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

## Despite local and national political protests, island sets new arrivals record

WITH 2014 having drawn to a close, Phuket's top-ranking officials and leading tourism industry figures have avoided a year of stagnant growth, which was a possibility given the ongoing anti-government protests and a slew of other issues that continue to plague the island. Tourism officials in both Phuket and Bangkok reported in late August that the trend in official tourist arrival statistics was on pace to achieve a record-breaking yearend figure: about 26.3 million visitors nationwide, with over one-third of these typically including Phuket in their itineraries.

Reasons for the optimism stemmed from a highly successful 2012, a 12month span of relative political stability that, not surprisingly, ended a banner year: 22.4 million international visitors, up 16.2 per cent over 2011.

Few countries are more reliant on foreign tourism as a source of revenue, and no Thai province more so than Phuket. Though we managed to have a recordbreaking year, 2013 finished far below expectations held prior to the protests. "Even though the official 2013 tourist figures for Phuket have yet to be released, I think this year we will break the record," Santi Pawai, director of the Phuket Office of Tourism and Sports said in late December.

"According to last year's statistics, about 10,288,000 people came to Phuket. Our raw data this year, from January to November show that over 10.6 million tourists came to Phuket. We think at the end of the year it is possible that the number will reach 12 million people," he said.

The tourists keep coming despite the fact that many foreign missions – those of almost all major source markets – continue to warn against "all but essential" travel to Thailand as the protests in...



In Phuket, despite the possibility of tarnishing the island's reputation as a "safe" destination, protesters showed their allegiance with anti-government protesters in Bangkok by demonstrating at Phuket Provincial Hall.

The island's largest political protest peacefully convinced the Governor to close down Provincial Hall for almost three weeks. while small protests forced the temporary closure of other government offices on the island.

As a testament to Phuket's creativity, some crafty private tour operators have been walking foreign tourists around the protest site at Provincial Hall.

The largest tourist market for Phuket in 2013 was the Chinese market, said Mr Santi. The Middle Kingdom is not only the great final frontier of Phuket tourism promotion, but also a place that takes a markedly different approach to dealing with anti-government protests.

For many tourists, the chance to see genuine political protest in action is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity.

But the Phuket protests led to tailbacks in and around Phuket Town, highlighting the island's everworsening traffic problems.

Headway has been made on several underpass projects this year. But according to

polls in 2013, improving Phuket's public transport system would be the best solution to traffic problems for locals, expats and tourists.

"Phuket needs to prove that we can provide public transportation for local people and tourists,"

Mr Teerayut said: "We are not targeting tourists. I believe people who prefer the convenience of using taxis will still use them, and they will be willing to pay more for the extra convenience. Public transportation is just another option to support the island's tourism industry," Mr Teerayut said.

Since the bus service's rushed launch in July, during Phuket's low season, the company has struggled to connect with its market. In October it still did not have an English version of its website, though it does now.

Taxis have been in the news repeatedly in the last year, as have official vows to standardize them, clear them from parking places and put an end to some drivers' criminal behavior.

The Department of Special Investigation (DSI) Organized Crime Centers, established this year, were established specifically to target illegal taxis.

"Right now, we are just working on reducing the power of whoever is behind the illegal taxis in Phuket," Lt Col Somboon Sarasitt of the DSI Bureau of Special Crime Region 3 said in August.

As Phuket enters the new year, it remains to be seen if a push by the DSI and local authorities to wrangle the illegal taxis into submission and "reclaim the streets" from illegal taxi ranks, with a scheduled "D-Day" of December 31, will have a significant impact on Phuket's tourism industry.

# Filipina stuck in legal limbo

A PHILIPPINE national charged with working in Patong illegally was forced to wait in limbo for five months for a trail and for her passport to be returned to her.

In the meantime, she remained stuck in Thailand without a work permit, or legal way to support herself.

"I'd been working at the hotel for only a month when I was arrested along with a co-worker. They put us in jail and took my passport," she said.

In the intervening five and a half months, her trial date was postponed four times.

"The police have to keep Ms Beleno's passport during this period to prevent her from fleeing the country," he added.

Phuket Provincial Chief Public Prosecutor Chiengsean Panhya confirmed that the case might take a long time.

"Some prosecutors investigate the entrepreneur and suspect separately, while others investigate how much work that prosecutor has to do. We have a lot of cases

coming in every day," he said. "In this case, Ms Beleno never

told us that she had a problem or wanted to leave the country. If the delay is causing difficulties, we will help in any way we can – she should just let us know," he said.

