Out-of-work locals blamed for plague of island villa robberies

THE increased number of unemployed people roaming Phuket's streets since the mass cleanup of the island's beaches has led to a plague of burglaries targeting villas in Cherng Talay, the tambon police superintendent confessed to the Gazette.

"We are not sure if every robbery is being reported to us, but we often receive complaints," Cherng Talay Police Superintendent Paworn Pornpromma said.

"We are doing our best to combat the problem, but it's difficult. There are just too many unemployed workers in the area due to the National Council for Peace and Order's cleanup of the beaches.'

The Cherng Talay Police Station has a total of 60 officers, 12 of which are patrol

"It isn't enough to handle the problem," Col Paworn said.

"Even when we catch these gangs of thieves, it doesn't stop. We arrested two gangs, and as soon as they were released on bail, they went straight back to robbing

Col Paworn explained that he has dispatched letters requesting more officers to be stationed in Cherng Talay, but with no

'We really can't wait anymore, the probon lem must be dealt with now," Col Paworn said.

For immediate results, the police were originally trying to bring 60 part-time volunteers on board, training them up as Civil Defense Volunteers. However, due to the upcoming high season, many qualified perspective volunteers are being hired to work in the tourism industry.

"At the moment we only have four Civil Defense Volunteers on duty in our area, but we are looking to add 10 more. These will be full-time volunteers, so they will receive some income, as well as food," said Col

Col Paworn cited the Koh Tao murders as an example of how completely an island's image can be destroyed by crime.

"I won't let that happen in Phuket, especially in my area of responsibility. Even though Cherng Talay is a bigger area, containing more people, I will not allow that to happen," Col Paworn said.

"Besides the 14 Civil Defense Volunteers, all I can do is hope that eventually we will get more officers. I think we need almost 50 more to adequately ensure the safety of everyone in our jurisdiction.

Man flees after killing estranged wife, in-laws

POLICE in Phang Nga, north of Phuket, are hunting a man who killed his estranged wife and her parents after he was allegedly denied entry into their house.

The bodies of Piyawan Jankerdkaew, 28; Prakob Jankerdkaew, 54; and Vas Jankerdkaew, 59, were found with gunshot wounds to the head Monday afternoon.

"We were called to the house by witnesses who heard gunshots. They told officers that Pornchai Pitak was the shooter," said Phang Nga Provincial Police Commander Chalit Kaewyarat.

After questioning witnesses, police learned that Mr Pornchai, 28, had recently separated from his wife, Mrs Piyawan, and that they had a 3-month-old son.

"We were told that Mr Pornchai came here to get his family back, but Ms Piyawan's parents would not allow him inside the house," Maj Gen Chalit explained.

"We believe that this was the

motive for the murders."

Mr Pornchai fled in a gold Toyota Vigo, plate number 410, which police found parked eight kilometers from the scene of the crime.

"The suspect was last seen running into the jungle. Officers are searching for him now," Gen Chalit confirmed.

Although the baby boy was in the house during the shooting, he did not sustain any injuries and is now under the care of a relative of Ms Piyawan, Gen Chalit told

Suspects arrested for hired killing

POLICE arrested a woman on Tuesday for hiring a hitman to kill a Phuket resident earlier this year.

Anyanee Jongmun, 29, was arrested in Srisoonthorn after the assassin, Chatchai Torkeaw, gave her name to police.

Mr Chatchai, was arrested on October 18 for the stabbing murder of 42-year-old Nongluk Thavorn, who was found in her garden screaming for help with a knife lodged in her head on May 29. She died as neighbors were

rushing her to Thalang Hospital.

"Mr Chatchai's testimony plus additional evidence gathered was more than enough for us to secure an arrest warrant for Ms Anyanee," Thalang Police Superintendent Sirisak Wasasiri told the Gazette. "However, we have yet to confirm her motive."

Ms Anyanee was charged with employing another person to commit a crime and premeditated murder. She has denied the charges. - Thawit Bilabdullar

Man, wife charged with rape, await court date in jail

A MAN charged with raping a 14-year-old undocumented Myanmar migrant worker and his wife, who helped him carry out the crime, remain incarcerated pending a court date.

"We are still preparing evidence against both suspects," Lt Palita Kangsing of the Khuk Khak Police told the *Gazette* on October 17.

Lt Palita said that Mr Ko-Nai and his wife, both Myanmar nationals, would remain jailed in Phang Nga Prison until the case went to court.

According to the 14-year-old girl's testimony, Mr Ko-Nai and his wife offered to take her to a market near where she stayed. On the way back, Mr Ko-Nai raped her.

Mr Ko-Nai was charged with the rape of a minor, while his wife was charged with aiding and abetting a person to commit rape, under section 277 of the Thai Criminal Code.

If convicted, both face fines of 8,000-40,000 baht; imprisonment of 4-20 years; or both. – *Natthaphol Wittayarungrote*

Two killed in boat crash

Bodies of Korean tourists pulled from wreckage off Phuket

SEARCH and rescue divers on Tuesday recovered the bodies of two Korean tourists from the wreckage of a speedboat that sank after it crashed into a fishing trawler in Phang Nga Bay on October 19.

The bodies of Ko Min Woo, 31, and An Sun Yong, 28, were found in the sunken vessel after two days of intense searches for them on the surface of the Andaman Sea.

The trawler, which suffered only minor damage in the crash, rescued the six speedboat crew members and 35 tourists of varying nationalities – including Australians, Chinese, French, Japanese and British – after the collision.

The captain then contacted Phuket Marine Police, who had their first ships on site in about 30 minutes, confirmed Phuket Marine Police Deputy Commander Prasert Srikhunrat.

The 39-year-old speedboat driver, Surat Matosot, was detained by Krabi Provincial Police.

Mr Surat has since blamed the

collision on a plastic bag.

"About 20 minutes after we departed from Maya Bay [on Koh Phi Phi] the sky got very dark and a black plastic bag flew under my seat. I was worried it would fly into the tourists, so I decided to pick it up," Mr Surat

told Krabi Provincial Police on Monday.

"I caught the bag, but when I got back into my seat I realized I was heading straight for the fishing boat."

Mr Surat explained that he attempted to turn, but at least one

of the boat's propellers became caught in a rope connecting the trawler to its fishing net below.

"I lost control and crashed into the boat," he said.

Mr Surat is expected to face charges for reckless driving resulting in death.

Tiger attacks Aussie tourist inside cage for photo-op

AN AUSTRALIAN tourist was mauled by a tiger at Phuket's Tiger Kingdom Tuesday afternoon, Kathu District Chief Sayan Chanachaiwong confirmed to the *Gazette*.

The tiger attacked Paul Goudie, 49, after he climbed into the cage with the animal at about 1pm to have his photograph taken.

Mr Goudie was taken to Phuket International Hospital for treatment. He received 29 stitches in his leg.

Mr Goudie remained under observation as of Wednesday evening.

"I visited Tiger Kingdom today and found all the ownership documents for the tigers in order. However, we will be reviewing their safety procedures," Mr Sayan said. "This should not have happened. We must ensure that this does not occur again."

Human trafficking victims relocated, await deportation

THE first wave of human trafficking victims have been moved from Phang Nga, north of Phuket, to Ranong and Songkhla provinces, where they will await deportation.

Police questioned 80 of the human trafficking victims that were rounded up in Phang Nga. Most of the refugees claimed to have come from Bangladesh, while a few confirmed that they had come from the war-torn Rakhine state in Myanmar.

"We had to move 56 of the people we questioned to other provinces, as our facilities here cannot handle the number of refugees we have taken in," Takuapa District Chief Manit Pianthong told the

"They will be held at the Southern Welfare and Vocational Training Centers for Women in Ranong and Songkhla until we are able to deport them."

Mr Manit was unclear about the specific destination to which the refugees would be deported.

The remaining victims are being held in temporary custody at the Takuapa Community Hall.

Kingpin identified as inmate

THE kingpin of a major drug ring operating out of a Thai prison was identified after a series of raids in Phuket, police said.

The raids, which began October 12, saw more than 2 kilograms of ya ice (crystal methamphetamine) seized.

