MULTI-MILLION BAHT SEA GYPSY CENTER DESERTED

THE long-awaited Sea Gypsy Cultural Center, slated to open at the end of 2012 at a budget that ballooned from 2 million to 5.4 million baht, has deteriorated into a derelict shell of a building that has become a shelter for the homeless.

The promised library, exhibition spaces and native handiwork demonstrations highlight-

ing the millennia-old culture of the Urak Lawoi sea gypsies now living on Koh Sireh never arrived. Instead, there are mattresses for those still sleeping under the stars.

Located on a small nondescript soi at Laem Tukkae, out of sight from the beach where tourists board speedboats for day trips to the islands, the unoccupied multi-million baht center has fallen into disrepair: roof panels have fallen off, a mattress lies under a supporting structure and another floats in a pond.

A takraw court has been set up on the grass at the entrance.

The center never opened because it was not completed when it was transferred to the Rassada Municipality in May last year, said Dachakanee Leelanon, Rassada Municipality Chief Administrative Officer.

"It was transferred to us before it was finished and we don't have enough money...

Officials rush to plug notorious Patong hole

OFFICIALS rushed to barricade a giant hole in Phang Muang Sai Kor Road in Patong this week after two motorbike riders found themselves over their heads in water and their motorbikes submerged at the bottom of a pit about two meters deep.

Unknown to the unlucky motorists, the hole was part of the works in progress to install large storm drains under the road, the entire 2km length of which remains under construction.

The "pit" – marked with one Reduce Speed sign and one freestanding steel rail barrier measured at least two meters deep, several meters across and about 10 meters long.

"After hearing what happened to the two motorcyclists on Sunday, I called in the relevant officers and the construction company [responsible for installing the drains and resurfacing the roadl.

"I reiterated the need to install more safety features, such as lights and signs. I apologize for this problem, which has caused physical and property damage," said Teeraporn Jirarattanakorn, Director of the Department of Rural Roads Phuket office.

By Wednesday, more sections of the large storm drains had been lifted into the trench and the large gaps beside the drains had been filled in with earth.

The entire hazard was also blocked off by a battery of concrete barriers and safety signs to ensure no other unsuspecting motorists fell into the same prob-

Mr Teeraporn pointed out that the long-awaited improvements to

Phang Muang Sai Kor Road are far behind schedule.

"The road was scheduled to be paved by December 19 [last year], but the work is only 40 per cent complete. It should be 60 to 70 per cent complete by now," he

"On June 28, Kosin Pittayavestsoonthon, the Director of the Bureau of Road Construction, will come from Bangkok to inspect the progress made," he added.

...to complete it," he said.

"It needs to be landscaped. That will cost two to three million baht, and we don't have the money.

"The Department of Public Works has agreed to finish the project. Right now, we are just looking after the structure. We have a security guard who keeps the place tidy,"

There is one other major obstacle to opening the cultural center: the rate of development in the area.

In May 2012, the center was described by Mr Dachakanee as one attraction among many that would contribute to the development of Koh Sireh.

"Koh Sireh has been neglected for so long, but Mayor Phudit Raksaraj has a plan to bring this part of town back to life. He

wants to develop Koh Sireh into an important tourist attraction," he said at the time.

Now, however, it appears that the cultural center will not be leading the way towards development but instead will need to wait for other development in the area to rise before it can open.

"We are waiting for the renovation of the Baan Laem Tukkae area and will officially open the whole area at the same time to promote Koh Sireh as an important Phuket attraction," Mr Dachakanee told the

On the mayor's list of developments as stated last year were an artificial beach, a musical fountain in the sea and a viewpoint on the hill behind Koh Sireh temple.

The proposal for the center – said to be the first of its kind in Asia – was first announced in 2009 as part of a plan to preserve and exhibit the life and culture of Urak

Lawoi sea gypsies.

Two million baht was provided for the construction of the center by the Phuket Provincial Public Works Office, and the remaining 3.4 million baht came from a financial stimulus package launched under the government of Prime Minister Abhisit Vejjajiva.

One local resident who declined to be named expressed her disappointment.

"It was supposed to open last year but it seems like it will never be finished, it just stays there without any further construc-

"The officers said that will be exhibitions and tourist attractions in Koh Sireh, but that seems like an imagination project," she said.

"You can see teenagers using the car park of the cultural center to play takraw in

DJ Doris out of ICU after motorbike fall

PAUL Norris, Phuket's renowned "DJ Doris" on Phuket Island Radio 91.5FM, is out of intensive care after suffering a head injury in what is believed to have been a motorbike accident in Patong early last Saturday morning.

He was rushed to Patong Hospital by rescue workers. However, he remained unconscious and was transferred to the better equipped Vachira Phuket Hospital in Phuket Town, and then later moved to Bangkok Hospital Phuket.

"The great news is he is out of ICU and now is in his own room at Bangkok Hospi-

PAUL Norris, Phuket's renowned "DJ tal Phuket," Byron Jones of 91.5FM re-Doris" on Phuket Island Radio 91.5FM, is ported on Facebook on Tuesday.

"He looked so much better and was sitting up in bed. He is in a lot of pain with fractured ribs and a broken collar bone. The ear specialist is due to see him today," Mr Jones said.

"Thank you everyone for all your kind wishes, text messages, etc. We have been reading them out to him each day," he added.

Mr Norris was due to undergo a physical assessment on Wednesday.

"If all goes well, he could even be

released to continue his recovery at home by Thursday," Mr Jones told the *Gazette*.

When the rescue crew recovered Mr Norris from Phang Muang Sai Kor Road, he had no identification on him.

Capt Pathapee Srichai of the Patong Police told the *Gazette* that police were not treating the incident as suspicious.

"It seems no other vehicles were involved in the accident. We received a report that a man was injured after falling off his bike... and we called the Kusoldharm Foundation," Capt Pathapee said.

Raid halts hotel room abortion

POLICE raided a hotel in Krabi province last week and arrested a former nurse who was about to perform an abortion.

Officers apprehended Prapak Thiparat, 67. The woman had already been prepared by Mr Prapak to undergo the procedure. Her male companion was standing beside her.

"I have been performing illegal abortions for over two years," Mr Prapak told the press at Ao Luek Police Station. He admitted to performing more than 20 abortions in that time.

"When police entered the hotel room, they found Mr Prapak in possession of 26 syringes of varying sizes, three used syringes, a jar of Vaseline, 11 vials of liquid antibiotics, five bags of antibiotic tablets and other equipment used for performing abortions," said Ao Luek Police Deputy Superintendent Sukkasem Nakornwilai.



Prapak Thiparat, 67, confessed to performing more than 20 illegal abortions over the past two years.

Mr Prapak, 67, said he had worked as a male nurse at a hospital in Nakhon Sri Thammarat for many years.

"I have seen doctors perform curettage and sterilization as common practice. After I retired, I came back to Krabi and I used the knowledge I had gained to perform abortions," he said.

Mr Prapak explained that he performed many of the abortions in hotel rooms or at guesthouses.

"People learned about my ser-

vice through word of mouth. I do not have a clinic," he said.
"I charged 1,500 baht per

"I charged 1,500 baht per month of the fetus's gestational age. In the abortion I was about to conduct before I was arrested, the fetus was four months old, so I charged them 6,000 baht," Mr Prapak said.

Mr Prapak was charged with illegally operating a medical center, dispensing medication without a license and attempting to perform an abortion.

"The suspect accepted all charges," Col Sukkasem said.

"At this stage, we can only charge him with attempting to perform an abortion. We are still investigating the other abortions he confessed to," he added.

Police questioned the couple.

"They said they were not ready to have the baby, so they decided to have an abortion. However, they were both released as they have not broken any laws," Col Sukkasem said.

Newborn dumped, found dead in trash

A NEWBORN boy with a rubber band twisted tightly around his neck was found dead in a pile of rubbish in Rawai on June 14.

The baby, estimated to have been dead for over 24 hours, was spotted by municipality trash truck driver Sutham Kansuwan on Soi Suksan 1.

"We noticed a black plastic bag covered by a red shirt that smelled foul... We opened the bag and were shocked to see the tiny hand of a dead newborn baby – we immediately called the police," he said.

"We believe the mother was not ready to raise the child, so she dumped it," said Pol Lt Col Jumroon Plaiduang.

"We are now searching for the mother," he added.

Police warn of attacks, violent teenage gang bike thieves

POLICE are urging motorists to exercise caution when travelling alone late at night in the Thalang area after a man was kicked off his motorbike while in motion by a gang of youths who then stole the bike late on June 14.

Chatmongkol Sukmak, 17, was riding home from Phuket Town at about 11pm when a gang of youths on three motorbikes rode up alongside, said Capt Patiwat Yodkwan of the Thalang Police.

"As he was passing Wat Tha Ruea, they surrounded him and blocked him in...

"Two of them kicked Mr Chatmongkol's motorbike, knocking him to the ground. They grabbed his bag, which had his wallet and his phone inside, and took his bike," he said.

Mr Chatmongkol suffered only slight injuries in the fall.

"We are checking CCTV footage in the hope we can gain some clues in order to catch the perpetrators," he added.

Man crushed as storm topples stage marquee at Saphan Hin

PHUKET Town motorbike taxi driver Muhammad Poksakul, 62, died of head trauma after strong wind toppled a marquee covering the stage at Saphan Hin on Monday night.

"A strong gust of wind pulled down the awning covering the stage. As it collapsed, scaffolding knocked a large stack of speakers about 10 meters high onto Mr Muhammad, knocking him to the ground," said Capt Udom Petcharat of Phuket City Police.

"It seems he died instantly," he said.

Meanwhile, across town at a housing estate on Palien Road, strong wind brought a large tree down onto eight units of terraced houses.

No injuries were reported in the incident.

"Residents were evacuated to safe houses and we will send officers to inspect the damage and to estimate what repairs need to be made," explained Tawatchai Thongmung, the chief administrative officer at Phuket City Municipality.

V-Phuket protesters brave Scuttled stormy weekend weather

HUNDREDS of V-Phuket protesters, wearing their iconic Guy Fawkes masks, braved the strong wind and lashing rain in Phuket Town last Saturday to continue their protest against the Pheu Thai government under Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra.

The rally in Phuket was held in concert with other "V for Thailand" protests in at least 22 provinces, as well as in Bangkok.

While several hundred protesters found seats in the covered area provided, many others braved the elements outside.

The protest held at Saphan Hin followed protests the week before, sparked by Deputy Prime Minister Plodprasop Suraswadi's comments that Phuket would not receive an international convention and exhibition center (ICEC) unless islanders voted for Pheu Thai.

Keeping a close eye on the protest was Phuket City Police Superintendent Sermphan Sirikong and fellow officers.

Many popular figures were on stage to present their opinions.

"An ICEC is very important to


Phuket. The province earns a lot of money for Thailand and helps a lot of Thais make a living. Many people from across the country come to Phuket to work," said wellknown anti-Pheu Thai government and anti-Thaksin spokesperson Kaewsan Atipo.

"Deputy PM Plodprasop made a comment that 'he was not in the mood' to build an ICEC in Phuket.

I have no idea what he was thinking... Not building an ICEC in Phuket would cost Thailand a lot of revenue," he said.

Jittakorn Bushaba, who joined a V-Phuket rally on June 9, urged Phuket people to maintain pressure on the government in order to have Deputy Prime Minister Plodprasop removed from office.

THREE Royal Thai Navy vessels have been scuttled in Krabi Province to provide superstructures for artificial reefs as part of the province's bid to create underwater learning centers for divers and boost the Andaman province's tourism industry. The Gazette's Irfarn Jamdukor reports.

THE ships are designed to function as both artificial reefs human-made underwater structures usually created to promote marine life – and marine learning centers.

"We expect to establish a museum about the wrecks and local marine environment onshore. However, there are no educational signs set up yet," said Boonnam Chuyradom, an assistant chief of Hat Noppharat Thara – Mu Ko Phi Phi National Park.

The promotion of marine

diversity expected e n c o u r a g e people of all walks of life and all ages to have a greater awareness of marine resources and pursue out-of-water learning opportunities about Thailand's marine systems, he said.

"We believe the project will increase our current visitor rate by 5,000

tourists per year and will bring in an additional revenue of 10 million baht per year," he added.

