Gov fights for Safer Phuket

National protests delay summit; water safety stays course

POLITICAL unrest may have forced the postponement of the Coastal Waters Safety Summit this week, but the ongoing protests will not prevent the landmark event from occurring after the February 2 election.

"The event may have been postponed, but it must be held as soon as possible," Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut told the Gazette this week.

"I fully support the Safer Phuket project [which organized the summit]. Although there are many departments that each stage watersafety campaigns, it is much better for us to develop a co-ordinated approach to keep tourists safe," he said.

Phuket Marine Office Chief Phuripat Theerakulpisut rated the summit as "critical" in improving water safety on and around the island. We see that it is very important...



Angry protesters avail

HUNDREDS of angry antigovernment protesters on Sunday night forced the organizers of the annual Phuket Red Cross Fair to cancel a live concert by Thai rock star Sek Loso, who was to perform the closing show at the fair.

Sek "Seksan Sukpimai" Loso was one of many Thai celebrities who joined a publicity campaign calling on voters to cast their ballots at the upcoming February 2 election.

His participation in the campaign. however, drew much criticism from anti-government factions, who posted angry comments on the Sek Loso Facebook page.

Sek fired back at his online critics, swearing at them in a post that was later pulled down from his Facebook page.

Determined to prevent the rock star from taking the stage, hundreds of protesters massed at the fair at Saphan Hin.

Phuket Red Cross President Pawinee Inthusut attempted to talk the protesters into disbanding, but the angry crowd refused to budge.

About an hour later, at 10:30pm, officials announced that the concert was cancelled. Protesters

blew their whistles and started heading home.

Two rival Burmese gangs were among the fair-goers leaving the event. They ran into each other outside of Saphan Hin and a battle broke out, said Capt Udom Petcharat of the Phuket City Police.

Police called to the scene found the body of Mr Min, 23, who had been stabbed with a sharpened steel construction rod, Capt Udom

explained.

About 20 meters away was Mr Min Min, 26, who was seriously injured with stab wounds.

Two other men, Mr Moo, 24, and Mr Pao, 22, were found iniured and in tears across from the Phuket Immigration Office nearby.

The men were taken to Vachira Phuket Hospital.

"Mr Min Min died en route," Capt Udom said.

Electrifying prison-escape attempt

AN ATTEMPTED jailbreak from Phuket Prison came to a shocking halt at 12:30pm on January 4 when an inmate trying to escape was electrified by wires strung across the top of one of the perimeter walls.

Alerted to the escape attempt, prison guards ran to the east wall, where they found 45-year-old Worawut Rordbhut unconscious, hanging upside down with his left leg tangled in barbed wire.

Rescue workers, with help from other inmates, were quickly called to bring Mr Worawut

back to ground.

"We believe he was attempting to break out because he was very homesick, as that is what he told our guards before his attempt," said Phuket Prison Chief

Rapin Nichanon.

Mr Worawut was sentenced to 2 years and 6 months in jail for a theft conviction on March 29 last year.

"That sentence was compounded by another theft conviction that saw 1 year and 9 months added to his sentence. He is currently on trial for two more cases of theft," Chief Rapin explained.

"He will now be charged with attempting to escape from prison," Chief Rapin confirmed.

Bus crash spurs B10mn budget

THE Phuket Highways Office has secured 10 million baht to widen the road at the bottom of Patong Hill in the hope of preventing more fatal bus crashes brought on by brake failure.

The news follows a runaway tour bus slamming into five vehicles, including one motorcycle, killing two people and leaving

26 others injured on December 29.

The bus, loaded with Russian and Thai tourists, stopped only after ramming a concrete barrier and hitting a power pole in front of Wat Suwankiriwong (Patong Temple).

"We have drawn up Jaturong Kaewkasi a plan to expand the

road from three to four lanes. This should help traffic flow and reduce the need for drivers to use their brakes so much," Phuket Highways Office Director Samak Luedwonghad said.

"We already have the 10 million baht budget required. The construction plan has been submitted to the Ministry of Transport

in Bangkok and is expect to be approved in March," he added.

The project will see 500 meters of Phra Barami Road expanded to four lanes, starting in front of the abandoned Crest resort and ending at the junction in front of Patong Temple.

"The expansion will take 150 days to complete. We will expand the road when we install larger drains along the roadside so

> both projects can be finished at the same time," Mr Samak explained.

> However, Samak admitted that little more could be done to make the road safer.

> "There is not enough room to reduce the incline on the

descent into Patong. If you want to make driving into Patong safer, I recommend we build a tunnel through the hills as soon as possible," he said.

"Some people will be negatively affected by such a project, but it will help save lives," Mr Samak

The horrific bus crash before

New Year's Eve prompted Phuket Governor Maitri Inthusut to call on the Phuket Land Transport Office (PLTO) to draw up a list of suggestions to prevent more fatal accidents from occurring on the notorious incline.

PLTO Chief Transport Technician Jaturong Kaewkasi presented a list of nine recommendations to the governor on January 1.

"Over the years, there have been many accidents on Patong Hill involving buses or trucks that have had brake failure. These accidents have cost many lives," Mr Jaturong said.

Among the suggestions was to ban all buses and trucks travelling over Patong Hill at all times, and transfer passengers to and from Patong by van.

Another suggestion was to enforce a maximum age for all buses and trucks travelling over Patong Hill.

Governor Maitri led officials on an inspection of the site on January 3 to evaluate the efficacy of the nine suggestions.

"We will now raise our ideas with business owners to see if they have any valuable suggestions," Mr Jaturong explained.

Cop charged over bar girl shooting

POLICE are considering discharging a police officer who shot dead a Soi Bangla bar worker before dawn on December 26.

The 35-year-old Patong Police officer, Sgt Pongsakorn Treeyuth, was off duty and allegedly drunk when he held an 11mm handgun to the head of Sawitree Kaewin, 27.

"We received an order from the Royal Thai Police in Bangkok late last month to investigate the case, and consider what action to take against Sgt Pongsakorn," Patong Police Investigator Jirasak Boonsang confirmed to the Gazette on Tuesday.

"It has yet to be decided whether or not he will be kicked off the police force," Capt Jirasak said. "At this point in the investigation, we believe that it was not murder."

According to witness statements, the magazine was removed from the gun before Sgt Pongsakorn showed Ms Sawitree how a person could be held from behind with a gun pointed at his or her head. It appeared that Sgt Pongsakorn forgot to check the chamber for bullets, Capt Jirasak stated.

"Three people who know both Sgt Pongsakorn and Ms Sawitree were drinking at a table nearby on the night of the incident. They told us that Sgt Pongsakorn and Ms Sawitree were friends and that there were no signs of argument that night," Capt Jirasak said.

"The only thing they saw after the sound of the gun firing was Ms Sawitree slumped over the table and a gun shot wound on Sgt Pongsakorn's hand," he said.

The police later questioned Sgt Pongsakorn.

"He told us that he was very drunk and claimed he could not remember what happened that night," said Capt Jirasak.

Patong Police have charged Sgt Pongsakorn with murder. However, Capt Jirasak said the charges may be changed before the case is handed over to the public prosecutor. - Irfarn Jamdukor

Officers take down taxi drivers

A STING operation involving an undercover policeman disguised as a taxi driver has put two taxi drivers behind bars.

Pamorn Maipuek, 40, and Narathid Wangaree, 27, were charged for threatening the plainclothes officer, who was attempting to pick up guests at Avista Hideway Resort and Spa on December 29.

"We had officers on standby and had Lt Sakson Prakapsin pick up guests at the hotel without a voucher," said Patong Police Deputy Superintendent Paisarn Sangthep.

A hotel guard stopped Lt Sakson's car so he could inform the staff that the taxi had arrived. "While Lt Sakson was waiting,



Mr Pamorn and Mr Narathid approached him," Lt Col Paisarn said. "Because he didn't have a ticket, the drivers told him that he couldn't pick up guests at the hotel. They claimed to operate the taxi queue in that area.'

The drivers then threatened

Lt Sakson, saying that if he tried to pick up any guests in the area without a voucher he would have a problem with them.

A team of police officers then rushed in and arrested both men. They face up to three years imprisonment, a fine of up to 60,000 baht or both.

The Department of Special Investigations (DSI) launched a similar sting in November, when a taxi driver tried to force a DSI officer out of his vehicle, but no arrest was made. DSI Special Crime Unit 3 chief Somboon Sarasit believes enough evidence was gathered to gain approval for the DSI to investigate.

Chinese tour guide battle turns violent

"Mr Leng works for the tour company Tai Lee Co," Wichit Police Superintendent Chawalit Phetsipear told the *Gazette*.

"He filed a complaint that he was attacked by six Thai tour guides," Col Chawalit said.

Mr Leng and the accused came to the station on Monday.

A small fight broke out as Mr Leng and his work colleagues left the police station. Angry guides accused Mr Leng of working as an illegal guide.

Only one candidate pushes through election blockade

THE Phuket blockade preventing any further candidates from registering to enter the February 2 national election held strong on January 1, the last day for potential candidates to enter the election.

'We couldn't even get inside the building this morning to open the center as the protesters blocked our way," Director of the Phuket office of the Election Commission Kittipong Thiengkunakrit said.

The blockade, led by protest leader Suratin Lian-udom, the former Mayor of Rassada, has been in force since registrations opened on December 28.

"We don't want to have an election on February 2," Mr Suratin explained during the

Yingluck Shinawatra must resign from all her work in politics, and the protesters in Bangkok must succeed in the formation of the People's Council before any elections are held," he said.

