#### Bangla bouncer alleges policeman brutally beat him

THE alleged victim of a vicious attack by police in Patong filed a formal complaint against the officer and others in his party on June 12.

Kamolchai Singhakerd, a bouncer at Hollywood nightclub on the party town's famed

Soi Bangla, told police that Patong Deputy Superintendent Sorapong Chukaew and a group of his friends attacked him at about 2am on June 10.

'It is not the first time he attacked people, and I don't want him to hurt anyone else," Mr Kamolchai said. "I hope that he will be removed from the police force. If our town is full of bad cops, who can we go to when we need

Lt Col Sorapong was moved from his post at Patong Police Station to Phuket Provincial Police following a protest during which more than 100 participants took to the street on June 10. The rally formed outside Hollywood Discotheque at about 8:30pm, drawing much

attention from tourists and passersby, with protesters demanding justice from police and Phuket Governor Nisit Jansomwong.

Some protesters wielded signs with messages including: 'Why physical abuse?'; 'Government officers bully residents'; 'We are too scared to go back to work'; 'Where is justice?'; and 'We are just honest workers, not drug dealers'.

Mr Kamolchai claims that he did nothing to instigate the confrontation, and that Col Sorapong abruptly attacked him.

"I did not fight back, my friends took me to another pub, but the police chased...

### Jet-ski rental operators making waves at resort

THE Naka Island, A Luxury Collection Resort and Spa, based on the small island off the east coast of Phuket, is battling against local jet-ski operators.

"The jet-skis are dangerous. They are always coming too close to customers swimming at the beach," said The Naka Island representative Sureeporn Roongreung. "They have yet to hurt anyone swimming or diving, and we want to make sure safety precautions are taken so it never


Ms Sureeporn also alleged that the jet-ski operators wandered into the resort to look for customers.

"They annoy our customers and try to persuade them to ride a jet-ski," he said.

After The Naka Island staff failed to negotiate with the operators, a complaint was filed to the Damrongtham Center (ombudsman's office) at Phuket Provincial Hall.

Vice Governor Somkiet Sangkaosuttirak; Bophit Chomchoei, registrar for the Phuket Marine Department; and other government officials followed up on the complaint on June 12.

"I have never walked into the resort. I'm only looking for cus-

tomers on the beach, because I know it is a resort area," Praphan Waharak, a representative of the jet-ski operators, told the investigative team.

Vice Governor Somkiet stepped in to point out that as long as the jet-ski operators were not entering the resort, they were free to use the public beach to source clients.

"We would like everyone to calm down and think about how

we can work together and conduct business without interfering with others," V/Gov Somkiet said.

Mr Bophit promised the resort that the Marine Office would start working on a zoning plan for jetskis and swimmers.

"There is no law preventing the jet-skis from going as fast as the rider wants. However, I am eager to see the zoning set in place soon in order to protect tourists," said Mr Bophit.

#### Boy crushed by cement truck

An 11-YEAR-OLD boy was killed motorbike, causing her son to fall after he fell off the back of his mother's motorbike and under the wheel of a cement truck on June 11.

Rescue workers arrived at the scene at the traffic light in front of Makro in Kathu to find Thanaphat Songserm severely injured underneath the truck.

"Patchanee Songserm, 42, had just picked up her son from Witchitsongkram School and was heading home when they stopped at the traffic light, next to the cement truck," said Maj Narong Muangduang of the Wichit Police.

"When the light turned green, both vehicles took off. Somehow, Ms Patchanee lost control of the

off and under the truck. He was dragged a short distance by the truck before it came to a stop."

Nong Thanaphat was rushed to Vachira Phuket Hospital, but was pronounced dead on arrival by doctors. His mother suffered only minor injuries.

Police have yet to press charges against the truck driver or Ms Patchanee.

"We must question both the mother and the truck driver about the incident," said Maj Narong.

"If it turns out that either of them was driving recklessly, we are prepared to press charges for reckless driving causing death."

#### Construction worker killed in landslide

A LANDSLIDE at a construction site in Phuket killed one worker and injured five others on June 13.

Myanmar national Set Lai, 20, was crushed by the dirt and rebar. The other five workers were rushed to Patong Hospital, four have since been discharged, confirmed Lt Col Weerapong Rakhito of the Patong Police.

The fifth worker remained in hospital care, but not seriously injured.

"We are investigating the incident at the Patong Bay Hill construction site and attempting to determine the cause of the landslide," said Col Weerapong.

Patong Mayor Chalermluck Kebsup visited the site this afternoon and confirmed that the project has all proper documentation.

Anupong Muttaraid, spokesman for the project, expressed his sorrow over the incident.

"It was an accident due to the recent heavy rain. Nonetheless, we are deeply saddened by the loss of life," Mr Anupong said.

Mr Anupong vowed that the company would cover medical costs and compensate the workers, as well as talk to the construction company about how to prevent such accidents from happening in the future.

"Mr Set's mother also works for us. We will take care of the funeral arrangements and of course take care of her the best we can," Mr Anupong added.

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# Sun lounger fate to be decided by PSU study

A TWIST of fate may be in the cards for Phuket's abandoned sun loungers, with island officials aiming to decide by the end of July whether or not to allow them all back on the sands.

Governor Nisit Jansomwong revealed to the *Gazette* earlier this month that a beach management research team at Prince of Songkhla University (PSU) Phuket campus is evaluating the results of the three-month trial period for the beaches' 10-per-cent vendor zones, which was launched by the governor in December.

Governor Nisit has stood firm on his strict beach management plan since the new rules were implemented, but has told the *Gazette* that he understands that not everyone is happy.

"I am aware that some foreigners need sun loungers for convenience. However, some do not want them. We must consider all opinions on the matter," he said.

"I personally like Phuket as it is now. We have come so far. Towels and mats are allowed on the beach, and even umbrellas are allowed within the beach zones. Is this not enough?

"Regardless, we will do what experts think is best for Phuket. We want all Phuket locals and tourists to be happy, not just

some."

In December, Gov Nisit delivered the news of the three-month trial run for the 10-per-cent beach vendor zone, which laid down a stringent list of conditions under which beach vendors were permitted to return to work.

Though the trial originally started in Patong, it was expanded to cover all of the island's beaches in February. Inside the zones, umbrellas are permitted.

Gov Nisit assigned a research

team of professors from PSU to monitor the beach-trial period, evaluate results and reactions and come up with the best solution to the problem.

"Before the trial for all beaches ended in May, the researchers asked for an extension. They are still evaluating the information they have gathered during this time," said Gov Nisit.

"If the experts suggest that we bring sun loungers back to the beach, we may do that. However, they would have to be chairs that could be removed from the beach every day."

Gov Nisit expects to make a final decision by the end of July, but insists that the current rules hold in the meantime.

"At this point, sun loungers are still not allowed on the beach," he confirmed.

"We should be able to announce whether or not sun loungers will return to the beaches by the end of next month."

### Island goes on MERS alert

PHUKET Health officials have ramped up efforts this week in order to identify people who might be carrying the Middle East Respiratory Syndrome-Coronavirus (Mers-CoV) to the island from South Korea or the Middle East, where the virus is spreading.

