Bomb Alert

Provincial Hall blast not connected to Deep South insurgency; security boosted

By Kritsada Mueanhawong

THE bomb that detonated in the car park at Phuket Provincial Hall on August 1 was likely the result of a local conflict and not associated with the ongoing insurgent attacks in the Deep South, officials said.

The blast, at about 2pm, emanated from a trash can in the car park.

No one was harmed, though three vehicles nearby sustained damage. The bomb was designed to frighten officials, and likely not intended to kill anyone, Phuket Provincial Administrative Organization (PPAO) President Paiboon Upatising said.

"The rising price of rental land might be the motive for the blast. Although actually, we don't really have problems with anyone," said Mr Paiboon, mulling the motive.

Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Saneh Yawila confirmed the explosion was from a civilian-made time bomb.

Wiring and parts of a clock were found among the debris strewn across the car park.

"At this stage, we believe that it is just a threat, rather than an attempt to take lives. The bomber, or bombers, set the detonation time...

DJ dragged to his death under truck

A PHUKET DJ was killed on July 31 after he was dragged beneath a pickup truck for about 700 meters, witnesses said.

The 58-year-old driver of the truck initially fled the scene, but turned himself a few hours later.

When they arrived, police and rescue workers found Terdpong "Bao" Phuttapiruk, 29, dying in the middle of the road.

"He was rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital, but he was unconscious and suffering from broken ribs, blood in his lungs and a broken leg. He died shortly after arriving at the hospital," Maj Chaleaw Taihoo of the Phuket City Police said.

Witnesses told police that Mr Terdpong was driving in the motorbike lane of Thepkrasattri Road heading toward Phuket Town when a black pickup truck came up behind him and knocked him from his bike.

As Mr Terdpong fell from the bike, he became entangled beneath the truck, which attempted to speed off, dragging Mr Terdpong for about 700 meters before he was freed.

Crew rescued from high seas

ELEVEN men were rescued from stormy seas after spending two hours holding onto floating debris between the Krabi coast and Phi Phi Island, last week.

The cargo boat *Unity*, carrying food, construction materials and other supplies bound for Phi Phi, was struck by large waves up to four-meters high on July 31 after passing Koh Por Da, said Thaweep Choonoon, the boat's captain.

We departed from Tambon Sai Tai at about 4pm to deliver goods to Phi Phi," he said.

"Along the way, waves about four-meters high hit the boat, causing it to lean.

"Water started coming into the boat and it began sinking, so I shouted to my crew to jump off and to hold onto any plastic package that could float," he recalled.

'We were floating for about two hours before we were rescued by another boat," he added.

Lt Col Chansit Karncharoen of the Krabi Marine Police said his team took 20 minutes to reach the survivors.

"Fortunately, another boat, the Sinmana 3, was passing by and rescued most of them," he said.

However, one of the crew, Pinit Chookerd, 38, was separated from the group and pushed by waves toward Koh Mai Pai.

"Our boat could not reach him because the water was too shallow, so we called in the Krabi

Administrative Organization rescue boat," Col Chansit explained.

"Everyone was taken to Krabi Hospital. They were exhausted and had chest pains from choking on seawater," he said.

"However, they are all safe and have been discharged from the hospital," Col Chansit added.

The owner of the ship, Somphone Boonyarak, was thankful the incident did not cost any lives.

"When I heard that the boat had sunk, the first thing I thought about was my crew... When I heard that one of them was missing, I felt frightened. I thought I had lost him," she said.

"It's so great he is alright."

As of Wednesday, efforts to salvage the Unity had been repeatedly delayed due to bad weather.

"We expect the task to be completed before Friday," Ms Somphone told the Gazette.

Krabi killers miss court date

ONLY one of the three musicians charged with killing a 51-year-old American tourist in Krabi appeared in court to be arraigned on Monday; the other two postponed their trial date.

All three men, charged with the July 31 murder of 51-year-old Bobby Ray Carter Jr and the assault of his son Adam, 27, outside the Little Longhorn

Ratikorn Romin, 27, from Phang Nga, appeared in court on Monday; Nopanan Yoddecha, 26, from Krabi, did not, nor did

Sathid Somsa, 40, from Bangkok, who was also charged with possession of an illegal firearm after he was found at the murder scene with a homemade gun.

Mr Ratikorn told police, "We accept that we attacked them, but we didn't intend to kill anyone."

Chinese guide robbed of 100,000 baht, Rolex

A CHINESE tour guide withdrew 80,000 baht from her bank account on August 4 and by the next morning it had been stolen from her house, along with her boyfriend's Rolex watch valued at 300,000 baht, and 20,000 baht she already had in her purse.

When police responded to the 9:30am call from Phuket Villa Daorung, they found a ransacked living room with books and belongings scattered across the floor.

"One of the front door latches had been broken," said Somkit Aon-jan of the Wichit Police.

Luo Xiao Yuan, a 29-year-old Chinese tour guide, told police that she had withdrawn 80,000 baht the day before and had a total of 100,000 baht in her purse.

"When she arrived home last night, she put her bag on the sofa and her boyfriend put his Rolex watch next to her bag. After that they went to sleep on the second

floor," he said. "This morning, as her boyfriend was getting ready for work, he found the living room trashed and his watch missing.

"When he opened Ms Yuan's bag, he saw that all the money in her bag had disappeared as well," explained Capt Somkit. The police are investigating the theft. - Kritsada Mueanhawong



LIFEGUARDS at Karon Beach, on Phuket's southwest coast, staged a mass rescue of five tourists on Monday after a large wave nearly

swept a group of men out to sea. Two of the men were able to struggle back to shore without assistance, while the other five needed the help of local lifeguards.

One of the men was pulled from the water unconscious and was Patong Hospital.

"They went to swim in an area marked by red flags," Karon head lifeguard Uten Singsom explained to the *Gazette*.

"Our lifeguards saw them entering the water and started to run over to stop them, but it was too late by

Call for probe into attack on SA family goes nowhere

POLICE have ignored the Kathu District Chief's plea to investigate an attack on a South African family near Soi Bangla last week.

"We sent a letter to ask Patong police about what happened and what they have done about the case, as it is getting a lot of tourist attention," Kathu District Chief Veera Kerdsirimongkol said.

"We received a reply from police that they have not been able to investigate the case because the victims have not filed a complaint," said Mr Veera.

Patong Police Deputy Superintendent Akanit Danpitaksat reiterated to the Gazette on Tuesday, "The family has not yet filed a report at the station, so we cannot investigate the attack."

After midnight on the morning of July 30, the family of four mother, father and two children in their 20s – were "hanging out near the beach road" when they were suddenly attacked.

Six men appeared "out of nowhere" and started to swear at the family and physically attack them,

the father told police.

"I don't know who they were. I only remember a man wearing a red shirt was the one who started swearing at us. They hit us in the face and on our bodies.

"We called for help, but nobody helped. As soon as we had a chance to escape, we split up and ran for our lives," he said.

The family later gathered in front of Jungceylon shopping mall and called police for help. Shortly

after 1:45am, police and Kusoldharm Foundation workers arrived.

"The family said they were attacked by six men in front of the Aloha Villa Hotel on Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Road [about a block away from Soi Bangla], said a Kusoldharm worker.

"They were clearly injured. In addition to marks on their heads and mouths, they had scratches on their bodies," he said.

Stumped for any explanation as to why Pranee, 39, had died, doctors were forced to list the cause of death as 'acute heart failure' as a form of Sudden Unexplained Death Syndrome. The Gazette's Saran Mitrarat investigates.

THE death of Pranee Srijaem last week left many questions unanswered. The case is closed, but the incident raised the chilling specter of the unexplained deaths of Canadian sisters Audrey and Noemi Belanger on Phi Phi Island last year, and that of several tourists at the now-demolished Downtown Inn in Chiang Mai.

Hans, a 68-year-old Dutchman, explained to police that he and

Pranee, 39. went out for somtam at a local restaurant, then stopped off at a Family Mart convenience store before heading back to the apartment last Saturday night.

"When we got back home, Pranee had a bad case of diarrhea before going to sleep,' he told police.

"She always woke up at

about 7am to make coffee, which we drank

together each morning. But on that day, I did not wake up until 9am. I thought it was unusual that she let me sleep so long," he said.

"I reached out and touched her hand, but it was cold. Then I checked, and she had stopped breathing... I was so frightened," said Mr Lehner, visibly shaken.

Capt Patapee Srichai of the Patong Police confirmed that his officers were notified of the death at 9:30am.

"We rushed to the scene with rescue workers from the Kusoldharm Foundation and Patong Hospital medics," he said.

"We found Ms Pranee's body on the bed, covered by a quilt.

"We believe she died about three hours before we arrived. Rescue workers transported her body to Patong Hospital at about 10am," he stated.

"In conducting our initial investigation, we checked her body and the room, but we found no signs of a struggle," Capt Patapee confirmed.

INVISIBLE KILLER

Patong Hospital Director Sirichai

Silpa-archa explained that his team of medical officers followed standard procedure in examining Ms Pranee's body, but failed to find evidence of a potential cause of death.

"Our first step was to check for signs of a struggle. In this case, we did not find any bruises or any other signs of injury on the body," said Dr Sirichai.

"After that, we focused on food

as a potential cause, so we checked her blood, stomach and intestines. We did not find any harmful contaminants from food and there were no traces of toxins in her body, so we had no reason to suspect that she was poisoned by something she ate or any other contaminant," he said. However, in

stopped breathing' – Hans Lehner, examining Ms partner of Pranee Srijaem Pranee's body in order to assist a

police investigation, doctors did not check for any signs of whether or not the 39-year-old had been smothered to death.

"We did not check for signs of smothering as we had already found no signs of a struggle," he told the Gazette.

"As her heart had stopped long before she arrived at the hospital - meaning we could not check whether or not she suffered from irregular heartbeat patterns - we had nothing else to check to confirm her cause of death.

"The only thing we could put down as the cause of death was acute heart failure," Dr Sirichai explained.

ACCEPTANCE

At about 7am on Tuesday, Ms Pranee's relatives arrived at Patong Hospital to claim her body. Ms Pranee was originally from Tambon Du Lat, located in Sai Mun District in Yasothon province, in Thailand's Northeast.

"Her relatives accepted the cause of death and did not want any further investigation," said Dr Sirichai, without elaborating on

Death comes calling

who claimed the body or why the relatives accepted an unexplained heart attack of the 39-year-old as the cause of death.

"If Ms Pranee's relatives wanted us to investigate her death further, we could have sent the body for forensic examination in Bangkok, but the cost of transferring the body and conducting such tests is expensive," Dr Sirichai said.

CASE CLOSED

Capt Patapee explained that as doctors had given a cause of death, and his officers had not identified a possible violent cause or a motive for Ms Pranee's demise, the case was now closed.

"Because there were no signs of a struggle, either on her body or in the room, we saw no reason to believe she died a violent death," said Capt Patapee.

"There simply was no evidence that she died from unnatural causes," he said.

"Her relatives accepted the death and did not request a further investigation. The case is now closed," he added.

