TOURISTS BANNED FROM PROVIDING OWN SHADE'

Beach brolly fiasco unfolds

Ban stays as tourists forced to leave beach for bringing own umbrella

OFFICIALS are scrambling to get beach umbrellas and mats on the sands at the island's key beaches this tourism high season before hordes of visitors arrive for the Christmas and New Year holidays.

The push comes as an island-wide ban on all umbrellas at Phuket's beaches saw a Swedish family on holiday last week being told they were not allowed to bring their own umbrella to provide shade for their 18-month-old baby.

"We are trying to get beach umbrellas provided by local municipalities at all main beaches. The high season has begun, and we are trying to get this done as soon as possible," Phuket Vice Governor Chamroen Tippayapongtada confirmed to the *Gazette* this week.

"The umbrellas will definitely be provided for free, but we are looking at having people who used to work as beach vendors provide mats for tourists to rent. There will be no more sun loungers. They will not be allowed back on the beach."

Hundreds of vendors were forced out of work earlier this year by the beach cleanup campaign ordered by the National Council for Peace and Order...

Billion-baht Belgian pot grower arrested

IMMIGRATION officers arrested Belgian national Patrick Lagrou, 55, who was wanted on an Interpol notice as a fugitive drug dealer, as he was attempting to leave Phuket on Saturday night.

Mr Lagrou is renowned as the biggest marijuana grower in Belgium's history, amassing a fortune of 25 million euros - more than a billion baht – in assets before he fled to Thailand, said Phuket Immigration Superintendent Sunchai Chokkajaykij.

"He was arrested at the Tah Chat Chai checkpoint while attempting to drive off the island at about 8pm," Col Sunchai told the press yesterday.

Mr Lagrou was trying to return to his residence in Phang Nga province, just north of Phuket, Col Sunchai explained.

"After receiving a notice from Interpol, we searched his

registered address in Phang Nga. He was not there, but we learned of the registration details of the van he was driving," Col Sunchai said.

"So we stationed officers at the Tah Chat Chai checkpoint to catch

Mr Lagrou arrived in Thailand on June 2 this year and extended his visa on August 1, the colonel

Thai officials will coordinate with the Belgian authorities in order to extradite Mr Lagrou to Belgium, Col Sunchai concluded.

Danish fugitive arrested for tax evasion

A DANISH expat has been arrested in Phuket on an international arrest warrant for tax evasion involving more than 8 million Danish kroner (about 45mn baht).

Phuket Immigration Police received an order from the Thailand Immigration Bureau headquarters in Bangkok on October 28 to track down and arrest Peter Jensen, 48, as he was wanted by Interpol on an arrest warrant issued by the court in Hjorring, Denmark, explained Phuket Immigration Chief Sunchai Chokkajaykij.

"Mr Jensen was arrested early

[November 7] at a restaurant in Pa Khlok, after we were informed that he was seen there," he said.

"Officers presented themselves and asked to see his identification.

Mr Jensen failed to provide any, so police arrested him and transported him to Phuket Immigation in Phuket Town."

According to records, Mr Jensen arrived in Thailand on August 3, 2010 via Suvarnabhumi International Airport in Bangkok. He extended his permit-to-stay multiple times, with the last one expiring on April 24, 2013.

"He has been charged with overstaying his visa," said Col Sunchai. "We are now in the process of handing him over to Interpol."

Krabi fishermen rally against proposed power plant

LOCAL fishermen in Krabi have joined the fight against an 870-megawatt coal-fired power plant to be built in the province's Nua Khlong district, east of Phuket.

A horde of boats carrying angry villagers congregated at the Baan Klong Ruo pier in Nua Khlong at about 10:30am on Monday, wielding large signs that read: "Protect Krabi from coal-power plant" and waving green

flags picturing dugong calling for "No coal". The fishermen were especially opposed to a coal seaport at the pier as part of the power plant project, the *Gazette* was told.

"About 102.12 square kilometers in this area are wetlands which are protected under the Ramsar Convention," said Alee Channam, leader of the Krabi Kon Rak Lay (Krabi Sea Lovers) Club. – *Kritsada Mueanhawong*

Construction will be halted to ease traffic congestion during the event.

Underpass construction put on hold for Games

GOVERNOR Nisit Jansomwong has ordered construction of the island's first two underpasses to be halted during the Asian Beach Games, which began on Thursday, so that all lanes can be open for traffic.

"Three lanes at the Darasamuth Intersection underpass [near Central Festival Phuket] will be open, as well as the road between Central Festival Phuket and HomeWorks, from November 14 to 23," he said during an inspection of the sites on Saturday.

"I have asked that all construction on both underpasses [including at the Samkong Intersection near the Tesco shopping center on the bypass road] be put on hold and that workers clean up the road surfaces as much as possible."

Governor Nisit is especially concerned about road safety during the Games, and will boost safety measures during that time.

"Concrete barriers will be removed from the road to make more room for motorists during the 10 days of the games. Lights will be installed in order to prevent accidents and so that drivers can see the direction of traffic flow," he said.

Patong bars threaten strike to protest corruption, early closure

BAR owners in Patong, Phuket's premier resort town, have gone back on a vow to close their doors for three days in protest of corruption and recent orders to close down at 2am, as it would cost them too much in could-be profits.

A letter that was passed among bar owners in Soi Bangla and elsewhere in Patong stated that bars would go on strike from November 14 to 16, the first three days of the Asian Beach Games.

However, Patong Entertainment Business Association President Weerawit Krueasombut confirmed to the *Gazette* today that the owners have decided not to close – yet.

