Leading Patong businessman denies collecting fees for corrupt officials

PHUKET businessman and adviser to the Thailand Trade Organization Chart Chindapol has refuted allegations that he is a Patong extortion artist, and instead has pointed the finger at a government official.

Although unwilling to name the official, Mr Chart said that 50 million baht a month was collected from Patong businesses alone, while the "bagman" pocketed 3 million baht for himself.

A letter accusing Mr Chart of "distressing, threatening and persecuting local entrepreneurs" was sent to the Phuket Media Association on July 23 and signed off by the Association for Honest Patong Entrepreneurs.

The letter alleged that Mr Chart bragged of having local government officials, police and media all in his pocket, and was therefore able to engage in extortion more effectively.

"I know who wrote the letter and why the letter was written," Mr Chart said. "This individual is a local government officer, who has been impacted by the anti-corruption project that I initiated. But I cannot reveal the person's name at this time.

"I personally have received many complaints from Patong business owners about local government officers demanding extortion money,

totaling about 50 million baht a month. One corrupt official skims about 3 million baht off this a month," Mr Chart said.

Patong business owners bribe officials from at least 17 local government offices, Mr Chart alleged. The payoffs are to ensure officials overlook closing times for night-entertainment venues, the

sale of pirated goods and the use of illegal workers, among other illicit activities, he said.

Mr Chart also questioned the authenticity of the Association for Honest Patong Entrepreneurs, which he said was not a registered association...



Aussie scam claim puzzles authorities

AN AUSTRALIAN couple who told the Australian media that their luggage was tampered with and marijuana planted in it as they were leaving Bangkok may not have been telling the truth, the Gazette has found.

Georgia (a pseudonym) told an Australian radio station that she and her boyfriend believe they were set up to be scammed by corrupt Thai airport officials.

When the couple checked in at Suvarnabhumi International Airport for their flight to Phuket, Georgia said, they learned that their luggage was overweight and were told to lighten it or pay a fee.

When they left the airport and went to a nearby hotel to repack the bag, they noticed damage to two suitcases: a broken lock and a rip. On closer examination, they say, they found a handful of marijuana in a small bag in one of the bags.

After finding the marijuana, they contacted the Australian Embassy in Bangkok for advice, Georgia told the radio station and also the Australian national daily, *The Age*.

The embassy, Georgia said, advised them to throw away the contraband and change their travel

plans for their own safety.

However, when contacted by the Gazette, the Australian Embassy in Bangkok stated that it had no knowledge of the conversation.

"We would not give such advice," an embassy staffer said, "we would advise them to follow legal processes."

Further doubt was cast by air-

port official Chainarong Phutharutsud, Chief of Phuket Airport Customs Law Enforcement Sub-Division, who said luggage problems were generally discovered and reported by staff at the x-ray point.

Chief Chainarong advised reporting suspected scams to his department or the Tourist Police.

Bartender saved from the drink

FRIENDS of an intoxicated Phuket bartender saved him from drowning on August 26 after he decided to go for a swim at Patong Beach.

Surachai Junmee, 29, and five friends were drinking at Loma Park after they got off work at about 2am, Patong Police Capt Teerasak Boonsang explained.

"At about 6:30am, when they were quite drunk, they went for a swim – but Mr Surachai was carried away by the waves and disappeared," he said.

"His friends searched for him, and eventually found him and pulled him out of the water," Capt Teerasak said.

Mr Surachai was unconscious when pulled from the surf.

"He was taken to Patong Hospital and admitted to the Intensive Care Unit," Capt Teerasak said.

Patong Hospital staff confirmed to the Gazette that Mr Surachai has recovered from his ordeal, and been discharged.

Italian expat arrested for temple theft

AN ITALIAN expat down on his luck was arrested on August 26 after he stole 100 baht from a donation box at a Phuket temple.

Monks at Karon Temple (Wat Suwankirikhet) reported to police that a man had stolen money from a donation box several times, said Karon Police Deputy Superintendent Sophon Borirak.

When police viewed temple CCTV footage, they saw a man use a stick with chewing gum attached at the end to fish money out of the donation box.

Anticipating that he would come back, police hid in the temple to wait for him, said Lt Col Sophon.

"At about 6:30 pm yesterday, he came back, walked directly to the box and used the stick to take money from it again," he explained.

'Officers waited until he put a 100-baht banknote in his pocket before they moved in and arrested him," he added.

The man, identified by police

as Franco Minichelli, 54, confessed to police that he stole the money, said Col Sophon. "He told police that he had been

living in Phuket for 10 years and owned a seafood restaurant in Rawai that went bankrupt. "He was destitute, so he turned

to stealing the donation money," Lt Col Sophon said.

Mr Minichelli has been charged with theft.

Aldhouse pleads guilty

Confession may help British kickboxer to avoid death penalty

LEE Aldhouse, the British kickboxer extradited from the UK to face murder charges in Phuket, on Wednesday entered a plea of guilty to murdering former US Marine Dashawn Longfellow in Rawai two years ago.

The plea was entered after Judge Montri Saroj, speaking via a court translator, reminded Aldhouse that a guilty plea would likely "help" commute a possible death sentence.

"The highest penalty for this charge is death. If you accept the charge before the witness testimony, your confession can help commute the death penalty," Judge Montri said.

The court watched for 15 minutes as Aldhouse consulted with his lawyer, Public Prosecutor Tawan Sukyiran, and his translator before prosecutor Tawan turned to the judge and said, "Mr Aldhouse enters a plea of guilty."

Judge Montri asked to confirm with Aldhouse that the guilty plea was accurate, to which Aldhouse silently nodded.

Despite Aldhouse admitting to the crime, the trial will continue, Judge Monrti explained to the court.

"Even though the suspect has pleaded guilty, we will continue with the witness testimony to be fair to both parties," he said.

Court was adjourned and the next trial date for hearing witness testimonies was scheduled for September 2.

Aldhouse, also known by his kickboxing nickname "The Pitbull", fled Thailand on August 17, 2010, three days after the slaying of Mr Longfellow.

Accompanied by his girlfriend, he hired a taxi to take them to Koh Samui, but along the way decided to take a bus to Bangkok instead. They then made their way to the Klong Yai checkpoint at the Cambodian border.

Mr Aldhouse was able to depart the country and enter Cambodia at the remote checkpoint, which at the time had no online connection with Thailand's Immigration database.

Immigration Police only realized Aldhouse had slipped out of the country six hours after the fact.

The girlfriend, who may yet testify, returned to Bangkok by bus and was later picked up for questioning by police. She confessed to her role in aiding Aldhouse's escape and told investigators of his plan to return to England.

However, British sources familiar with the case told the *Gazette* that Aldhouse had fled the UK years before, after serving two

years in a Birmingham jail for his part in an armed robbery. He served two years of a five-year sentence for illegal gun possession, the source said.

He was arrested by British authorities upon arrival at Heathrow Airport, London.

Aldhouse is the first person to

be extradited from the UK to Thailand since a treaty was signed between the countries more than 100 years ago.

Before Wednesday, Aldhouse had long maintained that he stabbed 23-year-old Longfellow, but did not have the premeditated intention of murder.

Phuket resorts next up for demolition

MANOPAT Huamuangkaew, director-general of the Department of National Park, Wildlife and Plant Conservation, has warned that Phuket is now at the top of his priority list in demolishing illegal resorts encroaching on national park land.

Mr Manopat specifially identified Sirinath National Park, on Phuket's west coast, as his key interest in protecting public land in Phuket.

Meanwhile, the chief of the DSI's Consumer and Environment Protection Office, Prawuth Wongsinil, said his office would investigate only two of 11 resorts previously identified as encroaching on Sirinath National Park, and would not release the names of those alleged to be involved in the encroachment, including government officers.

Owner's mobile not on the menu

PHUKET City Police have released CCTV images of the man who robbed the Tung Ka Cafe at the top of Rang Hill on August 5 in the hopes that the public can help identify him.

The bearded, dark-skinned man stole the owner's 15,000-baht Samsung Galaxy and 2,400 baht she had left



on the counter in the 7am robbery.

Bones may bolster sea gypsy claims

HUMAN bones found at the sea gypsy settlement in Rawai may help bolster the gypsies claim that they have lived on the land for generations.

Parts of skull, arm, leg, and chest bones were found 20cm deep in a Department of Special Investigations (DSI) excavation that started August 20.

Prawuth Wonginil, a DSI chief, had earlier noted that if bones were found, outsiders making land claims would need to explain why they had allowed the sea gypsies to bury their dead on their land.

Stolen visas turn up criminals, cocaine in Phuket

PHUKET Police have recovered at least one of the 300 visa stickers stolen from the Thai Embassy in Malaysia late last month.

The stolen visa was discovered in the passport of Nigerian Ebogbulem Chinwemdu Romanus, 33, who was arrested by Karon Police on August 23 for possession of 1.33 grams of cocaine.

Phuket Immigration were notified on about August 19 and told to be on the look out for the missing stickers.

"We notified immigration officials at Phuket International Airport and every police station in Phuket," said Capt Angkarn Yasanop of Phuket Immigration.

By August 24, the Immigration Bureau reported that 11 suspects had been arrested with stolen visas so far.

Five were caught at Suvarnabhumi Airport and two in the border province of Songkla.

According to the Foreign Ministry, more than 250 of the stolen visa stickers have already been used. "As of August 24, authori-

ties had retrieved 55 of the visa stickers", said said Immigration police investigator Col Chatchai Eam-Seang.

The stickers, which have all been cancelled, bore the numbers A4049901- A4050000, A4055901-A4056000 and A5801901-A5802000, said Suvarnabhumi Airport Immigration commander Col Withoon Decho.

A Thai woman referred to as "Mama" was allegedly behind the case.

"She's active in Bangkok's Pattanakarn area. She's still in Thailand," a source told *The Nation*.

Ongoing investigation suggests that the foreign nationals handed over their passport, a photograph and 10,000 baht to "Mama" to apply for the visa, and a few days later, they were required to pay another 20,000 baht to retrieve their passport with the relevant visa.

Five Thai government officers are suspected of involvement in the visa theft.

Members of the group, which includes one Malaysian woman, had bank accounts showing transactions of over one million baht a month, said Col Chatchai.

The visa theft was initially kept under wraps by the Foreign Ministry in order to protect their investigation, said Deputy Foreign Ministry Spokesman Jakkrit Srivali.

...He also took his moment in the media spotlight to promote Patong as a Special Administration Zone, which he said would adjust the laws in the party town in a way that would cut back on corruption.

"Mindful that nightlife in Patong only really gets going at around 8pm, we could extend opening hours of entertainment establishments. Then business owners can be fairly taxed by the government, which is a preferable alternative to paying local officials under the table," he said.

Mr Chart said he was not worried about his personal safety, but more concerned about how the official would be able to convolute the truth for his own personal gain.

"I don't know how much power the persons has. He might be able to turn black into white, who knows," he said. Phuket Provincial Police Commander Choti Chavalviwat said police were powerless to act on the letter or Mr Chart's allegations until a formal complaint had been filed with the police.

"We have not heard of this case. However, if somebody wishes to file a police complaint, an investigation would be started," Maj Gen Choti said.

"We would of course provide fairness to all parties."



Deputy PM calls for 'one-stop' police counters for Phuket tourists, expats

DEPUTY Prime Minister Pracha Promnok has called for every police station across Phuket to have a dedicated section to receive complaints from foreigners.

The call came at a meeting at The Metropole Hotel in Phuket Town last Saturday, attended by Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut, Provincial Police Commander Choti Chavalviwat and other topranking police officers from the Andaman provinces of Phang Nga and Krabi as well as Surat Thani.

