INVESTORS are re-thinking opportunities in Phuket as local government officers push to have legally established and modified multi-million-baht venues turned to rubble along Phuket's Surin Beach.

"One-and-a-half years ago I invested 1mn euros in the beach club; I believe that I did everything correctly," an investor, who asked to remain anonymous, told the *Gazette*.

"I talked to local officials and had the necessary permission to build and operate the beach club – and now I am told to pull everything down. Nobody is taking...

Island police lose one of their own to suicide

THE Phuket City Police were reeling on Tuesday morning after the death of one of their well-liked officers by suicide.

Sen Sgt Maj Sapeewat Kongchim was found in the car park of the police accommodation units behind the Provincial Police headquarters on Yaowarat Road, in Phuket Town, at 7:30am.

He had a single gunshot wound to the head. The weapon used was his .38 service revolver.

"Sgt Sapeewat was rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital, but was pronounced dead on arrival," said Lt Kraisorn Phakaree, the Phuket City Police officer assigned to investigate the case.

Officers living in the units heard a loud crash at about 4am.

"When they went outside to investigate, they saw Sgt Sapeewat walking around, so they paid no attention," Lt Kraisorn said.

"He went back to his room, and later came back down and sat on the stairs on the ground floor. Nobody thought he was thinking about suicide."

At about 7:30am, officers heard a single gunshot and then found Sgt Sapeewat slumped over a Styrofoam box under a carport

beside the building.

"Sgt Sapeewat lived on the third floor. We believe he jumped from his unit at about 4am, but the carport broke his fall and he landed on a car parked underneath it," Lt Kraisorn explained.

"We believe that since his attempt to die by jumping from the building failed, he used his gun."

Sgt Sapeewat, from Trang province, was known as a friendly man with a wife and one child.

"He was a friendly, fun person,"

said Lt Kraisorn. "He loved hanging out with friends and he helped out at the Phuket 191 emergency call center."

However, Sgt Sapeewat had tuberculosis and recently needed a lot of time off work to see doctors.

"At this stage we believe that he committed suicide because of his disease," Lt Kraisorn said.

"However, we will continue to investigate whether any other factors may have prompted him to commit suicide."

Cars crushed by tour bus with brake failure

BRAKE failure of a tour bus caused a major pile-up at the Darasamuth Intersection, near Central Festival Phuket, at about 3pm last Saturday.

"In total, 10 vehicles were damaged in the accident. The brakes on a bus failed, causing it to crash into vehicles waiting at the intersection," Wichit Police Deputy Superintendent told the *Gazette*.

"No serious injuries were reported. There were only minor injuries and damage to vehicles."

Motorists were urged to avoid the area while the wrecks were cleared from the scene.

"And please drive carefully, especially in this weather when the road is wet," said Preeyaporn Torwong of the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation Phuket office (DDPM-Phuket) after the accident.

Airport van driver facing charges drug-free

POLICE have confirmed that drug and alcohol tests ordered for a Phuket Airport van driver who hit and killed a motorcyclist last week have come back negative.

The driver, Manit Prateep Na Thalang, was saved from a mob of angry witnesses after he hit 23-year-old Jantima Srilertchalalai from behind when she reportedly braked sud-

denly halfway across a bridge about one kilometer from the British International School Phuket.

Despite the driver's claim that the bike braked suddenly, there were no skid marks at the scene of the accident.

"We tested Mr Manit for drugs and alcohol after the accident. His urine test results came back negative. However, he will still be charged with reckless

driving causing death," Maj Sakol Krainara of the Phuket City Police said.

Suwit Ngerndee, assistant manager of the Phuket Limousine and Business Service Cooperative Ltd (PBC), which operates vans and taxis at Phuket Airport, said that the company would be donating money to help cover funeral costs.

As there were no skid marks from either the bike or the van, and because witnesses had demanded to know how such an accident could have occurred in the absence of drugs or alcohol, the PBC called for an investigation into the state of the driver.

"The results came back negative, so he still works for us. He would have been fired if the results had been positive." — *Woranut Pechdee*

Tourists on 'walk-in' visa entries to get 30-day extensions

THE chief of the Phuket Immigration Office, Col Sunchai Chokkajaykij, has confirmed that his office has received an order to begin issuing extensions of up to 30 days to foreigners who enter the country on visa-exemption status.

The order is to come into effect from August 29, said Col Sunchai.

"Most foreigners entering Thailand on visaexemption status are from countries whose nationals are allowed to stay for up to 30 days. Those entering via border crossings from neighboring countries are granted 15 days' stay in the country," Col Sunchai explained.

"Currently, both these groups of foreigners can apply to extend their stay at any immigration office, but only for a further seven days.

"But from August 29, these foreigners can apply to extend their stay at any immigration office for up to 30 days – giving a maximum possible stay in Thailand of 60 days."

However, Col Sunchai was apprehensive about assuring that the new 30-day extensions will be rolled out.

Police take down loan shark gang

OFFICERS arrested a Phuket loan shark and his four henchmen in a raid on July 26.

Armed with a search warrant, officers entered a house in Suanluang Chaofa housing project in Soi Sermsab to arrest the 34-year-old alleged gang leader Sakkarin Saleh for running a loan shark operation.

Four other men were also arrested: Abdulloh Jeleh, 29; Muhammad Soming, 23; and Kanawuth Lateh, 20, all from Pattani; and Surin Siboo, 34, from Songkhla.

"Our investigation team learned that Mr Sakkarin and his men had been operating in Phuket for a few months. Mr Sakkarin used to have a loan shark business in Trat," said Maj Roongsak Maichandee of the Region 8 Police Crime Suppression Division.

"Mr Sakkarin told us that the gang had about 30 customers who they charged 20 per cent interest, compounded monthly. The legal maximum rate to be collected on loans is set at 15 per cent."

The men were charged with operating and assisting an illegal loan business and charging illegal interest rates. All four confessed to the charges, said Maj Roongsak.

Rip current close call

Belgian family saved by fast-acting Surin lifeguards

SURIN Beach's fatality-free fouryear record almost came to a tragic end when four tourists, including a 3-year-old boy, were caught in a flash rip current last Sunday.

"A family of three from Belgium, including their three-year-old son, along with a fourth victim, could have all lost their lives in a space of a few minutes," a Surin Beach lifeguard told the *Gazette*.

Despite average-looking surf and sunny conditions, all four were caught in the rip current.

"They had ventured into the ocean in the worst possible spot, passing a steady row of red warning flags and multilingual signs, all indicating that it was a no-swimming zone and that dangerous rip currents were present in the area," the lifeguard said.

Lifeguards spotted the four just north of "Elephant Rock" – well outside of the safe swimming area – at about 4:30pm. They were struggling against the current to make it to the shore, while being

"One man was trying to hold a small baby while fighting the fastmoving water," the lifeguard said.

"With the child's mother being swept the farthest out, onlookers watched as three lifeguards dove o: Surin-Bangtao Surf Lifesaving Club into the ocean and began the process of securing them and assisting them back to shore... The lifeguard assisting the man and baby was whistling nearby swimmers out of the water, even as he tended to the two in distress.

"Lifeguards were pounded by the surf and dragged by the current for nearly five minutes as they pulled the victims out of the rip current and back to shore."

Two other full-time lifeguards and a volunteer at the scene assisted the rescue from the beach.


All four victims were safely recovered without serious injury.

"Everyone will make it home safely from Surin today [Sunday], so no matter how difficult the rescue was, it was definitely a good day in the end," one lifeguard said.

A three-minute walk down the beach from where the family entered the water, large red-yellow flags marked an area safe for swimming, the lifeguard noted.

Pressure has been mounting on the Surin Beach lifeguards after their full-time staff numbers were cut from eight last year to only five this year.

"During the rescue, if another victim needed assistance at the south rocks, we just wouldn't have been able to get there in time", one of the rescuers said. "We are stretched fairly thin."

New Breed: The ATM crashers

A RECENT ATM skimming attack in Macau in which thieves used a specialized device to install malicious software into a cash machine may be a harbinger of more sophisticated scams to come, reports technology security expert Brian Krebs.

Two Ukrainian men were arrested in Macau on May 30 for installing malware on at least seven ATMs to skim an estimated US\$100,000 (3.1 million baht).

"Local police said the men used a device that was connected to a small laptop, and inserted the device into the card acceptance slot on the ATMs," Mr Krebs reported on his Krebs Security website.

"Armed with this toolset, the authorities said, the men were able to install malware capable of siphoning the customer's card data and PINs. The device appears to be a rigid green circuit board that is approximately four or five times the length of an ATM card."

According to local press reports, the insertion of the circuit board caused the software running on the ATMs to crash,

temporarily leaving the cash machine with a black, empty screen. The thieves would then remove the device. Soon after, the machine would reboot and begin recording the card and PINs entered by customers who used the compromised machines.

The Macau Police said that the

Ukrainian men would return a few days after infecting the ATMs to collect the stolen card numbers and PINs. To do this, the thieves would reinsert the specialized chip card to retrieve the stolen data, and then a separate chip card to destroy evidence of the malware. – *Phuket Gazette*

The Skim:

BANKS are spending millions of baht upgrading ATMs throughout the country and hope to replace all ATM cards with more secure microchipped versions by the end of next year.

The project aims to stem the rising tide of the world's fastest-growing computer crime: skimming. But what are the best ways to protect yourself – and your money – from skimmers?

The *Gazette*'s Chutharat Plerin reports.

THE FBI reports that this latest form of computer-based financial fraud costs banks and their customers around the world billions of dollars annually.

Its presence has been felt in Thailand, though the national police unit tasked with combating ATM skimmers and the national-level Thai Bankers Association (TBA), have both declined to reveal to the *Gazette* any figures defining the extent of harm caused in the Kingdom.

