Public urged to file complaints over mafia behavior at beaches

THE Damrongtham Center (ombudsman's office) has vowed to tackle any mafia-like behavior by local residents trying to distort the law as they attempt to illegally profit from any of the numerous small, secluded beaches on Phuket.

"If anyone is aware of mafia-like tactics or beach encroachment on beaches like Nui Beach in Karon or elsewhere on the island, please file a complaint with us," said Prapan Kanprasang, chief of the Damrongtham

Mr Prapan's statement follows a militarybacked raid of Nui Beach as investigators followed up on alleged beach encroachment and illegal land documents.

Navy officers led the raid on Nui Beach on May 21, following an investigation into allegations of 'mafia thugs' illegally claiming the land and extorting beachgoers.

In February, 46-year-old Chalothorn Chotianan, whose family claims ownership of the land, said that he was not aware of anyone trying to charge visitors for using the

"Everything is fine. I am not mafia and the and around the beach is legally my property I have all the documents to prove it," he told officers at the time.

Further investigation into the land documents for the 18 rai of property, which provides the only land access to Nui Beach, led government officers back...

Phang Nga newborn

POLICE are hunting for the happened, but it seems like whomother of a newborn girl who was found dead in a canal in Phang Nga, north of Phuket, on May 21.

"When we arrived we found the baby's body inside a well-tied plastic bag," said Lt Sarawut Phanpan of the Thung Ka Ngok Police. "Inside the bag we also found an umbilical cord and three

Though there was a cut across the baby's neck, police took the body to Phang Nga Hospital for doctors to determine the cause of death.

"We can't be sure what

ever was associated with the birth tried to hide the evidence. However, the stones weren't heavy enough to keep the body from floating to the surface of the canal," Lt Sarawut said.

"We are now looking for women in the area who might have recently given birth. We will also be questioning villagers to see if any pregnant women have recently disappeared from the area."

If caught, the mother will face due legal process, confirmed Lt Sarawut.

Rescuers helpless as Swiss man dies in elevator shaft

RESCUERS helplessly watched a Swiss national who was stuck in an elevator shaft in a Patong hotel die on May 22.

"We think that the doors to the elevator opened up before the lift had arrived and that he stepped into the shaft, unaware that there wasn't actually an elevator there," said Maj Teerasak Boonsang of the Patong Police. "An employee heard the sound of him crashing onto the roof of the elevator."

When Baan Paradise Hotel employees arrived at the scene, they found the 54-year-old man, who police declined to name, upside down with his head wedged in between the elevator and the wall of the elevator shaft.

"I was on the fourth floor when I heard the sound. I ran to the elevator and saw that the man had fallen. I went to the third floor to try and open the doors, but I couldn't get them open," a hotel employee said.

Employees then called police and rescue workers.

"He was still alive, but was in a weak condition when police and rescue workers arrived. He was calling out for help," Maj Teerasak

said. "We tried to get him out, but the hole was too narrow – he was trapped for almost an hour."

Eventually, the hotel mechanic was able to lower the lift to the first floor, where there was more space for rescuers to free the man's body, explained police.

Police are continuing their investigation to establish why the elevator doors opened before the lift had arrived to the fourth floor.

The Swiss Embassy has been informed of the death. Police are withholding the man's name pending the notification of next of kin.

Two dragged to death by bus

TWO men on a motorbike were killed when they were hit and dragged by a tour bus on Thepkrasattri Road early Monday morning.

The bodies of Thai national Somwang Chuaykamchu, 31, and Myanmar national Aung Myint, 32, were underneath the bus when police and Kusoldharm Foundation rescue workers arrived at the scene near the entrance of Thai Watsadu in Thalang at about 1:20am.

"The men were making a u-turn opposite Thai Watsadu when they were hit by the Pornsiwathep bus. They were dragged about 10 meters before the bus came to a stop," said Lt Col Sanit Nukong of the Thalang Police.

Police found a white Suzuki motorbike near the bus, but no helmets, confirmed Col Sanit.

The bus driver, Montree Posee, told the police that he was driving to work when the men suddenly cut in front of his bus, causing the collision.

"Police have, nonetheless, seized the bus and the motorbike

until the investigation is complete," said Col Sanit.

"Mr Montree was charged with reckless driving causing death."

The bodies were taken to Thalang Hospital.

Well-known Phuket reporter dies in Surat Thani car crash

A LOCAL reporter for the Phuket Daily News and Siengtai newspaper was killed in a car crash in Surat Thani on May 19.

Amnuay Korbkum, 46, a well-known member of the Phuket Reporters Club, was travelling from Phuket to Surat Thani to visit his father in hospital when the accident occurred at about 9:50pm.

"Panupong Sukaoon, Mr Amnuay's brother-in-law, was driving. We believe he tried to overtake a van on the left and smashed into the back of an 18-wheeled truck," explained Maj Daecho Khongsuk of the Baan Na Doem Police.

Mr Amnuay had already been rushed to Baan Na Doem Hospital by the time police

"Mr Amnuay died upon arrival at the hospital due to the serious chest injuries he sustained in the crash," Maj Daecho said.


Mr Panupong is currently recovering at Baan Na Doem Hospital from head injuries sustained in the accident.

He has been charged with reckless driving causing death and will be questioned further by police once he has recovered, Maj Daecho

"He was a very good man. He helped us

with everything, especially the news," Boonrat Apiwantanakorn, president of the Phuket Reporters Club, told the Gazette.

"He always supported events and never hesi-



tated to help anyone who needed it. "We were all very sad when he died."

TWO men have been arrested for their roles in the attempted murder of a man in Thalang on May

Kordetch Sinto, 38, was shot in the back while he was sitting in front of his house. Police originally thought that four suspects were involved but, during their investigation, they learned that only two men on one motorbike had participated in the crime.

Police found the driver, Natthakit Thongplaew, 22, at his rental room in Rassada on the same day as the shooting, said Phuket Provincial Police Deputy Commander Peerayut Karajedee.

"Mr Natthakit told us that he drove the shooter Nattapol Kamjeen, 23, to the house. Mr Nattapol jumped off, shot Mr Kordetch, got back on the bike and they fled the scene, he explained.

"He then revealed that Mr Nattapol had run away to his home province of Nakhon Sri Thammarat.