"The superintendent of every police station in the province should set up 'one-stop' sections to serve tourists and expats. This will make it much more convenient for people to file complaints and make it easier for officers in the police station to do their work," Deputy PM Pracha said.

He also called for police on the island to work together with the governor to help boost public safety in Phuket.

"Police and officials should share information in order to be able to provide better safety and security in Phuket. Security is a top priority not just for Phuket, but

for every province in Thailand in accordance with the policy laid down by the prime minister," Deputy PM Pracha said.

Provincial Police Commander Choti Chavalviwat highlighted efforts to boost police presence in tourist areas by involving Thai and foreign volunteers.

"Our officers work with many volunteers – Thai and foreign. In some police stations in tourist areas we have translators available to assist tourists," Maj Gen Choti said.

"Also, additional officers will patrol areas where many tourists stay. We are continuing our efforts to have illegal taxi and jet-ski operators become legal, and so far we have 343 CCTV cameras around Phuket.

"We will add 2,400 more cameras with a budget of 89 million baht," Gen Choti said.

One fateful

THIS Saturday marks four weeks since three Thai musicians were quickly arrested for the stabbing murder of American tourist Bobby Ray Carter Jr and the assault of his 27-year-old son in Krabi.

Since then, however, the case has slowed to a crawl. A trial date has yet to be set, police have yet to press formal charges and all three suspects are out on bail.

The Gazette's Chutharat Plerin reports.

KRABI Police arrived at the Little Longhorn Saloon bar in Ao Nang at about 1:30am on July 31 to find blood spattered on the ground and reports that two foreigners had been seriously injured in a brawl with three band members at the venue.

One of the foreigners, 51-yearold American tourist Bobby Ray Carter Jr, had suffered deep stab wounds. His son, Adam, 27, had also been hurt in the fracas, suffering serious head injuries and a stab wound to the arm. Both had been rushed to hospital.

Bobby Carter was pronounced dead soon after arriving at Krabi Hospital.

The three band members – R a t i k o r n Romin,27, from Phang Nga; Nopanan Yoddecha, 26, from Krabi; and Sathid Somsa, 40, from Bangkok – did not flee the scene and were immediately arrested.

Hours later at Krabi Town Police Station, all three accepted charges related to brawling, but denied any intent to kill.

"We accept that we attacked

them, but we didn't intend to kill anyone," Mr Ratikorn said in his statement to police.

"The father and son came to the pub and they joined us singing on the stage. Then we had an argument with them because they refused to stop singing when the time was up. "The father knocked our tipbox to the floor. We left the stage and sat [outside] in front of the bar... After a while they came outside and started another argument with us. The father knocked me to the ground first, and I could not breathe because he was sitting on my chest.

"Then I spotted a sharp piece of metal nearby, so I grabbed it and stabbed him," Mr Ratikorn said

All three suspects were charged with inflicting bodily harm causing the death and assault. Mr Sathid was also charged with possession of an illegal firearm after

> he was found at the scene with a homemade gun.

Despite the fast initial action by police, however, the case has now drawn out beyond expectations and the initial murder charges by police have been rounded down to manslaughter

"The three suspects have now been charged with causing death by inflicting injury upon the body of such

person without intent to cause death," Krabi Town Police Deputy Superintendent Noppadol Mukda confirmed this week.

"We are now collecting more evidence so we can hand over the case to the Public Prosecutor as soon as possible," he added.

"The suspects have not been

night at the Longhorn Saloon

formally charged in court. So far they have only been presented with police charges," Lt Col Noppadol said.

"We have also yet to find the weapon," he added.

In order to continue their investigation, police were forced to hand the suspects over to the court, which subsequently granted all three bail.

"Police can detain the suspects only 48 hours before we must release them, so we asked the court to take them into custody. The court then granted them bail. That was the court's decision," Col Noppadol explained.

Officers at Krabi Court declined to reveal over the phone any information regarding the bail posted by the three suspects, including how much bail was posted or who may have provided a good behavior surety.

However, an officer at the court's bail division explained, "Bail is normally set at 500,000 baht for murder suspects, and at about 180,000 baht for assault causing death."

Krabi Provincial Police Commander Nantadech Yoinuan supported the court's decision.

To expedite proceedings, Bobby Ray's son, Adam, was permitted to give his statement to the court on August 5-7 and then return home to Dallas, Texas.

However, Krabi Provincial Police Deputy Commander Col Boontawee Toraksa declined to relate to the Gazette any statements given by Adam.



Adam's pre-trial testimony also raised the issue of which translators may be used in giving evidence, as the suspects refused a translator provided by the US Embassy in Bangkok.

"They had the right to refuse the translator, whether or not it postponed proceedings," Col Noppadol explained.

'As they were out on bail and the trial had not yet begun, they were asked to attend the sessions during which Adam gave his testimony. We could not force them," he said.

"The suspects were concerned the version of events relayed by the translator provided by the embassy would not be entirely accurate. However, they agreed to

court," he added.

Suspects must accept a provided court translator, but if a court translator is not available, they can demand to have one they deem appropriate, Col Noppadol explained.

"If everyone agrees, proceedings may go ahead and will be recognized by the court," he said.

"However, every person has the right to have a translator

present to assist in understanding evidence presented to the court," he said.

Krabi TAT office Director Wiyada Srirangkul confirmed that the TAT Krabi office does offer to provide translators for foreigners involved criminal cases, a development that arose from the case of a

Dutch female tourist who was allegedly raped in Ao Nang late last year. The case made international headlines following the posting of the YouTube music video "Evil Man from Krabi".

"We provide translators for tourists at the request of the tourists themselves or of their embassies. However, we did not provide a translator for Adam because the US embassy decided to handle it," she said.

NO PRESSURE

In bringing the case to trial, the public prosecutor in charge explained to the Phuket Gazette that police have 84 days from the day the suspects are presented to the court to actually press formal charges.

"We cannot tell how long it will take. The police have to finish their investigation first," the prosecu-

use a translator provided by the tor said, declining to be named by the press.

> 'We have not set a deadline for pressing formal charges, but it must be done within 84 days of the suspects being handed over to

the court," Col Noppadol confirmed.

Asked whether the case deserved to be prioritized, Col Noppadol said: "That is the judge's decision."

JAIL TIME

Although manslaughter charges incur jail sentences of three to 15 years, Mr Ratikorn confessing to stabbing Bobby Carter is likely to result in a relatively light sentence being handed down.

"If suspects confess, the sentence handed down is usually less severe. However, that all depends on the judge," the case prosecutor told the Gazette.

If jail time is demanded, the suspects are likely to serve it at Krabi Prison, which incarcerates prisoners who receive sentences of 10 years or less. Prison terms are normally served in the province where the crime was committed.

"However, if they receive sentences of more than 10 years, they will be sent to the maximum security prison in Nakhon Sri Thammarat," the case prosecutor explained.

Prisoners also receive reduced sentences for good behavior, which means they are likely to not serve full terms, he added.

Police move to detain Rohingya at purpose-built regional shelters

THE Royal Thai Police are lobbying Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra to build detention centers across Southern Thailand to house Rohingya refugees.

The move aims to relieve pressure on already-overflowing detention centers at immigration offices in Phuket, Phang Nga and Ranong.

Maj Gen Kraibun Suadsong from the Office of Police Strategy revealed the push for regional camps during a meeting with Deputy Prime Minister Pracha Promnok in Phuket last Saturday (see page 4).

"The Royal Thai Police thinks that it might be easier to take care of all 1,722 Rohingya being detained in Thailand if they were kept in the same place," Gen Kraibun said.

He explained that initial efforts to build a single facility to house all 1,722 Rohingya met strong opposition from local residents in Cha-uat District in Nakhon Sri Thammarat, the selected site for the proposed mega-camp.

"Local residents did not agree with the idea, so we selected another site at Dan

Singkorn in Prachuap Khiri Khan province," Gen Kraibun explained.

"However, by that time the committee involved in the project believed that having so many Rohingya held at the one location might make it easier for them to escape," he added.

"Instead, the committee finally agreed to seek to have the Rohingya at new purposebuilt shelters in Nong Khai, Prachuap Khiri Khan, Ranong and Songkhla," he said.

Landslide alarm installed on hills above Patong

A LANDSLIDE early-detection system costing 4-million-baht has been installed in the Patong Hills.

The system was installed because of high risk of landslides in Patong, Kathu and Karon, Thawan Sukkho of the Bureau of Geotechnology, Department of Mineral Resources, explained to Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut during an inspection last Friday.

"Usually landslides are triggered by rain of more than 100 millimeters. If this much rain falls, the device can calculate how soon a landslide could take place, and send a warning to the Mineral Resources Department, indicating whether we should evacuate the area in 30 minutes or two hours," Mr Thawan said.

"We will report it to local government offices in the risk area," Mr Thawan said.

THE senior officer in charge of collecting forensic evidence at the home of Norwegian national Stein Harvard Dokset recounted to the court on August 22 what his team encountered when they discovered the gruesome remains of Mr Dokset's slain ex-girlfriend, Rungnapa Suktong.

Mr Dokset, 50, stands accused of murdering Ms Rungnapa and leaving her remains to dissolve in an acid-filled trash bin in the basement of his Kata villa.

Mr Dokset appeared at Phuket Provincial Court at 9:40am. He entered the court room with a smile and greeted the lawyers present, including the prosecutors, with a respectful *wai*.

Proceedings got underway at 11am with testimony from Lt Col Kittisak Nuphueng of the Phuket Office of Forensic Science.

Col Kittisak explained to the court that Chalong Police called him to inspect Mr Dokset's luxury six-bedroom villa in Kata at 2pm on February 27, 2012.

His team went to inspect the house the next day at 5pm, coinciding with the raid during which Mr Dokset was arrested.

"In the bathroom of the basement bedroom, we found bones in a bin that was sealed with tape," Col Kittisak said. "There was still flesh on some of the bones."

"The bones were in a black plastic bag. On inspection, we believed the bones were human," he added.

His team also found red spots that looked like blood along the stairway to the second floor and in a bathroom adjoining a bedroom on the third floor.

"We took photos and collected samples for DNA testing," Col Kittisak said.

The samples were sent for forensic examination, he said.

"In a desk drawer inside the home office on the second floor, we found a woman's shoulder bag containing a loaded 9mm gun. Also inside the bag was a permit for the 9mm handgun issued to Ms Rungnapa," Col Kittisak said.

"As the senior officer in charge of collecting forensic evidence at the scene, that was the end of my role in the investigation," Col Kittisak told the court.

The lengthy delay in starting the trial proceedings on August 22 drew stern words from one of the judges presiding over the trial.

"This case is taking too long," he cautioned the prosecutors.

Three witnesses failed to show and a mix-up over who would be providing an English-language translator for Mr Dokset saw the judges waiting more than an hour and a half for proceedings to get underway.

"Four witnesses were scheduled to testify today: Col Kittisak, two case investigation officers and one of Dokset's ex-girlfriends," explained Suriyatham Thongsai, the lawyer representing Mr Dokset.

"But three of them failed to show up," he said.

The next trial date for witnesses' testimonies was set for November 8. In the meantime, Mr Dokset will celebrate his 51st birthday behind bars at Phuket Prison on September 9.

Market vendor arrested for decade-old murder

A USED-CLOTHING vendor at the Baan Lipon market in Thalang was arrested on August 21 on a Songkla murder charge dating back to 2002.

