SuperCheap megastore ravaged by ferocious blaze

By Saran Mitrarat

FLAMES continued to ravage Phuket's renowned SuperCheap megastore on Thursday morning, stifling any efforts to search for victims caught in the inferno that broke out at the huge shopping facility the previous night.

Fresh reinforcements of firefighters arrived to relieve those who battled the flames throughout the night. Plumes of smoke continued to rise into the morning sky.

"Firefighters are doing their best, but parts of the building are still burning," Phuket Vice Governor Sommai Prijasilpa told the Gazette.

Two firefighters were injured during the night. "They were cut by sharp objects while fighting the fire, but thankfully their injuries were not serious," Vice Governor Sommai said.

The area surrounding the building remained sealed off, while investigators from the Phuket Forensics Police attended a briefing to prepare themselves for entering the facility.

The number of people possibly trapped by the fire could reach into the hundreds, though Phuket City Police chief Sermphan Sirikong was reluctant to estimate how many people...

...may have died in the blaze.

"We are co-ordinating our efforts with forensic police officers who will soon enter and search the building," Col Sermphan said.

The Phuket Social Security Office confirmed that 2,736 Thais and 700 Myanmar nationals are registered as employed by the store.

Throughout the night only one missing person report was formally filed at the incident center set up in front of the shopping

"After 2am, security guard told the Gazette.



Jongdee Chinthai was reported missing, but he was reported found alive by 8am today," Vice Governor Sommai confirmed.

Anong Khunpetthongrat, however, fears the worst for her 18-year-old daughter Siriporn Khunpetthongrat, a cashier at SuperCheap.

"I have been waiting all night to hear any news of her. I got here at about 9:30pm, as soon as I found out about the fire," Ms Anong said.

"I have very little hope that she is still alive. I am preparing myself for the worst," she tearfully

Vice Governor Sommai said the fire had damaged at least six houses in the vicinity.

Rassada Mayor Phudit Raksarat ordered his officers to conduct a door-by-door check to confirm how much damage local houses have sustained and to determine whether any local residents need assistance.

"We have about 200 police officers at the scene and about 300 rescue workers from Phuket and Phang Nga standing by," Vice Governor Sommai said.

Patong business owners threaten shutdown if Yingluck doesn't cut government corruption

PATONG business owners have delivered an ultimatum to the Office of Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra – fix the rampant corruption within the ranks of police and government officials in Phuket, or face the consequences.

The warning, delivered by Patong Entertainment Business Association (PEBA) president Weerawit Kureasombut on Tuesday, came with a deadline of October 31: Halloween.

"If steps aren't taken by then, bar owners in Patong may stage a general strike and shut down for one or even two nights," he told the *Gazette*.

If the seriousness of the message isn't heard - or fully appreciated – by the Prime Minister, then many bar and nightclub owners will be forced to close down permanently, as they cannot afford to keep making these corruption payoffs, Mr Weerawit explained.

"The entertainment business owners are in trouble. We filed a complaint in February to the Phuket Governor, but so far nothing has happened," Mr Weerawit said on Tuesday.

The complaint to the governor alleged that venue owners in Patong are required to pay an estimated total of 50 million baht a month to corrupt Phuket officials so that bars and nightclubs may trade outside of legal operating hours.

Phuket businessman and adviser to the Thailand Trade Organization Chart Chindapol said on Tuesday that he had now filed the same complaint with the Prime Minister's Office.

"I handed the complaint personally to Suranand Vejjajiva, the Secretary General to the Prime Minister of Thailand Yingluck Shinawatra," he said.

"The complaint was received by the Prime Minister's Office on October 7. We will give the government 15 days [until October

31] to take action. If nothing happens, we will do something to let them know that we are in distress," Mr Weerawit said.

Copies of the complaint were also sent to the Ministry of Tourism and Sports, Ministry of Interior, Royal Thai Police and other relevant departments.

Mr Weerawit also urged lawmakers to consider allowing entertainment businesses to trade longer hours in order to stamp out the rampant corruption.

"In the complaint, we explained that we want to extend the closing time for our venues to 4am. The Public Entertainment Place Act BE 2509 currently allows entertainment venues to be open until 1am only – and this is costing us a lot of potential income because our customers do not start coming to the venues until about 11pm.

"If we are allowed to stay open

Officer stripped of badge over drug den shoot-out

A PHUKET Tourist Police officer has been kicked off the force as the prosecutor moves forward to charge him with a double-homicide in a drug-den shootout in March.

Former officer Pinchai Piyadilok, 34 at the time of the shooting, lost a leg as a result of wounds sustained in the gun battle that left Saran Chaithum, 26, and Chalermpol Tripuk, 26, dead.

However, the only bullets and casings found at the scene, an apartment littered with kratom leaves near Phuket Rajabhat University, were fired from Mr Pinchai's gun, according to the Phuket Forensics Office.

"We have conducted a fair case, and not protected this officer just because he was on the force. If police break the law, then they too will go through the legal process like everyone else," said Phuket City Police chief Sermphan Sirikong.

"Now the case is out of our hands; I cannot give you any more details," Col Sermphan said

While being treated for gunshot wounds to his stomach and leg at

Prince of Songkla University Hospital in Haad Yai, Mr Pinchai's leg was amputated. After being discharged from the hospital he was allowed to return, on bail, to his home in Chumphon.

Mr Pinchai denies the charges

against him but has declined to give any statement to police, Col Sermphan said.

Natthapong Kaewkuanchum, the only other survivor found in the apartment, has also been discharged from hospital after receiving treatment for three gunshots to the chest. He too refuses to give a statement to police.

"Both parties have the right to remain silent. Anything that needs to be said can be said in court," Col Sermphan said.

In brief...

Officer charged with trafficking kicked off force, awaits trial

THE first police officer in Thailand to be charged with human trafficking has been discharged from the Royal Thai Police force.

Weerayuth Feuangfu, formerly with the Phang Nga Police, is free on bail as he awaits his trial in early November on charges of human trafficking, helping a refugee leave a shelter and abusing his position as an officer.

The charges were made after a Rohingya woman reported that she was repeatedly raped by a former employee of Mr Weerayuth after being smuggled out of a refugee shelter in Phang Nga on May 27.

Stiff penalties for restaurants with no grease traps

HEAVY pollution in the waterways throughout Phuket Town has prompted officials to lay down the law against all restaurants that do not install grease traps.

Any restaurants that do not have grease traps installed will not have their permits to operate renewed, Phuket City Deputy Mayor Dr Kosol Tang-Uthai warned last week.

"Too many restaurants do not use grease traps, and this greatly contributes to the wastewater problem polluting our public waterways," Dr Kosol said.

Sights on Patong water gate project

THE Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO) will spend over 19 million baht on a water gate to help alleviate flooding in Patong.

The gate will be used during heavy rains when high tides prevent water in the canal from draining into the bay. With the gate closed, the canal water will be pumped into the bay, explained Wassana Sriwilai, Director of PPAO's Engineering Division.

The project is set to be completed in 2015.

Cures for Racha woes gaining ground

A PLETHORA of measurements and proposals are moving forward on Racha Yai Island as tourist safety and environmental concerns loom over the popular tourist destination.

Racha Yai islanders last Saturday urged Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut to tackle tourist safety by supporting a health center as one way to solve the problem of tourist drownings there.

"To save tourists' lives, we need a health center on the island. Right now victims need to be transferred to the mainland for advanced medical help, and it takes too long," said Sarit Jandee, head of the Racha Island Conservation Club.

Mr Sarit asked the governor to provide a doctor and a nurse to staff the medical center, saying that islanders would provide land for the center free of charge, and the Chinese embassy would build the structure.

In response, Krit Sakulpat, the deputy chief of the Phuket Provincial Health Office, said he would analyze the feasibility of a health center.

Several days later, a meeting was called in Phuket Provincial Hall. Though a feasibility study had yet to be conducted for the health center, other issues, such as coral reef damage and wastewater were tabled.

To prevent boat operators from damaging corals by dropping anchor on them, 20 more moorings will be added, though their locations have yet to be determined, said Tanet Munnoy, director of the Department of Marine and Coastal Resources Phuket Office.

"We are going to add both big and small moorings. The bigger moorings will be better able to handle the weight of the big boats such as diving and fishing boats, while the smaller ones will be for the speedboats and longtails," Mr Tanet said.

He asked for help from boat operators and local residents in monitoring and taking care of the moorings.

The second major topic, wastewater, will be fully addressed on Monday when officials

Prab swears to play by the rules

LEADING Patong figure Preechavude "Prab" Keesin on Tuesday publicly announced that he was willing to pull down any structures at his family's Patong Bay Garden Resort that are found to be encroaching on the beach.

The announcement came after an inspection singled out his family's resort on Monday. The inspection was carried out by Department of Special Investigation (DSI) officers led by Tourism and Sports Minister Somsak Pureesrisak.

Mr Prab, whose father is Patong Mayor Pian Keesin, told the press that erosion had led to sea walls being built on the beach in front of the resort.

The resort was built in 1985 and taken over by the Keesin family in 2006, Mr Prab said.

"I noticed the beach in front of the hotel was being eroded by waves, and getting shorter and shorter every year.

"That's why the hotel set up the sandbag-and-stick wall along the beach, to prevent erosion. We were afraid that without that,

the waves would eventually erode the hotel structure itself," Mr Prab explained.

'If the investigation finds that the walls we made encroach on the beach area, we will remove them," he said.

Mr Prab invited the officials who inspected the resort on Monday, including Tourism and Sports Minister Somsak, to return and re-examine the resort at any time. He also offered to show them

his land documents. When asked why he was not present when officers went to the resort on Monday, Mr Prab said

"I felt the officials were being disrespectful toward me," he said. "Why did they have to come with

that he intentionally chose not to

so many Phuket and Bangkok media? It was as though they had proven me guilty already."

He also questioned why his family's resort had been the only one inspected that day.

"Why did they only inspect our hotel when actually there are many other hotels in Patong that have done the same thing," he mused, adding that he was happy to help officers "as long as they do not have any hidden agendas".

Mr Prab, who runs the Patong Taxi Federation, also took the opportunity to discuss taxis.

"I've talked with Minister Somsak about the taxis in front of Jungceylon. I explained to him that I have organized the taxi queue and made the taxis legal according to the law. If he wants to examine them, I am happy to help," he explained.

Mr Prab concluded by again denying that he is a mafia figure, arguing that he does not deserve to be on the list of Phuket mafia figures issued by the DSI on August 9.

"I believe I behave well," he said. "I participate in Patong and general Phuket community activities. If they say I am mafia simply because I know a lot of people, then the whole thing is really just wrong," he said.

"I do know who is who in Patong and who has done bad things, but I will never name names. I am not a mafia member, I am just an ordinary person. So I will live my life that way," Mr Prab said.

Road upgrades to ease clogged traffic arteries

THE local authorities responsible for main roads across Phuket will spend hundreds of millions of baht in road upgrades to make commuting in Phuket safer and faster.

The news was delivered by the chiefs of the Department of Rural Roads Phuket Office and the Phuket Highways Office at a meeting with Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut at Provincial Hall on Monday

"The projects will use the budgets of fiscal 2014 and 2015," Director Teeraporn Jirarattanakorn explained.

"We will develop five alternative routes with the aim of reducing traffic congestion," he added.

The first route to be upgraded will be the road joining Dowroong School on Chao Fa East Road to the intersection with Chao Fa West Road, Director Teeraporn said.