On May 19, Mr Nattapol was tracked down in Nakhon Sri Thammarat and police found the homemade handgun buried outside his home there.

"Mr Nattapol admitted that he shot Mr Kordetch because he looked like someone he had problems with who also lives in the same area, said Col Peerayut.

Mr Nattapol was charged with attempted murder and illegal possession of a firearm and corresponding ammunition and Mr Natthakit was charged for being an accomplice to attempted mur-

Mr Kordetch has since been discharged from hospital, confirmed a nurse at Thalang Hospital.

AN ANGRY passenger boarding a Thai Air Asia flight to Bangkok has been charged with causing a bomb scare after she told airline employees that her bag contained a bomb, in response to being forbidden from taking a water bottle on board on May

22.
"Phanarat Nopphakhun, 37, has been charged for the fake bomb scare at the airport. She faces a maximum fine of 200,000 baht, five years imprisonment or both," confirmed Lt Col Watcharin Jirattikarnwiwat of the Tah Chat Chai Police.

Ms Phanarat has denied the

All passengers on flight FD 3002, which was preparing to fly from Phuket to Bangkok, were

moved to an emergency parking area for further inspection, confirmed Monrudee Gettuphan, director of Phuket International Airport.

There were 141 passengers and six cabin crew on the flight, which was supposed to have departed by 8:40am," said Ms

Monrudee.

"We conducted thorough search of the plane and found nothing that have could been used as a bomb."

Locals discover headless turtle on Mai Khao

EXPERTS at the Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC) in Cape Panwa are investigating the cause of death of a headless turtle that washed up on Mai Khao Beach on Monday.

Kusoldham Foundation rescue workers arrived at about 10:20am after receiving a call from a local villager who found the turtle and initially tried to bury it.

"At this point, we think the turtle may have suffered a head or neck wound from a fishing net that became infected, causing it to die and the head to rot off," said Winai Sae-Ew of the Mai Khao Tambon Administration Organization.

The remains of the reptile were taken to the PMBC to determine the species of turtle and cause of death.

Tsunami drill hailed a success

A TOTAL of about 200 emergencyresponse officers and locals joined a full-scale tsunami evacuation drill at Koh Sireh, off the east coast of Phuket, on Tuesday, May 19.

"Every department handled the rescue role-playing situations very well and acted appropriately. However, the locals seemed to be more uncomfortable, as this was their first time," said Phuket Governor Nisit Jansomwong.

The drill simulated a warning being issued through television, radio and SMS alerts to people in Phuket by the National Disaster Warning Center (NDWC) in Bangkok.

"The tsunami warning tower siren was also sounded, which issued the warning in five different languages: Thai, English, Chinese, Russian and Japanese," explained Governor Nisit.

Following the warning, people were evacuated to predetermined locations and a number of complications were simulated.

"The drill included additional realistic complications such as injured children, a pregnant woman and a motorbike crash. Addition-

ally, a rescue team had to be deployed to find and recover five people who were reported missing during the evacuation," Gov Nisit said.

The three-hour drill was designed to ensure that each de-

partment understood its responsibilities and had clear lines of communication, as well as to ensure locals had a chance to freshen up their evacuation skills.

"We also want to make sure tourists, not just locals, are confident that we are well prepared for such a disaster," Gov Nisit said.

Santhawat Riwleung, chief of the Phuket office of the Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation (DDPM), was also satisfied with the results of the drill.

"It went well. I was glad that we chose to conduct this one in Koh Sireh, as we have not had a full-scale tsunami drill here before and the residents need to be comfortable with how an evacuation is conducted," Mr Santhawat said.

Earlier this month, residents of Koh Sireh fled to high ground in fear of a tsunami, following an earthquake.

The full-scale tsunami drill was postponed from May 8, as it conflicted with the traditional sea gypsy festival, *Loy Reua*.

It was the second time the annual full-scale drill had been postponed.

The exercise was originally slated to be held on Christmas Day last year, but was later postponed due to sensitivities over the exercise being held one day before the 10-year anniversary of the disaster of 2004.

...to the property. Mr Chalothorn's father, Thana Chotianan, attempted to present the same documents as proof of ownership.

"The KorSor 1 provided by Thana Chotianan to obtain a NorSor 3 for the 18 rai of property was for a completely different property, which voids the NorSor 3," explained Lt Somphop Kamthana of the Royal Thai Navy Third Area Command.

"We have collected enough evidence, and have now asked that the Phuket Agricultural Land Reform Office [ALRO] send the evidence to Karon Municipality, so that they can present the owners with an eviction notice."

The *NorSor 3* was voided by the Supreme Court, confirmed Lt Somphop.

The evidence is to be handed over

The evidence is to be handed over to the municipality in the next week. The municipality is then expected to issue a 30-day eviction notice.

During the raid, officers found five buildings used to provide services to customers on the beach, as well as tents, fitness equipment, tables, chairs and an unlicensed jetski, confirmed Lt Somphop.

"If they fail to remove the buildings, we will demolish them and charge them for land encroachment," he said.



Jet-skis wrangle more beach space in Patong

TWO jet-ski and parasailing zones and two swimming zones have been added to Patong Beach to fulfill the needs of tourists, Governor Nisit Jansomwong told the Gazette on May 21.

When the zones were first established last year, there were three swimming areas, each 500 meters wide and extending 150 meters offshore, and two jet-ski zones each about 300 meters wide, with jet-skis prohibited from venturing any more than one nautical mile offshore.

Now, there are five swimming zones and four jet-ski zones, all of which are 200 meters wide.

"We need to have options for tourists to choose from on a holiday destination like Phuket. When tourists spend money on activities such as jet-skiing, it gives a boost to the economy," Governor Nisit explained.

"We added the zones at the

request of operators, but also as a response to tourists' needs."

Jet-ski and parasailing operators must keep their vehicles parked inside their zones and in the water.

"The swimming zones will be

marked with buoys 200m apart and 120m into the sea. Even though these areas are marked for swimming, I urge all tourists to swim carefully," Gov Nisit said.

"All locals and tourists should

keep an eye out for any operators who break the rules. Please report any dangerous or suspicious activities to Patong Police, Patong Municipality, the Governor's Office or any other relevant officers."