Regardless, the problem of ATM fraud, and specifically skim-

ming, has grown so drastically in Thailand that TBA Secretary-General Twatchai Yongkittikul met with Royal Thai Police Deputy Commissioner Aek Angsananont in June to specifically clarify which police unit would be responsible for crimes involving ATM cards.

Immediately after that meeting, Mr Twatchai announced to the press the launch of a mammoth project: all ATMs in the country are

to be upgraded and all ATM cards issued by Thai banks are to be replaced with "smart card" versions fitted with microchips by the end of next year.

"Phuket is a top destination for skimmers," said Chumpon Donlayamahakomtorn, president of the Phuket Banker's Club.

"Millions of tourists from many countries visit Phuket each year, which means a lot of international bank transactions are conducted through ATMs throughout the island each day.

"This makes it much harder to track, as tourists might not realize their card has been skimmed until they go home. This is what exactly makes Phuket so attractive for skimmers; they can take advantage of the large volume of people who come and go."

Mr Chumpon welcomed the huge security upgrade underway.

"All the commercial banks are spending a lot of money to protect their customers," he said.

"Banks are spending millions on the upgrades, even more than the money reported lost by customers being skimmed, but it will protect more customers in the future."

Wassana Nakchainaramit, senior marketing officer for the Bangkok Bank in Phuket, confirmed that all Bangkok Bank ATMs – more than 8,500 nationwide – have been upgraded.

"All debit cards issued by Bangkok Bank are now 'smart cards', with microchips," Mr Wassana noted. "The old mag-

SKIMMED ILK

The first thing to do if a person believes his or her card has been skimmed is to contact the respective bank and suspend all transactions, said Col Chainarong Jaroenchainow, a deputy commander of the Economic Crimes Division, the police agency tasked with re-

ceiving all complaints related to skimming.

Mr Chumpon agreed, and urged people to keep the call center number for their bank in their phone.

"Call as soon as you think you might have been skimmed. Banks can instantly suspend all transactions related to your account while you're still on the phone," he said.

Col Chainarong was very clear that banks were responsible for filing skimming complaints to police as the banks were the actual victims, not the customers.

"They're the ones whose money has been stolen. They were trusted to keep your money safe," he said.

"If your local bank does not take any action over your case, you must report the skimming to your bank's headquarters in Bangkok. If still nothing is done, then report it to us."

Mr Chumpon, however, said

victims must report the crime to the police first.

"You must file a complaint to police, then bring that complaint to us so we can start working with police investigating your case," he said.

"Don't worry, the banks are responsible for losses due to cardskimming crimes. The bank will pay the full amount lost, but only after it has been verified that you lost your money by being skimmed."

Mr Chumpon pointed out that the refund policy for victims of skimming did not apply to people tricked by fake call centers asking victims to voluntarily transfer money to a specific account.

"And anyone caught filing false claims of being skimmed will face criminal charges," he warned.

TIME BOMB

Col Chainarong noted that most skimmers tend not to use the data they glean from ATM cards straight away.

"People usually think they've been skimmed when they realize money is missing from their account," he said. "But that's not what normally happens. It could be months, or even a year or more, before a victim's money is withdrawn.

"Skimmers have to collect the data before they can use it. It can take time to collect enough information to be able to access enough accounts to make it worthwhile.

"That is why changing your PIN number often is the best defense against skimmers. They might have data, but once you change your PIN they can't use it to take money from your account."

ANTI-SKIM TACTICS

In addition to the top-line defence of changing PIN numbers often, wisely choosing which ATM to use is one of the best safeguards against skimming, said Mr Chumpon.

"The best choice is to use ATMs in front of banks. There will be CCTV cameras and the machines will be checked very often to ensure that no skimming devices have been fitted," he said.

Despite an amateur's best efforts, however, telling whether an ATM has been altered is not an easy task.

In May, Patong Police discov-

ered an ATM fitted with a fake cover over the card-insert slot that was nearly identical to the original, factory-made cover.

The ATM was also fitted with a "new" form of card skimmer that local police and bank staff had never seen before.

"Take a moment to check the ATM before using it," advised Col Chainarong. "Check that the card slot and keyboard have not been tampered with or have a fake cover fitted over the top.

"If you see a hole above the keyboard or beside the monitor, don't use the machine."

Another tactic is to have a second bank account linked to the main account.

"Do not keep too much money in the main account. Just make sure there is enough money there to get you through for the time being," explained Mr Chumpon.

"That way, as soon as you suspect your primary account has been skimmed, you can quickly move the remaining balance to the second account, which the skimmers cannot access."

PAUSE FOR EFFECT

Mr Chumpon revealed a new technique to help prevent ATM cards from being skimmed: when removing the card from the ATM, do not remove it in one swift move.

"Skimming devices need a 'clean swipe' to obtain the data from the magnetic strip," he said.

"So you when you remove your card from the ATM, pause half-way through, then remove the card. You could even reinsert it part-way. Anything that breaks the rhythm of a clean swipe. This should help prevent the card from being skimmed when you remove it from the machine."

Tips for using ATMs

- Never allow someone you are not familiar with to guide you through an ATM transaction or process.
- Never hand your ATM card to a stranger for any reason, and be extremely wary of anyone who approaches you when you are using an ATM.
- Shield the key pad with your hand when you enter your PIN so that it cannot be read by secret cameras or strangers.
- Beware extra fittings such as brochure holders, as these may contain secret cameras.
- Use ATMs in places with good lighting that are in very secure or high-traffic areas, such as beside a 24-hour retail outlet or inside a bank.
- Report any ATM that malfunctions or holds your card to the bank immediately.
- Be wary of ATMs with "out of order" signs. It may be a scam to direct you to a nearby ATM that has been tampered with. Use another machine well away from this location.

Popular White Box restaurant told to remove half of facility

THE owners of the White Box restaurant on the Kalim beachfront, north of Patong, have been given seven days to remove more than half of the restaurant – or have the army take it down for them.

The order was delivered on Tuesday morning by Phuket Vice Governor Chamroen Tipayapongtada, who led officials and military to inspect the venue – the second visit in four days.

However, the restaurant was closed and the owner was abroad, explained the only representative present, who introduced himself as "Khun Andy" the caretaker.

A notice by the front door informed the officials that the restaurant was closed, by announcing, "Cause the director of the restaurant it is not in Thailand for clear the situation with the military we decided to close the restaurant until further notice."

The sign, written in English, was dated July 26 - the date of the first visit by Vice Governor Chamroen and his entourage.

Regardless, V/Gov Chamroen explained to Mr Andy that the owners had exceeded their building permit and had seven days to remove the offending structures.

"The building permit issued by Patong Municipality allows for only a one-storey structure to be built at the site," he said.

"The 10-by-12-meter terrace and the second floor must be removed. Otherwise, after seven days, the military will come tear it down." - Saran Mitrarat

Investors urged to verify land plots near national park

THE chief of Phuket's Sirinath National Park, Kitiphat Taraphiban, is urging current and prospective investors and private landowners to verify whether or not plots they have bought - or are thinking of buying - are deemed to be within the park.

The checks can be made at the park's land verification center, which was established at the order of Nipon Chotibal, the Acting Director-General of the Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation (DNP), in Phuket on July 8.

"The center is meant to help investors be assured that the property they are buying is not encroaching on national park land," Chief Kitiphat explained.

So far, only six people have visited the center to confirm whether or not specific plots were within the park.

"We do not have a detailed map showing the park's boundaries map available online, but we do have one at the center," Chief Kitiphat said.

"Please come and inspect it yourself. Any verbal advice from our officers is free."

Officials will issue written statements confirming whether plots queried are considered within the park or not. – *Chutharat Plerin*

Island forest land inspected

Officials look into encroachment in three major protected forests

THE Royal Forest Department (RFD) is untangling the land title documents that account for 90 per cent of what is supposed to be Bang Khanun protected forest, said RFD Director-General Theerapat Prayurasiddhi on July 26.

The RFD has joined the battle on Phuket against land encroachment, which has seen swaths of public beaches, national parks, protected forests and protected mangroves stolen from the

"Local government offices are working together with the Royal Forest Department and other departments to find solutions to land encroachment issues, but I think it will take about six months before we have a clear picture of the problem," Mr Theerapat said.

Mr Theerapat inspected three key areas for encroachment: the Bang Khanun protected forest, the Kamala Hills and the Nakkerd

Land-use documents and landownership documents account for almost 90 per cent of the 5,000-rai Bang Khanun protected

"A variety of land documents are out there that claim sections of what we believe is part of protected forest land. There are SorKor 1 and NorSor 3 Gor documents, as well as Chanote titles," Mr Theerapat said.

"Right now, we are looking into whether or not these documents were illegally issued."

Officials also followed up on an investigation into the legality of nine land title deeds for a Phuket luxury resort allegedly being built in a protected forest on Kamala

"We inspected a luxury resort that is being built on 10 rai of land that is possibly protected forest,"

Mr Theerapat said during his inspection on July 26.

"The project owner had previously shown officials nine Chanote titles as proof of his claim to the land.

"However, we could not find evidence of those Chanote titles in the Land Department's records. We also could not verify the existence of any SorKor 1 documents that might have been

upgraded to Chanote titles."

The investigators are now using aerial photo interpretations of the land to make a drawing that can be compared to an RFD map of the area, Mr Theerapat said.

"We believe the owner is in possession of illegal land titles," Mr Theerapat

Sirinath National Park Chief Kitiphat Taraphiban confirmed that his office will not withdraw a police complaint against those suspected of illegally issuing land documents to the operators of the long-defunct Phuket Peninsular Spa & Resort.

"From checking the history of the land title for the resort, we learned that the title originated from a SorKor 1 [land-use document] covering about two rai," Thammasak Chana, a deputy director-general of the Land Department said on July 25.

"When the *SorKor 1* was upgraded, the resulting documents were two NorSor 3 Gor deeds covering six rai. As the original SorKor

formed in 1963, that means they [the named owners of the land] have the right to legally own the land."

