produces attractive large trumpet-shaped pink blooms after the manner of its kind. Another easy vine to cultivate and readily available both in the wild and in nurseries.

Among small trees, the many varieties

Certainly an alpha choice. And one more manageable than alstonia is known for some reason as the devil tree. A quick grower, I have one in my garden which, after five years, is already too large for its surroundings. But it has attractive, umbrella shaped leaves, provides ample shade, and is often used in Phuket along avenues where less hardy trees would struggle to survive.

SILVANO Amolini of the Dusit Thani Laguna Resort is one of Phuket's preeminent chefs and is also a keen cyclist. Baz Daniel recently caught up with him for a ride around his Bang Tao Beach backyard, followed by some serious pasta-loading at La Trattoria Restaurant.

One of the great unsolved mysteries of the universe is the seemingly irrevocable link between pedaling and pasta. Certainly a good bike ride burns loads of energy and a fine dish of Italian pasta is a great way to replenish the bodily reserves that

all the leg-pumping and lungpanting have depleted.

But there's much more to it than

Here on Phuket the link seems particularly strong, as many of the island's top chefs are also keen cyclists. Perhaps packing on the pounds is an occupational hazard for chefs, being surrounded by so much great tucker 24/7. Certainly, many of Phuket's top chefs crow about the benefits that "getting on their bikes" brings them. And none more so than the doyen of Italian cuisine in the Laguna area -Dusit Thani's Executive Chef Silvano Amolini.

When I went to meet him, Silvano was the picture of good health, a svelte 44 year old,

bounding energetically from cooking range to lightweight Italian road bike in the blink of a microwave - but he says it was not ever thus.

Just a few years back, Silvano's bathroom mirror turned traitor. It began to display a decidedly overweight profile, indeed, one that many members of his chosen profession also seem to manifest. Then 'Madame Destiny' came calling.

The Patong Rotary staged an auction at the Dusit in aid of underprivileged children, and a bicycle just happened to be one of the prizes. Cursing his bathroom mirror and scales, Silvano seized his chance. He outbid everyone, collected the bike, and from then on became a passionate convert to pedaling and pumping as a way of life.

The turnaround in my lifestyle has been dramatic," he says.

"These days I am awake at 5:15 am and in the saddle by six doing my regular 38 kilometer ride along the back roads from the Laguna over to Nai Thon Beach and back.

"I ride three or four times a week with my training buddy and friendly rival Stefano Artosin, the executive chef from the Amanpuri

"We try to outdo each other at every sport we try and so we've formed a sort of Italian pasta pedaling parade as the sun comes up!"

You might think that the hectic life of an executive chef would make so many demands on Silvano's time and energy that training for this year's Laguna Triathlon in November, would be a nonstarter. But as he explains, the truth is quite the reverse.

'The strange thing is that since I started regular cycling I have so much more energy and I am more alert and able to handle stress far better than ever.

"Actually I would encourage any chef to get into cycling. It seems to be the perfect antidote for the stresses and strains, not to mention calories, of the job."

A recent stunning April evening saw us wheeling our bikes out of the Dusit Thani's grounds and setting off along the back roads that run along Bang Tao Beach and then heading north. Sleepy birds twittered, soi dogs

scratched and the sun threw its diminishing scarlet tentacles over the tops of the Casuarina trees as we sped (well Silvano sped and I tried to keep up) over the hilly back roads past Layan Gardens, Trisara Resort and then on down to the beautiful sands of Nai Thon Beach. There we had a Lycra-clad dip in the crashing spume as the sun continued its westward trajectory, as is its wont at that time of day.

Back at the Dusit we sat outside on their glorious sweep of Bang Tao Beach in front of Casuarina Restaurant and quaffed health booster drinks while the last vestiges of sunset called it quits and dipped below the horizon.

After a shower, Silvano and I regrouped in his spiritual home -La Trattoria Restaurant for some serious pasta reloading.

"Pasta, my friend, is like cycling. It should be simple, uncomplicated and honest. Just take the very finest Italian spaghetti with fresh tomato sauce cooked with a few drops of quality Italian extra virgin olive oil, fresh sliced garlic, chopped fresh chili and a good ripe tomato.

"Cut it all up by hand and dice in a few leaves of fresh basil, a sprinkle of fresh Parmesan cheese and there you have the perfect simple, energizing and delicious

"Serve it with a fresh a salad and a little cured ham and

> Mozzarella... oh, and a glass or two of good Chianti – because you deserve it."