Soi Bangla blaze guts rental room

TOURISTS on Soi Bangla panicked after a fourth-floor room along the popular party road burst into flames on May 20.

Three fire trucks spent about 20 minutes dousing the flames coming from the rental room above Rico's Restaurant.

No one was injured in the incident, confirmed police.

However, the blaze completely destroyed the room and its contents, causing an estimated 100,000 baht in damages.

The room was being rented out by Thai national Marisa Dermthamram, who was at work nearby when the fire broke out, explained Patong Police Superintendent Chaiwat Auikam.

"We believe that the fire started from an electrical short circuit. However, Ms Marisa was taken to the Patong Police Station for questioning in hopes that she might be able to shed more light on what might have caused the fire," said Col Chaiwat.

A similar situation is believed to be the cause of a fire that gutted ten shops on Phi Phi Don earlier this month.

Pebbles scattered around skate park cause stir

The X-treme skate park in Phuket Town was sabotaged with pebbles - creating a dangerous situation for a variety of skate sports – on May 21.

Phuket resident Phakhawat Jret Na Nakon made the discovery when he and friends went to the Saphan Hin skate park that day, according to his Facebook post.

There were pebbles all over the skate zone. We also found the plastic bag used to carry the pebbles. This is dangerous for children and everyone who plays in the park," Mr Phakhawat said on Facebook.

It is still unclear to many of the skaters

why the park was vandalized.

"It is not a good thing. I don't know why they scattered pebbles in the park, but we will buy our own CCTV to ensure our safety and so we can identify the suspects if it ever happens again," X-treme park member, Nattawut Paewgate, told the Gazette.

No complaint has been filed with police, confirmed Phuket City Police Superintendent Kraithong Chanthongbai.

"We can't send an officer to investigate until a complaint has been filed. If this is done, we will, of course, look into what happened," Col Kraithong said. - *Thanaphon Phromthong*

Witness spots arson suspects

A WITNESS told police that he saw two people set fire to a Phuket restaurant on May 20.

"It was dark, so the witness wasn't able to give us any details to help identify the suspects. However, he saw two people park a car a good distance from the restaurant and then return with cans of flammable fluids after the fire was set," said Lt Suporn Muangkhai of the Thalang Police.

The owner of the Baan Tharua Garden Restaurant, Chantana Pongkhawlou, 33, was asleep inside with her husband when the flames began consuming the palmfrond roof and wooden furniture.

"Ms Chantana and her husband, with the help of others nearby, managed to control the fire and prevent it from completely destroying the restaurant," said Lt Suporn.

Police have collected evidence at the scene and are currently searching for leads to identify the suspects.

An estimated 30,000 baht of damage was caused by the attack, noted Lt Suporn.

Murder suspects arrested

POLICE have arrested three men for the murder of a 72-year-old Kalim resident on April 24.

Eet Chaisit was shot multiple times while driving back from prayer at the local mosque to his home in Kalim, and later died in Patong Hospital.

Police first identified the driver of the motorcycle carrying Mr Eet's shooter from CCTV footage in the area, Phuket Provincial Police Commander Patchara Boonyasit told a press conference on May 22.

"On May 18, Phuket police and Trat police arrested Suthin Meenpran in Trat's Koh Chang district," said Maj Gen Patchara.

Mr Suthin confessed to the crime and told police the whereabouts of the other two suspects.

"On May 21, Phuket Provincial Police and Patong Police arrested Athit Sanlee, the gunman, at his rented room in Thalang," Gen Patchara said.

"Mr Athit has an extensive criminal record. He was a suspect in the murder of Jakkrit Nutad in 2012, but the case was dropped

due to lack of evidence and Mr Athit was released.

"However, we will ensure we have enough evidence this time to bring Mr Eet's case to court."

Mr Jakkrit was riding home along the Kalim beach road when two men following him pulled alongside and opened fire on January 13, 2012.

Police believe the killing may have been motivated by a land dispute over alleged encroachment on land in a street off Phra Baramee Road, the *Gazette* was told.

The residents of Phra Barami Road Soi 8, in the Kalim area of Patong, saw their homes destroyed in August 2010 after a development company ordered the demolition of the area.

Mr Jakkrit disputed the developer's claim to the land, saying he legally acquired the 13,600sqm plot in 1992. The long-disputed land case was taken to

court in 2010.

Also on May 21, Phuket police and police in Trang arrested Theab Noonueng, who is believed to have masterminded the murders of both Mr Eet last month and also Mr Jakkarit in 2012.

"Mr Theab was renting land in Kalim from Mr Eet. We suspect that they had a dispute over this land, which led to Mr Theab ordering Mr Eet's murder," said Gen Patchara.

Gen Patchara explained that Mr Theab was present on the day of Mr Eet's murder.

"He picked up Mr Athit and the guns after the shooting, and the three escaped Phuket separately shortly after," said Gen Patchara.

Mr Suthin and Mr Athit were charged with premeditated murder, illegal possession of a firearm and for carrying a firearm in public without permission. Mr Suthin accepted the charges, while Mr Athit denied them.

Mr Theab has been charged with conspiracy to murder, as well as the same charges that were brought against Mr Suthin and Mr Athit. He has also denied the charges.

Fishing net catches blame for death of manatee in Krabi



The 300-kilogram manatee was found dead near Koh Kurong in Krabi province, east of Phuket.

FISHERY Department officers believe that a fishing net was to blame for the death of a 300-kilogram manatee found dead near Koh Kurong in Krabi on May 20.

"There were scratch marks on its body and a deep cut along its neck. We believe it died just hours before it was spotted by a local fisherman," said Prawet Awirutphanit, head of the fishery management section of the Krabi Provincial Fishery Office, said after the discovery.

During the last two or three

years, local fishermen have spotted a herd of the marine herbivores in the region, confirmed Mr Prawet, who believes this could be a sign of improving marine conditions in the Andaman.

The dead manatee was taken to the Phuket Marine Biological Center (PMBC) to confirm the cause of death.

Last month, a fishing net was blamed for the death of a 500-kilogram whale shark that was found near Koh Pu, off the coast of Krabi.

Tiger Temple abbot attacked by big cat

THE abbot of the 'Tiger Temple' is in the hospital with no visitors allowed after being bitten by one of the temple's tigers on May 23.