Mr Thammasak did not explain how

a document for two rai could have resulted in a document covering six rai.

"There are actually two SorKor 1 documents under investigation. Mr Thammasak spoke about only one of them," Mr Kitiphat told the Gazette.

"The two SorKor 1 documents were for two entirely separate plots, but when the

No solutions for vendors displaced after cleanup

DOZENS of Phuket beach vendors went toe-to-toe with Patong's mayor on July 24, demanding that she protect them and their livelihoods.

"I thought the beach vendors would have ideas on how we can support them, but they mostly just complained about me not taking care of them and not protecting them," said newly-elected Patong Mayor Chalermluck Kebsab.

"I understand that they are angry that their livelihood has been taken away. Yes, taking care of the people of Patong is my priority, but following the NCPO's [National Council for Peace and Order] order to return the beach to the public is also my responsibility."

Champion for the about 60 angry vendors who attended the meeting was Patong Entertainment **Business Association President** Weerawit Krueasombut.

"We understand that the order had to be followed. However, Patong Municipality must take responsibility for the vendors who lost their jobs," Mr Weerawit told the *Gazette*.

"Before it was cleared, each vendor cleaned up his or her section of the beach. Now, trash washes up on the sand and nobody manages it. The municipality doesn't have the budget or manpower to

take care of that problem."

Mr Weerawit also noted that umbrella and chair rentals were an essential service in the eyes of many tourists.

A vendor, asked to be identified only as Mr Ton, has been working on the beach for decades and agreed wholeheartedly with Mr Weerawit.

"Customers tell us that they want shade and want to sleep in the chairs. They tell us they won't come back to Phuket because we

can't provide such a simple, ex- us?" Mr Ton asked. pected service," Mr Ton said.

"This will definitely affect Phuket's tourism."

Mr Ton pointed out that the vendors had paid fees and were operating on the beach within the legal constraints established by Patong Municipality.

Final warning for west coast beach vendors

OFFICIALS bolstered by military support have softened their approach in clearing all businesses from Phuket's beaches, but remain firm that all offending structures will be torn down.


First stop on Tuesday was Paradise Beach, where Vice Governor Chamroen Tipayapongtada and accompanying officials last week ordered a family-run business to remove their belongings from the public beach area.

The family had complied by Tuesday. The vice governor then confirmed that the family could continue running its business unless the Land Office finds the Sor *Kor 1* for the land to be illegal.

The Windsurf Shop and Restaurant, on Tri Trang Beach, however, did not receive such good news.

"The building owner could not show any evidence to occupy the beach. She will have to remove the structures as quickly as possible," said V/Gov Chamroen.

The family operating the Tri Trang Restaurant were also ordered to remove all structures from the beach. They were given 10 days. - Saran Mitrarat

Workers find unexploded artillery shell



live artillery shell wasn't reported to police for days.

WORKERS at a construction site unearthed an unexploded artillery shell on July 25.

However, Phuket City Police weren't notified of the find at the apartment complex building site in Rassada until Monday.

"Once we realized what it was, we called in the Phuket Provincial Police Explosive Ordinance Disposal (EOD) unit to promptly recover it and dispose of it," said Capt Wichat Kongtawai of the Phuket City Police.

"Experts have confirmed that it was a 105mm artillery shell," another officer at the scene told the Gazette.

Sopa Sae-hao, owner of the apartment block under construction, initially thought the ordnance was an old oxygen tank used for

"I told my workers to put it aside while they kept working," she said. "However, while we were cleaning up the site yesterday [Monday], we thought we should call the police."

Ms Sopa was thankful that none of her workers tampered with the live round.

An unexploded ordnance is a rare find in Phuket, though in May, local fisherman in Krabi discovered a WWII Japanese torpedo with a potential blast radius of one kilometer.

...any responsibility."

The investor explained that he was baffled and furious that if what he was doing were illegal, it was never brought to his attention, as he said he followed the legal channels to get the necessary permits from local officials.

"If I couldn't do business on the beautiful sand, just tell me. I would not have invested that much money in illegal land," he said.

"How can you do business in Phuket when it's like this? Some of my friends who have millions of euros do not want to invest in Phuket. I love Thailand, but look what happened. I am not considering any further investments here, at least not at the moment."

Staffers at another affected beach club, Zazada, said they were still operating, but given the recent news, were prepared to have the club demolished.

Catch Beach Club manger Ben de Bellis declined to comment. The club was to celebrate its 10th anniversary on Surin Beach this year.

The clubs, as well as the restaurants and other business on the east side of the Surin beachfront path were occupying units originally built by the government. However, many of the legal units had been modified, while other structures unassociated with them had been built.

Post-tsunami, the Cherng Talay Tambon Administrative Organization (OrBorTor) established 10 buildings on public park land next to the beach, each with two units, and the Phuket Provincial Admin-

Despite some of the buildings being legal and some of the modifications made to them being sanctioned by the local government, OrBorTor President Ma-ann Samran would like to see them all demolished.

"I admit that we were the ones who gave them permission to modify the buildings, to make them beautiful and to maintain them," Mr Ma-ann said.

However, they are allowed to continue operating for now.

"I feel sorry for the people who used to have their business on the land, but the situation has changed. I believe they have earned enough to just move on now," he said.

Nonetheless, he did say that he would follow all Army orders, so if the National Council for Peace and Order (NCPO) demanded the structures to be pulled down, he would comply.

However, the recent announcement to remove the businesses east of the pathway was not pushed by the NCPO, Mr Ma-ann said on Wednesday.

"This is my decision and my order to remove all the buildings east of the walkway. The NCPO is only my backup. I want to restore the entire beach to its natural state for everyone."

The only exceptions will be a public stadium and a building that was constructed in honor of a visit by HM King Bhumibol Adulyadej in 1959.

Mr Ma-ann assured that if he is able to have the area cleared, no new structures will be allowed to be built there.

Vice Governor Chamroen Tipayapongtada pointed out that demolishing the government-built properties posed a problem.

"We need to follow the law and examine leases and contracts. Part of that will be looking at who was originally given the non-transferable permission to use the government-built buildings, and who is currently using them under what conditions."

OrBorTor officers on Wednesday told the Gazette that the contracts for the buildings in question had expired. However, they were unable to produce the previous contract or any documentation concerning usage rights of the buildings.

Chalong Police to face extortion charges

THREE officers from the Chalong Police are expected to be charged with extortion and abusing their positions of power by the end of August.

Lt Col Wannop Somjintanakul, the Public-sector Anti Corruption Commission (PACC) officer leading the investigation into the alleged extortion of more than 20 dive instructors at Chalong Pier in March, said he would present his findings to the PACC board in Bangkok in the coming weeks.

Officers discovered three large ice boxes buried in the sand across the road from Burger King while patrolling the beachfront road on July 21.

"We asked people in the area who the coolers belonged to, and we soon tracked

down the woman who had buried them," Maj Eakkarat Paidong of the Patong Police

The woman, who officers declined to name, confessed to burying the ice chests in the sand. She was fined and released.

"Do not encroach on public land," said Maj Eakkarat. "If you do, we will be charged."

End of days for illegal taxis

PHUKET Land Transport Office (PLTO) Chief Terayout Prasertphol has called on all police stations to seek the highest penalty for any illegal taxi drivers caught operating on the island after August 1.

"Police have been just fining and releasing drivers. However, from August 1, if police apprehend any illegal taxi driver, they must send the case directly to court and seek the highest penalty," Mr Terayout said.

"We are now sending notices to every police station on the island to crack down on all illegal taxis."

According to the Land Transportation Act BE 2522, the penalty for an illegal taxi driver is a maximum fine of 100,000 baht, two years imprisonment, or both.

Mr Terayout also announced that the PLTO has opened up registration at its office for anyone wanting to apply to become a legal taxi driver.

"Applicants have until August 31," said Mr Terayout.

"We will be accepting applications for metered taxis. We will not be accepting applications to register 'green plate' taxis, except for drivers who have tourism registration licences issued by the Tourism Authority of Thailand [TAT], use hotel limousines or have a contract to carry passengers from bus terminals, piers and the cirport"

The crackdown comes as the PLTO seeks to enact a slew of changes to create a new fleet of "standard metered taxis" to serve tourists and residents throughout the island.

The proposed changes were handed to Col Somchai Ponatong of the Royal Thai Army's 41st Military Circle on Tuesday. Col Somchai is to pass on the request to the PLTO headquarters and the National Council for Peace and Order (NCPO) in Bangkok.

Jaturong Kaewkasi, the PLTO's senior policy adviser, explained that the proposal for the new fares and the new look for the taxis is to encourage drivers to become metered-taxi drivers instead of fixed-rate "limousine" drivers preying on passengers at Phuket International Airport.

"Drivers can make more money carrying a fare back to the airport, rather than having to drive back empty, as is the case now," Mr Jaturong explained.

"We have been trying to raise the standard meter rates for years. If this is approved, it would make it much easier for us to encourage drivers to operate metered taxis instead of becoming 'limousine' drivers."

PLTO chief Terayout last year noted that the Land Transport Department had not

increased the standard fares for Phuket drivers since 2003.

With the proposal to be handed to the NCPO were images of what Phuket's new fleet of standard taxis would look like: white sedans with red-and-yellow stripes and stickers showing the vehicle's taxi registration number and the PLTO complaint hotline number, 1584.

1,500 Thais to be moved from war-torn Libya

THAILAND decided on Monday to evacuate all of its nationals in war-torn Libya after the fighting intensified and many countries, including the United States, relocated their citizens and closed their diplomatic missions.

Nuttavudh Pothisaro, deputy permanent secretary of the Foreign Ministry, said Gen Prayuth Chan-ocha of the National Council for Peace and Order chaired a meeting of agencies and ordered the return of about 1,500 Thais within 48 hours for their safety.