"We received an order from the Ministry of Public Health in Bangkok to be on alert for the virus," Phuket Provincial Health Organization (PPHO) Chief Kajohnsak Kaewjarus said on June 13. "We started checking passengers on June 9."

Six airline carriers flying into Phuket currently have flights departing from South Korea and the Middle East.

"Every traveller arriving from these destinations is being checked by the Disease Control Center at Phuket International Airport," confirmed Dr Kajohnsak.

Airline crew members have also been asked to keep an eye out for any passengers showing signs of influenza and to notify officials upon arrival at the airport.

"Between Tuesday and Friday, we checked 3,900 passengers and found no MERS suspects," Dr Kajohnsak said.

"We have strong countermeasures in place, which we introduced in 2013, when MERS first became a concern for the island."

A total of 122 cases of MERS have already been identified in South Korea.

The outbreak killed nine people, reported *The Nation*.

#### Turkish couple rescued from jungle

A TURKISH couple was rescued after spending nearly nine hours on their own in the jungle in Khao Phra Thaew National Park on June 13.

Bulent and Pinar Burak, both 34, were on their way to the Wildlife Sanctuary when they got lost in the park. They then called Palm Beach Hotel in Patong, where they were staying, to ask for help.

"Police went to the scene at about 7:10pm after being notified by hotel staff. We found a white Honda Click in the parking lot which had been there since the couple entered the park at about 1:05pm that day," said Lt Watcharawit Kraiyuth of the Phuket Tourist Police.

"We split into two search groups. One searched between the Wildlife Sanctuary and Ton Sai Waterfall, and the other searched near Bang Pae Waterfall."

Lt Watcharawit said the search lasted more than four hours.

"It was very hard to locate the couple. Their mobile phone battery had died, so we were not able to call them," he said.

Finally, at about 10:50pm, the rescue team located the very weary and thirsty couple.

"Police gave Mr and Mrs Burak

some water and led them out of the park. We finally arrived at the parking lot near Bang Pae Waterfall at about 12:20am," said Khao Phra Thaew National Park Chief Pongchart Chuehom.

"Officials tried to take the couple to hospital, but Mr and Mrs

Burak insisted that they felt fine and just wanted to be taken back to their hotel."

The very grateful couple were taken back to Patong by minivan and their rented bike was returned to its owner by police.

"In addition to the cards, there was one bank book and a foreign ID card," Lt JG Taksin noted.

Police urged anyone who has lost his or her ID card to contact the Karon Police to verify whether or not any of the cards discovered belonged to them.

"It is possible that the information is being used to falsify legal documents, so it is necessary for anyone who might be affected to contact us," Lt Col Ason Jiraksa of the Karon Police said.

### Guide in hot water over fish grab

OFFICIALS have threatened to close down a tour company after it was discovered that they were allowing tourists to abuse sea life.

The news follows a tour guide caught catching a clown fish so that tourists could hold it at Koh Khai Nai.

The clown fish, which has become incredibly popular with some tourist markets following the Pixar animation *Finding Nemo*, was in a plastic bread bag being passed around by the tourists when an inspection team from the Ministry of Tourism and Sports (MOTS) Phuket Office arrived at the scene.

"We were following up on a photo posted on Facebook on June 9 of a Chinese tourist holding a fish in a net and posing with it," explained Santi Pawai, director of the MOTS Phuket office.

The life jacket being worn by the tourists in the photo were from Nonthasak Marine. However, neither officials at MOTS Phuket office nor Northasak Marine employees were able to identify the guide.

"They had rented out the boat to a different company, which

we've not been able to track down," Mr Santi said.

However, while inspecting the area, the team discovered Phuket tour guide Akung Saewang with a group of tourists who were holding a clown fish trapped in a bread bag.

Mr Santi ordered Mr Akung's

employer, tour company Joel Thai, and Mr Akung to attend a meeting on Tuesday about the problem.

"We have given Joel Thai, the tour company, a warning letter," said Mr Santi after the meeting.

"If we find Mr Akung doing this again, his permit will be revoked.

We will also order Joel Thai to close immediately.

"The company representative and Mr Akung both promised that they would inform other tour guides about this problem and prevent them from doing it in the future."

Joel Thai was also required to attend an animal abuse lesson at the MOTS office set for Friday.

The MOTS will also be demanding that Joel Thai help combat behavior that is damaging to the environment by not only changing the practices of their guides, but also by placing campaign posters on all their boats informing tourists of ethical and legal ways to interact with the environment, Mr Santi told the *Gazette*.

Mr Santi wants this incident to serve as an example to other companies about animal abuse and the importance of teaching tourists to respect the environment.

"Tour companies must have measures in place to ensure that tourists behave properly and interact with the environment properly while in Thailand," he said. "They must be told what they can and cannot do."



### Plans for island light rail trundle forward

ISLAND-DWELLERS were offered a chance to express their opinions about the light-rail project in a public hearing at Queen Sirikit Park in Phuket Town on Thursday.

The news follows a meeting with Sirigate Apirat of the Office of Transport and Traffic Policy and Planning on Monday about the light rail.

It was decided at the meeting that there would be an extra stop added in Mai Khao – bringing the total to 21.

"The details are being drawn up. We have to finalize the plan and make sure that locals are satisfied with it before we proceed," said Mr Sirigate.

"We will work with local authorities and hold open meetings for locals so they can speak their minds about the project.

"We will inspect the six stops slated for Phuket Town on Thursday, then we will hold a small public meeting at about midday at the 72nd Anniversary Queen Sirikit Park."

Experts at the meeting on Monday expressed their concerns about changes that would have to be made in Phuket Town for the light rail.

"These stops are in the heart of town, where there are so many people living. Traffic is already a huge issue there," said Mr Sirigate.

"We are also considering the effect this project will have on the beauty of the island, so we will not allow cables to be installed in Phuket Town or at the Heroines'

Monument. Those sections of the light rail will be battery powered."

Phuket City Police Deputy Superintendent Teerawat Leamsuwan noted that massive processions of entranced *ma song* and Vegetarian Festival revellers use the main streets in town every year, a point Mr Sirigate said would be discussed further with the light-rail project team.

A previous meeting for the project was held earlier this month, during which changes to the train's route and adjustments to traffic directions in Phuket Town were announced.

An additional change to traffic flow was announced on Monday, which will see Phuket Road between Rassada Road and Kra Road turned into a one-way street, from south to north.

Traffic will be able to head south on Dilok-Uthit Road.

# Beach resort puts safety on top with lifeguard training

LIFEGUARD training took place on Le Meridien Phuket Beach Resort's secluded beach to train guards from 11 different properties in Phuket.

The day was split into four sections with practical training at the beginning and end, and theory and first-aid training sandwiched in the middle, explained Surf Life Saving Australia Trainer and Assessor David Field, who has been conducting surf life-saving training workshops in Phuket for more than a decade.

"Most rescues are within 50 meters of the shore, so it's safer for the lifeguards and safer for the victim if they bring the victim to the shore on a tube [rescue buoy]," Mr Field says as he watches a group of newly-trained hotel lifeguards practice their skills. "For Thai people, I really recommend this. If something goes wrong, they've got the tube attached to them – they're safe. While if you lose the [rescue] board, they're gone."

During drills, the trainee lifeguards stop swimming about a meter away from the 'victim'. They pull the rescue tube from behind them and pass it to the victim, before safely clipping it around them and starting to bring them back to shore.