Other roads to be upgraded are:

• Route 3013, also known as Soi Koh Kaew 33, which runs directly past the Phuket Gazette

office, from Thepkrasattri Road to the intersection with Soi Han Farang

• Route 3013 to Route 4025. from the Phuket Mining Museum to the Loch Palm Golf Club in Kathu

• Route 3004, from Phuket Baan Charoen Sook to the intersection with Soi Han Farang in Koh Kaew

• Route 3001, which runs bend the Premium Outlet mall on the bypass road

"The total budget required is expected to be hundreds of millions of baht, and we expect the projects to be complete in 2015," he added.

Governor Maitri said he would lead a team to inspect the sites of the proposed road upgrades so he could help expedite the budget required.

"My team and I will inspect the routes so we can see them for ourselves and determine which routes must be fixed urgently," Governor Maitri said.

AoT sets new taxi rules QUEER

Engine size, age, insurance, GPS requirements go into effect in December

AN OPEN meeting at the Airports of Thailand (AoT) Phuket office on October 11 has resulted in a slew of new measures to be introduced to improve the quality of service of taxis serving Phuket International Airport.

The news follows weeks of controversy over current arrange-

"What has been agreed on is that each taxi operating to and from the airport must have an engine of at least 1,950cc," announced Phuket Airport Deputy General Manager Visutr Chantana.

These vehicles must be not more than five years old and must be insured for the car, the driver and passengers," he added.

"All of the taxis will be monitored by GPS from our control room to ensure that no taxis go astray. This will ensure that passengers are not taken on circuitous routes, but are taken directly to their chosen destinations," Mr Visutr said.

Kanputt Mungklasiri, an execu-

tive vice president at the airport, recommended that a single counter be dedicated for all taxis so that passengers could easily queue and be issued tickets for taxi service, much like the system used at Suvarnabhumi International Airport in Bangkok.

"The tickets would record the taxi number as well as the destination. Set fares for various destinations should be shown at the counter," Mr Kanputt told the

"We should also have standard uniforms for drivers. This can solve a lot of the 'gray-area' problems we have experienced," he said.

Chukiat Panyawai, a representative of a registered taxi co-operative that serves the airport, noted that any changes should keep the drivers in mind.

"If the AoT wants to terminate the existing taxi group system, they should establish a new system that will benefit us because we have served passengers at the airport for a long time," he said.

Phuket Vice Governor Chamroen Tipayapongtada, who

chaired the meeting, called for AoT to form an independent committee to resolve all the airport's taxi-related problems.

'Such a committee would de-

fine an exact and detailed plan to replace the current taxi-group arrangement, which will come to an end after November," V/Gov Chamroen said.






The search for closure

Captain's family makes heartfelt plea to find lost crew of MV Hope

THE family of Captain Rajib Chandra Karmaker, master of the Bangladeshi cargo ship MV *Hope*, has launched a public appeal for any information that may lead to the recovery of the missing captain's body and those of his lost shipmates.

The *Hope*, laden with ball clay, was struck broadside by large waves and listed heavily in stormy seas south of Phuket while en route from Malaysia to Bangladesh on July 4.

Five of the 17-strong crew managed to board a life raft and were later rescued by the passing German container ship *Buxmoon*, but the other 12 were tossed into the sea when the ship heaved violently.

Of those thrown into the sea, four were recovered alive. The bodies of four other sailors from MV *Hope* have since been recovered and identified, leaving four still listed as missing at sea: Capt Rajib, Jr Electrical Officer Sadim Ali, Deck Hand Md Nasir Uddin and Chief Cook Nasir Uddin.

"I want people, and especially hospitals in coastal areas, to recognize whether or not they have found the bodies of these men. If anybody finds any information about them, they should inform us," Capt Rajib's daughter, Ronika, told the *Gazette*.

"My father was wearing his uniform when they abandoned ship. If anyone identifies a body with that shirt, they should inform us," she said.

ACCEPTANCE

Ronika explained that the absence of her father has taken a grave toll on her family.

"Personally, I am still in a state of shock. It is very hard for me and my family to accept this. Life without my father seems unreal. My father was not around much

because of his work, so it just feels like he is only gone for some time

"It feels like he will be back from work, and everything will go back to normal. I miss him every day," she said.

DIRE STRAITS

The shipping community in Bangladesh and afar has rallied support for the victim's families, understanding their emotional loss and the financial impact of the tragedy.

"We are in a dire financial crisis now," said Ronika. "We were already going through some serious financial difficulties before my dad went off to sail on MV *Hope*. Now that he is missing, there is no source of income in the household. My mother is a housewife, like any other traditional Bengali woman."

Ronika, 22, is a student at the North South University in Dhaka.

"Now my only plan is to graduate from university and get a good job so I can support my family as the elder daughter. I have a

younger brother, who's in grade 10 now," she explained.

"The shipping community is trying to help us, and the Singapore Mariners Community has offered to fund my education. Their support has been a blessing for me," Ronika said.

LAW OF THE SEA

Meanwhile, efforts by the ship's owner, Trade Breeze Shipping Ltd, to provide assistance remain mired in antiquated maritime law.

"The company avoided con-

tacting us for the first 10 to 12 days after the incident. Then they contacted us and told us that we would be compensated for our loss. But it will be a long, difficult process because the men are 'missing'," Ronika explained.

"The Bangladeshi law for marine accidents – which is 100 years old – states that compensation shall be granted after seven years of the incident to a missing person's family. This is a huge problem because our family is in a dire financial crisis right now," she said.

"My father was the only wage earning member of the family and now we have no source of income. The shipping company is now cooperating with us, and hopefully we will receive compensation soon," Ronika added.

SUPPORT

The other victim's families have been a source of emotional support for Ronika and her family.

"We have been in touch with the families of the other missing crewmen, as all of us are suffering from the same situation.

"Because my father was the Master of MV *Hope*, the other families came to us for help," Ronika explained.

"The missing crew members were the earning members of their families, and losing them affected all of us both emotionally and financially.

"Most of the family members of the crewmen are not well-educated, and are not familiar with official procedures regarding this case. So my mother has helped them in every way possible," she said.

"I believe we will always be connected, because we are facing harsh circumstances together which nobody else would be able to understand.

HOPE

In the saddest of ways, the MV *Hope* tragedy has brought the Karmaker family closer together, explained Ronika

"This has definitely affected my mother and I. It has given us a sense of unity that we are facing the same problems together," she explained.

"The communication between the families is great; in a way it made us all stronger.

"It is the great irony of fate that the ship that destroyed everything was named MV *Hope*. I hope every day that my father returns.

"Hope is all I have now."

MISSING

"My father is a very brave man. In times of crisis, he does not think about himself. Rather, he goes on to help or save others who are in trouble. That is what he did during the whole incident.

"He apparently had put his life in danger to get other crewmen on the raft. When the German boat *Buxmoon* came to save them, he let go of their rope and pushed the other crewmen ahead.

"He fulfilled his duty as the master of the ship, even when they were in the water. I have heard all these from some of the crewmen. I wish he was more selfish and had thought about himself, but being the honest and brave person he is, he could not refrain himself from doing so. I respect him more now. As a daughter, I am so proud of him."



Elephant smugglers led to court, arrest of corrupt officials sought

TWO of the men involved in the elephantsmuggling operation blown open in Phuket in August were set to be presented in court on October 17 as the *Gazette* went to print.

Meanwhile, officers leading the investigation will move to have arrest warrants issued for public officials involved in the trafficking ring.

The suspects Surat Termsak and Prasong Bootchaiyaphum have both confessed to conspiring with a Provincial Chief Administrative Officer in Chaiyaphum province, in Northeast Thailand, by filing false elephant registration documents for approval, explained Nithit Kerdsri, an blood samples for DNA tests. Work coninvestigator with the Natural Resources and **Environmental Crime Suppression Division** (NREC).

The illicit registration documents were issued for 69 elephants suspected of being trafficked across the border from Myanmar.

The high-ranking Chaiyaphum official has since retired.

"We are also going to request arrest warrants for the officers involved in the case," Lt Nithit said.

During the raids on seven elephanttrekking camps in Phuket, officers collected

tinues on establishing whether or not the elephants were trafficked or poached from the wild, or are offspring stolen from elephants registered in Thailand.

We are still working on blood and DNA tests," Phuket Livestock Chief Weerasit Putthipairoj said.

"It will take at least one more month," he said.

At this stage, none of the owners of the Phuket elephant camp investigated in raids in August will face legal action.

Search for Thailand's sharks

ONE of the largest projects ever designed to document the worrisome trend of declining shark sightings in Thailand was announced last week in Phuket.


In the wake of professional diver testimonials showing a 95 per cent decrease in shark sightings at Thailand's renowned dive destination the Similans, the founders of UK NGO Shark Guardian have moved forward with the Thailand E-Shark Project, which will run from November 1 to April 30.

The project is designed to document the number of shark sightings by ocean explorers to provide scientific data to support general observations of a dramatic decrease of shark sightings across the nation.

Brendon Sing and his wife Liz, founders of Shark Guardian, have been working in the dive industry in Thailand for over 10 years.

"Since we started our work, and even until recently, local Thai guides and expats working in the dive industry have continuously reported seeing fewer and fewer sharks," Mr Sing said.

industry and their [dive professionals'] livelihoods. However, it's very hard to prove any of that," Mr Sing said.

Ahead of the launch of the Thailand E-shark Project, local

dive industry figures were surveyed to gather testimonials about shark sightings at Koh Tao, Koh Phi Phi, Phuket, Koh Lanta and the Similans.

"Shark sightings are massively

on the decline in the Similans. It looks like they've dropped by about 95 per cent since 2007," Mr Sing said.

The Thailand E-shark Project, which will collect data from divers, snorkellers, fishermen, boaters, beach walkers and standup paddle boarders, is expected to support these startling claims.

Most recently, data collected by the international organization E-Shark was used to support the introduction of five species of sharks to the Convention of International Trade of Endangered Species (CITES) Appendix II in Bangkok earlier this year.

Those logging sightings will be asked to provide the time and exact location of the sighting to allow scientists to identify multiple sightings of the same shark.

Thailand E-Shark was announced at the opening of Phuket's diving high season at Aquamasters in Chalong (see page 44). The announcement was made to the large gathering of dive professionals, who are expected to lead the charge in documenting sightings. However, Mr Sing said everyone was invited to take part in the project.

...we could generate more money, which would mean a lot more tax revenues would be collected by the government," he explained.

Businessman Mr Chart accused local government officers of not taking the issue seriously.

"The highest-ranking government officer on the island just called on the relevant department heads to discuss and inspect the problem, after that he went back to sleep. He is willing to let the problems from the past stay, and instead is focusing only on tackling new problems. The old problems have never been resolved," he said.

Mr Chart repeated his public claims made on August 23 that at least 17 government offices in Phuket are involved in extracting bribes from local businesses to overlook ("not see") closing times and to "protect them".

"At this stage, we have enough evidence to identify the places

where police have been collecting money and how they collected it, but I cannot reveal this to the media," he stated.

However, Mr Chart publicly named a "Sgt Wit" of the Royal Thai Police Phuket Special Branch (Santibaan) division as the bagman who collected the illicit payments. "Among the officers, he collects most of the money from Patong business owners, about 4 to 5 million baht per month," Mr Chart said.

"He asks for money from all kinds of businesses, including entertainment venues and businesses involved in land encroachment, and he supports foreign mafia operators in Phuket.

