Beach bans

Gov Nisit: no sun loungers, cigarettes or food on the sand

BEACHGOERS have been banned from eating and smoking on Phuket's beaches.

Governor Nisit Jansomwong announced the news on Tuesday at a press conference designed to clarify that beach chairs were also prohibited.

Beach umbrellas, even those brought by tourists, are now confined to the designated 10-per-cent areas reserved for beach vendors, Governor Nisit said.

Originally, the 10-per-cent plan allowed beachgoers with personal umbrellas to plant their parasols anywhere on the sand, and confined those renting them from vendors to the 10-per-cent area.

Now, umbrellas are not allowed outside these areas, though towels and beach mats are still allowed anywhere on the sands.

The news delivered on Tuesday wrapped up a wild week of beach-regulation enforcement that left one tourist in tears after police politely – but forcibly – removed her private beach chair from Patong Beach.

Meanwhile, more than 30 tourists stormed the Kamala Police Station to demand an explanation for why their beach chairs were moved off the beach by police officers.

Yet, Gov Nisit stood strong in his decision to ban sun loungers from Phuket beaches.

"Today, I would like to make it clear. We

will continue to strictly enforce the rules prohibiting beach chairs on Phuket sands," he told the press conference.

The governor's statement flew in the face of Patong Mayor Chalermluck Kebsup's call on Monday for a compromise, following several incidents on Patong Beach during which tourists became outraged after police asked them to remove their sun loungers from the sands in compliance with the no-chair policy.

The issue went viral on the internet, with videos and pictures circulating on social media sites showing tourists upset when asked to remove their sun loungers from the beach. Some videos showed tourists vowing never to return to Phuket if beach chairs remained banned.

Ms Chalermluck told the Gazette that she was concerned about the effect these incidents would have on tourism.

"I understand where the tourists are coming from, especially the elderly. They are more comfortable on the beach if they have a lounger," she said...

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Man stabbed meters away from Patong police station

A MAN is in hospital after a gang of teenagers dragged him out of his pick-up truck and stabbed him in the chest within meters of the Patong Police Station last Sunday.

Yet, police did not learn of the attack until staffers at Patong Hospital called them at about 3:30am.

The staffers reported that Surasak Ruengpeng, 26, from Nakhon Sri Thammarat, had staggered up to the emergency room and collapsed.

He had been stabbed once in the chest with a thin, sharp ob-

Lt Col Teerasak Boonsang responded to the call, and soon after his team of officers found a pickup truck parked askew in front of the police station with the driver's window smashed.

"Witnesses said that they saw Mr Surasak's truck screech to a halt in front of the police station, as he had tried to enter through the gate on Sainamyen Road," said Col Teerasak.

"But it was the wrong entrance; it was closed. The main entrance is around the corner."

The witnesses also reported seeing a group of teenagers – number unknown – ride up on more than four motorcycles.

"They smashed the window and pulled Mr Surasak out of the car," Col Teerasak said. "They beat him to the ground, then continued to kick and punch him.

"After that, one of the teenagers pulled out a knife and stabbed

The teenagers then sped off, leaving Mr Surasak to limp toward Patong Hospital, about 50 meters

"We believe that Mr Surasak had an earlier altercation with the gang that attacked him," Col Teerasak told the *Gazette*.

"He tried to get to the police after his condition improves."

station, but unfortunately could not get in through the side gate and became trapped."

Mr Surasak is now in the men's surgery ward at Vachira Hospital in Phuket Town, a hospital staffer confirmed on Wednesday.

Police are searching for the gang of attackers.

"We have very little to go on, and there is no CCTV covering the area where the attack occurred, but we will check other CCTV cameras in the area," Col Teersak

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German tourist drowns off Krabi

A GERMAN tourist drowned in Krabi while swimming with his son on February 12.

Martin Hofstetter, 57, and his family checked into a bungalow resort on Koh Siboya, south of Krabi Town, on February 11, explained Lt Col Kittichet Kittiratanasombat of the Klong Khanan Police.

"They took a sea trip to Koh Lola and went swimming there [on February 12]," Col Kittichet told the Gazette.

"They were unaware of the strong current there. Mr Hofstetter could not stop himself from being dragged out to sea."

Mr Hofstetter's son rushed to help his father, while his mother looked on from the shore, some 150 meters away, Col Kittichet

"His son was unable to pull his father back to shore, and he started calling out for help," he

"Several local villagers rushed to help. They managed to bring Mr Hofstetter back to shore, and

rushed him to Nuea Klong Hospital, but he was pronounced dead on arrival."

Arrangements are being made to return Mr Hofstetter's body to Germany for the funeral, Col Kittichet confirmed.

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One killed, three injured in multi-vehicle road accident

POLICE are blaming a new set of traffic lights for a high-speed crash that killed one motorcyclist and injured three others on Thepkrasattri Road on February 12.

Police arrived at the scene, at the old airport junction, to find a 10-wheeled truck and a van overturned on the shoulder of the road next to a motorcycle, as well as two other damaged vehicles in the street.

"CCTV footage in the area shows a 10wheeled truck in the northbound lane approaching the intersection at high speed and slamming into a van waiting there at the red lights," Lt Col Thanom Thongpan of the Tah Chat Chai Police told the Gazette.

"The truck and van flipped onto their sides and slid together across the southbound lane, hitting two motorbikes and two cars, before coming to a stop on the side of the road."

Uthit Saeyang, 34, on a Honda motorcycle, was killed in the collision. Three other people suffered minor injuries.

"We believe Prasit Srisomut, 43, the truck driver, did not know that the traffic lights were there, as they were installed only three days ago. He did not see them as he came up to the junction," Col Thanorm said.

"Regardless, he will be charged for reckless driving causing property damage and - Thawit Bilabdullar

Misbehaving Russian men charged for overstaying

IMMIGRATION Police arrested two Russian men at Nai Harn Beach on February 11 after complaints that the men were "behaving badly", including stealing small items from local stores and failing to pay for meals.

Officers arrested Mikael Morkretkof, 45, and Denis Rievsef, 32, as they were walking on Nai Harn Beach, explained Capt Nattapong Klaithong of Phuket Immigration Police.

After visually identifying the two men, Capt Nattapong asked to see their passports.

Mr Morkretkof arrived in Thailand on August 9. "His visa expired on September 7," said Capt Nattapong.

Mr Rievsef arrived on December 8. "His visa expired on January 6," he added.

The two men confessed to overstaying their permits-to-stay and were taken to Chalong Police Station to be charged.

Lost in translation

POLICE had to scramble last week to correct fliers that were handed out to tourists at Patong Beach on February 13 that mistakenly read in English "No Summer Dream On Beach, Start 12 Feb 2015".

"It was a translation error. The A4 flier was supposed to say something that would mean 'no beach loungers', as it did in Thai language below the English translation," Deputy Superintendent Akanit Danpitaksat of the Patong Police told the Gazette on February 14.

"Instead 'beach loungers' was translated as 'summer dream'."

Lt Col Akanit apologized for the misunderstanding and any inconvenience that might have been caused by the error.

"We wanted to make sure that

everyone understood the new rules before we started strictly enforcing them," Col Akanit said. "We don't want to ruin tourists' holidays by taking away their beach loungers, if they don't realize that the chairs aren't allowed on the

Without realizing the error, officers handed out fliers on Surin Beach later that said the same thing as those distributed to tourists on Patong Beach.

"Our officer handed the fliers out on Surin Beach to people who were bringing their beach loungers or chairs onto the sands," confirmed Cherng Talay Police Superintendent Serm Kwannimit.

"We are not pressing charges against foreign tourists at the moment, but any Thais found breaking the rules will be charged up to 2,000 baht."