SUDDEN DEATH

Dr Sirichai told the Gazette that the phenomenon Sudden Unexplained Death Syndrome, also known by its acronym "SUDS", is not uncommon in Thailand.

"Of all the people who have died from SUDS in Thailand, most were from the Northeast, with most of the rest coming from Northern Thailand," he said.

"There are theories that those people may have died from SUDS brought on by eating sticky rice, drinking alcohol or consuming a fermented product [somtam often can include fermented fish], but there is no research to support this idea," Dr Sirichai said.

"However, sudden death can happen from something as simple as a chemical imbalance in the body," he explained.

"If you eat a particular food or even stay in an unfamiliar environment, that might cause a chemical imbalance and sudden death may occur.

"For example, as shown by recent cases in Thailand, if you sleep in a car – or leave your baby in a car – with the air conditioning on for a long time, it's possible to die from sudden death," he said.

THE BRUGADA SYNDROME

Doctors listing Ms Pranee's cause of death as acute heart failure incidentally shone a light on one of the top causes for sudden death: Brugada syndrome.

The syndrome is only one form of SUDS, and is a well-documented genetic disease characterized by bouts of irregular heartbeats, which bring an increased risk of sudden cardiac arrest.

People with Brugada syndrome exhibit abnormal electrocardiogram (ECG) findings. Not having access to any ECG data for Ms

Pranee, doctors have no idea whether or not she suffered from any irregularities of the heart.

"We checked her records here at Patong Hospital, and as best we can tell, Ms Pranee had no known previous heart condition," Dr Sirichai said.

HISTORY OF MYSTERY

Dr Bancha Kakhong, chief of the Phuket Provincial Health Office, and hence the top administrator for all government hospitals on the island, said the circumstances of Ms Pranee's death was no cause for alarm.

"We are not overly concerned about sudden death in Phuket, and the cause of death in this instance seems to have been heart failure," he said.

both similarities and differences between the death of Ms Pranee and those of Audrey and Noemi Belanger on Phi Phi Island last year and the unexplained deaths of at least three foreigners at the infamous Downtown Inn in Chiang Mai in 2011.

"The cases are similar in that we have not been able to precisely identify the cause of death, but they do differ in that the deaths in Chiang Mai included men. Men and women have different physiologies, and the effect of undetected chemicals can differ between men and women," Dr Bancha said.

"But I cannot summarily say whether or not the cases are the same. Sudden death can affect nearly anyone," he added.

Dr Bancha explained that the Dr Bancha also pointed out variety of factors involved, and the

lack of in-depth tests conducted in Ms Pranee's case, made it nearly impossible to identify a likely culprit for her death.

"The food people consume, and the environment they are in, are very important factors that can cause sudden death. For example, in the northeast of Thailand people use blue plastic PVC pipes to steam sticky rice.

"This can introduce toxins that can collect in the body until they reach fatal levels, but this can be difficult to establish without conducting in-depth tests," he explained.

'Ms Pranee's relatives did not request further investigation. If they did, we would have sent the body to Bangkok to have a full autopsy performed. Instead, we have to respect the family's wishes," Dr Bancha said.



Krabi Airport unharmed by road collapse



The airport was recently renovated.

DEPARTMENT of Civil Aviation (DCA) officers confirmed that the domestic terminal at Krabi International Airport suffered no structural damage after heavy rains caused the ramp road of the terminal to subside and a retaining wall to collapse on August 3.

A budget has already been approved and a contractor engaged, and repairs are expected to commence next week, said Airport Director Sunyaluk Kraiboot.

A tourist noticed the damage and reported it on the morning of August 3, Director Sunyaluk said.

"We found that about 10 meters of road outside the terminal had sunk, and officers discovered that 30 centimeters of the retaining wall's concrete beams along the road to the domestic terminal were broken or weakened," he said.

Authorities closed the road and roped off the area.

"In the meantime, domestic passengers can be dropped off at Terminal 1 for international arrivals and departures, and walk to Terminal 2 using the elevated walkway," he said.

"We have also opened a service road to allow vehicles to drop off passengers at Terminal 2, but not at the main entrance," he added.

The airport had recently received a 743 million baht upgrade.

TAT gives Phuket 'time out'

Tells island to focus on infrastructure to lure upscale visitors

PHUKET is one of several main tourism destinations in the country that will not be promoted under the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) international marketing campaign for next year.

Instead, the focus will be on less-developed tourism areas, Director of the Phuket-TAT office Chanchai Doungjit revealed on August 1.

"We will not be promoting tourism centers that are already well-established. Instead, we will be promoting other popular destinations nearby, such as Phang Nga and Krabi. Similarly, we will be promoting Chiang Rai instead of Chiang Mai," Mr Chanchai said at a meeting at Provincial Hall.

"This will give popular destinations such as Phuket time to develop their infrastructure and fix problems such as water pollution, traffic jams and public transportation," Mr Chanchai explained.

"Consequently, we do not expect the number of visitors to Phuket to increase next year. Any growth in the number of visitors to Thailand will be due to tourists visiting less well-known destinations instead," he added.

The move to divert any potential tourism growth in Phuket is designed not only to promote other regions, but to allow the island to focus on "upgrading" the quality of visitors to the luxury market, he said.

"By doing this we can generate more income based on the same number of visitors. At the same time, nearby destinations can generate more income from visitors who travel there instead of coming to Phuket," said Mr Chanchai. "The main tourism centers will "The plan to hit those numbers focuses on Thai traditional culture, festivals, way of life and Thai experience," Mr Chanchai said.

In 2014 the plan will target those interested in weddings and honeymoons, medical tourism and community-based tourism.

"At wedding fairs abroad, we will promote traditional Thai wedding ceremonies. We will also hold familiarization tours so travel agents can experience Thailand first-hand, "Mr Chanchai said.

"For medical tourism, the TAT plans to promote traditional Thai remedies and treatments, as well as spa services," he said.

Thailand's main competition for the medical tourism market is

India, Singapore and South Korea. "We will contact insurance agents and companies in other countries, inviting them to come and inspect the facilities and services available in Thailand," Mr Chanchai said.

Mr Chanchai explained to those at the meeting that he felt secure in Thailand's footing for community-based tourism. Nonetheless, the TAT will promote homestay packages and tours that highlight village life in Thailand.

Other campaigns are "Fly Me To The South", promoting cheap flights; "Big Bike Riding South", focusing on road tours; and "Let's Go South", which promotes cultural centers.

'No worries' at Aussie police workshop on transnational crime and terrorism

THE Australian Federal Police (AFP) arrived in Phuket this week to hold a joint workshop with local law enforcement authorities on tackling the issue of transnational crime on the island.

"Phuket is one of the most famous tourist destinations in the world. Every day, large numbers of tourists from all over the globe come to visit us," Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Peerayuth Karajedee said.

"A criminal or terrorist could arrive disguised as an ordinary tourist," he explained.

"Therefore, preparing the relevant officers with the latest methods and tactics for tackling transnational crime is a sensible move," Col Peerayuth, the workshop project leader, told the *Gazette*.

The workshop was held at the Novotel Phuket Resort in Patong on Wednesday and Thursday. Participants included police officers

from local police stations and provincial police, as well as marine police and immigration police. Col Peerayuth stressed that the

Col Peerayuth stressed that the workshop was not a cause for concern.

"It does not mean Phuket is in a state of heightened danger from transnational crime. We are simply co-operating and sharing ideas with the AFP," he said.

"These mutual talks will be beneficial because they will help us upgrade our work efficiency, and enhance our law-enforcement abilities," he added.

AFP senior liaison officer John Tanti said the AFP has been working with the Royal Thai Police sharing information on Australian criminals and fugitives, as well as security issues of mutual concern in order to prevent the occurrence of transnational crime.

"In addition to Phuket, we will also conduct this workshop with peers in Bangkok and Chiang Mai, two other famous Thai tourist hubs," Mr Tanti explained.

"We hope to learn a lot from the AFP, and, together with AFP officers, we will examine case studies of transnational crime, such as the 2002 Bali bombing," said Col Peerayuth.

Poll: Public transport preferred to underpass

MORE than one-third of respondents to a Phuket Gazette online poll have voted to have an effective public transport system that reduces the volume of traffic on Phuket's roads, instead of building an underpass costing hundreds of millions of baht at the busy Chalong Circle junction in the south of the island.


Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut last month unveiled six routes being considered for a new underpass at Chalong Circle.

While introducing the six options, Governor Maitri pointed out that the new underpass will need to serve about 53,000 cars per day, accounting for about 60 per cent of all traffic in Muang District.

However, in response to the Gazette poll asking "Is an underpass the best solution for the traffic woes at Chalong Circle?", 30.4% of respondents voted: No, they should reduce the volume of traffic altogether by providing public transport.

Nonetheless, the proposal to build an underpass did receive a firm base of support, with 23.3% of respondents voting: Yes, and at least one of the proposed options seems viable.

That figure was achieved without being the top preference in any



one of the demographic categories available: Thai Nationals, Local Foreign Residents and Tourists / Visitors to Phuket.

It was also outweighed by the combined support for the three next most-popular responses: No, no action is needed as there is no


traffic problem there (16.4%); No, they should widen the roads (11.2%); and No, there should be traffic lights there (10.5%). Only 8.3% of respondents

voted: Yes, but none of the proposed options seem viable. - Phuket Gazette

... for 2pm. If they had wanted to ensure bloodshed, they would have set the bomb to explode at a busier time, like lunch hour or in the evening as people were getting off work," Col Saneh said.

National Police Office adviser Ratchata Yensuang agreed that the explosion was thought to be designed to frighten officials, but was unsure about motive.

"The bomb appeared to be quite amateurish," Gen Ratchata said during his visit to Phuket last Friday to learn about the incident.

Security has been increased at Provincial Hall for the time being, with Civil Defense Volunteers bolstering security at the gates starting at 5pm each night.

"We have ordered Civil Defense Volunteers to be more strict in keeping an eye on every vehicle that enters and exits the Provincial Hall compound," Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut explained.

"As always, we will also be relying on our network of Civil Defense Volunteers to supply us with security information," he added.

Ideally, rolling checkpoints among government offices and densely populated areas in Phuket Town will be established, Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Peerayuth Karajedee said.

'We'll be looking for weapons, drugs and other illegal items," he warned.

Explosion in Phuket Black taxis scoff at DSI

A TAXI company using illegal "black taxis" to serve Phuket International Airport said it will continue to do so despite the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) opening its Organized Crime Center for Tourism today.

"Our black plate taxis will still work as usual. If the DSI officers arrest them, I will explain to the officers why we are unable to get green license plates [to become legal taxis]," Mook Andaman Business & Travel Co-operative secretary Ittipol Mekmanee said.

Mook Andaman, not one of three co-operatives with Airport of Thailand (AoT) concessions to operate at the airport, has a fleet of 136 taxis, only 10 of which are legally registered, Mr Ittipol said.

The company has had limited success in attempting to have its vehicles folded into the legally operating co-operatives at the airport. Even that success came about only after stalking Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut at his home.

"I understand the rules and that officers want operators to register their vehicles to make the system better. However, we have encountered difficulties," said Mr Ittipol.