"The agreement to close bars was made between the bar owners, not the association. However, I have talked to them about the strike, and they have decided not to do it," he said.

"It would cost too much, and would have a great effect on Patong... I will talk to the governor about what can be done about the issues, then I will pass the information on to the bar owners."

In the open letter, local business owners expressed frustration over

being forced by police and military officers to close every night at 2am. They also claimed that they are now in financial trouble, alleging that they are still being asked to pay extortion fees despite making less money.

"We are being forced to close

at 2am; it has never been like this. Now that it is high season, we could be making more money from visitors," read the letter, written in Thai.

"We were told that this is an order coming from higher-ups, but were not told exactly who. It

has been a decade that we have been under control of corrupt officers, who ask us to pay 'tea money' and buy what they claim are charity event tickets.

"Nobody has ever lent us a hand to fix this problem. We are victims of corruption. It never ends."

Sinkholes strike again after heavy island storms

OFFICERS shut down a road in central Phuket on Monday after heavy rains and flash flooding last weekend caused a large, dangerous sinkhole to form on one side of the road.

Part of Rural Road 4008 off Thepkrasattri Road, near Bang Jo Prison in Srisoonthorn, gave way after strong water flow inundated the drain pipe below and washed away the earth around it that was supporting the road.

Local officers told the Gazette that they immediately closed the road, as they were worried that more of it would cave in if motorists tried to drive on it.

"Part of the road has crumbled away, but the rest of it is still there with water streaming underneath," said Amnouy Limpanon, an officer from the Srisoonthorn Tambon Administration Organization (OrBorTor).

"It's too dangerous to allow motorists to pass on this road right now."

Mr Amnouy did not specify when the damage would be repaired.

"We will fix it as soon as possible," he said.

Hunt for missing boats begins after Rohingya land on beach

POLICE are calling for all residents along the Andaman coast to report any sightings of two boats flying Thai flags which are believed to be trafficking refugees, including many Rohingya fleeing Myanmar.

The call to report sightings follows police taking into custody 299 refugees at Koh Nok, off the Ranong coast, on November 8.

The boat, a modified trawler, had been beached on the island. It had been carrying 80 Bangladeshis and 219 Rohingya, including women and children.

"We were notified of the boat at Koh Nok by a local fishermen who saw three trawlers in the area," said Col Kritsak Songmoonnak, deputy commander of the Ranong Provincial Police.

"The boat was modified to carry many people. We believe the other two boats that are still miss-

ing may be carrying up to 600 people," he told the *Gazette*.

"We have called for residents along the coast, including in Phang Nga, to report any sightings of vessels that appear to be carrying refugees. If anyone sees such boats, please report it to police by calling 191."

All refugees taken into custody on Saturday were taken to Ranong Community Hall for questioning by officials.

"Hopefully we'll be able to confirm where these people are from, and who was behind the operation that brought them into Thai waters," Col Kritsak said.

Hit-and-run driver wanted after striking motorcyclist

POLICE are looking for a hitand-run driver who struck a motorcycle on the road between Phuket International Airport and Thepkrasattri Road on Monday.

Police were notified of the incident at 11:05pm, said Lt Col Sanit Nookong of the Thalang Police.

"We received a call from a passing motorist reporting that a woman had been injured after being struck by a hit-and-run driver," he told the *Gazette*.

At the scene, near Thalang Technical College, officers found Phanthip Phengsombun, 24, lying on the road near her motorcycle.

Her left leg and left arm were broken, and she had suffered minor head injuries. She was taken to Thalang Hospital.

A pink helmet was found at the scene, Col Sanit confirmed.

Officers have begun their search for the driver, he added.

"We are now investigating this crime. We have collected evidence from the scene and hope to learn more information from Ms Phanthip," said Col Sanit.

Jilted spirit medium shoots man for allegedly flirting with girlfriend

A MAN was rushed to the intensive-care unit (ICU) at Patong Hospital on Tuesday after being shot in the head for allegedly flirting with the girlfriend of a jealous spirit medium.

Patong Police arrested Bundit "King" Pramualsil, 36, from Phuket, while he was riding his motorbike on a road near Tri Trang Beach, south of Patong, at about 10:30am.

"We arrived at the scene and were told by witnesses that the gunman was Mr Bundit, who lives in the street and was last seen speeding off on his motorbike," Patong Police Deputy Superintendent Khunnadet Na Nongkhai explained.

Narong Polcharoen was taken to hospital. At Mr Bundit's rented home, police found

a .22 rifle with a telescopic targeting sight and a loaded magazine.


"Mr Bundit confessed that he shot Mr Narong with the gun," Lt Col Khunnadet said. "He said that he believed Mr Narong had been flirting with his girlfriend. However, he did not explain how he had come to believe this."

Mr Bundit was charged with attempted murder and possession of an unlicenced firearm.

Swedish fundraising cyclists closing in on Laotian border

VERY little lies between four men and their goal of cycling from Sweden to Phuket in order to raise funds for the post-tsunami orphanage Barnhem Muang Mai.

Mountain climbs to nearly 4,000 kilometers above sea level and the cold weather in China have been a dramatic change from what Calle Wollgard and the team faced when crossing the Middle East.

"The weather has made the cycling a bit more difficult. One morning, we woke up and it was snowing a lot, so we had to take a day off and wait for the snowing to stop," Calle told the *Gazette*.

"And it has been cold, really cold sometimes..."

However, with the Laotian border just a day or two ahead of them, Calle, Fredrik Jessen, Tomi Blumen and Christofer Johansson are maintaining their high spirits.