Police received word from police in Padang Besar that Jatejit Boonchai, a 36-year-old Trang native, was living in Thalang.

"We found out that he was selling secondhand clothing in the market," said Thalang Police Superintendent Sirisak Wasasiri said.

"So we went to the market yesterday afternoon [August 21] at about 3:30pm and arrested him as he was working. We brought him back to the station, and now are

waiting to transfer him to Songkla to face the charges," he said

Mr Jatejit also faces charges for the illegal possession of a firearm in connection to the 2002 murder.

Warship bursts into flames – again

THE decommissioned warship HTMS *Lanta* burst into flames last week while workers were repairing damage caused by a previous fire that broke out at the tourist attraction on July 3.

No injuries were reported.

Krabi Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) firemen took about an hour to squelch the flames on the warship, a tourist attraction in Krabi Town, on August 23.

Police believe that the fire started in the engine room on the second floor of the ship and then spread to the first floor.

"It is very possible that the fire was caused by a spark from welding being done on the second floor," Krabi *OrBorJor* President

Somsak Kittitornkul said. "The spark might have landed on the insulation foam, which is flammable."

The blaze is estimated to have caused more than 100,000 baht of damage, Mr Somsak said.

"We will have to reiterate the importance of being careful to the construction team. We don't want this to happen yet again," Mr Somsak said.

Some local villagers, however, believe that careless construction workers were not the source of the fire. Some explained that the *OrBorJor* might have set up the ship museum without conducting the necessary prayers and letting resident ghosts know first.

Nonetheless, the HTMS *Lanta*,

measuring 98 meters bow to stern, is expected to re-open to the public as a floating museum some time next year.

Dodging the Patong solution

PHUKET's leading environment officer this week speculated that the color of the seawater at Patong Bay turned an off-brown over last weekend possibly due to a "plankton bloom".

The news came two days after officials staged a press event, led by Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut, promoting the launch of a campaign to regularly test the quality of seawater at Phuket's key tourist beaches, starting with Patong.

"The initial tests on August 23 showed the seawater quality at Patong was within normal parameters," Dr Pornsri Suthanaruk, director of the Phuket Environmental Office Region 15, told the *Gazette*.

"However, we believe that the brown color of the water [on Monday] might be the result of a plankton bloom," she said.

Dr Pornsri explained that excessive amounts of "nutrients", in the form of nitrogen and phosphorus, likely fed plankton growth in the bay, spurred on by the days of bright sunshine Phuket had recently enjoyed.

Regardless, Dr Pornsri maintained that her office would await test results from samples collected before taking action.

"The Phuket Marine Biological

Center [PMBC] will test the water samples [collected on August 23] for coliform bacteria, total suspended solids and nutrients. We will also have experts collect samples of the plankton bloom to determine the exact type of plankton and what caused it to bloom,"

the environmental chief said.

PMBC Director Ukkrit Satapoomin, however, told the *Gazette* he had no doubt the bloom was the result of untreated wastewater being released into Klong Pak Bang, which discharges straight into Patong Bay at the

southern end of Patong Beach.

"The are two main sources of wastewater that are emptied into the Pak Bang Canal. I would estimate that about 40 per cent is overrun from the wastewater treatment plant. The remaining 60 per cent is from residents, hotels

and other private establishments in Patong," he said.

"The wastewater treatment plant cannot treat all the wastewater in Patong. The officials at Patong Municipality know about this problem and are trying to find a way to solve it – by setting up another wastewater treatment plant," Dr Ukkrit explained.

"However, this requires a large budget and the problem has yet to be resolved," he said.

Dr Ukkrit explained that his office has previously tested water in the canal.

"We found elevated readings of nitrogen and phosphorus, among other 'nutrients' [sic]. This could have come from only one original source: residents and businesses in Patong," he said.

Meanwhile, it may take weeks for the bloom to dissipate from Patong Bay, Dr Pornsri explained.

"If the plankton bloom is not fed further, the brown water will return to its usual clear-blue color after about two weeks. Plankton has a short lifespan and will die off," she said.

"In the meantime. Patong Municipality has been asked to forward water quality reports of hotels and companies operating in Patong to the Phuket Provincial Office of Natural Resources and Environment as soon as possible," Dr Pornsri added.

Dolphin rescue fails at Patong

A DOLPHIN that washed ashore at Patong Beach on August 21 died despite the best efforts of bystanders to keep her alive.

The female striped dolphin was first spotted by a tourist, who informed a jet-ski operator, who in turn called the Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC).

"I was walking along the beach when a tourist came to tell me about the stranded dolphin, so I reported it," said the jet-ski operator, Noraworn Thonghom, 27.

"When I first saw it, it was very weak. We took it back to the water, but it died before the experts arrived." he said.

PMBC veterinarian Dr Patcharaporn Gaewmong told the Gazette, "It was a female striped dolphin, not over 10 years old, and about 30 kilograms in weight. She had a wound on her fin.

"This kind of dolphin is common in the Andaman Sea. We believe she was sick. We took her body back to the center to determine the cause of death," she said.

Fishery chief vows action after net drops on divers

THE Chief of the Fishery Management Center in Krabi vowed to bolster patrols at Phuket dive destination Shark Point after photos surfaced of a gill net being dropped over the protected marine area when divers were in the water.

"To ensure diver safety, we will increase the frequency of our patrols in the area to prevent any type of fishing," said Jaroenchai Srisuwan, chief of the Fishery Management Center in Krabi.

"However, this is only a shortterm solution," he added, promising to present the issue to Krabi Governor Prasit Osathanonda for a permanent solution.

Musang Rock, better known as Shark Point, is a marine conservation area and is protected under the Fisheries Act, Mr Jaroenchai said.

"No fishing of any kind is allowed in the area," he explained.

The gill net that sparked Mr Jaroenchai's concern this week was set up about a week ago by fishermen while divers were still in the water.

"The net itself is nearly invisible. Staff on our dive boat tried to warn the fisherman in the longtail boat that divers were in the water below, but the fisherman ignored them," said Joe Blasy, a dive instructor and twelve-year resident of Phuket.

estimated the net was about 200 meters long.

"It was wrapped around the entirety of Shark Point Pinnacle One, then up and over Shark Point Pinnacle Two, ranging in depth from about seven meters to 30 meters," Mr Blasy said.

"The net was tangled on several tube and bush corals. There is no doubt that had we not... carefully removed it, the coral, which are actually colonies of thousands of tiny organisms that take years to grow, would have been pulled up, broken and killed," he explained

Mr Jaroenchai said the recent patrols of the area had yet to turn up any illegal fishermen, but urged the community to help his office protect the reefs.



Thieves 'tagged' after CCTV images posted on Facebook

PHUKET City Police have arrested two suspects after posting CCTV images of the criminals on their Facebook page.

The first crime took place on August 5, when Tippaya Pho's room on Phun Pol Soi 2 in Phuket Town was robbed of a 35,500-baht MacBook and a black Lenovo laptop valued at 33,300 baht.

Police collected CCTV footage from Mr Tippaya's apartment complex and posted images of the thief on their Facebook page, Phuket City Police officer Prawit Engchuan said.

"People sent us information that enabled us to arrest the suspect, Udom Janthong, 22, in a rental room in Phuket Town on Monday," Col Prawit said.

"Mr Udom confessed that he wanted money to travel, so he sold the computers to Burmese workers at a low price," he said.

The second crime solved with the help of social media was the theft of water taps in Phuket Town.

Residents reported the tap thefts to police on August 8 and by Monday this week Rongroj

Pramutmatyakul, 33, was in police custody.

"Mr Rongroj confessed to stealing taps twice, but he couldn't remember how many taps in total he had stolen. He said he wanted money to buy drugs and pay computer fees in game shops," Col Prawit explained.

Both men have been charged with theft.

No indictment for Red Bull heir, again

PROSECUTORS have postponed the indictment of Vorayuth Yoovidhya, the Red Bull heir accused of killing a police officer in a hitand-run accident, for the fifth time.

The statute of limitations on the charge expires on September 3. If prosecutors fail to indict Mr Vorayudh before then, he will not face trial for the killing of Pol Sen Sgt-Maj Wichian Klanprasert, who died last September.

Recordings from CCTV show Mr Vorayuth driving at 170km per hour at the time of the accident.

Police have said that traces of cocaine and illegal levels of alcohol were found in the suspect's blood on the day of the accident.

Police have pressed two charges against Mr Vorayuth: reckless driving that caused a death, and failure to stop his vehicle and come out to help the victim.

"Police investigators have to question four more witnesses, including two speeding experts. The investigation report on this part has not been concluded," said Reuchai Krairerk, a senior expert public prosecutor.

Mr Vorayuth is the youngest son of Chalerm Yoovidhya, one of the richest men in Thailand. The family fortune is built on sales of the worldfamous energy drink Red Bull.

THE People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD), the yellow-shirted activist group that succeeded in bringing down two governments in 2008, are no more – at least for

In a statement last week, leaders Sondhi Limthongkul and Chamlong Srimuang said they were bowing out of leading the movement.

They said ousting the Yingluck Shinawatra government "would only result in a vicious cycle, as the ruling Pheu Thai Party would only be voted back into power," The Nation reported.

The leaders also said they did not want to risk violating their bail conditions. Both face charges relating to PAD actions in 2008, in which the group seized Government House and Bangkok's two main airports in a successful bid to bring down the Samak Sundaravej and Somchai Wongsawat governments.

The decision means PAD supporters are now free to join other rallies or movements.

The PAD, however, may make a return in the future once political reform takes shape, to ensure it can finally be completed, the leaders said.

The Democrat Party has been in talks with the PAD over a possible alliance.

The party has vowed to bring

down the "Thaksin regime" through actions both inside and outside Parliament.

PAD leader Mr Sondhi called on the Democrats to resign from Parliament and come to rally on the street to "prove themselves". But the Democrats had refused, the PAD claimed.

The PAD, former allies of the Democrats, said the party was partially responsible for its problems in Thai politics and was an obstacle to the overhaul.

For now, the PAD's decision on whether or not to join in mass street protests depends upon the to participate unless the governgovernment's next maneuver.

PAD leader Pibhop Dhongchai said: "We can't say whether we'll join hands [with the Democrats]. It depends on the 'issue'.'

Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra has set up a council on national reform to find solutions to the country's political crisis.

Wave of Rohingya escapes

A TOTAL of 163 Rohingya detainees have escaped from Thai **Immigration Detention Centres** (IDCs) in four separate incidents around Thailand over the last

Almost 2,000 Rohingya, who come mainly from Myanmar's Rakhine State and refugee camps in Eastern Bangladesh, are currently being detained in Thai IDCs, including in Phuket.

On August 9, 30 detainees managed to get out of the Songkla provincial IDC.

On August 20, 86 of the 137 male Rohingya being detained in Songkla's Sadao district managed to break out of the IDC.

The detainees apparently climbed up to the roof through the ceiling before abseiling down the eight-meter-high building and escaping via the rubber plantation at the back of the building.

On August 23, 10 detainees escaped from the center in Ranong. Two were recaptured and charged

with destroying state property.

The next day, 37 of 115 Rohingya detainees escaped from Prachuap Khiri Khan IDC. A manhunt involving 180 police, state officials and volunteers was launched soon afterwards, though at the time of writing only three had been found.

Writing in The Nation, Brad

Adams, executive director of Human Rights Watch's Asia division, called on the Thai government to release all Rohingya detainees and allow them to acquire migrant worker status.

Many of the detainees have fled horrific persecution in Myanmar. Naypyidaw refuses to grant Rohingya Myanmar citizenship.