"Finance companies require deposits of around 70,000 baht [sic] in order to release a registration book, which they hold as collateral for loans taken out to buy cars. How can we find that much



money?" he asked. The drivers need the books in

their hands in order to present them to the Phuket Land Transportation Office (PLTO) so officials can physically register the change from private vehicle to public.

Mr Ittipol's concern was formally recognized by PLTO chief Teerayut Prasertpol earlier this year.

Mr Teerayut explained that at the time the biggest remaining obstacle stopping taxi drivers from becoming legal was the cost

of changing the registered use of their vehicles with their finance companies.

However, a breakthrough deal was brokered six months ago.

"Drivers claimed banks and finance companies required deposits of up to 10,000 baht in order to release the registration books which they hold as collateral for loans taken out to buy cars," Mr Teerayut said in February.

Mr Teerayut was able to secure financing for about half of the

2,882 illegal taxis operating in Phuket after meeting with representatives from Thanachart Bank headquarters in Bangkok.

"Thanachart Bank has agreed to waive the deposit for drivers who give permission for the bank to hand the registration book directly to the PLTO in order to change the registration type. This saves the taxi drivers from having to come up with the money needed for the deposit," Mr Teerayut explained in February.

Despite this progress made months ago, Mr Ittipol made it clear that financial companies were still what was preventing him and the drivers of the Mook Andaman fleet from becoming legal.

"As I said, what are we going to do? If the government wants to make this rule more effective, they should provide more help to us. For example, they could allocate some funds for us to pay off our debts," he said.

Though Mook Andaman is struggling with legality, Vice Governor Chamroen Tipayapongtada has maintained that many other taxi operators had been very cooperative since the announcement of the new rules.

Mr Ittipol's disregard for the DSI crackdown flies in the face of Vice Governor Chamroen, who urged all illegal taxis to have their vehicles registered, warning them that they will be a prime targets for the DSI on Friday.

Snake snacking on cat

A PYTHON snuggled in an old washing machine about to enjoy a dinner of house cat was interrupted when the cat's owner walked by.

As Narongsak Laksanawisit walked out of his house in Mai Khao on August 2, he passed the washing machine and saw his cat's body in it. Then he saw a snake's tail.

"I think the snake had just squeezed it to death and was about to eat it," Mr Narongsak said.

"I took the cat's body out to bury it and called the rescue foundation for help," he said.

Largest library on the high seas sets compass for Phuket

LOGOS HOPE, the world's largest floating library, is Phuket bound for the first time, Project Coordinator Eunji Lee said.

The 132-meter ship, roughly half the size of the *Titanic*, will be docked at Phuket's Deep Sea Port from August 14 to 22.

"The ship will be open to visitors from August 15 to 18, and then again from August 21 to 22," Ms Lee said.

The ship, packed with over 5,000 titles, offers more than just book-knowledge: the ship's 400 volunteers from around the globe partakes in a variety of development projects when docked, ranging from building schools to providing professional dental care.

"We aim to share knowledge, experience and a variety of cultures with people from countries all over the world through our books and volunteers," Ms Lee said. "We also aim to help people

in the area by building schools, making book donations and providing medical services."

The price to come aboard *Logos Hope* during her visit to Phuket is 20 baht.

Admission is free for children under the age of 12 who are accompanied by an adult. The ship will be open to the public from 10am to 9:30pm from Thursday to Saturday, and 1pm to 9:30pm on Sunday. However, the vessel's doors will be closed to the public on August 19 and 20.

The vessel will be arriving from Kuching, Malaysia.

Since the launch into service in February 2009, *Logos Hope* has been in several regions, including:

the Caribbean, West Africa, the Persian-Arabian Gulf, and, most recently, South Asia.

The *Logos Hope* was launched in 1973 as a ferry that ran between the Swedish port of Malmo and the German port of Travemunde. From plying just the Baltic Sea 40 years ago, she now sails the oceans of the world.

Blaze destroys Patong room


POLICE suspect a spark from an electrical socket near a bed set ablaze a third-floor apartment at the Baan Chalika complex in Patong early August 5.

Paving a new path to Freedom Beach

TOP Phuket officials, including Governor Maitri Inthusut, attended the first public hearing for the proposed new road from Sirirat Road to Tri Trang Beach, on the southern headland of Patong Bay.

About 100 people turned out to join the meeting on July 30.

"Actually there is already an old road that villagers use that runs from Sirirat Road to Muean-Ngern Road, but it is just a dirt track. And it is not safe for people to use," explained Songjit Sappakit of Phisut Technology Company, hired to develop preliminary plans for the new road.

"Patong Municipality wants to make a new scenic route connecting Sirirat Road to Tri Trang Beach, passing Freedom Beach along the way," he explained.

Mr Songjit proposed three plans for the road, which will extend about 2.3 kilometers.

Plan 1: one lane each way, with a 2.5m-wide footpath on either side and two viewpoints en route.

Plan 2: one lane each way, with a 1m-wide footpath and a 2m-wide bicycle lane on both sides of the road; and two viewpoints en route. Plan 3: one lane each way, but the footpath and bicycle lane will be on the southern side of the road only and each will be only one meter wide – but the road will come with two viewpoints and be lined with pradu trees.

When Patong Mayor Pian Keesin announced plans for the new road in April last year, expected costs did not exceed 4 million baht. No estimates of costs were given for any of the plans proposed.

Mr Songjit supported the third option, saying, "This road will have two viewpoints with pradu trees lining the road, so people looking back at the road from afar will see a path of yellow flowers meandering through the jungle. The road itself will become a tourist attraction."

"We would like to see bicycle rental shops at each end of the road, so tourists can rent pushbikes and enjoy the ride along the scenic route," Mr Songjit added.

Patong Mayor Pian Keesin voiced his support of the plan, but made it clear that CCTV coverage and tourists' safety must be made priorities. – *Saran Mitrarat* Romantic Peranakan

True impact of oil spill still unknown

CRUDE oil that washed up on Koh Samet's picturesque Ao Phrao beach has been cleaned up, though the true impact of last month's oil disaster may not be known for years.

At least 50 tonnes of crude leaked from a pipeline off Rayong province into the Gulf of Thailand on July 27. The oil drifted to Koh Samet the following day.

Measures taken in response to the spill were stepped up after the oil reached Ao Phrao on the night of July 28, The Nation reported.

An emergency response team from PTT Global Chemical Plc (PTTGC), which owns the offending pipeline, arrived shortly after.

Following the cleanup operation, which also involved thousands of Royal Thai Navy personnel, oil has disappeared from the sea surface. Divers who checked coral reefs at a spot north of Ao Phrao said no coral had died. Around Khao Laem Ya and Ao Phe, seagrass showed no signs of being affected.

More than 560 entrepreneurs and other people affected by the leak have sought compensation from Rayong provincial office. PTTGC has also promised to compensate all those affected.

Questions remain, however, about whether the state oil and gas giant used an excessive amount of chemical dispersant on the spill as it drifted away from the site.

PTTGC said it used over 32,000 liters to disperse the oil but Pollution Control Department officials said they had allowed PTTGC to use only 5,000 liters. There is no penalty for excessive use of oil dispersant.

Army Chief Prayuth slams monarchy-rumors over protests

ARMY chief Gen Prayuth Chan-ocha has moved to quash rumors that Their Majesties The King and Queen's move to Hua Hin from Siriraj Hospital last week was connected to the anti-government protests underway in the capital.


Some claimed, on social media sites, that Their Majesties The King and Queen's move out of Bangkok signified the seriousness of a looming confrontation or a lack of confidence in the government.

His Majesty The King has been treated in Siriraj Hospital since 2009, with HM the Queen joining him there last year after suffering a stroke. Gen Prayuth said there was no truth in the rumors, which were unfair to the royal family.

The general also criticized people who spread rumours of a military coup and told others to hoard food supplies. The government is understood to be looking at charging some of those who did so with violation of the Computer Crimes Act.

Gen Prayuth said he was happy with HM The King's improving health.

The general said he did not agree with certain statements made at a rally held by an anti-Thaksin Shinawatra movement that

referred to the monarchy. He said that the monarchy played no part in Thai politics and stayed neutral and beyond political conflicts.

Fresh wave of Deep South bombings mocks ceasefire

THE Ramadan ceasefire was left in tatters after violence continued unabated in Thailand's troubled Deep South during the Islamic holy month.

In the early hours of August 2, suspected insurgents carried out a series of coordinated arson attacks in Pattani, Yala and Songkhla, The Nation reported.

Among the targets for destruction were three rubber factories and nine other businesses. Damage was in the billions of baht.

The wave of burnings appeared to be aimed at disrupting peace negotiations underway in Malaysia between the Thai government and the Barisan Revolusi Nasional (BRN), an insurgent group.

The attacks, which saw no civilian casualties, were carried out by "teenagers with a differing stance" to the BRN who are active in all areas under insurgent influence, said National Security Council (NSC) Secretary-General Paradorn Patthanatabutr at a Government House press conference.

"There have been efforts to disrupt and derail the peace process, but Thai authorities will continue to push ahead, because those with differing opinions are not great in number, although they are highly capable operatives," he said.

The fact that militants had disregarded the presence of a platoon from a cavalry unit less than a kilometer away from the incinerated Teck Bee Hang rubber factory illustrates their indifference to the government's military presence – as well as the claim the two sides reached a ceasefire agreement during Ramadan, which ends with 2004 Tak Bai massacre.

Mr Yakob survived an assassination attempt in October 2011. He was a moderate cleric who often and openly criticized violence by insurgents.

Thailand is to seek a more comprehensive explanation from the BRN over why violence has continued despite the peace agreement.

Mr Paradorn said he had assigned the Southern Border Provinces Administration Center (SBPAC) to collect information on the attacks in the region before formally seeking clarification from the Malaysian government, a facilitator of the dialogue between the Thai government and the BRN.

Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand to overhaul national grid

THE Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand (Egat) is considering selling off its 900-megawatt Unit 2 of the North Bangkok Power Plant to a 2-billion-baht infrastructure fund to be used to upgrade the national power grid.

If the fund draws investors, the controversial coal-fired Krabi Power Plant might also be sold to it, Egat Governor Soonchai Kumnoonsate said on Monday.

The fund is part of Egat's plan to spend

303.18bn baht on power plants and improvements to the national grid by 2017, including replacing the high-voltage transmission lines that failed in May, plunging all of Thailand's 14 southern provinces into darkness for hours.

The fund will offer a higher return than banks and give an opportunity to people to own the plant, Governor Soonchai said.

Construction of the 800MW coal-fired

Krabi Power Plant is scheduled for completion by 2019.

Governor Soonchai defended the use of coal-fired plants, saying they are needed to ensure national power security and affordable electricity bills.

The share of electricity generated from natural gas would be reduced to 40 per cent from 70 per cent in the Power Development Plan of 2013 under a revision expected to be finished by year-end.

The share of coal-fired power is expected to be raised to 30 per cent from 18 per cent, Governor Soonchai said.

Governor Soonchai, the 12th Egat governor, outlined his policies and mission after taking office on July 31, replacing Sutat Patmasiriwat, whose term expires on August 30.