"It means that we are very close to Thailand, which still feels a bit unreal, but in a good way," Calle said.

"The journey will soon come to an end, and, of course, it's a bit sad, but crossing the finish line will be amazing. We have had some really good months behind us, and I think all these things keep our morale very high."

They set their arrival date at Barnhem for December 6, ensuring that they will have the chance to spend Christmas with the kids ahead of the 10th anniversary of the tsunami, as well as raise millions of baht for the orphanage.

... (NCPO). The campaign resulted in the revelation that vendors had sold their rights to operate businesses on the sands for amounts that totalled billions of baht.

"We have held several meetings with vendors and officials about getting umbrellas and mats back on the beaches. However, we cannot give them permission to 'own' the beach like before," said Vice Governor Chamroen.

"Local authorities have to find suitable places where vendors can rent out their mats. Every vendor must wear a uniform. They will be issued permits year by year, and they cannot pass the permit rights on to any third party. "Each booth will be looked after by local

"Each booth will be looked after by local government staff to make sure beach vendors do not break any regulations."

Swedish tourist Thomas Tagheim and his family last week were forced to leave Patong Beach on November 5 – after days of ignoring warnings from officials to remove the umbrella they were using to protect their baby's delicate skin – after Tourist Police officers confirmed that it was not allowed.

"We have been coming here twice a year, in October and January, for seven years. If we cannot use our own umbrella on the beach, we will not come back to the island... And I

know that many of my friends and other tourists feel the same.

"What will Phuket be without family tourists? How can the government allow jet-skis onto a public beach, but not allow parents and grandparents to protect their children from overheating and sunburn?"

V/Gov Chamroen confirmed to the *Gazette* that he was aware of the incident.

"We would like to apologize for any inconvenience... but until we have found a solution I would like to ask all people not to bring their own umbrellas to the beach. It will only cause arguments and misunderstandings," he said on Tuesday.

Beach patrols hit the sand

PROVINCIAL Police Commander Patchara Boonyasit unveiled the latest in Phuket law enforcement: the Beach Police, resplendent in their polo shirt and shorts uniform, with sidearms, and mounted on their patrol bicycles.

"Phuket is a famous tourist destination that has many beautiful beaches and we want to ensure people's safety while they are on them," he said.

"Safety is our top priority, especially when big events, such as the Asian Beach Games, are held here in Phuket."

Beach Police patrols are now in action at Karon and Kamala, which both have four beaches within their precincts, Maj Gen Patchara explained.

We plan to expand this project to other police stations in Phuket with the goal of each station being responsible for a four-bicycle patrol," he said.

"The Beach Police squads are mainly here to serve and protect tourists visiting Phuket. They are armed and have the full power of arrest. I think this will make tour-

ists feel safer and more at ease while at the beach, and allow them to relax and really have fun while they are here."

Gen Patchara also reminded the public that crimes in Kata-Karon can now be reported to the nearest 7-Eleven convenience store.

The pilot project, being tested in Kata-Karon only, was initially announced last month.

"The main problem for tourists – and even some Thais – is finding a police station to report a crime," Gen Patchara noted. "This is why we set up this system. People are more familiar with convenience stores, which are easily found."

If the project proves successful in Kata-Karon, it will be rolled out across the island, he added.

Local butcher robs 7-Eleven at knifepoint

A LOCAL butcher robbed a 7-Eleven of 1,000 baht at knifepoint early on November 6, then used the stolen cash to pay for a prostitute, revealed a deputy commander of the Phuket Provincial Police.

Wichit Police received a report from the Tung Charoen 7-Eleven branch at about 4:20am.

Police arrested Boonlert Limpapanon, 37, at about 5:30pm on November 7 after they reviewed CCTV footage from the store and identified him as a local butcher.

"Mr Boonlert told officers that he spent the money on a prostitute in Soi Phoon Phol 11," Col Arayapan

Mr Boonlert was charged with theft and with carrying a deadly weapon in public.

Illegal tour guide arrested and charged

A MAN arrested on November 8 for illegally working as a Russian-speaking tour guide has been charged with attempting to bribe the Tourist Police officers who arrested him.

Dmitrii Pindiurin, 27, from the Kyrgyz Republic, was arrested at the Karon View Point at 10:30am.

"We were on the lookout for illegal guides when three foreigners arrived," said Sen Sgt Maj Surin Pitphan of the Phuket Tourist

"One of them was talking and explaining the place. That's when I suspected that he was an illegal guide."

Sgt Surin identified himself to the trio as a police officer.

"The two foreigners with Mr Pindiurin said he was selling tour and travel packages in Phuket and that he was in the middle of conducting a tour he sold to them on November 3," he said.

"Mr Pindiurin confessed that he was working illegally. We searched his car and found Russian-language travel brochures."

While the officers were placing him under arrest, Mr Pindiurin offered to pay them 40,000 baht to let him go, Sgt Surin alleged.

"Our officers played along, saying that the

money had to be paid at the police station. They did that so the act of him offering the officers money could be recorded on the station's CCTV cameras," he said.

With the alleged bribe recorded at the Karon Police Station, the officers charged Mr Pindiurin with attempting to bribe an official under Section 144 of the Thai Criminal Code, which incurs a fine of up to 10,000 baht, up to five years in jail, or both.

The cash offered was seized as evidence. Mr Pindiurin was also charged with illegally working as a tour guide.

Military dispatched to rescue residents in Trang trapped in homes after floods

FLOODWATER inundated about 100 homes in Trang's Huay Yot district Monday morning.