The first batch of 41, comprising 11 students and 30 Thais living around the Tripoli airport that was closed down because of the fighting, will be moved out in 48 hours because they live in the most risky area, Mr Nuttavudh said. The second group will be 70 Thais living in Al-Bayda city near Benghazi while the last group will comprise 1,500. All of them will be transferred by land out of the country.

They would move to Tunis and Djerba in Tunisia and stay there before travelling back to Thailand due to the deteriorating situation, he said.

Kittipong Na Ranong, the Thai ambassador to Libya, has reported that fighting will continue and grow worse, explained *The Nation*.

A team of four Foreign Ministry officials, two employment officials and two military medics will be sent to take care of the Thais.

The Thai Foreign Ministry will closely evaluate the developments in Libya before shutting the embassy in Tripoli or withdrawing personnel. Some mission staff and families have already left the country.

Last week a Thai worker was killed when a mortar shell landed near where he was staying in Israel. His remains arrived in Thailand on July 28.

End of Ramadan marked by mayhem in Deep South

INSURGENT violence has continued in the far South after the devastating car-bomb attack in Yala's Betong district on July 25, two days before the end of Ramadan, reported *The Nation*.

It included a roadside bomb attack in Pattani on the night of July 27, the end of the Muslim holy month of fasting, and a gun battle in Narathiwat on Monday that saw the deaths of civilians, security officials and insurgents.

Lt Gen Valit Rojanapakdee, Army Region 4 commander, said an internal investigation was under way to find out where to place the blame for the car bomb in Betong – the area's worst incident in seven years, which killed two and wounded dozens.

Business leaders in the southern border region on July 26, one day after the Yala attack, urged the ruling National Council for Peace and Order (NCPO) to come up with clear measures to deal with insurgent violence in the restive region.

Yala Chamber of Commerce chairman Noppong Thiraworn said that with its extensive powers after the coup, the NCPO was in a good position to tackle the violence effectively.

"I believe that the NCPO now has enough information about the insurgency violence over the past decade to come up with concrete measures to solve the problem," Mr Noppong said.

In a second attack two days after Yala, in Pattani, a roadside bomb planted in Sai Buri district blasted a passing pick-up truck carrying a number of Army paramilitary rangers at about 9:30pm, killing a 10-year-old girl and wounding five other civilians and two rangers. Explosive ordnance disposal personnel said the homemade bomb consisted of 10

kilograms of explosives in a fireextinguisher tank detonated by two-way radio frequencies.

Then, in Narathiwat at 11:15am on Monday, a gunfight in Rusoh district saw three suspected insurgents killed, two of whom were allegedly senior members, as well as two security officials.

A manhunt went underway shortly thereafter to find other in-

surgents who took part in an ambush that led to the gunfight.

Betong was much quieter than usual on Saturday as many locals remained at home and tourists cancelled trips to the area.

Hundreds of cancellations were made by tourists from Malaysia and Singapore, who were expected to celebrate the Eid ul-Fitr festival at the end of the fasting month.

B9mn worth of ivory seized at airport

CUSTOMS officials arrested a Chinese woman and a Vietnamese man at Suvarnabhumi Airport in Bangkok after they allegedly tried to smuggle elephant tusks and ivory products with an estimated value of about 9 million baht out of the country, Customs' Deputy Chief Paisarn Chuenjit said on Monday.

The man was identified as Luong Tien Phong, 62, and the woman as Chen Zhiyu, 23. They

were arrested on July 26 with 18 pieces of tusk and 587 ivory products, valued at about 9mn baht in total, found in their suitcases, reported *The Nation*.

Mr Paisarn said the arrest was the result of his department boosting its preventive measures to block the ivory trade in line with the Conference on International trade of Endangered Species (CITES).

The suspects claimed they were paid by an unnamed Asian to smuggle the items from the western African nation of Ivory Coast (Cote d'Ivoire) to Siem Reap in Cambodia via Bangkok. Ms Chen was paid US\$500 (15,900 baht) and Mr Luong was paid US\$300 (9,540 baht).

THE nationwide rice audit ordered by the National Council for Peace and Order (NCPO) is drawing to a close as scheduled, raising hopes that the state's mounting rice stockpiles can start to be released and the protracted nightmare is ending soon.

The headaches of those involved will soon be gone, said ML Panadda Diskul, permanent secretary of the Prime Minister's Office and head of the committee for examining the state's rice inventory.

"They would like the bad dreams to end. What-

ever the outcome will be, they will be a loser one way or the other," he said on his Facebook.

Gen Prayuth Chan-ocha, director of the NCPO, has said the regime was committed to inspecting the quality and quantity of rice stored at government granaries nationwide, as well as bringing charges against anyone found involved in fraud or non-transparent activity, reported *The Nation*.

The Commerce Ministry is preparing to resume selling rice from its stocks in early August.

THE complete removal of beach lounger and umbrella sets from Phuket's beaches is a drastic yet necessary step to completely rid the sand of illegal encroachment.

It may be a bitter pill to swallow, especially for those who have lost their jobs, but we need to start from ground zero in order to set the stage for a new Phuket: one in which the term "sustainable tourism" is more than just another buzzword bandied about by so many corrupt bureaucrats.

Nonetheless, the argument to eventually allow some beach loungers back on the sands does have considerable merit.

Unlike most residents, many tourists visiting the island want, and expect, to be able to rent out a beach lounger and umbrella for a reasonable fee. After all, nobody in their right mind would expose their skin to the sun all day without some sort of protection, and a parasol is far more effective and comfortable than using sunscreen – although we of course recommend using both.

Payment for rental of a lounger set does, of course, come with the expectation that certain services will be provided: that the beach boys (or girls) will adjust the umbrellas to ensure that the loungers provide shade at all times, clean up debris, provide protection from potential threats ranging from theft and assault to rip currents and tsunamis. For the most part, the workers do a good job in this respect.

Unfortunately, the beach lounge brigade is somewhat like *pak* bung talay, that impressive creeping plant with the beautiful purple flower that is usually the first to colonize the sand: they are inevitably followed by other, less attractive, varieties.

So the question is: if a certain controlled number of loungers are allowed back, how long will it take before the beaches are once again recolonized by an astonishing array of other vendors and all the gear and contraptions needed to run their operations?

It is impossible not to feel sorry for honest, hard-working beach vendors who provide the aforementioned services; we appreciate that many long-term vendors have established a sizeable number of devoted customers who return year after year.

However, the argument that "we are just poor local people" is tenuous, at best. As most long-term residents know, almost all of those that actually work on the beach are not from the area, but from other provinces.

If allowed back, we would like to see this profession restricted to a limited number of operators who can prove that they have been doing it for a long time, all with Phuket house registrations.

In the meantime, let's all enjoy this precious time when what is left of Phuket's beaches' natural beauty is on full display – because it is impossible to know how long it will last.

There was no way I could have disguised the look of pure shock on my face. I said hello nervously and had no idea what else to say, so my friend quickly recovered the moment with an explanation of how her cousin had never been able to banish her pregnancy pounds from a few years before.

What is a girl to do in that situation? I had no idea, and I probably caused offence with my reaction, but in my 23 years I never underwent training to prepare for a moment like that.

I was also not prepared for the internal battle one inevitably faces

when shopping in Thailand. At stores geared toward Westerners, like H&M, I manage to survive with a reasonable level of self-esteem intact. However, stores targeted at Thai people are a totally different story.

A recent shopping experience at a traditional Thai dress store was everything I thought it would be – a bit mortifying and a bit fun.

I went with some coworkers, as we had to find traditional garb to wear to an event. The dresses there were gorgeous, but no doubt made to fit Thai-sized women.

I ran into a major issue when trying to pull a dress over my American-sized bum. It wasn't going to happen. After busting out a few compromising positions to try to make it fit, I gave up and looked for a skirt that could be altered to contain my caboose.

If I hadn't braced myself for the possibility that my backside would cause me extreme stress, I might have walked out of the shop with a pretty negative memory of the experience. But, I ended up with a beautiful outfit and a funny story to tell.

I, and many of my Western friends, have learned to roll with the punches of blunt comments and frustrating shopping experiences. Life among the tiny Thais is much easier that way.

Issues & Answers... ...asking the questions that affect you...

Will the visa crackdown affect me?

I am married to a Thai and we have two children. I am about to take up work in Vietnam, but I will travel to Phuket weekly as we live here. Will I have a problems entering Thailand each time on a 30-day visa? Or I should obtain another type of visa?

Ant, Phuket

Col Sunchai Chokkajaykij, chief of the Phuket Immigration Office, replies:

First, please make sure you are from one of the countries whose nationals Thailand grants 30-days' stay in the country on visa-exemption status.

If you are, then you will be allowed to enter Thailand on 30-day visa-exemption stays, but be prepared to be questioned each time you fly back to Thailand.

If you do decide to fly back each week on 30-day "walk-in" visas, carry with you at least some evidence that you have family here. This would include copies of your marriage certificate, your children's birth certificates and photos of you with your family.

This should help with any immigration officer who stops and questions you, but there is no guarantee that the officer will be convinced and he or she may refuse you entry.

To avoid all this, I strongly suggest that you visit a Royal Thai Embassy or consulate and obtain a non-immigrant O visa on the basis that you are married to a Thai.

Make sure that the non-immigrant O visa is marked as "multiple entry", and you should have no problem returning each week to see your family.

The sky is the limit

PERCHED on a steep hillside directly beneath the watchful gaze of the Big Buddha rests the compound that houses Helicam.

Owned and operated by British national Phil Clark, the media production company which specializes in aerial photography and videography is just about to celebrate a dozen years of operating in Phuket.

The anniversary will be highlighted by the upcoming launch of their new website which will display to the world, and especially potential clients, the extensive library of work they have accumulated over the years.

Coming off of a 10-year stint as an art director at an agency in the UK, Phil began to merge his interest in photography and hobby of remote control helicopters.

After an attempt at finding a foothold for his fledgling business met with resistance in Dubai, Phil's Phuket-based brother suggested he explore his options on the island.