Mr Soonchai was promoted from deputy governor in charge of power-plant development.

Tensions rise over gun crime, deaths

HIGH-profile shootings and a surge of deaths of suspects in custody are stoking public anger in Malaysia, piling pressure on the government to tackle crime and clamp down on police corruption and brutality.

An execution-style hit on a former bank chief executive in Kuala Lumpur on July 29 – and the shooting of an anti-crime campaigner over the preceding weekend – have forced Prime Minister Najib Razak's government to respond, less than three months after it scraped through a general election with a depleted majority.

Najib called on the police on Tuesday to take "immediate and serious" action to restore public confidence. The government has also fast-tracked plans to submit a new security law to parliament this year that would replace a draconian Emergency Ordinance Act that Najib abolished in 2011.

"We cannot allow the situation to persist," Najib was quoted as saying by state-run Bernama news agency.

"Immediate and serious action must be taken by the authorities to bring back public peace and confidence."

But rights groups say the government is failing to tackle a culture of impunity and corruption in the police force that is a major root of the problem.

Since the beginning of the year,

12 people have died in Malaysian Police custody, compared with just nine for the whole of 2012.

So far, only three policemen, all related to a single custodial death, have been charged.

The campaigner shot and seriously wounded on Saturday, R Sri Sanjeevan, had said he had evidence of police involvement in illegal gambling and drugs, among other criminal activities, and said he had received death threats related to his work.

According to information given in the Malaysian Parliament, 230 people have died in police custody since 2000.

"The police enjoy almost complete impunity in these cases,"

Amnesty International's campaigner on Malaysia, Hazel Galang, said in a statement issued last week.

Phil Robertson, deputy Asia director of Human Rights Watch, and other rights campaigners say Malaysia needs to set up an independent commission to investigate police abuses.

That step was recommended by a Royal Commission of Inquiry in 2005, but has never been implemented. – Reuters

TROPICAL Storm Jebi claimed the lives of six people after making landfall in northern Vietnam early last Saturday.

Eleven others were injured and hundreds of homes were damaged by the fifth tropical storm to hit the country this year.

Quang Ninh was one of the hardest hit provinces, with two dead, three injured, and two antenna masts and 14 electric poles toppled. More than 320 houses and 200 hectares of crops were also damaged. -VNS

Myanmar airlines set for local launch

FOUR new airlines – Yadanabon. Saga, Apex and FMI - are preparing to launch domestic flight services, reports the Myanmar Department of Civil Aviation.

Yadanabon and Saga will base their companies in Mandalay and the rest will base in Nay Pyi Taw, the official capital of Myanmar.

They are all said to be owned by Myanmar nationals and FMI is already operating its Yangon-Nay Pyi Taw flight services with aircraft leased from Myanma Airways as it has yet to acquire its own aircraft. - Eleven Media

Four neo-Nazis jailed for killing spree that terrified Hungary's Roma

A HUNGARIAN court jailed four neo-Nazis on Tuesday for killing Roma families in a spree of racist violence in 2008 and 2009 that shocked the country.

The gang killed six Roma and wounded several others in carefully planned attacks across the country over 13 months.

Three men were jailed for life without parole and a fourth for 13 years, also without parole.

Cuban death toll from methanol sold as rum hits 11

ELEVEN Cubans died last week and more than 60 are in hospital after consuming toxic industrial methanol sold as rum, state media reported on August 2.

The poisoning cases emerged starting on Monday after poisonous wood alcohol was stolen from a warehouse and then passed off as rum.

Three suspects have been taken into custody, although their identities and the charges they face have not been disclosed.

Fukushima nuclear plant leaking radioactive water

HIGHLY radioactive water seeping into the Pacific Ocean from Japan's crippled Fukushima nuclear plant is creating an "emergency" that the operator is struggling to contain, an official from the country's nuclear watchdog said on Monday.

The contaminated groundwater has breached an underground barrier, is rising toward the surface and is exceeding legal limits of radioactive discharge, Shinji Kinjo, head of a Nuclear Regulatory Authority (NRA) task force said.

Countermeasures planned by Tokyo Electric Power Co are only

a temporary solution, he said. Tepco's "sense of crisis is weak," Kinjo said. "This is why you can't just leave it up to Tepco alone" to grapple with the ongoing disaster.

"Right now, we have an emergency," he said.

Tepco has been widely castigated for its failure to prepare for the massive 2011 tsunami and earthquake that devastated its Fukushima plant and has also been lambasted for its inept response to the reactor meltdowns. Additionally, it has been accused of covering up shortcomings.

It was not immediately clear how much of a threat the contaminated groundwater could pose. In the early weeks of the disaster, the Japanese government allowed Tepco to dump tens of thousands of tonnes of contaminated water

into the Pacific in an emergency move.

The toxic water release was heavily criticized by neighboring countries, as well as local fishermen, and the utility has since promised it would not dump irradiated water without the consent of local townships.

"Until we know the exact density and volume of the water that's flowing out, I honestly can't speculate on the impact on the sea," said Mitsuo Uematsu from the Center for International Collaboration, Atmosphere and Ocean Research Institute at the University of Tokyo.

We also should check what the levels are like in the sea water. If it's only inside the port and it's not flowing out into the sea, it may

not spread as widely as some fear."

Tepco said it is taking various measures to prevent contaminated water from leaking into the bay near the plant. In an emailed statement to Reuters, a company spokesman said Tepco deeply apologized to residents in Fukushima prefecture, the surrounding region and the larger public for causing inconveniences, worries and trouble.

The utility pumps out some 400 tonnes a day of groundwater flowing from the hills above the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear plant into the basements of the destroyed buildings, which mixes with highly irradiated water that is used to cool the reactors in a stable state below 100 degrees Celsius.

Tepco is trying to prevent groundwater from reaching the plant by building a "bypass" but recent spikes of radioactive elements in seawater has prompted the utility to reverse months of denials and finally admit that tainted water is reaching the sea.

"If you build a wall, of course the water is going to accumulate there. And there is no other way for the water to go but up or sideways and eventually lead to the ocean," said Masashi Goto, a retired Toshiba Corp nuclear engineer who worked on several Tepco plants. "So now, the question is how long do we have?"

Contaminated water could rise to the ground's surface within three weeks, the Asahi Shimbun daily newspaper said. - Reuters

New Zealand's clean, green image under scrutiny with dairy scare

FOR a country that markets itself to the world with the slogan "100% Pure", New Zealand's environmental credentials are not as impeccable as many would think.

The majority of its rivers are too polluted to swim in. Its record on preservation of natural environments is among the worst in the world on a per capita basis. And it is the only Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) country that does not produce a regular national report on its environment.

The discovery by dairy giant Fonterra of a bacteria that can cause potentially fatal food poisoning in ingredients sold to eight countries, exposes New Zealand's vulnerability to food safety scares and the fragility of the clean, green image underpinning its farming- and tourism-based economy.

Agricultural exports, including dairy, meat, fruit and wine, command high premiums internationally thanks to New Zealand's reputation as a producer of safe, natural and high-quality food.

"It was only a matter of time before our dirty little secret came out," said Jill Brinsdon, brand strategist at Radiation, a brand agency in Auckland.

"Fonterra is our largest exporter and they're completely intertwined with New Zealand's image and also they're the absolute biggest benefactor of the '100% Pure' brand. When you're coming out with something that presents itself as fact, or 100% pure, then you have to be 100% pure and we've proven that we're not."

New Zealand's primary sector accounts for some 60 per cent of exports and 18 per cent of the country's US\$160 billion GDP, among the highest proportions in the developed world. Tourism makes up another 10 per cent or so of the GDP. – *Reuters*

Asian groups may invest US\$150bn in markets abroad

Assets in West eyed by Asian financial institutions


INSTITUTIONAL investors based in Asia could look to invest in excess of US\$150 billion in global real estate over the next five years, though not necessarily in domestic markets.

According to the latest research from leading global real estate services provider, CBRE, since there is limited investable stock available in Asia, such investors – including banks, insurance companies as well as organizations managing various types of pooled funds – will likely seek opportunities outside of Asia – in London, New York, Sydney and other gateway cities.

Cash-rich Asian institutional investors currently control a fifth of global institutional capital; however, the current low global interest rate environment and weak stock market performance means they face significant challenges in maintaining adequate returns on their investments.

Many of these investors have begun to recognize the benefits of adding real estate assets to their portfolios, but despite a sharp increase in investment activity in recent years, presently allocate just 1.7% of their assets to real estate, compared to 6-8% among institutional investors in North America and Europe.

The lack of overseas investment experience, regulatory restrictions, limited investable stock and aggres-




sive pricing have posed significant challenges for investors seeking to expand their portfolios within the Asian Pacific region.

This has prompted Asian institutional investors to seek opportunities overseas, with core assets in gateway cities the most sought after asset class. Acquisitions by Asian investors outside the region surged from US\$2 billion in 2008 to almost US\$9 billion in 2012, with Asian institutions accounting for a large portion of the purchases. Europe is currently the major focus for Asian investors followed by North

> America and Australia. As Asian institutional investors diversify into lowrisk alternative asset classes, more are expected to increase their allocation to real estate.

A conservative estimate of increasing their allocation to real estate to 2.5-3.5% in the next five years – allowing for a steady increase of asset size at 4-6% per annum – would translate into a potential inflow in excess of US\$150 billion (including direct and indirect real estate investment) into the global real estate investment market.

The large volume of prime commercial property currently in the development pipeline in Asia Pacific will partly alleviate this pressure; however, this new stock will still be insufficient to meet the demand of the large volume of institutional capital earmarked to be invested in real estate. In addition, other investors such as Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs) and end-users will also be competing to acquire new



properties, a situation which may result in a prolonged period of structurally low yields for core assets in Asia.

Chris Ludeman, President, Global Capital Markets, CBRE, commented: "Asian institutional investors are already beginning to acquire assets overseas, with core assets in gateway cities being the most sought after asset class. Given the numerous challenges they face domestically, most groups are likely to target other major markets, particularly in Europe and North America," he continues.

"While investors that have already had exposure in global markets will continue to acquire new assets, the next few years will see a number of new entrants to leading global real estate markets such as London and New York. Japanese institutions, which to date have largely been absent from the global scene, as well as Taiwanese and Chinese insurance companies will be the first groups to emerge."

The past year has seen several markets make progress towards liberalizing outbound investment in the insurance sector. In October 2012 the Chinese Insurance Regulatory Commission (CIRC) relaxed its restrictions on overseas investment by domestic insurance companies. Chinese insurers are now permitted to invest in completed commercial properties in the gateway cities of 45 designated countries. In Taiwan, discussions about permitting domestic insurance companies to invest in real estate offshore are ongoing.

Marc Giuffrida, Executive Director, Global Capital Markets, CBRE, commented: "We are seeing an acceleration in enquiry levels and deals closed in just about every global gateway market. We initially advised a handful of the larger pension and sovereign funds, and now these first-movers have started harvesting their 2009 vintage assets.

The market has seen how successful they have been in both protecting capital and exceeding their investment hurdle rates. These positive results provide tangible evidence and confidence for the more cautious or skeptical that global real estate can add value and most importantly is accessible."