Soldiers from the Phraya Ratsada Nu Pradit camp were dispatched with flat-bottom boats to assist people trapped in their homes by the meter-deep flood, reported *The Nation*.

Impeachment case of ex-PM Yingluck deferred by NLA

THE National Legislative Assembly resolved Tuesday to defer impeachment proceedings against ex-PM Yingluck Shinawatra until November 28 because she had not yet looked into the documents or prepared herself to fight the case.

The meeting, which was originally scheduled for Wednesday, will take place on November 28, reported *The Nation*.

Officers identify 10 human-smugglers based in Thailand

MORE than 10 agents have allegedly been smuggling Rohingya from Myanmar to a third country, a source revealed.

The source said that the agents collected 30,000 baht from each refugee and another 60,000 baht from employers.

He said the Thailand-based agents began trafficking after the numbers of Myanmar national workers for their illegal business dropped, reported *The Nation*.

Pregnancy memo 'not policy', says hospital director

RAJAVITHI Hospital director Udom Chaovarindr has admitted that a memo prohibiting employees from getting pregnant until the end of next year did exist, but said that it was an agreement in its pharmaceutical division, not hospital policy, reported *The Nation*.

Koh Tao suspects to be indicted by end of month

THAWATCHAI Siangjaew, deputy directorgeneral of Public Prosecution Region 8, announced on November 7 that prosecutors should be able to indict two Myanmar men charged with the murder of Britons David Miller and Hannah Witheridge by the end of this month, reported *The Nation*.

Citing an earlier chat with Provincial Police Region 8 deputy chief Maj Gen Paween Pongsirin, Mr Thawatchai said the additional investigation requested by prosecutors was about 80 per cent complete and that police

would submit the report again in two weeks. Prosecutors would then be able to conclude it and pass it to the Samui public prosecutor to

indict Win Zaw Htun and Zaw Lin, he said.

He confirmed that the prosecutor and police working on this case were trying to be as detailed as possible, while keeping the Office of the Attorney General constantly updated.

He went on to say that British police had visited the crime scene and that they should be satisfied with the procedure followed as per the Thai justice system.

AirAsia on look out for passport crime with Interpol's I-Checkit

INTERPOL has agreed to expand its I-Checkit initiative under the "Turn Back Crime" campaign to other businesses after its cooperation with AirAsia, Asia's largest budget airline, proved successful.

Commencing in June, the initiative saw the passports of passengers wishing to board the airline checked against Interpol's Stolen and Lost Travel Documents (SLTD) database, which has about 43 million records. The aim is to detect individuals attempting to use stolen or fraudulent travel documents and provide better aviation security, reported *The Nation*.

Malaysia-based AirAsia is the first airline that applied I-Checkit after Interpol approached its executive, who immediately agreed to join. When a passport is found in the database, security officials will be alerted to apprehend the person who presented it.

"As an airline that flies to more than 23 countries, we take international security very seriously, which brought us to collaborate with Interpol," AirAsia's Group CEO Tony Fernandes said.

"We are proud to be the first airline in the world to have our check-in system integrated with I-Checkit solution to screen passen-

gers travelling within our network of 100 airports across Asia and 600 international flights per day."

Some six million AirAsia passengers have been screened since June when checking-in for flights, with 69 found to have lost or

stolen documents. Eighteen of them were not allowed to board their flights.

By using stolen passports, people are able to conceal their real identity, move between borders

and access key services in a bid to conduct illegal activities and escape justice. Therefore, measures to detect illegal use of sto-

len travel documents are seen as critical for crime prevention around the world.

Last week, the General Assembly of Interpol members endorsed expansion of the initiative to cover a wider range of industries, such

as more airlines, banks and hotels.

Interpol's outgoing chief Ronald Noble said during the assembly: "Passengers travelling with AirAsia know that the airline has their safety and security in mind and is doing all it can to prevent anyone using a stolen passport from boarding. With the overwhelming support of the member countries for expanding the system, my hope is that one day soon, all citizens the world over will feel as secure when conducting their daily activities."

Under the system, no airline gains direct access to Interpol's database of some 43 million lost or stolen passports from 168 countries; but it can enter searches through the I-Checkit.

Personal information is not disclosed to companies, but the system will flag passports if there is concern, and there is a procedure to refer passengers to the authorities. AirAsia also said no personal data would be transmitted to Interpol other than passport numbers and the issuing nation.

Qatar Airways has become the second airline to join the initiative. It became the first full-service airline to use the pilot project.

Meanwhile, an AirAsia source said the airline was willing to pay if Interpol decides to collect fees – reportedly a few cents each time the database is consulted – as the initiative would certainly help boost security for its passengers and aviation as a whole.

Blisterful beach

DESPITE some recent stormy weather, the "official" start to Phuket's annual high season for tourism got underway as planned on November 1, kicked off by this year's installment of the annual Phuket Carnival in Patong.

With a spectacular street procession, free concerts, fireworks and a wide range of other high-profile activities, this year's event was branded under the theme "Blissful Beach" in recognition of the unprecedented efforts by the National Council for Peace and Order (NCPO) to rid the island's beaches of illegal vendors.

But despite all the pomp and circumstance, Phuket's most popular beaches have yet to attain "blissful" status so far this high season. The "clean sweep" of the beaches has led to the complete disappearance of its most wanted service – the beach loungers and umbrellas for rent – even as jet-skis and speedboat parasail operators continue their, at times, lethal tourism services unabated.