"In the hotel industry, the biggest issue lifeguards face is

communication. There are a lot of people from non-swimming cultures that are coming to Phuket. The lifeguards have to be vigilant, but they also have to be good communicators — that's either verbal communication or non-verbal communication," Mr Fields says.

"They have to get all these people from vastly different cultures to understand that swimming between these flags means a lifeguard is watching you and that you are safe."

Though most lifeguards working in the hotel industry have some English-language skills, some tourists comprising Phuket's larg-

est source markets, such as the Russians and Chinese, often don't speak English, making non-verbal communication essential.

"It's better to use your whistle then a defib [automated external defibrillator, or AED]. The lifeguards are their to make sure guests have a good time and to prevent them from getting into trouble," Mr Field explains.

The lifeguards training at the Le Meridien are being taught the 'Chain of Survival', which is founded on immediate recognition of cardiac arrest and activation of the emergency response system; early cardiopulmonary resuscita-

tion (CPR) with an emphasis on chest compressions; rapid defibrillation (use of AED); effective advanced life support; and integrated post-cardiac arrest care.

Though training is essential, so is properly equipping lifeguards to ensure that they are able to take care of guests and themselves, Mr Fields notes.

"Really though, we're building resources for the community. These lifeguards are from all over Thailand. When they go home, they will be sharing the knowledge they've gained through this training and will be making Thailand a safer place," Mr Fields says.

#### Island to see superyacht chartering licences soon

REGISTRATION for foreignflagged superyacht chartering licences is expected to begin next month, Marine Department Director-General Chula Sukmanop recently revealed to the *Gazette*.

"Officials have been discussing how to standardize criteria for the licences. We are pushing hard on what needs to be done, in terms of laws, to allow foreign-flagged superyacht charters in Thailand," said Mr Chula.

A public hearing on the issue was set to be held on Friday, after being postponed to ensure that Mr Chula would be able to attend, the *Gazette* was told by Phuket Marine Office Chief Phuripat Theerakulpisut on Monday.

"We will hold a public hearing at Phuket Provincial Hall. After the public hearing we will submit the standardized criteria to the Ministry of Transport for approval. Then, the registration should be available for qualified vessels at the beginning of July," Mr Chula explained.

"The ministry is fully supporting this matter in order to move Thailand closer toward its goal of becoming the regional maritime hub."

It was noted in last month's public meeting in Phuket that the government is looking to give superyachts 30 meters or longer permission to charter in Thai territorial waters for a year at time.

### OAG to take down corruption

THE Office of the Auditor General's (OAG) two-day public forum designed to raise the public's awareness of the negative effects of corruption and what issues are faced in combating it started on June 11 at the Royal Phuket City Hotel.

"This is about raising people's awareness of the need for anti-corruption efforts. People need to understand why corruption is unacceptable," said Chairman of the State Audit Commission Chaisit Trachoetham, who led the forum.

Speaking on the panel to an assembly of about 200 people were Auditor-General Pisit Leelava-chiropas, Governor Nisit Jansomwong, Phuket City Mayor Somjai Suwansupana, President of the Phuket Anti-Corruption Network Surin Bamrungphol and *Phuket Gazette* Managing Editor Isaac Stone Simonelli.

"The biggest benefit from the forum was discussing which issues are preventing us from battling corruption and what the public thinks should be done," Dr Chaisit said. "On the other hand, the forum offered us an opportunity to explain to the people what the OAG does and how important

public input is."

Governor Nisit called on the OAG to spearhead investigations into construction companies that have won government contracts.

"There are so many multimillion-baht infrastructure projects taking place in Phuket, and when there is a problem, I'm the one who is blamed," Gov Nisit said. "However, there is nothing I can do. I would like to see the OAG investigate why there are delays in some of these construction projects... and root out the corruption.

"Because the mega projects are taken care of by departments in Bangkok, the OAG is in a much better position to take action against these companies."

Dr Surin opened the discussion in broader terms, pointing out that the way to tackle corruption was by focusing on the next generation "We have to make sure they deeply believe that there is no room in society for corrupt people," Dr Surin said.

The Phuket Anti-Corruption Network regularly holds anticorruption talks at schools and universities, Dr Surin noted.

Mr Simonelli, who was asked to join the meeting to represent the English-language media on the island, pointed out the effect this type of media can have when dealing with Thailand's image.

"Though the English-language media caters to a minority group in Thailand: expats, tourists and English-speaking Thais, it wields a great deal of power in the way Thailand is perceived by the rest of the world. The reports written in English are the ones that have the greatest impact on many Ultra High-Net Worth Individuals and other markets sought by the Tourism Association of Thailand," Mr Simonelli said.

"Clearly understanding what actions the OAG is taking and why they are taking them is fundamental to accurate reporting. Vagueness and lack of clear explanations of why some projects are being audited and others are not leaves room for foreign readers to speculate what corruption may lie behind the paperwork."

Mr Pisit assured that it isn't too late to send the OAG tip-offs.

"Provide us information so we can check up on possible corruption. You don't need to be directly involved, you just need to point us in the right direction," Mr Pisit said. "Even if money has been inappropriately spent, we can work to return that money to the state.

"We need everyone to join us in fighting corruption."

...us there and dragged me out," Mr Kamolchai said.

Mr Kamolchai told police that Col Sorapong and his friends forced him to grovel at the officer's boots.

"He kicked me in the chin. Then his friends began to kick me as well," Mr Kamolchai said.

Mr Kittipong's version of events and details of who exactly was involved have yet to be confirmed by CCTV footage from within the club, Phuket Provincial Police Commander Patchara Boonyasit told the *Gazette*.

"The only suspect we know of right now is Col Sorapong. We cannot confirm whether or not anyone else was involved. We have to investigate and collect more evidence," he explained.

Afraid of further abuse, Mr Kamolchai went to a friend's house in Phang Nga after being

discharged from Patong Hospital. He returned on June 12 to file the complaint.

Col Sorapong has yet to issue an official statement to the press.

# Officials seize 100 rai of illegally possessed land

ABOUT 100 rai of illegally possessed land in Sirinath National Park were seized by a team of park officials and Navy personnel on June 12.

Seizure notices were posted on the five plots in Sakoo and Cherng Talay, which were being used for rubber plantations, after the owners were unable to present ownership documents for the land.

"The owners are now under investigation for land encroachment," said Sirinath National Park Chief Kitiphat Tharapiban.

Earlier this month, officials seized eight pieces of land totalling about 150 rai in the park, added Mr Kitiphat. Those land owners are also under investigation.

"We will continue to do our best to take back the land for the

nation," said Mr Kitiphat.

Because the alleged owners of the land had no documentation to back their claim, there was no need for the officers to push a case through the legal system in order to reclaim the land, explained Mr Kitiphat.

Claiming that the court process

is 'very slow' when it comes to having land taken back from encroachers with illegal documents, officials have requested the use of Article 44 of the interim Charter to reclaim national park land, Mr Kitiphat told the *Gazette* last month.

# NRC members suggest legalization of casinos

A SMALL group of National Reform Council (NRC) members has called for casinos to be legalized in Thailand, citing the presence of booming casinos over the border in neighboring countries. They said Pattaya was the logical location for one.