"We come in peace, without weapons. We come only with whistles and a gift for the PEC. We want them to recognize that the people of Phuket are not ready

for an election on February 2," Mr Suratin added on the first day of his campaign.

Only one candidate managed to register to contest the election, Mr

Jirayus Songyos enrolled as a Pheu Thai candidate to contest Phuket Voting District 2 after being escorted into the community center on December 29 by an entourage of about 20 people.

After Sunday, however, the protesters strengthened their resolve, forcing Mr Kittipong and Pheu Thai potential candidate Visit Jaiart to file two separate complaints about the blockade to Phuket City Police after Mr Visit was prevented from enrolling on

On January 1, however, Mr Kittipong did not call the police.

"I have already filed a complaint. Once is enough. They are already aware of the situation," he told the Gazette.

"Today was the last day for candidates to register to contest a seat in the February 2 election. We will report the problems we have had here in Phuket to EC officials in Bangkok," he said. "What happens next is up to them."

Sea taxi rumors docked

Project included in 2015 Marine budget, but not yet approved

THE Phuket Marine Office chief trounced rumors this week that the 240-million-baht budget for an airport-to-Patong "sea taxi" had been approved.

"I do not know how the rumor that it was already approved was spread," Phuket Marine Office Chief Phuripat Theerakulpisut told the Gazette.

Director of the Marine Office 5 Wichai Khamkong plans to raise the issue of the budget for the project, known as "From The Boat to The Plane", at a meeting with the Marine Department Director-General on January 10.

"We asked for the project to be included in the Marine Department's 2015 fiscal budget. However, it has yet to be approved by Cabinet," Mr Wichai said. "Our project is not in the minutes for the meeting, but I will raise the topic."

Though the budget has yet to be approved, it is well supported by Marine Department Director-General Sorasak Saensombat, said Mr Wichai.

The project is meant to be an alternative route for tourists between Phuket International Airport and Patong Beach.

"We really want to help alleviate the traffic problems on the

Speed cams operational; 39 ticketed

PHUKET'S four speed cameras became operational on Christmas Day, and 39 tickets have been sent

Located at the notorious Ko En Curve, the Bang Khu Intersection, the bypass road and in front of Muang Thalang School, the cameras will photograph vehicles travelling faster than 90km/hr, the maximum speed on non-tollway roads outside of towns.

Speeders will receive a 500-baht ticket through the mail.

If the 500-baht fine does not deter speeders, it will be increased to 1,000 baht, the maximum allowed by law, said Lt Col Rungrit Rattanapagdee of the Phuket City Traffic Police.

"We are doing this for your safety," Col Rungrit said, urging drivers not to speed.

"Thank you to the police for finding us and bringing us back to safety," Mr Letshon said.

Top cop plays down bomb

THE commander of the Phuket Provincial Police has called for the media to not "help suspects" by publishing news of the car bomb found in Phuket Town on December 23.

The call from Maj Gen Ongart Phiewruangnont for media silence follows police confirmation that the pickup truck rigged as a bomb was stolen from a man shot dead in a car heist in the strife-torn Deep South province of Pattani in May.

"The media is free to publish stories as they choose, but they must be aware that the more information they give about this story, the more confidence the suspects will have," Gen Ong-art told the Gazette.

"[The news] should be an official secret because we do not want it to affect Phuket's tourism image. Publishing the story may inspire a feeling of success for the perpetrators in their cause," Maj Gen Ong-art said.

Despite confirmation from other police stations that the

pickup truck owner, Withan Yachumnan, was shot dead in the carjacking of his vehicle in Pattani, Commander Ong-art remains unconvinced that the bomb found in Phuket is directly linked to the Deep South insurgency.

"It's possible, that's all we can say at this stage," he said.

the bomb scare, Gen Ong-art declined to reveal any details about the bomb or its potential blast effect.

Gen Ong-art also said he could not confirm that the truck bomb was the largest explosive device found in the island's peacetime

The Gazette notes that in its In line with his call for silence on news team's 20 years of report-

ing incidents on the island, there has not been a single report of a bigger bomb being found here than the two gas cylinders rigged to explode in the pickup.

Commander Ong-art has ordered police across the island to be vigilant for suspiciously parked vehicles and to double patrols by calling in volunteers to assist.

Three saved from burning building

A FAMILY of three was rescued from a burning building after being trapped by an electrical fire in their bedroom above the family shop in Phuket Town late on the night of January 4.

When police and firefighters, along with three fire trucks, arrived at the Modern PVC plumbing supplies store on Mae Luan Road at about 11:40pm, they found smoke pouring from the building.

Firefighters split into two teams: one to start attacking the blaze and the other to ensure the family were safely out of the

"It took the fire team 20 minutes to put out the blaze," said Lt Col Chaliao Thaihoo of the Phuket City Police.

The other team of firefighters entered the building to rescue the family, who had become trapped by the flames.

Anucha Thanphrapasorn, 50, told the Gazette that he woke to the smell of burning, and saw the portable fan on his dresser on fire.

"Smoke started filling the bedroom, so I grabbed a fire extinguisher that we keep in the

house and tried to put out the flames. When I couldn't stop the fire, I called for help" he said.

Firefighters confirmed that evidence at the scene indicated the fire was started by a short circuit in the fan.

However, a little confused, Mr Anucha confirmed, "I switched off the portable fan in the bedroom before going to sleep."

Regardless, Col Chaliao said that a team of forensics investigators will be called in to confirm what started the fire.

Nai Harn gets artificial reef blocks

VILLAGERS and marine officers joined together on December 24 to drop concrete frames into the sea at Nai Harn Bay as substructures for artificial coral reefs.

"There were over 50 people there to help drop 200 concrete frame-cubes," said Tanet Munnoy, chief of the Phuket Office of the Department of Marine and Coastal Resources (DMCR).

"Coral reefs are important sources for marine animals. In our area, they have been affected by illegal fishing and natural disasters," Mr Tanet said.

The artificial reef blocks were placed for marine life to colonize and may be used as dive sites in the future, he said.

The DMCR received a 10-million baht budget to produce 1.300 reef-blocks and place them in areas around Phuket. Earlier in December they sank 200 blocks at Koh Hae, 200 at Koh Bon and 300 at Koh Kaew. In January the remaining 400 blocks will be de-

posited in the sea around Koh

"We are working on improving our marine resources. We are also increasing awareness of the importance of coral reefs and encouraging people to help us

preserve them," he added.

Mr Thanet says that the program is also educating fishermen about fishing practices that will not have long-term negative effects on valuable marine resources.

22 bus drivers fail DUI test

LAW enforcement officials randomly tested bus drivers for drugs and alcohol during the 10 Days of Danger, and found 22 drivers working under the influence.

Thung Thong Police and Phuket Land Transport Office (PLTO) staff stopped buses at the Thung Thong checkpoint on Phra Barami Road before they headed over the hills to Patong.

"Of 200 bus drivers headed to Patong, 12 tested positive for drugs and two for alcohol. One truck driver also tested positive for drugs," said Jaturong Kaewkasi, Chief Transport Technician of the PLTO.

"At Bus Terminal 2, we tested 680 bus drivers, and seven tested positive for drugs, none for alcohol," Mr Jaturong said.

PATONG Police have declared success in dislodging taxis and tuk-tuks from parking spots on the Patong beach road.

"We succeeded in our goal of freeing up space between Prachanukroh Road and Soi Bangla. Each of the seven taxi ranks there are now limited to five vehicles each," Patong Police

Deputy Superintendent Akanit Danpitaksat told the Gazette on January 2.

The freed parking spaces are now available to other locals, tourists and expats.

"We are continuing to enforce the new regulation that came into effect on December 31. We want to make sure that there are spaces available for visitors when they come to Patong," Lt

Col Akanit said.

Patong Police are now discussing reclaiming public parking spaces from the taxi ranks along Rat-U-Thit 200 Pi Road and Phang Muang Sai Kor Road.

"We don't have a deadline for that project yet. However, in the meantime, we will continue to enforce the rule along the beachfront road to keep it free," Col Akanit said.

Col Akanit stressed that anyone who encounters unruly or threatening behavior by a taxi or tuk-tuk driver should call 191 immediately.

"Unacceptable behavior includes being deceived; threatened; attacked; overcharged; taken somewhere that is not your agreed destination; prevented from entering another taxi or tuk-tuk; or forced to use a particular taxi or tuk-tuk," he said.

...to have all the relevant departments involved in creating a unified approach to improving water safety," Mr Phuripat said on Wednesday.

"It it is critical for us to co-ordinate our efforts. It is pointless carrying out one-off water safety campaigns and then forgetting about it," he added.

Duncan Stewart, founder of the Safer Phuket movement, announced the postponement of the inaugural summit on Monday.

"We've made a huge amount of progress, but with the current political situation, the momentum was starting to dissipate. Everyone is in interim status at the moment," he explained.

"We met with Governor Maitri to discuss the situation and it was unanimously decided that we should not compromise on our goals for the event, so postponement was essential," Mr Stewart said.

The summit was to take place over two days at the Phuket International Marine Expo (PIMEX) currently on show at the Boat Lagoon Marina in Koh Kaew (see story page 43)

The main objective was to bring together officials from diverse government departments to begin creating a unified vision of water safety in Phuket that meets international standards.

"Now we are looking to reconvene as soon as possible after the February 2 election," Mr Stewart said.

While the summit remains on ice, Safer Phuket is steaming ahead with its project to install an

additional 50 lifeguard towers on Phuket beaches.

"We see this as a demonstrable statement of safety intent that lets the world know our commitment and intentions," Mr Stewart told the Gazette before Safer Phuket's official launch late last year.

The lifeguard stations and professionalizing of the new lifeguards will be entirely funded by advertising and sponsorship of each tower.