So, we sat there admiring the dusk as she spread herself over the broad lawns of the Dusit Thani and enjoyed one of the most sensational meals I've ever

had. Was it my ravenous appetite from the ride? Was it the ambiance and atmosphere? Or was it the magic of the fine Chianti at work? I'll never know, but maybe, just maybe... at last I was beginning to appreciate the mystical link between pedaling and pasta.


smell of it.



Life & style Pirates of the Andaman

Looking Back

IN THE 1930s, the Thai government used the Andaman island of Tarutao as a prison to incarcerate the country's most undesirable criminals. When the Japanese Imperial Army brought the Second World War to the footsteps of the kingdom in December of 1941, the Thai government under Field Marshall Phibun Songkram sided with the invaders against the allied forces.

To a certain extent Phibun admired the Japanese and sympathized with their cause. In return for Thailand's friendship and cooperation, the Japanese had promised to return Thai

territories that had been seceded to Britain and France during the late 19th century. When British Malaya fell to the Japanese invaders in 1941, four Malay states, Terenganu, Kedah, Kelantan and Perlis, which used to be under Thai dominion, were returned

to Thailand as promised by the

Most of the information hereafter is based on a book written by Pongpol Adireksarn, a well-known Thai politician and author of several novels based on Thai history. Better known amongst westerners by his pseudonym Paul Adirex, in 1994 Pongpol wrote a book called The Pirates of Tarutao, based on actual events that happened in the penal colony during the Second World War.

From 1942 onwards many allied prisoners of war were imprisoned on Tarutao Island on orders from the Japanese. Before the war started, food and supplies were regularly shipped to Tarutao from the mainland to sustain the prisoners and the wardens. When war broke out the British navy aggressively blockaded the Malay Peninsula, sinking any ships that dared to deliver supplies to their enemy. As the war dragged on supplies on Tarutao Island began to diminish. Food and medical rations were reduced. Prisoners of war, common criminals and wardens, began to starve alike. The prison system soon began to break down.

During that time there may have been more than 10,000 inmates detained on Tarutao Island. According to Pongpol many high profile political

prisoners had already been removed from the island and transferred to Koh Tao in the Gulf of Thailand, for fear that they may be liberated if the British captured Tarutao.

Out of hunger and desperation, the remaining prisoners took to begging from boats that carried supplies past the island. Guards and inmates were on their own fighting for survival. The number of deaths from starvation and malaria continued to grow day by day.

As the situation continued to worsen and it became clear that simply begging from passing boats was not going to sustain them for long, several inmates banded together and turned to piracy. Initially the inmates attacked boats in order to steal

> food m e d i c a l supplies.

But when it became apparent that the naval powers were too busy fighting each other to safeguard the high seas, the pirates became more audacious and violent. Many more inmates and even prison guards took


to piracy. Soon they began to attack ships indiscriminately, stealing all the cargo that the vessels carried. The prolonged war had carved out a huge black market for goods that were in short supply all over the region. they attacked the passing vessels, the pirates would plunder them of their valuable cargo. Often they would murder the passengers and crews. The boats were then set on fire and sunk to the depths of the sea.

The beautiful landscape of the island: coasts, estuaries, creeks, rivers and narrow channels served to conceal the deadly marauders. According to reports from passing vessels, travellers soon began to fear for their own safety when passing the archipelago as vicious rumors of pirate attacks began to spread throughout the region. Ships that traveled between Penang, Satun and Kantang were vulnerable when they came close enough to Tarutao Island. The pirates also began setting up land bases on Langkawi Island, just south of Tarutao, using motorboats as well as sailboats to intercept merchant vessels.

The war in the Pacific ended in September 1945. After Japan surrendered to the allies, peace returned to the high seas and blockades were lifted as

Malaya and Singapore returned the Thai and British navies con-British Navy about the unabated piracy problem in the Andaman Sea.

Between December 1945 and March 1946, the British Navy launched a large-scale operation to clear the Strait of Malacca of its pirate infestation. At first the British simply used patrol boats to accompany merchant ships along the trade route. But they soon began to actively intercept pirates on the high seas and engage them. British efforts soon drove the pirates back to their bases on Tarutao and Langkawi Islands. In March 1946 ships and over 300 troops stormed Tarutao Island in order to arrest the inmates and prison guards that were suspected of piracy during the war years. The raid turned violent and many pirates died in the ensuing fight.