Major Arnun Watcharothai and Kriangkrai Phumlaochaeng said on Monday that the casino-revival plan was backed by a dozen NRC members, including themselves, reported *The Nation*.

They pointed to the benefits the country would reap – additional spending and tax revenue from foreign visitors and high-rollers who currently have to head to neighboring countries to gamble.

Calling themselves a group of 'NRC members who love Thailand', they said a formal proposal would be submitted to the government soon.

Maj Arnun said the group was aware of the previous unsuccess-

ful attempts to seek government permits for such complexes, but believed that there would be significant economic spin-offs from this new proposal because

Bangkok, for example, is a major tourist destination with millions of foreign visitors per year. The entertainment and casino facilities could be used as new attractions to boost tourism revenue.

There are now 22 casino facilities in neighboring countries, with plans to open more in the next three or four years, Maj Arnun said, adding that border areas in countries such as Cambodia would become a gambling magnet similar to Las Vegas in the United States.

Maj Arnun said 80 per cent of punters in these places were Thais, so legalizing casinos in Thailand would plug the leakage of foreign exchange from the country.

At this stage, Pattaya in Chon Buri province is among the most suitable places for the government to consider hosting casino operations, he added.

The NRC will propose the casino-revival plan to the government if the majority of council members vote for it.

However, the final decision rests with the Cabinet and the National Council for Peace and Order, Maj Arnun said.

#### Man strangles kids, kills self over troubles with finances

A FATHER strangled his three children before hanging himself at their rented home in Nakhon Sri Thammarat on Monday, reportedly because of financial stress.

Superintendent Chokdee Rakwattanaphong of the Sichon Police said that investigators learned that the 40-year-old man, who worked on fishing and tourism boats for a living, argued with his wife often over debts and expenses, reported *The Nation*.

Three days prior to the murder-suicide, his wife allegedly left him with the three children aged 14, eight and four, police said.

Police collected evidence for further investigation. The bodies will also undergo examinations at a morgue in Surat Thani.

### Thailand attempts to pacify Hong Kong over tumeric-soaked durian

THE Commerce Ministry will help the Agriculture Ministry to clarify health concerns Hong Kong officials have about the use of the turmeric liquid in exported durian.

The move comes as the ministries warned Thai exporters and farmers not to use any substances that could affect consumer confidence, reported *The Nation*.

Duangkamol Jiambutr, the Commerce Ministry spokes-woman, said the Thai Trade Office in Hong Kong would inform Hong Kong's Food and Environmental Hygience Department (FEHD) that turmeric did not harm people's health, so there was no need to ban Thai durian imports.

In a bid to prevent further problems, the ministry will also meet with relevant government agencies and the Thai Fruits Exporters Association to discuss the import fruit regulations for a variety of markets.

A recent media report stated that the FEHD had accused Thai durian farmers and exporters of soaking durians in turmeric and other chemicals to accelerate ripening.

The FEHD warned them not to use turmeric or any substance to accelerate ripening or Hong Kong would ban durian imports from Thailand.

Ms Duangkamol said the government would help ensure that farmers and exporters who used a chemical substance to hasten the ripening of durian are not using than two parts per million.

"Farmers and exporters have to be aware of this warning to not

use any substance that is forbidden by import countries or else it will affect the reputation of Thai fruit and affect the country's exports," she said.

The Commerce Ministry also urged farmers and traders to comply with relevant legal requirements, follow the Good Manufacturing Practice and use permitted food additives only in an appropriate manner.

Hong Kong is Thailand's third largest market for durian exports after China and Vietnam. In the first four months of this year, durian exports to Hong Kong were worth 1.21 billion baht.

Peeled durian is sold in Hong Kong for a healthy HK\$100 per kilogram (435 baht), up from HK\$50 last year.

During the current harvest seasons, the total durian output is expected to reach 639,960 tonnes, of which 338,515 tonnes would come from the East (May-June harvest) and 275,960 tonnes from the South (July-September), with the remaining amount coming from other provinces such as Uttaradit and Sisaket.



### Last chance

OFFICIALS' reactions to efforts by one resort to spare its guests the annoyance and dangers posed by jet-skis indicates that this plague on Phuket's tourism industry is highly-resistant, defying everything from common sense to existing Thai maritime law.

It remains mystifying how this particular industry has somehow been spared the law-and-order crackdown that has gone a long way toward putting an end to scamming and other illegalities in other parts of the tourism sector.

From any reasonable perspective, the jet-ski rental industry would appear to have been the perfect candidate for a similar clampdown or, better yet, complete elimination.

The Gazette has conducted a number of online readers' polls over the years about jet-skis, the results of which have consistently shown that a vast majority of readers, Thais and foreigners alike, would like to see Phuket free of jet-skis for hire.

The statistical trend generally shows growth toward more 'anti' jet-ski sentiments. The most recent poll, conducted earlier this year, indicated that 75 per cent of all respondents felt jet-skis had no place on any local beach.

Even more telling is the fact that only five per cent of tourists who took part in that survey found the jet-ski status quo acceptable. If tourists, the lifeblood of the island's economy, don't want jet-skis for rent, then who does?

Not only do they remain, but they seem to be flourishing, much to the concern of resort owners and tourists with the temerity to think they can enjoy a peaceful swim at a Phuket beach.

Unfortunately, the industry continues to enjoy the support of the Phuket Marine Office, the one agency that should have phased them out under a plan introduced as far back as 2004.

Phuket Marine Office Chief Phuripat Theerakulpisut reportedly told a recent gathering of the island's honorary consuls that 'the jet-ski problem was solved' under yet another 're-zoning scheme' - one that gives jet-skis access to about half of Patong Beach and now, apparently, even the remote beaches surrounding The Naka Island resort (see page 2).

This is just the type of place tourists choose for a peaceful sojourn - not to be imperiled by jet-ski cowboys the moment they dip their toes in the water.

The elimination of the jet-ski rental industry could be achieved overnight through the simple enforcement of a long-ignored regulation requiring jet-ski operators to possess a captain's licence.

The only role jet-skis should have is saving swimmers in distress. This is surely the last chance we will ever get to put an end to the international embarrassment that is the jet-ski rental industry.

For all these reasons, the Gazette pleads with the National Council for Peace and Order to use their extraordinary powers under Section 44 of the 2014 Interim Charter to order an immediate ban of the rental of jet-skis throughout Thailand and put an end to this tourism-killing plague once and for all.

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

### Island poised for superyacht glory


PHUKET plays a central role in the yachting industry in Southeast Asia, in the sense that it has a 10 or 20 year head start as the bestknown destination and the main 'hub' for large yachts cruising the region. More importantly, with the industry in Asia now poised to develop rapidly, the island has a genuine opportunity to capitalize on this situation over the next few

It has the popularity, geographical position and infrastructure to benefit most from the expected influx of superyachts coming east from the Mediterranean for the winter season.

Phuket is an important location for the yachting industry, in that it is the first and the most obvious stop-off point for all the big boats coming to Asia from the Mediterranean via the Gulf, the Indian Ocean and the Maldives. There are plenty of superyacht marina berths, hotels, refit and repair facilities and so on – it is a world-class cruising destination in its own right.