Lest we forget, Phuket's beaches remain the island's premier attraction for many, if not most, foreign visitors. The *Gazette* has received numerous queries from visitors in recent months asking if they could expect loungers and umbrellas to be available for them – or if they should opt for another destination.

In contrast, nearly every comment the *Gazette* receives about jet-skis and speedboat parasail operators are complaints: most often about the notorious "damage scams", but also about how annoying and dangerous they are.

The pre-coup situation on Phuket's beaches was in long need of an overhaul, but failure to allow the return of the beach-lounger-and-umbrella combos in time for the high season comes across as a classic case of "throwing out the baby with the bath water" (see page 1).

For better or worse, Phuket evolved as a beach tourism destination with beach loungers and parasols as an integral part of the infrastructure. That corrupt local politicians used them to illegally amass personal fortunes over the years does not negate that reality.

Their absence not only compromises the island's attractiveness to a huge segment of tourists, but also runs the risk of turning well-intentioned efforts "to return happiness" into an international debacle: with "blissful" replaced by "blisterful" to describe the sun-baked reality.

Tourists need loungers and parasols not only as convenience, but as the first line of defence against the sun's rays. Sadly, untold thousands of units remain stacked uselessly away in beachside locations and many people remain unemployed as a result.

It is obviously too late to develop a comprehensive plan for a fair and transparent beach lounger rental industry for this high season, but by whatever means, we need to get them back on our beaches as soon as possible: like sandbags in the face of rising floodwaters. We can figure out a better long-term solution during the next low season.

We cannot just tell people that we are good cops and expect them to believe us. Words cannot do that, but doing our jobs and proving ourselves can. The duty of police is to protect the public, and arrest those who break the law. It is that easy.

When people report crimes, we will act quickly. The result? The people will have trust. They will tell their families and friends about the good things we have done.

On the other hand, if we treat people like our enemy, they will see us as an enemy as well.

We must work hard to gain this trust. We must arrest bad people and always be fair. Meanwhile, we

must be open and welcoming to those who want to help us, such as police volunteers for patrols or those who wish to report crimes.

The Karon Police have just launched a campaign that allows victims of crime in Kata and Karon to file reports with police simply by visiting any 7-Eleven convenience store in the area.

I am looking to make that an island-wide service, and not only at 7-Eleven. I want to get other convenience stores involved as

well. I have ordered every police station on the island to work together with stores in their areas on the project. We should know which stores and which jurisdictions have made agreements by the end of the month.

After the stores and police agree to team up, staffers must be trained in how to work with police, and police must be given a direct contact number to the store.

Stickers promoting the service will be posted wherever it is avail-

able, so that people know which branches they can turn to for help.

Besides staying ahead of crime and protecting the public, we also need to find a way to resolve the major traffic problems on the island. Since I have taken up my position, I have heard endless complaints about traffic.

There are a lot of cars on the island, which naturally contributes to traffic jams.

On top of this, millions of tourists have already passed through Phuket International Airport this year – this is a huge number. We cannot deny

that more people means more problems, and more traffic.

We do what we can to solve this problem, including having traffic police out on the street directing traffic flow during rush hours. We think that this makes people feel more secure when they are on the road.

It doesn't matter how much crime there is or how many acci-

dents occur here. What matters is how quick and efficient we are at getting the job done, taking care of the people and bringing suspects to justice.

We also can't turn a blind eye to "small" cases. If police only spring to attention when there is a big case, but ignore the not-so-juicy ones – that is a big deal, a big problem. It can totally ruin

the image of safety on the island.

If we work to ensure that Phuket is safe, a good image will organically form at the same time. This

is why we must aim to make the island's residents and visitors safe and happy. Doing this will both gain us the trust of the people and result in a good image for Phuket.

Crime happens everywhere in the world. It is up to police to prove their worth, and to fight – and hopefully win – the battle against crime.

EARLIER this year, after I returned to Phuket from South Africa, a friend of mine gave me a 49-baht TrueMove H SIM card package – the type you can just top up at a 7-Eleven or Family Mart without having to worry about the hassle of monthly bills.

That suited me fine. After South Africa, where you have to dive though hoops to get an ordinary SIM card – including providing proof of address – it was great to be able to open the plastic wrapping, pop out the SIM and have my new number working within minutes.

I'm a phone traditionalist: make the call, convey my message and say goodbye.

It came as a surprise when I discovered the credit on my phone was disappearing without making a single call. Within a few days, my regular 90-baht top-up was down to about 60 baht, and within a week it had almost gone.

After observing this strange phenomenon for a few days, I realized that I was losing credit to a barrage of Thai "promotional" messages that were arriving in my message box multiple times a day.

It was difficult to tell exactly how much money I was being charged for each message, but I had never requested any such service and no one from TrueMove H had ever contacted me to ask me whether I even wanted it.

After searching their website,

I eventually found a TrueMove H number (tel: 1331) to ring the "Call Center". But get this: it's not free! They charge you 3 baht per minute to call one of their reps.

Finally, after going through umpteen recorded messages telling me to press this number, then that number "for more information", I got through to a TrueMove representative.

To make a long story short, she told me in happy tones that the service was provided by another company and therefore TrueMove H was not responsible. When I pointed out that the "other company" must have come to an agreement with TrueMove, she offered me 20 baht compensation. I complained that the amount was feeble and she increased it to 50 and told me that was the maximum she could offer...

I just read that True Corp has plans to invest 4 billion baht (US\$122.6 million) to further expand its 4G-2.1GHz network, and here they are offering me 50 baht compensation.