When the joint British-Thai forces managed to secure the island again, order was restored and the inmates were returned to their former prison conditions. A new prison governor was also appointed to manage the prison. The penal colony would survive for another year or so.

The thick tropical forest soon grew to assimilate the prison facilities, the cells, the offices and the kitchens. It would be years before backpackers would venture out to find Tarutao Island again, and put it on the tourist map. By then most of the physical evidence of its horrific past had been erased by nature, leaving behind a clean slate to start over for what would become a very different future for Tarutao Island.

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

THE Navy League Phuket (NLP) is pulling out all the stops in preparation for this year's American Independence Day weekend celebrations, with a family picnic, live music and the grandest of air-shows on the cards.

To celebrate the USA's 237th birthday, the NLP will stage the unprecedented extravaganza in a carnival-like format on July 6 and 7 at the expansive Phuket Airpark in Pa Klok, Thalang.

Headlining the itinerary will be an airshow – the first of its kind in Phuket – that will feature aerobatic planes, hot-air balloons and a death-defying skydiving stunt, among other aviation spectacles never-before-seen on or over the island.

Other free-of-charge activities planned include ATV riding; swimming and kayaking on the on-site lake; and an array of games and contests. Those wishing to see Phuket from on high, can buy tickets for hot-air baloon and airplane rides.

"By far, this will be the biggest American Independence Day celebration that we've ever had here in Phuket," says NLP President Pat James.

In previous years, the NLP's Independence Day festivities in Phuket have been limited to small-scale, single-day family picnics.

"We're quite excited about this year, which happens to mark the 180th year of Thailand-USA relations." he added.

Thai-American relations were officially kick-started in 1833, with the signing of the Treaty of Amity and Commerce, a document that, to this day, still provides nationals from both countries special privileges in the other's jurisdiction.

And what American picnic would be complete without authentic American food and beer? Living up to the spirit of the occasion, participants can look forward to a live jazz band, fireworks, and an all-American chilli cook-off, with food and drinks to be served on a pay-as-you-go basis throughout the festival.

This and much more which will be on offer during the two-day event, with activities starting at 10am and running well into the night on both days.

All are welcome – Thai, American, and anyone else wishing to join in on the festivities.

General admission is free, as is parking for up to 400 cars. VIP parking for up to 40 vehicles will also be available for a small fee. All proceeds from the event will be used to fund charitable initiatives, as directed by the NLP.

All about the NLP

The Navy League Phuket (NLP) is a local group (officially named Thailand Southern Seaboard Council) which is part of the larger Navy League of the United States.

This organization was founded in the United States in 1906 with the support of then-President Teddy Roosevelt to provide assistance to men and women serving at sea on US military and merchant ships.

The NLP is a non-profit organization with membership open to all nationalities. In fact, 90 per cent of current members are not even American and none are active duty servicemen, in order to avoid any conflicts of interest.

The NLP plays an important role with US Navy ships when they make a rest stop in Phuket during what is often an eight-month deployment away from their home ports in the US. The NLP assists in many ways, such as providing all visiting sailors and Marines with maps of Phuket along with suggestions of what to see and where to go.

Additionally, the NLP arranges Community Service projects (COMSERV) and coordinates putting between 20 and 40 of a ship's crew members side-by-side with local Navy League members and other community volunteers to help with various community improvement projects.

These have included such projects as rebuilding a school playground; painting a wall at an orphanage; improving a stream bank against erosion and repairing much needed hospital equipment.

When a large ship such as an aircraft carrier arrives here, the NLP may complete 10 or 12 such projects. To date, Navy League COMSERV guru Brad Kenny has successfully initiated more than 100 projects that have required many thousands of volunteer-donated man-hours, all for the greater Phuket community.

Star Trek II: Into Kirk-ness

NEXT week sees the release of the latest Star Trek movie. Into Darkness, the sequel to JJ Abrams reboot of the original TV

Mr Abrams came in for an awful amount of stick for taking on the Trekkies golden calf, particularly after he admitted to not being a fan of The Original Series (TOS).