Court frees suspects in model's grisly murder

A MALAYSIAN court has overturned the conviction of two policemen found guilty of shooting and blowing up a Mongolian model linked to a former associate of Prime Minister Najib Razak.

The release of the officers, who were part of Najib's personal security detail at the time of the 2006 murder of 28-year-old Altantuya Shaariibuu, appears to distance the prime minister from the case.

But the ruling also revived public outrage over her mysterious death and raises further questions as Najib prepares for a possible leadership challenge from within his ruling party in October.

A three-member panel on Malaysia's Court of Appeal unanimously decided that the conviction of Chief Inspector Azilah Hadri and Corporal Sirul Azhar Umar had been unsafe.

Among the grounds cited were that a key witness, Najib's then aide-de-camp, hadn't been called to give evidence and that a police diary that may have given one of the men an alibi hadn't been considered.

"It is our judgment that the cumulative effect of the nondirections by the learned trial judge rendered the conviction of the appellants unsafe," state news agency Bernama quoted one of the three judges, Justice Tengku

Maimun, as saying.

The high court that found the policemen guilty and sentenced them to death in 2009 never established a motive for the crime.

Najib's one-time close associate, Abdul Razak Baginda, a political analyst, was charged with abetting the murder but was acquitted in 2008.

Civil society groups and Malaysia's political opposition have alleged that Altantuya's killing was connected to her role as an interpreter and associate of Razak Baginda in Malaysia's purchase of two Scorpene-class submarines from French shipbuilding giant DCNS in 2002.

Najib, who was defence minister at the time, has strenuously denied allegations of corruption in the purchase and of having any links to the murdered woman.

But his government has declined opposition requests for a public inquiry into the case - which is currently the subject of a French investigation – and has only given brief responses to questions raised - Reuters in parliament.

Landslides kill 16 in Laos deluges

AT LEAST 16 people have died after torrential rain caused landslides to swamp six villages in Laos, reports children's charity Plan International.

"It is not known how many people are missing or have been injured, but aid workers from Plan International have been deployed to conduct a rapid assessment," said the report. – *Phuket Gazette*

Hagel in Indonesia for defense talks

US DEFENSE Secretary Chuck Hagel arrived in Indonesia on Monday for bilateral talks on defense. The talks during the two-day visit included counterterrorism, Indonesia's plan to buy a primary weapons defense system from the US and capacity development of military - Jakarta Post personnel.

50 houses torched in Myanmar riots

OVER 200 soldiers and police officers imposed order after a riot broke out in Htankone village, in the Sagaing region of northwestern Myanmar.

The riot began following rumors of an attempted rape of a girl by a Muslim man on the evening of August 24. Rioters torched some 50 houses in the village.

"My niece has to come from Zeepinthar village to Htankone for work. On the way back to her house from the work, a Muslim young man of Htankone village attempted to rape her in the field near the entrance to the village. Villagers arrested him and sent him to Htankone Police Station," claimed an uncle of the girl.

After the suspect was handed over to Kanbalu Police, a mob of about 200 gathered near the Htankone Police Station to demand the police hand over the accused.

Around 7pm, the mob increased to over 1,000 angry men who started to destroy and set fire to Muslim houses and shops in the village.

"The mob first destroyed shops near the railway station. At 8pm, they set fire to a chicken farm near the village. At that time, the crowd

numbered about 1,400," said one Htankone resident.

Upon investigation, the attackers were found to be locals from nearby villages.

"About 50 houses were burnt to ashes and 10 shops were destroyed," said another resident.

The rioters wielded rods, knives and catapults as they set fire to shops and houses. Some members of fire-brigade, the police and a monk were injured.

"The police at first deployed 70

officers from Shwe Bo district. We faced difficulty controling the mob," said a police officer.

"We managed to extinguish the fire around 1am. They set fire to a rice mill and a house. They cut off the hose with knives while we were filling water," a firefighter

The police fired guns into the air to disperse the mobs around 1am and 3am and the violence subsided around 3:30pm.

Pork Barrel protests stifle central Manila

TENS of thousands of predominantly middle-class Filipinos converged on Manila's Rizal Park on Monday to call for the abolition of the Priority Development Assistance Fund (PDAF) – also called the "pork barrel fund" - and the prosecution of the people who misused it to line their pockets.

The protesters marched across Manila and streamed into the park to stage a leaderless gathering called through Facebook and Twitter to express national rage at corruption in the government.

Police estimated the protesters numbered at 85,000 to 100,000.

President Benigno Aquino tried to head off the protest on the preceding Friday by announcing the abolition of the fund, which channels money to congressional districts, but allocations for it are set down in the budget drawn up in the preceding year.

But angered by a series of reports on the alleged plundering of the PDAF by a businesswoman in connivance with legislators, the people appear to have rejected

President Aquino's solution and proceeded with the march to demand the complete abolition of the pork barrel.

The protest was the first mass protest assembly since President Aquino was elected in 2010.

Civic groups called the protest after a state audit showed some lawmakers had funnelled 10 billion pesos (7.35bn baht) to non-existent projects and groups under the previous government of Gloria Macapagal Arroyo, who has since been charged with plunder and electoral fraud.

Brazilian minister resigns over case of Bolivian fugitive

BRAZIL's Foreign Minister Antonio Patriota resigned on Monday after one of his diplomats acknowledged that he had helped a Bolivian senator, who had been accused of corruption, cross the border into Brazil.

President Dilma Rousseff accepted Patriota's resignation but appointed him as Brazil's envoy to the United Nations, her office said in a statement.

The current Brazilian U.N. ambassador, Luiz Alberto Figueiredo, will become foreign minister. A career diplomat, Figueiredo was Brazil's lead negotiator in climate change talks until his appointment to the United Nations a year ago.

Taiwan women put overies on hold

WORKING women in Taiwan are increasingly opting to freeze their eggs at fertility clinics as they postpone marriage and motherhood.

Female employment in Taiwan is the third-highest in the Asia-Pacific region.

A slowdown in the economy has made job security an even more pressing priority.

"I was not sure when my ovaries would start degenerating but I was sure that I would probably marry late and that I wanted to become a mother," said Linn Kuo, 34, who chose to freeze her eggs.

Taiwan's average marriage age has risen to 30 today, from 24 in the 1980s, and has resulted in driving up egg freezing.

Cuban state eases control on eateries

MORE than 20 Cuban state restaurants are about to become employee-run cooperatives as Raul Castro's communist government continues its retreat from running just about everything on the island.

The restaurants will become cooperatives in October, with hundreds more likely to follow if the experiment succeeds.

The restaurants are the first to be ceded by the state since communist authorities took over all eateries in 1968.

China rebuffs Japan over lingering islands dispute

CHINA sees no reason to hold talks with Baodong said on Tuesday.

Assad stares down barrel of Allied punitive strikes

THE United States and its allies are gearing up for a military strike against Syria that could come within days, and would represent the firmest action thus far by the West since the Middle Eastern nation's civil war began about 30 months ago.

Western envoys have told the Syrian opposition to expect a military response soon against President Bashar al-Assad's forces as punishment for a chemicalweapons attack last week, according to sources who attended a meeting with the rebel Syrian National Coalition in Istanbul.

Amid a quickening drumbeat of preparations, Australia, a close US ally and incoming chair of the United Nations Security Council, on Wednesday endorsed possible action against Syria even if the security council fails to agree.

U.S. Defence Secretary Chuck Hagel said on Tuesday that US forces in theregion were "ready to go" if President Barack Obama gave the order.

Obama – long reluctant to intervene in the Syrian conflict worked to solidify allied support, including calling the leaders of Britain and Canada, while U.S. intelligence agencies assembled what they are sure to say is final confirmation of the Syrian government's culpability for Wednesday's poison gas attack near Damascus.

Carney said it would be "fanciful" to think that anyone other than Assad's forces was behind the large-scale chemical attack, which activists said killed hundreds of people as they slept.

Top US national security aides gathered to review the situation on Tuesday night in a meeting chaired by Obama's national security adviser Susan Rice, officials said. Obama has yet to make a final decision on the US response, Carney said, but left little doubt that it would involve military action.

The President insisted, however, that Washington was not intent on "regime change", signalling that any military strikes would be limited and not meant to topple the Syrian President.

The British military was also drafting plans. Prime Minister David Cameron, anxious, like Obama, to avoid another unpredictable Middle East war, said any strikes on Syria would be "specific".

UN chemical weapons investigators postponed until August 28 a second trip to the location where the chemical attack took place.

Ahmad Jarba, president of the Syrian National Coalition, met envoys from 11 countries at an Istanbul hotel, including the US ambassador to Syria. The rebel leaders proposed targets for cruise missiles and bombing. - Reuters

Boko Haram sect slaughters 14 in raid on pro-government vigilantes

vigilantes in an attack on the northeastern town of Bama, a local official who attended a mass funeral for the victims said on Monday.

The attack last Sunday was one of a spate of deadly assaults by the Boko Haram Islamist sect this month that raises doubts about whether a military offensive against it since May can succeed.

Local vigilante groups run by youth volunteers have been instrumental in helping the military capture Boko Haram members, but they have also made them a target for the insurgents, drawing civilians further into the conflict.

Alhaji Baba Shehu Gulumba, chairman of Bama local council, told journalists in the nearest main city of Maiduguri

NIGERIAN Islamists killed 14 pro-government youth that insurgents disguised as soldiers lured the youths into a trap. Nine others were wounded.

> "They were on guard duty when the sect members dressed in military camouflage came and told them that they were needed at a meeting nearby," he said. "When they had been lured away from their duty posts they were then attacked and killed."

> Bama is in Borno state, the centre of the insurgency. The town is not far from a mountainous area along the Cameroon border where many Boko Haram fighters are believed to be holding out, after being cleared from other areas by Nigerian forces.

"We will build new beautiful sky-walks which will link Central Festival West, Central Festival East, and Central Luxury



Capital values in Asia Pacific continued to increase slowly and outpace rental growth on the back of solid investment demand for quality assets. Yield compression for core assets was observed in several markets including Sydney, Brisbane, Tokyo, Seoul and Singapore.

Dr Nick Axford, Global Head of Research at CBRE commented: "On the back of strong investment demand for yield accretive assets, capital values are expected to increase at a steady rate although markets with ongoing weak

Residential rates climbing

RESIDENTIAL prices may rise 3 to 5% in the second half of this year from the first half due to recent increases in land prices and construction costs.

Pruksa Real Estate Plc has increased its residential price by up to 4% in the second half of this year over the first half, attributing the move to rising costs of both land and construction raw materials. Sansiri Plc has also adjusted its residential prices upwards by 2-3%, citing the same rising costs. LPN Development Plc has continued to maintain its condominium prices, but has adapted the designs of its projects to match its rising costs while taking into account customers' purchasing power. SC Asset Corporation Plc has also revised upward its residential prices by between 3 and 5%.

Pruksa Real Estate's president and CEO Thongma Vijit- pongpun said the company has been forced to increase its residential prices. This follows land price increases of

between 5 and 10% and similar rises in construction raw-materials costs. Residences account for about half the firm's total construction costs. As a result the company has had to adjust its residential prices upward by an average of 4% in the second half of this year compared with earlier in 2013.

Sansiri Plc chief operating officer Wanchak Buranasiri said the company has boosted its residential prices by between 2 and 3% following the rise in land and construction raw-materials prices.

"We did not adjust the residential prices directly but we have re-sized our residences and maintained prices to match our customers' purchasing power," LPN Development Plc managing director Opas Sripayak said.