"I started off doing the job using the helicopters to take aerial photographs of pieces of land. At the time, everyone was

buying and selling land so it did sort of quickly kick-off," recalls the energetic father of two.

"And then people were asking, can you also do the shots inside for me, can you do the rooms, can you do a video, so they were asking for more and I thought, 'well, we are going to have to do more different things. We diversified, got more equipment, we learned more about photography and became better photographers and videographers and now we're doing hotel corporate videos for the Accor Group, "Pullman, Banyan Tree, Angsana."

Although it might sound simple – buy a drone online for 30,000 baht and off you go - Phil and his team knew that to stay ahead of the pack, they had to offer services that branded them with a level of distinction.

"If we stuck with just doing the aerial photographs, we wouldn't be here anymore," explains Phil.

What gives Helicam an edge, and what makes them one of the most attractive options in their field, is the fact that they offer the full package – a one-stop shop for visual media.

"These guys can do virtual tours on the ground and these guys can fly helicopters and take shots of villas and there is a good production company that does videos, but I've never come across a company which does the whole thing and packages them together as one job [like Helicam does].'

Picture this: A property developer is marketing their new multi-villa project on a hillside overlooking the sea. Naturally, they want to pre-sell as many units as possible before breaking ground on the project. What Helicam can do is take a series of aerial images and process them into a interactive birds-eye view of the surrounding landscape. Next, they

create CGI graphics of the new project. When a prospective client clicks on one of the units, a photo pops up which shows the view that they will see from their balcony. From the balcony, they can use the 360-degree virtual tour feature to actually navigate through the villa.

When the villas are complete, Helicam can combine their skyward approach of sweeping fly-throughs of the property with romantic edits of couples enjoying candle lit dinners, kids splashing in the pool and smiling faces of the staff to create a professionally published and visually stimulating package.

Helicam's success has been a product of a proactive approach to identifying new technology and methodologies, and taking the initiative to develop the skills necessary to employ them and stay ahead of the game.

Although the business has enjoyed 12 years of growing success, it does come with growing pains. "One of the biggest challenges is actually – it's not doing the work – but being able to be legitimate, having a Thai company operating in Thailand with so many language barriers and paperwork for work permits, business visas... red tape," reflects Phil.

He explains the exhausting process of trying to keep up with the ever-growing list of requirements needed to operate his business. Even his Thai accountant has recently become very frustrated.

In addition to staying abreast of bureaucratic business requirements, Phil has to keep up with the break-neck pace of the quickly changing tech landscape.

"The helicopters changed [from petrol] to the electric ones, we got batteries instead of using fuel. And then it changed again and we got autopilots and instruments and they got more autonomous. Then the multi-

quadcopters, octocopters and it just keeps on going and changing."

Phil has also kept on the cutting edge of his field by using the latest photography and videography equipment. He has forged forward from the days of slide film cameras through to the digital age and has even joined the ranks of the latest mirrorless revolution.

Following a dozen years of building a robust reputation among a diverse group of notable clients such as Sansiri, Coca Cola and Proctor and Gamble, the sky's the limit for this Phuket entrepreneur.

June exports jump

THE Department of International Trade Promotion (DITP) and the Ministry of Commerce has reported an increase of 3.9 per cent in exports for June 2014, with a total value of 630 billion baht (US\$19.8 billion).

According to DITP Director-General Nantawan Sakuntanak, the increase in Thailand's exports in June was the highest in 17 months. Imports were valued at 573bn baht (US\$18bn), a drop of 14 per cent, allowing the country to enjoy a trade surplus of 57bn baht (US\$1.8bn).

The improvement is believed to have resulted from a jump of 2.6 per cent in agricultural exports and 3.9 per cent in industrial exports during the month.

Over the first six months of 2014, the export value accumulated to 36 trillion baht (US\$112.7bn), decreasing 0.35 per cent, while the value of imports also decreased 14 per cent to stand at 35.7tn baht (US\$112.47bn). -NNT

THE proposed Pak Bara deep-sea port in Satun province is awaiting results from environment and health impact assessment (EHIA) studies.

According to Harbor Master Chula Sukmanop, the Pak Bara seaport project has already passed an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) study. However, it has yet to undergo an EHIA study. Once the study is completed, the projects will be forwarded to the NCPO for consideration.

The project has been opposed by many locals who fear that pollution likely caused by heavy industries will affect their livelihood. As a result, protests have been held by villagers and fishermen who demand that the project be scrapped.


Pak Bara has been designed to link with the second Songkhla deep-sea port, and the two could significantly drive the South's economic growth when completed. If the Pak Bara project fails commence, Thailand will miss an opportunity to compete with neighboring countries, said the Harbor Master.

The shopping allure

THE Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) has launched a campaign to promote tourism in the low season, or "green season", in Thailand by offering discounts at major department stores and cheap plane tickets through Thai AirAsia.

Deputy Governor of the TAT Wilaiwan Thawitsi said the TAT has invited foreign tourists to shop at leading department stores in Thailand to take advantage of discounts from many brand names. The low-cost airline Thai Air Asia has also joined in the TAT's "green season" campaign by offering cheap tickets to Thailand from Ho Chi Minh and Hanoi for Vietnamese tourists, Ms Wilaiwan said.

The TAT and Thai AirAsia organized the event "Thailand Shopping Paradise with AirAsia" at Aeon Mall in Ho Chi Minh on July 26-27. The event targeted Vietnamese tourists who have high purchasing power and enjoy travelling abroad.



Retirement planning with MLPs

A COMMON question that I get from potential clients is, "Why do I need a registered investment adviser? I can buy stocks

on my own." Well, retirement planning is more than just buying and selling stocks and bonds. The answer is that retirement involves not only investment planning, but it also involves tax planning. The best way to explain this crucial point involves one of the most popular investments for yield today master limited partnerships, or MLPs.

MLPs invest in energy assets. They're similar to real estate investment trusts (REITs), except that they carry on an active business. This has allowed MLPs to constantly and consistently increase their payouts over the last several years. A trend which will likely continue.

There are three types of MLPs: upstream, midstream and downstream. Upstream involves exploring and developing oil and gas properties. Downstream focuses on processing and refining. Midstream refers to the companies in the middle that provide services to energy companies on either side and charge a fee for their services.

This is handy for retirees looking to limit the income they have to report to Uncle Sam and lower their tax bill.

Most retirees fail to take taxes into consideration when planning for retirement. The more money they have to pay Uncle Sam, the less they have for retirement and to live on. I not only provide you with suitable investments, but I also help devise your tax plan. After all, what good is saving for retirement if the government is going to keep taking a good chunk of your money?

Now, let's look and see how some MLPs have done for my clients since the start of the year. Here is how you would have fared had you put US\$100,000 into these MLPs on January 1.

Not including fees, you would be sitting on US\$117,435.49, good for over 17 per cent return on principal. Along the way, you would have also collected a total of US\$2,791.39 in distributions. You got price appreciation and received an average yield of 5.58 per cent on your money. This is why MLPs are so attractive and why I recommend them for my clients.

Now, what are some of the risks going Because of the income MLPs generate, forward? One risk is that interest rates rise.

This would increase the yield on bonds and term deposits. Investors could sell some of their MLPs and shift the money towards other assets.

What about the price of oil? The good news is that MLPs are not affected by the price of oil or natural gas, especially the pipeline MLPs like Kinder Morgan. Kinder Morgan gets paid to pipe oil and natural gas regardless of their price. Kinder Morgan charges fees based on volume, not on the price of the underlying commodity.

MLPs are great long-term investments. The increase in US oil and natural gas production will continue to drive demand for the businesses of upstream, midstream and downstream MLPs. As long as oil and gas keeps flowing, the MLPs will continue paying my clients and I and keep us happy long into our retirement here in the Land of Smiles.

Lessons to be learned from Brazil

RESEARCH from the Grant Thornton International Business Report (IBR) has found that the enthusiasm Brazilian businesses held for hosting the 2014 FIFA World Cup plummeted over the past two years leading up to event. However, while few business leaders predicted increased investment or increased profits as a result of Brazil hosting the competition,

there is hope that infrastructure improvements and the influx of tourists will provide enduring

Andrew McBean, Partner of Grant Thornton in Thailand and a specialist in the AEC said, "The big sporting events usually bring huge amounts of growth to the hosting country. For example it was estimated that the economic impact of the London Olympic games was 551 billion baht (9.9bn pounds) to the UK in 2012 alone. However, the withdrawal on April 17 by the Vietnamese Government from hosting the 2019 Asian Games was is a reminder that very careful consideration and planning needs to be given to hosting such events in emerging markets. Such a study needs to assess both

economic and social impacts."

The IBR reveals that the proportion of Brazilian business leaders who believed hosting the World Cup would translate to faster economic growth fell from 80% in Q1-2012 to just 33% by Q1-2014. Similarly, just 11% of businesses planned to make extra investments for the tournament, compared to 23% in 2012. A further 19% of businesses expected their profits to rise, and 52% expected the tourism sector to see the biggest pick-up in activity.

More than two in five business leaders expected infrastructure investments – particularly those in the transport sector – to be the most enduring legacy of the games (42%), with a further quarter expecting a greater influx of tourists

(26%). However, almost a third believed stadium construction in their city disrupted daily life and just 40% believed the stadium will be well used once the tournament is over.

"The important thing after the tournament is finished is the asset management. Of key concern is how to manage and utilize these in the future. Like the Bird's Nest in Beijing and Cape Town's Green Park Stadium, it is hard to

see the Amazon Arena in Manaus being well used after the tournament. However, there are good examples to follow so that stadia do not fall into disuse, particularly that of the east of London following the 2012 Olympic Games. The event allowed this previously derelict part of the UK capital to be modernized and it has subsequently attracted significant commercial and residential investment," explained Mr McBean.