"He claims that the money goes to all the highest-ranking police officers in Phuket," Mr Chart alleged.

Maj Chaisak Sawasri, chief of the Phuket Special Branch division, on Wednesday declined to confirm or deny whether any "Sgt Wit" was among his officers.

Mr Chart also gave the press a breakdown of monthly "standard fees" collected: 3,000 to 5,000 baht from small businesses; 10,000 baht from medium-sized enterprises; and 100,000 baht for big business.

"He collects a cut of the profits made by some of the businesses in addition to the standard fee." he also alleged.

Mr Chart announced that he will set up a center that will bypass Phuket officials and file complaints directly to the appropriate officials in Bangkok.

Big-hearted meth dealer booked for donation

A DRUG dealer is under arrest in Chonburi after trying to donate 11 *ya bah* (methamphetamine) pills to flood victims.

Having ingested five *ya bah* pills himself earlier that day, Jakkrit Mukpradap showed up at a center for collecting donations for flood victims in Satthahip District on October 14, *The Nation* reported.

When Mr Jakkrit, 39, tried to donate the pills to a booth in front of Wat Thep Prasart, he was promptly arrested.

A search of his home turned up a homemade gun and some ammunition.

Mr Jakkrit, a former drug convict, said he got the drugs from a Rayong supplier identified only as "Chamlong".

Mr Jakkrit said he had dealt drugs for three years after serving a prison term for his prior offense.

He said he was motivated to aid flood victims after watching a television news report, so he donated the pills believing staff members could sell them for 3,000 baht.

Bangkok protesters unmoved despite 'itchy plant' attack

POLICE on Tuesday tried in vain to convince protesters who have camped out at the Urupong Intersection for days to move to the National Stadium on Rama I Road.

"The relocation will ease road snarls and police can assure improved safety for protesters," Metropolitan Police spokesman Maj-General Adul Narongsak said.

Police had reopened 14 closed roads after assessing a reduced threat from the demonstrators, reported *The Nation*.

Rally leader Nitithorn Lamlua said police

had neglected their duty to ensure peace as some people had thrown *ma mui* (itchy plants) into the tent where the protesters were sleeping.

Mr Nitithorn called for the crowds to surge to 10,000 to show retaliation against poor police performance.

Leaders were drafting a petition for a probe into suspected foul play related to the prosecutors' dropping of a terrorism charge against former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra, he said.

Rally to remember 1973 riots

HUNDREDS of people marched through the streets of Bangkok lsat Sunday to mark the 40th anniversary of the October 14, 1973 uprising, one of the most important events in Thailand's modern history.

The United Front for Democracy Against Dictatorship (UDD) – better known as the red shirts – were heavily involved in the memorial event, which began at Democracy Monument at 7am, *The Nation* reported.

The organizers gave alms to 40 monks and laid wreaths at the monument before marching to Thammasat University, whose students led the 1973 protests.

They paused at times during the march and stood in silence to remember students killed recently and in the past.

Jaran Dithaapichai, a red-shirt leader who was the chief organizer of the event, said hundreds of thousands of students fought against a military regime 40 years ago, and allowed Thailand to achieve democracy – although this freedom was later disrupted by coups.

The protests were held against the unpopular military regime of Field Marshal Thanom Kittikhachon. Mr Thanom, his deputy Praphas Charusathien and son Col Narong

were known as the Three Tyrants.

On October 14, after several days of student activism, the protest reached a climax, with some half a million people gathering on

Ratchadamnoen Avenue.

The army was brought in against the protest and opened fire, eventually killing more than 100 people.

The protesters started to disperse following an intervention from HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej, who went on TV and radio at 7:15pm to announce that Mr Thanom's government had resigned.

However, the protests did not end completely until the next day, when it was announced that the Three Tyrants had gone into exile.

Speaking at last Sunday's event, Education Minister Chaturon Chaisang told the marchers that the students fought 40 years ago against injustice and in the hope of seeing Thailand become a land of justice and freedom.

Mr Chaturon said the wishes of the student activists would be achieved by amending the current charter to make it genuinely democratic.

Quake kills over 100 In brief... Myanmar braces

region

MORE than 100 people died after a 7.2-magnitude earthquake, the strongest to shake the Philippines in 23 years, devastated Central Visayas on Tuesday; 97 of the victims were from Bohol alone.

As of 8am Wednesday, National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) said 276 people were injured.

Eleven hospitals were damaged while two were shut down by the quake. Department of Health (DOH) officials noted in a press briefing on Wednesday that six of the 11 affected hospitals were owned by DOH, three were private hospitals while the two were established by the local government units in the Visayas.

The health department confirmed that two hospitals in the

quake-hit region were no longer functioning. They said the patients from the damaged medical institutions have already been transferred to other locations.

DOH teams were deployed to Tagbilaran City to augment medical staff there, the Philippine News Agency (PNA) reported.

Health Assistant Secretary Eric Tayag warned hospitals that an influx of patients with injuries ranging from simple lacerations to fatal crushing injuries may continue for days after the tragedy.

He also warned the public to beware dust from collapsed buildings, which he said could clog air passages of trapped survivors and cause severe lung problems or even death. - Philippine Daily Inquirer

THE Myanmar government has tightened security across the country after a series of bomb blasts in Bago and Yangon regions.

The move follows a bomb exploding in a bathroom at the Trader's Hotel in Yangon just before midnight on Monday, injuring an American woman. On October 11, a blast occurred in a guesthouse at Taungoo in Bagon Region, killing a man and a woman. - Eleven Media Group

Laotians top Asean as biggest drinkers

LAOS ranked top of the 10 Asean countries for alcohol consumption, with an average of seven liters consumed per person per year, according to a survey by the World Health Organisation.

The results were revealed at a meeting in Vientiane on October 12 to sum up the Communitybased Drug Abuse Control Project.

The survey also found that Lao women drink more than women in neighboring countries.

Malaysian churches fear fallout over 'Allah' ban

THE Malaysian Court of Appeal on Monday upheld a ruling to ban Catholic weekly publication *The* Herald from using the term "Allah", raising fear among Christians in Malaysia that the ruling may lead to further restriction of the use of the word among Malayspeaking Christians in the country.

Sabah Council of Churches president Bishop Thomas Tsen noted there were 1.6 million bumiputra (indigenous Malay) Christians in Sabah and Sarawak who use Bahasa Malaysia (Malay language) in their worship in addition to their native languages, and that such Christians make up about two-thirds of the country's Christian population.

Bishop Tsen said proscribing the use of the word "Allah" would turn the native bumiputra into lawbreakers. "The ruling contradicts a common practice of the Church in Sabah and Sarawak for hundreds of years.


"A most serious breach of the

pillar pertaining to religious freedom is the assault on the rights of bumiputra Bahasa Malaysiaspeaking Christians to the use of the Al-Kitab (Bible) and the word Allah," he said.

United Pasokmomogun Kadazandusun Murut Organisation (UPKO) president Bernard Dompok, who was instrumental in the establishment of diplomatic ties between Malaysia and the Vatican, said the ruling was a sad day for the natives of Sabah and Sarawak in east Malavsia.

"The use of the word 'Allah' in both states predated the formation of Malaysia. The word is being used by Christian communities in Indonesia and the Arab world. Why should Malaysia be any different?" he asked.

Constitutional law expert Syahredzan Johan said they could now use the decision as a precedent to ban the use of any word under the rationale that it would cause confusion. - The Star

Wheelchair-bound bomber's sentence sparks Beijing rage

A CHINESE man in a wheelchair who detonated a home-made bomb in Beijing's airport after trying to draw attention to a nearly decade-long legal battle was sentenced to six years in jail, his lawyer said on Tuesday, sparking widespread sympathy and anger.

A Beijing court found Ji Zhongxing, 34, guilty of intentionally causing an explosion.

Ji detonated the bomb at Beijing airport in July after being prevented from handing out leaflets petitioning for justice for an alleged police beating that left him wheelchair-bound in 2005.

"He only did it because he had no alternative," Zhao Min, a petitioner, said. "Because he couldn't get any resolution through legally petitioning many times."

Typhoon Nari hits Vietnam, 122,000 people evacuated

TYPHOON Nari knocked down trees and damaged hundreds of houses in central Vietnam early on Tuesday, forcing the evacuation of tens of thousands of people, state media said.

More than 122,000 people had been moved to safe ground in several provinces, including Quang Nam and Danang city, by late Monday before the typhoon

Small plane with at least 14 on board missing in Mexico

A SMALL plane carrying at least 14 people has gone missing in the northern Mexican state of Baja California, emergency services said on Monday, and rough weather from Tropical Storm Octave was hampering search efforts.

Attempts to contact the pilot had failed and the plane, which departed on Monday, only had fuel for a maximum of two and a half hours.

Oil keeps fires burning in Gaddafi aftermath

DEEP in Libya's southern Sahara, tribal sheikhs crowded into a Bedouin tent last month to declare their remote province bordering Algeria would break away from the government in far-off Tripoli.

A thousand miles to the east, armed protesters had seized ports disrupting oil shipments into the Mediterranean in support of local activists who appointed a de facto prime minister.

Prime Minister Ali Zeidan's Libya sounds like a country on the verge of splitting into a jigsaw of rebellious enclaves each with their own government, militias and, importantly, their own share of Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) member Libya's oil.

The recent US military raid to snatch a top suspected al Qaeda operative from Tripoli underscored how Libya's turmoil may make it easier for Islamist militants to find safe haven there.

PM Zeidan himself was kidnapped from a Tripoli hotel on Thursday by gunmen from a former rebel faction calling itself the Operations Room of Libya's Revolutionaries in reprisal for the government's role in the US raid.

Two years after civil war ended the 42-year rule of Muammar Gaddafi, federalist ambitions complicate PM Z eidan's fragile control over former rebels still jostling for more power.

His challenge is clearest in the east, where protesters claiming to protect Libya's oil from corrupt elites have closed ports, dug in and threatened to sell oil independently for their Cyrenaica region, long an anti-Gaddafi stronghold.

There, the main city Benghazi has already set up its own council demanding to run local affairs, and called for state oil company NOC to return to an area that was

once Libya's economic heartland.

"The government and congress exploit Libya's wealth and use it to serve their agendas," said Ibrahim al-Jathran, the former head of an oil protection security unit who defected and seized eastern ports as a self-styled federalist chieftain.

Yet as chaotic as Libya appears, it is far from partition or from taking the path of Iraq, where federalism splits oil revenue between Baghdad's Arab-led government and a Kurdish enclave that runs its own administration and armed forces.

Rather than a widespread popu-

lar movement, Libya's autonomy protests have grown out of Tripoli's lack of control, tribal loyalties and a series of unresolved local grievances over security, corruption and poor services that have festered since the 2011 revolution.

Independence declarations by Cyrenaica and more recently by the southern Fezzan region change little on the ground politically, analysts say, as they have no mass support for now, and carry no authority under Libya's transitional arrangement.

But the risk is that such demands could drive Libya deeper into chaos, with a weak government paralyzed by inertia and armed militias with little popular support holding Tripoli to ransom by shutting down oil in the name of federalism.

That scenario has already drawn comparisons to Nigeria, where militants with the Movement for the

Emancipation of the Niger Delta (MEND) have attacked oil installations, kidnapped foreign workers and siphoned off crude for sale under the banner of fighting for the oppressed people of the region.

Without a clear central government response, Libya may still slowly fragment with competing regions and cities, loyal to rival tribal and ethnic groups, vying for control of local oil and gas resources.