Bar staffer charged with assault for baseball bat attack on Phuket expat

AN EMPLOYEE at a bar in Rawai who brutally attacked a British expat with a baseball bat has been charged with assault, police have confirmed.

Sarawuth Kongphat, 37, a staffer at the Green Leaf Bar, beat customer Christopher Stark with the bat and fractured his skull, after Mr Stark discovered he did not have enough cash to pay for his drinks.

"Mr Sarawuth accused Mr Stark of punching him first, but we found no evidence of bodily harm to Mr Sarawuth that sup ported his allegation," Lt Chollada Chokdeesrijun of the Chalong Police told the Gazette.

Mr Sarawuth was escorted by police on February 10 to meet with Mr Stark, who is still recovering at Vachira Phuket Hospital.

Lt Chollada said that with no evidence to support his story, Mr Sarawuth admitted to the assault.

"He has agreed to pay all Mr Stark's medical expenses at Vachira Phuket Hospital, which amount to more than 150,000 baht."

Lt Chollada added that Mr

Stark's insurance claim to cover medical expenses had been delayed, forcing him to stay in hospital until the matter of who was to pay the bill could be re-

"It was necessary to bring Mr Sarawuth to meet with Mr Stark and discuss the bill, otherwise Mr Stark couldn't leave the hospital," she said.

However, the matter of compensation for Mr Stark, who has been in hospital since January 23 after undergoing brain surgery for a hematoma, still needed to be discussed, said Lt Chollada.

"Compensation for the injury was not agreed upon at the meeting. That part will be up to them to negotiate," she said.

"We will finish the paperwork for the assault charges against Mr Sarawuth and present them to the prosecutor's office as soon as possible." - Voratuss Intasee



Sweeping away cleanup crumbs

Gov vows to remove last buildings allegedly encroaching on beaches

GOVERNOR Nisit Jansomwong announced on February 12 that the final traces of the ubiquitous encroachment onto Phuket beaches that prompted the beach cleanup last year would be swept away as soon as possible.

The governor and other island officials, speaking at a press conference held at the Royal Thai Navy base in Cape Panwa, addressed the problem of several buildings still encroaching on two beaches at Cherng Talay.

Two restaurants – Beach Bar and Paul – are still standing on Lay Pang Beach, and vendors have started moving back onto the sand, Ma-ann Samran, president of the Cherng Talay Tambon Administration Organization (*OrBorTor*) explained to the press.

"We have filed complaints with the Cherng Talay Police about the two restaurants on the beach. It is in their hands now," he said.

"We also fined every vendor who has tried to go back onto the

beach 2,000 baht."

Two buildings also remain on Surin Beach – a one-storey structure filled with shops, and Zazada Beach Club.

"We will file a warning with the owners of Zazada Beach Club and the shops occupying the onestorey building within a week that will give them 30 days to move out," explained Mr Ma-ann.

"After the 30 days, Zazada Beach Club will be torn down," he said, adding that he was unsure of the specific demolition date.

The one-storey building occupied

by shops was originally built by the government, however, many of the units have been modified and other structures unassociated with them have been built, he added.

"The reason this process is taking so long is because the building used to belong to the government, which makes it more complicated for us to try to demolish it," Mr Ma-ann explained.

Governor Nisit added that he and other relevant officials would put into writing the official new post-cleanup beach rules as soon as possible.

The governor announced on February 11 that the regulations being tested at Patong Beach – with registered vendors being allowed to occupy 10 per cent of the beach – would become the standard for all Phuket beaches.

"We will wait a little while longer to make sure that we have everything worked out so that we don't have to go back and change things again. That always leads to confusion," he said.

"I cannot say when exactly this will happen, but I promise to have it done as soon as I can."

In closing, Governor Nisit expressed his approval of the results of the beach cleanup.

"The situation is slowly getting better. Almost every beach is neat and in order once again," he said.

French tourists survive dramatic tour van crash

THREE French tourists escaped serious injury when the passenger van they were in blew out a front tyre and tumbled onto the median guard rail en route to Phuket International Airport on Tuesday.

Yassin Bouhou, 31, suffered a broken left leg and compatriot Franky Legueulle, 33, broke his left arm in the accident, confirmed Lt Col Watcharin Jirattikarnwiwat of the Tah Chat Chai Police.

"Their friend Sertac Akkurt, 26, suffered only minor bruises," he told the *Gazette*.

The van driver, Phiboon Uthairangsri, 42, said that he heard a loud bang before the van skewed out of control.

"I heard a bursting noise and then lost control of the van," Mr Phiboon told the *Gazette*.

"The front right tyre had blown

out, which sent the van rolling onto the median. Fortunately, none of my passengers were seriously injured."

Mr Phiboon, working for Persona Travel Company, had picked up the three tourists from Patong and was taking them to the airport when the accident happened.

"We were about 350 meters from the Thalang Technical College when the tyre blew, at about 1:15pm," he said.

All three Frenchmen were taken to Thalang Hospital for treatment. Police took Mr Phiboon into custody for further questioning.

"He has been charged with reckless driving for the time being while we establish if his actions or negligence played any role in the cause of the accident," said Col Watcharin.

"They told us that they found him outside in a shopping cart, and then left without providing any further information," said Kamonthip Kanwong, a Tesco Lotus customer service manager.

The baby was taken to the Vachira Phuket Hospital maternity ward by Kusoldharm rescue workers.

Phuket City Police are now searching for the baby's mother, as well as the two women who found the baby.

Camp inspections underway

GOVERNOR Nisit Jansomwong led an inspection and health advice session at a workers' camp in Chalong on February 13, as a first step in improving conditions at the more than 200 camps in Phuket.

The inspection followed a meeting last month in which the governor announced his goal to improve health and safety standards at the island's worker camps.

Governor Nisit – along with military personnel; officers from the Phuket Public Health Office; and officers from the Labor Protection and Welfare Office - visited the Trimit Vitsavakam construction company camp at about 5:30pm.

During the inspection, health officers gave the workers advice about hygiene, contraception and general welfare. Those living in the camp also received vaccines for Tetanus and Diphteria.

"This is the first time I have visited this camp, so it is hard for me to accurately gauge the quality of life here. However, if I consider all of the junk lying around, the messiness of the

rooms and camp, as well as the smell of trash, I would say that it meets only 80 per cent of my standards," said Gov Nisit.

"The foul smell, as well as the dirty water, which the migrants bathe with, are examples of things that need to be improved for the camp to get a better rating."

Gov Nisit confirmed that officers would be sent to inspect camps on a regular basis.

"If they find anything disconcerting, the manager of the camp will have to make the necessary adjustments to get the living areas up to standard," Gov Nisit said.

During the inspection, the

governor outlined his general ideas for improving the quality of life at all of the island's worker camps:

- 1. Improving the entrances and exits of the camp so that they are safe and usable in case of an emergency
- 2. Inspecting and preventing any criminal activities
 - 3. Inspecting for drug use
- 4. Improving hygiene, including tackling sources of foul smells
- 5. Finding a proper way to dispose of any waste
- 6. Checking every migrant worker's work permit and identification card for validity, and making all camp managers aware of the laws regarding migrant workers

"Phuket has 226 migrant worker camps. There are 108 in Phuket Town, 16 in Kathu and 102 in Thalang. There are more than 10,000 workers in Phuket, who come from Myanmar, Laos and Cambodia," Gov Nisit explained.

"We are aware of how important it is to improve these workers' quality of life while they are living here, and we want to do it properly."





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Chalong locals petition gas station construction

CHALONG Mayor Samran Jindaphol led a group of 20 local residents to Phuket Provincial Hall on Monday to formally request that Governor Nisit Jansomwong halt the construction of a new LPG gas station.