"Thailand has hosted a record four Asian Games with the most recent in 1998, however before submitting any further proposals, it is worth pausing and performing deep economic and social studies using updated models and experiences," added Mr McBean.

Avoiding cost overrun on a home-build

THIS is both a question and a problem for homebuilding and usually concerns the last minute modifications that we often hear about. Let's

ways to minimize the risk.

Before anything else, we must have an understanding that home-building involves three major phases. First is structure layout, whose works include laying foundation pillars and basement and building beams for weight support. Second is brick masonry and plastering. At this stage, the structure of the house starts to take shape.

These two phases are often within budget, unless there are some additional works. However, what often leads to a cost overrun is in the third and final phase, where the selection of home decorative items is involved. This is where people's minds change as to the choice of floor materials, wall materials, house-painting colors, sanitaryware, lamps and so on, depending on the owner's taste.

Owners may think the cost adjustment for new materials is minimal, but if they combine all the items together, they will realize that the budget is already way up high.



However, the real cause of above-cost building is the choice of an unprofessional home subcontractor. Often these people will leave the job uncompleted, leading to

look at how it happens and then consider the hiring of a replacement and, therefore, a budget overrun.

> It is in many cases also caused by the initially unclear wishes and requirements of the owners. Sometimes, they have already agreed to a house design, but then change it later when they see that the house in the making is not to their satisfaction or expectation, and thus want to change the design despite the higher cost.

FOUR TIPS

To minimize these problems, the following tips should always be borne in mind:

1. Ensure that the needs of the owner and members of their family are clearly set out and understood, in terms of layout, construction materials, decorative materials and an affordable budget. Most budgeting for home-building has three components. The first 60 per cent goes to construction, which involves structure and major construction works that are not adjustable. The adjustable part is exterior



decoration. Another 30 per cent goes to interior decoration, which concerns aesthetic beauty and the taste of the owner in relation to air-conditioners, curtains and furniture. The final 10 per cent goes to landscaping and exterior decoration.

2. Secure a clear and comprehensive agreement, including identification of essentials such as price, design, materials and construction, as well as a fixing period, on paper prior to the commencement of construction. This is to avoid any conflict during work in progress, and to not waste time fixing and making changes during the construction process, which will add to the cost and finally end up in a cost overrun.

3. When choosing materials, the owner must dedicate time to the materials required for a particular phase of construction in order to allow work to continue as planned, and to prevent instances where the produc-

tion of materials has already been terminated – or materials are overpriced. Also important is to choose materials according to what has initially been agreed.

4. The owner should refrain from changing their mind if they see materials that they consider more favorable than what has previously been agreed upon. A salesperson will always attempt to persuade them to buy something different, but the owner could then end up spending more unnecessarily.

In conclusion, home-building is all about the owner's satisfaction and budget. Most importantly, in controlling the budget the owner must have clear needs from the outset in order to make good and worthy choices. Their satisfaction is the most important thing. If they are not satisfied and want to change things, then the budget is bound to end up being exceeded.



How to survive a plane crash



"I'M FLYING high over Tupelo, Mississippi, with America's hottest band, and we're all about to die," is one of those great movie lines, in this case from the film *Almost Famous*. In the end, they didn't soar straight into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame as Lynyrd Skynyrd did, but the scene tapped into the darkest nightmare of travel, a plane crash.

Rock and roll and planes have made an often fatal toxic pairing, from the far too early demise of Buddy Holly, Otis Redding, Jim Croce, Rick Nelson, Ronnie Van Zandt of Lynyrd Skynyrd and Stevie Ray Vaughan – who actually met his maker in a helicopter accident.

Over the last few months, ever since the phantom disappearance of MH370 on March 8, planes seem to be falling out of the sky with a disturbing frequency, exposing a raw nerve for passengers and those who work in the industry. The red-tagged Breaking News banner continues to be an unwel-

come visitor, with most of us just wanting it to go away.

As readers will know I am a FIFO kind of guy. FIFO meaning "fly in/fly out" or, to put it another way, away from the island on an altogether too frequent basis. My journey to work is often onboard the bus, the Airbus that is. While the current spate of crashes has not pushed me to cancel any upcoming flights, I did come down with a morose case of the "what ifs" this afternoon and ended up surfing the net, eventually coming across an article titled How to Survive a Plane Crash – 10 Tips to Saving Your Life.

Bizarrely, the lines from *Peggy Sue* kept running through my mind as I prepared to get educated. Though in reflection, it's more of a flashback to the plane crash in the Hollywood blockbuster *Con Air*, versus getting all Buddy Holly like. Still, a crash is a crash. My work was laid out before my very eyes; 10 easy steps and I could become the master of my own destiny. All I needed to do was to scroll down and save my life.

In no particular order, odd subjects popped up, such as the "Plus

Three, Minus Eight Rule". The text shouts out that over 80 per cent of planes that crash, do so within this time period – within the first three minutes of takeoff or in the eight minutes before landing. Underscored are the instructions "do not sleep". Questions arise, of course, considering I don't have a watch and using your mobile phone clock could actually make the plane crash, according to some inane FAA rule.

Up next was the "Remember The Five Row Rule" which infers statistically those within five rows from an emergency exit have enhanced their life expectancy should a crash occur. The odds are with you. But confusion starts to cloud any clarity as I recall reading about it being better to sit in the rear of the plane than the front, even though the main doors have all those exits, so my mind goes blank on which row to roost. Plus it really sucks sitting in the rear of the plane, which gyrates whenever you hit turbulence. Or being next to the lavatories at the rear which start to smell even on a mid-haul flight. Worst yet is being last off and spending two hours in line at the island's end-

less airport waiting lines.

My head is about to explode as more info flies into my head about the chances of survival on water landings (I did like the movie *Castaway*), or being familiar with the emergency landing information and last but not least – brace, brace, brace. My thoughts on the latter are that I would not want my last moment on earth to be one with my head buried in my lap.

With time bearing down on me (as I can tell from my switched on mobile phone) I simply can't

read this doomsday script anymore. When the big guy calls you, there isn't a lot that can be done to talk your way out of it. In final analysis, and the words of legendary rock star Jim Morrison, "no one here gets out alive". That means you and it means me too. Incidentally Jim didn't die in a plane crash, but from mysterious causes in Paris in 1971.

BIM system phenomenon

COMPUTER technology changes rapidly, forcing people to adjust the way they work in accordance with accumulative modifications.

Architectural design is one of the businesses affected by such change. From manual drawing and drafting of 20 years ago, the profession has moved on and adopted CAD (computer-aided design) for the presentation and production of architectural documents, especially with construction drawings.

The transformation has been so complete that one can hardly find an office still practicing manual drafting. New graduates are more accustomed to CAD programs.

Even clients are more familiar with CAD and computer technology. Computer representation allows clients to see the project – in which they are investing millions or billions – to the very minutest detail before the construction process begins.

The more the client sees, the further they can question, investigate or work to protect their investment, and computer technology allows them this advantage. This aspect coincides with the reality of growing complexity in the business of architectural design.

A building needs to respond to several simultaneous issues: energy consumption, meeting green building standards, LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) requirements, cost-effective facility management, environmental impacts, and construction uncertainties, among others. Because of these competing agendas, CAD technology begins to reach its limit, as it is best used in the static presentation of architectural drawings and scaled models.

BIM (building information modelling) extends these limitations. In addition to the capacity to create drawings and scaled models, BIM can also embed information into the representation of building parts.

Information may include data on the physical properties of building components, price, thermal induction, date and time of component installation, or the life expectancy of building parts. As this information can be integrated easily into drawings and models, BIM systems can do much more than the simple representation of buildings.

The information assigned in a BIM program to a building component can be usefully applied towards simulations and calculations – that is, bills of quantity, power consumption, or building maintenance schedules.

BIM allows project stakeholders to predict the future performance of buildings, using techniques of simulation to anticipate and prevent problems before the actual construction process begins. – *The Nation*

Magic, mystery and madness

AUSTRALIAN illusionist and escapologist Cosentino didn't do any disappearing tricks when he popped over to Bangkok last week to chat with the media about his upcoming TV show, though he did have one lady floating horizontally in the air and escaped from a straitjacket.

The 31-year-old, who was born Paul Cosentino, is bringing Cosentino to Thailand next month with cable provider TrueVisions.

The young Cosentino turned to magic at the age of 12 to try and overcome his shyness and was soon wowing family and friends with his tricks.

A runner-up on Australia's Got *Talent* in 2011, Cosentino has won two Merlin Awards: Most Original International Magician in 2012 and International Magician of the Year last year. His own TV show followed, along with an invitation to take part in Dancing with the Stars, which he won.

We waved our magic wand and convinced the affable Cosentino to sit down for a chat.

How do you create new magic? I have a very child-like imagina-

tion. That doesn't mean I'm childish, but that my imagination is as vivid as a child's.

I have six nephews and nieces and do magic for them and they see it as real magic, not a trick or illusion. If you think like a child you become creative.

What makes you different from other magicians?

In the TV shows we combine four disciplines – street magic, stunts, stage magic and reality, and of course, no other magician makes show unique.

Then there's the personality factor. I've been influenced by people as diverse as Michael Jackson and Bruce Lee, even some of Walt Disney's characters, and the combination seems to work.

Some of your escapes are really quite dangerous. Do you foresee a time when you will get into real trouble?

It's already happened. I did the show Dropped on TV. That involved my being in a sphere and dropping to the bottom of a 10meter water tank. My eardrum burst while I was still chained. My ear was bleeding and I was nauseous, but I still had to extract myself from the sphere and swim back up to the surface in one single breath.

Another escape act that almost went bad is Stabbed. It used a machine I invented with 18 chefs' knives that are released. They are meant to miss me, but one time I ended up with a bad cut on the chin.

How do you overcome your fear in situations like that?

It's very difficult to do. I convince myself that I have to do it. If I worry about the danger or think of the things that could possibly go wrong, I wouldn't do it.