Lightning struck near to the house and within seconds a torrential downpour ensued which brought about the inevitable black screen of unhappiness.



Yet we have an award winning, high quality product made locally. And it attracts certain people, the early adopters who realize the quality and uniqueness. But we have to educate others about our product, how

different it is from the Lao Khao which is the name given to all locally made white spirits.

TS: The culture of spirits and rum is not as wide spread and old here as in Europe for example. Little by little, by sharing our rum tradition and heritage, we bring and contribute to the

development of a complementary spirit culture. There is a part of cultural aspect of it. When we look at this trend on the market we see a strong interest in local, and boutique products.

How do you educate people?

TS: We have different types of events. We partner with bars, hotels and restaurants where we promote the product and educate clients about it. We try to retain very close proximity with the consumers.

ML: We recently opened the distillery for visitors. Our clients and anyone interested can come here and learn about the product. It's a unique opportunity for many people from the industry to see a distillery.

We organize food and beverage training, private events, cocktail workshops and so on. The distillery is also open for visits Monday to Saturday, from 4pm to 6pm.

Who is your target group and where can we buy your product? ML: Our rum is a

nice souvenir for tourists - it's local, it's high quality and it's truly a mix of two heritages, the tradition of Thai sugarcane of Thailand, and the distillation heritage of France at the same time.

But our market is first of all Thailand, both Thais and foreigners. We're happy to offer something that is a little different, yet goes well with the tropical spirit of the place. Chalong Bay Rum is available at the distillery and in a few outlets around the island, mostly wine shops. In most 5 star resorts and hotels, you can enjoy Chalong Bay cocktails.

What are your prospects for the future?

ML: The idea we have is to stay traditional. We merge traditions, history and heritage. We fill in the bottles by hands, we cap them by hands, seal them by hands and

personally stick the labels on the bottles.

TS: We want to establish Chalong Bay as one of the main brands of natural rum. On a short run it's not our goal to end up in supermarkets but in the long run we'll have to be available wherever other products from the same category are available. It is a long term project and long term strategy of product introduction into the market. We just started nine months ago and we're looking at a 5 to 10 year perspective. But it's looking good.. We talk to people who are tasting our product and the feedback is very positive.

Sounds like a lot of work, how do you divide it?

TS: I take care of the engineering side of things. I grew up in a wine estate with pipes and tanks around me. It's all liquid management and I know how to do it. But I'm also responsible for distribution, sales, promotion, and marketing. I'm involved in the production too, as it takes a lot of time so we have to divide the responsibilities.

ML: I'm passionate about biochemistry and spend my time here in the distillery, taking care of production, sourcing, legal aspects, among other things. But we both work on marketing together. We founded Chalong Bay together and we dedicate all of our souls, bodies, love and attention to this idea. It is the passion and faith in the project that keeps us going.

Phuket paradise: It's the bomb

NEWS of the the unprecedented bomb attack outside of the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO) offices on August 1 came as just the latest blow to the reputation of Phuket as a safe tourist destination. Fortunately, nobody was physically harmed by the explosion, though a number of vehicles were damaged (*see page 1*).

While the bombing itself was as completely unexpected as the 2004 tsunami disaster, the reaction to it by officials at Provincial Hall was nevertheless predictable; they were quick to downplay its significance, speculating that it was meant to intimidate, rather than cause injury or death.

Evidence collected at the scene would appear to support such conjecture, but until a complete investigation is carried out, downplaying this troubling incident is premature.

Terror attacks involving improvised explosive devices (IEDs) tend to come in spates. Those responsible – whatever their motives – tend to use them more and more as their "expertise" increases along with their sense of impunity.

Anyone unconvinced of this fact should review the trend in the three southernmost provinces, where hardly a day goes by – even during Ramadan – without a terror attack involving IEDs, despite elements on both sides of the conflict having agreed to an informal truce during Islam's holiest month.

On the topic of the Deep South, many online posters were quick to link the bomb in Phuket with events in Pattani, Yala and Narathiwat.

While reserving final judgment until results of the police investigation have been revealed, we find it highly unlikely that the August 1 bomb could be directly linked to the conflict in the Deep South.

Fear of such an attack has understandably been the single greatest concern among tourism industry analysts since that conflict began to spiral out of control under the hardline policies of former PM Thaksin Shinawatra.

But in reality, there are so many conflicts of vested interest in Phuket at the moment that the number of possible motives is already enough to give conspiracy theorists plenty of entertainment.

That said, there has been much discussion lately about establishing the three troubled provinces as a special administrative zone, where citizens elect their own governor, in the same fashion as Bangkok and Pattaya. If and when such a bureaucratic effort gains momentum, the Thai Government should do the same for Phuket.

The current "shuffleboard bureaucracy" is clearly not working on this island any better than it is in the Deep South. The August 1 bomb is only the latest reminder of this obvious fact.

Health insurance for tourists at 7-Eleven

First PERSON

THE cost of treating uninsured tourists at Patong Hospital totals about a million baht every year. At Vachira Phuket Hospital, the total is about 3 million baht.

In 2011, 15,000 tourists were treated at Patong Hospital. In 2012, the number increased to 17,000, and this year it is expected to hit the 20,000 mark. Only 400-500 of these tourists each year hold health insurance. The rest of them pay the medical fees out of pocket if they can. If they can't, we are left holding the bill.

The way to solve this problem is to make travel insurance a requirement for entering Thailand or make it a lot easier to get.

The Public Health Ministry is considering making it a requirement

for uninsured tourists to get travel insurance on arrival. In this case, the insurance would be available at the airport for the tourists to buy, according to the number of days they plan to stay.

However, this proposal is still under discussion with relevant or-

ganizations such as Immigration and the Ministry of Commerce.

In my opinion, insurance on arrival is probably not convenient for either tourists or officials because it would slow down the immigration process. I think it would be more practical to require tourists to get insurance before they arrive. If they come on a tour, medical bills reached 200,000 baht.

the cost of travel insurance could be included in the package.

Another idea is to make insurance available at stores such as 7-Eleven. Tourists could just buy it the same way they buy prepaid phone cards. They would select a card based on the number of days they are staying

here. That way they'd be covered while here. The problem with this is that

it's impossible to make sure that every tourist would buy insurance. Once they're in the country, what they do is out of

our control. The issue particularly affects

Patong Hospital and Vachira Hospital since uninsured tourists are sent to us.

I'll give you an extreme example. Two months ago we had a Filipino tourist who suffered a hip fracture. He had neither insurance nor the money to pay. He staved with us for two months and his He couldn't pay any of it.

At Patong Hospital, we treat all tourists the same, whether they have insurance or money to pay or not. In fact, until recently doctors weren't aware until the day of discharge whether or not a patient could afford the medical fees.

Now we have a new system, and summarize the bill every two days. That way, if someone can't pay, we know it sooner and have a chance to recuperate the costs.

The health of the patients comes first, of course, and if they are critical, we continue to treat them until they are better, regardless of their ability to pay.

But if, for example, we know on the second day that they are unable to pay, and they are recovering well and able to leave the hospital, we will discharge them.

In cases where they are not well enough to leave, we contact their embassy and report the problem. The embassy tries to get in touch with the family of the patient in their own country and ask them to help get the patient home.

Health insurance for tourists is a problem that needs a collective effort to solve effectively. Hopefully we'll find a solution soon.

Worthy of the title

APPROACHING Phuket Town from the north at dusk provides a magical moment. At the intersection of Thepkasattri and Thalang Roads, the ivory-white Song Nuan Pharmacy building is cinematically lit with colors that manage to stay just on the right side of garish.

Every time I pass it on my daily two-wheeled commute home, and then proceed through streets lined with elegantly crumbling Sino-Portuguese and Peranakan shophouse architecture, I'm reminded that Phuket Town is possibly the most marvelous World Heritage Cultural Site that is not actually on Unesco's official lineup of such sites.

Phuket Town made a bid to get on that list in 2011, but failed the audition after a team of International Council on Monuments and Sites (Icomos) officials decided that the historic core of our provincial capital didn't tick all the requisite boxes.

Nevertheless, Phuket Town is one of three shimmering pearls of historic interest on the west coast of the Malay-Thai peninsula, and no less rich in heritage - or potentially aesthetically pleasing – than Penang's Georgetown and Melaka, 360km and 790km to the south respectively, as the Andaman sea eagle flies.

The omission of Phuket Town from the list seems like a glaring anomaly. Redressing it could deliver considerable gains to three Asean

Aren't all the tuk-tuk ranks supposed to have their fares posted? What is the correct fare from Nai harn Beach to Kata Beach? Hotel owner



Simplicity and style

A taste of Tokyo in Phuket Town

GINZA, located on Yaowarat road, is a relatively newcomer to the Phuket culinary scene. But within the space of just four months since it opened, the restaurant has already managed to garner quite a following. The popularity is largely due to the establishment's strict adherence to the pillars of Japanese cuisine – the freshest and highest quality ingredients.

The shop house setting of Ginza is redolent of the busy Tokyo street it is named after. And that's the intention of one of the restaurant co-owners, Nitichai "Yuth" Nenraksa, who lived and worked in Japan before building a career as food and beverage manager working for many top hotels in both Bangkok and Phuket.

"The tiniest of lanes in Ginza are always crammed with gems of eateries serving wonderful, freshly prepared Japanese food. I chose to establish Ginza in the old town of Phuket and hope it can recreate the same vibes," say Yuth.

Everything about Ginza is distinctly Japanese – from the rock garden and red banners that greet guests at the door, to the black and red color palette interior, tatami covered seating (there's room to place your legs so you don't actually sit on the floor),

and smart

minimalist tableware. Recently, Ginza has extended its premises to include a shop next door, with private rooms upstairs for a more intimate dining experience.

A quick glance at the menu reveals a rich picking of appetizers and I highly recommend: Cold tofu (silky bean curd topped with soy sauce, spring onions, ginger and dried fish flakes), octopus and cucumber salad (made with tentacles only, and is not for the squeamish), salmon roe with radish, and spicy chilled seaweed. All

the hors d'oeuvres are refreshingly light, a great filler to pick through and prepare your palette for the moresubstantial things to come.

As we sip the chilled nama sake (a kind of draught sake with round and fresh aftertaste), a plate of mixed sashimi arrives. Making up the combo are hamachi (yellowtail), maguro (yellow fin tuna), salmon, saba (mackerel from Finland), octopus slices and red snapper. All fish slices are served fresh, except for the saba. which is lightly pickled in rice vinegar, and the lightly blanched octopus slices or taka.

You may want to sample unagi, soy sauce smoked eels, which comes directly from Hamamatsu City in Nagoya, a place renowned for the best Unagi found anywhere in Japan. Unagi is made by grilling freshwater eel slowly over charcoal while sprinkling it with sweet soy sauce, the process produces crisp unagi with the most flavorsome tender flesh inside.

"Unagi is a delicacy that is associated with good luck and longevity," explains Yuth, who is a mine of knowledge when it comes to Japanese food.