"The major dealers arrested implicated a female inmate, who we will name only as 'Ms B' until we conclude our case, as the kingpin managing the network from inside a prison," said Phuket Provincial Police Commander Patchara Boonyasit.

Maj Gen Patchara declined to specify where the inmate was serving her sentence, saying only that it was not in southern Thailand.

"Once we are sure that we have all the evidence we need, Ms B will appear before a judge to hear additional charges added to her current sentence," he said.

"The total amount of ya ice seized has a street value of about 3 million baht."

Phuket City Police first arrested "Mr A", 28, on Sunday at Karn Keha housing estate in Rassada with 0.17

grams of ya ice. Police are protecting the identity of the man due to the testimony he provided.

It was from questioning Mr A that police were able to continue to unravel the drug-dealing network that included users and dealers in Thalang, Phuket Town and Patong.

"A total of eight people were charged with possession of a

Category 1 drug, and a total of six were charged for possession with intent to sell," Patong Police Deputy Superintendent Khunnadet Nanongkhai said.

Gen Patchara assured the public that police would not rest in their mission to crack down on drug networks operating on the island.

"I have ordered both Phuket City

Police and Patong Police to thoroughly question all suspects arrested," said Gen Patchara.

"The amount of ya ice we have seized is quite small, but I am sure these arrests will lead to bigger hauls."

Police did not reveal when they would press additional charges against Ms B.

Illegal elephants rushed off island ahead of raid

SIX illegally-imported elephants were rushed out of Noparat Elephant Camp and off Phuket late on the night of October 17.

The pachyderms were moved off the island ahead of a Phuket Livestock Office raid that was planned for the following morning.

"We can confirm that the ephants were moved from the island and taken to Krabi province. The owner has secured a permit allowing them to stay there," Phuket Livestock Chief Weerasit Putthipairoj said.

The illegal elephants came to officials' attention after locals filed a complaint about the smell, as well as the amount of noise they were making.

The Noparat Elephant Camp, a new enterprise based in Kathu, does have five legally-registered elephants, confirmed Mr Weerasit.

"Those elephants have been checked. Their microchips have confirmed that they are legal and registered in our database," Mr Weerasit said.

"However, I still believe that there are many elephants being smuggled onto the island. The limit on the number of elephants allowed is difficult to manage."

Mr Weerasit explained that epending on the type of complaint filed about an elephant, a different regulatory agency would have to manage the situation, which often complicates matters. Additionally, the regulation citing the maximum number of elephants on the island does not stipulate a penalty for a breach of the regulation. However, a past case saw the owner fined 5,000 baht.

"I wish we could amend the regulation so that it is more suitable for our current needs," Mr Weerasit said.

Kamala Beach jet-skis get green light for now

Jet-ski operators are allowed to park their craft on Kamala Beach until the end of the month, confirmed Governor Nisit Jansomwong to the *Gazette* on October 18.

Watchara Koysakul, head of the Kamala Jet-Ski Club, said that it was a similar situation to the one in Patong, where jet-ski operators were allowed to return to work in August as long as their vehicles were parked at the tree line and not left on the beach.

"The difference is that all of the beachfront land in Kamala is private, so we can't park our jet-skis off the beach like they do," said Mr Watchara..

"We have no problem just bringing them down to the water when customers want to use them. However, it's just not feasible here.

"We are thankful that the military and other government organizations are making the beaches nicer. However, we need help – we are living hand-to-mouth right now."

The move to allow operators to leave their trailers and jet-skis on the beach comes as the provincial government attempts to finalize a plan for all of the island's beaches.

Gov Nisit confirmed that he will have a meeting this month with the Army and Navy to establish a comprehensive plan for all beach vendors.

"We will find a balance between meeting the demands of the locals who procure their livelihood from the beach and maintaining the sands for public use," Gov Nisit said.

Col Somchai Ponatong, the top-ranking soldier on the island, confirmed that the Army would support the governor's decision on how best to manage Phuket's beaches.

"For now, as long as the jet-ski operators aren't causing any problems or building permanent structures, we won't take action against them," Col Somchai said.



Neglected candles set island home ablaze

A PHUKET homeowner issued a warning about leaving candles unattended after his house was set on fire today by candles left burning for a personal Chinese shrine.

No one was injured in the blaze. However, an estimated 100,000 baht of damage was done, Lt Col Sanit Nookong of the Thalang Police told the *Gazette*.

'My wife, children and I left our house to visit a dim sum shop early this morning [October 17]; we lit the candles to honor the gods before leaving," said Pissanu Chonsiri, 44.

"At about 7:50 we were alerted by our neighbors about the fire – they told us they saw smoke coming from the house."

It took firefighters about 45 minutes to put out the blaze.

"We have learned our lesson, and would like to take this opportunity to warn others to be careful," said Mr Pissanu.

Last month, unattended burning candles set an air conditioning sales and repair shop ablaze in Rassada, causing about 300,000 - Thawit Bilabdullar baht in damages.

This year will see twice the number of ninth months in the Chinese lunar calendar – a phenomenon that only occurs every 99 years – and twice the number of visits from the gods.

Patong's first mayor cremated, honored



Mr Pian died at the age of 70, after nearly two decades as Patong Mayor.

Keesin, was cremated at Wat Laem Singh in Phuket on October

Mr Pian died from a heartvalve disease in his home at the Rock Garden housing estate on October 7 at the age of 70.

A fai prachataan provided by the Royal Household Bureau was used to ignite the cremation pyre in recognition of Mr Pian's special contribution to society.

During the nine days leading up to the cremation, hundreds of people gathered at the Keesin family home in Patong to pay their respects.

Mr Pian was born on February 12, 1944, and fathered five children with his wife, Srikham Keesin.

Two of his sons, Preechavude "Prab" and Pattawee, are still facing mafia charges for their alleged role in the island's taxi cartel.

Before his political career, Mr Pian served in the Royal Thai Army from 1965 to 1967 as part of his compulsory military service. He

PATONG'S first mayor, Pian then volunteered to serve in the Army during the Vietnam War from 1967 to 1969. He was stationed at the Khao Chon Kai Army base in Kanchanaburi province.

Mr Pian's political career started on February 12, 1974 when he ousted Fad Krailerd for the position of *Phu Yai Baan* (village head) of Village 3, in what has since become Phuket's leading resort town. He maintained the position until 1993 when he became the kamnan for the Patong sub-district, replacing Wichan Sawatdirak.

Mr Pian's next move was an enormous leap for Patong, as he was elected the town's first mayor in 1995. He then served five terms totalling nearly two decades.

Mr Pian and his two sons were to face charges of extortion and other criminal activities carried out by a criminal association on October 8 – one day after Mr Pian died.

Mr Prab and Mr Pattawee were given a grace period of one week to mourn their father's death.

Fight to save

SIGNS of an environmental disaster brought on by rapid development on the Phi Phi archipelago are emerging on land and at sea. The once pristine islands – renown for their stunning karst topography and classic blue Andaman waters – are under serious threat. The Gazette's Chutharat Plerin reports.

OFFICIALS are pleading for help in tackling the array of environmental disasters that plague the tourist-popular Phi Phi archipelago especially its largest island, Phi Phi Don.

Considering the more than 1,000 visitors that arrive on the island daily - a number that does not include the uncounted number of tourists who arrive directly on the beaches by way of the hundreds of speedboats and yachts it becomes clear that Phi Phi is under an enormous amount of unsustainable pressure, Ao Nang Administration Organization (OrBorTor) President Pankum Kittithonkun told the Gazette.

RUBBISH

Phi Phi produces an average of 25 tonnes of trash a day. That numbers jumps to about 40 tonnes during the high season, Mr Pankum explained.

The abundance of rubbish is to the point that even Wikitravel makes mention of it: "Unfortunately, there is still plenty of rubbish on the beaches.'

"Tourists must help us create and maintain a pristine island environment. There is too much rubbish for us to manage - making it necessary for tourists to help out by taking their trash off the island when they leave," Mr Pankum said this week.

"I have already asked tour operators to educate their guests, but nothing changes. Tourists continue to leave their trash on the

All tourists arriving on the island pay a 20-baht fee at Ton Sai Pier to assist in "keeping Koh Phi Phi clean", according to a posted sign. Though there is often skepticism about where the money goes due to the amount of rub-



bish found scattered across the island, Mr Pankum confirmed that the entire fee is used for waste management.