Temple followers said on May 24 that no serious injury was done to Phra Wisut Sarathane, the abbot of Kanchanaburi's Pa Luang Ta Bua Temple. The abbot was reportedly attacked by an adult male Bengal tiger while taking it to an exhibition area.

The tiger was said to have chomped on Phra Wisut's arm and scratched his face, *The Nation* reported.

Phra Wisut was sent to Thanakhan Hospital for an emergency operation and has been kept in the intensive care unit.

Suphap Korfuk, *kamnan* (subdistrict chief) of Tambon Sing, said the abbot's condition was not

as severe as depicted by some media.

The abbot could still walk, talk and eat. There were scratch wounds to his face, which had already been closed up with stitches, he said.

"As far as I know, the abbot fell because of the steep and slippery walkway and his arm smashed on a rock, which caused his bone to break," Mr Suphap said.

"The doctors do not allow visits to the abbot, as he has heart disease and needs close medical care," he said.

The temple was closed to tourists until further notice upon the advice of the National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation Department.

Nares Chombun, director of the Wild Animal Nurture Group, said the department would talk further about the fate of the tigers – whether they will remain at the temple or be moved to the department's breeding centers.

"Before the tiger attacked the abbot, the temple had asked the department to take care of all the tigers by opening a licenced zoo, but after the incident the department will discuss this matter with the temple," he said.

Investigation into human trafficking to finish in June

THE investigation into the trafficking of Rohingya migrants is expected to be completed in June, assistant national police chief Gen Aek Angsananont said on Monday.

Of the 77 individuals believed to have been involved in trafficking in Thailand, 46 have been detained. The 31 others remain at large.

"Interrogation of the 46 detained suspects has already taken place. The police intend to treat the suspect's crimes as transnational... These are human trafficking, assisting aliens in entering Thailand illegally and unlawfully detaining others and kidnapping them for ransom," Gen Aek said.

He added that many suspects have already confessed, though key suspects continue to deny the charges.

Fresh graduates hardest hit as unemployment rate rises

THAILAND's unemployment rate increased slightly in the first quarter amid low economic growth, the Office of the National Economic and Social Development Board (NESDB) reported on Monday.

NESDB Deputy Secretary-General Chutinart Wongsuban told a news conference that the unemployment rate increased from 0.89 per cent at the end of last year to 0.94 per cent in the first quarter, while the largest unemployed group was new graduates, *The Nation* reported.

"There are currently 361,297 people who are unemployed and 164,159 of them are newly graduated, a rise of 13.1 per cent from last year," Ms Chutinart

According to the statistics, 1.54 per cent of graduates with bachelor's degrees are out of work

Commenting on the current employment trend, Ms Chutinart said the engineering field was the most desired area to work in because of the demand for professionals in the sector due to major infrastructure projects.

"The most unemployed field is journalism and communications, with 2.77 per cent of the bachelor's degree graduates still without a job," she said.

"A degree in arts is next on the list, with 2.76 per cent of the new graduates from this field unemployed, and 2.71 per cent of humanities-degree graduates are jobless."

In related news, the average salary in the private sector has

risen by 4.6 per cent to 11,678 baht per month from a year ago.


However, the average wage for laborers in the agriculture sector decreased by 0.3 per cent because of the drought.

"Most of the job vacancies these days require a vocational to high-vocational certificate, which the new graduates in such degrees [as bachelor's] still lack," Ms Chutinart said.

"This is because most people like to send their children to study at high school and then do an undergraduate degree rather than going to a vocational school because of the frequent news about violence among vocational students."

In a bid to boost the quality of vocational students, dual training was introduced to provide students with an opportunity to work in aligned businesses.

"The students who pass the training not only have knowledge about the job, but also have more of an opportunity to get a [permanent] job," she said.



Ethics in today's social media world

FACEBOOK, Twitter, Instagram, LINE and an assortment of other social media platforms and blogs have transformed the way news is managed worldwide, enabling news outlets to be more in tune with their readership, while also allowing them to offload their ethics and other responsibilities toward their communities.

Social media tip-offs have become a foundation for community news, ranging from the public outrage of seeing Rihanna with a slow loris to boats being busted for dumping oil off Phi Phi.

The platforms allow the community to help focus news agencies on what is most important and most interesting to the community at large. They also help identify what is 'news'. Nails found in the cycling lanes at Saphin Hin and pebbles scattered in the Phuket Town skate park can become news stories through social media momentum.

If enough people in the community care, it will end up on an editor's desk. A simple piece of evidence, such as a picture captured on a mobile device, is all it takes to ignite change on the island.

However, social media can also cut deeply in a more negative way. The pattern is familiar and the pitfalls dangerous: a single photograph or video goes viral locally, generating a buzz within our readership, and a story is produced. The story follows a pattern similar to that used by news giants like CNN and BBC: "Public outrage is mounting this evening after a video went viral on Facebook..."

The pitfall is that the news item is in fact nothing more than public reaction to something, allowing media agencies to avoid verifying the validity of the catalyst. That verification process is what makes quality news expensive to groom for presentation. However, it is also the value added by a media company. Access to officials, and the ability to elicit responses from those in different levels of power, are the quid pro quo of any responsible purveyor of news.

As CNN noted earlier this year: "Intentionally or not, the latest round of misleading stories making viral waves has made it harder to tell truth from fiction." There are untold numbers of keyboard warriors creating bait-and-click scenarios to drive traffic to their websites, some doing it as a game to see how far they can string along the media – and the world.

The fact that Phuket officials had to step in just a few years ago to put down rumors on social media that the island was about to pull an Atlantis and sink into the Andaman is difficult to digest.

As Gazette columnist Simon Wetherell points out each week in 'Business Buzz', social media can be very easy to manipulate, allowing people with ulterior motives to work the public in a way that forces the hands of local media.

As we navigate this new world of media as readers, it becomes more and more necessary to draw lines between those sources we trust because they refuse to shrug off their ethical duties, and those that are simply cashing in on headlines more cunning than truthful.



THE amount of companies and businesses in Phuket continues to increase. This means more and more employees are required to get social security.

There is also another group of people who apply for social security based on Section 40 of Social Security Act BE 2533 (1990). Therefore, the number of people who come to our office is always increasing.