If you need a little more "fillers" then sushi is your next choice. Here at Ginza the selection is endless, and you can choose from the basic nigiri mariawase (mixed sushi) and the more fancy futomaki, to the popular California rolls; a concoction made with vinegared rice, shrimps, avocado and

asparagus, among many other choices.

There's also a set menu for those lunching between working hours, that include a choice of grilled saba, tempura (battered prawns), ramen (noodles), katsu kare (pork with curry). All dishes are served with rice, pickle and miso soup, at a very reasonable price of 140 baht, with only additional 20 baht for either coffee or green tea.

Go to Ginza to experience authentic and superior Japanese food in a cozy setting and a friendly service. Call in advance so you can chat with Yuth who will show you how to drink chilled matsu sake with a pinch of salt from a square wooden cup. He may even fill you in with the virtue of sweetness in Japanese food. His enthusiasm and knowledge will surely add another dimension to your dining experience.



AEC is coming, are you ready?

IN 2015, the 10 member states of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (Asean) – Thailand, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, Brunei, Myanmar, Cambodia, Laos and Vietnam – will formally integrate their economies as part of the Asean Economic Community (AEC) initiative.

The AEC will be similar to the European Economic community (EEC) where participating countries will aim for developing and maintaining a single, unified production base and market.

According to the AEC blueprint, the region will enjoy a free flow of goods, services, investment, capital, and skilled labor, as to become a competitive economic region, have equitable economic development and integrate into the global economy.

Under this integrated framework, Asean citizens working in seven fields will be eligible to pursue employment and investment opportunities throughout the Asean region.

These fields are: engineering services, nursing services, architectural services, surveying services, accountancy services, dental practitioners, and medical practitioners.

With less than a year and a half to go, many unskilled and/or under-qualified Thais are concerned about their future prospects – after all, it's no secret that Thais have a general disadvantage when compared to their counterparts in neighboring countries in terms of English language ability.

But the question remains – Is it hopeless

or hopeful for the Thai population?

"Joining the AEC in 2015 will bring both positive and negative effects, but Thai people should not be afraid," insists Prakong Rakwong, chief of the Phuket Provincial Commerce Office.

"Some career paths will be more advantageous while others will be less. Anyway, we need to grow up and face reality. Our economy has to grow up, we can't just trade with our own domestic markets," he said.

"All we need to do is to prepare our people by providing some necessary knowledge about trading within the AEC," he added.

The AEC will soon make it easier for investment as well as facilitating the free flow of products, services and labor among Asean countries.

For example, there will be no tax on imported products, with some exceptions for products placed on sensitive lists which can be taxed between zero and five per cent.

These sensitive products vary from country to country, for example, in Thailand there will be four kinds of sensitive products – cut flowers, potatoes, coffee and copra.

Thailand is a major hub for tourism in the Asean region and Phuket itself is a very popular destination with many attractions. As such, it is expected that in 2015 there will be many more people coming to Thailand and Phuket as tourists, largely people from neighboring Asean countries.

It is also expected that Thailand, and Phuket in particular will see a major influx of foreign labor seeking work in the hospitality and construction industries. Phuket Chamber of Commerce secretary, Surachai Chaiwat comments that most tourists from Asean member countries will probably go to Bangkok because it's Thailand's capital city and because Phuket is an expensive city.

"Probably, more people who speak good English will come to Phuket to work," he says.

"Phuket's economy is already over and beyond AEC. In fact, it is an

international city. Phuket **employment in ar** itself contributes 30 per cent [about 200-300 billion baht] of Thailand's gross income from tourism, about 700-800bn baht last year".

"In the future when the airport extension is finished, there will be 12-20 million people coming in to Phuket, up from 7-8 million tourists currently. These numbers show that we do not have enough workers to serve the tourists, so Phuket, indeed, will need more workers.

"At the same time, it's crucial to develop our people skills to be ready for AEC," he added.

After Asean becomes effective, trade in the tourism, transportation and the car industry is expected to increase by approximately 25 per cent. The agriculture, construction and textile industries may feel the effects, because Thailand's production



AEC. In fact, it is an international city. Phuket Asean nationals working in these fields will be able to pursue employment in any member county under the AEC.

base may be moved to other countries which have lower wages.

In fact, for many large Thai businesses that aren't dependent on highly-skilled labor, such as those in the textile industry, it is only inevitable that their production lines will look to source the cheapest, unskilled labor available.

President of the Real Estate Sales and Marketing Association of Thailand, Dr Pairote Sukjan said: The [main] problem that will arrise in the AEC will be labor. Thailand's minimum wage rate is quite high at 300 baht per day. And so, we attract outsiders to come to work in Thailand.

"But as Thailand has never been colonized – unlike Malaysia, Singapore, or Myanmar – many Thai people don't speak very good English and that can be a big problem for them," he concluded.

AEC training for tourism

THE Department of Tourism and the National Institute of Development Administration (NIDA) will hold major training courses for entrepreneurs in the tourism and hospitality industry in order to prepare them for the opening of the ASEAN Economic Community.

Pasit Poomchusri, Deputy Director General of the Department of Tourism said the tourism and service industry which includes lodgings, restaurants, transportation, souvenir shops and medical tourism has an important role in the national economy and may be affected by the formation of the AEC in 2015.

Speaking at a press conference about the training project, Mr Pasit said most of the foreign visitors to Thailand are from Asia and Europe. It is therefore necessary for Thailand to maintain high standard of service in order to attract more visitors. Realizing this need and in a hope to push the potentials of Thai entrepreneurs, the Department of Tourism and NIDA with support from the Thai Hotels Association, the Thai Gems and Jewelry Traders Association and many other associations in the field, will hold a training course to raise the

standard of service and personnel in the industry.

More than 2,500 entrepreneurs in the tourism and hospitality sector are expected to attend the course which will be available free of charge over the duration of the next few months.

The training course will be organized in top tourist destinations such as Bangkok, Chiang Mai, Phuket, and many other provinces with high potential of expansion throughout the country. Those interested are encour-

Hedging your bets

FEW of us don't relish the sense of ownership, of having our own pad or plot. And since we want to feel secure, we build

walls around us to ensure that we can enjoy some privacy, as well as for a feeling of protection. As the saying goes: "An Englishman's home is his castle." But there are dissenters to this view. Robert Frost, the America poet, was wryly amused by his neighbor's insistence that "good fences make good neighbors." He quietly begged to differ.

I was reminded of the issue when visiting a magnificent two rai garden in Cherng Talay: "I see you have no stone walls", I remarked. "No", came the owner's reply. "The developers insisted on green screens, 'walls' composed entirely of plants." Very laudable and an initiative that should be copied elsewhere.

Alright, there are disadvantages. The dividing trees and shrubs needed to be planted on a steep earthen incline which separated each terraced plot. So there was an inherent problem with rain run-off and



leaching of the soil. However, plants with substantial roots were helping: trees such as

yellow cane and lady palms at the back, evergreen shrubs in the middle and smaller ground-hugging plants at the front next to the expanse of lawn. A stepped effect that Gertrude Jekyll, the originator of the graduated herbaceous border, would have approved. Such a mixed border planting is the

exception rather than the rule. In general, Phuket residents prefer to put uniform green screens against existing walls, or to create internal patterns – after the manner of the formal European garden. There is plenty of choice.

The most favored shrub seems to be the ixora, usually the dwarf, orange flowering variety called *coccinea*, though it also exists in yellow, pink or white hues. *Ixoras* are employed in many contexts: as screens to decorate motorway verges, as hedges in front of garden walls or as borders. The leaves are small and glossy, evergreen (important with a hedge) and

amenable to regular clipping, though this practice will reduce their prodigious blooming capacity. Ixoras are hardy souls, need little water and can withstand full sun.

I favor duranta repens (golden dewdrop), a vigorous grower which is also tolerant of a range of conditions. It will make a taller hedge than *ixora* – up to two meters and will form a dense bush when clipped. Look for the variety with bright yellow leaves. There is also a variegated form, and another with clusters of lavender flowers.

Both the Arabian jasmine (*J.sambac*) and wrightia religiosa are popular evergreen choices as screening shrubs. They have the added advantage of fragrant white flowers. Thais, who often use *wrightias* in containers as a movable screen, will tell you otherwise, but I prefer the bushier growth of *sambac*. Both are quite tall and can be pruned at the top to restrict height, both are evergreen and both can be propagated from cuttings. They will take longer to establish than duranta.

For a really tall barrier, many people go for

the hibiscus. In the right conditions, it will form an attractive hedge up to four meters high, replete with – usually – scarlet blooms. *Rosa sinensis* is underiably spectacular. but it is less amenable to Phuket's humidity than our earlier choices, is disease-prone, and will need to be toppruned to encourage bushy growth. Smaller and lusher-leaved variegated varieties, with leaves marbled with pink, red and green, have their adherents: properly trimmed, they will make neat, colorful hedges. Witness the formal planting in front of Chalong's Home Pro. Durantas and *ixoras* complete the picture.

Witness too the neat hedge next to the Pearl outlet on Chao Fa East next time you pass by. A dense, neat hedge which shields a giant sator tree, it is composed, surprisingly, of tamarind saplings. This shows you can make a hedge out of most things botanical... And we haven't even mentioned bamboo, or oriental box.

SOME plants do not relish a position where saline winds are a regular feature of life. In general, broad-leaved trees such as bananas, traveller palms and some with delicate fronds suffer the most. The leaves may split and allow the wind to pass through, but they will eventually shred and look ragged.

If these sail-shaped leaves are the most vulnerable, herbaceous plants such as heliconias or ensete which have broad leaves at the end of slim stems, will be affected.

As a general rule, use shrubs with small, leathery or glossy leaves such as tabernaemontana, or trees with open crowns. Other plants that will even thrive in sea breezes include the Indian milkweed (often used as a wind break), and the sea lettuce. The sea almond is a good choice (attractive late red foliage) as is the smaller geiger tree with its orange flowers.



Adenium will tolerate hot and dry conditions.

However, the blood type the center is desperately in need of is Rh negative, which is common among non-Asian foreigners.

treatment of a 66-yearold British national, Marc Harrington, who was injured in a motorcycle accident," she added.

To qualify as a donor you need to be between 17 and 70 years old (If you're over 60 you need a certificate from a doctor). People who have multiple sexual partners, HIV, hepatitis B or jaundice, a history of drug abuse, considerable weight loss or are members of sexual minorities do not qualify as donors.

"You should avoid for three days before the donation. Donors must also wait

for six months after having a tattoo or body piercing before donating blood or bone marrow," added Ms Pornthip.

So if you're up for it and want to do something decent, get enough sleep and avoid fatty foods the day before you show up to one of the places to donate blood. The blood center will accept donations at their headquarters on Rattanakosin 200 Year Road, next to Phuket Provincial Employment Office in Saphan Hin, on August 12 from 8:30am-4:30pm. NSA's hacker hookup hurt by spy scandal

recruit talented hackers could suffer from the recent revelations about its vast domestic surveillance programs, as many private researchers express disillusionment with the National Security Agency.