MASCOT

Uber on the scene in Phuket

UNTIL the National Council for Peace and Order (NCPO) made historic efforts to sweep Phuket clear of local taxi mafias that had long tainted the island's international reputation, there were rarely rays of hope for its public transportation system.

However, this week, another major player has stepped up to provide the millions of tourists that holiday in Phuket, as well as the local community, with a safe, reliable and hassle-free transportation option.

Taxi-alternative Uber, valued at US\$18.2 billion (596bn baht), initiated a soft launch of its services in Phuket earlier this year, and is now ready to go full throttle just in time to tap into the high-season market.

"Uber is a technology company that connects riders and drivers to enable safe, convenient and affordable transport. Uber makes cities better by reducing congestion and improving transport availability and safety. Today, Uber operates in more than 220 cities across six continents," Mike Brown, Uber regional general manager, explained to the *Gazette*.

"Phuket is a city where reliable transportation options are few and far between, and public transport is virtually non-existent.

"We think it's a fabulous time to launch in Phuket because people there, and millions from around the world who visit the island every year, are clamoring for a great new transport alternative, and we are very much focused on that - the type of alternative that Uber's technology offers. People want safety, they want incredible reliability and they want accountability."

The Uber application for smartphones allows members to track Uber-approved drivers in the area – who are registered legal taxi drivers in Phuket already – as well as hail drivers with the tap of the screen.

'The car that picks you up when you request an Uber is an immaculate Toyota, Mitsubishi or Honda sedan or SUV driven by a professional driver," Mr Brown explained. "The vehicle and the driver's credentials have been inspected and approved by Uber and meet all regulatory requirements for a Phuket commercial

kicker, of course, is that their feedback is actually taken into account. After years of complaints being disregarded by local authorities, untold numbers of passengers have failed to take action against taxi drivers who have violated their personal rights due to the amount of hassle required to work through official channels. Now, Uber will be able to step in and provide a greater level of transparency and accountability to the services that tourists expect.

The company already has a reputation for taking swift, decisive action against drivers that begin to slack or violate the company's policies.

"Finally, at the end of each trip, the passenger can rate the driver and comment on the experience. Feedback is extremely important to us and helps us ensure that a consistent high-quality ride on the Uber platform could theoretically make the trip from Patong

a pre-registered credit card through the Uber app, preventing drivers from rounding to the nearest hundred baht and pretending not to have change for that 1,000-baht bill.

"Uber pricing is very competitive with the market rates for comparable on-the-ground transportation options accessible on almost all parts of the island like limousine taxis and tuk tuks," Mr Brown explained.

The rate currently being quoted for an Uber driver is 950 baht from the airport to anywhere on the island. Shorter rides, such as from Patong to Central Festival in Phuket Town -10.2km – will vary between 385 and 467 baht depending on traffic, according to the app's "Fare Quote" feature.

Though more expensive than one of the new metered taxis launched on the island, which

find one), Uber maintains that the consistency, convenience and safety provided by the company will make it a major player in the market place.

It's good for the passengers, but what incentives are there for drivers who are willing to break free from the mold?

Mr Brown assured that, in fact, the application was incredibly beneficial for drivers by providing another source of clientele while they continue to work their usual beats.

"Uber's technology offers consumers more choices [and] allows drivers to make more money," Mr Brown said.

"In fact, we have seen Uber become a unifying force among the driver community around the island, which has historically been very segregated. Uber driver partners have been sharing their experience with other top-notch drivers from different parts of the island and encouraging them to partner with Uber."

The launch in Phuket is the multi-billion-dollar company's first "#UberDESTINATION" – part of a series of exotic destination resort towns to which the Uber service is provided – a service that many holidaymakers have become accustomed to in their hometowns.

Though potential for windfall profits exists for the company, several enormous barriers still stand - most notably the island's apparent acceptance of drunk driving. Regularly, stories of car accidents or motorbike deaths that are believed to be directly or indirectly connected to alcohol consumption find their way onto the Gazette's pages. Despite the deaths, it is common for expats and tourists to clamber into or onto their motor vehicles after a night in the bars for the cheapest – or, sometimes, most expensive – ride of their lives.

"Locals and expats on the island will also benefit from Uber. Many typically drive their own cars or ride a scooter for long distances on windy roads to attend engagements, events or parties... that typically involve alcohol consumption. Uber offers a reliable service that is largely available around the clock on most parts of the island, which they can now turn to for a safe ride home," explained Mr Brown.

The SEC pushes for easing of foreign ownership regulations

THE Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) has said foreign ownership regulations should be relaxed in order to attract more foreign investors.

The call for the red-tape overhaul came as the Taiwan Stock Exchange revealed that getting rid of regulation barriers was key to luring back local companies that had listed abroad.

SEC deputy secretary-general Tipsuda Thavaramara told a seminar arranged by the Association of Thai Securities Companies that it was "almost embarrassing" that Thailand still had regulation barriers regarding foreign ownership.

Ms Tipsuda also said the list of industries protected by the Foreign Business Act could be shortened to lower these foreign investment barriers. "The FBA list is quite broad, especially list 3, which also stated that foreigners who provide a service that is not contained on the

list must still obtain a foreign business licence prior to commencing operations," she said.

"Therefore, an exemption has to be sought case by case, which is why the SEC has invented the NVDR [non-voting depository receipt] to allow access to financial benefits for foreigners who do not want to express any control; but there are complications and it is not the same as real holdings.

"It would be better if the FBA's list is shortened, as the market always has issues against NVDR but we always told them [the markets] that the regulations cannot be further relaxed because of the FBA."