"As soon as we arrive on the island, we have to pay a 20-baht entrance fee. Nevertheless, the streets and the beaches are extremely dirty. There is not even one public bin anywhere in the center of town!" a concerned person, who declined to be named, wrote to the Gazette.

"Moreover, some hotels do not hesitate to dump their own trash in areas where [trash] collection is not done, creating... mounds of decomposing bags under the

The fee at Ton Sai Pier was introduced in December 2012. A year later, the Ao Nang OrBorTor had collected 8 million baht.

"We collect up to 20,000 baht a day from tourists at the pier. The

money is then used to pay a private company to haul the rubbish from the island to the mainland in Krabi to be disposed of," Mr Pankum said.

The boat takes about 25 tonnes of trash from the island daily, weather permitting. Ao Nang OrBorTor pays 600,000 baht per month for the service. During the high season, an Ao Nang *OrBorTor* boat is used to help transport the overflow of rubbish.

"The OrBorTor has collected 6mn baht so far this year, but we've paid more than 16mn baht for waste management for Phi Phi and Ao Nang," Mr Pankum said. "There is a problem with tour speedboat operators dropping tourists off on the beach instead of bringing them to the pier to pay the 20 baht fee."

The largest producers of rubbish, however, are not the tourists,

Backhoe helps to bring public beach land back

ONE illegal building was removed from Phuket's Nai Yang Beach by officials on October 17.

Daeng Lawlang, the owner of the illegal building, was ordered to remove it by October 16.

Though Mr Daeng has a Sor Kor 1 land title for about two rai of beachfront property, the building and some smaller structures were constructed beyond his property boundaries.

they are the businesses on the island – especially hotels and restaurants.

To encourage businesses to be more proactive in recycling and minimizing the amount of waste they produce, the Ao Nang *OrBorTor* is considering implementing special rates for trash collection at hotels and restaurants.

"We are thinking of collecting fees based on the weight of the trash we have to remove from the island for them. The more they produce, the more they will pay," Mr Pankum said.

WASTEWATER

In Ao Nang, on mainland Krabi, there is a wastewater treatment plant that is able to handle about 3,000 cubic meters of wastewater per day – not nearly enough, according to Mr Pankum.

However, the situation on Phi Phi Don is even worse, he noted.

"We have no wastewater management plant there. Our only hope is that hotels, restaurants and other businesses act responsibly – but I have no faith in them," Mr Pankum told the *Gazette*.

"They of course have to treat their own wastewater before releasing it into the sea, but they very well could just be turning the devices on before officers arrive to check them."

Mr Pankum has denied that brown water recently seen in Loh Dahlum Bay, the second main bay on Phi Phi Don, was wastewater.

"The brown water seen during the [southwest] monsoon season is only a plankton bloom," Mr Pankum said.

The off-brown water visible in photos of Loh Dahlum Bay is simi-

lar to that seen at Patong Beach in August last year.

Dr Pornsri Suthanaruk, director of the Phuket Environmental Office Region 15, explained at the time that excessive amounts of nutrients in the form of nitrogen and phosphorus likely fed plankton growth in the bay, which was further catalyzed by days of bright supplies.

Mr Pankum was unable to confirm the origins of the nutri-

ents in Loh Dahlum Bay. However, he noted that officers from the Krabi Environmental Office had come to check the water quality about four months ago, and that everything tested had fallen within acceptable levels.

"If you see any brown water, please let me know and I'll call the officer so they can check the water quality again," Mr Pankum said.

A budget of 371mn baht was requested in 2012 by the Ao Nang

OrBorTor for a wastewater plant on Phi Phi Don. However, the local government was not able to set aside the necessary 37.1mn baht from its own budget for the project to be approved.

"I couldn't provide the money necessary from our side, so the project failed," admitted Mr Pankum.

"All I can do at this point is have officers regularly check on restaurants and hotels to ensure

that they are treating their wastewater."

STRUGGLING FOR SOLUTIONS

"Year after year, Phi Phi Island is losing its beauty. Without more responsible and strict management of the environment, Thailand will lose one of its most beautiful places," the concerned visitor wrote to the *Gazette*.

After being notified of the current situation, Capt Bancha Daowsook, commander of the Royal Thai Marine Corps based in Krabi, vowed to help the Ao Nang *OrBorTor*.

"I took up my position on October 1. I have yet to receive any complaints about Phi Phi being dirty. However, I will look into it, and if the Ao Nang *OrBorTor* needs any help, I will support them," said Capt Bancha.

The fundamental issue is that the budget allocated for Ao Nang and Phi Phi is based on its registered population, not on the number of people it plays host to every year, Mr Pankum said.

Ao Nang and Phi Phi share the same budget, which is managed by the Ao Nang *OrBorTor*.

"Phi Phi's slice of the budget is based on a few thousand people, but the island takes care of the whole world," Mr Pankum said.

"I don't know what to do. People from everywhere come to our home, but some of them don't care what condition they leave it in. The 20 baht per person really isn't enough for us to manage the waste of the entire island.

"I can only do my best to ensure the island suffers as little as possible and survives as long as possible."

Phuket loses one of its 'original' expats: Eric Snyder

WELL known, long-term Phuket expat Eric Snyder, 70, has departed the island he loved, succumbing to skin cancer earlier last week.

Eric Snyder arrived in Phuket in 1975 and remained in residence here for 39 years. Initially, he lived with a Muslim family on Kamala Beach for several years, growing his own food and catching his dinner from the abundant fish in the local waters. He was sure he had "found paradise".

Some years later, he bought a piece of land to set up his own home, but lost the property in one of those infamous Phuket land title disputes. He then decided to study Thai law and learn to speak, read and write the language so he could protect others from similar abuse by a less-than-transparent system.

He helped many hundreds of people during his more than 30 years in business.

"I plan to leave my estate to help those with the most needs on Phuket," he explained. The list would include the Home for the Elderly, he said.

Eric's cremation was set for October 25. Friends were welcomed to visit at any time to pay their respects. – *Bruce Stanley*



Officials ponder tourists' safety at Promthep Cape

OFFICIALS are considering more options to boost safety at Phuket's iconic Promthep Cape after three tourists – two Chinese and one Thai – slipped from the rocks last weekend. However, building a protective fence remains off the table.

"During the [southwest] monsoon season, there is a lot of rain and the waves are high. These conditions make it easy for accidents to occur when tourists walk down to the cape to take photos," Rawai Mayor Aroon Solos told the *Gazette* on Monday.

Several signs have been installed near the cape, written in Thai and English, urging people to take caution.

"We plan to add Chinese to the signs to ensure that tourists are receiving the message and clearly understanding the potential dangers," Mayor Aroon said.

"There are security guards that patrol the area near the viewpoint, but no one down at the cape. We will have one stationed in

that area soon."

Mayor Aroon, however, confirmed that a fence would not be built

"We will look for another way to enhance safety, one that will not alter the beautiful, natural landscape," he said. The tourists who slipped from the rocks over the weekend sustained minor injuries, but were still taken to Phuket Provincial Administration Organization (*OrBorJor*) Hospital for treatment.

Earlier this year, 25-year-old Teerawat Prasomsub slipped from

the cape's rocks, but was found safe – still drunk – a few hours later.

Just two days earlier, Somchai Yungtala was dragged out to sea while fishing from the rocks. His body was found washed ashore Ya Nui Beach two days later.

Peeping tom arrested for public toilet infiltration

A MYANMAR national has confessed to watching women use a public restroom to fuel his sexual fantasies.

The 18-year-old, named by police only as "Mr Joe", was caught looking through a crack in the wall of the bathroom at Star Wash car care on October 16.

"I saw his eyes watching me through the crack while I was using the bathroom," said a woman, who declined to be named. "I shouted for help."

Mr Joe was quickly apprehended, and later confessed to police.

"He told us that he regularly watched female customers use the restroom while masturbating. He also said that he had never considered doing anything other than watching them," said Lt Suchart Leucha of the Thalang Police.

Mr Joe was taken to Thalang Police Station and charged with disturbing the peace in a public place, under Section 397 of the Thai Criminal Code.