"They are trying to use this power as a bargaining tool with the state. They want to disrupt the current political process and to do so they threaten to break off from Libya," said International Crisis Group's Claudia Gazzini.

"Whether this becomes an armed confrontation that leads to greater autonomy depends very much on how the government responds to these peoples' demands."

Capital sees a flurry of new residential launches

RESIDENTIAL developers in the Thai capital are lining up to give their 2013 sales a final push by launching more projects, according to a survey by The Nation early this week

Namely, Pruksa Real Estate Plc's latest condominium, the 900-million-baht Condolette Pixel at Sathorn; Sammakorn Plc this week is introducing its first condo project, the S9, valued at 1.07 billion baht; Krisdamahanakorn Plc plans to roll out three condo projects worth 2.46 billion baht. The company also plans to rename itself AQ Estate Plc, subject to shareholder approval; Lucky Living Properties Co is marketing the Liv@49 condo project worth 1.5 billion baht at Sukhumvit Soi 49.

Veranda Resort and Spa has unveiled the Verasidence Pattaya and Veranda Resort and Spa Pattaya. About 2 billion baht will be spent to develop 360 condo units, starting at 16 million baht per unit and 1 billion baht to develop the hotel.

Kittipol Pramoj Na Ayudhya, managing director of Sammakorn, said last week that the company

RPM taps into rental market

ROYAL Phuket Marina (RPM) has plunged into the island's property rental market, releasing scores of luxury apartments for rent since the beginning of this year.

There are almost 100 units in total inside the RPM complex, and of the 40 units opened for rental, only 20 per cent remain vacant.

Formerly RPM was focused on property sales but since early 2013, the development's management began to eye the potentially lucrative rental market. As part of this new strategy, the company now facilitates the rental of privately owned apartments in its complex to third parties. While it is still early days – the rental facilitation service has not been officially announced yet – the response, from both owners and renters, has been very positive.

There are three kinds of rental agreements on offer from RPM: daily, weekly and monthly. And the range of residences to choose from includes two, three and four-bedroom apartments. Sales Director of Royal Phuket Marina Kanittha Prasopsirikul said that the two-bedroom apartments at RPM are very

unique: "We have the two-bedroom with pool deck, and the two-bedroom duplex - which is a twostorey apartment with a jacuzzi on the top," she said.

Rates for the two-bedroom apartments range from 8,000 to 15,000 baht per day; depending on the season and period of stay. For threebedroom apartments, the prices range from 10,000 to 18,000 baht. Monthly rental rates start from 60,000 baht and range up to 250,000 baht. Factored into these rates are the various services provided by RPM such as meals and housekeeping, which customers can choose to utilize.

"Customers can choose to pay for the room only, or the room plus breakfast and cleaning, high speed internet, bed sheet change, and so on. Everything is flexible. It's VIP living, customers can request what they want. Most importantly, RPM will take care of them 24 hours a day," said Ms Kanittha.

Ms Kanittha went on to talk about the various benefits of RPM's central location, which she expects will attract expats seeking convenience coupled with a luxury lifestyle.

"The selling point of RPM is

our location. We don't have an ocean view but we are in the heart of the island. It takes less than 30 minutes to go anywhere (except during rush hour).

"Our main residents are those who have boating businesses, executives from big hotels and company employees who have their children studying at the nearby British International School.

"In the morning, it takes at least one and a half hours to drive from Rawai to the school or 45 minutes from Laguna. So, living at RPM lets people have more of a city lifestyle – not an island lifestyle.

"Therefore, many people have moved to RPM because it's more convenient for them to drop their children off at school and in the daytime, mothers can go to the fitness center or restaurants. Most customers we have are European, about 80 per cent, but Russians also make up about 10 per cent and about 10 per cent of our customers are Thai as well," said Ms Kanittha.

Ms Kanittha also spoke about the added benefit of its rental services for customers interested in investing in the next phase of RPM.

"The positive results from our property rental service leads into our new project in RPM (Phase Three). This project is especially good for investors who want to buy an apartment to release for rental. We will also be able to help them find customers."

Developers sourcing new capital channels

A NUMBER of leading developers plan to issue property funds worth more than 30 billion baht combined, in order to raise capital to support their business expansion over the remainder of this year and during 2014.

When added to the property funds already issued this year, nearly 100 billion baht worth of such funds will have been issued in total. Raising funds via the capital market has the advantage of reducing developers' financial costs when compared with borrowing from commercial banks or the issuance of debentures, according to a survey by The Nation and information from the Securities and Exchange Commission.

This is why some developers have expanded their investment in rental-income businesses such as hotels, office buildings and retail, which are the sources for issuing property funds – to be upgraded to real-estate investment trusts (REITs) next year with a future. For example, CP Land is issuing the 10-billion baht CP Land Growth Leasehold Property Fund

3 Bangkok Land Plc

by selling three office buildings -Silom, Ratchada and Phayathai which currently provide rental income for the company and will generate a return for investors in the fund.

"Issuing the property fund will help us to raise low-cost capital to support our business expansion," said CP Land Chief Executive Officer Sonthorn Urunanonchai.

Listed developer Property Perfect, meanwhile, is issuing a property fund worth 500 million baht, with its Uniloft Salaya dormitory being sold to the Uniloft Property Fund as the income generator. The company has been planning such a move since 2010, when it started constructing dormitory projects.

Another listed developer, Bangkok Land, plans to issue an REIT worth between 18 billion and 20 billion baht next year by using its Impact Exhibition Center to generate income for the trust. Home Products Center will issue a 4.06 billion baht property fund this year, view to raising capital in the using the long lease on Market Village Hua Hin to generate a return for the fund.

I'VE always had an aversion to things that go bump in the night, but as our Thai Smile jet ramps up to 33,000 feet, an extended period of turbulence has left my forehead battered, but not bruised. Yes, the flight attendants shock orange uniforms put me into a Halloween mood, yet they move about the cabin like apparitions – not unlike giant mangos.

My mission, which I have duly accepted, is a flying trip to Chiang Mai and there is nothing quite like getting your feet on the ground to see how Thailand's great northern hope is faring these days. Things immediately get off to a good start with the taxi into town weighing in at a paltry 200 baht. A quick check of my pulse and slap in the face ensures this is not a bout of sleepwalking nor a visit to the afterlife.

Making big news in hotel circles lately has been the split between the Mandarin Oriental chain and the posh Dhara Dhevi resort; which is one of the city's top places to stay. Over the next two days of idle chit-chat with various hoteliers runs the typical rumor mill but expectations are that a global luxury flag will be attached to the property once again in the not-to-distant future.

Without a doubt, the highlight of the trip was a stay at the 137 Pillars House. Here the centerpiece of the property is a stunning restored teak house, which had served as the headquarters of the East Borneo Company. This place oozes charm, history and colonial elegance. I've travelled throughout Asia for longer than I can recall and this is one of the loveliest hotels I've come across.

A recent entry to the area is the 16-room boutique hotel Sala Lanna. With its unique riverside location, two restaurants and a rooftop bar overlooking the city, this is a very chic offering indeed. Having opened in April, the property is already gaining a strong reputation, as is the Sala Group, who aside from offerings here in Phuket, Koh Samui and Khao Yai, also recently added a Bangkok entry.

Both the 137 Pillars and Sala Lanna are strong design statements,

albeit in very different ways. With the former being created by top Thai interior design firm P49 and the latter having a more modern feel, yet personal at the same time. It's very much a yin and yang proposition and not dissimilar to a fine dining restaurant offering two irresistible specials for the day. Decisions, decision – perhaps I will have both.

As anyone who has not been in a coma for the past year can tell you, the Chinese have embraced Chiang Mai with an irresistible vigor. It's not uncommon to see Chinese on signs, menus or special hotel promo cards at front desks. Despite suffering the woes of the global financial crises, and Thailand's political circus, the destination now clearly has a second life. Walking through the Tapae area, there are echoes of the vibe you get in Luang Prabang or Ubud in Bali. Sure, there are budget travellers, but also a new set of older, well-heeled flash-packers who are looking for a more authentic Thai experience than that offered by the big beach destinations.

Another stop had me in the Manathai Village, which has retained its charm and its strong loyal following. Here, small is better remains the mantra. I had time to catch up with stylist David Shribsole, who continues to tweak the offering two to three times a year and keep things fresh for returning guests. Familiar faces surround me from a previous stay and David says that over the past six years, they have had only one staff member depart due to maternity reasons.

Nearby, in the district where the famed night market takes place, other guest houses and properties are starting to reinvent themselves. A case in point is the bright and funky SoHo which is an upgraded hostel offering, not unlike the new breed seen in Bangkok's Lub-d and others.

Unlike Phuket, Chiang Mai's tourists are taking to the streets in increasing numbers and the

pace and rhythm is refreshing. Yes there are worries about an influx of new large shopping malls, traffic and of course the annual air pollution issues which come each burn season, yet the friendliness of the people and laid

back feeling is infectious. As I board my Airbus to return to the island, and momentarily color blinded by the flight crew's bold orange-ness, I can't help but wish I could stay on just a little while longer.

Understanding finacial adviser fees

LET'S be upfront and say that while no one likes paying fees, there is no such thing as a free lunch, and I, as a financial adviser providing financial advice, along with those on Wall Street who create investment products all need "to eat", so to speak.

That said, there is no reason for you to pay unnecessary or excessive fees for financial advice or investment products once you have a firm understanding of how financial advisers on Main Street earn their money.

Understand how financial advisers get paid

Financial advisers will usually follow one of the following compensation models:

Fee only

Financial advisers who are fee only will typically charge you a percentage of the account value they manage and they will tend to favor individual stocks, bonds and low-cost ETFs, because they cannot accept commissions from financial product sponsors. That's because fee only financial advisers have a "fiduciary responsibility" to choose investments which are in your best interest and not because someone is paying them a commission on an invest-

ment product. Just be aware that than what a fee only not all fee only financial advisers are the same, as some charge lower fees because they provide more basic investment management services, while others charge higher fees because they provide full financial planning services (a complete financial plan or roadmap, for example).

Commission only

Financial advisers who don't charge a fee will usually receive commissions from transactions and/or from those who create the investment products they sell.

And while there are commission only financial advisers who provide excellent financial advice, many others are merely good salesmen whose advice tends to be driven more by how they are being paid rather than by doing what's best for you, the client. For that reason, you can expect commission only financial advisers to steer you towards annuities and managed funds that pay them the highest commissions.

Fee based

So-called fee based financial advisers will charge you a fee and receive commissions on the products they sell.

This means they do not have a "fiduciary responsibility" to do what's in your best interest and that may end up costing you more

Hourly rates or retainer

There are also some financial advisers who charge by the hour or a set fee - often to complete a special project that would otherwise be too complex even for a retail investor who is accustomed to managing his or her own money.

What arrangement is best for you?

Generally speaking, going for a fee only investment financial adviser who does not take commissions from those who create investment products like annuities or managed funds will end up being a better deal for you over the long term as they will steer you towards low cost investment products rather than those with the highest fees or commissions. Likewise, and even if you are an experienced do-it-yourself investor, there might be times when paying an hourly rate or a retainer will also make sense (a large or complex 401k roll-over for American investors). Just be aware that many fee only, as well as commis-

sion based financial advisers, will require a minimum sized account to manage before it makes sense for them to take you on as a full time client. However and even if your account balance is small, don't be afraid to check with a financial adviser to see if some kind of arrangement can be made to assist you if you need help.