## **Elephant** camp owner fined for illegal elephant

AN ELEPHANT camp owner charged in October with illegally bringing an elephant into Phuket has been fined and the elephant returned to its home in Phang Nga.

Prasob Jerkae, 37, paid a 5,000baht fine for bringing the elephant into the province without a permit, Kathu Livestock Acting Chief Jirayu Nirunwiroj said.

A tip-off led livestock officers to Mr Prasob's elephant camp in Kathu on October 26, where they found Phang Sutjai, an 18-monthold female elephant, chained to a coconut tree.

Mr Prasob confessed to officers that he did not have the proper papers to bring the pachyderm into the province, but claimed to have legal registration documents for her. Mr Prasob was charged with importing an elephant into the province without a permit.

## Case against violent taxi station delayed

THE investigation of a violent Phuket taxi rank whose behavior was exposed in a sting operation in late November has been postponed.

"We had expected the investigation against the Merlin Beach Resort taxi rank to get official sanction at our December 2 meeting," said Somboon Sarasit, head of the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) Special Crime Unit 3, referring to the monthly DSI national-level meeting.

"However, there were other topics we had to discuss at that meeting – such as the

anti-government protests in Bangkok," he said. Lt Col Somboon said that he would present evidence against the Merlin Beach Resort taxi drivers at the January meeting.

We have enough evidence to get the case added to our special investigations list," he said.

The evidence he referred to came from a sting operation initiated after the DSI received reports that taxi drivers at the resort were threatening people who

were picking up guests.

The DSI enlisted a foreigner to pose as a guest, and had a DSI undercover officer pick him up at the resort.


When our officer arrived to pick up the foreigner, one of the taxi drivers parked a motorbike in front of the officer's car and told the foreigner not to get in it. Another driver opened the car door and tried to pull the DSI officer out," Lt Col Somboon related.

Other DSI officers arrived on the scene to defuse the situation, but no charges were pressed.

Another high profile taxi case in November involved the Honorary Consul of Ireland who reported a similar experience at a resort in Rawai.

"We will not stop following up on complaints about taxi drivers in Phuket. Whoever is behind the illegal taxi operations on the island must be investigated," Col Somboon said.

# A nation at the crossroads

AS THAILAND begins a new year, the country finds itself at a crossroads. What seems to be at stake is not only the future shape of democracy in this country, but whether it will even remain a "democracy" at all. This should worry all those who care about the future of Thailand and its people.

The People's Democratic Reform Committee (PDRC) is determined to bring down Yingluck Shinawatra's government. They want to uproot the "Thaksin regime" and replace it with a "People's Government". They want a "People's Assembly" to serve as the legislative branch of this brave new administration, and to draft legislation that would reform Thailand's political system.

They insist that they are not anti-democracy, but support a cleaner democracy - one not corrupted by capital.

The group, led by former deputy PM Suthep Thaugsuban and several old faces from the People's Alliance for Democracy,

claim the Constitution allows them try to overthrow the system of to do this. Article 3 of the charter says sovereignty of the country "belongs to the people".

The government, they add, has violated Article 68 of the Constitution, which says that no one should constitutional democracy with HM The King as head of state. Because the current government says it will not heed the judgment of the Constitutional Court, which struck down its recent Senate amendment.



the administration is no longer respecting the Constitution, and has thus lost legitimacy, the PRDC claims.

Once Ms Yingluck has resigned, an eventuality the PDRC is plainly aiming to achieve, there will be a power vacuum. The PDRC then wants to invoke Article 7 of the charter, which says that when no part of the document seems to apply to the situation, the country should follow conventional democratic practice.

Since the country has been ruled by appointed prime minis-

ters before, this would allow the head of the Senate to appoint a new premier, who would in turn bring in a new government of technocrats -

"good people", using the protesters' term of choice.

A new "People's Assembly" would then replace the Parliament. Its 400-strong membership would comprise 300 representatives from professional organizations, and 100 appointed by the PDRC. This assembly would then set about "reforming" Thailand's corrupted political system.

The PDRC is right to say the system is in need of reform. Politics remains deeply corrupt. Vote buying, as the protesters claim, is indeed rife. But to claim that Pheu Thai "buys" elections entirely through the purchasing of votes, as the PDRC has claimed, is to

serious flaws - Thaksin Shinawatra and his proxies are the party of choice for millions of Thais.

A further oversimplification is in suggesting that only one party engages in vote buying. All the parties play the "votes for notes" game. Studies have shown that some voters take money only from the party they intend to support, while others take money from every party then vote for their preferred candidate anyway. Paying for votes is the price you pay to play the game, as academics Chris Baker and Pasuk Phongphaichit have argued. It does not guarantee victory.