ARTIFICIAL REEFS

Artificial reefs tend to develop in relatively predictable stages.

First, where an ocean current encounters a vertical structure, it can create a plankton-rich upwelling that provides a reliable feeding spot for smaller fish, which draw in pelagic predators. Quickly following are other creatures seeking protection within the reef or wreck. Shortly thereafter, opportunistic predators such as barracuda appear. Over the years, coral frags begin to take hold and eventually the site will hit an equilibrium point with the environment.

THE SHIPS


The three Navy transport ships Talibong HSZP 766; Varee HSZB 762; and Kolam HSZO 765 had been in service for more than 48 years before they were sunk on April 20, Kiratisak Phugaoluan Mayor of Krabi Provincial Municipality explained.

The ships took part in many natural disaster rescue missions, as well as efforts to help the American Navy quell pirate activity off the Gulf of Aden in 2010 and 2011, Paitoon Panchaiyaphum, director of the Phuket-based southern regional office of the Marine and Coastal Resources Conservation Department, said.

The fleet the ships were part of most notably provided service during Typhoon Gay in the Phil-

ippines and also carried rice and basic necessities to the people in Somalia, as well as those facing flooding in Sri Lanka.

To reach their final resting place near Koh Yawasam in Krabi, the retired ships were stripped of their armaments and towed along the coast of Thailand from Ao Udom in Chonburi,

A forth ship, the 382-ton Luangkladkaew, will also be sunk, near the famous day-trip diving destination of Koh Phi Phi.

DIVE SITES

The ships' hulls, resting on the sandy sea floor at 20 to 25 meters, were aligned so as not to be broadsided by any currents, which could potentially topple or move the ships from their current locations, said Mr Boonnam.

"The current can flow naturally and will not affect the ships. Also the sheer weight of these ships will ensure they remain steady and don't cause any harm to marine resources already established in the bay," Mr Boonnam said.

"The underwater learning center is special in that all the doors of the large ship have been left open to provide fish and other marine animals protection," he explained.

Though there is currently no dive site map of the wrecks, Mr

Boonnam assured the *Gazette* that there were plans to accurately map the ships, highlighting points of interest and providing necessary information to dive tourists.

TOURISM IMPACT

A major selling point in the project has been the hope of increasing tourist numbers by about 5,000 people a year explained Mr Boonnam.

Malene Jensen, General-Manger of Kon Tiki Diving and Snorkeling Center in Ao Nang, believed Mr Boonnam was right – the wrecks will help put Krabi diving on the map.

"For sure, being here in Ao Nang most people know that we are not a diving destination just like Phuket, Khao Lak and Koh Lanta. I mean we are struggling to get ourselves on the map so having these decommissioned warships here is going to give us more attention.

Ms Jensen pointed out that the presence of wrecks at depths within recreational dive limits is a major draw to dive destinations around the world.

The additional sites will help reduce the pressure on the 15

current sites, which are a short boat ride from shore. The relatively shallow existing sites near the mainland suffer from shrimp farming practices, which cause a fine layer of sediment to be deposited on the corals, explained Ms Jensen. "By adding new dive sites there are other places for the corals to grow, so I definitely think it's going to help," she said.

PROTECTION

The responsibilities of maintain-

ing and protecting the artificial reefs will fall onto the shoulders of the Marine and Coastal Resources Conservation Department; Hat Noppharat Thara – Mu Ko Phi Phi National Park; and Krabi Provincial Administrative Organization.

"We will frequently do biological diversity checkups at the site and ensure that the system is growing and thriving," Mr Paitoon said.

European ambassadors focus on marine safety

AMBASSADORS from 17 European nations highlighted marine safety problems in addition to three other critical issues plaguing Phuket's tourism industry in their meeting with the governor of Phuket on June 14.

At a press conference after the closed-door meeting, Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut explained that an "incremental" approach was being taken to addressing the

"The meeting today was held to identify several key issues affecting European tourists to Thailand and to come up with solutions to these problems," said European Union (EU) Ambassador to Thailand David Lipman, who led the 18-ambassador delegation.

A key factor in improving tourists' safety while in or on the water around Phuket is having tourists understand the warnings and safety information provided, Italian Ambassador Michelangelo Pipan pointed out.

"Having the same flag out all the time [indicating whether or not it is safe to swim] during the monsoon period, doesn't help. People disregard it," Amb Pipan said.

"Also, having beach guards issue inappropriate warnings causes problems of their own," he added.

However, Amb Pipan said the Governor has assured him that his office had called on local government agencies to boost maritime

"The maritime authorities, including the Marine Police, have been alerted to this problem [boat safety] and are taking action to

make it safer," the ambassador ter activities while on holiday, said.

"We are working with all the appropriate authorities in having the right agencies giving the right warnings to tourists, posting the right flags and making sure the right personnel are on the beaches," he said. "Hopefully, this will result in less deaths in the future."

Amb Pipan did recognize the Governor's comment that tourists are often determined to enjoy wasometimes at their own jeopardy.

"Many tourists come to Phuket specifically to enjoy the beaches or to go out on a boat. This can be problematic," Amb Pipan said.

Asked what confirmed action will follow the meeting, EU Ambassador Lipman said the quarterly meetings between the honorary consuls on the island and Phuket's top officials will resume in the near

we will share these concerns with other ambassadors and government officials in Bangkok to work together to come up with solutions," Amb Lipman said.

"We will also be meeting the Tourism Minister [Somsak Pureesrisak] on about June 28," he added.

Governor Maitri urged any tourists who find themselves in need of urgent assistance to call the Governor's Office directly.

Chinese tourist drowns on daytrip to Koh Racha Yai

with friends in Phuket drowned on Tuesday while on a day trip to Koh Racha Yai, about 25 kilometers south of Phuket.

Capt Wuttiwat Liang-boonjinda the Chalong Police named the victim as Li Ran, 28.

Ms Li was travelling with five friends who joined about 40 other tourists for the trip to Racha Yai Island, a popular tourist day-trip destination.

"The tour guide said he warned the tourists not to go swimming after eating lunch, but many of them went swimming anyway," he said.

Ms Li was soon experiencing difficulties due to the large waves and was dragged out into deeper

'When the tour guide saw her, she was already far from shore.

The guide grabbed a wave board and paddled out to get her, but it was too late," Capt Wuttiwat said. Ms Li's body was brought

back to Phuket.

Her friends, in tears, accompanied her body during the journey.

WHILE guns may be the weapon of choice for most bank robbers. one resourceful criminal managed to steal more than 200,000 baht from a branch of Bangkok Bank using something a little more innocuous: a bottle of orange juice.

Cops announced the arrest of Kittisak Rueankon, 42, on June 16 after they found him hiding out in a house in Phitsanulok.

Mr Kittisak had carefully chosen his moment to rob the branch, located at a Tesco Lotus in Muang Phitsanulok, waiting until there were only two members of staff present before going in.

On entering the bank, he pretended to be an ordinary customer, taking out a withdrawal slip and writing on it.

With a bottle of orange juice in his hand, he then walked up to one of the cashiers and handed her the slip.

On the paper, he had written "Sorry. Give me money. I'll spray acid [on you]." Then he opened the bottle and splashed the contents all over the terrified employee.

In the confusion, Mr Kittisak leaned over and grabbed 210,000 baht in cash from the counter before running out of the bank.

A civilian and a Lotus security guard gave chase, but failed to catch him.

He was later found by police and arrested. He will be charged with armed robbery.

Illegal elephants snuck past Tah Chat Chai checkpoint

THREE elephants were illegally smuggled into Phuket on June 17, making it across the Sarasin Bridge and through Tah Chat Chai checkpoint before finally being stopped in front of the Thalang Police Sta-

All nine men accompanying the animals were arrested.

The two trucks transporting the elephants were stopped after police received a 4am tip-off, said Thalang police case investigator Chatree Chuwichian.

"After we received the report from our informant, we set up a checkpoint in front of the police station and got in touch with the Phuket Livestock Office," he said.

"Sure enough, two trucks carrying three elephants came by, so we stopped them and investigated," he said.

Thanaruk Wanpoo, one of the nine men subsequently arrested, lives in Phuket.

"I was hired by someone named Mr Kao [Police did not reveal Mr Kao's full name] who is the owner of an elephant camp near Phuket's Big Buddha Hill. He paid me to go get three elephants in Phang Nga and bring them to Phuket," Mr Thanaruk said.

"I asked my relatives to accompany me to Phang Nga and help me get the elephants. We were hired for 12,000 baht," he said.

"I don't know where the three elephants came from. I just went

to the place Mr Kao told me to go to, put the elephants on the trucks with their three mahouts and drove to Phuket," Mr Thanaruk said.

Sa-ngad Khadphai, one of the mahouts, said that his father-inlaw owned the elephants and that each elephant had a "legal ticket" (identification document).

"I don't understand why I was arrested. I informed the relevant officers that we would transfer the elephants from Surin to Phang Nga and then Phuket," Mr Sa-ngad

"Me and my family live in Surin and work at an elephant show. We earn about 8,000 baht a month, which is not enough for our family. So when Mr Kao offered me 15,000 baht per month to bring our elephants down to Phuket, I agreed," he said.

The men have been charged with smuggling elephants into the province as they did not have the correct permits needed to bring the animals into Phuket in accordance with the Animal Epidemic Act BE 2499.

They have also been charged with forging the 'Guarantor of Animal Habitat' document, which guarantees the animals have a place to stay at their destination, said Capt Chatree.

Patong Police: New CCTV control rooms will boost tourist safety

THE push by Phuket authorities to increase tourist safety across the island has received a much welcome boost with Patong CCTV control rooms now up and running.

The new system, launched as part of the Patong Safety Zone initiative, displays footage from 32 high-quality police CCTV cameras and 300 private CCTV systems at three central locations, Patong Police Deputy Superintendent Akanit Danpitaksat confirmed.

"They are all connected to three control rooms in Patong: one at the Patong Police station, one at the Patong Municipality building and one at the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation at the Patong Municipality office," Lt Col Akanit said.

The police CCTV cameras were installed in crowded areas and places considered to be crime-prone, such as Soi Bangla, Sainamyen Road, Nanai Road and Kalim

"We are now asking private entities to provide us with access to any new CCTV cameras installed so we can all work together to ensure the safety of the public," Col Akanit said.

"If anyone is even considering committing a crime in Patong, know that you are being watched by us and our citizens – you cannot hide from us," he warned.

Mass tourism takes bullet

Senate Standing Committee blames island's rapid development for tourist woes

THE Senate Standing Committee on Tourism on June 13 highlighted a series of issues plaguing Phuket due to the rapid development of the province into a major center for mass tourism in Thailand.

"The growth of the tourism industry in Phuket is the source of many problems at its natural tourist attractions. Land and beach encroachment, as well as air and water pollution, are all serious concerns that affect the tourism image of the island," Senate Standing Committee on Tourism 2nd Vice-Chairman Pichit Kuandachakupt

Gen Pichit went on to point out that vendors harassing and taking advantage of tourists, as well as excessive numbers of beach chairs and umbrellas were also having a negative impact on tourists' experiences.

Nonetheless, Gen Pichit spoke highly of the province as a whole.

"Phuket has many beautiful natural tourist attractions. It is like a dream destination for both domestic and foreign tourists. Every year it generates a great deal of revenue for Thailand,"

The Minister rattled off a list of issues caused by the increase in numbers.

Insurgent names names of masterminds in Deep South conflict

A SUSPECTED insurgent has named some of the masterminds behind the bloody campaign of violence in the Deep South.

Sakariya Tohtayong, who was arrested by security forces in Pattani earlier this month, reportedly gave useful information about some of the most high-profile attacks in the troubled region in recent years.

They included the bombings at the CS Pattani Hotel and the Diana shopping complex, the robbery of a security van carrying 5.8 baht million in cash for a bank, and an attack on a grocery store in which six people, including a baby, were killed.

"His answers during the interrogation have allowed us to know who are the masterminds and who are members of the movement," Colonel Komkrit Rattanachaya, head of the 47th Paramilitary Regimental Taskforce, said.

The breakthrough came as talks between the Thai government and the Barisan Revolusi Nasional (BRN), one of the groups engaged in the conflict, entered their third round in Kuala Lumpur.