Finally, no matter what type of financial adviser you use, make sure you take the time to understand what services he or she is offering for the fees you are being quoted. At the very least, your financial adviser needs to provide you with a detailed service and fee disclosure form.

Fees create a reverse com-

pounding effect and reduce your nest egg over time. The higher the fees, in general, the greater the hit and reduced account size. Call me to discuss ways to reduce your portfolio fees and get your account growing efficiently.

If past performance did accurately predict future performance, which unfortunately it doesn't always do, this would be the number one go-to fund. Luckily you can now hold this fund as part of a diversified portfolio for only US\$ 10,000, meaning even a portfolio of \$ 100,000 would be able to hold it as a 10% holding. In the past you would have needed millions to hold it in any reasonable proportion.

What also makes this fund a little different from many of its trend following peers is that its best years haven't been stock market crash years. Of course, it still does great in these periods and thus provides a certain amount of protection for a stock based port-

folio. It made a whopping 158% in 2003, a rather unremarkable year for most, while making about 41% in the crash of 2008.

The new feeder fund does have an additional layer of management costs (although we can get into without paying any front or back end commission), but I have never had a problem paying up slightly for great managers. There is some truth to the saying that you get what you pay for, even though sometimes in reality you don't actually get what you pay for. With the top traders however, this is the truth and they have the track records to prove it. The only time to consider costs in my opinion is

when you are indexing, since there is no alpha, or return above what the stock market gives, being generated. If you only want a market return, get a discount brokerage account to buy ETFs and do it yourself. There is no reason to pay anybody for what you could get by simply buying one global equity ETF.

If you want real alpha (which can be either a similar long term return as the stock market but with less volatility, or similar volatility but a much higher return), Abraham Trading Company has been delivering for 25 years. As with many others in this asset class, the last four years have not been great. This is an indicator that the timing is likely perfect to be getting invested. All previous periods of under performance have been followed by amazing returns. I have a feeling the next few years will likely see some large displacements in the global financial markets, which is the environment in which this fund thrives.

Zero tolerance for 'zero dollar'

In push away from 'mass tourism', local operators losing out on 'mass margins'

THE governments of Thailand and China are working hand-in-hand to limit the number of tourists coming from the latter to the former, especially the "low-quality" ones, the head of Phuket's official tourism office recently announced.

Reinforcing Thailand's efforts to shift focus from quantity to quality tourist markets, the Chinese government since October 1 has been enforcing new regulations affecting its outbound leisure traffic, which will limit the number of its outbound tourists overall, as well as eliminate so-called "Z ero-dollar Tour"

"This is a positive way to help reduce 'low quality' tourists," said Chanchai Duangjit, chief of the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) Phuket office.

As part of the new regulations, Chinese authorities will scrutinize the itineraries of both Thailand and China based tour operators, who will be required to specify exact details of their tour programs. Moreover, the packages must be paid for in China only, and the Chinese tourists will not be allowed to partake in itineraries that are not explicitly stated in the original program. Tour operators deemed in violation of the new regulations will be subject to a 300,000 yuan (1.5 million baht) fine and/or face a revocation of their license.

"Z ero-dollar tour packages namely the lack of knowledgeable have given a negative image to Thailand tourism for a long time," Chanchai insisted.

He explained that such packages aren't necessarily "free" packages

or qualified tour guides; shortage of transportation; congestion and strain on infrastructure as well as declining profits for tourism operators and other

but were sold to tourists at cheaper local businesses. rates, subsidized through deals with "I think the new regulation will commission-paying third party firms – jewelery galleries, souvenir shops and tailors, for example.

In other words, tour operators were also acting as commissionbased "touts", while tour groups were subjected to additional itineraries that they didn't buy into.

"In the past, there was no strict regulation to address this problem and there were many bad tour guides who deceived Chinese tourists," Chanchai said.

The local tourism chief went on to underline other issues associated with mass tourism,

decrease the number of low-budget tourists coming to Thailand and I believe that Thailand will in turn see increased profits from quality tourists. I don't see any negative effects for the Thai tourism industry," he concluded.

Some tour agents in Phuket disagree, however.

One Phuket-based operator who deals with inbound Chinese tour groups, told the Gazette that the number of bookings from this segment had decreased immediately following the announcement of the new regulations.

"Compared to years past, the number of travellers these days is higher, especially during the Chinese holiday periods. Chinese zero-dollar [packages] was an effective strategy to bring more Chinese tourists to Thailand and increase locals' income," said the operator, who insisted that both tour guides and companies have been greatly impacted, and will continue to be impacted by the new regulation.

The operator, who asked not to be named, explained that many local tour companies and related businesses enjoyed considerable profits by offering supplemental activities to Chinese tourists hiring of speed boat trips, visits to jewelry showrooms, other shopping venues and so forth.

'Tour agents could enjoy profits of about 10,000-20,000 baht per tourist, while tour guides could get 30.000-40.000 baht per group tour," the operator revealed.

"Now, tour companies [serving Chinese tourists directly in China] will increase their tour package prices and reap all the profits from the sale of [supplemental] programs to tourists, while tour guides will end up earning only 1,500 baht per day. Nonetheless, we will try to find other solutions to increase our profits when Chinese tourists decline," he said.

Indeed, the days of cheap mass tourism seem to be numbered. at least if the will of Thai and Chiauthorities is fully

realized. Although many local tour agencies and their affiliate companies will immediately lose out on "mass margins", with every threat arises a new opportunity – to find new solutions for the greater good of all local businesses. But only time will tell how Thailand's mass tourism saga pans out.

Fiery culture

CREDIT must be given where it is clearly due: to the authorities who arrested more than 20 people for the illegal use or sale of dangerous fireworks during the recently concluded Vegetarian Festival (see page xx).

The Phuket Provincial Police have sent out somewhat mixed signals in recent years with regard to what level of fireworks usage would be allowed during traditional cultural festivities, many of which are connected to the island's heritage and deep links to China.

In general, the message over the past decade has been that traditional firecrackers in strips would be acceptable, while anything larger or with more explosive power would not.

Any Phuket resident who has observed these firework-centric traditions can testify that the enforcement of regulations on the island has been mostly nonexistent – until now. In past years at this time there were reports of victims, many of them young children, who lost an eye, finger or ear drum due to these dangerous explosives.

A simple 'cost-benefit' analysis on the use of fireworks needs to be performed. Let's look at the benefits first. There is the belief that these pyrotechnics might be useful at warding off evil spirits. And we are told that firecrackers and fireworks in general are an important part of the cultural and religious traditions of China. By association, they are an important way for Phuket's Chinese population to express their reverence for and identification with such traditions.

Yet ancestor worship is another vital Chinese tradition, and one that extends much further back than firecrackers. Surely Chinese culture and tradition is much older and more grand than is warranted by association with noisy, toxic explosives.

On the 'cost' side, there is not enough space here to even begin an accurate accounting. Apart from all the people who have been maimed or even killed, the Chinese fireworks industry is almost completely unregulated and a well-known source of not only noise pollution, but also a producer of toxic fumes from a variety of elements that include strontium, dioxins, aluminum and other particulates – hardly substances that the well-intended spirit of any ancestor would want to see their descendants ingest.

And in this age of global warming and "sufficiency economy" any discussion of the costs also has to take into account the preposterousness of the mass production, shipping and sale of a product which has as its sole purpose the creation of noise for very short-term excitement.

There is no denying the importance of Chinese traditions in the development of Phuket's own culture. However, despite the Vegetarian Festival being an important event that relies heavily on the use of explosives, the use of fireworks during this and similar events needs to be more tightly controlled for the benefit of all island residents.



Making Art known

FIRST PERSON

PHUKET does not lack the arts. I've been living here for five years and I have met many skillful artists.


However, I recognize that the art scene here is not widely known, by locals or visitors. I think this is because it is promoted only within a small group of people – those who are directly connected with it.

What we really need is help from the local government to publicize art events.

Let me give you an example of what tends to happen. Let's say one of the photography clubs wants to hold an exhibition. They will only advertise it on their own Facebook page or website, or maybe on another photography club's website. So the word will get out, but only within a small group and among friends of that group. Others have no way of knowing about it.

Even at the municipality level there's a problem with promot-

ing art events, because when they stage an art activity or exhibition, they ask us to publicize it for them! We do our best, but we don't have the resources to a d v e r t i s e



Imagine how much better it would be if the municipality helped to promote art.

The fact is that Phuket Town itself – the architecture of our old buildings – is art, but sometimes people forget it, don't appreciate it or are not aware of it. I bet there ists would visit Phuket.

are a lot of people who don't know that the old Standard Chartered Bank building in town is also the Phuket Peranakan Museum.

A few years ago, the photography clubs held an exhibition at the bank building. We invited famous artists from Bangkok to be our guest speakers. A lot of people joined the opening ceremony on the first day of the exhibition, but later, only a few of them came.

It's difficult to know whether

lack of attendance is due to poor advertising or lack of interest.

Our cultural unawareness has widespread implications, and can even affect the economy of

Phuket. When we invite tourists to visit, we are likely to focus on sea, sand and sun - and forget about other features, like architecture and culture.

If the municipalities or local government organizations could help promote the art activities and exhibitions more, even more tour-

One thing the government should do to support the arts is put up signs along the roads and in tourist areas when we have exhibitions. Another thing is to promote more events here. We promote the Vegetarian Festival, why don't we promote the Baba Yaya wedding ceremony? It's a unique traditional ceremony that Phuketians are proud of.

However, it's not only the government that needs to do more, it's local people too.

A friend of mine came to Phuket and was walking around the old town. He took his camera out to take pictures of the buildings and a house owner asked him to stop in an unfriendly way. I totally understand the privacy issue, but in my opinion, taking pictures just for pleasure should not be a problem. Pictures will capture good memories for visitors and might help promote the area to other

I love Phuket even though I am not a Phuketian. I see Phuket as an interesting place that still has a lot of beautiful and hidden arts and culture to discover. Let's make Phuket famous as a place where old arts and culture mix together with a modern lifestyle.

Turning yuan into baht at local ATMs

Can I use my Chinese bank card at ATMs in Thailand? Do the money machines there have the Chinese "UnionPay" logo on them?

An officer at Krung Thai Bank (KTB) Call Center replies:

Yes, you can make cash withdrawals from ATMs in Thailand. Any UnionPay card with a card number starting with "62" that also has the UnionPay logo on the card can be used at eight different Thai banks, namely: Krung Thai Bank (KTB), KasikornBank (KBank), Bangkok Bank, Thai Military Bank (TMB), Thanachart Bank, United Overseas Bank (UOB), Siam Commercial Bank (SCB) and the Government Savings Bank.

The local ATMs that have UnionPay logos appear on machines at many locations across the country including airports, 7-Eleven convenience stores, major shopping malls and tourist destinations.

The service fee for the use of the ATM depends on the bank you use, so pay attention to the charge message shown on the ATM

Also be aware that banks have withdrawal limits.

Are stores required to provide parking?

Thalang, and at the entrance to the estate on Thepkrasattri Road there is a 7-Eleven with very limited parking. This leads shoppers to park along the road. Buses for requiring small convenience hotel staff also stop at the stores to provide parking 7-Eleven, as do long-distance spaces. Only bigger establishbuses.

All these vehicles have made it dangerous to turn into Keha, as they pull out suddenly, and motorcyclists dart out between them to exit the 7-Eleven parking lot.