Safer Phuket is already in discussion with interested sponsors and supporters.

Highlighting the need for greater vigilance in keeping swimmers safe, the Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (PPAO) Tourism Division reported 23 deaths at Phuket beaches last year.

During the same period, lifeguards rescued 928 people from Phuket's surf, comprising 105 Thais and 823 foreigners, mostly tourists.

"Phuket is a part of the global community through its status as an international holiday destination, and therefore there is considerable support from within the Thai community for Phuket to be seen as an exemplary tourism destination model," Safer Phuket Executive Co-ordinator Tarin Tachthongchan said.

"We want to be proactive and lead within Thailand, Asia and beyond. The good news is that we have completed a huge amount of work for the Summit at the PIMEX boat show, so once we have political clarity we can reconvene very quickly," she said.

Army moves again set off coup chatter

THE nation is once again awash with rumors of a forthcoming military coup after the Army announced plans to roll a variety of heavy weaponry into Bangkok ahead of the "Bangkok shutdown".

The Army claims it is rolling military tanks, armored vehicles and other equipment into the capital for Children's Day on January 11, as well as the annual Armed Forces Day on January 18.

An Army spokesman denied the move was part of a coup plot, The Nation reported.

"No, the rumors are untrue. "The parades have been planned since mid-2013," said Maj-Gen Wara Boonyasit.

But those words did little to steady jitters on the part of Thais who oppose military intervention.

Adding to fears were comments by Army chief Gen Prayuth Chanocha, who said on Tuesday that the government would be held responsible for any violence during the shutdown.

Nevertheless, the situation did not warrant the declaration of a state of emergency, he said.

Gen Prayuth said he would try to have this conflict end rather than allow it to continue for sev-

Bangkok braces for closure

BANGKOKIANS are bracing themselves for the so-called "Bangkok shutdown" on Monday, when the People's Democratic Reform Committee has promised to bring the city to a standstill.

The PDRC says it will erect stages at seven key intersections across the city, blocking the traffic in a bid to force caretaker Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra to step down, The Nation reported.

It wants the interim government to resign so that an appointed "People's Government" can carry out reforms it claims are necessary for Thailand to progress.

The group had earlier said it would occupy 20 locations, leading to speculation that the PDRC reduced its goals due to lack of

The group plans to end its rally at Ratchadamnoen Avenue before moving to the new locations.

The seven locations are the Government Complex at Chaeng Wattana, Lat Phrao Intersection, Victory Monument, Pathumwan Intersection, Lumphini Park, Intersection Asoke Ratchaprasong Intersection.

Suthep Thaugsuban, leader of the PDRC, has promised that the demonstrators will not occupy the two major airports, Don Muang and Suvarnabhumi, as happened in 2008.

He has also said that buses will be allowed to operate as normal and that the BTS and MRT mass transit rail lines will also be left

Caretaker Prime Minister Yingluck has expressed concern at the PDRC's plans.

She criticized the group's plans to cut water and power supplies at state agencies, saying this would only cause trouble for residents in

spection, police applauded and shouted "PM, fight on", prompting her eyes to brim with tears.

A Pheu Thai Party source said it had been suggested that an emergency decree be invoked to deal with the PDRC's actions.

With a state of emergency in effect, the military would have to take charge and oversee operations to deal with the protesters.

But key military figures have

allegedly opposed the move and said they would prefer to play a back-up role to the police.

NACC to probe MPs, Senators

THE National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) is to investigate 308 MPs and Senators who voted or sponsored a bill that would have altered the composition of the Senate.

The Constitution Court earlier ruled that the charter change amendment, which would have led to a fully elected Senate instead of the current partially appointed Upper House, was unconstitutional, leading to the NACC investigation.

Some observers warned that the NACC ruling would be part of a so-called "silent coup" in progress to oust the government of Yingluck Shinawatra, The Nation reported.

Ms Yingluck was not among the 308. The NACC said that Ms Yingluck and 72 lawmakers voted for the bill only in the third reading while a further eight did not vote for it on the third reading, so the NACC decided not to charge

It is not clear what effects the

ruling will have on the lawmakers' ability to take part in the election currently scheduled for February 2.

The election is controversial. The Democrat Party has decided to boycott the poll, while the PDRC, currently campaigning for a "reform" process that would end the influence of the Shinawatra clan in Thai politics, does not want it to take place at all.

THE Phnom Penh Municipal Court on Tuesday summoned Opposition party leaders Sam Rainsy and Kem Sokha to appear in court on January 14 to be questioned about the deadly clashes last week that left five people dead and 37 injured.

The court also summoned Rong Chhun, president of the Cambodian Confederation of Unions, to answer charges of inciting crimes and social unrest.

Mr Chhun was one of the six union leaders who led nationwide strikes to increase the minimum wage from US\$80 to US\$160 before the violent clashes.

All six protest leaders are now

Meanwhile, tens of thousands of garment workers have returned to work, ending the two-week pay dispute after authorities used deadly force on January 3 to disband the strike.

Central to the strike and protest was opposition Cambodia National Rescue Party (CNRP) leader Sam Rainsy, who claimed the government cheated its way to power in the July 15 elections and is depriving workers of fair

Mr Rainsy also condemned the

Aussies repel boat people to Indonesian waters

INDONESIAN authorities confirmed on Monday that for the first time under a new policy the Australian Navy had driven a boatload of migrants attempting to enter their country into Indonesian waters.

The East Nusa Tenggara Police said they found 45 undocumented migrants from Africa and the Middle East aboard a boat floating adrift off the island of Rote Ndao after it failed to enter Australia.

The migrants comprised 28 Somali nationals, nine Sudanese, two Eritreans, three Egyptians and three individuals from Ghana, Lebanon and Yemen, the police said.

Nine of the immigrants were women, while none were children.

Quoting one of the boat people, Rote Ndao Police Chief Hidayat said that the Australian

Navy provided the migrants with life vests and communication equipment before repelling them into Indonesian waters.

"The Australian Navy knows that the local ship crews will usually put leaks in boats that aim to enter Australian waters, thus they took the initiative to anticipate it," Hidayat added.

Jakarta has opposed Canberra's "turn back the boats" policy and has refused to receive asylum seekers sent back by the Australian


In November, the two neighboring countries were engaged in a standoff over the policy before Jakarta froze bilateral cooperation following revelations that Australia had attempted to spy on President Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono and his aides.

As of Tuesday, the Indonesian government had yet to announce it would resume cooperation anytime soon, despite Australian Foreign Minister Julie Bishop visiting Jakarta to meet her Indonesian counterpart, Marty Natalegawa, last month. - The Jakarta Post



Chinese drug cop implicated in huge armed ya ice raid

A CHINESE drug enforcement officer has been linked to government officials arrested after the seizure of nearly three tonnes of the drug ya ice (crystal methamphetamine) in the southern province of Guangdong last month, local media reported. Thousands of armed police arrested at least 182 people in a dramatic raid on the town of Boshe.

Investigators found that a captain of the drug enforcement squad in surrounding Lufeng city, Mr Guo, was linked to Cai Dongjia, who was arrested in December.

Whale hunt keeps pressure on Aussie minister's policies

ANTI-WHALING activists said on Monday they had captured images of Japanese ships killing protected whales inside an internationally recognized whale sanctuary.

The aerial footage has raised pressure on Environment Minister Greg Hunt, who has backed away from a promise made during Australia's election campaign last year to send a ship to monitor Japanese whaling in the area.

Chinese cops detain activists ahead of newspaper protest

CHINESE authorities have detained activists in the southern city of Guangzhou to try to derail a protest planned for Tuesday to commemorate a strike by reporters at an outspoken newspaper.

The clampdown comes on the first anniversary of a rare newsroom strike at the Southern Weekly over censorship.

German Chancellor breaks pelvis skiing

GERMAN Chancellor Angela Merkel has broken her pelvis in a cross-country skiing accident, forcing her to call off some foreign visits and official appointments just when she needs to bed down her fractious new coalition government.

Central African Republic violence displaces nearly 1 million

VIOLENCE in Central African Republic violence between religious communities. (CAR) has uprooted nearly a million people, a fifth of the population, and is hampering aid efforts, particularly in the capital Bangui, the UN refugee agency (UNHCR) said.

A flare-up in violence between Muslim fighters and Christian militias has displaced more than 200,000 people in the past few weeks alone, leaving a total of 935,000 homeless.

A Muslim rebel group, the Seleka, unleashed a wave of killing and looting after seizing power in March, and the deployment of 1,600 French and nearly 4,000 African Union peacekeepers has done little to contain the tit-for-tat

"Insecurity and chaos around the site... prevents us from doing any distribution," UNHCR spokesman Babar Baloch said. "It's a horrible situation. We have heard a lot about revenge attacks happening inside health centers."

Medical charity Medecins Sans Frontieres said it was cutting services to a minimum at its airport clinic after stray bullets killed three children and injured 40 people this week.

"We are not going to continue to put the lives of our personnel at risk," Lindis Hurum, its coordinator at the site, told Reuters.

Syria war waters new life for Iraq al Qaeda

AL QAEDA gunmen seeking to form a radical Islamic state out of the chaos of Syria's civil war are fighting hard to reconquer the province they once controlled in neighboring Iraq, stirring fears the conflict is exporting ever more instability.

Exploiting local grievances

buoyed by al Qaeda gains in Syria, the fighters have taken effective control of Anbar's two main cities for the first time since US occu-

pation troops defeated them in

Their advance is ringing alarm bells in Washington: The United States has pledged to help Baghdad quell the militant surge in Anbar – although not with troops - to stabilize a province that saw the heaviest fighting of the US

Washington announced it was speeding up deliveries of military equipment to help Baghdad fight the gunmen. This would include missiles, surveillance drones and helicopters.