Construction started on the station, on Chao Fa East Road, but was soon put on hold after residents filed a complaint with the Damrongtham Center (ombudsman's office), explained Sutharat Chusombat, a local community representative.

"Most of the locals who live there are against it for health and safety reasons," she said.

"Now, construction has started again. We are worried about the inevitable safety and pollution problems this gas station will

Nightlife raids fail to find human trafficking victims

RAIDS on some 40 nightlife venues throughout Phuket Town over the past month have failed to uncover any evidence of human trafficking, police have reported.

"The only illegal activity we have found are women offering sexual services in public, mostly along Chaofa Road," said Phuket City Police Deputy Superintendent Khunnadet Nanongkhai.

"We recently arrested three more prostitutes in that area."

The venues raided included karaoke bars, massage parlors and other bars, and were all in Phuket

Town, Rassada and Koh Kaew, Lt Col Khunnadet explained.

The number of women working at the venues ranged from about six to up to 40.

"However, we uncovered no evidence of human trafficking. They are all registered businesses, with no illegal migrants or minors," Col Khunnadet confirmed.

Undeterred, police raids will continue, he assured.

"We will continue our random daily checks, starting from about 10pm," Col Khunnadet said.

Police nab ladyboy ya ice dealer

A LADYBOY drug dealer in possession of 58.48 grams of *ya ice* (crystal methamphetamine) and 145,000 baht in cash was netted on February 14 in Phuket Town.

Police were informed by undercover officers that Thiwa Saengreung, 38, had been selling ya ice to teenagers in the area, said Lt Col Chaiyadej Kaiyarit, an inspector for the Crime Suppression Division 5 of the Central Investigation Bureau.

"We sent in an undercover officer to buy drugs from Ms Thiwa at her rental room on Mae Luan Road," Lt Col Chaiyadej said.

"We arrested her in possession of 58.48g of *ya ice*."

Ms Thiwa told police that she had bought the drugs from a man who police named as "Mr Fuse".

"We then had Ms Thiwa set up an appointment with Mr Fuse outside of a 7-11 convenience store in Baan Kuku," Col Chaiyadej said.

"Unfortunately, as soon as our team started moving toward the car, Mr Fuse fled the scene."

Police are now hunting for Mr Fuse. Ms Thiwa was sent to Phuket City Police Station and will be charged for possession of a Category 1 drug with intent to sell.

Online 90-day immigration check-in to launch in April

FOREIGNERS living and working in Thailand will be able to report to immigration for their 90-day check-in via the Thai immigration website no sooner than April, an immigration officer confirmed to the *Gazette* on February 13.

The news follows an experimental launch of the online reporting system in Bangkok last month.

"The online 90-day reporting service is being tested now. For the time being, foreigners are still required to go to an immigration office to check-in," Maj Gen Tamrong Sangwatanakul, commander of the Royal Thai Immigration Division 3, told the *Gazette*.

"The service already appears on the website, but it cannot be used yet. We have to wait for the official order, which we expect to receive in early April."

The service will be available in all provinces for the convenience of foreigners, Gen Tamrong added. However, there will be consequences for late check-ins.

"Failure to report within seven days after the 90-day period will result in the usual fine of 2,000 baht, and the offending foreigner will be banned from using the online check-in system," Gen

Tamrong explained.

"From that point on, the person will have to report to an immigration office."

will be banned from using the Sgt Maj Ronnachai online check-in system," Gen Khongthirak of the Phuket Immi-

gration office confirmed to the *Gazette* that foreigners on the island must continue to report in person until an official order to launch the online service has been handed down.

CCTV mass upgrade reaches final hurdle

BUDGET allocation for the proposed 238 million baht upgrade of CCTV cameras in Phuket has reached its final hurdle and now awaits approval by the Ministry of Tourism and Sports, Governor Nisit Jansomwong announced earlier this month.

Governor Nisit said he was "delighted" by the news.

"This is one of my top priorities – to enhance security," he said.

"Last week, I signed a letter to confirm that the budget was necessary to upgrade the CCTV system throughout Phuket, and the request is on its way for final approval.

"However, I have also ordered all local administrations to allocate the budget needed to maintain their own CCTV systems in their areas."

The push to approve the budget for the island-wide CCTV

project comes with support from the Ministry of Tourism and Sports (MOTS) Phuket office marketing campaign "Phuket Peaceful City".

"The purpose of the campaign is to promote Phuket as a role model for tourist destinations in the country – in terms of safety," said Santi Pawai, chief of the MOTS Phuket office.

The new CCTV system will support the police in working more effectively, Mr Santi added.

"Police were recently unable to identify the hit-and-run car that killed a ghost rider on the bypass road because one of the CCTV cameras where the accident happened wasn't working," he said.

"With an upgraded CCTV network, police would have been able to apprehend that driver."

... "On one hand, if we let tourists use their loungers, we will receive complaints from the public regarding our lack of enforcement of the ban. On the other hand, when we do our duty, the tourists complain.

"This issue can seriously damage Phuket's tourism industry."

Although Ms Chalermluck confirmed that the chair ban is policy and police must carry out their duties in accordance with it, she said that she had spoken to Governor Nisit about the issue.

"I don't want to place the blame on anyone for this," Ms Chalermluck told the Gazette. "Everyone is doing what they are supposed to do.

"However, all relevant government offices need to meet and discuss whether or not they want to follow the rules, satisfy the tourists or find a solution somewhere in the middle."

Governor Nisit gave his answer at the press conference: no beach chairs allowed.

Patong Police Deputy Superintendent Akanit Danpitaksat told the Gazette that police had been facing resistance from tourists since they began enforcing the rule on February 12.

"Some people have been crying, some people have refused to move [their chairs] and some complain and say that they will never visit Phuket again. We have heard these things every day since we began telling people

about the new rule," Lt Col Akanit said.

"We have been as polite and understanding as we possibly can, but we must follow our orders.


"Thai people who travel abroad must obey the laws of whichever country they are visiting; why can't foreigners follow Thailand's

Governor Nisit answered that estion in part on Tuesday, noting, "This is about changing the behavior of both beach vendors and tourists who have gotten used to occupying the beaches with sun loungers over the last 30 years."

NHRC criticizes use of military protection for oil drilling machines

A NATIONAL Human Rights Commission (NHRC) subcommittee planned to file complaints on Wednesday over the deployment of soldiers and security personnel for an oil firm in Khon Kaen province.

"We will write to both the Khon Kaen governor and the chief of the Second Army Area to let them know that the deployment of security forces is utterly inappropriate," Dr Niran Pitakwatchara said on Tuesday in his capacity as chairman of the NHRC subcommittee on community rights.

Police, soldiers and volunteers arrived in Ban Na Mun last Saturday to assist Apico trucks carrying a drilling rig passing protesting locals to access the site of a new oil well in nearby Kalasin province.

Residents of Ban Na Mun had been protesting for days because they feared exploration for oil and gas so close to their hometown would hurt the environment, natural resources – and their health.

Locals said they had no idea what the energy company was doing due to the lack of public consultation, Mr Niran said, adding that villagers were now worried that no one would take responsibility if there were adverse effects.

He pointed out that it was agreed on February 10 between his panel and local government agencies that an academic forum on the petroleum operation be held promptly, reported The Nation.

"But the firm has chosen to move its equipment into the site before the forum has been held," Mr Niran said, adding that the NHRC will go ahead with the forum.

Bar security guard, manager confess to killing tourist on Koh Samui

A SECURITY guard and the manager of a bar on Koh Samui confessed on February 13 to conspiring to shoot dead a Turkish tourist, police said last Sunday.

Kabin Srisa-ard, 27, the guard, and Kanapong Nakwatchara, 56, the manager of the pub on Chaweng Beach, confessed after several hours of police interrogation that they conspired to shoot Polot Mehmet, 37, with a .38-caliber pistol that was found in Mr Mehmet's hand, reported *The Nation*.