On average, we see about 300 to 400 people in our office every day.

The number of officers and the size of the office, however, remains the same. When a large crowd comes in and a queue forms, the wait time becomes

claims with the human resources (HR) department at their company. The HR department can submit the document to us through the LINE messaging application or send it by mail. The insured will then receive the money via direct deposit into their bank account.

The insured people who file for social security on their own (Section 39) can also utilize this system.

The only documents required to complete this process are the

> dental reimbursement (SorPorSor 2-16), a receipt and a copy of the recipient's bank book.

There are conditions under which an insured person can be reimbursed for dental work.

The insured cannot receive project to handle the large amount more than 300 baht per claim, or 600 baht per year, for tooth removal, fillings, cleanings and embedded tooth surgery.

In the case of artificial teeth (which can be removed one by one), the insured cannot reimburse more than 1,300 baht for one to five teeth in a five year period starting from the day they are implanted.

If there are more than five teeth, the reimbursement will be

In the case of artificial teeth that are implanted in sets, the insured can reimburse no more than 2,400 baht for one set of teeth (either top or bottom), or no more than 4,400 baht for two sets, in a five year period from the first day they are implanted.

We have promoted and used this method of working with HR with more than 100 companies.

They have carried out the procedure according to our conditions and regulations and most of them have been very satisfied with the service.

As a result, we are aiming to broaden our network.

This can reduce transportation expenses for insured people, and they will be able to use their days off to relax rather than coming into our office.

The insured will get the same reimbursement through this method as they would if they had showed up in person.

We as an office will be able to better service the people who come in to see us.

I believe that all HR departments in all businesses should offer their employees similar opportunities. The insured people, the company and the social security office will benefit from such a program.

IF YOU live on Phuket for long enough, or pay attention to the news coverage while you are here, it becomes quite apparent how fascinated islanders - both Thai and foreign – are by horrific road accidents.

The sheer number of road deaths that occur on Phuket put into sharp focus how dangerous the roads are and exactly how fragile life is. Yet, after the initial shock and sadness of hearing about another senseless road-death wears off and the stories have run their circuit around local news sites and social media, every one returns to their daily lives.

How about when the accident victim does not die?

In Phuket, if we see a photo of someone we know or someone our friends know being shared around social media, we immediately tune in to the news, and probably end up sharing the same information ourselves - without taking the time to question the validity of the content.

Many don't take into account the ramifications of sharing information – whether it's true or not – about accidents at the time; they don't consider the effects it can have as it rapidly spreads through the internet.

In our globally-connected world, it is very possible that a victim's family members overseas are getting skewed information about a suffering loved one from a stranger's Facebook post before they can be told by those closest to them.

When a foreigner is involved in a fatal accident in Phuket, the media often withholds the name of the victim until next of kin is notified. This is absolutely the

most ethical and sensitive choice to be made when in possession of such information.

I submit that the media acts in the same sensitive manner when dealing with those who are involved in serious accidents that could eventually result in death or life-altering injuries.

The damage caused by a serious road accident goes beyond the physical state of the victim; it also takes a massive toll on family and friends. This damage can be mitigated by thinking carefully about what is shared and published about such a horrific situation, before automatically reacting and publicly spreading fragmented informa-

Sharing information is the nature of the internet beast, I suppose, but I worry that people are forgetting to think about what they are publishing through media outlets and self-publishing through personal social media outlets. I worry that they are forgetting the possible consequences and pain that could be caused by their actions, especially if the information is incomplete or, worse, incorrect.

Expats and frequent visitors can help change this frightening trend by being aware of the serious damage that can be done as they choose to disseminate information through social networks. It's hard not to be drawn to a road accident story, but try to think before you click 'share'.



Successfully harness social media power



THERE is no doubting the power of social media marketing as a business tool. The question is, are you using it, and if so, are you doing so effectively?

just may take more time.

Now, knowing the answer to the aforementioned questions, you need to prepare a strategy.

I have found one of the best ways to do this is by drawing a flow chart or mind map. Create the flows that show each step of interaction, possible outcomes and options. You will then have a much better understanding of what you want to happen, how it should happen and can then monitor the progress and success of

your project.

New Toyota truck to haul up market

TOYOTA has finally pulled the wraps off its much-anticipated allnew one-tonne pick-up truck, which is hoped to help dramatically re-energize the stalled automobile market.

The Hilux's launch, which was also its global premier, was held at Bitec Bang Na on May 21.

The new model is priced from 569,000 baht to 1.139 million baht. It is available with a choice of diesel and gasoline engines and three body styles.

Kyoichi Tanada, president of Toyota Motor Thailand, said Thailand accounts for 70 per cent of Toyota's global pick-up truck production in six countries.


Toyota plans to sell 14,000 new Hiluxes per month, up from the 11,000-unit average during the first quarter of the year.

The pick-up truck market has been suffering from low prices of agricultural products and high household debt. Pure pick-up truck sales have dropped by 12.5 per cent to 84,830 units.

The total vehicle market could remain at the 900,000-unit level this year, he said without ruling out the chance of the market hitting 1mn units if things go well.



Property market gap narrows

Southern Asian, Arabic visitors start to make up for Russian losses

ALTHOUGH a plunge in the number of Russian visitors hit Phuket's rental market hard this high season, the unsettling gap narrowed slightly through a small increase in Southern Asian and Arabic travellers, said Dexter Norville, Jones Lang LaSalle Thailand's national

This rental market is made up of the usual crowd of Europeans, Australians and Russians, but the Bang Tao and the Laguna ar-

now more Indian and Arabic holidaymakers are renting condominiums, apartments and villas on the island. Meanwhile, Chinese tourists continue to prefer staying in ho-

"The Chinese market is definitely getting more adventurous. I

mean, they still come on package tours, but you see a lot more independent travellers now," said Mr Norville.

Latest research by JLL Hotels & Hospitality Group notes that while international arrivals to Phuket grew by 25.8% to 3.2 million and domestic arrivals rose by 10.8% to 2.5 million in 2013 compared to the previous year, visitor arrivals at Phuket International Airport dropped by 0.6% during the first 11 months of 2014 as a result of the military coup in May that year.

However, a very bright future

lies ahead, as the research states that once the airport expansion is completed, passenger capacity will jump to 12.5 million a year from the current total of 6.5 million.