Al Qaeda's Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) has a tough potential foe in Anbar's well-armed

tribes, fellow Sunnis ill-disposed to ceding power to al Qaeda even if they share ISIL's hostility to the Shi'ite-led central government.

And the group's goal of creating a hardline Islamic state reaching into Syria is still seen by many as far-fetched.

But its high-profile push into Ramadi and Falluja illustrates the dangers of conflict spreading against Baghdad's rule and from Syria's three-year-old con-

flict, which is in part a proxy war between Sunni Muslim Saudi Arabia and Shi'ite rival Iran, analysts say.

ISIL fighters operate in Syria

as well, and recent setbacks for the group in the war there mean its Iraqi members may be all the more determined to secure gains in Anbar, analysts say.

"Both the Syrian and the Iraqi conflict are feeding upon one another," said Fawaz Gerges, a Middle East expert at the London School of Economics.

"There is already a fierce geostrategic struggle unfolding in the Arab arena between Saudi Arabia and Iran. There is a real danger that all-out war in Iraq could pour more gasoline on this raging fire and destabilize fragile Arab countries," said Mr Gerges.

The ISIL fighters are exploiting

simmering Sunni anger against the Shi'ite-led government of Prime Minister Nuri al-Maliki in Baghdad, seen by many Sunnis as a highhanded autocrat beholden to Iran.

They are also making the most

of rising sectarian sentiment around the region and a weakening of government control in those Arab countries most affected by the popular uprisings since 2011.



B-Ball for big Kim's birthday

FORMER NBA basketball star Dennis Rodman arrived in North Korea on Monday with a team of retired professional basketball players to mark the birthday of North Korean leader Kim Jong Un.

The visit marked Mr Rodman's fourth trip to North Korea, where he and his team of fellow former National Basketball Association stars were to hold basketball games on Mr Kim's birthday, which is believed to fall on January 8.

On previous visits, Mr Rodman spent time dining as a guest of Mr

Kim, with whom he says he has a genuine friendship, though he did not meet Mr Kim on his third trip.

Mr Rodman, however, said he

will not interfere in the country's politics.

Mr Vasu confirmed by email that the complex had been acquired by one of the hotel owners in the Accor Group, but

added that "we don't yet know what he has in plan for this hotel".

Robinson Department Store, Accor, the world's leading which closed at about the same hotel operator and market leader

in Europe, is present in 92 countries with more than 3,500 hotels and 450,000 rooms which include high-end names like Novotel, Sofitel and Pullman.

In Thailand it operates 50 properties with a total of 11,840 rooms, according to its website. These include: three Sofitels, five Pullman, five MGallery boutique hotels, twelve Novotel, nine Mercure, nine Ibis, three Ibis Styles, as well as four unbranded properties.

Mr Vasu has promised to inform the *Gazette* as soon as possible as to the owner's plans for the complex.



So near and yet so far

ASIA'S resort property scene is not unlike any other industry, in that it's always on the lookout for the next big thing. What do they say about the key to success — location location location. Is that one or three? Perhaps there is just an echo in the room or the snoring of an elephant next door.

Of course there remain other options than following the pack, you can always be a pioneer. In the old west, the perils of heading off alone into new territory often resulted in a barrage of deadly arrows aimed in your direction. Fatal? You bet. What real estate investors need to mimic is no different than following in the heels of the Microsoft/Bill Gates strategy and draft your way to prosperity in the wake of the more daring and often times less successful.

Whether you are in Phuket, Bali or elsewhere, tracking down the smart real estate market is no easy feat. One great example of speculation which backfired in the short term is the Natai area of southern Phang Nga, just over the bridge. In what was hailed to be the next Phuket, with high profile projects such as Richard Li's redevelopment of the 1,000 rai Thai Muang golf course into a mixed use world -class destination resort. Nearby were planned hotels branded to global brands such as Ritz-Carlton and the term "the Hamptons of Asia" came into vogue.

All of this quickly changed when government planning legislation effectively killed the deal with onerous restrictions on commercial areas from Thai Muang to the very southern tip of Phang Nga. Developers hit the snooze switch and things turned very quiet.



Track down to Bali and southern Lombok which for more years than I can remember has been touted to be the next big thing with the mega-development Mandalika Resort Development. This was to have become the next Nusa Dua and is managed by BTDC which has successfully driven the former in south Bali to great success. Today, the progress is just starting to gain momentum but the whispers remain as to how long will it take to get into the ground.

But like the stories of the pioneers, we are now entering a stage where both Bali and Phuket have firmly moved into the category of urban resort destinations and there is a defined number of new projects going beyond the boundaries of the big two.

A good case in point is that many industry types are facing the introduction of new, more liberal development guidelines in southern Phang Nga, which are currently in draft form but could be implemented in the first half of 2014. We have already seen Thai listed developer Charn Issara announce a new project in the area, after their successful Sri Panwa estate has fared well in terms of both property and hospitality success.

Over in Phi Phi, the Beach project, which will be branded by Bugatti, is on the radar. While further afield Centara has recently done a large deal in Krabi at the Pelican development. With a bridge under construction in nearby Koh Lanta that spans at least one island, the island is seeing a new rise of activity as well.

Down south, the deep deep south of Bali over the equator a similar transformation is taking place – pushing out of the urbanizing posh southern area. There is an outer island vibe pushing property transactions higher and higher in Nusa Lembongan, the three main Gili's and into Lombok itself.

One good example of the trend is the Latitude 8.1 Property Group with their hotel branded project just near Sengiggi. Noted green architect Charlie Hearn has designed well thought out modern pool villas with some excellent ideas on sustainability. As we have seen in Phuket, investment type buyers are the key movers in the resort grade space and in this case Latitude has enlisted the Archipelago chain's Royal Kamuela brand to spur sales.

I spoke to Dan Miller who heads up Jones Lang LaSalle in Bali and his comment is that the


project has been selling with great success on the back of a trio of divers – it's priced right from US\$ 400,000 up, has a dynamic ocean view and a known hotel operator.


As for those who are looking to get off the beaten path, the best



Seks' party interrupted

THIS year's Red Cross Fair ended on a bitter note, with incidents of lethal violence near the fairgrounds and a political protest that prevented one of Thailand's most famous rock stars from taking the stage (see page 2).

The last-minute cancellation of a scheduled performance by Sek Loso left scores of excited fans deeply disappointed, once again demonstrating that Phuket is "all in" on the disturbing trend of protesting to achieve collective socio-political and economic goals rather than relying on the rule of law, the foundations of which crumble with each successful protest.

This year's Red Cross Fair at Saphan Hin, by far the largest event of its kind on the island, appeared even larger than those held in previous years. We hope the organizing committee will look into all the problems that blemished this year's edition and take steps to prevent similar occurrences in the future. Though admittedly there is little the group could have done to prevent the protesters from sacking a key act on the final Saturday night, there are several other details that once shored up will make a huge difference for everyone attending the event.

Among the growing pains noted was that the scale of the event this year apparently made it necessary to extend the booth and exhibition area out onto the main road that runs to the tip of Saphan Hin, causing one of the worst traffic and parking problems the area has seen since the Songkran Festival last year.

With thousands of families arriving to enjoy the fair, the roadside booths forced parents with young children to brave walking in the street to reach the main event area.

Perhaps the best indication that the event had grown beyond the capacity of the venue was on the final night, when the featured Thai pop band playing on the main stage with a deafeningly loud sound system competed head on with a second large stage set up about 50 meters away, hosting a transgender cabaret show.

We have no doubt that this conflict of interest, between the desire to grow and the desire to produce a quality fair, has been noted by the Red Cross Society committee members and will be taken into account during next year's planning.

However, what is deeply concerning and remains unknown is how the protesters will continue to impose their will on their fellow islanders.

Just last month they blockaded all but one MP candidate from registering for the controversial February 2 national elections (see page 4), and though this action did not seem particularly democratic, it was a political action within a political sphere. To have these protesters expand their influence to something as good-willed as the Red Cross Fair is a very different matter.

Stricter penalties will deter thieves

First PERSON

RIGHT now, I do everything I can think of to protect my shop from thieves. I rely on the police, but only in the aftermath of a robbery - they can't prevent a theft from happening.

There's just one thing I'd like to see that I think would help prevent robberies: the government should stiffen penalties for theft.

The current penalty – six years in jail – is not a strong enough deterrent. Imagine this: A thief steals a million baht and spends it. Then he's caught and goes to court. The sentence is six years, but if he confesses, he can get it reduced by up to three years.

So here's someone who in a few minutes can get the same amount of money it takes other people six years or more to earn, and the price he has to pay is just three years in jail. And we, the gold shop owners, are out the money – is that fair?

You might think we can cover our losses with insurance, but actually it's not worth it. We have to pay 30,000 baht to insure 2mn baht ers and staff also adds to in property. I have more than 100mn baht of gold in my stores, so I'd have to pay 1.5mn baht for insurance each year. If you run a shop [with this volume of stock] for 40 years, as I have, that's going to total more than 60 million baht.

I think we're better off protecting ourselves.

Everyone thinks about CCTV, but there are a lot of other factors we consider to make our shops

safe. The first thing is choosing a safe location. The best locations are in busy areas, in city settings or areas where there are a lot of pedestrians.