Police said they confessed that one of the

guns used in the crime belonged to Mr Kabin and the other belonged to Mr Kanapong.

After shooting Mr Mehmet, they put Mr Kabin's gun in the victim's hand.

When they realized a security camera had captured the crime, they repositioned the camera but failed to note that the incident was captured by several other cameras.

Police said the men told them that the Turkish tourist often came to the bar, got drunk, intimidated staff and created a scene.

On February 13, they said, Mr Mehmet

got drunk and forced staff to keep the bar open. The staff pleaded with him to leave but he walked to the counter with a clearly visible pistol tucked inside his belt.

Mr Kanapong shot him in the abdomen with his own gun and then Mr Kabin shot him in the head with his gun. Mr Kabin and Mr Kanapong then tried to cover up the crime to confuse the police.

Police brought both men to the bar to re-enact the crime before detaining them at the Provincial Court last Sunday.

Thailand faces shortage of educated, skilled laborers

THE number of Thailand's vocational and technical students lags behind the market demand in the most-wanted fields, experts say.

Narong Kasatepibal, Association of Future Thai Professional's board chairman acknowledged that while the Office of the Vocational Education Commission (Ovec) is pushing for measures to enhance vocational education standards, the lack of skilled labor in the market remains problematic.

He said industries currently face a severe shortage of skilled workers across the board, notably welding engineering, mechanical power technology, machine tools technology and construction technology, reported The Nation.

Mr Narong noted that despite the rising demand for high-paid welders, enrollment in colleges

welders remained very low as students viewed the job as involving hard manual work.

Total demand for welders nationwide is more

than 300,000 - working in various industries - including petrochemical, fuel exploration and production, and construction. However, the current supply of trained welders who graduate

from vocational schools is only 20,000 a year.

Some private companies were

prepared to offer salaries of up to 30,000 baht a month for qualified welders, said Mr Narong.

Paitoon Soison, director of Nong Khai

College of Boatbuilding Industry and Technology, added that his college had only eight students studying for a vocational certificate in welding engineering. Most, he said, were not interested in the field, because of tough study requirements and safety issues.

"Colleges must be more aggressive in their attempts to change the perceptions of students and their parents – enabling them to better understand the needs of the labor markets and what they can achieve.

"However, most students aren't interested, because the welding engineering program requires students to be patient and practice in a workshop with safety clothes and tools - not in air-conditioned classrooms," Mr Paitoon added.

Students were also not interested in construction technology, Mr Narong said. Over 100,000 skilled construction workers were needed, but colleges could only produce 10,000 students a year.

Chanvech Boonpraderm, Ovec's deputy secretary-general, said huge infrastructure development and the growing property market had resulted in a critical shortage of skilled construction workers - especially foremen. This had even led to the Home **Builders Association collaborating** with colleges to produce workers for the housing market.

The ratio of vocational students to basic education students is currently 35:65.

Woman in Bangkok first arrest for refusing alcohol breath test

A WOMAN on February 12 became the first motorist Thailand to be punished for refusing a breathalyser test, said police, who added that they were forced to tow away her car with her still inside.

The Bangkok South Municipal Court found Chutima Kanthang, 28, guilty of drunk driving, but handed down a suspended three-month sentence with one year of probation, reported The Nation.

She was also ordered to pay a 8,500-baht fine and to perform community service.

Her driver's licence was suspended for six months. Ms Chutima told the court that she had some drinks with friends before she arrived the police checkpoint.

According to police, Ms Chutima parked her car on Naradhiwas Rajanagarindra Road near the police checkpoint at 2:30am last Thursday, but refused to get out of her car or take the test.

Pirates plant harmless bomb on Thai oil ship

A BOMB planted on a Thai oil ship, a chance to seek help last Sunin the Strait of Malacca, had a circuit panel and battery, but no gunpowder, Royal Thai Navy's Third Area Command chief Vice Admiral Sayan Prasongsamrej said on Monday.

On Friday, pirates attacked the Lapin, which was carrying oil from Singapore to a power plant in Krabi province, before leaving the bomb on board and making off with 2,000 tonnes of bunker oil and 5,000 liters of diesel. The ship eventually ran out of power and anchored near Koh Tarutao off Satun province, giving the captain

An ordnance disposal team disarmed the bomb on Monday afternoon and after discovering that it had no gunpowder, suspected it may have been planted with the intent of threatening the crew, Adm Sayan said. He said Satun police would interview the 15 crew members.

This was the first pirate attack on the Andaman side after five to six attacks in the Southern China Sea, he said, adding that Thai waters would be patrolled more frequently to prevent it happening

I PAY close attention to all crimes that occur in Phuket, as it is my duty as an officer in the investigation department. They are all my responsibility. However, I consider drug crimes my top priority because they are committed so often on the island.

As Phuket is a popular tourist destination, drug issues are hard to tackle. Not only are Thai people involved, but foreigners as well. I think the number of tourists that come here, and their apparent willingness to partake in drugs, increases the amount of drugs smuggled onto the island. Foreigners also pay a higher price for them than locals, which is an incentive for dealers to smuggle in and sell more drugs.

Therefore, we keep a close watch on tourist-attraction locales such as Bangla Road, Patong

Beach, Karon Beach Promthep Cape.

Police often go out into the communities to educate families about drug use, the negative effects it can have and how to prevent it. We can make arrests all day long, but the problem should be stopped at its roots. This is why we need everyone to work together, especially families and close friends.



Time to end the age-old, and sometimes fatal, visa runs once and for all.

THE new online system apparently in the works for foreigners to complete their 90-day reporting to immigration through a web portal may herald a new era for expats tired of the age-old visa run.

Who knows, if immigration wants to stage yet another security crackdown, they could easily ramp this up to a "selfie run" whereby all that would be needed is an app through which expats could post selfies, and facial recognition software and the GPS in the phone would do the rest.

But where would the muchsought-after cash "top-up payments" to officials come from?

Despite repeated reports detailing the exact same scenario something I believe the news industry calls "corroborating reports" – nothing has been done to resolve the "alleged" 200-baht per person "entry fee" for visa runners to re-enter Thailand at the Sadao checkpoint on the Malaysian border.

Perhaps an online payment system lurks somewhere down the road, but who would want to rankle the all-powerful immigration officers at the border, who on a whim could refuse a foreigner re-entry to Thailand – where, for many, their wives, children and homes await.

As any wildlife expert will tell you: cut off one source of food supply, and a wild animal will just turn to another form of sustenance.

Regardless of what officials like to think – or publicly ignore – visa runs remain dangerous, and at times lethal.

This is not whining. This is not a complaint. This is fact.

End it now, please.

Thanongsak Klaicharoen, head of the Disaster Prevention and Mitigation Division at Wichit **Municipality, replies:**

The new fire station, with a

budget of almost 2.5 million baht, has been under construction since July 2014. It will be open and ready to start operating in May.

The outside of the building may look complete, but there is more work to be done on the inside. We need to buy tools and a new fire truck and also hire employees

The station will serve people in Wichit. Firefighters and rescue workers will be on standby there 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

The station will be available to provide assistance to people in emergencies, such as fires, rescues, floods and serious storm

Staff will also be able to help people with less threatening issues, such as helping to remove dangerous animals from people's properties, watering public plants and even help clear blocked water supply pipes to private homes.

Beach bum blues

PATONG Mayor Chalermluck Kebsup is correct in calling for a compromising approach to the ban on beach chairs on the island (see page 1). An equitable and transparent solution must be worked out before this latest embarrassment causes irreparable damage to the island's tourism industry, permanently driving away many of the island's most loyal guests.