And now there is a genuine desire among owners, captains and charter guests to find somewhere new and less crowded – and here, even though it's twice as far away, they will find unspoiled and virtually limitless cruising grounds, beautiful beaches and diving spots, as well as great service from friendly, happy people.

The main thing that has been stopping them has been incompatible regulation and the inability to legally charter. It costs up to US\$500,000 to bring a big boat all the way to Asia, so once it's here, it really needs to stay for the entire season. Owners probably only use the boat for three or four

weeks, so it's important that the rest of the time the crew can be occupied, the boat active and some charter fees earned to offset costs.

I think Phuket will develop. We have been met with a positive, welcoming and proactive response from the government in regards to attracting superyachts to Thailand, and we have been assured that the change in regulations we have been requesting will be actioned very soon.

We have principally focused on the need to allow foreign-flagged superyachts to come here and charter, which is currently not allowed - but only because the existing regulations were based on traditional merchant shipping rules, and have never been adapted for large pleasure yachts. Our proposal was simply to 'customize' the regulations here, similarly to those we have seen adopted in other yacht-friendly countries.

This is not just reasonable, it makes perfect sense. The market will be boosted, and all the local yacht businesses, including the smaller charter yachts and boats, will see huge benefits too.

The government was naturally

keen to understand the economic benefits for tourism and maritime businesses, but also to ensure that if big yachts were to be welcomed in large numbers, they would be operated in an environmentallyfriendly way, and would comply with both Thai and international safety and security standards. We helped document positive evidence on all these levels - and, as I say, we have been able to discuss all of these concerns in a proactive way.

Phuket also has a major advantage in that there will soon be more than 100 berths for superyachts and megayachts here - very unique in this region.

At the same time, we are engaging, through our Singapore Yacht Show and our wider marketing efforts with, an ever-growing community of lifestyle-hungry people from all over Asia, who might currently be uninitiated, but are all new potential charterers – and, one day, new yacht owners.

Everybody loves coming to Thailand, and this industry will bring the kind of high-end, highspending tourism Phuket needs.

### Lack of discipline

I HAVE been driving various vehicles in Phuket on a daily basis for 12 years now. I started out riding a Honda Wave, before moving on to a car and a big bike. My 12 years of experience on the road has made me realize that people risk their lives every day because of their sheer lack of discipline.

What do I mean by lack of discipline? Just drive out into the street, look to your left and to your right, and you'll see what I mean.

There are motorbike drivers riding without helmets, driving through stop lights and riding against traffic without caution. Many cars make sudden turns without indicating, and if you honk at them, they'll give you dirty looks. All of these actions can result in accidents.

A lot of Thais and expats on Phuket think *mai pen rai*: don't worry, it's okay.

They think mai pen rai when driving through stop lights. They think 'It's okay. There's no need to wait. There are no vehicles coming'. Just last week, I was driving toward Phuket Town from Koh Kaew when I had to stop at the Bus Terminal 2 intersection. During the 45-second wait, I saw 15 people drive through the red light – all without helmets.

On the opposite side of the same intersection, u-turns are forbidden. However, those with lack of discipline ignore the law and make the turn, even with a legal u-turn only 80 meters away.

riding a short distance without a helmet. Maybe they don't want to waste time putting it on, or maybe they just got a new hair cut that they don't want to mess up. Either way, what happens if they have an accident in that distance?

Please note if your restaurant has music and a lot of your customers dance there, it will be considered a nightclub. You must register your restaurant as a nightspecific place for dancing.

You will need to pay the corresponding retroactive taxes to the PEO for your nightclub registration, starting from the first day your establishment opened.

Please go to the local municipality, which should be the same place you registered your bar and restaurant, to register your business as a nightclub.

#### Col Sien Kaewthong of the **Phuket City Police replies:**

If your restaurant and bar is considered a nightclub and you do not register it properly, the penalty can be up to a 60,000-baht fine, one year in jail or both.

### Bond investor survival guide

IT'S inevitable that interest rates will eventually rise, but what do rising interest rates mean for investors and how can you prepare your portfolio? First of all, here is what you need to consider or be concerned about:

#### **INTEREST RATES AND BONDS**

When interest rates rise, prices of fixed rate bonds will fall (and vice versa) because no one wants to buy a bond with a lower rate than what's currently available in the market.

However, and if you own individual bonds until their maturity, you will not actually lose any money (unless of course the bond defaults), as what you lose is the 'opportunity cost' of owning a newer bond with a higher interest rate.

#### **BOND FUNDS**

Most investors own bond funds rather than individual bonds, and that can be a problem because bond fund managers are constantly buying and selling bonds. In general, and when interest rates finally rise, a bond fund investor's principal will decline until interest rates stabilize or begin to decline again.

Moreover, bond funds holding long-term bonds in particular are more exposed to losses than short-term bond funds, which are less risky but also yield less to investors seeking income.

#### **JUNK BONDS**

bonds' are tempting in a low interest rate environment. However, there is a reason why some companies, and even governments, must issue bonds with above market interest rates, as these issuers could find themselves squeezed for financing or could go into default when rates rise.

#### **DIVIDEND PAYING STOCKS**

Low bond yields in many developed countries sent investors piling into dividend paying stocks sending share prices up and dividend yields down.

A rise in interest rates could have some investors exiting these stocks or stock funds for high quality bonds that are guaranteed a certain return at maturity without the risk to principal associated with stocks.

#### **EMERGING MARKETS**

Most emerging market governments have issued a greater share of debt in domestic currencies, but rising US dollar interest rates tend to lower the attractiveness of investments in other currencies. This means that emerging market exchange rates along with stock and bond prices could take a hit.

While trying to 'time' the bond market or guess when, and by how much, interest rates will rise is also a risky strategy, but there are ways to protect your investment portfolio from rising interest

#### **LADDER YOUR BONDS OR BOND FUNDS**

Individual bonds should always be held with 'laddered' maturities High yields from so called 'junk dates (1 year, 3 year, 5 year, 10

year and so on) to avoid the risk of every bond coming due in a low interest rate environment. This laddering can also be achieved to a similar degree by holding bond funds containing short, medium and long-term maturities.

#### **DIVERSIFY YOUR BOND HOLDINGS**

Besides holding bonds or bond funds of varying maturities, holding government, corporate, high yield (so-called 'junk') or emerging market issues either individually or via funds can be another way to lower long-term volatility and exposure to interest rate movements in either

#### **INVESTMENT GRADE SHORT-TERM BONDS**

Risk adverse bond investors

seeking more protection from rising interest rates might want to allocate a larger portion of their bond portfolio to short-term investment grade bonds and bond funds. Just be aware that the more allocated to short term and investment grade bonds, will likely mean lower returns over the longer term. My bond asset allocation model continues to show the longer term bonds entering a downtrend and focus more on these shorter term

Fortunately for bond investors, most analysts do not see a dramatic rise in interest rates for developed economies where economic growth remains relatively weak. for US investment grade bonds (or their equivalents) is an exceptionally rare occurrence.

"The northern half of Phuket has grown as a desirable residential area close to international schools and hotels. However, families living in these areas have not always had much choice in affordable shopping destinations where they can take the kids to be entertained while mum and dad take time out to do some shopping," said Ms Kanittha.

"Phuketians have always enjoyed having plenty to choose from when shopping at local markets, where locally grown produce and homemade baked goods can be found, but today's cosmopolitan consumers are demanding more quality and convenience."