Then we need to be careful about who comes in and how they come in. We use a remote control to operate the door; that lets us screen customers before they enter. I've told my staff again and again to be very careful about admitting people who are wearing jackets, sunglasses, hats or face masks

Having bars between custom-

As for hiring a security guard, that's a double-edged sword. A good security guard can be a great help, but a bad one can be a real problem. The pool of really capable security guards in Phuket is pretty small. It seems to be a profession that attracts people who don't know what else to do, or who aren't qualified for other jobs.

CCTV and alarms are of course

very important. We set up CCTV cameras to cover the entire shop, and also the parking area in front of the shop. With these we can provide police important evidence to investigate and prosecute thieves. Alarms should be connected to the police so they can respond immediately if there's a

It would be great if police patrolled around gold shops often, but I understand they just don't have the manpower for this. The number of officers isn't even enough for our real population. Add to that the fact that we're a world-famous tourist destination, which brings problems of its own that the police have to deal with. And there are about 120 gold shops in Phuket; we can't expect police to prevent robberies.

The only aspect of the safety equation that can be improved is stiffening penalties. For example, if the law said that thieves would have their hands cut off, or something worse, that would make people more afraid to steal.

Monster, shmonster

I OPERATED very large trucks, buses, cranes and earth-moving vehicles for more years than I care to remember, in various countries including Austria – whose mountain passes make "monster" Patong Hill look like a pimple on an elephant – and Australia, in giant mines in the northwest.

The cardinal rule for going downhill is: Let your engine help retard your speed. That means shift down through the gears before it's too late.

I am truly amazed at the frequency of vehicles – mainly buses – losing control on Patong Hill. It begs the question: Where and how do the drivers of these vehicles get their licenses to operate these vehicles? Innocent people's lives depend on the experience, capability and knowledge of the guy behind the wheel.

Have the drivers had any mechanical tuition? Do they know what makes the damn thing work? That is, do they understand the braking mechanism, the gearbox – yes, even on automatics you can shift down, and should - or the engine vacuum retarder?

I understand the average holiday-maker coming here doesn't

Phuket traffic law: rights for right lane the same for all

Phuket City Traffic Police Inspector Rungrit Rattanapagdee replies:

Trucks are allowed to use the right-hand lane only under certain circumstances - to pass other vehicles or to avoid obstructions in the left lane. If they are not doing these things, by law they should be in the left lane.

This rule applies to all vehicles. The right-hand lane should be used only for passing or if the left lane

Of course, there are exceptions. You may use the right lane if you are making a right turn, for example.

But the fine for using the right lane outside of these circumstances is 200 to 1,000 baht.

Discounting the time, not the crime

Phuket Chief Public Prosecutor Chiengsaean Panhya replies:

The main benefit of turning yourself in is this: it makes it easier to get out on bail while you are awaiting trial.

What gives you a better chance of getting a reduced sentence is confessing to your crime, to the police or in court.

Thai judges have the authority to reduce sentences by up to 50 per cent, based on "extenuating circumstances". The judge will consider all the information in the case, including whether a suspect vided police with useful more than one-half. information and so forth.

However, a judge can also increase sentences. He may do this, for example, if the convicted person had committed the same crime before

If a criminal committed the same crime before but confessed, the judge would consider both facts when deciding what sentence to hand down.

Judges' sentencing discretion is stated in Section 78 of the Thai Penal Code: Whenever it appears that there exists an extenuating circumstance, whether or not there be an increase or reduction of the punishment according to the provisions of this Code or the other law, the Court may, if it is suitable, reduce the punishment to be

Phuket Blood Bank's vaults low

Rh negative blood needed to meet the festive season high demand

Following the Phuket 10 Days of Danger the Phuket Regional Blood Center (PRBC) scrambles to boost low stocks of Rhesus-negative blood, calling on blood donors to come forward and save lives this holiday season.

"We have no AB- blood in stock at all," PRBC Chief Pornthip Rattajak told the Phuket Gazette. "We have a lot of visitors on the island, which increases the likelihood of road accidents. The demand for blood over the holiday period is 30 per cent more than the average demand – we need to be prepared," Chief Pornthip said. "We need all blood types, but we especially need Rhesusnegative [Rh-] blood. We just don't have enough of it."

Rhesus negative blood is a common blood type for foreigners, but not Thais. "Phuket is a tourism destination, so we need to stock a lot of Rh- blood to prepare for tourists in need," she added.

Donations can be made at the PRBC office on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 8:30am to 4:30pm; Tuesdays and Thursdays from 8:30am to 8pm; and on Saturday and Sunday from 9am to 3pm.



Party till you drop

Many people hit the bottle during the New Year festivities, but sometimes the bottle hits back. Luckily, help is just a call away. The Gazette reports.

PHUKET is renowned for its party scene, especially during the holidays, when tourists venture from around the globe to enjoy the island's nightlife, and expats let their hair down.

For many people, the annual revelry is marked by a few heavy drinking sessions followed by a few hangovers - and a new year resolution to take it easier next year. For some, however, the festive season likely marked a series of binges that progressed from drunken stupor to blackouts.

"Not remembering what you 'Those on their way to did the night bedeveloping a serious fore is a serious drinking problem have no indicator of a drinking probidea - or will not admit lem," explained that they drink much more Phuket one than the people they are member Alcoholics partying with' Anonymous (AA), the global

organization that has more than two million members worldwide.

"Blackouts tend to frighten normal people into cutting down how much they drink, but if the person keeps drinking to the point that they cannot remember what they did the night before, then they might consider seeking help," he added.

Many people over-indulge during the holidays, and many of these people might be heavy drinkers. That does not mean these people have a drinking problem, the member explained.

"What has proved to be a clear sign of a progression towards alcoholism is the inability to stop after a few drinks. Once a person cannot stop, despite all the promises they make to themselves and to loved ones, they are already displaying alcoholic behavior," he said.

Worse, usually those on their way to developing a serious drinking problem have no idea – or will not admit – that they drink much more than the people they are partying with.

"This is what makes it very dif-

ficult for people to recognize they might have a drinking problem," another AA member said.

Those who do see the progression much more clearly, however, are

those who are subjected to watching it reduce their loved ones to mere shadows of their former selves.

WHAT TO DO ABOUT IT

The first rule is to never be angry and to not directly confront a potential alcoholic.

"Treat them as a sick person. Let them raise the issue, then at least the person you are concerned about has admitted there is a problem," explained one Phuket AA member who has been sober for more than 15 years.

"This could be something as simple as them talking about how much they drank, whether they remember or not, or even just complaining about their hangover. Then at least you can discuss these aspects," he said.

Of course, a concerned person can contact AA in Phuket or Al-Anon, the support group for people living with alcoholics.

"AA does not do interventions, but members will talk to the person if the person agrees," one AA elder said.

"It is also strongly suggested that the concerned person come to a meeting to learn more about alcoholism and AA before taking steps to help the person they are worried about," he added.

"Every meeting in Phuket is an 'open' meeting, meaning that anyone interested in AA may attend, even if just to hear our stories and how we stopped drinking.

"One wife came to a Phuket AA meeting and ended up going home to tell her partner: 'I went to an AA meeting today, and I saw half your buddies there ... 'Some people are very surprised who are alcoholics in recovery and are now living happy, sober lives," he said.

If AA seems an appropriate suggestion, leave an AA leaflet around the house. "Just leave it lying around, some Phuket members got sober this way. Help could be this simple," was the advice.

But if recurring drinking bouts keep resulting in dire circumstances, taking a hard line against specific behaviors may be required. "Never clean up their messes and don't make excuses for them. If the boss calls asking why he or she isn't at work – tell them the truth," one well-experienced AA member advised.

Setting parameters for some behaviors might seem absurd, but they may well be needed for drinkers beyond the pail.

"Be very clear about breaking promises. If the person cannot adhere to a promise made, then there must be some consequence. It might be as simple as: 'You've done it again, so now you go to an AA meeting, or give up drinking for two months, or go see a doctor' -

this can be whatever is agreed, but stick to it," one AA member urged.

Seeing a doctor can drive the point home. Test results that prove the liver has sustained severe damage from prolonged heavy drinking is usually hard to argue, he added.

"If the person can control his or her drinking, then all well and good. They are probably just a heavy drinker, not an alcoholic, and we take our hat off to them.

"But if drinking remains a problem, the consequences usually become more severe. For one AA member, the wife took the kids and the passports and moved out of the house. If the drinking stopped or the member sought help, then the wife and kids would be nearby to provide support

'He did stop, after joining AA. That was more than 14 years ago and the couple have been happily married since," he added.





How time flies, it is now three years since I composed a list of the "Top Twenty" flowering plants. The hibiscus came in, perhaps rather arbitrarily, at number ten. Most enthusiasts would rate it more highly: certainly on looks alone. H. sinensis, the best known species, is not easily upstaged. Its familiar, showy, trumpet-

shaped flowers come in almost every color under the sun. Visit your local garden center and you will find small plants already displaying spectacular blooms in luminous shades of red, yellow, magenta, orange and white. Many consider the hibiscus to be the tropical flower par excellence, noting that its red blooms are traditionally worn in the hair by eligible Tahitian maidens.

H. sinensis is frequently employed in Phuket as a hedge, since it is a woody shrub, robust enough to form a tall barrier. And its propensity to flower most of the year round gives it an advantage over most of its rivals. If it has a disadvantage as a candidate for hedging, it is because the ovate or toothed leaves are somewhat sparse and a hibiscus screen is not always very dense. One variegated variety which has leaves in shades of pink, white and green, is often preferred for this purpose. It has a more compact habit, prunes readily and has smaller but vibrant red flowers. The unusual

The strains have often been developed in Florida or Hawaii (with names such as "Blue Bayou" or "Hula Girl") and are not quite right for this climate. Maybe they would do better as carefully tended

Dry season etiquette for healthy plants

Later than usual, the dry season is finally upon us. As a consequence, the ground is rapidly drying out and becoming hard and unworkable. So daily watering is needed, especially for newly transplanted specimens, for most grassy areas, and for container plants. Soak pots and other containers thoroughly, then allow the soil to become almost dry before another watery application. Porous pots will need more water than glazed,

plastic or concrete ones because of higher levels of evaporation.