Despite a few exceptionally large plot holes (worm-holes, more like) and completely ignoring some of Gene Roddenberry's significant Trek tenants, he did manage to pull off quite a cool movie that won over all but the most die-hard Trekkies.

In the process – more by desire than design – he created a catalyst that would allow a whole new series of adventures to begin in an almost brand new Trek universe. Not bad, Mr Abrams, not bad at all.

Then comes the sequel, which Abrams and his demonic writing crew of Roberto Orci, Alex Kurtzman and Damon Lindelof could just as easily have called: Star Trek Revenge ON the Nerds, because *Into Darkness* is packed with one-liners and favorite quotes from TOS and the original cast movies, but almost all quoted by the wrong characters.

Hah! Take that fan-boys.

On top of which, rather than taking the opportunity to "plough onto places where no starship movie has gone before", the team decided to slap the new cast with a well-worn old enemy. And, just in case you are in any doubt as to who it might be, up pops Leonard Nimoy's alternate-universe Spock to bang that nail deep into your noggin.

On the plus side, new Kirk's rather annoying, unremitting arrogance in the first movie is handled like a slap across Chris Pine's smug mug, allowing the character to grow just a wee bit.

Meanwhile, Zachary Quinto is so pedantically logical he would surely be channeling a young Mr Nimoy were the original Spock actually dead rather than reduced to a video phone call in this episode. But everyone else, from Zoe Saldana's Uhuru to Karl Urban's Doctor McCoy, gets barely any more screen time than in their first outing, because all those other fun crew members are really just foils for the "Kirk Grows" storyline.

In TOS, Kirk usually had McCoy and Spock, like opposing angels standing on either shoulder, to help direct his choices, but new Kirk's ego far outstrips that of his small-screen predecessor (yeah, I can't be-

lieve I wrote that either). With Into Darkness, as with the 2009 movie, Chris Pine's Kirk is shaped by his adversaries.

Ah, but what an adversary this time out. Played by the brilliant Benedict Cumberbatch, our villain of the piece is a dark, brooding man with a serious grudge against Starfleet. As with many past Trek villains, Mr Cumberbatch manages to steal what little of the show he is in, but being such a consummate actor he does so with barely a flair of the nostrils nor much scenery chewing - and is all the more sinister for it. It's just a shame he had to recreate an old adversary instead of being allowed to shape a brand new nemesis.

Originals are rarely as good as we remember, nor tangibly better than the reboots. Into Darkness is a fair Trek romp, but Team Abrams should have been brave enough to push forward with their new universe and perhaps taken the four years between films to actually watch the original series. Then they could have done more with this sequel than just re-tread old TOS with new tech.


THE Sports Authority of Thailand has confirmed that a six-kilometer Formula One circuit will be created near the Royal Thai Naval Dockyard in Bangkok, possibly with the main stands in the Chao Phraya river. There are plans for an inaugural F1 night race in 2015. Red Bull is a keen backer. Interestingly, the Malaysian GP at Sepang is probably up for renewal in 2015, so Bangkok may be looking to replace Kuala Lumpur.

Sepang has been criticized for the rubbish said to be littered all over the place. But more importantly in 2008, Sepang announced its aim to become F1's second night race from 2009, to fit in well with European TV schedules. However, the organizers later confirmed that they would not stage a night race, but a late-afternoon one. The 2009 Malaysian Grand Prix did indeed adopt a late afternoon start, which proved disastrous. Heavy rainfall and poor drainage ended the race on Lap 33. There have been plenty of other problems, including a very late start in 2012. So Sepang is vulnerable and Bangkok may have timed a rival bid very well.

In other news, Maria de Villota is set to return to the F1 paddock in Spain for the first time since her awful accident in England. I am sure the brave and glamor-

ous Marussia test-driver will be a big hit, sporting a piratical eye-patch. And Bernie Ecclestone is planning to team up two partners to buy the Long Beach Grand Prix and reinstall F1 there from 2016, 33 years after the last race in Southern California.







The track is well known to all teams because of the time spent there during winter testing. The 4.655km Circuit de Catalunya is a medium downforce, medium engine demand track, and a lot of engine and chassis

decisions are based around it. Catalunya has always been a difficult circuit for overtaking. But the introduction of a second DRS zone will help. The undulating nature of the track stresses every component of the engine. If engines are going to blow, this is a circuit that encourages it.

during the weekend, so a good set-up is a challenge. The track layout, with its high average speed, is hard on tyres, and this is likely to prove crucial. A variety of low and medium speed corners push engines in the lower rev ranges, particularly in sector three, but half of the track is taken at full throttle.