By Kanittha market research has shown a demand for quality goods and personal services; shops for everyday living needs; and edutainment for active kids, all of which needs to caters to the surrounding international community, said Ms Kanittha.

New shopping venues are coming to the east coast soon as local developer Boat Development, proprietor of Boat Lagoon in Koh Kaew and Boat Avenue in Cherng Talay, aims to fill the gap.

"Following the successful monthly markets along the marina's dockside, which attracted several

thousand visitors each weekend, we aim to offer a similarly enjoyable experience on a daily basis, putting local businesses in touch with local customers, while giving those customers a convenient place to relax, snack and meet friends," said Ms Kanittha.

### Building a better market

#### Re-sales dominate in luxury real-estate segment as new clients look to buy, not build

People have liquidity

but there isn't focus on

building in this area.

ALTHOUGH not visible across the island's multi-fold property market, the dominance of re-sales over new developments is obvious in the luxurious, but not lavish segment, chairman of CB Riewchard Ellis Thailand David Simister said last week.

Sitting just below the multi-

million-dollar villa tier is this interesting segment, which has a number of quality properties in the range of 12 to 30 million baht, are Plantation, The Heights Phuket and Kata Gardens.

"So people have liquidity, but there isn't focus on building in this area," said Mr Simister.

Mr Simister has noticed that a lot of buyers realize that Phuket is a mature market

and therefore do not expect to make huge capital gains on built real-estate.

"If you can see something that you can walk in to and you can sit down there for your Christmas holidays – that is more appealing than something perhaps more state of the art, but at the moment it's a series of brochures and DVDs and the property is under construction," said Mr Simister.

"Probably the main competitor to new development is existing sales."

At the rarefied top tier are impressive projects such as Amanpuri, where the asking price is more than 500mn baht, Andara

1 and Andara Signature.

"The Andara 1 has had a very active series of re-sales, and every re-sale has shown a significant rise. It has risen two and half times from its launch price," said Mr Simister.

Additionally, there are new products coming on stream, such as Minor Group's Anantara villas and Avadina Hills by Kajima. However, Mr Simister pointed out that

the major problem in this tier was a scarcity of good sites.

"In Phuket, land prices, which are obviously the base, essential ingredient for property, generally continue to appreciate. I think that applies [to all land] whether it's for a inland housing plot, an agriculture plot or, obviously,

west coast beaches, which are absolutely premium products," he said.

The lack of prime sites on the west coast, which is now relatively congested because of the expansion of tourist hotels and more mass-market condominiums, has led to a lot of people, both tourists and homebuyers,

looking across the bridge to Phang Nga's Natai Beach.

The newest project on the beach is the 42-rai Baba Beach Club undertaken by Charn Issara Development Plc in partnership with China-based Junfa Real Estate Company.

However, Mr Simister mentioned that Phuket isn't all about

luxury villas. At the other end of the spectrum, there has been the relatively recent appearance of small condo units that are not too much different in design or size to mid-town Bangkok, Hong Kong or Pattaya developments, and depending on the size, are priced from 3mn baht upwards.

#### MK Real Estate founding family sells stakes

THE Tangmatitham family has finalized a deal to sell its 20.64-per-cent stake in MK Real Estate Development worth 1.2 billion baht for 6.75 baht per share to Castle Peak Developments and CPD Holding.

The deal will make those two companies the major shareholders in MK Real Estate Development, and end the presence of the Tangmatitham family in a business they founded 50 years ago.

MK's founder, Chuan Tangmatitham, 78, said this handover of the family's shareholding was considered a bestowal of the business that he has fostered for more than 50 years upon a team that is determined to drive the company forward, and embrace opportunities to expand into new businesses.

"I believe that with the strong foundation of experienced staff, financial strength and a longstanding reputation among customers, the new executives will be capable of continuing the

company's sustainable growth. All stakeholders — customers, employees and shareholders — will be well taken care of.

"From now on, as the chief adviser to the board of directors, I am willing to give advice to help guide the company toward its business targets," said Mr Chuan.

Castle Peak Development is wholly owned by Suthep Wongvorazathe, former chairman of the Export and Import Bank of Thailand.

MK's board of directors has appointed Mr Suthep as chairman

to replace Mr Chuan, as well as Philipvira Bunnag and Sutida Suriyodorn as executive directors. Mr Suthep said his group was confident that the property market would return to strong growth, while MK had the potential to be one of Thailand's leading residential property developers.

Last year, MK earned 2.4bn baht in revenue and 450mn baht in net profit. Interest-bearing debt was less than 1.5bn baht, reflecting its strong financial position. Net profit margin, at the 20-percent level, was viewed as outstanding among listed developers. In the first quarter of this year, MK Real Estate Development reported revenue of 436mn baht and net profit of 30.51mn baht.

"I am confident in the company's growth potential in real-estate development for sales and intend to expand further into the rental business. We aim at being a comprehensive real-estate developer," Mr Suthep said.

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### RPM to see B5bn investment


ROYAL Phuket Marina announced a five billion baht investment plan for the next five years under the new campaign #DestinationRPM.

ond, and much larger, addition will be a 500-key hotel with a theme pool and beach access, which will be geared toward targeting Phuket's growing family segment.

The marina will see 160 units in eight four-storey buildings located near the Town Square as part of the La Reserve low-rise condominium development, designed to target the serviced apartment niche.

### Phuket pivots into regional education



SUN, sand, surf and study is without a doubt an unlikely combination of S-phrases. That said, Phuket is maturing into a key Asian resort destination for international level education and the upward trend is showing no sign of stopping.

This past week Thanyapura, the umbrella complex of Phuket International Academy, announced plans to further expand their already considerable 3.5 billion baht investment and expand their already sizable stable of facilities. On a larger scale, an emerging set of property developers are now looking into plans to use education as a core activity to expand their real estate business models.

Recently C9 Hotelworks conducted market research into the sector and found that there are fifteen international schools on the island and eight bilingual (English or Chinese as a second language or those featuring English programs). A total of 7,114 students attend these combined institutions.

ment, which boasts 2,309 children, the top three schools in terms of attendance are British International at the top spot with 830, HeadStart with 374 followed by Phuket International Academy hosting 318 students.

Of the newer entries, Kajonkiet International School has surged over just a few operating years and now plays home to 224.

While the term 'international' may lead readers to believe all the students are non-Thai, the reality is that within this segment, Thai nationals account for 39% and

Viewing the international seg- foreign students 61%. One very 8%. As a key market player, the relevant metric is the equation of households, meaning families with multiple students in a school, which surpassed 60% in the majority of the larger facilities.

As for the top three English or Chinese language programs at Thai institutions, these ranked with Phuket Thai Hua at 1,821, Kajonkietsuksa School at 1,376 and Darasamuth at 1,013. A total of 4,805 students attend institutions in this segment where Thai nationals make up 92% of the total student composition, though there are 358 foreign children, or Kajonkiet Group operates four schools across both sectors.

One key driver of Phuket's attractiveness is the eligibility for foreigners to obtain a Thai non-immigrant education visa (ED) for students and O type for dependent guardians. There is one O visa allowed per student, and this requires 500,000 baht to be deposited into a Thai bank for three months or else 1mn baht for two guardians. There are well over 500 education visas issued within the schools researched by C9 Hotelworks.