The BRN agreed to suspend attacks during the holy month of Ramadan.

But despite the previous two rounds of dialogue, the unrest in the Deep South has

Foreign ministry forced to defend 'crazy' diplomat

THE FOREIGN Ministry has been forced to issue a statement defending the first secretary of the Thai Embassy in Egypt after the female diplomat was accused of ferociously attacking an Egyptian woman in a Cairo hotel.

Thai Foreign Ministry deputy spokesman Jakkrit Srivali said Kakanang Amaranand had acted in "self-defence".

The alleged victim, Rana Ashraf, has filed a police complaint against Mrs Kakanang, Daily News Egypt reported.

Introduced through an Embassy colleague to a party of Egyptians in the Kempinski Hotel, Mrs Kakanang was allegedly very drunk and rude to the group from the start.

Mrs Ashraf's husband claims the "drunken lunatic diplomat" said Egypt was a "horrible place with horrible people".

Mrs Kakanang allegedly kicked Mrs Ashraf, angering her husband, who knocked her phone out of her hand.

Mrs Kakanang then attacked Mrs Ashraf's husband before launching a brutal attack on the woman, the man claims.

"She pushed her on the couch, kicked her over 5 times in the face and head with her heels, pulled her hair out, bit her until she bled and through all of this, my wife had let go. Whenever we tried to pull her off, she would bite or pull harder," said the husband.

The embassy has said it will investigate the incident.

Business tycoon murder investigation under fire

GOVERNMENT critics are questioning the police investigation into the murder of business tycoon Akeyuth Anchanbutr, whose body was found in Phatthalung earlier this month.

Mr Akeyuth was a prominent opponent of former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra, leading some to suspect his murder was carried out for political reasons, not merely financial gain, as police claim.

The Senate panel on human rights has called on the Royal Thai Police to remove Metropolitan Police Commissioner Lt Gen Kamronwit Thupkrajang as chief investigator on the case, pointing out that the officer was known to have had conflicts with Mr Akeyuth in the past.

Gen Kamronwit is also known to have close ties to Mr Thaksin.

Mr Akeyuth was abducted from his Bangkok home on the night of June 6, after being seen alive for the last time at a restaurant in the Saphan Khwai neighborhood.

His naked body was found buried in an orchard in Phatthalung's Muang district on the afternoon of June 12.

His 25-year-old chauffeur Santiparb Pengduang and suspected accomplices Chavalit Wunchum, 23, and Thiwakorn

Kuathong, 19, led police to the location where they had allegedly buried the body.

There were marks on the victim's neck showing he had been strangled, according to police.

On June 14, a fourth suspect handed himself in. Suthipong "Berm" Pimpisai denied killing the businessman, claiming he was already dead when he entered the van in which he was being held.

Police insist Mr Akeyuth was killed for 5 million baht, which he was reportedly forced to withdraw from a bank in Bangkok, some of which was later found in Mr Santiparb's possession.

Mr Akeyuth's lawyer, Suwat Apaipak, has told ASTV that he and the late businessman's family were certain the motivation was not theft as it has been made out to be. They believe the murder involved professional killers and included a "high-ranking military man who plotted the assassination".

Mr Suwat said he did not believe that Mr Santiparb could have contrived or carried out the elaborate plan alone.

Gas prices spark riots

INDONESIA's parliament paved the way on Monday for a jump in gasoline and diesel prices after months of delay that have undermined confidence in the government and the ability of Southeast Asia's biggest economy to continue growing rapidly.

The price rises – 44 per cent

The price rises – 44 per cent for ordinary gasoline and 22 per cent for diesel – will cut the government's costly fuel subsidies and could give support to the struggling rupiah after the central bank scrambled last week to prop up the currency as it was caught in an emerging market selloff.

After a 12-hour, often noisy session, parliament voted 65 percent in favor of a revised budget for the year, which includes cash compensation for the poor to help them cope with the higher fuel costs. President Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono had demanded aid for the poor before he would sign off on higher prices.

The surge in fuel prices, which will boost inflation and in turn could spark labor union wage demands, is testing Yudhoyono's already uneasy ruling coalition of political parties, which are increasingly focused on next year's general and presidential elections.

Outside parliament, police used water cannons to disperse demonstrators, among thousands holding protests in cities across the giant archipelago. There were scattered reports of violence.

"We reject the proposed cash handouts because it doesn't address the real issue of poverty," head of the largest labor union, Said Iqbal, told reporters.

National Police spokesperson Snr Cdr Agus Rianto said five protesters, six police and two journalists were injured in rallies in Ternate, North Maluku and Jambi. In Ternate, around 2,000 protesters clashed with local police as they tried to occupy the Baabulah Airport.

The mob, armed with slingshots, attacked police officers who responded by shooting rubber bullets.

"Six police were injured. There were also six civilians who sustained injuries from rubber bullets. among them was a journalist from local daily Mata Publik," Agus said in a press conference on Monday in Jakarta.

Ancient Angkor Wat city 'known since 1900s': researcher

THE lead archaeologist in a project studying medieval ruins in Siem Reap has issued a statement to clarify media coverage proclaiming the "discovery" of a lost city in the area, as researchers have known about the existence of the centuries-old city for decades.

The Sydney Morning Herald ran a "World Exclusive" last Saturday claiming that archaeologists had, "in a stunning discovery," uncovered an ancient buried city known as

Mahendraparvata on Phnom Kulen plateau, near Angkor Wat.

However, Jean-Baptiste Chevance, director of the Archaeology and Development Foundation and the project's lead archaeologist, said, "The way they put it together can make it feel very, very sensational."

"To be honest, it's not totally new – the technology was new – but most of the monuments were well-known," he said.

"It is an exaggeration to say a lost city has been found because if you're working in Cambodia you know it's been there since the 1900s."

What was exciting about the project, Mr Chevance said, was that by using Lidar technology – an airborne laser technology used to map features that may be indistinguishable on the ground – his team could clearly see a whole urban network linking the temples.

UN: Insecurity in Congo copper region concerning

SECURITY in Congo's coppermining heartland of Katanga is a "very serious concern" that must be tackled politically and militarily, the outgoing head of the UN peacekeeping mission said on Monday.

The Katanga province sits on some of the world's largest copper reserves.

In March, hundreds of rebel fighters attacked the Katangan capital of Lubumbashi and then surrendered following bloody clashes with security forces.

Obama sees Iran's recently elected as a hopeful sign

PRESIDENT Barack Obama said on Monday that Iran's election of a moderate as its next president is a sign that Iranians want to move in a different direction, but he was uncertain whether it would lead to a breakthrough over Tehran's nuclear ambitions.

Mr Obama has said the United States and its allies would be willing to hold talks with Iran over its nuclear program, as long as Tehran recognized that international sanctions would not be lifted unless Iran proved it is not building a nuclear weapon.

Saudi prince eyes world's big cities for tallest tower

SAUDI billionaire Prince Alwaleed bin Talal says he is looking at the world's largest cities, including Shanghai, Moscow, London and New York, as possible locations to build a mile-high skyscraper that would be the world's tallest building by far.

Opposition leader: Turkish protests expose hostilities

PRIME Minister Tayyip Erdogan's handling of Turkey's fiercest antigovernment protests in more than 30 years has exposed the extent of his authoritarianism and only entrenched hostility to his rule, the head of the main opposition party

The protests mark a "turning point" for Turkey and show the ruling AK Party is out of touch with a new "democratic generation" that makes up the bulk of the activists, Kemal Kilicdaroglu, chairman of the Republican People's Party (CHP), said in an interview with Reuters at the weekend.

An effort to block government plans to develop Gezi Park, a small green space in central Istanbul, began peacefully three weeks ago, but flared into running street battles. Riot police at the weekend used water cannon and tear gas to clear the park, where thousands had camped out.

"The intervention is a reflection on the street of the authoritarian state structure created by the AKP," said Mr Kilicdaroglu, 64, a bespectacled former accountant whom the Turkish press once nicknamed Gandhi for his passing resemblance.

"The use of excessive force has created resentment in society... (and) shows the demands for democracy and freedom are legitimate. If Erdogan continues with this conduct, the call for greater freedoms will grow."

The evacuation of Gezi Park was followed by a ruling party rally attended by hundreds of thousands of PM Erdogan's supporters, a show of strength seen as a response to weeks of street protests by his opponents.

"The underlying reason for dis-

proportionate force to disperse Gezi Park ahead of his meeting in Istanbul was to show power," Mr Kilicdaroglu said. "This is the mindset of a dictator."

PM Erdogan has rejected accusations of authoritarianism, saying he met protesters and offered to hold a referendum on the park's future as a compromise. He has said the environmental protest has been manipulated by "terrorists".

PM Erdogan also accused the

CHP of stoking the confrontation at Gezi to achieve what it has failed to do at the ballot box. The center-left CHP has been largely sidelined from government since the 1970s and now has just 134 seats in the 550-seat parliament.

Four people have died and more than 5,000 have been wounded, according to Turkey's Medical Association, in protests that have spread across the country and have rocked financial markets in this EU candidate nation.

PM Erdogan has made many democratic reforms, taming a military that toppled four governments in four decades, starting entry negotiations with the European Union, and forging peace talks with Kurdish rebels to end a three-

Per capita income has tripled in nominal terms and business boomed. But critics say his style, always forceful and emotional, has become authoritarian. He takes the current unrest as a personal affront.

Such large-scale protests in western Turkey have been rare since a brutal military coup in 1980 ended years of political strife that killed thousands.

Now protests threaten to pit secular, Western-oriented Turks against PM Erdogan's more religious, conservative supporters.

Only 15 per cent in a survey of 4,411 Gezi protesters by pollster Konda said they had joined the movement to protect the park's trees. Almost two-thirds of respondents said they were seeking greater protection of rights and freedoms.

Brazilians question status quo

AS MANY as 200,000 demonstrators marched through the streets of Brazil's biggest cities on Monday in a swelling wave of protest tapping into widespread anger at poor public services, police violence and government corruption.

The marches, organized mostly through snowballing social media campaigns, blocked streets and halted traffic in more than a halfdozen cities, including Sao Paulo, Rio de Janeiro, Belo Horizonte and Brasilia, where demonstrators climbed onto the roof of Brazil's Congress building and then stormed it.

Monday's demonstrations were the latest in a flurry of protests in the past two weeks that have added to growing unease over Brazil's sluggish economy, high inflation and a spurt in violent crime.

While most of the protests un-

folded as a festive display of dissent, some demonstrators in Rio threw rocks at police, set fire to a parked car and vandalized the state assembly building. Vandals also destroyed property in the southern city of Porto Alegre.

Around the country, protesters

waved Brazilian flags and chanted slogans.

The demonstrations are the first time that Brazilians, since a recent decade of steady economic growth, are collectively questioning the status quo.

Defense cuts 'hollowing out' European armies: US envoy

MOST European allies are "hollowing out" their armies as they slash defense spending, casting doubt on whether Europe can remain a viable military partner of the United States, the outgoing US ambassador to NATO said on Monday.

Many Western European countries have slashed defense spending in response to austerity induced by the 2008 financial crisis and the United States now accounts for nearly three-quarters of total NATO defense spending, Ivo Daalder

"Most European allies are hollowing out their militaries, jettisoning capabilities, and failing to spend their existing budgets wisely," he said in a farewell speech, hosted by the think-tank Carnegie Europe.

"As a result, the gap between

American and European contributions to the alliance is widening to an unsustainable level," he said. "The trends need to be reversed."

"Today, Europe's ability to serve as America's partner of first resort is diminishing," Mr Daalder said

Patong beachfront most expensive land

THE beachfront in Patong Bay comprises Phuket's highest valued roadside real estate, while the most expensive land plots in Phuket Town are valued only 7% less.

According to Phuket's official road and street-access land value summary covering 2012-2016, plots along Taweewong Road in Patong (the beach road), had been valued from 70,500 to 150,000 baht per square wa (sqw), which equates to 17,625 and 37,500 baht per square meter (sqm), respectively.

An official at the Phuket Land Office told the Gazette that the listing is utilized by the Phuket treasury department as well as the land registration office for "tax purposes".