Mr Norville cautiously advised those considering investing in a Phuket property for rental return, that demand remains on the beaches, not in the center of town. Among the beaches he recommends is Bang Tao.

eas are a good bet [now]. I believe it's a good bet for the future as well," he said.

"Karon and Kata are very well established, but there are definitely hotels occupying the prime space in those areas. That sets the actual achieved rent for such

properties in those locations.

"Patong is the party town of Phuket and is basically dominated by hotels."

Looking across the bridge to Phang Nga's Na Tai and Khao Lak beaches, Mr Norville says that they are hotel-dominated areas, and because of the infrastructure, should remain so for a long time.

"Will stand-alone [villas] or a group of villa developments have demand for rent? Not when you have got JW Marriott and things like that close by," he said.

Mr Norville added that while good villas can be rented out in

Phuket and surrounding areas, the market is thin and the majority of properties are owner used.

"In the years to come, things might change, you never know,"


While location is accepted as being the most important factor in investing in a property, another important aspect is having a good perspective of the market.

Unfortunately, this is not usually the case for most investors, and Mr Norville knows all too well that property owners often do not understand where the supply for

the rental properties is coming from, what the actual requirements are and how to hit a sensible pricing point.

"If you own a property and you want to entrust somebody to do the rental, you have got to appoint one of the big boys," he said.

Make change, not war



WE ALL may very well remember a court case involving a hot cup of coffee and a customer who sued the coffee shop for serving hot coffee. What a preposterous case, we may cry. How do people inhabit this earth and go about their daily lives, and yet still manage to create issues out of nothing by simply complaining about normal incidents?

In the property market in Phuket, although some people are innocently wringers, we have a more than fair share of 'vexatious litigants': people who seem to love suing other people and companies; the cut and thrust or one year hearing delays at the courthouses; or shouting 'I will not settle' and the classic 'It's not fair' as loudly as they can.

In school, there was always an argumentative, belligerent, verbose and perhaps slightly bright, but not smart, bully. We have this person – a litigation monster – in every step of life.

Amazingly, these legal hotheads often get sucked in to starting proceedings when they don't have a grasp of evidence, what the legal process actually involves and how or on what basis judgments are made.

I have now seen such wonders emanate from these brave warriors of court complaints and notices which will assist me in writing my memoirs - and

hopefully the online sales of such will generate enough money for a pint of real ale per week in my dotage.

WHO ARE THE PARTIES?

If you are an owner in an estate which has a 'committee', a 'juristic person' or a Thai company which owns assets, common area and facilities, and have an issue with management, tread carefully. Be cautious before you rush ahead and sharpen your litigation

If you sue such entities, you are in fact 'suing yourself'. You, together with other owners, are normally jointly responsible for the well-being of such an entity. The better the entity is managed and run, the smoother the meetings are, the better chances of successful re-sales in a development.

If you serve a 'writ' (court complaint) on such an entity, until that case is withdrawn, settled or produces a judgment, there is a blight on that entity visible to all those who check or deal with

Amazingly, in the heat of rage, many owners ignore this incontrovertible fact.

WHAT ARE THE ALTERNATIVES TO SUING YOURSELF?

If you have a problem with the accounts of a management company, demand an audit. Change the auditor. Become a director or committee member and ensure the accounts are handled properly. Reserve litigation for 'fraud'. By fraud I mean stealing money, not spending it unwisely.

If you believe management is poor, change the management. Change the management agreement, scope of services and duties of the manager. Avoid the sun-blazed

entrance to the courthouse followed by the phones-out-of-the-pocket security check before entering the halls of justice.

If you and a large group of individuals feel the same way, avoid creating your own 'class action' John Grisham novel based action group. Such groups are adept at destroying the value of projects they believe they were set up to 'protect'.

Use the energy you have to go sailing, play golf, eat at nice restaurants, set up businesses to employ Thais and apply it to reforming that which you are displeased with. Surely, if you all feel the same way and what you are asking for is reasonable, there is a path of compromise which can be found.

Listen to your advisers. I don't just mean legal advisers, although they are important too. Listen to voices of reason around you, and don't let your own inner voice drown out people trying to shake you out of your litigation rage. Settle, settle, settle.

Property is here to be enjoyed, used and shared in the same way this beautiful island is for those who keep their eyes open, and close them when they see the Phantom Menace speedway drivers along Thekprasattri Road. Try to avoid the courthouse, and suing yourself.

Life & style Arts Failed search for next giant

I'VE long sought for the successors to the twentieth century giants of Brazilian literature, Jorge Amado and Erico Verissimo. So far, I've failed.

Daniel Galera's novel Blood-Drenched Beard (The Penguin Press, New York, 2014, 374pp) is the latest disappointment. The prose is pedestrian, the pace leaden and the plot improbable, shading into preposterous. The entire mess limps along in a wild overabundance of unnecessary detail. The kindest word to apply to the novel is mediocre.

Like Erico Verissimo, Daniel Galera is from Porto Alegre, capital of Brazil's southernmost state of Rio Grande Do Sul. Descendants of Azorean Portuguese, Germans, Italians and Poles, the people here are called *gauchos* and speak a Spanish-inflected Portuguese influenced by Argentina and Uruguay. Galera's novel does have a strong sense of place: he brings to life the coastal villages and densely forested hinterlands of Santa Catarina, just north of Rio Grande do Sul.

For some reason, Galera insists on leaving his protagonist unnamed, referring to him simply as 'he' which causes all manner of confusion when other characters enter the picture and it's unclear to whom the pronoun refers.

The novel opens with the protagonist meeting his father in a remote town in Santa Catarina. The father tells him that he is dying and intends to commit suicide. His only request is that his son take his old dog Beta to be put to sleep

He also tells his son the strange story of the death of his own father who had come to live in a small fishing village called Garopaba. His temper and knife-fighting skills had made him unpopular among the menfolk and one night at a dance, they turned off the lights and plunged a great many knives into his body. The year was 1969.

Our hero looks like his grandfather, especially when he grows a beard. So after his father's funeral, where he refuses to meet his older brother Dante, who has stolen his girlfriend Vivienne, he goes to live on the beach in Garopaba too, hoping to learn more about his grandfather's fate. Like many towns in Thailand, Garopaba is in the process of transforming from a fishing village to a tourist resort. The 2008 tourist season has just ended with the onset of the antipodean winter.