Looking at the employment ben-

efits of the educational sector of international and foreign language schools in Phuket, there is a positive job creation of over 2,000 direct positions with the majority of these employees being Thai.

A secondary economic benefit is the demand it generates to the local real estate sector in terms of property sales and rentals. There are also cross benefits to automobile sales, consumer products, banking and the broader service sectors.

Overall education and the increasing critical mass of high-level schools to Phuket is helping create a key point of differentiation for the island, given its impressive scale, quality of facilities and increasingly global audience.

Next time you think Phuket is only a one-trick pony with a tourism-dominated business model, look into the real numbers of what is driving our growth and momentum.

# Life & style Safe cycling in Thailand Looking at the nation's cycling issues through international eyes



**Blazing Saddles** By Baz Daniel

THE tragic events of the past year have raised the title of this article. 'Safe Cycling in Thailand' from a mere eyebrow-raising non sequitur, to the status of a full-blown oxymoron.

Following the litany of cyclists' deaths on Thailand's roads, many would say there is no such thing as safe cycling in Thailand and that the activity should be banned from the country's bloodied

Sadly for Thailand and its all important 'image', some of the accidents have garnered worldwide attention as they involved cyclists who were on global long-distance trips to raise funds for various worthwhile causes. These tragic victims of Thailand's immensely dangerous driving culture had successfully navigated their way across many countries prior to arriving in the Land of Smiles, only to be mown down by inept, careless or inebriated drivers for the entire world to see and report.

On February 18, 2013 Britain's Guardian newspaper ran this

"A British couple's round-theworld cycling odyssey ended in tragedy when both of them were killed in a road accident in Thailand.

Peter Root and Mary Thompson, who had been chronicling their journey in a blog, died on Wednesday when they were hit by a truck in a province east of Bangkok. The couple, both 34 and from Guernsey in the Channel Islands, had been cycling through Europe, the Middle East, Central Asia and China since July 2011.

Thai police said that investigators found their bodies, their bicycles and their belongings scattered along a roadside, along with a pick-up truck that crashed

between some trees. The truck driver, 25-year-old Worapong Sangkhawat, was seriously injured in the crash and faces charges of causing death by dangerous driving.'

And this one appeared in the Daily Mail earlier this year:

"A Chilean cyclist's quest to bike around the world in five years has ended with his death in a road accident in northeast Thailand.

Police say the 47-year-old Juan Francisco Villa Honorato was hit by a pick-up truck and immediately killed on a highway in Nakhon Ratchasima province. Col Torsak Thammingmongkol says the driver was arrested on a charge of causing death by dangerous driving and released on bail.'

Clearly these tragedies are a public relations nightmare for Thailand and make a mockery of recent assertions from the Tourism Authority of Thailand that they plan to promote the Kingdom as a cyclist-friendly destination.

These recent disasters also prompted a typically ill-thoughtout knee-jerk reaction from top officials at the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration and the Department of Land Transport who suggested that a cycling licence was the way to make Thailand's roads safer.

Just for the record, Thailand used to have a law requiring cyclists to get a cycling licence. It was introduced 80 years ago when bicycles and other nonmotorized vehicles were still a major mode of travel and it was revoked in 2003 because it no longer made sense.

In fact, licences have nothing to do with Thailand's appalling driving conditions, the deaths and injuries from which are the second worst in the world per capita.

Under existing laws, all vehicle drivers are supposed to carry a current licence and their doing so makes not one iota of difference to the savage aggression and stupidity which is the daily norm on Thailand's roads.

A vast majority of cyclists are also drivers of other motor vehicles and know only too well the extreme danger of taking to Thailand's roads

on a bicycle. Only a highly skilled and confident cyclist would do so and so a test of cycling competency is an entirely redundant piece of grandstanding which fails to address the real solution to the problem.

Thailand's vehicle drivers will never improve, and so the real solution to the cycling carnage is to separate cyclists and other road users to the greatest degree possible.

Britain's National Cycle Network, founded 20 years ago, is a classic working example of this concept. It is a series of safe, traffic-free paths and quiet on-road cycling and walking routes that connects to every major town and city in Britain. The Network passes within two kilometers of half of all homes in the country and stretches over 22,000 kilometers across the length and breadth of the UK.

Almost five million people use the National Cycle Network, not just for cycling, as the routes are also popular with walkers, joggers, wheelchair users and horse riders too.

Phuket is a prime location in which Thailand could start introducing such segregated cycling and walking trails. Around the Bang Wad Dam, or closing off the Nai Harn Lake loop, or the Mai Khao loop at various times for non-motorized use would be easy options to start with.

Promoting bike rentals, food and drink stalls and post-ride massages are easy ways to monetize such an initiative and offset administrative costs.

All this takes is a little planning, the political will to support it, plus clean and transparent manage-

Could such positive steps be fostered in Thailand as a way of at least building a positive response to the awful biking tragedies that have already occurred here?

Only time will tell.

# Life & style Fixie passion gives birth to criterium

ONE man's love of fixed-gear cycling races gave birth to the Southern criterium which took place in Saphin Hin, Phuket Town last month.

Vissaves 'Bon' Kumphanthong, owner of Cuca Bike, event organizer and director of the Bangkok Criterium, got hooked on cycling only a few years ago.

"It was between 2009 and 2010 that I started looking for a sport that could improve my health, and I settled on cycling," Bon says. "I wanted a bike that looked awesome and unique, so I ended up settling on a fixed-gear bike."

A fixed-gear bicycle, commonly known as a 'fixie', is a bicycle that has a drivetrain with no freewheel mechanism, and has become increasingly popular over the past 15 years.

There were several major hurdles for Bon after he became a fixie owner. The first was the difficulty of finding a bike shop that could repair, maintain and modify the bike. So, he opened up his own shop – Cuca Bike.

During that time, Bon began establishing his 'biker gang' - Fixed Family Thailand – which consisted of 30 to 40 people who zipped around the streets of Bangkok at

"The style of the bike and the sensation we caused got a lot of attention. Some people even joined the family," Bon says.

After a certain point, just riding with 'the family' wasn't enough. Bon wanted to race fixies.

"That's how the Bangkok Criterium was born," Bon says.

The inaugural event, 'The Knight Criterium', was held in December 2011. There were about 30 racers, and the entire event was sponsored by Bon's friends, who also own bike shops around Bangkok.

"It was a small event, but we received lots of positive feed back. Many cyclists wanted to know what a 'criterium' was and wanted to race in the next one,' Bon says.

After that, the event began to pick up momentum – the kind of thing a fixed-gear cyclist knows exactly how to handle.

"The next event was held in the beginning of 2012. I was pretty prepare, and knew how to organize the event and how to find sponsors for prices," Bon says. "There were about 200 participants that time and it came together beautifully, with a lot of post-event coverage on social media sites."

The event was big enough to catch the eye of Cinelli Thailand. The Italian bicycle manufacturing company, based in Milan, mostly

produces components for bikes, many of which are widely popular for converting road bikes to fixies. The company recently teamed

up with San Francisco based MashSF to create the popular 'Cinelli MASH' frames, which are widely used for fixies.