The purpose of the list is to try and provide land title registration applicants with a consistent standard, the official said.

However, the official clarified that the prices do not necessarily reflect actual land market prices for any specific plots, and that the list only focused on public street side areas.

After Patong, the next four most highest valued roadside areas on the island are all in Phuket Town – off Rassada, Phang Nga, Yaowarat and Ranong roads, with plots along these roads valued between 60,000 to 140,000 baht per sqw, or a mere 15,000 to

35,000 baht per sqm.

The land official proposed that one primary reason Phuket Town land prices are relatively higher than other parts of the island, is because of its central location for business, history and culture.

To little surprise, Phuket's lowest valued public road access real estate is in Thalang district, covering most of Phuket's north, but not including Kamala, which is part of Kathu district.

Namely, all along the main drag of Thepkrasattri Road (highway 402), plot values range from 8,000-25,000 baht per sqw – or just 2,000 to 6,250 baht per sqm.

Although these rates are only a small fraction (about 11-14%) of those assigned to beachside property in Patong, land prices in Thalang are expected to continue to rise rapidly as main roads in the district become increasingly attractive to hotel and condo developers.

As for actual market prices, particularly in the island's rapidly expanding condominium market, the Gazette's property desk notes

that anything priced below 50,000 baht/ sqm for a 1.5mn baht 30 square-meter condo, for example, would generally be classified as a "low to lower-middle income" segment property.

And despite the higher price/ sqm for "shoe-box" units, it is not to say that buyers cannot find larger plots of one rai and up (1,600 sqm+) that actually do fall within the Land Department and Treasury valuation ranges namely, 3.4 to 10mn baht per rai in Thalang, or up to 56-60mn baht per rai in Phuket Town and Patong, respectively.

A quick search on the internet revealed that a plot of land with access to Jungceylon shopping complex and Soi Bangla, sized just over 1 rai, is on the market for 25mn baht (15,600 baht/ sqm)

Meanwhile, on the hill-top overlooking Kalim beach, a slightly-larger-than-one-rai plot with a sea view is going for about 28mn baht (17,000 baht/ sqm)

Another search found that there is a 36-rai plot of land along the bypass road hill for sale for 250mn

Siam Square most expensive for 8th straight year: AREA

THE Thailand Real Estate Infor- BTS skytrain stations. mation Center recently published expensively valued urban, commercial zones, which as usual, were all in the central part of Thailand's capital, Bangkok.

Published by the Agency for Real Estate Affairs (AREA), topping the list were plots in the shopping district that is centered around Siam Square.

The report notes that the survey zone for Siam Square also covers adjacent areas, including Mahboonkrong or MBK, Siam Discovery and Siam Paragon shopping malls, as well as the nearby zones next to the Chit Lom and Ploen Chit

ness district around Silom Road, which is followed by the bustling Bangkok China Town's Yaowarat Road in third.

With land values of Siam Square (and vicinity) plots this year expected to rise as high as 1.7mn baht per sq wa (425,000bt / sqm) by the year's end, the famous shopping district will be Thailand's most expensive area for the 8th straight year since surpassing China Town's Yaowarat Road in 2006.

With plots expected to be valued as high as 1.35mn baht

The second most expensive the end of the year, Silom will report about Thailand's most area in Thailand is the central busibe Thailand's second most expensive area for the 6th straight year since it matched Yaowarat in 2008, and then surpassed it the following year.

The decades-old cultural and traditional hotspot of Yaowarat road, is steadily in third with plots expected to be worth as much as 1,050,000 baht per sq wa, or 262,500 baht / sqm.

The AREA report anticipates land values around the central shopping district with access to the Siam, Chit Lom and Ploen Chit BTS stations, to rise up to 2 million baht per sqm by the end of 2015.

Big bang of luxury

WELCOME to rainy season in Phuket. It's Friday morning as I ponder the sound of rain pelting down on the roof and it feels almost as if I'm in Syria taking incoming fire. My life is that of a minimalist.

Give me a black t-shirt, shorts and a well worn pair of Sanuks. No watch, no jewelry, just an outdated Blackberry,

which I make no apologies for.

At times though, I long for more. My wife always berates me for not bringing an umbrella outside on rainy days. Like today, as I sit here in my office after the heavens opened up and doused me like a water cannon on the mean streets of Istanbul. I've changed my status on Facebook to "Soggy". Is more better? Or is more just more?

Asia remains out of step with the larger world. It always has, and probably always will. Maybe the date line has something to do with it, pulling an all-nighter is never a bad thing. Keeps you edgy, like playing with broken glass. Over in Hong Kong, Edward Snowden is doing long stretches without sleep, though, sadly, Gitmo looks to be on his horizon. Silence the lambs in a putabell.

But dammit, I'm here to talk about Asia's big bang of luxury and the tidal wave of "conspicuous consumption". A long time ago in the 19th century, economist Thorstein Veblen coined the term in his tome *The*

Theory of the Leisure Class. He somehow peaked behind the curtain of time to see what would evolve later in the

20th century and beyond into the burgeoning middle class, or as those more cynically inclined would call it; the consumer class.

Though when Veblen coined the term conspicuous consumption his critique was aimed more directly at the upper crust world of the "haves". For those with money, suddenly objects of desire become cars, houses, second houses, travel and the finer things in life. Sure there was a blip in the 1960s and certainly Mao, Lenin, Castro and Uncle Ho tried to derail the gravy train, but the wall of consumerism was built on solid foundations well before the new millennium and there has been no looking back.

Here in Thailand, the surge of the upper class and a groundswell in the middle class has changed the world we live in forever.

Without doubt the poster boy for this

episode is Steve Jobs, buy at higher prices, buy more and buy often.

Create the perception and feed the beast of consumerism. It's abjectly brilliant and I have to admit to owning an Apple MacBook Air, and yes my iTunes account is very active.

Phuket has its own class warfare, the ultra wealthy with their villas, mega yachts and private jets, and the aspirational emerging consumer class who love those Cs – cars, condos, country clubs, credit cards and smart cellphones.

Yet luxury remains a fickle giant, and though the island has garnered a massive inventory of high net worth individuals, the battle to stay on top is never an easy one. So much is being written about sagging infrastructure, mass tourism and chaos at the beaches. While the government and tourism leaders talk the talk of wanting high-end travelers; the changing world is seeing more a shift to smaller and less pricy.

To say Phuket has a split personality or is conflicted is a given. Cheap shoebox

condo hotels gather steam, alongside luxurious multi-million dollar ultravillas – can we see a merge of the tribes here and cater to the rich, the want to be rich and those on a budget? Tricky business. I spoke to someone who attended the trendy global chic travel show LE Miami and the feedback from the jet set is: that despite our Aman/Trisara/Andara/Sri Panwa foursome, the aisles were buzzing about Samui. Smaller, more exclusive, less crowded. Will the rich and famous leave us in our hour of need?

Probably not, as we have a mighty wind of new luxury brands opening hotels on the island over the next few years and Phuket is just such a strategic location. Yet on a broader canvas, conspicuous consumption now represents so much more than just real estate and travel – it's an insatiable appetite for more, faster, newer and glossier.

It's a different world we live in and I'm not entirely sure it's a better place. Except for iTunes of course; and MacBooks.

One rotten apple can spoil the whole barrel



AS OF the middle of June, the portfolios of many active managers of both mutual funds and hedge funds alike were badly under-performing the benchmark Standard & Poor's 500 index. In fact and despite a bull market that had seen the S&P index climb about 16% since the start of the year, over two-thirds of active managers were missing their benchmarks while active managers in general have had their worst performance since 1998. The major culprit?

Apple hit the US\$700 level around the middle of September 2012 amid talk that shares would reach \$1,000 by the end of the year or sooner. By the middle of June 2013, Apple had sunk to the \$430 level and was sinking the performance of many active fund managers along with it because they were overweight in its shares.

Moreover, of the 30 mostowned stocks by hedge funds, Apple was the only one to have delivered a negative performance for the first quarter, and as of mid-June, it looked set to be one of only several to deliver a negative performance for the second quarter. Bedsides Apple, the hedge funds have also found themselves saddled with portfolios concentrated in low-returning discretionary and information technology stocks rather than cyclicals which started to perform better in late spring.

In other words, the "smart money" crowd bet too many chips on Apple as well as on the wrong sectors. While you or I can easily move in or out of investments, because we aren't managing billion-dollar portfolios or positions, it's very difficult for a big fund to add to or unload a sizable (e.g. one million share) position in the wrong stock or sector without seriously impacting share prices. This is another reason active fund managers are lagging and will probably continue to lag major indices for some months as they try to adjust their portfolios.

What are the lessons we can learn from the recent mistakes made by the smart money crowd? For starters, do no blindly follow the herd but don't try and stand in front of it either. For example, any short seller who bet against the herd by shorting Apple before last September likely found themselves on the losing side of a "short-squeeze" while investors in funds that short the market have been consistently loosing money year

after year since the market bottomed after the financial crisis.

Likewise, be very careful about buying into media or Wall Street hype surrounding any one particular stock, investment or sector, as the bulls can quickly turn into bears or vice versa. Case in point: do you remember all those bullish stories about Apple up until early autumn or so? When Apple's share price was rising and kept rising, the media and much of the investment community kept singing the company's praises and tended to

attack its detractors, only to do a sudden u-turn when the stock or the company itself started to stumble.

However, unlike the managers of actively managed funds, the managers of exchange-traded funds (ETF) are not swayed one way or the other by hype because these funds are designed to track specific indices by having the same stock allocation as the indices they track. So instead of placing a bet on whether a manager of an actively managed fund can beat their index

benchmarks, it makes much more sense to just invest in ETFs tracking indices.

With that said, there will still be a considerable amount of onus on you to have an investment portfolio with a properly diversified asset allocation between different types of investments (equities, bonds and cash) and sectors. This is much easier to do with ETFs or individual stocks or bonds than with actively managed funds. Why? Consider this: If the managers of all the actively managed funds you own are overweight in Apple, plus you own shares, then you are overweight in Apple and your portfolio has probably been suffering since last September. In other words, you may have knowingly or unknowingly followed the herd and are now paying a price with diminished investment returns all because of one stock.

Culture of neglect holds steady path

FAILURE of local authorities to complete the multi-million baht "Sea Gypsy Cultural Center" on Koh Sireh in Rassada is just the latest in a long string of long-delayed projects on the island that highlights the inefficient use of taxpayer money and failings of bureaucracy - all at the teetering altar of "tourism promotion".

Millions of baht in funding for the project was justified on lofty objectives that few could dispute: to create a center where visitors could come to understand and appreciate what is known about the history and way of life of one sea gypsy tribe, the Urak Lawoi people, who have a seaside village at Laem Tukkae on Koh Sireh.

Inevitably, and as usual, the project was touted as a way to attract tourists to the area.

Beautiful and largely unknown, even to many long-time Phuket expats, Koh Sireh is perhaps the least promoted part of the province in terms of tourism. This is the result of an unfortunate geographic reality - the island is separated from the mainland by Klong Tah Jeen and what remains of the once extensive mangrove forests along its banks. In our "rich man, poor man" reality, encroachment generally tends to create either luxurious resorts and mansions or slums. In this case, unfortunately, it is the latter.

Access to Koh Sireh is by the bridge along Sri Suthat Road, which extends from the gritty and economically depressed east side of Phuket Town, home to derelict buildings, slum housing communities and the largest public housing estate on the island.

In its current state, this "island within an island" seems to lack anything resembling a coherent tourism promotion theme: it has beaches, but they are not as nice as their west coast counterparts; it has a nice temple, but not nice enough to attract many tourists; it has a macaque colony "viewpoint", but not nearly as nice as the one on Toh Seh Hill. It is also home to a number of disparate organizations: an orphanage for HIV-positive kids and an "international" dog training school, among others.

In short, despite being well worth a visit, most explorers will do a u-turn before they cross far enough over the bridge to realize that the island actually has something to offer.

It is only after passing through this area of urban decay and the fishing port area that Koh Sireh's real charms can begin to be appreciated. Some private investors, most notably the owners of the Westin Koh Siray Bay Resort, are spearheading real efforts to develop the area.