One further cause for caution is the leader of the protests himself. Those who have lived in Phuket long enough may remember a little of Suthep Thaugsuban's questionable record. In 1995, as Agriculture Minister, he was responsible for the SorPorKor 4-01 land reform scheme, in which the deeds to plots of empty land were supposed to be distributed to poor farmers around the country.

In Phuket, an investigation revealed that 11 of the island's richest families were among the recipients of this property. The accusations had enough credibility - and seriousness - to bring down Chuan Leekpai's Democrat government. This fact should serve as a strong signal that this conflict is driven by a lot more than just revulsion to corruption.

To lose faith in democracy at this point in Thailand's development would be a mistake. The system is highly flawed. But one

has to wonder what kind of reforms might the PDRC carry out that could somehow ensure that when democracy is restored within about 18 months – it is suddenly, miraculously clean.

The PDRC claims to be a peaceful movement, and so far the protests have been relatively free from violence. But those observers who support the principles of human rights and free speech have good cause to wonder what kind of reforms Mr Suthep and his fellow leaders have in mind – reforms that we are led to believe will succeed in cleaning up Thai politics where others have failed.



# **Ready for the Green Revolution?**

Consultant says gray out, green in for Phuket's real estate boom in 2014 and beyond

BACK in November, an energetic Chilean man paid a visit to the Phuket Gazette offices. Identifying himself as Ignacio Espoz Babul, the Director of (Santiago-based) LatinGreen – a patent holder, innovator and installer of "Green Walls" - the man passionately talked of a coming "Green Revolution" that he had envisioned for Phuket and the whole of Asia.

In the 80s, Babul watched with concern as the houses with gardens and trees as well as parks in his native Santiago de Chile disappeared to make way for larger buildings and urban sprawl. He had an idea to repurpose these lost spaces onto the roofs of buildings and even incorporate them into vertical walls.

As a commercial engineer Babul had the knowledge necessary to transform his vision into

reality as director of LatinGreen and founder of the World Green Infrastructure Network (wgin.org). In addition to creating green infrastructure, he organizes lectures and events worldwide.

Following is the first part of that spontaneous, albeit stimulating interview:

Phuket Gazette: In simple terms, what are green walls, roofs or buildings?

Living wall systems are comprised of pre-vegetated panels, modules or planted blankets that are affixed to a structural wall or free-standing frame. religion as well as friendly cordiality to strangers; and so, the world's tourists prefer this destination, with the number of visitors increasing exponentially every year. Phuket especially has a dynamic economy, driven mostly from the

which has triggered a surge in demand for new buildings, apartments, malls and hotels.

Now is the time – this is the moment where we can be in harmony with nature. Building green means eliminating the otherwise imposing gray, which will have an immediate impact on the environment and aesthetics of places.

My vision points towards the government, private sector and all the people of Thailand who have a special appreciation for nature: once you all have more information, options and offers, I'm sure the green infrastructure will become an integral part of the architecture.

We have the ability to build the projects - small, large and multiple units. The aim is to generate demand so that economies of scale apply to enable lower production costs.

In the first phase, we aim to

of green infrastructure, to stress the importance of having the city be in harmony with nature, it's people, their children and visitors. The central idea is to incorporate the dynamic real estate boom.

Initially, we've been in contact with the Phuket provincial government, establishing a healthy dialogue that includes improving aesthetics and functionality of the island's strategic points such as the airport, shopping plazas, advertising and road info points, schools and tourist areas.

I'm also looking to organize lectures at the local universities, to spread awareness among prospective entrepreneurs, investors and partners.

Green infrastructure is the perfect concept for tourism businesses, shops, banks or service companies, as well as for private applications.

is needed in terms of US\$ per square meter?

There are a lot of economic and environmental benefits, which can be translated into profit from investment. The investment will depend on the size of the project, plant varieties used and the technical elements that can be applied. In addition to construction of the roofs and walls themselves, clients might consider additional elements to add more automation and productivity, namely solar and wind power to supplement lighting, water pumping and even eco air conditioning.

The rate can range anywhere from US\$40 to \$1,000 per square meter, depending on whether it's just a simple grass garden, or with bonsais, waterfalls and hundreds of other options.

## The toll of tourism

AS WE embark on the year 2014, there seems to be no better time to reflect back on the monumental changes that have transformed Phuket over the past few decades, all the result of "Bangkok style" urbanization that continues to degrade what is left of the island's natural beauty and diminish its appeal to foreign tourists.

In a recent *Gazette* online readers' poll, only about six per cent of those who took part thought that the island's beaches remained its premier selling point. This was the least popular among six possible responses.