He added that although the company does not plan to raise prices, it looks to maintain its sales and net profit by changing its designs and reducing costs, while maintaining prices to match demand.

Taiwan tries to draw more Thai tourists

THE Taiwan Tourism Bureau has launched more aggressive marketing campaigns to boost the number of Thai visitors by 10-20%. Thailand is an important market for Taiwan, which last year welcomed about 100,000 Thais, but only 30,000 of them were real tourists.

This year, the country will spend 10 million baht on activities throughout the year to promote various aspects of Taiwan's charms, David Tsao, a director of the Taiwan tourism bureau based in Malaysia, said yesterday.

Beyond natural beauty and

friendly people, Taiwan is still safe and its transport system is convenient. All existing facilities to serve tourism are ready to welcome a growing number of travellers.

Regional tourism is very competitive with promotional campaigns executed by countries to capture a bigger share of the Thai market, which is considered as a key source, he said.

Countries are giving importance to their tourism industry to help strengthen their economies. Recently, Japan scrapped visas for Thai tourists. This is fanning competition. Now Thais will think twice before deciding where to travel. Tsao said. Taiwan is easing its own visa-application process for Thais as a way to reduce barriers.

Taiwan has an edge over such rivals as Japan and South Korea in terms of cost and shorter flight times. Costs there are similar to those in Thailand.

Last year, 7.6 million foreigners arrived in Taiwan, with mainland Chinese on top, followed by Japanese and Hongkongers. In SE Asia, Malaysia was its biggest source, sending over 340,000.– *The Nation*

Cut costs on investments

Five money-saving tips for expats

IF YOU are like many expatriates, you have probably failed to realize the impact trading or investment fees can have on your portfolio's return, as such costs are often hidden and can quickly add up over time.

In a rising market, these costs may not be so noticeable; but in a stagnant or falling stock market, they may quickly become very apparent. With that in mind, here are a few ways you can cut your investment costs in order to boost your investment returns:

Consider all investing costs

Trading is only one investment cost you must deal with and even trading fees can vary considerably as some investment products come with large front-end or back-end loads or both.

Other fees you might encounter when investing include annual fund expenses, custodian/ account fees, advisory fees, forex transaction charges and bid ask spreads, with the later being particularly hard to evaluate as a lousy spread can quickly increase your trading costs.

Remember, there are some investment fees that can't be avoided, but there are also plenty

of other fees that can be minimized or completely avoided – so long as you are made aware of them before you invest. That's why it's critical for your financial advisor to be transparent about ALL of your fees. If he or she isn't being completely transparent, then find someone who is.

Invest in ETFs rather than expat target products

Many ETFs have no extra commissions beyond normal transaction costs and have average annual expenses of just 0.49% while the average stock mutual fund will cost investors around

1.57% in annual fees.

However, many managed fund or offshore investment products targeted for expats come with high up-front fees (often 5% or more), annual fees of around 2% and a sales commission when they are sold. When these high fees are combined with taxes, inflation and currency fluctuations, you might be left with little to no return at all on your money.

Buy and hold rather than trade

Even if you are investing in low cost products like ETFs with a discount broker, the best way to reward your broker rather than yourself is to trade frequently as trading will generate them commissions. You should only trade when changes in your personal situation, market conditions or the value of an investment calls for changes in your portfolio's investment allocation.

Otherwise, a general portfolio review each quarter and around the beginning of the year should be sufficient for making necessary portfolio adjustments. I often get calls to review expat portfolios. One common problem I see is advisors that buy and sell often because they get a commis-

sion. Be careful of this and ask your financial advisor to list all fees and commissions.

Limit forex transactions

As with frequent trading, moving in and out of currencies can be both costly and unnecessary. Ideally, you should use the currency of the country or countries you hold citizenship of as a base currency for your investments and invest only in products that transact in your base currency (e.g. for Americans, an ETF listed on the NYSE) to gain exposure to other currencies or markets.

Consolidate your accounts

While having multiple financial accounts may seem like a good way to spread your financial risk around, it likely means you won't have economies of scale with any single financial institution. After all, the larger your account balance is with one financial institution, the more interested they will

be in servicing your account and keeping you happy as a client by offering lower investment and trading fees. They may also be able to offer you investment products not available to clients with lower account balances.

Investing isn't free, but you can drive expenses down to a reasonable level, including personalized one-on-one investment advice. Two airlines vying for Manila - Phuket market

FOLLOWING Tourism Malaysia recently announcing the closure of its Phuket office, another Southeast Asian source market is poised to link up directly with Phuket – the Philippines.

Indeed, two Southeast Asian based airlines will service direct flights between Manila and Phuket International Airport.

"Similarly, foreign tourists now

have the option to add Manila to their itinerary, after they visit Phuket. With CEB's trademark lowest fares, this route can contribute to tourist arrivals to both Thailand and the Philippines," he added.

CEB's Manila-Phuket thrice weekly service will be every Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The maiden flight departed Manila at 8pm and arrived in Phuket at 11pm. The return flight departed Phuket the next day at 12am and arrived in Manila at 5:35am.

Phuket is CEB's 2nd destination in Thailand, aside from Bangkok,

where CEB operates 14 times weekly from Manila, Clark and Cebu. Lowest year-round fares to Phuket start at PHP3,499 (about 2,500 baht).

Also looking to cash in on the new Manila-Phuket direct route, budget airliner, Tiger Airways Philippines is offering the same P3,499 round-trip fare for its inaugural flight from Manila to Phuket, Thailand, planned to commence from September 3.

"We are happy to announce that effective September, we are flying to Phuket, Thailand twice a week every Tuesday and Saturday to accommodate as many passengers who wish to visit Phuket," said Olive Ramos, CEO of TigerAir.

After rebranding as TigerAir Philippines on July 3, the Singapore-founded airline indicated that it planned to open new direct routes that would enable guests to travel faster and more conveniently to major destinations across Asia-Pacific.

On July 18, the airline launched the first and only direct flight between Kalibo and Singapore.

Reining in the rogues

CORRUPTION has publicly reared its ugly head as a topic of much heated debate, with one and all tacitly accepting that the situation in Phuket is out of hand. However, few are offering any realistic strategies to combat the problem at its roots: the wellentrenched mind-set that "playing by the rules is for suckers".

The good news is that corruption, the island's most fundamental problem, is finally getting the attention it deserves in the national and international media. Nonetheless, if concrete progress on tackling the problem is not achieved through efforts now underway, the only result will be more negative press for the island's all-important tourism industry.

It's true that Phuket's tourism industry has been remarkably resilient over the years, having literally endured "hell and high water" (the 2004 tsunami disaster), horrific accidents (the OG269 plane crash in 2006), high-profile murders of foreign tourists and sustained environmental degradation, as well as many of the social ills that tend to occur in poorly regulated, rapidly urbanizing environments.

Despite all this, tourists continue to make their way here in record numbers. It appears possible that, if we seriously tackle these issues now, there is hope that Phuket can maintain its allure as one of the world's premier resort-island destinations well into the future, at which time we would be able to look back at the current situation and view it simply as a period of "growing pains".

However, reaching that stage will require some real leadership and genuine personal bravery, not the kind of blindfolded selfpreservation and finger pointing that has appeared as a result of some recent allegations [see page 1].

Who might step up to the plate and take that role is anyone's guess, as Thailand has not exactly excelled at producing grassroots leaders in its fight against corruption. Perhaps the country's best-known anti-corruption figure is none other than Chuwit Kamolvisit, the former massage-parlor tycoon who went public with his own tale of paying millions of baht in bribes to cops, not initially on an ethical basis, but because he feared for his life.

It is easy to dismiss corruption as an "inevitable" part of doing business and to point out that no country in the world is completely free of it. However, it cannot be ignored that the problem in Phuket has reached grave proportions and is extremely harmful to the island's future.

For this reason it is imperative that these latest anti-corruption efforts not only achieve tangible results, but are also seen by the public as transparent and fair. It is only by convincing the public that the law applies to everyone equally that we can move forward to build the truly civil society that we are striving for.

How to steer children as they surf the web

FIRST PERSON

THE internet has brought about big changes in school children, some good, some bad.

In the past, students were more timid and didn't dare reveal their ideas when talking to adults or during discussions in the classroom. Nowadays, they have a lot more self-confidence and are more willing to speak up. This is a good thing, and it has happened because they have more access to information as a result of the expansion of cyberspace.

Still, access to information presents its own problems. Students often don't have enough life experience or knowledge to judge which websites are trustworthy. And they can become confused when they encounter different information on different websites.

While students are more confident nowadays, they are also prone to more delinquent behavior than in the past. These days they often don't pay attention in the classroom, they bully each other, and they are less obedient to their teachers and parents. In the worst cases, some of them get involved in drugs, inappropriate sexual behavior, and violence. I think this is also due to the internet – the online movies, social networks and video games.

I'm not saying we should ban the internet or try to stop its progress. For one thing, this is impossible, and for another, we would be denying ourselves the tremendous benefits it brings.

What we need to do is understand it and use it wisely.

sites are available to young people under age 18.

Secondly, parents and teachers need to work together to guide children's online experiences.

In the classroom, teachers should teach children how to determine if a website gives credible information or not. This means they need to teach youngsters how to analyze information they come across. Teachers should also guide children to websites that are related to what they are studying, so they can continue to learn outside of school.

As for parents, the first thing they need to do is make sure their priorities are straight.

Many parents nowadays become so focused on academic success that they equate it with their child's value. They think, "my child is getting good grades, so that means that my child is good."

I don't agree. The way I see it, we should have three goals for children: First, that they be good people, then that they gain knowledge, and finally, that they be happy.

If they are good citizens, the other two goals will follow autoput restrictions on what internet matically, so we must first help children become responsible, disciplined, honest and polite.

To do this, parents and teachers need to work together in a coordinated way. I arranged this in a small village where I used to work, and it was a success.

When parents and teachers meet, they discuss their expectations of who will teach what. Parents are told what the school curriculum is, so that they can reinforce it at home.

Parents also supervise their children's internet use at home, and guide their children to sites useful for their school work. A side benefit of this is that the parents and children spend time together, which deepens relationships.

It used to be the case that children learned something in class, then practiced it at home. Now, with the internet, they can learn at home and do practice - through discussion and games - in class. We call this "flipping the classroom".

Once we accept that technology deeply influences many aspects of our lives, we can understand that we need to use it with care, and teach our young people to do so too.

Violations and fines

I read online that someone was stopped by police while driving and got fined 1,000 baht for not having his passport with him and for having pirated CDs in his car.

Is there an official written list of traffic violations and fines?

Sarawut Meeboon, Thalang Police Deputy Superintendent, replies:

The Thai traffic laws are available at www.trafficpolice.go.th/

Foreigners must always carry their passports with them. It is the law in Thailand.

Expat Registration Act BE 2493 stipulates that foreigners must carry an identification card or passport and be able to present it on request. Anyone not carrying a passport who can later produce it is still liable to a 1,000 baht fine.

A Department of Intellectual **Property officer replies:**

The 1,000 baht fine was not due to the pirated CDs in the vehicle. It is not illegal to possess pirated CDs for personal entertainment. We target the production, distribution and selling of copyrighted goods as dictated by the Copyright Act BE 2537 section 5.

WITH so many Western-style restaurants and the longstanding

popularity of Northeasternstyle Thai food in Phuket, it is sometimes easy to forget that the island has its own unique cuisine. You won't find it in the tourist areas though, for an authentic taste of local food, you have to head to Phuket Town, and in particular, to the famous Lock Tien food court which has been serving up classic Phuket dishes for generations.