Nevertheless, Ms Tipsuda revealed that the SEC was working on vehicles to facilitate overseas investment and it expected to introduce an infrastructure trust early next year to go along with an infrastructure mutual fund.

When it's best to play it safe

RETIREES have really been given a raw deal by the global financial system ever since the big banks created the mess that led to the financial crisis in 2008. Since then, the banks have been bailed out and the economy has been on life support, at the expense of those trying to live on the fixed income they worked their whole lives to create.

In order to stimulate the economy, interest rates have been at rock bottom for an astonishing six years now. Despite the low returns on fixed income, it has never been more important to avoid risky investments.

Over the past few years there have been many horror stories from those who should have been in safe assets in a normal interestrate environment, but instead have been trying to make up for the lack of return. Many people are still moving into riskier asset classes even now, and with money they really cannot afford to lose.

The thing retirees should remember is that their retirement could possibly last many decades, if they survive that long, and they need to preserve their capital to be able to take advantage of higher rates — when they eventually do come back. Even though they feel the pinch very painfully now, trust that it is less painful than the results of making a big mistake with retirement funds that can't be undone.

The following asset classes

should absolutely be avoided by the bulk of retirees' net worth if they have stopped working, and do not wish to re-enter the work force during their golden years.

The first is stocks. A crash will come. While nobody can say when for sure, the longer any bull market runs, the higher the probability that a crash is coming soon. Of course, a recovery and rebound to eventual new highs always happens, but it's impossible to participate if money needs

to be drawn out to survive. With this is included specialist funds, which used to be a good choice. Sadly, that asset class has proven to have far too high a percentage of shyster fund-managers to risk retirement funds with.

Bond funds with durations over a few years are also to be avoided, as it is mathematically impossible for them to avoid losses on their portfolios when interest rates eventually do rise. Interest-rate risk is at the highest it has been in decades. It is better to buy medium-termed individual holdings of top-grade corporations that can be held to maturity. This eliminates interest rates, albeit at the expense of an increase in inflation risk and company specific risk. Only buy triple A-rated senior debt and diversify as much as possible.

The main thing to always remember is that investing is a long-term game that can be destroyed by short-term thinking. We have all fallen victim to short-term thinking at some point. Hopefully, the lessons learned will help avoid making a similar mistake again. Better days for retirees will come. Exactly when is hard to say, but they will come for sure. Make sure to have an intact capital base when that day comes.

Slowed economic growth results in delayed stimulous

THAILAND'S economic growth this year is likely to fall short of its target of 1.5 per cent, as Deputy Prime Minister MR Pridiyathorn Devakula, who is in charge of the economy, conceded that a proposed 324-billion-baht stimulus package is yet to be released to kick-start the economy by the year-end.

The Fiscal Policy Office recently cut its GDP growth estimate for the year to 1.4 per cent while the University of Thai Chamber of Commerce has maintained its growth forecast of 1.3 to 1.5 per cent. The Bank of Thailand is expected to revise its recent growth forecast of 1.5 per cent.

Speaking at a seminar arranged by the Economic Society of Thailand and the National Institute of Development Administration yesterday, Pridiyathorn said the economy in 2014 had slowed due to a lack of real public investment in the past 10 months along with the uncertainty surrounding the global economic recovery. He also said the government stimulus package, which aimed to create more jobs via maintenance projects, was delayed.

He admitted that some parts of the government's implementation of the stimulus package worth 324.47bn baht are slower than expected by two to three months. But, there was no need to introduce other measures at the moment as the package was sufficient.

"Has the stimulus package produced any effect? My answer is not yet and it is slower than what I expected," he said.

Mr Pridiyathorn explained that job-creation measures worth 23bn baht were delayed because the project's identification process was finished only at the end of October. He said that of the total 8bn baht leftover budget had yet to be approved by the Budget Bureau and 15bn baht from the "Strengthening Thailand Project" had still not been presented to the Cabinet for approval before it could be disbursed.

"Not even one baht has been disbursed and no contract has been signed, but it is okay. I will make sure that it will be out by December and that would be even better, as the rice farmers will be done with their harvesting and there will be more workers to work on maintenance projects," he said.

Mr Pridiyathorn explained further that there was also delay in the investment budget that was left over from the fiscal 2013-14 budget worth 149bn baht, of which only 14bn baht has been used since the acceleration.

But he expected that the leftover budget and the new investment budget from the 2015 fiscal budget, worth 129bn baht, would be implemented by December and its effect would be more apparent in the first quarter of next year.





Like sailing? Join the club

OFTEN the boats and the lifestyles featured in this boating column highlight how the "other half" lives. Well, not exactly the "one percenters", but more like the "eight to 12 percenters". Yet what lies behind all the luxury is the same common ground: the lure of the sea.

What many people don't know, including many long-term Phuket residents, is that a slice of that experience can be enjoyed in Phuket waters for just 200 baht – the race fee for non-members at the Ao Chalong Yacht Club (ACYC) to join one of the races in its annual series.

proved a valuable way of learning the local waters and where rocks and shallows lie, and for yachties to network and learn about what marine services are available on the island.

"It is also a great way to learn from expat sailors what the local regulations are and what is required to make sure your stay in Phuket remains legal.'

Steve Lawrence, 63, from England, has been sailing for 25 years. He finally ventured out for his first ACYC race last weekend.

"I've known about the ACYC since I arrived here, but this was my first race," he said. "I'm really a cruising sailor. I've spent eight years cruising Southeast Asia - Borneo, the Philippines. Essentially, I'm a cruising yachtsman."