The most popular response was that the island's unique combination of beaches, natural beauty, good value for money and nightlife was responsible for keeping tourist arrival figures on the rise year-in and year-out. Good enough, at least if one is prepared to accept tourism arrival figures as the gold standard by which success should be measured.

The sad fact is that it is far too late to turn back the clock and restore the island to what it once was: a tropical paradise with hillsides covered in virgin forest, beautiful coral reefs within easy swimming distance of most beaches, crystal clear waters and a friendly, laid-back local population for whom world-class hospitality came as second nature.

The problem, of course, has been the island's so-called "development", a term that comes across as increasingly oxymoronic as we watch Phuket's natural heritage plundered and replaced with an unsightly urban landscape more like images from the dystopian sci-fi film *Blade Runner* than those which appear on so many tourism promotion pamphlets.

This development has brought us endless traffic tailbacks, slum communities built on cleared mangrove forests, huge advertising billboards, and the latest trend: colossal concrete traffic underpasses that may have no appreciable effect on the evergrowing traffic problem, except to transform the existing mess into a three-dimensional nightmare la Bangkok and line the pockets of corrupt politicians.

It is hard to conceive of a way to stem this heartbreaking tide under the existing "vassal state" dynamic, with the island's "development" funded, authorized and approved by powerful people in the capital who have apparently spent too much time zoning out while sitting in traffic jams to conceive that there could be a better way forward.

One potential way out would be to establish the island as a "special administrative area" with its own elected governor, a concept that has long been discussed. But that would require honest politicians, which are as few on the ground here as they are in the capital.

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
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## **Abandoning elections isn't the way**


certainly not least, Phuket will host the 4th annual Asian Beach Games (November 14-21).

WHAT began as a languagelearning exercise – watching Thai soaps with English subtitles online - has become, well, a problem. I stay up too late, watch during breakfast, and abandon unessential tasks until I finish the series, all 20-plus hours of it.

I became addicted despite the fact that from the first moment I know what will happen – the main characters will get together, and those other two who seem to hate each other will get together, and the bad guys will get their comeuppance and everyone will suffer along the way.

So what is it that keeps me and countless Thai women spellbound by these shows? It's watching the main characters solve an endless series of problems while slowly falling in love along the way.

There is the macro problem: She is an actress trying to regain her former popularity by hosting a cooking show, and she needs him to teach her how to cook. Or she is a spirit trapped

in the body of his five-year-old niece. Or she is an independent woman who wants to have a baby and is angling to get him to donate his sperm.

And there is the long string of micro problems: Will he be able to love her even though he believes she's a prostitute? She's not a

daughter of a super rich soy sauce manufacturer in disguise. Ah! He realizes that he truly loves her. But wait, someone is spreading the rumor that she slept with his best friend. He breaks up with her. Bummer! Is he going to take her back? He does. Thank goodness! But by then she's pissed off and won't accept his apology. Oh golly!

We enjoy seeing the good guys triumph and keep their lovecompetitors at bay. Again and again, they clear their names, win mothers-in-law over, get out of scrapes gracefully, and say the right sassy or noble thing at just the right time.

prostitute of course, but the ogle, and a Mercedes or two.

But the very best thing that the soaps give us is a close up of two people falling in love in slow motion, a gradual dawning of feelings, their courtship. What could be more compelling to a woman. I do not know.

There are shy smiles, long looks, a first hand-holding, swabbing with a damp cloth when one falls sick. There are statements like "Thank you for worrying about me", which we understand really means "I know now that you love me."

The shows are as chaste as a Jane Austen novel. In fact, some-

times so chaste that the characters can't come together on their own. The girl needs to trip or fall, the man catches her, they gaze deep into each others' eyes, and voila, their love begins to flower.

After a brief period of happiness, the lovers face a mandatory separation as their feelings are tested.

During this painful time, they fall silent, gaze frequently into space, and relive scenes from the past as the theme music plays repeatedly. They cry, and beautiful tears fall down their cheeks.

They're always reunited of course, but the endings, while technically happy, are often duds. In a series called Oum Rak (Chain of love), we watch the lovers suffer terribly during their time apart. Sood Sanae Ha (A Recipe for Love): is a funny Thai Taming of the Shrew. She is a spoiled moviestar, he is her strict cooking teacher. YouTube.

Dao Kiao Duen, (Star Courts the Moon): She is independent and just wants him for his sperm. He needs her to pose as his girlfriend to get his match-making mother off his back. On Viki.com

Kon Rok Luang Jai (Heart-Luring Love Trick): Both are escaping match-making mothers. He thinks he's hired a prostitute to pose as his girlfriend, but it's actually her, in disguise. On YouTube.