The style of food at Lock Tien is a result of centuries of intermixing among Thai, Malay and Hokkien Chinese cultures. In the 18th and early 19th centuries thousands of Chinese workers from Fujian Province came to Phuket in search of their fortunes in the dozens of tin mines that were rapidly springing up all over the island.

At several times, these Chinese migrants vastly outnumbered the local Thai population, but overtime they intermarried and began to forge the unique culture known as Baba, a term which denotes the descendants of mixed Thai-Chinese parents. Phuket's Baba culture was deeply influenced by, and still shares much in common with, the Peranakan culture, which is most

prominent in Penang, Malaysia – where Chinese migrants intermixed with the Malays.

But Phuket's Baba culture and food developed along slightly

different lines to those in Penang, that pork still plays a prominent role in Baba food, unlike its

Penang counterpart.

Putting the history lessons aside, let's have a look at some of the most popular and delicious Baba dishes to try when you visit Lock Tien. This is a bit like a food court, with wait staff taking your order, then collecting your chosen food from the various

stalls which each specialize in the third generation of his two or three dishes. Then as the food is brought back to your table, you pay for each dish or drink as it arrives.

For starters, try some delicious the lack of Muslim influence meant Moo Satay, tender tiny strips of pure pork, barbecued and served with peanut sauce and cucumber.

Next, there is *Kien*, which is spiced, minced pork stuffed into tubes of tofu skin then deep-fried and served with a sweet barbecue sauce – this one is a must try. Another popular yet very simple starter is Mee Hoon Pa Chang, thin rice noodles stir-fried with soy sauce and topped with fried shallots and fresh spring onions. It is normally accompanied by a delicious pork-bone soup, a thin

broth with chunks of pork ribs covered with tender flesh. For adventurous diners, there is *Loba*, or as the menu describes it in English "assorted deep fried pig offal – but this is perhaps more of an acquired taste.

Finally there are the Por Pia or Fujian style fresh spring rolls,

> served not unlike Peking duck, they consist of a soft pancake filled with red pork, lettuce, bean shoots, pork skin and several other ingredients, which is then wrapped up, cut into bite sized pieces and smothered in a sweet sauce. These spring rolls are hand prepared by Ko Lai, who has been cranking them out to hungry locals for more than 40 years. He told the Gazette that he is

family to man their stall at Lock Tien. He began helping his parents when he was a child, before taking over from them in his

early 20s. Watching him prepare dozens of the rolls with a deft hand, it's clear that he has had plenty of practice and the walls of Lock Tien are covered in photos of Ko Lai with visiting celebrities who came to taste his famous spring rolls.

Next, it's onto the main dishes and here the traditional Fujian saying "It is unacceptable for a meal to not have soup" continues to hold sway. There are several noodle dishes served "dry" with soup on the side and also dishes where the two are

combined. The most obviously Thai-Chinese or Baba dish is the Mee Nam Tom Yum Kong, which mixes Hokkien-style noodles, prawns, pork, egg and vegetables with a spicy-sour *Tom Yum* soup. The "Ancient Style" noodles are similar but omit the *Tom Yum* soup for a strong pork based broth that is not as spicy. There are also several stir-fried noodle dishes to try, with various combinations of seafood, vegetables and noodles stir-fried in a spicy paste.

To wash all this down you can choose from a wide variety of fruit

fruit, cantaloupe or tomato. But to complete your meal in true local style, order a Oh Eaw a concoction of shaved ice, banana jelly, beans and syrup. Very refreshing in the midday heat.

All the dishes are a steal at between 30 to 50 baht, so don't be afraid to try a few different ones. Lock Tien is located in the heart of old Phuket Town, on the corner of Yawarat and Dibuk roads, opposite a beautifully restored, green Sino-Portuguese building.



Race for adventure

Phuket's neighbor Krabi to host global adventure race

ADVENTURE Racing is a sport that is rapidly capturing the imagination of sporting and adrenaline junkies in Thailand and around the world. These non-stop races, ranging in length from 4-8 hours, require teams to run, trek, mountain bike and paddle, while navigating a course through the wilderness. Likened to an expedition with a stopwatch, adventure racing requires teamwork, perseverance, strategy and determination.

The rules of adventure racing vary depending on location, terrain and disciplines but most races abide by the following general rules: No motorized travel; no GPS assistance; teams must travel together for the entire race usually within 50 meters of each other; no outside assistance except at designated transition areas but assistance from competing teams is generally permitted; and teams must carry all mandatory gear.

Adventure races are held in spectacular natural locations all over the world and attract an equally diverse range of international competitors. Phuket residents have a chance to get a taste of the action soon, with an upcoming race in neighboring Krabi

scheduled for late September.



RECENTLY the letters column in a Bangkok newspaper featured a debate about parks versus malls. One faction argued that we need more parks in Bangkok. Another

faction maintained that the space wasted on parks should be used to build more shopping malls, which are better because they make more money. This demonstrates the lofty values cherished by the deeply spiritual Bangkokians.

My friend Fardley Nerdwell dismissed the debate with the disdain he always reserves for lesser minds.


"Our species has an unfortunate tendency to think in terms of 'either-or' instead of 'both-and'," he pontificated.

"A warm and inclusive view of reality would suggest that we don't have to choose between parks and malls. We can have both. We can put the parks in the malls."

I blinked. "Come again?"

"Yes," Fardley affirmed.

"I recently visited the giant Mega Bangna mahasuperhypermall. It is the size of a small city. It even has its own transportation system. Modified golf carts speed foot-



weary shoppers from one enormous concourse to another. One or more parks could so easily fit within its vaulted vastness."

"A park requires trees,"

I noted. "How are you going to fit trees inside a shopping mall? "

Fardley snorted. "Obviously you've never seen Mega Bangna. Its lofty battlements would easily permit trees to be planted within a central area, lined by shops on every floor. "Shop 'n' stroll - this can easily become the defining slogan of my 'parks-in-the-malls' concept.

"Note, please, that the trees would provide oxygen for breathless shoppers. There would be no need to import oxygen from outside the 'mall-o-sphere'. Oxygenindependent malls would leave more oxygen for the wretched population languishing outside the malls to breathe. These unfortunate outcasts will inevitably be known as mall exiles, or mall outies."

'So mall culture will divide our population into two sectors?" I inquired. "Mall outies and mall innies? "

"Mall innies are already called mall rats,

mallsters, or mallies," Fardley replied. "Mall outies is a new concept.

"To enhance the natural ambiance, shopper-friendly fauna such as birds, squirrels and monkeys will be allowed to roam free in the park, with perhaps a tiger or two to provide excitement. Shoppers will have to be careful to avoid falling bird droppings, which might soil their persons and their purchases. This will sharpen their instincts and hone their reflexes, atrophied by too much civilized living. Grabby squirrels and monkeys, together with the occasional pouncing tiger, will convey the same benefit. They will provide alertness training and exercise for sluggish shoppers."

"I have a problem with the tigers," I said. "Most shoppers will not want to have to keep an eye peeled for tigers waiting to eat them at the checkout counters."

"The tigers will be kept away from the checkout counters," Fardley conceded. "Our love for nature must not be allowed to impede the smooth and stately course of commerce."

"In that case, I foresee a rosy future for parks in the malls," I agreed.

Life & style Enjoy the fruit of your labor

SEPP writes to say that he owns three villas in Phuket and "would like to change the gardens to [include] more fruit trees, fruit bushes and nice flowers". He adds: "Can you help me to find the right ones?" and asks "which books could I buy? "Well, Sepp, even teen (mankhut); rambutan to attempt an answer all your wide-ranging queries would take several articles, so I am going to concentrate on the fruit tree issue. In any event there are not many bushes producing edible crops unless you want to include vines such as pumpkins, water melons or bitter gourds, all of which will need support, or vegetables such as aubergines or tomatoes which do fit the bill as bushes.

My choice of fruit trees suitable for a garden is listed later in this article. Moreover,

most fruit trees do sport attractive flowers, so they can double both as decorative additions to your garden[s], and as sources of delectable fresh fruit for your table.

In no particular order, my recomended fruit trees are as follows: mango (mamuang); papaya (malakan); lime (manao); pomelo (som-oh); mangos-(ngaw); Guava (farang); avocado; pomegranate (taptim); star apple (aphoen);

and longan (langsart). I considered including the

dillenia or elephant apple (*mataat*) a small shrubby evergreen tree which has globular fruit and pleasant five-petalled yellow flowers, but is used in Southeast Asia mainly for chutneys. The jack fruit tree and its relative the bread fruit were other possibilities, but despite their exotic fruit and glossy foliage, they are slow to reach

their mature height of 15 meters and are perhaps better as specimen trees for a large open space. Bananas have instant appeal: they are fast growers and heavy croppers. But the huge sail-like leaves do become tattered so if orderliness is a key criterion, than the *kluay* may not be for you.

The mango must rank high on anyone's list. A favorite yard tree in Thailand, it grows quickly, has a neat habit and thick foliage - pinkish when young making it ideal as a shade tree. Nor does it need me to extol its virtues as a luscious and distinctive dessert fruit, sweet and mildly perfumed. It can also be eaten green in savory dishes.


The papaya is just as ubiquitous. Like the banana (not technically a tree), it has a fleshy, hollow stem and will grow almost anywhere. The massive, marrowshaped fruits are carried at

the top of the tree just below its crown of deeply indented leaves. Papayas are a staple of Thai cuisine, especially in *Isaan* where the unripe fruits are used to make som tum. When ripe, the flesh takes on an orange-pink tinge and is sweet, and scented. The papaya is good as a starter tree, since it is short-lived (two years or so) and easy to remove once it has finished cropping.

On the other hand, the lime,

referred to here as a lemon, is more difficult to establish. Easy to find in nurseries, it dislikes being transferred from a pot, so be careful not to disturb its roots when transplanting. It has glossy, leathery, evergreen leaves, white star-shaped flowers and carries spines on its stems. More a bush than a tree, citrus aurantifolia tends to sprawl, so it may need staking or pruning. But nothing can beat the acidic zest of a lime straight from the tree. Put it on your list.

There are of course other citrus varieties in Thai gardens and orchards including several kinds of orange, the diminutive cumquat and the enormous grapefruit-like pomelo. Interestingly, all the major citrus fruits have evolved in cultivation from just three wild parent species; the citron, the shaddock or pomelo, and the mandarin. During the growing season, all of them need plenty of water and sunshine accompanied by some nitrogenous fertilizer.

Tip of the week

Mushrooms: Growing your own

THERE is a bar in Rawai called The Magic Mushroom". Its name is testament to the fact that some mushrooms are hallucinogenic or psychedelic: for example the small psilocybin toadstool. Some are downright poisonous. But most mushrooms, and certainly all the cultivated varieties, are not only good to eat but are rich in medicinal substances such as betaglucan and polysaccharides which can help reduce bloodsugar levels, boost the immune system and act as antiinflammatories.

In Thailand, local markets usually sell several kinds: straw mushrooms (hed fang), termite mushrooms (hed khone), white coral mushrooms (hed nu noo khao) and Jew's ear mushrooms (hed hu noo). Some of these are cultivated; some are "foraged" from the wild.

If you want to cultivate your own supply, the process is relatively easy since you do not need sun or rain or conventional soil. Growing kits can be obtained from stores such as Macro and Super Cheap.





ON FRIDAY August 23, teachers and students of the Prince of Songkla University, Phuket College joined representatives of the US Embassy to welcome

Erin Hoffman, an American video game designer and book author who came to Phuket to conduct a workshop on game designing.