Images of elderly tourists being forced by police to remove beach chairs from the sand is the worst possible publicity for the island. This is especially true now, as it comes just months after images were seen around the world of the military personnel patrolling the sands with automatic assault rifles during the applauded cleanup campaign.

It is sad that our leaders so consistently fail to demonstrate sufficient foresight to prevent or mitigate impending problems.

In this space we have warned in advance about several disasters-in-waiting, including the inevitable collapse of the Patong Hill road due to downslope construction work, the SuperCheap inferno and the rapid break-up of the Coral Reef Squadron artificial reef after exposure to monsoon-season currents.

The *Gazette* is not blowing its horn or claiming special powers of prognostication: we are simply pointing out things that should be obvious to all. The ongoing beach chair fiasco is no different.

An editorial published at the start of this high-season read: For better or worse, Phuket evolved as a beach tourism destination with beach loungers and parasols as an integral part of the infrastructure. That corrupt local politicians used them to illegally amass personal fortunes over the years does not negate that reality.

That editorial went on to call for temporary measures to allow for sun loungers and parasols to be made available to tourists during the current high season, with a long-term, sustainable and transparent approach to be drawn up during the upcoming low season.

Instead, we have witnessed a series of highly-confusing directives and flip-flops, with enforcement of the controversial "no beach chair" rule varying greatly in different areas. In a final bid to end all the confusion, a complete ban on all beach chairs across the island was eventually imposed.

Not only is this ban harmful to the tourism industry, but it will no doubt prove to be unenforceable by police in the long term.

Looking further into the future, it is easier to imagine a scenario in which police replace local administrative bodies in reaping the profits from rented beach chairs, parasols and jet-skis than it is to imagine comprehensive enforcement of the ban.

Rather than ban beach chairs completely, a system could easily be devised in which tourists could simply "register" beach chairs into a central database and receive a sticker or some other form of certification that it is owed by them, not rented.

This of course seems like a cumbersome and overly bureaucratic approach to something as simple as enjoying a day at the beach, but for diehard beach bums it might be worth a try.

One voice for tourism

Phuket Hotel Association to be a key platform for hotel industry

THE erroneous 'No Summer Dream' fliers, warning tourists and locals not to bring sun loungers to the beach, is the latest blow for authorities attempting to restore a semblance of order to the island's tourism industry. One that has left hotel and resort owners, as well as their general managers, scrambling for a response and explanation to give to the world.

However, even when corporate responses are well coordinated, the impact becomes negligible when faced with the bombardment of messages from local and international media. The insignificance of the explanations is compounded when hotel and resort leaders fail to have a single message and a single voice: enter the Phuket Hotel Association (PHA).

On February 16, about 40 GMs, or their representatives, from many of the island's most prominent branded and non-branded resorts and hotels met as the groundwork for the PHA, a registered nonprofit organization, was laid out.

"This is the beginning of a forum that gives hoteliers and their owners a platform to discuss issues that are commonly shared, including education, marketing and 'Brand Phuket', as well as the industry's response to crises or negative press and so on," said PHA Executive Director Anthony Lark.

The core objective of PHA, based on the successful Bali Hotel Association, is to be the leading private sector initiative in marketing tourism in Phuket and to promote the island as the leading destination resort in Asia and one

of the finest in the world, it was explained during the meeting.

"It is time for Phuket to communicate to the world that, although we share the same core values with the rest of Thailand – good value, warmth, generosity of Thai culture – Phuket is a large entity in its own right and has a voice that deserves to be heard," explained Managing Director of C9 Hotelworks Bill Barnett.

"The PHA aims to be a significant force within Asia so it can effectively deliver the 'Brand Phuket' message to an international audience, and work as a forum between tourism and government on issues relating to the island's most important industry."

The PHA will launch on March 1 with an expected 25-30 hotels'

business heads having already joined, said Mr Barnett.

"We have critical mass, we expect to come out with 25-30 hotels by March, The initiative this year really is to address the critical components, which right now is how do you voice to customers what's happening on the beaches," he said.

"We are in market free fall right now. Bali dropped by 14% occupancy year-on-year. Markets are struggling to figure out how to replace those clients, so it's a business issue as well."

Unlike many other island tourist destinations in Thailand, arrivals at Phuket International Airport showed a quick recovery from the market contraction with the declaration of martial law last year.

Though arrivals show a 2% in-

ternational and 5% domestic growth year-on-year, market-wide occupancy in 2014 fell by 6%, according to a C9 Hotelworks report.

The decrease in demand led to average room rates slightly dropping from US\$147 in 2013 to US\$146 in 2014, as the baht depreciated six per cent against the US dollar.

To combat the decline in occupancy, as well as the 4,727 new rooms expected to enter the Phuket market by 2018, the PHA will be working with branding specialist Quo CEO David Keen.

"The damage we get from the media with the blogs talking about Phuket is [that the island is] ridiculous, stupid, nothing works, everything else – it's just nonsense," said Mr Barnett.

"We are trying to re-install pride hospitality industry.

back into it and positive messaging – not fluff. To pass on information about the beaches in a realistic way, so that people know what's going on. Right now hotel managers have to go online and blog about an issue, otherwise there is no way for them to voice their concerns. We are trying to give them a venue for that."

The lack of a platform has consistently been a problem, Mr Lark said. "For instance, there wasn't a unified body to discuss issues, so hotel GMs were just emailing each other independently, asking, 'What are you doing?'

"[Now] we can form a common position in response to any crisis... The PHA is therefore a unified body, representative of the views of our Thai owners, GMs and the larger chains, all of whom have a stake in seeing Phuket's brand communicated in a positive way," Mr Lark said.

"We want to work closely the Tourism Authority of Thailand in promoting the positive news and incredible experiences of our island. What we are saying is that at the level of private enterprise, a lot of the Thai owners of hotels on this island would like to see a more unified approach to issues, and we are better off speaking with one voice."

Membership fees for the PHA will range from 25,000 baht to 40,000 baht and be used for operational costs, and eventually to create a scholarship to send local students to top-flight hotelier schools outside of Thailand.

The PHA is also embracing the efforts of the Trisara Academy, which aims to improve the skill sets of Thais working in the hospitality industry.


To have real financial freedom, you need to first determine what your ideal lifestyle would be. This is different for everyone, and of that can be maintained within your

Building on strong foundations

ALL good projects begin with strong foundations. To make theirs even stronger, the developer of Diamond Condominium in Cherng Talay inaugurated an environmentally friendly piling system called "Hydraulic Static Pile Driver" at the initial stage of the project's construction.

Following the official land blessing ceremony in mid January, the first of 768 piles was laid using the "Hydraulic Static Pile Driver" technology, marking the first time such a piling system has been used in Southern Thailand.

"We used the hydraulic piling system as part of our ongoing commitment to minimize the impact on the environment and adjacent upmarket residences," explains Jo D'hondt, managing director at Silk Projects Co, Ltd, the company behind the development.

"Piles are driven in with virtually no vibration, which means there is less chance of damaging the steel and concrete pile heads," he adds, explaining that such piles can be more accurately inserted compared to traditional hammer-driven ones, which can damage the quality of foundations.

And as the Hydraulic Static system generates virtually no noise, neighbors should be glad as well.

However, this commitment to quality doesn't end with the foundations. Every-

thing in the project, from the amenities available for the residents to the architectural style, will reflect the up-market feel of the project's location in a high-growth area between Laguna and Surin Beach.

Located on a land plot of more than 5 rai (9,472.4sqm) the finished project will comprise four buildings with approximately 350 apartments, available in three different

configurations: one bedroom in eight different styles of 33.10sqm to 78.40sqm; two bedroom in seven versions between 50.20sqm to 100.40sqm, as well as an unspecified number of three-bedroom apartments.