It seems to be an uphill battle, however. Sadly, the current state of the museum-cum-homeless shelter serves not as a tourist attraction, but rather as a reminder of how indigenous people continue to suffer at the hands of successive governments that pay lip service to their needs while denying them the most basic of rights, such as land title deeds for plots of lands they and their ancestors have occupied for decades.

Promoting Islam for Exceptions, all of us youths and tourists

FIRST PERSON

In Phuket, we maintain halal. The term "halal" is used to designate any object or action that is permissible to use or engage in according to Islamic Law. The term does not cover just food and drink, but all matters of daily life.

These traditions and our

culture need to be preserved and advertised because they can attract tourists but mainly because we need to re-inforce the values of our culture in the youth

I think youths are not aware enough of the importance of the rules, rituals and practices that compose religion.

They lack the understanding. knowledge and education about religion and its importance. In many ways society is now pushing them away from religious understanding.

I am worried that one day they may look at religions and cultures and see nothing of value in them – it is a very serious problem.

Islamic education needs to be instilled in educational institutions. We have received very positive feedback when discussing this idea with educational institutions.

It also must be presented to young people by members of their family, religious leaders and relevant organizations.

I hope in the future the new generation of Phuket Muslims will be more aware of their Islamic heritage and be stricter in their observations of halal

AS CHILDREN we were told that we were special, unique – exceptional. Those of us who have flocked to this little island have taken our parents' words in stride and to heart. Individuals of every nationality in Phuket believe that they are an exception - an exception to everything: laws, moral creeds and consequences. I am without a doubt, and somewhat ironically, not an exception to this singular belief that runs so rampant in paradise.

It was 3am on a Sunday morning - the damage of a long Saturday night carrying through. Volunteering to give a teacher friend a ride home, I sped off from Kamala, up and down the windy hills, and through the dark.

The flashing triangle and cones set up at the bottom of a long hill north of Patong signaled a police checkpoint.

I didn't have a driver's license on me, but it was too late to attempt any criminal maneuvers in an attempt to dodge the checkpoint and I didn't have the motivation it takes to blow through one, as I have seen others do from time to time. So, waved to the side of the road, I pulled over – sifting through my empty wallet for the driver's license that wasn't there.

Eventually, the officer believed it was time to take me down to the station, to test me for drunk driving – he had the driving part already pinned down and just needed to establish the drunk part – when it happened, an unthinkable utterance back home, but something extraordinarily Phuket in nature: I told him, "No".

It wasn't an abusive or hard no, but it was clearly a "there must be some sort of mistake I am an exception to the law" sort of no. With a little more conversation and no money changing hands, as I was giving a teacher a ride home, we were set free to continue our journey.

Life & style NSA leak causes concerns for Asian governments' e-security

GOVERNMENT and security officials in parts of Asia have been sending sensitive information and policy documents via e-mail services offered by US web giants, and concerns are spreading that these may have been monitored and collected by the National Security Agency (NSA).

The official name cards of several directors at Indonesia's ministry of foreign affairs, for example, give only Yahoo or Gmail addresses, services provided by Yahoo Inc and Google Inc. One researcher who deals regularly with Indonesian security and police officials, said all of them used Gmail or Yahoo to communicate often sensitive information.

Gatot S. Dewa Broto, spokesman for Indonesia's Ministry of Communications and Informatics, acknowledged that officials had long been aware that public e-mail addresses were "prone to trespassing" but said it was hard to enforce use of official e-mail accounts.

"Sometimes we have difficulties sending large e-mails with photos, file or video attachments, and are forced to use a public e-mail account. But we have reiterated that public e-mail should not be used for highly confidential matters," he said, adding that he used Gmail "in emergencies."

Revelations this week by NSA contractor Edward Snowden of a program called Prism to sift data from US web companies has raised fears of a close relationship between the companies and the NSA, something denied by both sides. Whatever the truth, the reliance of Asian officials on such services highlights how vulnerable they are to eavesdropping.

At a recent conference of the United Nations Economic and Social Commission

for Asia and the Pacific in Bangkok, for example, officials from 20 of 33 Asian countries represented included Gmail, Hotmail or Yahoo addresses on their contact forms.

Of 18 Thai officials attending, only six gave only their official email address. This was despite all government officials being issued secure e-mail addresses.

"Government officials use the web domain go.th and we can vouch that this is secure," government spokesman Theerat Rattanasewee said.

Officials around the world use personal e-mail addresses for personal matters, but in parts of Asia some have little choice but to use them for official business. Some ministries and agencies have no domain of their own, while those that do are poorly serviced or cannot be accessed via smartphones, officials say.

A former Laotian government employee said most official agencies and ministries had their own websites "but they are not really convenient. Sometimes they break down, are slow and have very low qualified service."

Marek Bialoglowy, Jakarta-based security consultant and chief technology officer at ITSEC Asia, said: "Government employees in Asia-Pacific countries often ask to send e-mails to Gmail or Yahoo,

because their official e-mail rejects large or encrypted attachments.

"Highly sensitive information could be accessible to anyone with access to such personal e-mail accounts, either Prism staff or someone who just cracked a shared password."

Some countries, however, are firm in applying rules. In Singapore, senior officials use separate computers to access the Web and for internal communications.

Spokesmen at Japan's foreign and defence ministries said transmitting workrelated information through web-based e-mail services was strictly prohibited.

"There has been a long-established rule within the foreign ministry against using such services as Gmail and Yahoo mail for work, and as a matter of fact we are not using them," said Masaru Sato, director of the foreign ministry's international press division.

Chief Cabinet Secretary Yoshihide Suga told reporters on Wednesday: "Apart from (what's happened in) the United States, the Japanese government intends to review and reinforce information security, which has been a matter of importance in many ways."

Other nations in the region have taken a more flexible approach. Indian government officials said any eavesdropping on their web-based communications would not be a problem, because they used their official accounts for all internal communications and commercial services only to communicate with journalists and the outside world.

"I don't care if the Americans are watching that," one official said. "If I am sending it by Gmail, I want the world to know."

Solar yacht to study Gulf Stream

THE MS Turanor PlanetSolar, the largest solar boat in the world, continues her US tour, and reached New York City on June 17. As part of the 'PlanetSolar DeepWater' scientific expedition carried out by the University of Geneva, the MS Turanor PlanetSolar transformed into a scientific platform, enabling a team of researchers to take advantage of her exclusive features in order to conduct a campaign of physical and biological measurements along the Gulf Stream.

The navigation between the states of Florida and New York constitutes the initial phase of this unprecedented data collection on the Gulf Stream, an important regulator of European and North American climates.

After being forced to remain in Miami for a few days to avoid 'Andrea' the first tropical storm of the season in the Atlantic, the solar catamaran left the coast of Florida on June 8 to begin its scientific expedition to study the Gulf Stream.



"Now we are in the thick of the scientific expedition. We have been travelling along the Gulf Stream since we left Miami, so we were already able to take the first measurements. A strong and favorable current enabled us to sail at over eight knots at times!" explained Captain Gerard d'Aboville.

Headed by Professor Beniston, climatologist and director of the Institute of Environmental Sciences at the University of Geneva (UNIGE), the onboard research team began taking measurements with advanced instruments in order to study the key parameters of climate regulation, namely aerosols and phytoplankton. This unique campaign requires researchers to "navigate along the Gulf Stream and collect scientific data in the water and in the air in order to improve our understanding of the complex interactions between the ocean and the atmosphere, as well as the role these interactions play in climate change," said Professor Beniston.

In parallel, a pedagogical team has developed educational activities and resources designed to make young people aware of climate

change and its impact.

The interdisciplinary team of scientists from the University of Geneva will sail along the Gulf Stream, passing through Boston, St. John's (Canada), and Reykjavik (Iceland), and will disembark in Bergen (Norway) in August.

The yacht's exclusive technical features are a major asset for the researchers: given the absence of polluting emissions, the atmospheric measurements won't be distorted by residues

associated with fuel combustion.

The yacht, built in Kiel, Germany, is a catamaran powered exclusively by solar energy. On May 4, 2012, after sailing for 584 days and travelling over 60,000km, the MS Turanor PlanetSolar completed the first solar-powered trip around the world. The Yacht docked at Phuket's Ao Po Marina in October 2012 during its record-breaking circumnavigation of the globe.





Dr Sasivimon Chandhrasri

DR SASIVIMON Chandhrasri is the head of the Eye and LASIK Center she set up five years ago at Phuket International Hospital.

An ophthalmologist whose career spans over two decades, Dr Sasivimon has been performing refractive eye surgeries – popularly known as LASIK – that have helped many patients "see a new life."

"Refractive surgery has been around for 20 years now and it's nothing short of a miracle," explains Dr Sasivimon. "In the old days many people's lives were restricted by the use of corrective glasses. They couldn't play sports or aspire to a career they love. Now as a result of LASIK surgery, some of my patients have gone on to become airline pilots or flight attendants, and some have joined the army or police. Many can take part in extreme sports. Their lives have become, in a way, limitless, thanks to this technology, which makes this precision operation quick and painless."

And the success rate?

"Admittedly, there's no such thing as 100 per cent success in any operation. For one thing, you can't control the wound healing capacity of an individual. There's also the 'body response' factor, which varies from one person to another. However, low to moderate level myopia seems to respond extremely well with this treatment."



Having specialized in ophthalmology at Mahidol University in Bangkok in the late 1980s, Dr Chandhrasri furthered her training in LASIK eye surgery at the University Hospital of Manheim, Germany.

She moved to Phuket almost ten years ago and started practicing at Bangkok Hospital Phuket. In 2008, Dr Chandhrasri set up a few Eye and LASIK Centers, one within the compound of Phuket International Hospital and another in the Silom area of Bangkok. It's a juggling game, as Dr Chandhrasri travels to and fro between Phuket and the capital, combining work as managing director with her career as a doctor. But she has her reasons.

"Apart from being a business opportunity, owning a clinic enables me to manage everything my way. That includes being able to make sure the standard of treatment and the quality of patient care is high. You can only achieve this holistic approach when you are at the management level."

Presently, Dr Chandhrasri has a plan to move her LASIK Clinic from Phuket International Hospital to a new site, also on the Bypass Road. "The idea is that LASIK patients are not seriously ill and should not have to come into hospital where risks of getting an infection are high. Our new clinic will provide quality treatment in a comfortable and relaxing environment manned by friendly and professional staff."

A self-professed perfectionist — "I am a Virgo; I pay attention to details" — Dr Chandhrasri always performs her duties to the best of her abilities. But running a large company has compromised her time as a specialist, and she's beginning to rethink her work strategy. For the new LASIK Clinic, set to open in September, Dr Chandhrasri would like to hand over the operations to a management team with experience in running LASIK centers in Bangkok.

"I would like to get back to being a full-time eye specialist. Having to always think about business and management takes the focus away from my clinical work, which requires a high degree of concentration and commitment."

Dr Chandhrasri is married to a local businessman, who is also president of Rotary Club Andaman, Sathorn Somsakserm. in her free time she enjoys watching movies. "Movies provide a kind of ready-made experience. You come to understand human nature a little bit more and this helps me to let go of work-related stress I may have felt during the day."



BARLERIA, bixa, begonia, bismarkia, bromeliad, brownia, brugmansia, brunfelsis. What do all these words have in common apart from the obvious fact that each word starts with the letter B? Well, dear reader, of course, you got it in one. They are all tropical plants. Moreover, once you get away from these Latin-based botanical names, the list grows at the rate of tropical bamboo – that is to say, rapidly; banana, bat plant, balsam, bird's nest fern, buttercup tree, busy lizzie, bachelor's button, Buddha's belly, bird of paradise, boxwood beauty – many with evocative names that help us both to visualize and remember the plant in question.

Some of these can be rapidly glossed over since they have been considered in previous articles or simply don't match our key criterion of plants that will be at home in a Phuket garden. The bat plant (tacca chantrieri) is a case in point. I have never grown it and

have only once seen the devil flower (to give it yet another evocative and picturesque moniker) in a local nursery. It gets its bizarre name from flowers (actually bracts) that are purplish black in color and resemble a large moth or bat. Long thin filaments hang down from these bracts. Hence vet another name - cats' whiskers. These flowers appear above clumps of low-growing, lush, glossy green leaves.