He faces a month in jail, a fine of 1,000 baht or both.

Pirated goods rounded up in Patong raid

ABOUT 1,500 fake brand-name items were seized from three shops in Patong on October 16.

"The retail value of the counterfeit goods is about 1 million baht," said Kitti Sapaothong, deputy commander of the Economic Crime Division of the Royal Thai Police.

The majority of the items seized were polo shirts. However, bags, purses, luggage, watches and other items were also collected.

Thitika Katpituktam, 23, was the sole person arrested in conjunction with the raid on the shops.

Ms Thitika will face charges for selling fake copyrighted goods, which carries a penalty of up to two years imprisonment, a 400,000 baht fine or both, said police. – *Thawit Bilabdullar*

Rice farmers begin to get subsidy cash

RICE farmers throughout the nation on Monday began receiving a government subsidy of 1,000 baht per rai of land – up to a maximum of 15 rai – per household.

The registration period for the subsidy will continue until November 15, reported The Nation.

The money will be distributed via Bank for Agriculture and Agricultural Cooperatives branches.

Eligible farmers have been told to bring their identification cards, rice-grower certifications and BAAC passbooks.

UK cops 'to observe'

PRIME Minister Prayuth Chanocha has disputed foreign media reports from London claiming British police would be "allowed to help" with the probe into the recent Koh Tao murders, instead reiterating that only British observers would be permitted in the police investigation.

PM Prayuth said on October 18 that he had spoken to British Prime Minister David Cameron at the Asia-Europe Meeting (Asem), which had concluded in Milan the day before, about the recent murders of the two Britons, Hannah Witheridge and David Miller, on the resort island, reported The Nation.

PM Prayuth said Mr Cameron told him that he saw nothing wrong with the Thai justice system, but that many Brits had suspicions about the police investigation.

"I told him that there is no problem with this case because we follow the law. We agreed that Britain will send in observers," PM Prayuth said, adding that the British Embassy, Thai police and the Foreign Ministry were working together on this matter.

He also told reporters that Mr Cameron expected the British public to "take some more time to understand this matter".

The premier rejected claims that the police had arrested scapegoats for the murders.

He said he did not think the police would dare do such a thing in a high-profile case like this.

The news follows a BBC report on October 18 that said that British police would travel to Thailand to assist with the investigation.

It reported that PM Prayuth, who had previously objected to inviting British investigators, changed his stance after meeting with Mr Cameron in Italy.

"There are two areas we are particularly concerned about," the BBC quoted a diplomatic source as saying. "One is the verification of the DNA samples of the suspects... the second is the investigation into allegations of the mistreatment of the suspects."

The Myanmar suspects said they were forced to confess to the murders, but the police said the confessions were valid and denied reports of a retraction.

"What the [British] prime minister secured this morning was an agreement from the Thai prime minister that we can send some British police investigators to Koh Tao to work with the Royal Thai Police on this," the British diplomatic source said.

The source stressed that "obviously it is for the Thai authorities to lead and carry out that judicial process", but said it was important that it was "fair and transparent".



Pattani school fire strike suspects caught, confess

RELEVANT authorities have detained suspects who allegedly set fire to several schools in Pattani province earlier this month.

Deputy Prime Minister and Defence Minister Prawit Wongsuwan said on Monday that the suspects had confessed to the crimes, reported The Nation.

"During the interrogation, it became clear that they committed the arson attacks out of a misunderstanding related to the many deaths in the southernmost region," Mr Prawit said.

"After the misunderstanding was cleared, they were repentant."

He said the number of suspects was between six and eight.

The men have confessed to setting six schools ablaze in Thung Yang Daeng district in Pattani province on October 12.

B60mn set aside to stamp out road deaths, accidents

THE Safer Roads Foundation (SRF) has earmarked more than 60 million baht to put toward efforts to reduce road deaths in motion Foundation. The fund is Thailand, where an average of also intended to turn Thailand into more than 14,000 locals and foreigners are either killed or fatally injured in accidents every year.

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), Thailand came in third in world rankings last year in terms of the highest number of road deaths.

"I visited Thailand and saw many risks and danger in the traffic, which is supported by the rising number of deaths. So I chose to support Thailand in reducing traffic accidents," SRF Director Michael Woodford said.

His foundation is providing more than 60mn baht to help cut

down on road accidents in Thailand with the help of the Transport Ministry and the Thai Health Proa model of road safety, reported The Nation.

Mr Woodford said people should be aware of the rising number of road accidents and do what they can to resolve the problem.

Bangkok, Chiang Mai province and Surat Thani's Koh Samui district will be the first areas to introduce improvements in road accident hotspots.

"In order to reduce accidents, not only do individuals need to improve their behavior on the road, but all relevant organizations also need to work together," Mr Woodford said.

Fishing around for the answers

FIRST PERSON

UNDER Phuket's maritime fishing laws, no commercial fishing is allowed in the Andaman Sea within 5,400 meters of the coast (only 3,000 meters for Phuket), but as many people know, commercial fishing trawlers are constantly flouting this law to take advantage of the abundance of fish in these waters, where there is less competition.

One of the reasons commercial trawlers continue to break the law is because the charges they face are miniscule when compared to the profits they can reap from fishing in illegal waters.

As chief of the Krabi Fishery Management Center, I am at a loss as to how to deal with this problem effectively, because the charges that trawlers and their crews face are so ineffective, they do not act as a de-

terrent. There are good reasons for pro-[illegal fishing] effectecting areas near the coast. Not only does it protect the natural habitat, but it also allows local fisherman to practice sustainable ineffective, they do not fishing methods that have been around for centuries. Many local

fishermen still rely on traditional methods and they have to be protected from those trawling methods which can damage local nets placed closer to the coast.

My job is a difficult one. So many times we have arrested crews of commercial trawlers,

immediately released. The problem is that there are many loopholes in the current maritime law for illegal fishing. First, even though the law says we can seize the boats of those caught fishing illegally, this is almost always impossible. That's because the same

> law says the boat can only be seized if the owner is on board. In almost all cases, the boat is rented out to fishermen, which means the real owner of the boat cannot be held responsible, and therefore the boat cannot be seized.

In addition, fishermen who are

charged under Section 32 of Thailand's maritime law often get off with only a very small fine to pay. While the law allows for a fine of up to 10,000 baht and a jail sentence of up to six months, or both, if the accused fishermen admit to the crime they will only only to find that they have been have to pay a fine of between 2,500 and 3,000 baht. They can then return immediately to work with no repercussions, which makes them less afraid to break the law again.

The problems surrounding the law have been brought up in meetings with local government on a number of occasions, but so far our concerns have been met with silence. The only thing we can do right now is deal with the problem on a day-by-day basis.

Local fishermen act as our eyes. Fishing platforms set up in restricted zones are often damaged by commercial trawlers, so many local fisherman are ready to report illegal practices. Sadly though, this is not enough, and many vessels are able to get away scot-free.

These laws have been put in place for a reason and everyone should respect the rules, which, in my opinion, treat everyone fairly. We all need to take care of the resources available to us, if we want them to last. It's up to all of us to work together, if we want to solve this problem for the

Horrific holiday

WE ARE a senior Australian couple who have been lucky enough to have visited Phuket several times over the last ten years. This year we, and our son in a separate booking, paid upfront for eight weeks accommodation in Nai Harn, an area we love.

The first six weeks were fine. A number of Muay Thai fighters from various countries stayed at the resort while they attended camps. They were healthy, respectful guests. Most other guests were very short term.

Then, some young Australian men paid for three months' stay to "do Muay Thai".

The men had soon subjected guests to their shouting - some of the dirtiest language we have ever heard – day and night. They ran riot, monopolizing the pool, bringing girls home every night and banging on doors.

We asked the staff, who were aware of the problem, for help. Nothing was done. We were told to call reception when they got noisy, even though they could be heard all over the resort. At night, the phone went unanswered.

The men constantly referred to the Thai staff in the vilest language imaginable, as they were upset with the air conditioning in their room. You would not be able to publish what was said about the female staff. Their behavior was disgusting and offensive. We have great respect for our Thai friends.