Erin Hoffman is a lead game designer at the Institute of Play's Glasslab project -which is focused on introducing educational elements into computer games. Erin is also a novelist; her latest fantasy novel, Shield of Sea and Space was published this year. Born in San Diego, Erin still lives in California. She started programing when she was just 14 years old.

The *Phuket Gazette* spoke to Erin before the workshop to ask her about her creative approach to both game design and writing:

What is your inspiration when creating games?

Erin: I like animal games – I like systems, biology and the way that biology can be introduced into game mechanics and game systems. I love online game design and people connecting with each other through the internet. I wrote six or seven online games, not counting mobile [telephone based] games.

What motivates you to write a fiction?

Erin: I've always been interested in fantasy, particularly

I think that the features of science fiction and technology are going to be more female oriented. We will see more usability and software being

human which will influence science fiction as well.

What do you enjoy about writing fiction?

Erin: It is a connection between people. When you write something, like the books that I write, people read them and they feel very connected to me. I also enjoy giving people an experience they can not have in reality.

What are the most important elements of good game design?

Erin: There are two kinds of game designers, those who make games that they want

science fiction and futurism. to play and those who make games that other people want to play. These [second type of designers] are reacting more to other people needs. I think that the most important thing is

being able to put a game in front of a person, watch them play it and observe if they are confused, or understand the game and learn from that experience.

What can a novel writer teach to a game designer?

Erin: Books have a much greater sense of pacing, they are full of twists and climaxes. Games often don't have that sense, their pacing can be off. The way that you get introduced to a concept can be

either too fast or too slow. I think that the story telling of a novel can give a game a better sense of pacing, games that have a very good story also tend to be better

What are you working on right

Erin: I'm working on an educational game. It will teach argumentation, logical thinking and how to evaluate if something that somebody tells you is true or not, whether it has evidence that supports it, so when children grow up and they are listening to the news, they can evaluate whether they agree with it or not.

It will be a free tablet game.

What do you expect from this workshop?

Erin: I'm hoping to learn a lot from the students in Phuket. About what they want to be doing in games. I'm very interested in what kinds of games people in Thailand want to make if they could make games based on their own experiences. I'm travelling to the different universities, trying to connect with students to see what ideas are out there.



Thai smart-phone trends

MAJOR PC manufacturers Lenovo and Acer - newcomers to the mobile-phone arena – have picked up pace in the Thai smart-phone market, while local providers are increasingly competing on price in a bid for a bigger slice of the 8-million-unit market this year.

Subhasiddhi Rakkasikorn, managing director of Samart Multimedia, a local company providing smart phones and mobiles under its i-mobile brand. said the 3G smart-phone market in Thailand was highly competitive as demand continued to rise. The smart-phone market is now in a period of intense price competition. "We therefore try to provide our local brand with affordably-priced smart phones. Mobile phones priced at less than 5,000 baht are in high demand, therefore the firm will come out with both feature phones and smart phones to reduce the gap and cover all segments of the market," he said. "Samart Multimedia, which currently offers more than 30 mobile-phone

models, has divided its devices into three segments: premium smart phones, mass smart phones, and feature phones. It sold more than 1 million units in the first half of the year, and expects the full-year figure to come in at around 2.2 million. Acer, a leading PC-maker that jumped into the global mobilephone arena last year, is now strongly focused on the Thai market this year. Last week, the firm announced a new smart phone, the Acer Liquid Z3, which is an Android-based device that comes with Dual SIM capability at a price of just 2,590 baht.

Acer is concentrating on the mid to entry-level market and hopes to break into the top three in the Thai entry-level smartphone market in the next couple of years. Having set up a Thai business unit and team to support the new market, the company now provides devices to cover the entry, medium and high-end markets, with six models. - The Nation

Life & style Tronwoman: Get moving!

INSPIRATIONAL "Ironwoman", Australian Triathlon Hall of Fame member, Belinda Granger shed light on her inspiring career at an "Empowering Women Workshop" held at Thanyapura last week.

Belinda Granger is one of the most influential and successful triathletes Australia has produced, with an incredible 15 Ironman distance wins and five Top 10 finishes at the Ironman World Championships at Kona, Hawaii, putting her second in the all-time list of female Ironman champions.

Following her 10th and final appearance at the 2013 DATEV Challenge Roth event, the "Tour de France" of triathlon which attracts crowds of over 250,000 spectators to the hamlet, Ms Granger said she couldn't wait to return to Thanyapura to conduct the workshop and training camp.

The workshop focused on the reasons why it's good, and why sometimes not so good, to be a woman. Ms Granger also spoke passionately about promoting equality for women in professional sports.

"In Wimbledon, the prizes for women are much lower than for men. Some might say that it's because women play two sets and men play three sets. So [the theory goes] women don't work on the court as long as men, so they get less. But if you gave women a choice, they would be the first ones to say 'we might as well play three sets, we don't care'," she

"But in triathlon they don't have this excuse. Women run the same distance, compete on the same day and in the same conditions. I'd love to hear the director of such race explain why there are such differences in prize money."

She also spoke about her personal approach to sport and the mental attitude she adopts when competing.

"I never get to the finish line and give an excuse. There are excuses in racing, don't get me wrong. But I just don't like it. When you turn up at a race, you race as good as you can and give it all you got.

"As long as you give your 100 per cent, it doesn't matter if you come first or tenth or last to the finish line. As long as you know that you've given the best you have on that day, it's not a failure," she said.

"I am 43 this year and I am nowhere near ready to give it all I still love the sport so much and I still feel I have so much to give. I am living proof to all those women out there who think they are too old to do triathlon, that you are never too old or too slow or too inexperienced.

"But you don't have to compete in triathlons. Just notice something that keeps you energetic and lively and keep adding more of that element into your life," she added.

The workshop was part of Thanyapura's "Month For Women" held over August with a host of exciting activities and world class athletes gracing its campus in Phuket.

Besides the "Empowering Women Workshop" Ms Granger also con- ducted a three day, intensive "Women Only Training Camp" for female athletes. Speaking before the camp last week she told the *Gazette* about some of the topics and techniques that would be covered during the camp.

"I will be giving away many of the secrets to my longevity in the sport and maintaining a healthy balance between triathlon and lifestyle - something that many people struggle with," Ms Granger said.

"I will also be talking about nutrition for training and racing.

The camp is aimed specifically at women in triathlon. It does not matter what level you are at, the camp is open to women of all abilities, from the experienced racer to the 'newbie'," she said.

"The facilities at Thanyapura are second to none. There is nowhere else in the world where you have access to so much state-of-the-art equipment right at your finger tips. That is why my husband and I often stay there. It makes training so easy."

Ms Granger ran the training camp in tandem with Thanyapura's Triathlon Senior Coach, Juergen Zack, himself a legend in the sport and record-breaking, eight-time worldwide Ironman winner, whose Ironman Bike Course Record was 4 hours, 14 minutes and 12 seconds, which he held for 14 years.

Thanyapura President Robert Hauck said he was delighted to welcome Ms Granger and all the camp participants to Thanyapura and he said it was


an important milestone in cementing Thanyapura's leading role in transforming Phuket into one of the world's leading triathlon destinations.

Life & style Snot squeezes and secrets

Diving

THERE was an issue before we even boarded the boat. We had been waiting all weekend to photograph the artificial reef at Viking Cave off of Phi Phi Island and weather delays had pushed us back to our last day on the island, and now, looking at the pile of green mucus in my tissue, it was clear there was a problem - I had

For a BASE jumper, downhill skier, rock climber or sailor, a little congestion is just snot – for a diver it can be the difference between the perfect diving holiday in paradise and having to explain to everyone at the dive club back home that you bailed on the lifetime goal of spotting Manta rays in Thailand.

The fundamental difference between most activities and diving in this sense is equalizing the need to make the pressure of the air trapped inside our sinuses and air passages the same as the pressure exerted by the water around us. The smallest fraction of difference in that pressure can cause mind-zapping acute pain, known as a squeeze. And pushing too hard to equalize can have serious consequences.

There are people out there, including dive doctors, who have pushed through congestion for a last dive – and it was their last dive. Their mucus blockage turned out to be tougher than their eardrums. As they floated in the water, with fingers pinching their noses, blowing hard to push air through their sinuses into the air space in their ears, they ruptured their eardrums – and finished their diving

The pressure on divers, from dive professionals who pay the bills by being in the water to the once-a-year holiday dive junkies, can be enormous. It can cloud a diver's judgment.

After shutting the air-conditioner off, I sit in the hot shower, hoping

the steam will start to loosen some of the mucus from its moorings deep within my sinus passages. Sadly, the hotel did not have a neti, so no warm salt water snorting solution was on the table.

My dive buddy is banging on the door, worried we will miss our boat.

In no time at all, the boat is bobbing over the dive site. Already suited up, I get the nerve to let

my dive buddy and our dive guide know that I might have issues equalizing. This is a big moment. However unlikely, there is no sure way to know if the dive master will call off my dive for my own safety.

Suggesting cures for congestion is taboo among divers because the way we have been trained to deal with it. The reality of how many of us deal with it are at odds with each other.

Because serious issues can arise from equalization problems, the books say: "See a dive doctor to be cleared, or don't dive". Despite the the fact that issues relating to the ear, nose and throat are the most common conditions that the Divers Alert Network (DAN) receives calls about, the vast majority of divers seem to be allergic to seeing a dive doctor for "the sniffles". So many divers, and ashamedly I am one of them, occasionally cast caution to the wind.

Bobbing just one meter below the surface, I gently attempt to equalize, over and over again, as I watch the other divers easily continue their descent to the fish and corals below.


The underwater wonderland doesn't seem that far away.

"Standing" vertical in the water I breath out and let myself sink 20 centimeters deeper excruciating pain penetrates my head. It's too much.

Relaxing, I take a deep breath and ascend a bit. The pain disappears, and I return to gently

It is a strange sensation to see what you want, and where you want to go, but to be unable to get there. If there were a wall, a fence or a line of police officers with guns, my mind could wrap itself around the situation. But sitting at one meter, my obstacle was simply an invisible wall of pain just below my fins.

Another descent attempt yielded the familiar, sickly squeak reminiscent of earwax and tiny creaky doors; a few molecules of air had managed to squeeze by the well-fortified mucus barriers and relieve the pressure in my right ear. Then the left ear squeaked. I was almost down to three meters. Gently equalizing, my ears continued to create their own internal

cacophony, and I was descend-

Over beers and off the record, dive professionals are a little more willing to tackle the topic of congestion. They know nasal passages and sinuses make they aren't supposed to give professional advice, which can open them up to liability,

and is best left to dive doctors. However, they also know the territory, and they know it well.

This "insider" information marks the divergence between what some people do and what the book says they should do. These are the bits and pieces that are taboo.

The best trick in the book (on the up and up) is to dive -alot. The majority of

working dive masters and dive instructors spend enough time in the water that their bodies adjust. For some, practice makes perfect, and even with some congestion their

way. For others, equalizing isn't perfection, it's second nature: their bodies simply adjust to the change in pressure.

Most of us don't have the luxury of spending so much time in the water. Though a salt water neti can help, many turn to decongestants. If having congestion is the problem, something that removes the congestion seems a logical answer.

Decongestants come with their own dangers. When descending, a congested diver can "escape" to the surface, away from the pain of a squeeze. But if a decongestant starts to wear off below the surface, a diver can be trapped by the pain of surfacing – a reverse squeeze.

Many people turn to Actified as a decongestant of choice sticking to the 12 hour stuff as a precaution to it wearing off mid-dive. They take it about 30

minutes before a dive, and go for it. There are still risks, but they are risks they understand and are willing to except.