Our hero brings along the dog Beta and gets a job as a swimming instructor at a health club. A physical education teacher, he is also a triathlete, having competed in

Hawaii's Iron Man contest. He soon lands a girlfriend, Dalia, a tall, pretty, curly-haired single mother who works as a waitress in a pizzeria. Here's the culmination of their romance, told in typically clumsy prose:

"He kneels next to the sofa Dalia is sitting on and kisses her. The bitter coffee tastes nice in her saliva. They shoo away the dog, close the living room shutters, take off their clothes, and are soon in the bedroom."

This is on page 82. There are 300 more pages to go, mostly wheel-spinning. The hero attends a folk music concert, a county fair, a travelling circus, a whalewatching voyage. He dumps Dalia, falls in love with a beautiful black graduate student, and is dumped by her in a wildly improbable series of events involving buried treasure and dreams which predict a fatal future. He makes a few friends, but the locals evade his questions about his grandfather: "Everyone he has tried to talk to about his grandfather's death now ignores him. Some watch him with hostile looks as he walks through the village center, while others greet him with exaggerated friendliness. At times he worries that he is being paranoid."

Halfway through the book, he receives a tip from a journalist friend that the policeman who investigated the murder is now retired in a nearby town. He learns that his grandfather actually rose from the blood-soaked dance floor and ran out to disappear in the ocean. Then he gets even more improbable news from his grandfather's old girlfriend, who is now dying of cancer. I don't want to spoil the climax, but it was a long, slow, torturous way coming. And not worth the trip.

The sublime and the spiritual

BACK in Cannes to present a film for the first time since winning the Palme d'Or in 2010, Thai director Apichatpong Weerasethakul premiered his latest oeuvre Cemetery of Splendour (Rak Ti Khon Kaen) to a standing ovation that lasted a full 10 minutes.

Instead of playing in the main competition, which is the norm for films whose directors have won the much-coveted top prize, Cemetery of Splendour was screened in the Un Certain Regard category alongside other titles from acknowledged Asian masters like Naomi Kawase's *An* and Brillante Mendoza's Taklub.

Mr Apichatpong, though, was unperturbed.

Cemetery of Splendour is another step forward for me, but I understand why the film was chosen for Un Certain Regard. As I said on the stage, Un Certain Regard is the section for real discovery and excitement, and I am happy that the film is being shown with other titles from new direc-

tors who will be the future of cinema," he told *XP*.

Mr Apichatpong came to Cannes for the first time in 2002 with French producer Charles de Meaux for the screening of his second feature, Blissfully Yours, which went home with the top prize from Un Certain Regard and became an Asian classic.

"'I've had this idea about sleeping as a form of escapism since I worked on the exhibition Primitive. My films are always about time and crossing frontiers between reality and fantasy, or life

and death," says Mr Apichatpong, adding that he had been toying with the idea for the film even before starting work on his Palme d'Or winner, Uncle Boonmee Who Can Recall His Past Lives.

A Khon Kaen native, Mr Apichatpong decided to film Cemetery of Splendour entirely in the city and many of its attractions, including Kaen Nakhon Lake, make their big-screen debuts.

"I wanted to make a simple work. I went back to Khon Kaen and have tried to show the spirit and rhythm of the city in the film. I wanted to observe rather than make the audience feel the presence of the filmmaker in this work," he says.

Cemetery of Splendour is slated to travel to festivals around the world, but right now it seems unlikely that it will be seen in Thailand.

And should there be a need for additional syrup or toppings on any of these pancake desires, Pancake Corner offers several kinds from amber and light syrup to honey or


One might think that pancakes with every dish would become redundant, but that's not the case.



Friar fights way to Siam

Looking Back

THROUGHOUT his life, King Naresuan fought many wars with the Burmese in order to liberate Siam from their control. Toward the end of his reign, in the year 1600, Siam had recovered its independence and peace was restored. During this time, the king worked to restore foreign trade for the Kingdom.

Due to ongoing wars between Burma and Cambodia, the Portuguese – the only western traders that frequented the Kingdom during that period - had left Ayutthaya. Around the year 1600, King Naresuan sent a letter to the captain of Malacca, Dom Fernao de Albuquerque, inviting the Portuguese to renew their trading activities in Siam.

The king wanted the Portuguese captain to send Franciscan priests to his capital, promising 'honors and favors' on any Catholic priests who came to live in Siam. The reason King Naresuan specifically asked for Franciscan priests was because he had heard of their order from Portuguese residents living in Ayutthaya.

The friar chosen to undertake this role was Frei Andre Do Espirito Santo, who prior to his journey to Siam had been in Macau. According to Portuguese historical records, the friar was 'very praise worthy' and led an exemplary life. Although he was virtuous, Frei Andre was old and weak. Many years spent fasting in penance had left him looking like nothing but skin and bones.

Albuquerque named Frei Andre the secretary of the Portuguese embassy that was to travel from Malacca to Ayutthaya. He was instructed to conduct any business with the king that would be 'of service to God, the welfare of the Estado da India and the profit of Malacca'. Albuquerque also instructed the friar to obtain a commitment from King Naresuan that he would not form a pact with the Dutch, a western power who was becoming increasingly active in its business dealings.

Frei Andre then left Macau for Ayutthaya. A journey that should have only taken eight days became

a journey that took seven months. Due to bad weather and incompetent navigation, the vessel hit a rocky shore and was damaged. The passengers and crew had to disembark onto a nearby beach.

The Portuguese were stranded on the beach for a fortnight and could not decide what to do next.

They were on the verge of abandoning their damaged ship and continuing on foot when they noticed ships sailing toward

> Later it was discovered that the fleet was sent by the King of Siam and was sailing toward Cambodia to put down a rebellion. A Muslim captain commanded the fleet. When he learned that the

Portuguese were sailing up to Ayutthaya to fulfill a request from King Naresuan, he gave the crew some rice and raw materials to fix their ship. He also offered to take Frei Andre and a few others to Ayutthaya.