Even if you do manage to discover a specimen, you will need to tend it carefully. The bat plant does not appreciate an overdose of sun and needs rich, moist soil of the kind not readily available in Phuket. As a member of the edible arrow root family, mature plants can be propagated by root cuttings – if you get that far.

The bird of paradise plant is another temperamental exotic with a tongue-twisting name to match -strelizia. As a native of slightly cooler climes with a less consistently humid atmosphere, it may struggle in Southern Thailand, but if you can get it to thrive here, it will reward you with a magnificent display of extraordinary orange and blue flowers. The flowers last a long time: this helps to explain the fact that they are more likely to be spotted here as dramatic displays of cut flowers in high-end resorts and spas. S. regina is the most widely grown: S. nicolai is much larger with clusters of long oval leaves and blue and white flowers. It looks fantastic when planted as a massed bed – as I once saw in a hillside garden above Chalong where conditions suited it down to the ground. The bird of paradise can be grown from seed or by planting tubers. But it may take up to seven years to bloom. Quite a wait.

From the sublime *strelitzia* to the humble barleria is quite a step. Small, relatively insignificant, easy to grow, this plant comes into the category of "useful" additions to your garden. It is relatively lowgrowing and is one of those shrubs like the duranta or dwarf ixora – that will take any amount of clipping. Indeed, pruning will encourage a bushier growth. For this reason, barleria is often used as a low hedge or barrier.

B. cristata, the commonest variety, has tubular mauve flowers

and foliage that is dark green with paler undersides. It is a ruderal species, colonizing disturbed areas and roadsides. It likes full sun but will flourish in most soils. A spiny variety, sometimes called B. prionitis, has yellow or orange flowers and reddish brown stems;

B. repens has flame red flowers. Untemperamental, barleria can be easily grown from cuttings.

Tip of the Week

Kumquat care

BARLERIA SIAMENSIS: Often used to make hedges or garden barriers, the barleria is a hardy plant that can cope with heavy pruning. Photo: Vaikoovery

THE kumquat is an Asian member of the citrus family. Because it is hardier than the conventional orange (it can tolerate frost), and because it makes a small, compact bush, it is often grown as a container plant. The small orange fruits (either round or oval) have a sweet rind (which can be candied) and sour pulp. The foliage is an attractive glossy green. Kumquats are very resistant to disease.

A friend has a cherished potted specimen which he tells me is apparently dying. Unusual, because they are tough cookies. They do, however, go through a period of dormancy every year when they appear to be lifeless, and produce no new foliage or fruit, but they will normally start up again after a few weeks. Over-watering or feeding during this period is likely to prove terminal.

The iron man of whimsy

DAVID Sedaris is a classic example of the American Dream. In 1992, he was a 36-year-old

failure. College dropout, dabbler in crystal meth, lonely homosexual, drifting through lowly odd jobs in Chicago, New York and his native Raleigh, North Carolina. Sedaris was reading excerpts from his diary in a Chicago club when he was discovered by a radio host who later got him his debut on National Public Radio. He has since become ensconced on the Shouts and Murmurs humor page of The New Yorker and has published eight volumes of memoirs; wry, fey, whimsical, selfdeprecating and largely about his childhood among his large Greek family in Raleigh. The books have sold in the millions affording him homes in rural France and England with his longtime partner Hugh Hamrick. His globe-

Childhood memories would seem to be an inexhaustible source, Garrison Keillor and Jean Shepherd have mined the same

field, but Sedaris' eighth book, Let's Explore Diabetes with Owls (Little Brown and Company, New York, 275pp, 2013) shows that he is running thin on material. Too many stories, built on flimsy foundations, fall flat. But there are a handful of classics.

trotting book tours are legend.

In Memory Laps, he recalls his father's lavish praise for a competitor at his teenage swim meets. When Sedaris finally beats him in a butter-fly race, his father feigns indifference, leading

him to observe: "My dad was like the Marine Corps, only instead of tearing you to pieces and then putting you back together, he just did the first part and called it a day. Now it seems cruel, abusive even, but this all happened before the invention of self-esteem, which, frankly, I think is a little overrated."

In A Guy Walks into a Bar Car, he recounts an interminable train trip from New York to Chicago which he passes with fellow drunks "marinating like cheap kebabs" in the bar car. "At first their voices might strike you a jolly: the warms tones of strangers becoming friends," he writes. "Then the drinkers would get sloppy and repetitive, settling, finally, on that cross-eyed mush that

passes for alcoholic sincerity." He loves the cleanli-

ness of Japan and is

appalled by the omnipresent filth of China. "I saw wads of phlegm glistening like freshly shucked oysters on staircases and escalators. I saw them frozen into slicks on the sidewalk and oozing down the sides of walls." And don't get him started on the toilets.

In *Loggerheads*, his father takes a deeply reluctant Sedaris to a football game. Which team is he supposed to root for? How do you know if they score a point? "The thing about sports, at least for guys, is that nobody ever defines the rules, not even in gym class. Asking what a penalty means is like asking who Jesus was."

Laugh, Kookaburra is the title of a song which the eleven-year-old future author sings lustily with his sister, the future actress Amy Sedaris, after he sneaks into her bed. Three times they wake their father who finally enters with a fraternity paddle which "looked

like a beaver's tail made of wood" and is inscribed with signatures of fraternity brothers "with old-fashioned nicknames like Lefty and Slivers – names, to me, as synonymous with misfortune as Smith and Wesson".

On a trip to buy a stuffed owl an English taxidermist shows Sedaris his crown jewels: a severed seaman's arm, the mummified head of a Peruvian Indian girl, and the skeleton of a Pygmy, shot for sport by the English in 19th century Congo, prompting

Sedaris to reflect: "It would have been disturbing to see the skeleton of a slain Pygmy in a museum, but finding him in a shop, for sale, raised certain questions, uncomfortable ones like how much is he?"


Balancing these comic gems is a lot of trifling filler: visits to a dentist and a proctologist, spoiled children, elderly forgetfulness, Indian tele-salesmen, Jesus freaks, Lonely Planet phrasebooks, golddiggers, homophobic protesters, airport woes, British English, and Obamacare. These make up maybe 60 per cent of the book.

Which isn't bad – to use a baseball analogy, David Sedaris is still batting .400.

Not that he would know what that means.

LOOKING at a map of the world, Thailand is about as far away as you can possibly get from the soccerand-samba-crazed nation of Brazil. But don't buy your ticket to Rio just yet, Patong's newest restaurant has

saved you the trouble of flying halfway around the globe and brought a taste of Brazil right here to Phuket.

Rodizio derived from the Portuguese word for wheel means rotation and is the generic name for the allyou-can-eat restaurants, hugely popular in Brazil, where an endless rotation of barbecued meat is served to diners straight from the skewer. It also refers to the

method of cooking, where the skewers of meat are rotated over the hot coals and moved up and down to adjust the temperature at which they are cooked. And that's exactly what you will see when you come to Rodizio; take a peek through the wide glass window into the kitchen and you can watch hails from Brazil and he has worked

mesmerized as meat laden skewers spin tantalizingly over a glowing charcoal fire.

Located in Soi Patong Tower, just off Patong Beach Road near the Banana Walk Mall, Rodizio is the brainchild of the team behind Churrasco, another popular a la

carte South American style steakhouse at nearby Jungceylon. Clearly their love of high quality beef knows no bounds and Rodizio is their latest gambit to capture the culinary imaginations of meat-lovers in Phuket.

Manager and Chef Jair da Rosa

in restaurants, both in and out of the kitchen, in Sao Paulo and Saigon, for more then 15 years. His expertise enables him to re-create an authentic Brazilian taste and many of the recipes for side dishes such as Feijoada (a bean and pork stew which is Brazil's national dish)

> and Pao de Oueijo (a delicious cheese bread made from cassava flour with a chewy center) were handed down to Jair by his mother.

> After helping yourself to some sides from the buffet selection, which includes fresh vegetables, salads, rice dishes, roast potatoes and more – not to mention authentic Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese and thin slices of Parma ham the

carnivore's feast is set to begin.

When they say all you can eat, they really mean it. A seemingly endless array of perfectly grilled skewers of glistening meat and seafood are presented to your table and using the tongs provided, you grab slices as they are trimmed off with a razor-sharp carving knife and put them on your plate. Everything I tasted was a delight; chunky pork sausages, marinated chicken wings and nuggets of pork fillet wrapped in bacon. Other meats on offer, depending on availability, include pork ribs, fish of the day, shrimp, squid and lamb.

But that was only the beginning. Next came the most popular cut of beef served in traditional Brazilian Rodizios, which is known as Picanha. This is the topmost part of the sirloin, which has a layer of fat to keep the meat sublimely juicy and tender while it is slowly grilled over the coals. The Picanha alone is reason enough to visit Rodizio and no meal there would be complete without a liberal helping.

Perhaps the most surprising cut we encountered was the Cupim, which comes from the distinctive shoulder hump unique to the Brahman breed of cattle. This large chunk of beef is slow cooked first, before being finished over the charcoal, resulting in a flaky, almost white, meat that melts in your mouth with a flavor unlike any meat I have ever tried a uniquely Brazilian taste.


There are also several a la carte options available, such as a 250 gram Wagyu rib-eye steak, salmon steak, Rodizio burger or Brazilian lasagna, all of which include the sides buffet. But for the authentic Brazilian experience, we heartily recommend the all-you-can-eat option.

To complement your meal, there is a solid wine list to choose from, featuring some suitably South American wines from Chile and Argentina, as well as many other selections from France, Italy and Australia. If wine is not your thing, perhaps a fresh Brazilian Caipirinha cocktail, made to Jair's original recipe, would be more to your liking.

As the evening continued, our meal was punctuated with servings of sliced, grilled pineapple designed to serve as a palate cleanser between the various meat dishes. Inspired: re-think Thai desserts

A RENAISSANCE in the world of traditional Thai desserts has taken hold, away from the sand and seas of Phuket, in the heart of the province. Nestled in the center of the island, Ms Vachiraya "Yulie" Thitalohakul has turned back to her cultural heritage after years of working as a western-schooled patissiere.

With over a decade of experience as a patissiere in London, having worked for the JW Marriott Grosvenor House Hotel, The Crowne Plaza Hotel and 51 Buckingham Gate Hotel, Ms Yulie has teamed up with her sister Vachira "Yen" Thitalohakul from Tatonka Restaurant, as they rejuvenate the art of creating the multitude of Thai delicacies known collectively as kanom.

"We felt the availability of truly traditional Thai kanom was being lost in Phuket, and that local people, as well as expats and tourists were missing out on this unique aspect of Thai-food culture," Khun Yen says as Khun Yulie starts to warm up a pan to demonstrate how to properly toast watermelon seeds for one of the specialty desserts. "We want to re-introduce a widerange of tasty Thai treats that will reflect the tastes, textures, aromas and exotic colors of traditional Thai kanom.'

As Ms. Yen talks, Ms Yulie continues to create the different elements of a kanom known as "ja mongkut". This is perhaps the most difficult and time intensive Thai dessert to make. And unlike most, which rely heavily on the use of coconut cream and coconut flesh, the base of these delicate creations is a tiny dough ball made

of yolk, sugar and scented flour.

Kanom such as ja monkut and many others were once never seen beyond the palace gates. The source of the great diversity of these desserts in the Royal Household is often credited to Marie Guimar, a foreigner who, with as many as 2,000 women working under her, introduced the royalty of Siam to the pleasures of several Portuguese desserts that relied heavily on yolk and sugar.

"Over time certain kanom have become integral to the celebration of auspiciousoccasions, such as weddings and Buddhist ceremonies," Ms Yen says.

Desserts that have names beginning with the Thai word for gold, "thong", are thought to bring good luck, making desserts such as thong yip, thong yot and thonk ek very popular at weddings, birthdays and other celebrations.

Despite the heavy emphasis on rekindling and preserve Thai traditions, MsYen points out that many of the hand-made desserts they create have elegant, modern twists.

"We have many innovative and modern desserts for parties, coffee breaks and afternoon tea, as well as for gifts sets and other special occasions," Ms Yen says.