Oum Ruk (Chain of Love): She hates him, then he accidentally sleeps with her when they're both drunk, and she gets pregnant. On YouTube.

Then they meet by chance the very day he's to go abroad to start a new life. "Can you not go?" she asks. "I never wanted to leave," he says. Little kiss, little hug, and – jop, the show's over. It's as though the producers know that we know the ending will be happy, and don't waste much energy on it.

Some inadvertent pleasures of the soaps for a Western viewer are the cultural oddities that pop up here and there, like everyone wearing slippers indoors, even the bad guys, even when they're shouting and fighting. And all the men, including the hotties, wearing grandpa-style pyjamas to bed.

Other elements can be jarring. Women are often weak and it's unseemly for them to show their desire. And one show, so popular that it has been remade many times, has a plot I never grew comfortable with. In Sawang

Bieng, (Paradise Diversions) the man rapes the woman, then spends the whole series trying to win her love, finally succeeding.

But things may be improving for female characters. In a recent soap, Dao Kiao Duen (Star Courts the Moon), the woman is a rock climber and a black belt with major fighting skills. She's the one hunting for sperm to have a baby on her own.

And this is what her boyfriend says at the end when she asks forgiveness for her ulterior motives "I won't forget the past, but I'll look at it positively, because everything that happened made us know each other better, made us love each other. And the bad things I've done to you, I'd like you to forget. Remember just one thing: My life cannot go on without you."

Ah! Now that's an ending.

# Life & style Arts Preserving Thai cinema data and 1979's Mountain People (Khon January 4 - 10, 2014

THE first Thai film selected for the Cannes film festival, three Oscar hopefuls and movies made by King Rama VII are among this year's additions to the Registry of Films as National Heritage by the Culture Ministry and the Thai Film Archive.

Established in 2011, the Registry of Films as National Heritage aims to select entries based on their historical and artistic value and influence on society, and make them a priority for preservation.

The earliest addition this year is from 1901, Visit of the Prince of Siam. The two-and-ahalf-minute clip by British film company Mitchell and Kenyon shows the then-Crown Prince Vajiravudh on a trip across the Mersey during a visit with radio pioneer Guglielmo Marconi. The Oxford-educated prince was crowned King Rama VI in 1910.

The Royal family were among the first filmmakers in Thailand, with Vajiravudh's brother, Prajadhipok - King Rama VII a keen lensman. Two of his films were added to the registry.

One is 1929's Magic Ring, a home movie the monarch made on a trip to Koh Pha Ngan. The 25-minute short with silent-film intertitles is about a cruel stepfather who abandons his children on the island. One of them meets a nymph who gives him a magic ring that can grant wishes.

"All the actors are the royal family and King Rama VII shot the film himself," says Chalida Uabumrungjit, the Film Archive's deputy director.

The other entry from the King Rama VII

collection is 1930's Mon Ram Phee at Pak Lad, the monarch's recording of a traditional Mon dance. "It's a very rare ethnographic moving image," Chalida says.

From 1927 is Chang: A Drama of the Wilderness, the oldest surviving Hollywood production made in Thailand. It's directed by Merian C Cooper and Ernest B Schoedsack, who later made King Kong. The documentary-style adventure tale, complete with deaths of multiple species of wildlife, depicts a rural Isaan family beset by a marauding herd of elephants.

The newest entry is 2005's The Tin Mine (Maha'lai Muengrae), an expensively mounted historical drama directed by Jira Maligool and produced by GTH. Thailand's submission to the Academy Awards in 2006, it's adapted from the semi-autobiographical short stories by Ajin Panjapan, of a university dropout sent to work in the tin mines of

Southern Thailand in the 1950s. Another Oscar submission is 2004's The Overture (Hom Rong), directed by Ittisoontorn Vichailak. Loosely based on the life of palace musician Luang Pradit Phairoh, it follows a ranad-ek (xylophone) player from boyhood in the late 19<sup>th</sup> century to the 1940s.

And Thailand's first Academy Awards submission, 1983's Story of Nam Poo, makes this year's list. Directed by Euthana Mukdasanit, the factual drama is adapted from the book by award-winning writer Suwanni Sukhontha, which she wrote after her son died at age 18 of a heroin overdose. Singer Amphol Lumpoon stars as the son with theater doyenne Patravadi Mejudhon as the mother.

More social issues are depicted in 1973's Khao Chue Karn by MC Chatrichalerm Yukol, about the problems encountered by an idealistic young physician in the country-

side, and 1979's Mountain People (Khon Phu Khao) by Vichit Kounavudhi, depicting the lives of hilltribes in the North.