Continuous direct sunlight suits certain shrubs: euphorbias, neriums, bougainvilleas, ixoras

and adeniums. These will only require water in droughts and will bloom more abundantly in dry conditions. Pereskias, jasmines and gardenias also thrive in full sunlight, but need moist soil. At the other end of the spectrum are plants that will need frequent watering and some protection, even in open ground. These include all the ginger family, canna lilies, heliconias and the currently fashionable lilac-hued ruellia.



PIPER Kerman's memoir *Orange is the New Black* (Spiegel & Grau, New York, 2011, 327pp) is a charming and tender account of her year in prison. The focus is on her fellow inmates with whom she comes to share a hard-earned solidarity of love and respect.

Now a popular TV mini-series



in the US, Orange is the New Black takes place in the women's minimum security prison at Danbury, Connecticut. Half the inmates are Latinas (or "Spanish" as they prefer), the other half are divided equally between black and white.

Most are low level, nonviolent drug offenders. They are loosely segregated into three dorms. "A Dorm was known as 'the Suburbs', B Dorm was dubbed 'the Ghetto' and C Dorm was 'Spanish Harlem'." In time the author would move smoothly among them, settling in B Dorm with her "bunkie", a respected Jamaican baker known as "Miss Malcolm".

Thirty-four years old, a blondhaired, blue-eyed graduate of Smith, Piper Kerman surrenders at Danbury for the crime of being a cash courier for a drug ring on a flight from Chicago to Brussels. In 1994 she was the lesbian lover of the ringleader, partying in Europe and Asia. She escapes to San Francisco, meets her fiance Larry and is settled in New York five years later when federal customs agents come knocking on her door. Drug conspiracy charges percolate for another five years till she turns up

But under the tutelage of her new friends - Pop, Nina, Annette, Jae, Little Janet, Yoga Janet, Miss Malcolm – she learns how to do time. Construction work, endless laps around the running track. and yoga classes render her physically and mentally fit. She lives for visits, weekly with Larry, bi-weekly with her mother and often with friends who bring her books, lots of books.

Kerman is a graceful writer, providing thumbnail portraits of the friends she comes to rely on: wife of a Russian gangster, Pop ran the prison kitchen. "Pop was a source of wonder and mystery

at Danbury for a plea-bargained sentence of 15 months.

Danbury is hardly a "gladiator school" prison rife with violence and rape. Still the mind-numbing routines, drudgery, petty rules, noise, overcrowding, starchy food and sullen authority of the guards come as a shock to the new inmate, #11187-424.

"It was a weird place, the all-female society with a handful of strange men, the militarystyle living, the predominant "ghetto" vibe (both urban and rural) through a female lens, the mix of every age from silly young girls to old grandmas, all thrown together with varying levels of tolerance. Crazy concentrations of people inspire crazy behavior."

and revelation... who would help me do my time in every sense of the word, who would baby me when I needed it most and tell me to suck it up and get tough when there was no other option."

'Miss Malcolm had the respect of everyone in B Dorm and as I was clearly not going to give her any trouble, she seemed to take to me too. Despite her reserve and discretion, she had a dry but lively sense of humor and treated me to her sharp, sidelong observations on our daily life in B Dorm: "You in the Ghetto now, bunkie!"

"Camilla glowed with health and radiated beauty, tall, slim, with a glossy black mane, tawny brown skin, a pointed chin and

huge dark eyes, she was always laughing, loudly."

Yoga Janet was another middle class drug criminal, fifty-ish, tall, fair and striking: "a world traveler, a classic eco-peacenik intellectual, a fitness fanatic and yoga expert and a devout Buddhist possessed of a wry sense of humor, all incredibly welcome attributes..."

Other friends range from Sister Platte, a pacifist nun, to Vanessa, a 6'4" transsexual diva. Piper misses them all badly when, near the end of her sentence, she's transferred via Con Air to grim impersonal jails in Oklahoma City and Chicago where she makes a final court appearance.

But at last she is out on the street where Larry is waiting for her. "And then I was running, as fast as I could. No one could stop me."

IT'S almost a defining characteristic of an expat, not wanting to go where the tourists go. Hey, we know better. We know the best local restaurants, the shortcuts, the secret beaches. We refuse to be wedged among the throngs.

And yet, in some cases the throngs have got it right. Not with the cashew-factory perhaps (at least, not more than once) but with destinations like nearby Racha Island.

It's beautiful, is why, with white sand and clear blue water that make you happy just to look at them. It has intimate bays, a vast jungly interior, hiking trails, buffalos and butterflies, and when the daytrippers aren't there, a village feeling. And it's just half an hour from Chalong.

So how to avoid the crowds? It's pretty simple. Stay off the beach at Batok Bay, on the west side, between 10 and 4, and don't go to the restaurants mid-island at lunchtime, when the daytrippers are eating their buffet lunches.

You'll find the rest of Koh Racha mostly empty – the four other lovely bays less than a 15-minute walk away, the sandy paths crisscrossing the island, the hiking trails on the headlands.

The best approach is to stay overnight. Enjoy swimming and snorkeling at Batok in the early morning, and when the speedboats start pulling up to the pontoon jetty, either retire to the Raya Family local caf to watch the troops advance, or decamp.

You've got lots of choices for what to do next. Want more watersports? Head for the other bays. Alun's watersports has kayaks for rent at the east end of Siam Bay, local dive shops offer quick "Discover Scuba" courses, and freediving instruc-

tion is available too. Or go fishing from the rocks or a longtail.

One of my favorite things to do is walk. Paths tend to meander in a circular way, so it's not easy to get lost, and the trails on the northern headlands offer lovely sea glimpses. Since most visitors focus on the beaches, you'll have these routes mostly to yourself, shared only with the occasional skittish monitor lizard.

Koh Racha has been in the news lately for failure of some local businesses to properly dispose of wastewater and garbage. You may see dirty water in a stream inland, a garbage dump, or, here and there, a pile of construction material.

But for the most part, the island remains extremely lovely, and the development isn't all bad – it brought espresso, after all – at Rachaya Coffee in the little city center mid-island, now up





A narrow escape from the rat-race to take a plunge in Phuket

A WOMAN stands at the edge of one of the enormous limestone cliffs of Etretat, the salty Dutch air whipping her blond hair across her face. She's been in the banking industry for 10 years and it's come to this: make a down payment on a house back in the UK and pay the mortgage for years to come,

or roll up her financial nest-egg and take the plunge. Stephanie Holland jumped – splashing into Phuket as a new dive instructor, a new solo business owner and a single woman in

the dodgy red-taped, under-the-table business world of Thailand.

"I saw a little dive shop up for sale for about the same deposit as my supposed deposit for a house and I went hmmm... I could go be sensible, or go be rather stupid," Stephanie of Ocean Geo Diving and Tours admits, after having successfully weathered her second low season in Phuket.

"I had rose tinted spectacles on when I went out to do this... I just saw potential, my feet were not as firm on the ground as they should have been. I love the coffee shop though," she says.

Right, Stephanie landed in Phuket, got the keys to a struggling

dive shop, and decided to open a cafe on the side.

"The premise: you have a dive center and a class room, and you have somewhere to come chill out with a great deck at the front. I could just see it being a nice comfy area, and the two businesses would just bounce off of each other."

Despite the optimism, giving up an established career in the banking industry, giving up a well-grounded, happy life in Amsterdam and trading it all in for a dream flung far to the east was not a snap decision. "Did I want

to turn my hobby

and my passion, something I do

maybe twice a year, but on fantastic levels – the best diving you can get – into an every day job, and potentially hate it? Did I want to move to an Asian country as a single woman

trying to run a business solo?" she asked herself. "I certainly wanted the challenge."

It was a debate a six-month debate.

"I got access to the PADI Pro site when I became an instructor and I never really thought until then that the dream could become a reality," she said.

However, the dream swept in like a flash flood. There was no handover phase, Stephanie, relying on good advice from those who cared, such as Rene Balot of

Sea Fun Divers, scrambled to learn the ropes.

"I literally got the keys. I didn't know who my phone provider was; I didn't know how to pay the electricity; I didn't know if I was going to get the internet cut off; I didn't know which bills had been paid, I didn't know where the insurance policy was – so every aspect you can think of was kind of a learning curve, which made the first three months a bit of a blur," Stephanie recalls.

Such overwhelming odds

seem to be even more heavily weighted for tragedy then the Greek would allow. But tenacity is now bearing fruit, she admits.

"The first year financially was pretty much break even, which for me, was 'okay, I can do better, but that's actually not too bad."

This year, Stephanie's bench mark is getting return customers. Both customers loyal to Ocean Geo Diving and Tours before she took over, new customers and previous colleagues from a lifetime ago.

With Phuket an international hub en route to Singapore, Hong Kong and Sydney – the major business centers in Asia – those of the corporate world that Stephanie managed to escape are becoming regular customers.

"I've gone from earning a decent salary in the banking industry to spending about 200 baht on myself a day to eat and sleep and that's about it. So that's been a big shift mentally,"

"However, I properly dropped myself in the deep end and swam."