Compounding the problem, a new SuperCheap is about to open on the other side of the Keha entrance, also with limited parking.

Are there any legal regulations that require a new building, especially a retail outlet, to supply parking spaces?

I live in the Keha housing estate in **Nuchjaree Muangsri, an officer** at the Phuket Office of Public Works and Town and Country Planning, replies:

There are no legal regulations ments such as shopping centers

are required to provide parking.

Small convenience stores are generally built along the street because that is where they are most convenient for customers looking to make quick and simple purchases. But if the parking becomes clearly dangerous, I suggest you report the problem to the police or local government organization in your area. They would then take action to address the problem.

Phuket's middle path

RIGHT beside Kathu Waterfall, there exists a Phuket culinary gem. Krua Pailin, or Pailin's Kitchen, is a long-standing establishment that has been discerning locals for almost two decades now.

But what actually is authentic Phuket food? We all know of the Peranakan version, influenced by Chinese tastes – noodles and such – which is easy on the palette and therefore a good introduction to the local fares. On the other end of the scale, Phuket cuisine is marked by its heat, thanks to the copious amount of chilies used, a dominant taste that came to be known generally as "southern cuisine".

Yet, between these two polarities there exists a middle ground largely ignored by the general public. I am talking about a wholesome and tasty local cuisine that

makes full use of the land's bounty - fresh fish and seafood, wild herbs and indigenous greens, flavored by local seasonings like shrimp paste, dried fish and, of course, lots of chilies.

All of the qualities above come serving authentic Phuket food to together in dishes served at Krua Pailin, a garden restaurant right beside Kathu Waterfall. An institution in its own right, Krua Pailin's unassuming but idyllic jungle setting edged on one side by a running stream belies its quiet fame; the path leading to it has been well trodden by numerous Thai celebrities, local government officials and both local and tourist foodies. At one time, Pailin's shack-like kitchen regularly air-delivered its delicacies to a certain movie star in Bangkok who hankered after a southern taste.

The establishment owes its success to chef-owner Suwanna "Phung" Saetun. Having run the restaurant for 19 years, first

together with her husband and mother-in-law, Phung is now a fullyfledged chef keen to maintain what she calls the "true taste of Phuket." Such is her reputation that she has been approached by Thailand's Iron Chef TV producers who have spotted her talent. "I'll go when I am ready," says the 39-year-old chef.

Phung is aware that Phuket food is an acquired taste, so she has prepared a few dishes designed to entice newcomers to this cuisine. First up is tom som phuk ruam, a mixed vegetable soup that explodes with natural goodness. Refreshingly light, the soup contains no less than ten types of roots and wild herbs. Tender galangal and banana stem vie for attention, while pineapple chunks and dried garcinia fruits add to the overall tangy note. The soup is not only wholesome but also, when eaten as part of a meal, acts as a foil for other dishes with stronger tastes.

Pla mong jian trakrai, or Mong fish slices with tamarind sauce, is an all-time family favorite. Here it is topped with a generous amount of lemongrass slices, julienne ginger and garlic. Phung sources the fish herself everyday from the fresh talad kaset market in town – so freshness is always guaranteed.

If you like crab, you'd surely enjoy pu phad manao, or chunky crab-meat in lime sauce, an intriguingly exotic and satisfying dish. More exotic still, and rarely found anywhere else on the island, is the Malay-styled toumee curry. This is slow cooked fish fillets in an aromatic sauce – its unique ingredient being petals of bright pink torch ginger flowers and is mild enough for everyone to enjoy. For those with a stronger palette, try kang prik hoi gun, a robust curry that combined seemingly incompatible

ingredients of Andaman clams, green papaya and jeera, or curry leaves.

For the true food buff, try also wild krang mushrooms with garlic (suitable for vegetarians); roast ants' eggs; and deep-fried wasps, among many more "jungle" offerings. Some dishes are only available during the rainy season and a few, like toumee curry, must be ordered in advance.

At Krua Pailin, you can expect Phuket country food at its best and a no-frills dining experience. But like any other top-notch restaurant, the sophistication lies in the careful attention to details like preparation, freshness and unusual ingredients.

So how about giving sweetand-sour and green curry a break and trying something completely different?





Evolution of the MAMILS

ONE of the more amusing acronyms that the current boom in all things cycling related has spawned is "MAMILS".



MAMILS are of course "Middle Aged Men In Lycra" and if the tabloid media are to be believed, the Western world is awash with these rather dubious sounding creatures.

Certainly Phuket has not been spared this plague, as a brief foray around the island's roads any morning will attest. The island's highways and byways have become home to packs of Lycra-clad males, often sporting abundant graying locks or bulging tummies, doing their utmost to appear lithe and athletic, as they pump their pedals and slurp from their water bottles.

The MAMIL acronym also refers exclusively to MALE cyclists... as well it might. While it's true that the female of the species is certainly partaking enthusiastically in the global embrace of cycling, generally

she does so with considerably more sartorial aplomb and dress sense than the male Lycra louts – with whom, embarrass-

ingly, she is often forced to share the road.

What has brought about this flight to Lycra, other than the very obvious attractions of sweaty body-hugging material next to one's skin, a well-padded bottom and a tumescent, bulging cod piece?

Brightly colored Lycra has become a uniform of bonding and recognition amongst men of a certain age who enjoy cycling, and all joking aside, it does indeed have many advantages when out on the road, facilitating freedom of movement and ventilation, as any Phuket-based "pedal-phile" will confirm.

The global bulge in the Lycra market has, of course, been driven by those selfish "baby-boomers". This is the annoying generation that, not satisfied with reinventing sex, music, fashion and the media to meet its own ends, now refuses to just go away and age gracefully like previous generations and instead still desperately attempt to cling to their youth and feel entitled to constantly be the center of attention. This is an important key to understanding the rise of the MAMILS and their almost manic focus on exercise, good diet, social engagement and a balanced lifestyle – all in pursuit of an enduring youthfulness.

himself an enthusiastic MAMIL, says, "As they have reached retirement age with more time on their hands, plus an abundance of internet-based information and a desire to extend their years of healthy living, many men in Phuket have adopted cycling as one of the healthiest forms of exercise for the aging body.

"Cycling gets you outdoors, often in a sociable group situation and can be enjoyed for long periods without stressing or injuring the body," he says.

Garnett's piece of wisdom should perhaps be tempered, at least in the Phuketian context, with Mark Twain's famous quote: "Get a bicycle. You will not regret it... if you live."

Dr Sayam Hanpiphat, who specializes in physical medicine and rehabilitation at Bangkok Phuket Hospital is also a keen cyclist and explains that there are enormous mental and psychological benefits to becoming a MAMIL.

"We now know the human brain responds to regular aerobic exercise such as cycling by producing a flood of opiate-like 'happy chemicals' such as dopamine and beta endorphins that elevate mood while enhancing sleep and relaxation. In addition, cycling is very often a group activity which promotes sociability and bonding – which are inherently beneficial."

My good friend Claudio Vianello, with

whom I have just been cycling in Italy, spent much of his early life flying attack helicopters over Vietnam and subsequently jumbo jets around the world for American Airlines. Now 71 and settled near Kata, he is a classical example of the modern MAMIL – being an exceptionally fit cyclist and international-class skier for his

age group. Claudio says: "Cycling around Phuket has become an absolute passion for me and if I didn't rack up my 300 or so kilometers a week in Lycra, I'm not sure what I would do with myself."

A major meeting point for many of Phuket's Lycra louts is that temple of health and fitness – Thanyapura Sports & Leisure Club – which was developed by another arch MAMIL Klaus Hebben, himself an exceptionally fit and gifted sixty-something Iron Man. Each morning you can see a large peloton of Lycra-clad cyclists hammering out of Thanyapura to put in their



training klicks. Many members of this group, such as world Ironman legend Jurgen Z ack, are internationally famous and all of them are exceptionally fit and healthy; not a few are well into their fifties, sixties and even seventies. They stand as a highly inspirational testament to the immense health benefits that wearing Lycra (and possibly just a bit of physical effort) can lend to us all. Bring on Phuket's MAMILS!



Tigs for all tastes October 19 - 25, 2013 House and Garden Tastes



ONE of the stranger aspects of attempting an alphabetical survey of plants is that you end up with some odd bedfellows. Take the letter "F" for example. It embraces the huge genus of figs or ficus to

give the family its botanical appellation. In Plant Materials in Thailand, no fewer than 24 different varieties are listed; they dominate the letter in much the same way that the socalled strangler

fig throttles its unfortunate host. Figs vary from majestic park and forest trees in warmer climes

to tough indoor plants such as the rubber tree, or the edible fig of Mediterranean landscapes. There is even a creeping fig which ventures no more than an inch or two above the ground.

F religiosa is at once the most revered, the most unusual and, some would say, the most pernicious of trees. Revered because

Buddhism avers that the Lord Gautama attained enlightenment while meditating beneath its ample shade for six years, the bodhi tree flourishes on temple grounds everywhere in Thailand. In

Hindu mythology it is associated widely. One celebrated banyan with fertility in women. But it is definitely not one for your conventional garden. Fast growing and deciduous, it can attain thirty meters, possesses a trunk up to three meters wide and has hanging roots that may occupy much of the surrounding area.

The Bodhi tree is bizarre in another respect. It needs, as nearly all figs do, the presence of a pollinating agaonid or fig wasp which lays its eggs within the growing fruit. The larvae feed on the internal gall flowers, crawl out as adults, and in the process crosspollinate the external flowers. The mature fruits and seeds (not palatable to humans), are in turn eaten

> by birds, and dispersed as droppings, where they often lodge in the forks or bark of a host tree and develop into seedlings. In time, these intruders will send roots down to the

ground which will, in time, completely envelop and destroy the tree. Hence the pejorative name of "strangler fig".

Nonetheless, no self-respecting Buddhist or Hindu would ever dream of cutting down a tree which has not only sacred associations, but has been used for centuries for its medicinal properties, treating everything from gout and gastric disorders to diabetes. Moreover, it is an impressive ornamental presence and not just on account of its

> massive size and longevity, but because of its attractive, glossy, heart shaped foliage.

Benghalensis is a related species with similar aerial roots, but is capable of spreading much more

tree, in Calcutta, has a spread of 400 feet and covers more than three acres. The broad, stiff leaves are a shiny deep green and the fruits ripen to orange.

More suitable for our Thai gardens is Ficus carica, known world-wide as the edible fig, and a





dominant feature of Mediterranean countries. It is not as popular as it deserves to be in Thailand for the simple reason that it dislikes the high and continuous humidity - a feature of life here - which in *F. carica* tends to promote mildew. Oddly, edible figs grow best on poorish soil; too much nitrogen promotes leaf growth at the expense of the succulent, pear-shaped fruit. Pruning during the period of dormancy will increase the tree's fruiting capacity.

As befits a commercially viable fruit, there are many cultivars: "Black Genoa" is a prolific yielder of sweet, dark red flesh, "Mission" has blackish fruits. "White Adriatic" should do better here: it has pale greenish brown figs with tasty pink flesh. This was the variety that I grew in the mountains of Southern Spain. It loved the cool nights and cropped heavily and reliably.

If you are lucky enough to lay your hands on a fig tree, don't plant it close to a wall: it has a large root system and the tap root may go down several meters. One reason why they seem unaffected by drought.