The lighter side of Thai teenagers is shown in a pair of classic comedies on this year's list - 1976's Wai Ounlawon by Piak Poster and 1988's Boonchu Phoo Narak by Bhandit Rittakol. Both spawned long-running series of teen comedies by Five Star Production. And childhood memories are recounted in the 1990 drama Pook Pui by Udom Udomroj.


And from the Thai New Wave period of the late 1990s and early 2000s is director Nonzee Nimibutr's feature debut, 1997's Daeng Bireley's and Young Gangsters (2499 Antapan Krong Muang), a stylish, factbased drama about James Dean-obsessed teenage hoodlums in 1950s Bangkok.

Scripted by Wisit Sasanatieng, it was the start of a movement of films that revitalised the local film industry and brought widespread attention to Thai cinema on the world stage.


Wisit made his directorial debut with another entry on this year's list, 2000's Tears of the Black Tiger (Fah Talai Jone), which was the first Thai film to be selected for the Cannes Film Festival. It competed in the Un Certain Regard category.

A colourful western, with six-gun-toting bandits on horseback, Tears of the Black Tiger was an homage to an earlier era of Thai film - the action movies of the 1960 and '70s - like another entry on this year's list, 1966's Operation Bangkok (Petch Tad Petch), a Hong Kong coproduction featuring superstar leading man Mitr Chaibancha and Hong Kong starlet - The Nation Regina Piping.











LENNY Cooke, a New York City basketball legend who was ranked the top high school player in America in 2000 ahead of LeBron James and Carmelo Anthony, accepted a US\$350,000 jackpot from a sports agent and had the time of his life. But life in the fast lane quickly disappeared as he went from a top basketball prospect tantalizingly close to NBA millions to a hardcourt outsider struggling to make a living.

His story is chronicled in *Lenny* Cooke, the debut feature documentary by brothers Josh and Benny Safdie (*The Black Balloon*) that opened in selected US theaters this month. The life lessons of the film, a cautionary tale of squandered talent, have resonated for many years with its executive producer Joakim Noah of the Chicago Bulls.

"Lenny's story was a story I got to see firsthand from the bench," Noah, an NBA All-Star, told Reuters after a recent Bulls game at Madison Square Garden in New York.

"I was a little bit younger than him. We had just moved to New York from Paris, France, and that (Amateur Athletic Union) team in New York and I learned a lot from him."

Noah, the son of grand slam tennis champion Yannick Noah, said although it is a sad story, he is proud of Cooke, a gifted player who motivated him to demand more from himself.

"It's easy to talk about your successes in front of people but to talk about your hardships, your failures and to talk about what you could've done better takes a real man," he said.

The film follows Cooke, 31, from his schoolboy heyday 13 years ago to his modest home in southern Virginia, where he is still coming to terms with his life.

Cooke took a wrong turn at age 19 when he could not compete for his high school team because of an age limitation. Although he was advised to finish his studies so he would be eligible to play in college, he instead took the payday to sign with a sports agent.

"I had \$350,000 in cold cash. It was a jackpot for me," the 6-foot-6 (1.98 m), one-time flashy guard said in an interview. "I did a lot of things I'd never done or probably will get to do. I travelled, I bought anything I wanted. I had a lot of women, vehicles, jewelery, everything."

The next year he declared himself eligible for the 2002 NBA Draft and waited to be picked but his name was never called.

'Maybe they didn't want to take a chance on a kid they thought was unstable or was a head case or immature," Cooke said.

"Maybe they saw me as out of control. I did everything that I wanted to do, when I wanted to do it."

Because he had taken the money from the agent, Cooke had lost his amateur status and could not play college ball. So he played in the NBA developmental D-League, overseas and in other lesser US professional leagues and on NBA summer-camp teams but never made it to the big time.

After a game on a rainy night, his teammate drove into a street lamp, seriously hurting his passenger, Cooke, who fell into a coma and nearly had his left leg amputated. He returned to the game, twice tore his Achilles heel

and finally quit, overweight and out of shape.

The film combines early footage shot by producer Adam Shopkorn with later shots by the Safdies, who agreed to finish the long-shelved project started by their childhood friend. Cooke is captured in candid moments at high school All-Star camps that foreshadowed the attitude that sabotaged his future and in glimpses of his enormous talent in tournaments that also featured the young James, Anthony and

other future NBA players. It is a film that Cooke and

Noah believe should be shared.

"I didn't have a work ethic, I didn't want to work out. I just played off of my potential. I didn't go to the gym every day, four or five hours a day like those guys did," said Cooke.