But in the end it's all the practice and the training and the rehearsal that make you feel confident. You must never try and escape if you are not fully prepared, because you lose your confidence and start anticipating something going wrong.

And the main thing of course is not to panic. It's difficult but it's what you train for.

a habit of dancing! That makes the **Are you afraid that the tricks** will get old sometime?

Of course, you can never do the same tricks too many times. I have to keep coming up with new material and new ideas and they usually involve more chains.

What's the most difficult part about magic?

Like I said earlier, coming up with an idea is easy but bringing that idea to life is hard. We use technology to make it deceptive, but not everything we do works the first time.

We are constantly creating prototypes, which is very timeconsuming and expensive and often frustrating.

How do you rehearse?

I go to the gym five times a week and train for the acts every day. If I have live shows coming up, I train two months straight every day until it's perfect – really refined.

What does it take to be a magician?

Passion first and foremost. You also need hand dexterity training and to be creative. Most important I guess is charm, because a magician is really an actor.

What do you think when people watch the show to see how its done rather than for entertainment?

I would obviously prefer it if they watched just to be entertained. It is like watching a blockbuster like Hercules and thinking that that's all fake, that it's not real. Of course it's not. And that's the point. It's not real, it's illusion and it's entertaining.



What happens if someone discovers how a trick works?

We kill them! No, I'm kidding at the end of the day everyone wants to know how it's done. But when the audience is being entertained, they get wrapped up in the story, in the mystery and at the end of the day, although they want to know the secret, the entertainment overpowers it. But if someone does discover the secret, I would say shhhh!

You're famous now, have you reached your goal?

No, not at all. I always want to get better on my show. I believe we can always learn and for me it's always good to learn from different cultures and pick up inspiration from different people.

What do you get from being a magician?

In the beginning it was all about finding confidence in myself. Now, I love the fact that I can share who I am. It's not about money or fame but the feeling of being able to share my art.

Finally, do you call yourself a magician or an illusionist?

An illusionist, because a magician does smaller tricks and more of them. If you are an illusionist, the bigger and grander your escapes, the better the show. - The Nation





Life & style The lure of Angel's trumpets



WHILE perusing old photographs of Chiang Mai, I came across some views of Doi Inthanan. This mountain, at 2,564 meters, is not only the highest in Thailand, but boasts some spectacular montane forests and flowers. At the summit, the twin Chedis appear to float, disembodied, in swirling mists that are more reminiscent of a Scottish "haar" than a tropical mountainscape.

The upper slopes of Doi Inthanon offer a perfect setting for temperate plants – lower diurnal temperatures and cooler nights that would otherwise struggle to survive in Thailand's hot-house environment. With more than 300 kinds of birds, there is greater biodiversity here than in any part of the country. Red rhododendrons unique to this area of the kingdom – grow near the summit, there are two varieties of conifer found only here, and the moist hillsides provide a perfect environment for epiphytic plants such as wanda orchids, and a range of lichens, lianas, sphagnum mosses and osmada ferns.

Royal projects encourage hill villagers to cultivate cold climate crops including apples, strawber-

ries and grapes. Lower down where the air is dryer and warmer (at the top the temperature often falls below zero), there are magnificent stands of Angel's Trumpets. It was these that took my eye as I sauntered down memory lane. I have always loved Angel's Trumpets, formerly called daturas, but known nowadays in botanical parlance as brugmansias.

They were one of the few tropical plants that I managed to cultivate in England where I successfully grew them in pots in my Highgate loft. A constant source of astonishment to visitors. Moreover, they luxuriated in my Andalucian garden, which was perched precariously on a steep, rocky hillside at 300 meters.

They took readily from cuttings and quickly became leafy trees covered with masses of yellow blooms. Success has been harder to come by in Phuket. Natives of the Peruvian uplands, brugmansias need some protection from the tropical sun, and do better at higher altitudes. A pity since they are truly spectacular shrubs with huge, pendant, tubular flowers which hang directly down from woody stems. Moreover, they are fragrant and can, as my experience attests, be grown indoors.

Perhaps you should try them as house plants in Phuket. There are

now many hybrids. B. x candida is a fast grower (up to 3.5 meters tall) with dull green leaves and 20-30 centimeter long creamy white flowers. "Double White", from the same stable, has double blossoms and greyish foliage. Insignis, another hybrid, sometimes referred to in plant books as *suavolens*, has atypical trumpets that point outwards at 45 degrees from the branches. Spicily fragrant, they can be white, pink, or orange, though "Jamaica Yellow", the variety I probably grew in Spain, has pale golden blooms.

Yet another brugmansia, B. versicolor is the variety I remember on the slopes on Doi Inthanon: the largest species, it has flowers of a peachy apricot color that hang straight down in great profusion. Plenty of choice then, if you can locate specimens in the island's garden centers.

If you do find potted specimens, they are likely to be in the shaded area, away from direct sun and wind. For brugmansias are quite fragile, despite the fact that they can develop into large woody shrubs or small trees. The gray branches are brittle and the blooms are tissue-paper thin. The foliage, moreover, is easily reduced to tatters by strong winds. Before new growth begins, remove all weak, dead or overlapping stems.

If you want to try your hand at growing a brugmansia in a pot, give it a large container and water regularly. Its drooping leaves will soon let you know if the soil is allowed to dry out. And as with so many members of the solanaceae family, all parts are poisonous if ingested. Angels, though alluring, are not all they



Aboard the Blue World Witness a wild dolphin pod's beauty

AS SEA Shepherd and marine conservationists on the island prepare to battle the opening of a dolphinarium in Phuket, Captain Mike Fallows of Blue World Safaris continues to take hundreds of tourists to see a pod of these vastly intelligent marine mammals in the wild.

About 30 minutes after the captain's safety briefing – including sea sickness tablets and a run down about the on-boat bar – the 16.3 - meter multihull catamaran Blue World slides up against Koh Mai Thon.

"According to records, there has been a pod of dolphins living off Koh Mai Thon since at least 1970, and I am convinced that these dolphins are descendants of the same family," Capt Mike says.

When Blue

World Safaris first started visiting the pod more than two years ago, there were 22 individuals.

"But just over a year ago there was some kind of disaster, with some dolphins being washed up on the local beaches, and even one with a broken dorsal fin. We can only speculate as to what happened to them, but after these incidents the dolphins were

extremely reluctant to come to us. It was upsetting to see that their numbers had dropped to around 15!"

However, Capt Mike delightedly reports to the *Phuket Gazette* that within the last few months his team and countless tourists have spotted at least six dolphin calves.

"The pod is not only around

their previous numbers [now], but also looks healthy and once again are happy to approach the boat."

Koh Mai Thon, the play-ground for these graceful mammals, is about 14 kilometers from Phuket's Chalong Pier, which takes the speedy Blue World only about 30 minutes to reach.

than single hulled boats. We are able to carry up to 55 guests and her top speed of 27 knots brings islands previously only possible [to access] by liveaboards [from Phuket] within easy reach for a day trip," Capt Mike says. "For example, we can get to the Similans from Phuket in two hours and Phi Phi is just one hour away."

Dolphin spotting is usually in-

cluded on Mike's day trips to Phi Phi or Racha Noi, where guests swim, snorkel, kayak, free dive, scuba dive or even cliff jump, if they are so inclined. However, when it comes to dolphins, there are no guarantees.

"It's not always possible to see dolphins, but sightings are so exciting that we feel that the endeavor is well worth while. We are very restrained in how we approach the dolphins, always allowing them to swim to the boat voluntarily and breaking off when they lose interest. As a result, it is even more enjoyable to see them jump and play for us. I especially like when they roll over in the water to look at us," Capt Mikes says.

"There is a special affinity between man and dolphin and any encounter with wild dolphins is not only thrilling but leaves us feeling lucky and uplifted."

Though dolphins may perform even greater feats in marine parks, those moments lack the same wonder as seeing them play in the wild, because audience members can't hide from the fact that the animals suffer due to being kept in captivity.

In recognition of the rights dolphins should have, such as the same basic right of freedom as humans, India this year became the world's fourth country to ban keeping dolphins in captivity.

Even the United States' National Aquarium in Baltimore announced earlier this year that it is considering retiring its eight bottlenose dolphins and moving them to an oceanside sanctuary.

With the shift in mentality around the world on the rights of dolphins following the horrific documentary *The Cove* in 2009, perhaps tourists will bypass Chalong's proposed dolphinarium and see the creatures in the beauty of the wild from aboard *Blue World*.

Horrible history of captive dolphins in Thailand

DOLPHINS have been kept in captivity in Thailand since 1986. The first wild pink dolphin was caught and kept at Laem Singh in Chanthaburi at a venue that later became the Oasis Sea World. But it wasn't until recent years that interest in new dolphinariums developed within Thailand.

Several attempts to start up aquariums containing wild-caught dolphins in Phuket and Koh Samui did not eventuate.

Likewise, a Koh Samui resort obtained a locally caught wild pink dolphin in an attempt to increase tourist interest. While they claimed that they had rescued the dolphin from a collision with a fishing boat, the dolphin was trained to perform shows instead of being medically treated.

The animal was later confiscated and freed, with the resort's further plans of obtaining more dolphins being cancelled.

Prior to this, two enterprises initiated the exploitation of dolphins many years earlier: Oasis Sea World in Chanthaburi (established in 1991) and the "Sanctuary of Truth" in Pattaya (established in about 2001).

Oasis Sea World was able to export six pink dolphins to Singapore in 1999, despite the international regulatory body the Conference on International trade of Endangered Species (CITES) clearly forbidding the trade of wild-caught specimens for entertainment purposes.

The government did start enforcing the CITES regulations and local laws, ending the export of dolphins.

Oasis Sea World then looked into other options to increase profits. This resulted in the "Pattaya Dolphin World and Resort" being developed last year. A soft opening on August 12 this year saw the transfer of seven of 18 dolphins at Oasis Sea World.