Tip of the week More on pollination

SOME plants have male (stamens) and female parts (pistil) on different parts of the same plant. So an agency will again be needed to transfer the pollen. Most melons, pumpkins, and squash, for example, have both male and female flowers. Commercial growers sometimes activate the fertilization process by using a fine brush to transfer pollen from one flower to another. Butagain, insects are the main distributors.

A few species, for example, some citrus varieties, do not require pollination at all, though tangerines do. Obviously as a grower or gardener, it is important that you know the requirements of the species.

Another factor is maturity. Some trees do not bear fruit until a certain age; for avocadoes this is about six years, for papayas, rose apples, guavas or bananas as little as 18 months. Jujubes and jack fruit take 2-3 years.

Life & style How the west was won and where it got us

COMANCHES and Texas Rangers feature prominently in Philip Meyer's new novel The Son (Ecco, New York, 2013, 561pp) and its popular success undoubtedly springs from the buying power of a legion of fans of Larry McMurthy's Lonesome Dove. This 1985 Pulitzer Prizewinning masterwork centered on two ageing ex-Texas Rangers and the villainous Comanche renegade Blue Duck.

The Son goes one better: a multi-generational family saga that spans two centuries, from the days of the Comanches to the great cattle drives to the 20th century oil boom. Despite its grand ambition, the novel is no *Lonesome* Dove. Literary flaws abound, but

this is only Meyer's second book while McMurthy had written a slew of them about modern Texas - Hud, The Last Picture Show, Terms of Endearment – before turning to the historical fiction of

Lonesome Dove. Taken on its own terms, The Son is still a stupendous achievement as it artfully weaves together three narrative strands: an interview with the family patriarch, Eli McCulloch, in 1936, when he is 100 years old; the diaries of his son Peter spanning the years 1915-1917, and the reveries of his 86-yearold great granddaughter Jeannie as she lies dving in 2012.

When Eli McCulloch was born in 1836, the area that the Comanches ruled - the Comancheria – covered the western half of Texas, almost all of Oklahoma and parts of Kansas and New Mexico. They were the richest

tribe in the West as measured by horses and captives. They had driven out the Apaches and raided freely in East Texas and Mexico. One of their captives was 13year-old Eli McCulloch. The Comanches mutilated corpses to scare their enemies, raped and tortured survivors because they wanted to, and abducted captives because their tribe always needed more members. Over the course of three years, Eli McCulloch was adopted into a family and became a Comanche warrior. He acquired friends, lovers and scalps.

Meyer has done an enormous amount of research and it shows in the clumsy manner of James A. Michener. He devotes entire chapters to how the Comanches made their bows and arrows and butchered their buffaloes. Still, the narrative momentum seldom flags as Eli McCulloch moves on to become a Texas Ranger, a Confederate guerrilla, a cattle baron and an oil industry pioneer. He is only 40 when the once mighty Comanches are nearly wiped out by disease, hunger, the extinction of the buffalo and the US cavalry. And the lush green prairie of his youth turns dry and brown.

As the novel progresses, the other two narrative strands move strongly to the fore. Educated and irresolute, Eli's son Peter is tortured by a modern day massacre, yet redeemed by love. Tough and ruthless, the great granddaughter Jeannie idolizes Eli and presides over a quarter million acre ranch and a huge oil empire. She merits her own cover on Time Magazine but in

matters of the heart, she comes up short. In her dying moments, she numbers her regrets.

Peter is considered a disgrace to the McColloch family but Eli and Jeannie are celebrated for their Darwinian outlook on life. The Comanches massacred the Apaches who had massacred the Indian tribes before them. The Comanches also massacred the Americans who massacred them right back. The McCullochs not only murdered cattle rustlers but also any suspicious mounted man on their land. They grabbed their land by murder and kept it that way.

And their story is hugely entertaining – the furthest thing from the romance of the Old West. Here is Eli McCullocch on the grand days of the cattle drives from Texas to Kansas:

"The life of a cowboy has been written about as if it were the pinnacle of freedom in the West but in fact it was sleepless drudgery almost beyond imagination – five months of slavery to a pack of dumb brutes - and had I not been riding for my own brand I would not have lasted a day. The fact that the country was tame enough to drive valuable property across tells you all you need to know; the days of Bridger and Carson and Smith were long gone, the land was already going domestic."

WALKING DEAD LI

GRUELING VEG FEST DROPS JAWS WHILE CLEANSING COMMUNITY, KEEPING EVIL AT BAY

SPIRIT entities – righteous and evil alike – were once again summoned to Phuket en masse last week. For nine days and as many nights, purified devotees observing strict vegan diets while abstaining from vice, fulfilled their role by making symbolic offerings to the higher realms; entranced and possessed spirit mediums known as Mah Song, enduring grueling and imaginative acts of self-mutilation – apparently invoked and enabled by powerful, ancient deities if not lost local spirits – drew upon themselves the community's evil energy, suffering and misdeeds, delivering their transcendental occupiers to the numerous sacred Chinese shrines across Phuket and ultimately dispelling them back to the spirit realm in a grand finale last Sunday night at Saphan Hin to conclude the 2013 Phuket Veg Fest. If you missed your chance to witness such a bizarre yet enthralling spectacle, not to worry – for the dead shall be resurrected again on the eve of the region's ninth lunar month in one year's time.

MODERN ORIGINS

Although there are conflicting accounts as to the Phuket festival's origin, most agree it all began around 1825, when the island's population was centered in present day Thalang, before being relocated to Kathu at the dawn of Phuket's tin mining era. During this period, a travelling Chinese Opera was said to have travelled to Kathu to entertain the tin miners. At or around this time a terrible epidemic of some type of fever, possibly malaria, began to claim the lives of many in the mining community. The Opera singers however, never fell ill (or as some accounts claim, fell ill but quickly recovered). The miners, desperate to be alleviated from such a malady. sought advice from the apparently-immune performers, who informed the miners of their strict adherence to a vegan diet. The miners proceeded to strictly adhere to this diet, as well as abstain from alcohol and sexual misconduct.

The epidemic subsequently vanished, so the legend goes, and was cause for great celebration. Thus occurred the birth of the Phuket Veg Fest. The locals, so thrilled with their newfound health, sent an envoy to Kansai, in China. The envoy returned with holy incense and inscribed tablets. Two objects that still feature heavily in the modern day processions.

While the modern incarnation of the festival still retains many of the original practices, the most famous (infamous) spectacle, is the invocation of the god Lam Tao. Those who channel the deity are bestowed great abilities to withstand personal pain and mutilation. They use this power to inflict very

to lessen the suffering of those around them. These displays are not for the weak of heart, and cause some people to be repulsed and even physically ill. Although the original tradition is based on Chinese beliefs (see below), the practice of invoked Mah Song and self-mutilation is believed to have derived from Indian traditions – namely the Hindu festival of Thaipusam.

NINE IS THE NUMBER

Beyond 1825, the Phuket Veg Fest can trace its ancient Chinese Taoist roots to the Nine Emporer Gods Festival or Ji?hu?ngy? (Kow Wong Yeh in Cantonese) in which nine deities are traditionally revered

(hence the nine-day duration and alignment with the ninth lunar month): These emperor deities, represented by the stars in the big dipper constellation, include Tan Lang Tai Xing Jun; Ju Men Yuan Xing Jun; Lu Cun Zhen Xing Jun; Wen Qu Niu Xing Jun; Lian Zhen Gang Xing Jun; Wu Qu Ji Xing Jun; Po Jun Guan Xing Jun; Zuo Fu Da Dao Xing Jun and You Bi Da Dao Xing Jun. In Phuket's version today, there is less emphasis on (or perhaps



End of the Rains Retreat

AFTER three months of the Rains Retreat when Buddhist monks take shelter in their monasteries, men in orange robes can be seen walking the streets of Thai cities and towns once again. The day when the monks leave the monasteries is called *Awk Pan-sa*, meaning "leaving the rains retreat" and this year it falls on October 19.

It also goes by another name – Mahapavarana or "discussion day" as on that day monks exchange knowledge they gathered during the three months of retreat and discuss what they learned. Laymen who visit the temples on that day also have a chance to learn more about Buddhism and ask questions. Later the monks leave the monasteries to spread their knowledge around the country and to improve people's lives.


If you have some unanswered questions about Thailand's predominant religion, this might be a good time to visit one of the following temples:

Wat Chalong is the most famous temple in Phuket. It is dedicated to two monks who helped locals fight against a Chinese rebellion.

Wat Thepnimit is located in Wichit district and is one of the oldest temples in Phuket.

Wat Mongkol Nimit near old Phuket Town is very popular with local Buddhists because of its convenient location.

Wat Suvankeereewong in Patong is the temple of choice if you're staying in the popular seaside party town.

Each year on October 23, Thais commemorate their beloved King Rama V— Chulalongkorn. Rama V is known as the King who modernized Thailand ridding it of slavery, introducing electricity, postal services, telegraph, telephone and more. LOCK on your tanks and load that gear on the boat because the Phuket diving high season is officially here. This year's season was ushered in with the annual ruckus parties and dive show equipment suppliers, all brought to the industry pros of the entire Andaman region by Dive Supply and Aqua Masters.

Free flow drinks and all-youcan-eat grub enthusiastically marked an upcoming season of bounty.

The members of the dive business that weathered the patchy low season and the economic troubles it can bring to both established and new companies took full advantage of the hospitality by both Dive Suppply and Aqua Master.

The revelry got kicked off with a twist this year as Carl Webb the marketing manager for Dive Supply splashed out for a massive American Western themed hoedown complete with complimentary cowboy hats, catering by Sala Mexicana and a mechanical rodeo bull.


Sea Bees wins national award for excellence

Belgium, Germany, Switzerland book World Cup tickets

TWO-goal Romelu Lukaku fired Belgium's golden generation into next year's World Cup finals, with Germany and Switzerland on Friday also sealing their tickets to the Brazil extravaganza.

Belgium, boasting one of the most talented squads in Europe, will return to the global showpiece for the first time since 2002 after a 2-1 win in Croatia guaranteed top spot in Group A.

Perennial finalists Germany's 3-0 home win over Ireland, with goals from Sami Khedira, Andre Schuerrle and Mesut Ozil, put them through from Group C while the Swiss won 2-1 in Albania to wrap up Group E. Netherlands, with Robin van Persie hitting a hat-trick in an 8-1 demolition of Hungary to surpass Patrick Kluivert as record Dutch scorer with 41 goals, and Italy had sealed their passage to the finals before Friday's penultimate round of qualifiers.

Holders Spain moved to the brink of qualification from Group I after captain Xavi and substitute Alvaro Negredo struck in a laboured 2-1 win at home to Belarus.

Group F leaders Russia, with a 4-0 victory in Luxembourg, and England, who beat Montenegro 4-1 at Wembley with Wayne Rooney among the scorers, remain in pole position in Group H ahead of Tuesday's final round of matches.

Victory on a wet night in Z agreb prompted joyous celebrations from the Belgian players in front of a sizeable and vociferous contingent of travelling fans.

"I'm super happy for the team. We always believed we could qualify and now it's here," said Lukaku, looking ahead to a party atmosphere in Brussels for their final game against Wales.

The pacey Lukaku broke the deadlock from Steven Defour's defence-splitting pass and doubled the lead seven minutes before the break, racing away from halfway before lifting the ball over prone keeper Stipe Pletikosa and walking the ball into the net.

Germany progress

Injury-hit Germany, boosted by the return of midfielder Bastian Schweinsteiger after a six-month break to earn his 99th cap, still swept aside Ireland.