We went ahead and paid for villa upgrades to try to get away from the problem, but it only grew worse. Within two weeks, we asked for a refund so we could leave. Unfortunately, our son had

already paid for a 10-night upgrade the previous day.

The manager/owner refused to give us a refund or compromise in any way. She said she had blocked off our rooms. There were several empty villas and rooms, so she had lost nothing. She would not talk to us, or even face us, and made the staff tell us that she had gone away.

My husband recently had a mini stroke, so we could no longer take the stress of our surroundings. We left, losing 1,500 Australian dollars (42,600 baht) in the process.

We are not wealthy people, the loss was difficult.

Some of the staff were delightful. One said, "Why do the good people go and bad people stay?"

Why indeed? Do we have any redress in this appalling situation? Phuket's tourism numbers are down, and this unprofessional attitude by some resort management might be one reason why.

I hope that our story can help Phuket realize that they should treat tourists with respect, especially those tourists who pay the island the same courtesy.

If this resonates with anyone at all in the Phuket tourism industry then it can only be good for the island, a place that we still love and enjoy with regard to the many wonderful experiences we have had over the years, and the lovely people here we call friends.

If you are caught driving, you will face a fine of up to 2,000 baht.

When you go to renew your registration, you will only have to pay an overdue tax of 1 per cent per month that it is overdue. This applies to cars and motorcycles.

The tax rate for a motorcycle is 100 baht per year, which means

Can foreigners renew their driver's licence with a yellow tabien baan?

EVERY year I renew my driver's tion – even to renew my driver's licence by using my yellow tabien licence in previous years. baan (house registration document), issued in my own name, as proof of my address.

I have been issued a tabien baan as I own a condominium, bought and owned as foreign freehold in my name. I also hold an education visa.

This year I was surprised: my tabien baan was not accepted as proof enough of where I live. I was asked to also provide a proof of residency letter.

I have used my yellow tabien baan when buying a motorbike, signing up for an internet connec-

Is this a new rule – that I must have the proof of residency letter from Phuket immigration, even if I have a *tabien baan* issued in my name?

Who can I ask about this when I go to renew my licence?

Konlavut Jattutasri, Registrar of the Licensing Division at the Phuket Provincial Land Transport Office, replies:

In general, a foreigner listed as the property owner with a yellow

tabien baan does not need proof of address from immigration.

However, a foreigner listed only as a resident at an address, not as the property owner, definitely does need the letter from immigration.

In your case, there might have been a mistake somewhere. It is possible that, in the past, our officers did not check carefully enough to see whether or not your name was listed as the property owner, or just as a resident at the address for which the tabien baan was issued.

However, if you are listed in the yellow book as the "owner" and our staff still asked for proof of address from immigration, please come and see me and I will take care of it.

Tourism meets toilet humor

EFFORTS by the National Council for Peace and Order (NCPO) to clean up corruption in Phuket have had some dramatic results, steering the island toward sustainability – at least for the time being.

Unfortunately, some smaller destinations, including the Phi Phi Island chain, continue to suffer from unregulated development and mass tourism on a scale that has led to what can only be described as an environmental crisis [see pages 6-7].

For many first-time visitors to Phi Phi Don, the most striking revelation might be how over-developed Ton Sai, the gateway to the island, has become – a stark contrast to what one would expect after looking at travel brochures.

When it comes to destinations, tourists are shoppers, and branding still plays a key role in the process. To many Western ears, the name Phi Phi sounds exotic, like Fiji, Tahiti, Tonga or Bali.

Of course, native English speakers are quick to realize that Phi Phi also sounds strikingly like the phrasal verb "pee pee" in English; meaning: to urinate.

This association is not limited to native speakers. "I need to go to Phi Phi Island" is a phrase commonly used by polite Thai girls to indicate they need to go to the bathroom, even in places as far-flung as Pattaya and Chiang Mai.

Potential tourists who make the computer click to check out promotional images of Phi Phi's stunning limestone cliffs no doubt find them very compelling. Thus, the random word association is dismissed as a quirk – or even considered somewhat charming.

But charm quickly turns to repulsion when they disembark at Ton Sai Bay and see brown water staining the bay.

It is sad indeed that Phi Phi's unregulated post-tsunami development has been fuelled by such greed and ignorance.

Despite all of the devastation wrought by the region's worst natural disaster, the tsunami did literally wash the sands of Phi Phi clean and provide a chance to begin anew.

With its Designated Areas for Sustainable Tourism Administration (Dasta), Thailand is the only country in Asean to have an agency dedicated to supporting environmental development and conservation for sustainable tourism. Established just a year before the tsunami, the agency was keen to get involved in the re-development of the island.

Sadly, the powers-that-be on Phi Phi at the time had no desire to work with them, opting instead to re-develop under the same mindset that had turned the island's main commercial strip into a dump in the first place.

However, both local residents and tourists are keen to see the NCPO step in to help restore the island's natural beauty.

Bring on the heavyweights

DESPITE a fall this year in Thailand's overall sales of motorcycles and automotive parts, big-bike sales are continuing to thrive.

In Phuket, a relatively new destination for bikes over 500cc, brands like Ducati and Triumph are pushing the companies' marketing strategies to make their famed machines evermore accessible to everyone.

"Ducati's market strategy is to move toward developing models that are much more affordable," says Suriya Thamrangsri, managing director of HKT Motor Phuket, distributors of Ducati on the island.

"Our next model, the 2015 Ducati Scrambler, which we will launch later this month, is certainly priced toward the midrange market."

The 2015 Ducati Scrambler is a lightweight 800cc L-Twin-engined bike that harks back to the company's minimalist, single-cylinder dirt-road scramblers of the 1960s and 70s - ideal for Phuket's rougher terrain.

Compared to the majority of other Ducati bikes, the Scrambler is very competitively priced, coming in at about 400,000 baht.

"This bike is a classic based on an oldstyle model, but using the latest Ducati technology," says Mr Suriya.

"It's perfect for Phuket, all you need is a helmet and casual clothes like a t-shirt and jeans – and you're away," he says, echoing the Scrambler commercial, which features two free-spirited couples heading off on their

Scramblers into the the wilds of North America to the soundtrack, "I am Free" by the Dandy Warhols.

Ducati Phuket first opened in 2010 and sold 40 bikes in the first year – double its target.

All its models were imported over the first two years, and while the brand was able to build sales on the back of its name, Suriya admits that initially they were only selling to a niche market of wealthy people.

"In the big-bike market, Ducati is in a 'super class' - it's the Ferrari of motorbikes - so when we launched here [in Phuket] everybody knew the brand very well," he says.

"However, we were selling primarily to the rich – to those people who could afford to pay the higher price for an imported bike."

Two years on and the majority of Ducati's bikes are made in Thailand. Only a few – like the 1199 Panigale superbike – are still imported.

Mr Suriya says the move to local production has resulted in the retail price of Ducati's bikes dropping by about

When Ducati released the Monster 795 last year - the first Ducati to be made in Thailand with a starting price of about 449,000 baht – sales really picked up.

"The first Thailand-produced Monster really boosted sales, making 2013 the fastest-growing year for Ducati bikes, with total sales in Thailand reaching more than 8,000 models," says Mr Suriya.

"In Phuket alone, we sold more than 270 bikes – 70 more than our sales target a record number for us."

Warunyoo Sutthiphana, managing director of Saphantong Motor, the distributors for Triumph in Phuket, agrees that the island's big-bike market has continued to grow, despite this year's fall in overall motorcycle sales.

Mr Warunyoo says the Triumph name,

coupled with the diversity of its models, has helped them to hold their market share.

"Triumph is all about diversity – we have close to 20 different models. There is also a growing love for the old-school style - the classic bike – and 70 per cent of our models have the classic, traditional look of the brand," says Warunyoo.

Imported from the UK, tax duties mean that the price of Triumph bikes remains high, ranging from 750,000 baht for the popular Triumph Thruxton to 690,000 for the Bonneville.

However, clever promotion by the company has enabled it to grow its customer

"We offer customers a number of deals, including custom-work gift vouchers, which they really love. It gives each bike a uniqueness all its own," says Mr Warunyoo.

Triumph Phuket's target customers are Thai, aged 30-plus. However, in the last six months, Mr Warunyoo says the company has seen a lot of interest from "new-blood" bikers in their early 20s.