The longest full throttle is the pit straight. This allows a fully charged KERS to be deployed twice as the KERS energy counter resets on the start/finish line. A double KERS release also puts a lot of stress on the KERS cooling system, so look out for a few failures.

Pirelli has a revised version of their hard tyre for Spain; closer to the 2012 tyre. It has a wider working temperature window but delivers less. This should provide an even wider variety of race strategies than before. The medium tyre will be significantly faster and well suited to qualifying. The hard tyre will be the preferred race tyre.

I would expect to see Renault engines doing well here – Lotus, Red Bull, Williams and Caterham. So I believe we will see a Lotus on the podium, and maybe two. A Red Bull should be there too.

Traditionally teams bring upgrades to this race. Force India has come tantalisingly close to a podium finish this season; could Catalunya do it for them? Williams will have a number of upgrades, and since they won here last year, they may pull another rabbit out of a helmet.

Can McLaren squeeze a podium finish? They are playing down their strength, but who knows if Jenson Button can smooth his way through? I doubt if Mercedes or Sauber has a winning package.

So it's set to be exciting.

The Premier League champions confirmed on Wednesday that Ferguson, 71, would step aside at the end of the season.

He also steered the club to two Champions League triumphs and FIFA's Club World Cup. Ferguson will move upstairs to join the Premier League club's board of directors.

Following is his statement in full: "The decision to retire is one that I have thought a great deal about and one that I have not taken lightly. It is the right time.

"It was important to me to leave an organization in the strongest possible shape and I believe I have done so. The quality of this league winning squad, and the balance of ages within it, bodes well for continued success at the highest level whilst the structure of the youth set-up will ensure that the long-term future of the club remains a bright one.

"Our training facilities are among the finest in global sport and our home Old Trafford is rightfully regarded as one of the leading venues in the world.

"Going forward, I am delighted to take on the roles of both Director and Ambassador for the club. With these activities, along with my many other interests, I am looking forward to the future.

"I must pay tribute to my family, their love and support has been essential. My wife Cathy has been the key figure throughout my career, providing a bedrock of both stability and encouragement. Words are not enough to express what this has meant to me.

"As for my players and staff, past and present, I would like to thank them all for a staggering level of professional conduct and dedication that has helped to deliver so many memorable triumphs. Without their contribution the history of this great club would not be as rich.

International Sport Genia happiest with Cooper

AUSTRALIA scrumhalf Will Genia has dropped the strongest possible hint to coach Robbie Deans that he would prefer to play alongside Queensland Reds team mate Quade Cooper against the British and Irish Lions.

Genia is a nailed-on certainty for selection and could captain the side for the three tests in June and July, while flyhalf Cooper's international prospects have been up in the air since he spoke of the Wallabies' "toxic" environment last year.

Only two years ago, the pair combined to scythe through a succession of Super Rugby defenses as the Reds won the southern hemisphere's annual provincial competition for the first time.

They then teamed up for the national side to help Australia win the Tri-Nations for the first time in a decade, although they were less successful at the 2011 World Cup in New Zealand where the Wallabies finished third.

Both have since had knee reconstruction surgery and it is only in the last few weeks that they have been able to put together a sustained run of starts together.

Genia admitted the combination was still some way short of its very best but was quite clear who he preferred standing outside him in the number 10 shirt on match day.

"I love playing with Quade," Genia, who has played with Cooper since their schoolboy days, told reporters in Brisbane on Tuesday. "We've got a long relationship. We've played together for a long time - I really enjoy that combination.

"More than anything it is a trust thing.

In whatever decision each makes we back hitting two team mates and is more likely and support each other."

The flyhalf position looks to be one of the trickiest for coach Deans to fill, especially since he has made it clear he will not want to blood untried players in what he considers the ultimate test in international rugby.

That would seem to rule out the likes of in-form but uncapped ACT Brumbies Matt Toomua and Christian Lealiifano, as well as former sevens skipper Bernard

Kurtley Beale finished last season as incumbent in the position but has just returned to action after being banned for to be preferred at fullback.

Like Beale, Berrick Barnes played both flyhalf and fullback for the Wallabies last year and filled the playmaker role in all three tests as Australia swept Wales 3-0 in the June series.