Though hackers tend to be antiestablishment by nature, the NSA and other intelligence agencies had made major inroads in recent years

in hiring some of the best and brightest, and paying for information on software flaws that help them gain access to target computers and phones. Much of that

goodwill has been erased after the NSA's classified programs to monitor phone records

and internet activity were exposed by the former NSA contractor Edward Snowden, according to prominent hackers and cyber experts.

A turn in the community's sentiment was on show at two major security conventions in Las Vegas this week: Black Hat, which attracts more established cyber professionals, and Def Con, which gets a larger gathering of younger, more independent hackers.

"We've gone backwards about 10 years in the relations between the good guys and the US government," said Alex Stamos, a veteran security researcher who was to give a Def Con talk on Saturday on the need to revisit industry ethics. Stamos has willingly briefed FBI and NSA officials on his work in the past, but said that he would now want their questions in writing and he would bring a lawyer to any meeting.

With top intelligence officials warning in March that cyber attacks and cyber espionage have supplanted terrorism as the top security threat facing the United States, the administration is trying to boost security in critical infrastructure and the military is vastly increasing its ranks of computer specialists.

The NSA, working with the

THE US government's efforts to Department of Homeland Security, has been lending more of its expertise to protect defence contractors, banks, utilities and other industries that are being spied upon or attacked by rival nations. These efforts rely on recruiting talented hackers and working with professionals in the private sector.

supportive of the government. NSA Director Keith the Black Hat conference was well received on Wednesday, despite a few hecklers. But at the larger and less expensive Def Con, where attendance is expected to top last year's

15.000, conference founder and government advisor Jeff Moss asked federal agents to stay away.

Moss last year brought Alexander as a keynote speaker to woo the hacking community. But he said the relationship between hackers and the government has worsened since then.

"I haven't seen this level or sort of animosity since the 90s," Moss said in an interview. "If you aren't going to say anything in these circumstances, then you never are."

The NSA's surveillance programs target foreigners outside the United States who pose potential threats to US security or who can provide intelligence for foreign policies. But the secret projects also scooped up huge amounts of American data, according to documents leaked by Snowden, triggering sharp criticism from many lawmakers and civil liberties advocates.

"What bothers me is the hypocritical bit - we demonize China when we've been doing these things and probably worse," said HD Moore, an executive at security firm Rapid 7.

At Black Hat, a casual polling station at a vendor's exhibition booth asking whether Snowden was a villain or a hero produced a dead heat: 138 to 138.

An American original entreprenuer


Books By James Eckardt

A BOOK that is self-published is called a vanity project. Don Battles shows a big chunk of vanity. Subtitled An Entrepreneur's *Journey in Life*, his autobiography Merchant of the Orient (Xlibris Corp. 2013, 292pp) is printed on glossy A4 sized paper and costs over 60 american dollars.


The text is clear and free of typos, yet weakened by the chronic repetition of words and phrases; "needless to say", "fortunately", "difficult", "a mess", "a big mess". The author does not strain for any descriptive brilliance: "Hollywood was beautiful and wonderful." "Amsterdam was full of life and very enjoyable." "Paris in the springtime was simply beautiful."

But for all his stylistic flaws, is the story of Don Battles worth reading? Hell yes!

This is the classic American dream story of rising from abject poverty to wealth through hard work, pluck, luck and true grit. He hated Russia and used his unspent Russian rubles to paste the wall of his hotel room with the words "Russia sucks". India sucked







Happy Birthday Your Majesty

ON MONDAY, August 12, Thais throughout the country and world celebrate one of their most cherished holidays – the birthday of their beloved Queen and Mother of the Nation – Her Majesty Queen Sirikit Kittiyakara, who turns 81 this year.

The day is also celebrated as National Mother's Day in the Kingdom. Born on August 12, 1932 in Bangkok, at the home of Lord Vongsanuprabhand – her maternaldaughter and the third child of His Highness, Prince Chandaburi grandfather – then-Princess-now-Queen Sirikit is the eldest daughter and the third child of His Highness, Prince Chandaburi Suranath (Mom Chao Nakkhatra Mangkala Kitiyakara) and Mom Luang Bua Kitiyakara. Her name, which was given by Rama VII, King Prajadhipok, means "the Greatness of Kitiyakara". HM spent her early years in the Thai capital, but joined her family in Europe in the 1940s. As her father was an ambassador, she traveled and lived in various countries including the United Kingdom, Denmark, France and Switzerland. It was at the Thai embassy in Paris that she became acquainted with the newly-crowned Thai monarch, HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej, who was visiting the "city of love" during a break from his studies in Switzerland. Sirikit is said to have served as HM the King's personal tour guide in Paris. In 1948, HM the King was involved in an automobile accident in Switzerland, and as the story goes, the young princess visited and

tended to him while he was recovering in hospital; a blossoming friendship soon bloomed into a budding storybook romance. The couple were married by April, 1950, a week before HM's official coronation ceremony. The Queen went on to bear the King a son – the Crown Prince – and three Princess daughters, all of whom followed in their parents' model footsteps, continuing to serve as active and revered figure heads in Thailand to this day. Coincidentally, Thailand started celebrating a Mother's Day in 1950, initially on April 15. This day was changed to August 12, starting from 1976, as directed in the "The Royal Mother of All Thai Citizens", published on July 6, 1977 by the Ministry of Education.

From that point on, Thais on August 12 not only honor and show appreciation for the life, deeds and accomplishments of their beloved Queen and Mother, they also take the opportunity to show love and gratitude to their own mothers. Indeed, Mother's Day is one of two days in the year in which Thais honor their maternal legacy – the other one is traditionally on one's birthday, which would not have been possible without the intensive effort of giving birth.

KOH Yao Noi is a little island located in between Phuket, Phang Nga and Krabi and is part of the Phang Nga province.

From the urban center of Koh Yao Noi to the extreme north of the island takes about 20 minutes by motorcycle. The first part of the road is quite smooth and allows you to see the locals going about their daily

tasks. The majority of the island's residents are Muslim, so it's common to hear the call of the local Muezzin and see entire families going to pray at the mosque.

Once this is done pigments are applied covering the entire surface and filling in the spaces created by the wax covered lines. The result is just amazing and if you are looking for something really authentic,

then this is the place to go.

Longtail boats leave for Koh Yao Noi several times a day from Bang Rong Pier on the east coast of Phuket.

To get to he nier turn east from the Heroines' Monument onto route 4027, then turn right at the sign for

Bang Rong and follow that road for a few kilometers to the pier.





MOSCOW (Reuters) - Usain Bolt is determined not to let the absence of some of his main rivals make him drop his guard as he tries to win back the 100 meters world title he lost two years ago.

Bolt, who retained his Olympic title last year, said after arriving in Moscow for the world championships that he was not worried he would repeat the nightmare of Daegu in 2011, when he was disqualified for a false start.

"I went to the Olympics, and now I'm back – back to regain my title. I'm even more focused that last time. So I'm going to get it done," the Jamaican told Reuters on Sunday, six days before the championships start.

American Tyson Gay and Jamaican former world record holder Asafa Powell will not compete in Moscow after failing doping tests. Jamaican Yohan Blake will not defend his title because of a hamstring injury.

Bolt, who has won six Olympic gold medals and is the 100 meters world record holder. denied their absence would affect his own motivation, pointing out that he had won titles before when big rivals were not competing.

"So for me I'm really motivated to go and show the world that even without nobody there, I can

ready to go," he said.

Bolt, whose main rival for the 100 gold is likely to be American Justin Gatlin, made it clear that winning was his priority, not setting a new world record in next Sunday's final.

"I never [try to] predict times, because you never know, it might be like this, you know, overcast, and slightly chilly, or it might just be warm. You never

still win. So I'm focused, and I'm know what can happen so that's my focus, and that's what I'm going out there to do, and [to] prove to the world that I'm still a champion," he said.

Bolt, 26, looked relaxed as he performed a set with DJs at a Jamaican-themed party in the Puma Yard in Gorky Park in central Moscow.

He said he would not jump the gun by discussing the doping tests failed by Powell and Gay, saying the full details were not known: "So, I don't want to judge anybody until I hear the final."

Bolt won 100, 200 and relay golds in the 2008 and 2012 Olympics. He also won the 100 and 200 world titles in 2009 and retained the 200 title in Daegu two years later.

He said he was open to a proposal by Mo Farah, Britain's Olympic 5,000 and 10,000 meters champion, to race each other over 600 meters.

"We don't know if it will happen, but we'll definitely be thinking about it, to see if it possibly could fit in our schedules. So we'll definitely look into it and see what can happen," Bolt said.

The 14th World Championships in Athletics will be held in Moscow Russia from August 10-18 2013.



SERENA Williams has already achieved her stated goal of winning a second French Open title this year but the top-ranked American is still not satisfied with her season despite having more fun than ever on tour.

Six other titles have been won this year alone by the 31-year-old, but compatriot Sloane Stephens upset her in the semi-finals of the Australian Open and Sabine Lisicki stunned her in the fourth round of Wimbledon.

"You know I'm not there yet with the way my year has gone, Williams told a small group of reporters on Monday at the Rogers Cup where she is the top seed.

"Everybody is like 'You've had a good year and I'm like, who?"

Williams said she is not satisfied unless she wins every big tournament that she enters, particularly the slams which account for 15 of her 53 career titles - a significant percentage.

"That's me," she said. "I work really hard to do the best, especially in grand slams.'

This season, however, her form at non-grand slam events has been dazzling, proof that she is as hungry as ever.

From 2005-2010, seven of Williams 12 titles came at the grand slams. Since the start of 2011 only three of her 16 crowns came at the majors.

"It's more or less evening out, but I am okay just winning grand slams," she said. "What makes tennis beautiful is the small tournaments that make you as a player and make you win the grand slams."

"I was talking to [my sister] Venus the other day and I said I am never going to stop," she said.

"I just love this sport so much and we were just practicing. It's just so fun. I'm having more fun than I have ever had."

Williams said she was thrilled to see former number one Martina Hingis return to doubles play.

Hingis launched her comeback last week at the Carlsbad Open with her partner Daniela Hantuchova, reaching the second round.

She and Hantuchova will also play in this week's Rogers Cup.

Serena and Hingis - who were once bitter rivals - got to know

each other better over the past year and half while Hingis was coaching at the academy owned by Williams' coach, France's Patrick Mouratoglou.

"It's great," Williams said. "She's so good and has great hands and sees the ball so well and she's fun. "It's really kind of cool."

"I kind of am waiting for her singles comeback, but I'm not sure she will," added Williams, who will play either Italy's Francesca Schiavone or South Africa's Channelle Scheepers.

August 10 - 16, 201 England saved by the rain gods

AFTER all the predictions that no play would be possible on the last day of the Old Trafford Test, the weather defied expectations long enough for Australia to put England under the cosh. At lunch they were struggling at 36-3, and on an increasingly unpredictable pitch, and with Harris bowling with real venom, the odds were slightly on the tourists pulling off an improbable victory. In the event, Manchester drizzle had the last say, the players went off three balls after lunch never to return, and England survived to retain the Ashes.