Earlier this month, Cooke and Noah, who runs a foundation to help children in the Chicago area, hosted a screening of the film and held a question-and-answer session. Other screenings and

talks are planned.

The film will also be shown on the Showtime television network after its theatrical run.

"I know he watches it (NBA games), and he's like, 'Damn, I used to kill these dudes when I was younger' but I think that's what Lenny's story is about," Noah said.

"If your mindset isn't about progress, about getting better no matter how old you are, you're not going to make it."

# The trouble with England

SOME time ago, I ventured the opinion that England would lose the Ashes in Australia. That it would be so emphatic is, however, a cause for astonishment. Victors by 3-0 in the previous series, England have now lost three matches on the trot in just twenty seven days – and to a side that had lost seven of its last nine tests. Why, oh why?

There have been some calamitous reversals of form. Matt Prior, a key cog in the machine, vice-captain and English "Player of the Year", has suffered a massive loss of confidence. Averaging a mere 18 with the bat, his failures at seven have triggered a number of late order batting collapses, and badly affected his wicket-keeping. Brad Haddin's success both with the gloves and the bat has been in stark contrast. When an "Oz" collapse threatened at 132 for 6 in the first Test, Haddin came to the rescue. with a matchturning score of 94. He repeated the dose with 53, and then scored another important and rapid fifty at the Waca. The story of the captains reveals a similar about-turn. Coming into the series, Cook's recent record, both as captain and accumulator was far superior to Clarke's: he currently averages 25 and tactically he has been outthought by his rival.

As for the rest, Kevin Pietersen, England's most influential batsman, has "got out" five times to balls he would normally play with ease; Jonathan Trott, the rock of recent series at three, has returned to the UK with a stress-related illness, and neither Root nor Bell have made runs consistently enough. The centuries tell their own story: Australia has amassed seven, England one.

Most critical of all, Clarke's attack has been altogether more

potent. Mitchell Johnson, who ironically would has only played because of injuries to young tyros such as Pattinson and Starc, has been consistently hostile. The left-armer has 23 wickets at 15, an extraordinary statistic. And he has been ably supported by Ryan Harris and the naggingly accurate Peter Siddle. Add the miserly medium pace of Watson and the off spin of Lyons (who has so outbowled Graeme Swann that he has announced his retirement) and you have a world-class attack perfectly suited to conditions "Down Under".

In contrast, England have been far too reliant on James Anderson. Normally so dependable, he has been way short of his best form - seven victims for 406 runs. And apart from Broad, the other quicks – Finn, Tremlett and Rankin – have been disappointing, though in fairness, only Tremlett has been given an opportunity.

Which makes one wonder about the selection of the team, both before and during the series. Admittedly Ben Stokes, an unforeseen choice, has been a solitary success. But surely reliable paceman Graham Onions deserved a call, as did Buttler, a pugnacious batsman and a fine wicketkeeper. Hindsight is a wonderful thing, but now the selectors must gamble by including Jonny Bairstow and their quickest bowler, Steven Finn.

Of course, you can never entirely exclude "Lady Luck". Clarke has won all three tosses and has rightly elected to bat first. A couple of umpiring decisions have not gone England's way. Fast true pitches have meant that attacking Australian batmen such as Warner has enjoyed prolific days.

But it will take more than a change of fortune to turn things around.

PHUKET-based Australian racing driver Dylan Young stormed home to record a best placed finish of 7<sup>th</sup> position out of 20 of the world's best junior drivers during races 6-9 of the 2013 MRF Challenge Formula 2000 Championship which once again took place at the Bahrain Formula 1 Circuit on December 20 and 21.

The MRF races were held directly after the three-day Formula 1 test that was being held in Bahrain as part of Pirelli's 2014 tyre developments where four Formula 1 teams were in action including champions Red Bull, Ferrari, Mercedes and Toro Rosso.

The first practice session of the weekend revealed Young's pace and put him in good shape to attack the front of the field after recording a time of only 0.011 seconds shy of the championship leader Arthur Pic who is the younger brother of Caterham Formula 1 driver Charles Pic.

Young managed his best-placed finish of 7<sup>th</sup> out of 20 drivers in race 2 of the weekend. At the end of the race he crossed the line just over 3 seconds from  $3^{rd}$  place for a podium and 6.7seconds behind the winner in what was a tightly fought battle with numerous position changes.

"Once again I'm really pleased to have come away from the last race weekend of the year with an even stronger result," Young said. "P7 out of 20 drivers including being ahead of top GP3 drivers from Europe shows again just how much progress we're

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first place but one of the guys up the front has tested with the Marussia Formula 1 team this year and it just takes so much preparation and seat time to get up there. But now that I'm finally getting some solid seat time, I'm able to show that every time we jump in the car we are getting closer and closer to the front. I'm confident we will be challenging big time in 2014!"