Descending at the rate of phytoplankton, I was regretting not having taken a decongestant.

Finally at the sea bottom, there is a pit in my stomach as I watch our dive team follow the slowly sloping sands deeper. Not willing to push further, I float several meters above the group jealously playing with their bubbles as they photograph and explore the lower concrete blocks of the artificial reef.

Back on the surface, I was safe. The necessary photos were captured, but it hadn't been a fun dive by any stretch of the imagination. On the boat, stripping off my gear with the warm tropical sun beating down on me, it was hard to imagine what would have been so bad about skipping the dive and working on a tan.







While Roger Federer and Novak Djokovic and the rest of the sport's old order calmly went about their business, 17-year-old Victoria Duval became the toast of New York.

Making her second appearance in a grand slam event against the Australian who beat Serena Williams in the final just two years ago, the pint-sized Duval clawed and fought her way to a 5-7 6-4 6-4 first-round win.

It was a remarkable performance but made all the more astonishing because of her background.

When she was seven years old,

Duval was taken hostage by robbers at her aunt's house in Haiti, a terrifying incident that convinced her parents, both doctors, to move back to the United States.

"It's not a good memory, so I try to forget as much as I could about it. I don't remember too much of it anymore, which is great," she told reporters.

In 2010, her father was buried alive in the Haiti earthquake. He survived by digging himself out but suffered serious injuries, including broken legs, broken ribs and a punctured lung.

Duval took to tennis instantly and has quickly risen through the American junior ranks but Tuesday's win was by far her biggest.

With her family watching from courtside and chants of "U-S-A!" echoing around the Louis Armstrong Stadium, Duval had to battle all the way to beat the vastly more-experienced Stosur.

"I think I'm very much of a child at heart ... (but) on the court, you have to be a warrior because that's just the sport we are in," she said.

Stosur paid tribute to Duval, saying she deserved the win, but said she had contributed to her own downfall with a whopping 56 unforced errors.

"I'm not going to be a sore loser and say she didn't do anything." said Stosur. "But, you know, I think I certainly helped her out there today, that's for sure."

Federer and Djokovic blasted their way into the second round with ruthless efficiency, crushing their hapless opponents in straight sets.

Defying the sceptics who had

dismissed his chances of winning a sixth title in the Big Apple, Federer was in vintage form as he brushed past Slovenia's Grega Zemlja 6-3 6-2 7-5 in a delayed afternoon match at Arthur Ashe Stadium.

Djokovic then lit up Tuesday's night session with a dazzling combination of power and precision to defeat Lithuania's Ricardas Berankis 6-1 6-2 6-2.

The world number one hardly broke sweat on a balmy New York night as he took the first step toward a possible fourth straight appearance in the final.

"I'm in a good spot right now. I want to enjoy it as long as it lasts," Federer said.

Twelve months after her agonising defeat in the women's final, Victoria Azarenka made a triumphant return to Arthur Ashe

Stadium, chalking up a rare double-bagel win by thrashing Germany's Dinah Pfizenmaier 6-0 6-0 in just over an hour.

Former world number one Caroline Wozniacki survived a tough examination to join grand slam winners Petra Kvitova and Ana Ivanovic in the second round.

With her boyfriend, golfer Rory McIlroy, watching from the stands, Wozniacki had to dig deep to beat Chinese qualifier Duan Yingying 6-2 7-5.

Wozniacki raced through the opening set in just 35 minutes then reeled off five games in a row to seal the win after falling behind

"It's not about being pretty," Wozniacki said. "It's about just getting the job done. I did that, so I'm happy about that."

Bombers fined millions for doping

ESSENDON Bombers have been thrown out of the eight-team Australian Rules finals that start next month and fined two million Australian dollars (57.5 million baht) after a probe by an antidoping agency.

The Australian Football League (AFL) also suspended Bombers coach James Hird for 12 months as it announced on Tuesday the heaviest sanctions in the sport's history.

never see again," said AFL commission chairman Mike Fitzpatrick in a statement.

"This is powerful affirmation that no single club or individual is above our great game."

The top-flight club and four of their senior officials were charged two weeks ago after the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) submitted an interim

"It's a drama we hope we'll report into the use of performance-enhancing drugs in the country's professional leagues.

The Bombers, one of the league's oldest and most storied franchises, have also been stripped of draft picks for 2013 and 2014.

Manager Danny Corcoran was banned for six months, two months of which is suspended, while assistant coach Mark Thompson received a fine of 30,000 Australian dollars.

Club doctor Bruce Reid will fight on Thursday the charges that were levied against him.

The Bombers have been under a cloud throughout the 2013 AFL season as ASADA probed the programme of supplements the club gave to players in 2011 and 2012.

The team announced in February they were cooperating with the investigation and commissioned an

independent review which found governance failures at the club had contributed to a "disturbing picture of a pharmacologically experimental environment".

The probe, which also targeted a club in the National Rugby League, sent shockwaves through sports-mad Australia which has long prided itself on a reputation as a nation that plays fair.

ICC on a roll, Youth team crush Laguna

IN ROUND 8 of the Outrigger T20 league, ICC took on Patong in the morning session, while the Youth side faced Laguna in the afternoon session.



PHUKET Provincial Public Health Office in conjunction with Phuket Provincial Administrative Organization (PPAO) recently organized the "One District One Aerobic" event in order to promote public health awareness.

Phuket Provincial Administrative Organization Secretary Kraiwut Kumban presided over the activity at Satree Phuket School, where 996 people joined in the activities.

"Nowadays, technology development changes people's lifesyles. People have no time to exercise or take care of themselves and this leads to poor health and reduced immunity. More people get sick, especially with diabetes, cerebro-vascular disease, acute myocardial infarction and sickness from drugs. As a result, the government is obliged to pay more than three billion baht per year," Dr Prapornsri Narinrak, deputy doctor for public health said.

"The Ministry of Public Health thus set a new campaign Thai people must have better health in ten years (2023) and the average age must be 80 years old. The ministry will educate people with three principles: good emotion, good food and exercise, so that they can change their unhealthy behavior such as alcohol and drug comsumption," she added.

Phuket Provincial Public Health Office also requested funding from the Phuket Provincial Administrative Organization to provide a stereo set, aerobic training programs and public health meetings.

A number of fitness groups were trained how to use a stereo set and how to do line dancing style aerobics by Wanchai Tangutasaha and Pramote Singhapoom. Each group also exchanged their points of view about exercising and what fitness activities their groups engaged in.

Boys at Phuket's Youth Football Home orphanage win a chance for a better future

IT SEEMS that most of us come to Phuket to get something. For some, it's the sun, for others – relaxation or an exotic experience. But once in a while you meet a person who's here not to take, but to give.

When I arrive at the headquarters of the Youth Football Home in Thalang, a charity organization focused on providing

a home and education to orphaned and destitute boys, the daily training session is about to begin. A handful of young boys in full soccer gear circle the wellmaintained football pitch in an effort to warm up before the game. Their couch, Hannu Tuukkanen, finds a minute to talk to me.

"I have been in the media quite a lot, but I feel it's the children who are the stars of the show. And they have some unbelievable stories," he says and proceeds to introduce some of the players. Among them are three boys

from Bangkok who were found at a railway station where their father abandoned them. The police took them to a foundation that takes care of the worst cases, but they ran away and ended up in a railway station again, looking for their father who never showed up. Hannu didn't hesitate to take them in, neither did he when he met a boy going by the name Owen.

When I choose kids who stay with us it's not about football. For example one of the boys, whose nickname is Owen, lived in Laos and he used to come by boat to Thailand, everyday, to go to school. And when I saw him, it took me five minutes to

decide to admit him because he needed help. He couldn't really play football but when I saw the look in his eyes, how eagerly he followed the ball, I took him in. And now he is a top scorer," explains Tuukkanen

Out of 31 children in the orphanage, aged between eight and 18, about half have lost both their parents. Many don't have mother or father and a few have both parents but no income, no job and no future.

> They come from around Thailand but to be admitted, they need to go through trials in Phuket.

"We used to travel to different provinces to look for orphans but we faced many problems and often corruption.For example, there were people who wanted me to pay tens of thousands of baht to take a kid from a temple."

"That is why I decided that trials will be here and for every kid we will cover the costs of transport, food and housing

for as long as it takes, which is usually three days," explains the coach.

The kids get shelter, food, education and a chance to develop their football skills. The boys go to school everyday and attend full scale football training sessions throughout the week, except for Wednesdays and Syndays.

Effects? Of the three boys who will finish the school next year, one will become a professional footballer. He already has an offer from Finland but first he'll go to the well established German football club Schalke. What about the other two? They will study at university.

"As long as they want to study, the foundation will pay, even if they want to go to Bangkok or abroad. You want to be a be, the foundation will pay," says the coach.

"When the boys get older, they realize that this is the best thing that could have happened to them. There are not many kids who can travel like we do. Normally I try to take every single child to some place in Asia or at least one time to Europe," he adds.

The Youth Football Home property consists of a dormitory for 32 boys, a residential building for staff and a full size football field plus training areas. The staff comprises two nannies, a cook, cleaning, security and ground personnel, and the coach. The whole place is filled with the spirit of football, starting with the numerous trophies presented in a large room on the first floor, ending with an impressive collection of football jerseys, all of them original and most of them signed by famous players who became the patrons of the foundation, among them Sir Bobby Charlton, Sir Geoff Hurst, Uwe Bein and others, many of whom visited Phuket and trained with the

boys at the Youth Football Home.

All this is payed for by the foundation which was started by the late Henrik doctor? A lawyer? Whoever you want to Lorenz, a Hong Kong based entrepreneur.

"We don't accept any money donations from outside. We want to keep this pure and clear of all bad thoughts, corruption and so on. If you have old football shoes, I'd really love to take those, as boys use three pairs per vear. If you're in the market and can buy some bananas, bring them. But no money," explains the coach. "There was some officials who offered help but they always want to come and play here and show off for political reasons. But we don't make noise. We have celebrity players come and stay with us, but we don't brag about it. We don't want this place to turn into a circus." he adds.

Of course there are challenges, the usual mess of getting visas and work permits (and visas for the boys willing to play in the West). But knowing what some of these boys chasing the ball on the pitch went through, all this seems just a minor bump on the road. With so much passion, focus and devotion, it seems that the Youth Football Home's team have found a winning formula.

IF THERE was any hope left for Phuket FC to still get promoted after their home-draw last Wednesday (August 21) to 2nd placed Air Force, then it was all but relinquished with an away-loss the following Sunday night (August 25) to 3rd placed Singhtarua FC.

Played in front of an energetic "Klong Toei Army" crowd at the PAT Stadium in the heart of the Thai capital, the match was both side's 25th of 34 fixtures in the Yamaha League One (YL1) 2013 season.

Once again, Phuket took an early lead – through a fabulous goal by Cristian Alex five minutes into play – and once again, they let such a lead slip away, with Singhtarua's Serbian sensation, Ivan Petrovic scoring the equalizer on 34 minutes.

In terms of possession and chances, it was a one-sided match in favor of the home team, who found what would prove to be the wining goal through Leandro Oliveira, scoring his 16th of the season nine minutes into the second half. IF IT'S Muay Thai you're seeking, check the hoards of gyms in the south and west of the island. Up here on the north side, it's all about the high-flying, upside-down, precision-perfect scissor-kick acrobatics for which Takraw is famed. And if you had to read that word twice, then you haven't really experienced Thailand yet.

On August 24 and 25, Srisoon-