And with a rental program designed for owners who require a flexible usage option and a developer-backed guarantee of 7 per cent for there years, with 30 days complementary owner usage, Diamond Condominium offers something for the more business- minded buyers as well.

Even though the handover of the 900-million-baht project is scheduled for November 2016, 120 units have already been sold. Prices range from 2.8 to 9.20 million baht.

The piling is expected to take three months to complete.

Island expat community living



IF YOU are living in a foreign country where there is already a well-organized expatriate community, there can be many benefits. Having catered to an expatriate society for many years, Phuket is one such destination that is popular among foreigners – and for many reasons – including, of course, the tropical climate, beautiful beaches and the warm and friendly local people.

It's partly due to this established community that many expatriates settle down in Phuket and call it home. Demand for housing is therefore now on the rise. It is also not uncommon to see "seasonal" expats and retirees who choose to come to Phuket for a couple of months each year.

At this stage, the internet can be invaluable for establishing new contacts and doing your "homework" on the best properties to rent or buy.

Alternatively, contact a realestate agent to assist and recommend some local properties. This will take some of the stress out of hunting for a home, and while it might be an added cost, a good agent will have a much better knowledge of the market and could save you time in finding the right combination of factors to suit your family's needs.

Popular property choices are usually 3-4 bedroom pool villas in a gated community, with monthly rentals ranging from 70,000 to 250,000 baht on a one-year rental agreement. Because Phuket's tourism industry is seasonal, securing a one year contact will also save you money, as owners are usually ready to drop the monthly rate the longer you stay.

A one-year contract will also give you the time you need to adjust to the new culture, scout out the island, and then perhaps move to another property better suited for your family, once the rental period is over. In fact families sometimes relocate from one area to another just so that their kids can be closer to their playmates in the same street.

Most long term rentals in Phuket are fully furnished, which

is convenient and would save on the initial costs of moving to a new country. All that is usually required when moving in are your suitcases.

Timing is also important: secure a property before the tour-

ist high season starts as rental prices will go up sharply at that time and availability will go down.

Phuket's well-organized expatriate community has its advantages over other similar tropical destinations – especially

if you're not the adventurous type bent on blazing a new trail.

MK Real Estate Development pumps B5.9bn into six projects

MK REAL Estate Development plans to launch six new residential projects worth 5.9 billion baht this year to cash in on the recovery of demand for homes.

The firm's targets are pre-sales of 4bn baht and revenue of 3bh baht this year, Chuan Tangmatitham, president and managing director of the firm, told a news conference last week.

Mr Chuan confirmed that the company was negotiating with potential strategic partners for joint development of residential projects, focusing on those with expertise in marketing and construction.

"We are negotiating with both foreign and local investors who are interested in joining us in business, but no deal has been made at this time," Mr Chuan said.

Mr Chuan said that the company's investment budget would come from its internal cash flow and bank loans.

At present, the company's existing projects have homes for sale worth 5.5bn baht. When combined with this year's new

launches, MK will have projects valued at a total of 11.4bn baht, which will generate income through 2017.

Four of this year's six new projects will feature detached houses and townhouses worth a total of 3.16bn baht, and the other two will be condominium projects worth 2.74bn baht. All

of them will be in metropolitan Bangkok.

"We have continued to concentrate on developing residential projects in Bangkok and its suburbs rather than expanding upcountry as the supply in the provinces now is exceeding the demand," Mr Chuan said.

Our own evening experiencing Jasmine B's unique beauty started with chilled champagne cocktails sipped beside the outdoor garden bar. We then segued indoors to sample an array of complimentary tasters that were thoughtfully provided while we pondered the extensive menu.

My Thai partner opted for a tasty selection of Thai starters

> featuring deepfried crab meat, chicken sate in traditional peanut sauce and soft-shelled crab, all of which she demolished with élan and declared to be, "delicious".

> I chose the Sea Quest tossed green salad with seared tuna, marinated prawns, smoked salmon, bell peppers and other healthy veggies, which proved to be fresh and tasty, while al-

lowing me an inner glow of self righteousness about how healthily I was eating.

The story kicks off with 15-year-

old Holly Sykes waking up in her bedroom above the pub owned by her parents in Gravesend, on the banks of the Thames. After a fight with her mother, she runs away from home.

Now things turn weird. An old woman, Ester Little, is fishing off a pier and gives a thirsty Holly green tea from a thermos. She knows Holly's name and asks for "asylum" in the future.

Holly is psychic. She used to hear "radio voices" in her head, was visited daily by a beautiful and mysterious apparition called Miss

Constantin and suffered from delusionary "daymares" until cured by a Chinese doctor, Marinus who turns out to be a character from Mitchell's last novel about Nagasaki in 1799.

At the scene of a triple murder, Ester Little takes asylum in her soul before she erases all memory of the event.

In the second section, the narrative voice changes completely. Glib, clever, cynical, larcenous Hugo Lamb is in his last year at Cambridge. Born of modest means, he makes a living hustling his wealthy classmates at poker While pool.

listening to a choir rehearse at his college chapel, he meets the most beautiful woman he's ever seen, none other than Immaculee Constantin. She seems to be interviewing him for a mission, before mysteriously disappearing. At Christmas break, he's staying with his aristocratic friends at a chalet

in Switzerland when he falls in love for the first time in his life with an English barmaid, 21-yearold Holly Sykes. After a blissful time snowed in by a blizzard, he forsakes her to be initiated into a time-travelling cult known as the Anchorites, based in a mountain chapel in the Alps.

Elizabeth Little and Dr Marinus are also time travellers, but from a rival cult known as the Horologists. They are automatically reincarnated 49 days after death, commonly in a different race and sex. In contrast, the eternal life of

the Anchorites is based on three month installments of drinking the soul, the "Black Wine", of kidnapped victims, often children. The two cults have been at war for 150 years.

Telepathy, precognition, transmigration of souls - now we are in Stephen King territory. This conceit continues over two more entertaining sections, one about Ed Brubeck, Holly's old classmate, now an Iraq war correspondent and father of her daughter, Aoife; the other about Crispin Hershey, a washed-up novelist, who keeps bumping into Holly at various literary functions around the world. She is famous now for her psychic memoir Radio Voices.

But now we come to the gaping crater in the novel. Dr Marinus, reincarnated as an Afro-Canadian female psychiatrist, brings Holly along to the climatic battle of the war of the cults in Switzerland. Good and evil clash in comic book

embarrassingly bad.

The novel only redeems itself in the last section, narrated by 74-year-old Holly, living a handto-mouth existence in a cabin on the coast of a dystopian Ireland. The world is falling apart in 2043, starved of fuel, air travel and even government. However, even this section is ruined at the end by a seaborne deus ex machina from

BISP student paints his path to recovery

STRIKINGLY colorful works of art currently lining the hallways of the British International School Phuket (BISP) map the road to recovery for one very happy student who nearly lost his life in a motorbike accident in March 2013.

Sevastan Lukashov was left in a monthlong coma after a horrific accident on the bypass road, and had to undergo extensive cranial surgery - including having a metal plate inserted into his skull – before he could start the long journey back to health.

With the help of his art therapist, Claire Lester, the 18-year-old's creative recovery process over the last year has culminated in a collection of pieces depicting his memories of Russia, life in Phuket and his feelings about his family, recovery and more.

Sevastan's first solo art exhibition – called "I love my life: The art of Sevastan Lukashov" – opened at BISP this month.

"Phuket helped me to see life after my accident. If this would have happened in Russa, it would have been hard for me to recover," says Sevastan, as he stands proudly in front of one of his pieces.

When asked about his new-found talent and love for art, Sevastan says, "It makes me [happy], to remember what life is worth. Before my accident, I didn't like my life, but now I am so happy."