The seven vessels sailed slowly for another four days. Unfortunately for the fleet, on the fifth day, a great storm broke out and six of the seven ships were sunk in the storm. Luckily Frei Andre was on board the only surviving ship. The surviving ship sailed to a small island near the coast, where the passengers and crew once again disembarked. After several days on the island, subsisting entirely on crabs, Frei Andre had enough of sailing and decided to continue the rest of his journey on land.

Travelling on land was equally dangerous. Much of Siam was covered in dense forest that was home to dangerous wild animals, including tigers, rhinoceroses, elephants and buffaloes. At night, the travellers had to sleep in trees, securing themselves by tying their bodies to tree branches with vines.

After four nights spent in this

dangerous and uncomfortable environment, they came to a village where the headman was a Muslim. Frei Andre explained to him in Malay that he was on the way to Siam in response to King Naresuan's request for priests. The friar explained that his vessel had been shipwrecked off the coast of Cambodia and now his party was in need of food and a cart to take him and his sick companions to Ayutthaya.

At first, the headman refused and said that he did not know Frei Andre and could not believe that he was telling the truth. So Frei Andre, who at this point was suffering severely from swelling in his legs and groin, decided to stay at the village, where he began to compose a letter to the Portuguese in Ayutthaya, asking them to inform the king of his plight.

When the village headman heard of this, he relented and provided food and a cart to carry Frei Andre and three of his sick companions. From then on, Frei Andre was able to travel without much hindrance. Every village he came across, he was given food, water and shelter. Finally, the party arrived at the Chao Phraya River, where a boat was arranged for them to travel up-river to the city of Ayutthaya.

At last, after seven months, the party arrived in the capital city. All the Portuguese then living in the city gathered to welcome Frei Andre. They took him directly to their church, which was made of bamboo and straw-thatch. He rested there for a few days before going into the city to have an audience with King Naresuan.

Excuse Buster

THE word is out about self myofascial release - foam rolling - and, no, Phuket people, this doesn't have to do with a 'soapy' or 'happy-ending release'. Foam rolling was once a secretive technique used by professional coaches and therapists, but has become a regular practice for people across the spectrum of fitness levels.

Self myofascial release is in fact just a fancy term for a technique of self-massage that helps deal with muscle tightness and trigger points.

With a massage parlor in Phuket never being farther than a kilometer away, and decent one-hour massage costing you less than 500 baht, it might be difficult to see the point of learning the technique – which would explain the bunch of rarely used foam rollers at Nai Harn Gym.

Nonetheless, the understanding of your body and muscle structures that comes with practicing the technique has a great

deal of benefits.

The practice can be done with a foam roller, lacrosse ball, Theracane or your own hands by simply applying pressure to specific points on your body, aiding in the

recovery of muscles and assisting in returning them to normal function. We can think of 'normal function' as when your muscles are elastic, healthy and ready to perform at a moment's notice.

Foam rolling after a workout will provide deep compression that will help relax tight muscles and adhesions (fibrous bands) formed between muscle layers and their surroundings. The number of benefits is outstanding, outside of increasing blood flow, which will speed up muscle recovery. Foam rolling can be used for a variety of corrective bodywork.

It can loosen muscles to re-balance posture, re-establish proper movement patterns, enhance performance and help create painfree movement.

Stretching alone is not always enough when it comes to releasing the tightness, which makes the technique very helpful. Additionally, you are able to feel exactly what is happening and adjust the pressure so that it is uncomfortable, but not unbearable – not always the case when it comes to the toes of your Thai masseuse digging into your back.

Build muscle mass for healthier life

Bigger muscles mean you become stronger, and your strength reserves are growing. This does not simply mean you can lift heavier weights, but helps when you are stressed – with your body and mind functioning for longer periods, coupled with release of endorphins that combat stress and improve your mood. Physical strains are also easier to cope with,


and stronger muscles reduce risks of injury due to overexertion. Stronger muscles can improve your posture.

With more trained muscle mass comes a range of health benefits. Glucose and insulin levels are optimized, reducing risks of diabetes, coronary heart disease, high blood pressure and stroke. Ingested nutrients are also handled better by the body, and therefore fat accumulation decreases. The gain in health benefits may lead to lasting health benefits as you age, with stronger bones and joints.

While it's easy to read and think about the wonders of muscle building, in practice it takes hard work - and a lot of it. Fitness regimes with a strong emphasis on weight training are of course essential. However, these must be coupled with sound nutrition.

Suit up for SEA Games

THANYAPURA'S top swimming stars are hoping to bring home a bounty of medals when they dive into the pool and compete at the Southeast Asian Games (SEA) next week.

Swimming sensations Peerapat 'Garfield' Loessathapornsuk, 18, Patarawadee 'Ploy' Kittiya, 21, Kornkanjana 'Golf' Sapianchai, 17, and Tanakrit 'Nok' Kittiya, 19, will come up against the best in the region at the SEA Games from June 6 to 11.

Between the four of them, they will compete in ten races over a seven-day period, while representing both Thailand and Thanyapura on the international stage.

More than 4,700 athletes from 11 countries will travel to compete at the 28th SEA Games, which are held every two years. Athletes from 35 different sports will participate in the games.

"It's going to be a very intense week where a lot of exciting things will happen. I expect to come back with a handful of medals. The best outcome would be to return with two individual gold medals, a gold medal for the relay and a couple of bronze medals," said Miguel

Lopez, head of aquatics at Thanyapura. "I wish our athletes the best of luck at

the Southeast Asian Games in Singapore next week. They have all worked very hard to get to this point and I know they will do Thanyapura proud," added Thanyapura President and Chief Executive Officer Philipp Graf von Hardenberg.

Garfield will be competing in the 1500 freestyle, while Ploy will race in the 100m, 200m butterfly and 4x200m freestyle relay. During the week, Ploy can also qualify to compete in an additional race – the 4x100m independent medley.

Golf will come up against some of the best in the 4x100m freestyle, the 50m butterfly and 4x200m freestyle. Nok, who has already gained a qualifying time for the 2016 Rio Olympics, will swim in the 400m and 1500m freestyle.

The swimmers also have their eyes on Olympic glory and are hoping to gain qualifying times at the SEA Games. Garfield has received a wildcard to the Olympics from Federation Internationale de Natation (FINA) – the aquatics governing international body – but Ploy and Golf will both have to fight for their places.