After the highlight of 7<sup>th</sup> place, Dylan was unlucky to cop damage in the other races of the weekend, especially in the final race of the round where the car was so badly damaged that analysis after the race alerted Young's race engineer to admit they should have retired his car on safety grounds. Young was hit on turn 3 of the opening lap which bent the suspension and severely damaged the front wing causing a massive loss of downforce. Nevertheless, in a spirited drive, the 24-year-old battled hard with his damaged car to still finish in 11<sup>th</sup> place.

Taking the positives away from his continued progress and to be in the top 7 of one of the most competitive junior categories in the world, Dylan's attention will now shift towards working tirelessly behind the scenes in a bid to take his career to Europe in one of Formula 1's major feeder categories for 2014. Young said that someone had taken him onboard and believed in his career journey and that he hopes a deal can be done to begin testing in Europe early next year. person who has been simply tremendous in their support to me this year and I couldn't have raced without them backing me. They know who they are and I'm hopeful that together we can take a huge step next year on the pathway to Formula 1 and we should know more where I stand in the coming month or two, but it will take a lot of work. I can't do the journey alone though and there are numerous benefits, both short term and long term with a key return on investment for people who wish to come onboard, but time is running out before 2014 really kicks into gear."

Dylan was also thankful for the support he received from local Phuket companies in 2013 and urged other companies to join. "It's been fantastic to have Wahoo Phuket, Kata Rocks and Indigo Pearl partner me this year and for all of us to be showcasing Phuket internationally. I'm hoping that there will be some other businesses who will take notice and follow the trend that these leading companies on the island have done by supporting me towards Formula 1 and I invite them to get in touch."

The MRF Challenge Formula 2000 Championship is considered to be the fastest one to make single seater championship across Asia and the Middle East. The Formula 3 equivalent car is designed by Italian firm Dallara who is the largest racing car manufacturer in the world. The MRF Formula 2000 car is powered by a 2.0 litre 210 BHP Renault Sport Engine that propels the drivers to racing speeds of up to 260km/h.

# Power of the wind

THE fifth annual Kiteboard Tour Asia (KTA) recently visited Phuket, making its first stop as part of a five-stop Asia tour. Four days (December 17-20) of races were held in Chalong Bay just off of Friendship beach under better-thanexpected conditions. The KTA follows closely behind the Pro Kite Tour World Championships which came to a close in Argentina on December 8.

KTA has been no stranger to Thailand but this event marks their first in Phuket. "We have done four previous events up in Pranburi... but we wanted to try and give a different scene a look at what we can do," said KTA Founding Director Neil Godbold.

When it comes to finding new venues Godbold declares that "It's funny, when you come to a new place and they go 'oh, we don't even know about you'...you have to

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come back and prove yourself again." With 33 entries out of a possible 120, he expects a larger turn-out next year.

Races were held in two categories: twin tip and formula raceboards. Godbold described the characteristics of each," The twin tip board is the symmetrical board like a wakeboard or snowboard and it goes both ways easily." Twin tip boards demand stronger winds, only coming to life in 12 knots of wind.

The formula raceboards are bigger asymmetrical boards with more buoyancy, surface area and longer fins. "These big race boards... these are the ones that nearly got us into the Olympics for 2016 and almost certainly will for 2020," said Godbold. A mere 6 knots of wind will shoot raceboards across the water at high speed.

It's looking like a promising future for kiteboarding as inclusion in the Olympics will

Vietnam, Philippines and Thailand... and there is a really good national Thai racing scene."

Concerning next year's event, Godbold is thinking of adding "... The freestyle [division] or look at something even bigger like a race style event so maybe we'll have some long distance racing. So we'll grow it in some way, we're just not sure quite which direction yet."

The air about the KTA events has changed since the early years adds Godbold, "Our first party [at this event] started at 5 pm and was finished at 9 pm. Five years ago everyone would have partied til six in the morning, now they are getting a little more serious." "This year we have some really good local support from the Vijitt Resort and Tamarind Resort, who are our presenting sponsor, Kitezone hosting and the Nai Harn group for supporting it," said Godbold. Logically, he is positive about acquiring additional sponsorship for subsequent events in Phuket so the event can grow and flourish.

With a diverse group of nationalities being represented, the imminent growth of future events, potential Olympic sport status on the horizon and racers willing to forgo hedonistic temptation in the name of competition, the sport of kiteboarding is just getting it's second wind.


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