Art, in one form or another, played a pivotal role in Sevastan's battle back to life, even if he might not have been aware of it.

"[When I was in the coma], my parents would turn on my favorite music... They talked with me to help me remember who I was and where I was, Sevastan explains.

His mother, Irina, recalls, "Every day we would do everything we could to bring Sevastan back.

"We spoke every minute with him. We didn't know if he was listening, but I thought it would help him."

Music was also an element of inspiration and focus during Sevastan's weekly hour-long sessions with Ms Lester.

"[In the beginning], his drawings were very small and labored and he found it very difficult... He worked for an hour every week and he chose the music. Mostly, it was Mozart," Ms Lester remembers.

"He not only needed to rehabilitate himself,

but his movement, his gross motor skills. It was moving, moving to the music, as well as getting what happened to him out on the canvas."

Ms Lester says that she has seen immense improvement in the way Sevastan moves and works.

"He used to hold his hands and support his arms while he was working because he had trouble with his mobility. He used to

support himself," she says.

"Within the year, he went from using bigger paint brushes to smaller paint brushes. He could move quicker."

Sevastan's road to recovery has been successful, and beautiful, but it's not over vet, savs Ms Lester.

"His brain is going to continue to heal over a number of years. That's where the art is going to help. The creativity within that is going to make connections in his brain further and it's going to continue to heal," she says.

It's evident the powerful effect art has had on Sevastan's life and health, not to mention the potential it has for his future which Sevastan hopes will involve business

"The first time I came to draw [with Ms Lester], I was drawing people - my parents, my family. I said to Ms Claire, 'Can I draw something from my mind?" he says.

"She said 'It's beautiful, it's amazing.

"I want to say thank you, thank you so much to Ms Claire. Thank you very much."





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A Siesta in the making

WHEN Phuket yachtie Bob Mott settled on the design for his new 55-foot alloy Catamaran Siesta, little did he know that the project would be more than two years in the making.

Now, with the launch slated to be held in Phuket in September, Bob relates how his experience offers a great deal of good advice for yachties looking to build their own boat, or just pull in to Phuket for repairs.

"Completing a new catamaran of my own design has been quite a challenge," says Bob. "The shell was welded up in Cebu, Philippines, from a pre-cut kit sent from Australia.

"Once finished to 'motor away' stage, Siesta was delivered to Phuket on her bottom over 2,000 nautical miles without incident in nine days."

Critical to Siesta's successful completion in Phuket, including interior and electrical fit-out, was assembling a good team on the island, Bob notes.

"It was a challenge, but it is important to have your own team and try not to rely on contractors who can let you down," he says.

"It is best to control as much as you can in-house. This I have learnt through hard experience over the years by being involved in boat-building projects."

After the long haul to Phuket, Siesta lay in wait at the Premier Boatyard Phuket, near Yacht Haven, at the north end of the island. She lay there for months before serious work began on transforming the shell into a resplendent catamaran.

Asked why so long before any

work began, Bob simply replies: "I was very busy with other projects."

Finally, Siesta was motored down to Chalong Boatyard & Storage (CBS), also called "Chalong Coconuts", on Soi Koktanode beside Chalong Bay, where she has undergone her true metamorphosis.

Familiarity and trust in Chalong Coconuts owner Manop Seeriratthikan were key factors in the decision to complete Siesta there, but most important was location.

"The botyard is near where I live. I could pop down there within 10 minutes," notes Bob. "Also, boatyard workers are readily available in the area and I have had many years of dealing with the yard with my other catamarans."

Now *Siesta* stands proud on the hard with five double cabins and one double stack twin, as well as two single berths for crew. There are two separate toilet-shower units for the crew, while guests have four toilet-showers to share, two of them up upstairs.

Despite the impressive facilities on board, Siesta will not want for power: she will boast eight 135watt solar panels on the cockpit awning, four 175W panels over the dinghy davit area and a 175W panel over the upper helm station.

"She will also have a 150-amp DC [direct current] generator, two high-output wind generators, smart regulators on the two main 54HP Yanmar diesel drive engines, with 120-amp alternators fitted to

keep the power up 800 amp hours on the AGM batteries and run the on-board system," says Bob

"Lighting is mostly LED or lowdraw fluorescent, fridges are all 12V DC and low-draw with highefficiency insulation, a seawater to fresh water maker capable of producing 200 liters of drinking water per hour. Electric sheet and halyard winches have been added for ease of sail control."

In progress, as this article went to print, was the interior fit-out, as the exterior paint had already been applied.

Although *Siesta* as an alloy boat does not require painting other than underwater coating and deck coatings for non-slip, Bob has punted for an easily recognizable

color scheme with which to coat the hulls.

"She will be a very unusual charter catamaran in as much as she has been painted dark red on the port side and dark green on the starboard side," he explains.

"The reason for that is purely cosmetic, as well as for marketing purposes, as a charter catamaran for my company Faraway Yachting Charters Co Ltd. It's good for branding and she will be noticed.

Common sense came into play in the paint selections, with Chugoku etch primers and epoxy base coats, but more expensive Dupont polyuhrethane paint for top coats.

"If you want to make your boat look good, spend the extra money on the top coats. It is worthwhile in the long run," Bob advises.

Regarding the vital antifoul, the choice was to avoid the top-rated products. "We used the same Chugoku antifoul used on Thai fishing boats, which costs about 2,300 baht for a five-liter can," Bob chuckles. "Why spend more on something that needs to be done 12 months later?"

But if there is one rule in sourcing local services for work on your boat, Bob maintains that "due diligence" is vital.

"Do as much homework about the boatbuilder as you would for a builder about to build your house," Bob happily points out.

"And if you can't be there all the time, make sure you have a representative who has your best interests at heart," he says.

"This can save you a lot of time and money – and if the work goes wrong... it can save you much, much more."

Langkawi begins major overhaul

THE Royal Langkawi Yacht Club (RLYC) in Malaysia has begun a major redevelopment of its marina and its club, now 18 years old.

The work will cause some disruption to existing berth holders, and longer stays will not be possible until the upgrades are finished at the end of October, the RLYC said in a statement this week.

The project includes the expansion of mega-yacht berths. New power systems, sanitation pumps, safety equipment and extra berths will also be added to the marina.

The redevelopment of the club includes the restructuring and design of a new three-story block of shop lots, lifestyle floor and boutique retail outlets.

The main clubhouse will also undergo major refurbishment, with a grand lobby and reception area on Level 1. A completely new concept will take over Level 2,

and will feature eight boutique rooms for guest accommodations.

"RLYC has a long history and while we intend to maintain the traditions that have been established, we believe that redeveloping will enable us to provide our loyal clientele, and future clients, with what they deserve, which are world-class marina facilities and boutique hospitality services, said Executive Director and General Manager, Wicky Sundram.

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Life & style CA causes turbulence



ONGOING regulatory changes made by the Thai Department of Civil Aviation (DCA) headquarters in Bangkok have left recreational flying enthusiasts throughout the Kingdom scrambling to remain in compliance, Up In The Air has learned.

Pat James of AeroPro Management, based at Phuket AirPark in Pa Khlok, said that the administrative adjustments followed a change at the top of the DCA.

The new rules are intended to create a more streamlined and user-friendly system for private aircraft owners.

Nearly all facets of aviation regulation have been revamped, including ownership and registration of aircraft as well as pilot licensing procedures.

"Unfortunately, the policy changes have put everything at a standstill until everybody adapts and changes over. Needless to say, when people get used to doing things a certain way whether it be right or wrong – it is hard to change. Consequently, there are starting to be some delays in the DCA processing as people come in with the wrong paperwork, or submit it in the wrong order," Pat said.