"I think overall we played a very good qualification. We won eight of nine so we can be satisfied. Something still needs to happen though. The defense needs to become more stable," said coach Joachim Loew.

Sweden captain Z latan Ibrahimovic struck a late winner to earn a 2-1 victory over Austria that secured

second place behind the Germans and one of the playoff spots.

The eight best group runners-up advance to a two-legged playoff in November to fill the last four European places.

Goals from Xherdan Shaqiri and Michael Lang clinched Switzerland's passage with their successful campaign built around a rock-solid defense that has conceded just six goals.

Iceland or Slovenia will finish second in the group.

Iceland, 2-0 winners over Cyprus on Friday, will secure that spot if they can win in Norway on Tuesday while Slovenia, who face the Swiss in Berne, stayed in contention thanks to Milivoje Novakovic's hat-trick in a 3-0 drubbing of the Norwegians.

Spain's victory in Palma de Mallorca put them three points clear of France with one match to play and a point against lowly Georgia in Albacete on Tuesday will secure the world and European champions a berth in Brazil.

Late blunder

Russia need a point from their final game away at Azerbaijan to qualify after brushing aside Luxembourg to move three points ahead of Portugal.

A late blunder from goalkeeper

Rui Patricio gifted Israel a 1-1 draw in Lisbon to leave Portugal, who led through a first half goal from center back Ricardo Costa, staring at the playoffs.

England will win their section with victory at home to Poland. Roy Hodgson's side had to remain patient to overcome stubborn Montenegro who had not lost to the 1966 World Cup winners in three previous meetings.

Rooney, who missed the last two qualifiers through injury, eased England's nerves when he struck soon after the restart and a Branko Boskovic own goal, a stunning third on his debut by Andros Townsend, and an injury-time penalty from Daniel Sturridge secured victory.

Ukraine remain one point behind and must hope England slip up against the Poles. Andriy Yarmolenko scored the only goal as the Ukrainians edged Poland 1-0 in Kharkiv which all but ended the Euro 2012 co-hosts' hopes of progressing.

Bosnia, seeking to reach their first major tournament as an independent nation, and Greece remain neck-and-neck on 22 points at the top of Group G after home wins on Friday.

Bosnia, with Edin Dzeko scoring twice, thumped Liechtenstein 4-1 while a Martin Skrtel own goal handed Greece a 1-0 success at home to Slovakia.

Nicklas Bendtner made a sensational return from a sixmonth ban by netting both goals in Denmark's 2-2 draw at home to Italy in Group B.

The striker was suspended by the Danish FA after being arrested for drink-driving but his international return was spoiled by Alberto Aquilani's stoppagetime equaliser.

The Danes remain third, level on 13 points with Bulgaria who had two players sent off in a 2-1 defeat in Armenia.

Australia should back top six batsmen: Ponting

AUSTRALIA'S selectors need to show faith in their top six batsmen after undermining their confidence by chopping and changing the order during the recent Ashes series defeat, former captain Ricky Ponting has said.

Australia's 3-0 loss in England was marked by a string of calamitous batting collapses, as selectors dropped players and moved them up and down the order in a fruitless search for a winning formula.

With the first test of the return Ashes series starting in Brisbane next month, Ponting said there was no quick fix for Australia's woes and that selectors needed to decide on the nation's best batters and nurture them.

"I think everybody on the outside has been a little bit worried about what the next generation of players have got, particularly on the batting side of things," Ponting said in comments published by The Australian newspaper on Monday.

"Everyone acknowledges we have good depth of fast bowling, but where the next Michael Clarke is going to come from in the batting department is what everyone is concerned about.

"I don't think it is as bad as a lot of people might believe, I think they have just got to decide who the six best batters in the country are and I reckon they have got to back them for a while and try and release some of the

pressure on the guys when they go out to bat.

"Take the last series by itself, Watto (Shane Watson) and Phil Hughes seemed to bat in every position in the order – that can't be good for the individuals or everyone else because if those guys are moving so is everyone else.

"The lack of stability and the lack of confidence that some of our players have been taking, not just into each game but into each innings they play, that doesn't make things any easier."

Australia's struggles, which included a dismal 4-0 test series loss away to India earlier this year, prompted former players

and coaches to gather in Sydney last week to look at ways of solving the team's batting woes.

Ponting, a participant at the forum, backed Hughes and Usman Khawaja, who have struggled to convert their promise into consistent form at test level.

After scoring an unbeaten 81 in the first innings of the opening test at Nottingham, Hughes was dumped for the rest of the

Ashes series after managing just two runs from his next three innings.

Recalled for the second test at Lord's, Khawaja scored a half-century in the second inning, but was dumped for the final test at The Oval after four consecutive failures.

"If the answer is not Hughes

and not Khawaja and not those guys then what's going to happen?" Ponting posed.

"If they don't pick them, those guys will go back to Sheffield Shield cricket, they will be the leading run scorers and will be the next ones picked again, because they are simply the best we have got and they have proved that over a period of years. That's my belief, anyway.

"The selectors have been looking for short-term fixes and that's not going to happen with this current group and it rarely happens in international sport or high-level sport," he said.

"The challenge for selection right now is picking guys who can actually improve while playing international cricket and the only way they can do that is if they are given a bit of assurance and a bit of love along the way."

The first test of the return Ashes series starts in Brisbane on November 21.

International Sport 48-hour swim

DIANA Nyad, the first person to successfully swim from Cuba to Florida without a cage, completed her latest endurance swim on Thursday without having to worry about sharks, jellyfish or the current.

Her 48-hour continuous charity swim in New York City raised more than US\$ 100,000 (62,582 pounds) for Hurricane Sandy recovery, and came little more a month after the 64-year-old made her historic swim across the Straits of Florida. At 96 miles (155 km), her pool swim was shorter than her 110-mile (177km) swim in the sea.

The fundraising total, still of \$ 110,000 to bring mobile growing from online donations, was destined for AmeriCares, a humanitarian relief organization, which said it will use the funds to address the health needs of Hurricane Sandy survivors.

With more than 25,000 people still displaced from the storm, many survivors need help for basic healthcare access. Others face anxiety, depression and symptoms of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), said Lindsay O' Brien, who manages to contend with the ocean, "it the organization's Hurricane was by a thin line that I made it Sandy Relief program.

"That is exactly where this money will go," O' Brien said. AmeriCares has used a grant

mental health clinics to children and families in the Gerritsen Beach section of Brooklyn.

Nyad's two-day swim brought out celebrities including actor Joe Manganiello and Olympic gold medallist Ryan Lochte, who swam alongside her, as did Sandy victims and first responders from the US Coast Guard and the New York police and fire departments.

The 26-year-old, the son of former Formula One driver Guy Edwards, died on Tuesday, October 15 when the Porsche in which he was a passenger instructing a 20-year-old male, slammed into a wall and caught

Monaco-based Edwards, who was leading the drivers' championship in the 2013 Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup season with one race to go, was taking part in a private training day at the time, according to Australian news reports.

The driver reportedly suffered severe injuries.

"Our thoughts are with his family and we want to express our deepest condolences to his relatives," Hartmut Kristen, Head of Motorsport at Porsche, said in a statement.

Edwards had a cameo role in the recently-released movie Rush, playing his father Guy who helped pull Niki Lauda from his burning Ferrari after a crash at a F1 Grand Prix at the Nurburgring in 1976.

Reacting to the tragic news of Edwards' death, former McLaren driver David Coulthard took to Twitter.


"Shocking news about Sean Edwards passing, top man and super talented racer, condolences to his nearest and dearest," he said.

Attention to detail: extreme swimming

ATTENTION to detail... when I was in the military, it was something I learned a LOT about. But it was a necessity. When you are out on missions for weeks at a time, and getting tired and hungry, the ability to pay attention to small details, like personal hygene and health (eating and sleeping,) become very important. The ability of a person to stay on top of these little details can be the difference between staying alert, healthy, and able to carry on with the mission or falling ill, getting injured or worse,

becoming a casualty that requires others to stop doing their jobs to assist.

In sports, attention to detail can play an important part in the success or failure of an athlete. On deck, swimmers will hear me refer to "extreme" swimming. But what is it? It's attention to detail. Focusing on little things ALL THE TIME! Anyone can focus on drills when that's what you're working on. And anyone can work hard when told to. But what about during warm-ups and cooldowns?

Isn't technique just as tant then? Is form and skill something we only work on at certain times during the workout? Shouldn't it be ALL the time? And what about strength? Everyone is strong when they are rested. Can you be strong at the end of a workout, when you've been trying hard and are physically tired?




In second place with 60 points, PTT Rayong are under great pressure to secure promotion to the Thai Premier League;

negotiating a new contract; aside from this, he also recently found out the sex of his unborn child, scheduled for birth in two months.


"It's a boy," he said proudly.

VOLLEYING can be either the most satisfying shot in tennis, or be the most intimidating.

In PBI we don't use the word punch to describe the volley and this is the first layer to understand to become more effective at the

It can be a very unfamiliar area on

this is the first layer to understand to become more effective at the net. Punching leads to a very aggressive mindset. You're definitely hitting something. Your arm goes from bent to straight when you punch. This is a fantastic idea when you're participating in a Muay Thai class here at Thanyapura, but we feel this is a negative action at the net on a tennis court.

Peter Burwash likes to call the volley a C&D shot, a controlled-directional shot. However, he is also the first to say if you are close to the net and the ball is high then just pound it, swing away, finish it - but until you get that opportunity for a super easy ball you need to be able to do a few other things.

The word 'catch' for the volley provides a much calmer and more realistic mindset for players. The volley should be about subtracting speed from the ball rather than adding speed. Simply put, adding is punching and subtracting is catching. When you catch a ball in your hand typically your arm is bent and your hands are soft, there is some 'give' when you catch an object. The same when you are volleying, there should be a little bit of 'give' and ultimately this give will equal feel and touch. The first layer that needs to be laid is for your hands to become softer, so catch the ball instead of punching it.

The next layer is simple racket preparation when the ball is coming at you. You need to prepare for the height of the ball coming to you. The ball coming at you will be high or low, it may be slow or fast but it is the height of the ball that is the important issue.

Another layer to add is aiming the volley. In reality this is the simplest aspect of volleying. We all

just like using a mirror. Simply put you are reflecting your opponents shot either back to them or away from them. Simply aim the mirror (your racket) where you want the ball to go and let it 'reflect' off of your racket. Aiming a volley is not such a big deal, getting to the ball and judging it correctly are far more difficult tasks, but once you get to the ball make it simple by just using your understanding of the mirror.

The last layer to add is the concept of backspin on the volley. If you understand the concept of having an open racket face (tilting the racket so it is slightly pointing towards the sky, or roof) then you are well on your way to being able to create backspin as you volley. A volley struck with an open racket face will create spin and there is no need to do anything more than that to create the spin. This spin creates friction with the air and slows the ball down. Spin also allows you to have more 'feel' when you are volleying. You must be able to 'subtract' speed on your volley to be a good volleyer. Spin, along with relaxed hands will allow this to happen.

The following are your points for review for getting unstuck with your volley game:

- Get away from thinking "punch"
- "Catch" the volleys
- Think about subtracting speed when you volley, as opposed to adding speed.
- •Use a mirror to aim your volleys, reflect the ball away from your opponent.

•Hit volleys with an "open" racket face in order to create spin and consequently control.

These points will increase your comfort and success at the net. Happy controlled volleying!