Cinelli Thailand got on board as a sponsor for the third Bangkok Criterium. The president of Cinelli, Antonio Colombo, took much interest in the event, and stepped in to back the fourth criterium which had about 400 participants – with the full power of Cinelli.

Singha Corporation later took over as the main sponsor, backing Bon to arrange three events: one in Bangkok, one in Chiang Rai and one somewhere in Southern Thailand.

"I of course chose to hold the Southern Criterium in Phuket," Bon

Comments from the cyclists such as 'why pay a registration fee for such a short race, when cyclists can pay the same amount for a long race' made it clear to Bon that the community needed be educated about what a criterium entails.

"Once I started explaining how the race worked and the prize structure, there was a lot of interest and excitement," Bon says. "I actually couldn't allow anyone to register the day of the event because we already had so many participants.

"We will be bringing the event back to Phuket next year. It will be bigger and better."

# Life & style Design an aerie in Eden

IN A previous article, I wrote about an extraordinary mountain top project in Cebu, in the Phillippines. My brief for

this project was to suggest plants for such near my house in southern Spain. I would an environment. We started with an obvious choice: bromeliads.

Another very different kind of epiphyte (air plant) is the staghorn fern. Ferns traditionally grow in shade and need moisture – there are a few Boston ferns under the shelter of overhanging rocks in this site – but the fern I had in mind was the huge staghorn, or platycerium. These dramatic plants do best when attached to a tree trunk, where they can collect water and fragments of debris.

If most ferns are therefore unsuitable for our requirements, cacti are the bee's knees. Desert plants - accustomed to full sun and equipped with shallow, wide root systems which can cope with habitats of low fertility – have the added ability to thrive on limited water resources, such as mist and dew.

They inhabit some of the driest places on earth and come in all shapes and sizes. While most are spiny, the epiphytic *rhipsalis* has narrow, dangling leaves and can be planted in cracks with some compost and draped over rocks or roots. Others – the globular ferocactus or the rosette-shaped crassula come to mind – form neat shapes, which would add character and variety to bare rock.

They are worth introducing to this aerie. Other succulents include the genus of aloes, evergreen plants that grow either in rosettes or in spirals, and are usually sharptoothed and lance-shaped. Red or yellow tubular flowers appear annually. Popular because of their striking form and ability to tolerate poor soils, succulents are handsome and durable plants. For an example, A. arborescens grew on rocky outcrops

have no hesitation in recommending it here.

Yuccas, already in evidence on the lower slopes, where there is enough dappled shade to support large clumps of ginger, again possess attractive lance-shaped leaves. Though not as statuary, they are hardy as the aloe in dry, exposed conditions and might well adapt to these conditions.

Y. filamentosa is the easiest variety to cultivate. It produces long, blue-green leaves from the center of which arise stems up to 10-feet tall, bearing masses of creamy flowers. Another yucca, gloriosa (Spanish dagger), comes in a variegated form.

Among other desert plants which need little maintenance, euphorbias and adeniums tend to be grown in containers in Phuket, but there is no reason why they should not flourish in this elevated fastness.

Euphorbias have vicious spikes – hence their nickname 'crown of thorns' – but there is also a small variety with a dense, bushy habit and masses of brilliant scarlet flowers.

Adeniums (desert roses) are shrubs that have gray, often bulbous trunks and prominent roots. Known in the Philippines by the bizarre name of 'Bangkok calachuchi', they can tolerate full sun and meager soil. The trumpet-shaped flowers come in white, pink or brilliant red.

It is essential to study the local flora to see which plants have already habituated to this often hostile environment. Bougainvilleas are one such shrub. They could be encouraged to climb into the existing banyan trees or over the crags. They have

serpentine roots and bloom best in full sun.

Too much sun may in fact be an issue for the ground cover plant which does so splendidly in the established landscape below. There, it has covered the moist, shady slopes with a green carpet dotted with yellow, vetch-like flowers. Up here, at least in the most exposed situations, it looks less at home. Maybe it is worth trying wedelia. With its golden, star-shaped flowers and rapid capacity to creep, wedelia will flourish in full sun. Another plant that can provide a bi-colored green and purple display is the spiderwort (*rhoeo spathacea*). Arranged in dense clumps or even singly, sundang hari should fare as well amid the high-rise rocks.

There will be losses and failures. But what an awe-inspiring project it is. Only a remarkable imagination could conceive such a synthesis of art and nature. As the man said: Nothing ventured, nothing gained.

### Tip of the Week Dried flowers

WHILE dried flowers are no substitute for the vibrant hues of freshly cut ones, they can nonetheless look very attractive when artistically arranged in a vase. In Europe, we sought the beautiful seed heads of reed mace, better known as bulrushes. Dried hemlock and hogweed, with their long stems and circular umbels, always looked good, as did teazles and spindle berries. Relatively easy to find growing, you cut them and hang them upside down to dry out and stiffen. Perfumed lavender was also a

Here, oddly, the choice seems more limited, perhaps because the plastic copies are now so lifelike. Index, for example, has a huge range. Personally, I prefer the real thing – if you can locate it. Lotus seed heads on long stems look dramatic, as do the

oval seed pods of large poppies. Dried grasses too. I have also seen statice, which retains its color, as does the shorter daisy-like helichrysum or straw flower.

Local swimmers rule SEA Games

IT WAS an incredible showing for Phuket als in the women's 4x100m medley relay in the pool at Southeast Asian (SEA) Games in Sinappore, with 13 medals won thanks to the combined efforts of British International School Phuket (BISP) and Thanyapura.

On May 28, BISP Year 11 student Fukang Wong stole the show with a blistering second 50 meter of the 100m breaststroke to move from third to first in the final 25m of the race and take gold for Team Malaysia with a time of 1:02.46 minutes.

Next up was Year 11 student Phiangkhwan Pawapotako, racing in the 200m individual medley for Team Thailand. Phiangkhwan pulled into a clear secondplace position by the final turn, but needed to fight the final length to hold off a fast finishing Singaporean. She took second place with a final time of 2:18.56 minutes.

The day before, Phiangkhwan claimed BISP's first medal at the Games: a silver medal in the 400m individual medley, just behind Vien Thi Anh from Vietnam. Phiangkhwan got a new personal best, another Olympic qualifying standard in the medley events and a World Championship qualifying time for Kazan, Russia.

On the penultimate day of competition, BISP swimmers bagged another two medfinal, with Phiangkhwan leading the Thailand team to silver and Roxanne helping win bronze for the Philippines.

Phiangkhwan also seized a silver and set a Thailand National record with a 2:31.51 minute time in the 200m breaststroke.

Patarawadee Kittiya and Kornkanjana Sapianchai of Thanyapura netted four silver medals. They also broke Thai National records in the 4x200m freestyle, 4x100m freestyle and the 4x100m individual medley.

Peerapat Lertsathapornsuk of Thanyapura, who has a wildcard to the Rio Olympics 2016, ended up missing the podium with a fourth place finish.

However, both Phiangkhwan and Fukang now have three Olympic and World Championship qualifying times between them.

"Over the week, our BISP swimmers have given it their all," said BISP/JSA Swim Academy Head Coach Simon Jones, who was also head coach for Team Thailand at the SEA Games.

"It's been a truly wonderful experience, and for myself, an honor to have represented Team Thailand as a coach."