Merchant of the Orient: no regrets

Heart-to-heart with a legendary Phuket entrepreneur

"THIS Thailand, you farang!" Perhaps it's that simple for many fainthearted foreigners struggling to justify distorting dreams for selfmade financial freedom in the "Land of No Surprises"; but for one Phuket expat, entrepreneurial legend, the plot turned out to be a tad thicker. Anyone doing business in Phuket – or even just entertaining the prospect – should definitely read Don Battle's autobiography Merchant of the Orient (see end info).

From his poor farm-boy roots in the Alabama boonies, tours with the US Air Force and 24-hour shifts as a rocket scientist during the post Cold War space-race era - leading up to his American heyday inventing, consulting and

contracting for the global energy sector, Don's story ultimately ends up in Thailand – right here in Phuket where he would set the bar for the island's expat-run SMEs. This, despite prevailing "foreigner-phobia" sentiments and regulations that seemingly make it impossible if not

greatly limit the opportunities for non-Thai entrepreneurs to gain momentum for success, Don did it – then retired to write his book about it. Inspired by his story, the Phuket Gazette followed up with Don, who currently resides in Thailand's North.

As a foreigner doing business in Thailand, what would you say are some of the biggest challenges/ obstacles you faced - and that other expat entrepreneurs may likely face? How did you overcome these challenges?

Corruption: As a minority we are confronted and competing with corruption. We don't have the money to pay the corrupt purchasing officers and others. Even if we did, one week it's enough and the next week, they'll want more. I have had great difficulty running my engineering and food businesses and not paying 'tea money'. Why would someone want to buy from me if I don't pay while their friends and relatives do? This held me back greatly, or perhaps it saved me from destruction. I think that it saved me.

Government and public attitude towards products and services provided by foreigners: I must say that government policies and regulations were never a problem for me in 30 years of doing business in Thailand.

> As a matter of fact it is much easier here than the USA. Licenses, work permits and other things involving the government have been easy for me. But whether you believe it or not, a lot of racism exists in Thailand and this is a big obstacle in doing business across the board. If you are selling

engineering technology like I did for many years, the racism is erased by what you have to offer. I noticed this a lot in the village that I live in now. Chiang Rai is not like Bangkok. Bangkok is a lot easier to do business than other provinces.

Staffing. No matter where you are, staffing is always a big problem. I used to think that education for your staff was the answer to part of this problem. I spent millions on education of staff and never got anything in return. However, I am happy that I did what I could

for education. It is something that no one can steal from you.


Thai women operate Thailand's service sector. As a rule you cannot get Thai men to work in the service sector. Money is not the answer to a stable staff – happiness in the work place, which includes associates and business owners are. Frequent meetings are important but it is hard to get staff members to freely express themselves during the meetings. I always provided housing and food for staff members and this helped to keep a more stable staff. When a major holiday comes, you have to ask for volunteers to stay and work while others go back home. By doing this, you will have a small working staff during Songkran and New Years. I am not sure that I ever found the answer to stable staff as I had a reasonable turnover.

Pilferage and taking without permission was a major problem for me in the retail business. Even with security systems in place, I was never able to overcome these problems.

I never overcame a lot of the obstacles. I am a fluent Thai speaker, I read and write in Thai. The big difference is that I am not a Thai and I can never be one. I am also a Christian and not a Buddhist. The superstition and black magic has always been difficult for me to understand and deal with.

What little success that I have achieved comes from working night and day. I was objective and work-focused on my mission and

I made a serious mistake by having four different businesses in four different provinces where I had to entrust billing and collection to local staff. I lost a ton of money through this serious mistake. I tried to stay about five days in each location with rotation but I could never overcome this prob-

lem. Working during the day and flying at night can make an old man out of you in a hurry. It finally got the best of me.

I thought that getting married would relieve me of some of the burdens of doing business but it did not. Very seldom will a Thai take a position of a farang over a Thai... I guessed it wrong.

You successfully secured a substantial business loan from a Thai bank, which enabled you to expand your operations to a considerable degree. In your opinion, what were some of the main factors as to why you were able to secure such a loan as a foreigner?

First, I never wanted to leave the small successful cafe that I had on Sai Yuan Road in Rawai. My greedy landlord wanted to open up their own Don's and would not renew my lease. They tried and failed. After being in the food business for three years, I could see the potential in Phuket and Rawai. This motivated me to build a good and classy food and entertainment mall just down the road.

I thought that my chances of the Thai banks loaning me money was no more than 50 per cent. At this time Samree Moothong was my manager and girlfriend. She was a great asset to me in preparing for the loan and making the application. She also co-signed the loan with me. You might say that I did not do this without good Thai help. I did an extensive business plan with five-year cash flow projections. I had also included my past three years of successful performance in the plan. I had the business plan translated to Thai. I also used the services of Sam Fauma's International Law firm to help me. Eddie Farmer from Phuket helped me a lot in my business plan and business development.

In addition to the business plan, I made a scale model of the entire mall with removable roof sections so that the inside could be seen. I made appointments with the local heads of the banks and presented my business plan. I made my presentation in Thai. Most were overwhelmed, as they had never seen a business plan let alone a scale model of the project. You can imagine how they felt with a farang making the presentation.

After making the presentation and application to SCB, Kbank and Bangkok Bank, I heard from Kbank quickly. I had two rai of land paid for which was worth a lot. My loan application was for six million baht. Kbank came and measured the land and asked me some questions. I later went to the bank and signed the loan application; 29 days after application, the bank called me and said that the loan committee in Bangkok had approved the loan.

What advice can you give to other aspiring, expat entrepreneurs considering applying for a business loan from a Thai bank?

Try to find a business where the product or service is unique and everyone is not already doing it. Stay away from the bar business. When applying for a loan, you need to have good collateral for the bank to attach. A good staff of Thai managers is also needed.

If you could go back in time, what would you do differently in terms of doing business in Thai-

I don't think that I would change anything. I depended on a lot of good advice from customers and friends to make the right decisions.

As the Merchant of the Orient, do of retirement, at least partially? Surely, you're not "fading away" just yet?

I've been working on my second book, Lost in Bangkok for 30 years. Because of my age, I am not able to do much more than fishing and vegetable farming in Chiang Rai. I'm working with some Buddhist monks to help them with learning English.

IF YOU have been past the British International School Phuket (BISP) campus in recent weeks, chances are you've spotted the giant steel ship, Ixdos, that first appeared on December 4 and now occupies a prominent position on the school's grounds. The arrival of the ship is a result of the collaboration between former BISP teacher and self-described "boatperson" Patrick Vickers and a group of student council members who share his dream of launching a "mission ship".

Patrick Vickers is indeed a man on a mission – his decade-long

The idea was spawned during his work as a health systems analyst in Papua New Guinea, where he witnessed first hand the dreadful condition of people living without access to modern medical care. These dire circumstances are far from being unique to Papua New Guinea - according to UNICEF "about

five (21 every minute) die every day, mainly from preventable causes."

"As I was moving around in this amazing country, I found so much sickness, and [especially on] all these islands," Pat recalls.

Inspired to do something to help, Pat combined his boatbuilding skills and historical knowledge and hatched a plan to create a modern day "mission ship" to bring healthcare to these long-suffering islanders.

"I was in the navy for five years and I was always a nutter for the sailing boats, not the motor boats. So I've had a sailing background and I've had several boats before.



When completed, the 60-foot lxdos will be a fully equipped floating medical clinic.

"What they used to have were mission ships, with pastors and doctors going around [and] doing everything, but they don't have them anymore, as they can't afford them. So I thought why not turn back the clock and get a new mission ship to do this job?"

So it was, that Pat embarked on his own mission. Starting from scratch with plans supplied by renowned Australian naval architect Bruce Roberts, he sourced steel and materials and began

building the sturdy hull of *Ixdos*. It has been a slow process though, with Pat relying on sporadic donations and his pension to fund the build. Pat has also had much help over the years from BISP students, who donate their labor to the project as part of the school's IB Community Action Service (CAS) volunteer program.

Now, ten years after the first plate of steel for Ixdos arrived in Phuket, a group of BISP student councilors have initiated a plan to complete the ship in one year – an ambitious and daunting goal. The ship was initially housed (at no cost) at the yard of Khun Luk, and later at Thai Marine, next door to

> the Phuket Gazette office. Recently, with the generous help of the parents of a student, the ship-inprogress has been moved from a nearby shipbuilding yard to the BISP campus. The members of the student council say that getting the ship on the school grounds was a key step toward building the momentum and enthusiasm

needed to complete the ship in such an ambitious timeline.

Now, sitting on the lawn of the school, students, staff, parents and visitors alike have a daily reminder of the project and its worthy goals. The student councilors, many of them former students of Pat's, are also excited about the practical skills and experience they and their fellow students can gain while working on the boat – and as some of them are keen sailors already, they hope they will get their chance to sail on *Ixdos* when she is completed.

"I think because we've worked with Mr Vickers for so long, he's part of the school and the community here, so we felt we would like to step up and help him," says BISP Head Boy Luke Phillips.

"It has been estimated to finish this boat we will need at least five million baht. It will be a big

effort, so our motto is to 'push the boat out'," he added.

There is still much to do however, even when the boat is completed it will need to be crewed and stocked with medical supplies before setting off on its maiden voyage. Pat said he has received in-principle support from UNICEF, to help supply vital vaccines and medical equipment, but the logistics of this will need to be organized when the ship is seaworthy.


"In the meantime though, the main objective is to get the boat done – right now we're about 60 per cent finished but we have yet to get a generator, the sails... a lot of biggies," says Pat.

With the arrival of the ship

on campus, generous offers of assistance by the school community have been forthcoming, including one parent who has offered to supply a teak deck. It is hoped that every member of the school community, having learned about the mission ship, will do their small part to help it succeed.