The 26-year-old, who offers a more orthodox and structured option than Cooper, is short of match practice having just been declared fit after missing six weeks with a broken wrist he sustained in his only match of the season.

Equally versatile, and some would argue more talented, is James O'Connor but he

has mostly been used in the back three by Deans and has played just one test at flyhalf.

That leaves Cooper, who has started 27 times in the Wallabies number 10 shirt, as by far the most experienced flyhalf available.

Regardless, the mercurial 25-year-old was left out of a 30-strong squad for a planning camp for the Lions tour last month and Deans has been less than effusive when discussing him.

There is also a school of thought centered mainly but not exclusively on his homeland of New Zealand - that Cooper has been "found out" by international defenses and will never be the same threat he was in early 2011.

Adding to the doubts surrounding him is the fact that Cooper stands at fullback when the Reds are defending – a dispensation Deans is thought unhappy to continue at international level.

The first 25-man Wallabies squad for the Lions series will be named on May 19 with a further six players added when the Super Rugby season pauses for the international break.

Eschewing the outspokenness of last year, Cooper seems happy to let his performances for the Reds do the talking as he bids for a place in the party.

"It all depends on what the coach and the selectors are looking for," he said in Brisbane on Tuesday.

"Personally I am doing my best to work with Will, get the best out of each other and the Reds - I am not looking further

Senior Monty to compete in US full time

BRITAIN'S former world number two Colin Montgomerie repeatedly resisted the lure of the PGA Tour during his prime but now says he intends to compete full-time in the United States on the Champions Tour for players aged over 50.

The Scotsman, who won a record eight order of merit titles on the European Tour between 1993 and 2005, will be eligible for the senior circuit after his 50th birthday on June 23.

"I look forward now in many ways to starting a new life, a new chapter of my life to come over here now," Montgomerie told reporters on Monday before he was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in St. Augustine, Florida.

Montgomerie said he was often tempted at the idea of playing full-time in the United States occasions by former PGA Tour commissioner Deane Beman and current head Tim Finchem to come over.

Montgomerie became one of the first British golfers to attend a U.S. college, earning a degree in business management at Houston Baptist University in May 1987 before he decided to embark on a career as a playing professional.

However, he opted to leave the US to play full-time on his home European Tour where he piled up 31 titles and clinched the order of merit crown for a record seven consecutive years from 1993-99.

"Seven in a row, that was something that I look back on and realize how special it was," said Montgomerie, who also compiled a stellar record in the biennial Ryder Cup team competition where he

"So I'm probably most proud of that. But I look back at my career and raising the Ryder Cup as captain in 2010, to regain the Ryder Cup from the victory that the States had in 2008, was a very proud moment.

"It's funny because I never hit a golf shot that week. In terms of proud moments without hitting a ball, then it has to be raising the Ryder Cup."

Singapore to host women's tennis championships

SINGAPORE will host the glittering annual finale of the women's tennis season from 2014 until 2018, the WTA said on Wednesday.

The Southeast Asian city-state beat Tianjin in China and Mexico's Monterrey for the right to stage the S\$6 million (3.14 million pounds sterling) WTA Championships after Turkey's Istanbul ends its three-year stint in October.

"Your sensational city, the amazing city of Singapore, has won the right to host the WTA Championships for the next five years from 2014," WTA chairman and chief executive Stacey Allaster told reporters.

Allaster called the agreement a record breaker and "the largest and

most significant WTA partnership in our history".

The season-ender is the most prestigious women's tennis event outside the four grand slam tournaments – the Australian, French and US Opens plus Wimbledon.

The top eight singles and doubles pairs over the season qualify for the event which was won last year by American world number one Serena Williams. Russian pair Maria Kirilenko and Nadia Petrova took the doubles title.

The hosting rights are a major coup for Singapore, which has not held a top level tennis event since the 1999 Heineken Cup on the men's ATP Tour. Lower ranked challenger events and exhibition tournaments

have struggled to attract crowds.

The event will take place at the Sports Hub complex, which is due to be finished by the first quarter of 2014 at a cost of S\$1.3 billion.

The impressive complex will feature a 55,000-seater stadium with retractable roof, a 13,000 indoor stadium, aquatics center and water sports center. Reuters






In a tight first half, chances for both teams were hard to come by.