"Interest in Triumph bikes is growing quickly, and we are already seeing demand outstripping availability. So far this year we have sold 30 bikes [in Phuket]," he says.

Saphantong Motor has already started construction of a new showroom in Phuket Town to answer the growing demand for its models.

"Our new showroom, which will open sometime next year, will offer maintenance services and will have a much larger area to show off our models. There will even be a coffee shop for our customers," says Warunyoo.

For Triumph in particular, Phuket Bike Week, which took place in April this year, has been an important driver behind the growing demand for big-bikes in Phuket.

"The event has attracted much interest from people in Southern Thailand. Bikers from many different places come to Phuket for the event. It's a great community event, at which we can show off our new models and create greater awareness of the Triumph brand," says Warunyoo.

Fears of waning tourism sector voiced

THE tourism industry is expected against 11.3 million a year ago. to face another tough year if the government maintains martial law, the head of the Tourism Council of Thailand (TCT) said.

Meanwhile, the TCT has drafted several strategies aimed at providing relief to the tourism and travel sector in the current quarter.

"There's only one condition that will really help prevent the tourism industry from even worse circumstances, and that is the lifting of martial law. If the government continues enforcing the law, the country's tourism and travel business may face harder times through the coming year," said Ittirit Kinglake, president of the council.

The number of international arrivals at Bangkok's Suvarnabhumi Airport from January to September dropped by 19 per cent compared with the same period last year. Arrivals during the nine months came in at 9.1 million,

Other key tourism associations such as hotel and inbound bodies have also predicted that the sector will post a sharp decline this year, in the region of 15-20 per cent.

The Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) earlier lowered this year's target for foreigntourist arrivals from 28 million to 25 million, while the number is forecast to rebound to 28 million next year.

"Martial law is definitely hurting tourism, and there is still no sign of it being lifted," Ittirit said.

He said many countries had kept in place travel advisories issued after the military coup in May. As a result, travel operators overseas have shifted to selling other destinations such as Vietnam and the Indonesian island of Bali, as well as emerging countries like Myanmar.

To boost foreign-visitor num-

bers and relieve the industry in the current high season, the TCT has prepared three strategies, which are focused on tourists' safety, marketing, and a special plan to restore Koh Tao's image after the murder of two British tourists on

the resort island last month.

On the safety front, the council will ask the Tourism and Sports Ministry and other official bodies to draw up safety measures not only on Koh Tao, but at all major attractions, Ittirit said. - The Nation

Preparing for retirement

Building and managing a portfolio is the final step in post-career success

IN prior articles, planning for and managing retirement was discussed. The key is getting to the end goal, which is to have a worry-free retirement. Once retirees have gone through the steps, all that's left is to build and manage their portfolios.

Portfolio management is perhaps the most critical aspect to any retirement. With the help of a trusted adviser, it's actually quite simple and doesn't require too much time or effort. With many clients, a meeting and portfolio evaluation occurs on a quarterly basis. is something to consider for money that may be needed in the short-term. Investing in the stock and bond markets is for money that is needed many years from now. That's why allocating assets according to longterm and short-term goals is extremely important.

The second thing to think about is diversification. Investors don't want all their eggs in one basket. It's best to own several different ETFs to limit overall risk or a diversified stock portfolio that invests in healthcare, industrials, materials, energy and technology sectors. Not everything goes up or down together. Being diversified reduces your risk profile, which is very important in retirement.

Diversification consists of choosing the right mix of assets for a portfolio. In other words, what percentage should be in stocks and what percentage in bonds? Then, of these percentages, how much should be in growth stocks, value stocks, dividend stocks, long-term bonds, short-term bonds, corporate bonds, tax-free municipal bonds, government bonds, corporate bonds and so on.

Suvarnabhumi Airport's expansion budget slashed

AIRPORTS of Thailand has cut the budget for the second phase of the expansion at Suvarnabhumi Airport, while there are no reported changes for the Phuket International Airport

After a new feasibility study, AOT adjusted the budget from the initial 85 billion baht to 61.6bn baht. However, all major aspects of the second phase are retained as planned, and work is expected to start next year. The plan will be passenger capacity from the current 18mn to 30mn. proposed to the Transport Ministry for approval on

October 28. Prasong Poontaneat, chairman of the board of directors, said AOT planned to spend 19bn baht for a new runway, 11bn baht for parking and a tunnel, 29bn baht for a terminal complex that will also include a car park and monorail system, and 2.6bn baht for other facilities and infrastructure.

He said the new passenger terminal would increase passenger capacity from the originally planned 15 million to 20mn, while other new facilities would increase the airport's overall service competency.

AOT does not expect to need to borrow from financial institutions for the Suvarnabhumi expansion next year, but may need to do so

AOT is also expanding Phuket International Airport and renovating Bangkok's other international airport, Don Mueang. The renovation at Don Mueang is nearly complete. This should increase

Prasong said air traffic at its six airports between October 2013 and last month totalled 609,937 flights, up by 9 per cent from a year earlier. Of these flights, 285,145 were domestic and 324,782 international.

The total number of passengers in the same 12month period was 87mn, up by 1.6 per cent. Of that total, 36mn were domestic passengers, representing growth of 14 per cent, and 51mn were international passengers, down by 5.6 per cent. As a result, revenue is expected to drop slightly from last year. The company plans to cut staff's annual bonus from 11 months last year to 6.5 months this year. - The Nation

Eminent branding authority says hotels must be innovative

David Keen of QUO addressed the HICAP Hong Kong conference last week on the topic of hotel innovation. We are printing his views on why hotels are no longer objects of desire and what needs to change.

We have to stop doing ordinary. Predictable hotels are no longer desirable," QUO CEO David Keen told delegates at HICAP Sunday.

In the plenary session to Asia Pacific's hotel investment community, Mr Keen released the results of QUO's recent survey, which found that consumers both desire and say they will pay more for innovative hotels.

The vast majority of guests are looking for change. They crave innovation, and they are willing to pay more for it," he announced.

A follow-up to his earlier presentation at HICAP Update in April, the survey results supported his belief that the hospitality industry requires a new, bold and defining approach to brand development.

He reminded delegates how much the world has changed in the last 25 years: from the birth of the

LEADING hospitality brand guru Internet to 24/7 mobile connectivity; from the Berlin Wall coming down to Germany as a core member of a united Europe.

Yet, despite all the change around us, the standard hotel room remains the same as it was three decades ago. As the QUO survey proved, however, guests don't want this tried and tested "standard".

He explained that the survey presented consumers with three different hotels: two forwardthinking options ("Hotel A" and "Hotel B") and one control ("Hotel C"), a standard four-star property. The results demonstrated a clear preference for Hotel A, with it scoring highly on both innovation ("new and different") and relevance ("for someone like me").

In contrast, the control, Hotel C, scored low on innovation and desirability, with just 4 per cent of respondents saying it was for "someone like me."

Reaction to Hotel B was less clear-cut. While considered highly innovative, it scored low on relevance, and just 6 per cent of respondents were interested

in staying there.

"Hotel B's minimalist aesthetic was polarizing. It just didn't resonate," Mr Keen explained. He said the message was clear that innovation is only successful if it forms an emotional connection with the guest.

Keen concluded that forging this emotional connection and driving desire is the key to creating and sustaining asset value growth.

"We cannot sacrifice man's animal need for comfort and security," he said. "The hotel industry needs to change. It needs vision. But your target must be desire in order to grow asset value." - Bill Barnett

BKK 'Super Tower' to be tallest in Asean

GRAND Canal Land announced on October 14 a project to build a "Super Tower", which will be Asean's tallest building and one of the world's top 10 skyscrapers when it is completed in six years.

Despite Thailand falling under another military-controlled government after the coup on May 22, G Land said its board of directors had approved going ahead with the skyscraper, which will stand 615 meters tall and have a total of 125 floors. It will be part of the 100-billion-baht Grand Rama 9 project, situated on a 73rai (11.7-hectare) plot in Bangkok's new Rama IX-Ratchadaphisek business district.

"This skyscraper is going to be the new landmark of Thailand, a world-class attraction that everyone must visit at least once in his or her lifetime," said Yotin Boondicharern, chairman of G Land.