Pat said he hopes former students, who have helped build the ship, will one day be able to live aboard and take part in its mission to bring aid to remote communities.







NFL: Colts, Chargers survive wild card round

NATIONAL Football League fans who burned the midnight oil watching last weekend's four "wild card" playoff games were well rewarded, as all four games were amazing – quite possibly the best weekend of NFL action ever.

The first game saw an incredible come-from-behind win by the Indianapolis Colts over the visiting Kansas City Chiefs. Colts QB Andrew Luck, the former Heisman Trophy and first pick in the draft two years ago, looked really shaky early on, finding his team down by what appeared to be an insurmountable 38-10 deficit early in the third quarter.

But Luck never lost his composure, instead playing like a man possessed in the hurry up of-

the air and on the ground, including several runs of his own.

A 64-yard pass to Indy receiver AY Hilton tied the game at 44-44 with just over a minute left before veteran place keeper Adam Vinatieri iced the game with the point after attempt.

With the win, Luck and company won the right to travel to Foxborough to take on archrivals The New England Patriots this weekend (8:15am Sunday, January 12. Phuket time on CBS)

In the other AFC wild card game, Philip Rivers and the San Diego Chargers handed the Cincinnati Bengals their first home loss of the season, 27-10, knocking them out of the playoffs in the process and gaining the right to take on top-rated Denver at Mile High Stadium on

fense, hurting the Chiefs both in Sunday, January 13 (4:40am on monday, Phuket time on CBS).

> Over in the NFC matchups, San Francisco 49ers quarterback Colin Kaepernick led his team to a tight 23-20 win over the Green Bay Packers on the frozen tundra at Lambeau Field. Kaepernick completed 227 yards in passing, but his deadliest weapon was his feet, giving the Packers defense fits with a total of 98 yards on the ground.

Rodman says N Korea visit could help 'open door'

AMERICAN basketball star Dennis Rodman defended his latest visit to North Korea in an interview with broadcaster CNN on Tuesday, saying it would help "open the door" to the reclusive state.

Rodman, speaking during his fourth trip to the country, expressed "love" for leader Kim Jong Un and claimed his controversial trip was a "great idea for the world."

Rodman and a team of fellow former NBA stars will hold basketball games in the North Korean capital, Pyongyang, to mark Kim's birthday, which is believed to fall on Wednesday, though this has never been officially confirmed.

The games come just weeks after Kim's powerful uncle Jang Song Thack was purged and executed. South Korean president Park Geun-hye has described recent events in North Korea as a

"reign of terror."

During the interview, the former NBA star also appeared to question the activities of Korean-American missionary Kenneth Bae, who has been held in North Korea on charges of crimes against the state since May last year.

"If you understand what Kenneth Bae did Do you understand what he did in this country? Why is he held captive in this country?" Rodman said.

Rodman has faced both ridicule and harsh criticism from some quarters for his trips, which some US politicians and activists view as serving only as fodder for propaganda efforts by the North Korean regime.

"This is not about me. If I can open the door a little bit, just a little bit," Rodman said. "It's all about the game. People love to do one thing – sports."

He also lamented the criticism his visits have drawn.

"It's amazing how we thrive on negativity. Does anyone know this guy's only 31 years old?" he said of Kim, whom he calls his

"Dennis, he could be 31, he could be 51," said CNN interveiwer Chris Cuomo. "He's just killed his uncle. He's holding an American hostage."

Integrated swim training bears fruit

CHIANG Mai brother and sister swim duo Tanakrit "Nok" Kittiya, 17, and Patrawadee "Ploy" Kittiya, 19, are again putting their recent intensive Phuket training to the test, looking to excel at the National Games, currently being contested in Suphanburi.

The siblings have been training at Thanyapura Phuket – Ploy since August, Nok since November last year - under the tutelege of Head Swim Coach Randy Simon in preparation for several important competions – namely, the Southeast Asian (SEA) Games, which took place last month in Myanmar; the Thailand National Games taking

place as this goes to print, and ultimately the 2016 Summer Olympics in Brazil.

Their training at Thanyapura Phuket bore its first "harvest" last month with several accomplishments at the recent SEA Games in Myanmar. Ploy won two Gold Medals (Women 4x100m Freestyle Relay, Women 200m Butterfly) and also achieved two new Thai national records (Women 4x100m Freestyle Relay, Women 200m Butterfly); She was the "Top Seed" for the Women 100m Butterfly finals, though was scratched from the finals to concentrate on the 800m Freestyle event, in which she managed a 6th Place finish.

Meanwhile, Ploy's younger brother Nok brought back a bronze medal (Men 400m Freestyle) and a new Thai national record for the Men's 4x200m Freestyle Relay.

Upon the duo's return to Phuket earlier this month, before heading to Suphanburi for the National Games, Randy remarked: "The meet was a big challenge for both Ploy and Nok, and although we had some real highs, we also had so real lows to go with them. In all, I am proud of how the they conducted themselves and how they handled the adversity... as the Olympic Creed states, 'The most important thing is not to win, but to take part. Just as the most important thing in life is not triumph, it's the struggle. The

important thing is not to have conquered, but to have fought well.' They did that... so there is nothing more I can ask of them!"

The American went on to comment on their ongoing regimen: "As Ploy and Nok are just coming off of the SEA Games competition, much of our preparations is what we call in swimming a 're-taper', which refers to a period of short but intense training, followed by a short recovery period that allows the body to adjust/recover and be stronger.'

"We are also working more with our fitness trainer, Brian Finniss, with dryland training, and continuing our consultations with Andrea [mind trainer] on ways we can hone their ability to focus and perform to the best of their ability. As part of all of this, we are taking the swimmers to the Thanymundra retreat for three days to allow us to remove distractions and complete our heaviest training," he continued.

"Along with that, we are analyzing their performances from SEA Games, and looking at adjustments that should allow them to swim even faster at the Thai National Games. We are looking to have a strong showing there and have set some high goals in a number of events that will (if all goes to plan) see them achieve top finishes and possibly another couple National Records to their tally."

Meanwhile, Thanyapura Phuket will host three elite nations for winter training this month as follows: Jan 2-18: Norway National Swim

Jan 12- Feb 1: Dutch National Swim Team (Royal Dutch Swimming Federation)

Jan 18- Feb 7: Hungary National

Reaching the ultimate goal

THE ancient martial art of Muay Thai is alive and strong, especially in Phuket, where fighters from around the world make their way to train with some of the best. The Phuket Gazette and PGTV were able to get the scoop on what's new in the island's fighting scene during a recent visit to Tiger Muay Thai gym.

Located on Soi Ta Led in Chalong, the Tiger name has become somewhat synonymous with Muay Thai and mixed martial arts (MMA) fighting. Tigersponsored fighters Mairbek Taisumov, 25, and Zubair Tukhugov, 22, are now bringing the Tiger name to another level with their accomplishments on the world famous Ultimate Fighting Championship (UFC) circuit.

Chechnyans Taisumov and Tukhugov have been training in MMA for over a year under Tiger coach Roger Huerta.

"I used to fight for the UFC. My fighting next month in Brazil, then the next

DUE TO the ongoing socialpolitical unrest in the Kingdom's capital, the Futsal Thailand Premier League (FTPL) 2014 season's planned January 25 kickoff has been postponed.

The season opener has now been tentatively set to commence in early February, an administrator

of the island's pro fivea-side footy club Phuket United has confirmed.

"The [season] start was postponed due to the political [unrest]. The season should start around February 8, but we have to monitor the situation closely," he

Asked about this year's lineup, the coordinator confirmed that the club will have at

least two foreign players in addition to a dozen confirmed Thai players.

The two foreign players are Brazilian: Returning from last season, Jackson Santos and a new player, Francisco Edson Silva de Soares."

The news of Santos' surprise resigning comes to the delight of the Andaman Pearls' 3,000-plus fanbase, who were initially disappointed after it was announced back in November that the club was not planning to re-sign the skilled Brazilian due to budget constraints.

"Action Jackson" was the club's top scorer last season with 36 goals, second in the national

league behind fellow Brazilian Ramualdo Namorato, who scored 39 goals for Si Saket.

Santos, whose wife recently gave birth to a healthy baby girl, told the Gazette that he is very excited to return to Phuket this season, and will arrive back to the island for training after January 15.

Unfortunately, Phuket United's other two Brazilian players from last season, Marcos and Jardel will not be returning to the club; Marcos was reported to have signed with Si Saket, while Jardel's Brazilian club, Amp re Futsal reportedly would not release him for loan to Phuket this season.

Santos' new Brazilian team-

mate, Francisco, nicknamed "Gugu", played for Si Saket last season, helping the club finish 3rd in the league behind Chonburi and Thai Port ahead of Bangkok and Phuket, respectively.

Looking ahead to their second season in Thailand's top futsal ranks. Phuket United are one of 12 teams to have confirmed their readiness to compete in the 2014

FTPL, sponsored by Siam Multimedia Co Ltd.

The other returning clubs include champs Chonburi (who also went on to be crowned AFC Futsal Club Champions late last year in Japan); league runners-up Thai Port; Royal Navy; Si Pathum

Si Saket; Bangkok; Nonthaburi, Samut Sakhon; Highways Department, Prachinburi, CAT as well as Samut Songkhram - who transferred their squad, locale and competition right to a newlyformed club, Ayuthaya City.

Clubs who did not confirm readiness for the 2014 FTPL include Leo Bang Seu, Lampang United, Samut Prakarn and Surat Thani FC – whose places will be substituted by four new clubs: Chiang Mai, Pattaya Arena, Khon Kaen and Uthaithani.


The former four clubs will have the option to reinstate their right to compete in the 2015 season.