The importance of presentation is not lost on Ms Yen or Ms Yulie. Laid out in a tiny box on the coffee table are four thuai talai kanom, made from steamed sweet coconut jelly and cream and molded into the shape of a flower, with pieces of fruit inside to provide complexity in the texture and taste of the

"We use whole grains and seasonal fruit to add texture, taste and nutrition to our kanom," she explains, marking one of the

many difference between the elegant desserts composed at Ms Yulie and those block kanom found at local markets.

A small bowl of toasted, candy coated water melon seeds appear near Ms Yulie as she then begins to roll small yellow dough balls between her palms.

"You have to be meticulous in every detail, from selection of good ingredients to patiently monitoring the creation process," Ms Yen says.

Delicately, Ms Yulie lifts the tiny sugar coated water melon seeds, which now look like crispy snowflakes, and press the tips of them into the sides of the small yellow ball – creating a crown around the base.

Ms Yulie roles a smaller ball, and takes a then sheet of edible gold, twisting it and then pressing it onto

the top of the dessert.


The dedication and effort in making just a single ja monkut, a dessert that would require dozens to create a plate at a party or even for afternoon tea, makes it seem sinful to gobble down the small sweet. However, knowing just how lucky and tasty a well-crafted

ja monkut is, temptation wins out every time – as it always should when it comes to dessert.

IF YOU are from the Southwestern part of the United States, you already know what a chili cook-off is. However, given that expats in Phuket from that part of the country probably number less than a couple of dozen, maybe an explanation is due.

A chili cook-off, as described by Wikipedia, is a social event, similar to a barbecue, in which competitors prepare their own particular recipe for chili con carne and submit it for tasting. A cook-off may be in an informal gathering with the single goal of sharing recipes and enjoying food, or it may be a large-scale event with an official panel of judges and substantial prizes for winners.

Is it important? Well, some people must think so. If you Google "chili cookoff" you'll get about 4,160,000 hits, or Google the more accepted spelling "chili cook-off" for about 16,800,000 hits, and "chili recipes" for a whomping 19,300,000 hits. Compare this to 820,000 Google hits for tom yum kung.

Chili Heads have organized themselves through the Chili Appreciation Society International (CASI), of which your author is a proud member. CASI promotes and sanctions cook-offs, a staggering 550 per year. Their website currently lists 108 chili cook-offs taking place in the next few months throughout 18 states in Southwestern USA, along with Canada and Mexico. These events take place in such colorful places as Telephone and Geronimo in Texas, Chugwater, Wyoming and Tombstone, Arizona. CASI, along with their sister organization the International Chili Society, have raised millions for charities.

Although claims to the first chili cook-off


are about as prevalent as claims of the first or best som tum, one can imagine a couple of cowboys after a few cervezas (beers), arguing that "my chili is better than your chili". Thus, the first chili-cook-off was born.

The judges of Phuket's own Great Burnin' Bum Chili Cook-off will judge the various chilis on color, aroma, taste and the all-important after taste. In the interest of time, another characteristic of good chili, the after-glow, which comes quite some time after ingestion will not be a criteria for the judges.

The World Championship Chili Cook-off takes place in November each year in Terlingua, Texas, an old mining ghost town near the US-Mexico border. Terlingua is located adjacent to Carroll Shelby's ranch, a spread of 550,000 rai (yep, this is Texas). Carroll was one of the founders of the first Terlingua cook-off. You may remember Carroll as the developer of the Shelby Cobra sports cars of the 1960s and 70s. This year marks the 46th year of the Terlingua Chili Cook-off.

One of the sidelights of the Terlingua Cookoff a couple of years ago was the inclusion of a Mexican fence climbing contest in honor of the planned US border fence between Juarez, Mexico and El Paso, Texas. It was rumored that the organizers paid illegal Mexican immigrants US\$5 per day to erect the fence. Needless to say, the Terlingua cook-off is not on the official list of US events promoted by the Department of the Interior (our TAT).

But you don't have to travel to Texas, or even the USA to enjoy a chili cook-off. Phuket will be hosting its very own Great Burnin' Bum Chili Cook-off at the US Independence Day celebration sponsored by the Navy League-Phuket, at the Air Park on July 6. Y'all

Chili, or more formally, chili con carne, is a staple of the Southwestern American diet. Much like the position tom yum kung enjoys in Thai cuisine. This debate over beans or no beans has been raging for years and has divided the chili world into the red shirts (with beans), and the yellow shirts (no beans). You don't need to declare your colors when you come out to the Air Park as we'll be sampling both 'red shirt' and 'yellow shirt' chili.

If you can't make it to Terlingua this year, come on down to the Great Burnin' Bum Chili Cook-off at the Air Park on July 6 and cast your vote for the "People's Choice" best chili.

Black & Blue bring those blues to you

YOU would think a great blues band other for several years, teaming would have its name rooted in some great emotional torment, a bruised heart or tragic love story. Soulful expat blues musicians Black & Blue, however, chose their name based on their stage outfits.

"That was my idea," rhythm guitarist Peter explains. "We were talking about how we were going to dress for the stage - we were going to wear all black, but that seemed a bit too much, so we went for blue shirt and black pants or blue pants and a black shirt."

"Actually," lead guitarist Rob cuts in "the reason for the blue shirt, coincidentally, is because Peter has nothing but blue shirts." The fivepiece band laughs easily together. "That's right," Peter grins. "Our name came from the wardrobe."

While Black & Blue might not be named after the usual turmoil associated with the blues, that hasn't stopped them from crafting a beautifully bluesy sound, perfectly pitched for island life.

All seasoned musicians, the band had been playing with each up in different outfits or finding each other at jams – before all five coalesced into Black & Blue last October.

"Richard was asked to put together a blues band for a local club," Peter explains, nodding towards the band's singer/guitarist/flautist. "So he called me and talked to Rob and over a couple of months we worked on this act. It didn't work out at that club, but it's worked a lot of other places. The chemistry was good so we thought: let's keep going."

So, that's just what they did. At a gig this past week at the Welcome Inn in Layan, patrons danced and bobbed along happily to the blues crew's mix of down-home twelve bar and soulful rock, made all the more enjoyable thanks to Black & Blues' intuitively tight musicianship.

Setting up the beat is Jamie on drums. "I only got into the blues at the beginning of last year. I'm the young pup of the group," he grins. "Before that I was into

Life & style Hydroponics: a happy medium

LOCATED about a kilometer west of Chao Fah West road, en route to the Big Buddha, the DN hydroponic farm is not the bustling business operation it might at first seem.

"I can supply large orders, but this is really just a hobby," insists Pakdee "Doo" Khruthanang.

Ms Pakdee's primary hat is running her business, West Coast Divers, which specializes in liveaboard trips to the Similan islands.

Business in tourism, especially in the dive industry, goes up and down, and thus is not always reliable in terms of steady and stable income," she says.

The instability of such a seasonal industry drove Ms Pakdee to start thinking about ways she could supplement income for her family in an increasingly expensive Phuket.

"I started frequenting many restaurants that served European salad – not Thai," she says.

It was at an Italian restaurant, Capannina at Kata beach, where she got her first taste of the fiery, flavorful and astringent tasting rocket lettuce, Eruca sativa.

"I found out that they [restaurants] were paying as much as 900 baht per kilogram for this. Then I thought to myself, at such a price I wouldn't have to grow too much to be able to supplement our earnings year round."

A budding interest soon expanded to other types of lettuces, vegetables and herbs, and the curiosity soon became a passion.

To research the market, she went to various restaurants around the island, and particularly enjoyed visiting the Sizzler's salad bar, known for its diverse array of fresh and seasonal offerings.

"I took a one-day hydroponics course for 500 baht at Rajabhat University, and continued to research the science and methodologies on the internet."

Originally from Chiang Rai in the North of Thailand, Pakdee laugh

ingly admits that growing up, she didn't have any background or real experience in agriculture.

However, as a professional dive operator, she already had an underlying passion for the life sciences, particularly biological cycles and processes.

Such a passion – or "heart" as she calls it – is essential for

anybody looking to try their hand at something new, and hydroponics is not exception.

"Some people will try it out, perhaps as a hobby or even a small business venture. But if they don't have the heart and ample time to devote to it, they will not succeed," she says.

By the end of the initial year, highlighted by much trial and error, Pakdee was filling a small yet steady demand.

"We currently grow about a dozen types of lettuce and herbs, whereas others [in Phuket] only grow three to four types."

The types were chosen not only based on market demand, but also practicality.

Over the last four years, she has attempted to grow more than 20 types of herbs, ferns and vegetables, but Phuket's hot and tropical environment has proved inconducivve for growing many things. Pakdee has tried rosemary, sage, oregano and Italian parsley.

"These would be a lot easier to grow in Chiang Mai, for example, but the weather in Phuket is just not ideal," she says.

The farm has the capacity to grow and supply one tonne -1,000 kilograms-of fresh lettuces and herbs per month, and at this point, she's content.

"Any more than this, and it locally produced, high-quality would no longer be a hobby, but become full-time work."

Rocket continues to be the most popular of her offerings, and the two varieties she grows - Garden and Wild – combined make up about 40% of her supply.

Other than this, she grows both red and green varieties of Coral and Oak lettuces, as well as Frillice Iceberg, Batavia, Butterhead, Thai Mustard, Romaine Cos, Mizuna and both Thai and Italian Basil.

Half of her produce goes to local households, friends and their restaurants, and whatever is left about half of the produce – is sold to two wholesale brokers, who supply directly to hotels and restaurants. She also supplies both the Central and Patong branches of Sizzler.

The fundamental principles of supply and demand affect all business, whether a small dive company or vegetable farm," she says, before going on to highlight a common problem many business operators face in Phuket.

"In order to gain more market share, new players often end up producing too much. As supply exceeds demand, then everyone tries to undercut the competition, which makes prices plummet, and causes problems for everyone.

Ms Pakdee goes on to highlight the advantages of sourcing produce.

For the last four years, Ms Pakdee has not increased or decreased prices, regardless of inflation and other factors that often affect suppliers depending on produce from other regions.

'Whether there are floods in Bangkok, or a drought elsewhere, my price doesn't change... The important thing to keep in mind is sufficiency – make enough but not too much."

She says that the reason she has been able to keep her prices, and thus demand, stable, is because she views her operation as a past-time, rather than a trade, adding that such a model can be applied to any hobby, venture or operation.

Despite the constant threat of copy-cat entrepreneurship, Ms Pakdee readily shares her knowledge with anyone wishing to learn about hydropon-

ics, whether just to feed their families or to make supplemental income in their respective locale.

"When you start a business, it's important to have your own customer base and to maintain strong relations. And you really have to ensure that your offering is better than others, not just copying others."

Ms Pakdee has taught and continues to teach her hobby to a number of villagers, vendors and curious students, as well as hotel staff.

"They usually come to work and study on the farm on weekends and whenever they have holidays. I don't charge or pay them, but am happy to give them knowledge and even some vegetables to take home," she says.

Sport Can Phuket host F1 race?

THE proposed Bangkok Formula 1 Grand Prix has been scuppered by a new law prohibiting racing in the city's historic quarter. Strange?

Well, Phuket looks like the leading contender to host a Thailand GP, if it goes ahead, and rumours have for years abounded of a track in the north of the island. Other Thai destinations have been mooted, but how many could provide the facilities?

Just the teams and the media would probably account for 2,000 hotel rooms, and if the island only received 30,000 raceday fans it would be down with troubled Bahrain; 50,000 fans would be reasonable, and success would be 100,000. Phuket has 30,000 official rooms; it can manage, with an overflow in Krabi and Khao Lak if necessary. The Korean F1 will certainly have sensitised F1 to the issue.

A race could be staged in two years if well planned, so Phuket could be a contender for 2015, but it needs to start now.

Mr Anon from the Ministry of Sport and Tourism told the Phuket Gazette: "The decision about the place to have F1 has not

yet been made. Now there is no movement for this issue." So it looks as if nothing formal has yet started.

now sit, but a September/October date around Singapore, Japan, South Korea, and India might well be negotiable. That would suit the hotels, but it means the likelihood of a rainy race.

If it were to be a road race, or partial road race, it needs to be somewhere accessible from the main hotel and airport locations; the north or center of the island. The affect on an already overloaded infrastructure would be dramatic, and it is hard to imagine Sebastian Vettel negotiating flooded potholes.