Controversy has stalked the series since day one, with several dubious umpiring decisions, and a back-up technology that has proved less than infallible. On the penultimate day of this Test and with Australia having to win to keep the series alive (already 2-0 down), the umpires stopped play for bad light, even though the artificial lighting was on. Few agreed with the umpires' decision. It was a pivotal moment in the series.

The game had been fascinatingly different from the first two Tests in which England had dominated almost every session. Now Australia, taking advantage of batting first on a flat, dry pitch and some indifferent English bowling, amassed a huge total of 527-7. Michael Clarke, in a welcome return to form, scored an almost

chanceless 178 – his 24th Test century, new boy Rogers hit his maiden test fifty, and the lower order, not for the first time, rubbed salt into England's widening wound by putting on 97 for the seventh wicket.

England closed at 52-2 overnight and looked in danger of following on, but a dogged century from Pietersen, who restrained his natural impulse to attack, 60 from Bell and late contributions from Broad and Prior, ensured that the follow-on was avoided. 368 all out. Siddle was again the pick of the bowlers with 4-63.

Hoping for quick runs, Australia pro-

moted Warner to open the batting and, perhaps spurred by his role as "pantomime villain", he scored a quick-fire 41, helping Australia to reach 177 -7, leaving England to score 333 to win. For the statistically minded, Englands' highest 4th innings winning total here is 294-4 against New Zealand in 2008.

Attention now shifts to Durham where the 4th Test will be held. Bairstow, with only 161 runs in 5 innings may well be dropped, Trott is out of touch, and there is a case for adding a seam bowler – possibly Woakes, Tremlett or Onions who are all in fine form for their counties.

The visitors may well stick with the side which has served them well at Old Trafford. They have a more balanced and varied pace attack than England, who are heavily reliant on James Anderson; an advantage which cancels out England's superiority in the batting and spin departments. The next two Tests and the return series "Down Under" are likely to be closely contested.

Certainly Australians think so. Some 330,000 advance tickets have been sold for the Antipodean matches. Who says Test cricket is dead?



Local champions talk Mauy Thai

The Gazette speaks to two local female Muay Thai champs about their love of the sport

THE Gazette's Mark Knowles caught up with two local female fighters who will be competing for the Queen's Cup this Sunday; Amy Sharp from Sumalee Gym and Teresa Wintermyr from Sinbi Gym.

Can you tell us a little bit about the tournament?

Amy: It's an event for Her Majesty the Queen's birthday and its sanctioned by the WMC the World Muay Thai council. I competed when they held the first event here in Phuket last year. It had a number of title fights especially for female fighters, so basically it's title defenses and more. There will be a lot of fighters with great titles competing but the WMC is one of the best titles I would say.

How long have you been involved in Mauy Thai?

Amy: I've been doing it for four years, I started Muay Thai for weight loss reasons, because I was about 120 kilo's before, I'd never done it before in England. I just started it when I came here, to work as a teacher at Phuket International Academy.

Teresa: I've been doing it for almost six years, I started here as well, I read in a magazine about a girl that came here to train in a Muay Thai camp in Thailand and I thought that sounded really interesting. I came here that first time and had my first fight and

then [left Phuket before I] came back again, and now have been living here for five years.

Do you hold any Titles in professional Muay Thai? Teresa: I hold the World Muay Thai Council world title for 118 pounds. I won that in December last year and I'll be defending it on Sunday.

Amy: I'm challenging for a different title on Sunday, but I have a current title from the King's Birthday [bout] when I fought in Bangkok and that one is from the World Professional Muay Thai Federation. So it will be a rematch with the same fighter but for a different championship.

Do you think training and competing in Muay Thai is becoming more popular with women?

Teresa: Definitely. It wasn't very common when I started five or six years ago, but in the last two years it has really become more popular.

Amy: I thinks it's people coming to watch it, and worldwide it's becoming more and more popular and huge gyms are springing up everywhere.

There are more fight events [outside Thailand], so people are getting to know about it more, so more people are coming here to train. And obviously now there are events like the Queen's Cup which are really good for female fighters.

getting higher for girls, there is a lot of high-level girls now, before there was a lot of fighters, but they weren't very good.

Why is Mauy Thai your sport of choice?

Amy: For me it's a good thing to stay focused and also to try and maintain a good weight and I just love being part of a team as well.

Teresa: The level [of skill] is **Teresa:** I like the lifestyle, because you train twice a day and full time.So it keeps you healthy and you have to take care of yourself and you have something to do. It feels like more of a profession it's not a hobby like it would be at home. I just like the lifestyle and it keeps me very healthy, mentally and physically.

Tennis Tips: natural service

THE most important fundamental for the serve is a loose wrist. This will keep your whole arm looser and flowing more naturally through the hitting zone. If your arm is loose you are less prone to injury and will get more power from less effort. If you have trouble with this, try a couple of serves with your pinky finger hanging off the bottom of your racket.

There are four words you need to remember to correct and improve your serve. "Hit up" and "snap down". We need to hit up because there is a net in front of us and unless you are as tall as Del Potro, geometry and physics show us it is impossible to hit down from the baseline and make it over the net. Snapping down will help you keep the ball from flying out.

Practice: how to coach yourself

We all miss serves, but we should make sure we do not make the same mistake twice. If you hit your serve



goes in or in the net (snap down).

If you hit it in the net, hit the next one long (hit up). When we overcorrect, it becomes easier to find our range. There is such a thing as a good mistake, and one that is not the same is a lot better than hitting the net over and over again.



Thai teens, sweet 16

HOSTS Thailand came in a disappointing 16th place at the 2013 Girls Youth Volleyball World Championship, held in Nakhon Ratchasima from July 26 to August 4, and contested by the top 20 teams in the world.

In the preliminary round, Thailand finished second of Group A - behind Serbia - and were followed by Puerto Rico, Egypt, and Tunisia.

Thailand lost their first match to Egypt on July 26, 3-1 (23-25, 21-25, 25-22, 19-25), scoring 88 and conceding 97 points.

They also lost their second match on July 28, to Serbia in straight sets (17-25, 22-25, 21-25) or 51 to 75.

Third time lucky, Thailand beat Puerto Rico 3-1 on July 29 (21-25, 30-28, 21-25, 23-25), and kept up their momentum in their final group match on July 30, beating Tunisia in straight sets (25-22, 25-20, 25-12)

Four teams that were eliminated from group play were Tunisia (Pool A), Agentina (Pool B), Algeria (Pool C), Mexico (Pool D).

Thailand were defeated by

China, the world youth number 1, in straight sets.

The Asian giants went on to win the overall tournament, defeating the United states in the final in straight sets (16-25, 21-25, 23-25), while Brazil beat Peru for third place.

Thailand finally lost to Serbia (3-2) and Egypt (3-2) to settle for 16th place – one place better than their current world ranking.

Most of Thailand's points this go-round came from Jiraporn Chaymon who collected 26 points including 22 spikes from 79 attempts.

Lady Elephants charge on in 2013 World Grand Prix

THAILAND senior women's volleyball team last Sunday beat Algeria in straight sets (25-7, 25-14, 25-13), putting the Lady Elephants in 15th place out of 20 at the end of the first week of the 2013 FIVB World Grand Prix, taking place this month in various venues worldwide.

Following losses to Japan (3-0) and Pool C hosts, Turkey (3-1), Thailand's victory over Algeria was their first of the tournament. Having lost all three of their matches. Algeria are dead last of 20.

Topping Pool C and the overall tournament so far, based on a 1.417 points-won ratio, was Japan, who won nine sets and lost only one - to Turkey, who won seven and lost three (to Japan) for a 6th placed sitting (1.141).

Thailand's points-won ratio is 1.086, with 201 won to 185 lost. In the second week, contested from August 9-11, the Lady Elephants are in Pool J in Yekaterinburg, Russia, along

Cuba and Italy, who after the first week of the tournament, were in 13th, 19th and 3rd place respectively.

In week three, Thailand will be hosts of Pool L in Bangkok from August 16-18, competing against Russia, Germany and Puerto Rico.

Upon the conclusion of the third week, only the top six teams will continue to the final round in Sapporo, Japan from August 28 to September 1.

Currently ranked 12th in the world, Thailand finished 4th of the Grand Prix last year.

Phuket FC fans demand and get coach resignition after 11th draw

SOME vocally active Phuket FC supporters got their way last Sunday when Paniphon "Tu" Kerdyaem resigned his post as Head Coach.

His resignition followed last Saturday night's disappointing 1-1 league draw with lower ranked Thai Tobacco Monopoly (TTM) FC at Surakul Stadium.

Scoring for Phuket on his home debut was Brazilian import Cristian Alex, with a header on 59 minutes. About 20 minutes later, TTM's Nigerian forward answered with an equalizer from long range.

Phuket came close to winning the game with several attempts, but as the stars in the clear skies would have it, the match would end in a draw.

Moments after the final whistle blew, several dozen home fans united in synchronized chants demanding: "Coach Tu – Get Out!"

Those who have frequented Surakul Stadium in the past few years, hardly lifted an eye.

"He [Coach Tu] had his chance to prove himself in the first half of the season, and draws just won't get us to the Thai Premier League (TPL), so to show his professional spirit, he should move aside for someone else," exclaimed one supporter.

The draw against TTM was the third in a row since the start of the season's second half – and 11th draw of the season out of 20 matches so far; Phuket FC have more draws than any other side in Thailand's 18-team Yamaha League One (YL1).

Following a busy Saturday night on the three main Phuket FC Facebook fan club forums, supporters' wishes and demands were answered on Sunday when Coach Tu posted the following message: "I would like to thank Mr Pamuk [Achiriyachai], Ko Eam, Ko Jieo [Niwat Nuisanga], the execu-

tive team and all the staff, players and fans who have supported me. I've been happy working with you all here, but in the end, I've had to consider resigning as Head Coach from this point on... Thank you... Paniphon Kerdyaem."

Coach Tu's league record of 6 wins, 11 draws and three losses, coupled with a cup record of 2 wins and 2 losses is actually decent when compared to the combined record of the previous handful of coaches that have passed through the last two seasons.

Under the leadership of at least five coaches in the 2011 and 2012 seasons in the second-tier national league, Phuket FC had an average win rate of 30.8%, a draw rate of 32.3% and loss rate of 36.7%.

Under Coach Tu's leadership in the first 20 of 34 league matches this season, the club's win rate was 30%, followed by a 55% draw rate and only 15% loss rate - clearly a major difference that fans overlooked in their unchecked expectations for the big leagues.

Nonetheless, replacing Coach Tu as acting Head Coach will be Niwat "Ko Jieo" Nuisanga, formerly an assistant coach.

Following the latest draw, Phuket dropped into 7th place with 29 points, while TTM remain in 15th with 20 points.

Seizing the 6th place spot from Phuket was Nakhon Ratchasima, who on Sunday prevailed at home 1-0 against the high-flying Air Force United "Blue Eagles", who subsequently dropped into second place of the league as a result, with PTT Rayong surging to the top following their 2-1 home win over Ayuthaya FC, also on Sunday.

Home victories by the Port Lions and Bangkok FC, over Rayong United and Nakhon Pathom, respectively, further deluded the promotion prospects for Phuket, who are now 8 points shy of 3rd place, the final promotion spot.