Banphot Hongthong, G Land's independent director and former permanent secretary of the Ministry of Agriculture and Cooperatives, said this project had been under way on and off for the past two years. The company finally decided to go ahead with it, once it was convinced by the economic policy unveiled by the current government, and given the geographic advantage of Thailand as a hub of Asean.

Yotin said G Land's major shareholders included his Charoenkrit Enterprise, which holds a 37-per-cent stake, the Channel 7 group that has 33 per cent, Bangkok Bank, which has 5 per cent, and Italian-Thai Development Group with a smaller stake. Four Thai banks will be the major lenders for the project, whose total construction cost will be 18bn baht.

Yotin said "Super Tower" was only a temporary name for the project. It will succeed the 88storey Petronas Twin Towers, which top out at 452m, and a planned skyscraper in Indonesia, as the tallest building in Southeast Asia.

The company has hired a US firm, Skidmore, Owing & Merrill, as its design consultant, but all other design and construction work will be by Thai companies, Yotin said.

Covering a total construction area of 320,000 square meters, the Super Tower will be the main building of the Grand Rama 9 complex that also includes office buildings, a shopping complex, luxury hotels, a convention hall and condominiums. The already-opened CentralPlaza Grand Rama 9 and Unilever's new Asean headquarters, which are under construction, are also part of the scheme.

According to G Land's report submitted to the Stock Exchange of Thailand yesterday, debt financing will account for about 60 per cent of the Super Tower's investment costs. It will partially open the tower and earn some rental and service incomes from 2016, before full completion six years from now. – *The Nation*

NESTLED amid the chaos of Patong's Jungceylon shopping center is an inviting seafood joint by the name of Cafe Fish.

A quick visual sweep of the place and I was overcome with nostalgia. Memories of long, hot days at the beach and sensational seafood dinners with family and friends came flowing back as smoothly as the perfectly-chilled white wine being poured into the glass in front of me.

Soon, the table was covered in intoxicatingly aromatic food.

Closest to me was a frying pan full of crispy fried calamari and French fries. This sinful dish left nothing to be desired - the outside of the calamari was fried to perfection and the inside was cooked just right.

Kirk Stucker, operations manager of Café Fish, suggested that we sample a bright red piri sauce with the calamari.

"The piri is made from imported ingredients from South Africa: lime juice, spices and chilis," Kirk explained.

"I use this sauce all the time. I put it on everything: eggs, meat, rice, everything."

I cautiously dipped my calamari into the fiery-red sauce

and instantly understood the obsession. The *piri* jolted my taste buds, but in the best way possible.

I then noticed that an impressive seafood platter had also appeared before us. It was loaded up with all of the essentials: grilled calamari; mussels in a creamy herb sauce; white wine clams; lemon, butter and coriander dressed prawns; and grilled seabass, served with Spanish rice.

The grilled calamari had that signature texture we all know and love – the one that proves just how fresh the squid is. The same went for the seabass. The fish was flaky and melted in your mouth.

Next up were mussels covered in a creamy herb sauce. I had been on-the-fence about mussels my entire life before sitting down at that booth in Cafe Fish. The sauce had a fantastic, yet simple, flavor that still allowed the taste of the mussels to take the lead.

Runner-up to the mussels were the prawns. They were split in half - lobster-style - and basted in butter, lemon and coriander before being thrown on the grill. The dressing complemented the prawns and gave them an extra kick of familiar flavor one normally doesn't encounter when eating Thai-style seafood.

Last, but certainly not least, were the clams cooked in white wine. Yet another simple dish with Western-style finesse, but simple flavors that allow the star – in this case, the clams – to shine.

Between the simple, yet mouthwatering seafood, comfortable and inviting atmosphere, superb wine and good company, I felt compelled to sit and chat all night. Cafe Fish transports the mind and the senses to another place entirely – away from the hustle and bustle of busy Phuket without having to get up from your cozy booth.

WINE dinners run rampant here - whiskey dinners, however, are few and far between.

The five-course dinner at El Gaucho in Movenpick Resort and Spa Karon started strong with a smoked duck breast and pineapple relish, plated with a seared scallop and jalapeno relish. However, the coffee-roasted beef tenderloin stole the show.

"Simple tricks, simple things – it's not rocket science, it's just to get the feeling for it and try things out," head chef Roland Kaiser says.

"At the end of the day, a whiskey still goes well with certain types of food, especially chocolates."

The truffles came out about the time the whiskey started taking hold. They melted in the mouth with a swish of liquid gold - the perfect way to end a meal.

Substitute for bamboo walls



THIS piece continues an earlier article regarding revitalizing the access roads to a spectacularly beautiful hillside development, much of which is flanked mostly by walls with low troughs in front of them that sustain a variety of screening plants – with bamboo being the most prominently featured.

As I suggested earlier, bamboo is a mixed blessing. On the one out turning to bamboo presents a

hand, it does form a verdant and fast-growing barrier. On the other, tangled root systems allow little else to flourish in its vicinity.

Assuming the bamboo here is eradicated or, at least, reduced, what sizable shrubs might effectively replace it?

My suggestions would include the umbrella plant (schefflera), a dense, bushy evergreen shrub with pretty and variegated leaves. You might also try crotons (codiaeum) - for which I have developed a new passion after seeing the magnificent specimens lining the rain-drenched road to Ranong. They are generally neat plants with large multi-colored leaves and single stems, though in the right conditions

they can become substantial presences. Woody shrubs, such as wrightias, will grow to six or eight feet and can be drastically pruned to thicken the somewhat open growth. They have the advantage of fragrant flowers, as do orange jasmines (jasminium sambac). Lady palms have already been used on the estate with success: they tolerate shade well and are best planted in groups to form dense clumps. The same can be said for resident heliconias.

different challenge. Vines could be employed. Possibilities include philodendrons, which are natural climbers and in the rainforest often clamber high into adjacent trees. Self-clinging, flowering vines include the

purple bignonia (saritaea), which is extremely vigorous, the pink coral vine (phuang chompu), and - if you can find it - the yellow trumpeted odontadenia.

Others will need some support to scale the walls: they include the prolific and spectacular Rangoon creeper (quisqualis), the equally dramatic allamanda cathartica or baan buri (both personal favorites) and the exotic solandra or chalice vine. All are eye-catching. The insignificant ficus pumila operates differently; it has tiny suckering

work from the top, as owners have successfully tried with that trusty old favorite: bougainvillea. This means planting vines in the earth beyond the summit of these walls and allowing them to cascade down the sides. Best for this role might be thunbergia (blue trumpet vine), coral vine (antigonon) or the Rangoon creeper. Allamandas would look terrific. All these, however, need a helping of sun to bloom well.

Most small, flowering trees also need some sunshine to give of their considerable best. They could be used as alternatives to vines, or in conjunction with them: consider the free-blooming yellow trumpet tree (tecoma stans), the tall plumeria (leelawadee luxon in Thai), maybe acacias, cassias,

cordias (geiger tree) and the hardy yellow oleander (peruviana). There is also space for at least one flame tree (delonix

> regia). Whatever changes are envisaged, they are in the monsoon the soil is satu

rated and when it is easier to work the earth in order to remove established plants and to plant new ones. Fresh soil is essential. And if you are buying trees (one suggestion here is for a row of foxtail palms), choose ones from nurseries which are in submerged plastic bags. Where roots have been heavily trimmed, the tree may not recover.

WITH only a few days to work with, I had an opportunity to escape Phuket for a quick, albeit necessary, change of scenery.

Drawing a radius around Phuket left a number of viable and tantalizing options, which were eventually distilled down to the final decision – Koh Yao Noi. A decision made really for no particular reason other than I hadn't been there yet.

I'd heard the idyllic reminiscing of the quaint and quiet island life, and how refreshing the slothlike pace is compared to Phuket's insanity. So I drank the Kool Aid and decided to do it.

It was casually mentioned that bringing a motorbike was a good way to go. A brief bout of Googling confirmed that, indeed, boats from both Bang Rong Pier in Pa Khlok and Rassada Pier in Phuket Town allow bikes to be transported.