While some of the new administrative procedures should ultimately help the general aviation community [recreational flyers] in

the long run, others make it more restrictive, he explained.

Pat said that he has been flying to Bangkok to meet with DCA staff on a weekly basis since early January, when he first learned that five-year permit applications were not being processed in the usual way by the agency.

One of the most notable changes is that under the new rules all recreational pilots must now be listed as the legal owner of any aircraft they fly.

Before the changes, licenced pilots – including those presenting licences issued by other nations – could be issued five-year permits

by the DCA. They could then borrow and use a friend's aircraft, typically just paying for fuel and other expenses, or work out some other kind of arrangement. But that is no longer possible under the new rules: all would-be pilots must be listed as owners, either fully or in part, of any aircraft they intend to fly.

"This has a large impact on general aviation, because as we all know not everybody can afford to buy an aircraft," Pat said.

He said the five-year permitting system in place in Thailand is much more restrictive than procedures used in most other countries. The system is intended lar in recent years due to

to ensure that all pilots are extremely-well vetted before they are allowed to take to the skies above the Kingdom, he added.

"But it also cuts very deep into the general aviation community and holds it back under a heavy thumb. They [the DCA] tends to view general aviation more from a security perspective, not as a sport," Pat said.

GAME OF DRONES

The ongoing changes at the DCA will also affect the recreational use of small drone aircraft, which have become increasingly popuimprovements in technology and increased affordability.

Swedish drone aircraft enthusiast and part-time Phuket resident Aron Hansson recently used drone aircraft technology to produce an impressive three-minute video entitled Phuket - From The Sky through the popular video-sharing website, Vimeo.

The video, made using a relatively low-cost drone fitted with a GoPro Hero3 and other cameras, comprised segments covering 24 locations across the island, starting with traffic at the Central Festival Phuket junction and ending at Karon Beach. The video has attracted some 40,000 plays since its release on February 6.

Mr Hansson said that he felt lucky to have finished and released the video just days before strict new regulations on drone aircraft came into effect.

He has formed a company in Sweden, AH Film, which allows him to partly finance his drone aircraft hobby, he said.

Unfortunately the sky will no longer be the limit for drone aircraft enthusiasts like Mr Hansson in Thailand, thanks to new regulation that went into effect a few weeks ago.

"To fly a drone aircraft now in now requires that you have licences and permits issued to you. I am told that the people who are responsible will be the Royal Aeronautic Sports Association of Thailand, better known as RASAT, the same people who oversee paramotoring in Thailand," Pat said.

The rules apparently apply to all remotely-controlled aircraft, including the types that one might receive as Christmas presents, he

'We are looking forward to hosting more activities here. It has been kind of a long time, to let people know we are alive and well here. It's going to be a lot of fun. We will have water bombing and flour bombing contests, precision landing contests, and ground-based activities tutoring people who want to know more about flying," said Pat James of AeroPro Management, who also heads the Phuket Aviation Club.

Hot air balloons, which have been a highlight at some previous events held at the AirPark, will not be on display this year.

Persistent high winds, and the fact that Phuket is an island, have caused hot air balloon operators to abandon plans to use Phuket as a base for this activity for safety reasons. Other Andaman Coast provinces with dramatic landscapes, such as Phang Nga, would probably be more suitable, Mr James

At one time one of the biggest names on the muaythai scene in Europe, 44-year-old Jomhod has been in training for weeks at Tiger Muay Thai in Phuket for this one particular fight.

"MMA is challenging as it has some basic muaythai mixed with martial arts from other countries." he told the *Gazette*.

"However, I wanted to try a new style of fighting, so I joined the MMA. It is different from classic muaythai, because in muaythai you stand and fight. In MMA, you keep fighting even when you're down."

Switching fighting styles has had other benefits, Jomhod added.


"MMA gives me a new range of fighting techniques and keeps me fit in training. Moreover, I have made new friends to help me make the transition," he said.

Manager Jason Buchanan explained that Jomhod's training regimen has been wound down over the past week in preparation for the fight.

"Everything is okay right now. We just have to tighten his game up a little bit for him to get ready for his MMA debut on Saturday night," he said.

Buchanan explained that Jomhod had long shown throughout his muaythai career his

propensity to expand his skill set to include MMA.

"We have added new skills by including more training on the ground, which he was not used to when he was still in muaythai, and I think he is making the transition very well," he said.

Some of Jomhod's skills from muaythai were adapted, such as in-close grappling.

"Muaythai involves some inclose wrestling, with a lot of body locks and throws, and he has incorporated those skills in his MMA technique," Buchanan said.

"I think he's going to do quite well. It's Full Medal Dojo. I think it's going to be quite an event and I'm looking forward to seeing him display his skills."

Jomhod's trainer, George Hickman, rated the difference between the two styles as huge.

"We have a world number-one muaythai fighter, and we are trying to turn him to MMA. It is so different from what he has done

before," he said.

"Muaythai is a 'standing' sport, you hit the ground and stop. But in MMA, you hit the ground and

"Jomhod has had to learn to lots of new things, such as wrestling. We rate Jomhod as the number-one striker in the world, and I think he probably still is.

"Getting him into MMA is very interesting, and I think he will do it very, very well. It is going be very exciting to see."

Love to be appointed US Ryder Cup captain

FORMER US PGA Champion Davis Love III will be appointed United States Ryder Cup captain next week for the 2016 matches at Hazeltine, the Golf Channel reported on Monday.

The 50-year-old will be officially named on February 24 at the headquarters of the PGA of America in Palm Beach, Florida, the outlet said.

It would be the second time Love has led the team after he oversaw the 14.5/ 13.5 defeat to Europe in 2012 when Jose Maria Olazabal's side stormed back from 10-6 down on the final day at Medinah.

That loss is one of eight that the Americans have suffered in the last 10 editions of the biennial team event, which prompted the PGA of America to appoint an 11-person Ryder Cup task force, which Love sits

Tom Lehman, who captained the US to a heavy 18.5/9.5 defeat in 2006, and Steve Stricker, a winner of 12 PGA Tour events, also sit on the task force and are likely to hold roles in Love's 2016 team, the Golf Channel said

Love, who won his sole major in 1997, played in six consecutive Ryder Cups from 1993. He tasted victory twice, on his first appearance and in 1999.

Europe won last year's matches 16.5/ 11.5 with five-times major winner Phil Mickelson scathing of the approach used by American captain Tom Watson after another defeat.

At the time of going to press, Northern Irishman Darren Clarke, who won the British Open in 2011, was expected to be appointed Europe's new Ryder Cup captain.

A five-man selection panel was due to announce Paul McGinley's successor on Wednesday. - Reuters

MANCHESTER United survived a scare to beat League One Preston North End 3-1 in the FA Cup fifth round on Monday and set up a mouth-watering quarterfinal against Arsenal.

Scott Laird's deflected 47thminute strike gave third-tier Preston the scent of a huge upset but United regrouped and goals by Ander Herrera, Marouane Fellaini and Wayne Rooney sent the Premier League side through.

"We showed an unbelievable team spirit," United manager Louis Van Gaal told the BBC.

We changed the shape and that was the solution. We scored fantastic goals, a little bit lucky also I think. I liked the second goal a lot, we have trained for that a lot.

"Marouane Fellaini has a body, he also scores goals. I played him in the position that he wants for the first time, but I do not always have a position for him. The spirit was better."

Rooney, however, came under volatile criticism for taking a dive to win the penalty. The England striker went down in the box after a challenge from Preston goalkeeper Thorsten Stuckmann appeared to make little or no contact.

Preston North End manager Simon Grayson came to the England striker's defence.

Antonio Valencia's right-wing cross was powerfully met by Fellaini at the far post and the towering Belgian lashed home the rebound seven minutes later.