Life & style Sentinels of the sea

IT MIGHT seem like the ocean is big and can take care of itself, but with tourism booming around Southeast Asia's tropical locales and many eager to experience the underwater wonders that the sea has to offer, someone has got to look out for it. This is where the Green Fins Association comes into the picture.

Operating under regional coordinators Reef-World, Green Fins has six regional arms operating in the Philippines, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Maldives, Vietnam and Thailand. Launched in Thailand in 2004, the program was spawned from the perceived need to not only educate dive operators about best practice, but encourage them to teach it to their customers.

Green Fins Thailand is a marine conservation initiative aimed at developing relationships with dive centers in order to establish a baseline code of conduct for them to adhere to. Green Fins strives to provide divers with the knowledge and training to meet environmentally sustainable standards.

Green Fins' self-proclaimed mission is, "To protect and conserve coral reefs by establishing and implementing environmen-

tally friendly guidelines to promote a sustainable diving tourism industry."

"Our target group is the diving and snorkeling tour operators in Phuket, Phang Nga, Surat Thani and Krabi," explains Green Fins project coordinator Petchrung Sukpong (Aey).

Specifically, they are looking to establish a relationship with, "the tour guide or the tour leader who is in the middle between the customer and the owner," says Aey.

■ Green Fins strives to provide divers with the knowledge and training to meet environmentally sustainable standards.

"We have the Green Fin assessment program... We try to evaluate the quality of diving or snorkeling and then we talk with the owner to improve the quality."

Aey pointed out that the assessments are made not to focus on the things they are doing wrong, but to try and provide feedback that will hopefully translate into positive change.

Training sessions range from four hours to a day and a half. Topics cover issues regarding general safety protocols, best practice to protect and conserve coral reefs, marine wildlife interaction and minimum discharge guidelines.

Dive operators benefit by being able to proudly announce their participation in the Green Fins program and display the Green Fins logo on their website or other promotional materials. Of course, the long-term health of the marine eco-system will ensure that their business has a resource to continue capitalizing on.

"Thailand is the only country that still continues [Green Fins] without funding from UNEP (United Nations Environment Program) since 2006 or 2007. The government tries to sustain this with a very small budget," notes Aey.

Everything that Green Fins accomplishes is with one government staff member and three volunteers.

There are currently more than 220 members throughout Thailand, 40 of which are in Phuket.

"This year we are focusing on snorkeling tour guides," says Aey.

She explained that they are creating a standard briefing for tour guides to deliver to their customers as well as printed educational materials.

Part of the Green Fins training is to encourage divers to provide



feedback via the Reef Watch survey method. Using an underwater writing tablet, divers can collect data about various aspects of the reef in order to determine the health of the site. They collect general characteristics such as location and orientation of the reef as well as reef type, reef coverage, the presence of indicator species, damage to the reef and amount of litter. The data can then be used to create a profile of the

site to enable monitoring of its health over time.

Green Fins also has a campaign to teach dive companies the simple process of creating their own ecofriendly, all-purpose cleaner for land a marine use. They hope to soon be able to create large batches of the cleaner to sell or give to operators.

England's Proud night in the pool

BENJAMIN Proud said he had surpassed his wildest dreams after landing a second win to guide England to a record-equalling gold tally as the swimming event ended in thrilling style at the Commonwealth Games on Tuesday.

The 19-year-old edged out Australians Cameron McEvoy and James Magnussen in the 50 metres freestyle in a time of 21.92 seconds to add to the 50 butterfly gold he won on Friday.

On a night where Games-best times, record-breaking medal hauls and exhilarating relays brought the curtain down on the event, the session belonged to England and it was a sparkling performance that stood out.

Proud, who also won a bronze in the 4x100 freestyle relay, had never reached a final at a major competition before arriving in Glasgow.

"I couldn't have asked for any-

thing more," he told Reuters.

"Coming into these Games it was all about preparation and trying to learn as much as I could.

"There are some great swimmers here and I didn't expect to make a final, let alone get a medal. To become the Commonwealth champion for the second time is unreal.

"It's given me that confidence boost I need for Rio 2016," said Proud in reference to the Olympics. "I just need to make sure I step up when it's needed - it's a big learning curve for me."

In addition England beat Australia to the men's 4x100 relay crown in a Games-best time to snatch a 10th gold in the pool, matching their best total from Manchester 2002.

Wales also enjoyed a good night, capturing a gold, silver and bronze.

The country's 40-year wait for a female swimming champion at the Games was ended on Monday when Jazz Carlin won the 800 freestyle.

A day later compatriot Georgia Davies captured the 50 backstroke title in a Games record 27.56 seconds, making it the first time Wales have clinched multiple swimming golds in the competition.

The 23-year-old had already won

a silver in the 100 on Saturday and secured another medal by overcoming her rival and friend Lauren Quigley of England.

"I'm so happy especially with the two of us battling against each other. Now we stand on the podium next to each other having both smashed the old British record," Davies told the BBC.

"It is back to training tomorrow but I don't want to stop swimming now because I want the fast times to keep coming."

McIlroy not one to rest on his laurels

RORY McIlroy embellished his status as one of the game's best players with his wire-to-wire win at the British Open nine days ago, but has put that behind him as he strives to achieve further goals before the end of this year.

The Northern Irishman has made a habit of stringing together red-hot runs of form during his burgeoning career and has set his sights on clinching a maiden World Golf Championships crown at this week's WGC-Bridgestone Invitational in Akron, Ohio.

"I've obviously had a bit of time to reflect after the (British) Open and everything, but just decided I wanted to move on and move forward," world number two McIlroy told reporters at Firestone Country Club on Tuesday.

'There's a lot of big tournaments left this year, a lot of golf left to play and a lot of things I still want to achieve. So I definitely wasn't going to dwell on what I'd done at Hoylake (venue for the British Open).

"I want to move on and start by

playing well again this week. I've never won a World Golf Championship. I've got three majors but never won one of these, so there's a lot of stuff still to play for."

Though McIlroy has suffered a few lapses in form, most notably last year when he struggled to adapt after changing his equipment manufacturer in January and having to cope with legal distractions, he has already achieved more than most of his peers.

STIRRING RUNS

Victories at the 2011 U.S. Open and the 2012 PGA Championship gave him two major trophies to cherish by the age of 24 and he followed up on both successes with a stirring run of form.

"I always feel like winning a major is almost a springboard in a way," said the 25-year-old, who has already triumphed seven times on the PGA Tour. "Especially after the (2012) PGA (Championship) at Kiawah, I didn't want to rest on that. I'd already had a pretty good year, but I wanted to just keep going.

"I set myself a goal. I want to win the FedExCup. I want to win the Race to Dubai. I want to keep that No.1 position in the world.

"Every time you have success, you need to reassess your goals because it's only halfway, twothirds through the season, and a lot of the goals that I set myself for the start of the year, I've achieved already."

McIlroy said he would only be ready to savour his successes once the season was over.

"You've got to keep moving forward and keep thinking about what you want to achieve from now until the end of the year," he said. "And then at the end of the year, you can really reflect on everything you've done and enjoy it.

"So it's a springboard. I feel like I've got a lot of momentum, and I can carry that through to the end of the year. Hopefully ride that and play some really good golf, and some golf similar to what you saw at Hoylake."

McIlroy is scheduled to tee off

with American world number six Matt Kuchar in Thursday's opening round at Firestone, one of his favourite venues on the PGA Tour.

"This is one of the best courses we play all year," said McIlroy, who recorded successive top-10 finishes at Firestone in (2010, 2011

and 2012. "I really look forward to this week.

"All the players really enjoy it because of the atmosphere, because you're guaranteed four days of golf. It's on a great golf course and guys just enjoy coming here and playing. It's a good test."

Ali banned from wearing 'Save Gaza' wristbands

ENGLAND batsman Moeen Ali wearing, displaying or conveying ties or causes has been banned from wearing wristbands featuring the slogans "Save Gaza" and "Free Palestine", the International Cricket Council (ICC) announced on Tuesday.

Moeen, who is Muslim and of Pakistani descent, helped raise funds for charities working with those affected by the three-week conflict with Israel.

He wore the wristbands on Monday's second day of the third test against India at Southampton.

Moeen, 27, risked disciplinary action under the ICC Code of Conduct, which forbids players messages through arm bands or other items on clothing or equipment without prior approval.

Messages related to political, religious or racial activities or causes are not allowed.

Moeen was backed by the England and Wales Cricket Board but was told by match referee David Boon to remove the wristband and not wear them again while playing for England.

"The ICC Equipment and Clothing Regulations do not permit the display of messages that relate to political, religious or racial actividuring an international match," an ICC statement said on Tuesday.

Bailey-Cole, Okagbare dominate 100 meter dash

USAIN Bolt's training partner Kemar Bailey-Cole took advantage of the Olympic champion's absence to coolly grab 100 meters gold at the Commonwealth Games on Monday but Veronica Campbell Brown failed to seal a Jamaican double.

With the six-time Olympic champion and world record holder Bolt only competing in the 4x100 relay after an injury-hit season, the 22-year-old Bailey-Cole seized his chance and sped to victory in a time of 10 seconds flat at Hampden Park.

"I didn't feel any pressure, I just went out there and executed

my own race, but it wasn't that perfect," he told reporters.
"The aim was to come out here and win and I did just that. I said to myself, 'these guys can't beat me'."

In the women's 100m final, Blessing Okagbare beat out Jamaican Veronica Campbell-Brown to take home the gold.

The blonde Nigerian stormed to victory in a Games record 10.85 seconds ahead of Campbell-Brown and fellow Jamaican Kerron Stewart.

"It is an honor and the reaction back home is going to be absolutely amazing," Okagbare said. "All my preparations have been based on these Commonwealth Games so I

had expected to run a fast time and I am so happy I can't explain. "Everything has come together, it all just fell in place." -Reuters