The first lesson was that the vehicle ferry does not depart from Rassada, and the second was that it does not go to Koh Yao Noi. Instead, one must actually wind their way through questionable back alleys to the vehicle ferry nestled within the shipyard, and said person – me, in this case – will learn that the

"No problem" the jokers at the pier say. "Just ride to the the north of the island and there are many boats to take you and your bike over to Koh Yao Noi."

Simple enough, one might think. However, my days of blissful naivety are well behind me and I know better. If I were going to step foot onto Koh Yao Noi that day, I was just going to have to wing it.

Fast-forward a few hours and a lovely vista of tropical waters and glowing green islands show on the horizon with Koh Racha Noi just across the way - seemingly only a stone's throw.

Koh Yao Noi is there, I am here and my bike is here, but a vehicle ramp and boat suitable to heft my 250cc bike onto seems to be missing. Quick inquiry among a group of drunk guys on the pier (I thought

everyone was Muslim here!) results in the realization that they intend to roll my bike down some steep, slimy-looking steps and onto the bow of a small longtail boat.

The end of the steps disappear into the sea and the boat looks as if it, too, is about to meet a watery grave. I contemplate all the things which could go wrong and the extortionate cost while they cracked jokes about me thinking


they aren't strong enough and the clown of the group puts my helmet on backwards and dances around.

On Your Mind

MY FAMILY grew up in the world of marketing. My dad was the president of a marketing subsidiary of Time Inc., and my brother has, for many years, run Growth

Engine, a successful creativity and innovation marketing consulting agency in the US.

Although I've never been directly involved in marketing, I've always been interested in trying to understand what makes consumers tick, specifically how marketers try to align their strategies

with our clocks (or reset those clocks altogether).

Burger King recently ran a halfprice deal on certain select items to celebrate its 50th anniversary in Thailand. One of those sale items was its large milkshakes (priced at about 45 baht after discount). I was already in the habit of buying a strawberry milkshake there pretty much daily at 90 baht a pop, so I was obviously happy to keep buying them. When I got back from a trip, the price had reverted and now BK has specials on some other stuff.

What I've noticed is that I have now begun searching for other options to my daily milkshake, because suddenly, 90 baht seems expensive. I haven't yet found a replacement, but will likely keep

Obviously, BK (and any other sellers) would like to know if these temporary price reductions are good for business. My experience is "no", but I might not be the target customer. Here is what my brother Bryan had to say:

"Generally, we think of discount programs as a kind of fix that consumers can get hooked on, and which can be very hard to get them – the manufacturer and the trade – off of. A good example of this is Thomas' English muffins.

Thomas' got in the habit of offering a deeply-discounted twin-pack of twelve English muffins when they wanted to increase sales. Consumers loved this... but, like you, Pat, with your milkshake, after a while they came to expect the discount.

"And so some consumers would wait for this deal

to return and, as a result, modify their traditional purchasing behavior.

"What made it particularly tough is that some consumers also knew, or had learned, they could freeze the English muffins for later use. This resulted in what the industry calls 'pantry loading' [stocking up] when the product went on sale.

"One of the reasons the new product line we helped Thomas' create, Hearty Grains English Muffins, became so successful and profitable – is that besides attracting new users to the franchise (younger, more health-conscious consumers), consumers weren't accustomed to having the product discounted. So Thomas' could maintain a higher-margin, for this new, healthier product line."

Discounts lower the reference price for the customer. When businesses like BK offer a discount, the lowered price becomes the


new standard for the consumer.

Barbara Bix is the managing partner at BB Marketing Plus, a business that specializes in helping companies increase sales. Bix writes that, "Customers who buy at a discount often come to associate the discounted price

with the value of the product. Therefore, they become disgruntled when the price increases without the addition of new features that they find valuable."

Discounts may be a good way to attract new customers, encourage clients to try different

products, or get people to buy items retailers are having difficulty selling. Where I think BK messed up was in offering a long-time special for one of its tastiest staples, thereby establishing an artificially low price in my mind for its milkshakes.

Asian Beach Games welcome new sports

SEVERAL brand new sports will be added to the 4th Asian Beach Games being held in Phuket this November, making them the biggest Games ever in terms of the number of sporting events.

Pistorius sentenced to five years

OLYMPIC and Paralympic sprinter Oscar Pistorius started his five-year jail sentence on Tuesday for killing his girlfriend Reeva Steenkamp, marking the end of a trial that has gripped South Africa and millions around the world.

His uncle, Arnold Pistorius, indicated he would not appeal.

As judge Thokozile Masipa gave her decision on the 27-year-old's culpable homicide conviction, Pistorius, whose downfall has been likened to that of American football star OJ Simpson, stood resolutely in the dock.

His only reaction was to wipe his eyes before two police officers led him to the holding cells beneath the High Court in the heart of the South African capital.

Ninety minutes later, an armored police vehicle carrying Pistorius - still dressed in dark suit, white shirt and black tie - left the building through a throng of reporters towards Pretoria Central Prison, where he is expected to serve his time.

Once the execution site for opponents of South Africa's former white-minority government, the jail is now home to the country's most hardened criminals, including the man known as "Prime Evil",

apartheid death squad leader Eugene de Kock.

Prison officials said Pistorius, whose lower legs were amputated when he was a baby, would be housed in a separate and secure hospital wing of the massive

"ONE LAW FOR ALL"

In delivering her decision, 67-year-old Masipa stressed the difficulty of arriving at a decision that was "fair and just to society and to the accused".

Pistorius – a wealthy and influential white man – might be able to secure preferential justice despite the "equality before law" guarantee enshrined in the postapartheid 1996 constitution.

"It would be a sad day for this country if an impression were created that there is one law for the poor and disadvantaged, and one law for the rich and famous," she said.

Steenkamp, a 29-year-old law graduate and model, died almost instantly on Valentine's Day last year when Pistorius shot her through a locked toilet door at his luxury Pretoria home.

Prosecutors pushed for a murder conviction, but the athlete maintained he fired in the mistaken belief an intruder was hiding behind the door, a defense that struck home in a country with one of the world's highest rates of violent crime.

The ruling African National Congress' Women's League, which is at the forefront of political efforts to tackle violence against South African women, on Tuesday called for an appeal by the state against the September 12 culpable homicide conviction.

But Steenkamp's family said it was satisfied with the sentence.

"Justice was served," family lawyer Dup De Bruyn told reporters outside the court. The judge had given "the right sentence",

Insult against Williams sisters goes unanswered

MULTIPLE grand slam winner Martina Navratilova has questioned the "silence" of the International Tennis Federation after one of its members described world number one Serena Williams and older sister Venus as "brothers".

Russian Tennis Federation president Shamil Tarpischev was swiftly banned for a year and fined US\$25,000 by the

Women's Tennis Association tee member, offered an apology (WTA) after making the comments on local television on Friday.

Navratilova, one of the game's greats with a total of 59 grand slam singles, doubles and mixed doubles titles, praised the speedy action by the WTA to defend Serena and former world number one Venus, winner of seven grand slam singles title, but was critical of the ITF.

"The silence from the ITF has been pretty deafening," she told a small group of reporters in Singapore ahead of the start of the WTA Finals on Monday.

"They are the ones who have actually the possibility of doing something as Tarpischev is head of the Russian Tennis Federation, which falls under the ITF and is also Fed Cup captain which falls under the ITF.

"The WTA has done all they can do. They certainly have

shown they have Serena's back and Venus' back and he might have thought the comment was funny but it was anything

"Certainly this kind of bullying comment cannot be tolerated from anyone, but particularly from a high-up official in the tennis world."

Tarpischev, also an International Olympic Commit-

on Saturday at the behest of the WTA, whose Chief Executive Stacy Allaster said the comments were "insulting, demeaning and have absolutely no place in our

Serena Williams, winner of 18 rand slam singles titles, was clearly hurt when she labelled the comments by Tarpischev as "very insensitive and extremely sexist as well as racist" prior to the defense of the season-ending title.

"I thought they were in a way bullying," she added on Sunday.

Asked by Reuters for their view, the ITF said they hoped Tarpischev's WTA punishment and apology to the Williams sisters, who have teamed up to win 13 grand slams and three Olympic gold medals in doubles, could draw a line under the incident.