Yet, Steve had never joined an ACYC race in his 10 years' living in Phuket. The tipping point was friendship. "I've known Grenville a long time. I respect the contribution he's made to sailing in the country," said Steve.

"This was the first time I've been on a boat with Grenville... He made an offer I couldn't

Steve's verdict on his first foray racing in Phuket was simple: "Absolutely fantastic."

"If you want to go racing, you want challenging conditions – you want wind, choppy conditions and poor visibility. Today we had all that," he said.

"It was the kind of experience I wanted, and it makes me feel like I want to do more racing. It was my first race and the boat I was on came first."

"On handicap," chortled ACYC stalwart Bob Mott sitting nearby.

"Every cruising yachtsman should go racing," Steve admitted. "It sharpens your skills.

Everything must be done quicker, sharper. You must pay attention to everything you do.

"For a cruising sailor to turn up to a mooring or anchorage 10 minutes late is nothing – but today we won by six minutes, and in racing that is a huge margin."

For years the ACYC race series has proved a valuable training ground for local sailors competing in the Phuket Raceweek regatta or the annual King's Cup Regatta. And that's where the ACYC stalwarts shine, regularly notching up victories against professional crews.

"It is the range of weather

conditions that make it perfect for race practice. Last week we had gusts of up to 15 knots and onemeter waves on the bay. The previous two races saw light winds that tested racers' skills and patience - and pretty much resulted in a pleasant jaunt around the course," said Bob.

In recent years the club has also made strides in developing its new clubhouse into a family-oriented venue suitable for parents and children – not just salt-spattered yachties.

On race-day Sundays, the clubhouse serves a roast that is fast gaining a reputation as a feast to be conquered and provides live music. During the past year, the club has also organized dinghy sailing lessons for beginners.

"We encourage all people from sailors with decades' of experience to people who have never been on a sailboat before to join the series. It's simply one of the best ways to enjoy an essential part of being in Phuket," concluded Grenville.

A treacherous bore

Books

I PICKED up Henning Mankell's A Treacherous Paradise (Knopf, New York, 2013, 360pp) because I was interested in reading a novel about Mozambique. It was only later that I learned that Henning Mankell is part of a coterie of Swedish crime writers who have recently attained international popularity. His Detective Kurt Wallander mystery series has been translated into 40 languages. He has also written eight literary novels.

His most recent, A Treacherous Paradise, is a towering mediocrity, an interminable bore, an amateurish

mishmash of clumsy sentences, creaking plot and cartoonish characters. Henning Mankell is a gentleman of the political left, long cozy with the Marxist government that threw off Portuguese colonialism in Mozambique. The characters of his novel are black and white - black being good, white being evil.

The book's sole virtue is its heroine, Hanna Renstrom, who grew up cold and hungry in the northern mountains of Sweden and is dispatched in 1904 by her widowed mother to seek her fortune in the little port city of Sundsvall. Here, she

steamer bound for Australia. In Algiers she marries the ship's second mate and in Lourenco Marques, capital of Mozambique, her new husband dies of fever, leaving Hanna widowed at the age of 18.

She jumps ship and checks into the Paradise Hotel where she falls ill from a miscarriage. Later, she realizes that she is living in the city's most popular brothel, a lone white woman amid a score of black prostitutes. Here would be a chance for a parade of colorful characters, but the whores and their white clients are mostly left in the background, except for the good-hearted Felicia. Oh, and there's also a chimpanzee named Carlos who works as a waiter.


The author conveys no sense of place for Lourenco Marques, no insight into the populace other than that the whites are insufferably arrogant and the blacks won't look the whites in the eyes.

The brothel owner, Senhor Vaz,

is a fair man who lets his whores keep half their earnings. Though he barely comes up to Hanna's shoulder, she accepts his proposal of marriage. He turns out to be impotent. When Hanna slips him an aphrodisiac, he dies. Hanna is suddenly a wealthy woman.

Before he died, Senhor Vaz had advised Hanna to seek business advice from prosperous merchant Pedro Pimenta, who breeds guard dogs and crocodiles at his farm. Scandalizing the white community, Pedro has an African wife named

he dotes on. Hanna happens to be at his farm when Pedro's white wife turns up from Portugal with her own two children in tow. What follows is a very clunky murder scene:

"It was Isabel who progressed from words to action. Lying on the table was a knife that Pimenta used to carve small wooden sculptures, which he burnt when they were finished. She grabbed the knife and thrust it deep into Pimenta's chest, pulled it out, then stabbed him again. Hanna thought she could count up to at least 10 deep wounds before Pimenta's body slowly slithered down onto the floor of the veranda. Isabel took her children and disappeared into the house."

Isabel is then consigned to a

cell in the Portuguese fort. The final third of the novel revolves around Hanna's efforts to help her. There are more clunky murders, including that of the chimp Carlos. The ending is utterly unsatisfactory.

Mankell's narrative tone remains as didactic as Karl Marx. When Hanna enters black slums for the first time in search of Isabel's parents, "it came as a shock to her to discover the conditions in which black people lived. She discovered squalor and suffering way beyond her imagination...

But after a few days she noticed something else when she made her repeated visits to the black settlements. She discovered an unexpected lust for life among the poorest of the poor. The slightest reason for feeling joy was not tossed disdainfully aside, but seized with both hands. People supported one another, even though they had virtually nothing that they could share."

This passage is typical. Mankell constantly tells us opinions and shows us nothing. A Treacherous *Paradise* is a painfully bad read.