I cannot believe that Phuket could sacrifice the highways, the backbone of the transport system for the race. Phuket Town does not look race-friendly, and access is difficult.

So we are left considering Patong, which would provide a great backdrop. That would be more like a Monaco race, Patong would effectively be closed for large chunks of three days, and gate-fees would be very hard to manage.

The alternative is a track. I will stick my neck out and say that typically a purpose built track would need about 2,000 rai (790.7 acres) and cost about US\$400mn. That's not easy, and environmental impacts

need to be managed, but with will it is possible. At most a capacity of 150,000 would be needed, and it could be 50,000 in the first year. Phuket would need to hold a night race to accommodate European TV schedules, so the lighting infrastructure costs would be high.

F1 cannot risk cars travelling at 300 km/h suddenly being plunged into darkness. The Singapore GP uses three megawatts; 1,500 lighting projectors powered by 24 generators, rigged in pairs. Should one generator fail, the load is instantly taken by its twin powerful enough for the whole race.

Then there is the question of getting fans in and out of the circuit from the hotels and airports. Abu Dhabi built an eight-lane highway and bridge as the access road. The public finance of access roads has been a vexed question at venues from Silverstone to Austin.

It has been written elsewhere that Grand Prixs are run in sophis-

ticated cities with efficient public transport systems. That is not entirely true. South Ko-




Americas is 20km outside AustinTexas; Nurburgring is 70km from Cologne; and Sepang is 60km from Kuala Lumpur, albeit convenient for the airport.

Be that as it may, most spectators will of necessity be relying on Phuket's celebrated public transport system, and that would be a special challenge. Undoubtedly there would have to be public sector investment in transport infrastructure.

The benefits for the tourism industry here would be significant, but assessing the value of the event is complex. There may be no increase in airline arrivals or hotel room-nights because of the race. These much vaunted numbers mean little, because hotels and airlines discount their rates during lean periods and increase them when demand is high to maintain occupancy. So the question is, will average tourist consumption increase?

Airlines may not be able to increase rates, but hotels certainly would, and restaurants, bars and shops would benefit.

Around the world, F1 circuits themselves do not really make money, for reasons discussed in an earlier article. Singapore for

instance is rumoured to lose US\$150mn annually. Phuket would need a sponsor with deep pockets. Red Bull fits the bill. It has a stake in F1, is Thai, and has the contacts to bring other sponsors and the government on board.

F1 will require a host fee from the race. For the sake of argument, let us guess \$30mn. And the circuit will probably get no money from trackside advertising, TV fees, or corporate hospitality. The circuit would spend perhaps \$15mn marketing the event, and its costs of running the track would probably be \$20mn per year from what I know of other tracks. So it has an annual commitment of say \$65mn.

The circuit would expect a range of tickets and some multiday income. I am guessing an average gate-receipt of \$250, and catering profits of \$20 per person, say \$270 per person in total. That would be \$13mn income with conservative attendance estimates. So the circuit would reasonably be expecting to recoup its marketing costs, but not its operating costs. Of course, other racing events would raise additional income during the year, but those deals have to be negotiated as well.

There could be ancillary attractions on the site such as a Red Bull theme park, simulators, track-drives, hotels, air strip,

marina, residential area, and other F1 themed attractions, with year-round income. But in any case, I guess the circuit would be looking for support from sponsors and the government of over \$100mn in the first year, and similar amounts for some years thereafter.

Looking at the economy of Phuket, I have read that the local business community can expect increased consumption of \$600mn from an F1 weekend. That would require 100,000 people spending \$6,000 each over three days over and above what other low season tourists pay. That looks unlikely to me. Phuket might reasonably target 50,000 fans the first year, plus the circus itself, injecting over \$100mn to the economy. It could be double that in later years.

In addition, there would probably be 200-400 permanent jobs created, and most importantly, the value of the Phuket brand, significantly eroded over recent years by cheap tourists, could be significantly increased.

There is probably no other destination in Thailand with such brand-value-added potential.

It is an interesting proposition, but it depends on having a really committed sponsor.

All I can say is, I really look forward to meeting you at Phuket's Red Bull Stadium in 2015!

International Sport Wimbledon: Prestige and drama

RAFAEL Nadal's blistering return to tennis from injury means that the top four male tennis players in the world will compete at Wimbledon this year - Rafael Nadal, Novak Djokovic, Andy Murray and Roger Federer.

Rafael Nadal enters Wimbledon playing some of the best tennis of his career. The Mallorcan spent seven months out with a knee injury and watched helplessly as he dropped to fifth in the world rankings. Since his return in February, Nadal has played in nine straight finals, winning seven, and recently won his eighth French Open title in nine attempts. Nadal is the only player to have won a single Grand Slam eight times.

The grass courts of the Old England Club are probably Nadal's weakest surface, but he has still reached five finals, winning two, since he made his debut in 2003.

The biggest hindrance for Rafael Nadal will be the seeding at Wimbledon; because of his ranking he could face Novak Djokovic, Andy Murray or Roger Federer as early as the quarterfinals.

Defending Wimbledon champion Roger Federer has won Wimbledon seven times and has more grand slam titles, 17, than any other player in the Open era. Wimbledon is to Federer what Roland Garros is to Nadal. But that has not stopped the rumor mill churning out speculation that he could retire this year.

The main source of this speculation is centered around his advancing years, 31, compared to his main rivals: Djokovic 26, Nadal 27 and Murray 26.

Also, his grip on Wimbledon has started to slip as the last three editions have involved five different finalists and seen separate winners each time - Nadal, Djokovic and Roger Federer. His form this year has been surprisingly poor, winning his first title since August 2012 with victory over Russia's Mikhail Youzhny in the final of the Gerry Weber Open in Halle, Germany on June 16.

Roger Federer won 6-7 (5-7) 6-3 6-4 to collect the 77th title of his career. Ominously, four of Federer's seven Wimbledon wins have come after triumphs in Halle.

World number one Novak Djokovic, who was knocked out of Roland Garros in the semfinal by Rafael Nadal, won Wimbledon for the first and only time in 2011. The Serbian has maintained his consistency, winning the Australian Open, Dubai Tennis Championship and the Monte Carlo Masters already this year.

Andy Murray returned from the back injury that kept him out of

the French Open to claim his third Queen's Club title, beating Marin Cillic 5-7 7-5 6-3. The Queen's Club win will boost his confidence as he once again bids to become the first British men's singles champion since Fred Perry in 1936. Murray lost last year's final to Federer 4-6 7-5 6-3 6-4.

Women's tennis has formed its own breakaway group, the top three ranked women in the world: Serena Williams, Victoria Azarenka and Maria Sharapova. The last six majors have been won by someone out of tennis' newest trinity, and all three reached the semifinals

of last year's Olympics tennis tournament held at Wimbledon -Williams claiming gold, Sharapova silver and Azarenka bronze.

Williams, who won the recent French Open and has won 31 straight matches, is the clear favorite to claim her sixth Wimbledon title and her dominance over the other two ladies is brutally illustrated when comparing matches between the three. Azarenka leads Sharapova 7-6, Williams leads Sharapova 14-2 and Williams leads Azarenka 12-2.

Wimbledon runs from June 24 to July 7.

World rugby round up: Wounded Lions

IN SPORT, truth is often stranger than fiction. If someone had predicted that 36vear-old Shane Williams (who retired from international rugby two years ago), Brad Barritt (on holiday in the US) and both Christian Wade and Billy Twelvetrees (part of the recent tour of Argentina with England) would all be down under and playing in the last and crucial State game before the first Lions Test against The Wallabies, one would have doubted their sanity. Yet such is the injury count among the tourist backs that this is what happened.

The main reason for these draconian management measures was further injuries sustained during a bruising battle with the Waratahs. Though the Lions won convincingly 46-19, they lost Test center Jamie Roberts with a torn hamstring and having already declined to risk Brian O' Driscoll, George North, Tommy Bowe or Manu Tuilagi (all carrying knocks), the team had a makeshift look. In the event, they performed heroically, with Leigh Halfpenny again the star with 30 points, and Jonathan Davies offering a complete performance at outside center. Ten of this side will probably start the First Test, including the front five.

Sadly, the "reserve" team's subsequent display against the Brumbies in Canberra on Tuesday was an anti-climax. Unsurprisingly, the reinforcements performed like players either short of practice or unused to each other, the set piece was dysfunctional with Best's

throwing inaccurate, and Hogg, playing in the unaccustomed position of outside half, too often chose the wrong tactical options in a woeful first half. Though there was more urgency to their play in the second period, the Lions surrendered their unbeaten record, losing a tight game by 14-12.

In New Zealand, the top ranked nation lead France 2-0 in a three Test series. The first Test was close, with France belying their Six Nations form with a spirited display, in which Wesley Fofana scored a typically dynamic try to give France an early lead. If they were eventually unlucky to lose 23-13, they were then outclassed in the second game by a clinical All Blacks side, reaping the benefit of collective training, France conceded thirty points without reply.

Elsewhere in the rugby-playing world, there has been much activity and some surprises. In Japan, a Welsh team shorn of all its Lions and controversially lacking the experienced James Hook and Dwayne Peel, could only draw a two match series with the host nation. Also unexpected was Scotland's defeat by the feisty Samoans in South Africa, a defeat which shows that they, in common with Wales, have limited strength in depth. The outcome of this

quadrangular tournament, which also features Italy and South Africa, hinges on the final game between the hosts and

England, it seems, have no such problems with reserve strength. A young and inexperienced side inflicted on Argentina the first whitewash ever achieved by a visiting English team. They convincingly won the first game by 32 points to 3, and in a much tougher second encounter, triumphed 51-26

The tour produced some new international stars, especially in the three quarters where Christian Wade, Marlon Yarde, Kyle Eastmond and Jonny Maywere formed part of a rapier-sharp back division. Yarde scored twice on his debut and Eastmond beat five men in a run reminiscent of Jason Robinson

Forward dominance led to two penalty tries. Having won seven of their last eight games, England will go into the autumn internationals in the knowledge that they can, like New Zealand, field two very different teams of international standard.

As for the wounded Lions, they must raise their game against the Wallabies in the first Test in Brisbane. Not helped by the news that Digby Ioane, the Wallabies' star winger had declared his fitness for the encounter. Bring it on.

The Lions play their first Test against Australia on June 22 at 5:05pm, followed by a match against the Melbourne Rebels on June 25 at 4:40pm. - Patrick Campbell

Sport Wrestling action at Saphan Hin

THE 2013 Asian Junior Wrestling Championships was held at Saphan Hin's 4,000-seater Indoor Sports Complex last weekend. Nearly 400 wrestlers from 20 countries competed at Free Style, Greco Roman and Female wrestling. The event was open to 17 to 18year-old wrestlers, but participants under the age of 17 could compete if organizers received written permission from their parents.

Thailand had over 20 wrestlers at the event but none from Phuket. The majority of Thai wrestlers were from Nakhon Si Thamarat, Rachathani and Bangkok.

The event was the first time some of the Asian wrestlers have competed in an event since the World Wrestling Body (FILA) implemented a number of rule changes to help get the sport back into the Olympics, mainly: the time and periods of the bout (2x3 minutes), cumulative score instead of the best-of-three-format, the procedure for passivity (the rules governing Greco-Roman and Freestyle are distinctly different) and take downs are now worth two

points. These rule changes are designed to encourage wrestlers to adopt a more attacking style of wrestling.

Due to poor advertising by the event organizers or a distinct lack of interest in wrestling, the indoor arena at Saphan Hin was full of competitors, coaches, officials and family members, but hardly any fans.

The Thai Amateur Wrestling Association's International Coordinator, Achara Pimpang understands that wrestling is not as big in Thailand as in India or Iran.

"When people in Thailand think of wrestling they think the wrestlers will throw chairs and that it is the professional wrestling they see on TV. People in Thailand don't really know wrestling," she said.

India finished top overall in Free Style wrestling with 68 points, Thailand came 13th with nine points. Japan and India finished joint top on 55 points overall in Female wrestling. with Thailand's female wrestlers finishing a respectable 5th on 44 points. South Korea won the Greco Roman wrestling on 57 points, Thailand finished 9th with 24 points.

Wrestling has made the final shortlist




